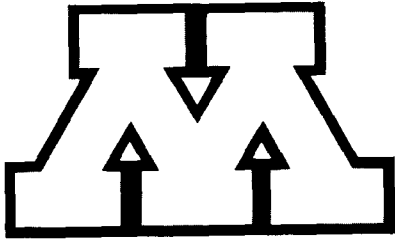

MINNESOTA TEAMS POST WINNING PERCENTAGE IN 1982-83

The nine University of Minnesota women's varsity sports teams compiled a winning 116-52 overall mark in 1982-83 for a winning .690 percentage overall. Minnesota tied for fourth in the Big Ten in conference women's all-sports standings, with the highest finish a second place mark by the gymnastics team. Swimming and softball were third in the conference and basketball and volleyball tied for third. This guide includes all statistics and season summaries for each varsity team.

SEASON SUMMARY: The volleyball team accomplished the one main goal coach Stephanie Schleuder set for the team in the fall: make the Big Ten Championships. The Gophers made it there by finishing second in the conference's West Division with an 8-5 record, and tied for third at the Championships behind national powers Purdue and Northwestern.

Never rated in the nation's top 20, Minnesota dumped three nationally ranked teams (Illinois State, Kentucky and Northwestern) and was the only regular season opponent to take Purdue to five games. They opened the season with a nine-match, two-week road trip that took their Winnebago to Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, Michigan, and all points in between. Three of those first nine matches were against nationally rated teams, and three others were conference matches. To come home with high spirits would be one thing; to come home 7-2, 2-1 in the Big Ten and riding a four match winning streak was quite another.

The Gophers promptly won three of four at home, losing only the five game nail-biter to Purdue before heading south again for the Florida Invitational. They won six straight matches in the tournament, losing only three games in the process, before host Florida State bumped them in the semi-finals. Minnesota beat Iowa on the way home and swamped Indiana at Williams Arena in three for a 6-1 conference record with six Big Ten matches to play.

Three conference losses in a row (at Wisconsin, at home against Ohio State, and in Illinois) looked as if they might cost the Gophers a shot at the Big Ten Tournament, but they won when they had to, beating Northwestern on the road to snap the string. They split their last two conference matches to finish 8-5 and earn a trip to West Lafayette.

The team played 32 matches in 1982, 24 of which were on the road. They were 5-3 at home and had an 18-6 away record. Their second road win, a five game match at Southern Illinois, gave Coach Stephanie Schleuder her 300th career win.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: AIAW All-American Jill Halsted was an honorable mention NCAA All-American in '82. She became Minnesota's all-time kill leader with 1350, and had a season high 26 kills against nationally rated Illinois State. She was the team's kill leader in 18 different matches during the year, and also led the team in matches played (32) and hitting percentage (.369). She was second in total attacks (804), block solo (59), and block assists (62). She was voted team MVP and received the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor.

Junior Martie Larsen was the only Gopher to make the All-Big Ten Tournament team and was also a second team Academic All-American. With a year remaining, she is already fifth on the all-time career kill list (681), and she led the team with 150 total blocks, total attacks (918), and matches played (32). She was second on the squad in kills (390), service aces (44), and total serves (497). Senior Gail Spencer moved into third on the all-time kill list with a career total of 877 and led the team in digs (19). Junior setter Chris Donnell set a school record with only 14 service errors in 450 attempts. She was also second on the team in digs (16) and third in total serves (450).

SEASON SUMMARY: Led by freshman Jody Eder and junior Sue Alm, the cross country team finished in the top 10 of all eight of its meets and only twice failed to place in the top five. Four times Minnesota was second at a meet and came within two points of first place Purdue at the Purdue Invitational. The young Gophers fell from fourth at the Big Ten Championships in 1981 to seventh in '82, and were eighth at the NCAA District IV Championships. Still, Minnesota's composite team record was 40-24 for a .625 winning percentage. Look for the Gophers to be strong next season; all of Coach Mike Lawless' top runners will be back in the fall.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Eder and Alm were the team's top finishers in every meet of the year, and three times immediately followed each other across the tape. In those meets (the Minnesota Quadrangular and the Saluki and Purdue Invitationals) the Gophers had their lowest team scores of the season (42, 52, and 49). Eder finished in the top five four times. She was second at the Minnesota Quad (18:01.2), third at the Saluki Invitational (18:54), fourth at the Tom Jones Invitational (17:37.1), and fifth at the Purdue Invitational (18:00.8). Alm was a top five placer three times, finishing third at the Minnesota Quad (18:08.5), fourth at the Saluki (19:05), and sixth at Purdue (18:01.7).

Team MVP Kris Rens completed the transition from the very short track distances to the longer cross country course in her second year on the team. She finished in the top 10 twice during the year and in the top 12 four times. Minnesota was second in both of Rens' top 10 meets, and her best time (18:13.9) was good for eighth at the Purdue Invitational. She was also eighth at the Minnesota Quad (18:30.1).

SEASON SUMMARY: The gymnastics team had its finest year ever in '83. Minnesota was undefeated in dual meets for the first time ever (7-0) and had its best finish in history at the Big Ten Championships (2nd). The Gophers defeated four nationally ranked teams during the regular season, and were second at the NCAA Central Region Championships.

Led by the senior tandem of Robin Huebner and Karie Ploof, and the freshman "triple threat" of Lianne Morland, Julie Kot and Wendy Dorsey, Minnesota burst into the nation's top ten in January, reached seventh by February, and finished the regular season with the tenth highest team score in the country (180.30).

They opened the season on December 10 by dumping powerful Missouri, then ranked #14 in the nation, at Williams Arena. Next up was the Minnesota Triangular, where Minnesota fell to eventual Big Ten champ Ohio State (174.70 - 171.70) but beat #10 Nebraska (171.70 - 167.25). After losses to #8 Alabama and #12 LSU at Alabama, the Gophers went on a tear, winning six straight dual meets.

The streak began with a showdown at Williams Arena against Utah State. The Aggies were rated #12 coming in; Minnesota was 11th. In the end it was the Gophers (177.45 - 175.00). Winona State fell next (174.65 - 167.25), then Minnesota traveled to California for wins at Cal-Berkeley (177.35 - 177.25) and San Jose State (176.95 - 137.65). Back home, the Gophers drilled Iowa State (180.30 - 168.30), then closed out the regular season in Wisconsin, beating the Badgers 173.60 - 170.00.

At the Big Ten meet, Minnesota's old nemesis, Ohio State, did the Gophers in again (178.00 - 176.05). The Buckeyes would wind up 8th at NCAA Nationals. At the Central Regional Championships, Minnesota was without #2 all-arounder Wendy Dorsey (shoulder injury) and finished second to Nebraska (178.15 - 173.45). Nebraska was 10th at Nationals.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Senior All-American Robin Huebner won her conference-record third floor exercise title at the Big Ten Championships, and also won the Central Regional all-around crown (36.95). She received an at-large invitation to the national championships and finished 24th all-around (35.85). She was 11th on bars (9.3), 17th on the floor (9.1), 36th on beam (8.65), and 39th in the vault (8.8). Twice she reset her own school record in the uneven bars during the season, finally settling for a high of 9.65. The most talented gymnast in Minnesota history holds school records in the all-around (37.15), vault (9.4), bars (9.65), and floor exercise (9.60).

Senior Karie Ploof narrowly missed winning her second consecutive Big Ten balance beam title, tying for second (18.25) with teammate Wendy Dorsey. Dorsey was Minnesota's #2 all-arounder throughout the year. She was the only gymnast at the Big Ten meet to finish in the top six in four events. She was second in the vault (18.45) and beam (18.25), sixth on bars (17.75) and third all-around with her best score of the year (36.30).

Injuries kept freshman Julie Kot and junior Judi Klein from performing at 100% efficiency. An assortment of wrist and knee ailments kept Kot out of the all-around in all but two meets, and ankle and back problems plagued Klein throughout the year. Still, Kot performed well in the vault (9.1 average) and uneven bars (9.55 best), while Klein had a personal best 9.40 on the bars in the team's best meet of the year (180.30 vs. Iowa State).

SEASON SUMMARY: The Minnesota swim team finished the 1983 season with an 11-1 record, one of the finest in Coach Jean Freeman's ten year career with the Gophers. Minnesota had its best finish at the Big Ten Championships since 1978, scoring 605 points for third place. The Gophers broke eighteen Minnesota varsity records at the conference meet and nine swimmers went on to compete at the NCAA National Championships.

Seven consecutive wins were claimed by the Gophers at the start of their season, including a 69-63 win over powerhouse Hawaii during Minnesota's training trip. The team's only loss was at Ohio State where the Buckeyes outswam the Gophers 79-70.

Eight Minnesota swimmers and diver Christy Oman also competed in the Texas All-American Swimming Invitational.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Two Big Ten records fell to Minnesota at the Championships. The 400 yard freestyle relay team of Diane Wallner, Anna Sheehan, Britta Wilk and Denise Johnson broke Indiana's old Big Ten record of 3:28.51 with a time of 3:27.34. Indiana's Big Ten record in the 200 yard freestyle relay also fell to the Minnesota relay team of Wallner, Jo Elsen, Wilk and Sheehan. They won the event in 1:35.19, breaking the old record of 1:35.83.

Denise Johnson won the championship in the 200 yard individual medley in 2:06.15, setting a new Minnesota varsity record. Johnson scored the most points (90) for Minnesota at the Big Ten Championships. Marja Raikkala won the 400 yard individual medley in 4:26.67. Johnson was second in that event with a time of 4:26.69, only .02 of a second behind Raikkala.

Other varsity record breakers include: Diane Wallner--50 freestyle (:23.72-split of relay), 100 freestyle (:51.64); Denise Johnson--200 freestyle (1:53.33, 500 freestyle (5:00.53) and 100 individual medley (1:00.36); Elyce Iwerks--100 backstroke (:59.32-split of relay); Marja Raikkala--1000 freestyle (10:22.50-split of 1650), 1650 freestyle (17:14.23) and 200 butterfly (2:07.49); Nancy Touve--50 backstroke (:31.38); Coleen Carroll--100 breaststroke (1:07.52) and 200 breaststroke (2:25.24). Also 4 of 5 relays set varsity records.

Minnesota's Christy Oman placed twelfth in the one meter diving finals at the Big Ten Championships with 387.30 points and thirteenth in the three meter diving with a score of 396.96.

Nine Minnesota swimmers competed in the NCAA National Championships: Marja Raikkala in the 400 yard individual medley, Denise Johnson in the 200 and 400 yard individual medleys, Diane Wallner in the 50 yard freestyle and Coleen Carroll in the 50 yard breaststroke in which she set a new Minnesota varsity record during the time trials. All five of Minnesota's relay teams competed at the National Championships: the 400 yard freestyle team of Wallner, Anna Sheehan, Marci Olson and Johnson; the 200 yard freestyle team of Wallner, Jo Elsen, Johnson and Sheehan; the 200 medley team of Elyce Iwerks, Nancy Touve, Elsen and Sheehan; the 800 yard freestyle team of Wallner, Johnson, Iwerks and Olson and the 400 yard medley team of Iwerks, Coleen Carroll, Olson and Sheehan. Britta Wilk, who swam on three of the five relay team at the Big Ten Championships, was unable to attend the NCAA National Championships because of an emergency appendectomy.

SEASON SUMMARY: Minnesota had a banner basketball season in 1982-83. The Gophers reset eight team records and thirteen individual marks, including most wins at home in a season (13-1). Aiding the Gophers home court advantage were record crowds which averaged 986.6 overall, including the second largest single game crowd in the conference at home against Ohio State with 2,214 fans. Another team record fell near the end of the year, most points in a single game, when Minnesota defeated Purdue 115-88. The old record was 108 points vs. Manitoba in 1979. The team boasted the highest scoring average (80.2), best field goal (.500) and free throw percentage (.701) in a season and had the highest game assist average (22.2).

Although Coach Ellen Mosher had six freshmen, her team posted 20 wins, with a 20-7 overall record, and placed tied for third in the Big Ten with a 13-5 record. The Gophers opened the year in style by defeating DePaul and Memphis State to win their own Dial Classic, but a highlight of the pre-conference schedule was losing to eventual final-four participant Georgia, 61-65, in the Dial Christmas and New Years Classic in Miami, FL.

Heading into the Big Ten season, Mosher aimed to place in the top three. The Gophers posted five straight conference wins before losing to Northwestern on the road, and then earned a share of the conference lead with Ohio State by defeating the Buckeyes and Indiana Hoosiers at home. However, on the road, Minnesota lost to the two eventual co-Big Ten Champions and with an injury to scoring leader Laura Coenen, lost two more games to end tied for third with Northwestern.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Sophomore Laura Coenen and senior Debbie Hunter were a powerful one-two punch for the Gophers. The two broke 13 individual records as Coenen led the team in scoring (24.2 pts.) and rebounding (9.1) while Hunter averaged 17.7 points, 6.4 assists, and 4.4 steals. Junior Mary Dressen was the only other Gopher in double figures at 11.7 points per game. Coenen was the Big Ten scoring leader every week, and ended seventh in the nation in scoring average, while Hunter and Dressen were nationally ranked in free throw percentage.

Many Gophers hit career highs. Coenen set school records of most points scored in a single game with 41 at Wisconsin, most field goals made (17) and attempted (26) and season records of most points scored, best scoring average, most field goals made and most field goals attempted. Coenen reached the 1,000 career mark and now has 1,016 points in 52 games, fourth on the all-time list.

Hunter ended second on the all-time scoring list with 1,363 career points, and hit a career high 34 points in the home game with Purdue. She also set a single game assist record with 15 against Illinois at home, and set a season record of best free throw percentage (82.9). Hunter holds career marks of best field goal percentage (51.9), best free throw percentage (75.8), most assists (633, 5.4 average) and most steals (413, 3.5 average).

Other career highs were set by senior center Cindy Kuhlman, who scored 20 points against Iowa and ended fifth on the all-time rebounding list, and by junior Barb Meredith who hit 14 points against Iowa. Junior Mary Dressen hit a career high 23 points against Iowa and Memphis State, and freshman Carol Peterka started in 14 games and hit 19 points against Northwestern and 12 rebounds vs. Purdue.

SEASON SUMMARY: The indoor season saw Minnesota gain its first ever NCAA track All-Americans. The Gophers' two-mile relay team entered the national championships with only the 11th fastest qualifying time, but beat the odds and finished third in that event (9:01.96). The team of Kris Rens, Cathy Gorecki, Ann Lundin and Jody Eder was also third at the Big Ten Championships, where they established a new school record (9:00.50). Eder was a two-time indoor All-American, placing fifth in the 1,000 yard run at the national championships with a new school mark (2:32.33).

The Gophers won their own invitational in February, scoring 162 points to outdistance second place Mankato State (145). They had 25 first place performances in their five regular season meets, including nine at the Minnesota Invitational and six each at the Northwest Open and the Iowa State Invitational. Eighteen times during the indoor season the track team either broke or reset a school record. When the smoke had cleared, 13 different event standards had been bettered by a total of 15 athletes.

Minnesota had hoped to improve on last year's finish at the Big Ten Championships, but scored only 15 points and again placed ninth at the indoor conference meet. The Gophers would have to wait for the outdoor Big Ten meet, where they would move up two places and nearly triple their point production.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Jody Eder broke at least one school record in all seven meets of the year, either individually or on a relay team. In all, she had a hand in nine new marks, including the mile (4:46.62), 800 meters (2:12.20), 4 x 440 relay (3:57.21), 1,000 yard run (2:32.30), and two-mile relay (9:00.50). Cathy Gorecki participated in six new records, three individually, including the 400 meter dash (:57.59) and 600 yard run (1:22.32), and three relays, the 4 x 220 yard relay and twice in the two-mile relay.

Fay Farrar was third (48' 1/2") and Becky Fettig sixth (46' 4") in the shot put at the Big Ten Championships. Farrar's 48-footer was another Minnesota school record. The two-mile relay team was third, Cathy Gorecki was fifth in the 600 yard run with a school record 1:22.32, and Jody Eder was seventh (4:49.06) in the mile at the conference meet after establishing yet another school mark (4:46.62) in a prelim heat.

Other school standards were set during the season by Sue Alm in the three-mile (16:29.65), Tracy Chestnut, Sherry Tetu, Judy Harju and Gorecki in the 4 x 220 yard relay (1:44.3), Jane Mattke, Linda Gohman, Eder and Gorecki in the 4 x 440 relay (3:57.21), Shondale Lewis in the 60 meters (:08.00), Stacy Bant in the 880 (2:13.44), and Sue Alm in the two mile (10:30.8).

SEASON SUMMARY: The indoor season brought All-Americans to Minnesota; the outdoor season brought Big Ten champions. Loreena Anderson and Becky Fettig became the first Gophers since 1980 to win individual event championships. Anderson won the javelin with a school record toss (159' 1") and was fourth in the discus, while Fettig won the discus with another school record (166' 1") and was fourth in the shot put. Only one other thrower in the conference placed in two different events at the Big Ten Championships.

Track MVP Jody Eder finished second in the Big Ten in the 1500 meters and also competed in that event at NCAA Nationals, and Cathy Gorecki was fourth in the 400 meter hurdles at the conference meet. And, Julie Rask was fifth in the shot put, giving the Gophers 44 total points and seventh place, their best Big Ten finish since 1978.

Minnesota's biggest enemy early in the season was not the competition, but the weather. Snowstorms cancelled two meets in April, the Iowa State Invitational and the Minnesota Five-Way at Bierman Field Track.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: The Gophers continued their assault on the record books in the outdoor season; five event marks would be broken or reset 15 different times. Anderson led the way, breaking the javelin and discus marks three times each. Her new javelin mark was over 30 feet farther than the old record set just last year. And although Anderson broke the discus standard three times during the year, that school record belongs to Becky Fettig, whose 166' 1" toss was nearly 23 feet longer than the old mark at the start of the season. Fettig also set a new record in the shot put (47' 1"), good for fourth at the Big Ten Championships.

Cathy Gorecki broke the school record in the 400 meter hurdles three times, settling for a career best 1:00.09 in the Meet of Champions at Rice University. Four times during the year she won that event, was second once, and fourth at the conference meet.

Eva Ljungstrom set a new record in the 10,000 meters (35:18.54) at the Big Ten Championships, and Ann Lundin, Stacy Bant, Kris Rens and Jody Eder reset the 4 x 800 meter relay mark twice during the year. Their last time was the fastest, as they finished second at the TAC National Championships (8:46.30).

SEASON SUMMARY: Under first year mentor Anne Zahn, the Gophers turned around from a last place finish in the Big Ten in 1982 to a fourth place mark in 1983. In addition, the same team members from 1981-82 captured first place in three out of five fall tournaments this year, after not winning a single tournament the previous year. The fall season opened at the Indiana Invitational and the Gophers shocked the eleven team field by placing first with a 309-314-623. The following weekend, Minnesota placed second to Ohio State at the Buckeye's 22-team tournament which included all the Big Ten opponents. In the spring season, the Gophers placed second at the 22 team Penn State Invitational and were fourth at the Big Ten Championship.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Junior Nancy Harris qualified for national competition for the second year in a row. She represented the Gophers at the NCAA tournament after being ranked tenth nationally of all NCAA golfers on her differential over par for all rounds in the regular season. Overall, Harris averaged 76.6 over 28 rounds of play and was medalist at the Indiana Invitational, and Iowa State Invitational and runner up at the Lady Northern (Ohio State), Northern Iowa Invitational, and Penn State Lady Lion Invitational. Harris finished fifth individually at the Big Ten Championship and 54th of 102 golfers at the NCAA Nationals.

Junior Jocelyn Smith also posted strong scores, averaging 78.5 over 24 rounds of play. Smith was eighth at the Big Ten Championship and third at the Indiana and Iowa State Invitationals.

SEASON SUMMARY: The Gophers had a successful season, despite the snowy weather during the Big Ten schedule. Minnesota posted a 32-18 overall mark, and Coach Linda Wells reached her 200th career victory in the last game of the season (now 200-120-1). At home, Minnesota was nearly unbeatable with a 22-1 record, the only loss being an 18-inning marathon with Northwestern.

The Gophers opened with three straight wins at the New Mexico Invitational and followed that tournament with a road trip over spring break to California. There Minnesota defeated the then #1 ranked team, Cal-Poly-Pomona 2-0 in nine innings of play. In the Big Ten season, Minnesota opened with a four series sweep of Michigan at home, but then lost four straight to champion Indiana on the road. The critical weekend came at Michigan State when Minnesota lost two games, and was snowed out of the other two. The Gophers won 3 of 4 against Northwestern, all four over Ohio State and split 2 for 2 with Iowa. In the final Big Ten standings, Minnesota led the conference in team fielding at .969, and was third in team batting and pitching.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Pitching seniors Lynn Schlichting and Gretchen Larson did the job on the mound and rewrote several school records this season. Schlichting broke the career strikeout record in her last home appearance and holds the school career strikeout (182), innings pitched (433 2/3) and games' pitched (74) records. She also is the career wins pitching leader (36-22) and set a season ERA record of .604 overall this year.

Larson became the Gophers' career batting leader with 495 at bats in 170 games and is the new career hit leader with 159. Freshman Judy Oliverius and junior Barb Solberg tied the season games played mark, as each played in all 50 contests.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS---The Minnesota tennis team had one of its finest seasons ever, finishing the year with a 21-13 overall record and a 7-8 mark in Big Ten play. After finishing ninth at the 1982 Big Ten Championship, Minnesota was seeded fourth at this year's competition because of an impressive 21-10 overall record and 7-5 conference slate during the regular season. But the Gophers lost their three matches at the Championship and ended the year in tenth place at the conference meet.

Minnesota defeated Wisconsin twice during the regular season (6-3 in both matches), but lost a close 5-4 decision to the Badgers in the first round of conference championship play. The Gophers shut out a Big Ten opponent for the first time ever during the regular season, beating Ohio State 9-0. The Buckeyes would later finish seventh at the conference tournament. Minnesota also beat Michigan earlier in the year. The Wolverines finished fifth in the conference.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS---Minnesota's No. 1 singles player, Kathleen Heckman, was named to the All-Big Ten singles team, winning two of her three matches at the Big Ten Championship, and finishing her season with a 33-8 singles mark. Of those 41 matches, only four went to three sets, and she had a ten-match winning streak near season's end.

The No.1 doubles team of Heckman and Claudia Brisk was also named All-Big Ten, and competed at the NCAA National Championships. At Nationals the duo advanced to the second round of play and ended the year with a 35-6 doubles record. They set numerous school records, including: most season doubles wins by a team (35), longest doubles winning streak (12), and tied the mark for most season doubles wins by an individual (36). Although they have played together for only one season, they have the sixth most career doubles wins as a team, and the third highest season doubles percentage in Gopher history.

Freshman Kelly Coleman had the second best singles record, finishing the year 24-11. She also teamed with junior Kathy Bjornson for the team's second best doubles record (16-15). Another freshman, Lisa Martin, had the Gophers' third best singles mark (18-13) at the No. 4 and 5 singles spot.

Junior co-captain Cathie Wadden racked up the third most doubles victories this season (22) in the No. 3 doubles spot. Kathy Bjornson also had 22 wins in the No. 2 doubles spot. Wadden and Bjornson also have the second most doubles wins by a team in Minnesota history (31).

HEAD COACH RON KORPI

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS---Coach Ron Korpi's crew team served notice in '82-83 that it is a power to be reckoned with on the national scene. Led by a host of experienced upperclassmen and a corps of talented freshmen, Minnesota's Varsity 4 squad finished fourth at the National Collegiate Rowing Championships and the Freshman 8 team was fifth in national competition.

The team of Stacy Godwin, Yvonne Goff, Chris Arndt, Wendy Godwin (stroke), and Debbie Woessner (coxswain) fell to three eastern powers in the Varsity 4, but topped archrival Wisconsin by nine seconds at nationals. Their fourth place finish allowed them to qualify two rowers for the National Sports Festival this June. Goff, a senior, and Arndt, a junior, will represent Minnesota at Colorado Springs, Colorado.

The most exciting race at the National Championships was the Freshman 8, where just over three seconds separated the top five boats. Minnesota, crewed by Laura Wierzbicki, Dorothy Knabe, Betsy Lowe, Anne Maloney, Nanette Wesenberg, Cathy Dahlstrom, Diane Kennedy, Erica Brunik and Megan Piche, was fifth (5:23.50).

The Gophers consistently challenged for the title in some of the largest and most prestigious regattas in the country. Their first hurdle of the season came last fall at the 18th annual Head of the Charles Regatta in Boston. With over 700 boats competing in 18 events, it is the largest single day regatta of its kind in the world. Minnesota promptly captured the Club 8 competition, outracing 27 other teams to the finish in a new course record time (17:26). The old course record for the three-mile event (18:26.8) was set by Minnesota the year before. The Gophers were also 16th in the extremely tough Championship 4 competition. The top five teams in that event have been competing internationally in recent years and included the U.S. National Team (1st) and the Canadian Nationals (2nd).

In the spring, Minnesota spent two weeks in Texas during March in preparation for the spring schedule. The Gophers returned ready to dominate, and did just that at a triangular against Purdue and Notre Dame. The Varsity 8 team swamped highly regarded Purdue by 11 seconds and beat Notre Dame by an astounding 49 seconds. Meanwhile, the Gophers' Novice 8 team was nearly as successful, losing to the Boilermakers by an eyelash (1.2 seconds) and pounding the Irish (54 seconds).

The Midwest Sprints at Lake Wingra in Madison, Wisconsin were up next, and Minnesota had high hopes of dumping number one rated Wisconsin in the Varsity 8. It was not to be, however, as the Gophers got off to a windblown start, and were last from the starting gun. They struggled back to finish second behind the Badgers, 17 seconds off the pace. The Novice 8 team also was second at the Sprints, trailing only powerful Wisconsin by 10 seconds.

In May, Minnesota traveled to Philadelphia for the 45th annual Dad Vail Regatta. The Gophers' Novice 8 squad emerged as champion in its 22-team event, beating second place Simmons to the finish by eight seconds. In the Varsity 8 race, 24 teams competed for the win, but in the end it was Georgetown by a nose, three seconds ahead of Minnesota.
