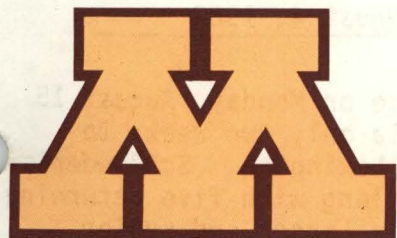

(SCHLEUDER ANNOUNCES NEW ASSISTANT; PRACTICE BEGINS MONDAY)

August 4, 1983

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota women's volleyball coach Stephanie Schleuder recently announced the hiring of an assistant coach for the 1983 season. Jeri Lynn Davidson of Winterville, N.C. becomes the first full-time volleyball assistant at Minnesota, replacing Jean Marconett who resigned in June to resume her duties as athletic director and head volleyball coach at Rochester Community College. Davidson, 25, will officially begin her coaching duties on August 15, the first day of practice.

The position at Minnesota will be Davidson's first coaching experience away from her native North Carolina. She has been head volleyball coach at East Carolina University for the last two years and has held the assistant softball coaching job at ECU since 1980. Her volleyball team finished the 1982 season with its best win-loss record in school history (26-14) and advanced to the AIAW Regional Tournament in 1981. A total of 35 applicants were considered for the position.

"We feel fortunate to have someone of Lynn's caliber working with our program," Schleuder said. "Her record over the last two years speaks for itself. She was an outstanding collegiate player and has an excellent knowledge of the game. She's enthusiastic about her work and we're happy she's here."

Davidson was a four-year starter on North Carolina State's volleyball team and was named captain as a senior in 1978. She responded by leading the Pack to the North Carolina AIAW Championship and being named to the Greensboro Daily News All-Star team. Davidson also played in the United State Volleyball Association National Tournament in the summer of 1979 and initiated a USVBA program at East Carolina in her first year as head volleyball coach in 1981.

Originally from Statesville, N.C., Davidson earned her bachelor's degree in Recreation Resources Administration from North Carolina State in 1979. She accepted the head volleyball coaching job at Cardinal Gibbons High School in Raleigh that fall and spent one season there before moving on to East Carolina. She has taught at volleyball and basketball camps for the last five years, including the Pat Hielscher Volleyball Camp at North Carolina State for the last four.

PRACTICE BEGINS MONDAY -- The Gophers officially begin practice on Monday, August 15 starting at 2:00 p.m. at the Bierman Gym. That gives Minnesota only two weeks to prepare for the season opener at the Kentucky Invitational in Lexington. Schleuder's squad will be extremely young; five freshmen will be in camp along with five returning letterwinners. Of those five, only senior middle hitter Martie Larsen and senior setter Chris Donnell started last season, and are the only two assured of a starting spot on opening day. The rest of the lineup will remain a mystery until Schleuder can get a look at the freshmen in practice. With only five returning players, at least one freshman must start.

"It's going to be a great experiment," Schleuder said, "to see if we can get five freshmen ready to play college ball in two weeks. Somebody's got to step in. I think all of our freshmen are capable of seeing a lot of action, but it really depends on how quickly they absorb our system. The ones that develop fastest will naturally play more. We're going to stick to the basics, especially early in the year. It may take us a while before we develop a set lineup." Schleuder said all of the players have been following an off-season training routine and should be in good shape the first day of practice.

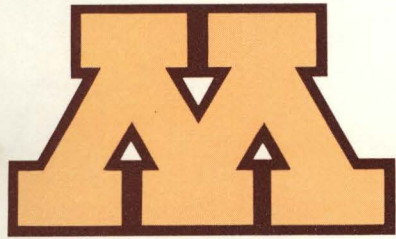
SCRIMMAGES SET -- Minnesota is scheduled to play two pre-season scrimmages before the end of the month. The Gophers will take on a star-filled lineup in the annual Alumni Match on Saturday, August 27. The match starts at 3:00 p.m. in the Bierman Gym and will feature former Gophers Jill Halsted (now Schleuder's student assistant), Diane Libbesmeier, Barb Abendroth, Kathy Kraemer and a host of others. "We're going to have our hands full," Schleuder said. No admission will be charged. On Monday, August 29, the Gophers will be at Forest Lake High School in Forest Lake to play the University of Minnesota-Duluth for their final pre-season tune-up. The match starts at 7:30 p.m. and admission will be \$2.00 for adults and \$1.00 for students.

SEASON STARTS ON THE ROAD -- Schleuder's young squad will be tested early as the Gophers take to the highway for a three-week road trip, beginning on September 2 at the Kentucky Invitational. Minnesota will play at least eight matches in the three-day tournament, which includes perennial national powers San Diego State and Texas A & M along with 15 other teams. "We're going to ask our players to grow up very quickly," Schleuder said.

From Kentucky the Gophers' Winnebago moves north for non-conference matches with West Virginia, Penn State, Toledo, Rutgers, Cleveland State and Purdue. The conference schedule begins in Illinois on September 17. They will face Wisconsin, Northwestern and Iowa to finish their 21 day excursion before the home opener against Iowa State on September 26. With 11 road dates that first month Minnesota will play in the neighborhood of 20 matches (depending on tournament play) before facing the Cyclones. The Gophers have only 10 home matches scheduled for the entire year.

"It's possible that we could come home just happy to be back," Schleuder said. "But I don't think it will work out that way. Last year the team really pulled together during the time we were away. We'll approach the early matches as a sort of experiment. Of course we hope to play well, but our focus will be on the Big Ten season. We really want to be ready to play those. Our concentration for the non-conference schedule will be to play consistently."

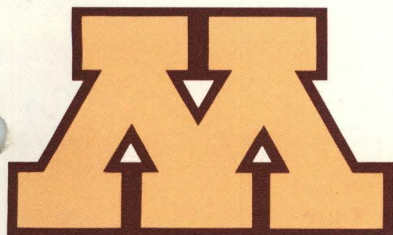

(VOLLEYBALL OPENS SEASON AT 20-TEAM KENTUCKY INVITATIONAL)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Coach Stephanie Schleuder and the Minnesota volleyball team will open the 1983 season at the 20-team University of Kentucky Labor Day Tournament this Friday through Sunday in Lexington. Each team is guaranteed eight matches, and Minnesota will play three on Friday and Saturday and two on Sunday.

BEGINNING OF THREE WEEK ROAD TRIP -- The tournament marks the beginning of a three week road trip which takes the team to West Virginia, Wed. September 7; and Penn State September 9-10, followed by matches with Big Ten rivals Purdue (September 16), and Illinois (September 17). The Gophers will return home briefly before traveling to Wisconsin (September 21), Northwestern (September 23) and Iowa (September 24). The home opener will be September 26 against Iowa State at 8 p.m. at Williams Arena.

THREE FRESHMEN TO START -- Coach Stephanie Schleuder announced that three freshmen, one sophomore, and two seniors will comprise her starting lineup. The freshmen Schleuder has tabbed for starting assignments include 5-9 outside hitter Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST H.S.), 5-9 outside hitter Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL), and 5-11 middle hitter Pam Miller (WORTH, IL).

"Karyn (Daline) has been very consistent and we will depend on her quite a bit," says Schleuder. "Pam has been a real pleasant surprise. We didn't know if we would be able to start a freshmen in the middle. Jennie's strength is her blocking ability and she has a real good court sense."

LARSEN/DONNELL STALWARTS -- Schleuder's only two returning starters, co-captains Chris Donnell and Martie Larsen will be depended upon to run the young team. Larsen is an experienced middle hitter, while Donnell will be running the offense as the only setter in the Gophers 5-1 offensive format.

The other starter will be sophomore Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) as an outside hitter.

GOPHERS OPEN AGAINST THIRD PLACE NCAA SAN DIEGO STATE -- At the Kentucky Tournament Minnesota drew one of the toughest of the five pools of four teams. The Gophers will open at noon on Friday against San Diego State, and then meet Miami (Ohio) at 5 p.m. and Eastern Kentucky at 7:30 p.m.

San Diego State won the NCAA Southwest Regional last year and placed third at the NCAA National Championships. The Aztecs return two first team All-American selections in 6-0 middle blocker Toni Himmer and 6-0 outside hitter Vicki Cantrell and have two outstanding freshmen recruits along with five returning starters from last year's 39-6 team.

KENTUCKY TOURNAMENT CONT. --

Miami University posted a 31-18 record last season and returns four starters. Eastern Kentucky returns three starters from last year's 34-15 team which won the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament and was nationally ranked part of the season.

"Obviously its quite a challenge to play somebody like San Diego State the first match," says Schleuder. "Both San Diego State and Eastern Kentucky offer us a real stiff challenge in our season opening weekend."

GOPHERS DOWN ALUMNI AND UMD IN SCRIMMAGES ---

The Gopher team has had two match situations so far, defeating a star-studded cast of alumni last Saturday 13-15, 15-10, 15-1 and defeating Minnesota-Duluth in a scrimmage at Forest Lake High School 8-15, 15-11, 15-2, 15-4. Senior Martie Larsen led Minnesota in both matches with 14 kills and no errors for a .636 kill percentage in the alumni match, and with 15 kills (.273) against UMD.

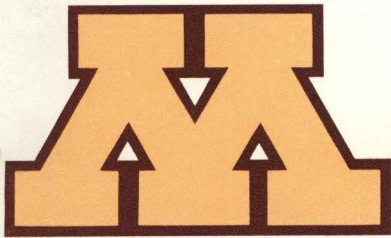

(WITH EVEN RECORD, VOLLEYBALL CONTINUES ROAD TRIP)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The Minnesota women's volleyball team opened the 1983 season at the Kentucky Invitational last weekend, and placed eighth of 20 teams with a 4-4 overall record. This week, Minnesota will meet West Virginia (Sept. 7) and then travel to Penn State for a round-robin tournament against the hosts, Toledo and Rutgers. The following Tuesday, Minnesota will be at Cleveland State.

INJURY TO DONNELL HURTS GOPHERS -- Senior co-captain Chris Donnell suffered an ankle sprain against Eastern Kentucky the first day of the tournament, but returned to play on Sunday. However, Donnell had been assigned all setting duties as the Gophers utilized a 5-1 offensive set. As one of only two returners, her injury hurt the team, says Coach Stephanie Schleuder.

"After Chris was hurt we switched to a 6-2 using Jeanette (Beaulieu) and Jenny (Collings). We played three matches like that and then switched back to a 5-1. We won some matches without Chris that we could have easily lost."

LARSEN SETS CAREER MARK -- Senior Martie Larsen (MARSHALL, MN) moved into first in the top ten career Block Assists category in the Gophers victory over Lamar (TX). Larsen now has 193 career block assists. She surpassed Jill Halsted (1979-82) who had 187. Larsen also tied the single match high with 7 block assists against Lamar.

OTHER RECORDS -- Donnell set a new school record for most digs in a match with five versus San Diego State in the teams' first meeting.

SCHLEUDER COMMENTS -- "As a whole, I'm pleased. We did beat some good teams. Finishing eighth is good for a young team -- at one time we had five freshmen out on the court.

ON NEXT WEEKEND -- "Penn State should be the strongest of the three teams. It is pretty important for us to start playing together with more consistency. At times we were really up and down, but we were using so many different lineups."

A LOOK AT THE STARTERS --

Setter -- Senior Chris Dornell has anchored down that spot, but when she was injured freshman Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) and senior Jeanette Beaulieu filled in.

Middle Hitter -- Senior Martie Larsen (MARSHALL, MN) has secured one spot, and is hitting .316 after eight matches. Freshman Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) is also starting at the middle hitter position. "Pam is doing a good job," says Schleuder. "She has a lot to learn but we've seen improvement in every match."

Left Outside Hitter -- Sophomore Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) and freshman Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) have these starting positions. "Karyn is one of our most consistent players. She is a consistent passer, and is cool under pressure," says Schleuder.

Right Outside Hitter -- Freshman Candy Thier (CHICAGO) and Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) have both been starting in this position.

"Candy is the stronger hitter and defensive player and Jenny is a better passer and blocker," says Schleuder.

Utility -- Senior Jeanette Beaulieu has filled in as a setter and is also an outside hitter, while junior Gretchen Kauth (MINNEAPOLIS/ SOUTHWEST) has played a lot in the back row for Pam Miller.

(GOLF FACES BIG TEN FOES IN OPENING TOURNAMENT)

Coach Anne Zahn's team will travel to Madison, Wisconsin for a 36-hole eight team tournament at the Odana Hills Golf Course (par 76) this Friday and Saturday. Zahn will be holding tryouts this week for her team, and plans to select the final group following the Gophers only home Invitational of the year, September 16-17 at the Les Bolstad Golf Course.

Teams competing in the Lady Badger Invitational include: Purdue, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Northern Iowa, Wisconsin-Whitewater, Wisconsin-Madison and the Gophers.

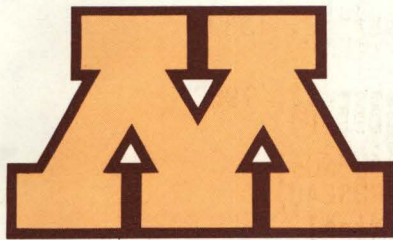

GOLF HOSTS ONLY HOME TOURNAMENT OF THE SEASON THIS WEEKEND --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Four of the Gophers opponents last weekend will be at the Minnesota Invitational this Friday and Saturday at the Les Bolstad (formerly U) Golf Course on Larpentur Ave. in St. Paul. Among the field is Wisconsin, which edged the Gophers on their home course last weekend, along with Iowa, Iowa State, Northern Iowa, Wisconsin-Whitewater and Illinois State.

The 54-hole tournament will include 36-holes Friday and 18 Saturday with tee times at 8 a.m. both days. The Gophers will have two teams Maroon (A) and Gold (B) on the par 74, 5,930 yard course.

TOUGH COURSE -- The Gophers home course has traditionally been tough on teams. Minnesota has won their own invitational six times in the eight years it has been played. Last year the tournament was not held. Past winners for Minnesota include: Ingrid Gallo in 1974 and 1975; Julie Gumlia in 1976, 1977; Gumlia and Kathy Williams tied in 1978; and Williams won in 1978 and 1979.

"Our course is a tough one," says Coach Anne Zahn. "It plays really long and you don't get any roll out there. I don't think you'll see the low scores that we saw at Madison." History bears this out. None of the Gophers' top ten all-time 18 and 36 hole scores were set at home.

HARRIS MEDALIST/GOPHERS SECOND AT MADISON -- Senior Nancy Harris (ROSEAU) trailing by two strokes after 18 holes, shot an even par 75 in the final round Saturday to force a sudden death playoff with Jeanne Hackbarth of Wisconsin, and then parred the first hole to capture the medalist spot with a 74-75-149 at the Lady Badger Invitational last weekend. Harris' one-under par total of 149 was the fourth best 36-hole total in Gopher history and made her only the second Minnesota player to ever win the Wisconsin tournament.

"Nancy hit the ball extremely well," says Coach Anne Zahn. "She hit all 18 greens in regulation on Saturday and her swing looked really good." Harris had several birdie putts that refused to fall during the tournament, but Zahn says she is not worrying about Harris' short game.

THE TEAM -- After an opening day 305 Minnesota led Wisconsin by three strokes but the Gophers faltered on Saturday and the Badgers won the tournament by four shots (612 to 620). Zahn was still happy with the tournament, especially with the play of her youngsters.

Sophomore Leslie Cummings was a big surprise finishing in a tie for eighth (156). She was the only Gopher, besides Harris, in the top ten, and although Cummings was on the squad last year she did not play a single tournament. Freshman Dee Forsberg had a 77 on Friday and finished at 159, third best on the team. Forsberg won this year's state junior girls tournament and was fourth at the Minnesota state high school tournament this spring. Freshman Ann Meyer was fourth with a 166 and freshman Jennifer Godfrey fought back from an opening round 89 with an 80 on Saturday.

CROSS COUNTRY OPENS SEASON AT WYOMING --

Coach Mike Lawless will find out where his team members stand at the Wyoming meet this Saturday at 10:30 a.m. Lawless expects 10-12 teams to be in the meet including Air Force, Kansas State, Colorado State, Colorado, Brigham Young, and Kearney State (Neb.).

VOLLEYBALL OPENS BIG TEN SEASON THIS WEEKEND --

The Gophers will open the Big Ten season this weekend with a non-conference match at Purdue, Friday at 8 p.m. and a conference match with Illinois on Saturday at 2 p.m. Illinois is an important West Division conference match for the team. The top two finishers in each division qualify for the Big Ten Championship November 18-19 at Northwestern.

GOPHERS EVEN AFTER 12 -- The volleyball team is still searching for the "magical six" after 12 matches, coach Stephanie Schleuder said. The Gophers are 6-6 on their current road trip (before Cleveland State, September 13) after dropping two of three at a round robin tournament in Penn State over the weekend. They played well in dominating Toledo Saturday but sandwiched that victory between losses to Penn State on Friday and Rutgers (for the second time in a week) on Saturday.

CONCERNED WITH CONSISTENCY -- "I'm most concerned with our consistency right now," Schleuder said. "We've beaten some decent teams and played well against some very good teams. But we haven't been able to maintain that level. Just look at Rutgers. We played exceptionally well in the first three games and we won the second game 15-2. But then in the fourth game we just fell apart and got beat (3-15). We haven't played a five-game match all season, and I think that's because we're just lacking in mental toughness right now. We're obviously not totally discouraged, but we have to be more consistent."

#16 RANKED BOILERMAKERS FAVORED TO REPEAT AS CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS -- Purdue is again the favorite to win the Big Ten. Four starters are back from the Boilermaker team that lost only one match all of last year and finished eighth in the nation. Among them are senior middle blocker Kate Crandall and senior setter Annette Bauer, who were both named to the All-Tournament Team at the Converse Redbird Invitational at Illinois State over the weekend. The Boilermakers won the tournament despite losing to Arizona in five games. Purdue beat highly regarded California-Poly in three games for its first ever win against a California team. They are 3-1 on the season.

This match against Purdue will not count in the conference standings, but the October 22 meeting at Williams Arena will. That gives the Gophers some extra time to prepare for the defending conference champs. "Purdue was scouting us at Kentucky so they know more about us than we do about them," Schleuder said. "But we know their tendencies and we know they're really big (5-11, 6-1, 6-1 and 6-2 across the front). Our goal will be to play more consistently and play better defensively. If we don't block better than we have been we'll be in trouble." The match will be broadcast on WBAA-AM radio in West Lafayette, Indiana.

BIG TEN OPENER AT ILLINOIS -- "Illinois is a real important match for us," Schleuder said. "We want to get our conference season off on the right foot and do well there. I don't know who well they've been doing recently but they have some people back and they're dangerous. Plus they're in our division and you always want to beat the teams in your division."

WINLESS IN FOUR -- The Illini are winless in four matches thus far in 1983, but have lost to some tough opponents. Illinois State beat them in their opener in three games, but Illinois has taken both Southern Illinois and Louisville to five games and rugged Western Michigan to four. Senior Laurie Watters and junior Kelly See have led the Illini hitters, who have been inconsistent in the early going. First-year coach Mike Hebert has six returners and six walk-ons on the roster. But the Illini have missed the blocking power of graduated seniors Karen Collymore and Chris Dowdy, plus the offensive punch of sophomore Esra Temelli, who decided not to return for her second season.

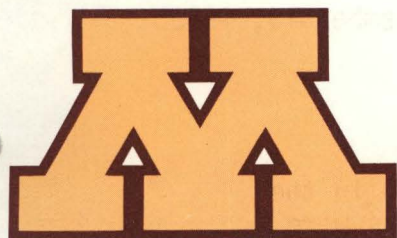

"Obviously it was an important conference match for us, but I was especially pleased because we came back and played strong after losing the first game and won the match. We showed more determination and intensity in that match."

LARSEN SETS RECORDS --

Senior Martie Larsen of Marshall, Minnesota moved into third place on the Gophers all-time career kill list against Illinois where she recorded 19 kills. Larsen surpassed Ann Croaker (1978-81) with 872 and Gail Spencer (1980-82) with 877 and now has 879 kills. Larsen also set a Minnesota single match record of most assists with 9 vs. the Illini and tied the total blocks record with 17 in that match.

A LOOK AT THE STARTERS -- The middle-hitters for Minnesota are Martie Larsen (MARSHALL), and freshman Pam Miller (WORTH, IL). Freshman Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS, SOUTHWEST) is playing at left outside hitter and is the second best hitter on the team with 114 kills and a .230 percentage. The other left side hitter is junior Gretchen Kauth (MINNEAPOLIS, SOUTHWEST) who has come on strong in recent matches to win a starting spot. Sophomore Beth Hiner (KENYON) continues to start at right outside and senior co-captain Chris Donnell (BATTLE CREEK, MI) is the sole setter where she has 261 assists.

THREE POSITIONS SET, QUALIFYING FOR 4,5,&6 -- Coach Zahn reports that Nancy Harris will be playing at the No. 1 position and Jocelyn Smith at No. 2. Freshman Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON) has earned the No. 3 position. However, Zahn will be holding a qualifying round Tuesday for the No. 4-6 positions for this trip.

GOPHERS WIN HOME INVITATIONAL/HARRIS MEDALIST FOR FIRST TIME AT HOME -- Senior Nancy Harris closed out her final home meet in style carding a 79-78-76-233 to come from behind and win her first title ever at the Minnesota Course. Harris was two strokes back of Connie Carlson (Iowa State) after the first day. Carlson carded a 76-78-81-235 and then won a sudden death playoff on the first hole over Karen Schultes of Illinois State to finish as runner-up.

Jocelyn Smith tied for fourth with a 80-79-78-237 and Dee Forsberg tied for eighth with an 82-79-83-244. Other scores included Julie Hennessy 81-84-85-250 and Ann Meyer 91-85-81-257.

The Minnesota Maroon team carded a 322-320-318-960 to best runnerup Illinois State by 14 strokes (974). Iowa was third (988) followed by Northern Iowa (1016), Wisconsin-Madison (1019), Iowa State (1026), Minnesota Gold (1028) and Wisconsin-Whitewater (1093).

CROSS COUNTRY FACES DEFENDING BIG TEN CHAMPS -- The cross country team travels to Iowa City this Saturday for the Iowa Invitational. The seven team field will be led by Iowa, the defending Big Ten champions. The Hawkeyes are paced by All-American Nan Doak, who ran in the World Cross Country Championships this past summer. The 5,000 meter invitational will begin at 10 a.m. at the University of Iowa Finkbine Golf Course. Other teams will include: Drake, Western Illinois, Northeast Missouri, Wisconsin-Parkside, and Central College (Iowa).

EDER SECOND/GOPHERS FIRST AT WYOMING -- Sophomore Jody Eder (STILLWATER) placed second and led Minnesota to a first place finish at the seven team Wyoming Invitational last Saturday. It was the Gophers' first meet of the year and the team finished with 48 points, five ahead of second place Colorado. Eder completed the course in 18:52, eleven seconds behind the winner, despite the 40 m.p.h. winds.

"Overall we had a good, solid performance," Coach Lawless commented, "and it's always nice to win. Our top two runners (Eder and Sue Alm) ran well, and the rest of the team turned in good performances."

OTHER GOPHER FINISHES (of 51 individuals) -- Senior Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON) finished fourth, two seconds behind Eder in 18:54. 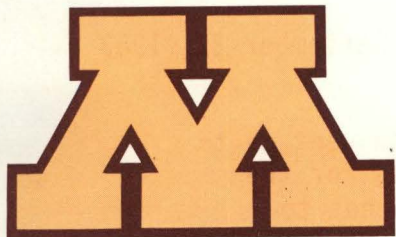

TENNIS OPENS SEASON AT HOME --

The Minnesota tennis squad opens their 1983-84 season on the road this weekend with matches against Drake on Friday, Kansas at Drake on Saturday, and Iowa State on Sunday.

Minnesota defeated Drake twice during the 1982-83 season, 7-2 in the fall and 9-0 in the spring, and the series record against Drake is 9-1 in the Gophers favor. Drake is 8-0 so far this season and they have won the last three matches without losing a set.

The meeting with Kansas will be the first since 1979 when the Gophers won the match 9-0. Minnesota has only played Kansas four times, splitting the matches for a 2-2 series record. Kansas is 0-1 so far but Iowa State has compiled a 2-2 record so far this season. Minnesota defeated Iowa last fall 9-0, and has a 9-1 series record against Iowa State.

ABOUT THE GOPHERS --

The Gophers' line-up may go through some juggling this weekend due to playing the first match and some minor injuries to Gophers Kathy Bjornson and Anne Lemieux.

The Gophers' top players this season are returners Claudia Brisk, a senior from Skokie, IL who posted a 16-24 record at No. 2 singles and 36-9 at the No. 1 doubles spot last season, and sophomore Kelly Coleman who had the second most singles wins (24), and the second best singles percentage (.686) on last year's team with a 24-11 record.

Brisk was named to the All-Big Ten First Team in doubles and went on to compete at the NCAA National Championships last year. A key loss for the Gophers is Brisk's doubles partner, Kathleen Heckman who decided not to continue her college education at this time. Heckman posted a 36-6 record at No. 1 doubles and an impressive 33-8 mark at No. 1 singles as the team MVP.

Nancy Rost is returning to the Gopher line-up after attending Augustana College (SD) her sophomore year where she did not compete in tennis. Rost compiled a 19-12 record at the No. 1 spot on the Gopher squad her freshman year, earning the third most singles wins and fourth highest percentage (.613). She also had the second most doubles wins (behind Brisk) with a record of 15-14.

After a devastating knee injury during the 1981-82 season, Anne Lemieux will be returning to play this fall. Also returning to the squad are sophomore Lisa Martin, junior Kathy McGuire, and seniors Cathie Wadden and Kathy Bjornson. Newcomers to the team are freshman Betsy Poggensee of Northbrook, IL, and sophomore Maura Bjerken of Edina, MN a transfer student from the University of Arizona.

Incoming Gopher Coach Jack Roach is optimistic about the season. "I think everybody is a better player than they were last year and they're all back, so we should be stronger." Roach replaces Ellie Peden, who left Minnesota after an eight year coaching career to pursue other interests.

This Friday through Sunday, the golf team will compete in the 54-hole Lady Northern Invitational at the University of Iowa. Eighteen teams will participate, including all of the Big Ten opponents, at the Iowa Finkbine Golf Course (6,000 yards; 72).

HARRIS MEDALIST IN THIRD TOURNAMENT THIS YEAR -- Nancy Harris

(ROSEAU) won her third tournament in as many starts last Saturday, carding a 71-76-76--223 to win the Lady Spartan Invitational at Michigan State by two strokes. The Gophers finished second in the 15 team field with a 944 team score, 18 strokes behind first place Ohio State.

Jocelyn Smith (LENOVILLE QUEBEC) was the second lowest Minnesota golfer, finishing seventh with a 54-hole total 235. Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON) placed eleventh with a 238, Dana Ross (LESEUR) carded a 253, and Julie Hennessey (LEWISTON) was right behind with a 254. Ann Meyer (SAUKE CENTRE) was the other golfer with 259.

"This was a good test," said Coach Anne Zahn. "Overall, I am very pleased with our performance. We're looking forward to next weekend's Lady Northern."

CROSS COUNTRY HEADS TO ILLINOIS -- This Saturday, Coach Mike Lawless' team

will participate in the Illinois Invitational at the Lake of the Woods Golf Course outside of Champaign. Thirteen teams will compete, including seven from the Big Ten. "There is still a big gap between our top three or four runners and the rest of the team," says Coach Lawless. "We need to work on that."

HARRIERS SECOND AT IOWA INVITATIONAL -- Defending Big Ten champ Iowa scored

32 points to win their own invitational, 26 points ahead of second place Minnesota. Jody Eder (STILLWATER) and Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON) again were the top two finishers for the Gophers, with Eder placing fourth (18:27) and Alm finishing fifth (18:28) in the 5,000 meter race.

"Overall, things went pretty well," says Coach Lawless. "Jody and Sue ran well, and we got a better race from Kris Rens (RANDALL)."

VOLLEYBALL SNAPS THREE GAME LOSING STREAK WITH HOME WIN --

The Gopher women's volleyball team snapped a three match losing streak by defeating Iowa State in five games at home Monday night. The Gophers now have an 8-11 overall and 1-3 Big Ten record.

Last week, Minnesota dropped three conference matches on the road to Wisconsin, Northwestern and Iowa. While the loss to tenth-ranked Northwestern was not an upset, the loss to Iowa was only the third in Minnesota history, and the first defeat by the Hawkeyes, who are on an eleven match winning streak, since the Big Ten tournament in 1977.

SCHLEUDER PLEASSED WITH WIN/RESETS GOALS -- "The win (over Iowa State) was our first five game match win and I'm pleased that we finally cleared that hurdle. We played with intensity throughout the match and enthusiasm. It was nice to be on our home court and have some fan support."

"Our goal at the beginning of the season was to make the Big Ten Tournament. I've reset that goal to playing one match at a time with enthusiasm and intensity. We still would like to make the tournament, but if we don't and meet our other goals, I'll be satisfied."

FRESHMEN PLAY KEY ROLES IN WIN -- Freshman Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) had her finest match of the season at middle-hitter. Miller led the Gophers in blocks with three solo and eight assists and compiled 14 kills while hitting .303. Freshman Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) also had 14 kills and hit .222. "That match was typical of Karyn's play so far this season," said Schleuder. "She is very consistent and a leader as a freshman by her play."

Coming off the bench, freshman Candy Thier (CHICAGO) compiled 16 kills and hit an excellent .359 and freshman Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) had three kills with no errors.

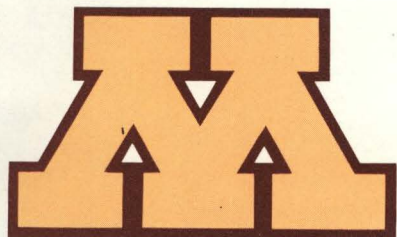

Coach Lawless says the teams should be evenly matched. EDER RUNS FASTEST TIME IN GOPHER CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY,

FIVE PERSONAL BESTS SET AT INVITATIONAL -- The cross country team finished fifth of 14 teams last Saturday at the Illinois Invitational, and the top five Gopher finishers ran their best times ever. 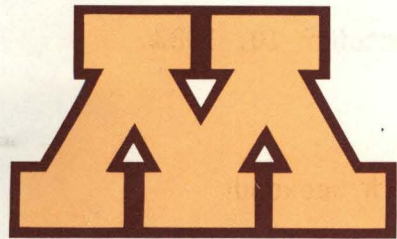

Minnesota hosts their first home tennis matches this weekend at the Minnesota Quadrangular with Wisconsin, Wichita State, and Nebraska competing. The matches will be held at the Como, 98th Street, and Burnsville Racquet Clubs.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS --

Wisconsin will face Minnesota on Friday for their first Big Ten meet of the season. Wisconsin has a 4-3 season record, leads the series standing against Minnesota 9-6, and won at their last meeting 5-4. Prior to coming to the quadrangular, Wisconsin faces the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater and Rosary College this week. 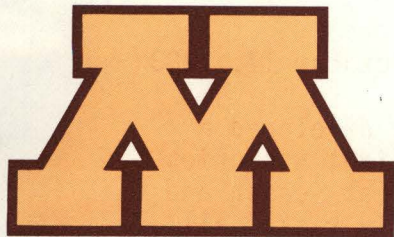

(VOLLEYBALL HOSTS WEST RIVAL ILLINOIS, DEFENDING BIG TEN CHAMPION PURDUE)

This weekend will be a crucial one for the Gopher volleyball team as they host West Division rival Illinois and defending Big Ten Champions Purdue on Friday and Saturday nights. On Wednesday, the Gophers will host North Dakota State.

Gophers Split Over Weekend -- Last weekend, Minnesota dropped a match in just 57 minutes at Ohio State 10-15, 8-15, 7-15 but rebounded at Indiana the next night winning in five matches 12-15, 15-6, 18-16, 13-15, and 15-11. Coach Stephanie Schleuder credited Ohio State with strong play, "Ohio State played exceptionally well and that combined with the fact that we played poorly made a very one-sided match."

Larsen sets school-Big Ten kill mark -- Against Indiana, two highlights were the play of senior co-captain Martie Larsen (MARSHALL, MN) and freshman Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL). Larsen hit .500 kill percentage with a school record 31 kills (4 errors, 54 attempts). She also had two block solos and nine block assists. Collings, playing right outside hitter, had a school record 11 block assists. The Gophers set a team record for most block assists (30) and total blocks (40) in the Indiana match.

BIG TEN RACE NOTES -- Purdue leads the East at 5-0, followed by Ohio State at 5-1...in the West, Iowa is undefeated at 5-0 followed by Northwestern 4-2, MINNESOTA 4-4, Wisconsin 3-5, and Illinois 2-4.

SCHLEUDER ON THE GOPHERS -- "If I were an opposing coach I would put a big question mark on top of the scouting report for Minnesota," says Schleuder. Indeed, the Gophers are unpredictable from match to match. "We hope to settle on our line-up for the weekend following Wednesday nights North Dakota State match. We may make a couple of switches," says the Coach.

BOILERMAKERS HAVE 27 STRAIGHT BIG TEN MATCH STREAK -- Purdue has developed a level of invincibility in the Big Ten conference and have 27 straight victories against Big Ten opponents. The Boilermakers won the conference last season and were ranked eighth in the final NCAA poll, and have been nationally ranked all year.

Leaders -- The formidable front line includes left outside hitter Joan King (6-1), middle blocker Kate Crandall (6-1) and right outside hitter Jan Hoosline (5-11). King leads the Boilermakers with 199 kills and a .303 kill percentage while Crandall is averaging 10.0 blocks in Big Ten matches. King also leads in digs with 124 while setter Annette Bauer (5-10) is averaging 36.4 assists in conference matches.

Series -- Purdue leads 15-2 and has won the last 11 straight matches. Minnesota last won in 1978 15-8, 9-15, 15-9 at the Big Ten Tournament. Earlier this year Purdue defeated the Gophers 15-7, 14-16, 15-5, 15-8.

Record -- Purdue is 14-3 overall and 5-0 in the Big Ten.

ILLINI PLAY SPOILER ROLE -- Illinois tied with the Gophers for second place in the West last year and are a stronger team than their record indicates. "They have the ability to beat almost anybody on any given day," says Coach Schleuder.

Leaders -- The Illini are led by senior outside hitter Laurie Watters who has 213 kills and a .222 kill percentage. Watters also leads in blocks with a 6.24 average. The second best hitter is Denise Fracaro with 134 kills (.220) and setter Sue Yario is averaging 27.4 assists.

Series -- The Illini lead the Gophers 7 games to 4. Minnesota won at Illinois in the Big Ten opener this season 12-15, 15-5, 15-10, 15-10.

Record -- The Illini are 3-15 overall and 2-4 in the Big Ten.

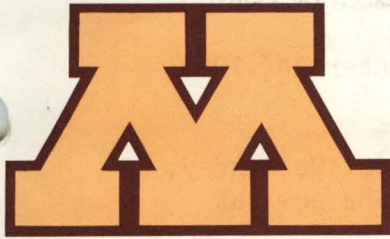

The Gopher women's volleyball team will host the top two teams in the Big Ten West Division this weekend. The Iowa Hawkeyes lead the West with a 5-1 mark (loss to Northwestern) while the Wildcats are 5-2. Minnesota is third at 5-5. Wisconsin is fourth at 4-6 and Illinois is 2-6.

Last weekend Minnesota downed Illinois three games to one, and played well in a four game loss to the seventh ranked Purdue Boilermakers. Purdue extended their Big Ten winning streak to 35 straight since 1981, and ledger over the Gophers to 16-2 since 1978. Purdue is the only undefeated Big Ten team remaining at 7-0 and lead the East Division while Ohio State is second (6-2).

SCHLEUDER PLEASED WITH NEW LINEUP -- Over the weekend, Coach Stephanie Schleuder started freshman Candy Thier (CHICAGO) and sophomore Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) for the first time in several matches, and says she was pleased with the results. "We finally have a starting line-up. The freshmen had a good weekend and we are able to depend on them."

Other starters remain Karyn Daline (freshman, MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST), Pam Miller (freshman, WORTH, IL), Martie Larsen (senior, MARSHALL), and Chris Donnell (senior, BATTLE CREEK, MI).

WEEKEND LEADERS -- Illinois -- The Gophers hit .256 as a team behind Martie Larsen's 17 kills, 5 service aces, and 7 total blocks. Freshman Candy Thier had a good night with 13 kills and a .346 kill pct. Pam Miller added nine kills and 5 block assists, while Karyn Daline had nine kills (.250) and Beth Hiner 5 block assists. "The Illinois match was one of the best we have played this year," says Schleuder.

Purdue -- The Gophers outblocked the Boilermakers with 37 total blocks behind freshman Pam Miller's 13 total blocks. Miller also had eight kills hitting .304 while Beth Hiner had five kills (.444). Larsen led with 10 kills, while Daline had eight. The second game which Minnesota won 15-3, the team hit .476. Purdue's Kim Corwin set a new Williams Arena mark with a .667 kill pct.

The Hawkeye's, who finished in the cellar of the West Division last season, have been the Big Ten surprise this year. Earlier in the season, Iowa reeled off a 15 match winning streak, which was snapped in a five match non-conference loss at Ohio State. Their only Big Ten loss was at the hands of Northwestern at home last week, where the Hawkeye's dropped the last three games after winning the first two.

Iowa had a rest last weekend, and will be on an important West Division road trip, beginning at Minnesota Friday. Junior middle hitter Dee Ann Davidson leads the Hawkeyes in kill pct. MINNESOTA TENNIS TRAVES TO KENTUCKY FOR WEEKEND COMPETITION

The Minnesota tennis team travels to Kentucky this weekend for three dual meetings against Louisville on Friday, Eastern Kentucky on Saturday, and Kentucky on Sunday. However, No. 1 singles and doubles team member Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) will not be making the trip due to coursework responsibilities. Everyone will move up one spot in the singles line-up with sophomore Kelly Coleman (TOLEDO, OH) at the No. 1 spot. Coach Jack Roach plans to juggle the doubles line-up during the weekend to get the best combinations possible.

This will be the Gophers first meeting with Louisville since before 1974. Louisville has a 4-1 record and is undergoing a change in the coaching staff at present. Minnesota leads the series against Eastern Kentucky 1-0, the Gophers defeated the Colonels 6-3 at their last meeting in 1982. Kentucky leads the series against Minnesota 2-0 and the Lady Kats won the last match 5-4 in 1982. Kentucky enters the weekend with a 4-3 record.

MINNESOTA PLACED THIRD AT WISCONSIN DOUBLES INVITATIONAL -- Minnesota placed third at the Wisconsin Doubles Invitational this past weekend. Of the six Big Ten teams competing, Northwestern, who placed second at last year's Big Ten Championship, won the tournament with 15 points. Indiana, last year's Big Ten Champions, was second with 13 points followed by Minnesota 10, Iowa 6, Wisconsin 5, and Illinois 2.

The No. 2 doubles team of senior Cathie Wadden (WINONA, MN) and Kelly Coleman came close to tying the all-time Minnesota record for most consecutive doubles wins of twelve, increasing their wins to ten consecutive matches after the first day of the Invitational. Unfortunately the pair lost their last two matches to Northwestern and Indiana, the toughest teams at the meet. The pair have compiled a 10-2 record at the No. 2 spot.

The new doubles pairing of freshman Betsy Poggensee (NORTHBROOK, IL) and Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN) turned out to be a good one as the duo went undefeated over the weekend, winning matches against Indiana, Northwestern and Illinois doubles teams. Gopher Coach Jack Roach was pleased with the play over the weekend, placing behind the two strongest Big Ten teams is not bad for a third place finish.

SWIMMING HOLDS ANNUAL TIME TRIALS THIS WEEKEND --

The Minnesota women's swimming team will hold their annual time trials this Friday at 6:00 p.m. and Saturday at 9:00 a.m. at Cooke Hall Pool, and there is no admission charge. Returning to this year's team are six swimmers who hold a total of fifteen Minnesota varsity records between them, not including records held on relay teams. Incoming freshmen Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) and Cindy Hovet (BELLEVUE, WA) join the Gophers with times under current varsity records in the 100 and 200 yard breaststrokes. In addition, Roell holds the Cooke Hall Pool record in the 50 and 100 yard breaststrokes. Freshman Jeri Machacek (PRIOR LAKE, MN) is also strong in the 100 and 200 yard breaststrokes as well as the 200 yard butterfly and the 400 yard individual medley. According to Coach Jean Freeman this is the most established team she has ever coached at Minnesota.

FROM CAROLINA TO CALIFORNIA FOR GOLF TEAM --

The Minnesota golf team has this weekend off but will travel to the Stanford Invitational in Palo Alto, California, November 4-6, which traditionally attracts the top collegiate golf teams in the country.

RAIN SHORTENS TAR HEEL TOURNEY -- Minnesota finished 12th of 19 teams in 36 holes at the rain-shortened Lady Tar Heel Invitational at the University of North Carolina. Nancy Harris (ROSEAU, MN) was the top Gopher, finishing in an 11th place tie with a 79-76--155. Sunday's final 18 holes started, but the golfers were called in from downpour and Sunday's results were washed from the scoreboard. Friday's first round was completed in a steady rain, and Saturday's second round took place under threatening skies.

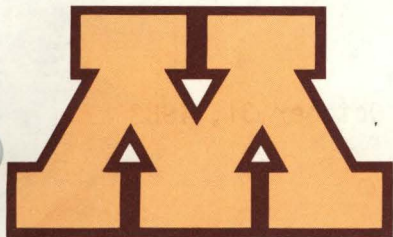

It is the last home match of the season, and the last match for the seniors."

ON LAST WEEKEND: "It was a really disappointing weekend...we played well enough to possibly win...we didn't choke, but we didn't come through with the clutch plays when we needed them. Iowa and Northwestern will be good representatives to the Big Ten."

LARSEN LEADS GOPHERS DESPITE LOSSES: Senior co-captain Martie Larsen of MARSHALL had a stellar weekend. Against Iowa, she hit .447 with 22 kills, and had one block solo and eight block assists. Against Northwestern, Larsen had a season high seven service aces, while registering one block solo and six assists and hitting .313 with eleven kills.

"I still believe that Martie's one of the premier players in the Big Ten," says Coach Schleuder. "We're really disappointed that our seniors (Larsen and co-captain Chris Donnell) won't have a chance to participate in the Big Ten Championship."

Coach Anne Zahn's golf team will have their hands full this weekend, as they face the top three finishers in last year's NCAA tournament at the 54-hole Stanford Invitational, Friday through Sunday.

Texas Christian University, the University of Tulsa and Southern Methodist University will be the three favorites of the 21-teams. Other teams participating in part include: Arizona, Arizona State, UCLA, Southern California, Stanford and Indiana.

"This will be, by far, the toughest field we have faced this year," says Coach Anne Zahn. "I am excited about such a high level of competition." This will be the last meet of the fall, with the spring schedule slated to begin with a southern trip the week of March 17.

BIG TEN CROSS COUNTRY MEET THIS SATURDAY --

Coach Mike Lawless says Minnesota is one of seven teams who have the runners to finish in the top three this Saturday at the 1983 Big Ten Cross Country Championships in Champaign, IL. Wisconsin and Purdue look to be the teams to beat, and the Gophers will need a strong team performance to move up from last year's seventh place finish.

A BALANCED FIELD -- "This is probably the most balanced Big Ten meet we've ever had," says Lawless. "We're deeper than anyone, except Wisconsin and Purdue. I'd say Iowa and Northwestern could also finish first; but Minnesota, Indiana, and Michigan are all good enough to finish in the top three.

ILLINI INVITATIONAL A PREVIEW -- The Big Ten meet will be run on the Lake of the Woods Golf Course, outside of Champaign, where the Illini Invitational was run in October with eight Big Ten teams participating. In what may be a preview of the Big Ten meet, Wisconsin won, 20 points ahead of second place Iowa; with Purdue, Northwestern, and Minnesota all right behind.

THE INDIVIDUAL OUTLOOK -- Wisconsin's Cathy Branta is the defending Big Ten champ, and the odds-on favorite to repeat. Branta won the Illini Invitational in a course record 16:22.7, and won the California Nike Invitational (16:36.9), outdistancing the top three runners from No. 1 ranked Stanford. The Badgers' Katie Ishmael was second at the Illini, and third at the California Nike meet. The top two runners from Iowa (Nan Doak and Jenny Spangler) and Purdue (Becky Cotta and Sue Bosch) finished in the top ten at the Illini.

THE GOPHER OUTLOOK -- Coach Lawless says Jody Eder (STILLWATER, MN) could finish in the top five; while she finished tenth at the Illini, Eder has run better ever since. Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON, MN) could finish in the top fifteen; she finished 20th at the Illini, but has also shown improvement.

Minnesota's team finish will rest heavily on the performances of the other five runners. Kris Rens (RANDALL, MN) is also running well, and may have a shot at the top fifteen. Peggy Grundman (OSAKIS, MN) and Cindy Dickison (FARIBAULT, MN) will also run, with the last two spots still contested between three runners: Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI), Kellie Benzow (RACINE, WI), and Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN).

MINNESOTA 3-0 IN WEEKEND DESPITE MISSING NO. 2 PLAYER -- Minnesota netted three wins this weekend against Louisville 9-0, Eastern Kentucky 7-2 and Kentucky 5-4, without No. 1 singles and doubles team member Nancy Rost who missed the weekend's competition due to coursework responsibilities.

According to Gopher Coach Jack Roach the team played better each match, facing stiffer competition as the weekend progressed. "The win against Kentucky was a good one, they were really a strong team," said Roach.

Three Gophers went undefeated in singles play this weekend. Sophomore Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL, MN) is undefeated since her first match of the season with a 12-1 record, and won all three of her matches at the No. 3 spot over the weekend despite a move up from the No. 4 and 5 spots. Senior Cathie Wadden (WINONA, MN) is undefeated this season at the No. 5 and 6 spots and added three more victories to her record which stands at 6-0. PAUL, MN) in 1:09.92 and senior Claudia Sanders (SEATTLE, WA) in 1:10.3 who are swimming faster than they were this time last year.

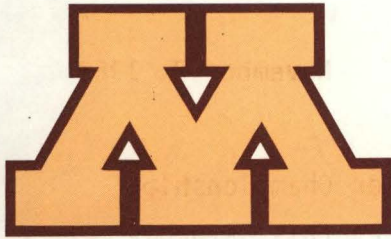

CROSS COUNTRY TO NCAA DISTRICT MEET --

Coming off a strong third place finish at last week's Big Ten Championship, Minnesota should be a strong contender at the NCAA District 4 meet this Saturday at Michigan State. "Michigan State has a tougher course than Illinois (where the Big Ten meet was run), but I would say that the top five Big Ten schools, along with Illinois State, will be the strongest teams," says Gopher Coach Mike Lawless. Jody Eder (STILLWATER, MN) will be a contender, individually, and will need to run a strong race to qualify for the NCAA National Championships. The top three individuals, other than members of the qualifying teams, will also go to the NCAA's. The team favorites are Big Ten champs Wisconsin and second place Purdue, Minnesota Iowa, and Northwestern.

THIRD IN BIG TEN BEST-EVER FOR HARRIERS -- Jody Eder and Sue Alm

(BLOOMINGTON, MN) ran the best times of their careers in pacing the Gophers to a third place finish at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships in Champaign, IL last Saturday. Eder finished eighth in a school record time of 16:56, the highest finish by a Minnesota runner since the Big Ten began holding official championship meets in 1981 (Cathie Twomey won an unofficial championship meet in 1976).

AN UPSET -- Minnesota pulled somewhat of an upset by beating out defending conference champs Iowa by just five points. The Gopher's fifth and sixth runners (Cindy Dickison (FARIBAULT, MN) and Kellie Benzow (RACINE, WI) passed Iowa's fourth runner right at the end of the 5,000 meter course, enabling the Gophers to finish third with 104 points, and relegating the Hawkeyes to fourth with 109.

Eder's time was 30 seconds off the pace of two-time conference champ Kathy Branta of Wisconsin. Sue Alm finished twelfth in 17:21. Kris Rens (RANDALL, MN) placed 28th (17:55), Cindy Dickison (FARIBAULT, MN) was 37th, Kellie Benzow finished 38th (18:15), and Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN) was 61st (19:21).

GOLFERS FIND TOUGH COMPETITION AT STANFORD -- The Minnesota golf team finished the fall season against the top teams in the NCAA last weekend, coming away from Stanford Invitational with a 16th place finish, out of 21 teams. "Certainly by the last day, we were very tired," says Coach Anne Zahn, "and we just didn't play that well."

GOPHER SCORES -- Nancy Harris (ROSEAU, MN) was once again the top Minnesota golfer, with a 77-77-80=234. Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) shot a 79-80-78=237, Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) had an 82-83-82=247, Jocelyn Smith (LENOXVILLE, QUEBEC) shot an 84-83-82=249, and Dana Ross (LE SUEUR, MN) had an 89-84-95=268.

SPRING GOLF -- Minnesota will open its spring golf season with a trip south the week of March 17, 1984.

VOLLEYBALL ENDS SEASON WITH WIN OVER WISCONSIN --

The Gopher volleyball team closed out the 1983 season with a four game 15-8, 8-15, 17-15, 15-12 victory over visiting Wisconsin. The win insured the Gophers of a third place finish in the West Division of the Big Ten with a final 15-16 overall and 6-7 conference mark.

Freshman Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS) suffered an ankle injury early on in the opening game and sat out the match. Despite missing the No. 2 kill leader, Minnesota won behind senior co-captain Martie Larsen's 31 kills (.340) and freshmen Pam Miller and Candy Thier's 13 kills a piece.

"We showed a lot of determination and persistence," said Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "We played without Karyn, who is about a third of our offense, the whole match."

ON THE SEASON -- The Gophers finished with a losing 15-16 record, the first time Coach Schleuder has had an under .500 season since her first year at Alabama. Minnesota returned only two starters, both seniors from last year, and played three freshmen at a time much of the year.

The season opened with a three week, 14 match road trip, which Schleuder says was a mistake. "We weren't ever able to establish consistency because we didn't have any time to practice. It's been a long time since I've had such an up and down season," says Schleuder. "The age of our starters should be encouraging to us. Next year we could be in the same situation (rebuilding) and we have to work towards correcting mistakes of this year."

ROAD TRIP BEGAN BIG TEN SEASON AT 1-3 -- A critical period for the Gophers was an early road trip to Wisconsin, Iowa and Northwestern, where the Gophers lost all three matches. After that, Minnesota stayed in the race, but didn't win the matches they needed to -- at Ohio State, and at home against Iowa. "We put ourselves in a hole early in the season, and even though we improved, it was not enough. I see the conference getting nothing but stronger. I really believe that the Western Division is much stronger overall than the East. On any given day, any one of the Western teams can knock off anyone in the division."

CO-CAPTAINS LARSEN & DONNELL INVALUABLE THIS YEAR -- "I'm firmly convinced that Martie's (Larsen) the best hitter in the Big Ten. She's played against two or three blockers all season long as all of our opponent's have keyed on her and she still leads the Big Ten in kills...that's quite an accomplishment," says Schleuder.

"When it comes time to choose our MVP it will be an impossible task to pick between Marty and Chris (Donnell). Martie was most of our offense, but Chris held us together and gave us the leadership we needed both on and off the court."

THIS SEASON -- Larsen led Minnesota in kills in 26 of 31 matches and had Minnesota season highs in nine of 12 categories. She had 472 kills for a 15.23 average and .288 kill pct. She had 52 block solos and 110 block assists for a 6.9 overall average and leads the Big Ten in kill average and blocking. Larsen also led Minnesota with 60 service aces and was second in digs at 247.

OTHER GOPHER STATISTICAL LEADERS --

Senior Chris Donnell led the Big Ten in assists most of the year and had 919 for a 29.6 average overall. She also led the Gophers with 249 digs and was second in service aces with 42. In just two seasons at Minnesota, Donnell is ranked 8th in career service aces with 79. She set season records of fewest service errors (min. 250 attempts) with 14 in both 1982 and 1983 and holds season records of 83 consecutive serves without an error (3rd on list), most assists (249) and match records of most assists (59) and best service pct. (2nd) 1.000 (29-29).

Freshman Karyn Daline was a standout in her first season of collegiate competition. She was second on the team in kills (287) and averaged 9.6 kills while hitting a .246 percentage. She was third on the team in digs (236) and led the Big Ten in digs most of the year. Daline also had 38 block assists and 24 service aces. Daline set a match record of most digs with 26 against Indiana and led the team in kills in four matches.

Freshman Pam Miller was second on the team in block assists with 65 and was third in kills with 190 while averageing 6.13 and hitting .237. Freshman Candy Thier had 140 kills for a 5.19 average while junior Gretchen Kauth had 127 kills.

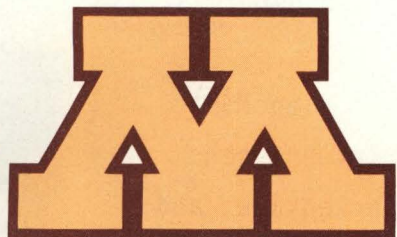

IT'S A CLASSIC -- AREN'T YOU GLAD YOU USE DIAL?

(Minneapolis, Minnesota) -- Razorbacks, Redskins and Jayhawks will invade Williams Arena November 25 and 26, as the University of Minnesota hosts the 1983 Dial Classic Women's Basketball Tournament. The Classic will open the season for the Gophers, as well as the Arkansas Razorbacks and the Miami (Ohio) Redskins. The Kansas Jayhawks open their season the preceding weekend.

First round action begins Friday, November 25, with Kansas playing Arkansas at 6:00 p.m. and Minnesota taking on Miami of Ohio at 8:00 p.m. The consolation game will get underway Saturday, November 26 at 1:00 p.m., with the championship game following at 3:00 p.m. An All-Tournament team and MVP will be announced Saturday.

"These are all very competitive teams," says Minnesota Coach Ellen Mosher. "It's the first part of the season for everybody, so you can't rely on what each team did last year. I think it's good to have new teams from different parts of the country in this year's Dial Classic."

A LOOK AT THE PAIRINGS -- MINNESOTA vs. MIAMI -- Minnesota is picked to finish in the top three of the Big Ten this year, after posting a 20-7 record (13-1 at home) and finishing third last year. Miami of Ohio went 21-6 last year, and won the Mid-American Conference (17-1 record) for the second year in a row. The Redskins are picked to win the MAC again this year.

Both teams lost two starters to graduation. Gone from the Gopher line-up are point guard Debbie Hunter (17.7 ppg, 3.1 reb.), a Kodak Region 4 All-American selection, and center Cindy Kuhlman (8.8 ppg, 8.2 reb.). Miami lost two-time all-conference guard Kris Livingston (12.4 ppg, 3.2 reb.), and forward Amy Cooley (10.3 ppg, 9.1 reb.).

This year the Gophers will rely on junior co-captain Laura Coenen (24.2 ppg, 9.1 reb.), who is a pre-season first team All-American (named by the Women's Basketball News Service), and led the Big Ten in scoring last year.

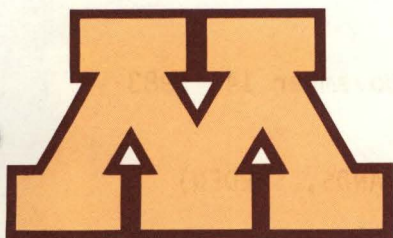

She was also a Kodak Region 4 All-American last year, and the Big Ten Most Valuable Player. Also returning are co-captain senior guard Mary Dressen (11.7 ppg, 4.2 reb.), who was nationally rated in free throw percentage, and sophomore forward Carol Peterka (8.7 ppg, 5.7 reb.).

Junior guard Linda Mallender (18.5 ppg, 5.1 reb.) will lead Miami of Ohio. The Women's Basketball News Service named Mallender a third team pre-season All-American. Last year, she led the MAC in scoring and field goal percentage.

Arkansas vs Kansas -- Both Kansas and Arkansas received honorable mentions on the Women's Basketball News Service pre-season top 20 poll. Kansas is returning four starters from last year, and is expected to be at the top of the Big Eight at the end of the season. Angie Snider (19.5 ppg, 6.5 reb.), a senior who plays guard and forward, earned Kodak Region 6 All-American honors last year, and was on the All-Big Eight team. She will lead the Jayhawks, along with senior Philicia Allen (15.9 ppg, 9.6 reb.), a 6'6" center.

Arkansas will miss two three-year starters: centers Kim Bunge and guard Connie Fitzgerald. Junior forward Betty Fiscus (18.3 ppg, 7.3 reb.) heads the list of returning Razorbacks. Fiscus was selected by the Women's Basketball Yearbook as one of the top Region 6 returning players. Junior forward Amanda Holley (14.9 ppg, 7.3 reb.) will join Fiscus on the Arkansas front court.

CROSS COUNTRY QUALIFIES FOR FIRST TRIP TO NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS --

The women harriers qualified for their first-ever trip to the NCAA National Championships by finishing second in the NCAA District 4 meet last Saturday. Minnesota will be one of only 16 teams in the country competing on Monday, November 21, at Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania.

Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) and Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON, MN) paced the Gophers, finishing sixth and eighth, respectively. Coach Mike Lawless also gives plenty of credit to the other Gopher runners. "Kellie Benzow (RACINE, WI) moved up from a 38th place finish in the Big Ten meet the previous weekend, to 19th in the district meet. That's the kind of performance we had on Saturday."

THOSE SURPRISING GOPHERS -- After last year's seventh place finish in the Big Ten meet, Minnesota was not considered a contender this year. The harriers finished fifth in the Illinois Invitational, on the course where the Big Ten meet would be held, competing against most of the Big Ten. A month later, Minnesota returned to Illinois, and surprised everyone, except Coach Mike Lawless who had predicted the strong showing, by taking third place, five points ahead of Iowa.

DEPTH IS THE KEY -- All season, Coach Lawless has talked about the Gophers' having more depth than most of the Big Ten. He credits much of the team's success in the Big Ten and District 4 meets to those third through seventh runners. "The top five runners score team points," says Lawless, "so they are obviously important, especially if those third, fourth, and fifth runners beat their counterparts from the other teams. But, if the sixth and seventh runners can beat the fourth and fifth runners from the other teams even though they don't score points for us, they increase the scores of those other teams."

In the Big Ten meet, the Gopher's fifth and sixth runners passed Iowa's fourth runner at the end of the 5,000 meters, making the difference between a third and fourth place team finish. At the district meet, four of the five Minnesota runners who scored, improved their finish from the previous week against most of the same competition.

GOPHER TIMES -- Jody Eder finished in 18:14.1 (sixth), Sue Alm finished in 18:19.9 (eighth), and Kellie Benzow ran a 19:08.7 (19th). Peggy Grundman (OSAKIS, MN) ran a 19:16.5 (23rd), and Cindy Dickison (FARIBAULT, MN) finished in 19:24.6 (30th).

Kris Rens (RANDALL, MN) finished 42nd, and Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN) placed 103rd.

GOPHER SWIMMERS COMPETE ON THE ROAD AND AT HOME --

The Minnesota Swimming and Diving team has both home and away meets this weekend. On Friday, fifteen Gophers will compete against Southern Illinois at Wheaton College in Chicago, and on Saturday, they will compete in the Relay Meet at the University of Illinois, at Chicago. They return home Saturday evening just in time to join the rest of the team for a meet against Hamline at 6:00 p.m. in the Cooke Hall Pool.

The meet with Southern Illinois will be the toughest dual meet on the Gopher's schedule according to Coach Jean Freeman. Southern Illinois finished in the top ten in the NCAA last year. Thirteen events will be swum at the Relay Meet in Chicago.

GOPHER MEN AND WOMEN DEFEAT NORTHWESTERN -- Minnesota's mens and women's swimming teams both defeated Northwestern in a co-ed meet on Saturday. The women defeated Northwestern 78-33 and the men won with an 84-25 score.

Every member of Minnesota's 400 yard medley relay team, which captured first in 4:01.99, showed improvement in their times over early season last year with the most improvement coming from freshman Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) who swam the breaststroke leg of the race.

Sophomore Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE, MN) who specializes in the individual medley, won the 1,000 yard freestyle with a 10:42.16 time. Junior Erin Driscoll (E. GRAND FORKS, MN) won the 100 yard freestyle in :55.31 and was a member of the winning 400 yard freestyle relay team which finished with a 3:46.50 time. Junior Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD) won the 200 yard backstroke in 2:13.02 against Northwestern's Ann Niehaus who took second in 2:19.43. Iwerks was also a member of the first place 400 yard medley relay team.

Northwestern's Ginni Vath set a new Cooke Hall Pool record in the 200 yard breaststroke with a time of 2:25.58. The old record of 2:28.10 was held by Gopher senior Claudia Sanders (SEATTLE, WA). Sanders took second behind Vath with a 2:27.68 time.

Sophomore Gretchen Schad (MILBANK, SD) scored 18 points as well. The Gophers have two more intra-squads at Mounds Westonka High School this Tuesday and at Coon Rapids High School at 7 p.m. Friday, November 18.

GYMNASTICS HOLDS INTRA-SQUAD THIS SUNDAY -- The Gopher women's gymnastics team will unveil their 1983-84 squad on Sunday with an intra-squad at 2 p.m. at Williams Arena. This year's team should be one of the best in Coach Katalin Deli's eleven seasons as head gymnastics coach.

GYMNASTICS HAS GREAT RECRUITING YEAR, SHOULD BE EVEN STRONGER THAN LAST YEAR --

Item -- This year's Gopher gymnastics squad has seven freshmen, only one senior and junior and three sophomores.

Item -- Minnesota's top record book holder Robin Huebner and balance beam standout Karie Ploof are missing.

Prediction -- "This year's team is much stronger than last year," by Head Coach Katalin Deli.

Deli is comfortable with that assertion because the Gopher 1983-84 gymnastics team will have a commodity sorely lacking last year -- DEPTH. After an injury to the No. 2 all-arounder Wendy Dorsey, the Gophers were unable to capture the NCAA regional and qualify for nationals. Depth was also a factor in the Big Ten title run, where the Gophers placed 2nd, their best-ever Big Ten finish.

But the season was full of highlights last year -- Minnesota was ranked as highly as seventh in the nation and knocked off several ranked teams in dual meets, and the Gophers posted a perfect 7-0 dual meet record. In addition, Minnesota's 180.30 team total was the tenth highest score in the nation.

THE GYMNASTS -- In addition to a solid nucleus of returning gymnasts, Deli had what could prove to be her best recruiting year ever. Headlining the cast of newcomers is Armstrong High School (Minn.) star Laurie Kaiser who was voted the nation's best prep gymnast by the National High School Coaches Association after earning five All-American titles.

Another standout is Canadian import Candace Doell, who was named Saskatchewan Female Athlete of the Year 1980 through 1982 and competed for the Canadian National Team last summer. Five other freshmen are also in the Gopher camp including Shelly Brown, Genevieve Bannie, Linda Bednar and Patty Hammond. In addition, junior Ellie Odegaard returns to the team after a year's absence.

The youngsters will join a corps of not-to-old upperclassmen to make Minnesota one of the youngest teams in the country. As the only senior on the squad, former AIAW vaulting All-American Judi Klein will assume the role of team captain. The other three returners are the multi-talented sophomore trio of Wendy Dorsey, Julie Kot and Lianne Morland.

Dorsey had her best all-around of the year at the Big Ten Championship where she placed third, but a shoulder injury kept the No. 2 performer from competing at the Regional Championships which may have cost the Gophers a trip to Nationals. Kot fought knee and wrist injuries most of the year, but had a 9.50 best on the uneven parallel bars - her strongest event. Morland was one of only two Gophers to perform every all-around of the year.

GYMNASTICS SCHEDULE -- Minnesota's schedule is one of the toughest in the country, with eight teams that were rated in the nation's top 10 last year including national champion Utah, third-place Cal-State Fullerton and fifth-place Florida. An important change for the Gophers is the regional realignment of the NCAA which places Minnesota in the Midwest Regional instead of the Central.

"The Midwest Regional is the toughest in the country," says Deli. "We've always scheduled top ranked schools, but now it will be much tougher to qualify for nationals. There is only one conference school in our region instead of nine schools." States in the new region include Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Oklahoma, Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Iowa and Minnesota.

Although the Big Ten Championship will not affect the Gophers bid for a trip to the nationals, it is a championship title Deli would like to win. "One of our goals is to go for the Big Ten Championship. We came very close last year," says the Coach. However, Minnesota will have to travel to the "lion's den" of Ohio State and beat the defending champions in their home gym this year.

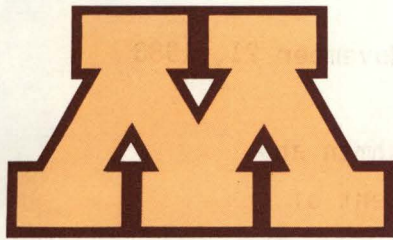

The middle-hitter led the conference in kill average all but one week this year with an 18.2 average and also led the conference in blocking average with a 8.1 average.

LARSEN, DONNELL NAMED TO ACADEMIC BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL TEAM -- The Gophers two senior co-captains were honored as Big Ten Academic players in volleyball. Larsen (MARSHALL, MN) carries a 3.37 cumulative g.p.a. in Youth Ministry and Chris Donnell (BATTLE CREEK, MI) has a 3.75 cumulative g.p.a. with a double major in psychology and anthropology. Donnell plans to apply to graduate schools in clinical psychology.

GOPHERS AIM FOR SECOND DIAL CLASSIC TITLE IN SEASON PREMIERE --

Coach Ellen Mosher will get a look at her 1983-84 Gopher squad against established basketball opponents in the season opening Dial Classic at Williams Arena. The Gophers captured the Dial Classic at Minnesota last year, with a first round win over DePaul and championship victory over Memphis State.

This year, the Gophers will meet Miami (Ohio) in the first round while Arkansas and Kansas face off on Friday night at 6 p.m. Coach Ellen Mosher expects all of the teams to be competitive. "Arkansas and Kansas have had fine teams for a number of years and Miami (Ohio) was very competitive last year."

INELIGIBLE PLAYERS WEAKEN TWO TEAMS -- Miami (Ohio) will be without last year's Mid American Conference scoring leader Linda Mallender (18.5 ppg, 5.1 rebounds) and Kansas lost 6-6 center Philicia Allen (15.9 ppg, 6.5 rebounds) to ineligibility.

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE GOPHERS -- Although Minnesota has three freshmen and five sophomores on the roster, Mosher is pleased with the development of her players. "All of our sophomores are much stronger than last year. They really matured in one year in their knowledge and understanding of the game."

A big plus for Mosher this year will be added height overall, and depth at the forward slot, as well as several alternatives at center. "Every game we lost last year we got beat inside. We didn't have enough strength, depth or experience." Mosher plans to stay with her running style of offense. "We will be a running team and rely on quickness. One of the things we'll be looking for is the high percentage shot."

A LOOK AT THE STARTERS -- Only three players have been tabbed outright as starters for this weekend. It's no secret that Big Ten Most Valuable player Laura Coenen will be at a forward slot. The 6-1 junior from Neenah, Wisconsin averaged 24.2 points last year and led Minnesota with 9.1 rebounds.

The other forward slot has been awarded to 6-0 sophomore Carol Peterka of St. Cloud, Minn. Peterka started the last 12 games of last season, averaging 9.8 points over that span and 8.7 points and 5.7 boards overall.

At center, Mosher will choose either experience in 6-2 senior Barb Meredith of Mankato, Minnesota or utilize the talented 6-3 freshman Molly Tadich of Bloomington.

The shooting guard spot will be held by 5-9 senior co-captain Mary Dressen of Browerville who averaged 11.7 points last year. The point guard slot will go to either junior Denise Freese or sophomore Lisa Hoelscher to start with freshman Cindy Phillips also available.

Mosher plans to look at everybody including sophomores Gretchen Schad at forward, Kelli Behrens at forward and Jill Nelson at center.

INTRASQUAD AT COON RAPIDS WON IN FINAL SECONDS -- Last Friday night's intra-squad game at Coon Rapids was won in the final three seconds on a three point play by sophomore Carol Peterka. Peterka paced the Maroon team to a 75-74 victory with a game high 23 points, while freshman Molly Tadich added 21 points and a game high 17 boards. 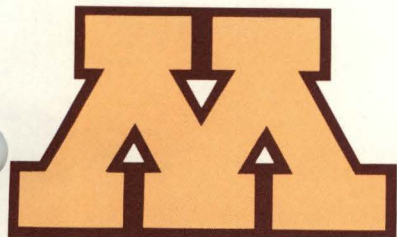

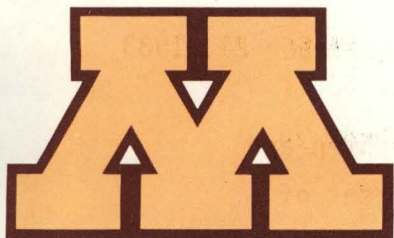

A big plus for Mosher this year will be added height overall, and depth at the forward slot, as well as several alternatives at center. "Every game we lost last year we got beat inside. We didn't have enough strength, depth or experience." Mosher plans to stay with her running style of offense. "We will be a running team and rely on quickness. One of the things we'll be looking for is the high percentage shot."

A LOOK AT THE STARTERS -- Only three players have been tabbed outright as starters for this weekend. It's no secret that Big Ten Most Valuable player Laura Coenen will be at a forward slot. The 6-1 junior from Neenah, Wisconsin averaged 24.2 points last year and led Minnesota with 9.1 rebounds.

The other forward slot has been awarded to 6-0 sophomore Carol Peterka of St. Cloud, Minn. Peterka started the last 12 games of last season, averaging 9.8 points over that span and 8.7 points and 5.7 boards overall.

At center, Mosher will choose either experience in 6-2 senior Barb Meredith of Mankato, Minnesota or utilize the talented 6-3 freshman Molly Tadich of Bloomington.

The shooting guard spot will be held by 5-9 senior co-captain Mary Dressen of Browerville who averaged 11.7 points last year. The point guard slot will go to either junior Denise Freese or sophomore Lisa Hoelscher to start with freshman Cindy Phillips also available.

Mosher plans to look at everybody including sophomores Gretchen Schad at forward, Kelli Behrens at forward and Jill Nelson at center.

INTRASQUAD AT COON RAPIDS WON IN FINAL SECONDS -- Last Friday night's intra-squad game at Coon Rapids was won in the final three seconds on a three point play by sophomore Carol Peterka. 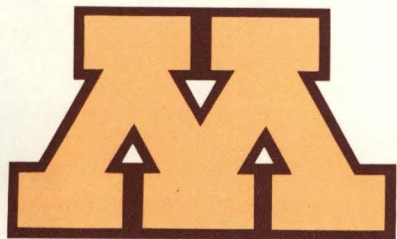

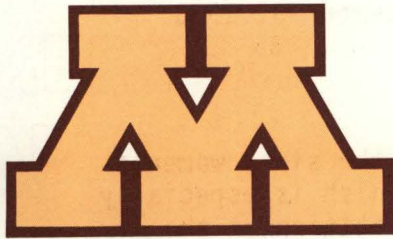

(GYMNASTICS OPENS HOME SEASON AGAINST STANFORD)

An experienced Stanford University team will provide the competition for the women's gymnastics home opener Thursday, December 8, at 8:00 p.m. in Williams Arena. Stanford has seven juniors and one freshman on the team, including red-shirt Marilyn Chapman, who was rated as the ninth best all-arounder in 1982 NCAA competition. Also competing for Stanford is junior Angela Barnes from Edina, who competes all-around with the vault as her best event. This will be the season opener for Stanford, while the Gophers have one meet under their belts.

MISSOURI SQUEAKS BY MINNESOTA IN LAST EVENT -- Gymnastics matches between Minnesota and Missouri have become thrillers, with the chance that every one-hundredth of a point may mean the difference. Last Saturday, the scale tipped in favor of Missouri, who defeated the Gophers by only 1.80 points (173.50 - 171.70). Last year, the Gophers came out on top by only 1.20 points. Illinois finished third in Saturday's triangular meet, with a 165.85.

"We were leading until the last event--the balance beam," says Coach Katalin Deli, "and our performance on the beam was terrible. However, I was very pleased with every other event, and I still think we are a better team, overall, than Missouri."

TEAMS SPLIT INDIVIDUAL EVENTS -- Minnesota won the uneven bars and floor exercise, while Missouri took the vault and balance beam. Freshman Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) placed first in the vault (9.3), and sophomore Julie Kot (BURNSVILLE, MN) won the uneven bars (9.4 -- which ties her for the sixth best uneven bars score in Minnesota history). Sophomore Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) placed second in the floor exercise (9.25) with the best score of her career.

OTHER GOPHER NOTES -- Wendy Dorsey placed second all-around, scoring a 35.65, with a fifth in the vault (9.0), fourth in the uneven bars (8.95), and fifth on the balance beam (8.35), along with her second in floor exercise. Laurie Kaiser was third all-around (34.80). Judi Klein (EDINA, MN) took third on the uneven bars (9.10), Julie Kot was second on the balance beam (8.50), and Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was third in floor exercise (9.05).

MINNESOTA SWIMMERS TAKE TWELFTH AT CANADA CUP MEET --

The Minnesota Swimming Team placed twelfth with 82 points of the sixty women's teams at the Canada Cup Meet in Toronto this past weekend. The finish is especially impressive since Minnesota only competed in two days of final competition at the three day tournament. The Gophers qualified for the finals in two events on Sunday but had to catch a plane prior to the final rounds.

The host team, Etibicoke Swim Club, won the meet with 656 points, followed by top teams Cincinnati Pepsi Marlins 312, Point Claire Swim Club 304, North Baltimore Aquatic Club 276, Queensland, Australia 228, Canadian Dolphins 191, Select University at Quebec 176, North York Aquatic Club 127 and Laurentin University 106.

IN THE FAST LANES --

Sophomore Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL, MN) had the best finish for the Gophers, capturing third place in the 50 meter freestyle with a time of :26.77. She was also a member of the fifth place 200 meter freestyle relay along with teammates Erin Driscoll (EAST GRAND FORKS, MN), Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN), and Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD) with a 1:50.93 time. Wallner also swam on the 400 meter medley relay which placed eighth with a 4:28.94 time. Other members of the relay were Iwerks, Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) and Elsen.

Junior Elyce Iwerks placed eighth in the 50 meter backstroke in :31.30 and fifteenth in the 100 meter backstroke in 1:07.85. Sophomore Marja Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND) placed fourteenth in the 400 meter individual medley in 5:04.56 and freshman Sue Roell placed fifteenth in the 50 meter breaststroke in :35.58.

FREEMAN SAYS:

"The meet was good for the team, there were World Class swimmers competing and it was good for the team to know they could swim against top competitors at such a large meet."

The Gophers travel to Florida on December 17 for winter training.

(BASKETBALL NARROWLY LOSES TO #5 TENNESSEE, HOSTS SDSU DEC. 16)

PLAY BY PLAY RECAP:

The Lady Gopher basketball team narrowly lost to #5 ranked Tennessee at Knoxville, Monday, 50-54 and will meet Western Kentucky on November 6. Against the Volunteers, Minnesota took a 28-22 half-time lead behind a turnaround jumper by Barb Meredith and four free throws by Molly Tadich. Early in the second half, Tadich converted on two more free throws to put Minnesota up 30-22, the Gophers biggest lead of the game.

However, Tennessee tied the game 34-34 and took the lead for good 36-34 at 12:19 to play. The Volunteers biggest lead was 50-44 with 4:24 to play and Minnesota came within two points twice in the closing minutes: 48-50 on a 15 foot shot by sophomore Lisa Hoelscher (ELMHURST, IL) and 50-52 on a 3 foot shot by Mary Dressen (BROWERVILLE, MN) with :21 to play. Dressen then fouled Pat Hatmaker who missed the first of a one-on-one, but Paula Towns grabbed the rebound and scored with :08 to play for the final total 50-54. A long court pass by the Gophers was intercepted by Lynn Collins with just :03 to play.

Gopher Leaders: Junior Laura Coenen (NEENAH, WI) led Minnesota with 14 points, with 10 in the second half and also grabbed 10 rebounds. Senior Barb Meredith (MANKATO) scored all 11 of her points in the first half, but fouled out with 8:19 to play. Freshman Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON) scored 10 points and tied the game high with 11 rebounds while converting 8-8 from the free throw line. Sophomore Gretchen Schad (MILBANK, SD) scored a season high 7 points in 18 minutes of play. Senior Mary Dressen was limited to only 4 points, converting 2-10 from the field.

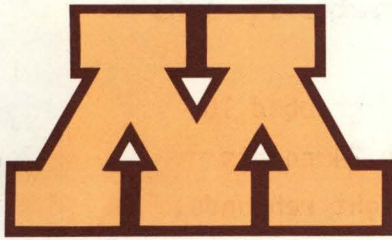

Both players were previously named to the All-Big Ten Academic team. Larsen was named Big Ten MVP and led the conference in blocks (8.1) and kills per match (18.2). She carries a 3.37 cumulative g.p.a. as a youth ministry major.

(BASKETBALL HOSTS SDSU, TRAVELS TO CENTRAL MICHIGAN)

The 2-3 Minnesota basketball team will host South Dakota State and travel to Central Michigan this week. Rounding out the pre-Big Ten schedule will be an important eight team tournament at LaSalle College (Philadelphia) Dec. 28-30 where the Gophers will meet Cheyney State in the first round.

Her 11 field goal attempts against the Lady 'Toppers was a career best and her field goals made (6) and rebounds (10) tied her career highs. "Barb showed leadership and poise," says Mosher. "She is such a good defensive player, and some of her shots are dropping this year. She is selective and taking good shots." more ---

Basketball continued -- Junior Laura Coenen scored 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds against Tennessee and at Western Kentucky had a game high 24 points hitting 10-17 from the field and 4-5 from the line while adding eight rebounds, five assists and four steals. "Laura is coming around," says Mosher. "When she stays in her game and doesn't overdo she has excellent games."

Freshman Molly Tadich came off the bench in both games and hit 10 points and grabbed 11 rebounds at Tennessee and had 13 points and a Gopher high 12 rebounds against Western Kentucky. The other three Gopher starters, Lisa Hoelscher, Mary Dressen and Carol Peterka did not assist the Gophers in the scoring categories on the trip. Dressen was held to 6 points in the two games, well below her 11.0 average heading into the trip, Hoelscher totaled 6 points and Peterka 4 points. Mosher says she may switch her starting lineup before the weekend. "Against South Dakota State I want to give a lot of people playing time and I would like to cut down on our turnovers."

GYMNASTS DOWN STANFORD --

The 17th-ranked Minnesota women's gymnastics team toppled 20th-ranked Stanford, 175.85 - 168.25, in a dual meet at Williams Arena last Thursday night. The Gophers defeated Stanford in team scores for every event, as well as taking every individual first.

"We had two goals going into the Stanford meet," commented Coach Katalin Deli. "We wanted to cut our beam mistakes in half, and score 175 points or better.

The Gophers accomplished both goals, with three gymnasts scoring better than 9.0 on the beam. Last week against Missouri and Illinois, no Gopher rated better than 8.50 on the beam.

DORSEY LEADS THE WAY -- Sophomore Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) turned in an outstanding performance, winning the all-around (36.65), and placing first in the floor exercise (9.55), trying the second highest score in that event in Gopher history (school record is 9.60). Dorsey placed second on the uneven bars (8.95), third in the vault (9.10), and fifth on the balance beam (9.05).

Freshman Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) was third all-around (35.65). Kaiser equalled her performance of last week on the vault (9.30), the third highest score in Minnesota history (school record is 9.40). She also took individual honors in the balance beam (9.25), and was second in the floor exercise (9.10).

KOT STILL UNBEATEN ON BARS -- Sophomore Julie Kot (BURNSVILLE, MN) tied her score from last week on the uneven bars (9.50), remaining undefeated in that event, and again equalling the third best score in Gopher history (school record is 9.65).

Candace Doell (SASKATOON, SASKATCHEWAN) placed second on the vault (9.15). Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was fourth all-around (34.85), placing fourth on both the balance beam (9.10) and the floor exercise (8.95).

NEXT MEETS IN SUNNY SOUTH -- The Gophers continue practicing, but will not compete again until January 13, when they square off against the 11th-ranked Georgia Bulldogs in Athens, Georgia. The following day, Minnesota faces sixth-ranked Florida and 20th-ranked Oklahoma State in Gainesville, Florida.

"We will be facing much tougher competition than we've seen so far," Coach Deli says. "But, it is great to go against top schools, and we're very excited. I'm sure Florida will be at the top of the ratings at the end of the year."

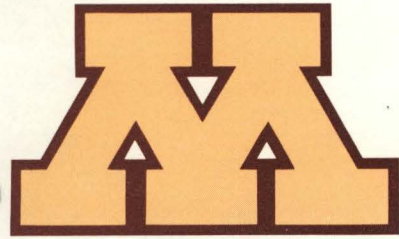

(BASKETBALL HEADS TO PHILADELPHIA/CONCLUDES PRE-BIG TEN SCHEDULE)

The Gopher women's basketball team will carry a 2-4 overall record to Philadelphia for the eight team LaSalle Invitational December 28-30. The Gophers will return home in January and open the double round-robin Big Ten schedule at home against Illinois on Friday January 6 and Purdue on Sunday January 8.

Minnesota dropped its third straight road game at Central Michigan last week, 71-92. The Gophers lost freshman Molly Tadich early in the second half with a broken nose, and sophomore Gretchen Schad in the first half with an ankle sprain. Both are expected to play in Philadelphia.

Minnesota opened the year placing second in the Dial Classic at home to an experienced Arkansas team. The Gophers then defeated Iowa State at home, but lost two close road trips to #5 Tennessee 50-54 and #17 Western Kentucky 61-69. Last week's home game against South Dakota State was cancelled due to the weather.

Coach Ellen Mosher says describing the loss to Central Michigan is difficult. "Every time we started to make a run back, we turned the ball over. We were not mentally sharp." Mosher is unsure of her starting line-up for the Philadelphia trip, but is looking forward to meeting new opponents. "We will get a chance to play teams we never play and the tournament will be a good conditioner before the Big Ten starts. LaSalle will give us exposure on the East Coast," says Mosher.

GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- Senior Barb Meredith, a 6-2 center, has started the year with a bang. Meredith pumped in a career high 17 points against Central Michigan before fouling out early in the second half and has scored in double figures the past three games currently averaging 9.5 points and 4.5 rebounds. Junior 6-1 forward Laura Coenen led Minnesota against Central Michigan with 21 points and had a season best 24 at Western Kentucky. She is leading the team in scoring with 18 points and is second in rebounding with 8.6.

Freshman Molly Tadich, a 6-3 center, has not started a contest yet, but was named MVP of the Gophers opening Dial Classic with 28 points and 22 rebounds in two games and is leading the Gophers in rebounding (10.3) and is second in scoring (10.8). She had most of her 10 points and 11 rebounds in the first half against Central Michigan.

Senior co-captain Mary Dressen, a 5-9 shooting guard and starter, is averaging 9.0 points and had a high of 18 points in the opener against Miami-Ohio. Sophomore 6-0 forward Carol Peterka has been the other starter at forward, and is averaging 6.7 points with a high of 13 in the Dial Classic Championship against Arkansas.

The final starting spot, point guard, has been filled by sophomore Lisa Hoelscher with freshman Cindy Phillips and junior Denise Freese filling in off the bench.

Mosher also has utilized sophomores Kelli Behrens and Gretchen Schad in reserve roles at forward. Behrens has a soft shot and scored 8 points against Arkansas while Schad had a high of 7 points at Tennessee.

Noting The Wolves -- Cheyney State is ranked 20th in the country this week, and is led by Yolanda Laney, honorable mention All-American last year, who is averaging 28.6 points per game and 12.7 rebounds. The Wolves have three other starters averaging in double figures. They had a rash of injuries at the beginning of the year, but are healthy now. The Wolves have lost only to number four Texas and number eleven Old Dominion.

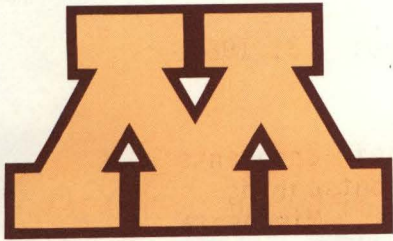

(BASKETBALL OPENS BIG TEN SEASON WITH ILLINOIS/PURDUE)

The Minnesota women's basketball team will open the Big Ten season at home this weekend by hosting Illinois on Friday night (8:05 p.m.) and Purdue on Sunday afternoon (2:05 p.m.). The Gophers carry a 3-6 record into the Big Ten season, but Coach Ellen Mosher considers her team 0-0.

"The nice thing about the pre-season and Big Ten season is you get to start over at the beginning with a 0-0 record. The pre-season is like having practice games -- now is the time to put it all together."

Although Minnesota has lost six games, three of those were close decisions to top twenty ranked Tennessee (50-54), Western Kentucky (61-69) and most recently Cheyney State (71-79). That has been an encouraging sign to Mosher. "We've gotten tougher in every game that we've played. I'm pleased with our character. We've had intensity and toughness and pulled out the best when we've needed the best."

As for the Big Ten season, Mosher is not "making any predictions". "We are going to play each game and look at each game seperately. We have to cut down on our turnovers and mental mistakes and those things have to do with game experience."

Basketball continued -- Although the Gophers are outshooting their opponents from the field (.445 to .427), outrebounding (389 to 345), and outscoring (67.9 to 61.1) turnovers has been a key factor in several losses. Minnesota is averaging 25.2 to their opponents 20.2.

LA SALLE INVITATIONAL/MINNESOTA 6th of 8 teams -- Although the Gophers lost to 20th ranked Cheyney State in the first round 71-79, Mosher was pleased with the team effort. Cheyney went on to win the tournament by upsetting highly rated Mississippi 81-76 in the Championship game. In the first round consolation Minnesota defeated Youngstown State 92-73, setting season bests of most points, field goals made and attempted, free throws made and attempted, rebounds (63), and assists (19). In the fifth place game, the Gophers lost to Villanova 69-76.

GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- Senior Barb Meredith (MANKATO/EAST) continued her stellar play with a career high 18 points (8-13 in field goals and 2-2) against Cheyney State and also scored 14 points and grabbed eight rebounds against Youngstown State and had 8 points and 7 rebounds against Villanova. Her 40 minutes of playing time against Villanova was only the second time in her career that she has played an entire game.

Sophomore Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) broke out of her scoring slump and had an excellent three game performance. She scored a career high 22 points on 10-16 shooting from the field and 2-3 from the line against Cheyney State and also had 18 points and 12 rebounds with 4 assists and 5 steals against Youngstown State. In the final game with Villanova, Peterka scored 16 points and grabbed 10 rebounds.

Freshman Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) had a career high and game high 23 points in the loss to Villanova hitting 11-16 shots from the field and 1 of 2 from the line. She also tied her career best with 13 rebounds. Tadich also had 7 points and 8 boards against Cheyney State and scored 15 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the victory over Youngstown State.

Sophomore Laura Coenen (NEENAH, WI) moved into fifth place on the all-time rebounding list during the tournament with 618 career rebounds surpassing Cindy Kuhlman (79-83) with 601. Coenen could move as high as second place by seasons end. Coenen scored in double figures all three games with 13 points and 9 rebounds against Cheyney State, 15 points vs. Youngstown State and 12 points against Villanova. Sophomore Kelli Behrens (ST. CHARLES) played only 16 minutes in the Youngstown State game but scored a career high 12 points and grabbed a career best 10 rebounds.

Junior Denise Freese (BRECKENRIDGE) started all three games of the tournament at guard and freshman Cindy Phillips (LANSING, MI) saw considerable playing time and had 7 rebounds against Cheyney State. Senior Mary Dressen (BROWERVILLE) had 10 points vs. Cheyney State, 12 points against State and 8 points and 7 rebounds against Villanova.

GOPHER STARTERS -- Mosher says she is unsure of her starting lineup for the weekend. "A lot will depend on this week's practice. I don't have any thoughts on who goes out there first. If they play well they play, if not, they sit." Top candidates include Peterka at forward, Meredith at center, Dressen at guard, Coenen at forward, and the other guard slot open. Lisa Hoelscher was starting there early in the year but Denise Freese started all three games in Philadelphia. Freshman Molly Tadich, the teams second leading scorer and leading rebounder has yet to start. more ---

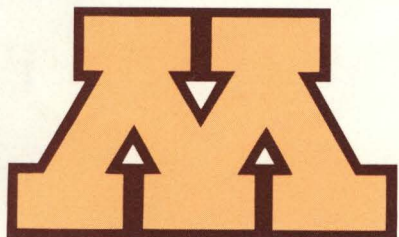

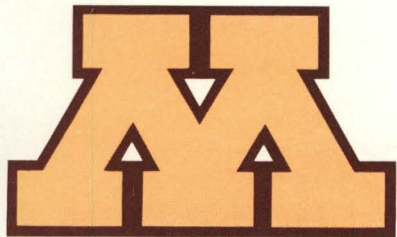
TEAM LEADERS The Illini --

THE SERIES -- Minnesota leads the series 3-0 and won both games last year in the opening weekend at Purdue 86-75 and in the last home weekend 115-88. The 115-88 win set numerous Minnesota records including most points scored in a game and most combined points.

PRE-BIG TEN SEASONS -- Purdue entered the Big Ten season with a 4-6 record while Minnesota was 3-6.

Purdue committed 33 turnovers although Wisconsin had 28, but the Badgers controlled the boards 49-28. Purdue shot 25-63 (.397) from the field and 12-16 (.750) from the line.

Minnesota played only six players and freshman Cindy Phillips got the nod to start at point guard and played all 40 minutes for the first time this year with a season high 6 points. Sophomore Carol Peterka played all 40 minutes for only the second time in her career and scored a career high 23 points and tied her career best with 12 rebounds. Senior Mary Dressen had 19 points and set a new Williams Arena record and had personal bests of 11 free throws made and 13 free throws attempted. Junior Laura Coenen played only 16.5 minutes after suffering from illness.

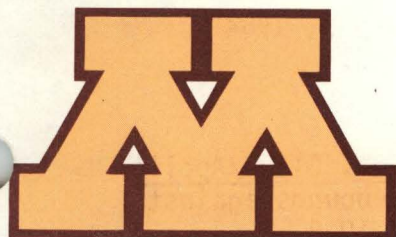

GYMNASTS WHISTLIN' DIXIE -- FACE TWO RANKED TEAMS

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team, ranked 17th in the first poll of this season, face two top ten teams this weekend. Friday, Jan. 13, the Gophers square off with the tenth-ranked Georgia Bulldogs in Athens, Georgia. Saturday, Jan. 14, Minnesota meets sixth-ranked Florida and Oklahoma State in Gainesville, Florida.

FIRST STOP -- ATHENS, GEORGIA -- Georgia is 2-1 so far this year, with the only loss to number five Alabama by four-tenths of a point (189.7-178.3). The 'Dogs defeated Jacksonville State (180.00-177-85) and Wisconsin (175.20-113.85). However, Georgia has suffered a key injury--three-time All-American Kathy McMinn has an injured knee and will miss the next three weeks. McMinn was third All-Around in the NCAA National Championships last year, and won the all-around in Georgia's first two meets. NEXT STOP -- GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA -- Saturday, Jan. 14, the Gophers meet Florida and Oklahoma State in Gainesville. Florida won the Southeastern Conference last year -- a conference which qualified four teams for the NCAA National Championships. The Gators are led by sophomore Elfi Schlegel, who won All-American honors last year by placing fifth in the all-around and floor exercise at the NCAA nationals. She represented Canada in the 1980 Olympics and has qualified to do the same in 1984. The Gators open their season this Wednesday, Jan. 11, against Auburn, Rhode Island, and Iowa.

OKLAHOMA STATE -- Oklahoma State has a 2-0 record this year, defeating Denver (171.05-166.65) and Iowa State (168.90-162.55). Teri Collings won the all-around against Denver, with a 34.90, and Lisa Hartman won the all-around against Iowa State (34.10). Last year, Oklahoma State was 6-7.

The Minnesota swim team travels to Lincoln to compete with Nebraska on Saturday at 7:00 p.m. The Gophers enter the meet with a 2-1 dual meet record while the Huskers are 3-2. Gopher Coach Jean Freeman says Nebraska is favored to win the meet.

Nebraska's best swimmers are sophomore Emily Ricketts, who has qualified for the Olympic Trials in the 800 yard freestyle and the NCAA Meet in the 500 yard freestyle; and freshman Dana Powers who has qualified for NCAA's in the 100 yard butterfly and the 50 and 100 yard freestyles. Powers' time in the butterfly is only .14 second off the Olympic Qualifying Standard. Minnesota team members that will not travel to Nebraska will compete at Wisconsin-Stout at 2:00 p.m.

MINNESOTA TAKES SIXTEEN FIRSTS AT USS SENIOR MEET

Minnesota swept all sixteen events of this weekend's USS Senior Meet at Cooke Hall Pool. Swimmers from local swim clubs, the Mach 3 Flyers of St. Louis Park, Star of St. Paul and Roseville, Valley Dolphins of Apple Valley, and the Richfield Swim Club participated. No team scores were kept.

IN THE FAST LANES -- Sophomore Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL, MN) was high scorer at the meet with 33 points. Wallner won the 50 yard freestyle (:24.56), the 100 backstroke (1:03.62), 200 freestyle (1:58.18), and the 100 freestyle (:53.90). She was also a member of the first place finishing 800 yard freestyle relay team (7:58.40), the 400 freestyle relay (3:39.54), and the 400 yard medley relay (4:06.37).

Season bests were swum in the 500 yard freestyle by Marja Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND) who finished first in 5:13.93, Elyce Iwerks (Aberdeen, SD) who swam to first place in the 1650 yard freestyle in 17:53.20 and the 800 yard freestyle relay team of Iwerks, Marci Olson (Cottage Grove, MN), Wallner, and Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE, MN) who won the 7:58.40,

MOST IMPROVED -- According to Coach Jean Freeman, junior Jeanne Ewing (SIOUX FALLS, SD) was the most improved at the meet. Ewing finished sixth in the 100 and 200 yard breaststrokes with 1:10.86 and 2:36.43 times respectively, and twentieth in the 200 yard individual medley in 2:28.81. Sophomore Nancy Touve (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) also improved upon recent times finishing second in the 100 yard breaststroke (1:10.27), third in the 200 breaststroke (2:31.31) and sixth in the 200 yard individual medley (2:17.88) and the 100 yard butterfly (1:02.79).

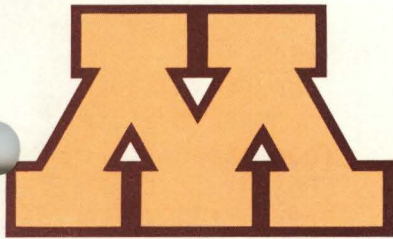

GOPHER NOTES BASKETBALL VS. MICHIGAN & MICHIGAN STATE
Minnesota Overall Record: 5-6 Big Ten: 2-0

SEASON REVIEW -- Minnesota ended the pre-season with a 3-6 overall record including three narrow losses to top twenty ranked Tennessee (50-54), Western Kentucky (61-69) and Cheyney State (71-79). The Gophers opened with their own Dial Classic, defeating Miami of Ohio in the first round, but lost to Arkansas in the Championship. The other victories were over Iowa State at home and Youngstown State at the LaSalle Invitational, but the Gophers lost to Central Michigan and Villanova.

A LOOK AT THE GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- The biggest problem so far this season has been finding a replacement for graduated All-Big Ten and Kodak All-American Region 4 selection Debbie Hunter (17.7 ppg). The first six games of the year, Mosher started sophomore Lisa Hoelscher at point guard and at the La Salle Invit. it was junior Denise Freese. But last weekend, Lansing, Michigan native Cindy Phillips got the nod and played all 40 minutes in the victory over Illinois and started again on Sunday against Purdue. Against Illinois, Phillips hit 3-9 from the field for six points and had four assists, both bests so far this year.

The other guard slot has been filled by senior co-captain Mary Dressen who was named to the Dial Classic All-Tournament team this year and has hit career bests in free throws with 11-13 against Illinois and 8-8 against Purdue (a streak of 12 straight).

At center, senior Barb Meredith has had an outstanding season hitting a career best 18 points against Cheyney State and despite being ill last weekend, scoring 6 points vs. Illinois and 14 against Purdue with 7 rebounds in both games. Freshman Molly Tadich has not started yet this year, but was named MVP of the Dial Classic and had career bests of 23 points and 13 rebounds against Villanova. Last weekend, Tadich scored 11 points vs. Illinois and 13 against Purdue.

Forward is a position with depth despite injury problems. Junior co-captain Laura Coenen is averaging 16 points and 7.5 rebounds and had a season high 24 points against Western Kentucky and 22 vs. Purdue. Sophomore Carol Peterka has caught on fire in recent weeks. She had a career high 22 points vs. Cheyney State, but broke that last weekend with 23 points and 12 rebounds against Illinois. Sunday, she got in foul trouble and played just 13.5 minutes but scored 11 points and grabbed a career high 14 rebounds. Peterka was named Big Ten Player of the Week and in the last five games is averaging 18 points and 10.8 rebounds. Reserve forward Gretchen Schad saw action for the first time against Purdue since injuring her ankle in the Central Michigan game and sophomore Kelli Behrens is doubtful for the weekend with tendinitis in her achilles.

THE COACH -- Ellen Mosher is the winningest coach in the Big Ten conference by victory percentage with a 40-12 mark in conference games. She is in her seventh season at Minnesota (130-66) and is ranked twentieth of Division I coaches nationwide by winning percentage with a ten year overall 184-77 mark.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads the series with Michigan 4 games to none and won both games last year 90-43 and 84-77. Minnesota leads the series with Michigan State 2 games to 1 and won the first meeting last year 75-65, but lost at Michigan State (with Laura Coenen injured) 75-94.

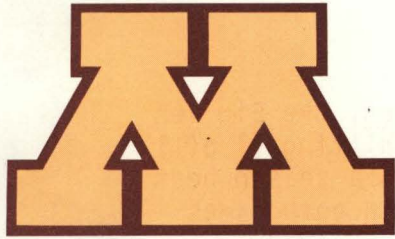

(BASKETBALL HOSTS IOWA AND NORTHWESTERN/MOSHER MAY CHANGE STARTING LINEUP)

With a 3-1 Big Ten record and 6-7 overall mark, the Minnesota basketball team will host undefeated Northwestern (3-0, 8-4) and Iowa (2-1, 8-4) this weekend. Both games will be important in the conference race. "It's obvious from their game scores that both Iowa and Northwestern are going to have very fine teams this year," says Coach Ellen Mosher. "We are fortunate to play at home this weekend."

Mosher may be especially glad to return to Williams Arena after Sunday's 67-92 loss at Michigan State after the Gophers defeated Michigan on Friday 81-75. The MSU loss ties the most points scored against the Gophers this season, and was the widest margin of defeat. Ironically, the other 92 point game was at Central Michigan 71-92. The losing margin does not bother Mosher. "It doesn't matter if we lost by one point or 25 points, it's still just one loss."

What Mosher is concerned about is her offensive production from the point guard position, and she is considering moving either junior Laura Coenen or sophomore Carol Peterka to a guard slot this week. "Against Michigan State we had only 2 points from our point guards," says Mosher. "We've got to get some offense from that spot."

Mosher had started sophomore Lisa Hoelscher at point guard the first six games of the year, followed by junior Denise Freese during the La Salle Invitational. Then, in the Big Ten season, she started freshman Cindy Phillips the past four games. Moving Coenen or Peterka to forward would mean increased playing time for reserve forwards Gretchen Schad and Kelli Behrens, and a possible starting spot for freshman center Molly Tadich.

NOTING THE HAWKEYES -- Iowa is off to their best season ever under first year coach Vivian Stringer, who is the third winningest coach in the nation and comes to Iowa from Cheyney State. Iowa won both Big Ten games their opening weekend over Michigan State 70-62 and Michigan 70-51 in Iowa City, but then lost at Northwestern last weekend 51-59. A big factor for the Hawkeyes in the loss to Northwestern was free throws -- Iowa converted only 3-14 while Northwestern hit 11-25. Both teams shot 24-61 from the field (.393). With four freshman in the starting line-up the Hawkeyes are a young squad and have been paced in scoring primarily by freshman 6-4 center Lisa Becker who had 15 points vs. Michigan State and 18 vs. Michigan and 5-11 freshman forward Lisa Long who had 14 points and 16 rebounds against the Wildcats. Freshman guard Pam DuBose started against Northwestern and scored 10 points. THE SERIES Minnesota leads 10-3. 1982-83 scores: W 73-62 and W 78-53.

NOTING THE WILDCATS -- Northwestern tied for third in the Big Ten with Minnesota last season and has three wins over Michigan 69-51, Michigan State 64-55 and Iowa 59-51 under their belts. Senior guard Connie Erickson had a hot second half against the Hawkeyes including five baskets in a crucial time period to tie the game and put Northwestern up for good 40-38 with 10 minutes left to play. She had 15 points altogether. Northwestern's bread and butter player is still All Big Ten pick Anucha Browne who was ranked 16th nationally in scoring last week and had 16 points and tied her career best with 20 rebounds vs. Iowa. Sophomore guard Laura Wiesen also had 10 points vs. Iowa. THE SERIES Northwestern leads 5 games to 3. 1982-83 scores: L 67-72 and L 92-93 (the only Big Ten team Minnesota lost both games to last season).

DOUBLES TEAM REACHES QUARTERFINALS OF MILWAUKEE CLASSIC/ROST ADVANCES TO REGIONAL OLYMPIC TRIALS

The doubles team of Claudia Brisk (SKOKIE, IL) and Kelly Coleman (TOLEDO, OH) advanced to the quarterfinals of the Milwaukee Tennis Classic by defeating Lisa Howett and Lorna Browne of Oklahoma State 4-6, 6-3, 6-2 in the first round, Heather Eldridge and Kathleen Cummings of Texas 7-6 (7-4), 6-2 in the second round and then lost to Diane Donnelly and Eva Lucido of Northwestern 6-4, 6-1 in the quarter final match. Brisk won her two qualifying singles matches but lost in the first round of the main draw to #4 seed Pam Jung of Pepperdine 6-2, 6-2.

Sophomore Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) defeated teammate Lisa Martin in three sets at the USTA Northwest region tennis playoffs last weekend to qualify for the regional competition of the national qualifying rounds for the Olympic Trials. The site and time for the regional meet have not yet been determined. more ---

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO NORTHERN MICHIGAN SATURDAY --

The Minnesota Swim Team travels to Marquette, MI Saturday to compete with Northern Michigan. At their last meeting the Gophers defeated the Wildcats 90-59. The Gophers enter the meet with a 3-1 dual meet record.

MINNESOTA SWIMMERS UPSET NEBRASKA 84-56 -- The Minnesota swim team accomplished a surprise upset on Saturday, defeating Nebraska 84-56. The Gophers won twelve of sixteen events at the meet. Meanwhile, the swimmers who didn't travel to Nebraska defeated Wisconsin - Stout 65-23. The Gophers won all eleven events against the Blue Devils.

IN THE FAST LANES -- Sophomore Marja Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND) swam the Gophers' best 1650 yard freestyle of the season, finishing second with 17:32.23 behind Nebraska's Emily Ricketts' 17:13.12 finish. Ricketts has already qualified for the Olympic Trials in the 800 yard freestyle and the NCAA's in the 500 yard freestyle. Raikkala also set a season best in the 400 yard individual medley winning the event in 4:34.83.

Sophomore Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL, MN) improved on the Gopher season bests in the 50 and 100 yard freestyles winning both events with times of :24.23 and :53.17 consecutively. Another sophomore, Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) set a new Gopher season best in the 200 yard butterfly with a winning time of 2:09.17. Freshman Cindy Hovet (BELLEVUE, WA) set the season best in the 200 yard breaststroke finishing first in 2:27.59.

Diver Carol Libbesmeier (ST. CLOUD, MN) scored NCAA Zone Qualifying points in both the 1 and 3 meter events, placing second in 1 meter diving with 252.00 points behind Nebraska's Marcia Heaton who had 267.00 points and Libbesmeier won the 3 meter diving with 267.00 points.

TRACK & FIELD INTRASQUAD SATURDAY --

Coach Mike Lawless will have his first look at the 1984 women's track and field team in competition this Saturday, when the Gophers hold their intrasquad meet at 10:00 a.m. in the Fieldhouse. Lawless says this meet is a good way to bridge the gap between practice and an actual meet.

"Most athletes are apprehensive going into competition," says Lawless. "It's a different psychology than practice, and it's good to have the experience before an actual meet."

TRACK & FIELD OUTLOOK -- After the Northwest Open, the Gophers travel to Madison for a triangular meet with Wisconsin and Marquette. Wisconsin finished second in the Big Ten Indoor Championships last year. Then, Lawless will take some of his runners to the Husker Invitational in Lincoln, Nebraska, which traditionally attracts some of the best teams in the country.

"We generally use the early season to prepare for the Big Ten meet and the NCAA meet," Lawless says. "This year, we are facing tough competition right off the bat with Iowa State, Wisconsin, and the Husker Invitational."

The Gophers' strong suit again this year will be the long and middle distances, starting with the members of the cross country team that finished tenth in the nation. Distance records toppled almost weekly last year, and sophomore Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) and senior Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON, MN) are back to see that it happens again this season. These two set five indoor records between them last year.

The throwers will be strong again this year, as well, led by Becky Fettig (ST. CLOUD, MN), a junior who holds the outdoor school records in the discus and shot put, and won the Big Ten Outdoor Championships last year in the discus. Lawless expects freshman Julie Albrecht (EXCELSIOR, MN) to begin learning the ropes and supply some depth.

In the sprints, senior Cathy Gorecki (STILLWATER, MN) can run with anyone in the Big Ten. She set new school indoor records in the 400 m and 600 yd. run last year, and placed fifth in the 600 yd. at the Big Ten indoor meet, qualifying for the NCAAs. Beyond Gorecki, Lawless says the team is a little thin in the sprints, as well as the jumps. He will be relying on some newcomers to fill in these gaps.

LAST YEAR --The Gophers finished ninth at the Big Ten indoor meet, then turned around and placed 16th in the NCAA indoor meet. The two-mile relay team finished third at the NCAA, winning All-American honors, and Jody Eder placed fifth in the 1,000 yd. run, winning individual All-American status.

"The Big Ten is tough again this year," says Lawless, "but I look for us to improve on our finishes of last year, both indoors and out."

GYMNASTICS FALL AGAINST TOP TEN COMPETITION --

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team held their own against two of the best teams in the country last weekend, but ended up on the losing end of both scores. The Gophers lost to #10 Georgia Friday by less than four points (177.05 - 173.25); then lost to #5 Florida and beat Oklahoma State in a triangular meet on Saturday.

"We had a tough time on the uneven bars in both meets," commented Coach Katalin Deli. "Overall, however, I was pleased with our performance, especially against Florida."

GEORGIA RECRUITS A NEW PEACH --

The Bulldogs performed without three-time All-American Kathy McMinn, out with a knee injury, but added a freshman who graduated from high school in December (Terri Eckert). She preceeded to win every event.

For the Gophers, sophomore Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) finished third all-around (35.40), placing second on the bars (9.00) and fourth in the vault (8.95). Freshman Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) placed second in the vault (9.00) and in the floor exercise (9.30) to finish fourth all-around (35.15).

GATOR GREAT --

Florida pulled out all the stops Saturday, scoring the highest point total recorded in the country this year (186.45). Minnesota posted their second highest score of the year (175.30), and Oklahoma State finished with 166.45. Florida's Canadian Olympic hopeful Elfi Schlegel logged the best all-around score in the country this year with a 38.05.

GOPHERS HAVE PLENTY TO CHEER ABOUT -- Laurie Kaiser tied the individual school record for the vault against Florida. Her 9.40 equals the mark set by Robin Huebner two years ago. Every Gopher scored above 9.00 in the vault, and the team set a new school record with a 46.05 team score (the old record was 45.70 set last year).

Kaiser was the top Gopher against Florida, finishing fourth all-around with the best score of her short career (36.00). She tied for first in the vault (9.40) and tied for third in the floor exercise (9.20).

OTHER GOPHER NOTES -- Freshman Marie Bandrowski (MILFORD, MI) competed in her first meets, after sitting out the first month of the season with an elbow injury. 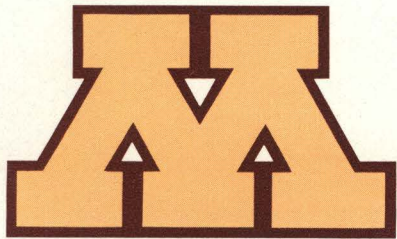

GAME NOTES MINNESOTA VS. NORTHWESTERN

Records: Minnesota: 4-1, 7-7 Northwestern 3-1, 8-5

THE SERIES -- Northwestern leads the series five games to three and was the only Big Ten team to defeat Minnesota in both meetings last season. The first matchup was in Evanston, with the Wildcats winning 72-67, and at Williams Arena Northwestern came from behind for a 97-92 victory -- marking the first time the Gophers ever scored over 90 points and lost.

NOTES ON FRIDAY NIGHT'S GAMES -- Wisconsin defeated Northwestern 80-70 and Minnesota defeated Iowa 57-55. Northwestern never led, as Wisconsin scored the first bucket at 18:59 in the first half. The Badgers built up a 10 point lead 27-17 with 6:53 in the half and led at halftime 35-27. The closest Northwestern came was four points, 61-65 with 3:35 to play despite the loss by fouls of Anucha Browne (11:23) and Stacey Neal (6:56). Browne led the scoring with 15 points and nine rebounds, while Laura Wiesen had 14 points, Connie Erickson had 13 and Joanne Palombo had 10 in a reserve role.

Minnesota held onto a victory over the Hawkeyes in the final seconds and shot their second best field goal percentage of the season (50.0). Senior Barb Meredith shot the best from the field of her career (8-9) and tied her career best with 18 points. She also had 18 against Cheyney State this year. Mary Dressen had her free throw streak snapped at 18 straight and scored 13 points, while Carol Peterka scored 12 points and added 7 boards. Laura Coenen's five points represents her third lowest total of her career, and only the sixth time she has not been in double figures in her career.

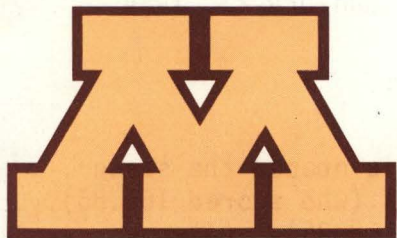

(GYMNASTS HOST MICHIGAN STATE/HOLD BEST BIG TEN PERFORMANCES) --

So far this year, the Gophers are the best of the Big Ten. Minnesota gymnasts have turned in the best performances of any Big Ten competitors in all four events and the all-around. The Gophers will put these achievements on the line this Friday, January 27, when the Michigan State Spartans bring their 6-1 record to Williams Arena at 8:00 p.m.

Sophomore Wendy Dorsey's (EDINA, MN) 36.65 all-around performance against Stanford earlier this year is the best all-around in the Big Ten, and is fourth in the country. Freshman Laurie Kaiser's (PLYMOUTH, MN) 36.00 ties as the third best Big Ten all-around.

Dorsey also has the best floor exercise score in the conference (9.55) with Kaiser fourth (9.30). Kaiser holds the top Big Ten scores in the vault (9.40 -- tied with Minnesota school record) and balance beam (9.25 -- a tie with Mary Olsen from Ohio State). Sophomore Julie Kot (BURNSVILLE, MN) has the top score in the uneven bars (9.50).

RECORD IS MISLEADING -- Minnesota is 3-3, but all three losses have come against top 20 teams: Missouri (by less than two points, Georgia (by less than four points), and Florida (who logged the highest score in the country so far this year).

"If we can clean up the falls," says coach Katalin Deli, "we can easily improve our score by five or six points. Each fall on the beam and bars counts against you, so we have to start eliminating them. Our goal against Michigan State is to score 177 or better."

So far this year, the Gophers' best score is 175.85, compiled against Stanford January 8. The team came close against Florida and Oklahoma State, when they scored 175.30.

SEASON RECAP -- A triangular meet against Missouri and Illinois opened the season. Minnesota lost to Missouri (171.70 - 173.40) and beat Illinois (who scored 165.85). Next came a win against Stanford in Williams Arena (175.85 - 168.25). After a month with no competition, Minnesota journeyed to #10 Georgia (a loss -- 173.25 - 177.05) January 13, and to #5 Florida on January 14. At Florida the Gophers scored 175.30 and set a school record in the vault (46.05) with every individual scoring over 9.00. Florida's 186.45, however, was the best score in the country this year. Oklahoma State also competed at Florida and lost to the Gophers.

MICHIGAN STATE -- The Spartans' best performance of their 6-1 season came against Illinois, when they scored 176.75. Earlier they beat Missouri 174.20 - 174.00. State's Kelly Doyle has the second best all-around score in the Big Ten (36.50) and the second best floor exercise (9.40). Both are school records. The Spartans also rely on freshman Linda Schmauder (best all-around -- 35.25) and Kellie Thorburn (34.30), and sophomore Frances Marino (35.30).

GOPHER NOTES -- Julie Kot injured her knee against Georgia on January 13 and will not compete this Friday, and may also miss the first two meets in February.

INDOOR TRACK SEASON OPENS THIS WEEKEND --

The Minnesota women's and men's track squads host the Northwest Open Friday and Saturday, January 27-28 in the Fieldhouse. Women's events get underway Friday at 4:15 p.m. with the trials and quarterfinals of the 60 yard dash. The high jump final is Friday with all other finals Saturday afternoon.

Coach Mike Lawless expects his team to fare well against mostly local competition, which will include teams from Augustana, St. Olaf, Mankato State, Macalester, and Hamline, among others. "We had no major surprises at our intrasquad meet last week," says Lawless. "Becky Fettig (junior from ST. CLOUD, MN) did throw the shot put an inch farther than her best effort this year, which is obviously very encouraging."

GOPHERS TO WATCH -- Fettig will perform in the shot put, which begins after noon on Saturday. All-American sophomore Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) will compete in the mile at 12:45 Saturday; senior Sue Alm (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and junior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) will run the two mile at noon; and Cathy Gorecki (LAKE ELMO, MN) will run the 440 yard dash at 1:20 p.m.

(SWIMMING HOSTS BIG TEN RIVAL WISCONSIN) --

The Minnesota swim team will host Big Ten rival Wisconsin this weekend at Cooke Hall Pool at 1:00 p.m. The Gophers enter the meet with a 4-1 record while the Badgers are on a nine meet winning streak with a 9-1 record.

On paper Minnesota is the stronger of the two teams, with season bests ranked in the top three of the Big Ten (tabulated through January 16) in ten events, while the Badgers are in the top three in only half as many events. Wisconsin's Marie Krug holds the second best time in the 50 yard freestyle, just three hundredths of a second ahead of Minnesota's third ranked time of :24.23 by Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL, MN). Krug holds third best times in the 100 yard butterfly (:57.62) and the 200 yard individual medley (2:10.50), while Minnesota is not ranked in these events. Sophomore Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE, MN) lost only to Krug in the 200 yard individual medley during last year's swimming season, and she hopes to avenge that loss at this year's meet. Johnson holds the best time in the Big Ten in the 100 yard individual medley (1:03.69).

BIG TEN RECORDS -- This past weekend Wisconsin upset Michigan 78 to 62. Michigan placed second at last year's Big Ten Championship, while Wisconsin placed seventh. The Badgers now boast a 4-1 Big Ten record, while the Gophers have only faced one Big Ten opponent this season having defeated Northwestern 78-33.

IN THE FAST LANES -- The Gophers posted a win this weekend defeating Northern Michigan 82-58. A season best time for the Gophers was posted in the 200 yard freestyle by Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD) who finished first with a 1:55.3 time. Individual season bests were swum by Iwerks in the 100 yard freestyle (:54.3) and the 200 yard individual medley (2:14.6); Julie Rezab (MACOMB, IL) in the 500 and 1,000 freestyles (5:27.3) and (11.18.5); Nancy Touve (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) in the 100 yard breaststroke (1:09.7) and as a member of the 200 yard individual medley relay which finished first in 1:53.75; Marci Olson (COTTAGE GROVE, MN) in the 200 yard butterfly (2:13.9); and Ruth Christensen (ST. PAUL, MN) in the 100 yard butterfly (1:00.6).

(BASKETBALL TRAVELS TO LEAGUE LEADING WISCONSIN)

The Gopher basketball team (4-2 Big Ten, 7-8 Overall) heads into the critical stretch of the Big Ten season with two road weekends. This Friday, January 27, the Gophers will face their biggest rival, Wisconsin, in Madison at 7:30 p.m., and the following weekend, Minnesota will face co-champions Indiana and Ohio State on the road. After that, Minnesota hosts Ohio State and Indiana February 10 and 12 and Wisconsin on February 17.

BADGERS UNBEATEN IN BIG TEN PLAY -- Wisconsin is tied for first in the Big Ten with a 6-0 record (11-5 overall). Victories have been over Purdue (92-62), Illinois (64-53), Michigan State (67-66), and Michigan (77-63). Last weekend, Wisconsin defeated Northwestern handily (80-70), but squeaked out a win over Iowa 50-49 with a basket at the buzzer. Wisconsin is 8-0 at home this year.

THE RIVALRY -- Minnesota leads the series 8 games to 1, with the only loss in 1974-75, 45-55, under former coach Jenny Johnson. Wisconsin, under coach Edwina Qualls, has never defeated the Gophers. Last year, Minnesota won the first meeting at Williams Arena 73-60 and at Wisconsin 77-71 behind Neenah, Wisconsin native Laura Coenen's career best and Wisconsin Field House record 41 points.

However, Sunday, Minnesota had only eight players and were unable to overcome a 12 point halftime lead by Northwestern. In that game, Minnesota shot their lowest field goal pct. of the year (35.0) and committed 30 turnovers. Minnesota is averaging 24.2 turnovers on the season.

NOTING THE GOPHERS -- Senior Barb Meredith (MANKATO) had a stellar game against Iowa, hitting her first seven field goal attempts (8-9 on the game) and tying her career best with 18 points (also 18 vs. Cheyney State this year). Meredith also grabbed a career best 14 rebounds and added 12 points in the loss to Northwestern.

Sophomore Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD) had 12 points vs. Iowa, and scored a career best 24 points (11-19, 2-2) against Northwestern and grabbed her second best rebounding total (13). Peterka hit 18 points in the first half.

TADICH SETS SCHOOL RECORD -- Freshman Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON) set a new Minnesota school record with 23 rebounds (15 offensive, 8 defensive) against Northwestern. It was her first start of the season, and she also added 11 points. The old record was 21 rebounds by Mary Manderfeld vs. Wisconsin 3/7/81.

Senior Mary Dressen (BROWERVILLE) had her free throw streak snapped at 18-18 vs. Iowa, and had 13 points in the game. She fouled out with 11:31 to play vs. the Wildcats. Junior Laura Coenen scored only five points vs. Iowa, the third lowest total of her career, and was benched vs. Northwestern in a one game suspension for disciplinary reasons, according to Coach Ellen Mosher.

ROSTER CHANGES -- As of Sunday, sophomore Jill Nelson (FOREST LAKE) has left the team. Freshman Trudi Spear transferred to Grandview College (Ia.) before the start of the Big Ten season. INJURY REPORT -- Sophomore Kelli Behrens (ST. CHARLES) has been unable to play with tendinitis in her achilles.

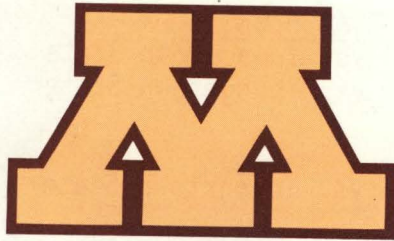

SEASON REVIEW -- Pre-Big Ten -- Minnesota ended the pre-Big Ten season with a 3-6 overall record including three narrow losses to top twenty ranked Tennessee (50-54), Western Kentucky (61-69) and Cheyney State (71-79). The season opened at home with the Dial Classic, and after defeating Miami of Ohio in the first round, Minnesota lost to an experienced Arkansas team in the championship game.

Big Ten -- The Gophers opened at home with wins over Illinois (71-57) and Purdue (83-67). The next road weekend, Minnesota overcame an 8 point halftime deficit to defeat Michigan 81-75, but lost to Michigan State 67-92 -- their worst losing margin of the season (25 pts.). Last weekend at home, the Gophers led most of the game and held off Iowa in the final minute for a 57-55 win, but trailed the entire game in losing to Northwestern 82-73.

MOSHER'S RECORD -- Minnesota 132-68 (7th year) Overall 186-79 (10th year).

THE RIVALRY -- Wisconsin has not defeated the Gophers since 1974-75, 55-45, under former coaches for both schools. Minnesota leads the series 8 games to 1 and defeated the Badgers at Minnesota in the first meeting last year 73-60, and then won at Wisconsin 77-71 behind Neenah, Wisconsin native Laura Coenen's Wisconsin Field House Record, and school record 41 points.

GOPHER TEAM NOTES -- A problem area all season for Ellen Mosher has been finding a guard combination. The Gophers are tall and have more depth than ever at the front line, but miss All-Big Ten point guard Debbie Hunter. Lisa Hoelscher started at that spot the first six games, Denise Freese the next three, and freshman Cindy Phillips since then. Minnesota has outrebounded most of their opponents, but average 24.2 turnovers.

GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- Sophomore Carol Peterka has come on strong during the Big Ten season, and was named Big Ten Player of the Week following the opening weekend of play. Last weekend she had a career high 24 points vs. Northwestern and averages 16.5 points and 10.5 rebounds in the Big Ten, best in both categories.

Junior Laura Coenen had a slow start this year, and was averaging 19 points in the Big Ten before last weekend when she had only five points vs. Iowa and was benched for disciplinary reasons against Northwestern. She still has a 16.2 Big Ten average and team leading 16.4 overall scoring average.

Senior Barb Meredith had a career high 14 rebounds against Northwestern last weekend and tied her career best of 18 points against Iowa (also 18 vs. Cheyney State this year). Meredith has an 11.8 scoring and 6.2 rebounding average in the Big Ten, the best of her career.

Senior Mary Dressen is ranked sixth in the nation in free throw percentage and had an 18-straight streak snapped against Iowa. She is averaging 11.2 points in Big Ten games.

Freshman Molly Tadich had her first start last Sunday and grabbed a school record (tied Big Ten record) 23 rebounds vs. Northwestern while scoring 11 points. Tadich opened the year as MVP of the Dial Classic and had a career high 23 points vs. Villanova.

Junior Denise Freese sat out last year with a broken finger, and came off the bench vs. Northwestern to score a career high 9 points. Cindy Phillips had her best game at Michigan (8 pts) and Lisa Hoelscher has been in a reserve role. Forward Kelli Behrens is out with tenidnitus in her achilles but Gretchen Schad has recovered from two sprained ankles and will see playing time.
