ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. The Computing Center will journal voucher the departments that have utilized our services during the month of June, in the week beginning with June 25th. In this manner, all business activities will be cleared before the fiscal year 1972-1973 comes to an end. Our year-ending cutoff will be on Friday, June 22nd, at 12:30 A.M. --- all activity thereafter will be processed at the end of July as fiscal 1973-1974 business.
