Curtis Sampson

Curtis (Curt) A. Sampson has been chairman, president and CEO of Communications Systems, Inc. (CSI) since its founding in 1970. CSI manufactures and markets telecommunications products and specialty voice and data connector products. From its headquarters in Hector, Minnesota, the company operates manufacturing and assembly plants in Minnesota, Indiana, Manitoba (Canada), Puerto Rico, and Wales (U.K.).

Mr. Sampson is also chairman and CEO of Hector Communications Corporation, which was formed when CSI spun off its investment in independent telephone companies, cellular telephone interests and cable TV. Hector Communications and Communications Systems, Inc., are publicly held and traded on NASDAQ.

A native of Hector, Minnesota, Mr. Sampson graduated from the University of Minnesota with a degree in accounting in 1955. He worked for a short time with Peat, Marwick & Mitchell Co. as an auditor, and then joined a small independent telephone company in Hector. This enterprise eventually grew to become North American Communications Corporation, of which Mr. Sampson became Executive Vice President and General Manager. The company was acquired by Continental Telephone Corporation in 1970.

Since founding Communications Systems, Inc. in 1970, Mr. Sampson has successfully guided the company through a number of acquisitions, spinoffs, and other strategic moves. CSI is now positioned as the high quality, low cost provider of telephone and data connection devices, having capitalized on every change in the industry. It shares market leadership with AT&T.

Mr. Sampson is active in industry, community, and church affairs, serving on various national, regional, and local committees and boards. He and his wife, Marian, have four children and six grandchildren.
