 ly important because it illustrated a
 very definite trend toward full depart-
 mental reports and special group studies
 of our own patients. There has been a
 sharp decline in individual case reports,
 even though the literature which accom-
 panied them may have been very full and
 complete. There have been many variations
 in the manner of presenting the staff
 meetings, but, during the past ten years,
 there has been a definite trend towards
 department and individual responsibility.
 This has brought out a spirit of coopera-
 tion which is not equalled elsewhere.
 The administration of this hospital thanks
 all who during this past year have made
 these meetings a success. They have been
 literally a common ground for all depart-
 ments to come and present their material,
 and the large groups of interested phy-
 sicians each week attest to the efficiency
 and popularity of the method.

IV. TEN YEARS AGO

June 1, 1929

Luncheon meeting of staff and interns was held at 12:30 p.m. with 30 present, including the dean of the Medical School, the Superintendent of the Hospital, chiefs-of-staff, staff, and interns. Dr. O'Brien was chairman and made a few introductory remarks.

The report of deaths for May, 1929 was given with an open discussion of each case. The surgical staff reported wound infections and what they were doing to combat same.

Considerable interest was aroused in the statistical report giving number of patients admitted, discharged, died, and autopsied. The average number of days per patient on each service also proved interesting.

The problem of private patients and physician fees was explained and discussed by those informed on the question. Then followed open discussion on general subjects. The meeting adjourned, the next one to be held June 13, 1929.
