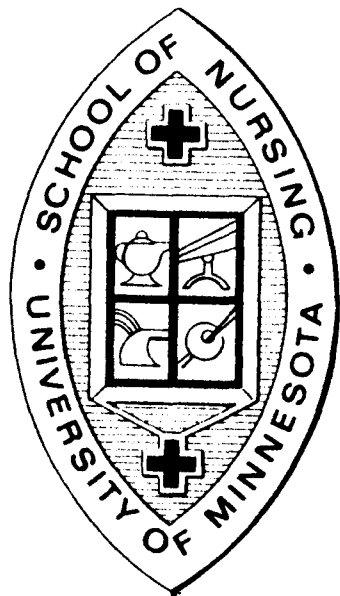

*Symbolism of School Pin. Figures on the seal:*

- 1) The antique lamp represents the metaphysical sciences;
- 2) The telescope represents the physical sciences;
- 3) The plow represents the industrial arts;
- 4) The artist's palette represents the fine arts.

The crosses above and below the figures are St. Georges crosses, which have stood for "unselfish service" for centuries. This pin has been the symbol of our School of Nursing since September 1913.
