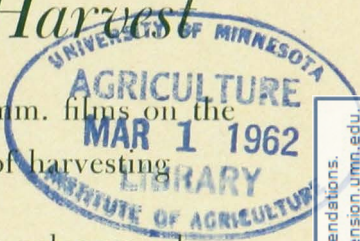

Make It A Safe Harvest is the *first* film of its kind in the field of farm safety. It was made possible by a grant from Group Health Mutual Inc. of St. Paul.

The film deals with hazards of the harvest season that frequently cause serious injury or loss of life. Five specific areas are covered:

- Transmission of power
- Cutting and processing
- Transportation
- Storage of the crop
- Fueling

Considerable emphasis is also placed on the responsibility of the farm machine operator in preventing harvest accidents.

Glenn Prickett, farm safety specialist of the University of Minnesota, served as technical adviser throughout the production. The script was prepared by Mr. Prickett and Gerald McKay, Agricultural Extension visual aids specialist.

Approximately 20 farm machines, including hay balers, choppers, mowers, combines, elevators, and wagons, are shown in operation. Specific danger areas are pointed out. In each case, ways to prevent accidents are illustrated—often by means of close-up photography.

John Anderson and Arthur Heinze, Minnesota farmers who lost both hands in farm accidents cooperated in the production of *Make It A Safe Harvest*. They helped set up situations that show common causes of accidents.

WHERE TO USE THE FILM *Make It A Safe Harvest*

1. In 4-H Club meetings to increase interest in safety projects.
2. For adult audiences who are carrying on a farm safety campaign.
3. In Farm Bureau, Farmers Union, Grange, and similar meetings of rural groups.
4. For meetings of Rotary, Lions, Kiwanis, and other service clubs.

5. In vocational agriculture classes—in-school, young farmers, and evening school groups.
6. In meetings sponsored by farm machinery dealers.
7. For annual meetings of co-ops, etc.
8. In college classes on farm machinery.

1. What harvest accidents have occurred in your community?
2. What was the cause of these accidents?
3. What community safety activities are being carried out in your community?
4. What can you do individually and as a group to bring about a decrease in harvest accidents?
5. What have manufacturers of farm machinery done for safe operation?
6. What are the state laws regarding pulling farm machinery on the highway?
7. Who are the officers in your farm safety council?
8. Can you interest a committee in "Human Resource Conservation?"
