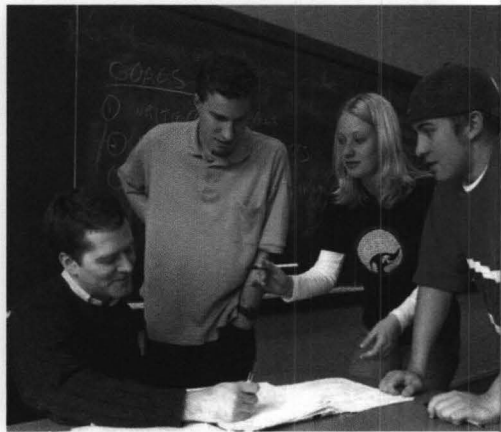
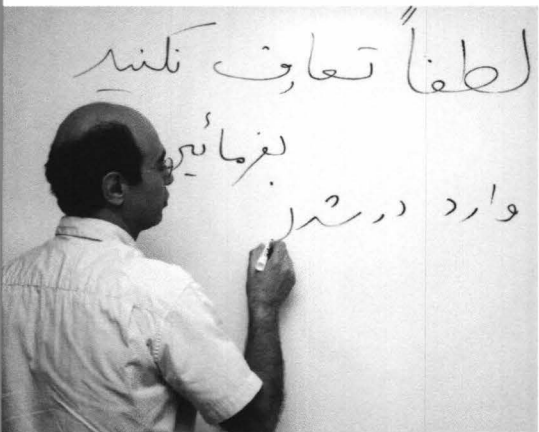
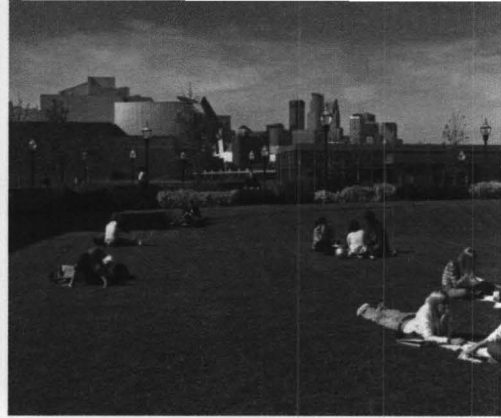

> **ACADEMIC COSTUME**

Academic gowns date back to the 14th century, when they served two functions of nearly equal importance: to indicate the academic rank of the wearer and to keep the scholar warm in the drafty stone halls of academia.

The markings, cut, and colors of the modern-day academic costume—cap, gown, and sometimes hood—indicate the academic degree, the field of study, and the institution that granted the degree. At commencement ceremonies those who already have a doctoral degree wear hoods. Degree candidates wear the gowns appropriate for the degrees they are about to receive, and new doctorates are hooded on stage.

Bachelor's degree gowns are black and untrimmed. A tassel hanging from the mortar board worn on the head is color-coded by college at the University of Minnesota. The College of Liberal Arts tassel is white. Honors graduates wear a medallion adorned with a maroon and gold ribbon.

Master's degree gowns, black and untrimmed, have pointed sleeves. Doctoral gowns in the United States traditionally have been black with velvet front facings and crossbars on the sleeves but in recent years a number of universities have adopted gowns of distinctive school colors.

The Minnesota hood, which may be worn by anyone with a doctoral degree from the University of Minnesota, is black with maroon chevron on gold. Each institution has its own pattern of colors on the hood, worn around the neck and down the back of the gown. The length and shape of the hood identify the most advanced degree the wearer has earned, and the velvet edging shows the field: blue for doctor of philosophy, light blue for doctor of education, and pink for doctor of musical arts.

> **THE MACE**

The University of Minnesota mace was carried for the first time in 1961 by Regents' Professor of Physics Alfred O.C. Nier at the inauguration of President O. Meredith Wilson. Art professor Philip Morton designed the mace: a crystal sphere four inches in diameter surmounted by the North Star, symbol of the state of Minnesota, on a solid aluminum handle set with the University regents' seal.

> **THE NORTHROP ORGAN**

Comprising 108 ranks of pipes, the Northrop Memorial Auditorium organ is not only one of the largest organs in the Upper Midwest but also one of the finest examples in the United States of a late-Romantic concert-hall organ. Built in 1932, the organ is located in the ceiling of the auditorium, above the stage and behind the proscenium, and is played from a console on an elevator platform in the orchestra pit. The University of Minnesota, ranked among the nation's top public universities, reflects the State of Minnesota's strong and enduring commitment to education. It is nearly unique among universities in the United States in its three defining characteristics:

- It is an international research university.
- It is a public land-grant institution with a strong tradition of education and public service.
- Its largest campus—the Twin Cities campus—is located in a vibrant metropolitan area comprising of not one, but two great cities: Minneapolis and St. Paul.

The University is the primary center in Minnesota (and much of the Upper Midwest) for education and research in the liberal arts and sciences, health sciences, law, education, engineering, agriculture, and natural resources. The Twin Cities campus comprises 19 colleges and offers a full range of academic and professional degrees. A comprehensive campus in Duluth offers undergraduate and graduate programs. The Morris campus offers a four-year liberal arts program. Crookston offers associate and baccalaureate degrees in technical, career-oriented programs. The Rochester campus provides graduate and undergraduate degrees, with a special focus on health sciences and biotechnology. Through the Minnesota Extension Service, the University is present in each of Minnesota's 87 counties.

When the University was founded as a preparatory school in 1851, Minnesota had been a territory for just

two years, and statehood was still seven years away. The school was built on little more than the pioneers' faith in education. In its early years, the University struggled financially; during the Civil War, it was forced to close. It reopened in 1867, thanks to the energetic leadership of Governor John S. Pillsbury, who came to be known as the "Father of the University." Mathematics Professor William Watts Folwell became the University's first president in 1869. Robert Bruininks is the University's 15th president.

Two students received bachelor of arts degrees at the first commencement in June 1873. Since then, the University has granted nearly 600,000 degrees.

University alumni include eight Nobel Prize winners, 15 of Minnesota's 39 governors, a former chief justice of the United States Supreme Court, two former U.S. vice presidents, the heads of Fortune 500 companies, pioneers in medicine, civil rights leaders, top journalists, distinguished teachers and scholars, performing artists, and countless other men and women who have achieved distinction in every field.

Alumni, their families, and friends are always welcome at the University. We invite you to visit campus regularly to enjoy the many educational, cultural, and entertainment opportunities that are open to the public—including performances by students in CLA's vibrant arts programs. THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

With some 17,000 undergraduate and graduate students, The College of Liberal Arts (CLA) prepares more students than any other college at the University of Minnesota—in fact, more than any other college in the State of Minnesota, public or private.

Students are taught by approximately 550 permanent faculty members—teachers and researchers of international stature—and they can choose from more than 60 majors or design their own cross-disciplinary program.

Most CLA students complete their undergraduate education in the college. Others complete their basic liberal arts coursework in CLA, then transfer to another unit of the University. The college offers strong pre-professional programs with close ties to the University's health sciences and other professional schools.

Since the University's earliest days, the liberal arts have been its essence and academic core.

This is because, as William Watts Folwell, first president of this land-grant University, put it, they “enrich and emancipate communities.” They prepare thoughtful citizens by posing difficult questions about the nature and meaning of our lives, and by addressing some of the most important issues that confront our nation and the world.

Examples are easy to find. We need to understand history, culture, religion, and language to appreciate and navigate the shifting ground of diplomacy and politics; leaders who lack that understanding affect war and peace around the world. We need to understand economics to survive in the current climate; economics without ethics

has led to a worldwide recession. Justice and equality, belief and truth, the beauty of the written word, a work of art, a musical passage—these equip us to create a meaningful life, a life worth living.

Liberal arts graduates can challenge accepted paradigms, create bold new ideas or artistic works, view issues from multiple perspectives. They can develop hypotheses and collect data, reason soundly about complex questions, and, above all, communicate clearly and ethically.

By choosing a liberal arts education they have prepared themselves for a life-long, self-motivated voyage of discovery. They know there are no pat answers to be found in the back of the book—but are prepared to create, critique, synthesize, and defend their own independent thinking. They can know themselves from the standpoint of other times, people, and cultures, which makes them less egocentric—and more able to live in a world where people must get along together.

Today's graduates are likely to lead nomadic lives of short-term jobs—some of which have not even been invented yet—and multiple careers. But the liberal arts have provided them solid grounding across disciplines, centuries, cultures, and geographic boundaries, and in research, ways of thinking and communication skills—the very best preparation for life in a rapidly changing world.

NARAYANA KOCHERLAKOTA

PRESIDENT, MINNEAPOLIS FEDERAL RESERVE BANK

Keynote Speaker

In October 2009, Narayana Kocherlakota, then a professor of economics at the University of Minnesota's College of Liberal Arts, became the 12th president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis.

In that role he helps determine monetary policy for the nation, supervises numerous banking organizations, and provides a variety of payments services to financial institutions and the U.S. government.

For some 40 years there has been strong interplay between researchers from the U of M's internationally top-ranked Department of Economics and the real-world policy-makers at the "Fed," with econ professors (more than half of them) and graduate students collaborating with the Fed on questions of macroeconomic theory and monetary and fiscal policy. Kocherlakota belongs to that tradition.

He believes that progress in economics demands rigorous discipline and an often highly technical dialogue between data and theory. "Few if any important questions in economics can be addressed with data or theory alone," he says. "Good answers require that the two be used together."

Narayana Kocherlakota was born October 12, 1963, in Baltimore, Maryland. He entered Princeton at 15 and graduated four years later (1983) with an A.B. in mathematics. He received his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago in 1987 on the topic of pricing financial assets, incorporating new kinds of consumer preferences and, analyzing how risky payoffs influence attitudes.



As chair of the economics department, he led a recruiting effort that increased the number of professors from 15 to 25 and, according to *U.S. News and World Report*, improved the department's national rank from 15th to 10th among the nation's graduate economics programs.

Kocherlakota has published more than 30 articles in academic journals, including *Econometrica*, *Journal of Political Economy*, *Journal of Economic Theory*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, and *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking*. His

work includes theoretical and empirical contributions to macroeconomics, monetary economics, financial economics, and public finance.

He has authored a forthcoming book from Princeton University Press, *The New Dynamic Public Finance*, which describes an approach to tax design pioneered by him and others over the past decade.

"For an economist who has spent his career working on issues related to macroeconomics, monetary policy, and finance," says Kocherlakota, "there can hardly be a better job than president of a Federal Reserve Bank."

The Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis is responsible for the Ninth Federal Reserve District, which includes Montana, North and South Dakota, Minnesota, northwestern Wisconsin, and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

JULIE SCHUMACHER

PROFESSOR, ENGLISH

*Horace T. Morse - University of Minnesota Alumni Association Award
for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education*



Describe yourself without using any form of the words "to be," "to have," "to look" or "to seem."

Describe a body of water without using the letter E.

These aren't ordinary brain teasers; they are eclectic writing exercises English professor and Morse award-winner Julie Schumacher uses in her creative writing courses designed to encourage imaginative, rigorous, independent thinking.

But Schumacher's inventive teaching tools don't end with brain teasers.

She introduces her students to guest speakers who are the essence of imaginative thinkers. Students find themselves in class with Garrison Keillor one day, Newbury Award winning author of young adult fiction Kate DiCamillo the next week, then Walter Mondale....

Schumacher also developed the hugely popular "ArtWords" contest, for which students write poems, stories, or essays in response to works in the Weisman Art Museum's permanent collection. The student writing is judged by a panel. The winning writers are honored at a ceremony, and their works are displayed next to the art that inspired them.

"Professor Schumacher's work surely ranks as among the finest, most dazzling, most intellectually and artistically rich currently being done in undergraduate education," says Geoffrey Sirc, professor and chair of the department of English.

One of Professor Schumacher's most outstanding contributions to undergraduate education lies in the way she re-designed the Introduction to Creative Writing course. Now more popular than ever, the course draws

over 500 undergraduates a year from all corners of campus.

"This course deserves an award of its own," says colleague and award-winning author Patricia Hampl. "I have visited the Introduction to Creative Writing course several times when Julie has been in charge, and each time I'm amazed—and grateful—to see the beautiful work she does and that she elicits from others."

Schumacher served as director of the Creative Writing Program most recently from 2006 to 2009. Under her stewardship, the

program catapulted in the rankings to become one of the top 10 creative writing programs in the country.

"Julie is uniquely attuned to the needs of undergraduates," says creative writing coordinator Kathleen Glasgow. "She knows what makes them tick, what makes them happy, what they need that they can't yet articulate. She's invested not only in their undergraduate education at the University of Minnesota, but in their real world education; what they study now, and how they study it, will impact everything they do once they leave our leafy, green campus."

Her students often testify that Schumacher's advising doesn't stop at graduation. She helps them apply for Fulbrights, draft book proposals, write letters to literary agents, apply to graduate school, and even craft book jacket blurbs.

Says one of her students, "Julie not only showed me how to improve my stories—she taught me how to read like a writer, which is ever more important. This gift is inexhaustible."

WALTER R. JACOBS III

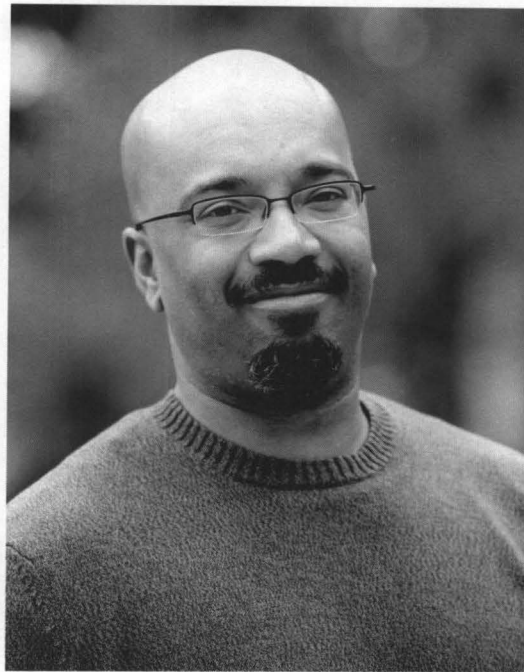
Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award

College of Liberal Arts faculty members have enormous amounts of expertise in something—Baroque art, Latin, or 20th century warfare, for example. But few of them have expertise in how students learn. And while they are teaching they are unlikely to reveal too much about their personal background. This is what makes the Walt Jacobs experience so unusual and wonderful for his lucky students.

Professor Walt Jacobs is a sociologist who is interested in critical pedagogy and popular culture. His research focus has been on what helps students learn, especially students of color, and he puts his findings into practice with his students at the U. One of his goals is to teach his students media literacy—analyzing critically what they read, hear, and see—without reducing their enjoyment of the media. He encourages his students to learn how to tell their own stories as a way of influencing how the media in turn portrays them.

To that end, his class *Digital Storytelling In and With Communities of Color* engages students in ways they don't expect. In order to get their creative juices flowing, Jacobs shares his own story with them, a video version of his memoir, *Ghostbox*, which revealed very personal accounts of his childhood. That moment of sharing has had a profound influence on his students. As one student recounted, "The bravery that Dr. Jacobs exemplified proved to be contagious and his willingness to share such a story helped to establish a very tight-knit relationship between everyone in the class."

This connection with his students, and more, earned Jacobs many enthusiastic nominations for the Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award.



In addition to teaching, Jacobs serves as chair of the Department of African American and African Studies, where his duties include the everyday troubleshooting of student issues. This brings him into contact with even more undergraduates, and his impact is no less here. The department's students routinely praise Jacobs for his accessibility, which comes as a surprise to them in such a large university.

"He is never too busy to sit down to listen," and "The way that he personally invests himself in his students' success, and is accessible and open to them is what makes him an amazing professor," are typical examples of their praise of him.

Naturally, Jacobs says students are the reason he is here at the U. "My job is to help students explore their potential. I'm happy to help them see the possibilities in their lives and the implications for making some choices and not others." This philosophy is played out in numerous examples: the student who found his perfect major after encountering Jacobs on the bus; the student who aspires to be a teacher thanks to the support he received from Jacobs; the former "battle rapper" who now uses his music as a tool for education and debate. The numbers of students who have found their true direction thanks to Jacobs are too innumerable to count.

It's probably one of today's graduating students who sums it up the best: "He has a big vision for his students, and I believe he understands that teaching in the classroom while practicing great leadership is what helps undergraduate students the most."

PATRICK MCNAMARA

ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, HISTORY

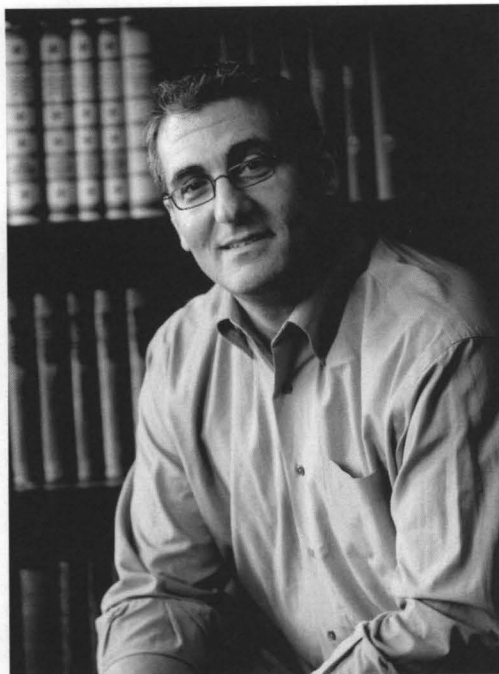
Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award

Not many history students get to take a class from a professor who actually lived the history he's teaching. But that's the case for students who study 20th century Latin American history with Professor Patrick McNamara. As a college student in the mid 1980s, McNamara lived and worked in Costa Rica, Nicaragua, El Salvador, and Guatemala. Interning with a journalist, McNamara witnessed some of the history-making civil wars, and their aftermaths, that rocked Latin America during that period.

One of the students who nominated McNamara for a Arthur "Red" Motley Exemplary Teaching Award said that his sharing of his own photographs and news clippings, "as well as retelling the adventures he lived while working in Central America," makes the history come to life in the classroom.

McNamara's adventures as an undergraduate now influence his own students. Few professors have advised and encouraged as many Undergraduate Research Opportunities Program (UROP) projects and study abroad experiences as McNamara; in CLA, he is easily in the top 10 faculty advisers for UROP's, and he routinely takes on two or three students each year.

"When I was an undergraduate I was able to work closely with professors, and that's what I enjoyed most," says McNamara. "When I was in Central America I did my own research projects and wrote papers for professors. I think the UROP is a win-win for the professor and student. The students do tremendous work."



Latin American history is not McNamara's only academic love. He has also been a crusader in the new field of disability studies. This interest is particularly personal; McNamara's son has muscular dystrophy, so as McNamara says, "I think about it every day. My interest in disability studies will never be purely intellectual." The U does not yet have a program in disability studies, but that hasn't stopped a number of undergrad and graduate students from pursuing research in this field; a staunch advocate such as McNamara has made their

progress much more meaningful and productive, and even influenced some students' decisions to come to Minnesota.

McNamara's engagement with his students is extraordinary, and is central to his work as a professor. And his students take notice. They praise him uniformly for his commitment to them, his ability to create a safe space to debate and discuss course material, and his "peculiar strength for pulling students toward civic involvement." And as his students move on, they take what they've learned from him and apply it to their careers. One former graduate student who is now an assistant professor at a small college says she is trying to thank McNamara by "paying it forward," by investing in her own students the way McNamara did in her.

"My teaching is not just a job," McNamara says. "I've dedicated my life to it."

LIBERAL ARTS DEGREES

The College of Liberal Arts offers five bachelor's degrees—bachelor of arts (B.A.), bachelor of individualized studies (B.I.S.), bachelor of fine arts (B.F.A.), bachelor of music (B.M.), and bachelor of science (B.S.). The bachelor's degrees have many requirements in common.

DEGREE CANDIDATES

Degrees and degree candidates are listed alphabetically in this program. Subject to successful completion, degrees will be conferred on those students listed below and on others meeting all curriculum requirements for graduation. Degree candidates may graduate with Latin Honors or Distinction or both. Honors citations are provisional and do not become official until all requirements for the award indicated are fulfilled.

LATIN HONORS AWARDS—*Cum laude*, *magna cum laude*, and *summa cum laude* graduates complete honors requirements, including research leading to an honors thesis project in their major. Students graduating *cum laude* have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50 for the last 60 graded credits at UMTC. *Magna cum laude* awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.66 and *summa cum laude* awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.75 on the final 60 graded credits at UMTC.

DEGREES WITH DISTINCTION—Students earn graduation “with Distinction” or “with High Distinction” based on cumulative grade point average at the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities with at least 60 graded credits completed at UMTC. Students graduating “with Distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation; students graduating “with High Distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation.

OTHER AWARDS—Students graduating with the Community Engagement Scholar distinction have completed at least nine credits of service-learning course work, at least 400 hours of community service, and a series of reflective pieces. 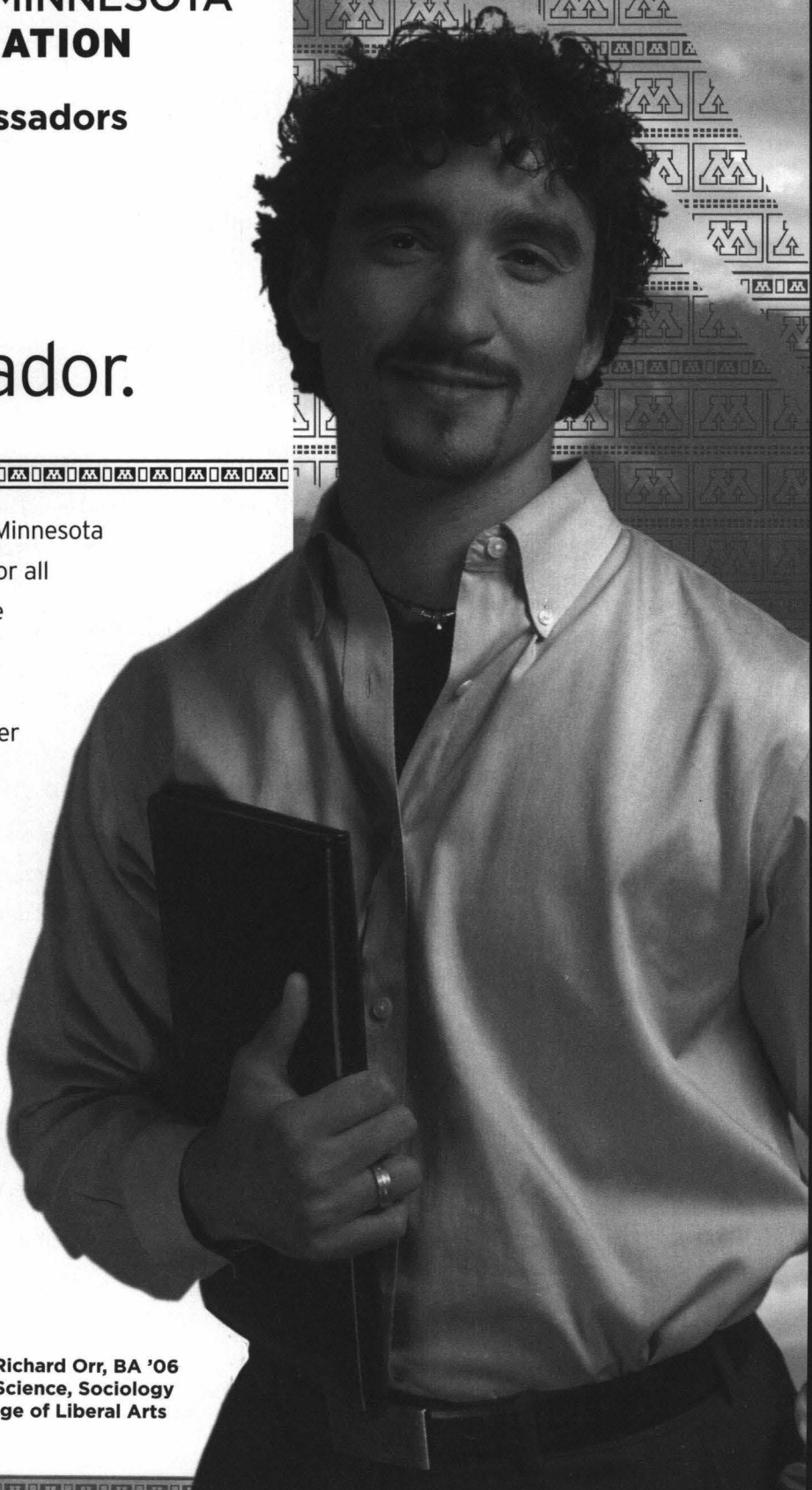

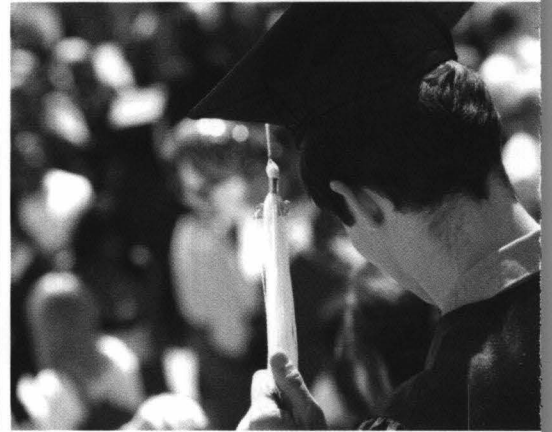
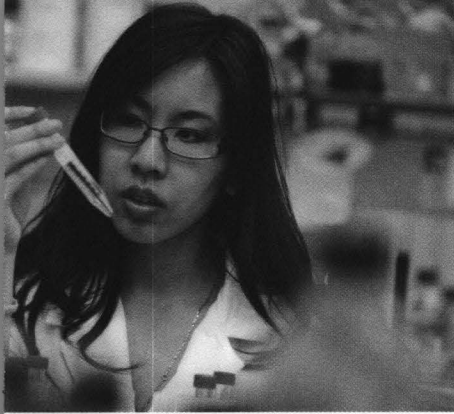
