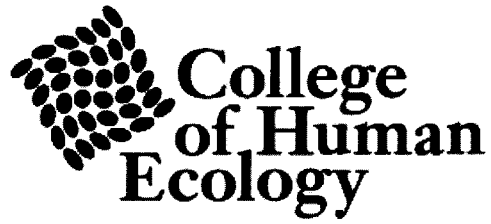

Candidates for Degrees

This program contains the names of College of Human Ecology students who have applied to graduate from fall semester 2003 through summer 2004. This is not an official University of Minnesota graduation list.

To graduate with *distinction*, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher at graduation. To graduate with *high distinction*, a student must have a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher. Graduation with designated Latin honors (*cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, *summa cum laude*) is limited to students who participate in the College of Human Ecology Upper Division Honors Program. Students must complete at least two academic honors learning opportunities, a capstone project, and in their last 60 University of Minnesota credits maintain a 3.50 GPA for *cum laude*, a 3.66 GPA for *magna cum laude*, and a 3.75 GPA for *summa cum laude* honors. Candidates for academic honors are noted in this program.

Φ Phi Upsilon Omicron is a national honor society recognizing and encouraging achieved excellence in scholarship, leadership, and service in the fields of family and consumer sciences. It was founded on February 10, 1909 here at the University of Minnesota (the alpha chapter) and is represented today by more than 60 collegiate chapters and 40 alumni chapters with 80,000 members. Phi Upsilon Omicron members are denoted in the program with Φ after their name.
