

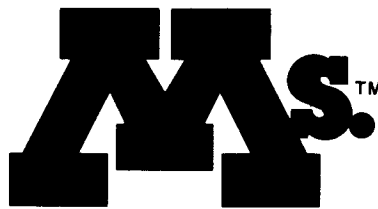

SOFTBALL TEAM WINS MINNESOTA'S FIRST OFFICIAL BIG TEN TITLE

The Minnesota softball team tied for first in the Big Ten and won the university's first "official" Big Ten title since the conference sanctioned women's athletics in 1981. That title, and the department's ten year anniversary celebration, headlined a successful 1985-86 season. In addition to the softball team's first-place finish, three teams -- swimming, gymnastics and golf -- placed second in the conference. Minnesota hosted the 1986 Big Ten Gymnastics Championship, and the team came within .45 of winning the title while two Gophers won individual titles. Individually, Jody Eder (cross country), Diane Wallner (swimming) and Barb Drake (softball) earned All-American honors, and seventeen athletes in eight sports were named to All-Big Ten teams.

This guide contains summaries of the accomplishments of all the teams, as well as the year-end statistics.

SEASON SUMMARY: Led by two All-Big Ten players, middle hitters Pam Miller and Andrea Gonzalez, the Minnesota volleyball team came back from an 0-2 Big Ten start and finished 11-7, good for fourth place in the conference. With five returning starters and a solid group of substitutes, coach Stephanie Schleuder had a team with depth and that kept the team competitive all season. The conference season was highlighted by an eight-match winning streak which kept the Gophers in contention for a second place conference finish until the end of the year.

The Gophers opened the 1985 campaign with six straight road wins, including a first place finish at the Rhode Island Classic. At the team's first match against the University of Toledo, freshman Andrea Gonzalez established herself as a powerhouse player when she broke Minnesota's individual records of most kills per match and most total attacks in a match. After that strong start, an ankle injury to Pam Miller hampered the team and they placed fourth in the Southern Illinois Tournament. However, the Gophers rebounded to defeat Drake in their home opener.

The Big Ten schedule was changed this year to a double-round robin, home-and-away format, and the first true conference champion was determined based on season play. The Gophers' conference season was highlighted by an eight-match winning streak that started in a come-from-behind, five-game victory over Indiana on October 12 in Williams Arena. The winning streak also included road victories over Iowa and Northwestern for the first time since 1982, but the streak was snapped in a five-game loss at Ohio State on November 9. That loss, and a home loss to Northwestern, put the chance for a second place conference finish and possible advancement to the NCAA Midwest Regionals out of reach for the Gophers.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: The middle hitters dominated the Gophers statistically, and all members of the squad had good seasons. Most of the starters moved onto the career best lists in various categories.

Co-captain Pam Miller was named to the all-conference second team, and she moved into fourth on Minnesota's career kill list with 445 kills in 1985 (1002 total). Blocking was her strongest point, though, and Miller won the conference blocking title with 118 total blocks and a 1.6 per game average. In addition, Miller broke her own block assists record with 124 in 1985 and moved into first place on the career block assists list with 311 in three seasons. She also moved into third on the all-time block solos list and second on the total blocks list. Along with leading the Big Ten in blocking, Miller finished fourth in kills per game (3.99) and ninth in hitting efficiency (.249).

All-Big Ten first team selection Andrea Gonzalez came to Minnesota from Argentina and had an outstanding freshman season. She broke Minnesota's single-season kill record of 481 and led the team with 522 kills on the season, placing her in tenth place on the career kill list. She led the Gophers with a 4.3 kills per game average and was ranked among the top twenty hitters in the nation. In the Big Ten, Gonzalez finished fourth in kill percentage (.291), third in kills per game (4.25), eighth in blocks per game (68 total, .94 average), and third in service aces (34). In addition, Gonzalez was the only player in the Big Ten to be named Player of the Week twice, on October 29 and November 12. Gonzalez was also named to the all-tournament team at the Southern Illinois Tournament.

Junior outside hitter Karyn Daline also had a fine season. She moved into seventh place on the career kill list with 243 in 1985 (841 in three years) and set a new fewest service errors record of 11 errors in 491 attempts. For the second year, Daline led the team in digs with 246 and was again a leading defensive player. Junior Jennie Collings was the team's primary setter for the second year, finishing with 960 assists and a 7.87 per game average, good for ninth in the Big Ten. Collings was also a strong blocker, and she moved into fourth on the all-time total blocks list.

Junior Julie Binder returned from last season's reconstructive knee surgery and split court play with sophomore Patty Ryan. Binder had the best service ace average (.49) and Ryan was fourth on the team in kills (173). The team's only senior, co-captain Beth Hiner, finished her career by moving up on many career lists, including total blocks, fewest service errors, and best service percentage.

CROSS COUNTRY

Overall composite record: 33-36

Head Coach: Gary Wilson

SEASON SUMMARY: Head coach Gary Wilson began his first season at Minnesota with a difficult job ahead of him. Returning only three letterwinners from the 1984 team, Wilson was forced to depend upon inexperienced runners if he wanted to make his premiere Division I season a coaching success. While Wilson didn't surprise anyone with an outstanding team, he certainly didn't disappoint anyone either.

Led by senior All-American Jody Eder, the Gophers helped Wilson make his debut a moderate success. Eder earned cross country All-American honors for the second straight year in leading the Gophers to a ninth-place team finish at the Big Ten Championships. Along with Eder's consistent performance, junior Sue Schroeder and freshman Eileen Donaghy also performed well in helping Minnesota place tenth among 23 teams at the NCAA District IV Championships. While Wilson was disappointed with the teams' performance at the Big Ten meet, he felt they "bounced back well" at the District IV championships and ended his debut season on an overall good note.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Once again, Jody Eder was the person to watch for the Gopher harriers, closing out her college career with a super senior season. Beginning with the season's first meet, the Husker Invitational, Eder performed well and consistently placed in the top ten of every meet.

Eder began the season with an eighth place finish at the Husker Invitational with a time of 18:27.7, and from there she continued to improve. Season highlights included a first-place finish at the South Dakota State Invitational (17:22.7), a second-place finish at the Minnesota Invitational (17:55.1) and two fourth place finishes -- one at the Big Ten Championships and the other at the NCAA District IV Championships. Eder's final collegiate performance was in the NCAA National Championships in Milwaukee, Wisc. Eder placed 21st and earned All-American honors for the second year in a row.

While Eder was the best Gopher harrier on the year, Wilson did receive some strong performances from several different athletes. Freshmen Eileen Donaghy and Eileen Schaller, along with junior Sue Schroeder all gave Wilson some much-needed depth. Donaghy and Schaller both came on strong at the end of the year, placing fourth and tenth, respectively, at the South Dakota Invite. Schroeder, on the other hand, began strong as she placed 17th, 31st and 23rd in the Gophers' first three meets. Other strong performers included Natalie Burke, Patty Burns and Patti Walsh.

SEASON SUMMARY: It was obvious this year that the Gophers lost more when Laura Coenen left than the all-time scoring leader's 25.3 ppg and 12.2 rebound averages in 1984-85. Coenen was the team's can-do-all leader and this year's squad never could get running on all five cylinders, a situation Coach Hanson knew would be needed if the team was to win.

Despite strong performances from front-line players Molly Tadich and Carol Peterka and improved guard play, the Gophers dropped from third to ninth in the Big Ten with a 4-14 overall record. In addition, the team set a new school record by going winless all year on the road, 0-12 away and 0-2 at neutral sites. It was the first time since 1973-74 (1-6 road record) that the Gophers failed to win at least one game on the road.

The statistics point to a lack of offensive production. Opponents outscored Minnesota 72.9 to 67.9 overall and in the Big Ten the margin was 6.9 ppg (72.8 to 65.9). Rebounding was, once again, a Minnesota strength. The Gophers outrebounded opponents 42.0 to 39.3 in league play and by 2.2 rebounds overall, but shot poorly from the field, averaging around .42 percent in the Big Ten and overall.

The Gophers opened the year at the Penn State Lady Lion Classic, and lost their first game by three points to Western Michigan and then lost to Providence. That was followed by home victories over San Diego State and New Mexico before being overwhelmed by Kansas State in the Dial Classic Championship. Three straight road losses to Big Eight opponents preceded the Big Ten season.

Minnesota opened the Big Ten at home with a loss to Illinois, but rebounded to defeat Purdue on Sunday. The next Friday, the Gophers led at halftime, and nearly upset Iowa at home with the final 63-66. But then it was back on the road and Minnesota lost to Michigan for the first time ever at Ann Arbor, and also dropped a close game to Michigan State when a late game rally fell short 60-62 at East Lansing. Returning to the friendly confines of Williams Arena, Minnesota downed Wisconsin and Northwestern in what would prove to be the teams' final back-to-back victories.

The Gophers won only one more game, at home against Michigan State. Michigan defeated Minnesota for the first time ever at Williams Arena, and the Gophers ended the year with a seven game losing streak, which also included the first loss ever to Purdue at West Lafayette. The ninth place conference finish was the Gophers' worst finish in the four years of double round-robin play, and the team's 8-20 mark was only the second losing season ever for Head Coach Ellen Hanson.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Junior 6-2 forward/center Molly Tadich had an outstanding season despite the team's record. She scored the third most points ever in a season with 511, behind Laura Coenen's 581 in 1982-83 and 708 in 1984-85. Tadich connected on 210 field goals (4th on season list) of 484 attempts (2nd on season list). She led the Gophers with an 18.3 ppg average and 11.7 rebounding average and also led the Big Ten in rebounding (11.1) and blocked shots (1.9). Tadich's performance earned her recognition on the All-Big Ten second team for the second straight year.

After three seasons, Tadich is ranked sixth in career scoring with 1,237 points and third in career rebounding with 904 caroms. She hit in double figures in 24 of 28 games this year including highs of 27 points at home against Iowa and 30 points, hitting 15 of 17 shots from the field, in the season finale at Illinois. She also rebounded in double figures in 21 of 28 games.

The other key offensive and defensive performer was senior tri-captain Carol Peterka, who ended her career playing in all 110 games and starting 96. The 6-0 forward ranks third on the all-time scoring list with 1,441 points and is also fourth in rebounding with 744 caroms. Peterka is also ranked third in field goals made (595) and fourth in field goals attempted (1286).

Peterka was second on this year's team averaging 14.3 ppg and 7.9 rebounds overall and for her career averaged 13.1 ppg and 6.8 rebounds as well as 2.4 assists and 1.3 steals. For the third straight year, she was named the team's Defensive Player of the Year and she also received honorable mention All-Big Ten.

In the guard court, 5-10 junior Cindy Phillips made substantial improvements in her play, averaging 10.3 ppg, 4.3 assists and 1.7 steals during the Big Ten season. Overall, she averaged 8.5 ppg and scored in double figures in 12 games, hitting a career high of 17 points twice, against Purdue Jan. 7 and Indiana Feb. 2. She was named the Gophers Most Improved Player. The other starting guard was senior tri-captain Lisa Hoelscher who completed her career starting in all 28 games this season and averaging a season high of 7.4 ppg and 2.6 assists. She scored in double figures in 11 games with a season high of 15 points against Drake Dec. 17. A durable player, Hoelscher appeared in 100 of a possible 110 games during her career.

Two other centers saw considerable playing time -- 6-4 sophomore Diane Kinney and 6-0 sophomore Susie Piram. Neither player had scored in double figures prior to this season. Kinney quickly asserted herself with 14 and 16 points the first weekend of play and ended the year averaging 9.1 ppg and 6.9 rebounds overall. Kinney started in 23 of 28 games, scoring in double figures 11 times, with a career high of 18 pts March 2 against Ohio State. Piram averaged 17.9 minutes off the bench and started four games in the middle of the Big Ten season, while appearing in 27 of 28 games. She averaged 5.1 points and rebounds in the Big Ten and scored a career high of 14 points Feb. 7 at Iowa and grabbed a career high of 14 rebounds Feb. 14 against Michigan State.

SEASON SUMMARY: The gymnastics team started the season with two goals: win the Big Ten Championship at home and qualify as a team for regional competition. Three months, five team records, six individual records, and numerous personal best scores later, the Gophers nearly achieved their team goals, but individual goals were achieved far beyond coach Katalin Deli's dreams.

All seven members of the 1984-85 team returned and four newcomers gave the team depth in all events. The vault and floor exercise were the team's strongest events and the balance beam and uneven bars showed substantial improvement. Minnesota again made its mark nationally as the team was ranked among the top twenty for most of the season.

The team's 180.92 regional qualifying score was nearly one point better than last year's mark, but the team finished seventh in the always strong Midwest Region. Although the team did not qualify for regionals, individual gymnasts advanced to post-season competition.

The 1986 season opened with wins over Wisconsin-Oshkosh and Wisconsin-Stout. Then the Gophers traveled south and competed against nationally-ranked Florida and Georgia along with Midwest Region foe Nebraska. At the Florida Invitational, the team set a new vaulting record with a 46.50 score, and they came within .05 of breaking the school balance beam record with a 45.40 score at the Georgia Invitational.

In February, the Gophers went over the 180 plateau with a 180.60-173.85 win over Wisconsin. School records fell at the Gopher Invitational when the Gophers defeated Winona State 182.05-163.40, even though all-arounder Candi Doell was injured during warm-ups and could not compete. Even emergency substitutions didn't deter the team from success as they set new school records for team score (182.05) and floor exercise (47.00).

The ever-improving Gophers traveled west in March and competed at the UCLA and BYU invitationals. At Brigham Young the Gophers nearly upset Utah State, 181.20-180.90, and the team's consistency and strong performances "surprised a lot of people," according to coach Deli.

Minnesota hosted the 1986 Big Ten Championship on March 21 and 22 and led Ohio State through five rounds before OSU vaulted to victory. The 181.80-181.35 results are the narrowest margin of victory in the five years of official Big Ten competition and one of the closest finishes ever. Minnesota's challenge to unseat Ohio State was successful at the individual level: junior Shelley Brown unseated two-time all-around champion Mary Olsen and set a new conference all-around record (37.35). All three of the Gopher all-arounders placed in the top six, and five gymnasts competed in the individual event finals.

The regular season ended on March 29 against Iowa State with the Gophers cruising to a 181.00-149.20 victory. Although the team was out of the running for regional competition, Kaiser's 36.95 all-around score guaranteed her an individual berth at regionals. She joined Brown, whose 36.92 qualifying score gave her the second seed. At the regional championships on April 5, Brown placed seventh all-around and tied for first on the balance beam. The season concluded with Brown's competition at the NCAA National Championships April 18-19. She was seeded sixth among ten individual competitors and finished 44th all-around.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Junior Shelley Brown was the surprise gymnast of 1986. She entered the season as the number four all-arounder and ended as the team's leading gymnast. Brown won the Big Ten all-around title and set new school records on the vault (9.60), balance beam (9.75) and all-around (37.45). She placed first on the balance beam and seventh all-around at the NCAA Midwest Regionals. In addition to setting a new Big Ten all-around record (37.35), Brown was the only gymnast in the conference to compete in all four individual finals. She placed second on the vault, third on the balance beam, fourth on the floor exercise, and sixth on the uneven bars.

Although slowed by injuries early in the season, junior Laurie Kaiser rebounded from an injury-filled sophomore season and regained the championship form of her freshman season. She won the conference floor exercise title for the second time, and she placed third on the uneven bars. In addition, her fourth-place all-around finish (36.50) was her best conference finish in three years.

Other Gophers also had strong seasons. Sophomore Mary Jo Mastel tied the school floor exercise record (9.60) and set a new Williams Arena record in February against Winona State. She finished fourth in the floor exercise finals at the conference meet and was named to the All-Big Ten team. Junior Linda Bednar improved her personal best vaulting score from 9.15 to 9.35 and competed in the vaulting finals at the conference championship. Bednar was one of five Gophers to average over 9.00 on the vault: Brown, Kaiser, Wendy Dorsey, and Candi Doell also averaged scores above 9.00. Doell started the season strong with a new personal best score on the vault (9.45), but a heel injury in February hampered her performances for the rest of the season.

Senior Wendy Dorsey concluded her career with a sixth-place all-around finish at the Big Ten Championships and competition in three individual events. A consistent performer throughout her career, she set a new career best on the balance beam (9.45) at the BYU Invitational and won the all-around (36.35) in a dual meet against Wisconsin.

SEASON SUMMARY: It was another great year for the women's swimming and diving team. Along with a winning season, they maintained their strength in the Big Ten Conference as they placed second for the third straight year. For the first time ever, a Gopher swimmer received All-American honors in an individual event at the NCAA Championships. In addition, Gopher swimmers re-set six individual and two relay records and one Cooke Hall Pool record.

The swimming and diving team started the season by winning their first four dual meets and a relay competition. Ending the season with a 6-3 dual meet record, the Gophers were 3-2 in the Big Ten Conference.

In their first Big Ten meet of the season, the Gophers avenged last year's one-point loss to Wisconsin, trouncing them by 29 points. Minnesota also defeated Northwestern twice in dual meets -- once in Florida during the winter training trip, and then at home a few weeks later. The Gophers' conference nemesis, Ohio State, defeated them at Ohio State, as did Iowa in the Hawkeye pool.

In non-conference action, Minnesota out-scored Hamline, Northern Michigan and Iowa State. Nebraska defeated the Gophers for the first time ever in a meet that went down to the last event to determine the winner. The Minnesota-Nebraska series record now stands a 2-1.

At the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships, Minnesota tied for second with Iowa, with Ohio State winning their fourth consecutive championship. The Gophers set three individual and one relay team Big Ten records, and qualified seven swimmers for the NCAA championships.

At the NCAA Division I Championships, the Gophers had their best finish ever as they scored 46 points and placed 21st. All-American honors were earned by one Gopher, with five Minnesotans earning 14 All-American Honorable Mention honors.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: For the second time in her thirteen years as head swimming coach, Jean Freeman was voted the Big Ten Coach of the Year by her fellow conference coaches. She was also honored in 1984.

Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner set individual Big Ten records in the 50 (:22.97) and 100 (:50.69) yard freestyles. Her 50 yard freestyle time of :22.97 proved to be the number one seed time in the NCAA championships, where she earned All-American honors in the 50 yard freestyle by finishing seventh with a time of :23.45. Wallner earned All-American Honorable Mention honors in the 100 yard free (16th-:51.46), 400 (13th-3:26.83) and 200 (11th-1:34.78) freestyle relays, and the 200 yard medley relay (1:47.01). She ended the season ranked third nationally in the 50 yard freestyle.

Also at the NCAA Championships, junior Sue Roell earned All-American Honorable Mention honors with her 10th place finish in the 100 yard breaststroke (1:04.34). Roell also received All-American Honorable Mention honors for her part in the 200 and 400 free relays and the 200 medley relay. Freshman Ruth Gunard received All-American Honorable Mention honors in the 200 and 400 free relays and the 200 medley, with freshman Amy Volna receiving them in the 200 and 400 free relays and senior tri-captain Jo Elsen in the 200 medley relay.

Wallner and Roell both set three individual and two relay team varsity records this season. Wallner holds the 50 free (:22.97), 100 free (:50.69) and 50 backstroke (:27.04) records, with Roell holding the 50 (29.88), 100 (1:04.18) and 200 (2:23.31) breaststroke records. Roell's 200 breaststroke record is also a new Cooke Hall Pool record. Both were members of the 200 free (1:34.06) and 200 medley relay (1:45.51) teams that set varsity records. Elsen and Gunard were also on both record-setting relay teams. The 50 and 100 free records and the 200 free relay records were set at Big Ten's and are new conference records.

Minnesota's divers, Maureen Lewis and Jennifer Carpenter, both scored at the Big Ten Championships and qualified for the NCAA Zone Diving meet. Chris Gentz returned to the Gophers this year as the head diving coach for both the women's and men's teams. Gentz was the Gold Medal winner in three meter diving at the 1981 AIAW National Championships.

SEASON SUMMARY: Like the new surface which covered the Cooke Fieldhouse track this winter, Gary Wilson's squad covered a lot of ground in setting a solid foundation on the way to rebuilding the Gopher track and field program. Minnesota, as a team, suffered from a noted lack of depth and placed ninth in the Big Ten Championships for the seventh straight year. The Gophers tallied 12 points in that meet on fourth-place finishes by Jo Arvesen in the pentathlon and Lisa Johnson in the 880-yard run. Fifth-place finishes by Steph Stoltman in the 60-yard hurdles and Jody Eder in the mile run finished off the Gopher scoring.

While the Gophers didn't fare too well at the Big Ten meet, they did manage some stellar team performances in other indoor meets. Minnesota placed third as a team at the Golden Shoe Invitational in Madison, Wisc., and won their own Minnesota Invitational at the Cooke Fieldhouse on February 1. The Gophers charted 171.5 points to easily eclipse second-place Drake at 94 points.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Performing in the newly-remodeled fieldhouse was a definite plus for Minnesota and especially senior Jody Eder. Eder set a fieldhouse record in the 1000-meters at the Invitational with a time of 2:48.6. She also established a meet, fieldhouse, and Gopher varsity record in the 3000-meters with a time of 9:32 at the Northwest Open. Eder's final indoor performance came in the Big Ten Indoor Championships where she finished fifth in the mile run with a time of 4:50.66.

Under a new coach, Jo Arvesen took up a new event -- the pentathlon, and she proved to be very successful at it. Arvesen, in her training for the five event competition, set Gopher season bests in the long jump (17'6"), triple jump (35' 1-2"), and pentathlon itself. Arvesen amassed 3,186 points on her way to a fourth place finish in the pentathlon at the Big Ten Indoor Championships.

Sophomore Lisa Johnson was another Gopher who had many individual highlights during the indoor season. Johnson set season-best marks in three separate events -- the 500 meters (1:17.5), 800 meters (2:16.7), and 880-yard run (2:12.94). Johnson's time in the 880 placed her fourth among the competition in the Big Ten Indoor Championships.

Stacy Bant and Steph Stoltman also performed admirably for Minnesota. Bant set a new fieldhouse record in the 5000 meters at the Minnesota Invitational with a time of 17:17.5. Stoltman proved to be the Gophers' best hurdler, winning or placing in every indoor meet.

SEASON SUMMARY: "This year has been one of the most rewarding ones of my career, but I'd never want to go through it again," said Gary Wilson after a rookie year at Minnesota which featured several unexpected peaks and valleys. After reviewing the Gophers' outdoor season, one can see why Wilson feels this way.

The Gopher outdoor season started out on a high note. Performing in the warm weather at Houston, Texas, Minnesota opened its season with a fourth-place finish in the Bayou Classic at Rice University. Although no Gophers placed first, six Gophers placed in the top five to help Minnesota tally 43 points and a fourth place finish.

Once back in the colder climates of the Midwest, the Gophers continued to perform well. A pair of second-place team finishes, including one at their own invitational on April 5 and another in the Macalester Open April 26, boosted the Gophers' confidence and morale. Unfortunately, that morale received a severe setback at the April 19 Wisconsin Open when hurdler Steph Stoltman and sprinter Lisa Walton suffered leg injuries. Both athletes would be out five weeks before competing again.

The Gophers went to the Big Ten Outdoor Championships shooting for personal records in all events. In their attempts to do so, Minnesota athletes combined for 16 points and a ninth-place team finish, which, for the first time all season, was what Wilson expected.

INDIVIDUAL HONORS: Despite nagging injuries to most every Gopher athlete, several still managed stellar performances throughout the season. In their final year of competition, seniors Jody Eder and Stacy Bant proved to be the Gophers' major threats in the distance races. Eder placed in the top five at every meet except one. Her best times came at the Texas Relays and Drake Invitational. Eder placed fourth in the 1500 meters at Texas with a time of 4:23.6 and then, a week later, ran a season-best 9:39.67 in the 3000 meters at Drake. Bant, unlike Eder, saved her best for last. On her way to a fourth-place finish in the 5000 meters at the Big Ten meet, Bant set a personal record by almost 20 seconds with a time of 16:24.09.

Jo Arvesen and Steph Stoltman also performed admirably for Minnesota. Arvesen, in her first year as a heptathlete, took fifth place in that event at the Big Ten meet. Her efforts earned her the MVP award for Gopher field event performers. Stoltman's efforts earned her the Gophers MVP track award. After battling back from shoulder and foot injuries, Stoltman managed to place fourth in the 400 meter hurdles at the Big Ten championships.

Shirley Molitor was perhaps the Gophers' unsung hero. Molitor finished her season off with a brilliant fourth-place performance in the shot put at the Big Ten meet. In training for the Big Ten Championships, Molitor won the shot at the Wisconsin Open and May 10 Minnesota Invitational. She also placed in the top five at five other meets.

SEASON SUMMARY The Minnesota women's golf team enjoyed a very successful year, winning two tournaments and finishing second in the Big Ten Conference. The team competed in 11 tournaments in 1985-86, finishing in the top five slots in seven of their outings, and the Gophers were among the top ten finishers in all but one of their competitions.

The fall season started out strong, with the team winning their first two tournaments of the year, the Gopher Fall Invitational and the Lady Badger Invitational. In winning their home tournament, the Gophers played the lowest 54-hole tournament in Minnesota history -- 902. The previous low was 916, shot at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational in April, 1985. The team also tied the lowest 18-hole round score in Gopher history of 298, not once, but twice -- at the Gopher Fall Invitational and the Beacon Woods Invitational.

Also at the Beacon Woods Invitational, Gopher freshman Kate Hughes came within one stroke of tying the all-time low 54-hole individual score when she shot a 222. The record of 221 is held by Kathy Williams, set in the fall of 1980. In the last three tournaments of the fall season, the golfers averaged 308 strokes, ending the fall with stroke average of 310.61. At the Gopher Fall Invitational, Minnesota had eight golfers finish in the top 10 slots, including the first five places.

The long Minnesota winters tend to rust the competitors a bit, and it took until the third tourney of the spring season to bring the Gophers back to their fall shape. They finished second at the Iowa Invitational with a 305 stroke average, and placed third at the Lady Buckeye Invitational on a tough course that was also the site of the 1986 NCAA Women's National Golf Championship.

The Big Ten Women's Golf Championship was held on the unforgiving University of Michigan Golf Course, where the team finished in second place behind the top ten nationally ranked Indiana Hoosiers. The second place finish was quite an improvement over last year's sixth place finish, and ties their best finish (second, 1984) of the five official Big Ten championships.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Junior Dee Forsberg had her best year of collegiate golf ever, winning medalist honors in two tournaments, and receiving recognition on the All-Big Ten golf team. Forsberg won both the Lady Badger Invitational in the fall and the Iowa Invitational in the spring. Her two wins in a season puts her into a fifth place, five-way tie for most wins in a season. It also puts Forsberg in a two-way tie for fifth place for most medalist wins in a career. She also moved into the record books in the Top 18-Hole Score category with a 71, which was carded at the Iowa Invitational. It puts her in two-way for fifth place with former Gopher great Nancy Harris.

Team captain Julie Hennessy was the Gophers only other medalist during the 1985-86 season, winning the Gopher Fall Invitational in a sudden death play-off against teammates Kate Hughes and Mary Kuhlmann.

Freshman Hughes led the team after the fall season with a 76.77 stroke average, but relinquished the lead to Forsberg who had a strong spring performance (80.10) and topped the Gophers with a overall 78.89 stroke average. Hughes ended the year with the second best team stroke average with a 79.25, with Hennessy close behind with a season average of 79.58.

Forsberg earned the Most Valuable Player award as well as receiving her second letter award. Other letter winners this year included Leslie Cummings, Sarah Johnson, Jodi Krafka, Ann Meyer, Hennessy, Hughes, and Kuhlmann.

SEASON SUMMARY: The highlight of the season was the Gophers' share of the Big Ten Conference softball championship title after improving from a fifth place 8-12 Big Ten record in 1985 to an 15-9 mark this year. Minnesota also played a competitive non-conference schedule in 1986, with games against 31 top-twenty teams. The Gophers were 28-23 overall, and the 51 game schedule was the second most games played in a season in Minnesota softball history.

The team finished as tri-champions of the Big Ten Conference by virtue of a tie with Northwestern and Indiana. All three teams posted 15-9 records in the Big Ten single round-robin schedule. The shared conference title is the first "official" Big Ten Conference title gained by any women's team at the University of Minnesota since the league sanctioned women's championships in 1981. The Gopher softball team last won the title in 1981, during tournament play, and three other Minnesota teams -- volleyball, basketball and golf, have won "unofficial" Big Ten titles.

Only fifteen of the Gophers' 51 games were played at home, and the team started the season at two strong tournaments -- the Roadrunner Invitational at Las Cruces, N.M. and the Houston Classic in Texas. The Gophers entered the Big Ten schedule 7-11, with an upset over Nebraska 7-6 and three games with one-run losses to nationally ranked teams.

Heading into the Big Ten schedule, Coach Wells challenged her pitchers, senior Judy Oliverius and junior Barb Drake, to rise to the challenge, and they did. The Gophers' first two Big Ten series were at home, against Iowa and Michigan State, and Minnesota swept three of four games in both series. Then came three road weekends and the real test for the team. A key factor the remaining of the year was a contribution from more than the top five players in the batting order.

The Gophers split 2-2 on the road with nationally ranked Michigan, the 1985 Big Ten runner-ups. On the same trip they split a doubleheader with ranked Central Michigan and swept top-twenty ranked Creighton. Then, the Gophers went 2-2 on a do-or-die weekend in Evanston against the two-time defending Big Ten champions Northwestern. After sweeping Ohio State all four road games, Minnesota hosted Indiana.

The Gophers needed to win just two of the games, as Michigan State split with Northwestern the same weekend, in order to clinch the Big Ten title. But, five errors in game 1 and the pitching of Indiana's senior Amy Unterbrink, who set a Big Ten season ERA record of 0.21, combined to limit the Gophers to a one game victory. That was enough for a share of the title. The Gophers were second in the Big Ten in batting average at .218 to their opponents .197, and were tied for fourth in pitching with a team 1.04 Big Ten ERA.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS -- Junior pitcher/catcher and second base Barb Drake was a dominant player in the Big Ten and was named the league's Most Valuable Player in a vote by conference coaches. Drake was also named to the All-Region team as a utility player and to the second team All-American as a designated hitter, repeating her selection to those two teams which she earned as a freshman. She led the Big Ten in batting with a .408 average, and was tabbed the Big Ten's Player of the Week in four of the six weeks of conference competition. Drake was also named to the first team as a pitcher -- she was fifth in the league with a 0.74 ERA and 9-3 record.

Overall, Drake led the Gophers with a .345 batting average, tied for the team lead with 49 hits, and scored a team high 27 runs with a slugging percentage of .479 and on base pct. of .472. In pitching, she handled most of the mound duties going 164.7 IP, with a 15-7 record and 1.06 ERA. She reset her season record for most doubles with 15, and holds the career mark with a career total of 34. Her 19 complete pitching games was the second most in a season, as were her eight shutouts.

Senior Judy Oliverius left her mark in the career record book this year. She finished as the all-time leader in games played (192), and at bats (592) and second in hits with 155, just four shy of Gretchen Larson's record of 159. Oliverius was also fourth in total bases (193), third in putouts (653) and fourth in assists (284). In pitching, she was third in games (66), innings pitched (385.7) and strikeouts (179). Oliverius was third for the team overall in batting at .292 this year, and had 42 hits, 19 runs and 15 RBI's. She pitched 140.7 innings with a 11-10 record and 1.29 ERA. Oliverius was named to the All-Big Ten first team and All-Region first team this year.

Senior Ann Flis was named to the All-Big Ten first team for the second consecutive year, and was also an All-Region second team selection. This year Flis was called on to handle all of the defensive duties at first base and in the process she set a new Minnesota season record for putouts (431), and games played (51). Flis also became the all-time record holder for career putouts with 752, and for best career fielding pct. at .979 (818 chances). She batted .301 overall this season, tying for the team lead in hits at 49, and leading the team with 21 RBI's. She also was ranked third in the league in batting with a .303 average. Her career totals include a batting average of .310 (136-439), and an on base pct. of .412.

Senior Kim Katzenmeyer ended her career on a high note batting .228 for the season (31-136) and playing in a season record 51 games. She started at catcher in 30 games, and also played in the outfield and at second base. Her career fielding pct. of .966 includes just 13 errors in 377 chances. Jeana Cullen ended her career during which she was a defensive specialist at shortstop, second base, and this year in the outfield. Cullen is 11th in career putouts with 260, and third in career assists with 289 -- she played in 151 games.

Junior Carla Cray also played in a season record 51 games and batted .221 for the year. Cray set a season record for most assists with 148, and was a defensive sparkplug at shortstop. Freshman Kathy Casull stepped in and handled third base all year, posting the second most assists in a season with 130. Sophomore Deb Lewis was named to the All-Big Ten first team as a designated hitter after batting .200 in league play.

SEASON SUMMARY: Coach Jack Roach and team overcame mid-season adversities to be seeded fourth at the Big Ten Championship for the second year. Since the 1986 Big Ten Championship featured three nationally-ranked teams, Minnesota's third consecutive fourth-place finish was the highlight of an up-and-down year.

The fall season started strong with five straight victories and good showings at three invitational tournaments. Winter season play reflected Roach's plans to make the Gopher team a dominant national force, as the team spent weekends in February on the road playing against nationally-ranked competition. However, the Gophers also suffered key losses in freshmen Anna Hallgren (shoulder injury) and Anne Gorde (scholastic ineligibility). The losses and lineup switches gave freshmen players a chance to rise to the opportunity, and in the process they gained competitive experience. A week of play in Florida over spring break prepared the team for the competitive Big Ten spring season and the chase for the fourth seed.

April wins over Illinois, Michigan, Michigan State, Iowa and Purdue clinched the fourth seed and presented the new challenge of winning the first-round match. Once again the Gophers prevailed with a 5-4 win over Michigan State at the Big Ten meet. The match was the closest of the year, with the win coming after Darcy Jones and Karin Eneberg won their third-set tiebreaker in the final doubles match. Minnesota ended the year with an 8-5 conference record, with losses to Northwestern (twice), Wisconsin (twice) and Indiana, all nationally-ranked schools.

Eight players ended the season with winning singles records and the team had a combined win-loss record of 137-118 (.537). Doubles teams changed throughout the year, and no dominant teams appeared as players were teamed with as many as five different partners.

INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS: Depth was a key improvement for this year's team. Five of the top six singles players returned from the 1984-85 squad, and three top freshmen joined the team.

Two-year captain and MVP Nancy Rost played at first and second singles and number one doubles all year. She posted a 17-17 singles record and a 7-24 doubles record to conclude an outstanding career. Rost started the season at number two singles and moved to number one during the winter when Hallgren was injured. Rost's leadership and consistency earned her a spot on the All-Big Ten tennis team for the third straight year. She ended her career on the all-time Minnesota win lists in both singles (74 total) and doubles (65 total). Rost also posted winning singles records during her four years of collegiate competition.

Minnesota's Swedish invasion continued with the return of sophomore Karin Eneberg and the arrival of freshman Anna Hallgren. Hallgren started the season like a future superstar when she compiled an 8-4 record at number one singles (12-5 overall). She also defeated the number one seeded player at the Midwest Intercollegiate Invitational and was seeded second in the ITCA regional tournament. Hallgren spent much of the winter and spring seasons on the sidelines because of a shoulder injury. After recovering from surgery in March, Hallgren played singles at numbers three and four. She ended the year with a 20-11 record, but she returned to Sweden after the Big Ten Championship.

Another standout freshman was former Hill-Murray star Anne Gorde. Gorde finished fall play with a 10-3 record, including seven straight singles wins. Although she was academically ineligible for winter quarter play, Gorde returned for the spring season and played like a champion. She moved to number two singles in the spring and finished the season with a 12-2 record at number two (18-6 overall) and her 9-3 conference record was second in the conference at number two singles and the best conference record on the Minnesota team.

The remaining returners, seniors Maura Bjerken and Lisa Martin, junior Darcy Jones and sophomore Karin Eneberg gave the team stability and experience in both singles and doubles play. Martin finished her career with a 74-46 singles record, eighth on the all-time Minnesota wins list. She was a mainstay singles player and had the team's top singles records for two years, with a 25-13 record as a sophomore and a 20-10 mark during her junior season.

Other newcomers, freshmen Lisa Dick, Foon Huie and Jennie Huston, saw limited action. Dick played number one doubles with Nancy Rost during the spring season in addition to singles play, and she ended the season with a 14-13 singles record. Huie was a substitute doubles player during the winter season, while Huston played at number seven singles during the fall, winning the number seven singles championship at the Drake Invitational in September.

SEASON SUMMARY: The 1985-86 Minnesota crew team returned five All-Americans from last year's team that placed third in the nation. The 1985-86 competition started at the Head of the Charles Regatta in Boston, Mass., where the team placed eighth in field of 40. The fall and winter practice seasons included two training trips to Tampa, Fla., in addition to indoor training in Minnesota.

The spring season started with a sixth-place finish at the San Diego Crew Classic, despite the fact that the rowers had to use borrowed equipment as theirs was snowbound in Colorado. The San Diego Crew Classic is a prestigious invitational, according to assistant coach Carolyn Reckman, and the Minnesota team was invited based on their strong finish at the 1985 national championships.

On April 26, the team placed second, behind a top-ranked Wisconsin team, at the Women's Varsity Eights at the Midwest Championships in Madison, Wisc. On May 9 and 10 they placed second at the Dad Vail Regatta in Philadelphia, behind an undefeated New Hampshire team.

The season ended with a third place finish at the Collegiate Championships held June 13-14 in Cincinnati, Ohio.
