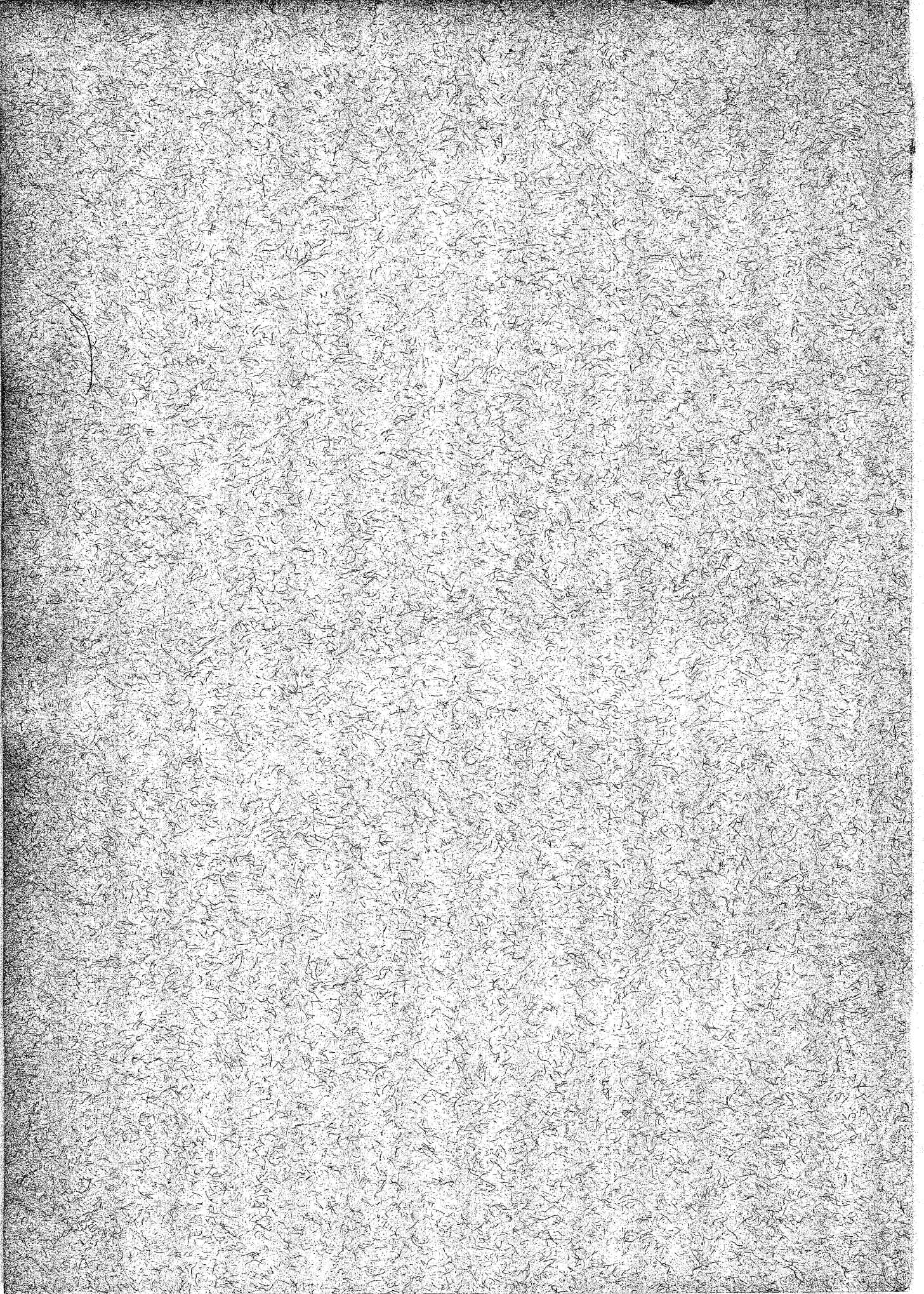

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LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

PRESIDENT J. L. MORRILL,
University of Minnesota.

Dear Mr. Morrill:

I have the honor to submit herewith the annual "Financial Report" of the University of Minnesota for the year ended June 30, 1946.

The balance sheet, the summary, and detailed statement of receipts and expenditures have been grouped under the five headings, "General University Fund," "Federal Funds," "Special State Appropriations," "Service Enterprises and Revolving Funds," and "Trust Funds."

GENERAL UNIVERSITY FUND

On June 30, 1945, the cash balance in the General University Fund for operating purposes was \$2,557,985.35 and for plant extension \$259,658.31, making a total of \$2,817,643.66. This compares with a balance at the end of the year for operating purposes of \$1,578,103.11 and for plant extension of \$705,191.31, or a total of \$2,283,294.42. This is a net decrease of \$534,349.24. The outstanding orders, obligations, and allotments decreased \$533,474.84 during the fiscal year. The free and unencumbered balance known as the Regents' Reserve remaining after deducting the amount required to meet outstanding orders, contracts, and allotments was \$7,760.32 on June 30, 1946, as compared with \$8,634.72 on June 30, 1945.

State Support

FOR OPERATION

General University Fund: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, to appropriate money for maintenance and improvements of the State University, University Farm School and Experiment Schools and Stations. (1945-46, Receipts, \$3,825,000.)

23/100 Mill Tax: The Legislature approved in 1878 a bill granting a standing tax levy of 10/100 of one mill for the support and maintenance of the University of Minnesota. This has been increased to 15/100 by the Act of 1893 and 23/100 by the Act of 1897. (1945-46, Receipts, \$237,619.95.)

University of Minnesota Hospitals Reimbursement: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, appropriating state's half of cost for care of indigent patients \$310,000 and reappropriating moneys collected from counties. (1945-46, Receipts, \$656,195.82.)

Psychopathic Hospital, department of the Minnesota General Hospital, for maintenance and operation: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$90,000.)

FOR SPECIAL PURPOSES

Dairy Manufacturing: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$10,000.)

Soils Investigations: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for the continuation of soil experiments and demonstrations in different parts of the state, and for the making of soil surveys in certain counties in Minnesota and for accompanying field experiments in the fertilization and management of soils to produce the most profitable crop returns under the direct charge of the Minnesota Experiment Station. (1945-46, Receipts, \$10,000.)

Beneficiation of Manganiferous and Low Grade Ores: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for experiments in the beneficiation of manganiferous and low grade ores. (1945-46, Receipts, \$50,000.)

County Agents: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for maintenance, County Agricultural Agents and co-operative extension work. (1945-46, Receipts, \$115,000.)

Agricultural Extension: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for agricultural extension work. (1945-46, Receipts, \$45,000.)

Medical Research: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for Medical Research only, at the University. (1945-46, Receipts, \$45,000.)

Live Stock Sanitary Board Laboratory: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for the maintenance of a laboratory for the Live Stock Sanitary Board. (1945-46, Receipts, \$30,000.)

Crop Breeding and Testing: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, providing for breeding and testing of superior varieties of farm crops with a view to developing varieties and strains that are of high yield and resistant to rusts, smuts, and other crop diseases. (1945-46, Receipts, \$20,000.)

Mastitis Control: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$10,000.)

Potato Research: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, for research in improving the quality of Minnesota grown potatoes, for studying the appropriate condition of potato production and storage in Minnesota, including the control of potato diseases, potato insects, and such other factors as may influence potato quality, market grades and consumer demands for Minnesota grown potatoes. (1945-46, Receipts, \$10,000.)

Institute of Child Welfare: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, for scientific studies of child development and for training students. (1945-46, Receipts, \$20,000.)

FOR SPECIAL PURPOSES—Continued

General Research: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$50,000.)

Minnesota Institute of Research: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, to assist in general research and in the discovery, development, promotion, and co-ordination of methods for the utilization and development of the products and natural resources of the state through scientific research, and to aid further studies for the purpose of developing the industries and resources of the state. (1945-46, Receipts, \$14,973.75.)

Home Demonstration and 4-H Club Work: Act of the Legislature approved April 23, 1945, to expand program into additional counties on basis of supplemental local support. (1945-46, Receipts, \$20,000.)

FOR BUILDINGS, IMPROVEMENTS, ALTERATIONS, AND EQUIPMENT

Old Minnesota Union, Shevlin Hall, and Zoology Buildings on the Main Campus: Chapter 529, Laws 1941; \$205,000. Additional sum approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$32,000.)

Greenhouses and equipment for the Field Crops Building at University Farm: Act of the Legislature approved April 28, 1941; \$40,000. Additional sum approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$13,500.)

Improvements at Southeast Experiment Station, Waseca, Minnesota: Act of the Legislature approved April 28, 1941; \$11,000. Additional sum approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts: Hog House \$2,600, Granary \$3,000, Tile Outlet \$1,500.)

Dormitory at the Northwest School and Station, Crookston, Minnesota: Act of the Legislature approved April 28, 1941; \$90,000. Additional sum approved April 23, 1945. (1945-46, Receipts, \$60,000.)

Federal Aid

Morrill-Nelson Fund: Acts of Congress approved August 30, 1890, and March 4, 1907, appropriating \$50,000 annually for instruction in agriculture, the mechanic arts, the English language, and the various branches of mathematical, physical, natural, and economic science with special reference to their application in the industries of life and to the facilities for such instruction. (1945-46, Receipts, \$50,000.)

Adams and Hatch Funds: Acts of Congress approved March 2, 1887, and March 16, 1906, appropriating \$30,000 annually for conducting original researches or experiments bearing directly on the agricultural industry. (1945-46, Receipts, \$30,000.)

George-Deen Fund: Act of Congress approved June 8, 1936, authorized appropriations annually for vocational education in agriculture, trades and industries, home economics and distributive occupations—and for teacher training in these fields. (1945-46, Receipts, \$8,417.75.)

Smith-Lever, Lever Extension, and Additional Co-operative Extension Funds: Acts of Congress approved May 8, 1914, June, 1919, and July 3, 1930, to provide for co-operative agricultural extension work between the Agricultural Colleges in the several States and the United States Department of Agriculture. (1945-46, Receipts, \$110,427.47.)

Smith-Hughes Fund: Act of Congress approved February 23, 1917, relating to the promotion of vocational education, instruction in agriculture, the trades and industries and for the preparation of teachers of vocational subjects. The moneys expended shall be conditioned that for each dollar of Federal money expended for salaries, the State or local community, or both shall expend an equal amount for such salaries. (1945-46, Receipts, \$13,719.20.)

SOURCES OF INCOME

Federal Aid—Continued

Purnell Fund: Act of Congress approved February 24, 1925, appropriating to agricultural experiment stations, \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1926, \$30,000 June 30, 1927, \$40,000 June 30, 1928, \$50,000 June 30, 1929, \$60,000 June 30, 1930 and \$60,000 annually thereafter to be applied in conducting investigations or making experiments bearing directly on the production, manufacture, preparation, use, distribution and marketing of agricultural products and including such scientific researches bearing upon agricultural industry. (1945-46, Receipts, \$60,000.)

Capper-Ketcham Fund: Act of Congress approved May 22, 1928, appropriating moneys for conducting the further development and expansion of the co-operative system of extension work in Agriculture and Home Economics. (1945-46, Receipts, \$32,213.31.)

Public Health Service Training Center Fund: Allotment of the United States Public Health Service as provided in the Social Security Act designating the University of Minnesota as the regional training center for the states of Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, South Dakota, and North Dakota. (1945-46, Receipts, \$16,522.59.)

Bankhead-Jones Fund: Act of Congress approved June 29, 1935, to provide for research into basic laws and principles relating to agriculture and to provide for the further development of co-operative agricultural extension work and the more complete endowment and support of Land Grant Colleges. The appropriation is shown under Title I and Title II of the act. (1945-46, Receipts, Extension \$333,141.99, Research \$62,041.48, and Instruction \$51,868.41.)

Bankhead-Flanagan Fund: Act of Congress approved June 6, 1945 to provide for the further development of the co-operative extension system as inaugurated under the Bankhead-Jones Act of June 29, 1935. The appropriation is shown under Title II, Section 23 of the act. (1945-46, Receipts, \$116,574.57.)

Permanent University Fund

Act of Congress approved July 2, 1862, donating from public lands, 30,000 acres for each senator and representative in Congress for the establishment of a college for the benefit of agriculture and mechanic arts. All moneys derived from the sale of the lands shall be invested in stocks of the United States or of the state, or some other safe stocks, yielding not less than 5 per cent upon the par value of said stocks, and that the interest of which shall be appropriated to the endowment, support, and maintenance of at least one college where the leading object shall be, without excluding other scientific and classical studies, and including military tactics, to teach such branches of learning as are related to agriculture and the mechanic arts. An Act of the Legislature was approved April 11, 1921, providing for the imposition of a tax upon persons, co-partnerships, and associations, however organized, engaged in the business of mining or producing iron ore and other ores. This was amended April 19, 1923, to provide that 10 per cent of the tax collected be added to the principal of the Land Grant Endowment. (1945-46, Income from invested funds, \$472,630.05.)

Swamp Land Fund

By amendment of the constitution ratified in 1881, Article VIII, Section 2 of the constitution, apportioned the income from principal received from the sale of swamp lands to the several educational and charitable institutions in the relative ratio of cost of support of such institutions based on the cost for the fiscal year next preceding the one in which such distribution is made. (1945-46, Receipts, \$55,066.74.)

Other University Income

Students fees \$2,427,802.32, Departmental Sales and Miscellaneous \$1,921,910.55, Service Enterprises and Revolving Funds \$5,314,144.28, Athletics \$643,697.91, Endowment \$739,014.88, Gifts \$2,048,551.38, Miscellaneous Income Plant Funds \$2,234.95.
