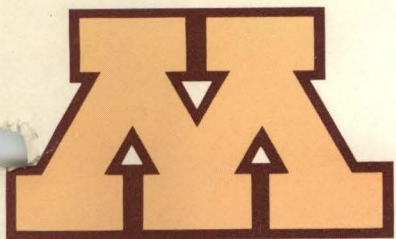

(DOROTHY FRANCO NAMED ASSISTANT VOLLEYBALL COACH)

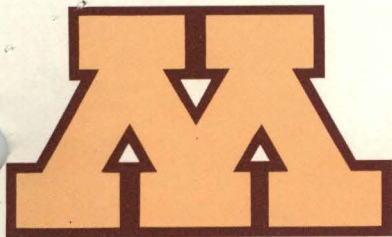
Minneapolis, Minnesota -- Coach Stephanie Schleuder recently announced that Dorothy Franco, a member of the 1984 Olympic Team Handball squad, has been selected as the new assistant volleyball coach for the University of Minnesota. Franco played volleyball under Schleuder's guidance at the University of Alabama from 1976 - 1979 and was head coach at the University of Bridgeport in Bridgeport, Connecticut for 1982 - 1983.

"We're delighted to have a person of Dorothy's quality," Schleuder said, "she brings a wealth of competitive experiences and enthusiasm that will enable her to become a strong asset to the program." Franco was selected from an outstanding field of candidates in a national search.

Franco has been a member of the National Team Handball squad since 1982 and will compete in Los Angeles this summer. According to Schleuder, "Dorothy's Olympic status shows that she is one of the premiere athletes in the country. I've seen her grow from a freshman in college to an Olympian -- she's proven that if you work hard enough you can achieve your goals."

At the University of Bridgeport, and previously at Jonathan Law High School in Milford, Connecticut, Franco turned around losing volleyball programs in just one season. She also conducted clinics and lectured on volleyball and basketball in Guatemala in 1979, taught elementary physical education and served as Physical Fitness Director of a Connecticut health spa.

While an undergraduate at Alabama, Franco completed her B.S. in physical education with a coaching emphasis and health minor. She played middle and outside hitter on teams which competed in the AIAW Nationals and is ranked in the top five in eight of 13 statistical categories on the all-time individual match record list.

RECRUITING UPDATE -- Coaches in the Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Department at the University of Minnesota have been busy so far this summer firming up those rosters for the fall. Here is an update with the latest signings, and a recap of the new faces in Gopher uniforms...

## FALL SPORTS FIRST -- VOLLEYBALL SIGNS FOUR FRESHMEN

VOLLEYBALL -- Coach Stephanie Schleuder will start the season with four freshmen and a new assistant coach. Missy Larson (GLEN ELLYN, IL) is an Illinois All-Stater from Glenbard West High School in Glen Ellyn. She led Glenbard West to the state championship, earning all-conference honors for two years, as well. Kathryn Anne Bell (ST. CLOUD, MN) led Technical High School to a sixth place in the state tournament and was named all-metro and all-conference, as well as female Athlete of the Year for Tech High. She is Tech's all-time leader in ace attacks.

Rochele Goetz (WACONIA, MN) is a two-time all-conference selection and led Waconia High to the Suburban West championship last year. Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) led River Forest High School to a 24-11 record and a regional championship last fall and competed in the Second City Junior Program, which Coach Schleuder calls "one of the strongest in the country."

GOLF -- Coach Anne Zahn has two freshmen joining her second place Big Ten team this fall to shore up the loss of All-Big Ten and national competitor Nancy Harris. Lynda Otness (FARMINGTON, MN) will join her former Farmington teammate Dee Forsburg at the "U" this fall. Otness took top honors at the Class A high school tourney this spring. Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN) will also join the Gopher golfers. Kuhlman was fourth in the Class A high school championships, after winning the conference, district and regional crowns. She is the first alternate to Minnesota's entry in the U.S. Publinks tournament.

CROSS COUNTRY/TRACK -- Coach Mike Lawless loses five seniors from last year's team that finished tenth at the NCAA National Championships. Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) will try to help fill that void. Walsh finished second at the Class AA state cross country meet last fall for Moundsview High School. She also finished second in the 1600 meters at the state track championships this spring.

TENNIS -- The Gophers lose one Bjornson but gain another this year. Coach Jack Roach has recruited Sharon Bjornson (CHANHASSEN, MN), ranked third in the 18 year old division of Tennis Northwest, to follow sister Kathy, who has competed with Minnesota the last four years.

Roach also needs to replace Big Ten Player of the Year Claudia Brisk and Cathie Wadden. He has recruited two Swedish junior national stars to try to fill that void--Ulrika Pahlett and Karin Eneberg. Pahlett is the sister of Gopher men's star Fredrik and has been ranked among the top ten for Swedish juniors and the top 15 for Swedish women, overall. Eneberg has also been ranked among those same categories.

WINTER SPORTS -- FIVE ALL-STATERS JOIN GOPHER BASKETBALL

BASKETBALL -- Coach Ellen Mosher Hanson has a new last name (she was recently married) and five new all-staters on next year's basketball squad. Hanson says she has signed the top recruit in the state in Debbie Hilmerson (LITTLE FALLS, MN), who averaged 16 points and 7.1 rebounds per game. Little Falls took the 1984 state AA title with a perfect 26-0 record, and the 5-10 guard/forward was the All-State Most Valuable Player.

Hanson has also signed Diane Kinney (BURNSVILLE, MN), a 6-4 center for the state AA runner-up Burnsville High team. Kinney averaged 14.5 points and 7.5 rebounds per game. Susie Piram (ST. PAUL, MN) led Derham Hall High to a third place in the state AA tourney; the 6-0 forward averaged 15 points and 8.8 rebounds per game last season.

The number one prep player from Iowa will also join the Gophers next season. Beth Hufford (MOUNT VERNON, IA) averaged 38.4 points per game at Mount Vernon High last season, leading the team to two straight state tournament appearances, earning All-State honors this year and all-conference honors for the last two years. Mary Jo Nowak (CUDAHY, WI) is a 5-7 honorable mention All-State guard, who averaged 20.1 points at Cudahy High last season. She is a three-time all-conference player.

GYMNASTICS -- With only one senior graduating, and seven freshmen on the team last year, Coach Katalin Deli has just one freshman joining the squad this season. Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) is a Class I gymnast from the KEGA club in Edina, the same club that produced two-time All-Big Ten selection Wendy Dorsey. Mastel qualified for the United State Gymnastics Federation (USGF) national championships three years in the five she has competed with KEGA. In 1983, she won the state bars and beam competition and qualified for the USGF nationals all-around. This past season, Mastel was second all-around at the state meet and finished 10th all-around at the USGF regional meet (which includes seven states). One fall in one event cost her a sixth place finish and another trip to the nationals. She averaged 35.50 all-around and at or above 9.0 in all four events.

SWIMMING AND DIVING -- While only three seniors graduate from Coach Jean Freeman's team, she has signed three swimmers and two divers, and expects four additional walk-ons to be pivotal in next year's season. Nancy Swanum (BURNSVILLE, MN) is a three-time high school All-American and holds several state titles, including the 100 meter backstroke, 200 meter individual medley and 200 meter medley relay. She is a former Junior National Champion in the 200 individual medley and the 100 and 200 backstrokes.

Linda Hayworth (QUEBEC, CANADA) will also attend the "U", and has excelled in the 400 and 500 meter freestyles during USS competition. The third swimmer is Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD), who competed in USS club swimming in the backstrokes and individual medley and freestyle events.

The divers are Kathleen and Maureen Lewis (GREEN BAY, WI). Kathleen is a sophomore transfer from the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. She finished fourth in the one meter competition at the NAIA nationals and third in the three meter. Maureen is a recent high school grad, a regional champ in her age group, and the one meter Junior Olympics champion.

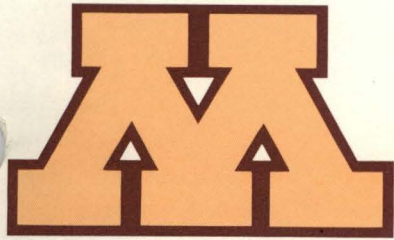
MORE SWIMMING -- Coach Freeman's walk-ons will include Diane Alstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MN), a breaststroke and freestyle competitor; Tracy Nelson (MOUNDSVIEW, MN), who was fourth and fifth in the state tourney with Moundsview High in the 200 individual medley and the 500 freestyle; Lana Trevino (BURNSVILLE, MN), a member of Burnsville High's state record 200 medley relay team; and Lisa Camilo (DELAVER, WI), who placed in the top six of both the 1500 freestyle and 100 butterfly in last year's Wisconsin high school meet.

SPRING SPORTS -- SOFTBALL SIGNS LOCAL TALENT

SOFTBALL -- Several local Twin City athletes will join Coach Linda Wells' softball squad for this fall's intrasquads and next spring's season. Kelly Darrow (INVER GROVE HEIGHTS, MN) was Simley High's star shortstop and led her team in hitting for the last two years. She was named to the all-conference team both of the last two years, and was also an all-conference selection in basketball and volleyball. Debbie Lewis (RICHFIELD, MN), also an all-conference selection at third base, was captain of the Richfield High team. Stacy Hohertz (EXCELSIOR, MN) is a two-time all-conference selection from Minnetonka High School, where she hit better than .300 this year and had a .454 average last year. She competed with McGovern's softball team of St. Paul last summer at the ASA Class A National Championships.

A non-Minnesota recruit is Jackie Savis (BALLWIN, MO), who led Lafayette High School to the 1982 Missouri state championship. Savis is all-conference, hit around .400 and carried a 4.0 grade point average.

Two other members of next year's Gopher softball team will be Jane Paradeis (ROYALTON, MN) and Debra Reineke (FARIBAULT, MN). Paradeis has transferred from Moorhead State, where she played softball the last two years. Reineke is a freshman from Faribault High, where she was an all-conference selection.

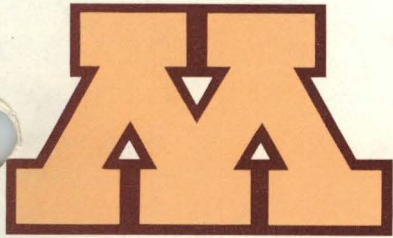
(BETH LINDBLAD SIGNS WITH GOPHER RUNNERS)

(Minneapolis, Minnesota) -- Former St. Louis Park High School standout Beth Lindblad recently signed a tender to join the University of Minnesota track team for 1984 - 85, according to coach Mike Lawless. Lindblad set an all-time Minnesota prep best and won the 200 meter hurdles title at the AA State High School meet.

"She's a good all-around athlete," Lawless said, "she should help us in the relays and sprints as well as the hurdles." Lindblad also started on her high school basketball team and maintained a 3.5 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale).

Lawless added, "Beth has potential in the heptathlon." Minnesota graduates its school record-holding heptathlete Polly Oas and will be looking for a replacement in that event. Also graduating is the Gopher's top hurdler/sprinter Cathy Anderson Gorecki and Lawless expects that Lindblad will step in and fill the vacancies.

Minneapolis, Minnesota -- University of Minnesota softball coach Linda Wells has announced the signing of Debbie Lange to the Gopher softball squad next season. Lange led LaCrescent High School to an 18-2 record and a berth in the state tournament this past season, and a state championship in 1983.

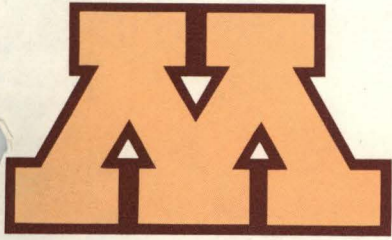
Lange boasted a .410 batting average this past season and has proven to be a clutch hitter in her five years on the LaCrescent varsity squad. This season, she homered in the regional finals against Kasson-Mantorville to put LaCrescent ahead for good in a 5-3 victory, earning the team a trip to the state tournament. Although ranked number one going into the tourney, LaCrescent was upset in the first round by Delano, 5-3.

Last season, Lange hit another key home run--this one in the state finals. That homer also put her team in front for good, as they defeated St. Agnes for the state championship.

Lange has been LaCrescent's captain for the past three years and was MVP her junior and senior seasons. She also played basketball and volleyball, and received all-conference volleyball honors last year.

Coach Wells says Lange has the ability to break into the line-up next season. "We look for top athletes," Wells commented, "and then find spots for them on the team. Debbie could see some time at short and in the outfield next season."

Lange is the daughter of Mrs. Les Lange of LaCrescent. She is tentatively planning an elementary education major at Minnesota.

(STOCKER NAMED NEW ASSOCIATE 'U' WOMEN'S A.D.)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Minnesota women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker announced today that Dr. Janice M. Stocker has been hired, pending approval by the Board of Regents, as the new associate athletic director for the women's athletic program. Stocker, who will begin work Sept. 4, will replace M. Catherine Mathison who resigned effective Sept. 15 to pursue other career interests.

"I am delighted that Jan Stocker has accepted our invitation to serve as associate director," said Baker. "She brings a wealth of experience and personal qualities which will benefit all of us. She is an excellent addition to our staff."

Stocker, 53, has been involved in athletics as an administrator, coach and teacher. Since 1980, she has served as the commissioner of the twelve school NCAA Division III and NAIA Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. From 1976-79, Stocker worked in a combined Division I 20 sport athletic department as the assistant athletic director in charge of non-revenue sports at West Virginia.

Her first administrative position was at Ball State (Ind.) where she supervised an eleven sport Division I program as the women's athletic director from 1970-76. Stocker also served at Slippery Rock State College (Pa.) from 1966-70 as the women's volleyball and softball coach.

A native of Bradford, Ohio, Stocker received her B.A. degree from Earlham College in Richmond, Ind. in 1954 where she played four years of varsity field hockey, softball, volleyball and basketball. She then worked on her master's degree while coaching and teaching for six years at Richmond Senior High and coaching two years at Earlham College. In 1962, she received her M.A. from Ball State and later earned her Ed.D. in Higher Education from Temple University (Pa.) in 1971. Stocker has extensive teaching experience in physical education skill, theory, and athletic administration courses.

Of accepting the Minnesota offer, Stocker said, "I'm delighted to be back on a campus with a No. 1 athletic program, and a good leader and support staff. I can't think of any place I'd rather be." As associate director, Stocker will coordinate and supervise all internal operations of the women's athletic department.

SCHEDULE NOTES -- With fall quarter classes beginning Sept. 20, the women's volleyball team is jumping into action early, with an annual road trip to Illinois and Florida. The women's golf team will have qualifying rounds August 29-31 to determine this year's team before opening the season at Madison, Wisc. Sept. 7-8. Coach Anne Zahn will be relying on senior Jocelyn Smith and sophomore Dee Forsberg to lead the team. Forsberg finished 12th at the Canadian Ladies Amateur last week after leading the field for three days with a 72-72-77-81-302. More on golf next week. The cross country team will open the season Sept. 15 at Drake and the tennis team will start Sept. 28-30 at the Midwest Intercollegiate Invitational.

YOUNG VOLLEYBALL SQUAD OPENS SEASON THIS WEEKEND -- Entering her third season at Minnesota, Coach Stephanie Schleuder is faced with a major rebuilding season. Her 1984 team has four freshmen, five sophomores, and just one junior and one senior.

GONE FROM 1983 -- Missing from last year are veterans Martie Larsen and Chris Donnell. Larsen was named Big Ten Player of the Year after leading the conference in kills and blocks and became Minnesota's all-time block leader. Donnell, the team MVP, was equally important as the team's only setter in a 5-1 offense.

1983 RECORD -- Overall 15-16, Big Ten 6-7, third West Division, fifth overall

1984 PREDICTION -- The ultimate goal of every Big Ten team is a trip to the final four Big Ten Championship, but for Schleuder, the Gophers would need to pull some surprises to finish in the top two of the West division. "We're definately a dark horse," she says. But, on the brighter side, the Gophers will be relatively unknown to opponents and "surprise could work in our favor".

#### PROBABLE STARTERS

OUTSIDE HITTERS -- The steadiest returner from last year is Karyn Daline, a sophomore left-side hitter from MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST. The 5-9 Daline started all 31 matches last year and led the Big Ten in digs (13.2) while hitting second on the squad in kill percentage (.246).

Another improved sophomore is 5-11 left-side hitter Candy Thier of CHICAGO/CARL SANDBERG. A powerful hitter, Thier was fourth in kills last year and saw action in every match. Junior Beth Hiner, KENYON, MN, is a probable starter at right-side hitter. The 5-9 Hiner is versatile enough to fill in where needed and was third in blocks last year.

MIDDLE HITTER -- One slot will be filled by 5-11 sophomore Pam Miller of WORTH, IL/ALAN B. SHEPARD. Miller is improved over last season when she was a regular starter and was third in kills per match (6.13 avg.) and second in blocks. The other position will be filled by either freshmen Patty Ryan of OAK PARK, IL, or Rochelle Goetz of WACONIA, MN. The 5-9 Ryan is an excellent blocker and played with a prestigious Chicago based club team "2nd City". The 5-9 Goetz should be a strong all-around player.

SETTER -- Schleuder plans to utilize a 5-1 offense with both her setters playing to begin with. Vying for the spot are 5-9 sophomore Jennie Collings of ROCHESTER, IL and 5-4 freshman Missy Larson of GLEN ELLYN, IL. Collings will be utilized in the front row to set and use her blocking strength, and Larson will enter the game in the back row to serve and set. "They are both equal right now. We want to utilize their different strengths," says Schleuder.

OTHER PLAYERS -- Senior captain Gretchen Kauth MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST, has been slowed by lower back pain and will be x-rayed today. Freshman Anne Bell ST. CLOUD/TECH, suffered from a broken toe early on and entered practice late. Sophomore Julie Binder, HANOVER PARK, IL/HOFFMAN ESTATES, is playing exceptionally well and could possibly earn a spot at outside hitter. The 5-7 Binder was a dependable back-row specialist last season.

MORE ---

A LOOK AT THIS WEEK'S VOLLEYBALL OPPONENTS -- "In general, I'm more concerned about our team than our opponents," says Schleuder. "We don't have a chance to scout non-Big Ten teams, and I'm concerned with us becoming consistent and using our offense. Overall, we're fairly well matched."

OLD-HOME WEEK -- The Northern Illinois Tournament will be a homecoming of sorts for the six players on the Gopher team from the Chicago area. Schleuder predicts quite a few friendly fans.

N. ILLINOIS TOURNEY -- BUTLER : Opener both teams; Series 0-0.  
The Lady Bulldogs return eight players and were 14-24 in 1983.

INDIANA STATE: Tourney is opener; Series 1-0 UM won 3-0 9/22/78  
The Hatters also return eight players and were 10-23 in 1983 and just 1-8 in the Gateway Conference.

N. ILLINOIS: Tourney is opener; Series 0-0. Return seven starters from 37-32-1 season in 1983 and fourth place in the Mid-American Conference

LOYOLA: 2nd match for Loyola of season; Series 0-0; return seven players from 20-7 1983 team which was 8-0 in the North Star conference and tourney Champions. Coach Niels Pederson is the club coach of Gopher freshman Patty Ryan.

ILLINOIS-CHICAGO: 4th match for UIC; Series 0-2, UM lost 0-2 10/1/77  
Ten players return from 1983's 22-16 team, including all six starters.

**HAUGEJORDE NAMED TO NEW FULL-TIME BASKETBALL POSITION** -- Head women's basketball coach Ellen Mosher Hanson has announced the hiring of Cindy Haugejorde to the new full-time assistant coaching position at Minnesota. Haugejorde held a one-year appointment as a part-time assistant coach last season, and was named to the full-time position after a nationwide search. She will join Chris Howell as Hanson's second full-time assistant.

"Cindy's number one strength is her enthusiasm," Hanson commented. "She is very interested in this line of work and her enthusiasm carries over into all aspects of the job--in practice, in recruiting and in all of her areas of responsibility."

Haugejorde will share recruiting responsibilities with assistant coach Howell, as Hanson realigns her recruiting procedures. "Basically, the two assistants will split the pool of recruits," Hanson said. "Then they will each work with me in sorting out the best candidates."

Haugejorde brings a wealth of playing experience into her second season as an assistant coach. During 1981-82 and 1982-83, she played professional basketball in Italy, where she was the fifth leading league scorer in her final season, averaging 25 points and 10 rebounds. In 1980-81, she played in the former Women's Basketball Association professional league for the San Francisco team and was named All-Pro.

During 1976-80, she attended the University of Iowa, where she rewrote the record books as the Hawkeye's all-time leading scorer (among both men and women), with 2,059 career points. She was a two-time captain at Iowa, and was named an All-American in 1980. In 1978 and 1979, she toured Europe with the Athletes in Action basketball team, and in 1978 toured with the Women's Select Team to the Orient. She was selected to the Junior Pan Am team in 1977.

Originally from New London, Minnesota, Haugejorde played basketball for New London-Spicer High School. She now lives in Minneapolis,

In setting, sophomore Janice Goffings of ROCHESTER, IL has 90 assists (.22.5 average) while freshman Wendy Larson of GLEN ELLYN, IL has 58 assists and six service aces. At a recent Minnesota

COACH SCHLEUDER SAYS -- "Obviously I'm pleased with our opening performance. We showed some determination in tough situations. We have a lot of technical problems we need to iron out -- our blocking and set selection needs to improve and we need more production from our outside hitters."

ON FLORIDA TRIP -- "We have to play stronger teams to get ready for the Big Ten season and this will be a nice progressive step for us. (At Central Florida tourney:) South Carolina, Western Kentucky, East Tennessee State and Central Florida should all be strong."

GOLFERS OPEN THIS WEEKEND AT WISCONSIN --

Coach Anne Zahn takes her team to Wisconsin this weekend to open the 1984-85 campaign (an outlook, roster and fall schedule are included in this release). The Gophers join a five-team field at this year's Lady Badger Invitational, and look to be the favorite going into the tourney.

STAR GONE, BUT CORE OF GOLF TEAM RETURNING

Individually, this year's version of the Minnesota women's golf team may not appear to be particularly strong. But, head coach Anne Zahn has shown a knack for moulding successful teams from just such a situation.

The Gopher golfers have moved from last place to second place in the Big Ten in Zahn's two years at the helm. With the core of last year's team returning, she feels her team will, once again, make a run at the Conference title next spring.

However, the coach shies away from making any predictions.

TOP GOPHER GONE -- The big loss is Nancy Harris, Minnesota's Big Ten Medal of Honor winner last year. Harris was All-Big Ten twice and finished second at the Conference championships last season. She qualified for national competition three years in a row and is one of the top two golfers in Minnesota history (along with past All-American Kathy Williams).

SMITH LEADS LIST OF RETURNERS -- Three strong performers return from last year's team, and all three played impressive golf over the summer. Leading the list is senior Jocelyn Smith (Lennoxville, Quebec), who finished fifth at the Big Ten championships last spring, improving on her 1983 eighth place finish. Her average last spring was the seventh best in Gopher history (80.2 strokes over 14 rounds). Smith has been one of Minnesota's most consistent performers throughout her career, and was Minnesota's MVP for the 1981-82 season. She placed second in the Quebec Amateur tourney last summer.

Zahn feels sophomore Dee Forsberg (Farmington, MN) matured quite a bit during competition last season and over the summer. Forsberg placed 11th at the Big Ten championships last spring and averaged 81.6 strokes last season. Over the summer, she was runner-up at the MWGA state medal play championship and tied for first in the state publicx tourney (losing in the playoff). Forsberg finished 12th at the Canadian Ladies Amateur, after leading the first three days.

Sophomore Julie Hennessy (Lewiston, MN) also returns, after competing in all but one tournament last season as a freshman. She was 24th at the Big Ten and averaged 83.4 strokes. During the summer, Hennessy placed fourth at the MWGA state medal play championship.

HELP FROM OTHER VETS -- Zahn also looks for help from senior Ann Meyer (Sauk Centre, MN) and junior Leslie Cummings (Aitkin, MN). Meyer finished second at the Minnesota state amateur medal play tourney this past summer and Zahn says Cummings has "improved this summer and has lots of desire."

NEWCOMERS -- Three freshmen join the team this season: Lynda Otness (Farmington, MN), Jodi Krafka (Alexandria, MN) and Mary Kuhlman (Montevideo, MN). Otness won the state junior tournament this past summer, Krafka took district and regional titles in MGA competition, and Kuhlman took top honors at her MGA regional the past three years. All three finished in the top ten in the state in high school competition last year.

EDER BACK, BUT FIVE OTHERS GONE --

University of Minnesota Women's Cross Country Coach Mike Lawless anticipates 1984 to be a rebuilding year, after last year's banner season. The Gopher's number one runner, junior Jody Eder, returns, but the other five top runners have graduated. These six harriers led Minnesota to a 10th place finish at the NCAA National Championships last year, after finishing third in the Big Ten and second at the NCAA Region Four meet. It was the first time in Gopher history that the cross country team has advanced to the national championships.

As a sophomore, she placed in the top 10 at every regular season meet and was in the top four of every meet except one. She finished eighth in the Big Ten, sixth at the Region Four meet, and 35th at the NCAA championships. Eder holds the record for the best cross country time in Minnesota history, with a 16:56 for the three miles. In track last season, Eder won All-American honors in the 1,000 meters indoors and the 3,000 meters outdoors.

BANT, LJUNGSTROM LOOK STRONG -- Coach Lawless looks to two seniors to provide the support Eder will need if Minnesota is to finish in the top half of the Big Ten. Stacy Bant (Racine, WI) was hampered by injuries last fall and competed in only three meets. However, she had a healthy and competitive track season and Lawless predicts that she has the potential to be "one of our best ever." Eva Ljungstrom (Harnosands, Sweden/Minnetonka High) was the Gophers' number seven runner last year and has the experience to do well this fall.

OTHER CONTRIBUTORS -- Sophomore Wendy Knight (New Hope, MN) and senior Tammy McGrane (Park Rapids, MN) will join the cross country effort this fall and should be competitive. Knight was injured early in the 1983 season, but according to Lawless "looked very good" before the injury. McGrane competed for Minnesota three years ago, and was the Minnesota state 800 meter track champion at Park Rapids High in 1978. Lawless calls her "a talented runner. Provided she stays fit and healthy, she should be a big help." Freshman Patti Walsh (Shoreview, MN) is Minnesota's top recruit. She placed second at the state high school cross country meet last year and, with experience, should be a valuable contributor.

THE SCHEDULE WILL BE TOUGH -- The highlight of the Gopher's fall, prior to the Big Ten meet October 27, will be the Wisconsin-Burger King Cross Country Classic in Madison on October 13. The Badgers have upgraded the competition this year to include seven of the top ten teams in the nation from last season (including the number 10 Gophers). Defending national champion Oregon will be on hand, along with Tennessee (#4), Wisconsin (#5), Iowa State (#6), and Brigham Young (#9). Minnesota opens at Drake on September 15, then travels to Kansas and Illinois before hosting the Minnesota Quadrangular on October 6.

(VOLLEYBALL BRINGS 11-4 RECORD INTO HOME/BIG TEN OPENER)

Although Coach Stephanie Schleuder admits that "consistency is not our hallmark", her young volleyball squad won three out of four matches last week, upping their pre-Big Ten season record to 11-4. That record includes winning the Northern Illinois Invitational, and placing second at the eight team Central Florida Tournament.

BIG TEN SEASON -- The Gophers' will open the Big Ten season against East Division rival Indiana in an important match-up. "This match is one that we can win, and one that we need to win," says Coach Schleuder. The Gophers will play a double-round robin with West Division rivals (Iowa, Illinois, Northwestern, Wisconsin) and a single round-robin with the East Division. The top two qualifiers in each division enter the final four Big Ten Championship. Last year Minnesota was third in the West.

### THIS WEEK'S MATCHES

INDIANA, Williams Arena, Sept. 22 7:30 p.m.

The Hoosiers placed third in the East Division last year with a 5-8 conference record and 12-26 overall mark. So far this year they are 2-7 prior to playing Wisconsin Fri. Sept. 21. Minnesota won last year's meeting three games to two in Bloomington, and the Gophers lead the series 6-2. Coach Doug West enters his second season at IU.

Leaders -- Junior transfer from Kent State Bridgett Dickson (5-8, H) is leading the Hoosiers with 45 kills, while freshman All-American setter Karen Dunham is so highly regarded by Coach West that she is serving as co-captain. Junior 5-10 hitter Dee Dee Olmstead is the top returning hitter from last year when she had 181 kills.

NORTH DAKOTA STATE, Williams Arena, Sept. 24 7:30 p.m.

The Bison have a 13-1 record, and as a Division II school, have played mostly Division II opponents. Prior to Monday's game, NDSU will compete in the St. Cloud State Invitational this weekend. Minnesota won last year's meeting three games to none and lead the series 3-0. Donna Palivec is entering her seventh year as coach (206-95), and last year the Bison were 43-20.

Leaders -- Outside hitters are senior Amu Quist (5-8) and Gretchen Hammond (soph., 5-8), while middle hitter is senior Pati Rolf (5-9). The Bison have an experienced setter in senior Terese Reynolds.

COACH SCHLEUDER ON THE GOPHERS -- "We've been playing better and our intensity has been good. We are making more physical mistakes than mental mistakes, so we should be able to correct those errors. I think that our record represents a real good start for us."

GOPHER LEADERS -- Sophomore PAM MILLER of WORTH, IL continues to lead the team with 176 kills and a .332 kill percentage. Miller also is the blocking leader with 12 block solos and 67 block assists, and has a team leading 26 service aces. The 5-11 middle hitter put away 18 kills and hit .517 in the Gophers loss to Florida State last week.

Sophomore KARYN DALINE of MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST is back in form, with 144 kills and a .293 kill percentage. The 5-9 outside hitter also leads the team in digs with 105 for a 1.84 game average.

Sophomore CANDY THIER of PALOS PARK, IL has totaled the second most kills at 145 and has also put away 25 service aces while adding 79 digs. Freshman PATTY RYAN of OAK PARK, IL is second on the team in blocking with 10 block solos and 42 block assists.

She led the squad again last weekend at the Hawkeye Invitational, finishing second (77-73-79--229), two strokes back. Sophomore Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) was sixth, seven shots off the pace (77-79-78--234).

OTHER GOPHER FINISHES -- Senior Jocelyn Smith (LENOXVILLE, QUEBEC) placed 12th, (79-80-81--240), followed by freshman Lynda Otness in 17th (83-78-81--242), freshman Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) was 20th (80-86-79--245), and senior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) tied for 30th, (78-85-88--251).

CROSS COUNTRY OPENS WITH A WIN AT DRAKE --

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team travels to the University of Kansas this Saturday, after opening the season with a win at the Drake Invitational. ## (VOLLEYBALL FACES TWO TOUGH FOES ON ROAD)

The Gopher women's volleyball team will travel to #13 ranked Purdue this Friday and to Illinois on Saturday in two important Big Ten matches. Minnesota lost their Big Ten opener to Indiana last Saturday at home in four games, 5-15, 15-11, 12-15, 2-15, to bring the team's overall record to 11-5.

**BINDER INJURED FOR YEAR** -- Sophomore Julie Binder of Hanover Park, IL injured her knee in the fourth game against Indiana and the prognosis is ligament damage which may require surgery. Binder, who played in 37 games and totalled 50 kills, was a "vital team member" according to Coach Stephanie Schleuder.

"Julie is one of our best passers and was versatile enough to come in at different positions. Her injury is doubly disappointing because she has improved so much since last year and is our hardest worker."

**A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS** -- PURDUE is a traditional powerhouse in the Big Ten but were upset at last year's championship by Northwestern. Still, the Boilermaker's finished the season 26-6 and ranked eighth in the final NCAA Coaches' Poll. This year Purdue is 9-3 overall and 1-0 in the Big Ten with a three game victory over Michigan, and although the Boiler's defeated Northwestern 3-1 at home, the next match at Evanston will count in the Big Ten race. Leaders: 6-2 Jr. middle blocker Marianne Smith leads the Boiler's with 132 kills and a .296 pct. while 5-9 Jr. outside hitter Kim Corwin has 123 kills (.158). Another hitting threat is senior 6-1 middle blocker Kate Crandell and the team has an experienced setter in All-Big Ten 5-10 senior Annette Bauer. Coach: Carol Dewey (263-98, 9 yrs) Series: 2-16. MORE---

**ILLINOIS --** The Illini hope to improve upon last year's 2-11 Big Ten record and are 9-6 overall prior to meeting Illinois State Wednesday and hosting Wisconsin in their Big Ten opener Friday. The team returns three starters and has six newcomers and the match with Minnesota, traditionally a strong rivalry, should be a close one. Leaders - 5-8 Jr. outside hitter Rita Schwarz leads the returners, but it has been the freshmen -- hitters Lori Anderson and Beth Binkley and setter Disa Johnson, who have been the core of the team so far this year. Coach: Mike Hebert (5-25 1 yr.) (195-134, 8 yrs.) Series: 5-7.

**GOPHER LEADERS --** Sophomore middle hitter Pam Miller of Worth, IL led the Gophers with 13 kills against Indiana and on the season has 189 kills with a .320 hitting pct. She also leads the team in blocks with 13 solo and 69 assists. Sophomore outside hitter Karyn Daline (Minneapolis/Southwest) had nine kills vs. the Hoosiers and is second in kills (153) and kill pct. (.280) while leading the team in digs (111). Sophomore Candy Thier of Palos Park, IL also had nine kills vs. Indiana and has 154 on the season.

**SCHLEUDER ON LAST WEEK --** "I think Indiana is one of the most improved teams in the Big Ten. We never really got rolling consistently -- the third game was the turning point in the match. We didn't block well and were not able to convert offensively like we have been."

GOLF TEAM POSTS WIN, LADY NORTHERN NEXT

The Gopher golfers have the coming weekend off and will prepare for their biggest meet yet this fall--the Lady Northern. All of the Big Ten teams and 8-10 other teams will attend the meet, October 5-7, in Bloomington, Indiana, making it the unofficial conference "championship" for the fall. The Big Ten Championship will be held at Indiana April 26-27.

Last weekend, Minnesota captured its own "Gopher Classic," out-distancing second place Iowa by 12 strokes. Sophomore Jennifer Godfrey (FAIRMONT, MN) qualified to compete in a tournament for the first time this season and captured medalist honors (79-75--155). It is the first tournament win in her collegiate career, and she becomes the second Gopher in three tournaments this fall to bring home medalist honors.

SMITH SECOND--OTHER GOPHERS FARE WELL -- Senior Jocelyn Smith (LENNOXVILLE, QUEBEC) was three strokes back (79-79--158), capturing second place. Two freshmen, Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) and Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN), tied with two Iowans for third, shooting 83-76--159 and 80-79--156, respectively. Kuhlman did not qualify to play with the team and was competing individually, along with four other Gophers.

ZAHN PLEASED WITH WEEKEND -- "It's too bad we couldn't play 54 holes," commented Minnesota golf coach Anne Zahn (the second 18 holes scheduled for Saturday was rained out), "but we had four people under 80 for the second round. Our three freshmen are playing well and we are becoming a well-balanced team. The Lady Northern will be a good test against some tough competition."

OTHER GOPHER FINISHES -- Sophomore Julie Hennessey (LEWISTON, MN), who finished first and second in Minnesota's first two outings, was ninth (83-79--162). The two FARMINGTON, MN natives finished back-to-back, with Lynda Otness 11th (82-81--163) and sophomore Dee Forsberg tied for 14th (84-81--165). Senior Robin Wright (ROSEVILLE, MN) and junior Lesley Cummings tied for 18th (90-78--168 and 82-86--168, respectively); senior Diane St. Peter (BISMARCK, ND) tied for 21st (82-89--171); and sophomore Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) tied for 23rd (85-87--172).

CROSS COUNTRY TRAVELS TO ILLINOIS --

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team faces a tough field this Saturday at the Illinois Invitational in Champaign. The Gophers will face Big Ten opponents Ohio State, Indiana, Michigan, Northwestern, Iowa and Illinois, along with six other teams.

EDER FIRST AGAIN -- Junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) will be aiming at her third win in as many meets this weekend. She ran a school record and personal best time at the Illinois course last year (16:56). At the Kansas Invitational last Saturday, Eder covered the course in 17:05.3, winning the meet by 13 seconds.

Senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) finished fourth at Kansas (17:26.7)--her second top ten finish in as many weeks. Senior Tammy McGrane (PARK RAPIDS, MN) was 20th (18:58.8), sophomore Wendy Knight (NEW HOPE, MN) finished 25th (19:16.0), and senior Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN) was 27th (19:22.5). Freshman Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) was 31st (19:46.5), senior Julie Sher (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) finished 32nd (19:47.5), sophomore Sue Schroeder (MEQUON, WI) was 35th (19:55.2) and freshman Kathy Scharnhorst (WAUSAU, WI) was 42nd (20:27.7).

LAWLESS COMMENTS -- Cross country coach Mike Lawless was pleased with the performances at Kansas. "Everyone improved over the week before, so that was a positive thing. However, there is still a huge gap between our number two and three runners."

## TOP TENNIS PLAYER BACK; SWEDES SHOULD SHINE

University of Minnesota women's tennis coach Jack Roach begins his second year with a bright outlook. His number one singles player from last season, All-Big Ten selection Nancy Rost, will return for her junior year. Furthermore, Roach has recruited two of the top 10 junior players from Sweden--freshmen Ulrika Pahlett and Karin Eneberg.

The Pahlett name is familiar to Gopher tennis fans as belonging with the first name of "Fredrik," the former Gopher men's tennis All-American who played number one singles the past two seasons and won the Big Ten championship.

GOAL TO REMAIN IN THE TOP FOUR -- Last season, the Gophers finished fourth at the Big Ten Championships, a marked improvement on the previous year's tenth place performance. In overall dual matches, Minnesota posted a 20-11 record.

"Our goal for this season," Coach Roach commented, "is to remain in the top four of the Big Ten and to build a team that will shoot for the title within three years."

The Gophers will miss last year's number two singles player, Claudia Brisk, who was the Big Ten Tennis Sportswoman of the Year, and was half of the Gophers' number one doubles team. Also missing from last year's line-up are Kathy Bjornson and Cathie Wadden. Wadden was 21-9 in singles competition.

ROST LEADS RETURNERS -- Junior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) compiled a 22-16 record at the number one singles spot last year and Roach expects her to be one of the better singles players in the Big Ten this season. Teamed with Brisk, she posted a 25-12 number one doubles record, as well.

SWEDISH CONNECTION TO HELP -- Roach expects the two Swedish freshmen to challenge for top singles spots immediately. Ulrika Pahlett (VAXJO, SWEDEN) and Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, SWEDEN) both rank in the top 10 in the highly competitive Swedish juniors program, and in the top 15 for all Swedish women. Pahlett covers the court well and Eneberg advanced to the quarterfinals of both singles and doubles play at the Swedish national tournament.

GOPHER VETS -- Sophomore Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) had a fine freshman season at the number four singles spot, earning an 8-5 overall mark, after transferring to Minnesota for the spring season. Jones should be in the top four again this year. Three other players return from last year's squad: juniors Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL, MN) and Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN), and sophomore Betsy Poggensee (NORTHBROOK, IL). Martin played at the number five position last year and had the most singles wins on the team, with a 25-13 mark. Roach feels Bjerken and Poggensee have the talent to break into the regular line-up this year.

OTHER NEWCOMERS -- Debbie Osmera (WAYZATA, MN) transfers from St. Cloud State, where she played at number one singles for three years, and will be the only senior on the squad. Freshman Lesley Keirn (Shorewood, WI) placed third in the Milwaukee Sharon Bjornson (CHANHASSEN, MN) is recovering Suburban Conference at number one singles last season, and placed second and fourth in the state in doubles her sophomore and junior years, respectively. Freshman Sharon Bjornson (CHANHASSEN, MN) is recovering from a knee injury, but she is ranked third in the 18 year old division of Tennis Northwest.

DOUBLES A MYSTERY -- "Our singles line-up will be even stronger than last year," Roach says, "but our doubles teams are a huge question mark." No experienced doubles team returns for the Gophers, although Rost and Bjerken both have plenty of collegiate doubles experience and the freshmen are all top doubles players. Only experience will tell which combinations will work.

**GOLFERS ON ROAD TO LADY NORTHERN --**

The highlight of the fall golf season is the Lady Northern Invitational, which will be held this weekend, October 5-7, at Indiana University in Bloomington. All of the Big Ten teams will be there, making the tourney an unofficial conference "championship" for the fall. A total of 17 teams are entered this year, for the 54 hole tournament which spans three days, Friday through Sunday. The Gophers finished seventh last season in a 19 team field. Coach Anne Zahn says qualifying will conclude today, for the five team spots open.

**ZAHN UNSURE OF WEEKEND** -- "I feel like we're in kind of a slump," Zahn commented, "even though we did win our own tournament a week ago. We'll face much more difficult competition than at any tournament so far, and the field will have a lot more depth. Jocelyn Smith is playing better and Julie Hennessy continues to shoot well. **HENNESSY HAS LED SO FAR** -- The Gophers have competed at three tournaments so far this year, winning two (the Lady Badger and Gopher Classic) and finishing second at the Hawkeye Invitational. Sophomore Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) had the hot hand the first two tourneys, winning the Lady Badger and placing second at the Hawkeye. Sophomore Jennifer Godfrey (FAIRMONT, MN) won her first tourney, capturing the Gopher Classic a week ago. Senior Jocelyn Smith (LENNOXVILLE, QUEBEC) has been very consistent, finishing third at the Lady Badger and at the Gopher Classic, and 12th at the Hawkeye.

CROSS COUNTRY TEAM HOSTS MINNESOTA FIVE-WAY --

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team hosts its only home meet of the season, the Minnesota Five-Way, at the Les Bolstad University Golf Course Saturday Oct. 6 at 11:30 a.m. The field will include small college powerhouses Wisconsin-La Crosse and St. Thomas, which finished one-two in the NCAA Division III cross championships last fall. Other schools competing will be North Dakota State and South Dakota State.

Individually, Minnesota junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) will be looking to set a new course record by shaving four seconds off her winning time at last year's meet (17:17). Eder will receive stiff competition from senior teammate Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) and Jenny Hintz of St. Thomas, who finished second individually at the Division III championships in 1983.

EDER BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD AT ILLINOIS -- Gopher junior Jody Eder ran the fastest time in Gopher history last Saturday at the Illinois Invitational (16:46). She finished third in the race, but eclipsed her old school record set on the same Illini course last year by ten seconds.

Senior Stacy Bant set a new personal record and ran the fourth fastest time in Minnesota history (17:03), good for seventh place. Senior Julie Sher (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) also ran a personal best with her time of 18:44, finishing 54th. Senior Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN) placed 60th in 18:50, followed by senior Tammy McGrane (PARK RAPIDS, MN) in 72nd (19:03); freshman Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) in 74th (19:06); and sophomore Sue Schroeder (MEQUON, WI) in 79th with a personal best of 19:14.

LAWLESS COMMENTS -- Cross country coach Mike Lawless felt his team ran "some reasonable times" at Illinois, and was particularly pleased with Stacy Bant, who chopped 50 seconds off her time in the same race last season. "We need to get some other people besides Jody and Stacy to compete with the three, four and five runners from other schools. We still have a big gap there, and if we don't shorten it, we'll be in trouble."

TENNIS TRAVELS TO DEFEND TITLE --

Coach Jack Roach takes the University of Minnesota women's tennis team to Edwardsville, Illinois, this weekend for the Southern Illinois Invitational. The Gophers took the team title, three singles titles and two doubles titles last year. This year's opponents include Purdue, Illinois, Louisville, Illinois State, Drake, SIU-Carbondale and SIU-Edwardsville.

ROST HOPES TO REPEAT -- Junior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) hopes to repeat as number one singles champion this year; she also was part of the winning number one doubles team last year. Junior Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL) was the number five singles champ last year. Based on performances last weekend at the Midwest Intercollegiate Invitational, Rost and the two Swedish freshmen--Karin Eneberg and Ulrika Pahlett--will be the favorites to place in their respective positions.

### (VOLLEYBALL AT HOME, HOSTS NORTHWESTERN/IOWA)

The Gophers broke a four match losing streak, and captured their first Big Ten and home victory last Saturday by defeating Illinois. Minnesota will now face an important home weekend with West Division rivals Northwestern and Iowa, after playing at Drake on Tuesday (Oct. 9). Minnesota lost to Northwestern and Iowa in both meetings last year, and would like to up their 1-3 conference and 12-8 overall record this weekend.

**The Opponents -- NORTHWESTERN** is the only undefeated team in the Big Ten, and leads the West Division with a 3-0 conference and 13-5 overall mark. The Wildcats upset Purdue last year for the Big Ten title, and are favored again this year. Hitting is the teams' strength behind 6-0 senior outside hitter Madelyn Meneghetti who has 284 kills and a blistering .353 kill pct. on the year. Other powerful hitters are 6-0 senior Mary Stack and 5-10 senior Sue Kerry, both at middle hitter. Stack has 152 kills (.295) while Kerry leads in blocks with 14 solos and 33 assists and is hitting .293 (142 kills). The Wildcats have an experienced setter in senior Jackie Nunez (583/9.6 avg.). Coach: Jerry Angle (6th yr., 159-73-5). Series: NW 6, MN 4.

**IOWA** finished second in the West last year, and will be looking for a couple of wins this weekend as they travel to Wisconsin on Friday before meeting Minnesota Saturday. Iowa's 0-3 Big Ten record includes two losses to Northwestern and one to Ohio State, but the Hawks are 14-7 overall. Leading the team is Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1983, setter Kathy Greisheim who has 119 assists in the Big Ten. The attack leaders include middle hitters 5-11 sophomore Lana Kuiper and 5-11 junior Linda Gensing. Kuiper has 22 kills (.263) while Gensing has 41 (.219) in the Big Ten. Dee Ann Davidson, a second team All-Big Ten pick last year, has 33 kills (.215). Coach: Sandy Stewart (3rd yr., 32-31). Series: MN 19, IA 4.

**THIER SHINES IN BIG TEN** -- Sophomore 5-11 outside hitter Candy Thier (PALOS PARK, IL) led the Gophers in the win over Illinois with a personal best of 20 kills and a .280 kill pct. Thier also served eight aces, including four in the deciding fifth game for points 11-14. Thier is leading the team in the Big Ten with 54 kills and a .254 pct. and is second overall in kills with 211. Coach Stephanie Schleuder says, "Candy played one of the best matches in her career so far."

**OTHER GOPHERS** -- Sophomore Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had 16 kills in the win over Illinois and is hitting .235 overall with 191 kills. She also leads the team in digs with 172. Sophomore middle hitter Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) continues her consistent play with 12 kills vs. Illinois and a .309 kill pct. overall with a team leading 239 kills. Miller has 18 block solos and 85 block assists. Sophomore Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) is handling the setting duties for the team and has 533 assists on the year for a 7.0 game average, and also is blocking well with 13 solo and 37 assists. Freshman Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) has proven an effective blocker with 13 solo and 47 assists.

**SCHLEUDER SAYS** -- "I'm pleased we came back to win over Illinois as strongly as we did in the fifth game (15-1). We've been struggling the last couple weeks so it's nice to get back on the winning track.

**This Week** -- "Iowa is a big rival and a slight favorite. They are going to want to be back in the race and will be ready to play. I think we have to go out against Northwestern with the attitude that we can win and take it one point at a time. Everybody contributed to our win last week, and I hope we can get that performance again this week with improved concentration and intensity."

FOUR TENNIS PLAYERS TO ITCA --

Minnesota women's tennis coach Jack Roach will take four of his players to Madison, Wisconsin this weekend to compete in the International Tennis College Association (ITCA) Indoor Invitational. The tourney will include 64 singles and 32 doubles players from colleges and universities throughout the Midwest. Gophers competing in singles will be junior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD), freshmen Kika Pahlett (VAXJO, SWEDEN) and Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, SWEDEN), and junior Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN). The doubles pairings will be Rost-Bjerken and Pahlett-Eneberg.

Coach Jack Roach expects some tough competition with Big Ten powers Indiana and Northwestern both represented, along with a good Wisconsin team. "The winner and runner-up will advance to the national ITCA tournament," Roach said. "This is a very important tourney for both the individual and doubles selection process for the NCAA tournament selection.

TEAM DOES WELL AT NEBRASKA -- "As a whole, we did well at Nebraska. Not having Pahlett (who was out with a minor injury) hurt us, and I had to move everyone else up a spot. The biggest plus last weekend was the improvement in our doubles play. We saw a lot of tough competition, and that's what we need for our game to improve. Martin and Bjerken both played well, and Nancy Rost beat Texas Tech's number one player the final day--and they won the tournament."

Five of the Gophers' top six players won two out of three matches. Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) came away with a sore arm and will be out for a week. Jones injury forced Minnesota to default a doubles match, which could have meant the difference between a second and third place finish.

The Opponent -- "What we have at stake here is pride," comments Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "It should be an interesting two matches. Both teams are strong hitters, although we probably pass better and Wisconsin probably blocks better. The Badgers are young and unpredictable."

Both teams are inconsistent. The Badgers, for instance, put Michigan away in just 50 minutes last weekend, then went to Michigan State and lost three straight. The Gophers lost in three at Michigan State, as well, and struggled against Michigan, before pulling it out 15-13 in the fifth game.

HENNESSY LEADS TEAM -- Sophomore Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) leads the Gophers with an average 79.7 per round this season. Hennessy won the Lady Badger Invitational and was second at the Hawkeye Invitational. Senior Jocelyn Smith (LENNOXVILLE, MN) is second on the team with a 79.7 average.

ZAHN COMMENTS -- Minnesota coach Ann Zahn sees the good and bad side of the Gophers' two-week layoff: "My main concern was that the weather was not cooperative. Our practice time was limited. But maybe the rest did us some good."

(EDER CONTINUES TO ECLIPSE MINNESOTA RUNNING MARKS)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The sky would seem to be the limit for University of Minnesota track and cross country star Jody Eder, who enters her junior year as a four-time All-American and the holder of school records in nine track events. But the former Stillwater High School standout, who also ran in the 1984 U.S. Olympic Trails during the summer, keeps a low profile on her goals for her final two years as a Gopher.

"I have goals but they are personal goals," Eder said. "They say the older you get, the stronger you get and I hope that's true with me. I'll just try to stay away from injuries and keep things rolling for me."

Minnesota coach Mike Lawless usually does not work with Eder on specific goals, although both of them think she should finish in the top five at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships at Purdue University October 27.

Eder started the cross country season with a victory and a course record at the Drake Invitational, and picked up two wins in the next three weeks at the Kansas Invitational and the Minnesota Five-Way Invitational. She also set a school record with her third-place finish at the Illinois Invitational (16:46), and placed eighth at the Wiaconsin-Burger King Cross Country Classic among a field that included a dozen cross country All-Americans. Eder broke 17 minutes at Wisconsin (16:56) and now holds the four fastest times in Minnesota cross country history.

The cross country season concludes with the NCAA District IV meet November 10 at Illinois and the NCAA Championships November 19 at Penn State University.

Following the cross-country season, Eder will set her sights on indoor track. Last year she was fourth in the 1000 meter run at the NCAA Indoor Championships, earning All-American honors. As a freshman in 1983, Eder was named an All-American twice with a fifth-place finish in the 1000 yard run at the nationals and as a member of of Minnesota's two-mile relay team, which placed third. She holds school indoor records in the 800 (2:12.20) and 1000 meters (2:47.31) and in the 880 (2:11.72) and 1000 yard runs (2:31.05). Eder also shares school records as a member of one-mile and two-mile relay teams.

Eder's outdoor credentials are no less impressive. Last season she was sixth in the 3000 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, earning her fourth All-American award. Eder ran the 1500 meters at the Drake Relays in 4:15.59, the fastest time in that event ever by a Big Ten athlete. She owns Minnesota outdoor records in the 800 meter dash (2:10.6) and the 1500 (4:15.59) and 3000 meter runs (9:07.46), and as a member of the 3200 meter relay team.

Both Eder and Lawless chalk up her successes this fall to experience and confidence gained from track. "I never used to view myself as a cross country runner because I did prefer track, but this year I feel really strong," Eder said. "Cross country takes a lot of concentration and I think it's harder than running on track to that extent."

Eder fulfilled a personal goal this summer when she ran in the 3000 meters at the Olympic Trails, the youngest runner in a field that included world-record holder Mary Decker.

At Stillwater High School, Eder was an all-conference selection in cross country, basketball and track. She was a state champion in the 800 meters and ran one of the fastest miles in state history (4:57.3).

Eder is the daughter of Jerome and Nancy Eder of Lake Elmo, Minnesota.

Minnesota closes out the year by hosting Drake (Monday, Nov. 5) and Ohio State (Saturday, Nov. 10 at 7:30 p.m.).

**BACK-TO-BACK** -- The Gophers tallied two wins over Wisconsin last week, winning at Madison on Wednesday in a five, game battle, and handing the Badgers a three game loss on Saturday at Williams Arena. It was the Gophers first three game victory since September 12 at Jacksonville, Fla.

**SCHLEUDER COMMENTS** -- "I think we've found a new spark of life. The players' have committed themselves to giving 100 per cent effort and not worrying about the results. I saw us picking up balls that we had been letting fall. Even though we made mistakes, we came back time after time."

**ON THIS WEEK** -- "If we want to have a chance (in Big Ten) we have to do something to help ourselves. It would be nice to win at Iowa State to keep us on a roll. Against Iowa we are going to take a new approach. I think we have to play an intelligent match and slow down their offense. To play well at Northwestern will be the biggest challenge of the season."

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS -- IOWA STATE is in a three-way tie for second place in the Big 8 with a 5-3 conference record and 17-6 overall mark. Coach Schleuder expects a tough match. Minnesota leads the series 18-1 and won last year in five games. NORTHWESTERN is seeking to repeat as Big Ten Champions this year, and the Wildcats are the only undefeated team in the league with a 9-0 conference and 20-7 overall record. Hitting is the teams' strength behind 6-0 senior outside hitter Madelyn Meneghetti and senior middle hitters Mary Stack (6-0) and Sue Kerry (5-10). Senior Jackie Nunez provides experience as a setter. Northwestern defeated the Gophers 15-5, 15-7, 15-7 at Williams Arena earlier this year but Minnesota still holds the series edge 6-5.

IOWA would like a repeat trip to the final-four Big Ten Tournament this year, and need to ensure their return trip as they face Minnesota Friday and Wisconsin on Saturday, after playing Western Illinois on Monday. The Hawkeyes are currently in second in the West at 5-4 conference and 20-10 overall. Senior hitter Dee Ann Davidson leads the team with a .264 kill pct. (328 kills) while outside hitter Julie Michelleti has 283 kills (.203). Big Ten Freshman of the Year, setter Kathy Greisheim has a 7.9 assist average. Iowa downed the Gophers in three games at Williams earlier this year, 15-7, 15-11, 15-9 but Minnesota leads the series 19-5.

GOPHER RECORD-BREAKERS -- Sophomore Candy Thier (PALOS PARK, IL) set a new school and Big Ten record with 65 attack attempts last Wednesday at Wisconsin, and also hit a season high and personal best 23 kills. Thier also powered the Gophers to victory on Saturday with 17 kills.

Sophomore setter Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) set a new Big Ten record and school record with 66 assists at Wisconsin last week. The old school and Big Ten mark was 59 by Chris Donnell against Indiana (10/24/84). Three team school records fell as well -- most attacks (237), most assists (69) and most digs (104) at Wisconsin last week.

OTHER TOP GOPHERS -- Sophomore Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) hit 21 kills in the first match with Wisconsin and added eleven on Saturday, while blocking effectively in both matches. Sophomore Karyn Daline (MPLS/SOUTHWEST) hit 18 kills at Madison and six at home. Coach Schleuder praised senior Gretchen Kauth (MPLS/SOUTHWEST) and freshman Missy Larson (GLEN ELLYN, IL) for their defensive play.

HARRIERS PREPARE FOR NCAA DISTRICT IV MEET --

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team takes a week off from competition as it prepares for the NCAA District IV Championships Saturday November 10 at Champaign, Illinois. The winning team from District IV, which includes all of the Big Ten teams as well as several other schools from the upper Midwest, and the top three individuals from the rest of the field will advance to the NCAA National Championships.

GOPHERS PLACE TWO RUNNERS IN TOP SEVEN AT BIG TEN'S -- Minnesota placed two runners among the top seven at the Big Ten Championships at Purdue University last Saturday; the only team to do so besides champion Wisconsin. Junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) was fourth in 17:34, her second consecutive top ten finish at the Big Ten Championships. Senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) came in seventh, just seven seconds behind Eder (17:41).

Minnesota placed sixth as a team at the Big Ten's, a pleasant surprise considering that the Gophers lost five of their top six runners from last year's squad that was third in the Big Ten and tenth at the NCAA Championships. Freshman Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) came in third (19:33), her highest finish among the Gopher runners this season. Sophomore Wendy Knight (NEW HOPE, MN) ran 43rd (19:34) and senior Tammy McGrane (PARK RAPIDS, MN) was 46th (19:37). Seniors Julie Sher (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) (20:25) and Eva Ljungstrom (HARNOSANDS, SWEDEN) (20:40) finished 64th and 66th, respectively.

LAWLESS COMMENTS -- Cross country coach Mike Lawless was pleased with the results at the Big Ten's. "We needed a come-through performance as a team, and we got it, especially from our top five runners. Patti Walsh easily ran her best race of the season, and Wendy Knight responded well in her first Big Ten Championships."

GOLF CLOSES FALL SEASON THIS WEEKEND --

The Minnesota women's golf team will travel to Palo Alto, California this weekend for the Stanford Invitational, and the tournament of the fall. The Stanford tourney traditionally attracts the top teams from the southwestern U.S., including teams from Texas and California that usually qualify for the NCAA championships.

The Gophers finished tenth in the 15-team field at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational last weekend. Sophomore Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) was the top Gopher, finishing in 27th (82-78-75=235). Senior Jocelyn Smith (LENNOXVILLE, QUEBEC) tied for 30th (79-78-79=236). Other Gophers competing were sophomores Jennifer Godfrey (FAIRMONT, MN) (77-86-82=245) and Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) (82-81-87=250); and freshman Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN) (81-82-82=245).

"While I was disappointed with our team finish, I thought Jocelyn (Smith) and Julie (Hennessy) played well," commented coach Ann Zahn. "Mary's (Kuhlman) scores were not that bad for a freshman without much tournament experience. We played some tough teams, and we'll see more tough teams this weekend. I hope we can get our scores down and finish higher up in the team standings."



FOUR GOPHERS TO SENTRY WORLD INVITATIONAL --

Minnesota women's tennis coach Jack Roach will take four of his players to the Sentry World Invitational tennis tournament in Wausau, Wisconsin this Saturday and Sunday. The tourney features top players in the Midwest from both the pro and amateur ranks and is by invitation only. Minnesota and Northwestern are the only universities to be represented in the 18-woman field.

Representing the Gophers will be junior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD), sophomore Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) and freshmen Kika Pahlett and Karin Eneberg, both from Sweden. Pahlett has a swollen Achilles tendon and may not be able to play; should that happen, Roach will probably take freshman Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN)

TENNIS WINS TWO OF THREE AT QUADRANGULAR -- The Gophers beat Iowa and Wichita State last weekend at the only home meet of the fall--the Minnesota Quadrangular. A powerful Wisconsin team took all three of their matches, including one against Minnesota.

"These were all good teams," commented coach Jack Roach, "and we won two out of three, so we have to be happy about that. I think it helped us to play some dual matches (these were the first of the season for the Gophers). There is a lot more pressure on the individual to win her point, since it counts toward a team score. It brings the team closer together."

FRESHMEN KEEP IMPROVING -- Minnesota has three freshmen in the six-woman singles line-up -- Pahlett (8-3 in singles this year), Eneberg (9-4) and Bjerken (8-5) -- and all three won two out of three matches last weekend. Sophomore Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL) (9-3) also took two of three for the weekend.

"The freshmen just keep getting better and better," said Roach. "That's exciting to watch as a coach."

Jones (5-6) won the only singles match for Minnesota against Wisconsin, but suffered defeats against both Iowa and Wichita State. Junior captain Nancy Rost (SIOUX CITY, SD) (10-6) beat Iowa's number one player, but lost at the number one singles position against both Wisconsin and Wichita State.

DOUBLES STILL FLUID -- Coach Jack Roach mixed and matched at the doubles positions all weekend, with only the number one team of Rost and Bjerken playing together against all three weekend opponents. Pahlett and Eneberg were together for two matches, before Pahlett's swollen Achilles tendon forced her out of competition for the doubles match against Wichita State.

FIRST LOOK AT THE GOPHER SWIMMERS ON TAP --

The Minnesota women's swimming and diving team will join with the Gopher men's team in the annual time trials Friday, November 2, beginning at 5:00 p.m. in the Cooke Hall pool. Team members will compete in either the 400 yard individual medley or the 1650 yard freestyle. On Saturday, November 3, the annual Maroon and Gold intrasquad meet will be held, starting at 10:00 a.m. The meet will feature co-ed teams competing against one another in a full schedule of events. Women's coach Jean Freeman says the meet will give her athletes a flavor of the competition to come when the season opens at home, Friday, November 9, against Michigan State.

## (SWIM TEAM OPENS SEASON HOSTING MICHIGAN STATE)

The Minnesota swimming and diving team will open their dual meet season at home this weekend against Michigan State on Friday at 5 p.m. at Cooke Hall Pool. The Gophers, who placed second in the Big Ten last year, are aiming for the title this season and would like to start the year with a win.

"I believe we can beat Michigan State," says Gopher coach Jean Freeman. "We will be swimming all our varsity swimmers so there will be some good races." Minnesota's strongest event should be the backstroke where senior Ruth Christensen (ST. PAUL/IRONDALE), and juniors Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY/ARMSTRONG), and Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL/RAMSEY) are scheduled to compete. The last time Minnesota and Michigan State met in a dual meet was in the 1981-82 season with the Spartan's winning 78-62. However, Michigan State was eighth in the Big Ten last year.

TIME TRAILS SHOW PROMISING PERFORMANCES-- Freshman Jodi Shirmers (ST. CLOUD/TECH) took first in the 200 freestyle (1:58.51) and 500 freestyle (5:17.50) gaining praise from Freeman. "Jodi has adjusted to college swimming very well. She's explosive off the blocks and she beat Elyce Iwerks (top point scorer last year) in the 200 yd. freestyle. Elyce has not lost that event very many times." Another bright spot for Freeman is the improved performances of junior Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE). "Denise is looking really good in workouts and she's swimming with more confidence than every before," says Freeman.

CROSS COUNTRY HOPES FOR NATIONAL QUALIFIERS AT DISTRICT MEET

University of Minnesota women's cross country coach Mike Lawless will take his top five runners from the Big Ten Championships to the NCAA District IV Championships at Champaign, Illinois Saturday. The winner of the District IV meet, which includes all of the Big Ten teams and many other schools from the Upper Midwest, plus the top three individuals from the rest of the field will advance to the NCAA National Championships at Penn State University November 19. Last season the Gophers went to the NCAA Championships for the first time in school history, placing 10th as a team.

EDER AND BANT HOPE TO QUALIFY FOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS -- Big Ten champ Wisconsin is the overwhelming favorite to win the District IV meet and advance to the NCAA Championships. But Minnesota has two runners -- senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) and junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) -- who have a legitimate chance to place among the top three non-Wisconsin individuals and qualify for the NCAA Championships. Both Bant (17:03) and Eder (16:46) ran personal bests on the Illinois course earlier in the year; Eder's time is a school record. Eder finished fourth and Bant seventh at the Big Ten Championships two weeks ago; among the non-Wisconsin placers they ran second and fourth at the Big Ten's. Eder was the top Minnesota runner (35th overall) at the NCAA Championships last fall, but Bant did not compete due to an injury.

Senior Tammy McGrane (PARK RAPIDS, MN), sophomore Wendy Knight (NEW HOPE, MN) and freshman Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) will round out the Gophers' squad for the District IV Championships. They are coming off strong performances at the Big Ten Championships when they helped Minnesota to a sixth-place finish, a pleasant surprise in a rebuilding year for the Gophers.

LAWLESS COMMENTS -- "We want a solid team run, comparable to the Big ten performance if not better. More importantly, we're looking for Eder and Bant to qualify for the nationals. I feel that the others are coming off their best races of the season at the Big Ten's."

## MINNESOTA DIAL CLASSIC FEATURES TWO TOP 20 TEAMS

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Two pre-season top twenty teams and several pre-season All-Americans highlight a field of four major college women's basketball teams at the 1984 Dial Classic, hosted by the University of Minnesota at Williams Arena November 30 and December 1. Northeast Louisiana and Tennessee, both ranked in top twenty polls by Street and Smith magazine and the Women's Basketball News Service, and Big Eight contender Nebraska will join the Gophers.

First round action begins Friday, November 30, with Minnesota playing Nebraska at 7:00 p.m., followed by Northeast Louisiana against Tennessee at 9:00 p.m. The consolation game will be played Saturday, December 1 at 1:00 p.m., with the championship game at 3:00 p.m. An all-tournament team and MVP will be announced Saturday.

A LOOK AT THE PARINGS -- MINNESOTA VS. NEBRASKA -- The Gophers boast a formidable front line, including 6-1 senior forward Laura Coenen (13.6 ppg, 6.5 reb.), the Big Ten's MVP in 1983 and a pre-season honorable mention All-American by Street and Smith. She'll be joined by junior forward Carol Peterka (14.8 ppg, 7.2 reb.) and center Molly Tadich (11.2 ppg, 10.7 reb.), who was ranked fourth nationally among freshman rebounders. Minnesota (12-15 last season) opens the season at the Plainsview (Tex.) Queens Classic Nov. 22-24.

The Cornhuskers are coming off a 16-12 season, and with four starters returning they should contend for the Big Eight title this year. Senior 5-10 forward Debra Powell (18.3 ppg, 6.3 reb.) was named by the Women's Basketball yearbook as one of the top returning players in District V. Senior 5-7 guard Cathy Owen (10.1 ppg, 4.6 reb.) led the nation with a 88.5 free throw shooting percentage (54 of 61), and 5-9 freshman guard Maurtice Ivy is a second-team pre-season pick on the Women's Basketball News Service Freshman Team. The Cornhuskers host the Nebraska Invitational, which includes a tough Clemson team Nov. 23-24, prior to the Dial Classic.

Minnesota and Nebraska have met five times, with the Gophers winning three games, including their last meeting (81-70) at Lincoln two seasons ago.

NORTHEAST LOUISIANA VS. TENNESSEE -- Northeast Louisiana raced its high-scoring offense (86.3 ppg) to a 22-3 record and the Southland Conference title last season, and the Lady Indians should be just as fearsome this year. They were picked seventh in pre-season polls by both Street and Smith and the Women's Basketball News Service. Junior 6-3 center Lisa Ingram (24.0 ppg, 11.7 reb) ranked among NCAA leaders in scoring, field goal percentage and rebounding last year, and was picked by Street and Smith as a pre-season first-team All-American. Junior guard Eun Jung Lee (18.0 ppg, 10.3 assists) led the nation in assists last season and is a high honorable mention pick by Street and Smith. Chana Perry, a 6-4 freshman center, leads a prize recruiting class. Perry was named "Player of the Year" by USA Today and was considered the nation's No. 1 high school basketball player. Northeast Louisiana opens its schedule at home against Stephen. F. Austin Nov. 19 and on the road vs. Mississippi College Nov. 23 before coming to Minnesota.

Perennial powerhouse Tennessee, coached by Olympic gold medal coach Pat Summit, advanced to the NCAA Championship game last season before losing to Southern California, 72-61. The Lady Vols lost four starters from that squad, including forwards Tanya Haave and Mary Ostrowski, but they have been picked 12th by Street and Smith and 14th by the Women's Basketball News Service. Senior 5-9 guard Sheila Collins (10.5 ppg, 3.8 reb) will lead a squad heavily stacked with four sophomores and five freshman.

One of those freshmen, 6-3 forward Jennifer Tuggle, is a second-team all-freshman choice by Women's Basketball News Service. Tennessee, which played the toughest schedule in the country last year, according to the Women's Basketball Yearbook, opens with four games prior to the Dial Classic, including a home contest with highly-regarded Cincinnati Nov. 26.

The Gophers have never met Northeast Louisiana and are 0-1 against Tennessee after losing 50-54 at Knoxville last year.

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team ended its season in team competition with a strong seventh place finish (fourth among Big Ten schools) at the NCAA District IV Championships at Champaign, Illinois. But junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) will run one more race -- at the NCAA National Championships Monday, November 19 at Penn State University.

EDER SETS SCHOOL RECORD WHILE QUALIFYING -- Jody Eder's third place finish at the district meet qualifies her for the NCAA Nationals for the second consecutive year (last year as a member of the Gopher squad that finished tenth in the nation). The winning team (Wisconsin) and the top three non-Wisconsin individuals earned a trip to the nationals; only Wisconsin's Cathy Branta and Katie Ishmael were ahead of Eder. Eder's time of 16:32.6 shattered her own school record by 14 seconds, set on the same course earlier this season. Last year Eder placed 35th individually at the nationals. The top 25 runners earn All-American honors. Eder is a four-time All-American, all of them from track.

The other four Minnesota runners all recorded their fastest times of the year at the District IV meet, three of those career bests. Senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) became the only other Minnesota runner besides Eder to ever break 17 minutes with her 11th-place finish in 16:56.1, just eight-tenths of a second from the top ten. Senior Tammy McGrane (PARK RAPIDS, MN) finished her cross country career in 18:09.3 (46th), her fastest time of the season and just three seconds away from her personal best. Career bests were also turned in by sophomore Wendy Knight (NEW HOPE, MN) and freshman Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN). Knight was 74th in 18:29.1 and Walsh came in 84th in 18:40.3.

## FEDER QUALIFIED FOR CROSS COUNTRY NATIONALS

The University of Minnesota women's cross country team ended its season in team competition with a strong seventh place finish (fourth among Big Ten schools) at the NCAA District IV Championships at Champlin, Minn., but Junior Judy Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) will run the state race -- at the NCAA National Championships Monday, November 19 at Penn State University.

EDER SETS SCHOOL RECORD WHILE OVERTAKING -- Judy Eder's third place finish at the district meet qualified her for the NCAA National for the second consecutive year (last year as a member of the Gopher squad that finished sixth in the nation). The winning team (Wisconsin) and the top three on Minnesota had virtually earned a trip to the nationals; only Wisconsin's Lanny McGarr and Katie Lammert were ahead of Eder. Eder's time of 18:29.1 beat the previous year's record by 14 seconds, set on the same course earlier this season. Last year Eder placed 28th, 10th among the nationals. The top 25 runners were 11-12 minutes shorter. Eder is a four-time All-American, all of them from the Big Ten.

The other four Minnesota runners all returned with faster times of half a year at the District IV meet. Three of those career bests (Lanny McGarr, Katie Lammert, and Patti Walsh) became the only other Minnesota runners besides Eder to run faster than 18 minutes with her 11th-place finish in 18:09.3. Just eight-tenths of a second from the top ten, senior Lanny McGarr (PARK RAPIDS, MN) finished next in country career in 18:09.3 (45th). Her fastest time of the season and best is 18:09.3 seconds away from her personal best. Career bests were also running in 18:09.3 were Wanda Knight (NEW HOPE, MN) and freshman Patti Walsh (CHICKADEE, MN). Knight was 18:29.1 and Walsh came in 18:30.2.

LAWLESS COMMENTS -- Cross country coach Mike Lawless was especially pleased with Eder's run because she "responded well" when Eder and Lammert took up the pace. Overall, we had an excellent team race. We beat Northwestern, which beat us at the Big Ten. Lanny McGarr's really had her best race of the season and the others did very well.

(SWIMMERS LOOKING FOR SECOND WIN OF SEASON AT HAMLIME-ST. PAUL)

The Minnesota Swimming and Diving team will be looking for their second win in as many meets this Saturday when they travel to Hamline University, St. Paul. Minnesota plans to use the Hamline meet to give the strong event swimmers an opportunity to swim off events. In the same vein, swimming assistant coach Terry Nieszner says "our third and fourth swimmers (in an event) will be swimming their strongest events." Head Coach Jean Freeman was absent from the meet due to the death of her father.

Jeanne Ewing (SIOUX FALLS, SD/LINCOLN) and Diane Almstrom (NO. MINNEAPOLIS/HENRY) will be strong candidates in the 100 and 200 breaststroke, while Lisa Camillo (DELAVAN, WI/DELAVAN-DARIEN) and Kari Anderson (BELLEVUE, WA/INTERLAKE) will be up in the 100 butterfly. JoJo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN/RICHFIELD), a strong butterflyer, wants to swim some distance races and will compete in the 500 or 1000 freestyle.

FRESHMAN SWIMMER INJURED IN CAR ACCIDENT-- Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN/TECH) was injured Saturday night when the car she was in hit a deer near St. Cloud. She suffered cuts to the head and possibly pulled muscles in her back. She was not hospitalized, but Nieszner is not sure if Jodi will be physically able to compete in the Hamline meet.

SWIMMERS FIRST BIG 10 MEET A VICTORY OVER MICHIGAN STATE-- The Gopher's swimming and diving team soundly defeated Michigan State 92-48 Nov. 10 in the first meet of the season for both teams. Coach Nieszner said "the team swam really well, with everyone swimming as we expected." Minnesota has 3-1 meet record with Michigan State.

Minnesota's Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL/RAMSEY) won the 100 yard backstroke (1:04.03) and swam the first leg of the winning 800 free relay (7:55.54) team. Others on the 800 relay team were Erin Driscoll (E. GRAND FORKS, MN/E. GRAND FORKS), Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN/TECH), and Elyce Iwerks, (ABERDEEN, SD/CENTRAL). Schirmers also won the 200 freestyle (1:56.57), and Iwerks won the 200 backstroke (2:11.81).

(VOLLEYBALL ENDS SEASON)

The Gopher women's volleyball team closed out the 1984 season with two home losses to Drake and Ohio State for a 16-16 overall mark and 4-9 Big Ten record. However, Saturday's finale against the Buckeye's was one of the best home showings of the season, despite the 15-11, 12-15, 13-15, 9-15 loss. "I thought we played well," said Gopher head coach Stephanie Schleuder. "Had we taken the second or third game it would have given us added momentum."

The loss was the fifth straight defeat for the Gophers who posted the worst home record in Gopher history, 2-6. Prior to the Big Ten season, the Gophers were 11-4, but struggled throughout the conference schedule posting three straight wins over Michigan and Wisconsin twice before the final five matches.

YOUNG VOLLEYBALL TEAM HAS INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS -- The Gopher volleyball team, which featured four freshmen and five sophomores, did have individual highlights. "What we have to do is look at the individual accomplishments this year," says Schleuder. "Pam (Miller) stands out in my mind -- for a sophomore to break Martie's (Larsen, Big Ten MVP in '83) season blocking record is a real accomplishment. I was pleased with her progress all year long."

Schleuder also commented on setter Jennie Colling's improvement in her first year of setting. "I think Jennie came a long way this season. It took her three fourth's of the year to get used to her position. Recently, she has done shown some good setting."

TEAM LEADERS -- Sophomore Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) led the Gophers with 377 kills and a .267 kill percentage in all matches. Miller also led in blocking with 31 solo and 122 assists for a 1.24 per game average. She set a new season block assist record with 122, breaking Martie Larsen's record of 110 in 1983. Miller also had a personal best of .684 in hitting percentage vs. Butler (Ind.) with 15 kills and two errors in 19 attempts. She led the Gophers in kills in 16 of the 32 matches.

Sophomore Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) averaged 7.24 assists per game this year and set a new single match record with 66 assists against Wisconsin (I). Collings holds the school block assists record from last year (with 11), and was the second best blocker this season with 21 solo and 65 assists, while finishing second on the team in service aces with 47.

Sophomore Candy Thier (PALOS PARK, IL) was second on the team in kills with 358, but only managed a .146 kill pct. Thier led the Gophers in service aces with 59 and was second in digs with 225. She set two school records: most total attack attempts in a match with 65 vs. Wisconsin (I), and best kill pct. in a match at .692 against E. Tennessee with nine kills in 13 errorless attempts.

Sophomore Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) was the third leading hitter with 311 kills, but had the second best kill pct. at .223. Daline also led the Gophers for the second season in digs with 293, setting a new Minnesota season dig record. Freshman Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) was an effective blocker with 15 solo blocks and 63 assists.

NORTHWESTERN AND PURDUE WIN DIVISIONS -- Northwestern captured the West Division with a 12-1 record after suffering their first loss of the year at the hands of Indiana last weekend, while Big Ten Tournament host Purdue won the East Division with a 10-3 mark. Meanwhile, Ohio State, despite tying Indiana, received the second spot from the East, based on having lost fewer games in Big Ten matches. Iowa earned the second place slot in the West.

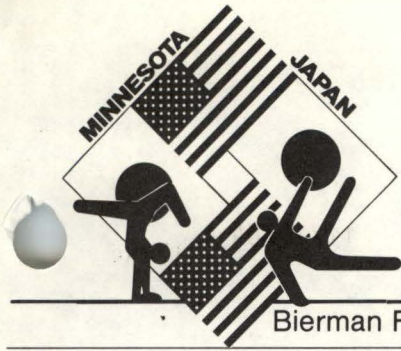

## MINNESOTA WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS IN REVIEW --

Whether it's conference, regional or national competition, the Minnesota women's gymnastics team has proven to be a competitive force in the last few years. In eleven years under head coach Katalin Deli, Gophers have competed at nationals six times, have qualified for regional competition the last five years in a row, and placed second in the Big Ten the last two years.

As a team, Minnesota went to the AIAW National Championships five times, with their latest appearance also their best -- a seventh place finish in 1981-82. That year, three Gophers earned All-American distinction -- Robin Huebner, Karie Ploof and Judi Klein. The last performance by any Gopher on the national level came a year later, in 1982-83, when Robin Huebner qualified individually.

QUALIFYING IN THE TOUGH MIDWEST -- Minnesota has qualified for regional competition the last five years in a row. Last season, as a result of the NCAA's realignment, the Gophers moved to the toughest region in the country -- the Midwest. Only six teams in the region qualify for the regional meet, and Minnesota was one, placing fourth behind national champion Utah and national qualifiers Arizona and Arizona State. The region also includes perennially tough teams from Oklahoma, Utah State and Nebraska.

Minnesota placed second at the NCAA Central Regional during the 1982-83 season. The previous three years, the Gophers qualified for the AIAW Region 6 championship meet, winning the region title twice and placing second once, and qualifying for the AIAW national championships all three years.

Prior to the introduction of regional competition, the Gophers won the Minnesota AIAW state championship four years running.

A FORCE IN THE CONFERENCE -- The Gophers have become one of two dominant teams in the Big Ten since the conference began holding official gymnastics championships during the 1981-1982 season. That year, Minnesota finished fourth, but the team has finished second the last two years in a row. In addition, the Gophers are co-holders of two records: number of individual champions since the championships began (7) and number of individual championships in one year (4 in 1982).

In just three years, individual Gophers have received All-Big Ten recognition eight times (Robin Huebner, Wendy Dorsey and Karie Ploof all did so twice; Laurie Kaiser and Judi Klein have done so once). Including unofficial Big Ten Championships, the Gophers have won eleven individual titles.

Head Coach Katalin Deli and her assistant coach and husband Gabor, emigrated from Hungary to the U.S. Both were members of the Hungarian national gymnastics team and Gabor represented Hungary at the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City.

MINNESOTA MEN'S GYMNASTICS IN REVIEW--

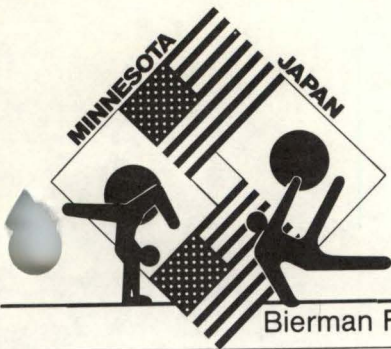
Since taking over the head coaching duties in 1972, Fred Roethlisberger has compiled an impressive 81-36 coaching record (.691). Roethlisberger took over a team that had not finished higher than fifth in the Big Ten since 1961, and guided the Gophers to seven Big Ten titles. Nationally Minnesota has finished in the top ten in the NCAA five times since 1976, and in the top 15 in the nation every year. Under Roethlisberger, the Gophers have had five All-Americans -- Jeff LaFleur in 1976, Tim LaFleur in 1978, Peter Velguth in 1981, Brian Meeker in 1982, and Joey Ray in 1983. Both of the LaFleur's, Meeker and Ray received the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor given to the senior athlete at each university with the greatest proficiency in athletics and academics.

A DYNASTY IN THE CONFERENCE -- From 1976 to 1980, the Big Ten title had a permanent home at Cooke Hall, Minnesota's gymnastics facility. Minnesota won the title five years straight, finished second in 1981, and regained the crown in 1982 and 1984. Before the 1976 season, the Gophers had not won a Big Ten title since 1949, but since then the lowest finish has been fourth in 1983.

Gopher individuals have won the all-around title every year since 1976, except in 1984. Tim LaFleur won the title three times from 1976-78, Kevin Prady won it in 1979, and Dan Price captured the title in 1980. The next two years, Brian Meeker earned the all-around title and Joey Ray gained the Big Ten honor in 1983. Since 1972, the Gophers have won 25 individual Big Ten titles.

GOPHERS IN WORLD COMPETITION -- Minnesota gymnastics has not only had an impact in the conference and the NCAA, it has contributed to the world gymnastics scene. Since 1975, seven Gophers have participated on the US National team, three have been in the Pan American games, and two have been alternates to the Olympic team. Brian Meeker in 1984 and Tim LaFleur in 1980. LaFleur has also competed in the World Championships twice.

Coach Roethlisberger also has a long list of accomplishments in the gymnastics world. He coached the US National team which traveled Europe in 1977, and led American teams that participated in the 1978 Canada Cup, 1979 Barcelona Invitational, 1979 Taiwan Cup, 1981 South African Cup, 1982 France Invitational, and the 1982 London Coca-Cola Invitational.

## (INTERNATIONAL GYMNASTICS AT WILLIAMS ARENA DEC. 8 AS U MEETS JAPANESE ALL-STAR TEAM)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- A touch of the Olympics will come to Minnesota on Saturday, December 8 at 3 p.m., when the Japanese University all-star gymnastics team visits Williams Arena for the fifth straight year. This year's meet will be different than the past, however, because it will include competition against both the University of Minnesota men's and women's gymnastics team. Past meets have included only a men's competition.

The Japanese team includes the top seven men and women, as selected by their finish at Japan's national collegiate championships. The Japanese will face the defending Big Ten champions in the men's team, which returns with three top ten all-arounders from last year's Big Ten race. The Minnesota women's team includes two All-Big Ten selections and four top ten finishers from last year's Big Ten championships.

THE JAPANESE TOUR -- Minnesota is part of a nine-stop tour that will take the Japanese from Pittsburgh and Penn State in the east to Brigham Young in the west. The tour opens November 30, with Japan competing against the University of Pittsburgh. After a stop at Penn State December 2, they will head for the Midwest and meets against Wisconsin-Oshkosh (December 3), Iowa State (December 5) and Iowa (December 6).

After the meet at Minnesota on December 9, the Japanese travel to Nebraska (December 9), Kansas City and competition against the Big Eight Conference All-Stars (December 11) and the final meet at Brigham Young (December 13).

THE MINNESOTA MEN -- Minnesota enters the 1984-85 season as the defending Big Ten Champions, and Coach Fred Roethlisberger has the personnel to field another strong team. Juniors Rob Brown (CHICAGO, IL), Dave Menke (BLOOMINGTON, MN), and sophomore Collin Godkin (WEST ALLIS, WI) form Minnesota's traditionally strong core of all-around performers.

Brown took fourth at Big Ten's in the all-around last year while Menke placed fifth and Godkin was ninth. In addition on the individual events, Brown tied for second on the still rings, and Menke finished sixth in the parallel bars and fifth in the horizontal bars.

Junior Pat Houde (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and sophomore Jamie Gerado (SPRINGFIELD, VA) add depth to the returners which also include specialists sophomore Kevin Cochran (BLOOMINGTON, MN) on the floor exercise, and senior Steve Braun (BLOOMINGTON, MN) on the pommel horse. Six freshmen form the largest academic class on the team and include highly successful Junior Olympic competitors Ron Hill (BLOOMINGTON, MN), Steve Bajusz (NAPERVILLE, IL), and Mike McCabe (DES PLAINES, IL).

THE MINNESOTA WOMEN -- Seven members of last year's Minnesota women's gymnastics team are back. Considering last year the team finished second in the Big Ten, fourth in the NCAA Midwest Region and ranked 16th in the country, Coach Katalin Deli is looking ahead to another successful year.

The Gophers' returning gymnasts include two All-Big Ten selections -- sophomore Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) and junior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN). Kaiser took two of the four individual titles at the Big Ten Championships last year (vault and floor exercise), was second on the balance beam and finished fifth all-around. She re-set Minnesota's vault record three times during the season, set a new Big Ten vault record and tied the Minnesota floor exercise record.

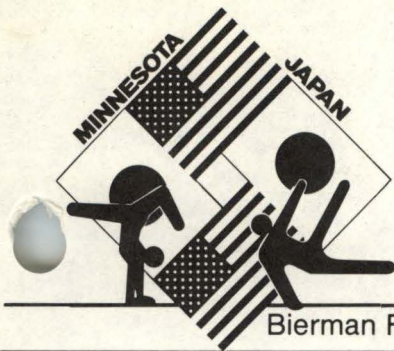

### (BASKETBALL HOSTS TWO RANKED TEAMS IN DIAL CLASSIC)

The Gopher women's basketball team will feature the toughest field ever in the third annual Dial Classic at Williams Arena this weekend. The Gophers will meet Nebraska in the first round while #7 ranked Northeast Louisiana will take on #14 Tennessee.

**GOPHERS 1-2 IN TEXAS** -- The Gophers opened the year at the Queens Classic at Wayland Baptist University in Plainview, Texas and finished sixth of eight teams. Minnesota lost to host Wayland Baptist in the opening round 52-59 then defeated Texas-San Antonio 60-57 and ended up with a loss to Florida A&M 57-66.

**COENEN SECOND IN SCORING/REBOUNDING** -- Gopher 6-1 senior forward Laura Coenen of Neenah, WI moved into second place on Minnesota's all-time scoring and rebounding charts over the weekend. Coenen has 1,397 career points and could challenge leader Linda Roberts (1977-81) 1,856 record this season. In rebounding, Roberts holds a commanding 1,413 lead to Coenen's 727.

**HANSON LOOKING FOR SHOOTING GUARDS** -- Coach Ellen Mosher Hanson will be looking at her guards this week to see who wants to shoot the ball. "I was happy with our defense last weekend...we followed our game plan. The biggest weakness is that we have to have more than three people shoot the ball. We have the same three people scoring as last year (Coenen, Tadich and Peterka), but we lost Mary Dressen who averaged 10.1 points per game. Whoever shoots the ball will play this week," says Hanson.

**FORWARD LINE PACES GOPHER SCORING--** The Gophers were paced in scoring in all three games by Coenen, 6-0 junior forward Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) and 6-3 sophomore center Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON). Against Wayland Baptist, Peterka had 18 points, Coenen had 16 and Tadich pulled down 12 caroms. Against Florida A&M, Coenen led all scorers and rebounders with 24 points and 16 rebounds while Peterka had 12 points and Tadich 10 points.

NOTING NORTHEAST LOUISIANA -- The Lady Indians have wasted no time this season in shifting their offense into high gear. Northeast Louisiana hammered Stephen F. Austin 90-51 at home and Mississippi College 100-81 on the road. Pre-season All-American Lisa Ingram led the Lady Indians in scoring and rebounding both games, including 30 points and 11 boards against Mississippi College. Point guard Eun Jung Lee led the nation in assists last year and has picked up where she left off, averaging 13.0 assists in the first two games. Freshman Chana Perry, the USA Today prep player of the year in 1984, is averaging 18 points per game. NE Louisiana was 22-3 last year, and won the Southland Conference. They defeated Kansas State in the first round of the NCAA 78-73, but lost to Texas in the second round 99-91.

NOTING TENNESSEE -- The Lady Volunteers already have one tournament championship under their belts this season, winning the Bowling Green Invitational by defeating Southern Illinois 56-54 and Western Kentucky 70-62 in the finals. Lisa Webb, a 5-9 center, was named MVP of the tournament pulling down 14 rebounds in the final and scoring 31 points over both games. Tennessee then defeated Notre Dame at home, 62-57. Sheila Collins scored 24 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in that victory. The Lady Volunteers also host a tough Cincinnati team prior to the Dial Classic. Tennessee was 23-10 last year and 10-3 in the tough Southeastern Conference. They were national runnerups to Southern Cal at the NCAA's, 61-72.

THE COACHES -- LINDA HARPER is in her seventh year at Northeast Louisiana, where she has a 92-75 record. She has led the Lady Indians to the Southland Conference title the last two seasons.

Tennessee coach PAT HEAD SUMMITT has a 245-76 record entering her 11th season as head coach of the Lady Volunteers. She coached the U.S. Olympic women's basketball team to a gold medal this past summer.

#### EDER NAMED CROSS COUNTRY ALL-AMERICAN

Junior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) picked up her fifth All-American honor with a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championships at Penn State University November 19. (The top 25 American finishers were named All-Americans.) It is her first All-American award in cross country; the other four are from track. She is the first Minnesota woman to win All-American honors during all three running seasons: Cross country, indoor track and outdoor track.

Eder ran the third fastest time in Gopher history (16:50.9), topped only by her two times on the University of Illinois cross country course earlier this year. Last season she placed 35th at the NCAA nationals as the Gophers placed 10th in the team competition. This year she qualified for the nationals individually.

Eder was a two-time All-American as a freshman. She was fifth in the 1000 yard run and third as a member of Minnesota's team two-mile relay team at the 1983 NCAA Indoor Championships. Eder won two more All-American awards as a sophomore, one each in indoor and outdoor track. She was fourth in the 1000 meter run at the 1984 NCAA Indoor Championships and sixth in the 3000 meters at the 1984 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

WOMEN GYMNASTS OPEN SEASON SUNDAY --

The University of Minnesota women's gymnastics team opens a new season Sunday, December 2, with a meet against NCAA Division III power University of Wisconsin-Stout. The starting time is 3:00 p.m. at Williams Arena.

The Gophers return all but one gymnast from a team that finished last season second in the Big Ten and ranked 16th in the country. Sophomore Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) and junior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN), both All-Big Ten selections last year, will lead the team once again this year. Kaiser won two individual events at the Big Ten championships, while Dorsey finished third all-around. All told, the Gophers had four gymnasts in the top ten all-around at the Big Tens.

STOUT WAS FOURTH IN THE NATION -- Wisconsin-Stout returns all but one athlete from a team that finished fourth at the NCAA Division III nationals last season, and that finished ninth at the NAIA nationals. However, Stout has had three injuries to key performers already this year, including one to top all-arounder Terry Traczyk (FRIDLEY, MN). Stout coach John Zuerlein says he is hoping for some of his individuals to do well, including Division III All-American junior Pam Fujioka, who can score in the 9.0 range in two events, and sophomore Margie Christenson, the school record holder on the balance beam.

(SEASON'S FIRST DUAL CO-ED MEET AT HOME VS. NORTHWESTERN)

Minnesota's womens and mens swimming teams will join forces Saturday, Dec. 1, at 3 p.m., when they take on the swim teams of Northwestern at Minnesota's Cooke Hall Pool. The women will swim 13 events instead of the usual 16 in a dual meet, and coach Jean Freeman expects to win. "It will be a very close and exciting meet, but the overall team score shouldn't be on the line. Northwestern doesn't have any divers, so we start out with a 16 point lead."

THE RACERS--The 400 medley relay should produce a good race in the 100 backstroke portion of the event. Minnesota's Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD/CENTRAL) will probably swim the 100 backstroke and her season's best (1:00.96) will be up against Northwestern's Anne Niehaus (1:00.7).

Mana Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND/KANKAANPAA) a probable starter in the 1000 freestyle (10:43.32) will be up against Ann Lewis (10:43.90) in a tight race. Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN/TECH) will have a close race in the 200 free (1:56.77) if the Wildcats swim Kim Tesch (1:57.55), but Tesch is a strong competitor in the next event, the 50 free (:24.7). Diane Wallner (ST. PAUL, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) is the favorite in the 50 free (:24.98). The 200 backstroke should be a close race with Minnesota's Iwerks (2:11.81) going against Northwestern's Barb Harris (2:11.7). The same goes for the 200 breaststroke, with Coleen Carroll (ST. PAUL, MN/KELLOGG) (2:30.22) racing Tricia Miller (2:30.0).

(GYMNASTS FACE JAPANESE ALL-STAR TEAM SATURDAY) --

Both the women's and men's gymnastics teams from the University of Minnesota will host the Japanese University All-Star team this Saturday, December 8, 1984, at Williams Arena (starting time is 3:00 p.m.). This will be the first time the Gopher women have competed against the Japanese, who have squared off against the men for the last four years.

The Japanese team was chosen on the basis of the gymnasts' finish at Japan's national collegiate championships. The top seven women (and the top seven men) qualified for the nine-city tour of the United States.

"Our gymnasts are very excited and feel fortunate to get this exposure and level of competition," commented Minnesota's head gymnastics coach Katalin Deli. "We're going out to do our best and we hope to give the Japanese a good run."

GOPHERS OFF TO BEST START IN YEARS -- One Williams Arena record and nine personal bests fell as the Minnesota women's gymnastics team coasted to a 177.45 - 145.22 win over the University of Wisconsin-Stout. This is the best first meet for the Gophers in years -- last year, the team didn't score above 177.00 until the sixth meet of the season.

"We had a great meet," said Deli. "Our athletes are in as good as shape as they were at the end of last season. I'm very please, and very excited."

Sophomore Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) had the best meet of her career, breaking one Williams Arena record and tying another. Kaiser broke her own balance beam record, with a 9.45 (the old Williams Arena record was 9.40) and tied the all-around record of 37.05, set by Robin Huebner in 1983. She becomes only the second Gopher gymnast ever to score above 37.00 all-around. For the meet, Kaiser won two events (the beam and the floor exercise), tied for first in the vault, and won the all-around.

OTHER GOPHER GYMNASTS SET PERSONAL BESTS -- Sophomore Candace Doell (SASKATOON, SASK.) had three personal bests, including an all-around score of 35.80, well above her previous best of 33.80 from last year. Doell finished second for the meet, all-around, and won the uneven bars competition with another personal best (9.10 --well above her best from last season, 8.00). She also upped her floor exercise best to 8.85.

Sophomore Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) finished third all-around (35.35) and had the best performance of her career on the uneven bars (8.95; third place). Junior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) finished fourth all-around (35.25) and tied with Kaiser for first in the vault (9.15). Sophomore Linda Bednar (OSSEO, MN) had the best meet of her career, with new personal marks in the beam (8.35), floor exercise (8.70) and all-around (33.00). Freshman Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) finished fifth all-around (33.70).

ELLEN MOSHER HANSON is in her eighth year at Minnesota (134-72) and eleventh year overall (188-83).

**COENEN SCORES 42 POINTS VS. NEBRASKA --** Gopher 6-1 senior forward LAURA COENEN of Neenah, WI, proved she is back in top form over the weekend by setting a new tournament scoring record with 60 points (22-41) in Minnesota's two games. On Friday night, Coenen scored a record-setting 42 points against Nebraska hitting 16-25 shots from the field and 10-15 in free throws. Freshman DIANE KINNEY of Burnsville had her first start against NE Louisiana and scored six points and grabbed five rebounds in 19 minutes. GRETCHEN SCHAD of Milbank, SD saw action for the first time this year against NE Louisiana and scored four points and had four rebounds in 14 minutes.

**SWIMMING AND DIVING TRAINING TRIPS TO FLORIDA AND CALIFORNIA** -- The Minnesota women's swim team leaves for a training trip to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, Dec. 8, while the diving team will train in San Diego, Cal. The swimmers will be participating in the College Swim Forum at the Fort Lauderdale International Swimming Hall of Fame. The Gophers will work-out in the Hall's 50 meter, 10 lane pool daily, as well as one of the 15 other pools participating in the Forum. Coach Jean Freeman says the trip is designed "for heavy-duty training", with the athletes being in the water four hours a day, and weight training every other day. No over-all meet will be held, but individual events will be raced throughout the two week trip. Minnesota plans to compete in the 800 and 1500 meters events.

**GOPHERS VICTORIOUS OVER NORTHWESTERN** --The Gophers won their second Big Ten meet of the season, with a 78-33 win over Northwestern Dec. 1 and are 2-0 in the Big Ten, and 3-0 overall for the year. Two Minnesota divers, Patty Weiss (ST. PAUL, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) and Carol Libbesmeier (ST. CLOUD, MN/ST. CLOUD TECH) qualified for the NCAA Zone Diving meet in March. Weiss qualified in 1 meter diving (244.40 pts.) and Libbesmeier in 3 meter divings (268.15), winning their events.

Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD/CENTRAL) won the 200 backstroke (2:12.84) setting a new meet record in the event, breaking her old record (2:13.02) set in 1983. Iwerks was also on on the winning 400 medley relay team (4:04.46) and the 400 freestyle relay team (3:40.05). Mana Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND/KANKAANPAA) won a tight race in the 200 butterfly (2:12.54) over Northwestern's Ann Lewis ((2:12.56), setting the season's best time in the event. Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE, MN/BURNSVILLE) won the 200 I.M. ((2:14.91) and set the meet record with her victory. It was the first time Minnesota and Northwestern had competed in the 200 I.M. Sue Roell (BURNVILLE, MN/BURNSVILLE) won the 200 breaststroke (2:29.63) and set the season's best time in the event. Also setting the season's best times in the 100 freestyle (:54.34) and 200 freestlye (1:56.42) was Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN/ST. CLOUD TECH). Northwestern's Kim Tesch set a meet record in the 100 free (:54.01), breaking Minnesota's 1981 record (:54.05), set by Stephanie Schoening.
