SHORT TERM FILE MEMORANDUM

FCC Conversation with President

9/27/79

1. At the special November 1 Senate meeting there will be a nomination for replacement of Betty Robinett as vice chair of the Senate and TCCA. Her resignation is effective as of that day.
2. The President said small meetings can be arranged between three or four faculty members (FCC) and one to two Regents. He recommended this as good for faculty-regential relations.
3. Legislative Relations Advisory Committee. President Magrath agreed to the same arrangement as last year: Professor Kenneth Keller to be faculty lobbyist to the legislature on one/half release time.
4. President Magrath announced a grant proposal is in preliminary form to the Bush Foundation for support of sabbaticals. Amount requested is \$900,000. Top priority is to fund teaching and research purpose sabbaticals.
