In the campus elections held last Spring the student body endorsed a new plan for student government to replace the former All-University Congress. Designated as the Minnesota Student Association, the new student government will be organized and go into effect this Fall Quarter. Until permanent representation and officers can be elected, an interim committee will be carrying on the functions of the MSA, as it has been called.

The new organization will be based on student, staff and faculty participation and cooperation at every level of the structure. It is hoped that this plan will result in additional prestige and influence for student leadership.

(Minnesota Student Association)

The principal body of the MSA is the Student Assembly composed of the representatives of campus organizations with forty or more members. The Assembly will meet at least once a quarter to debate and legislate on issues of major campus interest.

The Student Senate is a smaller group made up of students, staff and faculty representatives which will meet several times a month to handle the day-to-day business of MSA.

The Cabinet will be made up of the appointed heads of standing committees of the MSA which carry out the many program functions of student government in new student orientation, international relations, National Student Association, student welfare, athletic affairs, public relations and the like.

Because this will be the first year for this new form of student government, it represents a unique opportunity for able and interested students to participate at all levels. There is not only the opportunity for personal development and experience in working with others, but also the chance to contribute to the welfare of fellow students and the University by helping to organize and run the new Minnesota Student Association.
