"We had another hard work day today," said Head Coach John Gutekunst. "We still have a lot left to accomplish before Saturday, but we're getting there. We worked hard on our run defense to get ready for Blaise Bryant (Iowa State star running back) and also on our pass defense. Offensively, we worked on our passing game to try and get our young receivers ready for Iowa State's veteran defensive backfield."

Athletic Director Rick Bay closed out the two-and-a-half hour session by first faking an extra point attempt and running around end for the two-point conversion, and then nailing the next attempt right through the middle of the uprights.

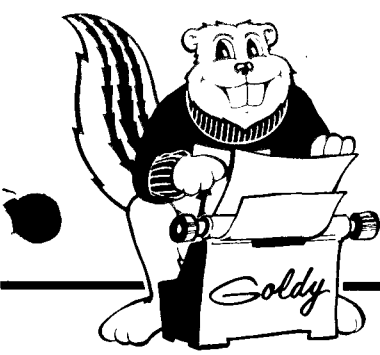

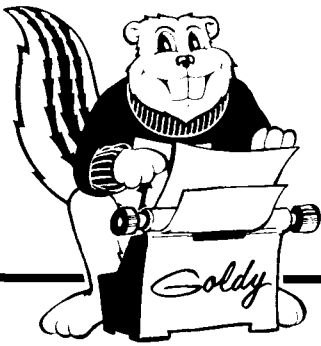

GOLDEN GOPHERS SET TO INVADE NEBRASKA

After two straight non-conference assignments at home, the University of Minnesota is scheduled to hit the road this week to square off with nationally-ranked Nebraska in Lincoln. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. [CDT].

The 'Huskies will put a 2-0 record on the line after downing Baylor and Northern Illinois in their first two assignments. Nebraska, however, had last week-end off and thus has had two weeks to prepare for the Golden Gophers.

Minnesota, meanwhile, will take a mark of 1-1 to Nebraska after squeezing by Iowa State 20-16 this past weekend. It was another heart-stopper for the Golden Gophers who lost a 35-29 decision on the last play of the game to Utah in the season opener two weeks ago.

"I'm obviously happy to have the win," Head Coach John Gutekunst said after Minnesota scored its come-from-behind verdict over the Cyclones. "It's a good feeling, and I'm proud of our people for the way they came back.....not only from Iowa State's early 13-0 lead but also from the taste of that disappointing loss to Utah."

But, while the win over Iowa

State came over a Big Eight opponent, Gutekunst and his Golden Gophers know that this week's foe from the same conference will present a much more difficult assignment.

"No need to say much about Nebraska," Gutekunst hedged. "They have one of the premiere programs in the country. Coach Tom Osborne has a team with tremendous defensive speed, and after looking at their second game as well as adding a week off, their offense will be equally as potent."

In addition, it is Minnesota's first road assignment of the season, and while road games always are "more" challenging, the first one is even more so.....especially when dealing with as many young players as is the case with the Golden Gophers. Not to mention history. True, Minnesota holds a seemingly comfortable edge of 29-19-2 in the series with the 'Huskies, but a closer look shows that Nebraska has prevailed in the last 13 confrontations.

In addition, the Golden Gophers' edge in games played in Lincoln is only 9-8-2, and the last victory for Minnesota on Nebraska turf.....in fact the last win in the series for

Minnesota.....came in 1960 when Coach Murray Warmath's national champions edged the Huskers 13-7.

"We know the odds," Gutekunst said, "but we always play to win. We go into every game with the same attitude. All we can do is try to control the things that we have the ability to control. We'll just get ready to play Nebraska."

Once again Minnesota came out of the Iowa State game in good physical condition, and any injuries suffered against the Cyclones were not serious in nature. Everyone should be ready to go against the Cornhuskers.

All of which means that no dramatic changes are expected in Minnesota's two-deep listings this week. Marquel Fleetwood, who rushed for 66 yards and a touchdown and completed 19-of-30 passing attempts for 196 more yards in his first collegiate start against Iowa State last week, again will get the nod at quarterback in Lincoln....but Scott Schaffner, who opened against Utah and then came off the bench to throw the game-winning touchdown against ISU will be waiting patiently in the wings.

GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM SET FOR 21 APPEARANCES ON MIDWEST SPORTS CHANNEL

The University of Minnesota basketball team will make 21 appearances on Midwest Sports Channel (MSC) during the 1990-91 season, with seven of those telecasts scheduled to originate on WCCO-TV and be simulcast on MSC.

Total distribution of MSC in households across Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Northern Iowa and Western Wisconsin is over 200,000. MSC, however, currently has about 26,000 subscribers in the Twin Cities area, most of them located in the Western suburbs. In addition, over 150 commercial establishments also subscribe to MSC in the metropolitan area.

"A lot of fans in the Twin Cities area who do not receive Midwest Sports Channel have expressed a great deal of concern that they will be unable to see many of the Gophers and Big Ten basketball games once again this season," said University of Minnesota Athletic Director Rick Bay. "We discussed this issue with the rights holder to these games, Raycom Sports and Entertainment, and were told there was nothing we could do to increase distribution on metropolitan cable systems. MSC has a legally-binding contract with Raycom to distribute these games, so all we can do is ask viewers to call their local cable operator and MSC and encourage them to resolve the situation."

"We're working very hard to come up with a formula that is fair to both the metropolitan cable operators and MSC," said MSC Vice President and General Manager Kevin Cattoor. "This is a very complex issue, but the bottom line is we have a great product and we want everyone to have the opportunity to enjoy it."

Head Coach Clem Haskins' squad is also tentatively scheduled to make three appearances on ESPN and two on ABC during the 1990-91 season.

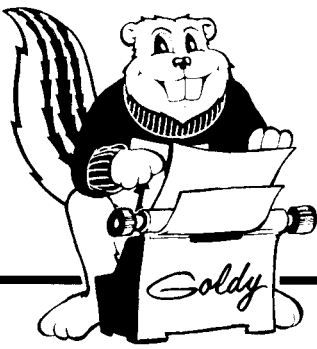

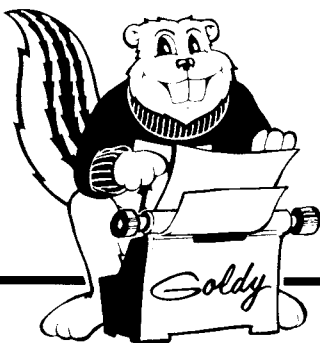

Bill Crumley has been named Assistant Sports Information Director at the University of Minnesota, pending final approval by the school's Board of Regents.

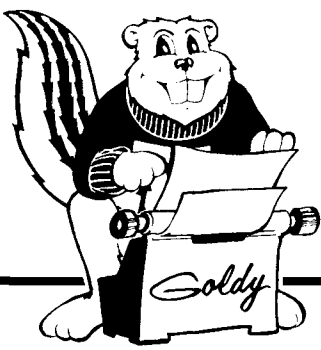

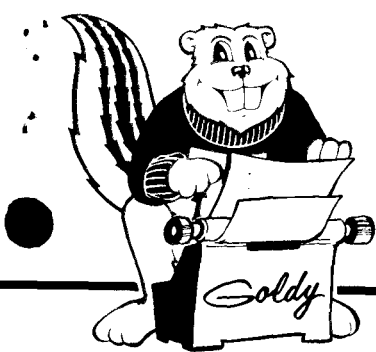

GOPHER GRIDDERS HAVE WEEK OFF TO PREPARE FOR BIG TEN OPENOR

The Golden Gophers wrapped up the non-conference part of their schedule this past weekend with a loss to the eighth-ranked Nebraska Cornhuskers 56-0 in Lincoln. The Golden Gophers never moved the ball past midfield in the game in which winds gusted up to 35 mph. The offense totaled just 106 yards compared to Nebraska's 564 yards of total offense. "We won one game and we gave one away, but it was our job to be good and give Nebraska a football game. Every handoff was going for 8 or 10 yards. "I'm very, very disappointed in the defense. We've got to get kids in better position to make plays."

The Golden Gophers are idle this week and they will try to regroup before they open up the Big Ten season October 6, in West Lafayette, IN, when they take on the Boilermakers of Purdue. The Boilermakers are 1-1 in non-conference games. On Saturday the Boilermakers pounced on Division I-AA opponent Indiana State 41-13 to gain the first victory of the young season. Quarterback Eric Hunter passed for 291 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Boilermakers on offense, while on defense Purdue blocked two Indiana State punts to set up scores. This weekend the Boilermakers will be on the road for the first time this season when they take on the Irish of Notre Dame.

Minnesota leads the series against the Boilermakers 26-19-3, with Minnesota winning last season at the Metrodome 35-15. The Boilermakers last won in 1988 when they defeated the Golden Gophers 14-10 in West Lafayette. Minnesota leads the series in Minneapolis 23-9-3, and Purdue leads the series in West Lafayette 10-3-0.

Once again, Minnesota came out of the Nebraska game in good physical condition, and any injuries suffered against the Cornhuskers were not serious in nature. Everyone should be ready to go against the Boilermakers when the Golden Gophers open up the Big Ten season.

MEANS TEES OFF HIS COACHING CAREER AS THE GOLF TEAM OPENS THE FALL SEASON AT THE NORTHERN INTERCOLLEGIATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

University of Minnesota Head Golf Coach John Means heads into his first tournament as the Gophers top man this weekend as the Gophers visit West Lafayette, IN, for the Northern Intercollegiate Championships. The 54-hole tourney runs Friday through Sunday.

Means, who began his tenure at Minnesota last June, has just finished his final cuts to form the 1990-91 Golden Gopher golf squad. Over 60 golfers participated in the team's qualifying rounds from which this year's squad was formed.

Captains Paul Keller and Dave Carothers return to lead a host of new players into the fall schedule. The Golden Gophers begin play this weekend at the Northern Intercollegiate, after that it's on to the Ohio State Invitational on October 13-14, followed by the Walter McGlaughlin Invitational at St. Johns University in Long Island, NY on October 20-21.

The squad then travels south to the Charleston Invitational in Kiawah Island, S.C. on November 3-4. They finish the fall season at the University of San Francisco Invitational on November 12-13.

Coach Means is a native of Burnsville, Minnesota and a 1979 graduate of the University of Oklahoma. Prior to coming to Minnesota, he was the head coach at the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY. for 11 years, where he directed the Cadets to nine consecutive Metro Atlantic team titles and four NCAA appearances. He was chosen District Coach of the Year by the Golf Coaches Association of America in July for his efforts this past season at Army where they set a school record five victories en route to their 20th-place finish at the NCAA Tournament.

ALUMNI BASEBALL GAME SET FOR SATURDAY AT SIEBERT FIELD

Head Coach John Anderson's Golden Gopher baseball team will host its annual Alumni game on Saturday, September 29, at Dick Siebert Field on the campus of the University of Minnesota.

"It's a great opportunity to get our former players together and renew old friendships and develop new ones," said Anderson. "It is very important that we bring these players back to campus and to Siebert Field to get them involved with the program and give them a sense of where we are going."

The Alumni Day activities will consist of two games with a picnic in between and after the games. First the inactive players will draw teams and compete at 12:00 Noon, followed by the more active players, who will split into two teams and begin play at 2:30 p.m. "It is really a great day for the alumni," said Anderson. "They get to see their old teammates and have that great feeling of pulling on the Maroon and Gold again."

Anderson's squad began their fall practice sessions on Monday as they start preparing for the 1991 baseball season. The Golden Gophers start the season on February 22, 1991 in Tallahassee Florida against the Florida State Seminoles.

Minnesota returns six starters and 16 letterwinners from last year's squad that finished second in the Big Ten. Entering his ninth season at Minnesota, Gopher skipper John Anderson has a career mark of 305-204-3, including three Big Ten championships and four NCAA Tournament appearances.

ROETHLISBERGER SET FOR INDUCTION INTO WISCONSIN ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

University of Minnesota head men's gymnastics coach, Fred Roethlisberger, will be inducted into the Wisconsin Athletic Hall of Fame at a special enshrinement program to be held this Thursday (September 27) at the MECCA in Milwaukee.

Roethlisberger was honored by his colleagues as the 1990 Big Ten Coach-of-the-Year after directing the Golden Gophers to the Big Ten team title at the league championship meet last March. Since taking over the reins of the program in 1972, he has led the Golden Gophers to eight Big Ten titles, never finishing lower than fourth at the meet championship. In addition, his teams have placed in the Top 10 at the NCAA Championships a total of 11 times. He has been named Mideast Coach-of-the-Year the past two seasons, USA Today also selected him as their 1989 Minnesota Coach-of-the-Year. The Golden Gophers finished second to Nebraska by one-tenth of a point at the NCAA Championships held last April in Williams Arena in one of the most exciting finishes in the history of the competition.

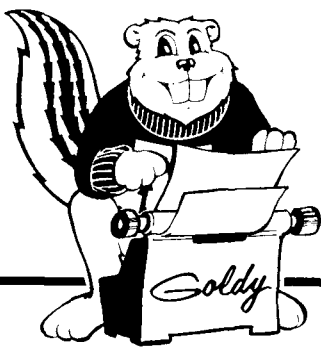
Roethlisberger, who was inducted into the U.S. Gymnastics Hall of Fame this year as a gymnast, coach and contributor, charted an illustrious gymnastics career of his own. Starting at an early age, he was an active participant with the Milwaukee Turners club team through high school. Following his prep days, he went on to star at the University of Wisconsin, where he became the first individual to receive the school's Athlete-of-the-Year Award while participating in a sport other than football or basketball. He earned his Bachelor's degree in 1966, and his Master's in 1970.

On the international scene, Roethlisberger competed in the 1966 World Championships, the 1967 Pan American Games and the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City. He was the second-highest scorer for the U.S. squad in Mexico City, and captained the Pan Am team, while winning gold medals in the all-around, horizontal bar and parallel bars at the competition in Winnipeg.

Following the 1968 Olympics, Roethlisberger began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater. In 1971 he came to the University of Minnesota where he assisted head coach Pat Bird for one season before being named the head coach the following season.

Throughout his career, Roethlisberger has been an active figure in the efforts of the U.S. National Team. In 1988, he served as head coach in the U.S.-U.S.S.R. dual meet in Phoenix, Arizona. In addition, he coached the U.S. National Team that traveled to Europe to compete against West Germany, Hungary and France in 1977, and has led contingents that participated in the 1978 Canada Cup, 1979 and 1985 Barcelona Invitational Tournaments, 1979 Taiwan Cup, 1981 South America Cup, 1982 France Invitational, 1982 and 1985 London Coca-Cola Invitational Tournaments, 1986 U.S.-China meet in Boston, 1989 China Cup, 1990 USA vs. Switzerland and East Germany.

Roethlisberger is currently the Collegiate Coaches Association representative on the United States Gymnastics Federation Board of Directors, and served for eight years, including three as chairman, on the USGF Men's Program Committee. He also is the vice president for the NACGC (National Association of College Gymnastics Coaches).

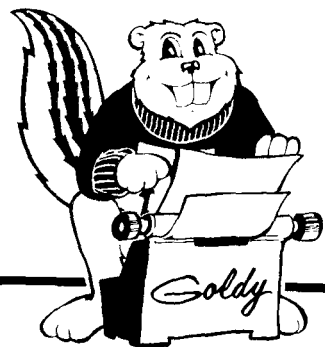
GOPHER ALL-AMERICAN IS FINALIST FOR THE GOLDEN SPIKES AWARD

Former Gopher All-American catcher Dan Wilson has been named one of nine finalists for the Golden Spikes Award which is given annually to the top amateur baseball player in the country. Wilson is a two-time finalist for the award, having been chosen in '89 as well.

The Barrington, IL native had a standout season in 1989 when he batted .370 with 49 RBI's, eight home runs and 17 doubles. In addition he was the primary force behind the 37 base runners caught stealing by the Gophers in '89. He threw out an amazing 64% of would-be base stealers during '89-'90 (33 of 52). He also set a Big Ten record for 23 walks in 26 games.

Wilson, who was the top collegiate player taken in the 1990 major league draft, left Minnesota with one year of eligibility remaining. Wilson has represented the U.S. on four different occasions in international play.

He was the first Golden Gopher named First Team All-American since shortstop Paul Molitor was chosen in 1976. The 6-3, 190 pound Wilson was drafted by the Cincinnati Reds organization in the first round and is currently competing in their minor league system.

GOLDEN GOPHERS TO OPEN BIG TEN SLATE AT PURDUE

After a week off from competition, the University of Minnesota returns to action in a big way Saturday when kicking off its 1990 Big Ten Conference season at 1:00 p.m. (EST) against the Boilermakers at Purdue University.

The Golden Gophers will take a 1-2 non-conference record into the circuit opener after falling to Nebraska in their most recent outing. Prior to that, Coach John Gutekunst's charges had lost to Utah and beaten Iowa State.

Purdue, which dropped a non-conference assignment at Notre Dame last weekend, will take a similar 1-2 mark into Saturday's Big Ten opener. Previously the Boilermakers had lost to Washington and defeated Indiana State.

The Minnesota-Purdue series has been a good one. In all, there have been 48 football meetings between these two schools, and the Golden Gophers will take a 26-19-3 edge into Saturday's game.

Minnesota won 35-15 a year ago in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome in Minneapolis, but is only 3-10 in games played in West Lafayette. The most recent

victory for the Golden Gophers at Purdue was a 36-9 decision in 1986.

There are two big questions that continue to surface in Minnesota's camp as it prepares for Purdue are: 1) can the Golden Gophers bounce back from their one-sided loss at Nebraska two weeks ago? 2) did the open date and week off hurt or help their cause?

"The loss at Nebraska was a tough one," Gutekunst admitted, "but it is something we simply have to put behind us. We still have to hold our heads up, and now it is time to get ready for the Big Ten schedule. We want to get started right, so we will need a solid effort at Purdue."

Gutekunst gave his contingent a couple of days off....in hopes of mending both physically and mentally....but since then the pace in Minnesota's practices has been brisk, including an abundance of contact work.

No drastic changes are expected in Minnesota's two-deep assignments for the Boilers in spite of Gutekunst's pledge to "look at everyone and everything" in pre-game preparations.

Quarterback Marquel Fleet-

wood continues as Minnesota's offensive leader. He's rushed for 120 yards and passed for 326, scored two touchdowns on the ground and thrown for three more. John Lewis leads the receiving corps with seven receptions for 105 yards.

Defensively Frank Jackson is setting the pace with 30 tackles (22 solo and 8 assists) while Mike Sunvold and Skeeter Akre lead in tackles for losses with three each. Pat Wright has three interceptions to top the U of M in that department.

Some "dubious" but noteworthy statistics going into this weekend's contest: The Golden Gophers have been outscored 36-0 in the first quarter in their three non-conference games; overall, Minnesota has been outscored 107-49; and Minnesota's longest run from scrimmage thus far this season has been 23 yards by Fleetwood in the opener.

Following Saturday's road assignment at Purdue, Minnesota returns home to entertain Northwestern on October 13 in the 1990 Homecoming game. Kickoff is set for 1:30 p.m. (CDT) in the Metrodome and tickets still remain.

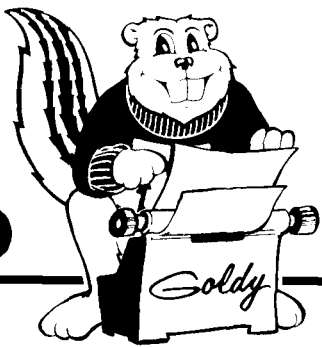

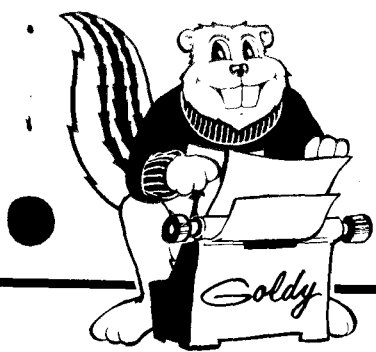

MINNESOTA TO HOST NORTHWESTERN IN HOMECOMING GAME ON SATURDAY

After two road assignmentsand an open date.....the University of Minnesota football team returns home to the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome on Saturday to host Northwestern in the 1990 Homecoming game at 1:30 p.m. (CDT).

Coach John Gutekunst's Golden Gophers, fresh from that stunning 19-7 triumph at Purdue last Saturday, will risk an overall record of 2-2 and a Big Ten mark of 1-0 against the invading Wildcats who are 1-3 and 0-1 after falling to Indiana by a 42-0 margin on Saturday.

A year ago Minnesota edged the 'Cats 20-18 down in Evanston, and as a result the Golden Gophers will take an edge of 43-23-5 in the series into Saturday's Homecoming contest. Minnesota leads 24-10-3 in games played in Minneapolis, and it is 1-1-1 against NU in games played in the Metrodome.

The Golden Gophers are happy to be returning to the Metrodome where they have not played since mid-September when they downed Iowa State 20-16, and while they may not be completely satisfied with their 1-1 road record, their most-recent effort against the Boiler-makers restored some of their

confidence, while also providing hope for the future.

"Our people did a heck of a job," Gutekunst said, "and I'm extremely proud of them for the way they came back.....not only from the early 7-0 deficit against Purdue, but also the disheartening loss we suffered at Nebraska a few weeks ago."

Several Golden Gophers drew rave reviews for their efforts in getting Minnesota off to the right start in this year's Big Ten Conference football race. Marquel Fleetwood, for example, may have turned in his best performance as the starting Golden Gopher quarterback. He was 11-of-19 through the air for 171 yards without an interception. He also rushed for 44 yards in 10 carries.

On the season, he leads Minnesota in rushing with 164 yards and in passing with 497.

Defensively, Russ Heath got his first collegiate start at linebacker and responded with three tackles, a pass broken up and a key pass interception. Frank Jackson and Andre Thaddies also recorded pass interceptions for Minnesota, while Keswic Joiner blocked a Purdue punt.

Brent Berglund accounted for 13 of Minnesota's 19 points at

Purdue on four field goals (that tied a school record for most field goals in a game held by Paul Rogind, Jim Gallery and Chip Lohmiller) and an extra point. He now has 24 points on the season and leads the Golden Gophers in that department.

All was not golden at Purdue, however. "We started like we did in our last three games," Gutekunst pointed out. "We gave up the ball on a fumble (Minnesota's only turnover of the game) on our first possession and wound up spotting them a touchdown. But our defense came back, and it played very hard. I feel we've made great improvement."

Now Gutekunst would like to see his Golden Gophers continue showing that same kind of improvement. "We'd like more points from the opportunities we are being given by our defense," he said. "We still are not a great defensive team, and there still is a lot of progress to be made. But we are getting better."

Gutekunst isn't planning any surprises in his two-deeps for the invading Wildcats, but he is concerned that defensive end Skeeter Akre may not be available after suffering a knee injury against Purdue.

The team also returns some additional scoring punch in seniors **Ken Gernander (Coleraine, 32G, 17A)** and **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids, 21G, 19A)**. Gernander finished third on the team in scoring last season with 49 points.

Back on the Blue Line: The Gophers return all of their players except for Lance Pitlick, who was out most of last season with an injury. That veteran blue line corps is led by juniors **Tom Pederson (Jefferson, 8G, 30A)** and **Larry Olimb (Warroad, 6G, 36A)**.

The Last Defense: The goaltending duties rest in the hands of two tested veterans, **Jeff Stolp (Greenway)** and **Tom Newman (Blaine)**. These two goalies were in the net for 35 of Minnesota's 46 games in 1989-90. Newman finished with a 19-13-2 record and a 3.84 GAA, while Stolp was 5-1-0 with a 4.75 GAA.

BIG New Talent: There is also a strong group of newcomers arriving on the scene from the junior hockey and high school ranks. This group has to be one of the most physically imposing groups to arrive in Gold Country in some time. Six of the seven signees are over six feet tall with an average weight of 196 pounds.

The largest of that group is last year's "Mr Hockey" **Joe Dziedzic (Edison)** who is a 6-3, 215 pound wing. Other impressive newcomers are **Mike Muller (Wayzata)** a 6-2, 212 defenseman who has been very impressive in training camp. On the front line, center **Craig Johnson (Hill-Murray)** looks like he will contribute immediately. All of these newcomers will add a more physical dimension to the Gopher lineup and bring some additional scoring punch as well.

St. Cloud Series: "This series with St. Cloud is the beginning of a strong rivalry," said coach Woog. "Because we recruit out of the same areas, a lot of players have competed with and against each other, and I think that adds to the emotional level of the games. We really look for this to become an exciting and fun series for years to come."

Schedule: The Golden Gophers start their 1990-91 season with the home-and-home series against St. Cloud State. Friday night the two teams meet in St. Cloud, and then on Saturday the Gophers home slate begins with a 7:05 p.m. matchup from Mariucci Arena. This is St. Cloud State's inaugural season as a member of the WCHA.

Up Next: Following the St. Cloud State series the Gophers travel to Denver to take on the Pioneers on October 19-20, from the Denver University Arena.

GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM SET TO OPEN PRACTICE

Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gopher basketball squad will start practice sessions for the 1990-91 season on Monday, October 15.

1990-91 Pre-Season Outlook: As he enters his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota program, Clem Haskins is well aware of the challenge that lies ahead of his young squad in 1990-91.

The Golden Gophers lost 64 percent of their scoring and 61 percent of their rebounding from last year's team that equalled the second highest victory total in school history with a 23-9 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Final Eight before dropping a heartbreaking decision to Georgia Tech in the Southeast Regional Final. That followed on the heels of the 1988-89 season when Haskins' team journeyed to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Providing an encore to that kind of success story will be a difficult task indeed.

"Defense and rebounding are the areas of our biggest concerns," Haskins said. "Whenever you lose the number of points and rebounds that we lost, it's obvious that some people are going to have to step forward. We have some outstanding basketball players coming back, however, and feel that the level of ability of the freshmen coming in is the best we've ever had."

Headlining the list of returnees will be All-America candidate **Kevin Lynch** (Bloomington, MN). The 6-5 senior guard was third on the team in scoring a year ago with a 13.4 average. An honorable mention All-Big Ten choice, he shot 51 percent (167-330) from the field, including a team-leading 40 percent (41-103) from three-point land, and 75 percent (53-71) from the free throw line last season for the Golden Gophers. A fine passer as well, he was second on the team with an average of 3.2 assists per game.

Redshirt freshman, **Arriel McDonald**, will be the heir apparent to the Golden Gopher point guard slot that was so capably handled by Melvin Newbern. Honored on the Southeast Regional All-Tournament Team and a third-team All-Big Ten choice last season, Newbern led the team in assists the past three seasons, finishing with 369 for his career to rank second on the all-time school list, in addition to finishing 12th in career scoring with 1,224 points. The 6-2 McDonald, however, came to Gold Country out of Athens Drive High School in Raleigh, NC equipped with an impressive prep resume and he appears ready and able to accept the challenge of directing the Golden Gopher attack.

Senior **Mario Green** (6-2) (Freeport, Bahamas), who saw action in 19 contests and averaged 1.7 points last season, is a seasoned backcourt performer that Haskins can call upon. Freshmen **Jon Laster** (6-4) from East High School in Denver, CO, and **Townsend Orr** (6-1), out of Thornridge High School in Dalton, IL, will also vie for playing time during their first season in Gold Country after recording fine prep careers.

Senior **Walter Bond** (Chicago, IL) is a multi-talented player who has the ability to play either guard or forward depending on game conditions. The 6-5, 220 pounder was third on the team in rebounding with an average of 4.2 boards a contest and fourth in scoring, averaging 10.5 points per game. He started 10 of 32 games a year ago, averaging 25 minutes a contest, and will look to be a full-time member of Haskins' starting fivesome in '90-91.

Replacing the frontcourt trio of Willie Burton, Richard Coffey and Jim Shikenjanski will be a major task to say the least. Burton finished second in career scoring with 1,800 points and ninth in rebounding with 705, while Coffey hauled down 904 rebounds in Gold Country to rank fourth on the all-time school chart. All told, the threesome combined to start 289 games, score 3,565 points and record 2,000 rebounds during their careers at the University of Minnesota.

In addition to Bond, forward candidates include returnees **Rob Metcalf** (Port Edwards, WI), a 6-6, 210 pound senior, and **Nate Tubbs** (Fort Wayne, IN), a 6-4, 206 pound sophomore. Metcalf played in 28 contests last season, averaging 6 minutes, 1.4 points and 1.3 rebounds per game. He displayed a potent outside shot and will look for increased minutes in '90-91. A defensive wiz, Tubbs averaged 6 minutes, 1.3 points and 1.0 rebounds during his rookie season. Those statistics don't reveal the fact that he often times was called upon to come off the bench and successfully defend some of the most feared sharpshooters in the Big Ten.

Sophomore **Dana Jackson** (Chicago, IL), who had to sit out last year after transferring from San Diego State University, and redshirt freshman **Ernest Nzigamasabo** will look to make an impact this season as well. The 6-8, 220 pound Jackson averaged nearly 13 minutes, 2.5 points and 3.0 rebounds per game for the Aztecs as a freshman in '88-89, while the 6-9, 228 pound Nzigamasabo, who registered an outstanding prep career at Mound-Westonka (MN) High School and is a native of Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa, has all of the tools to become a major force on the collegiate scene during his career.

Freshman **Randy Carter** charted a sparkling prep career at Central High School in Memphis, TN and at 6-8, 225, should be able to immediately handle the physical wars that take place down low in the rugged Big Ten. Fellow freshman, **Chad Kolander**, is a talented 6-9, 210-pounder who led Owatonna (MN) High School to back-to-back Minnesota Class AA crowns. Junior 7-0, 250 pound center, **Bob Martin** (Apple Valley), played in all 32 games last season, averaging 10 minutes, 2.9 points and 2.3 rebounds a game, in addition to recording a team-high 31 blocks. He provided a big spark off the bench in the Golden Gophers' 82-75 NCAA Tournament victory over Syracuse last season, scoring 10 points and snaring three rebounds against the Orangemen's highly-touted front line.

Haskins and the Golden Gophers will tackle a demanding non-conference schedule which includes home games against 1990 NCAA Tournament qualifiers Robert Morris on November 25, Oregon State on December 15 and Virginia on December 29, before they open what promises to be yet another exciting conference season on the road at Wisconsin on January 7.

"Our non-conference schedule certainly will give us a good indication of our maturity as a team and ability to compete in the league," Haskins said. "With the exception of Ohio State, Indiana and Michigan State, everyone lost a number of key players, so the conference race should once again be very interesting."

Ohio AAU Exhibition Game: The Golden Gophers will play the Ohio AAU team in an exhibition contest at Williams Arena on Sunday, November 4, at 2:00 p.m. Tickets priced at \$5.00 each for the game may be purchased in person at the Bierman Athletic Building Ticket Office beginning on Wednesday, October 10. All seating will be general admission. All proceeds from this event will benefit the University Hospital and Clinic, and the Williams Scholarship Fund.

TENNIS TEAM HAS MIXED RESULTS AT HARVARD TENNIS TOURNAMENT

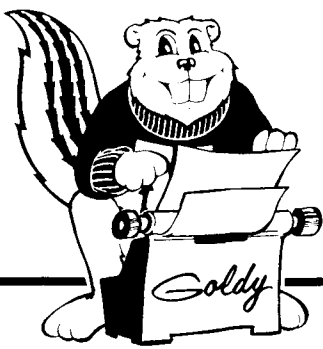

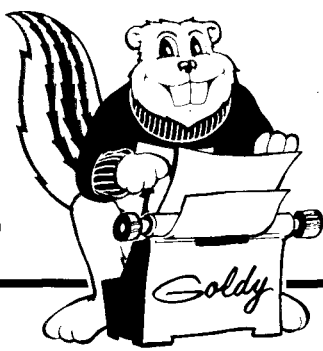
MONSON AND KOPFER NAMED CAPTAINS FOR '91 BASEBALL SEASON

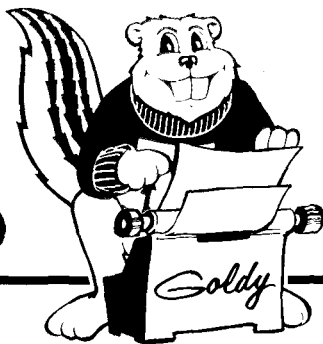

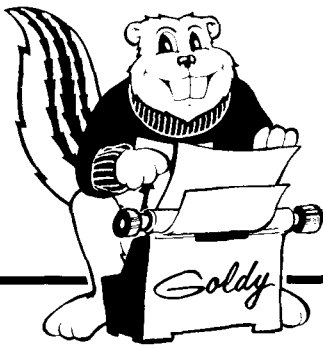

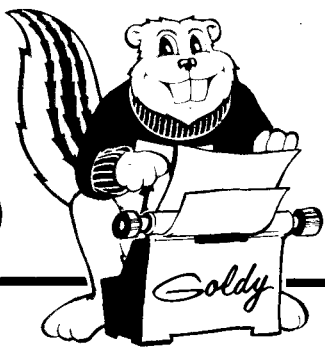
PEDERSON DECLARED INELIGIBLE FOR HOCKEY OPENER

Tom Pederson, junior defenseman for the University of Minnesota hockey team, has been declared ineligible for the 1990-91 season opener at St. Cloud State University Friday night by the Big Ten Conference, U of M Athletic Director Rick Bay announced today.

Pederson participated in a pre-season off-campus intra-squad scrimmage earlier this month after all of his summer school classwork was successfully completed but prior to the official recording of grades with the University of Minnesota registrar's office, a violation of Big Ten Conference eligibility standards.

When the violation was discovered, the U of M immediately declared Pederson ineligible, according to Bay. Pederson was subsequently withheld from the team's second intra-squad game. Minnesota then appealed for restoration of Pederson's eligibility, and he now has been declared eligible for the remainder of 1990-91 season.

"The violation was through no fault of Tom Pederson" Bay said. "He was involved in a rare technicality, and we are pleased that the issue now has been resolved."

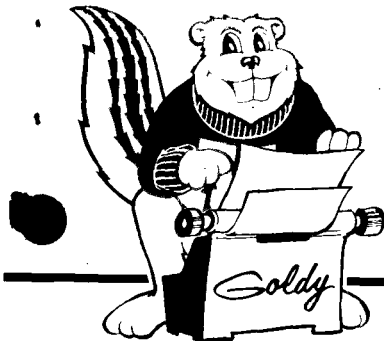

GOPHERS TO HOST HOOSIERS IN CRUCIAL GAME SATURDAY

Minnesota's Golden Gophers face a major test Saturday when they entertain Indiana in a crucial Big Ten Conference football assignment at 1:30 p.m. in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.

Coach John Gutekunst's upstart contingent is tied for first place in the Big Ten with a 2-0 league record (Minnesota is 3-2 overall) after beating Purdue 19-7 two weeks ago and Northwestern 35-25 last Saturday. But the Hoosiers are a cut above those conference entries and will risk an overall mark of 4-0-1 and a Big Ten standard of 1-0-1 after deadlocking powerful Ohio State 27-27 this past weekend.

"Indiana is awfully good," Coach Gutekunst lamented. "They have several fine individual players, and they have excellent team quickness. They had chances to win against Ohio State (a holding penalty nullified a late Indiana TD), and all we have to remember is that they're coming in here unbeaten."

Facing a tough Indiana team is no new experience for Gutekunst. In his first year at the Golden Gopher helm, Gutekunst saw his Golden Gophers eke out a 19-17 triumph

in the Metrodome. In 1987 Minnesota fell 18-17 in another Metrodome thriller. Since then Indiana has posted two straight triumphs in Bloomington.....33-13 in 1988 and 28-18 a year ago.

In all there have been 51 meetings in football between Minnesota and Indiana, and despite those three most-recent setbacks at the hands of the Hoosiers, the Golden Gophers lead in the series 30-18-9. Minnesota leads 27-7-1 in games played in Minneapolis, but the two teams are even at 2-2 in games played in the Metrodome.

"We're going to have our hands full Saturday," Gutekunst admits, "but all we can do is try to get better every game. We're still not a good team, but we have some talent, and we have great work habits. We're getting better, and all we hope to do is be as good as we can be."

Looking back to last weekend's win over Northwestern, Gutekunst found some areas to be pleased about.....just as he found some areas for concern. "We turned the ball over four times (three fumbles and a pass interception)," he pointed out. "It's difficult to win when you

do that. But our people have to be given credit for overcoming those turnovers and finishing on top."

Defensively all-star candidate Mike Sunvold was a key for Minnesota with 12 tackles including two for losses totaling seven yards. Anthony Bryant was equally impressive with eight hits including two for losses of eight yards. William Collins chipped in with eight tackles of his own.

Offensively Marquel Fleetwood turned in another sparkling effort at quarterback despite that one interception. He completed 11-of-15 passing attempts for 220 yards and a pair of touchdowns (to Kevin Grant and Keswic Joiner). But the real show-stopper was Mark Smith who registered 169 yards on 32 carries. He also notched a pair of touchdowns in what ranks as the best effort of his young collegiate career.

"We knew that we would need an excellent afternoon offensively (the Golden Gophers finished with 489 yards of total offense and converted an unprecedented 15-of-17 third down attempts) if we were going to win," Gutekunst said.

GOPHER HOCKEY TEAM HEADS WEST TO DENVER AFTER GAINING 3 POINTS AGAINST ST. CLOUD STATE THIS PAST WEEKEND

Mile High City: Doug Woog's Golden Gopher hockey squad travels west this weekend to take on the Denver Pioneers in a two-game series Friday and Saturday night at the Denver University Arena. The Gophers are coming off of a thrilling 5-4 win over the St. Cloud State Huskies last Saturday night at Mariucci Arena.

Gophers pick up three points against Huskies: The Gophers struggled in the season opener at St. Cloud gaining a 3-3 tie after one overtime period. Minnesota was out shot 29-23 as the Huskies jumped to an early 2-0 lead. The Gophers then battled back to take a 3-2 lead on Grant Bischoff's goal 57 seconds into the second period. The Huskies responded with a goal by Dan O'Sheal at the 11:26 mark of the second. The Gophers had their chances to take the lead in the third period and during overtime, but couldn't find the net. The Gophers defensive play improved as they held the Huskies to four shots on target in the third and overtime periods.

Woog Pleased with Play of Freshmen: Head Coach Doug Woog said he was pleased with the play of the four freshmen who were on the ice over the weekend. "I thought the young guys played very well for such a tough series," said Woog. "McAlpine played real good and he didn't back down, he just kept putting his nose back in there."

Friendly Confines of Mariucci bring Season's First Victory: The home ice of Mariucci Arena helped out as the Gophers battled back from yet another early deficit, as they spotted St. Cloud leads of 2-1, and 4-2. The Maroon and Gold fought their way back to a 4-4 tie on the strength of Nick Gerebi's first career goal, and Tom Pederson's first of the season. Pederson's came at the 1:54 mark of the third and was followed one minute and forty seconds later by Trent Klatt's game-winner.

Veteran Goaltending Shines: Veteran goaltenders Jeff Stolp and Tom Newman played solidly, which helped cover-up for some of the early defensive errors in both games. Jeff Stolp played exceptional at St. Cloud as he kept the Gophers in the game, making some spectacular early saves to keep the Huskies from taking an even larger lead. Stolp finished with 26 saves, 13 of them in the first period. Tom Newman struggled early on Saturday night giving up four goals on five shots but stiffened up after that not giving up any goals in the final 48 minutes of play.

Huskies Prove They can Play with WCHA Elite: St Cloud State's inaugural weekend series in the WCHA proved they are capable of competing in the league. They played steady defense and proved they have some people who can put the puck in the net.

Denver was Victim of Minnesota Sweep Last Season: During the 1989-90 season the Gophers swept the Pioneers in all four games, putting up a 29-18 goals margin. Denver is led this season by first-year coach Frank Serratore. The Pioneers return 16 lettermen from last season's squad that finished 18-24. Overall the Gophers lead the series with Denver with a comfortable margin of 58-41.

Woog is Tough on Pioneers: After starting slow against Denver when he lost his first four contests against them, Woog has had the upper edge. He holds a career record of 15-6-1 against the Pioneers, including a 6-3-1 record at Denver.

Gophers Shorthanded at the Forward Position: As the Gophers prepare for Denver, they are a little short of forwards due to injuries. Junior Cory Laylin and freshman Todd Westlund have been out since early in training camp. To add to the problem, senior Jason Miller went down on Friday night with a sprained shoulder. It is unlikely that Miller will make the trip to Denver. Coach Woog has moved junior Tom Pederson up to the wing spot to help out, and junior Nick Gerebi came in on Saturday at the center position and scored his first goal as a Golden Gopher.

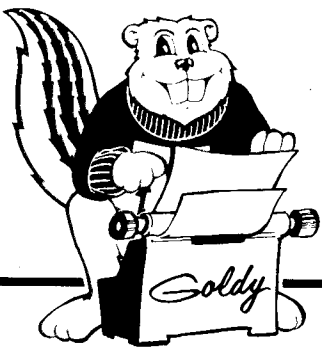

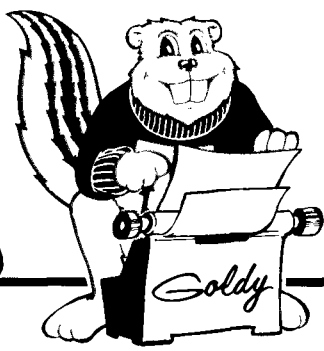
TICKETS FOR U.S.S.R. BASKETBALL GAME GO ON SALE TOMORROW

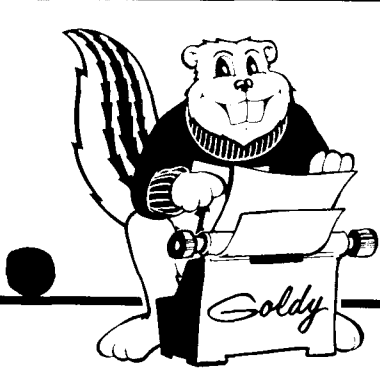

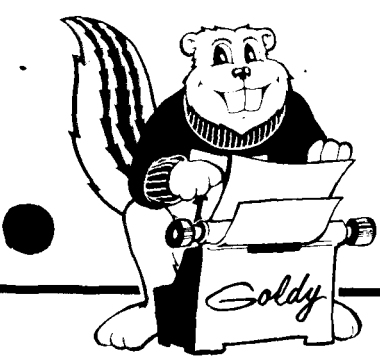

GOLDEN GOPHERS RESUME ROAD WORK ON SATURDAY

Following two straight home contests, the University of Minnesota resumes its Big Ten Conference football road work Saturday when invading Columbus, OH, to face Ohio State.

The Golden Gophers will take an overall record of 4-2 and a Big Ten log of 3-0 (good for a tie for first place) into Saturday's 1:30 p.m.(EDT) confrontation after upsetting Indiana 12-0 last weekend. It was Minnesota's first shutout since 1977 when they blanked Illinois 21-0, and it was the first time Indiana had been held scoreless since USC turned the trick 21-0 in 1981.

Ohio State, which whipped Purdue 42-2 at Purdue last time out of the blocks, will risk an overall mark of 3-2-1 and a conference standard of 1-1-1.

Over the years Minnesota and the Buckeyes have met 33 times on the gridiron, and the host club will take an overwhelming edge of 27-6 in the series into Saturday's game. Ohio State leads 13-2 in games played down in Columbus, and is ahead 14-4 in games played in Minneapolis.

Minnesota's most-recent win over Ohio State came during the 1981 season when the Golden

Gophers prevailed 35-31 at old Memorial Stadium. The last time Minnesota won in Columbus was 1949 when Coach Bernie Bierman's Golden Gophers notched a 17-0 victory.

A year ago Minnesota led Ohio State 31-0 late in the first half only to see the Buckeyes rally miraculously and pull out a 41-37 decision in the Hubert. H. Humphrey Metrodome.

All of which means that the Golden Gophers have lost eight straight to the Bucks, and they have not won at Ohio State in more than 40 years.....or in 11 tries. So if history is regarded as a factor, the host contingent might be considered heavy favorites to win Saturday.

Coach John Gutekunst isn't ready to throw in Minnesota's towel, however. "We know that Ohio State is an awfully good football team," he said. "Their offense is excellent. But we've worked hard, and we've gained some experience, some confidence and some pride."

Gutekunst also is fully aware of the fact that the last time UM was 3-0 was in '86 when it beat the same foes, Purdue, Northwestern and Indiana, only to fall 33-0 the following week at OSU.

"We're still not halfway through our conference schedule," Gutekunst pointed out, "but our goal has been to get better every game. We are getting better, and it would be an understatement to say that our win over Indiana was another solid step forward."

The solid step forward to which Gutekunst refers included excellent efforts by TWO Minnesota quarterbacks.....starter Marquel Fleetwood who rushed for one touchdown (he had another called back) and completed nine of 19 passes for 82 yards before suffering a mild concussion, and reliever Scott Schaffner, who completed three-of-three passes for 30 yards.

But it was on defense that Minnesota really excelled. Consider the fact that the Golden Gophers blocked three Indiana passing attempts at the line of scrimmage (Mike Sunvold, William Collins and Sean Lumpkin). It also blocked a Hoosier field goal attempt (Frank Jackson). It also recorded a fumble recovery (Ron Mertz) and it had two interceptions (Lumpkin and Jackson).

Sizing Up The Competition: Traditional power Wisconsin will be the heavy favorite as they go after their sixth consecutive league crown. Michigan has been in the national rankings all season long and would appear to be the logical choice to push the Badgers for the top spot, with the Golden Gophers, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan State, and Ohio State hoping to be in the hunt as well. Indiana junior Bob Kennedy will be going after his third straight individual title to go along with the NCAA crown he won as a freshman in 1988.

Eidman Leads The Golden Gophers: For the second straight season, co-captain Keith Eidman has been at the forefront of the Golden Gopher attack all season long. He finished 10th at the league meet in 1989 and appears ready and able to challenge for a top spot once again on Saturday.

Harder Ready To Go: Although he hasn't raced since September 21 at the Purdue Invitational because of a virus, Chris Harder's return to the Golden Gopher lineup will certainly provide a major boost to Griak's squad. He finished 23rd at both the 1987 and 1988 Big Ten Championships, after placing 40th as a freshman in 1986. A co-captain for the Golden Gophers along with Keith Eidman, he redshirted the 1989 cross country season.

DeLong On The Sidelines: The Golden Gophers were dealt a big blow when sophomore Scott DeLong (Aurora, CO) was diagnosed last week as having a stress fracture in his left leg. He was the team's third runner at the 1989 Big Ten Championships as a rookie, placing 22nd overall with a clocking of 25:28.

Last Time Out: Chris Berg placed 24th individually to pace the Golden Gophers to a fifth-place finish in the final team standings at the Cyclone Invitational held on October 13 at Ames, IA. Keith Eidman, because of a prior commitment, and Chris Harder, still battling that nagging virus, did not run in the competition. Doug Milkowski (26th in 26:57), Mark Narveson (35th in 27:27), Scott DeLong (36th in 27:30) and Chris Schmid (39th in 27:38) followed Berg across the finish

line for the Golden Gophers. Defending NCAA champion and top-ranked Iowa State won the team title with 24 points, followed by Wisconsin (36), Kansas (76), Illinois State (105), the Golden Gophers (143) and Colorado (150).

Do You Remember?: The last time the University of Minnesota hosted the Big Ten Championships was in 1981 when Wisconsin's Tim Hacker won the individual race to lead the Badgers to the team title. Hacker, now an assistant coach for the Badgers, toured the 8,000 meter Les Bolstad/University of Minnesota Golf Course in a time of 24:05.3. The Golden Gophers, led by a sixth-place individual finish by Lloyd Ness, finished third overall in the league that year. Griak's squad then went on to finish second at the Region Four Championships and 12th at the NCAA Championships that year.

Coach Griak: "We'll miss Scott DeLong, but I think we're ready to run. We have a great opportunity in front of us. We're at home, on our home course, and in front of our home fans. We'll just have to pick up our lunch pails and go to work on Saturday."

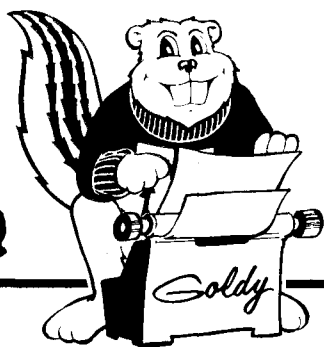
KELLER LEADS GOLF TEAM AT WALTER MCLAUGHLIN INVITATIONAL

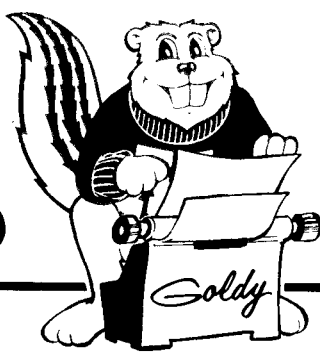
GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL MEDIA DAY ON OCTOBER 30

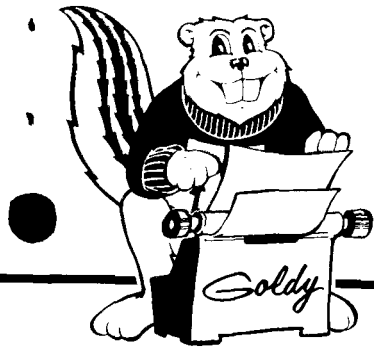

100TH GRIDIRON MEETING AT WISCONSIN SATURDAY

Minnesota and Wisconsin square off for the 100th time Saturday at 1 p.m. (CST) in Madison where the nation's oldest continuing collegiate football rivalry pits the Golden Gophers against the Badgers in a Big Ten Conference assignment.

Coach John Gutekunst's invaders will put an overall record of 4-3 and a Big Ten mark of 3-1 on the line after falling 52-23 at Ohio State last weekend. The Badgers fell 21-3 at home to Illinois the last time out of the blocks and their overall record now stands at 1-6. They are 0-4 in the conference. The Golden Gophers currently are in third place in the standings, the Badgers in the cellar.

Those previous and historic 99 meetings between Minnesota and Wisconsin result in the visitors bringing a 54-37-8 edge in the series into Saturday's game. The Golden Gophers boast a 34-14-1 advantage in games played in Minneapolis, but the Badgers lead 23-20-7 in games played in Madison.

A year ago Minnesota posted a 24-22 triumph in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome, but in

1988 Wisconsin notched a 14-7 victory at Camp Randall Stadium. The most-recent win at Madison for the Golden Gophers was by a 22-19 margin in 1987.

Coach Gutekunst is 3-1 against Wisconsin, and he can recall quarterback Scott Schaffner hitting 10-of-16 passing attempts for 167 yards and a touchdown in last year's win.....a good sign for Minnesota since Schaffner is expected to start at quarterback against the Badgers Saturday after Marquel Fleetwood suffered a shoulder injury at Ohio State last weekend.

"Marquel sprained his right shoulder," Gutekunst explained, "and we may have lost him for a couple of weeks." If it was feared that Minnesota's total yardage leader had suffered a shoulder separation, but X-rays showed that it was "only" a sprain.

Minnesota's MASH report after the OSU contest.....a game that has to rank as the most physical of the current campaign.....was extensive. Wide receiver Paul Hopewell DID suffer a shoulder separation, and he's on the shelf. Defensive tackle Gary Isakson had an ankle sprain, and his status is uncertain.

On the credit side of the ledger, Skeeter Akre, an early-season starter at defensive end is back after being sidelined for three weeks with a knee injury, and Mark Drabczak, a defensive tackle, could return after missing the Ohio State contest with an ankle sprain.

There weren't many bright spots for the Golden Gophers at Columbus last weekend. "We got off to a bad start defensively," Gutekunst said, "and we were not able to run the ball very well in the first half. We are very disappointed in the outcome. But give Ohio State credit.....they just whipped us."

On the surface there seemed to be some good things happening for Minnesota at Ohio State. Like taking the opening kickoff, driving the length of the field and getting a field goal from Brent Berglund. And like chalking up 367 total yards of offense. But six penalties, a fumble lost and three interceptions were too many mistakes.

Now all eyes are on the Badger game! "We can't change what happened last week," Gutekunst pointed out. "All we can do is try to change what we do in the future."

GOPHERS RESUME WCHA PLAY WITH ROAD TRIP TO COLORADO COLLEGE

Hockey Heads West: Doug Woog's Golden Gopher ice hockey team goes on the road this weekend to Colorado Springs, CO to take on the Tigers of Colorado College. The Gophers are coming off of two tough exhibition losses to the Canadian National Team.

1989-90 Review: Last season the Gophers split at Colorado College, losing the first night 7-5, before bouncing back to claim an exciting 3-2 victory on Ken Gernander's overtime goal in the second game. Minnesota owned a 5-1 record over the Tigers last year including two WCHA playoff victories at Mariucci Arena. The Maroon and Gold holds a 118-50-4 lead in the overall series record.

The Series: The Golden Gophers head west with a 3-0-1 conference record and a 4-0-1 overall record. Colorado College is 1-5 after splitting their series with Denver last weekend. Freshmen Shine: Freshmen **Joe Dziejcz** (Minneapolis), **Chris McAlpine** (Roseville) and **Mike Muller** (Plymouth) each scored their first collegiate goals in the victory over Notre Dame. Fellow rookie, **Craig Johnson** (St. Paul) tied a school single-game record with a total of five assists in the contest.

Keeping It Going: Craig Johnson kept things going over the weekend, posting three assists and three goals in the games against the Canadians. On Saturday he had the hat trick and one assist. Results from the weekend exhibition games, however, are not counted in the overall statistics under NCAA rules.

Hankinson is Early Goal Leader: Senior captain **Ben Hankinson** (Edina), is the Gophers early goal scoring leader with four official goals. He continued to shine last weekend, tallying a pair of goals against the Canadian National Team.

A Tough "Road": It was no secret coming into the 1990-91 season that the Golden Gophers would spend much of the first month of the WCHA season on the road. After facing Colorado College in Colorado Springs this weekend, the Golden Gophers will be back on the road once again the following weekend (Nov. 9-10), when they play at UM-Duluth. By the time they wrap up that weekend series in Duluth, the Golden Gophers will have played seven of their first eight league games on the road. With a 3-0-1 league mark heading into this weekend, Woog's squad has certainly been up to the challenge thus far.

Region 4 Championships: The Golden Gophers will be seeking a berth at the NCAA Championships when they compete at the Region 4 Championships on November 10 at West Lafayette, IN. The top three teams in the competition will advance to the national meet to be held at Knoxville, TN, on November 19.

Eidman Leads The Golden Gophers: For the second straight season, co-captain Keith Eidman has been at the forefront of the Golden Gopher attack all season long. Although he was looking for a better individual finish on Saturday after placing 10th at the league meet a year ago, he appears ready and able to challenge for a top spot at the Region 4 Championships.

Courageous Effort By Harder: Although he hadn't raced since September 21 at the Purdue Invitational because of a virus, Chris Harder's return to the Golden Gopher lineup certainly provided a major boost to Griak's squad. During his career, the steady performer has also finished 23rd in 1988, 35th in 1987 and 40th as a freshman in 1986 at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships. A co-captain for the Golden Gophers along with Keith Eidman, he redshirted the 1989 cross country season. With two more weeks of sharpening ahead, he will definitely provide another shot in the arm to the Golden Gophers' hopes for an NCAA berth.

DeLong On The Sidelines: The Golden Gophers were dealt a big blow when sophomore **Scott DeLong** (Aurora, CO) was diagnosed the week before the league meet as having a stress fracture in his left leg. He was the team's third runner at the 1989 Big Ten Championships as a rookie, placing 22nd overall with a clocking of 25:28.

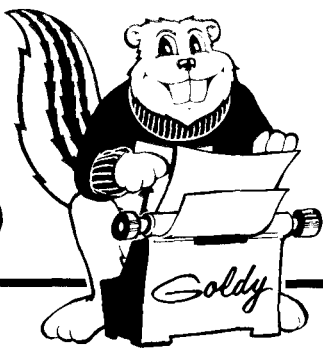

Paul Bunyan's Axe, a traveling trophy which is awarded to the winner of the University of Minnesota vs the University of Wisconsin football game each fall, will be at stake Saturday when the Golden Gophers meet the Badgers in Madison. Kickoff is at 1:05 p.m. (CST).

Back in 1948, the National "W" Club from the University of Wisconsin deemed it proper that a trophy symbolic of the rivalry between the two neighboring states of Wisconsin and Minnesota would be fitting.

What better symbol than the axe allegedly used by the greatest Upper Midwest giant of them all, Paul Bunyan. And so it was. That colorful axe went to the Golden Gophers after their 16-0 victory in 1948, and it has been passed to the UM-vs-UW winner every fall since.

More recently, the axe had a four-year stay in Minneapolis before the Badgers regained possession with a 14-7 victory in Camp Randall Stadium in 1988. The Golden Gophers won back the axe with a 24-22 triumph at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome last fall.

Coach John Gutekunst and his Golden Gophers hope to keep possession of the axe, the first of three such "rivalry trophies" they play for each year, in the 100th meeting between Minnesota and Wisconsin on Saturday.

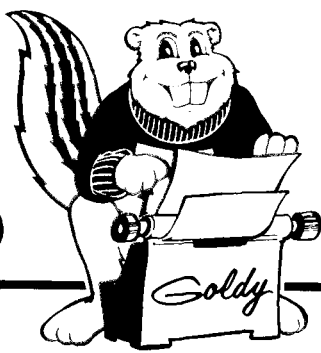

BASKETBALL INTERVIEW/PRACTICE POLICY

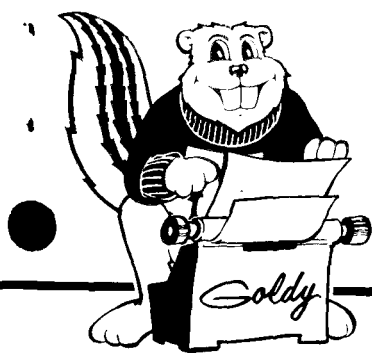

Please call the Sports Information Office at (612) 625-4090 to schedule interviews, and by allowing at least 24 hours prior notice for the interview, arrangements can be greatly facilitated.

In general, player interviews will be conducted prior to practice from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Gold Room at Williams Arena. If that is not a feasible time, we will attempt to arrange an alternative time and location to conduct the interview that suits both parties. Interviews done after practice will not conflict with meetings, training room treatments or other team obligations. Media should understand that practices are not officially concluded until such team obligations are completed.

If the interview is to be conducted over the telephone, we will arrange to have the student-athlete call you at a specified time. NO telephone numbers of student-athletes will be made available under any circumstances and they are not available to the media on game day until after the conclusion of the game.

Again this year, the University of Minnesota will conform to an "equal access" policy, and this means that the basketball locker room and the training room will be closed to the media. The post-game locker room policy will be determined on a game-by-game situation on the basis of equal access requests.

SPARTANS NEXT FOE FOR GOLDEN GOPHERS

After two weeks on the road, Minnesota's Golden Gophers return to the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome on Saturday to play host to the Michigan State Spartans in a crucial Big Ten Conference football game at 1:30 p.m.

Both Minnesota and Michigan State still nurse bowl bids, both have high hopes of finishing in the conference's upper division and both have their sights set on winning records.

The Golden Gophers will come into Saturday's important contest with an overall record of 5-3. They are 4-1 in the Big Ten, currently tied for second with Illinois after whipping Wisconsin 21-3 at Madison.

Coach George Perles has his Spartans at 4-3-1. Their conference standard is 3-2 after smashing Indiana 45-20 in East Lansing last Saturday. Michigan State currently is deadlocked with Michigan for fifth.

The Minnesota-vs-Michigan State series is a relatively young one. Only 28 games have been played between the two schools since the series got its start in 1950. The Spartans won 21-7 at East Lansing a year ago. They

have won the last 11 meetings, and they are on top 17-11 in the series. In Minneapolis, the series is tied at 7-7, but Michigan State is 3-0 in the Metrodome.

The series, the two team's records and comparative scores would make invading MSU the logical favorite, but Coach Gutekunst has hopes that his club can turn in another improved performance Saturday.

"We know we are not a great team," Gutekunst said after the win at Wisconsin, "but on some days we can play pretty well. Hopefully we can do that against Michigan State. If our fans give us the help we need, maybe we can do it again Saturday."

At Wisconsin the kicking game and the defense probably made the difference. Punter Dean Kaufman put the Badgers inside their own five three times, and that helped the Golden Gophers maintain good field position much of the time.

And the defense, after allowing two Wisconsin third-down conversions on the Badger's initial possession, stopped 14 consecutive such attempts while not allowing a touchdown. The Golden Gophers also picked up three turnovers.....interceptions

by Drinon Mays and Joel Staats and a fumble recovery by Gary Isakson....to help turn the tide.

"We were able to control things on first down," Gutekunst explained, "and that enabled us to do what we had to do on second or third and long. But we can't be satisfied. We know that we have to play better against a team the calibre of this week's opponent."

Gutekunst was not as happy with his offense, despite the fact that Minnesota scored 21 points. "The defense gave us some opportunities we did not capitalize on," he said. "We struggled for consistency on offense. We did not get as much production as we would have liked."

But Minnesota came home 4-1, and it still is in control of its own destiny. The road remaining is a tough one, with Michigan at Ann Arbor next week and Iowa at home in the 1990 regular-season finale after that.

"I'm pleased and proud of the way our people are coming along," Gutekunst concluded. "We came back from the loss at Ohio State very well and won on the road. Our intensity was excellent. If we can continue that, we have a chance."

GOPHERS SWEEP COLORADO COLLEGE REGAIN TIE FOR FIRST

The Golden Gopher hockey team completed a sweep of the Colorado College Tigers with a 7-5 victory Saturday night. The Gophers, winners on Friday night 3-2, catapulted themselves into a three-way tie for first place in the WCHA with Northern Michigan and North Dakota.

The Gophers, 7-0-1 overall this year, were led this past weekend by junior **Larry Olimb (Warroad)** who posted a six-point weekend. Olimb, who was recently moved from defense to center, sparked the Gophers Friday night with two goals including the game winner. On Saturday the smooth skating center notched a goal and three assists.

"We struggled on Friday night taking some dumb penalties," said Coach Doug Woog, "but Saturday we really played a strong overall game."

The sweep means that the Gophers have swept both of the WCHA teams from Colorado on their own ice. The Gophers received strong goaltending from junior **Jeff Stolp (Nashwauk)** who got the victory on Friday giving up only two goals, and then came into the Saturday evening game when sophomore **Tom Newman (Blaine)** was injured to preserve the victory.

Range Line Lights up the Scoreboard: The newly formed line of Larry Olimb, freshman **Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids)**, and sophomore **John Brill (Grand Rapids)**, was responsible for six goals over the weekend, helping maintain the Gophers unbeaten streak. In addition all three are key members of the penalty killing and power play units.

Hankinson Continues Hot Streak: Senior Captain **Ben Hankinson (Edina)** continued his scoring touch when he notched another big goal in Saturday's game to put the Gophers back up by two goals. Hankinson leads the Gophers in goals scored with five. He is followed closely by Larry Olimb with four goals, who now leads the Gophers in total points with 10.

Pederson Shines: Junior defenseman **Tom Pederson (Bloomington)** had a strong weekend as well when he posted a goal and two assists. Pederson was all over the ice setting up Gopher scoring opportunities and breaking up potential Tiger scoring chances.

Freshman Play Key Role Again: This year's freshmen class is proving it's worth every weekend for the Gophers. This weekend the outstanding freshman was Jeff Nielsen who had two goals and an assist and provided strong penalty killing play as the Gophers held the Tigers to one power play goal on 13 opportunities.

On the Road Again: Doug Woog's squad takes to the road again this weekend as they head to Duluth to take on the Bulldogs who tied and lost to St. Cloud State over the past weekend. The Bulldogs are 2-2-2 in WCHA play and 3-3-2 overall for the season.

1989-90 Review: Last year the Bulldogs started off hot, sweeping the Gophers in their home opener series 9-6, and 4-2 at Mariucci Arena and holding first-place during the WCHA for the early stages of the season. When the Gophers returned to Duluth in January they returned the favor, sweeping the Bulldogs at home 4-1, and 5-2. Those victories were part of a mid-season 14-game winning streak that put the Gophers in first place in the WCHA.

Home at Last: After the Bulldog series the Gophers return home for their first full WCHA series on the ice of Mariucci Arena. They will host Northern Michigan at 7:05 p.m. Friday and Saturday, November 16 and 17. The Wildcats currently are unbeaten and are tied with the Gophers for first place in the WCHA with an identical conference record of 5-0-1.

Packing It Up: The Golden Gophers did not have anyone finish in the top 20 individually at the Big Ten Championships, yet relied on overall team balance to finish fifth. Coach Griak's squad had a spread of just 28 seconds from their number one runner down to the fifth runner. Leading the way once again was Keith Eidman, who placed 22nd overall with a time of 25:43.8 over the demanding 8,000 meter course. A trio of sophomores followed Eidman across the finish line. Chris Berg finished 24th in 25:49.3, Mark Narveson was 25th in 25:51.0 and Doug Milkowski was 27th in 26:00.3. Chris Harder, who was competing in his first race in five weeks after battling a virus most of the season, placed 28th overall in 26:11.6 with a gutsy effort. Chris Schmid and Jason Rathe also turned in solid efforts on the day, finishing 44th (27:09.0) and 48th (27:16.8) respectively.

Eidman Leads The Golden Gophers: For the second straight season, co-captain Keith Eidman has been at the forefront of the Golden Gopher attack all season long. Although he was looking for a better individual finish at the Big Ten Championships after placing 10th at the league meet a year ago, he appears ready and able to challenge for a top spot at the Region 4 Championships on Saturday.

Courageous Effort By Harder: Although he hadn't raced since September 21 at the Purdue Invitational because of a virus, Chris Harder's return to the Golden Gopher lineup at the Big Ten

Championships certainly provided a major boost to Griak's squad. During his career, the steady performer has also finished 23rd in 1988, 35th in 1987 and 40th as a freshman in 1986 at the Big Ten Cross Country Championships. A co-captain for the Golden Gophers along with Keith Eidman, he redshirted the 1989 cross country season. With two weeks of sharpening behind him since the conference meet, he will definitely provide another shot in the arm to the Golden Gophers' hopes for an NCAA berth.

DeLong On The Sidelines: The Golden Gophers were dealt a big blow when sophomore Scott DeLong (Aurora, CO) was diagnosed the week before the Big Ten Championships as having a stress fracture in his left leg. He was the team's third runner at both the 1989 Big Ten and Region 4 Championships as a rookie, placing 22nd overall with a clocking of 25:28 (8,000 meters) at the league meet and then 48th overall in 32:37 (10,000 meters) at the regionals.

IOWA'S BELL, MINN.'S SUNVOLD HONORED WITH WEEKLY BIG 10 PLAYER AWARDS

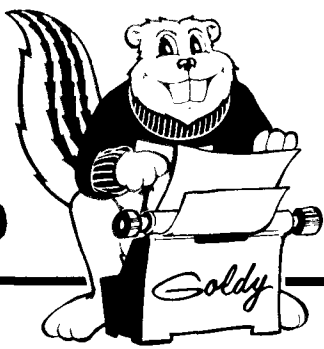

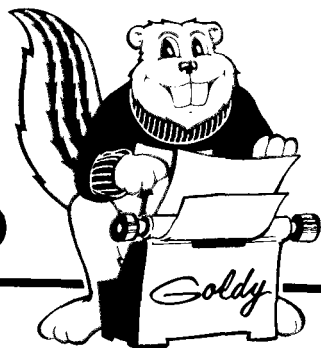
FANS TO RECEIVE FREE TEAM POSTER AT FRIDAY'S U.S.S.R. BASKETBALL GAME

LITTLE BROWN JUG AT STAKE FOR GOPHERS ON SATURDAY

When Minnesota invades Michigan on Saturday for a 12:30 p.m. (EST) Big Ten Conference ESPN extravaganza, the Golden Gophers will be playing for pride, they'll be hoping to remain above the .500 mark, AND.....they'll be battling for possession of the Little Brown Jug.

Coach John Gutekunst's contingent will have its' hands full. First of all the Wolverines are 6-3 on the season (4-2 in the Big Ten Conference), and they'll be coming off an impressive 22-17 victory over Illinois recorded this past weekend.

Minnesota, meanwhile, must bounce back from that devastating 28-16 setback suffered at the hands of Michigan State at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome last Saturday afternoon. It will take an overall record of 5-4 and a Big Ten log of 4-2 with it to Ann Arbor.

Making the task seem even more overwhelming is the fact that Michigan leads 53-23-3 in the series which dates back to 1892. It also leads 29-11-1 in games played in Ann Arbor. It also won last year 49-15, and

the Golden Gophers have not beaten the Wolves at Michigan since 1986. In fact that was the last time Minnesota prevailed over Michigan.

And while Coach Gutekunst, as well as the Golden Gophers, know the magnitude of their task, they are heading for Michigan with the idea of getting back on the winning track and assuring the fact that they will wind up 1990 with a winning record.

"We know that we still have two very good football teams left on our schedule," Gutekunst stressed. "We also know that we were close to something very good in our game with Michigan State. To get over the hump this week against Michigan, we just need to play with the same kind of intensity that got us close for an entire game."

The closeness Gutekunst eluded to included being deadlocked at 7-7 midway through the second quarter and then coming back from a 21-7 deficit with a field goal and a touchdown only to fall short. Making it closer still, Minnesota had a shot at narrowing the gap even further when it had the ball at the MSU seven only to suffer a delay of game penalty and a sack.

"It was a game of mixed emotions for me," Gutekunst said. "I was extremely proud of our effort, and I was proud of the way we kept coming back. But I was distressed with the number of penalties we had, and I was very disappointed with the way we fouled up our last chance to score. As well as we played at times, the fact remains we did not play well enough to win. We did not cash in when we needed to, and no matter how hard we played or how much we tried, it does not change the fact that we lost."

So now Gutekunst must attempt to rally his forces against those great odds at Michigan. He knows his club's health is better than it has been for a couple of weeks.....including Marquel Fleetwood at quarterback but not including Mike Sunvold at defensive tackle. He suffered a broken left hand against MSU but is expected to play against the Wolves. Minnesota fans hope that improved health will help beat the odds at Ann Arbor.

The trip to Michigan will be the last regular-season journey for the Golden Gophers. They return home to host Iowa November 24.

GOPHERS RECORD THIRD ROAD SWEEP OF YEAR AT UMD SHOWDOWN WITH NORTHERN MICHIGAN THIS WEEKEND AT MARIUCCI

The Golden Gopher hockey team recorded their third straight road sweep of the young season this past weekend when they beat UMD 3-2, and 6-2, before sellout crowds at the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center.

The Gophers were led this past weekend by junior goalie **Jeff Stolp (Greenway)** who recorded his fourth and fifth wins of the season. He now stands at 5-0-1 for the year with an outstanding 2.33 GAA, and a .907 save percentage.

On offense the Gophers demonstrated their trademark, balanced scoring, with eight different people tallying goals for them over the weekend. The top line was the **Trent Klatt (Osseo)/Craig Johnson (St. Paul)/Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids)** unit which tallied four goals, including Klatt's game-winner at 15:01 of the third period Friday night.

Friday evening's game also saw some fireworks when two players from each team were ejected from the game at 9:13 of the third period. The skirmish started around the Minnesota net and led to game disqualifications for senior winger **Jake Enebak (Northfield)**, and freshman defenseman **Chris McAlpine (Roseville)**, along with two UMD players.

The Saturday night event saw fireworks as well, but it involved Gopher shots on goal. Minnesota outshot the Bulldogs 21-8 in the first period, but could only tally one goal, thanks to the stellar play of All-American goalie **Chad Erickson**.

The game tightened down for the middle period, but the Gophers blew it open in the third with four goals by different people. **Bischoff** recorded the game-winner at 1:34 of the third period, followed by tallies by **Ken Gernander (Greenway)**, **Tom Pederson (Bloomington)**, and **Larry Olimb (Warroad)**.

The two victories allowed the Gophers to keep pace with Northern Michigan, who swept Denver at home, and set up this weekend's showdown of the WCHA leaders at Mariucci Arena on Friday and Saturday night at 7:05 p.m. CST. Both teams will enter the game with identical records of 8-0-1 and 7-0-1 in WCHA play.

The Wildcats have played six of their eight WCHA games at home, while the Gophers have played only one conference game at Mariucci Arena this season, a 5-4 decision over St. Cloud State on 10/13/90.

Last season at Mariucci, the Wildcats and Gophers battled to a 5-5 overtime tie in the Friday game, with the Maroon and Gold battling back to win the Saturday game 11-4. Last year when the Gophers traveled to Northern Michigan they were swept at Lakeview Arena 5-7, 2-5 in the third to last series of the regular season.

Minnesota leads the series with the Wildcats 15-7-2. Head Coach **Woog** has a 11-5-2 career record against Northern Michigan.

Northern Michigan is coached by **Rick Comley** who has been at the helm for 14 years and sports a 300-230-27 career record.

"We're really excited to come back and play in front of the great fans at Rochester," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "On top of that, it's also nice to be able to put something back into the youth basketball programs in communities around our state."

Season Opener: The Golden Gophers will open their 1990-91 regular season when they host Robert Morris on Sunday, November 25, at 2:00 p.m. at Williams Arena. The Colonials charted an overall record of 22-8 last season and captured their second straight Northeast Conference regular season championship, before dropping a tough 79-71 decision to Kansas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

St. Cloud Intrasquad: Seniors Mario Green (Freeport, Bahamas) and Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) tallied 16 points apiece to lead the Gold team to a 69-64 victory over the Maroon in Sunday's intrasquad scrimmage at St. Cloud. Sophomore Nate Tubbs (Fort Wayne, IN) and redshirt freshman Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) joined them in double figures with 13 and 10 points respectively. Senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN) paced the Maroon squad with 20 points, 5 assists and 5 steals in the contest. Senior Walter Bond (Chicago, IL), redshirt freshman Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) and freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) tallied 15, 13 and 12 points respectively. Carter also hauled down a game-high 10 rebounds.

Ohio AAU Exhibition: Walter Bond tallied 31 points to lead the Golden Gopher basketball squad to a 98-94 exhibition game victory over the Ohio AAU team on November 4 at Williams Arena. Bond connected on 11 of 16 field goal attempts, including three of four from three point land, and on six of seven free throw attempts in the contest. He also added a game-high six steals in the win. Although none of the statistics will officially count, he surpassed his collegiate career highs for points (19), field goals made (8), three pointers made (2) and attempted (3), and steals (5), while equalling the standard for field goals attempted at 16. Kevin Lynch, Randy Carter and Arriel McDonald joined Bond in double figures. Lynch scored 15 points and dished out a game-high nine assists, Carter tallied 15 points and joined Bond with a team-high seven rebounds, and McDonald added 13 points in the win.

Canby Intrasquad: Arriel McDonald scored 21 points and added six assists to lead the Gold team to a 79-75 victory over the Maroon squad in the team's first intrasquad scrimmage on October 27 before an overflow crowd of 2,100 fans at Canby High School. Walter Bond, who canned four three pointers, paced the Maroon team with 26 points on the night.

Packing It Up: The Golden Gophers did not have anyone finish in the top 20 individually at either the Big Ten or Region 4 Championships, yet relied on overall team balance to finish fifth and seventh respectively. Coach Griak's squad had a spread of just 28 seconds from their number one runner down to the fifth runner at the conference meet. Leading the way was Keith Eidman, who placed 22nd overall with a time of 25:43.8 over the demanding 8,000 meter course. A trio of sophomores followed Eidman across the finish line. Chris Berg finished 24th in 25:49.3, Mark Narveson was 25th in 25:51.0 and Doug Milkowski was 27th in 26:00.3. Chris Harder, who was competing in his first race in five weeks after battling a virus most of the season, placed 28th overall in 26:11.6 with a gutsy effort. Chris Schmid and Jason Rathe also turned in solid efforts on the day, finishing 44th (27:09.0) and 48th (27:16.8) respectively. The spread from one to five at the regional meet was less than 42 seconds, with Harder placing 25th in 32:12.4 and Berg finishing as the team's fifth man in 55th with a 32:54.0 clocking.

Courageous Effort By Harder: Although he hadn't raced since September 21 at the Purdue Invitational because of a virus, Chris Harder's return to the Golden Gopher lineup at the Big Ten and Region 4 Championships certainly provided a major boost to Griak's squad. After placing 28th at the league meet, he came back to finish as the team's top runner at the regionals, finishing 25th overall in 32:12.4.

DeLong Missed: The Golden Gophers were dealt a big blow when sophomore Scott DeLong (Aurora, CO) was diagnosed the week before the Big Ten Championships as having a stress fracture in his left leg. He was the team's third runner at both the 1989 Big Ten and Region 4 Championships as a rookie, placing 22nd overall with a clocking of 25:28 (8,000 meters) at the league meet and then 48th overall in 32:37 (10,000 meters) at the regionals.

GOLDEN GOPHER WRESTLERS IN UNO MEET

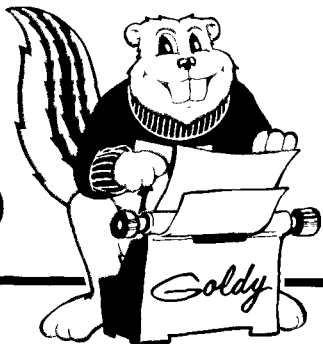

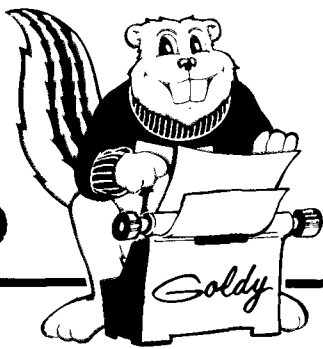
WELCOME GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL LUNCHEON IS TUESDAY

Callinan, a 5-11, 165-pound goalie, came highly recommended from former Gopher defenseman Pat Furlong. The Mound native did not compete for the Skippers last season because of his transfer status, but was a member of the prestigious Team USA Select 17's team. "Jeff is a hard working player who skates well enough to play other positions at the high school level," said Woog. "He is extremely quick and agile, as well as possessing amazing acrobatic skills in the net."

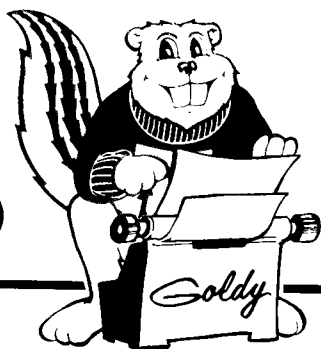
Fiebelkorn, a 6-4, 210-pound forward, comes from an athletic family (his sister Jessica is attending Notre Dame on a volleyball scholarship). "Jed has unlimited potential, and with the great skating stride and other tools he possesses, we look for him to be an impact player right away," said Woog. "He has the strength to dominate the area in front of the net and knock in a ton of goals. He also has nice hands and sees the ice extremely well."

Hendrickson, a 6-0, 185-pound center, is the most versatile of the newcomers. He was a member of the Team USA Select 17's and 18's the last two years. He has the ability to contribute up front or help out back on the blueline. A very smooth skater with excellent speed, he scored 21 goals and 19 assists during the regular season for the Spartans last year. "Darby is a very exciting player to watch, he has great puck skills and should be able to step right in and contribute as a goal scorer and playmaker," said Woog. "I played against his dad in high school, and he seems to possess that same strong hockey sense, and is a delight to be around."

Magnusson rounds out this group. The 6-0, 170-pound center is a fierce competitor who has a strong knack for being around the puck and making things happen. Besides tallying 18 goals and 27 assists for the Tornados during the regular season last year, he is also a standout cornerback on their nationally-ranked football team. "Steve has the skills to be a prolific scorer and playmaker for us," said Woog. "He is very crafty with the puck, and his Athletic Director Terry Abram calls him a winner and a class individual."

"We feel this fine group of recruits is balanced with players who can do different things well," said Woog. "There is good size, speed, stick skills, and hockey sense in this group, and we look forward to seeing them put on the Maroon and Gold."

This is the first year of the early signing period for hockey. The early signing period runs through November 21. The 1990-91 Minnesota high school hockey season began on Monday, November 12, and runs through the Minnesota State Tournament in March.

FANS TO RECEIVE FREE POSTER AT BASKETBALL TEAM'S REGULAR SEASON OPENER

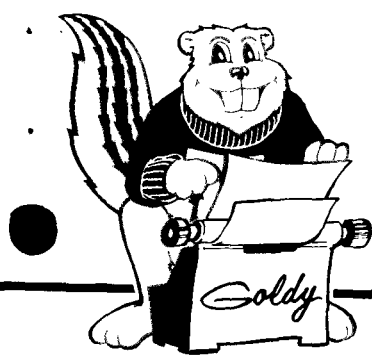

FLOYD OF ROSEDALE AT STAKE IN FINALE

Floyd of Rosedale, the treasured trophy that resembles a hog, will be at stake Saturday when the University of Minnesota closes its 1990 football season by playing host to arch-rival Iowa at 1:30 p.m. in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.

The invading Hawkeyes will be risking an overall record of 8-2, a 6-0 mark in Big Ten play and first place in the conference standings after smashing Purdue 38-9 this past weekend not to mention the fact that they will be playing for the right to play in the Rose Bowl.

Minnesota stands at 5-5. It is 4-3 in the Big Ten after falling 35-18 at Michigan last Saturday, and while a trip to Pasadena may not be at stake for Coach John Gutekunst's contingent, the bronze pig is.

"They'll be playing for the roses," Gutekunst admitted, "but we're both playing for a very important college football trophy," and nobody in the Golden Gopher camp is taking Floyd of Rosedale lightly.

"Iowa has had a tremendous year," Gutekunst said, "and they

certainly are the surprise of the Big Ten Conference this season. But we'd like to think that we have surprised some people too. It should be a great game."

There has been an abundance of those over the years. In all Minnesota and Iowa have met 83 times on the gridiron, and the Golden Gophers will take a 53-28-2 edge in the series into Saturday's finale.

In games played at Iowa City, Minnesota leads 22-17-1. In games played in Minneapolis, the Golden Gophers are on top 31-11-1. A year ago Gutekunst's charges prevailed 43-7 at Iowa, but Minnesota trails 1-3 in games played in the Metrodome.

The loss at Michigan was a sobering one for Minnesota, and the failure to regain possession of the Little Brown Jug means that the Golden Gophers are 1-1 in trophy games this year (they retained ownership of Paul Bunyan's Axe by beating Wisconsin with Floyd up for grabs Saturday.)

"We fought hard and we played hard," Gutekunst said of last Saturday's game at Ann Arbor, "but we got beat because Michigan made the big plays when it had to and we did not.

That made it disappointing."

Minnesota actually led at the half by a 10-7 margin, but after the intermission Michigan dominated in the kicking game and used excellent field position to turn the tide. "We made some mental mistakes in the second half," Gutekunst pointed out, "and that really hurt us."

But now all eyes are on the invading Hawkeyes. "We've gotten better," Gutekunst stressed. "We're an improved football team, and we know what we have to do to win Saturday. Our people will be ready."

He hopes they will be ready physically. The already battered Minnesota contingent suffered even more injuries at Michigan, and several Golden Gophers might have to be placed in a doubtful or probable category.

Linebacker William Collins, for example, missed much of the Wolverine assignment with an ankle injury and he'll be replaced on the two-deep by Anthony Davis. Quarterback Marquel Fleetwood reinjured his shoulder, and spent much of last Saturday on the sidelines. And there are others, but they all vow they'll be ready for the Hawks.

GOPHERS TAKE OVER SOLE POSSESSION OF FIRST PLACE IN WCHA AND GAIN TOP SPOT IN NATIONAL POLLS

The Minnesota Golden Gopher ice hockey team took over sole possession of first place in the WCHA with a win and a tie at home against Northern Michigan. The Gophers gained three of four possible points as they stayed unbeaten and improved their record to 9-0-2, 8-0-2 in the WCHA.

Minnesota was led by WCHA Player of the Week nominee, alternate captain Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids), who had three goals in two games to pace the Gophers. Junior defenseman Tom Pederson (Bloomington) had a strong series as well, scoring a goal and two assists in Saturday's game after setting up many scoring opportunities on Friday.

Scoring Leaders: Larry Olimb (Warroad) managed to hang onto the Gophers scoring lead with a goal and an assist on Saturday, giving him 13 points for the season. He is followed closely by Craig Johnson (St. Paul), who had a goal and two assists on Saturday to stay one point back of Olimb. Bischoff and Pederson are tied at ten points, and seniors Ben Hankinson (Edina) and Ken Gernander (Greenway) are tied for fifth with eight points.

Balanced Scoring: The closeness of the Gophers scoring lead reflects the balanced scoring of the team. Eleven players have two or more goals, and 14 players have more than four points for the season. The Gophers powerplay also improved, going two for six for the weekend, while the penalty killing unit held Northern to 2 two goals on six opportunities as well.

Friday night's game against Northern was a tightly fought matchup with neither team able to hold more than a one goal lead. The game was finally broken open in the third period when freshman Chris McAlpine (Roseville) stole an outlet pass and came up the slot putting the puck past Northern goaltender Billy Pye to put the game out of reach at 5-3.

On Saturday the Gophers came out storming, taking a 4-1 lead mid-way through the second period. The Wildcats then fought back with two goals to cut the margin to one goal going into the third period. That score held until there were two seconds left and Brad Werenka threw a desperation pass out in front of the net and it deflected off of a Gopher player's skate and into the net to tie the game. The game finished in a tie when neither team could really mount an attack in the overtime period.

Next Up the Huskies of Michigan Tech: Next up for the Gophers are the Michigan Tech Huskies on Friday and Saturday, November 23-24 at Mariucci Arena, with both games slated to begin at 7:05 p.m. (CST). The Huskies swept their series at St. Cloud State over the weekend and will come into Mariucci Arena with a 6-4-1 record.

Woog versus the Huskies: Head Coach Doug Woog holds a 17-3 record against Michigan Tech, with the overall series at 116-66-7 in favor of the Maroon and Gold. First-year coach Newell Brown will be making his first appearance in Mariucci Arena as the Huskies head coach. Brown is a product of Michigan State University, where he played and coached under Spartan coach Ron Mason.

On the Road Again: After this weekend's series with Michigan Tech the Gophers go on the road again to North Dakota, to take on the Sioux at Engelstad Arena on November 30, and December 1. Both games are scheduled to be televised on KITN-TV 29 with 7:00 p.m. (CST) starting times both nights.

GOPHER HOCKEY TEAM LANDS FOUR TOP MINNESOTA RECRUITS

The University of Minnesota has announced the signing of four Minnesota high school hockey players to national letters of intent. The four prep stars are the first signings of the early signing period. Jeff Callinan (Minnetonka), Jed Fiebelkorn (Osseo), Darby Hendrickson (Richfield), and Steve Magnusson (Anoka), all signed letters indicating they will come to Minnesota and play hockey for Head Coach Doug Woog.

Callinan, a 5-11, 165-pound goalie, came highly recommended from former Gopher defenseman Pat Furlong. The Mound native did not compete for the Skippers last season because of his transfer status, but was a member of the prestigious Team USA Select 17's team. "Jeff is a hard working player who skates well enough to play other positions at the high school level," said Woog. "He is extremely quick and agile, as well as possessing amazing acrobatic skills in the net."

Fiebelkorn, a 6-4, 210-pound forward, comes from an athletic family (his sister Jessica is attending Notre Dame on a volleyball scholarship). "Jed has unlimited potential, and with the great skating stride and other tools he possesses, we look for him to be an impact player right away," said Woog. "He has the strength to dominate the area in front of the net and knock in a ton of goals. He also has nice hands and sees the ice extremely well."

Hendrickson, a 6-0, 185-pound center, is the most versatile of the newcomers. He was a member of the Team USA Select 17's and 18's the last two years. He has the ability to contribute up front or help out back on the blueline. A very smooth skater with excellent speed, he scored 21 goals and 19 assists during the regular season for the Spartans last year. "Darby is a very exciting player to watch, he has great puck skills and should be able to step right in and contribute as a goal scorer and playmaker," said Woog. "I played against his dad in high school, and he seems to possess that same strong hockey sense, and is a delight to be around."

Magnusson rounds out this group. The 6-0, 170-pound center is a fierce competitor who has a strong knack for being around the puck and making things happen. Besides tallying 18 goals and 27 assists for the Tornados during the regular season last year, he is also a standout cornerback on their nationally-ranked football team. "Steve has the skills to be a prolific scorer and playmaker for us," said Woog. "He is very crafty with the puck, and his Athletic Director Terry Abram calls him a winner and a class individual."

"We feel this fine group of recruits is balanced with players who can do different things well," said Woog. "There is good size, speed, stick skills, and hockey sense in this group, and we look forward to seeing them put on the Maroon and Gold."

This is the first year of the early signing period for hockey. The early signing period runs through November 21. The 1990-91 Minnesota high school hockey season began on Monday, November 12, and runs through the Minnesota State Tournament in March.

BASKETBALL TEAM HOSTS ROBERT MORRIS IN SEASON OPENER ON SUNDAY; WELCOME LUNCHEON TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY

The Golden Gopher basketball team will open their 1990-91 regular season on Sunday when they host Robert Morris at 2:00 p.m. at Williams Arena.

Final Tuneup: In their final tuneup before the regular season opener, the Golden Gophers had six players score in double figures en route to a 111-80 victory over the Soviet Ukraine National Team last Friday before 4,678 fans at the Mayo Civic Center in Rochester. Senior **Walter Bond** (Chicago, IL) led the way with 19 points, followed by fellow senior **Kevin Lynch** (Bloomington, MN) who tallied 17 points, seven steals and four assists. Freshman **Arriel McDonald** (Raleigh, NC) tossed in 15 points and recorded seven assists, senior **Mario Green** (Freeport, Bahamas) and freshman **Randy Carter** (Memphis, TN) each tallied 12 points and freshman **Ernest Nzigamasabo** (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) registered 11 points in the victory. After leading 48-39 at the half, the Golden Gophers shot 70 percent (23 of 33) in the final 20 minutes of the contest to blow things wide open and cruise to the easy win. Overall, Head Coach **Clem Haskins'** squad shot a blistering 61 percent (45 of 74) from the field and finished with a 40-33 advantage on the boards in the game.

Sunday's season opener will mark the first meeting between Robert Morris and the University of Minnesota on the basketball court. The Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home, racking up an impressive 27-4 record over the past two years within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

"We're really looking forward to the 1990-91 season and to playing in front of our home fans at Williams Arena," Haskins said. "We feel that we have the best college basketball fans in the country right here in Minnesota. Their support has been tremendous."

Robert Morris: The Colonials charted an overall record of 22-8 last season and captured their second straight Northeast Conference regular season championship, before dropping a tough 79-71 decision to Kansas in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Three of last season's top four scorers return from a year ago for Head Coach **Jarrett Durham**. Senior 6-1 guard **Andre Boyd** averaged 12.3 points and 3.3 assists a game in 1989-90 en route to being honored as a All-Northeast Conference first-team selection. Joining Boyd in the backcourt will be 6-3 senior **Scott Sheperd** (6.6 ppg), who nailed a team-leading 53 three pointers last season. Junior 6-7 forward **Joe Falletta** (9.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg), who was named to the Northeast Conference All-Tournament team, and junior 6-8 forward **Ricky Cannon** (10.0 ppg, 3.6 rpg), who scored 13 points against Kansas in the NCAA Tournament last season, return up front along with senior 6-5 forward **Tyrone Steals** (7.0 ppg, 3.6 rpg). He also was named to the Northeast Conference All-Tournament team last season.

"I feel very strongly that this could be the best team in Robert Morris history," Durham said. "Overall, we should have a quick team with a lot of good athletes who can get up and down the court."

Poster Day: Fans in attendance at the regular season home opener on Sunday will receive a free schedule poster, compliments of Pepsi, Hardee's, Northgate Computers and WCCO Radio. Busy Schedule: The Golden Gophers will keep themselves plenty busy as they open up the season with four games over a nine-day period. Following Sunday's contest against Robert Morris, Haskins' squad will also host Augusta College on Tuesday, November 27, at 7:00 p.m. and Northern Illinois on Saturday, December 1, at 7:00 p.m., before taking to the road for the first time this season when they play at Iowa State on Monday, December 3, at 6:00 p.m. The Golden Gophers will then take a break for the first semester exam period, before returning to action at home on Thursday, December 13, at 7:00 p.m. when they host Santa Clara.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: During their 10-game non-conference schedule, the Golden Gophers will face three 1990 NCAA Tournament teams at home in Robert Morris on Sunday, Oregon State on December 15 and Virginia on December 29, and one 1990 NIT Tournament team when they host Cincinnati on December 20.

"This is probably the toughest non-conference schedule in the history of the school," Haskins said. "Robert Morris, Oregon State and Virginia all made the NCAA Tournament last year, while Cincinnati played in the NIT Tourney. Those four teams all won at least 20 games last season. On top of that, Iowa State is always tough down there, along with Washington at home and Youngstown State on the road. We don't have any cupcakes on our schedule this year."

Welcome Golden Gopher Luncheon: The 1990-91 Welcome Golden Gopher Basketball Luncheon sponsored by the St. Paul Area Chamber of Commerce will be held on Tuesday (November 20) at the Radisson Hotel in St. Paul beginning at 12:00 Noon.

Head Coach Clem Haskins, his staff and members of the 1990-91 Golden Gophers will be present, along with Athletic Director Rick Bay. Special guest, Governor-elect Arne Carlson, will help welcome the Golden Gophers by conducting player interviews as part of the program.

Nichols Signs: Josh Nichols, a 6-foot-6, 185-pound forward from Jackson (MI) High School, has signed a national basketball letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota.

"Josh is a young man who is an outstanding outside shooter, and we're going to need that when we lose the likes of Kevin Lynch, Walter Bond and Rob Metcalf after this season," Haskins said. "He's not only a great player, but an outstanding person as well. He will fit in well with the type of student-athletes we have on our team."

Nichols was an honorable mention All-State selection as a junior last season after averaging 14 points, 8 rebounds, 3 steals and 3 assists a game. The team MVP and captain was also named to the first-team Capital Area Conference (CAC) and All-Area squads a year ago. He also was a starter as a sophomore for the school when he averaged 12 points, 8 rebounds and 4 assists a contest, and was a reserve as a freshman on the team that advanced to the Michigan State Class A Championships Final Four. He will once again serve as team captain for Jackson as a senior during the upcoming 1990-91 season.

An AAU honorable mention All-American this past summer after helping to lead the Ann Arbor River Rats to the national tournament in Jonesboro, AR, he was named the top senior at the Western Michigan basketball camp as well. An honor roll student in the classroom with numerous scholastic-athlete awards to his credit, he has recorded an impressive 3.4 cumulative GPA during his prep career. In addition, he is a member of Jackson High School's student council and government, and is the head of the school's grievance committee.

"I was very impressed with the coaching staff at the University of Minnesota and that was the determining factor in my decision," Nichols said. "It wasn't a hard decision for me. I narrowed a list of 45 schools down to seven and Minnesota stood out above them all. I want to play for Coach Haskins because he doesn't accept anything less than your best both on the court and in the classroom."

"Josh is a very good outside shooter and rebounder," said Jackson High School Head Coach Andy Sheridan. "He's a talented kid and a very hard worker. Clem Haskins has things going the right way at Minnesota and I believe that Josh has made a good decision. As a person, you won't find a better kid. He comes from a great family and is the type of kid that you never have to worry about."

St. Cloud Intrasquad: Mario Green and senior Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) tallied 16 points apiece to lead the Gold team to a 69-64 victory over the Maroon in the team's final intrasquad scrimmage held on November 11 at St. Cloud. Sophomore Nate Tubbs (Fort Wayne, IN) and Ernest Nzigamasabo joined them in double figures with 13 and 10 points

respectively. Kevin Lynch paced the Maroon squad with 20 points, 5 assists and 5 steals in the contest. Walter Bond, Arriel McDonald and freshman Randy Carter tallied 15, 13 and 12 points respectively. Carter also hauled down a game-high 10 rebounds.

Ohio AAU Exhibition: Walter Bond tallied 31 points to lead the Golden Gopher basketball squad to a 98-94 exhibition game victory over the Ohio AAU team on November 4 at Williams Arena. Bond connected on 11 of 16 field goal attempts, including three of four from three point land, and on six of seven free throw attempts in the contest. He also added a game-high six steals in the win. Although none of the statistics will officially count, he surpassed his collegiate career highs for points (19), field goals made (8), three pointers made (2) and attempted (3), and steals (5), while equalling the standard for field goals attempted at 16. Kevin Lynch, Randy Carter and Arriel McDonald joined Bond in double figures. 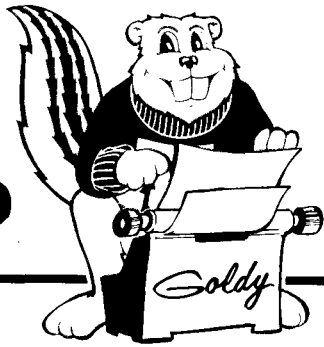
TENNIS TEAM TRAVELS TO HONOLULU FOR THE HAWAII INVITATIONAL

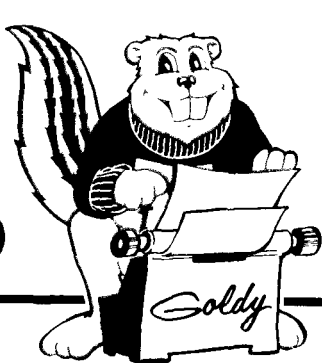

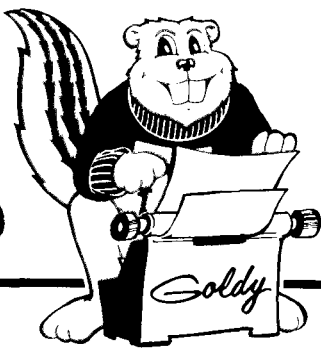

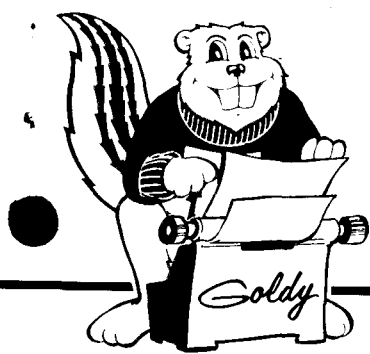

BIG WEEKEND FOR THE GOLDEN GOPHERS

A total of 92,997 fans passed through the turnstiles at University of Minnesota men's home athletic events this past weekend and the Golden Gophers responded with a perfect weekend of their own. The No. 1 ranked hockey team swept Michigan Tech before 14,310 fans (7,239 Friday/7,071 Saturday) at Mariucci Arena. Before a crowd of 64,694, the second largest crowd in Metrodome history, the football team scored a thrilling 31-24 victory over Iowa on Saturday afternoon. The basketball team then put the appropriate finishing touches on it all with a 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in their season opener before 13,993 fans at Williams Arena on Sunday afternoon.



GOPHERS END SEASON WITH WIN OVER IOWA

Minnesota brought down the curtain on its' 1990 football season in festive style this past weekend by downing Big Ten Conference "co"-champion and Rose Bowl bound Iowa 31-24 at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.

It was the second straight triumph over the Hawkeyes for a John Gutekunst coached Golden Gopher contingent, and it enabled Minnesota to finish the '90 campaign at 6-5.....the fourth winning regular season in Gutekunst's five years as head football coach at Minnesota.

The Golden Gophers also wound up at 5-3 in the Big Ten, and that put Minnesota in sixth place just one-half game behind Ohio State and only one game out of the four-way log jam at the top of the standings.

"I'm really proud of this football team," Coach Gutekunst said. "They came back all season long, and they came back again against Iowa. I said going into the game that we had played the rest, and now we are going to play the best. But we were the best team on the field Saturday."

It was a team effort for Minnesota, and it enabled Floyd of

Rosedale to retain his residency in Minnesota for another year. And it resulted because the Golden Gophers dominated nearly every phase of the game.

Iowa was the top-ranked defensive team in the Big Ten coming into the season finale, but Minnesota chalked up 309 offensive yards. The Golden Gophers not only had the edge in yardage, they also had more first downs, more offensive plays, more third-down conversions and most important.....more points.

"One of the big things," Gutekunst pointed out, "was that we did not turn the ball over. And our defense blocked a punt (for a Keswic Joiner touchdown), recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass."

Joiner and Mark Smith were the touchdown leaders for Minnesota with two each. Marquel Fleetwood also had a spectacular day at quarterback with 13 completions in 19 attempts for 159 yards and a touchdown. And, as Gutekunst noted, with no interceptions.

Defensively there also were heroes....such as Omar Douglas who blocked that Hawkeye punt, and Frank Jackson, Sean Lumpkin and Mike Sunvold who set

the pace in tackles.

"We played our game," Gutekunst said, "and we did not make mistakes. That was not true of this club at the beginning of the season. We were not a good team then, but we got better as the season progressed." He didn't dispute the fact that Minnesota was a good team in the finale.

The future? There were 20 seniors who made their final home appearance Saturday. But Gutekunst will have 15 starters from the final game of the 1990 season returning next year. And there appears to be a fine crop of young people ready to take over. The future looks bright.

"We played a lot of young people this season," Gutekunst said, "and they are maturing. But our seniors were quality individuals, and we will miss the stability they gave us."

A crowd of 64,694 was on hand for the final game of the year, the second largest crowd in Metrodome history. That brought Minnesota's season attendance total to 246,511, an average of 41,085, up more than 1,000 per game from a year ago.

BASKETBALL TEAM HOSTS AUGUSTA ON TUESDAY & NORTHERN ILLINOIS ON SATURDAY; BOND HURT IN SEASON OPENER

After opening the season with a 74-61 victory over Robert Morris before 13,993 fans at Williams Arena last Sunday, Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gopher basketball team will continue their non-conference schedule this week when they host Augusta College on Tuesday and Northern Illinois on Saturday. Both games are scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m., and will be carried by the Midwest Sports Channel (MSC) and on WCCO-AM Radio (830), the exclusive voice of Golden Gopher basketball.

Lynch Leads The Way: Senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN), an All-America candidate, scored 19 points and added six assists to pace the Golden Gophers to the season-opening victory over Robert Morris, who had been in the past two NCAA Tournaments. Making his first collegiate start, freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) tallied 12 points and collected four rebounds in 25 minutes of action. Sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL), a transfer from San Diego State University, made his first game in Gold Country an impressive one. He came off the bench to score nine points and grab three rebounds in 18 minutes. A total of 10 players got into the scoring act in the contest for the Golden Gophers.

"I was thrilled with the win," said Coach Haskins. "Robert Morris really pushed us to play well. What can I say about Kevin Lynch? He played a fabulous game and showed tremendous leadership, which doesn't surprise me at all. He is without question one of the premiere guards in the country. Randy Carter's performance indicates that he can and will make a solid contribution. Dana Jackson showed his ability to play aggressive basketball by making some very tough buckets inside. I was really pleased with his performance."

Costly Victory: Sunday's victory over Robert Morris also proved to be a costly one when senior Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) went to the sidelines midway through the final 20 minutes with an injury to his right foot after scoring 10 points and snaring four rebounds in 24 minutes of play. The injury has been initially diagnosed as a possible stress fracture. Further examinations and tests were to be conducted on Monday and then a complete diagnosis will be released.

"We will certainly miss Walter," Coach Haskins said. "He's a senior, he's a leader and he has the potential to score 15 to 20 points every night. He's part of the heart and soul of this team."

Lynch Nears Record: Kevin Lynch went four of five from three-point range on Sunday to up his career total to 79, just three shy of the all-time school record of 82 held by Willie Burton. The Golden Gopher veteran leader has never missed a game during his collegiate career, appearing in 92 of 92 games, with 67 starts.

Augusta College: Tuesday's meeting between the Golden Gophers and Augusta College will be the first ever between the two schools...in fact it will also be the first time that the Jaguars have ever faced a Big Ten opponent. Head Coach Clint Bryant's squad dropped a 100-63 decision in their season opener at Georgia Tech last Saturday. The Jaguars actually led the contest 35-23 with 6:57 to play in the first half, before the powerful Yellow Jackets reeled off 28 straight points to take command of the game. Junior Kerwin Harris led Augusta with 12 points, while junior Keenan Mann added 11 points and nine rebounds in the losing effort. Ironically, the last time that the Jaguars dropped a season opener was during the 1984-85 season when they fell 93-57 to the then Clem Haskins-coached Western Kentucky Hilltoppers.

Northern Illinois: Donnell "D Train" Thomas headlines a deep and talented Northern Illinois squad that will invade Williams Arena on Saturday night. The Golden Gophers scored an 81-62 home-court victory over the Huskies last season and hold a 3-0 edge in the all-time series. Head Coach Jim Molinari's club, which finished 17-11 last season and returns all five starters in 1990-91, will open their season on Tuesday evening at Maine. Thomas, a 6-4, 212-pound senior forward, is an All-America candidate for the Huskies and has been tabbed as the pre-season Mid-

Continent Conference pre-season Player-of-the-Year by Big Ten 1990-91 Basketball heading into the season. He averaged 17.8 points and 8.0 rebounds a game last season. Senior 5-10 guard, Donald Whiteside, averaged 11.8 points and 2.8 assists a game a year ago and warrants consideration for the Francis P. Naismith Award which goes to the nation's best senior player under six feet. The Huskies, selected as the pre-season Mid-Continent favorite by a number of publications, finished fifth nationally in defense last season, allowing just 61.1 points a contest.

Looking Ahead: The Golden Gophers will make their first road trip of the young season when they travel to Ames, IA, to take on the Iowa State Cyclones on Monday, December 3, at 6:00 p.m. The Golden Gophers scored a 98-82 victory over Head Coach Johnny Orr's squad at Williams Arena last season and hold a 16-7 edge in the overall series. The Cyclones last victory in the series was an 80-78 overtime win at Ames back in 1983. Following the Iowa State game, the Golden Gophers will take a break from competition for the final exam period, before resuming their non-conference schedule at home on December 13 against Santa Clara.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: During their 10-game non-conference schedule, the Golden Gophers will face three 1990 NCAA Tournament teams at home in Robert Morris, Oregon State on December 15 and Virginia on December 29, and one 1990 NIT Tournament team when they host Cincinnati on December 20.

"This is probably the toughest non-conference schedule in the history of the school," Coach Haskins said. "Robert Morris, Oregon State and Virginia all made the NCAA Tournament last year, while Cincinnati played in the NIT Tourney. Those four teams all won at least 20 games last season. On top of that, Iowa State is always tough down there, along with Washington at home and Youngstown State on the road. We don't have any cupcakes on our schedule this year."

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After Sunday's victory over Robert Morris, they have now racked up an impressive 28-4 record within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena over the past two-plus seasons.

Seniors Named Quad-Captains: Minnesota seniors Walter Bond, Mario Green (Freeport, Bahamas), Kevin Lynch and Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) have been named quad-captains of the 1990-91 Golden Gophers.

Three Sign With Minnesota: The Golden Gophers signed three outstanding student-athletes to national letters of intent during the early signing period. They are as follows:

The top-ranked Golden Gopher hockey team continued their unbeaten streak with a two-game sweep of the Michigan Tech Huskies this past weekend at Mariucci Arena giving the Maroon and Gold a 11-0-2 overall record for the year.

The Gophers came out flying Friday night when they outshot the Huskies 41 to 22 en route to a 7-2 victory. Head Coach Doug Woog's revamped lines paid off in a big way. The reunited line of **Trent Klatt (Osseo)**, **Ken Gernander (Greenway)**, and captain **Ben Hankinson (Edina)** accounted for three goals. In addition, the newly assembled line of **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids)**, **Jason Miller (Bloomington)**, and **Craig Johnson (St. Paul)** tallied three goals in the game as well.

Saturday evening's contest was in stark contrast to the previous evening. It was a defensive orientated game. The Gophers **Larry Olimb (Warroad)** scored at the 9:11 mark of the second period and Minnesota held onto that narrow margin until Ben Hankinson's empty-net goal at 19:31 of the third period secured the 2-0 shutout.

Once again WCHA-leading goaltender **Jeff Stolp (Greenway)** was strong in the nets, as he gained wins number seven and eight of the 1990-91 season when he stopped 34 shots over the weekend. Stolp now holds a 2.33 goals against average in 10 league games. His won-loss record in WCHA play now stands at 7-0-2 and 8-0-2 overall.

The Fighting Sioux are coached by Gino Gasparini who has a 337-166-18 record in 12 years at North Dakota. Gasparini's squad returns 21 lettermen from last year's squad that finished 28-13-4, and they were a consensus pick to finish in the top spot in the conference. Currently the Sioux are 9-4-1 and have played two more conference games than the Gophers.

The series with North Dakota shows the Gophers holding a slight edge with a 92-87-4 record. Last year coach Woog's squad posted a 3-1-1 record against the Sioux, including a thrilling, come-from-behind 5-4 victory in the WCHA playoffs at the St. Paul Civic Center last March. Overall Woog holds a 14-8-1 record against the Fighting Sioux during his tenure at Minnesota.

The Gophers stingy defense and balanced scoring is still the backbone of the team. The Maroon and Gold lists seven players with 10 or more points and three others just one point back with nine points. Larry Olimb and Craig Johnson are tied at the top of the scoring chart with 14 points each. In the goal scoring category there is a three-way tie between Olimb, Ben Hankinson, and Trent Klatt with seven goals each.

All-American candidate **Tom Pederson (Bloomington)** leads the blueline corps in scoring with four goals and eight assists for 12 points, good for third in team scoring. **Luke Johnson (St. Paul)** and **Travis Richards (Crystal)** are just behind Pederson with nine and eight points respectively.

This weekend's games are slated for 7:35 p.m. on Friday, and 8:05 p.m. on Saturday with all the action being broadcast on WAYL-AM 980 radio and KITN-29 television. Following the North Dakota series the Gophers return home to Mariucci Arena to host the defending NCAA Champion Wisconsin Badgers, in two sold-out matinee games on December 8 & 9 at 2:05 p.m. Both games of the Wisconsin series will be broadcast on KITN-29 and WAYL as well.

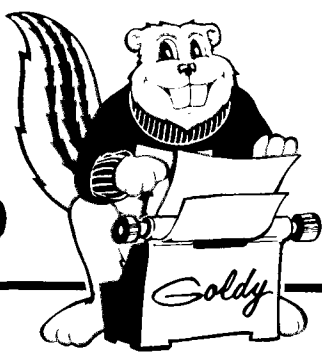

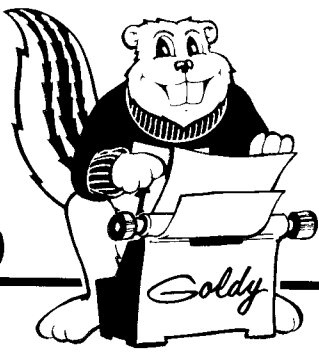
BOND SCHEDULED FOR SURGERY ON TUESDAY

University of Minnesota senior forward Walter Bond is scheduled to undergo surgery on Tuesday morning at the University of Minnesota Hospital.

Bond suffered a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal on his right foot during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris at Williams Arena on Sunday. Following the surgery, he is expected to be sidelined from four to six weeks.

"We have chosen to treat this surgically by putting a screw down the shaft of the metatarsal bone," said Dr. Elizabeth Arendt, team orthopedist. "He will be casted until comfortable and then begin rehabilitation as soon as his comfort level permits it. Although he had acute pain on Sunday, the fracture represents an overuse injury of the bone. This is becoming an increasingly recognizable injury in the sport of basketball."

"We're going to miss Walter Bond a great deal because he not only gives us great scoring and rebounding, but also because of his outstanding leadership both on and off the floor," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins. "Our main concern at this time is for him to get through the surgery and then we wish him a speedy recovery."

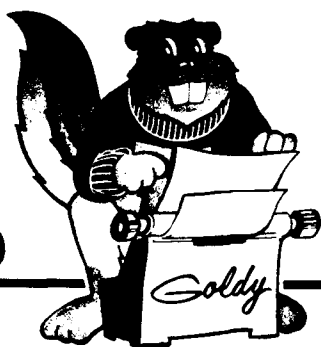

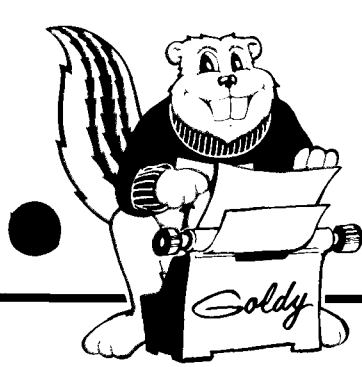

The University of Minnesota men's golf team finished 36th in a national poll released today by Florida Golf Week magazine.

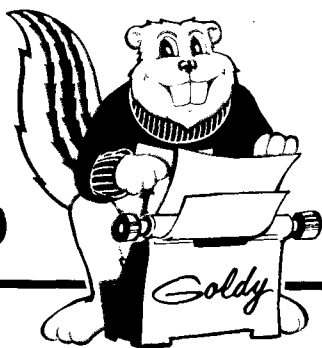
The final poll marks the end of a very successful fall season for the Golden Gophers who were led by first-year coach John Means. Means, who took over the Minnesota program in June, is a former NCAA District II Coach of the Year (Army '89). He is currently serving as the Vice-President of the Golf Coaches Association of America. He is known as an excellent golf technician, and gives many lectures across the country promoting the sport.

This past fall the Gophers finished in the top five in three of the five tournaments they competed in, including 3rd at the Ohio State Invitational, 2nd at the Charleston Invitational, and 4th at the Walter McGlaughlin Invitational.

At the Charleston Invitational, the Gophers set the collegiate course record in their last round of the tournament when the team shot a 289. In addition, sophomore Joe Gullion tied the course record for an amateur with the 69 he shot on his last round.

The Gopher accomplished these results with two of their top golfers red-shirted for the season. Senior Billy Emo and sophomore Phillip Ebner were both red-shirted for the 1990-91 season. Ebner, a transfer from West Point, where he played under Means, was named All-East District as a freshman last year. Emo is a two-letter winner for the Golden Gophers and is expected to make a big impact next season.

The Gophers begin their spring season February 15-17 in Miami, FL at the Fountanbleu Classic golf tournament.

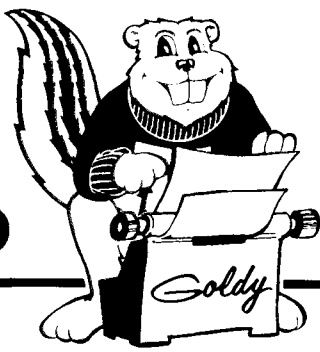

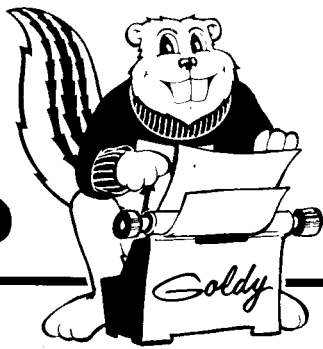

The Fighting Sioux beat Minnesota 6-1 in the series opener on Friday night, but the Gophers stormed back to take a 6-3 victory in the series finale on Saturday night.

The Golden Gophers faced an outstanding goalie in Tony Couture, who held the Gophers offense back on Friday, but couldn't repeat the task on Saturday. The Gophers showed great poise as they fired in three third period goals against the Sioux after allowing them to tie the game early in the period.

Senior captain **Ben Hankinson (Edina)** led the charge scoring the gamewinner on a feed from **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids)**, Hankinson added another insurance goal as did **Cory Laylin (St. Cloud)** on an outstanding individual effort.

Still Number One: Even though the Gophers took it on the chin from the Sioux in the first game, their performance on Saturday allowed them to retain their top ranking in the polls. The weekend also saw conference-leading goalie **Jeff Stolp (Greenway)** let in some goals, but he battled back and was able to hold onto his lead in the goalie standings with a 2.63 GAA in WCHA games.

Woog versus the Badgers: Doug Woog holds a 17-8 record against the Badgers. The overall series with the Badgers stands at 65-51-6, with Minnesota having the upper hand. GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM REMAINS UNBEATEN

Behind a stingy defense and a balanced offensive attack, the Golden Gopher basketball team upped their record to a sparkling 4-0 on the season with an 84-70 victory at Iowa State on Monday night. Senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN) tallied 18 points to lead a total of five players in double figures in the contest. Freshman Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) with 17 points, sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL) and freshman Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) with 12 apiece, and senior Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) with 10 joined Lynch in double figures. McDonald registered a game-high seven assists, while Metcalf led the Golden Gophers to a 47-33 advantage on the boards with nine rebounds.

Taking A Break: The Golden Gophers opened their season with four games over a nine-day period, but will now take a break for the first quarter exam period. They will return to action at home on Thursday, December 13, at 7:00 p.m. when they host Santa Clara.

Lynch Nears Record: Kevin Lynch remains tied at 82 with Willie Burton for the all-time school three-point record. The durable Golden Gopher veteran leader has never missed a game during his collegiate career, appearing in 95 of 95 games, with 70 starts. He has also scored 925 points during his career in Gold Country, leaving him just 75 points shy of the coveted 1,000 point mark.

Bond's Surgery Is Successful: Senior forward Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) underwent successful surgery on his right foot last Tuesday (Nov. 27) at the University of Minnesota Hospital. He suffered a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal on the foot during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. The injury is expected to keep him sidelined from four to six weeks.

"We're going to miss Walter Bond a great deal because he not only gives us great scoring and rebounding, but also because of his outstanding leadership both on and off the floor," said Head Coach Clem Haskins. "Our main concern was for him to get through the surgery successfully and now we wish him a speedy recovery."

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After opening the season with three straight home victories, they have now racked up an impressive 30-4 record within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena over the past two-plus seasons.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris at home on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a home season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 15,334, attended last Saturday's Northern Illinois game, bringing the season total to 42,968 for an average of 14,323 a game. The Iowa (Jan. 12) and Indiana (Feb. 3) games this season are already sold out, while only approximately 1,000 tickets remain for the Ohio State (Jan. 24), Michigan (Jan. 31), Michigan State (Feb. 25) and Wisconsin (Mar. 9) games.

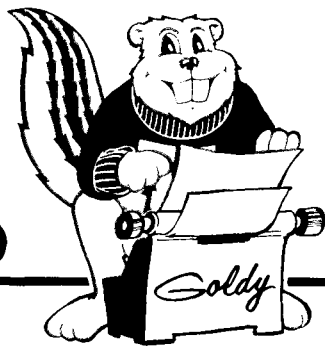

Winner's Circle: The Golden Gopher swimming & diving team claimed the top spot in 19 of 20 events en route to capturing the 1990 Minnesota Invitational crown. The Golden Gophers never trailed in the three day, three session meet. Junior **Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, MN)** was all the firepower the Golden Gophers needed at the meet. Quackenbush touched first in three individual events. He won the 200 yard individual medley (1:55.24), 100 yard butterfly (:49.62), and finally the 200 yard butterfly (1:49.57). Quackenbush was on four winning relay teams as well. The 400 yard medley relay team, which included junior **Scott Tripps (Seattle, WA)**, sophomore **Paul Nelsen (Lincoln, NE)**, and junior **Del Cerney (Staples, MN)** they touched first with a time of 3:27.12. 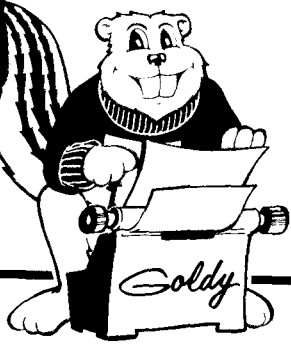

GOLDEN GOPHER HOCKEY TEAM PREPARES FOR ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE AND DYNAMO RIGA AS HALFWAY POINT OF WCHA SEASON IS REACHED

This Week: The Golden Gophers play host to two non-conference foes this week. It all starts on Wednesday night as the Alabama-Huntsville Chargers invade Mariucci Arena for a 7:05 p.m. contest. Next up is an inter-continental matchup between the Gophers and the Dynamo Riga of the Soviet Elite League on Saturday. The game is slated for 2:05 p.m. from Mariucci Arena.

Report on the Chargers: The University of Alabama-Huntsville hockey program is a young one, but has made tremendous strides under Head Coach Doug Ross who has been the driving force behind making hockey a Division I sport at the school. Building up from the club status eight years ago, the UAH hockey program has become a power in the Central States College Hockey League, winning the last three conference championships under Ross who has a 202-122-9 lifetime coaching record and a 146-87-7 record at Huntsville.

International Exhibition: The Saturday, December 15th matinee exhibition game with the Dynamo Riga will be the Gophers third exhibition game of the year. In the two previous exhibitions the Gophers lost to the Canadian National Team 6-5-OT, and 11-8. The Dynamo Riga hockey club is a member of the Soviet Elite League, which provides the majority of the players for the Soviet National Team during Olympic years. The game is one game of an eleven-game American tour that the Riga club is on. They will play at St. Cloud State on Wednesday night and at North Dakota on Thursday before coming into Minneapolis for Saturday's game.

Wisconsin Recap: The Golden Gophers pulled down three, of a possible four points this past weekend when they beat Wisconsin 9-4 on Saturday and battled to a 4-4 overtime tie on Sunday afternoon. The Gophers were the dominant team on Friday night when three players tallied three or more points, (Larry Olimb Warroad, MN), (Mike Muller, Plymouth, MN), (Grant Bischoff Grand Rapids, MN). Bischoff continued his impressive weekend with two goals in Sunday's game which helped pull the Gophers into a 4-4 tie that held up through the five-minute overtime period.

Stolp Retains Lead in WCHA Goalie Standings: Junior goalie Jeff Stolp (Greenway, MN) held on to his lead in the goalie standings with his four goals allowed performance on Friday. Stolp now posts a 10-1-2 record with a 2.69 GAA. This marks the fourth straight week Stolp has been on top of the list since he was named Player-of-the-Week after the UMD series.

Bischoff Surges to Top of Scoring List: Alternate captain Grant Bischoff took over the Gopher scoring lead for the first time this season when he posted five points for the two games last weekend. Bischoff tops the list with 19 points, followed by Larry Olimb (18), and Craig Johnson (17 pts, St. Paul, MN). The balanced offensive attack of the Gophers now boasts eleven players in double figures in the point category. In addition to gaining the scoring lead, Bischoff tied Olimb and captain Ben Hankinson (Edina, MN) for the goals scored lead with nine goals.

Halfway Point of WCHA Schedule Reached: The Gophers have reached the mid-point of their conference schedule. They currently are in first-place with 27 points and a 12-1-3 record, followed by Northern Michigan with 24 points on a 11-1-2. The Gophers have played two more WCHA games than Northern, but the Wildcats travel to Grand Forks to take on the North Dakota Fighting Sioux this weekend.

Gophers to Head West to Play in Great Western Freeze-Out: Doug Woog's squad will take a short break from WCHA action on December 17, when they travel to Los Angeles, CA to participate in the Great Western Freeze-Out tournament. The team will take in some of the sights of the L.A. area and start off the tourney with the Boston College Eagles, who knocked Minnesota out of the NCAA's last season. Michigan St. and the Univ. of Toronto are the other tourney teams.

UNBEATEN GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM GETS BACK INTO ACTION THIS WEEK

After a week off for the fall quarter final exam period, the Golden Gopher basketball team will host Santa Clara on Thursday and Oregon State on Saturday at Williams Arena. Both games are scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m.

Santa Clara: Injury-riddled Santa Clara struggled to a 9-19 overall record last season, the program's worst since the 1963-64 team finished 6-20. Under Head Coach Carroll Williams, the Broncos have averaged nearly 20 wins a year over the last eight seasons, resulting in five post-season appearances and one league title since 1984. Ron Reis, an honorable mention All-West Coast Conference selection last season, headlines the returnees. The 7-1 junior center scored 17 points and grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds to help lead the Broncos to a 77-73 victory at home over Fresno State last Saturday, upping the team's overall record to 5-1 in the process. Melvin Chinn, a 6-0 junior guard, and Rhea Taylor, a 6-7 junior forward, tallied 22 and 20 points respectively in the victory. Santa Clara will play at St. Louis on Tuesday before facing the Golden Gophers.

Oregon State: The name Gary Payton immediately comes to mind when looking back at Oregon State's 1989-90 season when the Beavers racked up an impressive 22-7 record and were Co-Pac-10 champions with a 15-3 league mark. Honored as *Sports Illustrated's* Player of the Year and a first-round NBA draft pick, he averaged 25.7 points, 4.7 rebounds and 8.1 assists a game last season. But the cupboard is hardly empty for Head Coach Jim Anderson's squad. A pair of seniors, 6-4 guard Will Brantley and 6-9 forward Teo Alibegovic, return to the fold in 1990-91. Brantley averaged 11 points and shot 55 percent from the field last season, while Alibegovic, regarded as one of the most underrated players in the Pac-10 in '89-90, averaged 8.9 points and 3.3 rebounds. After falling 112-78 to Illinois in the first game of the Illini Classic on Friday, the Beavers came back on Saturday to score a 75-72 victory over Long Beach State on Saturday. Alibegovic scored 21 points and Brantley had 19 as the Beavers moved their record to 2-1 on the season. Prior to meeting the Golden Gophers, they will play at the University of New Orleans on Wednesday.

Last Time Out: Behind a stingy defense and a balanced offensive attack, the Golden Gophers upped their record to a sparkling 4-0 on the season with an 84-70 victory at Iowa State on Dec. 3. Senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN) tallied 18 points to lead a total of five players in double figures. Freshman Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) with 17 points, sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL) and freshman Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) with 12 apiece and senior Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) with 10 joined Lynch in double figures. McDonald registered a game-high seven assists, while Metcalf led the Golden Gophers to a 47-33 advantage on the boards with nine rebounds.

Getting Busy Again: The Golden Gophers opened the season with four games over a nine-day period, and after taking the break for the fall quarter exam period, they will now play four games over a 10-day period before Christmas.

Lynch Nears Record: Kevin Lynch remains tied at 82 with Willie Burton for the all-time school three-point record. The durable Golden Gopher veteran leader has never missed a game during his collegiate career, appearing in 95 of 95 games, with 70 starts. He has also scored 925 points during his career in Gold Country, leaving him just 75 points shy of the coveted 1,000 point mark.

Bond's Surgery Is Successful: Senior forward Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital. He suffered a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-

61 victory over Robert Morris at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He has already begun the rehabilitation process. Following the surgery, he was expected to be sidelined from four to six weeks.

"We're going to miss Walter Bond a great deal because he not only gives us great scoring and rebounding, but also because of his outstanding leadership both on and off the floor," said Head Coach Clem Haskins. "Our main concern was for him to get through the surgery successfully and now we wish him a speedy recovery."

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After opening the season with three straight home victories, they have now racked up an impressive 30-4 record within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena over the past two-plus seasons.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris at home on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a home season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 15,334, attended the Dec. 1 Northern Illinois game, bringing the season total to 42,968 for an average of 14,323 a game. The Iowa (Jan. 12) and Indiana (Feb. 3) games this season are already sold out, while only approximately 1,000 tickets remain for the Ohio State (Jan. 24), Michigan (Jan. 31), Michigan State (Feb. 25) and Wisconsin (Mar. 9) games.

Santa Anonymous Program: The basketball game at Williams Arena on Saturday night against Oregon State and the hockey game on Saturday afternoon against Dynamo Riga (USSR) have been designated as drop sites for new, unwrapped toys and clothing for the Santa Anonymous program. There will be bins located at all gates for collection. This project is a joint effort between the Men's Athletic Department and the Office of Research and Technology Transfer.

MINNESOTA WRESTLERS GO WEST

Minnesota's youthful Golden Gopher wrestling team, heeding the advice of Horace Greeley, will "Go West" this week to compete in four challenging dual meets against Northern California opposition.

Coach J Robinson's contingent, 1-1 on the season after losing to Northern Iowa and beating Mankato, will square off against San Francisco State Friday afternoon and then Fresno State Friday night. On Saturday Minnesota will face Fresno State in the afternoon and Cal State Bakersfield in the evening.

Robinson doesn't plan any drastic lineup changes for the California trip, and he expects to use the same Golden Gophers that have carried the load thus far. However, a couple of Minnesota grapplers could get their first taste of dual meet action in one or two of those West Coast assignments.

Eric Folkins (Sacramento, CA), 9-2 on the year, probably will get the nod at 118 pounds, but if **Ben Morris** (Wooddale, IL) is recovered from a knee injury, he could see action either Friday or Saturday. **Scott Rohrer** (Waupun, WI) 6-2, appears set at 126 as does **Shannon Ward** (Irving, TX), 10-3, at 134.

Damon Johnson (Mustang, OK), 5-1-1, will get the call at 142. **Willy Short** (Inver Grove Heights, MN), 9-2 on the year, will go at 150 and **Cliff Casteel** (Montrose Hill, MI), 2-2-1, will wrestle for Minnesota at 158. The same holds true for **Mike Marzetta** (Liberty Lake, WA), 6-4, at 167.

Brad Gibson (Chokio, MN), 5-3, again is expected to be Robinson's choice at 177 and unbeaten **Marty Morgan** (Bloomington, MN), 10-0 thus far this season, will compete at 190. **Eric Betterman** (Prior Lake, MN), 2-5, could draw the assignment at heavyweight but **Chris Stogdill** (Charles City, IA), a University of Minnesota gridder, will make the trip and could see his first action of the 1990-91 campaign.

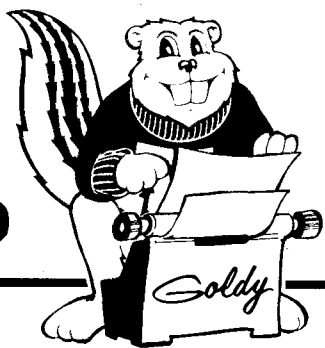
"It would be nice to come home with four wins," Robinson admits, "but we have a lot of respect for the California schools. It will be a challenging road trip for us, and we just hope to do well."

Following the jaunt west, Minnesota will take a week off from competition before returning to action in the Midlands Wrestling Championships in Evanston, IL, December 28-30. Then the Golden Gophers return home to entertain Oklahoma State on January 6, in the 1991 Wrestling Showcase at Williams Arena.

The latest national rankings from the AWN Coaches Poll appearing in the Amateur Wrestling News has Minnesota in the number 10 position. **Morgan** is the top-ranked 190-pounder in the nation in the individual ratings.

U OF M SPORTS HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCES SELECTION COMMITTEE

The University of Minnesota Lettermen "M" Club and the Men's Intercollegiate Athletic Department have announced the initial Selection Committee for the recently formed University of Minnesota Golden Gopher Men's Sports Hall of Fame. Honoring student-athletes in 11 sports, the Golden Gopher Hall of Fame's first inductee group will include 10 Gopher greats from a "Pioneer Group" (graduating classes prior to 1940) and 10 from a "Contemporary Group" (graduating classes 1940 to 1989). Non-lettering honorary candidates (coaches, administration, managers, etc.) could also qualify as inductees into the Hall.

Voting members of the first Hall of Fame's selection committee will include University President Nils Hasselmo, Men's Athletic Director Rick Bay, Men's Faculty Representative and Law School Dean Robert Stein, "M" Club President Bud Ericksen, the Hall's Committee co-chairmen and "M" Club board members Pat Fitzsimmons and Timothy Browne, and annual rotating members consisting of WCCO Radio sportscaster Ray Christensen, Mona Meyer McGrath chairman and radio sports personality Dave Mona, Dr. Harvey O'Phalen representing the fans, "M" Club board of directors members Bill Davis, Peter Jocketty, Darrell Bunge and Tim Oliver. Non-voting members of the committee will include Bob Peterson, the University's Men's Athletics Sports Information Director, and future Hall of Fame inductees.

Additionally five advisory members from Minnesota newspapers will assist the committee in providing their suggestions of the first "Pioneer" and "Contemporary" inductees: Jon Roe, Minneapolis Star Tribune; Mike Augustin, St. Paul Pioneer Press; Charley Hallman, St. Paul Pioneer Press; Bob Brown, Rochester Post Bulletin; and Dave Pederson, Post Publications.

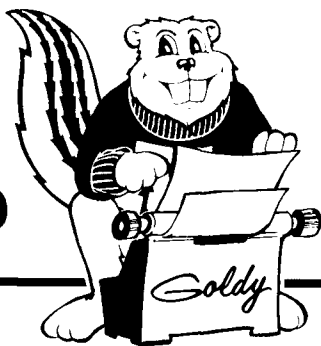
"M" Club president Bud Ericksen said, "we've compiled a very capable group of Selection Committee members for the initial Hall's inductee class. There are so many exceptional Gopher sports greats that this first group's identification will be especially challenging. We feel we have compiled an experienced group of Gopher sports historians, journalists, writers, and former Gopher athletes from a variety of sports."

The first 20 inductees into the Hall of Fame will be announced at halftime of a 1991 football game. A Hall of Fame Exhibit Room will be part of the remodeled Williams Arena. After the initial induction, a smaller group of student-athletes, including at least one from the pioneer category, will be made each year. Each year a dinner and ceremony will be held the night preceding one of Minnesota's home football games. The new members of the Hall of Fame will be introduced in a special

"M" Day half-time ceremony at the game the following day. Currently both corporate and media sponsors are being contacted to play a role in the Hall of Fame. Gopher fans will also be involved through several fan balloting programs at games, the first opportunities being this February when voting ballots will be passed out at Gopher basketball and hockey games.

The University of Minnesota "M" Club is a national organization of over 3,500 former Golden Gopher student-athletes serving its members, the University, and the Men's Intercollegiate Athletic Department with programs in career placement and counseling, fund raising, special member events, and coach support programs. OFFICIAL LETTER OF INQUIRY RECEIVED FROM NCAA

The University of Minnesota has received a letter of official inquiry from the NCAA, which will be released with names and identifiers removed at a news conference this afternoon at 3:00 p.m. in the university's Regents Room, 238 Morrill Hall.

The inquiry contains allegations of violations of NCAA rules. Most of the allegations in the inquiry are based on the University of Minnesota's own self-investigation, the reports of which were submitted to the NCAA in June 1989 and in February 1990.

University of Minnesota Athletic Director Rick Bay said that "The official inquiry is pretty much what we expected and contains no surprises. While it may seem odd, we are pleased to finally have the official inquiry so that we can have our hearing before the NCAA Infractions Committee and put this matter behind us."

In addition to doing its own self-investigation, the university has cooperated with the NCAA enforcement staff on all follow-up matters that they addressed.

At this point, the university is required to submit a response to the official inquiry, which it will do as soon as possible. The response will rely almost entirely on the university's self-investigation, which has already been provided to the NCAA, and will be made public, with names and identifiers removed, upon its completion.

The university expects to be heard before the NCAA Infractions Committee at its next meeting Feb. 1 through 3, 1991.

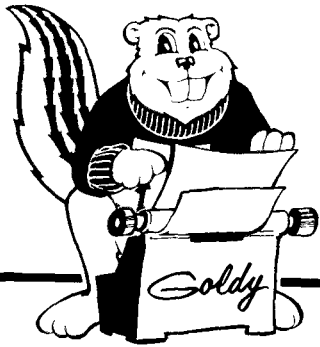

The contest between the Golden Gophers and the Bearcats can be seen on Midwest Sports Channel and heard on WCCO-Radio 830 AM. Fans will also be able to keep up with the undefeated Golden Gophers as they head west to take on the Huskies of the University of Washington on Saturday, December 22, at 9:30 p.m. (CST). MSC and WCCO-Radio will be bringing the game action live over the airwaves.

UNBEATEN GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM OFF TO BEST START SINCE 1976-77

Behind 20 points and seven rebounds from senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN), the Golden Gopher basketball team upped their record to a sparkling 6-0 on the season with a 64-53 victory over Oregon State at Williams Arena on Saturday. Junior Bob Martin (Apple Valley, MN) added a career-high 13 points in the contest. In the team's 73-63 victory over visiting Santa Clara on Thursday, Lynch led the way once again with 19 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL) came off the bench to score 15 points.

Best Start Since 1976-77: With a perfect 6-0 record, the Golden Gophers are off to their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Dan Kosmoski, an assistant coach for the Golden Gophers, was a member of that powerful squad.

Cincinnati Comes To Town: The Golden Gophers will host the University of Cincinnati Bearcats at Williams Arena on Thursday. Tip-off is at 7:00 p.m. Head Coach Bob Huggins took over the reins of the Cincinnati program a year ago and he promptly directed the squad to a 20-14 overall record, a tie for second-place in the Metro Conference and a berth in the National Invitation Tournament. Three starters, led by first-team All-Metro selection Louis Banks, are back from that squad and are joined by an outstanding recruiting class, headlined by Herbert Jones, one of the finest junior college players in the nation at Butler Community College last year. The Bearcats dropped a heartbreaking 65-63 decision at home to Michigan State last Thursday after holding a 40-25 advantage at the half. They bounced back with a 58-48 victory at Evansville on Saturday to up their record to 4-3 on the season. Huggins' squad will host St. Francis (PA) on Monday, before facing the Golden Gophers. In the season opener for both teams a year ago, a three-pointer at the buzzer by Steve Sanders provided the winning points in a heart-stopping 66-64 Bearcat victory over the Golden Gophers as Cincinnati opened their new 13,200 seat Myrl Shoemaker Center with a bang. Minnesota, however, holds a 2-1 lead in the all-time series between the two schools.

"I didn't like our overall effort and intensity in the game," said Golden Gopher Head Coach Clem Haskins following the win over Oregon State. "We will have to play much better come Thursday against Cincinnati. They're an outstanding ballclub, with great athletes and exceptional overall team quickness. We're going to have to get some things ironed out between now and Thursday."

Back On The Road Over The Weekend: Following Thursday's game with Cincinnati, the Golden Gophers will hit the road for the second time this season when they play at the University of Washington in Seattle on Saturday. The Huskies, idle since a 64-60 victory at Nevada-Reno on Dec. 11, will come into the game with a spotless 6-0 overall record. Forward Dion Brown has been simply sensational thus far. He leads the team both in scoring (23.2) and rebounding (9.3). The Huskies hold an 8-6 edge in the all-time series, but the Golden Gophers scored a 77-60 victory at Williams Arena last season. Game time is at 9:30 p.m. (CST).

Lynch Breaks Record: Kevin Lynch's three-pointer that put the Golden Gophers on top 62-55 with 4:52 left in the win over Santa Clara on Thursday made him the all-time career three-point leader with 83. Going into the game he was tied at 82 with Willie Burton. He added another three in the victory over Oregon State to up his career mark to 84 and counting. The durable Golden Gopher veteran leader has never missed a game during his collegiate career, appearing in 97 of 97 games, with 72 starts. He has also scored 964 points during his career in Gold Country, leaving him just 36 points shy of the coveted 1,000 point mark.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They are allowing just 57.3 points a game and have an impressive 17.7 scoring margin (75.0-57.3), while limiting opponents to shooting just .375 (117-312) from the field. In addition, the Golden Gophers hold an 11.6 rebounding margin (41.8-30.2) over their opponents this season. The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a University of Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

The Bench Factor: Dana Jackson's 15 points in the win over Santa Clara helped pace the Golden Gopher bench to a 29-4 advantage over the Broncos reserves last Thursday. Freshman Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi - Africa) scored six points, and senior Mario Green (Freeport, Bahamas) and sophomore Nate Tubbs (Fort Wayne, IN) chipped in four points apiece. Through six games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 147-67 margin.

New Kids On The Block: Kevin Lynch will make his 73rd start at the University of Minnesota on Thursday against Cincinnati, while the other four starters - senior Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) and junior Bob Martin (Apple Valley, MN), along with redshirt freshman Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) and true freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) - are in their very first season as members of the starting five.

Bond's Surgery Is Successful: Senior forward Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital. He suffered a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He has already begun the rehabilitation process. Following the surgery, he was expected to be sidelined from four to six weeks.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After registering two more home victories last week, they have now racked up an impressive 32-4 record within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena over the past two-plus seasons, including a perfect 5-0 mark this season.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris at home on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a home season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 15,334, attended the Dec. 1 Northern Illinois game. A crowd of 14,868 attended Saturday's Oregon State game bringing the five-game season total to 71,895 for an average of 14,379 a game.

Clem Haskins Show: The "Clem Haskins Show" will return for its second season on Midwest Sports Channel beginning on Monday, Dec. 17, at 7:00 p.m. Ted Robinson will once again host the program which will run for 16 weeks, predominantly on Monday evenings, culminating with the season finale on April 1 in conjunction with the NCAA Finals.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches will once again participate in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call will take place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) starting on Jan. 8 and continuing up until March 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. The actual order of appearance by the coaches will be announced at a later date.

GOLDEN GOPHER HOCKEY TEAM HEADS WEST TO PLAY IN GREAT WESTERN FREEZE-OUT

Great Western Freeze-Out: The Gophers take a break from WCHA action this week when they travel to Los Angeles, Calif., to participate in the Great Western Freeze-Out hockey tournament. The top-ranked Gophers, (14-1-3), will open up the tournament action with a 6:30 p.m. (CST) matchup against Boston College of the Hockey East conference. In the later game, defending tournament champion Michigan State takes on the University of Toronto with the winner of that game playing the winner of the B.C.-Minnesota game Friday night for the tournament championship.

The Great Western Freeze-Out is in its second year. The tournament is held at the Great Western Forum, home of the Los Angeles Kings hockey club and the Los Angeles Lakers basketball club. Janie Buss-Sulpice is the host contact for the tournament. Three of the tournament games will be televised by Sports Channel of America, (both of Thursday's games and the championship game on Friday).

The Series: The Gophers and Boston College Eagles have met 19 times over the years, with the Gophers holding a slight advantage with an 11-7-1 record in the series. The most recent confrontation between these two teams was last March when the Eagles eliminated the Gophers from the NCAA Tournament beating them 6-1 in the deciding game of a best-of-three series at the Conte Forum in Boston, Mass.

Scouting the Eagles: The Eagles are coached by Len Ceglarski who has been at B.C. for 18 years and holds a 388-216-24 record with the Eagles. In his 32 years of coaching Ceglarski has a 642-313-35 career record. The Eagles returned 18 lettermen from last season's squad that finished 28-13-1 and was knocked out of the NCAA Tournament by eventual NCAA Champions, the Wisconsin Badgers. The Eagles are led by senior captain David Emma, who has 27 points on the year with nine goals and 18 assists. Just behind Emma in the scoring charts is winger Stephen Heinze who has 12 goals and 11 assists in the Eagles 14 games this season. In the nets for Boston College are two players splitting time, senior Sandy Galuppo has posted a 5-1 record with a 3.60 GAA, while sophomore Scott LaGrand has a 5-3 record with a 3.55 GAA.

Woog vs. the Eagles: Head Coach Doug Woog has a 5-5-1 record against Boston College during his tenure at Minnesota. Woog, who has a 179-65-9 career coaching record at Minnesota, has led the Gophers to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and NCAA Final Four appearances in four of the last five years. The former Golden Gopher All-American center is in his sixth season at the helm of the Minnesota hockey program.

All-Americans on the Ice: Once again when the Gophers and Eagles take to the ice it will be a historic matchup because all of the players will be Americans. Boston College and Minnesota are two collegiate programs who list all Americans on their rosters. The Gophers on the other hand, not only list all American players, their entire roster is made up of student/athletes from the state of Minnesota. Boston College has two Minnesota players on their roster in freshman defenseman Mike Spalla from Wayzata, Minn., and sophomore defenseman Pat Schafhauser from Hill-Murray High School in St. Paul, Minn.

Olimb Takes Slim Lead in Gopher Scoring Chart: Junior center/defenseman Larry Olimb (Warroad, Minn.) holds a slim one point margin over freshman Craig Johnson (St. Paul, Minn.) in the scoring chart with 21 points on 10 goals and 11 assists. Not far behind those two are Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids, Minn.) with 19 points and Tom Pederson (Bloomington, Minn.) with 18 points. The Golden Gophers balanced offensive attack that has produced 89 goals so far this season boasts 12 players scoring in double figures at the half-way point of the season.

Klatt and Johnson Join U.S. National Junior Team: Sophomore wing Trent Klatt (Osseo, Minn.) and freshman Craig Johnson will join the U.S. National Junior Team for the IIHF World Junior Championships in Saskatchewan, Canada, December 26, 1990 through January 4, 1991. The two players, both from the top line, will miss the Great Western Freeze-Out and the WCHA series with Colorado College on December 29-30 at Mariucci Arena.

Stolp Leads the WCHA: Junior goaltender Jeff Stolp (Greenway, Minn.) is the leading goaltender in the WCHA this season. He has a 10-1-2 record with 34 goals against and a 2.71 GAA. Stolp has led the league since being named WCHA Player of the Week November 11, for his play against the UMD Bulldogs in Duluth. For his career Stolp has a 22-4-2 record and a 3.52 GAA.

No Radio Coverage of Tournament: Due to financial considerations there will be no live radio coverage of the Great Western Freeze-Out in the Twin Cities. WAYL-AM, the Gophers exclusive hockey broadcasters will not be with the team in Los Angeles.

Return to WCHA Action: The Golden Gophers return to WCHA action on December 29-30, when they host the Fighting Tigers of Colorado College in two matinee contests at 2:05 p.m. from Mariucci Arena. The Colorado College series will be the beginning of a five-game home stand for the Maroon and Gold. After the Colorado series the Gophers host the University of Denver on January 4-5, 1991 at 7:05 p.m., and St. Cloud State on Friday, January 11, 1991 at 7:05 p.m.

Recap of Alabama-Huntsville and Dynamo Riga Games: Last week the Gophers won a non-conference game against the University of Alabama-Huntsville 10-0 at Mariucci Arena on Wednesday night. The Gophers dominated all aspects of the game as they out-shot the Chargers 44-17, and had eight players with two or more points. Craig Johnson led all players with his first official hat trick, (Johnson had a hat trick against the Canadian Nationals but it does not count as an official stat). Trent Klatt also chipped in two goals for the Gophers.

Dynamo Riga: Last Saturday the Gophers played to a 4-4 tie with the Dynamo Riga team of the Soviet Elite League in an exhibition game at Mariucci Arena. The Gophers were led by Grant Bischoff who notched a goal and an assist, including the tying goal in the game. Bischoff who has been on a hot streak, was named WCHA Player of the Week on December 10 for his five-point effort against Wisconsin on December 9-10. The Riga game was an exciting matchup that had five powerplay goals, including three by the Gophers. Dynamo Riga had defeated St. Cloud State 7-2, and North Dakota 6-2, before playing the Gophers. They now travel to East Lansing, Mich., to play the Spartans before heading south to play against the USA Selects in Orlando, Fla., on December 18-19.

New Faces in the Lineup: In the past few games the Gophers have had some new faces in their lineup. Freshmen; Joe Dziedzic (Minneapolis, Minn.), Scott Bell (St. Paul, Minn.), Andy Mills (Minneapolis, Minn.) and Todd Westlund (Burnsville, Minn.) have all seen action recently. Dziedzic leads those players with two goals and two assists in as many games. With Trent Klatt and Craig Johnson gone with the U.S. National Junior Team for two weeks, you can bet the ice time these players get will increase.

Ticket Sales for WCHA and NCAA Final Four are Doing Well. Ticket sales for the WCHA Tournament and the NCAA Final Four Championship at the St. Paul Civic Center are doing very well. The advance ticket sales have always done well in the past and it appears to be the same this time around. The WCHA Tournament is on March 10-11 at the Civic Center. 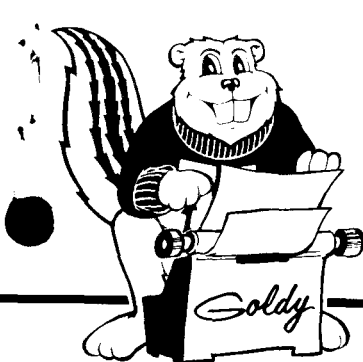

BASKETBALL TEAM TO HOST 19TH-RANKED VIRGINIA ON SATURDAY
