THE SERIES VS. PURDUE: Purdue leads the all-time series 76-65 • Minnesota owns a 43-26 edge in 79 games at Minneapolis • a total of 12 games between 1993-94 and 1998-99 have been removed from Minnesota records - Purdue was 9-3 in those games • the series dates back to Jan. 25, 1904, with Minnesota winning the first seven and nine of the first 10 meetings

LAST SEASON VS. PURDUE: The Boilermakers won both games last season, defeating the Golden Gophers in Minneapolis (74-69 - Jan. 19) before a convincing win at West Lafayette (97-61 - Feb. 19) • poor free-throw shooting (7-for-22 as a team) was Minnesota's downfall in the five-point loss at home, while 28 turnovers on the road was key in the loss at Purdue • guard Terrance Simmons scored 13 points in both games, while Dusty Rychart averaged 13.5 in the two games (19 points in the home game)

FIRST OF THREE IN A ROW AT HOME: Wednesday's game at home against the Boilermakers is the first of three straight at Williams Arena for the Golden Gophers. Minnesota will host Indiana (Saturday, 11:17 a.m.) and Iowa (Jan. 24, 7 p.m.) before playing three of its next four games on the road.

THE COACHES: Golden Gopher Head Coach **Dan Monson** is in his second season in Gold Country with a career record of 77-36 (.681), including a 25-19 (.568) mark in his first two seasons at the University of Minnesota. Monson guided Gonzaga to the 1999 NCAA Elite Eight and spent a total of 11 seasons at the school as an assistant, associate head and head coach before coming to Minnesota. Purdue Head Coach **Gene Keady** is in his 21st season with the Boilermakers and 23rd season as a head coach at the Division I level. He has a coaching record of 440-191 (.697) at Purdue and 478-210 (.695) overall. Keady is in his 36th season of coaching including his prep and junior college seasons at Beloit High School (seven seasons), Hutchison J.C. (eight seasons) and Western Kentucky (two seasons).

Guard Arriel McDonald scored 10 points in the final 2:02 to lead the Golden Gophers to a 59-56 win over Purdue at Williams Arena. McDonald, who had scored just two points to that point of the game, hit two jump shots and went 6-for-6 from the free throw line to lead Minnesota to its second Big Ten win of the season. Forward Dana Jackson scored 10 points and pulled down seven rebounds.

MINNESOTA GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL

MINNESOTA'S LAST GAME: The Golden Gophers lost to Ohio State on Saturday, 75-72, in Columbus, Ohio. Senior guard Terrance Simmons scored 21 of his season-high 27 points in Minnesota's second-half comeback attempt. The Golden Gophers trailed by as much as 23 points with 15:15 remaining and by 10 points with 2:00 left.

PURDUE'S LAST GAME: The Boilermakers were defeated by Iowa, 83-73, on Saturday afternoon in West Lafayette, Ind.

SEE YA NEXT WEEKEND: Minnesota and Purdue will become very familiar with each other during the next few weeks. The Golden Gophers will travel to West Lafayette, Ind. to battle the Boilermakers a mere 10 days after their meeting at Williams Arena (Jan. 27).

A TALE OF TWO HALVES: After a slow start Saturday, trailing 39-22 at half-time, Minnesota mounted a second-half charge with 50 points - cutting a 23-point Buckeye lead with 15:15 remaining to just one point (73-72) with 35 seconds left. The Golden Gophers forced 15 Buckeye turnovers in the second half and held OSU without a field goal for the final 5:00 of the game in nearly pulling off one of the greatest comebacks in school history.

EASY MATH: All 21 of Minnesota's free-throw attempts in the Ohio State game Saturday came in the second half. The Buckeyes attempted 16 first-half free throws while the Golden Gophers did not hit the free-throw line until the 16:23 mark of the second half.

BIG HALF: Senior guard Terrance Simmons scored 21 second-half points in Minnesota's comeback attempt Saturday at Ohio State, but it was not the most

points a Golden Gopher had scored in a half this season - junior forward Dusty Rychart scored 23 second-half points in Minnesota's win over Hawaii Pacific.

CLOSE SETBACK: Minnesota almost was able to stage its sixth win this season when trailing with 5:00 remaining on Saturday at Ohio State. The Golden Gophers are now 5-1 this season in games decided between 1-5 points. The Golden Gophers have won five games this season (Georgia, TCU, Florida State, Marquette and Nebraska) when trailing with 6:00 to play.

FIRST TIMERS: Minnesota became the first Big Ten team to reach 13 victories overall with its win over Wisconsin on Jan. 6. The Golden Gophers were also the first conference team to reach the 10, 11 and 12 win plateau. Michigan State became the first conference team to 13 wins with its overtime victory over Wisconsin on Saturday.

HIT EM WHEN THEY MATTER: Minnesota has made 10-of-12 (.833) free throws in "crunch time" during the last two games. During other portions of the last two games, the Golden Gophers have made just 15-of-29 (.517) from the line. On the season, the Golden Gophers have made 51-of-60 (.850) free throws in the final three minutes of games decided by 10 points or less - while making 218-of-333 (.655) from the line in other times of the game.

A few of the stats to consider - Minnesota has four players who have scored in double figures in 10 or 11 games this season • the Golden Gophers have five players who have led the team in scoring in at least two games this season • Minnesota has seven players who have led the team in rebounding this season • eight players attempted between four and seven shots in the Jan. 6 win over Wisconsin

FAMILIAR STARTS: Senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff has started all 36 games he has played in as a Golden Gopher, while junior forward Dusty Rychart has started 42 of his last 43 games, senior guard Terrance Simmons has started 42 of 44 games the last two seasons and sophomore guard Shane Schilling has started each of the last 22 games he has participated in (missed the Morris Brown game due to injury).

HOME SHOOTIN': Senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff is shooting 46-for-70 (.657) from the field at Williams Arena

this season. The Golden Gophers as a team are shooting 46 percent (237-for-514) from the floor at Williams Arena.

SCHILLING LEADS

BIG TEN: Sophomore Shane Schilling leads the Big Ten in three-point FG percentage (.512, 21-for-41) in all games. Schilling, who made all three treys he attempted and made 4-of-5 shots overall from the field in the team's win over #12 Wisconsin, is 14-of-24 (.583) from behind the three-point line at Williams Arena.

GIVING AND RECEIVING:

Minnesota committed a season-high 19 turnovers in Saturday's loss to Ohio State, but forced the Buckeyes into a season-high for a Golden Gopher opponent (24). Minnesota forced the five Buckeye starters alone into 22 miscues.

Get With The Program!!

The University of Minnesota men's basketball program announced the signing of five student-athletes to national letters of intent during the early national signing period.

Maurice Hargrow is a 6'4", 170-pound shooting guard who averaged 18 points, six assists and six rebounds per game last season for Highland Park High School in St. Paul, Minn. Hargrow, who is an explosive leaper who possesses a nice outside shooting touch, led the Scots to the Minnesota State Class 3A Championship in his sophomore season.

Jerry Holman is a 6'11", 220-pound power forward/center who averaged 13 points, seven rebounds and three blocks per game for Minneapolis Community and Technical College in Minneapolis, Minn. Holman is a tall, athletic player who will give the Golden Gophers much needed depth and an inside presence.

O'Neal Mims is a 6'8", 205-pound power forward from Reagan High School in Austin, Texas. Mims, who has grown seven inches in the last 18 months from 6'1" to his current height of 6'8", averaged 15 points and 12 rebounds per game in his junior prep season.

Rick Rickert is a 6'10", 210-pound forward from Duluth East High School in Duluth, Minn. Rickert is regarded by nearly every recruiting service as a top 10 national prospect. He averaged 28.8 points per game as a junior with a .566 field-goal percentage, .490 three-point percentage and .857 free-throw percentage. Rickert also averaged 15 rebounds and over five blocks per game last season for the Greyhounds.

Aaron Robinson is a 5'8", 165-pound point guard from Guilford High School in Rockford, Ill. Robinson averaged 15.3 points, 12 assists, six rebounds and four steals per game as a prep junior last season.

"We feel very good about the five student-athletes we've been able to secure during the fall signing period," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Dan Monson. "Obviously landing Rick was an outstanding day for Golden Gopher basketball. With Jerry we feel like we've addressed some of our needs to get bigger across the front line. O'Neal is a talented swingman who we feel will develop into an outstanding player once he has time to build his body to match his growth spurt and get stronger. Maurice and Aaron both bring a great deal of athleticism to our program, and we look forward to getting them into our system and developing their talents."

PROTECTING THE BALL:

Senior guard Terrance Simmons has committed just 12 turnovers in his last eight games and has only one turnover in five or his last six games at Williams Arena. Minnesota has committed fewer turnovers than its opponent in 11 of 16 games this season.

LATE GAME BOMBERS:

Minnesota is shooting 42 percent (60-for-144) from behind the three-point line in the second half of games this season compared to just 34 percent (53-for-156) in the first half. The trend continued at Ohio State on Saturday, with the Golden Gophers connecting on 7-of-17 three-pointers in the second half - including making four in the final 6:00 - after just 2-of-10 shooting in the first 20 minutes.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS:

Minnesota has not lost this season when they have won or tied the first 5:00 of the second half (11-0)

STIFF COMPETITION:

Minnesota's three losses this season are to teams that have a combined record of 38-10 this season (#11 Georgetown, #10 Illinois, Ohio State).

VARIETY OF WAYS: Minnesota has won games featuring varying styles of play this season. The point

total in the Golden Gophers' win against Wisconsin (54) was 53 points fewer than in the team's win over TCU (107). The following illustrates the points breakdown in Minnesota's 13 wins this season.
