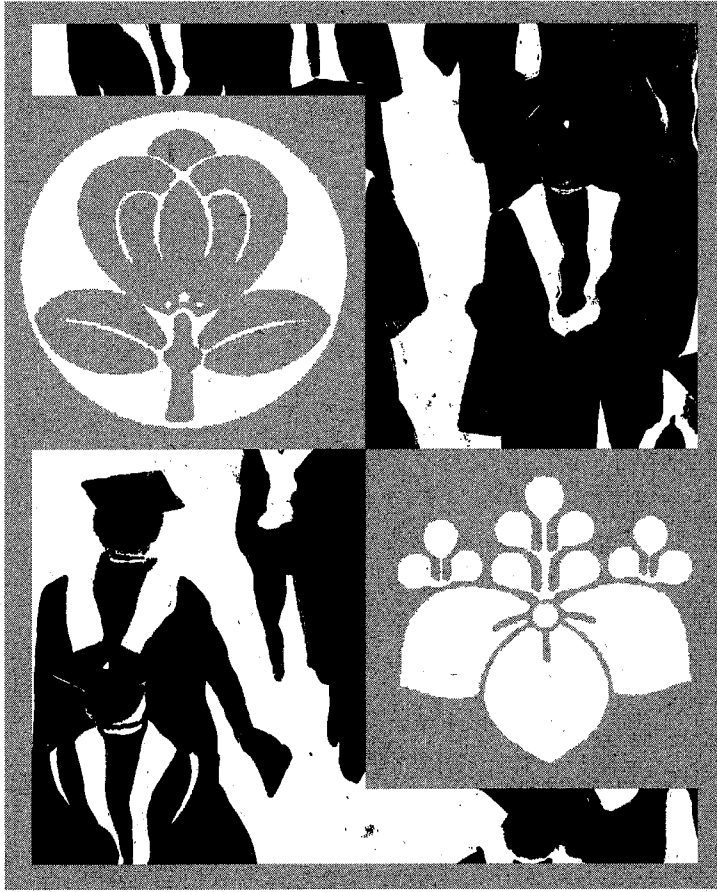

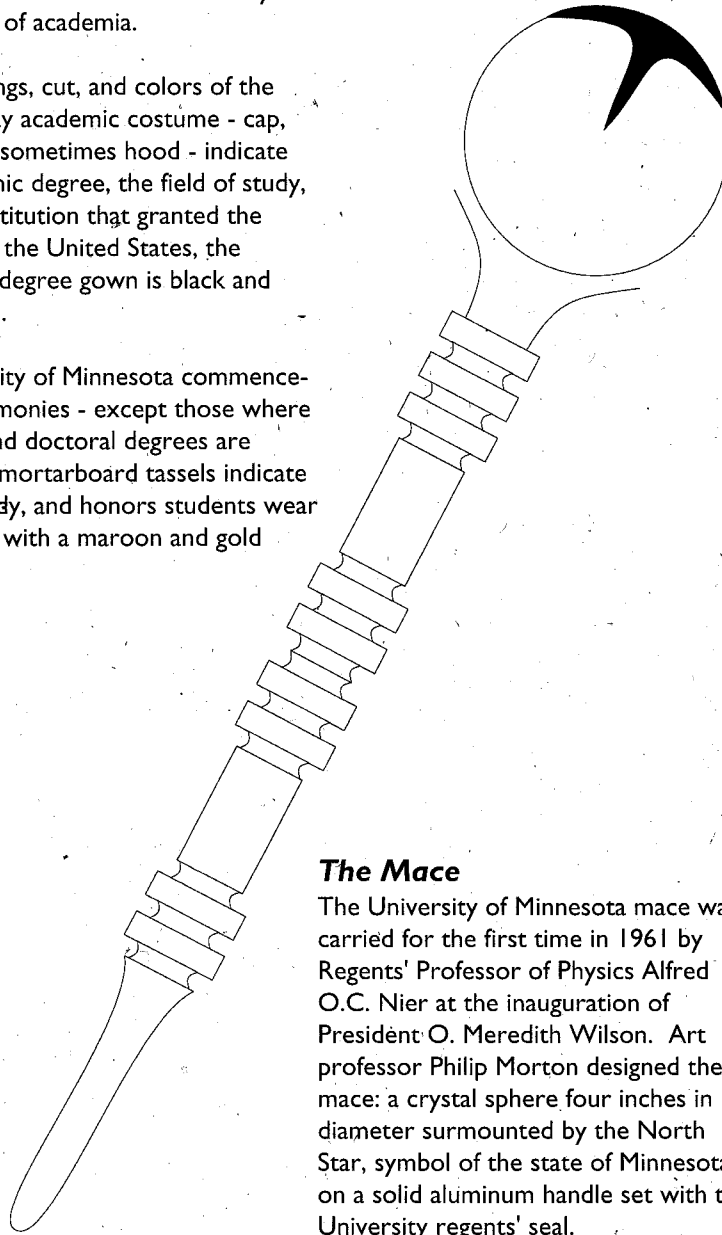

Academic Costume

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and colors of the modern-day academic costume - cap, gown, and sometimes hood - indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree. In the United States, the bachelor's degree gown is black and untrimmed.

At University of Minnesota commencement ceremonies - except those where master's and doctoral degrees are awarded - mortarboard tassels indicate field of study, and honors students wear medallions with a maroon and gold ribbon.



The Mace

The University of Minnesota mace was carried for the first time in 1961 by Regents' Professor of Physics Alfred O.C. Nier at the inauguration of President O. Meredith Wilson. Art professor Philip Morton designed the mace: a crystal sphere four inches in diameter surmounted by the North Star, symbol of the state of Minnesota, on a solid aluminum handle set with the University regents' seal.

This program contains the names of College of Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Sciences students who have applied to graduate from Fall Quarter, 1994 through Fall Quarter 1995. Degrees will be granted when all graduation requirements have been met.

Honors Designations

Students in the College of Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Sciences may graduate with various honors depending upon grade point average and the completion of an honors curriculum.

The College of Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Sciences Honors Program is an academic enrichment program providing a college-wide educational opportunity for students who qualify and accept the challenge for academic enrichment. The Honors Program is designed to give students and faculty, regardless of their specific majors and academic departments, the opportunity to interact with each other in formal and informal contexts. Students graduating with honors must have completed three honors colloquia courses and presented the results of a research project defined and sponsored in cooperation with a faculty member. Honors courses are taken in addition to degree program requirements. Students graduating *Cum Laude* have earned a grade point average of 3.4 - 3.59; *Magna Cum Laude*, a grade point average of 3.6 - 3.79 and *Summa Cum Laude* graduates have earned a grade point average of 3.8 - 4.0.

For those students who chose not to participate in the Honors Program we acknowledge their academic success with the designations *Distinction* and *High Distinction*. Graduation with *High Distinction* is awarded to students graduating with a grade point average of at least 3.8 over their last 90 credits; *Distinction*, is awarded to students graduating with a grade point average of at least 3.5 over their last 90 credits.

Dean's List (DL)

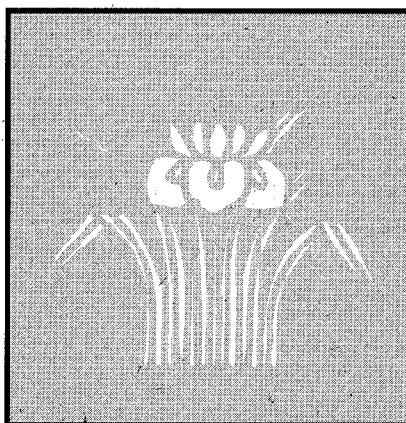
Students with the designation (DL) following their name have made the Dean's List at least for two quarters while in the College of Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Sciences. To be mentioned on the Dean's List requires that a student achieve a quarter grade point average of at least 3.70 while registered for a minimum of 12 credits.

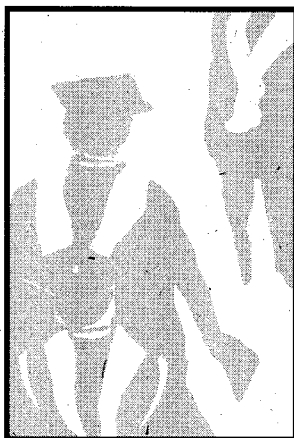
