(OLSON NAMED NEW MINNESOTA WOMEN'S ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Minnesota women's athletic director, Merrily Dean Baker, announced today that Donna J. Olson has been hired as the new associate athletic director for the women's athletics program, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Olson, who will start at her new post Sept. 3, replaces Dr. Janice M. Stocker, who held the position through June 30.

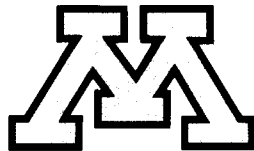
"We are pleased that Donna has accepted our invitation to join our staff as associate athletic director," Baker said. "Donna brings a wealth of experience and leadership which will serve women's athletics and the program well. I look forward to working with her."

Olson comes to Minnesota from Montclair State College in New Jersey, where she has been involved in athletics as an administrator, coach and teacher. Since 1973, she has guided Montclair State's 10-sport women's program in her post as the assistant director of athletics. Olson started at Montclair State as a physical education instructor in 1971--the same year she became head coach of the school's field hockey team, a position she held until 1981. She was also the head coach of Montclair State's softball team in 1983, after serving as the team's assistant coach for 11 years.

While at Montclair State, Olson has held a number of national and regional administrative posts. She was the president of the Jersey Athletic Conference from 1983-1985, and the first president and one of the founders of the Cosmopolitan Conference for Women's Division I basketball schools in the New York City area. Olson was a member of the NCAA Division III softball committee in 1983-84, and helped to establish the Dial Basketball Classic, which was founded at Montclair State in 1979.

A native of Wallace, Idaho, Olson received her B.S. from the University of Idaho in 1967, where she played varsity field hockey and softball. After three years as a high school physical education teacher and coach in Reedsport, Oregon, Olson went to Washington State University, where she earned her master's degree in physical education in 1971.

On accepting the Minnesota offer, Olson said, "I'm pleased to become a member of one of the outstanding women's intercollegiate athletic programs in the nation. The commitment of the state of Minnesota to women's athletics had a major impact on my decision. I'm looking forward to working with Merrily Baker and her fine staff. Being a part of Big Ten sports will be challenging and exciting."

(GOPHER VOLLEYBALL TEAM COMPETES AT MINNESOTA SPORTS SPECTACULAR AUG. 10)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The University of Minnesota women's volleyball team will kick off its 1985 season by participating in the first Minnesota Sports Spectacular, Saturday Aug. 10 at Parade Stadium in Minneapolis. The Minnesota Sports Spectacular, a fundraiser for the American Lung Association, is a weekend-long festival that will feature world-class athletes in a variety of events.

The Gophers will play the Minneapolis-St. Paul All-Stars, a team featuring many former University of Minnesota players, in a timed match between 2:45-3:20 p.m. Following the women's match, four members of the 1984 U.S. men's Olympic Volleyball team will compete in a demonstration against six local all-stars between 3:25-3:55 p.m.

The volleyball matches at Parade Stadium will be preceded by a soccer match between the University of Minnesota club team and the University of Missouri and a seven-man rugby match between the United States and Canada. Following the volleyball matches, there will be a gymnastics demonstration among some of the nation's top gymnasts.

Other events at the Minnesota Sports Spectacular include the Wheaties Mile on Saturday -- a mile run down Nicollet Mall in Minneapolis featuring world-class runners such as Francie Larrieu-Smith and Eamonn Coghlan -- and the KSTP-TV Rat Race, which will be a five mile road race open to the public. Highlights of the Minnesota Sports Spectacular will be shown on KSTP-TV (Channel 5) Saturday at 10:30 p.m.

The Gopher volleyball team, which will play a double round-robin Big Ten schedule for the first time this year, starts its regular season Sept. 2 at New York Tech. Minnesota's first home match at Williams Arena is against Drake Sept. 21 at 2:00 p.m.

VOLLEYBALL STARTS 1985 SCHEDULE WITH EAST COAST TRIP

The Minnesota volleyball team opens its 1985 season with a three-week road trip that starts in the Northeast during the first week of September. The Gophers play six matches in as many days during the first leg of the trip, including a stop at the four-team Rhode Island Classic.

On Labor Day, Minnesota opens the season with a doubleheader, playing Toledo (5-28 last season) at noon and New York Tech (12-24) at 3:00 p.m. Both matches are at New York Tech. The Gophers move on to Hofstra (32-8) Wednesday before heading to the University of Rhode Island (26-13) Thursday for the start of the Rhode Island Classic. Minnesota plays Providence (44-4) Friday and North Carolina (13-21) Saturday, to complete their play in the Classic.

"We'll face some formidable opponents at the Rhode Island Classic," says Minnesota coach Stephanie Schleuder, who is starting her fourth season with the Gophers. "Rhode Island is one of the up and coming teams in the country."

Last year Rhode Island had the best hitting percentage (.345) of any team in the nation. The Wrams' Chris Gallery (.377) and Sue Scott (.354) both ranked among the top 20 players in the nation in hitting percentage. By comparison, the player with the best hitting percentage in the Big Ten last year was Annette Bauer of Purdue (.312).

SCHLEUDER OPTIMISTIC ABOUT 1985 GOPHERS -- Minnesota coach Stephanie Schleuder says she "has been real pleased with the (Gophers') practices so far" since the team's workouts started Aug. 7. But she adds that "we're really anxious to play a match and see how we stack up."

Schleuder feels that the Gophers will have a stronger team than last season, when they finished 16-16 overall and 4-9 in the Big Ten. "We're going to have a different look because right away we'll be stronger at the two middle hitter positions."

Schleuder plans to start junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) and freshman Maria Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) at the two middle hitter positions. Miller, the Gophers' MVP in 1984, is emerging as one of the top middle hitters in the conference. Last year she was third in the Big Ten in blocks per game and sixth in kills per game. Schleuder feels that Gonzalez, who has been a member of Argentina's national team for the past three years, could be an all-conference selection by the end of the season.

The other probable starters during the Northeast trip include junior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) and sophomore Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) as outside hitters and senior Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) at right-side hitter. All three players were starters most of last season, and Daline is beginning her third year as a starter. Hiner is one of Minnesota's two captains, along with Pam Miller.

At setter, junior Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) and sophomore Missy Larson (GLEN ELLYN, MN) probably will share playing time during the season-opening road trip. Schleuder says that the setting -- one of the Gophers' weak points last year -- has improved greatly over last season by the indication of pre-season practices.

Minnesota's bench is more experienced this season and Schleuder says that depth gives the team "much more flexibility with the lineup than last year because we have several people who can play different positions." Sophomore hitter Rochele Goetz (WACONIA, MN) has had an excellent pre-season, according to Schleuder, and will see a lot of playing time this year. Goetz should help to ease the loss of Candy Thier at outside hitter. Thier transferred to St. Francis College in Illinois just prior to the start of practice earlier this month.

Junior Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL) is making tremendous progress after missing the second half of the 1984 season due to reconstructive knee surgery. Binder, who tore ligaments in her left knee in a match against Indiana last September, has been cleared for full competition and should help the team defensively in the back row. Freshman Shaleen Hipschen (HOWELL, MI) could also help the Gophers as a defensive specialist, Schleuder says.

MATTSON NAMED BASKETBALL ASSISTANT; SWANSON NEW ASSISTANT TRAINER

The Minnesota women's athletic department has made two staff additions in recent weeks with the hiring of Sherrri Mattson as an assistant basketball coach and Karen Swanson as assistant trainer.

Mattson joins coach Ellen Mosher Hanson's staff as an assistant after serving as head basketball coach at Macalester College in St. Paul for the past five years. Prior to coaching at Macalester, Mattson was the head coach at Inver Hills Community College for three seasons. Mattson, who graduated from Minnesota-Duluth in 1975, played professional basketball for two seasons before turning to coaching. She replaces Cindy Haugejorde, who recently was named an assistant women's basketball coach at Penn State.

Swanson is a familiar face to Minnesota athletes, as she served as the Gophers' student trainer from 1981-84 while working on her B.S. (1983) and M.A. (1985) degrees. Most recently, she was an athletic trainer at the West Michigan Sports Medicine Clinic. Swanson succeeds Dusty Ripplemeyer, who became an athletic trainer/therapist at Two Rivers Physical Therapy Clinic in Coon Rapids.

GOLF SEASON OPENS WITH GOPHER INVITATIONAL

The Minnesota women's golf team opens their 1985 fall season by hosting the Gopher Fall Invitational at the Les Bolstad University Golf Course on Sept. 7-8. The two-day, 54-hole match features teams from Iowa, Wisconsin, Northern Iowa, and Nebraska.

The Gophers are looking for their third title in a row at the tournament, winning it last year in a rain-shortened 36-hole contest, 323-310=633. Junior Jennifer Godfrey (FAIRMONT, MN) will seek to repeat as medalist after shooting a 79-76=155 last year. Coach Anne Zahn expects Godfrey will be in contention again this year, but she will face tough competition from teammate Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN). Hennessy leads this year's team with a career average of 81.27 and had a 79.32 average last season, second only to the graduated Jocelyn Smith.

THE COMING SEASON -- Zahn looks toward Hennessy as the top candidate to fill Smith's shoes. "She led the team after the fall season last year and had her game so much more together than she did as a freshman," Zahn says. "She has a good attitude and knows how to compete."

The other Gopher with the experience to lead the team is junior Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN), who has played in every tournament in her two years at Minnesota. "Dee should be a team leader with her experience," Zahn says. "She went through some swing changes last season, and didn't do as well as we'd hoped. I'm waiting for her to shine."

That leaves four, possibly five, slots wide open, depending on Forsberg's consistency. Besides Hennessy and Forsberg, six returning players competed in at least one tournament last season and will be working to gain a regular spot.

Those six include all three of this year's sophomores: Jodi Krafka, (ALEXANDRIA, MN), Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN) and Lynda Otness (FARMINGTON, MN). Krafka has the most experience of the group, having played in all but two of last year's tournaments, and finishing the season with the third best average on the team (81.8). Otness earned a trip to five tournaments last year, while Kuhlman went to three, including the Big Ten Championships.

Junior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) earned a spot to play at the Big Ten Championship last year and has the potential to be a strong player this year. Zahn says, "She is a very determined young woman. She has definitely improved and will play at least some this year."

This year's seniors are Leslie Cummings (AITKIN, MN), Sarah Johnson (WAYZATA, MN) and Robin Wright (ROSEVILLE, MN), but Wright is eligible only for the fall season. Only Wright appeared in tournament play last season, but Zahn doesn't count any of them out. For example, she says Johnson has "worked on her game three hours a day this summer" -- something which the coach admires.

This year's freshmen include Minnesota's state high school AA champion Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN). The other freshman is Louise Lines, from England. Zahn says Lines shoots in the 70s consistently in England, and Zahn is eagerly anticipating her arrival here.

The Gophers will be aiming to improve their sixth place Big Ten finish of last year, after placing second the year before. Hennessy placed 23rd individually last year, although she has the talent to compete among the top ten according to Zahn. Forsberg has proven herself, finishing 11th at a freshman, but slipped to 39th last year.

CROSS COUNTRY OPENS 1985 SCHEDULE AT HUSKER INVITATIONAL

The Minnesota women's cross country team, under first-year coach Gary Wilson, opens its 1985 schedule Saturday at the Husker Invitational at Lincoln, Neb. The nine-team Husker Invitational field includes Kansas, Kansas State, Nebraska, and Drake. An outlook on the 1985 Gopher cross country team is included with this week's release.

VOLLEYBALL TAKES 6-0 RECORD TO TOUGH SALUKI INVITATIONAL

Minnesota's volleyball team, off to a 6-0 record and its best start since 1974, faces a critical early season test this week at the 10th annual Saluki Invitational at Southern Illinois University in Carbondale, Ill. The Gophers play four games in three days in the round-robin tourney, which starts Thursday. Those four teams combined for a 101-29 record last season and each of them returns at least four starters from last year.

Thursday, Minnesota takes on the tourney's two-time defending champion, Southern Illinois (22-9 last season) at 7:30 p.m. Friday at 5:00 p.m., the Gophers play Texas A & M (33-4), which is ranked 14th in the national pre-season polls. And Saturday, the Gophers meet Central Michigan (24-8) at 10:00 a.m. and Kentucky (22-8), last season's regular-season Southeast Conference champs, 5:00 p.m.

"This tournament will be a good test for us," says Minnesota coach Stephanie Schleuder, who was the winning coach at the Saluki Invitational in 1977 while with the University of Alabama. "We'll get a chance to stack up against some of the best teams in the nation. We still haven't met any teams as good as some of the Big Ten teams, so this tournament should be a good indication of how we could do in the conference."

The Gophers won their only meeting with Southern Illinois in five games back in 1982. Southern Illinois is off to a 6-1 start this season, including a second-place finish at the Central Florida Tournament last week. Minnesota has lost both its matches to Texas A & M, although the last time the two teams met was four years ago. The Aggies have yet to start their 1985 season. It will be the first meeting between the Gophers and Central Michigan, which has won both of its matches this season. And Minnesota has won its only encounter with Kentucky, a five-game match in 1982. The Wildcats are 2-2 so far in 1985.

After the Saluki Invitational, the Gophers travel to the state of Missouri for two contests before returning to Williams Arena for their first home match of the season against Drake Sept. 20. Minnesota plays at the University of Missouri (15-15 last year) Monday Sept. 16 at 7:30 p.m. before heading to St. Louis University (7-25) Tuesday Sept. 17 at 7:00 p.m. The Gophers hold an 11-1 edge in the series against Missouri, which is 1-2 so far this season, including a four-game win over Indiana. Minnesota has split its two matches with St. Louis, which has not started its 1985 schedule.

Prior to the Gophers' Sept. 20 home match with Drake (2:00 p.m.), four-time All-American Mary Jo Peppler will host a volleyball clinic at Williams Arena from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. Peppler, a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic women's volleyball team, has coached and played on national collegiate championship teams.

GOPHERS WIN RHODE ISLAND CLASSIC; RETURN FROM EAST COAST UNDEFEATED

Minnesota coach Stephanie Schleuder says she didn't expect to come back from the Gophers' season-opening East Coast trip with a perfect 6-0 record. But any giddiness she might feel about the team's fast start -- its best since winning the first 11 matches of the 1974 season -- is tempered by the reality of having to face some tough opponents at the Saluki Invitational.

"I have guarded optimism right now -- things are going to get tougher for us very quickly," Schleuder says. "But I'm very pleased with our offense. Our passing has been unbelievable -- our passing efficiency has been close to 60 percent, which is excellent."

Not only have the Gophers won six straight matches, but they have won 12 consecutive games. Minnesota topped all three opponents at the Rhode Island Classic -- Rhode Island, Providence and North Carolina -- in the minimum three games. Just prior to the Rhode Island Classic, the Gophers also won three straight games from Hofstra, after dropping the first game. Minnesota's only close match of the trip was the opener against Toledo, which went five games. But Minnesota recovered from its opening match jitters to beat New York Tech in three games later that day. In all, the team won 18 of its 21 games, and copped the championship at the round-robin Rhode Island Classic.

FRESHMAN GONZALEZ LEADS ATTACK -- Freshman Maria Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) came to Minnesota as highly-touted middle hitter with vast international experience, and so far she has more than lived up to her advance billing. In the Gophers' first match of the season against Toledo, Gonzalez broke the school record for kills in a single match. Her 37 kills eclipsed the record of 31 kills set in 1983 by former Big Ten Player-of-the-Year Martie Larsen. Gonzalez also broke a school record during the Toledo match with 67 total attacks, two more than the previous record set by Candy Thier last year.

Gonzalez led the team in kills in four of the six matches, and she is averaging 5.5 kills per game. She is also second on the team total blocks with 18 and in digs with an average of 1.89 per game.

Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) picked up where she left off last season as one of the top middle hitters in the conference. Miller led the team with a 99. Miller also led the Gophers in total blocks (24) and service aces (16). Another junior, Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS, MN), was second among the Gophers in kill percentage (.355) and service aces (14).

As a team, the Gophers compiled a kill percentage of .297, over 100 points higher than last season's final percentage. Minnesota also broke a school record with 72 assists in the match against Toledo, 48 of them by junior Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) and 24 by sophomore Missy Larson (GLEN ELYN, IL).

"Our attack has been balanced and we've been hitting the ball well," Schleuder says. "But at this point, we definitely need to work on our blocking and defense and we need to diversify our offense."

GOLFERS TRAVEL TO LADY BADGER

The Minnesota women's golf team hopes to make it two-in-a-row as they defend their title at the Lady Badger Invitational this weekend at the University of Wisconsin. The Gophers won the competition last fall (311-308=619) by 19 strokes, and are out for back-to-back wins. Another second two-in-a-row for Minnesota would be winning back-to-back matches this fall. The Gophers won their first tournament and only home appearance last weekend at the Gopher Fall Invitational by an impressive 58 strokes over their nearest competitor. Gopher junior Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) has a personal two-in-a-row to make at the Lady Badger as well; she won the individual title last year (76-76=152) and would like to do it again.

THE FIELD -- Minnesota will face teams from UW-Whitewater, Northern Illinois, Iowa State, Northern Iowa, as well as Wisconsin. Gophers playing at the Lady Badger will be Hennessy, freshman Kate Hughes, (WOODBURY, MN), sophomore Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN), juniors Jen Godfrey, (FAIRMONT, MN) and Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN).

GOPHERS SET NEW 54-HOLE RECORD -- Minnesota set the varsity 54-hole team score record September 7-8 when they carded a 300-304-298=902 to win their only home tournament of the year - the Gopher Fall Invitational. The team's previous best was 916 shot at the Lady Hawkeye Invitational April 27, 1985.

The Gophers led throughout the 54 holes with Iowa (317-319-324=960) finishing second with Nebraska coming in third (326-326-323=975), Wisconsin (328-317-332=977) fourth, and Northern Iowa (327-329-335=991) fifth.

INDIVIDUAL FINALISTS -- Three Gophers, Julie Hennessy, Kate Hughes and Mary Kuhlman, squared off in sudden death play when they finished with 225. Hennessy (75-75-75=225) won with a birdie on the third play-off hole, while Hughes (75-75-75=225) shot par for second. Kuhlman took third after losing the first extra hole.

Coach Anne Zahn hopes to be faced with the same situation at the Lady Badger as she was during the Gopher Fall Invitational, "The problem that we've got right now with three University (of Minnesota) players teeing off in sudden death for the number one spot is one that I'd take every week."

Eight of the first 10 places went to Minnesota players, with fourth going to Jen Godfrey (FAIRMONT, MN) (74-75-77=226), and fifth to Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) (77-76-75=228). Junior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) (81-75-77=233) was seventh, sophomore Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) (83-79-74=236) was eighth, while senior Sarah Johnson (WAYZATA, MN) (81-75-82=238) was 10th. Jeanne Hackbarth of Wisconsin finished sixth and Nebraska's Kari Mangan placed ninth.

Other Gopher finishers include senior Robin Wright (ROSEVILLE, MN) who finished 12th with 78-78-85=241, sophomore Karen Weiss (ST. PAUL, MN), tied at 13th with 78-82-82=242, senior Leslie Cummings (AITKIN, MN) at 16th with 81-81-81=243, sophomore Lynda Otness (FARMINGTON, MN) at 24th with (82-84-84=250), and freshman Louise Lines (TIVERTON, DEVON, ENGLAND) at 36th with 89-82-93=269.

Prior to the Gophers' Sept. 21 home opening volleyball match with Drake, Olympian Mary Jo Pepler will host a volleyball clinic at Williams Arena from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. Pepler, a four-time All-American and a member of the 1968 and 1972 U.S. Olympic volleyball teams, has coached and played on national collegiate championship teams.

Coach Stephanie Schleuder calls Pepler "one of the nation's foremost authorities on volleyball". "Mary Jo is an outstanding speaker and her clinic will be a real treat for the people of Minneapolis," says Schleuder. Entrance to the clinic is free with the purchase of a ticket to the match -- prices are \$4.00 for adults, \$2.50 for students and children 6 years and under are free.

VOLLEYBALL HOSTS FIRST HOME MATCH OF 1985 SEASON SATURDAY VS. DRAKE

After three weeks on the road, the Minnesota volleyball team returns to Williams Arena to host its first home match of the season Saturday at 2:00 p.m. against Drake. The Gophers are off to a 7-3 start, including a championship at the Rhode Island Classic. Minnesota also plays at Missouri Monday and at St. Louis University Tuesday before returning for Saturday's home opener.

THE BULLDOGS--Drake (0-4) started its season last weekend at the Kansas State Invitational, dropping all four of its matches in three straight games. The Bulldogs leading hitter was freshman Caroline Orr with a .341 kill percentage, over 200 percentage points higher than the team's kill percentage. Drake hosts Iowa State Tuesday night prior to coming to Minnesota. "We've always had knock-em-down and drag 'em out matches with Drake," says Schleuder. They have always been scrappy and it should be an exciting opening home match."

MORE---

The Bulldogs were 13-11 last season, including a five-game win over the Gophers at Williams Arena in November. But Drake has several new faces this year, including first-year coach Bill MacLachlan. The Bulldogs graduated the Gateway Conference's 1984 Player-of-the-Year, Kris Hey, and another all-conference selection, Marcia Meyer. The only returning starter is senior outside hitter Bonnie Wandless. Seven of the Bulldogs' 10 players are freshmen.

GONZALEZ NAMED ALL-TOURNEY AT SIU -- The highlight of the Gophers disappointing fourth place finish at the five team Saluki Invitational at Southern Illinois-Carbondale last weekend was freshman **Andrea Gonzalez** being named as one of six players to the all-tourney team. Gonzalez had 15 kills vs. SIU, eight kills vs. Texas A&M, 12 kills vs. Central Michigan and 13 kills vs. Kentucky.

"I think it is pretty impressive for a freshman to earn an honor like that," says Schleuder. "There were a lot of good players there, but Andrea's talents are obvious."

On the season Gonzalez leads Minnesota with 147 kills, for a 4.32 per game average, and is second in kill pct. at .279. She also leads the Gophers in digs with 59, and is averaging 1.0 blocks per game.

MILLER'S ABSENCE A FACTOR -- The Gophers lost two five game matches at the tournament -- the opener to host SIU, and their third match to Central Michigan. Junior middle hitter **Pam Miller** (WORTH, IL) was unable to play in the first two matches, and returned for Central Michigan and Kentucky leading the Gophers in both matches with 14 and 15 kills respectively despite playing on a severely sprained ankle, suffered in practice last Wednesday.

"Pam is more than just a starter," says Coach Schleuder. "She is kind of the heart of our team. We lost a lot when we lost her and we didn't have a chance to practice with somebody else in her spot." Miller is expected to remain in the starting lineup.

SEASON LEADERS -- Besides Gonzalez, Miller leads the team in kill percentage at .374 with 98 kills and a 3.38 per game average. She also is the Gophers blocking leader with a 2.7 per game average. Two other hitters are helping the team -- sophomore **Patty Ryan** (OAK PARK, IL) and junior **Karyn Daline** (MINNEAPOLIS, SW). Ryan is hitting .205 with 71 kills and Daline has 77 kills and a .229 pct. In serving, junior **Julie Binder** (HANOVER PARK, IL) racked up a season match high seven aces vs. SIU over the weekend, and has 21 on the year.

TENNIS OPENS 1985-86 SCHEDULE AT IOWA STATE, DRAKE INVITATIONAL

Minnesota's women's tennis team starts its 1985-86 season with a trip to the state of Iowa this weekend. The Gophers travel to Iowa State (23-16 last season) for a dual match Thursday, followed by a trip to the Drake Invitational Friday-Sunday. The Drake Invitational is an individually-flighted singles and doubles tournament featuring six schools, including Drake, Nebraska, Iowa State, Kansas and Gustavus Adolphus. A season outlook is enclosed.

GOLFERS TO FACE 14 TEAMS AT LADY NORTHERN INVITATIONAL

Minnesota women's golf team will be one of 15 teams competing this weekend in the Lady Northern Invitational, hosted by Michigan at Ann Arbor. The tourney field includes all the Big Ten schools as well as Northern Illinois, SIU-Carbondale, Ferris State (Big Rapids, MI), Northern Iowa and one team yet to be announced.

Qualifying rounds to choose the Gopher traveling team are being held today and Tuesday at the Les Bolstad University Golf Course with one exception. "Junior Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) is exempt from qualifying, and will make the trip since she finished first at the the Lady Badger Invitational," says coach Anne Zahn.

The Gophers have easily won their first two tournaments this year, and Zahn knows there will be pressure at the Lady Northern. "What I'm going to try to beat into their brains is that it doesn't matter who's at the tournament because you don't play the competition, you play the golf course. And now I can tell them truthfully if we shoot 300's, we don't have to worry about what anybody else is doing." In six rounds of play this season, the team has had three rounds of 300 and one of 298.

GOPHERS VICTORIOUS AT LADY BADGER INVITATIONAL -- Minnesota remains unbeaten this season, winning the Lady Badger Invitational at Wisconsin this past weekend by 56 strokes. It was the second straight victory for the team, which won the Gopher Fall Invitational last weekend by 58 strokes.

The Gophers shot 310-300-300=910 to outpace second place Iowa State's 324-322-320=966. Northern Illinois was third (334-322-311=967), Wisconsin finished fourth (330-339-335=1004), Northern Iowa fifth (334-345-332=1011) and Wisconsin-Whitewater sixth (341-346-350=1037).

FORSBERG IS TOURNAMENT MEDALIST -- Dee Forsberg shot her way to first place with a 75-75-73=223 to win her first University career tournament. She was fifth last week at the Gopher Fall Invitational (77-76-75=228).

Sophomore Mary Kuhlman (81-75-74=230) and freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) (76-76-78=230) tied for second after regulation play, with Kuhlman taking second after defeating Hughes on the first hole of sudden death play. At the Gopher Fall Invitational it was Kuhlman who took third behind Hughes in sudden death play. Finishing fourth was junior Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) (82-74-83=244) with junior Jennifer Godfrey shooting 78-83-83=244.

COACH'S COMMENTS -- "The team is doing it together...everybody is shooting good team scores which is just super," says Zahn. "Winning the Lady Badger (and the Gopher Fall Invitational) by all those strokes is fine, but we're looking at the team scores and that's what's important to us." Minnesota's two victories were by a combined 114 strokes.

CROSS COUNTRY TRAVELS TO KENTUCKY INVITATIONAL

The Gopher cross country team, coming off a third-place finish at the Husker Invitational, travels to Lexington, Ken., Saturday to compete at the Kentucky Invitational. The Kentucky field includes Ohio State and Indiana from the Big Ten Conference, along with North Carolina State, Virginia, Kentucky, Edinboro University and Western Ontario.

GOPHERS START SEASON WITH STRONG RACE AT NEBRASKA -- First-year coach Gary Wilson described his team's season-opening race at the Husker Invitational last Saturday as "almost a perfect team effort for our first race." Minnesota finished third in a tough eight-team field, and placed six runners among the top 32 individuals. Nebraska won the meet with 28 points, followed by Kansas State with 34 and Minnesota with 96. Kansas was fourth with 125 points, followed by Southwest Missouri State (142), Nebraska-Omaha (147), South Dakota State (159) and Drake (167).

"We ran a very heady race," Wilson said of the team effort. "The thing that impressed me most was our competitiveness. It was a very tough course to run but we hung in there."

Senior **Jody Eder** (LAKE ELMO, MN) led the Gophers by placing eighth in 18:27.7. But Wilson said the individual effort he was most excited by was run by junior **Sue Schroeder** (MEGNON, WI), who placed second among the Gophers and 17th overall. Schroeder's time of 19:07.6 was nearly seven seconds better than her previous personal best of 19:14, which was run last season on a much easier course.

Other Gophers who ran strong races included freshman **Eileen Schaller** (NEENAH, WI), who was 22nd in 19:31.3, sophomore **Patti Walsh** (SHOREVIEW, MN) (26th in 19:39.3), junior **Wendy Knight** (NEW HOPE, MN) (31st in 20:06.1), and freshman **Kim Mittel** (EXCELSIOR, MN) (32nd in 20:07.8).

VOLLEYBALL OPENS BIG TEN DOUBLE ROUND-ROBIN AT HOME THIS WEEKEND --

The Gopher women's volleyball team will host two tough conference foes in the first year of a double round-robin schedule for Big Ten volleyball this Friday and Saturday nights. Minnesota's opening match will be Friday at 7:30 p.m. vs. Purdue, followed by Illinois Saturday at 7:00 p.m. "We are certainly underdogs," says Gopher Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "Purdue is a traditional power, and Illinois is one of the new powers in the conference. To win we will need to have an outstanding night at the net, both in blocking and hitting."

A LOOK AT PURDUE -- The Boilermakers have won the Big Ten title three of the past six years, and advanced to the NCAA First Round last year as an at-large team, after being upset by Northwestern in the Big Ten Tournament.

SERIES -- Purdue has dominated Minnesota more than any other opponent leading the series 17-2, including 12 straight victories with the last Minnesota win 10/27 1978 at the Minnesota Invitational.

RECORD -- Purdue is 7-0 this year and an honorable mention in the Tachikara Top-twenty poll...the Boiler's have won both the Hoosier and Montana State Tournaments, and have lost just four games in 25 total games. Last year Purdue was 10-3 in the Big Ten losing to Ohio State, Iowa and Northwestern, but ended the year 25-12 overall.

KEY PLAYERS -- Senior 6-2 middle blocker Marianne Smith returns after being named a 2nd team All-American and Big Ten MVP in 1984. Smith has been named MVP of both tournaments Purdue has won and has 76 kills, a .337 kill pct. and leads the Boiler's in blocks with 12 solo and 26 assists.

Senior outside hitter Kim Corwin has 67 kills (.315 pct.) while 6-0 junior Debbie Leeman has 45 kills (.295) and sophomore Linda Reichl leads the team with 81 kills (.225 pct.) The Boiler's setter is senior Cheryl Flowers who is averaging 9.2 assists per game.

COACH -- Carol Dewey is in her eleventh year at Purdue with a career and Boiler record of 288-110 prior to this season.

A LOOK AT THE ILLINI -- The Illini boast a young but talented team that has an 18-0 record and two tournament victories as well as a 17th place national ranking heading into the Big Ten season. The Illini won the University of Las Vegas Tournament with a 3-1 win over Cal-Berkeley in the championship and the BYU Pepsi Invitational last weekend. Illinois will play at Wisconsin Friday.

KEY PLAYERS -- The Illini's top two middle hitters are freshman Mary Eggers of Aurora, Ill. who was named MVP of the BYU Tourney, and senior Denise Fracaro. Junior Sally Rea is playing well at outside hitter.

SERIES -- Illinois leads the series 8-6, and the two teams' split matches last year with both teams winning at home. **COACH** -- Mike Hebert is in his third year at Illinois with a 23-40 mark prior to this year and in his career has a 212-149 mark.

GOPHER TOP PERFORMERS -- Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) continues to lead the team with a stellar .361 kill percentage and with 129 kills is averaging 3.39 kills per match. Once again, Miller is a strong blocker averaging 1.0 blocks per game and has 26 service aces and 52 digs. Miller led Minnesota with 14 kills and a .345 pct. against Missouri, despite the Gophers loss, and also had nine kills and hit .333 in a sweep at home over Drake.

Andrea (Dina) Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) has 186 kills on the year and is hitting .293 with a 4.33 per game average. She leads the team in blocks with 18 solo and 28 assists and also leads in digs with a 1.7 average (73 total). Last week Gonzalez had 13 kills vs. Missouri (.345), 14 vs. St. Louis (.393), and 12 vs. Drake (.304).

Junior **Jennie Collings** (ROCHESTER, IL) has been the Gophers primary setter and is averaging 8.40 assists per game, while averaging 1.4 digs per game.

Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL) leads the team in service aces with 27, while senior **Beth Hiner** (KENYON, MN) is second in digs with a 1.6 average (67).

Junior **Karyn Daline** (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) is third in hitting with 94 kills and a .243 kill percentage.

"Probably the most outstanding player for us was Anne Gorde. She won her flight and beat three outstanding players to do it," said Roach adding, "Jennie Huston has played well. It was nice for her, in her first college matches, to go undefeated for the weekend."

GOLFERS HAVE THREE WEEK REST AFTER THREE WEEKS OF TOURNEYS

The women's golf team has three weeks to rest and hone their skills before traveling to the Beacon Woods Invitational at Tampa, Florida. "After three tournaments in three weeks, we're all ready to take a break," says head coach Anne Zahn. "Hopefully everyone will be rejuvenated by the time qualifying rounds begin to determine who makes the trip to Florida."

MINNESOTA FINISHES IN TOP THIRD AT LADY NORTHERN INVITATIONAL -- The Gophers were fifth of 15 teams at the Lady Northern Invitational, hosted by Michigan this past weekend. The Lady Northern is a traveling tournament, which is played in the fall on the same course that will be the site of the Big Ten Championships in the spring. Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MN) (82-83-81=246) led the Gophers in scoring, finishing 12 strokes behind tournament winner Lisa Marino of Michigan (71-84-79=234).

The Gophers shot 337-336-330=1003 to finish behind first place Indiana (321-321-311=953), second place Michigan State (312-337-327=976), third place Ohio State (325-329-331=985) and fourth place Illinois (329-345-324=998). After the first round Minnesota was in seventh place, but worked their way to fourth at the conclusion 36 holes. They slipped to fifth in the final round, even though they played their best 18 holes of the tourney.

"Obviously it was disappointing for all us," says Zahn, "because we are a much better team than we played. They haven't had any rain there (Ann Arbor) for awhile and the course was like playing on concrete...you just didn't know where the ball would be bouncing to next."

GOPHERS NARROWLY LOSE TO ILLINI -- The Gopher volleyball team played with the 16th rated Illinois team last Saturday, but despite having a 10-2 lead in the fifth game, lost the game 14-16 after the score was tied at 10-10, 12-12 and 14-14. "It was a disappointing loss because we had a chance to win," says Coach Schleuder, "but I'm encouraged that we could stay with a team ranked that highly until the end. Both Andrea (Gonzalez) and Pam (Miller) had outstanding matches."

TOP GOPHERS -- Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) had a career high of 22 kills against Illinois and hit .316 with seven digs. Miller also had a Minnesota season high of seven block assists in that match. Against Purdue, Miller led Minnesota with 10 kills and with a three year total of 718 kills, she moved into sixth on the Minnesota career top ten list. She is hitting .321 on the year with 161 kills and has 29 service aces while leading in total blocks with 37 solo and 48 assists.

Andrea Gonzalez also had an outstanding weekend -- she hit .210 vs. Purdue with eight kills and .359 vs. the Illini with 19 kills. Gonzalez was also praised for her back-row play against Illinois -- she had seven digs and a personal best of five service aces. On the year, Gonzalez is hitting .295 with 213 kills (4.2 per game avg.) and leads Minnesota with 29 service aces.

Junior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had a good night vs. Purdue hitting .278 with eight kills and Coach Schleuder was pleased with her passing in the Illinois match. Daline has 708 career kills, seventh on the top ten list. Junior Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) blocked well vs. Illinois with two solo and six assists, a season match high for Minnesota. On the season, she has 440 assists and an 8.3 game average as the primary setter. Collings has 23 block solos and 36 block assists on the season as well.

Sophomore Rochelle Goetz (WACONIA, MN) came off the bench and played in four games vs. Illinois with a Minnesota season match high of eleven digs and a .300 hitting pct. Senior Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) is second on the team in digs with a 1.47 per game average.

TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA INVITATIONAL --

There's no time to rest for the Gopher tennis squad as they prepare to compete in the Nebraska Invitational this weekend. The tournament will be held Thursday-Saturday, Oct. 10-12, at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. In addition to Nebraska, the Gophers will face players from Iowa, Purdue, Colorado, and Texas Tech. The tournament is flighted, and the Gophers will send eight singles players and four doubles teams to compete. Last year, the Gophers placed third, missing second place by one point. "We hope to come out with some individual champions," says Roach, "and hopefully we will finish higher than third place."

Over the weekend, the Gophers faced Georgia Tech on Friday and the University of Iowa on Sunday and won both meets 8-1. "We played well; they were good matches," said Roach. The Iowa meet was the Gopher's Big Ten opener, the team's record is now 3-0.

Bjerken and Gorde defeated Tech's Kimberly Lash and Jamie Myers 6-1, 6-2 and Iowa's Kelly Fackel and Pat Leary 6-1, 6-1.

In addition, Roach was impressed by the number three team of Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA). They defeated Iowa's Robin Gerstein and Madeleine Willard 6-1, 6-0. "They played well and won easily," said Roach. "They make a good number three team."

SINGLES -- The singles players also had a good weekend. Hallgren boosted her season record to 9-2 with victories at number one singles over Georgia Tech's Kimberly Lash (6-0, 6-4) and Iowa's Michelle Conlon (6-4, 7-5). Roach was also pleased by the performances of Eneberg at number three singles and Gorde at number four. "They were evenly matched against their opponents," he said. Eneberg defeated Amy Alsobrook (Georgia Tech) 6-1, 6-2 on Friday, and she came back from a first-set defeat to down Iowa's Robin Gerstein 3-6, 6-3, 7-5 on Sunday. Gorde defeated Tech's Pam Haskin 6-4 6-4 and Iowa's Madeleine Willard 6-3, 6-3.

CROSS COUNTRY TRAVELS TO MICHIGAN INVITATIONAL

The Gopher cross country team will be traveling to Ann Arbor this weekend for the Michigan Invitational Oct. 11 after a successful hosting of the Minnesota Invitational, in which they placed third. "I thought we did as well as we could considering Sue Schroeder (MEGON, WI) ran with a foot injury," said coach Gary Wilson. "We have to start putting all five people in the top group." The Michigan Invitational will be held on the same course as the Big Ten Championships Nov. 2. Teams competing from the Big Ten will include Michigan, Purdue, Northwestern, Iowa and Michigan State.

JODY EDER LEADS GOPHERS -- Senior captain Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) led the Gophers with a dramatic 2nd place finish (17:55.1) at the Minnesota Invitational last weekend. Eder was only .1 second behind Sandra Rettie, a national cross-country runner from Manitoba, who crossed the finish line just barely in front of Eder in first place with a time of 17:55. GONZALEZ/MILLER BIG TEN LEADERS/NATIONALLY RANKED -- The Gophers two middle hitters have been establishing themselves this season...Junior co-captain Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) led the Big Ten last week in blocking and was fourth in kill average, while freshman Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) led the conference in kills per game, in kill pct. (except for Indiana and Illinois setters), and was fourth in service aces. Nationally, Gonzalez has been ranked 18th in kill average and Miller has been ranked 18th in blocking average. On the season, Miller has a .304 kill pct. with 224 kills and 1.3 blocks per game. Gonzalez leads the team with 278 kills, has a .298 kill pct. and is averaging .94 blocks per game.

SOFTBALL BANQUET THIS SATURDAY -- The University of Minnesota women's softball program is sponsoring a banquet this Saturday, Oct. 19 at the Radisson University to honor the Gopher coaches, players, alumni, parents, friends and fans. The dinner will include the initiation of the first softball Hall of Fame.

VOLLEYBALL INITIATES HALL OF FAME -- The University of Minnesota women's volleyball program initiated a Hall of Fame last Saturday night at a banquet preceding the Ohio State volleyball match. Named "The Golden Spikers" the Hall is sponsored by the booster group -- the Gold Diggers.

There were five categories available for nominations -- former player, team, honorary and coach. Three members were inducted this year.

Monica Lacis Getchell -- One of the all-time great setters at Minnesota, Getchell played from 1975-78 on Gopher teams that compiled 172 wins and 65 losses. Her leadership is evident, in that she served as the Gophers captain all four years and was MVP in 1977. With the former Lacis setting, Minnesota won three state championships in the AIAW. Originally from Brooklyn Park, Minn. Getchell is now the head volleyball coach at her alma mater, Osseo High School.

Jill Halsted -- Halsted played from 1979-82 and is the University of Minnesota all-time career kill leader with 1,350 kills. Halsted was the Gophers MVP for three years and was named an NCAA Honorable Mention All-American in 1982 and an AIAW All-American in 1981. Halsted was named All-Big Ten and All-AIAW Region 6 in both 1980 and 1981 and was selected to every all-tournament team but one her final three years. Halsted also holds Gopher career records for best kill percentage (.324), most service aces, and most block solos. Her senior year she was selected as Minnesota's Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor recipient, based on academics, leadership, and athletic ability. A graduate of Cooper High School in Brooklyn Park, Minn., Halsted is currently assistant volleyball coach at North Carolina State.

Linda Wells -- Wells coached the Gopher volleyball team for six years, in 1974 and from 1977-1981 compiling a .718 winning percentage record of 246-95-5. Her teams competed in two AIAW National Championships, placing seventh at the 1981 tournament. Wells' teams won three Minnesota State AIAW Championships, and compiled the most wins in 1978, with a 58-14 record, and Big Ten Championship (based on tournament play). Well's involvement with the department dates back to 1972-73, when she was a part-time instructor and coach. She has coached basketball, in addition to softball and volleyball over the past 13 years, and currently serves as head softball coach where she has compiled over 250 career wins.

(VOLLEYBALL FACES STIFF ROAD TRIP/CHANCE TO IMPROVE RECORD) --

The Big Ten women's volleyball race heads into the final weekend of the first half of the double round-robin schedule, and the Gophers will meet two tough opponents on a crucial road trip if they are to improve in the standings. Leader Illinois (7-0), and second place Purdue (6-1) host Ohio State (6-1) and Indiana (5-2) with the opportunity for some shake-ups in the upper echelon. Meanwhile the fifth place Gophers travel to Iowa (3-4) and Northwestern (3-4) who are tied for sixth place.

"We have a legitimate shot at the top three places, but all of our remaining matches are critical," says Minnesota Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "Illinois and Purdue are in the drivers seat and the rest of us are chasing them."

ON THE GOPHERS -- Minnesota has won their last two Big Ten matches over Indiana and Wisconsin by winning the last three games after losing the first two. "I think we are making some progress, but we need to maintain a little bit better control of the match," says Schleuder. "Our blocking, hitting and defense are coming along, but our offense depends on our setting and it has to be more consistent than it has been."

IT'S BEEN TWO YEARS -- Minnesota has not defeated either Northwestern or Iowa since 1982. In 1984 the Gophers lost to both teams in three straight at home and on the road, and in 1983 Minnesota lost to Northwestern 3-1 at home and away and to Iowa 3-1 at home and 2-3 in Iowa City. In 1982 Minnesota defeated Iowa 3-1 at home and three straight away, but while defeating the Wildcat's three straight in Evanston, lost in three straight at home.

SERIES -- Northwestern leads 6-5, Minnesota leads Iowa 19-6.

THE WILDCAT'S -- Two-time Big Ten champion Northwestern is hoping to get back into the Big Ten race after graduating four key starters. The Wildcat's have been beaten by Iowa, Purdue, Illinois and Ohio State this year, but last year were 12-1 in the conference and 27-10 overall. Senior Jackie Nunez has been setting with 442 assists but freshman Andrea Proos has also been utilized. Leading hitters are sophomore Kathy Burns with 131 kills (.166 pct.), and two freshmen -- Janine Makar with 205 kills (.277) and Jill Wagner with 184 kills (.151) pct.

THE HAWKEYES -- Iowa placed second in the West Division of the Big Ten last year with an 8-5 record and 25-16 overall mark, and started the year off with a bang this year, defeating Northwestern at home 3-1 in the first conference match. Since then Iowa has lost to Illinois, Purdue, Ohio State and Indiana, while defeating Michigan and Michigan State. Senior Linda Gensing leads the Hawkeyes with 213 kills (.244 pct.) while junior Lana Kuiper has 146 kills (.229 pct.). Setter Kathy Griesheim has 503 assists for an 8.5 average.

VOLLEYBALL SETS ATTENDANCE MARK -- Minnesota drew a record crowd of 1,080 for the North Dakota State volleyball match at Williams Arena Oct. 17...the previous best crowd was 954 vs. Iowa State Sept. 26, 1983...the Gophers top attendance at a Big Ten match is 917 vs. Ohio State on Nov. 10, 1984.

GOPHER NOTES -- Freshman Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) led the Gophers in both matches with 23 kills against Wisconsin and 12 against North Dakota State. Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) had 19 kills and two block solos and five block assists vs. the Badgers, and seven kills against NDSU. Coach Schleuder says that sophomore Rochelle Goetz (WACONIA, MN) has continued to play well, keeping a starting spot at outside hitter. Goetz posted five block assists and ten kills vs. Wisconsin.

Statistical leaders for the Gophers remain Gonzalez with 336 kills for a 4.2 average per game and .289 overall pct., and Miller with 269 kills for a 3.6 per game average and .286 pct. Miller also leads in blocking with 27 solo and 68 assists for a 1.3 per match average.

TENNIS TEAM HOSTS INVITATIONAL WITH INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR -- This weekend's Minnesota Invitational will have an international flavor courtesy of three Swedish players, one West German, and one Canadian. Texas Tech, Northeast Louisiana, Wisconsin, and Minnesota will compete in the round-robin tournament Friday-Sunday, Oct. 25-27. Minnesota will meet Texas Tech on Friday at 6 p.m., Northeast Louisiana on Saturday at 6 p.m., and Wisconsin on Sunday at 9 a.m. Friday's and Saturday's matches will be played at the Burnsville Racquet Club, while Sunday's will be played at the 98th Street Racquet and Swim Club.

The international players include two Gophers: freshman Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) and sophomore Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden). The other Swedish player is Northeast Louisiana's Lillemore Hedberg, their number one singles player. Texas Tech brings the remaining international players: freshman Petra Pennekamp from Vreben, West Germany, and sophomore Nicole Barrett from Calgary, Alberta. The most interesting match of the tournament could be the number one singles match at the Minnesota-Northeast Louisiana meet: Minnesota's Hallgren against Hedberg, or one Swede playing another in an American university's tennis tournament.

COACH'S COMMENTS -- Minnesota coach Jack Roach is approaching the tournament cautiously. "We're playing some good teams, but I think we'll be competitive. We'll need to play well to win," he said. The Gophers had an opportunity to see Texas Tech play at the Nebraska Invitational two weeks ago as well as last season, and Roach says that their team is "much better than last year." In addition, Texas Tech is a member of the Southwest Conference, which Roach says is the strongest tennis conference in the country.

The Gophers lost to Wisconsin last year during the regular season 7-2, and 6-3 and at the third-place match at the Big Ten Conference championships 9-0. Roach says that they have the same team back this year. "They're a good team, famous for their doubles teams," Roach says. The Badgers are returning three All-Big Ten players, and their coach, Kelly Ferguson was last year's Big Ten Coach of the Year. Minnesota has never played Northeast Louisiana in a dual meet, but they did see them play at last year's Milwaukee Classic. The Gophers have seen all of the teams play at some time or another, and Roach says that might help "a little. But they know us too."

GOPHER LINEUPS -- Roach may change the lineup during the tournament if one person plays better, especially at the number five and six singles spots. Freshman Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) will rejoin the team and play at number four singles, which Roach says will be an advantage. "The four to six singles players will play lower than they did at Nebraska, and that should keep it competitive," he said. Another possible change may occur at number one doubles. Roach says that Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN) and Gorde may play number one, with Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) and Eneberg switching to number two. Hallgren and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) will play number three.

The tentative singles lineup has Hallgren at number one, Rost at two, Eneberg at three, Gorde at four, Bjerken at five, and Jones at six.

The meets this weekend are the last Gopher home meets of the fall season. Minnesota's current dual meet record is 3-0.

GOLFERS TO NORTH CAROLINA IN 14-TEAM LADY TAR HEEL INVITATIONAL

Minnesota's womens golf team heads into their fifth tournament of the season this weekend after two weeks off the competition trail. The Gophers are one of 14 teams competing in the Lady Tar Heel Invitational, hosted by the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. "We are planning to finish much higher at the Lady Tar Heel this year than we did last year," says head coach Anne Zahn. The Gophers, who were 10th of 14 teams at last year's Lady Tar Heel, haven't placed lower than fifth in a tournament this season.

The Gopher's traveling team to North Carolina will be determined by qualifying rounds held this week. "The same five players who go this weekend will also travel to our last tourney of the fall, the Stanford Invitational," says Zahn.

HUGHES A STANDOUT AT BEACON WOODS -- Freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MINN.) led the Gophers in scoring to finish second at the Beacon Woods Invitational at Bayonet Point, Fla. She shot the lowest three rounds of golf in her college career with a 73-72-77=222. Hughes' second round 72 was also the lowest individual round of the tourney. Also competing from Minnesota were juniors Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MINN.) (75-77-79=231 and Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MINN.) (80-74-80=249), and sophomores Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MINN.) (82-75-82=239) and Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MINN.) (83-83-83=249).

Minnesota shot 310-298-318=926 to finish fourth of seven teams, with Miami (303-300-301=904), University of South Florida (300-302-313=915) and North Carolina State (308-302-312=922) leading the field. The Gopher's second round 298 ties the all-time best team score at Minnesota for an 18-hole team score. Minnesota also shot a 298 this year the Gopher Fall Invitational.

CROSS COUNTRY TRAVELS TO SOUTH DAKOTA ST. INVITAIONAL -- The Gopher Cross Country team will be traveling to Brookings, S.D. this weekend after a fantastic finish by the B-team at the LaCrosse Invitational, in which they placed 7th. "I think what stands out is that we really ran well," said assistant coach Vanessa Seljeskog. "Everybody ran a PR (personal record), they all got their personal best of the year. With 15 teams and over 150 runners, that was real nice." Teams competing at this weekend's invitational will include Nebraska, Nebraska-Omaha, South Dakota, South Dakota State, and Augustana.

EILEEN DONAGHY LEADS GOPHERS -- Freshman Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN) led the Gophers with her 15th place finish (18:33) this past weekend at the LaCrosse Invitational. "Eileen Donaghy ran a real strong race," said assistant coach Seljeskog, "She ran more than a minute faster than last week." Other Gophers running well included Kathy Scharnhorst (WAUSAU, WI) who also ran her personal best (19:39) this past weekend.

BIG TEN AHEAD -- The Gopher Cross Country team will have two more weeks to prepare for the Big Ten Championships which will be held in Ann Arbor, MI on November 2. The University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse (coach Gary Wilson's former team) finally beat Minnesota (although the B team) at last weekend's meet. This was the third time the two teams had met this year with MINNESOTA having beaten them on the two previous meetings.

Vickie Swanson Played from 1977-78 after transferring from Northwestern College in Minneapolis. A pitcher, Swanson posted the best career win-loss pct. with a 34-8 record (.809). She is second in ERA at .91, and third in strikeouts at 172. Originally a shortstop, Swanson batted .357, second on the all-time list, and is third in slugging pct. at .459. Served as head softball and basketball coach at Northwestern College and assistant softball coach at Augsburg College. Pitched one year for the St. Louis Hummers of the Women's Professional softball league, and played with Bloomington Shimers. A native of Jamestown, ND, Swanson now resides in Chatsworth, Calif.

Mary Owen Played from 1976-79 at second base, shortstop and third base. Owen is second in career slugging pct. at .460 and fourth in batting average .323. Played for New York Golden Apples of Women's Professional softball league in 1979, and was a first team ASA All-American in 1981 with Bloomington Shimers. Originally from Minnetonka, Minn., Owen will graduate from the U of M dental school in 1986. She has coached at Eisenhower High School in Hopkins and the College of St. Thomas prior to entering dental school.

Judy Knight -- Played 1978-81 at shortstop. Known for her defense, holds all-time defensive assist record, and is fourth in career hits with 141. Knight was invited to 1979 Pan American tryouts and has played for the Anoka Spooks women's major slow-pitch team for the past ten years. VOLLEYBALL SWEEPS ROAD TRIP, THIRD IN BIG TEN, HOSTS MICHIGAN/MICHIGAN STATE

The Gopher women's volleyball team swept Northwestern and Iowa on a road trip last weekend, climbing into a third place tie in the Big Ten with Ohio State at the halfway point in the double round-robin schedule. The Gophers (16-7, 6-3) broke a two year losing streak to both Iowa and Northwestern who they had not defeated since the 1982 season. In addition, Minnesota has now posted five straight wins, including four in the Big Ten -- all five game matches.

The Gophers have been pulling out the close matches...three of the four Big Ten wins Minnesota has lost the first two games and won the next three. "We've taken one step, we are now able to perform well in critical situations," says Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "The next step is not to put ourselves in as many of those situations. We need to take charge earlier in the match."

THE BIG TEN -- Illinois remains in first place at 9-0, followed by Purdue at 8-1...Ohio State is tied with Minnesota at 6-3 followed by Indiana at 5-4. The Gophers have a tough schedule remaining -- they play Indiana and Ohio State on the road Nov. 8 and 9, and the final weekend of the schedule at Illinois and Purdue Nov. 29 and 30...in between Minnesota hosts Michigan, Michigan State, Wisconsin, Iowa and Northwestern.

SCHLEUDER SAYS: "I think we are maturing as a team and if we can continue to make progress we can stay in the thick of things down to the end. We don't have an advantage with the schedule, but we did win this last weekend on the road and you have to win on the road. We are certainly not going to take Michigan or Michigan State lightly this weekend, even though on paper we might be rated as the favorite."

MICHIGAN NOTES -- The Wolverines are 2-7 in the conference with wins over Wisconsin and Michigan State, but are coming off a big win against Kentucky, 3-1 on the road last weekend (overall 11-13). Senior setter Andrea Williams leads the team with 210 kills (.270 pct.), while sophomore Lisa Vahi has 158 kills. Freshman Marie-Ann Davidson has also been setting with 165 assists to Williams 215.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads 11-0; this year Minnesota won 15-4, 15-4, 15-9 at Ann Arbor.

MICHIGAN STATE NOTES -- The Spartans are 0-9 in the conference and 5-15 overall, but took the Gophers to five games at Lansing earlier this year, and have lost several close matches. Junior middle hitter Shantelle Schmidt leads State with 194 kills (.240 pct.) while junior Kris Durst has 118 kills (.177). Freshman Judy Doles has been the primary setter with 589 assists for an 8.4 game average.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads 7-3; this year Minnesota won 15-8, 11-15, 15-4, 5-15, 15-11.

GOPHERS RACK-UP CAREER BESTS -- Minnesota set a new team record of most block assists in a match with 31 vs. Northwestern and individual players accumulated six career bests. Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) tied her career high of nine block assists vs. Northwestern (she also had four block solos) and then tied her career high against Iowa with 22 kills. Miller also had 22 kills vs. Toledo and Illinois this year. Miller also tied her career high with 15 digs against Iowa, hit .333 vs. the Hawkeyes, and had 16 kills vs. Northwestern Friday.

Andrea Gonzalez of Buenos Aires, Argentina had an excellent weekend -- Gonzalez had the second most kills on the year with 26 vs. Northwestern hitting .274 in the match, and had a career best of four block solos and five block assists. On Saturday, Gonzalez had 22 kills at Iowa hitting .260.

Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN) passed well in crucial situations in the Northwestern match and had a career best and game high of 21 digs. Hiner also had 14 digs Saturday at Iowa. Junior Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) had the second most assists of her career with 51 at Iowa, and also had 14 digs in the match. On Friday, Collings had a career high of 18 digs vs. Northwestern and also had four block assists and 42 assists.

Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had 10 kills and 21 digs at Northwestern and at Iowa had nine kills and 14 digs. Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) had six kills and six block assists vs. Northwestern and seven kills and two block assists at Iowa.

SCHLEUDER ON THE GOPHERS -- "Both Andrea (Gonzalez) and Pam (Miller) played well. Pam was at the net blocking when we were winning against Northwestern and both players come through when they had to. Andrea's serving has improved tremendously and if she gets a good set, I'd put my money on a kill. Beth (Hiner) did an excellent job on defense and blocked effectively."

CROSS COUNTRY COUNTS DOWN FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS -- The Gopher cross country team will be traveling to Ann Arbor, MI for the Big Ten Championships Saturday after a spectacular team effort at the South Dakota State Invitational in which they placed second. "They really pulled together," said coach Gary Wilson, "Our goal was to have 30 seconds between our 2nd and 3rd place runners. We had 40 seconds between our 2nd and 5th place runners. It was our best team performance of the year."

GOPHERS SHOOTING FOR TOP FIVE AT BIG TEN'S -- "We'll be shooting for the top half of the conference," are coach Wilson's words about this week's upcoming Big Ten Championships. "Our goal is to be fourth but if we can be in the top five we would be really happy. It's going to be a real dog fight for second through tenth place," said Wilson.

Wisconsin has won the Big Ten title the past two years and is the defending NCAA National Champion. Although the Badger's lost Cathy Branta to graduation, their top two runners are Stephanie Herbst, a sophomore, whose best time is 16:32 in 5,000 meters and Katie Ishmael, who was second to Branta at the Big Ten meet last year and has clocked a 16:36 this season.

Wisconsin is rated first in the nation by the NCAA, while Northwestern is ranked fourth, Illinois fifteenth, and host Michigan, while not ranked, received votes. The Gophers Jody Eder finished fourth at the Big Ten meet last year.

JODY EDER AND EILEEN DONAGHY: FULL OF SURPRISES -- Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) led the Gopher pack at last weekends South Dakota State Invitational with her first place finish (17:22). Eder's time is now the 14th overall fastest time on the Minnesota Cross Country 20 Fastest Times (1977-1985). "Jody Eder really ran tough today," said coach Wilson.

Another surprise included Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN) who finished in fourth place (18:22). "Eileen Donaghy continually surprises me," said coach Wilson. "She has been dropping 20 to 30 seconds each meet. She is doing a fantastic job."

GOLFERS FACE 18 TEAMS THIS WEEKEND AT STANFORD

The Gopher women's golf team heads into the final tournament of their fall season this weekend as they compete in the Stanford-Burger King Intercollegiate Tournament at Stanford University. The 54 hole medal play contest will field 18 teams which include Arizona, Ohio State, Southern Methodist and Texas A&M.

Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MINN.) and Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MINN.) are the only Minnesota team members who competed last year at Stanford, and both are expected to compete there again this weekend. Other Gophers who are slated to make the trip are Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MINN.), Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MINN.) and Robin Wright (ROSEVILLE, MINN.).

HUGHES LEADS GOPHERS AT LADY TAR HEEL INVITATIONAL -- Freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MINN.) led the Gophers in scoring for the second week in a row to finish in a three-way tie for fifth at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational. She posted a 74-76-76=226, six strokes behind medalist Michelle Michanowicz of Miami-Florida. Hughes has finished in the top five in four of the five tourneys of her collegiate career.

Tied at 8th was Mary Kuhlman (76-79-72=227), while teammates Julie Hennessy shot a 74-82-82=238 and Dee Forsberg carded a (81-81-80=242). Robin Wright competed through the 15th hole of the third round, but had to withdraw from the match due to uncontrolled bleeding from her nose. She had shot 77-77=154 in her first two rounds of the Lady Tar Heel.

Minnesota finished in sixth place at the University of North Carolina sponsored tournament, scoring 301-313-310=924. First went to North Carolina (302-303-298=903), Kentucky was second (302-298-308=908), Miami (294-305-310=909) was third, with Florida International (309-301-306=916) fourth and South Carolina (307-311-302=920) fifth.

TENNIS 2-1 AT MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL -- Two out of three isn't bad, especially when the competition is from Texas Tech, Northeast Louisiana, and the University of Wisconsin. The Gopher tennis team, in play at the Minnesota Invitational last weekend, defeated Northeast Louisiana 6-3 on Friday, lost to Wisconsin 5-4 on Saturday, and defeated Texas Tech 5-4 on Sunday. "It's good to win two, and to only lose one by 5-4," says coach Jack Roach. "We played well all weekend."

Minnesota's record is now 5-1, 1-1 in the Big Ten. Dual meet competition for the fall season is finished, and the team's next competition will be in two weeks at the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association (ITCA) qualifying meet November 15-17.

ROST WINS THREE SINGLES MATCHES -- Roach was particularly pleased with the play of senior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD). She was the only Gopher to win all three of her singles matches over the weekend. "Nancy had some tough matches. She also showed a lot of team leadership," said Roach.

DOUBLES TEAM AVENGES EARLIER LOSS -- The number three doubles team of Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) met the doubles team from Texas Tech that defeated them in the finals of the Nebraska Invitational. This time, though, the results were different. Hallgren and Jones were the victors over Texas Tech's Lisa Roberts and Paula Brigance, 7-6 (7-2) 5-7, 7-5. This win gave Minnesota the win over Texas Tech, because the team score was tied 4-4 while that match was in progress. "It was a good win," said Roach. "Anna and Darcy were also top doubles players of the weekend."

(VOLLEYBALL WINS SEVEN STRAIGHT MATCHES, FACES TOUGH ROAD WEEKEND) --

The Minnesota women's volleyball team swept Michigan and Michigan State at home in three game matches last weekend, and will put their seven-match winning streak and conference title hopes on the line this weekend as they head to Indiana and Ohio State. The following Tuesday, Nov. 12, the Gophers will host travel partner Wisconsin at Williams Arena.

The Hoosiers and Buckeyes are both 6-4 in the Big Ten, tied for fourth behind Minnesota (8-3). Illinois suffered their first loss of the season at Northwestern last weekend, tying them at 10-1 with Purdue, however the Illini will face the Boilermakers in W. Lafayette on Tuesday, Nov. 5 for a first-place showdown.

"I have to feel good about our chances against Ohio State and Indiana," says Minnesota Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "We've gained a lot of confidence and are ready to meet formidable challenges -- these will be very tough matches and obviously it is harder to win on the road. I still believe the conference race is up for grabs."

THE BUCKEYES -- Ohio State is 20-9 overall prior to playing at Ball State on Nov. 5. The Buckeyes have won the last four meetings between the two teams and swept the Gophers 15-6, 15-13, 15-9 at Williams Arena earlier this year. Ohio State leads the series 7-6, and Minnesota's last win was in Columbus, Sept. 23, 1982, 3-1. Senior Lisa Bettio leads the Buckeyes with a .264 kills pct. and 409 kills while Kristi Newman has 348 kills (.291 pct.) and Victorea Wright has 282 kills (.182 pct.). Junior Marlene O'Brien has 793 assists for a .575 setting pct.

THE HOOSIERS -- Indiana is 14-12 overall with the Gophers as the next opponent. Minnesota came back from a 2-0 deficit to defeat the Hoosiers in five games at Williams Arena earlier this year -- that win was the first of the current seven-match winning streak. Minnesota leads the series 7-3. Setter Karen Dunham, the Big Ten's freshman of the year last season, leads the Hoosiers with 395 assists in the Big Ten and has 64 kills. Hitters Dee Dee Olmstead (121 kills, .275 pct.) and Suzanne Scheele (97 kills, .210 pct.) are leading Indiana in the Big Ten season. The Hoosiers have had two big wins over Ohio State, at home and on the road.

BADGER BRIEFS -- Wisconsin is 2-9 in the conference with two wins over Michigan State and 6-17 overall prior to playing at Ohio State and Indiana this weekend. Minnesota leads the series 12-5 and has won the last four meetings including a come-from-behind 3-2 match on the road earlier this year. Leading hitters for the Badgers are Kristen Roman with 252 kills (.161 pct.) and Julie Fautsch with 200 kills (.205 pct.) overall on the year. The Badger's setter, Sue Gilmeister, has 824 assists for a 9.7 per game average, and 88 kills with a .294 pct.

GOPHER NOTES -- "I thought we did a good job last weekend, we were much more consistent and able to win in three games," says Coach Schleuder. "I was delighted that everybody got to play in both matches and our depth is much improved."

Junior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had a career high and Minnesota season match high kill percentage of .647 vs. Michigan State with 11 kills, 0 errors in 17 attempts. Daline also had seven digs and two block assists in that match and Friday night hit .385 with six kills. On the season, Daline is hitting .219 with 193 kills.

Freshman Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) had 11 kills Friday with five blocks and Saturday, led Minnesota with 16 kills and tied her career best with six block assists (seven total). On the year, Gonzalez has 388 kills for a 4.3 per game average, is hitting .294, and averaging 1.0 blocks per game.

Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) led Minnesota with 15 kills Friday and added eleven Saturday with seven blocks. Miller has been leading the Big Ten with a 1.7 per game blocking average and overall has 314 kills and is hitting .279. Sophomore Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL) is the Gophers fourth hitting leader in kills with 140 on the year for a 1.7 per game average.

In setting, sophomore Missy Larson (GLEN ELLYN, IL) had 15 assists vs. Michigan State with a .500 pct. and junior Jennie Collings had 19 assists vs. Michigan State with a .475 pct. Collings also had 29 assists vs. Michigan with a .403 pct. on Friday night. In the Big Ten Collings is averaging 7.6 assists per game and Larson 2.7 assists per game.

SWIMMING INTRA-SQUAD ONE OF TOP FOUR MEETS OF SEASON

The women's and men's swimming and diving teams are holding a co-ed intra-squad meet this Saturday at the Cooke Hall Pool at 2p.m. "Each team (men's and women's) will be divided equally by talent into two teams," says Jean Freeman, Minnesota women's head coach. "We're swimming this like a regular season dual meet, and it will be one our four toughest meets of the year."

SWIMMERS IN BEST EVENTS -- "This is not a meet to try people in new events..." says Freeman, "...the swimmers will be competing in their strongest strokes." During the past few intra-squads, the final outcome came down to last race, a relay event. Freeman expects this meet will be "as exciting and close as one would see against teams like Nebraska, Wisconsin and Ohio State."

GOLFERS END FALL SEASON AT STANFORD WITH SEVENTH PLACE FINISH

Minnesota's womens golf team wrapped up their six tournament fall season at the Stanford - Burger King Intercollegiate, at Palo Alto, Cal., finishing seventh of 18 teams. The Gopher's carded a 310-311-305=926 during the three-day, 54-hole tourney.

Ahead of Minnesota was first place Stanford (295-306-288=889), with San Jose State in second (306-300-294=904), Tulsa third (303-299-302=904), Indiana fourth (302-308-296=906), UCLA fifth (300-306-310) and USC sixth (303-307-308=918).

HUGHES TOP GOPHER THREE TOURNEYS IN-A-ROW-- Freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MINN.) set the pace for the Gophers as she finished the Stanford tournament in 8th place with a 75-76-74=225. This is the third tourney in-a-row that she has been the top Minnesota scorer. Juniors Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MINN.) and Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MINN.) finished one stroke apart with Hennessy carding 78-78-75=231 and Forsberg a 75-78-79=232. Sophomore Mary Kuhlman (MONTEVIDEO, MINN.) shot 87-79-77=243 and senior Robin Wright (ROSEVILLE, MINN.) scored 82-85-88=255.

COACH'S COMMENTS -- "I was pleased with the way we played the difficult Stanford University course," say Minnesota coach Anne Zahn. "Only one of the 12 team scores (for Minnesota) was in the 80's, with the rest in the 70's, which contributes to a good finish for us in a very tough field." Last year at Stanford, Minnesota shot a 330-327-326=983 for 13th among 21 teams.

EDER LEADS GOPHER HARRIERS AT BIG TEN MEET --

University of Minnesota senior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) placed 4th for the second year in a row at the Big Ten Championship cross country meet last weekend at Ann Arbor earning all-Big Ten honors. Head Coach Gary Wilson called Eder's finish "one of her best races ever." Eder clocked in at 18:01 behind three Wisconsin harriers including individual winner Stephanie Herbst (17:20).

Despite Eder's phenomenal performance, the Gopher cross country team placed a disappointing 9th with 199 points. Wisconsin won their third straight Big Ten title with 22 points, followed by Northwestern (83); Illinois, Indiana and Michigan (120); Iowa (141); Michigan State (183); Purdue (188); the Gophers (199) and Ohio State (224). After Eder, the next Minnesota finisher was Eileen Donaghy who was 36th with a 19:22 time.

NCAA DISTRICT IV MEET NOVEMBER 16 -- The NCAA District 4 cross country meet will be held in Bloomington, Ind. on Saturday Nov. 16. The top two teams at the District meet will qualify to attend the NCAA nationals as will the top four individual runners. Gopher Head Coach Gary Wilson says, "We want to have a good, solid respectable race." The Gophers hope to place in the top half of the meet.

The Gophers lead the series 16-3.

GONZALEZ LEADS GOPHERS -- Freshman Andrea Gonzalez led Minnesota in both weekend matches. Against Indiana, she had 18 kills, five blocks and six service aces, and against Ohio State, she added 20 kills, and five blocks. Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) had 13 kills and seven blocks vs. the Hoosiers, and 15 kills and eight blocks against Ohio State. Junior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had 10 kills at Indiana and seven kills at Ohio State.

GOPHER HARRIERS GO ON TO DISTRICT IV CHAMPIONSHIPS -- This Saturday the Minnesota Gopher cross country team will compete in the District IV Championships at Bloomington Indiana. Head Coach Gary Wilson says he hopes that the Gophers will place in the top half of the 20 teams vying for a spot at the NCAA Nationals, Nov. 26 at Milwaukee WI. Only the top 2 teams and top 3 individuals from the District IV championships will get a trip to the NCAA Nationals. While coach Wilson doesn't expect the Gopher team to upset Wisconsin and Illinois, who placed 1st and 2nd at the Big Ten Championships, and are favorites at the District IV meet, he does expect a strong race from Minnesota. Last year the Gophers finished a respectable seventh among the best teams in the upper Midwest at the District IV meet. The following runners will be competing on the Gopher roster for this year's District IV Championships: Patty Burns, Eileen Donaghy, Jody Eder, Kim Mitzel, Eileen Schaller, Sue Schroeder, and Patti Walsh.

JODY EDER HAS CHANCE AT NCAA BERTH -- Following her fourth place finish at the Big Ten Championships, November 2nd, Jody Eder has a shot at qualifying for the NCAA Championships to be held November 26 at Bloomington Indiana. "Eder has an excellent chance," says coach Wilson. "She is rested and healthy." To qualify, Eder must place among the top three individuals. Last season Eder won a berth to the NCAA Nationals for the second year in a row and went on to place 14th at the NCAA meet, earning her first All-American honors in cross country.

TENNIS TEAM COMPLETES FALL SEASON AT ITCA -- The Gopher tennis team completes fall season play this weekend at the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches' Association (ITCA) regional qualifying meet at Madison, Wis. Coach Jack Roach will send six singles players and three doubles teams to the tourney, which he says is "a compliment to our program. Only three or four schools get six players in, the rest get four." Representing Minnesota at the tournament will be seniors Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) and Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN); junior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA); sophomore Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden); and freshmen Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) and Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN). The doubles teams of Rost/Eneberg, Bjerken/Gorde, and Hallgren/Jones will also compete. ITCA is an open tournament, with 64 singles players and 32 doubles teams competing in the single-elimination, no consolation competition. The two finalists in singles and doubles will advance to national competition in February.

COACHES COMMENTS -- "I'd like to see Anna (Hallgren) make it to the finals," says Roach. The top four seedings for singles and doubles will be announced later in the week, and Roach is hoping that Hallgren will be one of the seeded players. Her current singles record is 12-5 overall, 8-4 at number one. Roach also says that the competition will be "extremely difficult." Perennial Big Ten tennis powerhouses Indiana and Northwestern will be competing, along with other Division I, II, and III schools from the Midwest.

A LOOK AT THE TEAMS -- MINNESOTA vs. Western Michigan (first meeting)
(Season Opener for both teams)

THE GOPHERS -- 1984-85 Record: 18-10 overall, 13-5 in Big Ten, third place. Minnesota returns four starters and will be looking for more balanced scoring this year to make-up for the loss of all-time scoring leader Laura Coenen. She contributed 25.3 ppg and 12.2 rebounds last season - both team leading. Coach Ellen Mosher Hanson will be looking to start senior 6-0 forward Carol Peterka (ST CLOUD/APOLLO) and 6-3 forward/center Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON). Peterka averaged 14.5 ppg/6.2 rebounds and Tadich averaged 15.6 ppg and 10.7 rebounds. The other returning starter is 5-8 junior guard Lisa Hoelscher who averaged 6.0 ppg last year.

Hanson will look to two other guards who split time starting last year -- junior Cindy Phillips and sophomore Debbie Hilmerson at the other guard slot. At center, she would like to increase the playing time of 6-4 sophomore center Diane Kinney (BURNSVILLE) who averaged 12.6 minutes last year. Hanson also looks to use senior 6-1 forward Gretchen Schad and 6-0 sophomore Susie Piram as forwards this year.

WESTERN MICHIGAN -- 1984-85 Record: 19-10, 14-10 Mid-American, Champions. Western Michigan also returns four starters from a team which finished second in the MAC during the regular season, but then upset Central Michigan in the post-season tourney and advanced to the NCAA first round where they lost to Texas 62-84. The starter lost to graduation was All-MAC forward Vicky Musky who averaged 12.7 ppg and 7.0 rebounds.

Junior 5-6 point guard Tracy Wells is the top returner after being named MVP of the MAC tournament, and was the Broncos leading scorer with 14.6 ppg and 6.2 assists last year. Another two year starter is junior 5-9 guard Shelly Klare who averaged 11.9 ppg last year. Junior 6-0 forward Brenda Goldner started at forward last year and averaged 10.7 ppg and 7.1 rebounds, and was named all-MAC. The center position was split last year between 6-1 Shannon Pickell and 6-2 Kendra McDonald.

THE COACHES -- Ellen Mosher Hanson has an eleven year record of 206-93 and eight year record at Minnesota of 152-82. Jim Hess has a three year Western Michigan and career record of 35-45.

MINNESOTA SERIES: vs. Penn State 0-0, vs. Providence 0-0.

(Season opener for Penn State and Providence)

PENN STATE -- 1984-85 Record: 28-5, 7-1 in Atlantic 10, 1st place.

The Nittany Lion's are ranked 13th in the pre-season AP poll, and won their third straight Atlantic 10 Championship last year, while appearing in the NCAA tournament for the fourth straight year -- they defeated North Carolina 98-79, but lost to Ohio State 81-78. Penn State has eight letterwinners returning, including an experienced backcourt but lost all-time scoring and rebounding leader Kahadeejah Herbert to graduation. She averaged 18 ppg and 8.6 rebounds last year.

Leading the Nittany Lions are returning starting guards 5-3 sophomore Suzie McConnell and 5-9 junior Vanessa Paynter. McConnell was second in the nation in assists last year (9.7 avg.) and averaged 12.6 ppg. Paynter averaged 9.3 ppg. last season and the two combined for 183 steals. At center, Penn State will be looking to utilize 6-4 freshman Pia Edvinsson, a member of the Swedish national basketball team. Junior 6-2 forward Vicki Link started the second half of last year averaging 9.5 ppg and 6.5 rebounds and 5-10 senior Joanie O'Brien who started prior to injuring her knee and has returned from surgery in April, may be the other forward. She averaged 9.3 ppg. last season.

PROVIDENCE -- 1984-85 Record: 14-14, 9-7 Big East, 6th place

The Lady Friars return four of their five starters from last year and have a new coach, Bob Foley, who previously was an assistant at Penn State for the past seven years. Providence has an experienced front-court with leading rebounder 5-11 senior Britt King, who averaged 15.1 ppg and 14.2 rebounds last year. She is joined by junior 6-0 forward Mary Burkner, who led the team with 15.9 ppg last year and also grabbed 7.1 rebounds. Senior Joanie Powers, is an experienced 6-1 forward/center who averaged 10.4 ppg and 5.8 rebounds last year.

Junior 5-6 guard Doris Sable is the only experienced guard returning. She averaged 11.4 ppg and 4.4 assists last year. Three other guards return with limited playing time from last season.

THE COACHES -- Renee Portland has a nine year 203-68 record and five year 116-39 mark at Penn State. Bob Foley is in his first year at Providence and in his first head coaching position after assisting Portland at Penn State for the past seven years.

HOME OPENER VS. SAN DIEGO STATE -- The Gophers home opener will be Wed. November 27 at 7:30 p.m. in Williams Arena against San Diego State. Last year was the first meeting between the two teams, and the Aztecs defeated Minnesota 82-66. San Diego State posted a 21-9 record last year and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament where they lost to Louisiana Tech 64-94 after defeating Nevada-Las Vegas 70-68 in the first round.

The Aztecs have lost three of their top players from last year. Leading scorer Tina Hutchinson (17.0 ppg) will be red-shirted this season, while sophomore guard Penny Toler (14.1 ppg) transferred and 6-4 center Toni Wallace, who averaged 10.6 ppg and 6.1 rebounds, is academically ineligible. The two returning players are 5-11 senior forward/guard Dee Dee Duncan who averaged 12.1 ppg and 6-0 junior forward Shelda Arceneaux, who averaged 9.8 ppg and 9.3 rebounds. Coach Earnest Riggings, who has a two year career and SDS record of 45-15, will be looking to newcomers Jessica Haynes, Brooke Meadows and Hope Ceasar to boost his team.

(EDER WINS SPOT AT NCAA CROSS COUNTRY NATIONALS)--

Placing a strong fourth at the NCAA District IV Cross Country Championships last Saturday, Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) earned a spot at the 1985 NCAA Division I Nationals to be held at Marquette University in Milwaukee, WI Nov. 25. This is the third year that Eder has qualified for the NCAA Nationals. Last year she finished 14th earning her first All-American honors in cross country. According to Head Coach Gary Wilson, Eder hopes to do "better than last year's 14th place finish." She will be competing against a very tough field of individual runners including the Wisconsin harriers, the defending NCAA national champions for the past two years.

GOPHERS FINISH TENTH AT DISTRICT IV CHAMPIONSHIPS --The Gophers placed tenth in a field of 23 teams at the NCAA District IV meet in Bloomington, Ind. last weekend. The top two teams -- Wisconsin with 39 points, followed by Northwestern with 81, qualified for the NCAA Nationals. The Gopher team's 267 points represented a "good, respectable race" according to coach Wilson. "We had hoped to finish in the top half of the race," he said.

GOPHER INDIVIDUALS -- Other runners scoring for the Gophers included freshman Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN) who was 32nd in 19:04; freshman Eileen Shaller (NEENAH, WI) who was 70th in 19:45; junior Sue Schroeder (MEGNON, WI) who was 81st in 19:52 and sophomore Patti Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) who was 99th in 20:15.

TENNIS TEAM FINISHES FALL COMPETITION AT ITCA -- The Minnesota tennis team ended its fall season with competition at the Intercollegiate Tennis Coaches Association (ITCA) regional qualifying meet at Madison, WI. Freshman Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) was seeded second out of 64 players in the Midwest region. She defeated players from Western Michigan, Purdue, and Wisconsin before losing to Northwestern's Lynn Nabors in the quarterfinal round. Hallgren was the lone Gopher to advance beyond the first round. Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden), Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN), Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN), and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) also competed for Minnesota. Senior captain Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) did not compete due to illness. Two doubles teams competed for the Gophers: Bjerken and Gorde were defeated in the first round, and a new team, Eneberg and Jones, advanced to the second round before completing play.

ROACH SAYS -- "The competition was tough. We didn't have a good draw, but we played good," says Minnesota coach Jack Roach. "Anne Gorde played a good match, and Anna (Hallgren) had a couple of good matches." He added that the loss of Rost for the tournament was the loss of a doubles team, but "it was a good time (in the season) for Nancy to be sick." Minnesota completes its fall season with a record of 5-1 overall (1-1 Big Ten). The team now has a break before beginning competition at invitational tournaments in February.

SWIMMERS TO HOST WISCONSIN, MIDWEST RELAYS THIS WEEKEND

The Minnesota women's and men's swimming and diving team is hosting Wisconsin in a dual meet Friday night and the Midwest Relays Saturday afternoon, with both co-ed events being held at the Cooke Hall pool.

Minnesota's women have come out on the short end in their last two meetings with the Badgers, losing by one point last season and by two points the year before. The Gophers are out to avenge those losses, "I think we can win more events than they can, and in a dual meet, that makes the difference," says Minnesota head swimming coach Jean Freeman. "We'll be swimming our best (swimmers in each event) against them...this is one we don't want to fool around with." MIDWEST RELAYS FIRST RELAY MEET FOR MINNESOTA IN YEARS-- Minnesota's participation in the Midwest Relays is the first relay meet for the team in the past three years. The Midwest Relays, a long established men's meet, has been co-ed since last year. Women's teams from Minnesota, Wisconsin, Wisconsin-Eau Claire and North Dakota will be racing. "Our team loves relays," says Freeman, "there's so much variety."

GOPHERS WIN TRIPLE DUAL AT HOME -- The Gophers defeated Hamline and Northern Michigan last Saturday evening in a three-way dual meet at Minnesota's Cooke Hall pool. The Gopher's defeated Hamline 114-13, and Northern Michigan 70-61. Northern Michigan beat Hamline 109-20.

Minnesota won all fourteen events in the Hamline contest, giving the Gopher's a 10-1 win/loss record against the Pipers. The Gopher's extended their series record with Northern Michigan to 3-0 as Minnesota won eight events to the Wildcats seven.

Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) won the both 100 backstroke (1:03.07) and freestyle (:54.40) events in both contests, with freshmen Sanna Harkonen (HYVINKAA, FINLAND) and Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN) adding double wins in both duals. Harkonen won the 200 free (1:59.38) and the 400 I.M. (4:44.86), with Volna picking up victories in the 50 free (:25.13) and the 100 butterfly (1:00.32). VOLLEYBALL TEAM TRAVELS TO FINAL BIG TEN MATCHES -- The Gopher volleyball team will close out the regular season on the road this weekend when they face conference leader Purdue and second-place Illinois. Minnesota closed out its 1985 home season last weekend with a win over Iowa and a loss to Northwestern. Minnesota remains in third place in the Big Ten with an 11-6 record. Ohio State drops to fourth place after losing to Purdue and Illinois; they and fifth place Indiana will travel to Michigan and Michigan State this weekend.

THE BIG TEN -- Purdue remains the conference leader with a record of 15-1 (31-3 overall). Illinois is in second with a 14-2 conference record. The Gophers are in sole possession of third place. For the Gophers to finish in a third-place tie they will have to defeat either Purdue or Illinois as fourth and fifth place teams Ohio State and Indiana are favored in their matches against Michigan and Michigan State. Even if Minnesota loses both matches this weekend, and Ohio State and Indiana win, Minnesota will finish in a tie for fourth place.

SCHLEUDER SAYS -- "We've taken a little bit of excitement out by losing to Northwestern," says head coach Stephanie Schleuder. "We were hoping to be in a position to challenge for second place."

Minnesota defeated Iowa 15-5, 15-0, 15-11 and lost to Northwestern 15-6, 16-11, 15-17, 12-15, 4-15. "Both Andrea (Gonzalez) and Pam (Miller) had a good weekend. Jennie (Collings) had an outstanding night setting (against Iowa," Schleuder says. "Against Iowa we played one of our best matches of the season. Northwestern was a very disappointing loss -- we played well enough to win, but had breakdowns late in the match."

"I'm pleased with how far we've come this year," Schleuder adds. "I think we'll go into our last two matches with a positive attitude and end the season with a good performance."

GONZALEZ BREAKS KILL RECORD -- Freshman middle hitter Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina) broke Minnesota's individual season kill record of 481 against Northwestern on Saturday. Gonzalez, who has been named Big Ten Player of the Week twice, now has 501 kills on the season. The record was set by Deb Bell in 1980. Gonzalez also leads the team in kills per game (4.32), kill percentage (.297), and service aces (33).

GOPHER TEAM LEADERS -- Junior Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) leads the team in blocks with 108 total and a per game average of 1.64, and she is also a leading hitter with 263 total kills and a kill percentage of .243. Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) remains the leading setter with 488 assists and a per game average of 7.75. Junior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) leads the team in digs with 158 and a 2.47 average per game.

A LOOK AT THE ILLINI -- Illinois has a conference record of 14-2 (35-2 overall), good second place in the Big Ten. The Gophers lost to them earlier in the season 6-15, 15-8 15, 15-7, 14-16. Leading players for Illinois are hitters Denise Fracaro and Mary Egge Eggers leads the Big Ten in hitting efficiency with a .355 kill percentage. Fracaro has percentage of .299 and 374 total kills. Disa Johnson is also a conference leader in assists per game with a per game average of 11.1. Eggers is the team leader in service aces, with 40 and a .37 per game average. Fracaro and Eggers are also the team's lead blockers. Illinois leads the series between the teams 9-6.

A LOOK AT THE BOILERMAKERS -- Purdue remains the conference leader with a 15-1 (31-3 overall) record. They defeated the Gophers 7-15, 13-15, 11-15 in September at Williams Arena. The Boilermakers are led by last year's conference MVP Marianne Smith. She leads the team in kills with a .356 kill percentage and 518 total kills, and blocks with 61 solos and 131 assists. Cheryl Flowers is the team's leading setter with a per game average of 10.0 assists. Flowers also leads in service aces with 64 total and a .52 per game average. Purdue leads the series between the schools 18-2.

GYMNASTICS TEAM FACES JAPANESE ALL-STARS -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team will open its 1985-86 season in a joint meet with the Minnesota men's team against the Japanese University All-Stars. The meet will be held on Sunday, Dec. 1, at Williams Arena, beginning at 2 p.m. At last year's meet, the first between the women's teams, the Japanese team defeated Minnesota, 182.25-180.85. Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) won the all-around title with a score of 37.15, tying the school record. Key returners for the Gophers will be Kaiser, Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN), and Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Sask.). Doell finished third in the all-around at the 1984 meet; Dorsey placed seventh. For the Japanese women, two of the seven members, Yayoi Nozawa and Manami Kawamukai, are returners. The Minnesota stop is part of a national tour by the Japanese All-Stars.

SWIMMERS OFF UNTIL NEW YEAR

After three dual meets, one USS Invitational and a relay meet in just eight days, the women's swimming and diving team is taking a break from competition until a Jan. 4, 1986, intra-squad meet at the Cooke Hall pool. The team leaves Dec. 15 for a winter training trip to Orlando, Florida, returning home Christmas Eve day. Minnesota's record is 3-0 for the season.

GOPHERS VICTORIOUS IN BIG TEN OPENER-- The Minnesota women's swimming and diving team got the revenge they wanted over Wisconsin, as the Gophers drowned the Badger's 71-42 in Minnesota's first Big Ten competition of the year last Friday night. The revenge comes after being beaten by Wisconsin in the last two dual meetings of the teams' by a total of three points.

One varsity and two pool records were eclipsed during the meet, in which the Gophers won 10 of the 13 events. Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MINN.) set both the varsity and Cooke Hall pool records in the the 200 yard breaststroke (2:23.31) and she was a member of the team that set the pool record in the 400 medley relay (3:59.40). Medley relay team members included Nancy Swanum (BURNVILLE, MINN.), Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MINN.) and Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MINN.).

"Sue Roell's time in the 200 breaststroke was totally unexpected" says Jean Freeman, head swimming coach, "It's hard to say why she swam so fast...she hasn't been working out as hard (due to a foot injury) this season as she has the last two years, and we weren't counting on her to score points in the event."

OTHER WINNING GOPHERS-- Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MINN.) turned in a pair of victories in the 1000 (10:27.23) and 500 freestyles (5:09.89) with teammate Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MINN.) winning the 50 (:24.10) and 100 (:53.72) freestyle events. Volna won the 200 free (1:53.95), with Elsen taking the 200 butterfly (2:12.31) and Swanum the 200 backstroke (2:14.65). The Minnesota team of Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MINN.), Elsen, Sanna Harkonen (HYVINKAA, FINLAND), and Jeanne Simley (PLYMOUTH, MINN.) won the 400 free relay (3:40.50).

GOPHERS WIN MIDWEST RELAYS-- Minnesota defeated Wisconsin, UW-Eau Claire, and North Dakota at the Midwest Relays on Saturday at the Cooke Hall pool. The final scores were Minnesota 68, Wisconsin 61, UW-Eau Claire 40, North Dakota 0. Roell set two more records during the relays: as Minnesota's lead-off swimmer in the 300 breaststroke relay, she set a varsity record in the 100 breaststroke with a split time of 1:05.88, and a pool record in the 50 breaststroke (31.0) which came in her split time in the 200 medley relay.

The Gophers won eight of the 13 events with the Badgers taking five, including both diving events. Minnesota wins came from the 400 free relay team (3:40.09) of Kelly Gallagher (MINNETONKA, MINN.), Gunard, Elsen, and Volna; the 300 backstroke relay (3:05.08) of Wallner, Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SO. DAK.) and Swanum; the 300 breaststroke relay (3:26.89) of Roell, Cindy Hovet (BELLEVUE, WASH.) and Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MINN.); the 500 crescendo relay (4:46.55) of Gallagher, Harkonen, Wallner and Gunard; the 200 free relay (1:38.32) of Roell, Elsen, Gunard and Wallner.

Minnesota also won the 400 medley relay (4:04.96) with Schirmers, Diane Almstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MINN.), Volna and Gallagher; the 200 medley relay (1:52.98) with Swanum, Roell, Lisa Camillo (DELAVAN, WISC.) and Gunard; and the 100 free relay (7:57.90) with Schirmers, Camillo, Volna and Harkonen.

GOPHER BASKETBALL NOTES -- Junior Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was named to the Dial Classic All-Tournament team. Tadich led Minnesota with 16 points against Kansas State in the championship game and in the opening round had 22 points and 16 rebounds against New Mexico. Last Wednesday against San Diego State, Tadich scored 18 points and grabbed 10 boards. She was also named to the Lady Lion All-Tournament team in the Gophers opening weekend of play.

Sophomore 6-0 forward Susie Piram (ST PAUL) had an excellent week as a reserve. Against San Diego State, she played 22 minutes and grabbed 7 rebounds, and in the opening Dial Classic game against New Mexico she had career bests of 11 points and 10 rebounds in 22 minutes. Against Kansas State, Piram played 15 minutes with four points and seven boards.

Junior guard Gandy Phillips (E. LANSING, MI) had a career best of 12 points coming off the bench and playing 19 minutes against San Diego State. Phillips then started against New Mexico, but was scoreless. Debbie Hilmerson (LITTLE FALLS, MN) started against Kansas State after scoring four points in 11 minutes vs. New Mexico. Against Kansas State she scored five points, and had three steals and two assists.

Senior Carol Paterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) scored 16 points and added seven rebounds against San Diego State last week and during the Dial Classic had 13 points and a game high 13 rebounds against Kansas State. However in the opening round, Paterka scored just four points (2-11 in FG) against New Mexico in 23 minutes -- her fewest points since Dec. 16 of 1984.

Guard Lisa Hoelscher (ELMHURST, IL) continues to start for the Gophers at the other guard slot. Hoelscher was a key to the Gophers victory against New Mexico with 12 points behind 5-9 field goal and 2-2 free throw shooting. Sophomore Deane Kinney (BURNSVILLE) has also been starting at center for the Gophers. She scored nine points and grabbed six rebounds against San Diego State; had eight points vs. Kansas State, and scored seven points and grabbed six boards against New Mexico.

EDER NAMED ALL-AMERICAN AT CROSS COUNTRY NATIONALS

Gopher Harrier Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) was named an All-American in cross country for the second year in a row, finishing 21st in a field of 134 runners at the NCAA Division I Nationals held at Marquette University in Milwaukee WI, Nov. 25. She completed the 5000 meter course in 16:57, besting her performances this year by 25 seconds.

"Jody ran a great race," said head coach Gary Wilson. "Considering the cold, slippery conditions, she ran very well." Temperatures were near 30 degrees during the race and the course was made slippery by days of sub-freezing temperatures. The top team finishers were Wisconsin, followed by Iowa State, North Carolina State, Kentucky, and Texas with a fifth place finish.

The Gopher cross country team finished their season Nov. 16 at the NCAA District IV meet held at Indiana University in Bloomington IN.. There Eder won a spot at the Nationals, finishing fourth with a time of 18:04. The Gopher team finished a disappointing tenth to end their 1985 season.

(VOLLEYBALL TEAM HAS SUCCESSFUL SEASON)

(Minneapolis, Minn.) -- The Minnesota's women's volleyball had an excellent season, finishing with a 22-12 overall record (11-7 Big Ten), good for fourth place in the Big Ten. Ohio State finished ahead of the Gophers in third place, while first-place Purdue and runnerup Illinois advanced to NCAA Mideast regional competition.

GONZALEZ, MILLER NAMED ALL-BIG TEN -- Gopher middle hitters Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina) and Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) were named to the all-Big Ten volleyball teams this week. Gonzalez, a freshman, was named to the conference first team, and Miller was named to the second team. Miller led the conference in blocks with a 1.6 per game average, and Gonzalez led the Minnesota team with 4.3 kills per game and has been ranked among the top twenty hitters in the nation. Purdue's Marianne Smith was named the conference MVP for the second year, and coaches Carol Dewey (Purdue) and Mike Hebert (Illinois) tied for conference coach of the year honors.

In the Big Ten, Gonzalez finished fourth in kill percentage (.291), third in kills per game average (4.25), eighth in blocks per game (68 total, .94 average), and third in service aces (34). Miller won the conference blocking title (118 total, 1.64 average), and finished ninth in hitting efficiency (.249) and fourth in kills per game (3.99).

"I'm delighted for Andrea and Pam. They worked very hard for that (all-conference honor)," says Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder. "Andrea has established herself as a dominant force in the conference in hitting and, statistically, Pam is the best blocker in the conference. They give us the strongest middle attack in the conference."

SCHLEUDER SAYS -- "I'm disappointed that we didn't finish higher in the conference, but I'm very pleased with the season as a whole," says Schleuder. "We made tremendous progress this year and are in a position to be a conference contender."

Looking over the season, Schleuder says that the turning point of the year was Minnesota's come-from-behind, five-game victory over Indiana on October 12. "The Indiana match was a key victory. It gave us confidence and we started to play more intensely as a team," she said. The Indiana victory started an eight-match winning streak that included road victories over Iowa and Northwestern -- the team's first wins over those schools since 1982. "To beat both Iowa and Northwestern on the road was an accomplishment," said Schleuder.

Key losses for the Gophers came late in the season, against Ohio State on the road and Northwestern at home. "Those losses took us out of chance to finish in the top two in the conference," Schleuder said.

NEW GOPHER RECORDS -- After only one season of play, freshman middle hitter Andrea Gonzalez moved into tenth on the Gopher career kill list with 522 kills and set a new Minnesota individual single-season kill record. Gonzalez broke the old record of 481 set by Deb Bell in 1980. She also set new school records of most total attacks in a season (1153), most kills per match (37 against Toledo on Sept. 2) and most total attacks in a match (67 vs. Toledo, Sept. 9). In addition, Gonzalez was the only conference player to be named Big Ten player of the week twice, on October 29 and November 12.

Pam Miller finishes the season third on the career kill list with 1102 (445 this year) and needs just 250 kills next year to break Jill Halsted's school record of 1350. Miller also broke her own block assists record of 122 which she set in 1984 with 124 this year. Junior outside hitter Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTH-WEST) moved into fifth on the career kill list with 243 in 1985 (941 total) and also set a new fewest service errors record of 11 in 491 attempts.

TEAM RECORDS -- Several team records were also set in 1985. The team reset last year's season block assists record of 409 with 448 this year. They also tied the fewest blocking errors record of 79 for the third time and set a new record of fewest reception errors in a season with 236. In addition, a new digs record of 1552 was set.

SEASON LEADERS -- On the season, Gonzalez led the team with 522 kills, a kill average of 4.2 kills per game, a kill percentage of .295, and 58 service aces. Miller had 445 kills, and led the team in blocking with 45 solo blocks, 124 block assists, and a block average of 1.43 per game. Daline had 246 digs to lead the team for the second year. She also had 243 kills and a .208 kill percentage. Junior setter Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) finished the season with 960 assists and a 7.87 per game average, good for ninth in the Big Ten.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 1986 -- The team loses one senior, hitter Beth Hiner (KENYON, MN). "Beth has had a great four years here," says Schleuder. "She's been an outstanding player and role model. I'm sorry to see her leave." Five starters return: juniors Miller, Daline, Collings, freshman Gonzalez, and two players who split front and back row play -- junior Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL), and sophomore Patty Ryan (OAK PARK, IL). "Our nucleus is returning," says Schleuder.

Schleuder says that next season's conference competition will be a "battle all season." Illinois, Purdue, and Ohio State will return most of their teams, and Schleuder predicts that Northwestern and Iowa will again be competitive. "The conference is strong. Outside of California we are one of the strongest volleyball conferences in the country," she says.

GYMNASTS OPEN SEASON AGAINST JAPANESE ALL-STARS -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team opened its 1985-86 season five days later than originally planned, thanks to a snowstorm. The squad had been scheduled to meet the Japanese University All-Stars in a joint exhibition meet with the Minnesota men on Sunday, Dec. 1, but a snowstorm postponed the meet until Friday, Dec. 6. The change didn't bother the Japanese, as they defeated the Minnesota women for the second time 178.9-176.75. The Japanese men were also victorious over the Minnesota men for the sixth time, 279.45-271.9.

LEADING GOPHERS -- Brown set a new career best in the vault with a score of 9.25 and finished second in that event. Kaiser was the Gopher's only winner in an individual event, winning the balance beam with a 9.35 score. Dorsey was the most consistent performer for Minnesota as she finished fifth on the vault, tied for second on the bars, and tied for fourth on the beam.

TEAM RESULTS -- The Gophers won the vault by a score of 44.85-44.20. The All-Stars took the other three events, but the scores were close: bars 44.80-43.75, beam 43.95-43.25, and floor exercise 45.95-44.90.

NEXT ACTION -- The team is off until after Christmas break when they will travel to the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh on Friday, Jan. 10. On Tuesday Jan. 14, the team will meet the University of Wisconsin-Stout at Williams Arena to open the home season.

Hanson sees improvements -- Despite suffering two losses on a tough road week at Drake (71-81) and Missouri (74-93) last week, Gopher Coach Ellen Hanson said there were some positive aspects to the week. "We learned a lot mentally, and we are much closer knit as a team," said Hanson. "If we stay in our game and are ready to play, I think we can play with anybody. We had spurts in both games where we looked really good, but we can't afford mental lapses."

Tadich has outstanding week -- Gopher junior forward Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) led the Gopher againsts both Drake and Missouri with 26 points...she has scored 26 points in the last three games, and has scored over 20 points in seven of the nine contests this year. She also had 16 rebounds against Drake and 13 against Missouri and has been in double figures in rebounding in seven of nine games. Her 28 field goal attempts against Drake was a career best, and she connected on 8-8 in free throws against Missouri.

Week game notes -- Hanson said the Drake game "slipped away" by Drake's 53-43 rebounding edge, which provided second shots, along with the free throw advantage (Drake 17-23, Minnesota 5-12). Drake converted 10-11 charity shots in the last 3:46. Lisa Hoelscher (ELMHURST, IL) connected on 7-11 from the field for 15 points, while Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) had 17 points and 7 rebounds with 8 assists. Diane Kinney (BURNSVILLE) had seven points and 10 boards in that game.

Against Missouri, the Gophers were blown out in the first half 54-29, but outscored Missouri in the second half 45-39. "Missouri outrebounded us 32-16 in the first half and we committed a lot of turnovers. We were not ready to play," said Hanson. Peterka again was the only Gopher besides Tadich in double figures with 16 points.

NOTING THE LADY BUFFS -- Colorado was 5-2 prior to playing at the Marriott-Converse Christmas Classic at Virginia Tech. Already, that represents an improved start over last year's 6-22 record, (2-8 in the Big Eight, 8th place). Colorado has just two returning starters in center LeAnn Banks and guard Bridget Turner, with the other three starters freshmen -- including the teams' leading scorer Tracy Tripp and point guard Bridget Turner.

COACH -- Ceal Barry is in her third year at Colorado with a 16-40 record, and in her sixth year overall with a 99-82 mark, prior to this season.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads the series with the Illini 7-2 and won both games last year, 77-61 in the season opener at Illinois and 74-67 in the season finale at Williams Arena. Minnesota has won the last six games with Illinois. The Gophers are 7-0 against Purdue and defeated the Boilermaker's 69-64 on the road and 97-83 at home last year.

COACHES -- Laura Golden is in her second year at Illinois with a 13-15 record and has an eleven year career mark of 188-93 prior to this season. Dr. Ruth Jones is in her tenth year at Purdue with a 85-150 record and has a 13 year career mark of 141-161 prior to this season. Jones was not made a full-time coach until two years ago, with full-ride scholarships added during the same year.

A LOOK AT THE ILLINI-- Coach Laura Golden is in her second season at the helm at Illinois, and with all of her starters returning the Illini should be competitive in the Big Ten league. The top returner is second team all-Big Ten pick Jonelle Polk. A 6-3 center, Polk led the Illini with 17.9 points and 10.1 rebound averages last year. In the Big Ten, Polk was second to the Gophers Molly Tadich in blocks averaging 1.6, and was fourth in scoring (18.4 ppg) and third in rebounding (10.2 avg.) behind the Gophers Laura Coenen and Tadich. So far this year, Polk has been leading the Illini in scoring and rebounding and was named MVP of the Illini Classic.

Other returning starters for the Illini include 5-10 sophomore forward Angie McClellan who is averaging 14.3 ppg and 7.3 boards through seven games this year. At the other forward slot, the Illini have been utilizing 5-10 senior Stephanie Romic (7.1/5.9). Depth is certainly evident in the front-court with 6-0 senior Chenise Whitehead, 6-0 sophomore Jenny Middeler, 6-4 junior Leslie Hudgins, and 6-3 freshmen Carrie Henderson.

In the back-court three guards return with considerable playing time. Five-eleven senior Liz White has been starting this year along with 5-9 sophomore Lisa Bradley (7.7 ppg). Sophomore Jenny Johnson of Minneapolis/Armstrong started the beginning of the year, and is averaging 7.1 points through the first seven games.

A LOOK AT THE BOILERMAKER'S-- Heading into her tenth year as head coach at Purdue, Dr. Ruth Jones is pleased with her team's depth. Four starters and several part-time starters return from last year's team which moved up from 10th in the conference in 1984 to seventh last year. Purdue features a balanced attack with six player averaging nine or more points per game.

The Boilermaker's back-court features a first team freshman All-American in 5-8 sophomore Sharon Versyp, who led the team with 12.3 ppg and had 85 assists last year. Through seven games this year she was averaging 14.6 points -- leading the team. The other returning sophomore guard is 6-0 Lisa Jahner who set a school record for assists last year (95) while averaging ten points per game. The team's only senior, 5-7 Erin Doelling won Purdue's defensive player award the past two years.

Although not particularly tall, the front-court is experienced. Juniors Kay Sharp and Cathy Tyree, both 5-11 are returning starters. Sharp averaged 12.3 ppg and 6.3 caroms last year while Tyree averaged 10.6 ppg and 8.1 rebounds. Junior Sandy Alston (5-10) has also seen playing time at the forward slot, while 6-4 sophomore Christa LaCroix is averaging nearly ten points this year.

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The Gopher women's basketball team will face a stiff home challenge this Friday night as they host #19-ranked Iowa at 7:30 p.m. at Williams Arena. The game will be broadcast live on KMSP-TV, Channel 9. Although Minnesota leads the series between the two rivals, 11-6, the Hawkeye's have won the last three meetings, breaking a previous eight-straight streak by the Gophers. The two teams' last met at Williams Arena with Iowa winning 66-58.

NOTING THE HAWKEYES -- Iowa would like to win the Big Ten title this year, after finishing second in the league to Ohio State last season with a 14-4 conference mark and 20-8 overall record. With all five starters returning from last year's team and two All-American newcomers, the Hawkeye's will have the depth and balance to make a run for the title. But defense is also a Hawkeye trademark -- Iowa was second in the nation in scoring defense and led the Big Ten in points allowed (54.7 avg.).

Players to Watch -- Center Lisa Becker (6-4) was honorable mention all-Big Ten last year and played on the U.S. National Team. She is supported by second team all-Big Ten pick Lisa Long, who returned to action last weekend after recovering from a knee injury. Long scored 16 points in 12 minutes against Illinois, and led Iowa last year with 13.1 points and 9.5 rebound averages. Lynn Kennedy had 24 points last weekend. Jolynn Schneider has been starting while Long was injured.

At the guards, sophomores Michelle Edwards, who averaged 10.3 ppg as a freshman, starts alongside Pam Williams. Edwards returned from an ankle injury and reserve guard Tricia Blair returned from a stress fracture last weekend. Ten of the 14 Hawkeye's averaged 10.0 minutes or better in last weekend's conference games.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson -- is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 157-89 current mark and in her 12th year overall with a 211-100 record. In eight years in the Big Ten Hanson has a 61-27 mark.

C. Vivian Stringer is in her third season at Iowa with a 45-22 record and is the third winningest coach in NCAA Division I history with a career 13 year record of 296-72. In her two years in the Big Ten she has a 33-14 mark.

GOPHERS SPLIT OPENER -- Minnesota suffered their first loss to Illinois since 1977, 63-82 in the Big Ten opener last Friday. The game was a see-saw battle until the final eight minutes, when Illinois went up on a nine-point spurt. Minnesota then extended their victory streak to eight over the Boilermaker's on Sunday with a 75-66 win. The win over Purdue also snapped a four-game losing streak for the Gophers.

Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) led the Gophers against Illinois with 22 points and a career high 15 rebounds and added another 15 points on Sunday. Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) had a season low of 12 points, with just two first half points, against Illinois, but returned to form with 22 points and 17 boards against Purdue.

BASKETBALL CONTINUED -- Lisa Hoelscher (ELMHURST, IL) had 10 points in both contests, while Diane Kinney had 11 rebounds against Purdue. Junior Cindy Phillips (E. LANSING, MI) had a career high of 17 points against the Boilermaker's, including five points during the Gophers nine-point spurt in the opening minutes of the second half which sealed the victory.

CAREER WATCH -- Molly Tadich has 979 career points, seventh on the Gophers top ten list, and with 735 rebounds, is third in career rebounders. Carol Peterka is fifth in career scoring with 1,228 points.

SCHAD LEAVES TEAM -- Minnesota 6-1 Senior Gretchen Schad of Milbank, S.D. left the basketball team following the December trip for personal reasons. Schad had played in eight of the Gophers nine games, averaging 1.9 points in 10.9 minutes.

GYMNASTS OPEN REGULAR SEASON AT WI-OSHKOSH -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team opens its 1986 regular season competition on Friday, Jan. 10 at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in a dual meet beginning at 5 p.m. According to assistant coach Gabor Deli, the Oshkosh team is strong and could be the NCAA Division II national champion. The first home meet for the team will be on Tuesday, Jan. 14 against the University of Wisconsin-Stout. The dual meet will be held at Williams Arena beginning at 8 p.m.

ALL-AROUNDERS -- For the Gophers, Deli says that senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) and juniors Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN), Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada), and Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) will compete in the all-around. Dorsey, Brown, and Kaiser were the three all-arounders in Minnesota's pre-season exhibition meet against the Japanese University All-Stars. Doell has successfully recovered from an ankle injury that limited her competition to the uneven bars at the Japanese meet. Deli says that the entire team has been looking good in practices over Christmas break. "Everyone is healthy and in good shape," he added.

A LOOK AT THE TITANS -- Wisconsin-Oshkosh is a recognized power in NCAA Division II gymnastics. Their 1986 squad returns one Division II All-American, senior Debbie Lindemer. Lindemer was an All-American in the all-around and the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference all-around champion.

Another top performer has been freshman Mary Leizin. She won the all-around in a triangular meet with the Wisconsin-La Crosse and Wisconsin-White-water. As a team, the Titans are seven-time WWIAC champions and placed third in their NCAA region last year. Minnesota has met Oshkosh once before, in a 1980 dual meet which the Gophers won 125.35-119.20.

(SWIMMERS TO FACE BIG EIGHT CHAMPIONS AT NEBRASKA)

The Minnesota women's swimming and diving team (4-0) will face the University of Nebraska (6-1) this weekend at Nebraska. The Cornhuskers won the Big Eight Championships last season for the first time, defeating an always tough Kansas.

"We will have our work cut-out for us," says Gopher coach Jean Freeman. "On paper, Nebraska's best times this season are faster than our best in every event." Minnesota was second in the Big Ten's and 29th at NCAA's last year.

Freeman isn't implementing any special training techniques for last year's NCCA ninth place Cornhuskers. "We are going to swim our best against them...we've beaten Nebraska the last three years, even though their times (on paper) were better than ours." Last season's meeting at Cooke Hall Pool went down to the last event to determine a winner, with Minnesota winning 62 1/2 - 50 1/2. "It was the most exciting meet of the season for us, and one of the best of my career," says Freeman.

THE SWIMMERS -- Sophomore Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MINN.) holds the Gopher times this season in the 500 (5:09.89), 1000 (10:27.23) and the 1650 (18:08.52) freestyle, while freshman Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MINN.) has the season's fastest in the 100 (:53.54) and the 200 (1:53.95) freestyles. Two Burnsville natives dominate both the backstroke and breaststroke events. Sophomore Nancy Swanum has the best times in the 50 (:29.42), 100 (1:02.17) and 200 (2:14.65) backstrokes, with junior Sue Roell having the best in the 50 (:31.06-pool record), 100 (1:05.88-varsity record) and 200 (2:23.31- pool and varsity record) breaststrokes.

These top Gophers will be facing Nebraska's Emily Ricketts and Dana Powers, who between them, hold eight of Nebraska's best times. Ricketts is the fastest this season in the 100, 200 and 500 freestyles, with Powers in the 50 free, 100 breaststroke, 200 I.M. and the 100 and 200 butterflys. Powers has already qualified for the NCAA Championships in the 50 free, 100 fly, 100 breaststroke and 200 I.M.

DENISE JOHNSON LOSES ELIGIBILITY -- Senior Denise Johnson (BURNSVILLE, MINN.) ended her collegiate swimming career early as she lost her NCAA eligibility because she failed to pass enough credits. Johnson was ineligible to compete this fall, due to her grades last year. She didn't bring them up to NCAA standards this past fall quarter, said Coach Freeman.

As a freshman, Johnson scored 90 points at Big Ten's (then a Gopher record) and was Big Ten Champion in the 200 I.M. and the 400 yard freestyle relay. In her three years of swimming at Minnesota, Johnson scored points a total of 12 times at Big Tens, and qualified for nationals five times.

Johnson holds varsity records in the 100 (1:00.36-1983) and 200 (2:06.15-1983) individual medleys. She also co-holds the varsity record in the 800 free relay (7:31.68-1985).

(BASKETBALL FACES ROAD TRIP TO MICHIGAN/MICHIGAN STATE) --

The Gopher women's basketball team will hope to improve their record (5-8, 1-2) on the road this weekend at Michigan and Michigan State. Gopher Coach Ellen Hanson says, "If we are going to think about staying in the race in the Big Ten, to finish in the top three or four teams, we need two wins this weekend."

Although playing their best game of the year, the Gophers came up short against Iowa last Friday night, 63-66. Minnesota shot .537 in field goal percentage for the game including a blistering .625 in the first half -- their best field goal performance of the year. The Gophers also outrebounded Iowa 42-34, mostly in the first half in taking a 32-21 half-time lead. However, Minnesota was not able to get any closer than three points, after Iowa went ahead 46-45 with 9:53 to play.

"Mentally, we played the best against Iowa that we have all year long," said Minnesota Coach Ellen Hanson. "We committed turnovers, but not the same kind of unforced turnovers, and we took shots within our offense. We also played very well defensively."

TADICH HITS 1,000th POINT IN SEASON HIGH PERFORMANCE -- Gopher 6-2 junior forward Molly Tadich (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) hit a season and game high 27 points against Iowa connecting on 12 of 15 shots from the field and 3-3 from the line to surpass the 1,000 career mark. Tadich is the seventh player in Minnesota history to do so, and now has 1,006 career points. Tadich is also ranked third in career rebounding with 747 caroms. Against the Hawkeyes, Tadich scored 17 second half points, and gathered 12 rebounds. In 10 of 13 games this year, Tadich has had 20 or more points, and has also had 10 or more rebounds in 11 of the 13 contests.

PETERKA IMPROVES IN BIG TEN PLAY -- Six-one senior forward Carol Peterka (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) has come on strong in the first three Big Ten games, averaging 17.0 ppg and 11.3 rebounds. Against Iowa, she scored 14 points and grabbed a game high 13 rebounds while dishing out 7 assists, and in the Big Ten opener, led the Gophers in both points and rebounds (22/15) against Illinois. Peterka is ranked fifth in career scoring with 1,242 points, and should move into third place this season...she is seventh in career rebounding (631).

GUARD PLAY IMPROVES --Coach Hanson knew that her guard court would have to provide more offense to be competitive in the Big Ten, and so far the starting combination of Cindy Phillips (E. LANSING, MI) and Lisa Hoelscher (ELMHURST, IL) have been doing just that. Phillips is the Gophers third leading scorer in Big Ten play, with an 11.0 average -- including nine points against Iowa and a career high of 17 the game before against Purdue. Hoelscher is fourth in scoring in conference play with an 8.7 average and had 10 points in the first two Big Ten games.

WOLVERINE WRAP-UP -- Michigan served notice that they will upset some teams this year, by defeating Indiana 63-59 at home in the Big Ten opener, snapping a 14-game conference losing streak from last year. Since then, they have lost to Ohio State 53-77, and Illinois 61-89, but defeated Purdue on the road 71-68.

Last Year -- Purdue was the only team Michigan beat, and that was at home, in compiling a 1-17 Big Ten mark and 7-21 overall season record.

NOTING THE SPARTANS -- Although 1-3 in the Big Ten prior to hosting Iowa on Friday, the Spartans are an improved team this season, and proved it the opening weekend of Big Ten play by defeating Indiana 76-61 at home and handing coach Karen Langeland her 150th career victory. Michigan State dropped their first conference game to Ohio State 58-72, and then lost two road games last weekend to Purdue 53-70 and Illinois 72-81. **Last Year** -- MSU posted a 11-16 overall mark and 4-14 Big Ten record, placing ninth in the league.

Players to Watch -- Junior forwards **Kris Emerson** (5-10) and **Sue Tucker** (5-11) have been keys to the Spartans play this season. In the Big Ten, Emerson is averaging 16.0 ppg and Tucker 14.3. (SWIMMERS TO HOST NORTHWESTERN SATURDAY AT COOKE HALL)

The Minnesota women's and men's swimming and diving teams will host Northwestern in a co-ed dual meet at 2 p.m. Saturday at the Cooke Hall Exhibition Pool. This will be the second meeting for the women in less than four weeks -- the Gopher's beat the Wildcats 69-35 in a meet Dec. 23, at Orlando, Fla., during the annual winter training trip.

Minnesota has never lost a meet with Northwestern, with the Gopher-Wildcat series record standing a 6-0. The Gopher's have also finished ahead of Northwestern in 12 of the 15 Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships. The Wildcats are 1-5 overall this year and 0-3 in the Big Ten, while Minnesota comes into the meet 4-1 on the year and 2-0 in the Big Ten.

Wallner was also in the 400 medley relay (3:57.59) which tied for first against the Nebraska relay team.

Burnsville junior Sue Roell scored individual firsts in the 100 (1:06.45) and 200 (2:26.45) breaststroke events and was on the 400 medley relay team. Another Gopher first came from sophomore Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) in the 1000 freestyle (10:34.05). Burnsville sophomore Nancy Swanum and senior tri-captain Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) were also on the 400 medley relay team.

GYMNASTS DEFEAT WI-OSHKOSH; HOST WI-STOUT TUESDAY -- The Minnesota gymnastics team opened their 1986 season with a win Friday at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh, 173.20-160.20. The Gophers host Wisconsin-Stout Tuesday, Jan. 14.

Mary Leizian, a WI-Oshkosh freshman, won the all-around with a score of 36.50, as well as winning the uneven bars, balance beam and floor exercise. For the Gophers, junior Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) finished second in the all-around with 35.40 points and won the vault with a score of 9.45. Senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) and junior Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) tied for third with 34.20 points, and junior Candace Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) scored 34.15 points in the all-around.

WAY LOSES ELIGIBILITY -- Freshman Jana Way (SACRAMENTO, CA) will not be eligible for winter quarter competition due to academic problems. "It's not the end for her," says Deli. "Jana is working out with the team and training hard. She has a positive attitude and is willing to work. Hopefully she will be eligible by spring quarter."

He also looks for Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN) to run well in the 800 meter run.

GOPHERS PREPARE FOR SEASON AT INTRASQUAD -- The Gophers began their indoor track and field season with an intrasquad-alumni meet Jan. 18 at the remodeled U of M Fieldhouse. BROWN WINS FIRST COLLEGIATE ALL-AROUND -- Minnesota junior Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) won her first collegiate all-around title with a score of 35.45 points. Brown also won the uneven bars with a score of 9.20 and placed second in the floor exercise with a 9.15 and third on the vault with a 9.10. "Shelly has been putting in a lot of practice time," says Deli. "All of her hard work paid off. It's a great victory for her."

MASTEL SETS NEW CAREER BEST SCORE -- Sophomore Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) also had a good meet. She won the balance beam and placed second on the uneven bars, but her best achievement of the evening was in the floor exercise. Mastel scored a 9.40--a new career high--and won the event. (SWIMMERS TO FACE BIG TEN CHAMPS OHIO STATE AT COLUMBUS)

The Minnesota women's swimming and diving team travels to Columbus, Ohio, to face four-time Big Ten Champion Ohio State on Friday at 3 p.m. EST in a dual meet. Friday evening and Saturday morning the Gophers will compete in the Mike Peppe Classic at Ohio State. "The Ohio State meet is going to be our biggest dual of the year," says Minnesota head swimming coach Jean Freeman, who admits "the Buckeye's have the edge on paper."

The Gophers, finishing second the last two years behind Ohio State at the Big Ten Championships, are 5-1 overall and 3-0 in the Big Ten this season, while the Buckeyes are 0-2 overall and 0-1 in the Big Ten.

THE BUCKEYES -- Ohio State, losing to Cincinnati University in November and Michigan this past weekend at Ann Arbor, spent their Christmas training trip at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo. They were there to participate in a high altitude training experiment under the direction of the U.S. Olympic Committee and United States Swimming.

Michigan defeated Ohio State 83-50, with the Buckeyes winning only four events. Winning two of those events were Big Ten Champions Janette Bosse (400 I.M.) and Gail Armstrong (100 butterfly). Bosse won the 400 I.M. (4:33.85) and Armstrong won the 100 butterfly (:58.93).

THE MIKE PEPPE CLASSIC -- The Gophers will also compete in the Mike Peppe Classic, a two-session meet on Friday night and Saturday morning. The Gophers and Buckeyes are the only collegiate entries among numerous high school and USS teams. Ohio State expects about 100 swimmers to participate in the event.

GOPHERS TAME THE NORTHWESTERN WILDCATS AT COOKE HALL POOL -- For the second time this season, the Gophers have beaten the Wildcats of Northwestern. The first win came during the winter training trip (69-35), with the second one this past weekend at the Cooke Hall Exhibition Pool. Minnesota won seven of the 13 events in their 74-38 victory.

Junior Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) won both the 50 (:24.67) and 100 (:54.28) free events and was on the winning 400 free relay team (3:40.24). Also on the relay team were two swimmers from St. Cloud, Minn., sophomore Jodi Schirmers and freshman Mary Louise Brix, and sophomore Lisa Camillo (DELAVAN, WI).

Senior tri-captain Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) won the 200 I.M. (2:15.78) and was joined by sophomore Diane Almstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) and senior tri-captains Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) and Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) in winning the 400 medley relay (4:04.15). Sophomore Maureen Lewis (GREENBAY, WI) won the 1 meter diving (278.775 points), and her sister, junior Kathleen Lewis won the three-meter diving (274.40 points).

DIVERS ALL QUALIFY FOR NCAA DIVING QUALIFYING MEET -- All three of Minnesota's divers have qualified in both the one and three-meter diving events for the NCAA Diving Qualification meet to be held at Ohio State, March 14-16. Maureen Lewis, Kathleen Lewis and freshman Jennifer Carpenter (GRAND RAPIDS, MN) surpassed the minimum requirements of scoring 240 points or more in a dual meet for one-meter diving or 250 points in three-meter competition.

(BASKETBALL LOOKS FOR A WIN, HOSTING WISCONSIN/NORTHWESTERN)

The Gopher women's basketball team will aiming to improve upon their 1-4 conference mark this weekend as they host Wisconsin Friday at 7:30 p.m. and Northwestern Sunday at 2:00 p.m. The Gophers are off to their worst start in the three years of double round-robin play -- against the same five opponents, Minnesota was 4-1 the past two years and 5-0 in 1982-83.

"We are not playing well enough in every category in every game to win," says Coach Ellen Hanson. "Last Friday (vs. Michigan) it was turnovers, and Sunday (against Michigan State) it was free throw shooting. We are going to concentrate on what we can do in each particular game to make improvements and see if we can get a win."

BADGER BRIEFS -- Wisconsin lost all five starters from last year's team, including guards Faith Johnson (of Minneapolis) and Chris Pruitt. Last year Wisconsin was tied for seventh in the conference with a 6-12 record and 11-17 overall mark. Last weekend, the Badgers lost to Illinois 69-82 and Purdue 57-72 and have also lost to travel partner Northwestern 64-68, to defending conference champion Ohio State 70-82, and to Indiana 46-65.

Key Players -- The top returner is 5-8 senior forward Sheila Driver who started in 14 games last year, while at the other forward slot, 5-11 sophomore Lisa Bonnell has been starting and leads the team with 10.5 ppg and 6.9 rebound averages. Wisconsin is starting two freshman in the backcourt -- 5-7 Karen O'Malley of Madison, Wisc., and 5-5 Verdell Hale of Jamaica, NY. NORTHWESTERN NOTES -- The Wildcat's won ten straight games before starting play in the Big Ten this year, but are now 11-3 overall. A key loss was the graduation of All-American Anucha Browne who led the nation in scoring average last year (30.5) and was the Big Ten MVP. Also lost was guard Stacy Neal. However, three players return with considerable starting time, from last year's fifth place Big Ten team (10-8 conference). Northwestern defeated Illinois last weekend 75-61, breaking a streak of losses to Purdue (72-80), Ohio State (70-82) and Indiana (64-80). The Wildcats opened the season by defeating Wisconsin (68-64). They will play at Iowa this Friday night.

Key Players -- Senior guard Laura Wiesen captains this year's squad and is averaging a team leading 14.4 ppg. Wiesen hit a career high of 32 points earlier this year against league-leader Ohio State. At the other guard slot is 5-7 senior Anne Marie McNamee is playing well and had 24 points in the win over Illinois. Forward Judy Banathy is the third leading scorer on the squad with a 12.8 scoring average, and has hit in double figures eight straight games prior to the weekend.

SERIES RECORDS -- Minnesota leads the series against Wisconsin 11-2 and won both meetings last season. The Badger's have not won a game at Minnesota since 1974-75. Northwestern leads the series with the Gophers 8-4. Minnesota won the last meeting at home last year 82-70, marking their first win over the Wildcats since 1981-82 and breaking a previous five-straight streak by Northwestern.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 157-92 overall record, in her twelfth year overall (211-103) and ninth year in the Big Ten (61-30). Edwina Qualls is in her tenth year at Wisconsin with a career mark of 130-129 and a Big Ten record of 41-64. Don Perrelli is in his second year at Northwestern (27-15) and tenth year overall (202-86). His current Big Ten marks is 12-11.

BASKETBALL WINS TWO, BUT TRAVELS TO OHIO STATE/INDIANA) --

The Gopher women's basketball team picked up two wins over the weekend over Wisconsin, 75-58 and Northwestern 75-70, marking the first time the team has had back-to-back wins since Dec. 7 and 8. Minnesota's record improved to 7-10 overall and 3-4 in the conference, moving up to a tie for sixth place.

However, now the Gophers must close out the first half of the double round-robin schedule on the road, and Minnesota has not won a single road game this season. To make matters tougher, Friday's opponent Ohio State has won 32 straight Big Ten games, including all 21 at home during the two and a half years of double round-robin play, and the Buckeye's are averaging over 2500 fans per contest.

Ohio State is 7-0 in the conference and 13-4 overall, with all four losses to nationally ranked teams by a combined total of 12 points. Friday's game has been moved back to 8 p.m. EST and will be broadcast locally by WTVN-TV, Ch. 6. On Sunday, Minnesota will play at Indiana (11-6, 4-3).

SERIES -- Ohio State leads the series 9-3 and has won the last five meetings. The Gophers have never won at Ohio State, and lost there in the last meeting March 3, 72-85. Minnesota leads the series with Indiana 8-3 and won both meetings last season including the March 1 game 90-77 at Bloomington.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 159-92 overall record, in her twelfth year overall (213-103) and ninth year in the Big Ten (63-30). Nancy Darsch is in her first season as a head coach at Ohio State while Jorja E. Hoehn is in her first season at Indiana, but sixth year overall with a career mark of 120-40.

NOTING THE BUCKEYES -- LAST YEAR -- 18-0 Big Ten, 28-3 overall, mark advanced to the NCAA East Regional Final before losing to eventual national champion Old Dominion 68-72. LOSSES -- Point guard Yvette Angel (14.1 ppg) and forward Carla Chapman (12.9 ppg). THIS YEAR-- Return nine letterwinners...leading the way is 6-0 forward Tracey Hall, the Big Ten's freshman of the year last season. Her counterpart, Francine Lewis, has seen limited action this season due to knee problems, however, Lewis did pump in 18 points and grab 10 rebounds in 27 minutes against Purdue last weekend. GOPHER NOTES -- Deli is not sure who will go all-around in the meets, but she expects that senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) and juniors Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) will compete. Junior Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) may or may not go all-around depending on her thumb injury. "Laurie's been doing all right in practices," says Deli, "but I'm not sure."

"I hope we can do well (this weekend). We want to concentrate and improve on the little things," says Deli. "And we want to score well too." The team has not had a meet for almost two weeks, and Deli says that practices have been going "really, really well. Everyone has been putting in a lot of effort and working hard. They are looking good; they're getting ready for the Big Ten meet."

THE COMPETITION -- The teams Minnesota will be competing against this week are among the best gymnastics teams in the nation. The National Gymnastics Scoring Service, in their pre-season coaches poll, ranked Florida as the number two team behind five-time national champion Utah. Georgia was ranked fifth, Oklahoma thirteenth, and Nebraska was fifteenth.

Florida is currently 2-1, and their top team score is a 183.55. The top all-arounder is Elsie Schlagel with 37.25 points. In 1985, Florida finished third at the NCAA National Championships and first in the Southeast Region.

Georgia is 3-0 with wins over Illinois State, Alabama, and Florida. The team's high score is a 186.25, and the top individual all-around score is returning All-American Terri Eckert's 37.80. Another top all-arounder has been freshman Paula Maheu who won the all-around at the Florida and Illinois State meets. The Bulldogs placed seventh as a team at the NCAA nationals and second in the Southeast Region.

Nebraska also has a 3-0 record. The Cornhusker's top all-arounder has been Jeaneane Smith with a 37.20 score. Last season, Nebraska placed second in the Big Eight Conference and fifth in the NCAA Midwest Region.

Oklahoma is 3-0 with wins over Denver, New Mexico and Iowa State. The Sooners have a young team, featuring Tatiana Figueirido, a member of the Brazilian Olympic team. In 1985, Oklahoma finished tenth in the nation, second in the Midwest region and first in the Big Eight.

West Virginia has participated in three meets and has a 6-2 record. Top all-arounders have been Bev Fry with a 35.55 score and Cathie Price with 35.45 points. Price was an alternate all-arounder at the 1985 NCAA Championships. Also in 1985, the Mountaineers finished fourth in the Southeast Region and second in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

(SWIMMERS HAVE A BREAK IN SCHEDULE; TO FACE IOWA IN TWO WEEKS)

The Minnesota women's swimming and diving team has a two week break in their competition schedule before they face the University of Iowa at Iowa City on Feb. 8.

GOPHERS DO WELL AGAINST OHIO STATE IN DUAL, AND IN PEPPE CLASSIC -- "We're happy with the way we swam at Ohio State, in both our dual meet and in the Mike Peppe Classic on Friday night and Saturday," says head coach Jean Freeman, "even though we didn't win. We set two varsity records in the breaststroke and two Peppe Natatorium relay event records." The Gopher's lost to the four-time Big Ten Champions Ohio State 84-56, in Friday's dual meet. No team scores were kept in the Mike Peppe Classic.

In the dual, senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) scored a pair of firsts in the 50 (:24.06) and 100 (:52.66) freestyles and freshman Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN) took first in the 200 freestyle (1:54.22). Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) set a Minnesota varsity record in the 100 breaststroke (1:05.70) with her second place finish. Along with freshman Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN), Roell, Wallner and Volna won the 200 free relay (1:38.24), setting the Peppe Natatorium record for the event.

RECORDS SET IN THE PEPPE CLASSIC -- Minnesota set a varsity and pool record during the Mike Peppe Classic, a collegiate and USS competition hosted by Ohio State. Roell set a Minnesota varsity record in the 50 breaststroke (:30.61), and joined Wallner, and senior tri-captains Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) and Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) in setting a pool record in the 200 medley relay (1:49.07). Other Gophers winning in the Classic were Volna in the 200 (1:55.88) and 100 (:54.01) freestyles, Touve in the 100 breaststroke (1:09.77) and Wallner in the 50 free (:23.88).

TENNIS TEAM BEGINS 1986 PLAY -- The Minnesota women's tennis team will see its first action since November this weekend when they compete in the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic at the Arden Hills Tennis Club Feb. 1-3. Coach Jack Roach says it will be good to be playing again: "It's been a long time." The tournament will feature local and college competition in the open draw, single-elimination, no consolation event.

GOPHERS PARTICIPATING -- For Minnesota, Roach plans to play seniors Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD), Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN), and Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL, MN); sophomore Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden); and freshmen Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario), Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) Kelly Hartung (BLOOMINGTON, MN) Jennie Huston (BURNSVILLE, MN) and Foon Huie (DULUTH, MN) in the singles competition. Rost has been seeded second in the 29-player draw, and Eneberg has been seeded fourth. In doubles, Roach plans to play Bjerken/Huie, Huston/Dick, and Rost/Eneberg. Sixteen doubles teams will compete.

Unfortunately, two top players for Minnesota during the fall season will not be competing for Minnesota. Freshman Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden), the team's number one singles player during the fall, has been sidelined indefinitely with a shoulder injury. Another freshman, Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) has been declared academically ineligible for intercollegiate competition during winter quarter.

GOPHER INDOOR TRACK TO HOST MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL

The Gopher women's track and field team hosts the Minnesota Open this Saturday at the newly remodeled U of M Fieldhouse. The women's meet, run concurrently with the men's dual meet, features a strong roster of teams including Hamline, SDSU, Drake, NW Missouri, St. Cloud, NDSU, the University of Wisconsin-Stout, Moorhead State, and Winona.

EDER SETS RECORD IN 3000 METER RUN-- Gopher runner Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) set a new school record of 9:32.0 in the 3000 meter run at Saturday's Northwest Open. She bested the record of Gopher great Rocky Racette set in 1980 (9:37.51). "In all I think we had a very good first meet," said head coach Gary Wilson. In other meet highlights Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) placed in the top three in the 55 meter high hurdles (:08.45). "Steph ran a really strong race," said coach Wilson. In the 800 meter run Gopher runner Lisa Walton (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) finished first with a time of 2:16.07. "We had some very good individual performances, and I feel the team is starting to come together," Wilson said.

(GYMNASTICS HOSTS WISCONSIN-MADISON SATURDAY IN DUAL MEET) --

The Minnesota gymnastics team continues their home season Saturday when they take on Big Ten rival Wisconsin. The dual meet will be held at Williams Arena beginning at 6 p.m. on February 8. Over the weekend, Minnesota competed at the University of Florida Invitational on Friday and the University of Georgia Invitational on Monday, Feb. 3. Following Friday's competition, Minnesota's regular-season record stands at 3-2.

At the Florida Invitational, the Gophers finished third, behind nationally-ranked Florida and Nebraska. Florida won the meet with 181.70 points, followed by Nebraska's 177.70. Minnesota scored 173.85 points, and West Virginia scored 173.50 points. Another nationally-ranked school, the University of Oklahoma, was scheduled to compete, but they had to withdraw because of injuries. "We did pretty well," says Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli. "We had very few misses all night, and we showed great improvement on the balance beam."

BROWN TIES SCHOOL VAULT RECORD -- The highlight of Friday's meet was the vaulting event, where Minnesota junior Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) tied for first with a 9.55 score, tying the school record set by junior Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) in 1984. This score also topped Brown's previous career high, a 9.25 set in December. Another Gopher, junior Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada), set a new career best with a 9.45, good for fourth place. As a team, the Gophers scored 46.50 on the vault, a new school record.

NOTING THE BADGERS -- Wisconsin is 2-1 with wins over Illinois and UC-Santa Barbara and a loss to Utah State. The team's highest score is a 175.60 which came in the Illinois victory. Wisconsin's top all-rounder has been freshman Beth Benevente who scored a 35.95 against Illinois. She has also set two new school records: a 9.55 in the floor exercise and a 9.25 in the vault. Junior Carol Robinson has also been a strong performer. Her top all-around score is a 35.40, in addition she set two new personal bests in the uneven bars and the floor exercise in the Illinois meet. Wisconsin has a young team: four juniors, two sophomores and five freshman. The Badgers placed sixth at the 1985 Big Ten Championships and second to Minnesota at the Wisconsin Invitational. Series: Minnesota leads the series between the two schools 15-0 in competition since 1978.

(BASKETBALL TRAVELS TO IOWA CITY TO MEET TRAVEL PARTNER)--

The Gopher women's basketball team will face a stiff road game this Friday night in Iowa City as they meet the top-twenty ranked Hawkeyes in the first game of the second half of the double round-robin schedule. Iowa is second in the league with a 7-2 mark and 13-5 overall record while the Gophers are tied for eighth place with a 3-6 Big Ten and 7-12 overall mark.

The Hawkeyes will be looking for a win after losing to league-leader Ohio State in Columbus last Sunday, 70-54 -- Iowa's other conference loss was an upset at Michigan 56-58. Meanwhile, Minnesota has not won a road game all season, and are 0-7 away and 0-2 at neutral sites.

FIRST MEETING -- Minnesota narrowly lost to Iowa 66-63 at home Jan. 10, and led 32-21 at half-time. The Gophers shot .537 in field goals --their best on the year, while Iowa shot .408. Molly Tadich had her best game of the season hitting 12 of 15 field goals for 27 points and grabbing 12 rebounds, while Carol Peterka added 14 points. For Iowa, Lisa Becker scored 17 points and led the Hawkeyes second half surge, and Lynn Kennedy added 16 points. The Gophers outrebounded Iowa 42-34, but committed 22 turnovers to Iowa's nine.

SERIES -- Although Minnesota leads 11-7, Iowa has won the last four meetings breaking a previous eight-straight streak by the Gophers. The Hawkeyes first broke Minnesota's streak at home in 1984 with a 79-58 win, and also defeated Minnesota at Iowa City last year 60-38. In Iowa City the series is 5-4 in Iowa's favor.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 159-94 overall record, in her twelfth year overall (213-105) and ninth year in the Big Ten (63-32). C. Vivian Stringer is in her third year at Iowa with a 301-74 career mark, picking up her 300th career win this season...her record at Iowa is 50-24 and in the Big Ten is 32-13.

NOTING THE HAWKEYES -- If Iowa's hopes for an at large bid to the NCAA tournament or of winning the Big Ten title are to stay alive, they need to win nearly all of their remaining Big Ten games. The Hawkeyes placed second in the league last year with a 14-4 mark and are 7-2 at the halfway point this year. Last weekend, Iowa survived a last minute surge by Indiana to win 47-46 in Bloomington with Lynn Kennedy scoring 18 points and center Lisa Becker adding ten points. The Hawkeyes failed in an upset bid at Ohio State 54-70 on Sunday, but the game was closer than the final score indicated. Becker had 13 points, Lisa Long added 12 and Kennedy 10 against the Buckeyes.

GOPHER BASKETBALL NOTES -- The Gophers had their worst weekend of the Big Ten schedule last weekend. Against Ohio State, the Gophers allowed the most points by an opponent this season (95), while grabbing a season low of 27 rebounds and committing a season high of 31 turnovers. Minnesota went scoreless for seven minutes in the first half, and trailed 24-39 at the half. At Indiana, the Gophers shot just .263 in field goals in the first half and .370 for the game while Indiana shot .565. Molly Tadich was out of double figures in both games for the first time in 25 straight games dating back to the middle of last season...she had season lows of 6 points in both games, and fouled out for the first time this year in a Big Ten contest on Sunday with 5:30 to play. Tadich also had a season low of 6 rebounds vs. Ohio State but collected 12 boards vs. Indiana. Carol Peterka also had her troubles, fouling out with 7:20 to play at Ohio State after scoring 10 points and fouling out with 13:10 to play on Sunday after scoring just 6 points...Cindy Phillips extended her scoring streak to five straight games in double figures with 12 at Ohio State and a career high tying 17 at Indiana...Diane Kinney led Minnesota with 15 points and 7 rebounds at Ohio State and scored 12 points at Indiana...

TENNIS SQUAD TRAVELS TO NORTHWESTERN -- The Minnesota tennis team continues winter competition this weekend when they travel to Northwestern University for a doubles tournament. Coach Jack Roach has entered four teams in the round-robin competition which will include doubles teams from Northwestern, Purdue, Michigan, Michigan State and Illinois. Competing for the Gophers will be Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) and Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden); Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN) and Foon Huie (DULUTH, MN); Anna Hallgren (HALMSTED, Sweden) and Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario); and Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL, MN) and Jennie Huston (BURNSVILLE, MN). Roach says that the tournament will be a "good test of where we stand in doubles play."

Over the weekend, the team competed at the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic. The doubles team of Rost/Eneberg was seeded second, and Rost was seeded second in singles while Eneberg was seeded fourth. Rost advanced to the semifinal round before she was eliminated, and she and Eneberg competed in the doubles finals against the number one seeds, Robin Coverdale and Minnesota freshman Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN). The Coverdale/Gorde team won 6-0, 0-6, 7-6 (7-5).

SWIMMERS FACE IMPORTANT BIG TEN TEST IN IOWA CITY -- The Minnesota-Iowa dual meet this Saturday at Iowa City is also a duel on paper between the Jean Freeman led Gophers and the Hawkeyes, who are coached by Pete Kennedy. Minnesota goes into the meet holding the series record with Iowa 6-3, but lost to Iowa last season at home 75-65.

Minnesota has been second the last two years in the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships with the Hawks finishing third both years. The Gophers have finished ahead of Iowa in 14 of 15 Big Ten Championships. Both teams are 3-1 in the Big Ten this year, with Minnesota having a 5-2 overall record compared to Iowa's 7-2.

GOPHER-HAWKEYE COMPARISONS -- Iowa has the edge on the Gophers when it comes to best times, having faster times in 14 of 24 events so far this season. Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) has recorded a faster time in the 50 free (23.88) than Iowa's Kim Stevens (24.44), but Stevens has the edge in the 100 free (52.32) over Wallner (52.56) by only .24 of a second. In the distance freestyles, sophomore Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) has the best Gopher times in the 500 (5:07.70), 1000 (10:27.23) and the 1650 (17:12.18), while Iowa's junior Jane Keating holds her teams fastest in all three distance events (500-4:55.48, 1000-10:00.61, 1650-15:35.02).

The Gopher's are stronger in the breaststroke events, with junior Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) having faster times in the 50 (:30.61), 100 (1:05.35) and 200 (2:23.31) breaststroke than the Hawkeye's Chris Dieterle (100-1:09.03, 200-2:27.20). In the backstrokes, the teams do a flip-flop, with Iowa swimming faster in the 100 back and the Gophers faster in the 200 back. Sophomore Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD) recorded a 2:12.68 in the 200 back, almost two seconds faster than Iowa's Vickie Nauman (2:14.41). McClure has a 1:02.61 in the 100 backstroke, compared to Nauman's 1:01.87. Gopher sophomore Nancy Swanum (BURNSVILLE, MN) leads Minnesota in the 100 back (1:02.17) but is out for the season, recovering from a shoulder re-injury.

Minnesota is stronger in the relay events, having better times in the 200 (1:38.24 to Iowa's 1:38.44) and 400 (3:33.79 to 3:35.90) free relays, and the 200 (1:49.07 to 1:51.69) and 400 (3:57.59 to 3:59.14) medley relays.

GOPHER TRACK AND FIELD WINS MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL -- The Minnesota indoor track and field team finished first at the Minnesota Invitational, Saturday. Competing in a field of nine teams, the Gophers scored 171.5 points. The next closest challenger was Drake with 94 points. Other team scores were: Mankato 90.5, Moorhead 40, St. Cloud State 27, Winona State 23, Hamline 15, Club Soda 14, and UW-Stout with 13 points. Next Saturday the Gophers compete in the Golden Shoe Invitational in Madison, Wisc.

GOPHER ATHLETES TOPS IN SEVEN EVENTS -- Leading the way to a Minnesota team victory, seven Gophers finished first in their respective events. Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN.) won the 1500 meter run (4:31.2) finishing over 15 seconds faster than her nearest competitor. Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) led the pack in the 5000 meter run, finishing with a time of 17:17.5. Jo Arveson (WASECA, MN) won both the long jump (17' 6") which was a personal best, and the triple jump (35' 1/2") placing her second on the Gopher all-time list. The shot put was won by Leslie Smith (MINNEAPOLIS) with a throw of 44' 7". Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) placed first in the 55 meter hurdles with a time of 08.4.

COACH WILSON PLEASED WITH GOPHER PERFORMANCE -- "I told the athletes that I want them to remember this (team victory). It is the start of a new team philosophy and attitude," said coach Gary Wilson. "It proves that we can win as a team. It takes team unity and dedication, and I feel that we really showed that on Saturday."

FIRST MEETINGS -- Michigan posted their first win ever over the Gophers, (series now 8-1) 70-56 leading the whole game...Wendy Bradetich led all scorers with 21 points, while Lorea Feldman had 16 points and 12 rebounds and Kelly Benintendi 13 points...the Gophers shot just .314 in field goals and were outrebounded 43-38...Carol Peterka had 14 points and 12 rebounds and Molly Tadich added 14 points.

Michigan State evened the series with the Gophers at 4-4 holding off a late Gopher rally 62-60...Kris Emerson led all scorer with 18 points and teammates Julie Polakowski added 13 and Sue Tucker 11 points and 14 boards...The Gophers made just 8 of 17 free throws (.470)...Molly Tadich had 17 points and 16 rebounds, Carol Peterka had 14 points and Cindy Phillips 12 points.

TRACK TRAVELS TO IOWA CITY -- The Minnesota women's track and field team will compete at the Iowa Open this Saturday in Iowa City, prior to returning home Feb. 22 to host the Minnesota Open. The Big Ten Indoor Track and Field Championships will be Feb. 28 - March 1 at Indiana.

TRACK TEAM COMPETES AT WISCONSIN -- The Minnesota women's track team placed third at last weekend's Golden Shoe Invitational in Wisconsin behind Wisconsin and UW-Milwaukee. Five Minnesota athletes, including seniors Jo Arveson and Jody Eder stayed home from the meet due to illness. Minnesota's highest finishes were a pair of seconds. Sophomore Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN) placed second in the 880-yard run with a 2:15.63 time. Junior Leslie Smith (MINNEAPOLIS/IRONGDALE) took second in the shot put with a 43'-7 1/4" throw. Another strong performer was junior Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN). She ran her first 600-yard dash and placed third with a 1:26.56 time.

(SWIMMERS TO TEST BIG TEN RELAY TEAMS AT IOWA STATE MEET)--The last regular season competition for the women's swimming and diving team before the Big Ten Championships is this Saturday at Iowa State, and Minnesota head coach Jean Freeman wants to make the most of it.

"Iowa State should be a relatively easy meet as they are down this year, so we should be able to experiment in some of our events," says Freeman. The experimenting Freeman hopes to do deals with just who will be on the five Gopher relay teams at the championships Feb. 28 - Mar. 2, at Milwaukee, WI

Iowa State comes into this weekend 2-5 overall and 0-2 in the Big Eight Conference, while the Gophers are 5-3 overall and 3-2 in the Big Ten. The Gophers lead Minnesota-Iowa State series 7-1, which started during the 1974-75 season.

IOWA'S PAPER EDGE CUTS GOPHERS -- The Iowa Hawkeye's had the paper edge when it came to faster times when Minnesota went to Iowa City this past weekend, and that edge held strong as the Gopher's lost 75-65. Still, Minnesota swimmers had 27 season's best performances, including eight top team times of the year.

Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) became the first Gopher swimmer to ever qualify for the NCAA Championship meet prior to the Big Ten's. Wallner earned the distinction with her victory in the 50 free with her first place time of :23.79 equaling the NCAA qualifying time. Wallner was also on the winning 200 medley relay (1:49.59) and the 400 free relay (3:32.64) teams. Senior tri-captains Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) and Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN), and junior Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) were also on the 200 medley relay team. Elsen, along with Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY, MN) and Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN) joined Wallner in the 400 free relay win.

Volna set a season's best team record in the 200 free (1:52.74) when she defeated the defending Big Ten champion Kim Stevens. Sophomore Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD) won both the 100 (1:01.83) and 200 (2:12.07) backstroke events, with both times the best for Minnesota this year. Roell also scored double victories, winning the 100 (1:06.21) and the 200 (2:26.40) breaststroke events. Elsen won the 100 butterfly (:58.32) and third in the 200 butterfly (2:09.06), with both times her best performances of the year.

Wallner (:52.64) and Volna (52.98) finished second and third in the 100 free in a close race behind last year's Big Ten champion Kim Stevens (:52.36). Freshman Sanna Harkonen (HYVINKAA, FINLAND) cranked out Minnesota's best time this season in the 400 individual medley (4:40.19) with her third place finish.

GYMNASTS DEFEAT WISCONSIN -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team improved its overall record to 4-4 and kept its dual meet record at a perfect 3-0 Saturday when they defeated Big Ten conference foe Wisconsin 180.60-173.85. "We did really well and looked strong," says Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli. "Our goal was to hit 180 and we reached it. We are working hard toward the Big Ten Championships. It's very encouraging." The next competition for the Gophers will be Sunday, Feb. 23 at 6 p.m. when they host the Gopher Invitational. Winona State and conference rival Iowa will compete.

DORSEY TAKES ALL-AROUND -- Minnesota senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) captured her first all-around title of the season with a 36.35 score. Wisconsin freshman Beth Benevente placed second with a 36.30 mark, and Gopher juniors Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada), Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) and Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) finished in the next three spots.

Saturday's meet was the first meet that Kaiser has competed all-around since injuring her thumb in early January. She won both the balance beam and floor exercise and placed second on the vault. Her 35.80 all-around score and fourth-placed all-around finish were hampered by a fall from the uneven bars. "Laurie's thumb is still sore, but she can fully train. I'm very optimistic," Deli says.

Individually, the Gophers won every event except the uneven bars. Doell won the vaulting with a career best 9.45 score, and the team swept the first five places. Kaiser had winning scores of 9.25 on the balance beam and 9.40 in the floor exercise. Wisconsin's Benevente won the uneven bars with a 9.05 mark, but five Gophers finished in the next four places. Minnesota's top score was a 9.00 by Brown.

TEAM SETS NEW WILLIAMS ARENA RECORD -- As a team, the Gophers set a new Williams Arena vaulting record with a 46.40 mark. The previous record was a 46.00 set in 1984. In addition, Saturday's team score of 180.60 is a current season high score and the first time the team was score over 180 points this season.

GOPHER FINISHES AT GEORGIA INVITATIONAL -- Although Minnesota finished third behind Georgia and Nebraska at the Georgia Invitational last Monday, coach Deli was encouraged by her team's performance. Brown placed third in the all-around with a personal best score of 36.70 points. On the balance beam, an event the Gophers have been struggling with all season, the team scored 45.40 points and won the event. "We did super on the beam," Deli said. Individually, Kaiser won the beam with a 9.50, tying her Minnesota school record. Brown finished second with a career-best 9.40 mark.

TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO KENTUCKY -- After a weekend of doubles competition, the Minnesota tennis team travels to Kentucky this weekend to play four dual matches against strong tennis teams. The Gophers will play Kentucky and Vanderbilt on Friday, Feb. 14, Wake Forest on Saturday, and Mississippi State on Sunday. "Kentucky is a top twenty school, and the others are in the top 40," says Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. "We will really have to play well to win." Roach does not have a definite lineup planned for the weekend. "We may switch the players around, especially in doubles, depending on how they play," he said.

Over the weekend the team competed in the Northwestern Doubles Invitational at Northwestern University. "The tournament was a tremendous experience," said Minnesota coach Jack Roach, "because we have only three people with any doubles experience out of eight players." The team started slow on Friday with only one victory in 8 matches, but they came on strong Saturday and won 7 of 11 contests.

(GYMNASTICS TEAM HOSTS GOPHER INVITATIONAL SUNDAY) --

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team hosts the Gopher Invitational on Sunday, Feb. 23 in their final home meet before hosting the 1986 Big Ten Championships on March 21 and 22. The Gophers will compete against the University of Iowa and Winona State University, with the triangular meet starting at 6 p.m. in Williams Arena. Minnesota has a 4-4 record overall and are 3-0 in dual meets. "To score over 180 is our number one goal for this meet," says Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli.

At Sunday's meet Deli plans to have four all-arounders: senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN), and juniors Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN), Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) and Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN). Sophomore Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) will also compete in three events: uneven bars, balance beam and floor exercise.

Deli says that she is pleased with how the 1986 season has gone so far. "We have performed really well. Scoring 180 in early February is a good indication of what the team can do. The kids have given a 100 percent effort," she says.

GOPHER NOTES -- Deli would like to score above 180 points to boost the Gophers' team average, as a higher team average will help the team qualify for the NCAA Midwest Regional Championships and the NCAA national meet. Through five meets, Minnesota has a team average score of 176.93. Individually, the team has had several highlights. Brown tied the school vault with a 9.55 mark at the Florida Invitational, and Kaiser tied her school balance beam record with a 9.55 score at the Georgia Invitational. Brown, Doell, and Dorsey have competed all-around at the team's five meets this year, with Brown having the top score, a 36.70 scored at the Georgia Invitational. Kaiser has seen limited all-around action due to a thumb injury, but Deli says that she has recovered and is training and competing in all four events. In addition, the vaulting team has set new school and Williams Arena records.

NOTING THE HAWKEYES -- Iowa has a 2-1 dual meet record, with wins over Illinois State and Illinois-Chicago and a loss to Wisconsin. They also competed in two triangular meets in California. The Hawkeyes have a top team score of 170.60, scored in the victory over Illinois-Chicago. Top all-arounders have been Mindy Taylor with a score of 35.50 and Jennifer DuBois with a 35.40 score. Iowa finished eighth at the 1985 Big Ten Championships, and have one returning All-Big Ten team member, Wendy Hussar. Hussar finished third in the floor exercise and sixth on the uneven bars at the Big Ten meet, but she has not competed for the last two weeks due to an injury. Series notes: Minnesota has a 16-4 series record against Iowa, with Iowa's last win coming in 1979.

NOTING WINONA STATE -- Winona State has a top team score of 169.10 points which came in last weekend's win over the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. The top all-arounder has been sophomore Laura Robillard with a 35.0 mark. In 1985 the Warriors won the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics national championship and third at the NCAA II nationals. Key losses for Winona State were three All-Americans from the 1985 squad. Series: Minnesota leads the series between the two schools 7-0 with the last meeting coming in a 1983 dual meet in Williams Arena.

TRACK TEAM HOSTS MINNESOTA OPEN SATURDAY -- The Minnesota track team will host the Minnesota Open on Saturday in the team's final competition before the Big Ten Indoor Track Championships on February 28 and March 1. The competition will be held in the newly-renovated field house beginning at noon. St. Thomas, Carleton, and Macalester colleges, Club Sota, and other individual athletes are scheduled to compete. Over the weekend, the team competed at the Iowa Open in Iowa City. "We performed very well," Minnesota head coach Gary Wilson said. "It was a fun meet."

IOWA OPEN RESULTS -- No team scores were kept at the meet, but Minnesota had several strong individual finishes. Senior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) won the mile run with a 4:48.00 time, and Minnesota senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) finished third with a 4:54.70 time. In the three-mile run, freshman Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL/HIGHLAND PARK) placed second with a time of 16:43.42. Three Minnesota runners also finished fourth, fifth and sixth in that run: Patty Burns (MENOMONIE, WI), Patti Edman (ROSEVILLE, MN), and Amy Mills (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST). Stephanie Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) finished third in the 60-yard hurdles, and Beth Lindblad (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) placed fifth. The Gophers placed second in the mile relay with runners Stoltman, Lindblad, Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN) and Lisa Walton (MINNEAPOLIS/NORTH). The relay team of Bant, Eder, Kathy Scharnhorst (WAUSAU, WI) and Natalie Burke (PLYMOUTH, MN) finished third in the two-mile relay.

Last weekend, the Gophers snapped a three game losing streak by defeating Michigan State 73-62, but lost to Michigan on Sunday 60-74. (VÓLLEYBALL SIGNS FOUR RECRUITS) --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota volleyball coach Stephanie Schleuder announced recently the signing of four recruits for the 1986 season. The recruiting class is the largest since the 1983-84 class, which also included four players. Here is a look at the newcomers:

Karen Staab, a 6'0" middle blocker from Palatine, Ill., was rated a top one of the top twenty college prospects by both Volleyball Monthly magazine and the Mid-West Scouting service. Staab was named a first team all-state selection playing for Palatine High School, and also played USVBA ball with the Circus Club team. Academically, she is ranked in the top third of her high school class.

Sharon Oesterling, a 5'9" setter/hitter from Frankfort, Ind., was rated a top Division I prospect by the Mid-West volleyball scouting service. Oesterling was the starting setter/hitter for Clinton Prairie High School and led her team to the state championship in 1984. She was named to the first team all-state. Oesterling is ranked first in her class academically, and also played basketball, track and softball.

Chris Schaefer, a 6'1" middle blocker from Florence, Ky. was named All-Region Player of the Year in 1985 while playing for Saint Henry High School in Erlanger, Ky. She has played middle hitter/blocker, back row setter and outside hitter and was a three time first team all-tourney and all-region selection. A member of the national honor society, Schaefer is ranked third in her class. She has competed on the Northern Kentucky/Southwestern Ohio Junior Olympic team for the past three years.

Lori Miller, a 6'0" middle hitter from Worth, Ill. was rated one of the top 50 players in Chicago by the Chicago Sun Times newspaper. She is the sister of current Minnesota junior middle hitter Pam Miller. Miller (Lori) is also versatile at outside hitter and has been named honorable mention all-conference and MVP of her Alan B. Shepard High School team. Her USVBA Chicago Spikettes team placed second in the National AAU Junior Olympics in 1984-85. Miller was also rated among Illinois' top-twenty basketball players, and also was an all-conference badminton player. She is ranked ninth in her high school class.

The Minnesota volleyball team compiled a 22-12 overall record last year, placing fourth in the Big Ten with a 11-7 conference mark. Only one player, Beth Hiner, was lost to graduation and ten players will return next season. With this recruiting class, the team will have good depth at every position.

(SWIMMERS HOPEFUL, BUT REALISTIC ABOUT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Minnesota's head swimming coach Jean Freeman wants to better the Gophers standings at the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships later this month. Minnesota has finished in second place the last two years behind the Ohio State Buckeyes, winners of the last four championships. Freeman would like to have her team be the Big Ten Champions this year, but the Buckeyes keep getting in the way. Minnesota was ranked second behind Ohio State in the Big Ten Coaches Pre-Season Poll and the Gopher coach believes those rankings are still valid.

"The swimmers don't like it when I say we may not be first this year at the Big Ten's, but let's be realistic -- it's going to take a lot to beat Ohio State," says Freeman. "But, if they (Ohio State) have a bad meet and we have a good one..."

The Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships are Feb. 28-Mar. 2, at the Walter Schroeder Aquatic Center in Brown Deer, Wisc. This marks the fourth time the championships have been in the Milwaukee suburb. They were there from 1982-1984.

Competition begins each day with the preliminaries starting at 11 a.m. The 16 fastest swimmers in each event advance to the finals at 7 p.m. The top eight prelim swimmers compete in the championship finals, while the other eight compete in the consolation finals.

FREEMAN'S VIEW OF THE COMPETITION -- Michigan State is one of the most improved teams this year in the Big Ten Conference, and Freeman expects them to move up from last year's ninth place finish all the way to fourth. Freeman expects to edge Iowa again (the Hawkeyes have been third the past two years) with Michigan maintaining its hold on fifth.

Freeman feels Indiana will drop from last year's fourth place finish to sixth, with Wisconsin following in seventh, and Northwestern, eighth. Illinois and Purdue both have vastly improved teams over last year, but should round off the scoring in ninth and 10 place, respectively, speculates the 13-year Gopher coach. "There will be fewer points scored by the top teams this year than they have in the past," says Freeman, "with all of the lower ranked teams earning more."

SEASONED BIG TEN COMPETITORS -- Many of Minnesota's opponents at this year's championships are fielding many of their point makers from the 1985 Big Ten's. The Gophers are competing this season with "seven of our 18 swimmers who scored last year at the Big Ten's", says Freeman, "And those seven accounted for 53 percent of our total score. We are looking to them to finish higher in all their events, with the freshmen filling in the gaps by scoring more than they traditionally have in the past." Minnesota's returning scorers from last year's Big Ten Championships are seniors Diane Wallner, Jo Elsen and Mana Raikkala; junior Sue Roell and sophomores Jodi Schirmers, Diane Almstrom and Maureen Lewis.

MINNESOTA BIG TEN SWIMMING PREVIEW -2-2-2

THE GOPHER'S BY EVENTS: 50 yard freestyle -- Minnesota's Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) is favored among the five top returners from last year, having the fastest time this year in the conference (:23.79). Wallner won the 50 free in 1983 and 1984, and was sixth last year. Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) and Sue Roell (BURNSVILLE, MN) are expected to be among the top eight finalists, with Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN) and Kelly Gallagher (MINNETONKA, MN) hoping to finish in the top 16.

100 yard freestyle -- Wallner is expected to be one of the top three conference finishers, along with Iowa's Kim Stevens and Indiana's Kate McDonald. Roell and Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY VILLAGE, MN) should be in the top eight with Gunard and Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN) in the bottom eight.

200 yard freestyle -- This is the most improved event this year in the conference, with six of the top eight finisher's back from last year. Iowa's Kim Stevens is favored to win, with Wendy Ingraham of Michigan State to be second. Minnesota's Volna, Schirmers, Wallner, and Sanna Harkonen (HYVINKAA, FINLAND) are all expected to reach the finals.

500 yard freestyle -- Iowa's Jane Keating should win this event, as she's the best distance swimmer this year in the Big Ten. Schirmers should repeat her second place finish from last year.

1650 yard freestyle -- Schirmers is the defending Big Ten champion in the swimmer's mile (16:53.16) and will have to swim the best the race of her life to keep the title out of the hands of Iowa's Keating. Schirmers should finish in the top three.

100 yard backstroke -- Kate McDonald of Indiana, Betsy Skowron of Ohio State and Northwestern's Barb Harris are favored in the event, with Gopher sophomore Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD) and senior tri-captain Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) expected to be among the 16. Minnesota has been led in the past four Big Ten's by powerhouse backstroker Elyce Iwerks (ABERDEEN, SD), who graduated this past spring.

200 yard backstroke -- Skowan and Harris are both favored to be in the top slots, especially since last year's 200 yard backstroke champion Kim Tesch of Northwestern has been sick with mononucleosis this season. Gopher McClure should be in the top 16 and has a good chance to be in the top eight finalists.

100 yard butterfly -- Minnesota is looking to Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) and Volna to be in the top eight scorers, with Lisa Camillo (DELEVAN, WI) to be in the top 16. Last year's first and second place finishers at the Big Ten's, Gail Armstrong (Ohio State) and Rosie Wicht (Indiana) are expected to vie for the top honors again.

200 yard butterfly -- Mana Raikkala (KANKAANPAA, FINLAND), Harkonen, and Elsen are expected to be in the finals, with at least one of them being in the top eight. Ohio State's Armstrong is favored as the best in the conference.

MINNESOTA BIG TEN SWIMMING PREVIEW -3-3-3

100 yard breaststroke -- All of last year's top four finishers are returning, with the Gopher's Roell (fourth last year) among them, with Teresa Fightmaster (third last year) of Ohio State having the edge this year. Minnesota plans to improve its performance this year, with two in the top eight and two in the bottom eight. Other Gophers in the 100 yard breaststroke may be Cindy Hovet (BELLEVUE, WA), Diane Almstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MN), Diane Erstad (BLOOMINGTON, MN), and Touve.

200 yard breaststroke -- Roell is expected to improve her 11th place finish last season and should move up to the top eight. Freeman feels that the Gophers need to have at least three in the top 16 in order for Minnesota to be competitive in the race. Hovet, Touve and Almstrom are among the Gophers favored to compete in the 200 yard breaststroke.

200 yard individual medley -- The Gophers had four in the top 16 at the Big Ten's last year, and none of them are back this season. Raikkala and Roell are Minnesota's hope in the I.M.

400 yard individual medley -- Raikkala was third last year and is expected to be in the top eight again this year, along with fellow Finlander Harkonen. Hovet has a good chance of scoring in the bottom eight this year.

THE RELAY EVENTS -- Minnesota has not chosen the members of its five relay teams to compete at the Big Ten's, but some facts are known. In the 200 medley relay, both Minnesota and Ohio State are favored over last year's winner, Indiana. Ohio State is favored to again win the 400 medley relay, but the Gophers are expected to be among the top three teams.

Minnesota has dominated the 200 yard freestyle relay, setting two Big Ten records in three years (1:34.60 in 1985, 1:35.19 in 1983), and is again favored, but Michigan State is expected to be a strong competitor in the relay. Returning champions Wallner, Roell, and Elsen will be joined by as of now, an unnamed Gopher sprinter.

The Gophers set Big Ten records in both 1983 (3:27.34) and 1985 (3:26.38) and have won the 400 free relay the last three years. Wallner has been on all three of the relay teams, and will be again. Joining her will be Schirmers, who was in the 400 yard freestyle relay last year. Volna will fill one of the two vacancies on the relay created by graduations, with the possibility of either Roell or Gunard filling the fourth hole.

"The 800 yard freestyle relay race is up for grabs," says Freeman, "between five teams." Minnesota, Michigan State, Northwestern, Iowa and Ohio State all have teams capable of winning the event.

THE DIVERS -- Minnesota is looking towards two young divers, sophomore Maureen Lewis (GREENBAY, WI) and freshman Jennifer Carpenter (GRAND RAPIDS, MN), to score in both one and three meter competition. Lewis should be in the top eight in both heights, with Carpenter scoring in the top 16 in both. Ohio State should dominate both boards, with Kim Fugett favored in one meter diving and Karen LaFace in three meters.

THE GOPHERS AT BIG TENS -- There have been four Big Ten sanctioned swimming and diving championships, with the Gophers being in the top five all four years. Ohio State has won all four of the official Big Ten championships, but three other schools dominated the 11 unsanctioned championships. Michigan has won the most, posting five consecutive wins from 1976-1980, with Michigan State winning the three prior meets (1973-1975). Indiana won the other three in 1971, 1972 and 1981.

A special ceremony honoring Gopher seniors Lisa Hoelscher and Carol Peterka will precede Sunday's game.

SERIES -- Minnesota leads the series with Indiana 8-4, but lost at Bloomington earlier this year, 67-80. The Hoosiers last won in Minneapolis, Feb. 12, 1984, 78-65. Ohio State leads the series against the Gophers 10-3 and the Buckeyes have won the last six meetings. The Gophers last win was in Minneapolis, Jan. 6, 1983 68-56.

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 160-98 overall record, in her twelfth year overall (214-109) and ninth year in the Big Ten (64-36). Jorja E. Hoehn is in her first season at Indiana, but her sixth year overall career mark is 133-43. Nancy Darsch is in her first season as a head coach at Ohio State.

QUICK OPPONENT UPDATE -- Indiana lost at home last weekend to Illinois 65-69 and Purdue 57-59 in overtime, breaking a four-game Big Ten winning streak that culminated the weekend before with a defeat of Ohio State 68-66. That upset broke a 36-game conference winning streak for the Buckeyes. Indiana has knocked off four top-twenty teams this year. Indiana was fourth in the league last year with an 11-7 conference record. Two talented forwards, Karna Abram and Cindy Bumgarner lead the Hoosiers along with guard Linda Cunningham.

Ohio State rebounded from the loss to Indiana by crushing Purdue 78-50 and Illinois 90-71 last weekend. Ohio State posted a perfect 18-0 Big Ten mark last year and advanced to the NCAA East Regional final before losing to eventual national champion Old Dominion. Nine letterwinners return from that team. The Buckeyes are led by Big Ten freshman of the year last season Tracey Hall. Coach Darsch added a second freshman to her starting lineup last weekend, center Lisa Cline and she responded with 26 points and 9 rebounds over the two games. Ohio State shoots 52.0 pct. in field goals to opponents 42.0, outscores Big Ten foes 78.4 to 61.4 and outrebounds league opponents 38.0 to 31.9. In addition, no Big Ten team has shot over 39.8 from the field in the last seven games.

FIRST MEETINGS -- The first time around was no picnic for the Gophers against these two teams. Ohio State scored a season high 95 points in the 95-65 win. Minnesota meanwhile had a season low of 27 rebounds and committed a season high of 31 turnovers. Six players were in double figures for the Buckeye's led by Jodi Roth with 19 points and Tracey Hall with 16 points. Diane Kinney led the Gophers with 15 points and Cindy Phillips added 12.

Molly Tadich had a season low of just six points in both games against Ohio State and Indiana, and Carol Peterka fouled out early in both games. Indiana recorded an 80-67 win with Karna Abram scoring a game high 23 points, Cindy Bumgarner adding 18 and Linda Cunningham scoring 17 points. The Gophers shot just .370 from the field, while Indiana had a .565 from the field. Phillips tied her career high with 17 points, and Lisa Hoelscher and Kinney both scored 12 points.

GOPHER NOTES -- Carol Peterka moved into third place on the all-time scoring list over the weekend scoring 16 points and grabbing 10 rebounds at Wisconsin and scoring 8 against Northwestern. She now has 1,378 career points. Diane Kinney regained a spot in the starting lineup, coming off the bench against Northwestern and scoring a career high 17 points while grabbing 10 rebounds. Molly Tadich had 14 points and 12 rebounds at Northwestern, with a career high of 10 for 14 free throw shooting. Lisa Hoelscher also had 11 points and 7 rebounds against the Wildcats. Cindy Phillips was also in double figures against Wisconsin with 13 points. Minnesota did not score enough points to win either game, shooting .383 from the field against Northwestern and hitting just six of 18 free throws against Wisconsin.

GYMNASTS BREAK RECORDS VS. WINONA STATE, TRAVEL TO UCLA SATURDAY -- School and Williams Arena records were broken and tied Sunday when the Minnesota women's gymnastics team defeated Winona State 182.05-163.40. The team score, a new school record, boosts Minnesota's regional qualifying average to 178.80 (five meets, minimum two home and two away scores). The Gophers will try to improve that average this weekend when they travel to Los Angeles to meet nationally-ranked UCLA. "We need to improve the average," says Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli, "and we can do it."

NOTING THE BRUINS -- UCLA is ranked seventh in the nation and has a 12-5 overall record with wins over Nebraska, Arizona, Stanford, Oregon State and other schools. Their losses have been to nationally-ranked Florida, Arizona State, and Cal State-Fullerton. The team's top score is a 183.30. The top all-arounder for the team has been freshman Tanya Service with a high score of 38.10 points. That score was at one time during the season the highest all-around score in the nation. In 1985 the Bruins placed fourth in the NCAA West Region and had no individual qualifiers for the national championships. Series: UCLA leads the series between the two schools 2-1, but Minnesota defeated UCLA last year 178.15-176.90 in a triangular meet with Cal-Fullerton.

TEAM, INDIVIDUAL RECORDS FALL -- Sunday's meet did not look like the record-breaker it became. First, Iowa did not compete as scheduled due to team illness. Then Gopher junior Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) fell during warm-ups, bruised her heel and did not compete. Doell's injury forced an immediate change in Minnesota's lineup and gave three team members their first chance to compete. "We got off to a bad start," said Deli. "The first kids started the team out strong and tried to cover the hole left by Candi's absence. The extras did an outstanding job for us, especially since they were not prepared mentally." The extra competitors for Minnesota were freshmen Karen Howe (TRAVERSE CITY, MI) on vault, Janice Ball (SASKATOON, Canada) on balance beam, and Kris Gallagher (SHOREVIEW, MN) on floor exercise.

In the all-around, junior Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) won her second all-around of the season with a record-tying 37.15 score. Junior Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) finished second with a 37.00 mark, and senior Wendy Dorsey placed third with a 36.35 score. Brown now has a regional average of 36.00 -- highest on the team. Kaiser has a 36.07 average, but she has only competed all-around in three meets.

Along with breaking the school team score record, the Gophers set new school and Williams Arena records in the floor exercise with a team score of 47.00 points. Individually, Minnesota sophomore Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN) tied the school record and reset the Williams Arena floor exercise record with a 9.60 score.

The Gophers also won each individual event. Brown won the vault with a 9.45 mark, Brown and Dorsey tied on the uneven bars with 9.15 scores; Kaiser won the balance beam with a 9.15 score; and Mastel's record-breaking 9.60 was her second floor exercise victory of the season. In addition, new personal and season high scores were set. Junior Linda Bednar (OSSEO, MN) threw a new vault in competition for the first time this season and scored a 9.30 -- a new career best. She also tied for second in the event. Brown and Mastel both set new career bests in the floor exercise, with Brown scoring a 9.50 and placing third. Brown also reset her career high in the all-around for the second time this season. As a team, the Gophers scored a 45.20 on the uneven bars, a season high.

(MINNESOTA PLAYERS LEAD GOPHER SOFTBALL SQUAD) --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Heading into her twelfth season as head coach at the University of Minnesota, Linda Wells will be relying on Minnesota talent with a roster that features ten home-state players, as the Gophers head into the 1986 season. Many of the current team members played for the T.C. Jammers team in ASA class AA ball last summer-- the Jammers won the regional tournament and placed seventh at the nationals.

Two of the top Minnesotans are versatile players that Coach Wells will keep in the lineup. Senior Judy Oliverius of Spring Lake Park and junior Barb Drake of St. Paul/Kellogg H.S. Oliverius will be utilized as a pitcher, and infielder at first or second base, but is also available to play in the outfield. Drake will catch for Oliverius, and is also a starting pitcher. She may also see action in the infield, or as a designated hitter.

Oliverius was the mainstay of the pitching staff last year, starting more than half of the Gophers games and posting a 14-12 overall mark with a 1.08 ERA in 168 2/3 innings. She set a new Minnesota season record for complete games (22), and held opposing batters to a combined .153 average. Oliverius pitched for the Jammers last summer. Wells is looking for an improved performance from Oliverius at the plate -- she hit just .195 last year, but batted .299 as a sophomore. Her former high school teammate Jeana Cullen will be looked at to play at second base this year. Cullen is known for her defensive skills and is third in career assists, having played shortstop in the past.

Drake won the ASA batting title at the nationals last summer with a .570 tournament average, and she will be hoping to boost her average this season. Last year Drake missed the first 10 games of the year and hit .281 in the Big Ten after batting .326 as a freshman. She was the Gophers MVP as a rookie, and was a first team all-Big Ten and second team NCAA All-American selection. Drake posted a 1.13 ERA on the mound last year with a 9-8 record in 118.0 innings pitched. She completed 12 of the 16 games she started.

Senior Kim Katzenmeyer of Fergus Falls, Minn. was elected captain of this year's team and will catch for Oliverius, or play as a utility infielder or outfielder. Four of the team's five sophomores are from Minnesota and two of them will be starting in the outfield -- Stacy Hohertz of Minnetonka and Kelly Darrow of Inver Grove Heights.

In the infield, sophomore Deb Lange of LaCrescent will see action at shortstop or second base, and sophomore Deb Lewis of Richfield will play at third base or as a designated hitter. Junior Mary Stallman of Columbia Heights will play at catcher or in the outfield, and junior transfer from Minneapolis Community College Amy Iverson of Dellwood, Minn. will play at catcher.

GOPHER TRACK SQUAD HEADS TO BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. -- The Minnesota women's indoor track and field team, under first-year coach Gary Wilson, will compete in the Big Ten Indoor Championships this Friday and Saturday at Bloomington, Ind. The Gophers, who scored only six points and placed ninth in last year's meet, are shooting for the 20 point mark and hoping to finish higher than ninth place.

"Realistically, we don't have a chance to win the meet," said Wilson. "But we do have some pretty good athletes who can definitely score some points for us." Wisconsin is the defending champion and odds-on-favorite to win the meet again this year. The Badgers have won eight of the last nine meets and chalked up 126 points last year to out distance second-place Indiana by 24 points.

Minnesota's favorite events to score points in are the distance races. The Gophers' hopes here rely on seniors Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN), and Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI). Eder, an indoor All-American last year, has already set a new Minnesota varsity record this year in the 3000-meters. She ran a 9:32.0 3000-meters in the Gopher's second meet of the season. In last year's indoor championships, Eder placed fifth in both the 3000 and 1500-meters. Again this year, Eder will run both events. Stacy Bant is another Gopher distance threat. Bant has a personal best of 17:12.01 in the 5000-meters and will run the three-mile race for Minnesota.

Other strong contenders for Minnesota include junior Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) and sophomore Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN). Stoltman will compete in the 55-meter hurdles and Johnson will run the 800-meters. Stoltman is beginning to peak in the hurdles. In last weekend's Minnesota Invitational she set a personal best of 8.2 seconds in that event. Although only a sophomore, Johnson isn't new to Big Ten competition. In last year's outdoor Big Ten Championships, Johnson ran the 800 and cut four seconds off her personal best and placed fourth overall. This year her best time in the 800 is 2:16.7.

Also competing for the Gophers in the indoor championships will be pentathletes Jo Arvesen (WASECA, MN) and Beth Lindblad (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN), Distance runners Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN), Amy Mills (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) and Kathy Scharnhorst (WAUSAU, WI). Sprinters Faduzia Hasni (SILIANA, TUNISIA), Lisa Pruitt (ROSEVILLE, MN) and Char Wetzel (NEW BRIGHTON, MN). Shotputters Shirley Molitor (COLD SPRING, MN) and Leslie Smith (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) round out the Gopher squad.

First season at U of M

After building a Division III powerhouse at the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse, Gary Wilson comes to Minnesota this season as the new head coach of both the Gopher cross country and track and field teams. Wilson brings a winning tradition to Minnesota, as he coached the UW-LaCrosse women's teams to three consecutive national track and field championships and one national cross country championship. He becomes only the second head coach in the history of the women's running program at Minnesota, replacing 11-year coach Mike Lawless, who decided to leave the coaching ranks following last season.

In Wilson's four seasons as head coach of the UW-LaCrosse women's track and field team, the school won three national titles and finished third once. UW-LaCrosse captured the AIAW Division III Outdoor Track and Field Championship in 1982, and the NCAA Division III Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 1983 and 1984. Wilson coached 33 track and field All-Americans in just four seasons, including 14 All-Americans on the 1985 UW-LaCrosse squad that placed third at nationals. Along with coaching the UW-LaCrosse women's teams, Wilson was the head coach of the school's men's track and field team for seven seasons between 1976-1983, producing 25 NAIA All-Americans.

Wilson was named the NCAA Division III Coach-of-the-Year in 1983 and 1984, and as a Runners World all-star coach in 1984. He has served as a member of The Athletics Congress (TAC) Coaching Certification Committee, and as a member of the AIAW national and regional cross country committees. Wilson also has operated several successful runner's camps and coaching clinics, and he has written numerous articles for publication on the subject of coaching.

Wilson coached the UW-LaCrosse women's cross country team for eight years, from 1977-1984. He produced 10 All-Americans during that period and won the the NCAA Division III cross country team championship in 1983. UW-LaCrosse was the Division III runner-up in 1982 and 1984, and the school finished in the top five at the cross country nationals in six of Wilson's eight seasons. Depth was a key ingredient to UW-LaCrosse's cross country success: After inheriting a roster of 17 runners in his first season, Wilson's teams regularly carried more than 40 runners -- one of the largest cross country squads in the nation.

Prior to coaching at UW-LaCrosse, Wilson was an assistant men's track and field coach at Westchester State College in Pennsylvania in 1975. He also served as the athletic director and chairman of the the physical education department at Hannibal Central High School in upstate New York in 1973-74. While at Hannibal, Wilson also coached boys' cross country, basketball and track and field from 1968-1974.

Originally from Lyndonville, New York, Wilson received his B.S. (1968) and M.S. (1974) degrees in physical education from the State University of New York at Cortland. Wilson competed in cross country, and indoor and outdoor track while an undergraduate -- and captained all three teams as a senior -- at SUNY-Cortland. Gary and his wife, Suzy, have three children: Ben, 5, Laura, 3, and Adam, 9 months.

(Gopher roster, schedule, outlook and '85 stats enclosed)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The Gopher women's softball team will face stiff competition next week as they open the season in a doubleheader against last year's runner-up in the College World Series, Nebraska, on Wed. March 5 at 3:30 p.m. (MST) in Las Cruces, N.M. Following that, Minnesota will compete on March 6-8 in the Roadrunner Invitational hosted by New Mexico State University.

"Obviously opening against Nebraska will be a challenge," says Minnesota Head Coach Linda Wells. "The trip will give us a chance to size ourselves up with several top twenty teams. We need to play competitively with those teams and see what our strengths and deficiencies are."

NOTING NEBRASKA -- Nebraska posted a 38-15 overall record last year and are ranked No. 2 in a pre-season spring top-twenty poll. Although the Cornhuskers lost seven starters from last year they aren't reeling from the loss. Nebraska posted a 15-1 fall record, behind a pitching staff that posted a 0.54 fall combined ERA as Nebraska outscored their opponents 76-12.

Sophomore Lori Sippel was 15-5 last year as a rookie with a 0.42 ERA and was named the Big Eight's MVP and to the NCAA All-Tournament team. Sippel was third in the NCAA in strikeouts last year with 210 (9.9 avg.) and threw a no-hitter at the World Series. Sophomore Donna Deardorff was 18-5 last year with a 0.69 ERA and was 3-1 last fall with a 0.47 ERA. The top returning batter is junior Lori Richins who has a .278 career average and was also named to the NCAA All-Tournament team. SERIES -- Tied 4-4.

ROADRUNNER INVITATIONAL FEATURES SIX RANKED TEAMS -- The Roadrunner Invitational will feature 18-teams competing in three pools of six teams. Following pool play on Thursday and Friday, the top four teams will advance to the championship single-elimination bracket with the winner of each pool getting a first round bye. The bottom two teams in each pool will go into a consolation bracket. First round championship play begins at 6:30 p.m. Friday, with all play concluding Saturday.

GOPHERS IN TOUGH POOL -- Minnesota's schedule in the blue pool includes a rematch with No. 2 Nebraska, and No. 16 Utah State (who placed seventh at nationals last year). The Gophers schedule follows:

1986 Minnesota Softball Outlook

(VERSATILE PITCHERS BACKBONE OF GOPHER SQUAD)--

A common problem for softball and baseball coaches is what to do with their pitchers when they aren't on the mound, but Gopher Coach Linda Wells has a different concern. She must decide which positions to utilize her three pitchers at when they're not hurling a game.

The pitching staff features three versatile performers who will be the back-bone of this year's team. Senior Judy Oliverius of Spring Lake Park, Minn., and juniors Barb Drake of St. Paul and Carla Cray of Chester, Ia. Oliverius will be at first or second base when not on the mound, but is also a possibility in the outfield, according to Wells. Drake will catch for Oliverius when she is not pitching, or could be used as a designated hitter, outfielder, or at second base. Cray will get the first nod at shortstop when she is not pitching.

Those three players will always be in the lineup along with returning Big Ten batting champion and Gopher MVP in 1985 Ann Flis. Flis will be utilized primarily at first base, designated hitter, or if needed, at third base.

For the Gophers to improve on last year's 25-24 overall record and 8-12 Big Ten finish, Wells says Drake, Oliverius, Cray and Flis must have "average or better seasons". But, how quickly her five sophomores can contribute may hold the key to the 1986 year.

"We are fortunate to have a few outstanding players, but there's also an unknown quantity in the five sophomores on the team, and they could be a substantial difference in the season," says Wells.

Last year, the Gophers were third in the Big Ten in batting (.239) but were ranked fifth in fielding and pitching. One problem on the mound was Cray being plagued by illness and injury, but she is healthy this year. "Offensively we are strong," says Wells. "Our infield defense should be improved, and our sophomores will be the key in the outfield."

Still, consistency is a key factor in the Big Ten single round-robin schedule which features a four game series against each of the six league opponents. Last year, the Gophers were rained out of the series against Michigan State, and then faced NCAA qualifiers Northwestern and Indiana, posting only one victory in those eight games (vs. NU). Minnesota was quickly 1-8, but finished 8-12 after taking three of four vs. Ohio State, and splitting against second place Michigan and Iowa.

The Gophers tied with Michigan State for fifth, but both teams were hindered by missing their head-to-head series. Minnesota placed second in the league in 1984 (14-8) and third in 1983 (13-9), the first year of the round-robin schedule.

LOSSES FROM '85 --Missing from last years lineup will be two starters. Third base/outfielder Danne Leininger was second in batting (.344) and led the team in runs (27), tied with Flis for RBI's (18), and had the teams' best slugging pct. (.475). Second baseman Nancy Jungkans was third at the plate (.243) and led the team in sacrifices (7).

Also gone is first base/designated hitter Anne Keirstead who batted .207 appearing in 41 of 49 games, and outfielder Diane Portner who had a .978 fielding pct. and hit .184.

THE BATTERY ALSO HAS BATS -- The three upperclassmen will handle the pitching duties again this season. "Our pitchers are solid," says Wells. "Judy (Oliverius) looks strong, Drake is a capable pitcher, and Cray needs to work on her consistency."

Oliverius was the mainstay of last year's pitching staff, starting more than half the Gophers games (26 of 49), hurling almost half the innings pitched (168 2/3), and setting a new season record for complete games with 22. She posted a 14-12 mark for the season, and a 1.08 ERA, while holding opposing batters to a .153 combined average on the season. Oliverius also is a capable hitter, averaging .299 as a sophomore, although she hit just .195 last year.

Drake completed 12 of the 16 games she started and had a 1.13 ERA and 9-8 overall record in 118.0 innings pitched. She is a strong hitter, having won the batting title at the ASA major fast-pitch nationals last summer (.570 during tournament play). Drake missed the first 10 games of last season, but batted .234 overall on the year and .281 in the Big Ten. As a sophomore, she was a second team NCAA All-American, Gopher MVP, and batting leader (.326 average).

Coach Wells will be hoping to utilize more of Cray this year to relieve Oliverius and Drake. Cray completed just four games last year, appearing in 11 and posted a 2-4 record while pitching 52.0 innings. At the plate Cray hit .263 in the Big Ten last season and batted .255 overall as a freshman.

At catcher, Wells plans to pair Drake with Oliverius and have senior Kim Katzenmeyer of Fergus Falls, Minn. catch Drake. Katzenmeyer hit .261 in the Big Ten last year and will captain this year's team. Other possibilities behind the plate are junior Mary Stallman of Columbia Heights, Minn., junior transfer from Minneapolis Community College Amy Iverson, and sophomore Deb Lewis of Richfield, Minn.

AROUND THE HORN -- The infield features several favorites at various positions, but Wells will be instituting many lineups to best utilize her personnel depending on who is pitching, and who is contributing at that point in the season.

At first base, Wells has utilized several players in the past, but look for Flis to get the most time there. Flis proved herself at the plate last year, leading the conference with a .406 batting average and earning recognition on the NCAA Midwest Regional team and first team all-Big Ten. She also set a new Minnesota season record with a .503 on-base percentage. Wells will also continue to use Flis as a designated hitter, with freshman Tonya Meredith of Aurora, Colo. or Oliverius filling in at first. Meredith may also be used as a designated hitter.

At second base, Wells plans to move over senior Jeana Cullen from shortstop. Cullen has been one of the teams' top defensive players the past several years and is third in career assists. Reserves at second will be freshman Sally Dighton of Boone, Ia., or Oliverius.

Cray will get the first nod at shortstop, but sophomore Deb Lange of LaCrescent, Minn. will also play there. Lange started 13 games and appeared in 20 last year. Wells may also move either Cullen or Dighton over to short.

At third base, Wells will look to freshman Kathy Casull to fill in for the loss of starter Leininger. Another contender is sophomore Lewis who saw considerable playing time as a rookie, appearing in 42 games and starting 30, even though often she was in the outfield. Wells also plans to use Lewis as a designated hitter.

Minnesota Softball Outlook -3-3-3-3-

IN THE OUTFIELD -- Three sophomores will be relied upon to handle most of the outfield duties, as they did the second half of last season. At left field, Wells pre-season favorite is sophomore Jackie Savis of St. Louis, Mo. who finished fifth on the team in batting last season (.222) and started in 25 of 49 games, including 11 of the last 13.

In center field, Wells will utilize Kelly Darrow of Inver Grove, Hts., Minn. Darrow started in 29 games as a rookie in left field and finished the season batting .198. In right field, Stacy Hohertz of Minnetonka, Minn. will be looked to. She earned a regular assignment in center field midway through last year, starting 15 of the last 16 games.

Reserves in the outfield could include Cullen, Katzenmeyer, Lange, Oliverius or Stallman, according to Wells.

THE BIG TEN -- Wells expects defending champion Northwestern to be strong again, behind the arm of NCAA record-holding pitcher Lisa Ishikawa. She also expects second place Michigan and third place Indiana to field good teams. "It's really difficult to predict how we will finish," says Wells. "If we can get performance out of our young people we will be okay. I'm starting three sophomores, and we will need them to bring their bats around and play solid defense."

THE SCHEDULE -- Minnesota will play Nebraska prior to the annual Roadrunner Invitational in Las Cruces, N.M. March 6-8. At the end of the month, the Gophers will play Texas A&M and compete in the Houston Classic March 27-29. The Big Ten single round-robin schedule will begin at home with a four game series against Iowa April 4-5.

MINNESOTA HOSTS 1986 BIG TEN GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIPS ---

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The University of Minnesota will be the host school for the 1986 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championships on March 21 and 22 at Williams Arena. Team competition will be held on Friday, March 21 beginning at 6 p.m., and individual finals will be on Saturday, March 22 at 7 p.m.

TICKETS -- Tickets are available for a single session or in a two-day package. Single-session ticket prices are \$5 for adults and \$3 for students and children. Two-day tickets are \$8 for adults and \$5 for students and children. Tickets are available in the athletic ticket office in the Bierman Building.

PRESS CREDENTIALS-- Press credentials must be requested in advance of the meet and only tournament press passes will be honored at the gate. Requests should be sent to sports information director Karen Smith at 376-5259.

BROADCAST -- KMSB-TV, Channel 9 will be broadcasting a two-hour tape delayed special on the championship on Sunday, March 23 at 12-noon. Former Gopher All-American gymnast Robin Huebner will provide the color commentary.

TEAMS -- Seven teams, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Ohio State, and Wisconsin will compete in the fifth officially-sanctioned conference championship. Ohio State has won the last three championships. Michigan State was the runnerup in 1985, and Minnesota finished third in 1985 and second in 1983 and 1984.

INDIVIDUAL COMPETITION -- Along with the team title, individual titles will be awarded in the all-around, vault, uneven bars, balance beam, and floor exercise. Competition for these titles will be strong, as all of the individual champions will be returning to defend their titles. In addition, only one member of last year's fourteen-member all-Big Ten team was a senior.

Individually, two-time all-around champion Mary Olsen of Ohio State will be trying to win her third consecutive all-around title and retain her titles in the balance beam and uneven bars. Other strong competition from Ohio State includes senior Nina Dziem, the 1985 conference vaulting champion and junior Patti Monaghan, who finished second in the all-around in 1985. Michigan State freshman Kim Hartwick will also be in the race for the all-around title. Hartwick is one of the top twenty all-arounders in the nation and the conference leader.

GOPHERS --For Minnesota, junior Laurie Kaiser will be trying to win the vault and floor exercise titles she captured in 1984. Kaiser holds the Big Ten vaulting record with an 18.95 score. Although she has struggled with injuries last year and part of this year, Kaiser could also be a threat in the all-around competition. Other Gophers aiming for a Big Ten title are junior Shelly Brown, the school's top scorer in the vault, uneven bars and all-around, and senior Wendy Dorsey. Dorsey has finished third in the all-around at the Big Ten Championships twice, in 1984 and 1983.

MORE ON SWIMMING LATER THIS WEEK

WALLNER, FREEMAN EARN TOP HONORS AT BIG TEN SWIMMING, GOPHERS FINISH SECOND

Minnesota swimmer Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) was named the 1986 Big Ten Swimmer of the Year and head Gopher swimming Coach Jean Freeman was named the 1986 Big Ten Coach of the year this past weekend at the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships. Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships this year, behind Ohio State, who has won the championships five straight times. It is the third time in three years Minnesota has finished second. Iowa tied with the Gophers this year for second, with both teams scoring 509.5 points, compared to Ohio State's 552.

WALLNER FASTEST IN NATION -- Wallner, a senior tri-captain, earned the title for her top performances in two individual and three relay events. She set a Big Ten record in the 50 yard freestyle with a preliminary time of :22.97, which is the fastest time turned in this year by any female collegiate swimmer in the country. The previous Big Ten record was 23:47, set in 1982 by Ohio State's Terri Paumier. Wallner went on to win the 50 freestyle with a time of :23.09, which was then the second fastest time ever in the Big Ten. Her prelim time obviously sets a Minnesota varsity record and qualifies her for the NCAA Division I Nationals.

Wallner also recorded the second fastest time in Big Ten history by swimming a split time of :22.98 in the first leg of the 200 yard freestyle relay which the Gophers won (1:34.06). In the 100 yard freestyle, Wallner broke a three-year-old Big Ten record with a prelim time of :50.69, and won the event with a :50.72. Her time, which exceeds the NCAA qualifying standard, eclipses the previous record of :50.87, set in 1983 by Naomi Marabushi of Michigan. Wallner was also a member of two other relay teams, both of which qualified for national competition-- the 200 yard medley and 800 yard freestyle.

FREEMAN COACH OF THE YEAR-- For the second time in her thirteen years as Minnesota's head women's swimming coach, Jean Freeman has been named the Big Ten Coach of the Year. She also received the honor in 1984. Freeman has compiled an impressive 95-26 win/loss record in dual meets, and has led the Gophers to three consecutive second place finishes in the Big Ten in the past three years.

(BASKETBALL CLOSSES OUT SEASON ON ROAD AT PURDUE & ILLINOIS) -- The Gopher women's basketball team will be seeking to break two streaks this weekend as they close out the 1985-86 season on the road. Minnesota has lost five straight games, and also is winless on the road this year with a 0-12 road and 8-5 home record. The fewest road wins in the record book is the 1-6 mark during the 1973-74 season when Minnesota finished at 3-10 overall.

Ohio State will be hosting Michigan and Michigan State and Iowa will be traveling to Illinois and Purdue in the race to determine the conference champion as both teams are tied at 14-2. Minnesota would need to win both games this weekend in order finish in eighth place, or in a tie for eighth place with Northwestern. This year marks the Gophers lowest Big Ten finish in the three seasons of double round-robin play, previously the Gophers have finished third (1982-83), seventh (1983-84) and third (1984-85).

COACHES -- Ellen Hanson is in her ninth year at Minnesota with a 160-99 overall record, in her twelfth year overall (214-110) and ninth year in the Big Ten (64-37). Ruth Jones is in her 14th season at Purdue with a 156-171 career mark, and has a Big Ten record of 32-87 in her eleventh season. Laura Golden is in her second year at Illinois (30-24), and in the Big Ten (17-17) but is in her twelfth season overall with a 205-102 record.

BOILER BRIEFS -- Purdue is enjoying the most successful year ever in basketball history with a 15-10 overall and 8-8 conference record...the Boiler's are 8-3 at home. Four starters return from last year, including freshman All-American guard Sharon Versyp who is leading the team with a 14.3 ppg average. Versyp scored 26 points behind 10-15 field goals and 6-6 free throw shooting in the first meeting with the Gophers.

ILLINI OUTLOOK -- Illinois has a 10-2 home record and has won six of their last seven games, with the loss to league-leader Ohio State...the Illini must play host to Iowa on Thursday. Jonelle Polk has been named Big Ten Player of the Week three times this season, averaging 20.5 ppg overall. She had 20 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Minnesota earlier this year. In a win over Purdue last weekend, Polk scored 22 and guard Lisa Bradley 18 points.

GOPHER NOTES -- Once again, the Gophers failed to score enough points in the loss to Indiana on Friday, 69-75...the Gophers are being outscored in the Big Ten 71.1 to 65.0 and in the last five losses by a margin of 73.0 to 63.4...Molly Tadich scored over 20 points for the first time since Jan. 26 against the Hoosiers with 24 points and 11 rebounds...a factor in the Gophers loss at Indiana was Peterka fouling out at 4:31 and Kinney fouling out at 4:11...
Against Ohio State, the Gophers battled back within five points in the last few minutes of the game from a 21 point deficit, before losing 70-77...Carol Peterka scored 16 of her 18 points in the second half, and Diane Kinney had a career high of 18 points and 12 rebounds...Kinney also had 12 points on Friday...Tadich had 12 rebounds, nine points, and a career high of 7 blocks against the Buckeyes...Lisa Hoelscher scored 12 points against Ohio State.

GYMNASTS HAVE WEEK OFF AFTER COMPETING AT UCLA -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team will have a week to train after weekend competition at the UCLA Invitational. The Gophers placed second to the host Bruins and finished ahead of UC-Santa Barbara. Final team scores were UCLA 186.35, Minnesota 178.90, and UC-Santa Barbara 170.85. The next competition for the team will be at the BYU Invitational on Saturday, March 15, against Arizona, BYU, and Utah State.

COACH'S COMMENTS -- "We had a good meet," Minnesota assistant coach Gabor Deli said. "Our goal was to hit 180 and we very nearly did it." Deli coached the team this weekend because his wife, head coach Katalin Deli, was ill with the flu. Deli said that the team did exceptionally well on three events, but "there were a lot of falls on the (balance) beam."

INDIVIDUAL RESULTS -- Junior Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was the Gophers' leading all-arounder for the fourth time this season at the UCLA meet. She scored a 36.65 all-around and finished third. Brown also tied for second in the floor exercise with a 9.30 mark, and was the team leader in the vault (9.20) and uneven bars (9.25). The uneven bars score is a new season high score for the team, and it ties Brown's personal best in that event.

Junior Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) scored 35.90 and placed fifth in the all-around. She was the team leader on the balance beam with a 9.10 score and the only Gopher that didn't fall off the beam during her routine. According to Deli, Kaiser performed very well because she was ill from an ear infection all week. Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Sask.), a leading all-arounder, missed three event because of a bruised heel, but scored a 9.10 on the uneven bars.

GOPHERS BREAK INTO NATIONAL TOP TWENTY -- After scoring 182.05 points in the February 23 meet against Winona State, the Gophers cracked the national top twenty standings for the first time this season. According to National Gymnastics Scoring Service from the University of Washington, Minnesota was 18th in the nation last week. The standings are based on the team scores and are released weekly.

TENNIS TEAM HAS TWO WEEKS OFF BEFORE NEXT COMPETITION -- After eight matches in three weeks, the Minnesota women's tennis team will take two weeks off before traveling to Florida for a spring break training trip. Over the weekend, the Gophers defeated conference rival Ohio State 7-2 but lost 7-2 to a strong Miami of Ohio team. "We played well all weekend," Minnesota head coach Jack Roach said. "We had some strong matches and solid competition overall." Minnesota's record is now 9-5 overall, 2-1 in the Big Ten.

WEEKEND HIGHLIGHTS -- Senior Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, SD) and freshman Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario) were undefeated in singles play last weekend. Rost now has five straight singles wins at number two and number one singles. Dick has had three consecutive wins and has won five of her last six matches. Roach also cited impressive play by senior Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN) and junior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA). Both players split their singles matches, and Bjerken was a member of the weekend's only winning doubles team. She and freshman Foon Huie (DULUTH, MN) won their number three doubles match against Ohio State.

Roach was especially impressed with the play of two freshman, Dick and Huie: "Our freshman played well for us. They filled in the gaps well." The gaps were left by injured freshman Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden), who did not compete last weekend, and senior Lisa Martin (ST. PAUL, MN), who injured her leg during Saturday's loss to Miami of Ohio.

(INDOOR TRACK TEAM PLACES NINTH IN BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS)

The Gopher women's indoor track and field team, led by Jo Arvesen (WASECA, MN), Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN), Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) and Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN), scored 12 points to place ninth at the Big Ten Indoor Championships in Bloomington, Ind. Feb. 28-March 1. Wisconsin won it's ninth indoor title, amassing 126 points, easily outdistancing second-place Indiana at 85. For the Gophers, it was their seventh straight ninth-place finish.

Although Minnesota did not score well as a team, several individual Gophers performed admirably. Minnesota's two best performances came from Arvesen in the pentathlon and Johnson in the 880-yard run. Arvesen, in her first full pentathlon, accumulated 3186 points to claim fourth place overall. Johnson also claimed a fourth place in the 880, where she cut three seconds off her seasonal best, running a 2:12.94.

Other solid performances were turned in by Eder in the mile and Stoltman in the 60-yard hurdles. Eder ran a 4:50.66 to place fifth in her final Big Ten indoor meet. Stoltman set a personal best of 8.01 on her way to placing fifth in the hurdles. It was the fourth straight time that Stoltman had broke her personal best.

WILSON HAPPY WITH TEAM'S PERFORMANCE-- "I was real pleased with our team attitude and enthusiasm," said Wilson. "I think that the team realized at the meet that in a few years, they can be right up there competing with schools like Wisconsin and Indiana. I think that this meet might have been the turning point for our entire program."

GOPHERS TO HOLD CLINIC, GO SOUTH UNTIL OUTDOOR SEASON--The Gopher coaching staff and members of the track team will hold a track clinic for high school athletes on Saturday, March 8 in the newly-remodeled Field House. After that, the Gophers will travel to Houston, Texas on March 22-29 to compete in the Rice Invitational and train for their upcoming outdoor season.

(SEVEN SWIMMERS QUALIFY FOR NCAA NATIONALS)--

Seven members of the Minnesota women's swimming and diving team qualified for the NCAA Division I Championships in seven events during the recent Big Ten Championships at the Walter Schroeder Aquatic Center, Brown Deer, Wisc. The national championships will be held March 20-22 at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville.

Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) will be competing in the 50 (:22.97) and 100 yard (:50.69) freestyles, the 200 (1:34.06), 400 (3:25.90) and 800 (7:32.65) yard freestyle relay teams, and the 200 medley relay team (1:45.51).

Burnsville junior Sue Roell, will compete in the 100 breaststroke (1:04.43), as well as the 200 free and 200 medley relays. Senior tri-captain Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) and freshman Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN) join Wallner and Roell in the 200 yard relays. Gunard is also on the 400 free relay team.

Other qualifiers in the 800 freestyle relay are freshmen Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY VILLAGE, MN) and Sanna Harkonen (HYVINKAA, FINLAND), and sophomore Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN). Schirmers and Volna also qualified as members of the 400 freestyle relay team.

Wallner and Schirmers earned All-American honors in the 400 freestyle relay at last year's NCAA Division I Championships.

FREEMAN COACH OF THE YEAR-- For the second time in her thirteen years as Minnesota's head women's swimming coach, Jean Freeman has been named the Big Ten Coach of the Year. She also received the honor in 1984. Freeman has compiled an impressive 95-26 win/loss record in dual meets, and has led the Gophers to three consecutive second place finishes in the Big Ten in the past three years.

GOPHERS FINISH SECOND AT BIG TEN'S-- Minnesota finished second in the Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships this year, behind Ohio State, who won their fifth straight title. It is the third time in three years Minnesota has finished second. Iowa tied with the Gophers this year for second, with both teams scoring 509.5 points, compared to Ohio State's 552.

WALLNER SWIMMER OF THE MONTH, YEAR -- Diane Wallner's performance during the month of February added another award to the ones she's already garnered this year: the February Big Ten Swimmer of the Month. She is the only Gopher athlete in any sport to receive the award this school year. Wallner was also named the 1986 Big Ten Swimmer of the Year at the conclusion of the Big Ten Conference Swimming and Diving Championships on March 1. At the championships, she received plaques for her first place finishes in the 50 and 100 freestyles, the 200 yard medley relay, and the 200 and 800 yard freestyle relays. In January, she was the recipient of the Outstanding Collegiate Athlete of the Year Award for an individual sport at the Minnesota March of Dimes Sports Awards Dinner.

FASTEST IN NATION -- Wallner earned the Big Ten Swimmer of the Year title for her top performances in two individual and three relay events. She set a Big Ten record in the 50 yard freestyle with a preliminary time of :22.97, which is the fastest time turned in this year by any female collegiate swimmer in the country. The previous Big Ten record was 23:47, set in 1982 by Ohio State's Terri Paumier. Wallner went on to win the 50 freestyle with a time of :23.09, which was then the second fastest time ever in the Big Ten. Her prelim time set a Minnesota varsity record.

Wallner then recorded the second fastest time in Big Ten history by swimming a split time of :22.98 in the first leg of the 200 yard freestyle relay. In the 100 yard freestyle, Wallner broke a three-year-old Big Ten record with a prelim time of :50.69, and won the event with a :50.72. Her time, which exceeds the NCAA qualifying standard, eclipses the previous record of :50.87, set in 1983 by Naomi Marabushi of Michigan.

GOPHERS SET TWO RECORDS IN RELAYS -- Minnesota's 200 free and 200 medley relay teams set three records, with four swimmers receiving the honors. Roell, Elsen, Wallner and Gunard set a varsity and Big Ten record in the 200 yard freestyle relay (1:34.06 - previous record 1:34.60 set by Minnesota in 1985), and a varsity record in the 200 medley relay (1:45.51).

ROELL SETS 100 BREASTSTROKE RECORDS -- Sue Roell set a Big Ten and a varsity record with her prelim time (1:04.43) in the 100 yard breaststroke, and then came back later in the day to win the event with a time of 1:04.62. Roell was fifth in the 50 yard freestyle (:24.33), 10th in the 200 yard breaststroke (2:25.81) and 13th in the 100 yard freestyle.

FINNS ONLY GOPHERS IN 400 I.M. FINALS -- Senior Mana Raikalla and freshman Sanna Harkonen, both from Finland and members of the Finnish national Swimming Team, were the only Gophers to score in the 400 yard individual medley, with Raikalla (4:32.56) fourth, and Harkonen (4:33.98) 11th. Raikkala was also 11th in the 200 butterfly (2:06.52).

FIVE SWIMMERS IN 100 YARD BACKSTROKE-- Five Gophers scored points in the 100 yard backstroke, with Wallner (1:00.06) fourth, Gunard (1:00.84) seventh, freshman Kelly McClure (RAPID CITY, SD) (1:03.25) eighth, Harkonen 13th and senior tri-captain Nancy Touve (GOLDEN VALLEY, MN) (1:02.83) 16th. McClure was fourth (2:09.17) and Harkonen 10th (2:10.56) in the 200 yard backstroke.

OTHER GOPHER FINISHERS -- Volna was sixth (:52.07) in the 100 yard freestyle with Gunard scoring at 10th (:52.59). Volna was also seventh in both the 100 yard butterfly (:58.18) and 200 yard freestyle (1:52.23), and sixth in the 50 free (:24.35). Schirmers was sixth (17:09.44) in the 1650 freestyle, third (4:56.30) in the 500 freestyle, and 10th in the 200 yard freestyle (1:53.14). Freshman Diane Erstad (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was 16th in the 1650 freestyle (17:41.59), 500 freestyle (5:05.56) and the 200 individual medley (2:13.77).

Diane Almstrom (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) was 11th in the 200 yard breaststroke (2:27.56) with teammate Cindy Hovet (BELLEVUE, WA) 14th (2:29.30). Almstrom was 12th (1:08.91) in the 100 yard breaststroke and Hovet 14th (1:09.34). Elsen was sixth in the 100 yard butterfly (:57.66) and 10th in the 50 yard freestyle (:24.65).

DIVERS SCORE POINTS -- Sophomore Maureen Lewis (GREEN BAY, WISC.) was eighth in one meter diving with 402.57 points and freshman Jennifer Carpenter (GRAND RAPIDS, MINN.) was 15th with 356.43 points. Carpenter also finished 16th in three meter diving with 370.89 points.

RECAPS OF BASKETBALL SEASON AND
SPRING SOFTBALL TRIP

GYMNASTS TRAVEL TO BYU; LAST MEET BEFORE HOSTING BIG TEN'S --

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team will make its last road trip of the regular season this Saturday, March 15, when they travel to the BYU Invitational in Provo, Utah. The Gophers will compete against two Midwest Region opponents, Utah State and host Brigham Young. "The kids feel confident coming in to this meet," says head coach Katalin Deli. "This meet will have good competition for us. It is also our final preparation for Big Ten's." Minnesota will be hosting the 1986 Big Ten Championship on March 21 and 22 in Williams Arena. Minnesota will also be hoping to boost their regional qualifying average, as this is the Gophers last away meet of the season.

GOPHER NOTES -- Deli is not sure if junior Candi Doell (SASKATOON, Canada) will be competing all-around in Saturday's meet. Doell bruised her heel before the Winona State meet in February and did not compete in that meet, but she competed on the uneven bars at the UCLA Invitational two weeks ago. "Candi is better," says Deli, "but I can't decide yet if she will go all-around."

Probable all-arounders for the invitational are senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) and juniors Shelly Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN). Kaiser has competed in the last two meets with an ear infection, but Deli says that she is coming around and feeling better.

THE COMPETITION -- Minnesota will be facing a nationally-ranked Utah State team. In national standings, Utah State is ranked tenth, and the Gophers are eighteenth. In the Midwest Region, Utah State is ranked third and Minnesota sixth.

Brigham Young has a dual meet record of 3-3. Their top team score is a 178.55 mark. Sophomore Gina Hansen leads the Cougars in all events with top scores of 9.30 on the vault, 9.25 on the uneven bars, 9.20 on the balance beam, a school-record 9.60 on the floor exercise, and a 36.45 mark in the all-around.

SERIES NOTES: Minnesota is 0-1 against Brigham Young, with their only meeting coming at the 1982 AIAW National Championships. BYU scored 140.85 points and placed sixth; Minnesota scored a 140.65 and placed seventh. Minnesota leads the series between Utah State 4-3. They last met at the 1984 NCAA Midwest Regionals, where Minnesota placed fourth and Utah State finished sixth.

BASKETBALL CLOSES OUT 1986 SEASON -- The Gopher women's basketball team was unsuccessful last weekend in their bid to avert a winless road record for the 1985-86 season. The Gophers lost at Purdue 78-95 and at Illinois 68-79 ending the year with an 8-20 overall record, including a seven-game losing streak at season's end. Minnesota's 0-12 away, and 0-2 neutral site road record marked the first season since records began in 1973-74 that Minnesota has failed to win at least one game on the road. The previous low was 1-6 on the road in 1973-74.

THREE BIG TEN TEAMS TO NCAA -- For the first time, three teams have been selected to the NCAA tournament from the Big Ten. Previously only the conference champion received an automatic bid, but this year the NCAA field was expanded from 32 to 40 teams. First place Ohio State (15-2) will host Maryland in the second round Sunday, while second place Iowa (15-3) will play at Tennessee on Sunday. Third place Illinois (12-6) will host Ohio University in the first round on Wednesday.

GOPHER SEASON NOTES -- Minnesota dropped from a third place finish in the league last year to ninth in the Big Ten this year with a 4-14 record, their worst finish in the four years of double round-robin play. In addition, this year marks only the second losing season ever for Gopher Head Coach Ellen Mosher Hanson, and the fewest total victories by a Hanson coached team. Her 12 year career record now stands at 214-113 (.654) and her nine year Minnesota record is now 160-102 (.611). Minnesota suffered losses for the first time ever to both Purdue on the road, and Michigan in both meetings this year.

HANSON CITES LOW SCORING -- "Basically, we did not score enough points this year," says Coach Hanson. "We'd always get three people to come through, but we never got that fourth person, and it was always a different person who did not come through. Last year we either had four scorers, or three people with Laura (Coenen) scoring enough for two people. If we could have had one more player score 12 points a game it would have changed our season."

STATISTICS -- Overall, opponents outscored Minnesota 72.9 to 67.9 and in the Big Ten the margin was 6.9 ppg (72.8 to 65.9). The Gophers outrebounded opponents 42.0 to 39.3 in league play and by 2.2 rebounds overall, but shot poorly from the field, averaging around .42 percent in the Big Ten and overall.

BASKETBALL PLAYER NOTES --

PETERKA ENDS CAREER IN RECORD BOOK -- Gopher senior tri-captain Carol Peterka of St. Cloud, Minn. ended her career playing in all 110 games and starting 96. She ranks third on the all-time scoring list with 1,441 points and is also fourth in rebounding with 744 caroms. She is also ranked third in field goals made (595) and fourth in field goals attempted (1286). Peterka averaged 13.1 ppg and 6.8 rebounds over her career as well as 2.4 assists and 1.3 steals. She averaged 14.3 ppg overall this year and 7.9 rebounds and scored 28 points at Purdue last weekend, her second highest of the year (the highest in the opener with 29 against Western Michigan).

TADICH HAS SUPERLATIVE SEASON -- Junior 6-2 forward/center Molly Tadich of Bloomington/Jefferson scored the third most points ever in a season with 511, behind Laura Coenen's 581 in 1982-83 and 708 in 1984-85. Tadich connected on 210 field goals (4th on season list) of 484 attempts (2nd on season list). She led the Gophers with an 18.3 ppg average and 11.7 rebounding average and also led the Big Ten in rebounding (11.1) and blocked shots (1.9).

After three seasons, Tadich's career rebounding average is 11.0 and her scoring average is 15.1, and she is ranked sixth in career scoring with 1,237 points and third in career rebounding with 904 caroms. Tadich hit in double figures in 24 of 28 games this year including highs of 27 points at home against Iowa and 30 points hitting 15 of 17 shots from the field in the season finale at Illinois last Saturday. She also rebounded in double figures 21 of 28 games.

HOELSCHER ENDS CAREER -- Senior tri-captain Lisa Hoelscher of Elmhurst, Ill. also completed her career starting in all 28 games this season and averaging a season high of 7.4 ppg and 2.6 assists. Hoelscher scored in double figures in 11 games with a season high of 15 points against Drake Dec. 17. A durable player, Hoelscher appeared in 100 of a possible 110 games during her career.

PHILLIPS IMPROVES GUARD PLAY -- Junior 5-10 guard Cindy Phillips of E. Lansing, Mich. made substantial improvements this season in her play, averaging 10.3 ppg, 4.3 assists and 1.7 steals during the Big Ten season. Overall, she averaged 8.5 ppg and scored in double figures in 12 games, hitting a career high of 17 points twice, against Purdue Jan. 7 and Indiana Feb. 2. She closed out the year with 14 points against Illinois last weekend.

KINNEY, PIRAM IMPROVE AT CENTER -- Neither sophomore 6-4 center Diane Kinney of Burnsville, Minn. or 6-0 center Susie Piram of St. Paul/Derham Hall had scored in double figures prior to this season. But both players scored several career firsts this year. Kinney quickly asserted herself with 14 and 16 points the first weekend of play and ended the year averaging 9.1 ppg and 6.9 rebounds overall. Kinney started in 23 of 28 games, scoring in double figures 11 times, with a career high of 18 pts March 2 against Ohio State. Piram averaged 17.9 minutes off the bench and started four games in the middle of the Big Ten season, while appearing in 27 of 28 games. She averaged 5.1 points and rebounds in the Big Ten and scored a career high of 14 points Feb. 7 at Iowa and grabbed a career high of 14 rebounds Feb. 14 against Michigan State.

SOFTBALL REVENGES LOSSES TO #2 NEBRASKA IN TOURNEY The Gopher women's softball team opened the 1986 season last week with a trip to Las Cruces, NM, and opened with doubleheader losses to last year's national runner-up and #2 ranked team Nebraska. However, the following day, in pool play of the 18-team Roadrunner Invitational hosted by New Mexico State University, the Gophers upset the Cornhuskers 7-6. Minnesota placed fifth in pool play, and then placed third in the consolation bracket at the tourney. A brief recap of the road trip follows.

In the opening doubleheader the Gophers scored two runs in the first game with senior pitcher Judy Oliverius taking the loss (2-6). The Gophers first run was scored in the third inning on a RBI double by sophomore Deb Lewis (RICHFIELD, MN) who was pinch-hitting. The other Gopher score came in the seventh inning when senior catcher Kim Katzenmeyer (FERGUS FALLS, MN) hit a triple and then scored on an error. In the second game, junior pitcher Carla Cray took the loss in the 6-0 Husker win, as the Gophers committed seven errors.

POOL PLAY -- On Thursday, junior Barb Drake (ST PAUL) pitched 17 1/3 innings, picking up victories over New Mexico Highlands (5-0) when she allowed just one hit, on a shutout and struck-out four. Drake also relieved for Cray against Nebraska picking up the win in the upset (7-6) and suffered a loss to Arizona (1-2) in the opener that day. Against Nebraska Minnesota scored six runs in the second inning with RBI's by freshman Kathy Casull, Oliverius, Drake, and senior Ann Flis (MENOMONIE, WI). The game winning run was scored in the top of the fourth when Flis singled and was brought in on an RBI double by designated hitter Deb Lewis. On Saturday, the Gophers finished pool play as Oliverius pitched 13 innings in losses to Utah State (2-3) and Arizona Western (2-3).

CONSOLATION ROUND -- Minnesota opened the consolation bracket with a win over Scottsdale Community College 7-0 with Cray picking up the win with a shutout and eight strikeouts with no walks and just four hits. Then the Gophers lost an extra inning game 1-0 to New Mexico with Drake taking the loss, pitching all ten innings, allowing five hits, striking out five and walking three. In the third place game, Oliverius picked up her first win as the Gophers defeated New Mexico Highlands 11-2. Oliverius and Cray both batted 2-4 in that game and hit home runs in the fifth inning.

STATS/NOTES -- Ann Flis is leading the team with a .379 batting average while Carla Cray is at .281 and Barb Drake at .267. "Carla Cray not only pitched well, but played outstanding defense," commented Coach Linda Wells. "Drake lost several close games, but was very adequate on the mound."

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The 1986 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championship will feature some of the best gymnasts in the country competing for team and individual honors. This year's championships could have the closest finish in the five years that the conference has officially sanctioned the championship. Ohio State University has won the title for the last three years, but the Buckeyes are far from being the runaway favorite for the 1986 title. Both Minnesota and Michigan State will also be contenders for the award.

In 1985, Ohio State won the team title, followed by Michigan State and Minnesota. In 1983 and 1984 Ohio State captured the team title and Minnesota was the runnerup.

THREE TOP-TWENTY TEAMS IN MEET -- Michigan State, Minnesota and Ohio State are the leading contenders for the team title. All three teams have been ranked among the top twenty teams in the nation and the top six in their respective NCAA regions. In the March 4 rankings, Ohio State was the top team in the Northeast Region, Michigan State was third in the Central Region, and Minnesota was sixth in the Midwest Region, the toughest region in the country.

Ohio State has a 12-2 overall record this season and has been ranked in the national top twenty all year. In 1985 the Buckeyes won their third straight Big Ten team title and the NCAA Northeast Regional title and ended their season with an eighth-place finish at the NCAA National Championships. Depth is the strongest feature of the 1986 squad, as the team returns all of last year's top performers, including six All-Big Ten selections. The Buckeyes are led by two-time Big Ten all-around champion Mary Olsen and the 1985 NCAA Northeast Regional all-around champion Nina Dziem.

Michigan State, the 1985 runnerup, returns three All-Big Ten selections, Keiko Timmermann, Kelly Doyle, and Linda Schmauder. The Spartans' leading gymnast in 1986 has been freshman Kim Hartwick. Hartwick has set new school records in the all-around and balance beam, and was named the Big Ten Gymnast of the Month in January. Michigan State's record is 11-4, including wins over conference rivals Illinois and Michigan.

Minnesota will be trying to rebound from last year's third-place conference finish. A healthy Laurie Kaiser and consistent performances by the entire team should allow the Gophers to give Ohio State close competition for the conference title. The Gophers have a 6-5 record overall and are 4-0 in dual meets. Shelly Brown has been the team all-around leader this year, aided by consistent performances from two-time all-conference selection Wendy Dorsey and junior Candi Doell. Although bothered by injuries most of last season, Kaiser has been named to the all-Big Ten team the past two years and will be in top form for the championships.

All-Around

Ohio State junior Mary Olsen has been bothered by injuries this season, but she will be one of the favorites when she goes for her third straight all-around title. The toughest competition will come from Ohio State teammate Nina Dziem, Gophers Shelly Brown, Laurie Kaiser, and Wendy Dorsey, and Michigan State freshman Kim Hartwick.

Olsen has a top all-around score of 37.05, good for fourth in the conference. Olsen has not won the all-around in 1986 competition, but she has been the Buckeye's highest scorer on the balance beam all season.

Dziem, the Big Ten's Gymnast of the Month for February, currently has the highest all-around score in the conference, a 37.50 scored against West Virginia. In previous Big Ten Championships, Dziem placed second in the all-around in 1984 and eighth in 1985.

Michigan State freshman Kim Hartwick is another gymnast in the running for the all-around title. Hartwick set a new Michigan State all-around record with a 37.25 score -- the second highest conference score. Hartwick has won the all-around eight times for the Spartans.

For Minnesota, Shelly Brown has been the Gophers' leading all-arounder this season. Her top all-around score is a 37.15, tying the school record. Three of Minnesota's top five all-around scores this season are Brown's and she has won the all-around in two meets this season.

Kaiser has battled injuries and illness this season, but she is healthy now and will be a top contender for the all-around title. Her top all-around score this season is a 37.00 mark. In previous conference championships, Kaiser has placed fifth and seventh in the all-around.

Dorsey placed third in the all-around at the 1983 and 1984 Big Ten Championships. In addition, she has competed in the individual event finals for three years. Consistency is the strong point of Minnesota's only senior gymnast, and 1986 could be the year she wins the all-around crown.

Vault

The vault fields the strongest competition, with over a dozen gymnasts who could win the title. The event also returns two conference vaulting champions, Ohio State senior Nina Dziem, the 1985 titlest, and Minnesota junior Laurie Kaiser, the 1984 champion and holder of the conference vaulting record (18.95). Co-holders of the top conference vaulting score, however, are two Ohio State freshman: Monica Stavros and Julie Somers, with 9.60 marks. The next highest score is a 9.55 scored by Minnesota's Shelly Brown.

Ohio State and Minnesota have the top vaulting scores and should again dominate this event. Leading Buckeye vaulters include Patty Black, Dziem, and Patti Monaghan. Both Black and Monaghan competed in the vault finals at the 1985 championships.

In addition to Brown and Kaiser, Gopher junior Candi Doell and senior Wendy Dorsey are leading vaulters. Doell placed fourth in the vault at the 1984 Championships, and Dorsey has placed sixth for the last two years and second in 1983.

Other contenders for the vaulting title will be Laura Hicks from Illinois and Wisconsin freshman Beth Benevente. Benevente set a new Wisconsin vaulting record, scoring a 9.35, and Hicks has consistently scored above a 9.00 all season.

Uneven Bars

Ohio State swept the bars competition in 1985 and they will probably sweep the event in 1986. Ohio State gymnasts own the top four conference scores this season, led by Patty Black's 9.65 mark. Mary Olsen is the defending uneven bars champion, but injuries have hampered her performances this year.

Michigan State senior Frances Marino is another high scorer in this event. Her 9.40 is the third-highest season score, tying her with Buckeyes Diane Cunningham and Patti Monaghan.

The uneven bars are Minnesota's weakest event, but the Gophers are capable of strong performances. Shelly Brown has the teams' top score, a 9.25, good for ninth in the Big Ten. Wendy Dorsey, Candi Doell, and sophomore Mary Jo Mastel are other consistent bars workers.

Balance Beam

Mary Olsen is also the defending balance beam champion. She and teammate Barrie Muzbeck have the top conference season score, a 9.70 mark. Nina Dziem and Kim Hartwick have 9.60 scores and will be strong contenders for the title.

Laurie Kaiser placed second on the balance beam in 1984 and third in 1985 and she is also a leading performer in this event. Kaiser tied her own school balance beam record (9.50) earlier this season. Shelly Brown's 9.40 mark is another top conference score.

Other top beam performers include Illinois sophomore Missy Ruf with a 9.55 score, and teammate Allison Garrity with a 9.45 mark. As a team, Illinois has a top score of 46.20, behind Ohio State's 46.90, and ahead of Minnesota's 45.40.

Floor Exercise

The 1985 floor exercise champion, Michigan sophomore Angela Williams will not defend her title because of a season-ending shoulder injury. This event, like the vault, fields a large number of title contenders, including 1984 champion Laurie Kaiser.

The conference's top floor exercise score, a 9.65, is held by Ohio State freshman Monica Stavros. Nina Dziem and Mary Jo Mastel have both scored a 9.60, followed by Wisconsin's Beth Benevente, Kaiser, and Ohio State freshman Michelle Schulte with 9.55 scores.

Ohio State junior Tracey Long placed second behind Williams last season, and her 9.40 season-high score puts her among the top ten scorers in the conference. Other returning gymnasts who placed in the floor exercise last year are Minnesota's Linda Bednar (fourth place), Wendy Dorsey (fifth place), and Michigan's Heidi Cohen (fifth place). In addition, Shelly Brown, Kim Harwick, Illinois' Luan Roberts and Allison Garrity are among the conference scoring leaders.

SPRING SPORTS -- Previews and media guides will be mailed later this week for Spring Break week trips of golf, tennis, outdoor track and softball March 24-30.

(GOPHERS HOST BIG TEN WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP) -- The 1986 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championship will be held this weekend in Williams Arena on the University of Minnesota campus. Two sessions of the championship will be conducted on Friday and Saturday, March 21 and 22. Tickets are available in the athletic ticket office in the Bierman Building.

TEAM PREVIEWS -- The Big Ten Conference is developing into a national gymnastics powerhouse. This weekend's competition will feature three nationally-ranked teams and four teams that are among the top six teams in their respective regions. As of March 4, Ohio State was ranked eighth in the nation and first in the NCAA Northeast Region; Michigan State was 20th in the nation and third in the Central Region; and Minnesota was 15th in the nation and sixth in the Midwest Region. In addition, Illinois was ranked fifth in the Central Region.

Defending champion Ohio State is favored to win the team title, with the strongest competition coming from Michigan State and Minnesota. Michigan State finished second at the 1985 Championship and Minnesota was the runnerup team in 1984 and 1983.

Illinois has a much-improved team and the Illini have the potential to finish among the top four teams at the championship. The team doesn't have a top individual performer but instead relies upon consistent performances from several strong gymnasts, including Laura Hicks and Luan Roberts. Illinois has an 8-5 overall record and defeated Southeast Missouri 177.60-175.15 in action last week. 1985 record: fifth at the Big Ten Championship (172.05 points).

Iowa heads into the championship with a 3-4 dual meet record. The Hawkeyes lost to Ball State 172.65-172.60 on Saturday. The team has battled injuries and illness all season, including the loss of 1985 All-Big Ten team member Wendy Hussar. Hussar has been out of competition since January because of a knee injury. Leading the team at the championship will be Jennifer DuBois and Mindy Taylor, the top competitors for the Hawkeyes all season. 1985 record: 4-2 in dual meets, eighth at the Big Ten Championship (170.25 points).

Michigan placed fourth at the 1985 Championship and will be trying to finish among the top three. The team has a 4-10 record overall and were defeated by Pitt 183.80-174.60 last weekend. The Wolverines have lost a key performer, 1985 floor exercise champion Angela Williams, to a shoulder injury. In addition, Joan Lybrook will not compete this weekend due to an ankle injury. 1985 record: 14-16 overall, fourth at the conference championship (172.95 points)

Michigan State, the 1985 runnerup, has three returning All-Big Ten selections and an outstanding newcomer, freshman Kim Hartwick. Hartwick has set new school records in the floor exercise and balance beam and was the Big Ten Gymnast of the Month in January. Michigan State has a 13-4 overall record after defeating Bowling Green and Clarion State last weekend. 1985 record: 13-6 in dual meets, second at the Big Ten meet (177.85 points).

On paper, **Ohio State** looks like the winners of their fourth consecutive title. The Buckeyes have a 12-2 record and did not compete last weekend. The Buckeyes have six returning members of the 1985 All-Big Ten team, including two-time conference all-around champion Mary Olsen. Another top performer for the team has been senior Nina Dziem, the February Gymnast of the Month. Ohio State also has no injured competitors. 1985 record: 9-1 in dual meets, Big Ten conference champions (180.85 points).

Minnesota had a slow start this season, but they have steadily improved with each meet. The team has a 7-6 record overall and are 4-0 in dual meets. The Gophers are a better team this season and they should give Ohio State a tough challenge for the conference title. 1985 record: 16-7 overall and third at the conference championship (175.15 points).

Wisconsin closed the regular season with wins over the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh and Western Michigan. The team is led by freshman Beth Benevente, who has set new school records in the all-around, floor exercise, balance beam and vault, surpassing the marks scored by 1985 All-Big Ten selection Susan Soldat. Freshman Sue Seymour has been bothered by a knee injury and is questionable for the conference meet. 1985 record: 15-13 in dual meets, sixth at the championship meet (171.75 points).

GYMNASTS SCORE HIGH AT BYU MEET; REGIONAL AVERAGE MOVES ABOVE 180 --

The women's gymnastics team scored above 180 for the third time this season at Saturday's BYU Invitational in Provo, UT. Minnesota scored 180.95 points, ahead of Brigham Young's 177.65, but behind Utah State's 181.20. Still, head coach Katalin Deli was pleased with the team's performance. "We did perform very well. We were clean and consistent. A lot of people were surprised at how well we looked," she said.

BROWN IS TOP ALL-AROUNDER AGAIN -- For the fifth time this season junior **Shelly Brown** (BLOOMINGTON, MN) was the team's top all-rounder. **Brown** scored a 35.75 mark and placed second all-around. She tied for first on the uneven bars, scoring a 9.25 for the second consecutive meet. **Brown** also placed third on the vault (9.40) and second on the balance beam (9.15). Gopher senior **Wendy Dorsey** (EDINA, MN) placed fourth all-around, scoring a 36.15. **Dorsey** won the balance beam with a new career-high 9.45 score -- the second highest score in Minnesota history.

BASKETBALL NAMES AWARDEES AT BANQUET -- The Gopher women's basketball team recognized several individuals at the annual awards brunch on Sunday. Senior forward **Carol Peterka** (ST. CLOUD/APOLLO) was named the teams' **Best Defensive Player** for the third straight season. Junior forward/center **Molly Tadich** (BLOOMINGTON/JEFFERSON) received the teams' **Gopher Award** based on best overall statistics in the most games during the season. **Most Improved Player** went to junior guard **Cindy Phillips** (E. LANSING, MI/EVERETT) and the **Sportsmanship Award** voted by the **FastBreak Club** was awarded to freshman **Cindy Bradley** (EUREKA/CA). The **Most Inspirational Award** did not go to a player, but to first year manager Jamiela Taylor. For the first time, Coach Ellen Hanson did not give out a MVP Award.

(WALLNER TOP SEED IN 50 FREESTYLE AT NCAA DIVISION I SWIMMING NATIONALS)

University of Minnesota senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) is the number one seed in the 50 yard freestyle for the NCAA Division I Swimming and Diving Championships. The championships will be held March 20-22 at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. Wallner earned the top slot when she clocked the fastest time in the country this year (:22.97) in the event during the recent Big Ten Championships.

The Alexander Ramsey High School graduate is also among the top qualifiers as the fifth seed in the 100 yard freestyle (:50.69). The number one seed in the 100 free is Conny Van Bentum of University of Southern California with a time of :49.7. Wallner will also compete in as many as four relay events at the championships.

ROELL ALSO AMONG TOP SEEDS -- Burnsville junior Sue Roell, winner of the 100 yard breaststroke at the recent Big Ten's, is seeded fifth in that event with a time of 1:04.43. Kathy Smith of Stanford is the number one seed with a time of 1:02.88. Roell is slated to be on two of the Minnesota relay teams during the meet.

THE RELAY EVENTS -- The Gophers are fielding four relay teams at the championships, with three of the teams among the top six seeds. All line-ups in the relay teams for the Gophers are tentative, as team members may be changed during the meet. The 200 yard freestyle relay team is seeded second with a time of 1:34.06 behind Michigan State (1:33.90). Competing for the maroon and gold are Wallner, Roell, Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE, MN) and Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY VILLAGE, MN).

Minnesota is seeded fifth in the 200 yard medley relay (1:45.51) with the team consisting of Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN), Wallner, Roell and Gunard. Texas is number one with time of 1:44.56. The Gophers are the sixth seed in the 400 yard freestyle relay (3:28.90) behind first seed Stanford (3:22.65). Swimming in the 400 free relay for Minnesota are Wallner, Gunard, Volna and Jodi Schirmers (ST. CLOUD, MN).

The 800 free relay team is seeded 22nd (7:32.65) behind Texas (7:16.24) and will feature Volna, Wallner, Schirmers and Diane Erstad (BLOOMINGTON, MN). Unlike the Big Ten's where relay teams compete only in the finals, all relays at the championships must qualify for the finals via prelims.

COACH FREEMAN'S COMMENTS -- "All our swimmers could score (top 16) if we do well and have a good meet," says head coach Jean Freeman. "The swimmers are looking good in practice, are healthy, and are confident they can compete against everyone at the championships."

DIVERS MISS CUT FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS -- Minnesota will not have any divers competing at the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. The Gophers faced extremely tough competition at the NCAA Zone Diving Meet this past weekend at Ohio State and didn't make the final cut. Only the top four divers at zones go on to the nationals.
