### GYMNASTS HOST IOWA STATE SATURDAY; FINISH SECOND AT BIG TENS --

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team will close the regular season at home this weekend when they host Iowa State. The dual meet begins at 4 p.m. on Saturday, March 29, in Williams Arena. Over the weekend, Minnesota hosted the 1986 Big Ten Women's Gymnastics Championship, finishing second as a team but winning two individual titles.

Saturday's meet will be the last chance for Minnesota to finish among the top six teams in the NCAA Midwest Region and advance to the regional championships to be held in two weeks. Minnesota's regional average is now 180.85, seventh in the region. "I hope we can compete in the regionals," said Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli. "After seeing some of the teams in our region, I believe that our place is in the regionals."

NOTING IOWA STATE -- The Iowa State Cyclones competed at the Big Eight Conference Championships last weekend but could only send four healthy gymnasts. The team placed fifth with an 82.50 score and had only one all-around competitor. The Cyclones have a 4-5 dual meet record with wins over Illinois-Chicago, Southern Illinois, Iowa and Northern Michigan. The team's highest score (174.45) came in a loss to conference rival Missouri. Top all-arounders for the team have been senior Kathy Edwards with a 35.65 score and sophomore Tracy Remien with a 35.60 mark.

OHIO STATE WINS FOURTH TEAM TITLE -- Ohio State won their fourth consecutive Big Ten team title Friday with a 181.80 score. The Gophers finished second with a 181.35, their second-highest team total of the season. Minnesota led through three events, but OSU clinched the victory with a 46.95 team score on the vault.

Coach Deli was pleased with her team's success: "Our team is almost the same team we had last year, while the other schools had significant recruiting years. It shows how hard these kids work. I'm really proud of them."

**BROWN WINS ALL-AROUND TITLE** -- Minnesota junior Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) won the all-around title scoring 37.35 and setting new school and Williams Arena records. Brown also set a new school vaulting record with a 9.60 score. "I'm really proud of Shelley," said Deli. "She has improved in college and many gymnasts don't." Brown's victory marks the first time since 1982 that an Ohio State gymnast has not won the all-around title.

Two-time all-around champion Mary Olsen of Ohio State finished third, scoring 36.60 and teammate Julie Somers placed second with a 36.85 total. Minnesota's Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH/ARMSTRONG) and Michigan State freshman Kim Hartwick tied for fourth with 36.50 scores. Minnesota senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) placed sixth scoring 36.05 points.

**FIVE GOPHERS COMPETE IN FINALS; KAISER WINS SECOND FLOOR EXERCISE TITLE** -- In the individual event finals held on Saturday, five Minnesota gymnasts competed: Dorsey, Brown, Kaiser, junior Linda Bednar (MAPLE GROVE, MN) and sophomore Mary Jo Mastel (BLOOMINGTON, MN). Brown was the only gymnast of the 19 finalists to compete in all four Olympic events, but she did not win any individual titles.

Kaiser competed in three event finals and won her second floor exercise title with a 9.35 score. Kaiser also won the event in 1984 and did not qualify for the event finals in 1985. "Laurie needed that win. I'm glad she was able to do that. She has one more year of competing but something always happens," said Deli. Kaiser also finished third on the uneven bars.

Three Minnesota gymnasts were named to the All-Big Ten team: Brown, Kaiser, and Mastel. The team consists of the top three finishers in each event excluding the top three all-arounders. Kaiser has been named to the team for three straight years.

**OTHER EVENT WINNERS** -- Ohio State freshman Julie Somers won the vault with a 9.70 score. That score broke the Williams Arena record of 9.65, also set by Somers during Friday's team competition.

OSU junior Mary Olsen successfully defended her uneven bars title, sharing first place with Wisconsin freshman Beth Benevente. Benevente's win marks the first time that a Wisconsin gymnast has won an individual title.

Another freshman, Michigan State's Kim Hartwick, won the balance beam title with a 9.40 score. Olsen, the defending champion, fell off the beam during her routine and scored 8.50. Hartwick also placed second on the floor exercise.

**GOPHER NOTES** -- Junior Candi Doell competed all-around at the championship for the first time since injuring her heel in February. Her all-around score was 34.35, and Deli is optimistic that she will be in top form for the Iowa State meet...Freshman Jana Way (SACRAMENTO, CA) has left the team for personal reasons. Way was academically ineligible for winter quarter competition... Assistant coach Gabor Deli will be coaching in an elite international meet in the Soviet Union this week. A gymnast from Deli's Olympic Gymnastics Academy, Jennifer Hedberg, qualified for the competition...Even if the Gopher team does not qualify for regionals, there is a good chance that Brown will qualify as an individual all-arounder. Brown's regional average is 36.92. Kaiser and Dorsey may also qualify as their regional averages are 36.22 and 36.08, respectively. The top six individual all-arounders whose teams do not qualify for the regional championships compete.

**(WALLNER EARNS ALL-AMERICAN HONORS, GOPHERS FINISH 21ST AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS)**

Senior tri-captain Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN) earned one All-American and four All-American Honorable Mention honors at the NCAA Division I Swimming and Diving Championships this past weekend at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. Minnesota had their best showing ever at the NCAA Championships, earning 46 points and finishing in 21st place. The Gophers previous best finish was 29th in 1985. This was Minnesota's fourth appearance at the NCAA's, competing before that in nine AIAW national meets, where their best finish was 15th place in 1982.

Wallner capped her University of Minnesota swimming career by earning her first collegiate All-American honor in an individual event with her 7th place finish in the 50 yard freestyle with a time of :23.45. In 1985, Wallner earned All-American honors as part of the Minnesota 400 free relay team at the NCAA finals. Wallner also earned All-American Honorable Mention honors this year in the 100 yard freestyle (16th-:51.46), the 400 (13th-3:26.83) and 200 free relays (11th-1:34.78), and the 200 yard medley relay (14th-1:47.01). Wallner also set a Gopher varsity record in the 50 yard backstroke (:27.04) in the lead-off leg of the 200 medley relay.

**ROELL SETS VARSITY RECORD AND EARNS HONORABLE MENTION--** Junior Sue Roell

(BURNSVILLE, MN) set a Minnesota varsity record and earned All-American Honorable Mention honors with her 10th finish in the 100 yard breaststroke with a time of 1:04.34. She held the previous varsity record (1:04.43) set at the Big Ten Championship's earlier this month. Roell also received All-American Honorable Mentions in the 400 and 200 free relays and the 200 medley relay.

Also winning All-American Honorable Mentions for their part in the relay events were freshman Ruth Gunard (ROSEVILLE MN) in the 400 and 200 free relays and the 200 medley relay; freshman Amy Volna (ST. ANTHONY VILLAGE, MN) in the 200 and 400 free relays; and senior tri-captain Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN) in the 200 medley relay.

## SOFTBALL OPENS BIG TEN SCHEDULE AT HOME THIS WEEKEND --

The Gopher women's softball team will open the single round-robin Big Ten schedule at home this weekend with a four-game series against Iowa. Doubleheaders will be played Friday night at 7 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Complex with the rain-date Sunday at noon.

**THE BIG TEN --** The Gophers open the first two weekends at home with four-game series against Iowa and Michigan State and need to do well those two weekends. "Iowa is definately a critical series," says Coach Linda Wells. "We don't have to win every game, but we can't lose every game." League favorites include last year's defending champion #9-Northwestern, runner-up #15-Michigan, and #6-Indiana. Last year, Minnesota was rained-out of a series against Michigan State, and then faced Northwestern and Indiana, posting only one victory in the eight games (vs. NU). Minnesota very quickly was 1-8, but finished 8-12 after taking three of four vs. Ohio State and splitting with Michigan and Iowa.

Pitchers -- Senior Diane Reynolds Roorda has 54 strikeouts, a .65 ERA in 43 IP with a 4-2 record; senior Ann Coughenour is 5-0 with no runs scored in 35 IP; junior Tracy Langhurst is 1-1 with no earned runs in 15 IP.

**TOUGH SCHEDULE**-- Although Minnesota carries a 7-11 overall record into the Big Ten season, the Gophers have faced stiff competition from seven top-twenty ranked teams. Overall the Gophers are doing well at the plate, batting .240 to opponents .219, but in pitching, Minnesota boasts a 1.95 team ERA to opponents 1.81.

"Hopefully the strong competition we have faced will help us in the Big Ten season," says Coach Wells. "We show great capability, not only with strong defense, but hitting the ball well. We're not winning all the games, but we're pressing. In pitching we need more consistency, and offensively we need a couple more people to come around and help out a little bit."

**GOPHER LEADERS** -- Senior Ann Flis (MENOMONIE, WI) continues to lead the Gophers at the plate with a .345 average including team highs of 11 runs, 20 hits and 10 RBI's. Sophomore Jackie Savis (ST. LOUIS, MO) was ill during the last road trip, but batted .313 in New Mexico. **HOUSTON TRIP HIGHLIGHTS** -- Prior to playing in the 16-team Houston Classic, the Gophers dropped a single game to #3-ranked Texas A&M 0-4 with Drake taking the loss. **Houston Classic Notes** -- For the tournament, a pleasant surprise for Wells was the performance of sophomore Stacy Hohertz (MINNETONKA, MN). Hohertz batted .333 in the seven games with six hits and scored four runs. The leader during tournament play again was Ann Flis who batted .364 with eight RBI's, eight hits and five runs in the seven games. Cray batted .316 for the tourney with six hits, followed by Oliverius who hit .294 with five hits, Drake who hit

**POOL PLAY** -- Minnesota posted a 2-1 record in pool play opening with a 1-0 win over St. Mary's (Tx.). Drake pitched the seven innings, with the shutout, allowing just three hits. Drake also hammered the winning RBI double in the bottom of the seventh, scoring Flis who had led off the inning with a double.

The second game, Minnesota dropped to #12-Cal-Berkeley 1-4 with Cray taking the loss. Minnesota scored in the top of the seventh on an RBI double by Oliverius scoring Drake who led-off the inning with a double. Minnesota concluded pool play with a 4-1 win over Adelphi. Oliverius pitched a perfect game for six innings, but then had one hit-pitch, and one hit and run in the seventh. Katzenmeyer slammed an RBI double in the second scoring Cray who had singled, and both Flis and Drake hit RBI's in the third inning.

In bracket play, Minnesota lost the first game 5-7 to #17-Utah with Oliverius taking the loss. Flis batted 3-3 with two runs and four RBI's as the Gophers committed four errors, with Utah scoring four runs on two errors in the sixth inning. Minnesota then lost to #9-Northwestern 2-4 with Cray taking the loss. Flis drove in Hohertz and Oliverius who had singled with an RBI single in the bottom of the fifth.

Minnesota again blanked St. Mary's 5-0 with Cray taking the win allowing five hits, striking out three and walking two. Flis was 1-3 with an RBI double in that game. The Gophers ended 14th in the tourney with a 0-5 shutout at the hands of #5 Kansas. Drake was the losing pitcher and although the Gophers tallied seven hits they stranded six and did not score.

(TRACK BOTH AT HOME AND ON ROAD THIS WEEKEND)

Minnesota continues it's outdoor season Saturday, April 5 at 12:00 p.m. when they host the Minnesota Invitational at the Bierman Track. St. Cloud State, North Dakota State University, South Dakota State University, Moorehead State, Club Sota and the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse will all be competing.

"It's a pretty low key meet," said Wilson. "We'll have the same trouble with our depth but a good team effort could win the meet for us."

While most of the Gopher squad will be at home this weekend, Minnesota's big guns will be on the road competing at the Texas Relays in Austin, Texas. Jody Eder, Steph Stoltman and Stacy Bant will all be competing in Austin. Eder will run the 1500-meters, Stoltman will run the 100-meter and 400-meter hurdles, and Bant will run the 5000-meters at the Saturday meet.

TRACKSTERS OPEN OUTDOOR SEASON WITH FOURTH PLACE FINISH-- The Gopher women's track and field team began it's 1986 outdoor season on a successful note March 28-29 when they finished fourth in the Rice Invitational at Houston, Texas. Houston, the host school, won the meet, scoring 112 points. Texas Southern placed second with 91 points and Rice grabbed third with 50 points. Minnesota, which tallied 43 points, was the only Big Ten team competing in the meet.

Minnesota scored the majority of their points in the middle distances. Senior Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) was the highest Gopher finisher. She took second in the 1500-meters with a time of 4:24.94. Eder placed second to Angelita Lind of the Puerto Rico National Team who set a meet record of 4:19.73. Also excelling in the middle distances for the Gophers were Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI), and Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN). Bant placed third in the 5000-meters with a time of 17:21.51 while Johnson took fourth in the 800-meters at 2:11.21. Distance runners were not the only ones who helped the Gophers finish fourth. Hurdler Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) placed third with a time of 14.6 seconds and also placed third in the 400-meter hurdles, running a 61.10.

(GOLFERS TO DUKE SPRING INVITATIONAL FOR THEIR SECOND SPRING TOURNEY)

The Minnesota women's golf team has their second outing of the spring season this coming weekend when they compete in the Duke Spring Invitational, Friday through Sunday at Durham, N.C. Last year at Duke, Minnesota was 5th of 16 teams and posted a three-round total of 948.

The Gophers will be facing only one Big Ten school in the tournament, Ohio State, winner of the last two Big Ten championships. Others in the 14 team field include the University of North Carolina, North Carolina State, Alabama, Wake Forest, Longwood, Penn State, University of North Carolina-Wilmington, South Alabama, Meredith, Alabama-Birmingham and James Madison. Minnesota head golf coach Anne Zahn hasn't made the final determination of who will be going the Duke Spring Invitational.

GOPHERS IMPROVE OVER LAST YEAR'S FINISH AT SOUTH CAROLINA -- Minnesota carded a 317-321-324=962 this past weekend in the team's season opener for 11th place at the South Carolina Spring Invitational. "The 962 was a a 37 stroke improvement over last season's opener (332-332-333-997) at the same tournament," says Zahn. Georgia won this year's tourney with a 313-303-300=916.

Team captain Julie Hennessy, a junior from Lewiston, Minn., was the low Gopher with a three round total of 237 (78-79-80). Finishing five strokes behind her was sophomore Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) with a 82-78-82=242. Junior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) shot a 80-80-84=240, with sophomore Mary Kuhlmann (MONTEVIDEO, MN) carding a 77-89-80=246. Freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) shot a 89-84-82=255.

**GYMNASTS DEFEAT IOWA STATE; BROWN, KAISER QUALIFY FOR REGIONALS** -- The Minnesota women's gymnastics team concluded their regular season Saturday with a 181.00-149.20 win over Iowa State. The score raised the team's regional qualifying average to 180.93, placing them seventh in the NCAA Midwest Region. The team will not compete at the regional championships on Saturday, April 5 in Salt Lake City, UT, but two individuals, juniors Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) and Laurie Kaiser (PLYMOUTH, MN) will compete. The top six teams and the top six all-arounders from teams that do not qualify compete at the regional championship.

Brown has a final regional average of 36.93, ranking her second in the region. Kaiser was ranked seventh before the Iowa State meet, but her 36.95 all-around score at Saturday's meet boosted her average to 36.45 and earned her the final spot. Kaiser placed 14th all-around at the 1985 championships. Brown will be competing as an individual for the first time.

**COACH'S COMMENTS** -- Head coach Katalin Deli was pleased with the team's performance against Iowa State. "The meet went really good. There were a couple more misses than I thought we would have, but it's hard to get up mentally after Big Tens. The kids have done a super job all season."

**KAISER WINS ALL-AROUND** -- Kaiser won her first all-around of the season at the Iowa State meet. Individually, Kaiser placed first on the uneven bars with a season-high 9.35 score, and first on the balance beam with a 9.20 score. The junior also placed second on the vault (9.15) and floor exercise (9.30). Brown also won two events, the vault (9.45) and floor exercise (9.40). She finished second all-around with a 36.70 score.

Senior Wendy Dorsey (EDINA, MN) completed her collegiate gymnastics career with a 35.85 all-around score and third place finish. She placed second on the balance beam, scoring 9.20, and also placed third on the vault, scoring 9.05. Dorsey was the only Gopher gymnast to not score below 9.00 on the vault all season.

**TENNIS TEAM OPENS BIG TEN SEASON SUNDAY** -- The women's tennis team will try to get back on the winning track this Sunday, April 6, when they host Illinois in the first Big Ten match of the spring season. Sunday's match begins at 9 a.m. and will be held at the 98th Street Raquet Club in Bloomington. The team competed in Florida during spring break week but they lost all four of their matches. The losses bring the team's overall record to 9-9, 2-1 in the Big Ten. "We played a lot of tennis," said Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. "We're kind of wore out, but this will be good for us in the long run."

**INJURIES HAMPERED TEAM'S PLAY** -- Two key members of the team, Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) and Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) did not play in Florida. Eneberg re-injured her back during her singles match against South Florida and did not play for the rest of the week, while Hallgren is recovering from shoulder surgery. Roach is unsure when they will return to the lineup.

The Gopher women's softball team improved their overall record to 10-12 and won three of the four games with Iowa in the Big Ten opening series last weekend. This week the Gophers will play a doubleheader at Iowa State on Tuesday (April 8) and then host Big Ten rival Michigan State in twin bills this weekend, starting at 7 p.m. on Friday night and 1 p.m. on Saturday. The Spartans lead the series between the two teams 7-6, but last year the four-game series was washed out at E. Lansing.

"Michigan State is showing good scores in the pre-season against opponents and appear to be much stronger than last year," says Gopher Coach Linda Wells. "They are a power swinging team, so it will help to play on our field where the fence takes away some of the extra base hits."

Following the Michigan State series, the Gophers will be on the road for three straight weekends, with four-game series at Michigan (April 18-19), Northwestern (April 25-26) and Ohio State (May 2-3). They will close out the Big Ten schedule hosting Indiana on May 9-10. With that schedule in mind, the Gophers need to do well again this weekend in the home stand.

**TENNIS TEAM DEFEATS ILLINOIS; MEETS MICHIGAN/MICHIGAN STATE THIS WEEKEND** -- The Minnesota women's tennis team opened the spring Big Ten season Sunday with a 7-2 win over Illinois. The squad will try to improve on their 3-1 conference record (11-9 overall) this weekend when they travel to Madison, Wisc., to compete against Michigan and Michigan State. "Michigan and Michigan State are important matches and will be of the same intensity as Illinois," said Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. "We need to win." Wins against conference teams are important because a team's win/loss record against Big Ten schools determines the seedings for the conference championships.

**NOTING MICHIGAN/MICHIGAN STATE** -- The Michigan Wolverines are 7-9 overall, 1-4 in the Big Ten. Their lineup, like Minnesota's has changed because of injuries. Senior Paula Reichert has played number one singles and has a 13-5 record. Michigan's doubles teams have been shuffled due to injuries. Tricia Horn and Erin Ashare had an 8-3 record at number three, but Horn has been injured. In 1985 Michigan placed eighth in the Big Ten and compiled a 9-13 overall record. The Michigan State Spartans are 5-8 overall, 2-1 in the Big Ten. The team has defeated Michigan twice and lost 6-3 to Indiana. Freshman Linda Pursel has a 6-4 record at number one singles. Tracy Balagna and Gina Romeo have a 9-3 record at number one doubles. Michigan State placed seventh at the 1985 conference championship, defeating Michigan 5-4.

**RETURNING FRESHMEN SPARK GOPHER WIN** -- Freshman Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) won both her singles and doubles matches Sunday. Gorde was academically ineligible for winter quarter play. "It's nice to have Anne back," said Roach. "She played very well." Gorde won 6-2, 6-2 at number two singles. Another freshman, Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) returned to the Gopher lineup after undergoing shoulder surgery. Hallgren won 6-3, 6-4 at number four singles, after compiling a 10-6 record at number one. She has been out of the lineup since February.

**BROWN QUALIFIES FOR NCAA NATIONAL GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIP** -- Minnesota junior Shelley Brown (BLOOMINGTON, MN) has qualified to compete as an individual all-arounder at the 1986 NCAA National Gymnastics Championship on April 18-19 in Gainesville, Fla. "I'm very, very happy for Shelley," said Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli. "She certainly deserved it."

Brown placed fifth all-around at the Midwest Regional Championships in Salt Lake City, Utah, last Saturday to qualify for nationals. Her all-around score was 37.60, breaking the school all-around record she set at the Big Ten Championship in March. In addition, Brown tied for first place on the balance beam, scoring a school-record 9.75. "It was tough competition, and Shelley hit everything," said Deli. "She looked better on the beam than she did at Big Ten's." Brown also scored 9.40 on the vault, 9.35 on the uneven bars and 9.10 on the floor exercise.

Junior Laurie Kaiser also competed at the regional meet, scoring 36.25 and placing 21st. In 1985, Kaiser placed 14th all-around at the regional meet and qualified for nationals, but broke her foot in training before the meet. Kaiser scored 9.35 on the vault, 9.20 on the uneven bars, 8.45 on the balance beam, and 9.25 on the floor exercise.

(TRACK TEAM TO START COMPETITIVE CLIMB TOWARDS BIG TEN MEET)

The Minnesota women's track team will begin a tough series of away meets Saturday, April 12 when they travel to Des Moines, Iowa to take part in the Drake Invitational. Big Ten arch-rival Iowa will also be there, making it the first outdoor meet in which Minnesota will face Big Ten competition.

Although the Drake Invitational is a big meet, first year coach **Gary Wilson** isn't worried about it. In fact, he's looking forward to it. "I've always liked the Drake Invite," says Wilson. "It's a good chance to go against some top quality athletes."

GOPHERS TAKE SECOND AT HOME, EDER SHINES IN TEXAS RELAYS-- Minnesota, in its first home outdoor meet of the season, came in a close second to the University of Wisconsin-LaCrosse at the Minnesota Invitational on April 5. LaCrosse used team depth to nip the Gophers, 117-96. Club Sota placed third with 70 points. Seven other schools also participated in the meet.

Although Wilson was disappointed with the loss, he was happy with the team's performance overall. "I think we did an outstanding job considering three of our top runners were at the Texas Relays in Austin."

Even without **Jody Eder** (LAKE ELMO, MN), **Stacy Bant** (RACINE, WI) and **Steph Stoltman** (MINNETONKA, MN), who were all in Texas, the Gophers still recieved some stellar performances. **Lisa Pruitt** (ROSEVILLE, MN) placed first in the 400-meter dash with a time of 59.35 and **Lisa Walton** (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) also took first in the 200-meter dash at 25.91. The performance of the day went to **Jo Arvesen** (WASECA, MN) who took second in the long jump (17' 11"), second in the 400-meter hurdles (67.51) and ran for both Minnesota relay teams.

While most of the women were at home competing, **Eder**, **Bant** and **Stoltman** all competed in the Texas Relays. **Eder** performed the best by taking fourth in the 1500-meters at 4:23.26. **Bant** ran a 17 minute 5000-meters to place tenth and **Stoltman** failed to qualify for the finals in both the 100-meter (14.8) and 400-meter hurdles (1:01.7).

(GOLFERS HAVE A THREE-WEEK BREAK BEFORE THE IOWA INVITATIONAL)

After back-to-back weekends of traveling to South and North Carolina, the women's golf team will have three weeks at home to work on their game before their next outing, the Iowa Invitational at Iowa City. "We'll use the practice time to get the rust out of our play, with the travelling team for the Iowa tourney being decided by qualifying rounds the week of the invitational," says Anne Zann, golf coach.

GOLFERS FINISH SEVENTH AT DUKE-- Minnesota played its three best rounds of the spring season this past weekend at the Duke Spring Invitational, shooting 312-305-316=933 to finish in seventh place. The University of North Carolina (Chapel Hill) finished on top of the 12-team field with a 303-297-294=894.

Sophomore **Jodi Krafka** (ALEXANDRIA, MN) played the best three rounds of her collegiate career at Duke, leading the Gophers with a three rounds of 74-78-75=227. Following Krafka with a 78-76-76=230 was freshman **Kate Hughes** (WOODBURY, MN). Team captain junior **Julie Hennessy** (LEWISTON, MN) shot 77-75-83=235, with teammates freshman **Mary Kuhlmann** (MONTEVIDEO, MN) (83-77-83=243) and junior **Ann Meyer** (SAUK CENTRE, MN) (84-77-82=243) both carding 243's.

(WALLNER STARTS TRAINING TODAY FOR WORLD AND GOODWILL GAMES)

Thirteen-time Minnesota Big Ten swimming champion Diane Wallner starts training today for the World Championship Trials, hoping to qualify for either the World or Goodwill Games which will be held this summer. Spain is hosting the World games, with the Goodwill Games being held in Moscow, Russia. Wallner is training for the 50 and 100 meter freestyle sprints under the tutelage of Jean Freeman, Gopher head swimming coach.

The 1982 Alexander Ramsey High School graduate is a two-time individual Big Ten Champion in both the 50 and 100 yard freestyles, and currently holds the Big Ten record in each (50 free-:22.97, 100 free-:50.69). Wallner holds, or has held, eight Big Ten records over the past four years.

To qualify for the World Games in the 50 meter freestyle, Wallner must be one of the two top finishers at the trials, which will be held June 22-27, in Orlando, Fla. Wallner is currently ranked third nationally, in the 50 yard freestyle after the recent USS Senior Nationals, where she finished fifth with a time of :23.33. To make the cut in the 50 free for the Goodwill Games, Wallner must finish third or fourth.

Wallner is currently ranked 10th nationally in the 100 yard freestyle, and will have to maintain that ranking after the June trials to qualify for the Goodwill Games. Seventh through 10th place in the 100 meter freestyle will go to Moscow, with the first six finishers competing in the World Games.

WALLNER'S RECORDS-- Wallner has held the Minnesota varsity record in the 50 and 100 yard freestyles since her freshman year, and currently holds three individual and shares in four relay team varsity records. She also holds or shares four Cooke Hall Pool records, setting two of them when she was swimming at Alexander Ramsey High School.

As for the Big Ten, Wallner leads the Gophers in over-all titles, having won 13 individual and relay events over the past four years, setting eight Big Ten records in the process. She was also the first and only Gopher to tryout for the Olympics.

HONORS BESTOWED-- After her sophomore year, Wallner was named Most Valuable by her teammates; after the 84-85 season, she was made a tri-captain of this year's team by her fellow swimmers. In January, the Minnesota March of Dimes named her the Individual College Athlete of the Year. The Big Ten swimming coaches voted her the 1986 Big Ten Swimmer of the year after her sterling performance at the conference championships.

Wallner won All-American honors this year in the 50 yard free at the NCAA championships, and last year in the 400 free relay. She also earned All-American Honorable Mention honors this year in the 100 yard freestyle, 400 yard free relay, 200 yard free relay and the 200 yard medley relay.

GOPHERS SUFFER INJURIES OVER WEEKEND--

Good and bad both came out of the Gophers' trip to Des Moines, Iowa on April 12. While participating in the Drake Invitational, Minnesota lost two of it's top athletes. Hurdler Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) and sprinter Lisa Walton (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) both came out of the meet with serious injuries. Stoltman cut herself and pulled the deltoid muscle in her left shoulder when she tripped in the 100-meter hurdles. Walton pulled a hamstring while running the 200-meters. Pentathlete Jo Arvesen (WASECA, MN) took second in that event with 4388 points while and shotputters Shirley Molitor (COLD SPRING, MN) and Leslie Smith (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) grabbed second and third respectively. Molitor threw 42 feet 8 3/4 inches and Smith tossed the shot 42' 5 1/2". Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) finished second in the 10,000-meters at 36:34.1

TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO NORTHWESTERN/IOWA -- After raising its Big Ten record to 5-1 with wins over Michigan and Michigan State last weekend, the Minnesota women's tennis team travels to compete against sixth-ranked Northwestern and Iowa this weekend. "Northwestern will be tough. Iowa will be the key match for us. They're a tough team," says Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. The Gophers defeated Michigan 6-3 on Saturday, April 12 and narrowly edged Michigan State 5-4 on Sunday. "The weekend was great. We couldn't have done better," said Roach. "Michigan State was a big win for us."

NOTING NORTHWESTERN/IOWA -- Northwestern, the defending Big Ten champion, is currently ranked sixth in the nation. The team is 3-0 in the Big Ten, with wins over Iowa, Michigan and Ohio State, and 17-3 overall. The Wildcats' number one singles player, Katrina Adams, is ranked tenth nationally. The number one doubles team of Adams and Diane Donnelly is ranked fourth in the nation.

Iowa has an 8-8 spring record and a 2-2 conference record, with wins over Illinois and Ohio State. Michelle Conlon has a 9-6 record at number one singles, and Pennie Wohlford is 8-8 at number two. The duo has a 6-8 record at number one doubles. Minnesota defeated Iowa 8-1 in a dual match last fall.

ENEBERG RETURNS TO LINEUP; GOES UNDEFEATED ON WEEKEND -- Minnesota's wins were sparked by the return of sophomore Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) to the lineup. Eneberg played at number six singles and partnered with junior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) at number three doubles and was undefeated in weekend play. Eneberg lost only five games in her straight-set singles victories. Jones was also undefeated over the weekend, playing at number three and four singles.

Freshman Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) won both of her singles matches and is now 7-0 at number two singles. She has a 13-4 record overall and is 5-1 in singles and doubles play since returning to the lineup two weeks ago.

Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) aggravated her shoulder injury during her match against Michigan. Roach lists her as "doubtful" for this weekend's play.

BROWN HEADS FOR NCAA NATIONAL GYMNASTICS MEET -- Minnesota junior Shelley Brown will be looking to add an All-American award to her list of gymnastics honors this weekend when she competes at the NCAA National Gymnastics Championship. The national meet will be held on Friday and Saturday, April 18-19, at the University of Florida in Gainesville. Brown, the 1986 Big Ten all-around champion and NCAA Midwest Region balance beam champion, will be one of ten individual all-arounders competing along with ten teams.

"Shelley has been training hard and she is looking great," says Minnesota head coach Katalin Deli. "I'm looking for her to have a good meet. She is very excited and very happy to be a part of the meet."

Brown has rewritten the Gopher gymnastics record books this season. She now holds school records in the vault (9.60), balance beam (9.75) and all-around (36.70). During the season she re-set her career high vaulting and all-around scores three times and also scored new personal bests in all events. Brown was the team's number one all-arounder all season and her regional qualifying score of 36.93 was second-highest in the Midwest Region.

## (THREE ELITE NATIONAL TEAM GYMNASTICS MEMBERS SIGN WITH 'U') --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota gymnastics coach Katalin Deli has announced the signing of three recruits for the 1986-87 season. All three recruits are national team members and have had extensive national and international competition. The newcomers are:

Marie Roethlisberger, daughter of Minnesota men's gymnastics coach Fred Roethlisberger, was an alternate to the 1984 U.S. Olympic team. Roethlisberger has been a member of the U.S. Senior National Team since 1982. She is a member of the Southern California Acro Team and is a 1984 graduate of Marina High School in Huntington Beach, Calif. Internationally, Roethlisberger placed fifth all-around at the 1985 McDonald's Gymnastics Challenge: China vs. USA and placed fourth all-around at the 1985 McDonald's American Cup. In national competition during 1985, Roethlisberger won the all-around at the United States Gymnastics Federation (U.S.G.F.) American Classic Nationals and placed third in the all-around at the McDonald's Championships of the USA.

Lisa Wittwer, a senior at Rosemount High School, comes to the Gophers from coach Deli's Olympic Gymnastics Academy in Brooklyn Center. Wittwer has been a member of the national team since 1983 and was an alternate to the 1985 World Championships team. In 1985 she placed first on the vault and sixth all-around at the Grand Prix International Invitational in Rome. In national competition, Wittwer placed second all-around at the 1985 U.S.G.F. American Classic, behind future teammate Marie Roethlisberger. As a member of the 1983 Pan American Games team, Wittwer placed third all-around and second on the uneven bars. She has also competed in Hong Kong, England, Japan and Venezuela. Wittwer was also the 1982 U.S.G.F. Class I national floor exercise champion.

Kathleen Finnegan has been a member of the Canadian National Team since 1982 and was an alternate to Canada's 1984 Olympic Team. She presently trains at the Winnipeg Gymnastics Center in Winnipeg, Manitoba and has a National Elite III standing. She has competed in Japan, Mexico, China, Korea, Hungary and the United States. Finnegan is a senior at St. Mary's Academy in Winnipeg. She will join fellow Canadians Candace Doell and Janice Ball of Saskatoon on the Gopher squad.

The Minnesota women's gymnastics team finished the season with a 13-7 overall record. The team placed second at the 1986 Big Ten Championship, but failed to qualify for regional competition. One member of the team, junior Shelley Brown, will be competing at the NCAA National Championships as an individual all-arounder.

(FOUR MINNESOTA PLAYERS AMONG GOPHER BASKETBALL RECRUITS) --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota head women's basketball coach Ellen Hanson has announced the signing of six recruits for the 1986-87 season, including four Minnesota high school prep stars. All six were prolific high school scorers, and Hanson expects them to aid the Gophers on offense. Minnesota returns eight players from this year's 8-20 squad.

Heading the list of Minnesotan's is 5-9 forward/guard Jennifer Hall of Burnsville, Minn. Hall averaged 19.2 ppg and 10 rebounds this past year while shooting 53 per cent in field goals and 70 per cent in free throws. She was the top scorer in the high school state tournament, scoring 74 points in her final three games, and was the leading scorer for the second straight year in the Lake South Conference as well as Burnsville High School's all-time leading scorer.

Hall was named the Metro Player of the Year by the Minneapolis Star and Tribune and a First Team All-State Player by the St. Paul Pioneer Press and Dispatch. She was also tabbed Minnesota Player of the Year by Scholastic COACH Magazine and Gatorade. She will join Burnsville grad Diane Kinney, who will be a junior next season, on the Gopher squad.

Another All-Metro team selection and first team all-state pick by the St. Paul Pioneer Press and Dispatch is Alexander Ramsey High School's Ellen Kramer. A 5-11 forward, Kramer averaged 18.9 ppg, 11.5 rebounds and shot 49 per cent in field goals and 69 per cent in free throws. Kramer started her career at Akeley High School and was an honorable mention all-state pick there in 1985, but transferred to Ramsey for her senior year. She ended her career with 1,883 points, 12th on the Minnesota all-time scoring list. Kramer was also an all-stater in volleyball.

The final two Minnesota players are both centers. Sue Renner of Grand Rapids, Minn. is a 6-5 center and averaged 24 ppg and 13 rebounds along with 4.6 blocks and a 57 field goal percentage this past year. She scored over 1200 points during her career and was a First Team All-State selection by the St. Paul Pioneer Press and Dispatch.

Juanita Boehland of Minnehaha Academy, a 6-3 center, was an All-Metro pick by the Minneapolis Star and Tribune and a second team All-State selection by the St. Paul Pioneer Press and Dispatch. Boehland sat out a year after transferring from Hill-Murray High School during her sophomore year. This year she averaged 19.1 ppg, 13.3 rebounds, 4.5 blocks and 2.7 steals. During her career she totaled 1,136 points.

The other two recruits hail from Michigan and Washington. Jackie Goulet is a 5-11 forward from Midland, Mich. At Dow High School she averaged 20.4 ppg and 10.4 rebounds while shooting 47 per cent in field goals. She was a First Team All-State selection in Michigan by UPI and AP and a Miss Basketball finalist.

The final recruit is Jodi Olson, a 5-7 guard from Bellevue, Wash. Olson averaged 18.4 ppg at Interlake High School and shot 85 per cent in free throws. She was a First Team All-State selection and a high school Street and Smith All-American.

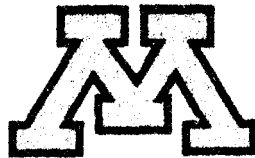

TENNIS TEAM HOSTS PURDUE, WISCONSIN; LAST MATCHES BEFORE BIG TEN'S --

The Gopher women's tennis team hosts Purdue and Wisconsin this weekend in the team's final home competition of the season. These matches are also the teams' final competition before the Big Ten Championships May 2-4 at the University of Illinois. Minnesota will meet Wisconsin on Friday at 1 p.m., and Purdue on Sunday at 9 a.m. Both matches will be held at the Bierman Courts on campus; in case of rain play will be moved to the 98th Street Racquet Club.

"It's real important to defeat Purdue to keep our fourth place seed (in the Big Ten)," says Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. "If we beat Wisconsin we have a good chance to be seeded second or third." Seedings for the conference championship are based on a team's won-loss record against conference schools. Minnesota now has a 6-2 Big Ten record after defeating Iowa 6-3 but losing to Northwestern 9-0 last weekend.

NOTING WISCONSIN -- The Badgers are ranked 25th in the nation and have a 7-1 conference record. Last weekend the team defeated Iowa 8-1 but fell to Northwestern 8-1 for their first conference loss of the year. Several players have played at the number one singles spot for Wisconsin. Wendy Gilles has a 6-5 record at number one, and her sister Chris Gilles is 7-6 at that position. The number one doubles team of Lisa Fortman and Wendy Gilles has a 13-5 record and the number two combination of Chris Gilles and Cathy Van Pelt is 18-5. Wisconsin defeated Minnesota 5-4 during fall season play at Minnesota. In 1985 the Badgers placed third in the conference and head coach Kelly Ferguson was named Big Ten Coach of the Year.

NOTING PURDUE -- The Boilermakers have a 4-2 conference record and are 9-7 overall. Over the weekend the team defeated Michigan 6-3 but lost to Michigan State 6-3. Kris Dicken has an 11-7 record at number two singles and Krista Schreck is 6-12 at number one. The Schreck/Dicken doubles team has a 9-11 record at number one. Purdue placed sixth at the 1985 Conference tournament and finished the 1985 season with a 5-7 conference record. Minnesota and Purdue did not compete against each other last season.

WINNING STREAKS END AGAINST NORTHWESTERN -- Undefeated records and winning streaks fell in Sunday's loss to Northwestern. The defending Big Ten champions handed the Gophers their second shutout of the season and the team's first conference loss since October's loss to Wisconsin.

Minnesota's number three doubles team of Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) and Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) were the only players to win a set against Northwestern. They lost to Kirstin Laux and Christina Schuschel 6-4, 5-7, 6-2.

(GOPHERS HOPING TO SEND EDER AND MORE TO DRAKE RELAYS)

Gopher track coach Gary Wilson is hoping to send six-time All-American Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) and at least one relay team to the Drake Relays in Des Moines, Iowa, Saturday, April 26.

"We're hoping Jody will get in and maybe one or two more, plus a relay team," said the first-year coach. "The Drake is a real big meet. They only take the top times in the country, so the competition is real tough just to get there."

Gophers with an outside shot at going to the Drake Relays include distance runners Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT) and Stacy Bant (RACINE, WISC). Hurdler Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) could also have qualified but a shoulder injury has forced her to sit out the next month.

Those Gophers not going to the Drake Relays will participate in the Macalester Relays in St. Paul, MN on the same day.

MINNESOTA FARES WELL AGAINST BIG TEN POWER WISCONSIN -- Although the meet was definitely low key and several top runners from both schools didn't compete, the Gophers still performed admirably against the Badgers in the Wisconsin Open on April 19. No team scores were kept as several unattached runners also competed.

For the Gophers, the throwers sparkled in somewhat windy conditions. Shirely Molitor (COLD SPRING, MN) won the shotput with a toss of 43' 5" and also placed third in the discus at 121' 4". Dana Hawksford (ANOKA, MN) won the discus with a personal best of 141' 6".

Johnson was the only Gopher who won a track event. She placed first in the 800-meters with a time of 2:13.25. Although no one else won a running event, several Gophers turned in solid performances. Jo Arvesen (WASECA, MN) and Michele Brown (POMPANO BEACH, FL) were just a few of the Gophers who fared well. Arvesen placed third in the javelin, throwing the spear 110'. Brown placed third in the 100-meters at 12.83 while senior Lisa Pruitt (ROSEVILLE, MN) took second in the triple jump with a leap of 36' 5".

Eight of the nine Big Ten golf teams face off against each other at the Iowa Invitational, April 26-27, at Iowa City. Michigan, host of the 1986 Big Ten Golf Championship, and Northwestern which does not field a golf team, will be absent this weekend.

Joining the Gophers and the Hawkeyes at the Iowa Invitational are Illinois, Indiana, Ohio State, Purdue, Wisconsin, Michigan State, Northern Illinois and Northeast Missouri State. Minnesota won the Iowa Invitational last spring when they shot a three-round total of 916 in a field of four teams.

"The Gopher's travelling team to Iowa will be determined after practice today," says Anne Zahn, head golf coach. "We're playing a 54-hole qualifying match over a week's time to determine the top five who will make the trip."

SO FAR THIS SPRING-- The Gophers are 7-16 after two tournaments this spring, finishing 11th of 13 teams at the South Carolina Invitational and 7th of 12 teams at the Duke Spring Invitational. 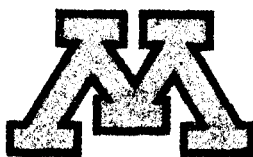

SOFTBALL IN THICK OF BIG TEN RACE TRAVELS TO OHIO STATE --

The Gopher softball team moved to second in the Big Ten with a 2-2 split at defending champion Northwestern last weekend. The Gophers, 10-6 in the league, trail Northwestern (9-5) on a percentage basis. But, with two weekends remaining, the conference race is up for grabs as Michigan State swept previous conference leader Indiana all four games last weekend.

Running down the remaining teams Michigan State is third at 8-6, Indiana fourth at 10-8, Iowa fifth at 9-9, Michigan sixth at 6-8 and Ohio State seventh at 2-12.

BIG TEN SCHEDULE -- This Tuesday Iowa plays a doubleheader at Northwestern and Indiana plays a doubleheader at Ohio State. This weekend's series May 2-3 have Minnesota at Ohio State, Northwestern at Michigan, and Iowa at Michigan State.

GOPHER SCHEDULE -- Minnesota is 21-19 overall, and will be hosting Iowa State in a doubleheader today (April 28) and Minnesota-Duluth in a single game April 30 prior to this weekend's four-game series at Ohio State. Minnesota will close out their schedule May 9-10 at home with a four-game Big Ten series against Indiana.

WELLS COMMENTS -- "Overall the team is doing everything I've asked them to do. They have improved dramatically from the Las Cruces and Houston trips. I'm concerned about everyone being healthy, Barb (Drake) had a knee injury that kept her from pitching all of game four, and Judy (Oliverius) pulled a groin muscle.

"Also of concern is looking forward to Indiana -- which we can't do because the conference race is too tight. Ohio State split with Michigan State and judging by their game scores they are playing better every weekend. It's pretty obvious that we have to be in the win column against them to hold our spot in the Big Ten."

On last weekend -- "Losing game four (5-4) was disappointing, but beyond that I was pretty pleased...we needed to win on a home-run and we did and we needed to win on a bunt and we did. Drake was outstanding with her bat...she was patient and swung at good pitches."

Pitchers -- Senior Renee Pearson is 2-1 with a save and 1.26 ERA in 50 IP; Junior Shelley Eger is 2-12 in 86 IP with a 2.77 ERA and freshman Colleen Kennedy is 6-9 in 90 IP with a save and 1.71 ERA.

OLIVERIUS TOPPING CAREER RECORDS -- Minnesota senior Judy Oliverius of SPRING LAKE PARK, MN will surpass the Minnesota career games played record in this week's contests. Oliverius has played in 181 games to date, with the record 185 by Barb Solberg from 1981-84. Oliverius has already topped the career at bats mark this year with 558, and currently her career batting average is .263.

The biggest mark within her reach is the career hits record which stands at 159 by Gopher Hall of Famer and All-American Gretchen Larson (1980-83). Currently, Oliverius has 147 hits with eleven games remaining. She is also fifth in total bases (184), and as a pitcher is fourth in career strikeouts (157), third in games pitched (60), and third in innings pitched (353.0). Her career pitching mark is 26-24 with a 1.25 ERA.

This year Oliverius is batting .356 in the Big Ten and .309 overall with 34 hits, 10 RBI's and 15 runs. On the mound, she has a 7-8 overall mark with a 1.36 ERA and in the Big Ten a 3-3 mark with a 1.37 ERA.

DRAKE POWERFUL AT PLATE IN SERIES -- Junior Barb Drake of St. Paul batted .500 in the Gophers series with Northwestern last weekend. Drake suffered a knee injury while catching in Game 2, but continued to play the series at second base. She scored three runs during the series including the game winner in game three. Drake is hitting .408 in the Big Ten with team highs of 20 hits, and eight runs and overall leads the Gophers with a .339 average. On the mound, Drake is 12-5 overall with a 1.24 ERA and in the Big Ten she is 7-1 with a 0.69 ERA.

OTHER GOPHERS -- Senior Ann Flis of MENOMONIE, WI is third overall in batting with a .302 average and leads the team with 39 hits and 18 RBI's. Flis is also batting .288 in the Big Ten. Senior Kim Katzenmeyer of FERGUS FALLS, MN caught three of the four games last weekend, and is fourth overall in batting with a .245 average and 27 hits. She is hitting .237 in the Big Ten. Junior transfer Amy Iverson of DELLWOOD, MN is batting .250 in the Big Ten as a designated hitter.

Freshman Kathy Casull has been a key starter this season at third base. Last weekend Casull had two putouts and 16 assists against Northwestern, and scored two runs as the lead-off batter including ripping a double off of Lisa Ishikawa. Sophomore Deb Lewis of RICHFIELD, MN is batting .237 in the Big Ten as a designated hitter and hit .333 in the series vs. Northwestern last weekend with two doubles.

**TENNIS TEAM SEEDED FOURTH FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP** -- The Minnesota women's tennis team has been seeded fourth in the Big Ten conference and will face Michigan State in the first round of this weekend's Big Ten Tennis Championship. The fifth official championship meet will be held May 2-4 at the University of Illinois. Minnesota was seeded fourth in 1985 and the team finished fourth in 1984 and 1985.

The Gophers enter the tournament with a 7-3 conference record and a 15-11 record overall. Minnesota closed out the regular season at home last weekend with a 5-4 loss to Wisconsin on Friday and a 6-3 win over Purdue on Sunday. Friday's match started with the Gophers down 0-3 in singles when rain forced play to move indoors. Once inside, the Gophers evened the score 3-3, but Wisconsin won two doubles matches to defeat Minnesota for the second time this year. "Wisconsin was a good match. We could have won it. It went down to the last doubles point. The number two doubles could have gone either way," said Minnesota head coach Jack Roach.

Minnesota's number two doubles team, Maura Bjerken (EDINA, MN) and Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) switched from playing in the match-deciding loss on Friday to being the match-winners on Sunday. After losing 6-3, 3-6, 6-3 to Wisconsin's Chris Gilles and Cathy Van Pelt on Friday, Bjerken and Gorde defeated Purdue's Jennifer Allen and Julia Chambers 6-1, 6-3 to give Minnesota the win after the Gophers took a 4-2 lead in singles. Minnesota will play the fifth seed, Michigan State in the opening round on Friday. The Gophers narrowly defeated the Spartans 5-4 on April 13. "It's important to be seeded high. The first match is the most important because if we lose we would play twice on Saturday and the highest we could finish is fifth," said Roach.

The Gophers' chances may improve if freshman Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) is able to play at Big Ten's. Hallgren has spent most of the spring season recovering from shoulder surgery after playing number one singles during the fall season. "Hopefully Anna will play," Roach said. "It would be a boost for her and the team."

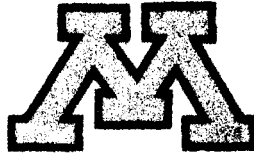

The Hoosiers return to the championship with five of the top 10 performers from the 1985 finals, including top ranked Sarah DeKraay (76.6), with Michele Redman and Tracy Chapman tied for the number two spot (77.2) and Mary Fechtig (77.7) at fifth. Ohio State is in a year of rebuilding, after graduating their top competitors from last season. The battle for the crown is not just between Indiana and the Buckeyes, as Minnesota, Illinois, Michigan State and Iowa all have had a good spring season.

**MINNESOTA'S CONTINGENT--** Leading the Gopher pack to the championships is Junior Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) with a spring stroke average of 78.00. Forsberg won the Iowa Invitational a week ago by carding a 71-76-76=223 and place fifth this past weekend at the Lady Buckeye Invitational with a 78-81-85=245. Forsberg also won the Lady Badger Invitational last fall by shooting a 75-75-73=223. She was 39th last year and 11th in 1984 at the Big Ten's.

Sophomore Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) shot the best game of her university career this spring when she recorded a 10th place 74-78-75=227 at the Duke Spring Invitational. Krafka has the second highest spring stroke average on the team with a 79.66, and leads Minnesota in the Big Ten Standings with a seventh place ranking. As a freshman she tied for 36th at the finals. Team captain junior Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) ranks third on the team in spring averages, with a 80.08, and is eighth in the Big Ten Standings. Hennessy won the Gopher Fall Invitational with a 75-75-75=225 and had a fall average of 78.38. She tied for 23th last year and was 24th in 1984 at the Big Tens's.

Junior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) has played as much golf this spring as she did all of sophomore her season with the Gophers, and is fourth on the team with a spring stroke average of 81.16 for 12 rounds of play. She placed sixth at the recent Iowa Invitational with a collegiate career best of 73-79-76=228, and is rated ninth in the conference. Meyer was 30th last season in her first championship appearance. Sophomore Mary Kuhlmann (MONTEVIDEO, MN) has struggled with her game this spring after coming off her best fall season ever, when she had a 78.38 fall stroke average. Currently she has a 81.16 spring stroke average. At the Big Ten's last years, Kuhlmann tied for 36th.

Freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) burned the links during the fall season, leading the Gophers with a 76.77 fall stroke average, finishing second in two tourneys, and fourth and fifth in two others. Hughes's game hasn't come together yet this spring, and she is averaging 83.22 strokes per round. She is second on the team for the year's low stroke average with 78.92.

**COACH ZAHN'S COMMENTS--** "We are certain to improve on our finish (6th place) from last year's championships," says head coach Anne Zahn. "If we get a contribution from all six players ... the only place we are looking at is first. The team has been on the verge of playing well all season, and we played well at Iowa (2nd place). The course at Ann Arbor is scoreable, but you have to get alot of pars and play strong regulation golf, and not rely on birdies to help your scores."

The Gophers finished third last weekend at the Lady Buckeye Invitational with a 329-328-332=989. Michigan State won the event with 327-327-328=982 and host Ohio State was second with 329-335-324=988. Jane Kang of Ohio State was the medalist with three rounds of 82-80-77=239.

Minnesota's Dee Forsberg led the Gophers with a fifth place finish with a 79-81-85=245. Jodi Krafa shot a 82-87-80=249, and Julie Hennessy had the low round of the tourney with her second round 76 and an overall 91-76-83=250. Mary Kuhlmann shot a 83-84-85=252, with Ann Meyer carding a 85-90-84=259 and Kate Hughes a 85-93-86=264.

(GOPHER TRACK TO HOST MINNESOTA OPEN) --

In their final competition before the Big Ten Outdoor Championships, the Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Minnesota Open, Saturday, May 10 at Bierman Field. Northern Iowa, Michigan Tech and Club Sota will provide the Gophers' competition.

The Gophers should field a strong team as hurdler Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) and sprinter Lisa Walton (MINNEAPOLIS) will compete for the first time since being injured on April 19. Four other Gophers will also compete after resting out last Saturday's meet in Ames, Iowa.

GOPHERS FARE "OK" AT IOWA STATE -- Despite leaving six of it's top athletes at home because of injuries, the Gophers still performed admirably in the Veishea Invitational at Ames, Iowa Saturday, May 3. Five teams competed in the non-scored meet.

For the Gophers, stellar performances were turned in by Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN) and Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN). Johnson placed second in the 1500-meters with a time of 4:37.9, while Eder took third in the 3000-meters at 9:37.8, only one second off her season-best performance.

"Considering the injuries we have, we did okay," said Wilson. "We simply can't compete with the big schools because of our lack of depth." The Gophers competition Saturday included Kansas, Kansas State, Iowa, and host Iowa State.

**TENNIS TEAM PLACES FOURTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS** -- The Minnesota women's tennis team finished fourth in the Big Ten Conference at last weekend's conference championship in Champaign, IL. The team has finished fourth for the last three years, and they were also seeded fourth heading into the tournament. The Gophers defeated Michigan State 5-4 in the first round to advance to the championship bracket. In the semifinals the team lost to eventual-champion Northwestern 8-1, and Indiana defeated Minnesota 8-1 for third place. Northwestern defeated Wisconsin 8-1 for the title.

"I'm very pleased. It capped a good season," said Minnesota head coach Jack Roach. "To be fourth after having to scrap all season for seedings, it turned out good." The top three teams in the Big Ten are ranked among the top 25 teams nationally, and Roach said that Minnesota was one of six teams that could have placed fourth.

**ROST NAMED TO ALL-BIG TEN TEAM** -- Senior captain Nancy Rost (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) ended a fine collegiate tennis career by being named to the All-Big Ten second team. This is the third straight year that Rost has been named to an all-conference team. Rost ended the season with a 17-17 singles record.

Freshman Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN) ended the season with a 9-3 conference singles record, the second best number two singles record in the conference, behind Northwestern's Diane Donnelly. Gorde was ranked third, but her win over Indiana's Janet McCutcheon (6-4, 3-6, 6-3) gave Gorde the second place spot. Gorde finishes the season with an 18-6 record overall, including a 12-2 record at number two singles.

Anna Hallgren (HALMSTAD, Sweden) returned to the lineup after sitting out because of a shoulder injury. Hallgren played number three singles and was 1-2 on the weekend, with a win over Michigan State's Nancy Redman, 6-1, 6-4. The freshman ends the season with a 20-11 singles record despite missing most of the spring season. Hallgren is also the only Gopher to reach the 20 win mark this season.

**MICHIGAN STATE VICTORY COMES DOWN TO FINAL DOUBLES POINT** -- Minnesota's win over Michigan State in the first round was determined by the final doubles point. With the score tied 4-4, the Gopher's number three doubles team, Karin Eneberg and Darcy Jones, won 6-3, 3-6, 7-6 (7-1) over Kathy Yorimoto and Kristen Streng. "It was a close match," said Roach, "as close as any all season."

When the two teams met on April 13, Minnesota's win also went to the final doubles point when Rost and Lisa Dick defeated MSU's Tracy Balagna and Gina Romeo.

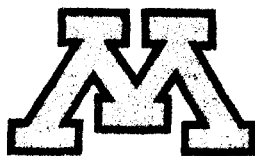

**SOFTBALL TRI-CHAMPION OF BIG TEN CONFERENCE, DRAKE LEAGUE MVP**

The Gopher women's softball team finished the 1986 season as tri-champions of the Big Ten Conference by virtue of a tie with Northwestern and Indiana. All three teams posted 15-9 records in the Big Ten single round-robin schedule. The shared conference title is the first "official" Big Ten Conference title gained by any women's team at the University of Minnesota since the league sanctioned women's championships in 1981. The Gopher softball team last won the title in 1981, during tournament play, and three other Minnesota teams -- volleyball, basketball and golf, have won "unofficial" Big Ten titles.

The Gophers were second in the Big Ten in batting average at .218 to their opponents .197, and were tied for fourth in pitching with a team 1.04 Big Ten ERA. Minnesota finished the season with a 28-23 overall record on a schedule which included 31 top 20 ranked teams. The 51 game schedule was the second most games played in a season in Minnesota history.

**DRAKE LEAGUE MVP, FOUR GOPHERS ON FIRST TEAM** -- Minnesota junior Barb Drake of St. Paul/Kellogg was named the Big Ten's Most Valuable Softball Player in a vote by conference coaches. Playing at pitcher/catcher and second base, Drake led the Big Ten in batting with a .408 average, and was tabbed the Big Ten's Player of the Week in four of the six weeks of conference competition. Drake was also named to the first team as a pitcher -- she was fifth in the league with a 0.74 ERA and 9-3 record. It was the second year Drake was named to the first team, the last being in 1984 when she was also All-Midwest Region and a second team All-American.

**THREE OTHER GOPHERS HONORED** -- Seniors Ann Flis of MENOMONIE, WI, Judy Oliverius of SPRING LAKE PARK, MN, and sophomore Deb Lewis of RICHFIELD, MN were also named to the All-Big Ten first team. Flis was selected at first base and was ranked third in the league in batting with a .303 average. It was the second year she was selected to the first team -- in 1985 she was picked at designated hitter after leading the league in hitting with a .406 average. Flis was also named to the All-Midwest Regional team last year.

Oliverius was selected at second base and she was ranked third in the Big Ten in batting with a .300 average. A marketing education major, Oliverius was also picked to the All-Academic Big Ten softball team. It was the first year that Oliverius earned All-Big Ten honors. Lewis was tabbed All-Big Ten at designated hitter where she batted .200 in League play.

**WELLS CREDITS ATTITUDE** -- Gopher Coach Linda Wells said her team's spirit was a key factor in the Gophers improved performance from a fifth place 8-12 Big Ten season in 1985 to a share of the title this year. "We obviously had a lot to do from last year, and we concentrated on making some attitudinal changes. It was really the responsiveness of the team to change in that area that helped us in all areas this year."

**SEASON RECAP** -- Only fifteen of the Gophers 51 games were played at home, and the team started the season at two strong tournaments -- the Roadrunner Invitational at Las Cruces, N.M. and the Houston Classic in Texas. The Gophers entered the Big Ten schedule 7-11, with an upset over Nebraska 7-6 and three games with one-run losses to nationally ranked teams. "We had a couple of should've's and could've's in Las Cruces and Houston," says Coach Linda Wells. "Going into the Big Ten schedule, I challenged our pitchers to perform better, and they responded well to that challenge."

The Gophers first two Big Ten series were at home, against Iowa and Michigan State, and Minnesota swept three of four games in both series. Then came three road weekends and the real test for the team. "After the Iowa series, we had five people batting and then a lot of zeros. But, we were able to get performances out of more players in the rest of the Big Ten schedule," says Wells.

The Gophers split 2-2 on the road with nationally ranked Michigan, the 1985 Big Ten runner-ups. On the same trip they split a doubleheader with ranked Central Michigan and swept top 20 ranked Creighton. Then, the Gophers went 2-2 on a do-or-die weekend in Evanston against the two-time defending Big Ten champions Northwestern. After sweeping Ohio State all four road games, Minnesota hosted Indiana.

The Gophers needed to win just two of the games, as Michigan State split with Northwestern the same weekend, in order to clinch the Big Ten title. But, five errors in game 1 and the pitching of Indiana's senior Amy Unterbrink, who set a Big Ten season ERA record of 0.21, combined to limit the Gophers to a one game victory. That was enough for a share of the title.

**INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS/RECORDS** -- Minnesota senior Judy Oliverius of SPRING LAKE PARK, left her mark in the career record book this year. She finished as the all-time leader in games played (192), and at bats (592) and second in hits with 155, just four shy of Gretchen Larson's record of 159. Oliverius was also fourth in total bases (193), third in putouts (653) and fourth in assists (284). In pitching, she was third in games (66), innings pitched (385.7) and strikeouts (179).

Oliverius was third for the team overall in batting at .292 this year, with 42 hits, 19 runs and 15 RBI's. Her career average is .262 (155-592) with an on base pct. of .407 and fielding average of .969. She posted a 30-26 career pitching record with a 1.23 ERA. During her career, Oliverius played at pitcher, first base, second base and in the outfield.

**FLIS BREAKS CAREER FIELDING MARK** -- After leading the Big Ten in hitting with a .406 average as a junior designated hitter, this year senior Ann Flis of MENOMONIE, WI was called on to handle all of the defensive duties at first base. In the process she set a new Minnesota season record for putouts (431), and games played (51). Flis also became the all-time record holder for career putouts with 752, and for best career fielding pct. at .979 (818 chances). She batted .301 overall this season, tying for the team lead in hits at 49, and leading the team with 21 RBI's. Her career totals include a batting average of .310 (136-439), and an on base pct. of .412.

**DRAKE LEADS TEAM** -- St. Paul junior Barb Drake led the Gophers with a .345 overall batting average, tied for the lead with 49 hits, and scored a team high 27 runs with a slugging pct. of .479 and on base pct. of .472. In pitching, she handled most of the mound duties going 164.7 IP, with a 15-7 record and 1.06 ERA. She reset her season record for most doubles with 15, and holds the career mark with a career total of 34. Her 19 complete pitching games was the second most in a season, as were her eight shutouts.

**KATZENMEYER, CULLEN CONCLUDE CAREERS** -- Senior Kim Katzenmeyer of FERGUS FALLS, MN ended her career on a high note batting .228 for the season (31-136) and playing in a season record 51 games. She started at catcher in 30 games, and also played in the outfield and at second base. Her career batting average stands at .227, with her best year as a freshman (.273), and her 19 sacrifices is ninth on the Gopher career list. Her career fielding pct. of .966 includes just 13 errors in 377 chances. Jeanne Cullen, of COON RAPIDS, MN, ended her career during which she was a defensive specialist at shortstop, second base, and this year in the outfield. Cullen is 11th in career putouts with 260, and third in career assists with 289. She played in 151 games during her career.

**OTHER GOPHERS** -- Junior Carla Cray of CHESTER, IA also played in a season record 51 games and batted .221 for the year. Cray set a season record for most assists with 148, and was a defensive sparkplug at shortstop. Freshman Kathy Casull of SALT LAKE CITY, UT, stepped in and handled third base all year, posting the second most assists in a season with 130.

The Minnesota women's golf team wrapped up their regular season of play last weekend with a second place finish at the Big Ten Women's Golf Championship at Ann Arbor, Mich. The Gophers carded a four-round total of 331-324-327-326=1308, finishing 58 strokes behind the tournament leader, Indiana. The Hoosiers won their first Big Ten golf championship ever with a 316-311-313-310=1250. Minnesota improved from sixth place last year, however the Gophers were second in 1984 at the conference championships.

Junior Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) was one of 10 golfers named to the All-Big Ten Team on a vote by the coaches. Forsberg led the Gophers this year with a 78.89 stroke average, and won two tournaments, the Lady Badger Invitational in the fall, and the Iowa Invitational this spring. Forsberg finished the Big Ten Championship in 17th place, carding a 80-88-82-83=333.

Leading the Gophers at the Big Ten's were sophomore Jodi Krafka (ALEXANDRIA, MN) and freshman Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) who tied with one another for eighth place. Krafka carded a 79-84-85-78=326 for the 72 holes and Hughes scored a 86-76-81-83=326. Indiana's Sarah DeKraay was the medalist, shooting a 80-78-77-78=313.

Junior Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN) tied at 18th, scoring a 86-81-82-85=334, and junior Ann Meyer (SAUK CENTRE, MN) tallied a 87-85-82-82=336 for 21st place. Sophomore Mary Kuhlmann (MONTEVIDEO, MN) shot a 88-83-87-88=346 finishing in a four-way tied for 34th.

All of the Gophers that competed last year at the Big Ten finals improved their final placings from a year ago. The team had a successful fall season, winning their first two outings of the year, and placing in the upper brackets in three other tournaments. The spring season started with Minnesota being ranked for the first time in the top 20 teams nationally by the NCAA. The Gopher's finished the year by placing in the top three slots in three of their five competitions.

COACH ANNE ZAHN COMMENTS-- "We were pleased to finish in second place, as it's quite an improvement over last year's sixth place finish. Indiana is a tough competitor and will be excellent conference representatives at the NCAA championships. Dee (Forsberg) went through some swings changes a year ago, and it paid off this season. She had the low stroke average (78.89) on this year's squad."

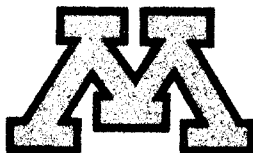

**(GOPHER TRACKSTERS TRAVEL TO BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS) --**

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The Minnesota Gopher women's track and field team will travel to Madison, Wisc. to take part in the 1986 Big Ten Outdoor Track and Field Championships, May 22-23. The Gophers will take 19 athletes and hope to top last year's sixth place finish. That won't be an easy task though, as all ten teams will provide Minnesota with strong competition.

The Gophers' strongest suit into the Big Ten meet is the DISTANCE races. Six time All-American Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) and fellow senior Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI) are Minnesota's top two distance threats. Eder will run the 1500 meters and Bant will compete in the 5000 meters. Joining Bant in the 5000 is freshman Patty Burns (MENOMONIE, WI), while sophomore Kathy Scharnhorst (WAUSAU, WI) will pair with Eder in the 1500. Running the 10,000 meters for the Gophers are Eileen Donaghy (ST. PAUL, MN) and Patti Eidman (ROSEVILLE, MN). Lisa Johnson (LA CRESCENT, MN) in the 800 meters, and Natalie Burke (PLYMOUTH, MN) in the 3000 meters round out the Gopher distance troops.

In the SPRINTS, Minnesota is pinning its hopes on Michele Brown (POMPANO BEACH, FL), Lisa Walton (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) and Char Wetzel (NEW BRIGHTON, MN). All three Gophers will compete in both 100 meters and 200 meters. Minnesota's lone representative in the HURDLES will be Steph Stoltman (MINNETONKA, MN) who will run both the 100 meter and 400 meter hurdles.

The Gophers may surprise the competition with its depth in FIELD EVENTS. Leading the way for Minnesota are Jo Arvesen (WASECA, MN) and Beth Lindblad (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) who will both compete in the the HEPTATHLON.

In the JUMPS, senior Lisa Pruitt (NEENAH, WI) is a threat in both the triple jump and long jump, while Cindy Bradley (EURAKA, CAL) is Minnesota's high jump entrant. THROWERS hoping to do well for the Gophers include Dana Hawksford (ANOKA, MN) in the discus, and Shirley Molitor (COLD SPRING, MN) and Leslie Smith (MINNEAPOLIS, MN) in the shotput.

The RELAYS are the only undecided for the Gophers. First-year Coach Gary Wilson may run a combination of Pruitt, Stoltman, Brown, and Wetzel in the 4 x 100 meter relay, while those four plus Johnson could be used in the 4 x 400 meter relay.

**COACH WILSON COMMENTS ON THE BIG TEN** -- "Our goal is for everyone to set personal bests," said Wilson. "If we were 100% healthy we could top our sixth place finish last year, but with injuries to Walton, Stoltman and others, we're not in top form. I think the competition is also going to be tough. Right now, it's just hard to say where we'll end up."

**NOTING THE COMPETITION** -- Host school Wisconsin has to be considered this year's odds-on-favorite having won the title the past three years. Returning 11 All-Americans, Wisconsin could easily exceed the 138 points they accumulated in winning the 1985 outdoor championships. Indiana could prove to be the Badgers toughest team competition. The Hoosiers have added some depth to their already talented squad.

**COMPETITION CONTINUED** -- Hoping to surprise Indiana and Wisconsin is Purdue. The Boilermakers placed third in the 1985 meet, scoring 86 points. Yvonne Netterville, last year's outdoor athlete of the meet, is expected to lead this year's squad. The Hawkeyes of Iowa placed fourth in the 1985 outdoor championships and hope to improve on that showing by performing well in the sprints. The Michigan State Spartans finished 15 points ahead of Minnesota last year to capture fifth place in the outdoor championships. The Spartans are strong in the sprints again this year.

The Wolverines of Michigan are hoping to catch and surpass both their state-rivals and the Gophers at this year's meet. Michigan is putting its hopes in the hands of an experienced senior distance squad. Ohio State tallied 42 points at last year's meet, falling one short of Minnesota's 43 point total. Ohio State coach Mamie Rallins has added depth and hopes that will help improve on last year's showing. The Fighting Illini of Illinois, like the Wildcats of Northwestern, have little where else to go except up. Illinois placed ninth in first year's meet, while Northwestern finished tenth.

**GOPHERS MAKE MOST OF LAST CHANCE** -- The Gopher women's track team made the most of the Gopher-Burger King Last Chance meet Saturday May 10 at Bierman Field. Despite rainy conditions, several Gophers had fine showings in the five team non-scored meet.

Leading the way for Minnesota were the Gopher seniors. Stacy Bant (RACINE, WI.) had an outstanding final home performance in the 5000-meters. Bant set a personal best by 17 seconds on her way to winning the race in 16:43.3. Jody Eder (LAKE ELMO, MN) also ended her home career on an up note. The six-time All-American placed second in the 1500-meters at 4:24.0. Lisa Pruitt was the last of the Gopher seniors to finish out her home career. Pruitt began the day by winning the long jump, despite the soggy conditions. She then helped the Gophers to victory in the 400 meter relay, and finished off the day by anchoring the Gophers victorious 1600 meter relay. The three graduating seniors were presented with roses by former Gopher coach Mike Lawless.

Other Gophers who placed first were Stoltman in the 110 meter hurdles (14.91), Wetzel in the 100 meter dash (12.42), and Johnson in the 400 meter dash (59.33). Bradley won the high jump at 5' 2'' and Molitor won the shot with a toss of 43'-6 1/2''.

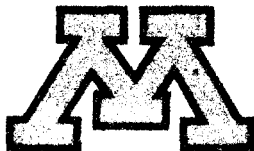

Patty Walsh (SHOREVIEW, MN) also improved her personal best in the 3000 meters as she cut 14 seconds off her previous best and placed 15th in the race with a 10:09.70 time.

## (FIELDS NAMED ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker announced that LaRue Fields has been hired as a new assistant coach for women's basketball, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Fields replaces Sherri Mattson, who worked as an interim assistant during the past year.

For the past seven years, Fields has served as the Coordinator of Women's Sports and Head Women's Basketball Coach at Morgan State University in Baltimore, Md. In addition, she was a full time faculty member in Health and Physical Education.

Her seven year coaching record of 110-53 (.675 pct.) includes five regional and two national tournament appearances. From 1978-79 to 1982-83 Morgan State competed in the Division II of the AIAW. Field's teams had three 20-plus win seasons during that span, and in 1980-81 her team compiled a 24-4 mark, was ranked in the nation's top-twenty, and Field's received Coach of the Year honors. Last year Morgan State moved up to Division I status in basketball.

Fields, 32, received her B.A. degree in Sociology from Francis Marion College, in Florence, S.C. The next year she served as a graduate assistant at Salisbury State College in Maryland while earning her masters degree in education.

"LaRue brings a strong background to our program as a head coach for seven years in Division II and Division I," said Minnesota head women's basketball coach Ellen Hanson. "The contacts she has developed through her years of coaching will help us recruit some quality players."

Upon accepting the position Fields said, "I'm very excited and honored. Minnesota is a classy organization, and I'm glad to be a part of it." Fields said that after seven years at Morgan State she was ready to pursue "different avenues for growth".

Her ten month appointment will run from September 1, 1986 to June 30, 1987. Field's parents, Norman and Gertrude, still reside in her hometown of Effingham, S.C., just outside of Florence.

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker has announced the hiring of Karen Swanson as an assistant athletic trainer, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Swanson served as an interim assistant trainer from September of 1985 until the present, and was appointed to the position after a nationwide search.

Swanson worked during 1984-85 as an exercise physiologist and athletic trainer at the West Michigan Sports Medicine Clinic in Grand Haven before returning to Minnesota. BIG TEN CONFERENCE MEDAL OF HONOR -- JODY EDER, LAKE ELMO, MINNESOTA

During her career at Minnesota, Jody Eder has collected six All-American titles, two in cross country, three in indoor track and one in outdoor track and field. She not only holds the school cross country record of 15:32.6, but the four fastest times as well. In indoor track, Eder holds five school records in the 800, 1,000 and 3,000 meters and in the 880 and 1,000 yard runs. In outdoor track she holds three school records in the 800, 1,500 and 3,000 meters. As a member of relay teams, Eder also holds three more school records.

Eder captained this year's cross country team and has been the team's MVP in 1983, 1984 and 1985 while earning All-Big Ten honors as a junior and senior. She earned All-American honors by leading the team to a tenth place national finish in 1983 when she was 14th individually, and by placing 21st individually this year.

In indoor track, Eder was third in 1983 at the NCAA Nationals on the two-mile relay team and fifth in the 1,000 yard run, earning her two All-American titles. She picked up her third the next year by placing fourth in the 1,000 meter run. As a freshman, Eder was MVP of both the indoor and outdoor track and field teams. As a sophomore, she earned her All-American honor in outdoor track and field by placing sixth in the 3,000 meter run. That summer, she ran in the U.S. Olympic trials in the 3,000 meters. Her junior year, Eder was third at the Drake Relays in the 1,500 meters outdoors. Although a Big Ten track title has eluded her, she was placed second in both the 1,500 and 3,000 meters outdoors. Eder was honored by the March of Dimes as the Minnesota Collegiate Athlete of the Year for an individual sport in 1985. A physical education major from Lake Elmo, Minnesota, Eder carries a 3.12 gpa and was named to the Big Ten Academic At Large team this spring.

SENIOR ATHLETE OF THE YEAR -- DIANE WALLNER, ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA

(This award is voted on by athletes in all sports)

Diane Wallner capped off her swimming career with a superlative senior season. She was honored this year as the Big Ten Swimmer of the Year, the Big Ten Swimmer of the Month for February, and by the March of Dimes as the Minnesota Collegiate Athlete of the Year for an individual sport. Wallner was also named the Gopher's MVP, an honor which she also received as a sophomore.

At this year's Big Ten meet, Wallner won both the 50 and 100 yard freestyles and swam on three relay teams, two of which won Big Ten titles. Her time of :22.97 in the 50 freestyle pre-lim's was the fastest time by any female collegiate swimmer in the country and seeded her No. 1 in that event for the NCAA Nationals. At the NCAA's she placed seventh, earning her first individual All-American honors. Wallner led Minnesota with 94 points at the Big Ten's and 245 varsity points for the season and placed first 38 times during the year in dual competition.

During her career Wallner has won thirteen Big Ten titles and has held or holds eight Big Ten records individually or as a member of relay teams. She also hold three Minnesota individual and five relay varsity records and four individual Cooke Hall pool records. In addition, Wallner has earned five honorable mention NCAA All-American honors as a junior and senior, and was a first team All-American as a member of the 400 free relay as a junior. She tried out for the U.S. Olympic Swimming Team after her junior year, the only Gopher swimmer to ever do so. A chemistry/pre-med major, Wallner is from St. Paul and attended Alexander-Ramsey High School.

OUTSTANDING ATHLETE AWARDS --

KIM ONG, CREW -- Sophomore Kim Ong was honored as the top performer on the All-American varsity eight crew team. As coxswain on the varsity eight boat Ong was responsible for steering, commanding and motivating the rowers. Ong advanced to the varsity eight team this year after competing on the third novice boat last year. Ong also excels academically as an honors student in the Institute of Technology.

JODY EDER, CROSS COUNTRY -- (see Medal of Honor)

BASKETBALL, MOLLY TADICH -- Junior Molly Tadich established herself as one of the top centers in the Big Ten this year, earning recognition on the second All-Big Ten team for the second straight year. Tadich led the league in rebounding with an 11.1 per game average, and for the third straight year led the Big Ten in blocked shots with a 1.9 per game average. She was also sixth in the conference in scoring. Tadich also led Minnesota in -- scoring with an 18.3 points per game average, rebounding at 11.7 per game, and minutes played -- while averaging 1.6 blocks, 2.4 assists and 2.0 steals.

Tadich was named to All-Tournament teams at the Lady Lion and Dial Classics this year, and surpassed the 1,000 career points mark early in the year against Iowa. She is currently sixth in career scoring with 1,237 points, and third in career rebounding with 904 carom. Tadich was also honored for the second year on the Big Ten All-Academic team and CoSIDA GTE District Academic Team.

GOLF, DEE FORSBERG -- Junior Dee Forsberg was the golf team's leading performer this year with a 78.89 stroke average, and she was one of ten golfers selected to the All-Big Ten golf team. Forsberg placed 17th individually at the Big Ten Championship and was a key performer in the team's second place finish. She won two tournaments this year, the Lady Badger Invitational in the fall and the Iowa Invitational during the spring season. She carded a 223 total for 54 holes at both tournaments, tying her for the third lowest three round score in Minnesota history. Forsberg had a spring stroke average of 80.10 to lead the team. Her fall stroke average of 78.22 was the second best on the team, and her career stroke average is 80.77.

GYMNASTICS, SHELLEY BROWN -- Junior Shelley Brown was the gymnastics team's leading performer this year and has been one of the team's top four all-arounders throughout her career. Brown won the Big Ten All-Around title this year and was a major contributor to the team's second place finish at the conference meet. She was also the only gymnast in the conference to compete in all four individual events at the championship. Brown advanced to NCAA Midwest Regional competition as an all-arounder and there she tied for first on the balance beam and placed seventh all-around. She ended her season as a individual competitor at the NCAA National Gymnastics Championship where she was seeded sixth out of the ten individual all-arounders. Brown set new school records in the vault, with a 9.60 score, on the balance beam, with a 9.75 mark, and in the all-around with a 37.45 score.

SOFTBALL, BARB DRAKE -- Junior Barb Drake was a dominant player in the Big Ten this year, playing as a pitcher, catcher, and at second base for the Gophers. She was named Big Ten Player of the Week in four of the six week's of conference play, and led the Big Ten in batting with a .408 average. It was no surprise when the conference coaches voted her the Big Ten's most valuable player. Drake was also named to the first team All-Region as a utility player and to the second team All-American as a designated hitter, repeating her selection to those two teams which she earned as a freshman. Drake led the Gophers overall with a .345 batting average including 49 hits, and in pitching posted a 15-7 record with a 1.06 earned run average. She reset her school record for most doubles in a season with 15, and holds the career doubles record with 34.

SWIMMING, DIANE WALLNER -- (see Senior Athlete of Year)

TENNIS, NANCY ROST -- Senior Nancy Rost's earned her second alumni award. Rost started this season playing at number two singles and number one doubles, but when a teammate was injured she moved to number one singles during the winter season. Rost was named to the All-Big Ten second team as a singles player, her third consecutive year on an all-conference team. She led the team to a fourth-place finish at the conference meet for the third straight year. Rost ended the season with a 17-17 singles record and 74 career singles victories, which places her sixth on the all-time career singles wins list. Rost played at both number one singles and doubles for most of her career, and her 65 career doubles wins are eighth on the all-time victory list.

TRACK AND FIELD, JO ARVESEN -- Senior Jo Arvesen was named the track team's top performer in the field events. She shares MVP honors with runner Stephanie Stoltman. Arvesen placed fifth in the heptathlon at the Big Ten Outdoor Track and Field Championships and placed first in the 800 meter run portion of the competition. This is the first year that Arvesen has competed in the heptathlon. At the Big Ten Indoor Championships in February Arvesen competed in her first complete pentathlon and placed fourth. She was an all-around performer for the team competing as a hurdler, runner, thrower and jumper during the season. Arvesen had the team's best performances in the long jump and javelin and was a member of the top 4-by-400 relay team. Arvesen transferred to the U after competing for one year at St. Olaf College in Northfield.

VOLLEYBALL, ANDREA GONZALEZ -- Although only a freshman, Andrea Gonzalez quickly became a dominant volleyball player in the Big Ten conference. She came from Argentina to play for the Gophers and her rookie year ended with selection to the All-Big Ten first team. In her first collegiate match Gonzalez broke the Minnesota single-match kill records with 37 kills in a win over Toledo. She also set a new single-season kill record with 522 kills to lead the team. Gonzalez was also the team's leading hitter with a .295 kill percentage and a kill average of 4.2 kills per game. For her efforts she was the only conference volleyball player to be named Big Ten Player of the Week twice and Gonzalez was also ranked among the nation's top twenty hitters all season.

## (WALLNER TO ATTEND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TRIALS) --

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Gopher senior swimmer Diane Wallner of St. Paul, Minn. will be competing in the World Championship Trials in Orlando, Fla. beginning June 22. Wallner will leave for the trials with her coach, Jean Freeman, on Friday June 20.

Wallner hopes to qualify for either the Goodwill Games which begin July 5 in Moscow, or the FINA World Aquatics Championships which will be Madrid, Spain August 14-24.

She is seeded third in the nation in the 50 freestyle based on her :22.97 time and is also seeded 10th in the nation in the 100 freestyle with a time of :50.69.

On Sunday, June 22, Wallner will swim in the 100 free, where she must finish in the top six swimmers to go to the FINA Championships, or in the 7-10 finishers to qualify for the Goodwill Games. On Friday, June 27, she will swim in the 50 freestyle. The top two 50 free finishers will qualify for the FINA games and the third and fourth place swimmers will go to the Goodwill Games.

Wallner was seeded No. 1 in the nation in the 50 freestyle prior to the NCAA Nationals this past year, and ended up placing seventh at the meet, earning All-American honors. Her performance at the Big Ten Championship earned her honors as the Big Ten Swimmer of the Year.
