

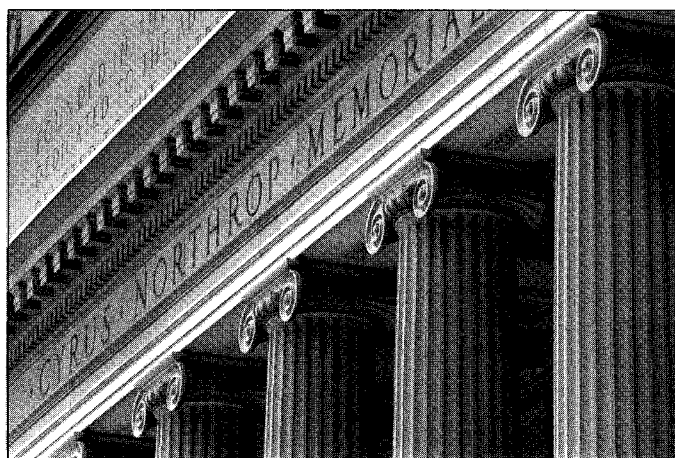

The University of Minnesota, ranked among the nation's top public universities, reflects the state of Minnesota's strong and enduring commitment to education. It is almost alone among universities in the United States in its three defining characteristics:

- It is an international research university.
- It is a land-grant institution with a strong tradition of education and public service.
- Its largest campus—the Twin Cities campus—is located in a vibrant metropolitan area with not one, but two great cities at its center: Minneapolis and St. Paul.

The University is the primary center in Minnesota (and much of the Upper Midwest) for instruction and research in the liberal arts and sciences, health sciences, law, education, engineering, agriculture, and forestry. The Twin Cities campus comprises 19 colleges and offers a full range of academic and professional degrees. A comprehensive campus in Duluth offers undergraduate and graduate programs. The Morris campus offers a four-year liberal arts program. Crookston offers associate and baccalaureate degrees in technical, career-oriented programs. Through the Minnesota Extension Service, the University is present in each of Minnesota's 87 counties.

When the University was founded as a preparatory school in 1851, Minnesota had been a territory for just two years, and statehood was still seven years away. The school was built on little more than the pioneers' faith in education. The University struggled financially in its early years and was forced to close during the Civil War. It reopened in 1867, thanks to the energetic leadership of Governor John S. Pillsbury, who came to be known as



the "Father of the University." Mathematics Professor William Watts Folwell became the University's first president in 1869.

Two students received bachelor of arts degrees at the first commencement in June 1873. Since then, the University has granted a total of 515,676 degrees. Students earn undergraduate and graduate degrees in more than 250 fields of study. During the 1997–98 academic year, the University of Minnesota conferred a total of 10,646 degrees on all of its campuses.

The Duluth campus joined the University in 1947; the Morris campus, in 1960; and the Crookston campus, in 1966. Enrollment in fall 1998 was 51,835 on all four campuses. Enrollment was 39,595 on the Twin Cities campus, 7,831 at Duluth, 1,917 at Morris, and 2,492 at Crookston.

University alumni include five Nobel Prize winners, a former chief justice of the United States, two former U.S. vice presidents, the heads of Fortune 500 companies, pioneers in medicine, civil rights leaders, top journalists, distinguished teachers and scholars, performing artists, and men and women who have achieved distinction in every field.

Alumni and their families and friends are always welcome at the University. We invite you to visit campus regularly to enjoy the many educational, cultural, and entertainment opportunities that are open to the public—including performances by students in CLA's arts programs. We also invite you to continue your relationship with the University through the Minnesota Alumni Association and the CLA Alumni Society.

## THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

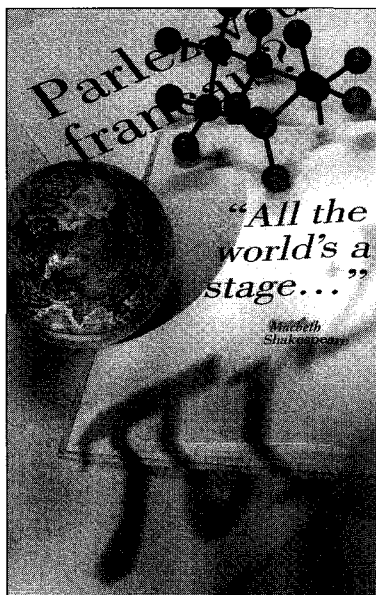
*...education for a lifetime*

**T**he College of Liberal Arts (CLA) was formally established at the University of Minnesota in 1868, 17 years after the founding of the University. Since then, it has become an international center for education in the arts, humanities, and social sciences.

The liberal arts span all areas of human knowledge, enterprise, and aspirations. The college offers 60 majors, with study and research opportunities in fields ranging from anthropology to women's studies. Students whose interests cross disciplines may also choose to design individualized major programs.

The majority of students who enter CLA as first-year students complete their undergraduate education in CLA. Others complete their basic liberal arts coursework in the college and then transfer to other units of the University. The college offers strong preprofessional programs with close ties to the health sciences and other professional schools at the University.

There are more than 14,000 undergraduate students and 1,600 graduate students enrolled in CLA programs. Approximately 500 permanent faculty members—teachers and scholars of international stature—share with students their vast knowledge, their provocative insights,



and the most current research in their fields.

CLA students acquire both breadth of knowledge and particular depth and proficiency in a specialized field of knowledge. Whatever their majors, students complete an education based broadly in the liberal arts. Courses necessary to meet general education requirements introduce students to modes of inquiry and subject matter across the major branches of knowledge.

This education is the very best preparation for lives and careers in a rapidly changing world—a solid grounding in ideas and knowledge across disciplines, across centuries, across cultures, and across geographic boundaries, as well as in critical analysis, communication, and research methodologies.

Equipped with this education, graduates of the College of Liberal Arts bring into the world the communication skills, critical and innovative thinking, creativity, and intellectual versatility needed for a lifetime of learning and leadership.

ANN E. BANCROFT  
EDUCATOR AND POLAR EXPLORER

*Keynote Speaker 10:00 a.m.*



Listening to Ann Bancroft talk about her life could give you a chill—despite her reputation for graciousness so warm it could melt the polar ice cap. Bancroft is accustomed to frigid temperatures—indeed, she has built her professional life around braving the elements in subzero temperatures. She has stood on the crest of both the North and South Poles, having traveled great distances on foot and by dogsled across the frozen polar wilderness—in minus-75-degree wind chills.

As part of what she calls her “global education program,” Bancroft is spreading the word about exploration and discovery to children—and adults—around the world.

Bancroft is the first woman in history to have crossed the ice to the North and South Poles. In 1986, she dogsledded 1,000 miles, from the Northwest Territories in Canada to the North Pole, as the only female member of the Steger International Polar Expedition. In 1993, she led the American Women’s Expedition to the South Pole, a 67-day expedition of 660 miles on skis by four women.

In November 2000, Bancroft will undertake her next polar adventure. Along with Liv Arnesen, a renowned polar explorer from Oslo, Norway, Bancroft will attempt to make history once again: The Bancroft Arnesen Expedition will be the first all-women’s crossing of Antarctica. Pulling 250-pound sleds, the women intend to ski 2,400 miles for 100 days across Antarctica. They will be “wired” during their journey so they can stay in touch with school children worldwide via computer and satellite phone.

The satellite hookup speaks to Bancroft’s deep commitment to education. A former teacher of physical and special education in Minneapolis with a bachelor’s degree from the University of Oregon, she continues to be a role model for young people and to put teaching at the center of her life.

Bancroft is known nationwide and beyond not only for her polar explorations but for her leadership in helping to shatter gender stereotypes and demonstrating to young people that they, too, can meet any challenge by claiming their own strength and working collaboratively with others. Bancroft founded and leads the AWE Foundation, a nonprofit organization that celebrates the achievements and potential of women and girls. She serves on the National Women’s Hall of Fame Board of Directors and has been a spokesperson for the M.S. Society, United Way, United Cerebral Palsy, and the Learning Disabilities Association.

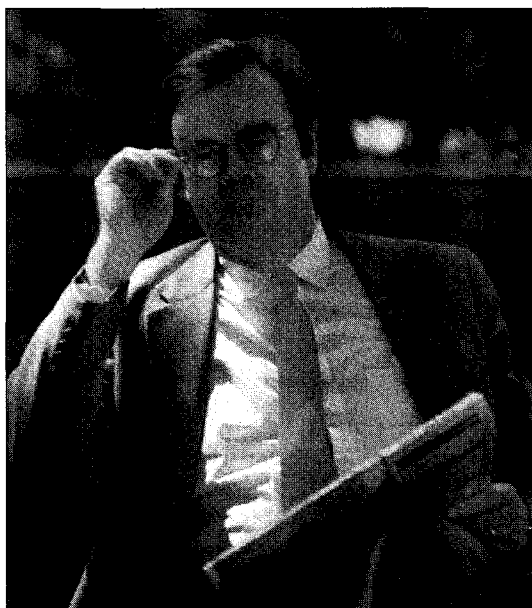
Bancroft has been featured in *Time*, *People*, *USA Today*, *Ms.*, *McCall’s*, *Vogue*, *Good Housekeeping*, *Glamour*, *National Geographic*, *Outside*, and *Sports Illustrated for Kids*, and on CNN, the BBC, and National Public Radio. She has been featured in the book *Remarkable Women of the Twentieth Century* (1998); inducted into the National Women’s Hall of Fame (1995); named *Ms.* magazine’s “Woman of the Year” (1987); and honored with numerous awards for her accomplishments.

## GARRISON KEILLOR

AUTHOR AND HUMORIST

*Keynote Speaker 2:00 p.m.*

Garrison Keillor has been called both the Mark Twain and the Will Rogers of the nineties. But no analogy can pay due credit to what Garrison Keillor has become to Minnesotans. Not just the most famous raconteur of Lake Wobegon, he has become a Minnesota icon and a kind of national folk hero—a philosopher for our times with a wry and nimble wit, a gift for storytelling, and a knack for bringing to life the assorted oddballs, misfits, and ordinary people who inhabit our minds and our communities.



*The Old Man Who Loved Cheese* (1996), *Wobegon Boy* (1997), and *The Sandy Bottom Orchestra* (cowritten with his wife, Jenny Lind Nilsson). Most recently, he wrote *Me By Jimmy "Big Boy" Valente*, the "biography" of a wrestler-cum-governor. In yet another genre and medium, he writes a biweekly column of advice to the lovelorn for *Salon*, an online magazine. As Mr. Blue, he answers such burning questions as "How can I get the exciting man I married to stop talking about multiprotocol networking?"

Keillor's recording of *Lake Wobegon Days* received a Grammy Award. He received two ACE cable television awards and a George Foster Peabody Award for excellence in broadcasting. In 1994, he was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame at the Museum of Broadcast Communications in Chicago. In April of this year, he was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

With Philip Brunelle, Keillor has performed with the Chicago, Milwaukee, San Francisco, Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Dallas, and National symphony orchestras. He has appeared at Wolf Trap, Carnegie Hall, and other major concert halls as a member of The Hopeful Gospel Quartet. And he has taken his show on the road, appearing throughout the country in solo performances and with *A Prairie Home Companion*.

Of himself, Keillor once said in typically self-deprecating fashion, "I can tell that I'm going to be a strange old man someday, grumpy and given to odd habits and strange hours, eating beans out of the can for breakfast and talking to house plants and compiling a Dictionary of Verbal Abuse and Insult and writing a novel with a steam iron as narrator. I hope to postpone this a while—but it's coming."

Minnesotans join Americans across the country weekly to spend the Saturday dinner hour listening to this Anoka native who graduated from the University of Minnesota's College of Liberal Arts in 1966 with a degree in English and a radio career already under way. Today Keillor's soft, flannel voice has become as familiar and soothing to his audiences as an old friend's. He tells stories. He croons. He teaches and admonishes. He gently skewers politicians, trends, and orthodoxies. He treats his audiences to a rich cavalcade of eccentric, sometimes roguish, always lovable characters whose particular brand of folk wisdom and humor punctuates his own wry, witty, and astute observations on life in these times. He makes his listeners laugh, reflect, relax, and look at themselves and their neighbors in a whole new way.

First broadcast on Minnesota Public Radio on July 6, 1974, *A Prairie Home Companion* is today heard each week by more than 2.2 million listeners on more than 410 radio stations. Keillor also hosts a daily five-minute books program, *The Writer's Almanac*. But he is much more than a radio personality. He is a frequent contributor to *Time* and *The Atlantic Monthly* and is the author of 10 books, including *Lake Wobegon Days* (1985), *The Book of Guys* (1993), *Cat, You Better Come Home* (1995),



## PROFESSOR JOHN ARCHER

### ARTHUR H. "RED" AND HELENE B. MOTLEY OUTSTANDING TEACHING AWARD

*Department of Cultural Studies and Comparative Literature*

As this year's recipient of the Arthur "Red" and Helene B. Motley Outstanding Teaching Award, John Archer exemplifies the College of Liberal Arts' highest standards in teaching and scholarship. An accomplished and dedicated teacher who also is a recognized scholar of cultural studies and comparative literature, Archer has brought distinction to his department and a love of learning to his students.



can only say that the pleasure John takes in his work is contagious. He has demonstrated his commitment to undergraduate education as a commitment to [the undergraduates themselves]. His virtuosity as a teacher comes through paper by paper, student by student, course by course. John has shown me what undergraduate teaching is all about, and what it can be."

Noting his openness, his dedication, and his "meticulous care," his colleagues and students alike laud Archer's active engagement both with his material and with his students. Spending more than half of his time teaching undergraduates, Archer keeps his material and his approaches constantly fresh, developing new courses, taking advantage of new technology, and forging new directions of inquiry while encouraging his students to take the lead.

In the words of a colleague, Archer's teaching "extends beyond commitment, and beyond technique. He has brought [students'] work to bear on life outside the classroom; he has led students struggling with learning disabilities or [troubled] personal histories to see those histories as opportunities for pointed engagement with learning rather than as limitations; and he helps [academically gifted] students as well"—helping them to win scholarships, fellowships, and admissions to top-tier graduate schools.

In the words of a former student: "John was and is a great teacher, and also a strong advocate for students. I

Another student says, "I cannot stress enough the degree to which I was affected by Professor Archer's willingness to see past my confusion and into my potential. On [one] dark December afternoon, Professor Archer explained to me the facts of theoretical life, and essentially opened the door to not just my paper but the eternal possibility of further projects. His willingness to read draft after draft and his firm but patient critiques made the difference between a paper to finish and a project to continue. [He] makes for some very lucky students indeed."

Archer received his B.A. *summa cum laude* from Yale University, and his A.M. and Ph.D. from Harvard University. He has been a member of the University of Minnesota faculty since 1977. He has received awards from the American Council of Learned Societies, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, and the Getty Center for the History of Art and the Humanities. As a leader in implementing the University's Writing Across the Curriculum initiative, he received the first Annual Award for Excellence in the teaching of Writing from the Center for Interdisciplinary Studies of Writing.

## PROFESSOR JOHN WRIGHT

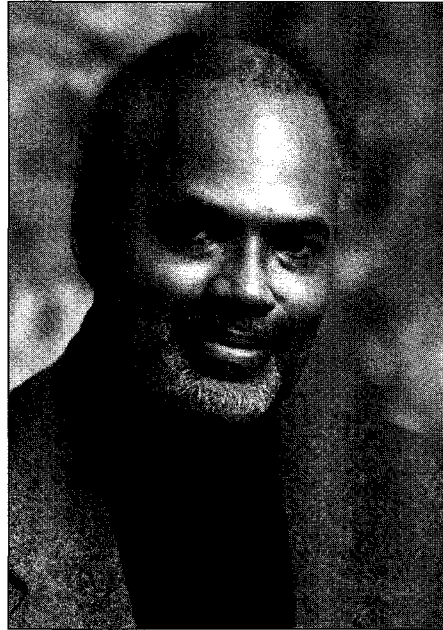
### HORACE T. MORSE—UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA ALUMNI AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTIONS TO UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION

*Department of English & Department of Afro-American and African Studies*

**J**ohn Wright is the consummate public intellectual: not only a teacher and scholar, he also is an ambassador, crossing the boundary between the academy and the community and, within the academy, between disciplines.

An associate professor in both the Department of English and the Department of Afro-American and African Studies, Wright is also the leading scholar of the University's Givens Collection of African American Literature and a national spokesperson for the collection. For his contributions to students, the University, and the larger community, Wright has been selected to receive the coveted Horace T. Morse—University of Minnesota Alumni Award for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education.

His sense of vocation and commitment to teaching and learning have made Wright a popular teacher and noted champion of African American literature both at the University and in the community. Those who have observed him in his many contexts and guises note consistently his passion for the literature, his love of teaching, and his gift for "spreading the word," generating enthusiasm for his subject in the classroom and beyond.



As an educator of educators, Wright teaches one of the University's most popular summer seminars for K–12 teachers on the Harlem Renaissance. His teacher-students uniformly laud him for his command of the subject as well as for his commanding presence in the classroom: his teaching is frequently described as "inspirational."

As the primary scholar of the Givens Collection, Wright has provided extraordinary leadership. His work has been pivotal in developing the identity of the collection, and he has been its most ardent and outspoken champion

both locally and among his fellow scholars nationally.

Wright received his B.E.E. (electrical engineering), M.A., and Ph.D. (American studies) from the University of Minnesota and has been a member of the University's faculty since 1984. His scholarly interests focus on American and African American literature, intellectual history, and popular culture, and on folklore and the oral tradition. He has published widely, on subjects ranging from the Harlem Renaissance to "Ralph Ellison and the Quest for Black Leadership in Postwar America."

## LIBERAL ARTS DEGREES

The College of Liberal Arts offers five bachelor's degrees—bachelor of arts (B.A.), bachelor of individualized studies (B.I.S.), bachelor of fine arts (B.F.A.), bachelor of music (B.M.), and bachelor of science (B.S.). The bachelor's degrees have many requirements in common.

### DEGREE CANDIDATES

Subject to successful completion, degrees will be conferred on those students listed below and on others meeting all curriculum requirements for graduation. Honor citations are provisional and do not become final until all requirements are met for the level indicated. Degrees and degree candidates are listed alphabetically in this program.

**Honors designations**—Honors graduates complete college and departmental honors requirements with a minimum of 60 credits overall with a grade of 'A.' Students graduating *cum laude* have earned As in at least 50 percent of their upper division credits. Students graduating *magna cum laude* have earned As in 66 percent of their upper division credits. Students graduating *summa cum laude* have earned As in 75 percent of their upper division credits and have completed an honors thesis or project.

### THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS

This degree can be earned through majors in most CLA departments and programs. Its breadth and diversity in general education make it valuable as a base for many kinds of careers or for advanced study. CLA offers several professional majors and specializations as well as interdepartmental programs for the B.A. degree.

## ACADEMIC COSTUME

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and color of modern-day academic-costume—cap, gown, and sometimes hood—indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree.

Bachelor's degree gowns are black and untrimmed. A tassel hanging from the mortar board worn on the head is color-coded by college at the University of Minnesota. The College of Liberal Arts tassel is white. Honors graduates wear a medallion adorned with a maroon and gold ribbon.

Master's degree gowns, black and untrimmed, have pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns in the United States traditionally have been black with velvet front facings and crossbars on the sleeves, but in recent years a number of universities have adopted gowns of distinctive school colors.

A new University of Minnesota Ph.D. gown and matching tam made their appearance in 1988 to celebrate the centenary of the first Minnesota doctor of philosophy degree. The new Minnesota gown is maroon-trimmed with black velvet chevrons and gold metallic braid. The traditional gown may still be worn.

The Minnesota hood, which may be worn by anyone with a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota, is black with maroon chevron on gold. Each institution has its own pattern of colors on the hood, worn around the neck and down the back of the gown. The length and shape of the hood identify the most advanced degree the wearer has earned, and the velvet edging shows the field: blue for doctor of philosophy, light blue for doctor of education, and pink for doctor of musical arts.

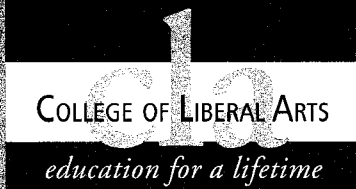
At commencement ceremonies those who already have the doctoral degree wear hoods. Degree candidates wear the gowns appropriate for the degrees they are about to receive, and new doctorates are hooded on stage.

## THE MACE

The University of Minnesota mace was carried for the first time in 1961 by Regents' Professor of Physics Alfred O.C. Nier at the inauguration of President O. Meredith Wilson. Art professor Philip Morton designed the mace: a crystal sphere four inches in diameter surmounted by the North Star, symbol of the state of Minnesota, on a solid aluminum handle set with the University regents' seal.
