SIBLEY WILL TALK AT SUNDAY
SEMINARS ON ST. PAUL CAMPUS

Literary utopias, religious communities and contemporary communes are among the topics for discussion at a new Sunday Supper Seminar being offered by the department of continuing education for women at the University of Minnesota.

The seminar will be led by Mulford Q. Sibley, professor of political science, who will offer his own ideas of utopia as well as leading discussion. The sessions will be held Oct. 24, Nov. 7, Nov. 21 and Dec. 5 in the staff dining room of the St. Paul Campus Dining Center.

The non-credit seminar is open to anyone.

Students will meet at 4:30 p.m. for a talk by Sibley, and then engage in group discussion after supper until 8:30 p.m. Registrants are welcome to bring a guest to each meeting. Tuition is \$25, and suppers are \$12 for the four meals. Supper for each guest is \$3.
