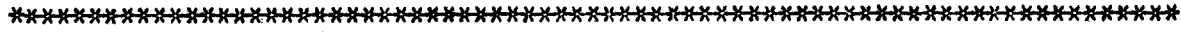

5. Certain groups unfortunately failed to comply with our repeated requests for officer lists, making it impossible to list officers for them. In these cases we have endeavored to cite some contact person who can provide information about the group upon request.

GOVERNING BOARDS AND INTER-GROUP COUNCILS

PURPOSE: These organizations form the structure of student government at the University. The functions of the separate boards vary from those with considerable governing authority to those created simply to coordinate the activities of member groups. Others, particularly the college governing boards, serve a liaison function between students and faculty in policy-making on matters of concern to students.

From the governing boards stem many of the traditional events and programs of the University such as Homecoming, Greek Week, and Religion in Life Week.

As a representative student governing board, Congress promotes student interest and student welfare, encourages and trains student leadership, and sponsors or underwrites a variety of activities such as Homecoming, the Gopher Rooter Club, and the All-University Student Forum. In partnership with the Office of the Dean of Students and the Senate Committee on Student Affairs, it sponsors the New Student Orientation Programs.

Membership There are 34 members of Congress: 24 are elected at All-Campus Elections each spring and 10 are appointed by college governing boards and councils. The officers of Congress are elected by the membership.

ALL-UNIVERSITY PROJECTS,
TRADITIONAL EVENTS AND PROGRAMS

The projects and programs described in this section are not recognized student organizations but are tied either administratively or financially to one of the Governing Boards or Councils listed in the first section of the Directory. Included are some of the major events which are open to all members of the University community. Through these activities, students can gain valuable experience in formulating long-range plans, in selecting and organizing committees, in creating publicity campaigns, and in cooperative work with other students and faculty members.

This listing is by no means complete, but is intended to be representative of the many semi-independent projects which are carried out on the campus each year. Further information on these and other programs is available at the Student Activities Bureau, TSMa, extension 6277.

BROTHERHOOD WEEK

The National Conference of Christians and Jews has for many years promoted a nation-wide observance of Brotherhood Week. At the University of Minnesota, the Student Council of Religions sponsors such a week during Winter Quarter. Religious organizations, the All-University Congress, the Interfraternity and Panhellenic Councils, the Union Board of Governors, and the Inter-Dormitory Council contribute to the planning and execution of the program which includes convocations, dinners and discussions, art exhibits, and many other activities. Through these events, the committee hopes to increase student awareness of the problems and possibilities of brotherhood.

CAMPUS CARNIVAL

This is the only all-University fund raising project in the Spring Quarter. The organization which directs this traditional program is selected by the Social Service Council. While the sponsorship of the Carnival is open to any major campus organization, Alpha Phi Omega has usually been chosen for this responsibility. The net profits of the Carnival are used traditionally for University scholarships, the support of SPAN, and special student projects.

CAMPUS CHEST DRIVE

This is the only all-University fund drive in the Fall Quarter. Funds raised during this drive are traditionally used for off-campus charitable purposes and are allocated to agencies on the community, national, and international levels. Major campus organizations apply for sponsorship of the drive to the Social Service Council in the Spring Quarter. The Social Service Council selects the sponsor and turns the administration of the project over to the organization.

FRESHMAN CABINET

Thirty-five members of the freshman class are selected by the Civil Service Commission of the All-University Congress to form the Freshman Cabinet. Members of the Cabinet elect their own officers. The High School Visitation Program constitutes the Cabinet's principal project. During spring vacation, approximately 150 University students visit between 75 and 100 high schools throughout the state to bring to high school students a picture of the opportunities for vocational and personal development in higher education.

GREEK WEEK

Annually during Winter Quarter, the Interfraternity and Panhellenic Councils cooperate in presenting a week of activities for the campus community. Through Greek Week, fraternity and sorority members raise thousands of dollars for a community or campus project. They also attempt to inform non-members as to the purposes and goals of fraternities and sororities, and to evaluate their own programs. Features of Greek Week include the Song Fest, the "Tunic Twirl," faculty and Exchange Dinners, conferences on common problems, Small Fry Party (for homeless or handicapped children), Minnesota Olympics, the Variety Show, and the Award Banquet.

HOME COMING

During 1957, the University of Minnesota will celebrate its 49th annual Homecoming. One of the biggest all-University events of the year, Homecoming centers around a Big Ten Conference football game selected by the Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics in consultation with the All-University Congress. A large student committee will coordinate the more than 20 events of Homecoming. Some of the more prominent of these are the Varsity Show, Coronation Ball, bonfire, and Homecoming Dance.

NATIONAL STUDENT ASSOCIATION

The National Student Association (NSA) is a confederation of American colleges and universities representing some 600,000 students. NSA serves as a clearing house for such student programs as the Student Discount Service, the Foreign Travel Program, student government research and the International Student Relations Seminar at Harvard. The legislative body for the organization is the National Student Congress (NSC) which is designed to promote leadership in student government, educational affairs, student welfare, and international affairs. In addition to the NSC, the Minnesota-Dakota Region, of which we are a member school, holds two Regional assemblies each year. The Regional assemblies are workshops on problems relating to one of the four programs listed above.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMS

Under policies set by the Senate Committee on Student Affairs, an orientation program is conducted for all new students by the Office of the Dean of Students and the All-University Congress. More than 500 students and 100 staff members work together in this large joint effort to make new students feel at home. All students may apply for work on such events as The American Brother-Sister Program, Club Groups, New Students' Camps, and Welcome Week.

RELIGION IN LIFE WEEK

This week of religious emphasis is sponsored annually (during Fall Quarter) by the Student Council of Religions. Religious services, speakers and discussions on subjects such as "God and the Scientist" or "Religious Problems in Marriage," special musical programs, feature articles in the Daily, and religious drama highlight the week. A committee composed of representatives from the participating religious foundations plans and executes the program.

STUDENT FORUM

After a period of inactivity, the Student Forum was revived during 1953-54 under the sponsorship of the Educational Affairs Commission of All-University Congress. The Student Forum plans a series of speakers, discussion meetings, and forums on topics of current interest. These programs are usually held during the noon hour and are open to the public.
