GOVERNING BOARDS AND INTER-GROUP COUNCILS

PURPOSE These organizations form the structure of student government at the University. Others, particularly the college governing boards, serve a liaison function between students and faculty in policy-making on matters of concern to students.

From the governing boards stem many of the traditional events and programs of the University such as Homecoming, Greek Week, and Religion in Life Week.

MEMBERSHIP Membership drives called "rushing" periods are conducted during the academic year. A student interested in joining a fraternity or sorority must register for rushing at the Panhellenic and Interfraternity Councils' Office, Room 225, Coffman Union. (Two academic sororities, Alpha Kappa Alpha and Gamma Omicron Beta, are associate members of Panhellenic and conduct their rushing independently.) More detailed information about rushing may be obtained from these offices or from the Student Activities Bureau.

MEETINGS Meetings are held weekly (usually on Monday nights) at the respective residences or in Coffman Union.

EXPENSES Monthly living expenses compare favorably with those of the University residence halls.

ALL-UNIVERSITY PROJECTS,
TRADITIONAL EVENTS AND PROGRAMS

The projects and programs described in this section are not recognized student organizations but are tied either administratively or financially to one of the Governing Boards or Councils listed in the first section of the Directory. Included are some of the major events which are planned either wholly or partly by students and which are open to all members of the University community. Through these activities, students can gain valuable experience in formulating long-range plans, in selecting and organizing committees, in creating publicity campaigns, and in cooperative work with other students and faculty members.

This listing is by no means complete, but is intended to be representative of the many semi-independent projects which are carried out on the campus each year.

BROTHERHOOD WEEK

Chairman To be Appointed, Minneapolis
 To be Appointed, St Paul

The National Conference of Christians and Jews has for many years promoted a nation-wide observance of Brotherhood Week. At the University of Minnesota, the Student Council of Religion sponsors such a week during Winter Quarter. Religious organizations, the All-University Congress, the Interfraternity and Panhellenic Councils, the Union Board of Governors, and the Inter-Residence Council contribute to the planning and execution of the program.

Convocations, exchange dinners and discussions among campus living centers, art exhibits on a cultural theme, a skit night with contributions by sponsoring groups, a square dance, and coffee-discussion hours have been featured in past years. Through these events, the committee hopes to increase student awareness of the problems and possibilities of brotherhood.

CAMPUS CARNIVAL

This is the only all-University fund raising project in the Spring Quarter. The organization which directs this traditional program high-light is selected by the Social Service Council. While the sponsorship of the Carnival is open to any major campus organization, Alpha Phi Omega has usually been chosen for this responsibility.

The net profits of the Carnival are used traditionally for University scholarships, the support of SPAN, and special student projects.

CAMPUS CHEST DRIVE

This is the only all-University fund drive in the Fall Quarter. Funds raised during this drive are traditionally used for off-campus charitable purposes and are allocated to agencies on the community, national, and international levels.

Major campus organizations apply for sponsorship of the drive to the Social Service Council in the Spring Quarter. The Social Service Council selects the sponsor and turns the administration of the project over to the organization. The 1956 Campus Chest Drive is sponsored by the Freshman Cabinet.

FRESHMAN CABINET

Fifty members of the freshman class are selected by the Placement Commission of the All-University Congress to form the Freshman Cabinet. Members of the Cabinet elect their own officers.

The High School Visitation Program constitutes the Cabinet's principal project. During spring vacation, approximately 150 University students visit between 75 and 100 high schools throughout the state to bring to high school students a picture of the opportunities for vocational and personal development in higher education.

Students interested in serving on the Freshman Cabinet should file applications at the All-University Congress, 213 Coffman Union, during Welcome Week.

GREEK WEEK

Annually during Winter Quarter, the Interfraternity and Panhellenic Councils cooperate in presenting a week of activities for the campus community. Through Greek Week, fraternity and sorority members hope to raise money for a community or campus project, to better inform non-members as to the purposes and goals of fraternities and sororities, and to evaluate their own programs.

Features of Greek Week include the Song Fest, the "Tunic Twirl," faculty and Exchange Dinners, conferences on common problems, Small Fry Party (for homeless or handicapped children), Minnesota Olympics, the Variety Show, and the Award Banquet. In 1956, the Variety Show raised more than \$6500 for the Crusade for Freedom.

HOMECOMING

During 1956, the University of Minnesota will celebrate its 39th annual Homecoming. One of the biggest all-University events of the year, Homecoming centers around a Big Ten Conference football game selected by the Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics in consultation with the All-University Congress.

Thursday and Friday, the Varsity Show, a student created variety show, is presented followed on Thursday by the Coronation Ball. Friday is traditionally "Alumni Day" with a parade of floats and judging of house decorations. A torch-light parade, bonfire, and pep dance climax that day's activities. On Saturday, the annual alumni luncheon, football game, and Homecoming dance complete the weekend festivities.

A large student committee will coordinate the more than twenty events and features of the 1956 Homecoming. Interested students can apply to the Congress Office, 213 Coffman Union, or to Chairman Jim Poole.

NATIONAL STUDENT ASSOCIATION

The National Student Association (NSA) is a confederation of American colleges and universities representing some 600,000 students. The legislative body for the organization is the National Student Congress (NSC) and is designed to promote leadership in student government, educational affairs, student welfare and international affairs. In addition to the NSC, the Minnesota-Dakota Region, of which we are a member school, holds two Regional assemblies each year. The Regional assemblies are workshops on problems relating to one of the four programs listed above.
