The Golden Gophers will depart for Worcester, Mass., on Thursday morning, March 22 and will be headquartered at the Holiday Inn. NCAA Bound

The Golden Gophers will make their return to the NCAA Tournament this weekend. After 13 consecutive appearances, Minnesota did not make the tourney from 1998 to 2000. The Golden Gophers have won five straight opening games in regional play, but in four of those years, Minnesota was eliminated in the second game (1995).

HEADING EAST

The Golden Gophers will make their first trip east of the state of Michigan since October of 1999 when the team traveled to Maine to open the 1999-2000 season.

Series Notes: This will be the 21st meeting between Minnesota and Maine • the Black Bears lead the all-time series 10-8-0 • the two teams met last year with host Maine sweeping the Golden Gophers (5-3, 5-4) • the Black Bears have won eight of the past nine meetings.

Vs. Maine in the NCAAs: Minnesota and Maine have met in the NCAA Tournament five times. The Black Bears hold a 4-1 edge in tournament play. Maine defeated Minnesota 6-2 in the 1993 East Regional final in Worcester, Mass. In 1991, the Black Bears took a pair from the Golden Gophers in the quarterfinals (4-0, 5-3). Minnesota's lone victory was a 7-4 decision in the 1989 NCAA Semifinals in St. Paul, Minn. The Golden Gophers finished second to Harvard that season.

Head Coach: Shawn Walsh is in his 17th season at the helm of the Maine hockey program. He owns a career record of 398-214-44 with the Black Bears. His teams have won two NCAA titles.

Hauser vs. the Black Bears: Junior goaltender Adam Hauser has faced Maine just once in his career. In the first game of the 1999-2000 campaign, the Black Bears prevailed over the visiting Golden Gophers 5-3. Hauser stopped 26-of-31 shots in defeat.

Minnesota vs. Hockey East: The Golden Gophers are 67-41-3 (.617) against teams from Hockey East. The only teams Minnesota has not faced from the league are UMass-Amherst and Merrimack. In the NCAA Tournament, the Golden Gophers have a 16-13 edge.

News & Notes

Minnesota Goes Winless in WCHA Final Five: Seeded third in the tournament, Minnesota was defeated by St. Cloud State 3-0 in the semifinals of the WCHA Final Five at the Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul. The Golden Gophers were held scoreless on nine power-play opportunities. In Saturday's third-place game vs. Colorado College, Minnesota fell to the Tigers by a score of 5-4. It was the first time this season that the Golden Gophers had two power-play goals and lost (16-0-1).

Head Coach Don Lucia: Golden Gopher Head Coach Don Lucia has a career coaching record of 326-186-32 (.629) in 13-plus seasons behind the bench. At Minnesota, he owns a 47-31-4 mark (.598). Including this season, his teams have won 20 or more games in each of the past nine seasons. Lucia's teams are 0-6-2 vs. Maine and 1-3-0 against Boston College.

New Experiences: Three of the 12 teams (Minnesota, Mercyhurst, Providence) enter this weekend without a single player that has experienced the NCAA Tournament. The nine other teams were all a part of the 2000 tourney. While the Golden Gopher have not been to the postseason since 1997, the Friars were ousted by Minnesota in the 1996 Regional in its last appearance. Mercyhurst is making its first-ever appearance.

Leopold Named Hobey Baker Finalist: Junior defenseman Jordan Leopold became the first Golden Gopher since Mike Crowley to be named a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award. He is the 13th Minnesota player to be named a finalist. Leopold was also named the WCHA Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the first Golden Gophers to receive the honor in the 10 years since the award's inception. He is the first Golden Gopher since 1996-97 to be named to the league's first-team (Steve DeBus, Mike Crowley).

Relying on Westy: When senior captain Erik Westrum leads offensively, the Golden Gophers have proven to be virtually unbeatable. In nine of the 13 league series this year (including the playoffs), he has had three or more points in the two-game set. In those games, Minnesota is 17-0-1. In the four WCHA series when he has totaled two or less points, the Golden Gophers are just 3-8-1.

With two goals and an assist vs. Colorado College, Erik Westrum moved into 15th place on the school's all-time scoring list with 165 points. He can move into a tie for 14th place with Ryan Kraft (1994-98) with just one more point.

Special Teams: Minnesota was 13-0-1 when scoring a power-play goal in the first period, but lost to Colorado College last Saturday despite scoring with the man-advantage in the opening period • The Golden Gophers allowed the Tigers to score two power-play goals which was the first time an opponent had been able to accomplish that since Dec. 30, a span of 21 games • The Golden Gopher penalty kill paces the league at 89.5 percent (196-of-219) • The school record for best penalty-kill percentage in a season is .863 in 1983-84 • Since going 22-for-61 (36.1 percent) on the power-play during its nine-game win streak, the Golden Gophers have gone 6-for-56 (10.7 percent).

The Specialist: Freshman Grant Potulny found his niche early on in Gold Country. In only his second collegiate game, the Grand Forks, N.D., native tallied a pair of power-play goals at Bemidji State. Entering the NCAA Tournament, Potulny now owns 15 power-play goals, a total that leads the nation. That is the most since Brian Bonin had 12 in 1995-96 when he took home the Hobey Baker award. His 20 goals this season is the eighth-best total for a freshman in school history and ranks just behind Neal Broten's total of 21 from the 1978-79 season.

Saving the Day: Minnesota is 20-1-0 when the goaltenders have a save percentage of .900 or better. The lone loss was on Nov. 24 against Michigan State (3-2 loss, Hauser - 28 saves). Conversely, the Golden Gophers are just 7-11-2 when it drops below .900.

Out of the Gates: In Minnesota's last 18 games, the team that has scored first has won the game. In that span, the Golden Gophers are 12-6-0. On the season, Minnesota is 22-3-1 when finding the back of the net first. The three losses came in a span of four games against Michigan State, Michigan and Denver.

Two-Year Turnaround: Minnesota's seven-win improvement from Don Lucia's first to second year as head coach is tied for the second-best improvement in school history. Glen Sonmor's team won 10 more games from his first season in 1966-67 to his second in 1967-68. Herb Brooks and Brad Buetow had seven-win improvements, as well.

Different Day, Different Results: Minnesota is 10-8-0 this season on Fridays, and 16-4-2 on Saturdays • the Golden Gophers average 3.2 goals on Friday, and 4.9 on Saturdays • Minnesota's power-play operates at 18.2 percent on Friday, and 30.4 on Saturday • Minnesota is outscoring opponents 19-18 in the first period on Fridays, and 31-8 in the first on Saturdays.

Freshmen Phenoms: This year's freshmen class came in with high expectations and, needless to say, has exceeded them. Offensively, this is the most prolific group of newcomers at Minnesota since the incoming class in 1987-88. With three less games played than the group in '87-88, this year's group of rookies could surpass that total. The following is a breakdown:

Senior Motivation: While the senior class of Erik Westrum, Dylan Mills, Stuart Senden, Matt Leimbek and Aaron Miskovich lacks the experience of participating in the NCAA Tournament, the group will be counted on this weekend in Worcester. The seniors avoided becoming the first class since 1970 to never reach the NCAA Tournament.

Freshman Phenoms, Part II: Three of the Golden Gopher freshmen (Grant Potulny, Troy Riddle and Paul Martin) were named to the WCHA All-Rookie team last week. Martin joins Jordan Leopold, Ben Clymer, Mike Crowley and Chris McAlpine as Golden Gopher defensemen named to the league's All-Rookie team. The three selections for one team is tied for the most in a single-season for a WCHA team. North Dakota placed three on the team in 1997-98 (Karl Goehring, Trevor Hammer and Jeff Panzer). That class went on to win three WCHA titles and an NCAA Championship.

Minnesota and the Tournament: The Golden Gophers lead all WCHA teams with 24 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. Minnesota has won three NCAA titles and pace all league teams with 39 tournament wins and 16 top-four finishes.

On The Road Again: The Golden Gophers are just 9-8-1 away from the friendly confines of Mariucci Arena. Minnesota is 18-4-1 in its home arena. Junior netminder Adam Hauser has fashioned an impressive 17-4-1 mark at home with a 2.12 goals-against-average and a .912 save percentage. On the road, he is 9-7-1 with a 2.92 gaa and .893 save percentage. Both of his shutouts though, have been on the road.

Series Note

The Golden Gophers and Black Bears last met in the East Regional Final on March 27, 1993, in Worcester, Mass. Top-ranked Maine defeated Minnesota 6-2 and advanced to the NCAA Final Four. The Golden Gophers entered the game on a 9-0-2 tear. The Black Bears capitalized on four of its six power-play opportunities in the victory. Paul Kariya had a goal and two assists and Hobey Baker finalist Joe Montgomery added two goals and two assists. Andy Brink and Scott Bell tallied goals for the Golden Gophers.
