THE SERIES VS. PENN STATE: Minnesota leads the all-time series 3-1 • a total of 12 games (Minnesota won eight) played from 1993-94 through 1998-99 were taken out of the Golden Gopher record books - making the "unofficial" series record 11-5 in favor of Minnesota • Minnesota has never lost to Penn State (eight games overall, two games officially) in games played at Williams Arena • Minnesota has won four of the last five unofficial regular-season meetings

LAST TIME VS. PENN STATE (Jan. 26, 2000): Forward Jarrett Stephens posted 24 points (11-for-15 shooting) and hauled in 13 rebounds to lead the Nittany Lions to an eight-point win at State College, Pa. • the Golden Gophers were able to stay close throughout the contest on the heels of 54 percent shooting (29-for-54) and a rebounding edge of 13 (40-27) over the home team • the difference in the game turned out to be the Nittany Lions shooting 13 more free throws (27-14) and cashing in 10 (20-10) more than Minnesota

LAST TIME AT WILLIAMS ARENA (Jan. 9, 1999): Freshman Joel Przybilla scored 17 points, grabbed 13 rebounds and blocked five shots to lead the #16 Golden Gophers to a 75-60 win • forward Quincy Lewis led all scorers with 24 points • Minnesota expanded an eight-point halftime lead by holding Penn State to 9-for-36 (.250) shooting in the second half

THE COACHES: Golden Gopher Head Coach Dan Monson is in his second season in Gold Country with a career record of 80-41 (.661), including a 28-24 (.538) mark in his first two seasons at the University of Minnesota. Monson guided Gonzaga to the 1999 NCAA Elite Eight and spent a total of 11 seasons at the school as an assistant, associate head and head coach before coming to Minnesota. Penn State Head Coach Jerry Dunn is in his sixth season as a head coach with the Nittany Lions. He has a coaching record of 96-64 (.600) entering Wednesday night's game. Dunn is a 1980 graduate of George Mason University.

Center Randy Brewer led the way with 29 points as the Golden Gophers knocked off Purdue 92-72 at Williams Arena 20 years ago today. Minnesota shot 69 percent in the second half as the team expanded a nine-point halftime lead. Guards Trent Tucker and Darryl Mitchell combined for 31 points. Boilermaker coach Gene Keady was quoted as saying, "They (Minnesota) probably could have beaten anyone in the country tonight."

MINNESOTA GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL

MINNESOTA'S LAST GAME:

Minnesota dropped a 94-83 decision to Michigan State on Saturday evening at Williams Arena. The Golden Gophers staged a second-half rally to cut a 20-point first half deficit to two points late in the contest. Guard Terrance Simmons scored a career-high 34 points along with snaring a team-lead six rebounds and five assists in a losing effort.

PENN STATE'S LAST GAME: Penn State defeated Michigan, 77-66, last Wednesday evening at State College, Pa. Four players (Cline-Heard, Smith, Joe Crispin and Ivory) combined to score 67 of the team's 77 total points. The Nittany Lions have not played since their game a week ago against the Wolverines..

A MATTER OF EXPERIENCE:

Players who will participate in Wednesday's game scored 54 of Penn State's 80 points in the meeting between Minnesota and Penn State last season, while Golden Gophers who will play against the Nittany Lions this season scored only 28 of the team's 72 points.

BOMBS AWAY: Penn State and Minnesota are ranked 1-2 in the conference in three-point field goals made (all games). The Nittany Lions have made an average of 8.19 three-pointers per game, while the Golden Gophers have cashed in 7.33 long-range shots per contest. Minnesota has made four more three-point shots (176-172) in three fewer games.

TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK:

Minnesota and Penn State are also among the league leaders in turnover margin this season. The Golden Gophers are third in

that category (all games) with a +2.08 turnover margin in 24 games, while the Nittany Lions lead the Big Ten with a +3.43 advantage.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE: Senior guard Terrance Simmons had a hand in 44 of Minnesota's 83 points in Saturday's game against Michigan State, scoring a career-high 34 points and handing out five assists. Simmons' seven three-point field goals set a single-game school record, and led a team effort from behind the arc which also produced a school record for three-pointers made in a game (16). The 34-point effort ties Simmons for 17th-best single-game performance in school history - with among others teammate Dusty Rychart. Rychart scored 34 points earlier this season against Hawaii Pacific.

HOME NUMBERS: guard Terrance Simmons has a nearly 2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio at home this season (60-31) • forward Travarus Bennett is averaging one turnover per 39 minutes played at home (5 TO's/195:00) • junior forward Dusty Rychart is shooting 56 percent (71-for-127) at home • no Minnesota starter other than Rychart (7.5) is averaging more than 3.5 rebounds per game at home • injured players Bauer and Bickerstaff accounted for 33 of the team's 70 blocked shots at home • Simmons is the only Golden Gopher player to have started every home game this season (14) • Rychart is shooting free throws better on the road (23-of-26, .885) than at home (44-of-56, .786) • Minnesota is averaging 75.5 points per game at home

SCHOOL SEASON RECORDS

FALLING: Minnesota has already set a new school season record with its 176

three-point field goals heading into Wednesday's game with Penn State. The previous record was the 134 made in the 1992-93 season. The pre-NCAA sanction record was 202, set in the 1994-95 season. The Golden Gophers have attempted 468 three-point field goals this season, also a school record - that previous record was 403 in 1991-92. The pre-NCAA sanction record for that category is 601 in 1994-95.

The University of Minnesota men's basketball program announced the signing of five student-athletes to national letters of intent during the early national signing period.

Maurice Hargrow is a 6'4", 170-pound shooting guard who averaged 18 points, six assists and six rebounds per game last season for Highland Park High School in St. Paul, Minn. Hargrow, who is an explosive leaper who possesses a nice outside shooting touch, led the Scots to the Minnesota State Class 3A Championship in his sophomore season.

Jerry Holman is a 6'11", 220-pound power forward/center who averaged 13 points, seven rebounds and three blocks per game for Minneapolis Community and Technical College in Minneapolis, Minn. Holman is a tall, athletic player who will give the Golden Gophers much needed depth and an inside presence.

O'Neal Mims is a 6'8", 205-pound power forward from Reagan High School in Austin, Texas. Mims, who has grown seven inches in the last 18 months from 6'1" to his current height of 6'8", averaged 15 points and 12 rebounds per game in his junior prep season.

Rick Rickert is a 6'10", 210-pound forward from Duluth East High School in Duluth, Minn. Rickert is regarded by nearly every recruiting service as a top 10 national prospect. He averaged 28.8 points per game as a junior with a 56.6 field-goal percentage, 49.0 three-point percentage and .857 free-throw percentage. Rickert also averaged 15 rebounds and over five blocks per game last season for the Greyhounds.

Aaron Robinson is a 5'8", 165-pound point guard from Guilford High School in Rockford, Ill. Robinson averaged 15.3 points, 12 assists, six rebounds and four steals per game as a prep junior last season.

"We feel very good about the five student-athletes we've been able to secure during the fall signing period," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Dan Monson. "Obviously landing Rick was an outstanding day for Golden Gopher basketball. With Jerry we feel like we've addressed some of our needs to get bigger across the front line. O'Neal is a talented swingman who we feel will develop into an outstanding player once he has time to build his body to match his growth spurt and get stronger. Maurice and Aaron both bring a great deal of athleticism to our program, and we look forward to getting them into our system and developing their talents."

season's final weeks. Bennett showed promise for filling Bickerstaff's shoes at Northwestern, producing team game-highs of 16 points and 11 rebounds in a personal season-high 31 minutes.

SLOW STARTS: Minnesota has trailed at halftime in nine of its 11 Big Ten games this season. The Golden Gophers are 10-0 when leading at the half.

TOUGH IN TIGHT GAMES: The Golden Gophers are 7-1 this season in games decided between 1-5 points. Last season, the Golden Gophers were 3-3 in games with margins between 1-5 points.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS: Minnesota is 12-1 this season when they have won or tied the first 5:00 of the second half.

SHOOTING FOR ACCURACY: In 22 of Minnesota's 24 games this season, the team that has a better shooting percentage for the game won the contest. The only two games where the team with the poorer percentage from the field came away with a win were Minnesota's wins over UNC-Greensboro and Marquette.

BACKCOURT PLAY IS KEY: Minnesota is 4-2 this season when its both its starting guards score in

double figures, 10-3 when one of the starting guards score in double figures, and 2-2 when neither backcourt starter hits double digits. The Golden Gophers' starting guards, Terrance Simmons and Kevin Burleson, combined to score 50 points in Saturday night's loss to Michigan State.

DOWN THE STRETCH: The Golden Gophers have outscored their opponents 320-264 in the last 5:00 of regulation and overtimes, and have scored the same amount or more than their opponents in that time frame in 17 of 24 games. Minnesota has won five of the seven contests when they have been outscored in the final 5:00, with the exceptions the loss on Jan. 31 when Iowa outscored the Golden Gophers 14-8 and Saturday night's loss to Michigan State when the Spartans outnumbered the Golden Gophers 19-12. The 19 points Michigan State scored in the final 5:00 on Saturday is the most points Minnesota has surrendered in that time period this season.

BALANCED SCORING: Minnesota's four leading scorers this season, junior forward Dusty Rychart, senior guard Terrance Simmons, senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff and freshman forward Michael Bauer - the latter two of which are out for the rest of

Both Bickerstaff and Simmons have obtained their undergraduate degrees in speech communications and Bickerstaff is working on coursework for a sports management certificate.

BICKERSTAFF LOST FOR THE SEASON: Senior forward John-Blair Bickerstaff's Golden Gopher career ended abruptly after the team captain suffered a broken leg with 17:21 remaining in the first half of the game at Northwestern on Tues., Feb. 6. Entering his final game, Bickerstaff was the only Big Ten player who was in the top 25 in the conference in scoring (25th, 11.3), top 15 in rebounding (11th, 6.4) and top 10 in assists (tied for 7th, 4.2).

BAUER LOST FOR THE SEASON WITH BROKEN ARM: Redshirt freshman Michael Bauer, who missed the majority of last season due to injury and was granted a medical redshirt, will be sidelined for the remainder of the 2000-01 season after suffering a broken left forearm in the second half of Minnesota's loss to Purdue on Jan. 27. Bauer underwent surgery the following morning at University Hospital to repair the damage, which included the insertion of plates and screws into the arm. He will be able to resume weightlifting in three months, with a full recovery expected by the time the 2001-02 season begins.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES: Minnesota's six losses to Michigan State, Illinois, Iowa (2), Ohio State and Purdue have been decided by an average of 11.8 points - Minnesota's

other five Big Ten games, four of them wins, have been decided by an average of 4.4 points.

RECRUITING CLASS IN THE TOP 10 NATIONALLY: The University of Minnesota men's basketball recruiting class is listed among the top 10 nationally by some recruiting services as the fall signing period drew to a close. *Hoopscoop* ranks the Golden Gophers in a tie for sixth nationally and first in the Big Ten. Bob Gibbons All-Star Report, ranks the Golden Gophers' class as tops in the Big Ten. Midwest Hoops has the Golden Gophers' recruiting class ranked fourth in the Midwest and second best in the Big Ten behind defending national champion Michigan State (third).

WALKING ON...: Minnesota's roster consisted of just 11 players, nine on scholarship, after accepting transfer Steve Esselink (Hills, Minn.) from Augustana (S.D.) and invited walk-on Jeff Hagen. The coaching staff was able to find four student-athletes during an open try-out on the morning of Sat., Oct. 14: **Wade Hokenson** (Watertown, Minn.), a 5'9" guard; **Justin Lorang** (Worthington, Minn.), a 6'5" forward; **Tyree Bolden** (Milwaukee, Wis.), a 6'5" forward; and **Randy Chall** (Forest Lake, Minn.), a 6'5" forward. Golden Gopher football standout **Matt Anderle** (Roseville, Minn.) joined the team on Fri., Jan. 5.

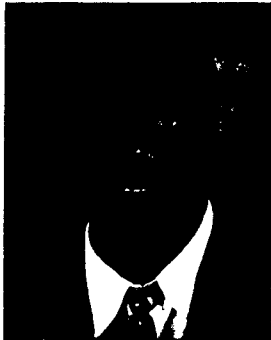

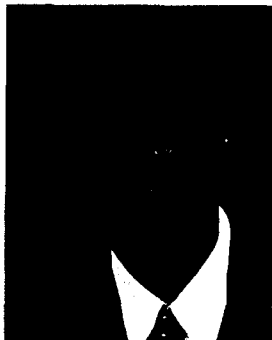
