BUSY WEEK FOR GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM; BIG TEN OPENER AT WISCONSIN ON MONDAY

The Golden Gopher basketball team will be plenty in the next week when they play four games over an eight-day period. Head Coach Clem Haskins' club will close out its non-conference season at Youngstown State on Saturday at 6:30 p.m. (CST) and then open up the Big Ten season at Wisconsin at 8:30 p.m. on Monday in a nationally-televised game on ESPN. The Golden Gophers will then travel to Illinois on Thursday, January 10, for a 7:00 p.m. (CST) contest, before facing Iowa at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 12, in the Big Ten home opener at Williams Arena. After dropping a tough 79-72 decision to Virginia in front of 16,491 fans at home last Saturday, the Golden Gophers are now 6-3 on the season.

Lynch Joins 1,000 Point Club: All-America candidate Kevin Lynch scored 16 points on Saturday against Virginia to become the 24th player to join the University of Minnesota's coveted 1,000 point club. With 1,015 career points, he now ranks 21st overall on the all-time scoring chart, surpassing Larry Mikan (23rd, 1007), Dick Garmaker (22nd, 1,008) and Jim Brewer (21st, 1,009) in the Virginia game. The all-time school record holder with 91 three-pointers to his credit, he has never missed a game during his college career. He played in his 100th game as a Golden Gopher last Saturday and has a total of 75 starts to his credit.

GOLDEN GOPHERS PREPARE FOR WEEKEND SERIES WITH DENVER

The University of Minnesota Golden Gopher ice hockey team enters the new year with a 16-3-3 overall record, a one-point lead over Northern Michigan in the WCHA standings (13-2-3), and a third-place ranking in the national polls.

The Gophers first three games of the new year are within the friendly confines of Mariucci Arena. This weekend the Gophers host the Denver Pioneers in a two-game series on Friday and Saturday, January 4-5, at 7:00 p.m. Following the Denver series, the Gophers entertain St. Cloud State on Friday, January 11, at 7:00 p.m., in the first game of a home-and-home series that finds the Gophers traveling to St. Cloud the following night to complete the series.

That game will mark the start of a crucial string of five road games for Doug Woog's charges. The road trip begins with that St. Cloud State matchup, followed by a pair of two-game series scheduled for Michigan Tech on January 18-19, and Wisconsin on January 25-26. The final two games of that road trip has the Gophers back on the local and national television screens when both games of the Wisconsin series are televised by KITN-29 and the Saturday game is televised by Midwest Sports Channel and Prime Sports Network as the WCHA game of the week.

Coach J Robinson's Golden Gophers will host top-ranked Oklahoma State at 2 p.m. Sunday in Williams Arena in the 1991 University of Minnesota Wrestling Showcase. Tickets are available through the Golden Gopher ticket office in advance at discounted prices of \$4.00 for adults and \$2.50 for students. At the gate Sunday, those prices will be \$5.00 and \$3.00. Fans attending the Showcase will receive a free four-color "Minnesota Pride" wrestling poster, compliments of WCCO Radio. Marty Morgan (Sr. Bloomington, MN), will risk his perfect 18-0 record against the invading Cowboys at 177 pounds.

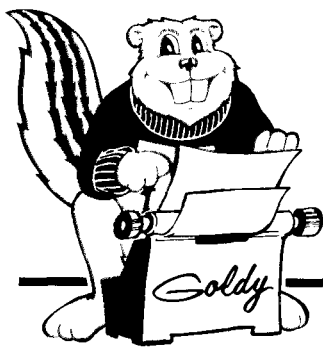

GOPHERS BASEBALL TEAM RANKED 26TH IN PRE-SEASON POLL SHORTSTOP BRENT GATES NAMED PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN

The University of Minnesota baseball team is ranked 26th in the nation in a pre-season poll released last Friday by Collegiate Baseball magazine. John Anderson's Gophers return seven starters from last year's squad which finished 36-24-1 and recorded a Big Ten record 16 straight conference victories on the way to a second-place finish and a spot in the conference tournament.

The top returner for Anderson is shortstop Brent Gates who was named pre-season All-American by Collegiate Baseball. The switch-hitting Gates set team records for at bats with 223, and base hits with 82, last season while posting a .368 batting average and garnering All-Big Ten second-team honors.

Gates has been an exciting addition to the Gophers since his arrival from Grandville, Mich. in 1989-90. He had an excellent freshman year for the Gophers when he hit .382 and knocked in 40 RBI's on the way to being named Freshman All-American by Baseball America. In addition, Gates has been a member of five different national teams including Team USA this past summer when he hit .373 for the team and helped them gain the Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games in Seattle, Wash.

The Golden Gophers will open the 1991 season against Florida State on February 22, in Tallahassee.

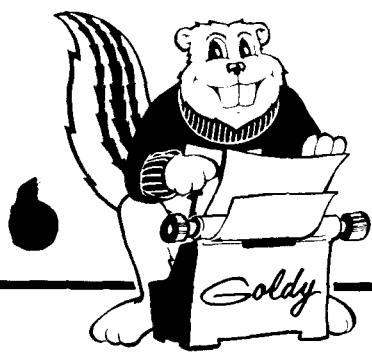

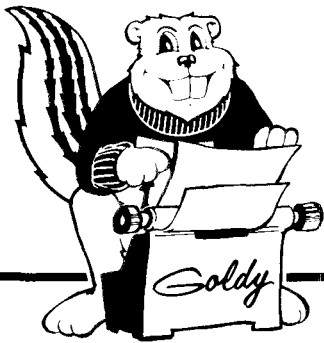

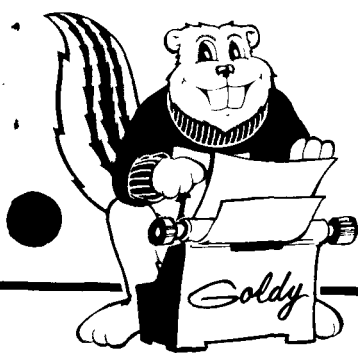

GOLDEN GOPHER BROADCAST SCHEDULE

Minnesota sports fans can prepare for a big week of Golden Gopher events on the airwaves beginning on Thursday when Clem Haskins' basketball team will take on the Fighting Illini from Champaign, Illinois in a game broadcast on WCCO-AM Radio and WCCO-TV channel 4. Saturday's Big Ten basketball contest at Williams Arena between the Iowa Hawkeyes and the Gophers will be broadcast on WCCO-AM Radio and MSC cable television. Hockey action this weekend has the Gophers hosting St. Cloud State Friday night and traveling to St. Cloud Saturday to conclude the series. Both games will be broadcast on "Z-Rock" KMZZ-AM Radio at the 980 mark on your AM dial. Friday night's game from Mariucci Arena will be broadcast by Prime Sports Network on cable TV.

GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM AT ILLINOIS ON THURSDAY; BIG TEN HOME OPENER AGAINST IOWA ON SATURDAY

The Golden Gopher basketball team (7-4, 0-1) will play at Illinois on Thursday night at 7:00 p.m. and the host Iowa at Williams Arena in the Big Ten home opener on Saturday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. The game against the Hawkeyes will put the finishing touches on a busy week in which Head Coach Clem Haskins' squad will have played four games over an eight-day period.

Big Week: The Golden Gophers will be looking for their first win against Illinois (11-4, 1-1) at Champaign since 1977-78. The two schools split the season series a year ago with each team winning at home. Behind 27 points from Melvin Newbern and 21 from Willie Burton the Golden Gophers took a 91-74 decision at Williams Arena in the 1990 Big Ten home opener on Jan. 6. The Illini won the rematch in Champaign in equally convincing fashion. Marcus Liberty scored 33 points and Kendall Gill added 26 as Head Coach Lou Henson's club rebounded with a 99-72 victory. Iowa (12-2, 1-1) comes into Williams Arena for the Big Ten home opener on Saturday on a roll. Head Coach Tom Davis' young squad, led by Acie Earl, has been the surprise of the early-season in the league. The Golden Gophers swept the season series in 1990, winning 84-72 at Williams Arena on Jan. 25 and then again 102-80 at Iowa City on Feb. 24.

Series Records: Illinois holds a 86-53 advantage in the all-time series against Minnesota, while the Golden Gophers have an 80-68 edge over Iowa.

Looking Back: The Golden Gophers fell 72-62 at Wisconsin in the Big Ten Opener for both teams on Monday night. The Badgers, who shot 26 of 43 from the charity stripe, were led by the inside tandem of Willie Simms (19) and Patrick Tompkins (15). **Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN)** once again paced the Golden Gophers, who were just 4 of 11 at the line, with 17 points. Coach Haskins' squad wrapped up the non-conference portion of their schedule with a 95-77 win at Youngstown State on Saturday night. Lynch scored 23 points and **Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL)** added 17 coming off the bench. The win snapped a three-game losing streak for the Golden Gophers.

Haskins in Big Ten Home Openers: In his fifth season at Minnesota, Head Coach Clem Haskins has recorded a 3-1 record in Big Ten home openers. During his first season in 1986-87, the Golden Gophers topped Wisconsin 69-67 at home. A 65-61 loss to Illinois in 1987-88 and an 80-78 victory over Iowa in 1988-89 followed, before the 91-74 victory over Illinois last year.

Lynch Joins 1,000 Point Club: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch scored 23 points on Saturday against Youngstown State and 17 on Monday against Wisconsin and now has a total of 1,055 career points. He ranks 21st overall on the all-time school scoring chart, after already surpassing Larry Mikan (24th, 1007), Dick Garmaker (23rd, 1,008) and Jim Brewer (22nd, 1,009) in the Dec. 29 Virginia game. Mark Hall and John Shasky are tied for 19th on the list at 1,072. The all-time school record holder with 95 three-pointers, he has never missed a game during his college career. He played in his 102nd game as a Golden Gopher on Monday and has a total of 77 starts to his credit. The Minnesota native was named Big Ten Player of the Week for Dec. 9-15 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting 5 assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Bond's Back: Saturday's Youngstown State game marked the return of Walter Bond to the Golden Gopher lineup. He scored 11 points and grabbed 7 rebounds in 34 minutes of action in the contest and then tallied 9 points and a team-high 9 rebounds in 35 minutes against Wisconsin. The senior forward underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital, after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in the season opener at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He had scored 10 points and hauled down 4 rebounds in 24 minutes of action prior to going down

with the injury. Recognized as one of the finest sixth men in the country a year ago, his return has undoubtedly provided a big boost to the Golden Gophers.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank at, or near, the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 65.1 points a game and in opponents field goal percentage at .413 (235-569). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 11 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 241-132 (21.9-12.0) margin and racked up an equally impressive 124-72 (11.3-6.5) advantage in rebounding.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers started two seniors, one junior and two freshmen against Youngstown State and Wisconsin. Kevin Lynch made his 77th start at the University of Minnesota against the Badgers, while Walter Bond made his 27th start in Gold Country. The other three starters are in their very first season as members of the starting five.

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 68-62 overall record at Minnesota, including a sterling 49-25 mark (.662) over the past three seasons. He has a 169-135 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: Under Coach Haskins, the Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After opening the season with five straight home victories prior to the setbacks to Cincinnati and Virginia, they have now racked up an impressive 32-6 record (.842) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena. In fact, the 72-64 loss to Cincinnati snapped a 17-game non-conference home winning streak for the Golden Gophers.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,491, attended the Dec. 29 Virginia game bringing the seven-game season total to 103,793 for an average of 14,828 a game.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their demanding 10-game non-conference schedule with a fine 7-3 overall record. Taking a closer look, they finished 2-2 against teams that qualified for post-season tournament action in 1990, defeating a pair of NCAA Tournament teams in Robert Morris and Oregon State, and falling to another in Virginia. They also came up short against Cincinnati which qualified for the NIT Tournament.

Clem Haskins Show: The "Clem Haskins Show" has returned for its second season on Midwest Sports Channel. Ted Robinson once again is hosting the program which will run for 16 weeks, predominantly on Monday evenings at 7:00 p.m., culminating with the season finale on April 1 in conjunction with the NCAA Finals.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches will once again participate in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call will take place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) starting on Tuesday, January 8 and continuing up until Mar. 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. Media wishing to access the teleconference can do so by calling (312) 399-1700. Clem Haskins will be available on the teleconference each week at 12:00 Noon.

Clem Haskins Media Luncheons Begin On Tuesday: A weekly luncheon/news conference with University of Minnesota Head Coach Clem Haskins will be held each Tuesday during the Big Ten season beginning at 12:00 Noon in the Gold Room, located on the east end of Williams Arena. The first of these luncheons is scheduled for Tuesday, January 8. Access to the weekly Big Ten Conference teleconference call will also be available to the assembled media.

Interview Policy: All requests for player or coach interviews, either in person or via phone, will be arranged by the University of Minnesota Sports Information Department. Please call the Sports Information Office at (612) 625-4090 to schedule interviews, and by allowing at least 24 hours prior notice for the interview, arrangements will be greatly facilitated.

In general, player interviews will be conducted prior to practice from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Gold Room at Williams Arena. If that is not a feasible time, we will attempt to arrange an alternative time and location to conduct the interview that suits both parties. Interviews done after practice will not conflict with meetings, training room treatments or other team obligations. Media should understand that practices are not officially concluded until such team obligations are completed. If the interview is to be conducted over the telephone, we will arrange to have the student-athlete call you at a specified time. NO telephone numbers of student-athletes will be made available under any circumstances and the student-athletes are not available to the media on game day until after the conclusion of the game.

GOPHERS SWEEP DENVER HOLD ONTO FIRST PLACE HOME AND HOME SERIES WITH ST. CLOUD STATE UP NEXT

The Golden Gopher ice hockey team prepares for a tough home and home series with St. Cloud State after taking a pair of games from Denver this past weekend. The Huskies are currently in fifth place in the WCHA with a 9-8-3 record and an 12-9-3 overall record. This past weekend the Huskies took a pair of games from Guelph University of Canada, 7-1, 10-0.

Huskies on a Roll: The Huskies, coached by first-year Head Coach Craig Dahl have been on a roll of late. Since December 1, 1990 they have posted an impressive 9-2 record, including six straight conference wins, until they lost in overtime to Denver on the 29th of January.

About the Huskies: The St. Cloud State Huskies have had solid success on their maiden voyage in the WCHA this season. A tough, disciplined team, they possess one of the top power play units in the conference. They hold a 6-3-2 conference record at home and an 8-3-2 overall record within the confines of the National Ice Hockey Center.

First Time Around: In the earlier meetings between these two teams this season, the Gophers gained a 3-3 tie in the season opener at St. Cloud and defeated the Huskies in a hard-fought battle at Mariucci Arena 5-4. The leader for the Gophers in those games was senior defenseman **Luke Johnson (Brooklyn Park, MN)** who tallied a goal and three assists in the two games. Senior **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids, MN)** also posted a goal and two assists in the series.

Gophers Hold Lead in WCHA: The Gophers maintained a one point lead over Northern Michigan in the WCHA conference standings with their sweep of Denver. Northern also had the broom out as they took two from Colorado College and maintained their sterling 13-0-1 home record. Wisconsin also won two from the visiting Bulldogs of UMD, slipping ahead of North Dakota in the standings.

Denver Recap: The Gophers took a pair of wins from the scrappy Pioneers by 5-2, and 4-3 margins. The Gophers out-shot the Pioneers 87-54 for the weekend, but couldn't find the twine as often as they would have liked. In Friday's game the Gophers broke the game open in the second period with two unanswered goals by All-American and Hobey Baker Award candidate **Grant Bischoff**. Both of his goals were set up by senior center **Jason Miller (Bloomington, MN)**.

Friday's Game on Prime Sports Network: Friday's game from Mariucci Arena will be broadcast by Prime Sports Network and available on cable television. Broadcasters for the game will be **Frank Mazzocco and Wally Shaver**.

Klatt and Johnson Return From U.S. Junior National Team: Sophomore **Trent Klatt (Osseo, MN)** and freshman **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN)** returned from the U.S. Junior National Team and may be available for the St. Cloud Series. Klatt was a standout for the team, scoring six goals and four assists, while Johnson had been off to a fast start with three assists in two games before going down with a shoulder injury sustained in practice. Klatt returned from Saskatchewan to play in Saturday's contest for the Gophers and knocked in the tying goal in the Gophers come-from-behind victory.

McAlpine and Muller Return from Suspensions: Freshman **Mike Muller (Plymouth, MN)** and **Chris McAlpine (Roseville, MN)** will be available for this weekend's series with St. Cloud State after sitting out games for fighting. Muller missed Friday's game with Denver and McAlpine sat out both games of the Denver series because it was his second fighting disqualification of the season. The NCAA rule states that the disqualification penalty is a progressive one so a player will sit out two games for his second disqualification infraction and three for his third and so on.

Crucial Road Swing begins With St. Cloud State: This Saturday's game at St. Cloud State is the beginning of a crucial five-game road swing for the Golden Gophers that will take them to St. Cloud, Michigan Tech (Jan. 18-19), and Wisconsin (Jan. 25-26) before returning to Mariucci Arena for a two-game series with the UMD Bulldogs.

health of **Brad Gibson (So., Chokio, MN)**. Gibson injured a knee in practice last week, and his availability remains in question.

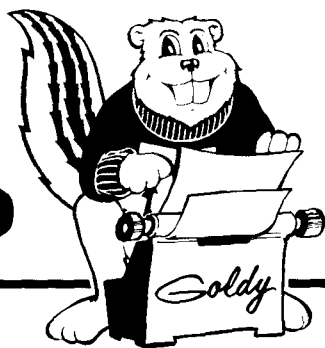

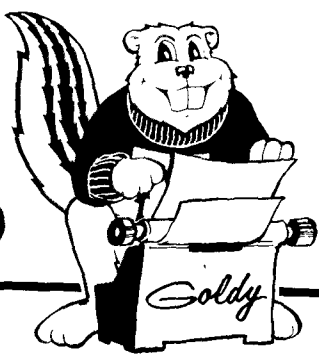

GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM UPENDS NO. 22 IOWA; HOST PURDUE ON THURSDAY AND PLAY AT MICHIGAN STATE ON SATURDAY

Home Sweet Home: Behind a total team effort, the Golden Gopher basketball team (8-5, 1-2 Big Ten) rallied for a thrilling 79-77 victory over No. 22 Iowa before 16,555 fans at Williams Arena last Saturday. Senior Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN) tied his career high with 26 points in the contest. He nailed six three-pointers to also tie the single-game school record set by Tim Hanson against Michigan State on Feb. 28, 1987. Seniors Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) and Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) both scored 17 points apiece in the game, with Metcalf's total being a new career high. Sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL), starting his first game of the season with freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) forced to the sidelines with a hip pointer, made the most of his opportunity. He grabbed a team high eight rebounds and scored 10 points, including the game-winner with 1.3 seconds left. The Hawks, led by 24 points from Val Barnes, led 43-31 at the intermission and had a lead as big as 16 points in the first half. The Golden Gophers had played three straight games, and four of their last five, on the road prior to Saturday's encounter with the Hawks.

Big Week: The Golden Gophers will entertain the Purdue Boilermakers on Thursday night at Williams Arena. Tip-off is at 7:00 p.m. Head Coach Gene Keady's club raised their record to 10-3 overall and 2-1 in the Big Ten with an 86-69 victory over Michigan in West Lafayette on Saturday. Jimmy Oliver stole the show, scoring a career high 35 points in the victory. He leads the team in scoring (18.8) heading into Monday night's home game against Indiana. Following Thursday's game, the Golden Gophers will travel to East Lansing, MI, to face the defending Big Ten champion Michigan State Spartans at 12:00 Noon (CST) on Saturday. Steve Smith tallied 23 points to lead the Spartans to a 66-59 win at home over Northwestern last Saturday and up his league-leading scoring average to 27.2 on the season. Michigan State (10-4, 3-1) will play at Illinois on Thursday night.

Tough One: Playing their second straight road game in the Big Ten and third straight overall, the Golden Gophers dropped a heartbreaking 67-66 decision to Illinois at Champaign last Thursday. Minnesota led the Fighting Illini by 10 at the half (36-26), but were undone in the closing stanza by fouls. For the game, Illinois made 28 of 41 free throws, while the Golden Gophers were limited to just eight of 16 from the charity stripe. With under a minute left in the game, Walter Bond, who led Minnesota in scoring with 18 points, hit the first of two free throws to put the Golden Gophers up by two 66-64. Rennie Clemons then took a pass from Andy Kaufmann and hit an off-balance jumper while being fouled in the process to tie the game with 3.2 seconds remaining. He calmly drilled the ensuing free throw to give the Fighting Illini the victory. Kevin Lynch scored 16 points and also added team-highs of eight rebounds and five assists in the game.

Series Records: Purdue holds a 71-62 edge in the all-time series with Minnesota, while the Golden Gophers lead 45-32 in the all-time series with Michigan State.

Do You Remember?: Last year, when Minnesota swept both games of the season's series with Iowa, it was the first time the Golden Gophers had done so since the 1981-82 season when Minnesota finished with a 23-6 overall record and won the Big Ten title with a 14-4 league mark. That year, the Golden Gophers took the Hawkeyes by scores of 61-56 in Minneapolis, and a 57-55 three overtime classic in Iowa City. Minnesota and Iowa will meet for the rematch in Iowa City at 8:30 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 14.

Lynch Joins the 1,000 Point Club: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch tied his career high with 26 points (Marquette, Dec. 17, 1988) against Iowa and now has a total of 1,097 career points to rank 17th on the all-time school chart. In the Iowa game he leapfrogged past Mark Hall and John Shasky (20th, 1,072), George Kline (19th, 1,089) and Eric Magdanz (18th, 1,092). The all-time school record holder with 103 three-pointers to his credit, he tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 104 games with 79 starts as a Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native was named Big Ten Player of the Week on

Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Bond's Back: The Golden Gophers' January 5 contest against Youngstown State marked the return of Walter Bond to the Golden Gopher lineup. He scored 11 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 34 minutes of action in the contest, and then tallied nine points and a team-high nine rebounds in 35 minutes against Wisconsin. He then led the team in scoring with 18 points against the Fighting Illini last Thursday night and came back with 17 points and six assists in 37 minutes against Iowa. The senior forward underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital, after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in the season opener at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He had scored 10 points and hauled down 4 rebounds in 24 minutes of action prior to going down with the injury. Recognized as one of the finest sixth men in the country a year ago, his return has undoubtedly provided a big boost to the Golden Gophers.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank at, or near, the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 66.2 points a game, and in opponents field goal percentage at .416 (278-668). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: The Golden Gophers are 6-1 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less this season, with the lone setback being the 67-66 heartbreaker to Illinois in the closing seconds last Thursday. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-4 record on the season.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 13 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 287-148 (22.1-11.4) margin and racked up an equally impressive 139-86 (10.7-6.6) advantage in rebounding.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers started two seniors and three freshmen against Iowa on Saturday, with Kevin Lynch making his 79th start at the University of Minnesota and Walter Bond his 29th career start in Gold Country. Dana Jackson was in the starting lineup for the first time against Iowa, while Ernest Nzigamasabo (Bujumbura, Burundi, Africa) made his very first start on Thursday against Illinois.

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 69-63 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 50-26 mark (.659) over the past three seasons. He has a 170-136 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: Under Coach Haskins, the Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After opening the season with five straight home victories prior to the setbacks to Cincinnati and Virginia, they have now racked up an impressive 33-6 record (.846) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena following Saturday's win over Iowa. In fact, the 72-64 loss to Cincinnati snapped a 17-game non-conference home winning streak for the Golden Gophers.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,555, attended last Saturday's Iowa game bringing the eight-game season total to 120,348 for an average of 15,044 a game.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their demanding 10-game non-conference schedule with a fine 7-3 overall record. Taking a closer look, they finished 2-2 against teams that qualified for post-season tournament action in 1990, defeating a pair of NCAA Tournament teams in Robert Morris and Oregon State, and falling to another in Virginia. They also came up short against Cincinnati which qualified for the NIT.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches are once again participating in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call takes place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) and continues up until March 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. Media wishing to access the teleconference can do so by calling (312) 399-1700. Clem Haskins will be available on the teleconference each week at 12:00 Noon.

Clem Haskins Media Luncheons: A weekly luncheon/news conference with University of Minnesota Head Coach Clem Haskins will be held each Tuesday during the Big Ten season beginning at 12:00 Noon in the Gold Room, located on the east end of Williams Arena. Access to the weekly Big Ten Conference teleconference call will also be available to the assembled media.

Interview Policy: All requests for player or coach interviews, either in person or via phone, will be arranged by the University of Minnesota Sports Information Department. Please call the Sports Information Office at (612) 625-4090 to schedule interviews, and by allowing at least 24 hours prior notice for the interview, arrangements will be greatly facilitated.

In general, player interviews will be conducted prior to practice from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Gold Room at Williams Arena. If that is not a feasible time, we will attempt to arrange an alternative time and location to conduct the interview that suits both parties. Interviews done after practice will not conflict with meetings, training room treatments or other team obligations. Media should understand that practices are not officially concluded until such team obligations are completed. If the interview is to be conducted over the telephone, we will arrange to have the student-athlete call you at a specified time. NO telephone numbers of student-athletes will be made available under any circumstances and the student-athletes are not available to the media on game day until after the conclusion of the game. The first half-hour (usually 3:30 to 4:00 p.m.) of practice each Tuesday will be open to the media. Any action photos/video should be taken at that time. All other practice sessions will be closed.

Doug Woog's Golden Gopher hockey team posted two wins against the fifth-place St. Cloud State Huskies last weekend to retain control of first-place in the WCHA and hold on to their number three national ranking while improving their overall record to 20-3-3 (17-2-3 in the conference).

The Gophers remain two points ahead of Northern Michigan University in the WCHA standings with 10 conference games remaining. This weekend the Gophers will travel to Houghton, MI to take on the Michigan Tech Huskies in a two-game series on Friday and Saturday nights. The two games are the start of a four-game road swing that also has the Gophers traveling to Madison, WI to take on the Badgers on January 25-26.

Gophers vs. Michigan Tech: The Gophers hold a 118-66-7 edge over Michigan Tech in the overall series record. Doug Woog has posted a sparkling 19-3-1 record against the Huskies during his tenure as head coach. In games at Houghton Woog has tallied a 7-1 record. In the two games earlier this season against Michigan Tech at Mariucci Arena the Gophers posted 7-2 and 2-0 victories on the strength of **Ben Hankinson (Edina, MN)**, **Jason Miller (Bloomington, MN)**, and **Trent Klatt's (Osseo, MN)** three-point weekends against the Huskies.

Flashback to St. Cloud State: The Gophers offense was humming this past weekend when they knocked in 14 goals in the two games. That broke the previous high tally for a two-game series that was set when the Gophers scored 13 times against Wisconsin in gaining a win and a tie at Mariucci Arena in December of this past year.

Stolp Picks up Two More Wins: Junior goalie **Jeff Stolp (Greenway, MN)** picked up both victories in the series holding the Huskies to four goals in two games while making 48 saves in the two games. Stolp still leads the WCHA in conference games and has upped his career record to 26-6-2, with an outstanding 13-2-2 record this year with a 2.65 GAA and a .898 save percentage.

Olimb Increasing Lead in Gopher Scoring: Junior All-American and Hobey Baker Award candidate **Larry Olimb (Warroad, MN)** increased his lead in the Gopher scoring chart with a five point weekend. Olimb now has 15 goals and 21 assists to lead the Gophers in both of those categories. Olimb has now moved up to fourth in WCHA scoring for all games. He is followed in the Gopher scoring chart by another post-season honors candidate, **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids, MN)** who has 13 goals, and 16 assists for 29 points.

McAlpine Returns with a Flash: Freshman defenseman **Chris McAlpine (Roseville, MN)** came back from a two-game suspension for fighting to tally two big goals against St. Cloud State, while playing strong defense in the Gopher zone. His goal at St. Cloud on Saturday night was crucial in that it answered the Huskies' three first-period goals 13 seconds before the end of the period. That goal was the first of a seven goal attack that left the Huskies reeling.

Injury update: In Saturday night's contest at St. Cloud the Gophers sustained injuries to key players. Alternate captain Grant Bischoff took a shot to the head for the second time in as many trips to the National Hockey Center. Bischoff left the game for x-rays but returned in the third period and scored a goal and had an assisted on another. He will be evaluated this week but is expected back for the Michigan Tech series.

Freshman center **Craig Johnson (St. Paul, MN)** re-aggravated the shoulder separation that he sustained with the U.S. Junior National team and his status for the upcoming series is questionable. Defenseman **Tom Pederson (Bloomington, MN)** sustained an injury to his left knee on a check and is going to be examined early this week to determine the extent of the injury. As of right now his status is questionable for the Michigan Tech series.

Bulldogs Up Next at Mariucci Arena: The Gophers next home series is against the UMD Bulldogs on February 1-2, with game times slated for 7:05 p.m. both nights.

U OF M WRESTLERS OPEN BIG TEN SEASON

Coach J Robinson's University of Minnesota wrestling team moves into the Big Ten season in rapid order this week when entertaining Wisconsin on Wednesday in Williams Arena at 8:00 p.m. and then journeying to Northwestern to take on the Wildcats at 2:00 p.m. Saturday.

The Golden Gophers came into this week's action with a dual-meet record of 7-1 after edging Missouri 20-18 in non-conference action at Minnesota last Saturday.

Trailing 15-8 in that competition, Robinson's contingent rallied to gain the win, Minnesota's seventh straight dual-meet triumph of the season, on the strength of two falls at 177 and 190 from **Marty Morgan (Sr., Bloomington, MN)** and **Brad Gibson (So., Chokio, MN)**.

Morgan got his pin at 1:15 and upped his unbeaten string to 20 in the process. He has eight falls on the year. Gibson's fall was his second of the current campaign and came at the 5:24 mark.

But all of that was non-conference. Now, Robinson knows, the stakes are even higher, and the opener against Wisconsin will pit his charges against one of the nation's top-ranked contingents.

No radical changes are expected in Minnesota's lineup, either for Wisconsin, Wednesday, or Northwestern, Saturday, but a couple of "ifs" still remain.

Ben Morris (Jr., Wooddale, IL) is expected to get the call at 118 pounds, and **Scott Rohrer (Sr., Waupun, WI)** probably will go at 126. At 134 **Shannon Ward (Jr., Irving, TX)** got the call against Missouri, but if **Dave Zuniga (Sr., Worland, WY)** is ready, he may move into the lineup.

Damon Johnson (Fr., Mustang, OK) is set at 142 as is **Willy Short (So., Inver Grove Heights, MN)** at 150. **Cliff Casteel (Fr., Montrose Hill, MI)** again is expected to get the nod at 158 and the same holds true for **Mike Marzetta (So., Liberty Lake, WI)** at 167. Morgan will attempt to keep his string going at 177 and Gibson will get the 190 assignment.

But at heavyweight, Coach Robinson has another "if" situation. **Eric Betterman (Fr., Prior Lake, MN)** worked against Missouri, but if **Chris Stogdill (Jr., Charles City, IA)** has recovered from a knee injury, he could return to Minnesota's lineup.

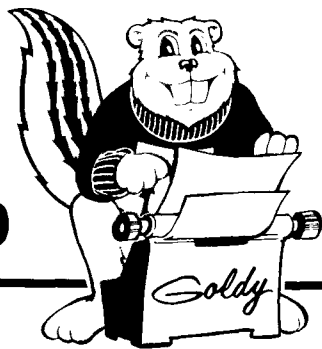

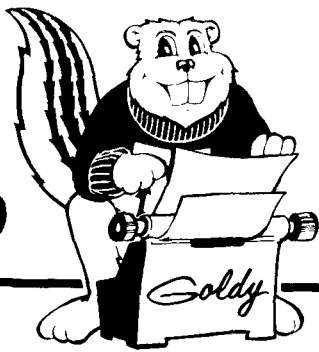

Both the Friday night and Saturday night games will be broadcast by KITN-TV FOX- 29 beginning at 7:00 p.m. KMZZ-Radio Z-Rock at 980 on the AM dial will also be carrying the series.

GOLDEN GOPHERS HOST UNBEATEN OHIO STATE ON THURSDAY, TRAVEL TO NORTHWESTERN ON SATURDAY; SPLIT TWO GAMES LAST WEEK

Powerful Ohio State: After taking an impressive 93-85 decision at Indiana in Monday night's showdown for the Big Ten lead, No. 4 Ohio State will come into Thursday night's confrontation at Williams Arena against the Golden Gophers with a perfect 16-0 overall record, 6-0 in the league. Head Coach Randy Ayers returned all five starters and all 12 players from last year's team that finished 17-13 and gave eventual national champion UNLV a real dogfight before falling 76-65 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The powerful Buckeyes lead the Big Ten in a number of categories, including scoring (93.6) and scoring margin (28.5). Registering more than 100 points in their first four games and in six of their first seven, the Buckeyes have been impressive to say the least this season. Headlining the returnees is 6-6 sophomore forward Jim Jackson. Honored as the Big Ten Freshman of the Year last season, he is once again one of the league's premiere players. Senior 6-8 center Perry Carter is one of the finest inside players in the conference, while junior 6-1 guard Mark Baker is one of the league's best playmakers. A trio of juniors, 6-4 guard Jamaal Brown, 6-7 forward Chris Jent, and 7-0 center Bill Robinson also return, along with 6-8 senior Treg Lee. Tip-off is at 7:00 p.m. The game will be broadcast on WCCO Channel 4 and the Midwest Sports Channel, along with WCCO-AM 830.

Northwestern On Saturday: The Golden Gophers will travel to Evanston, IL, to take on the Northwestern Wildcats on Saturday. The game, to be broadcast on Midwest Sports Channel and WCCO-AM 830, will begin at 7:00 p.m. The Wildcats fell to 5-10 overall, 0-5 in the Big Ten, after dropping an 84-79 decision to Northeastern in Boston last Saturday. Sophomore 6-5 guard Todd Leslie, who leads the team in scoring (16.6), paced Head Coach Bill Foster's club with 22 points in the contest. Freshman 6-11 center Kevin Rankin leads the squad with an average of 7.4 rebounds a game. Prior to the Minnesota game, the Wildcats will host Wisconsin on Thursday.

Series Records: Ohio State holds a 62-41 edge in the all-time series with Minnesota, while the Golden Gophers lead 70-50 in the series with Northwestern. The Golden Gophers won 83-78 at Williams Arena on Jan. 20 last season but the Buckeyes took the rematch in Columbus 93-83 on March 10. Head Coach Clem Haskins' squad swept the season series with Northwestern a year ago, winning 97-75 at Williams Arena on Jan. 18, and then taking a 90-72 decision in Evanston on Feb. 17.

Golden Gophers Split Last Week: Freshman Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) scored a team-high 12 points to lead the Golden Gophers to a 59-56 victory before 15,058 fans at Williams Arena last Thursday. Sophomore Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL), with 10 points and seven rebounds, and senior Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI), with six points and seven rebounds off the bench, also played key roles in the win over the Boilermakers who were led by center Craig Riley's game-high 19 points. Michigan State senior Steve Smith was simply too much for the Golden Gophers to handle as the Spartans, behind 33 points from their superstar, cruised to a 73-64 win in East Lansing on Saturday. McDonald scored a career-high 25 points for the Golden Gophers. Freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) also turned in a solid game. He registered 10 points in 25 minutes of action off the bench.

McDonald Leads The Way: Arriel McDonald turned in a pair of fine games last week, and showed just a glimpse of what lies ahead in the future for Golden Gopher fans. He keyed the victory over Purdue last Thursday by scoring 10 points in the final 2:02 of the game, finishing with a team-high 12 points in the contest. He nailed six free throws without a miss in the final 56 seconds to preserve the victory. He came back on Saturday in the loss at Michigan State with a career-high 25 points on 10 of 16 shooting from the field, including five of nine from three-point range.

Lynch 16th On All-Time Scoring List: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch was held to just 11 points on Saturday against Michigan State. He scored just eight points against Purdue on Thursday, the first time he has not hit double figures this season. With 1,116 career points, he now ranks 16th on the all-time school chart. In the Iowa game on Jan. 12, he leap-frogged past Mark Hall and John Shasky (20th, 1,072), George Kline (19th, 1,089) and Eric Magdanz (18th, 1,092), after

equalling his career-high with 26 points against the Hawkeyes. He then surpassed Osborne Lockhart, who scored 1,106 career points, with his driving layup with 5:34 remaining in the first half against Michigan State on Saturday. The all-time school record holder with 103 three-pointers to his credit, he also tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 106 games with 81 starts as a Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Bond's Back: Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) returned to the Golden Gophers lineup for the January 5 contest against Youngstown State and proceeded to score 11 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 34 minutes of action to help the team put an end to a three-game skid with a 95-77 victory. Since his return, he has averaged 12.0 points and 5.2 rebounds for the Golden Gophers in six games and the team has recorded a 3-3 record during that time. His season-high is an 18-point effort in the 67-66 loss at Illinois on Jan. 10. The senior forward underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital, after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in the season opener at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He had scored 10 points and hauled down 4 rebounds in 24 minutes of action prior to going down with the injury. Recognized as one of the finest sixth men in the country a year ago, his return has undoubtedly provided a big boost to the Golden Gophers.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank at, or near, the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 65.9 points a game, in opponents field goal percentage at .416 (319-766) and in turnover margin at 2.8 (15.9-13.1). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: The Golden Gophers are 7-1 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less this season, with the lone setback being the 67-66 heartbreaker at Illinois in the closing seconds. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-5 record on the season.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 15 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 317-159 (21.1-10.6) margin and racked up an equally impressive 159-93 (10.6-6.2) advantage in rebounding.

Home Sweet Home: Four of the Golden Gophers' next five games will be at Williams Arena. Following Saturday's game at Northwestern, the Golden Gophers will return home to face Michigan on Jan. 31 at 7:00 p.m, Indiana on Feb. 3 at 3:00 p.m. and then Illinois on Feb. 10 at 3:00 p.m.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers started two seniors, one sophomore and two freshmen against Michigan State on Thursday, with Kevin Lynch making his 81st start at the University of Minnesota and Walter Bond his 31st career start in Gold Country. .

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs

through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 70-64 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 51-27 mark (.654) over the past three seasons. He has a 171-137 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: Under Coach Haskins, the Golden Gophers have become nearly invincible at home. After opening the season with five straight home victories prior to the setbacks to Cincinnati and Virginia, they have now racked up an impressive 34-6 record (.850) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena following back-to-back wins over Iowa and Purdue.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,555, attended last Saturday's Iowa game. A total of 15,058 fans attended Thursday's Purdue game, bringing the nine-game season total to 135,406 for an average of 15,045 a game.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their demanding 10-game non-conference schedule with a fine 7-3 overall record. Taking a closer look, they finished 2-2 against teams that qualified for post-season tournament action in 1990, defeating a pair of NCAA Tournament teams in Robert Morris and Oregon State, and falling to another in Virginia. They also came up short against Cincinnati which qualified for the NIT.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches are once again participating in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call takes place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) and continues up until March 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. Clem Haskins will be available on the teleconference each week at 12:00 Noon. For more information, contact the Big Ten Conference office or any Big Ten sports information office.

Clem Haskins Media Luncheons: A weekly luncheon/news conference with University of Minnesota Head Coach Clem Haskins will be held each Tuesday during the Big Ten season beginning at 12:00 Noon in the Gold Room, located on the east end of Williams Arena. Access to the weekly Big Ten Conference teleconference call will also be available to the assembled media.

Interview Policy: All requests for player or coach interviews, either in person or via phone, will be arranged by the University of Minnesota Sports Information Department. Media should understand that practices are not officially concluded until such team obligations are completed. If the interview is to be conducted over the telephone, we will arrange to have the student-athlete call you at a specified time. NO telephone numbers of student-athletes will be made available under any circumstances and the student-athletes are not available to the media on game day until after the conclusion of the game. The first half-hour (usually 3:30 to 4:00 p.m.) of practice each Tuesday will be open to the media. Any action photos/video should be taken at that time. All other practice sessions will be closed.

GOPHERS SPLIT WITH MICHIGAN TECH; TIED WITH NORTHERN MICHIGAN FOR FIRST-PLACE IN WCHA; WISCONSIN UP NEXT

The third-ranked Golden Gopher hockey team split a pair of games against Michigan Tech at Houghton, MI this past weekend to fall into a first-place tie in the WCHA standings with Northern Michigan. The Gophers will travel to Madison, WI this weekend to play the defending National Champion Badgers in a two-game series at the Dane County Coliseum.

Gophers vs. Badgers: The Minnesota /Wisconsin hockey series is one of the most storied in collegiate hockey. These two teams have a total of eight national titles between the two of them with the Badgers holding five including the 1990 championship. The teams also have 10 WCHA titles between them with the Gophers holding the edge in that category with eight. In short, these two schools represent the best in college hockey today.

The Series: There have been a total of 152 meetings between Minnesota and Wisconsin in ice hockey. The first game of the series was in 1926 in Madison when the Gophers and Badgers played to two ties (0-0, 1-1). Since that time, the Gophers have established an 86-57-9 record in the series, including a 9-4 victory and a 4-4 overtime tie this past December 8-9.

Overtime: The Gophers and Badgers have played in a remarkable 21 games that have resulted in overtime periods since the 1964-65 season. In those games the Gophers hold an 11-4-6 edge. Head Coach Doug Woog holds a 21-9-1 record against the Badgers during his coaching career with the Gophers. Woog also recorded a 3-1 career record against Wisconsin as a player.

Tech Recap: The Gophers rebounded from an opening night 5-2 loss to Michigan Tech by defeating the Huskies 6-2 last Saturday night. In the opening night loss the Gophers outshot the Huskies 46-22, but couldn't find the twine often enough against Tech goalie Geoff Sargeant. One bright spot for the Gophers in the series was the continued hot streak of senior **Ken Gernander** (Greenway, MN) who has scored 11 points in his last four games. Gernander, the Gophers top returning goal scorer from last year who started the season slow now has 10 goals and 14 assists for the year.

Olimb Continues to Shine: All-American and Hobey Baker award candidate **Larry Olimb** (Warroad, MN) continued to shine for the Gophers this past weekend when he posted a goal and an assist putting him at the top of the Gophers scoring charts with 16 goals and 22 assists. Olimb is now fifth in WCHA scoring and is tied for the league lead in game-winning goals with five.

Gophers Climb in WCHA Scoring: In addition to Olimb being fifth in league scoring, All-American and Hobey Baker Award candidates **Ben Hankinson** (Edina, MN), and **Grant Bischoff** (Grand Rapids, MN) have climbed in the WCHA charts. Bischoff is 11th in WCHA games with 14 goals and 13 assists while Hankinson now is 18th with 11 goals and 12 assists. In addition, Ken Gernander's recent surge has put him in a tie with Hankinson at the number 18 spot with 10 goals and 13 assists.

Broadcast Schedule: This weekend's games from Madison will be televised on KITN-FOX 29 with Wally Shaver and Frank Mazzocco bringing you all of the action in the games which are slated to start at 7:05 p.m. on Friday and 7:30 p.m. on Saturday night. Both games will also be brought to Gopher fans on KMZZ Z-ROCK Radio at 980 on your AM dial with Doug McLeod calling all of the action.

WCHA First Round Playoff Tickets Go On Sale: The Golden Gopher ticket office will begin selling the WCHA first-round playoff tickets for the games at Mariucci Arena on March 1-3, 1991. Although the Gophers opponent has not been determined, the Gophers 39 points has assured them of hosting the first-round WCHA action.

Skate With the Gophers: The Golden Gophers will host their annual Skate With the Gophers program which allows area youths and hockey fans to come to Mariucci Arena and meet the players and get autographs while joining them on the ice. The event is scheduled for Sunday, February 17, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. There is no charge for admission and KITN FOX-29 is co-sponsoring the event. It also marks the first time that the two teams have competed in dual competition since 1977. Juniors **Del Cerney (Staples, MN)** and **Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, MN)** continue to lead the Golden Gophers, each capturing an individual event as well as being a member of a winning relay team. Cerney captured the 50 freestyle with a time of :21.06 and Quackenbush also won easily in the 200 butterfly with a time of 1:50.33. The 400 medley relay team continued its winning ways, as they touched first with a time of 3:27.15. The team consists of Cerney, Quackenbush, freshman **Andy Kurtz (Coon Rapids, MN)**, and sophomore **Steve Busse (Cincinnati, OH)**. Senior divers **Omar Boyd (Los Angeles, CA)** and **Scott Upper (Pompano Beach, FL)** dominated in the diving events, as they each placed first in the one and three meter events respectively. Boyd won the one meter diving with 182.75 points and Upper, the three meter diving with 211.45 points. The Golden Gophers are now 5-2 in dual meet competition.

DALER BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD AT NORTHWEST OPEN

Sophomore **Justin Daler (Toledo, OH)** set a new school record in the pole vault with a winning mark of 16-9 1/4 to lead the Golden Gopher track & field team as they officially opened the 1991 indoor season at the Northwest Open held last Saturday at the University of Minnesota Field House.

Hello Again: Picking up right where he left off last season, Daler's vault topped the previous school indoor record of 16-5 set by Glen Bullick in 1975. Sixth at the Big Ten Indoor Championships as a freshman last season, he set the school outdoor record as a rookie a year ago with a vault of 16-7. Prior to Saturday, his previous indoor best had been 16-4.

Looking Good: The Golden Gophers had three other winners in the competition to go along with a number of outstanding performances. Junior co-captain **Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada)** won the 3,000 meters with a fine early-season clocking of 8:31.3. Sophomore **Chad Goldstein (St. Louis Park, MN)** and freshman **Chris Brinkworth (Bloomington, MN)** finished 1-2 in the shot put with throws of 54-10 3/4 and 52-9 1/4 respectively. Juniors **Kirk Dyer (San Jose, CA)** and **Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria)** showed that the Golden Gophers will be strong this season in the sprint events. Dyer, a transfer from Arizona where he was a 1989 All-American for the Wildcats, won the 55 meter final in 6.3 (manual) after going 6.46 (electronic) in the heats. He then came back to finish in a dead heat with Willy Wood in the 200 meters in 22.4 (manual). Arinze, the mainstay of the Golden Gophers sprint corps last season, placed third in both the 55 final in 6.4 (manual) after running 6.57 (electronic) in the heats, and in the 200 in 22.7 (manual). 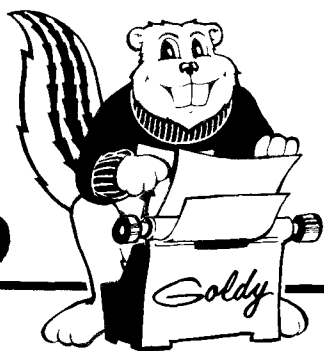

TWO GOLDEN GOPHER MEN'S TEAMS RANKED IN THE TOP TWENTY

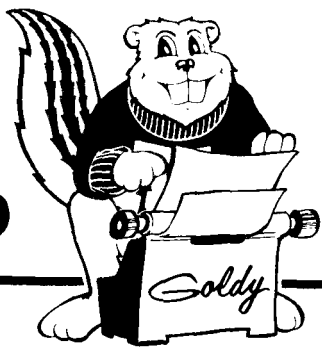

CARTER LEADS GOLDEN GOPHERS OVER NORTHWESTERN; TEAM BEGINS THREE GAME HOMESTAND ON THURSDAY AGAINST MICHIGAN

Carter Shines: Freshman **Randy Carter** (Memphis, TN) scored 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds, both career highs, to pace the Golden Gophers (10-7, 3-4 Big Ten) to an 85-68 victory at Northwestern last Saturday. Carter shot 13 of 18 from the field and seven of his 15 rebounds were on the offensive end of the floor. Seniors **Kevin Lynch** (Bloomington, MN) and **Walter Bond** (Chicago, IL) also scored in double figures with 18 and 16 points respectively.

Powerful Ohio State: Kevin Lynch scored a career-high 27 points, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out five assists, but it wasn't enough as undefeated Ohio State (17-0, 7-0 Big Ten) scored an 80-70 victory over the Golden Gophers last Thursday before 15,661 fans at Williams Arena. Walter Bond and Randy Carter joined Lynch in double figures with 11 and 10 points respectively. Jamaal Brown led the Buckeyes, who simply had too much firepower and physical strength inside for the Golden Gophers to contend with over 40 minutes, with 17 points.

Home Sweet Home: Head Coach Clem Haskins' Golden Gophers will now head into an important stretch of the season when they play three straight games at Williams Arena. They will face Michigan on Thursday at 7:00 p.m., Indiana on Sunday at 3:00 p.m., and then Illinois on Sunday, Feb. 10 at 3:00 p.m. The contests with Michigan and Indiana will be televised on both WCCO Channel 4 and Midwest Sports Channel, while the Illinois game will be broadcast by ABC. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio station for Golden Gopher basketball.

The Scouting Report: Michigan fell 72-67 to Illinois at Ann Arbor last Saturday and will come into Thursday's game with a 9-9 overall record, 2-6 in the Big Ten. Senior guard Demetrius Calip, one of the Big Ten's leading scorers at 19.7 points a game, tallied 25 points in the loss to the Illini. Sophomores Michael Talley (11.1 ppg) and Eric Riley (10.8 ppg, 8.2 rpg) chipped in 15 and 10 points respectively. Junior Kirk Taylor (11.9 ppg, 4.9 rpg), who has come back strong after missing the entire 1989-90 season with a knee injury, was held to just two points in the contest. Behind a balanced scoring attack, Indiana scored an impressive 97-63 homecourt victory over defending Big Ten champion Michigan State last Saturday. Freshman Damon Bailey (10.6 ppg, 2.9 rpg, 3.4 apg) led the way with 19 points. Sophomore Calbert Cheaney (21.9 ppg, 5.0 rpg) scored 17 points, sophomore Greg Graham (10.6 ppg, 2.5 rpg) tossed in 16, and junior Eric Anderson (13.4 ppg, 7.4 rpg) and sophomore Pat Graham (7.1 ppg) registered 11 apiece as a total of 11 Hoosiers figured into the scoring column in the game. The Hoosiers, 18-2 overall and 6-1 in the Big Ten, will host Wisconsin on Wednesday night.

Series Records: Michigan holds a 60-49 edge in the all-time series with Minnesota. The Wolverines swept the season series last year, winning 87-73 in Ann Arbor and then 77-73 at Williams Arena. Indiana leads the all-time series by a 75-47 margin, but the Golden Gophers swept the Hoosiers last season, winning 108-89 at Williams Arena and then 75-70 in the rematch at Bloomington.

Lynch 16th On All-Time Scoring List: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch scored a career-high 27 points in the loss to Ohio State last Thursday and then came back with 18 in the victory over Northwestern on Saturday. With 1,161 career points, he ranks 16th on the all-time school chart. In the Iowa game on Jan. 12, he leap-frogged past Mark Hall and John Shasky (20th, 1,072), George Kline (19th, 1,089) and Eric Magdanz (18th, 1,092), after equalling his previous career-high with 26 points against the Hawkeyes. He then surpassed Osborne Lockhart, who scored 1,106 career points, with his driving layup with 5:34 remaining in the first half against Michigan State on Jan. 19. Darryl Mitchell is 15th on the all-time list with 1,182 points. The all-time school record holder with 107 three-pointers to his credit, he also tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 108 games with 83 starts as a Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Bond's Back: Walter Bond returned to the Golden Gophers lineup for the January 5 contest at Youngstown State and proceeded to score 11 points and grab seven rebounds in 34 minutes of action to help the team put an end to their three-game skid with a 95-77 victory. Since his return, he has averaged 12.4 points and 4.9 rebounds for the Golden Gophers in eight games. His season-high is an 18-point effort in the 67-66 loss at Illinois on Jan. 10. The senior forward underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital, after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in the season opener at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. He had scored 10 points and hauled down four rebounds in 24 minutes of action prior to going down with the injury. Recognized as one of the finest sixth men in the country a year ago, his return has undoubtedly provided a big boost to the Golden Gophers.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank near the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 66.9 points a game, in opponents field goal percentage at .415 (343-823) and in turnover margin at 2.5 (15.6-13.1). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: The Golden Gophers are 8-1 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less this season, with the lone setback being the 67-66 heartbreaker at Illinois in the closing seconds. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-6 record on the season. Offensively, the Golden Gophers are 7-1 when they have scored more than 70 points and 3-6 when they have scored 70 points or less.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 17 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 338-174 (19.9-10.2) margin and racked up an equally impressive 170-105 (10.0-6.2) advantage in rebounding.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers are scheduled to start two seniors, one sophomore and two freshmen against Michigan on Thursday, with Kevin Lynch making his 84th start at the University of Minnesota and Walter Bond his 34th career start in Gold Country.

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 71-65 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 52-28 mark (.650) over the past three seasons. He has a 172-138 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: Under Coach Haskins, the Golden Gophers have become very tough to beat at home. With a 7-3 home record thus far this season, they have now racked up an impressive 34-7 record (.829) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,555, attended the Iowa game on Jan. 12. A total of 15,661 fans attended Thursday's Ohio State game, bringing the 10-game season total to 151,067 for an average of 15,106 a game.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their demanding 10-game non-conference schedule with a fine 7-3 overall record. Taking a closer look, they finished 2-2 against teams that qualified for post-season tournament action in 1990, defeating a pair of NCAA Tournament teams in Robert Morris and Oregon State, and falling to another in Virginia. They also came up short against Cincinnati which qualified for the NIT.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches are once again participating in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call takes place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) and continues up until March 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. Clem Haskins will be available on the teleconference each week at 12:00 Noon. For more information, contact the Big Ten Conference office or any Big Ten sports information office.

Clem Haskins Media Luncheons: A weekly luncheon/news conference with University of Minnesota Head Coach Clem Haskins will be held each Tuesday during the Big Ten season beginning at 12:00 Noon in the Gold Room, located on the east end of Williams Arena. Access to the weekly Big Ten Conference teleconference call will also be available to the assembled media.

Gopher Back Court Club: The next Gopher Back Court Club meeting will be held on Wednesday, February 6, at Jax Cafe, 1928 University Avenue NE, Minneapolis. The guest emcee will be Dick Jonckowski. The public is invited and the luncheon cost is \$12.50.

GOPHERS SWEEP AT WISCONSIN; REMAIN TIED WITH NORTHERN MICHIGAN FOR FIRST-PLACE IN WCHA; BULLDOGS UP NEXT

The second-ranked Golden Gopher ice hockey team took a pair of games from the Wisconsin Badgers this past weekend in Madison to remain in a first-place tie in the WCHA standings with Northern Michigan University. The Gophers are now 23-4-3 overall for the season, with a 20-3-3 league record.

UMD Bulldogs come to Mariucci Arena: The Gophers will play host to the UMD Bulldogs this weekend at Mariucci Arena in yet another great WCHA rivalry. Earlier this season the Gophers swept a pair of games from UMD at Duluth by scores of 3-2, and 6-2. The Bulldogs are on a three-game winning streak and just came off two big victories over Michigan Tech in Duluth this past weekend.

About the Bulldogs: The Bulldogs are led by center Derek Plante who has posted 14 goals and 18 assists for the year. Protecting the UMD nets is All-American goalie Chad Erickson who has struggled this year posting a 10-15-5 record with a 4.04 GAA. The Bulldogs are coached by Mike Sertich who is in his 10th season as head coach and holds a 193-155-20 record at the helm of the Bulldogs, and 17-25-3 record against the Gophers.

The Series: The Minnesota-UMD series began in 1961-62 and the Golden Gophers hold a 81-41-7 advantage in the series. During the Woog tenure the Gophers have posted a 15-6 record against UMD, including a 7-2 mark within the friendly confines of Mariucci Arena.

Wisconsin Recap: The Gophers two-game sweep of the Badgers in Madison, WI was based on balanced scoring and strong defense. In the Friday night matchup the Gophers broke out to a quick two-goal lead and never looked back. The Maroon and Gold was led by sophomore defenseman Travis Richards (Crystal, MN) who tallied two goals and an assist in the 5-3 victory.

More from Madison: The Saturday night game in Madison started out much the same as the previous night with the Gophers taking an early four-goal lead and dominating all facets of the game from that point forward. Junior Cory Laylin (St. Cloud, MN) netted a pair of goals while freshman winger Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, MN) had a four point night with three assists and a goal, giving him five points for the weekend.

Goaltending Strength: On the strength of a victory apiece, the Gophers goaltending duo of Jeff Stolp (Greenway, MN), and Tom Newman (Blaine, MN) took over the top two spots in the WCHA statistics board. Stolp who has led the league all year for conference record and goals against average is still in command there with a 14-3-2 record and a 2.75 GAA in WCHA action. For all games Tom Newman holds a slight lead over Stolp with a 8-0-1 record and a 2.71 GAA, while Stolp's record in all games is 15-4-2 with a 2.73 GAA. The consistent play of the duo has been the backbone of the Gophers defense all year.

Showdown in Marquette: The Gophers face a tough series this weekend with arch-rival UMD, so hopefully their minds won't drift to Marquette, MI, where the Gophers travel to in two weeks to play for what looks like the WCHA regular season title. The Northern Michigan Wildcats share first-place with the Gophers, but they have this weekend off from WCHA action as they host Bowling Green in a two-game series in Marquette.

Skate With the Gophers: The Gophers annual event which allows area fans to come out onto the ice and join the Gophers squad and staff while they skate and sign autographs is scheduled for Sunday night, February 17, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. The event is being co-sponsored by KITN-FOX 29 and KLXK 93.7 FM radio. KITN broadcasters Wally Shaver and Frank Mazzacco will emcee the event.

Minnesota's wrestling team will get a severe test Friday and Saturday when it journeys to Stillwater, OK where it is scheduled to participate in the Oklahoma State University Invitational tournament.

Coach J Robinson expects this two-day meet to be the most demanding for his club since the Midlands Wrestling Meet at Northwestern in late December, but it should be an excellent tune-up for the Golden Gophers as they prepare for the rapidly-approaching Big Ten Conference Championships.

Willy Short (So., Inver Grove Heights, MN) appears set at 150 while either **Mike Marzetta (So., Liberty Lake, WA)** or **Cliff Casteel (Fr., Montrose Hill, MI)** will get the call at 158-pounds.

Brad Gibson (So., Chokio, MN) is expected to drop down to 167 while **Marty Morgan (Sr., Bloomington, MN)**, still unbeaten with an overall record of 23-0, will represent Minnesota at 177. **Todd Moss (Fr., St. Paul, MN)** is listed at 190 and Johnson will choose between **Eric Betterman (Fr., Prior Lake, MN)** and **Chris Stogdill (Jr., Charles City, IA)** at heavy-weight.

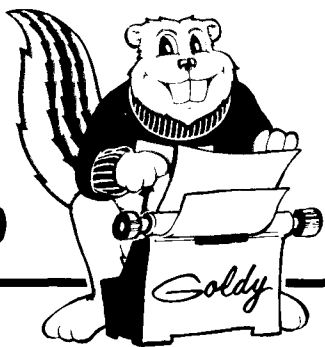

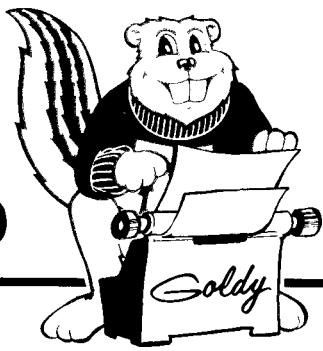

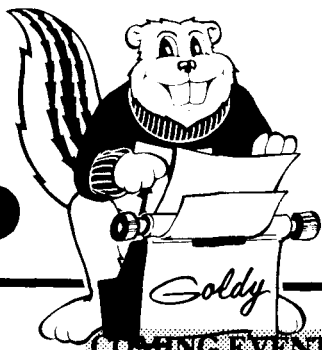

The Golden Gopher basketball team (10-9 overall/3-6 Big Ten) will host Illinois on Sunday at 3:00 p.m. at Williams Arena.

The Fighting Illini: Illinois (15-6 overall/5-3 Big Ten) topped Wisconsin 70-62 at home on Saturday. Andy Kaufmann and Rennie Clemons scored 16 points apiece, while Deon Thomas and Larry Smith chipped in 15 and 10 points respectively in the victory. Prior to meeting Minnesota on Sunday, the Fighting Illini will host Northwestern on Monday night and then play at Purdue on Wednesday. Sunday's game will be televised on ABC-TV (Channel 5). WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball.

Do You Remember?: The Golden Gophers dropped a heartbreaking 67-66 loss to the Fighting Illini at Champaign back on Jan. 10. Minnesota, led by 16 points from Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN), held a 10-point (36-26) advantage at the half, but Illinois battled back in the final 20 minutes. With the Golden Gophers leading 66-64, Rennie Clemons hit an off-balance jumper while being fouled to tie the game with 3.2 seconds remaining. He calmly drilled the ensuing free throw to give the Fighting Illini the win.

Series Record: Illinois holds an 87-53 advantage in the all-time series between the two schools.

Tough Week: The Golden Gophers dropped a pair of games at Williams Arena last week. Down 44-32 with just under 16 minutes to play, the Golden Gophers battled back to take a 61-57 lead with 2:56 remaining, only to see Demetrius Calip drain back-to-back three pointers to lead Michigan to a 66-62 victory before 15,596 fans at Williams Arena on Thursday night. For the 13th time in 18 games this season, Kevin Lynch led the Golden Gophers with 14 points in the contest. Calip led all scorers with 23 points. The Golden Gophers led by as many as 13 points in the first half against No. 4 Indiana on Sunday, and held a 34-27 advantage at the intermission, before the powerful Hoosiers stormed back largely at the free throw line to take a 77-66 victory. Eric Anderson and Calbert Cheaney paced the Hoosiers, who made 42 of 51 free throws compared to nine of 14 for Minnesota, with 22 points apiece, while Lynch once again led the Golden Gophers with 20 points. Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) joined Lynch in double figures with 11 points, while Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL) hauled down a career-high 10 rebounds.

Lynch 15th On All-Time Scoring List: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch scored a career-high 27 points in the loss to Ohio State on Jan. 24. With 1,195 career points, he ranks 15th on the all-time school chart. His 20 points in the loss to Indiana on Sunday enabled him to pass Darryl Mitchell (1,182) on the all-time list. Archie Clark, father of current Golden Gopher walk-on guard Chris Clark, is 14th with 1,199 points. The all-time school record holder with 109 three-pointers to his credit, he also tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 110 games with 85 starts as a Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Carter Shines: Freshman Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) grabbed 15 rebounds, both career highs, to pace the Golden Gophers to an 85-68 victory at Northwestern on Jan. 26. Carter shot 13 of 18 from the field and seven of his 15 rebounds were on the offensive end of the floor. Recognized as one of the finest freshmen in the Big Ten this season, he is currently ranked second on the team in rebounding (4.9) and fourth in scoring (9.3).

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank near the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 67.4 points a game, in opponents field goal percentage at .417 (403-967) and in turnover margin at 2.6 (15.8-13.2). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37

points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: Thursday's 66-62 loss to Michigan marked just the second time this season that the Golden Gophers have lost a game when holding an opponent under 70 points. The Golden Gophers are now 8-2 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-7 record on the season. Offensively, the Golden Gophers are 7-1 when they have scored more than 70 points and 3-8 when they have scored 70 points or less.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 19 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 379-211 (19.9-11.1) margin and racked up a 192-119 (10.1-6.3) advantage in rebounding.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers are scheduled to start two seniors (Kevin Lynch & Walter Bond, Chicago, IL), one sophomore (Dana Jackson) and two freshmen (Arriel McDonald & Randy Carter) against Illinois on Sunday. Last season the 23-9 Golden Gophers started four seniors (Willie Burton, Richard Coffey, Jim Shikenjanski and Melvin Newbern) and a junior (Kevin Lynch).

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 71-67 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 52-30 mark (.634) over the past three seasons. He has a 172-140 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have now lost three straight home games. The last time that happened was during the 1987-88 season when they fell to Illinois (65-61), Purdue (82-74) and Ohio State (85-76). The last time they lost four straight at Williams Arena was when they dropped the final three games of the 1986-87 season to Purdue (81-73), Michigan (95-70) and Michigan State (77-67), and then the 1987-88 opener to Drake (70-67). With a 7-5 home record thus far this season, they have now racked up an impressive 34-9 record (.791) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,555, attended last Sunday's Indiana game, bringing the 12-game season total to 183,281 for an average of 15,272 a game.

Clem Haskins Media Luncheons: A weekly luncheon/news conference with University of Minnesota Head Coach Clem Haskins will be held each Tuesday during the Big Ten season beginning at 12:00 Noon in the Gold Room, located on the east end of Williams Arena. Access to the weekly Big Ten Conference teleconference call will also be available to the assembled media. THE LUNCHEON WILL NOTE BE HELD THIS TUESDAY, FEB. 5.

GOPHERS TRAVEL TO NORTHERN MICHIGAN FOR SHOWDOWN FOR FIRST-PLACE IN WCHA

The Golden Gopher ice hockey team travels to Marquette, MI to take on the Northern Michigan Wildcats in a two-game series that may decide the winner of the MacNaughton Cup trophy that is given to the WCHA regular season champion. The games are both slated to start at 6:05 p.m., February 8-9, from Lakeview Arena in Marquette.

The Series: The Gophers hold a 16-7-3 edge in the series with the 5-3, and 4-4 tie last November being the most recent results. In those games both teams played an exciting fast-paced game with Minnesota coming away with three of four possible points. All-American candidate **Grant Bischoff (Grand Rapids, MN)** led the way for the Maroon and Gold with three goals for the series, while **Tom Pederson (Bloomington, MN)** chipped in a goal and assisted on another for three points.

Woog Against the Wildcats: Head Coach Doug Woog holds a 11-5-2 record against the Wildcats during his tenure at Minnesota. Woog is 5-5 at Lakeview Arena including last year's 7-5, and 5-2 losses that may have cost the Gophers the WCHA regular season title.

About The Wildcats: The Wildcats are coached by Rick Comley who started the program at Northern Michigan in 1976. Comley holds a 376-281-32 record in his 15 seasons at Northern Michigan. He is the 15th-winningest coach in U.S. college hockey. The Wildcats hold a slight advantage in the race for the MacNaughton Cup in that they have two games in hand on the Gophers, while the Gophers could only gain a one point lead on Northern Michigan when they hosted the Bulldogs of UMD this past weekend. Northern features the highest scoring team in the nation averaging over six goals a game. In the nets for the Cat's, is senior Billy Pye, who is Northern Michigan's all-time winningest netminder. Pye holds the WCHA lead in wins with 18 and he also has posted three shutouts this season.

Schedules: Northern Michigan will host the Golden Gophers this weekend at Lakeview Arena where they have a sparkling 15-0-1 record this season and have a 24-game unbeaten streak dating back to the 1989-90 season. Following this weekend's games the Wildcats have a home-and-home series with rival Michigan Tech. They finish the WCHA regular season with a two-game series at Madison, WI against the defending WCHA and NCAA Champion Wisconsin Badgers. The Gophers will be idle for one weekend after the Northern series, and will finish the season at home against North Dakota on February 22-23 at Mariucci Arena.

Recap of UMD Series: The Gophers played five strong periods of hockey this past weekend but came away with only one point of the four they were looking for. In Friday night's edition, the Gophers came out of the gate slow giving up three first-period power play goals to the Bulldogs. The Maroon and Gold battled back to tie the game at three midway through the third period, only to give up yet another power play goal to UMD at the 13:52 mark of the third period. The strength of the Bulldogs was the outstanding goaltending of Chad Erickson. He faced 33 shots in the final two periods and only gave up two goals. Freshman **Chris McAlpine (Roseville, MN)** scored his fifth goal of the season on the power play, and freshman **Scott Bell (St. Paul, MN)** scored his second short-handed goal of the year at 10:32 of the final period to tie the game at three. For the game UMD's power play was four for six, while the Gophers managed only one power play goal in five attempts.

More Recap: The Saturday night matchup started much the same as the previous night as the Bulldogs scored first on a power play goal by Derek Plante. In this game the Gophers were not flat coming out of the gates. They peppered Erickson with 16 first-period shots, and scored once on **Ben Hankinson's** (Edina, MN) 16th goal of the season at 19:58. The Gophers and Bulldogs traded goals in the second period and the game remained tied until Grant Bischoff scored at 15:19 of the third period to put the Gophers on top. The Gophers held on until the waning moments when they let the Bulldogs score the tying goal with just seven seconds left on the clock. The game ended in a tie as neither team could find the net in the overtime period.

Scoring Chart: The Golden Gophers continue to be paced by Hobey Baker and All-American candidate **Larry Olimb** (Warroad, MN) who now has 16 goals and 24 assists for 40 points this season. He is tied for the WCHA lead in game-winning goals with five and now has a five point lead over fellow Hobey Baker candidate Grant Bischoff. Bischoff is the Gophers leading goal scorer with 18, including a team-leading six goals on the power play.

Goaltending Duo: The goaltending duo of All-American candidate **Jeff Stolp** (Greenway, MN), and **Tom Newman** (Blaine, MN), continues to provide consistent play. Although neither goalie tallied a victory over the weekend, they only allowed a total of seven goals against for the two games. Stolp leads the WCHA in league games with a 2.82 GAA, while Newman has a 2.78 GAA and an unbeaten 8-0-2 record in all games.

Balanced Attack: The Golden Gophers now feature 15 players scoring in double figures with nine players with 20 or more points. The team has 33 power play goals in 149 attempts for a .220 percentage. The Gophers also have seven short-handed goals this year with freshman Scott Bell leading in that category with two.

Injury Update: The Gophers look for the return of freshman **Craig Johnson** (St. Paul, MN) this weekend. Johnson has played in just four periods since the Christmas break when he suffered a separated shoulder playing for the U.S. Junior National Team in the World Junior Tournament. All-American candidate **Tom Pederson** (Bloomington, MN) will again sit out this weekend's series at Northern Michigan with a badly sprained ankle. Pederson, who suffered a knee sprain earlier this season, went down with the ankle injury at Madison two weeks ago and it is hoped he will be back in time for the WCHA playoffs.

Skate With the Gophers: The Gophers annual event which allows area fans to come out onto the ice and join the Gophers squad and staff while they skate and sign autographs is scheduled for Sunday night, February 17, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. The event is being co-sponsored by **KITN-FOX 29** and **KLXK 93.7 FM** radio. KITN broadcasters Wally Shaver and Frank Mazzacco will emcee the event.

WCHA First Round Tickets on Sale: Tickets for the first round of WCHA Playoffs at Mariucci Arena on March 1-3 are now on sale at the Gopher Ticket Office. For more information call 624-8080.

WCHA and Final Four Tournament Update: Ticket Sales for the WCHA and NCAA Final Four Tournaments which will both be held at the St. Paul Civic Center appear to be on pace for a sellout once again. The WCHA Tournament which will be held March 10-11 will determine the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. The NCAA Final Four will be held on March 28-30 at the Civic Center. The 400 free relay team made up of juniors Quackenbush and Cerney, sophomore **Steve Busse (Cincinnati, OH)** and freshman **Eric Jorgensen (Rochester, MN)**, also touched first with a time of 3:06.30, to establish a new pool record.

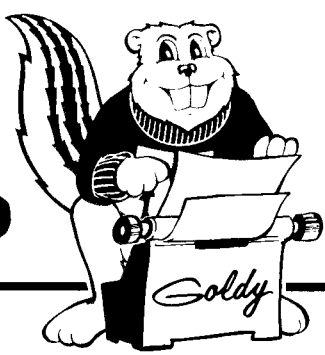

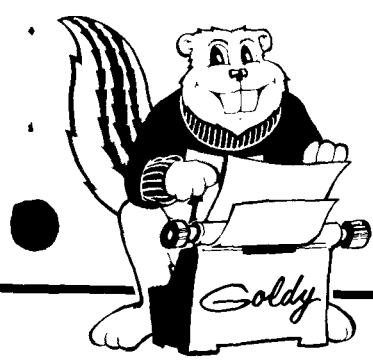

GOLDEN GOPHER BASKETBALL TEAM TAKES TO THE ROAD TO FACE IOWA ON THURSDAY AND PURDUE ON SATURDAY

This Week: The Golden Gopher basketball team (10-10 overall/3-7 Big Ten) will begin a three-game road trip on Thursday when they face Iowa (16-7 overall/5-6 Big Ten) at Carver-Hawkeye Arena in Iowa City. Tip-off is at 8:30 p.m. Behind 24 points from center Acie Earl, the Hawkeyes scored a big 71-67 victory at Michigan State last Thursday, before falling 84-70 at Michigan on Saturday. The middle game of the road swing will be on Saturday when the Golden Gophers play the Purdue Boilermakers (11-10 overall/3-8 Big Ten) at Mackey Arena in West Lafayette. Indiana scored an 81-63 victory over the Boilermakers on Sunday, despite 17 points apiece from Chuckie White and Jimmy Oliver. Coach Clem Haskins' club will close out the road trip on Saturday, Feb. 23 at Ohio State.

Broadcast Coverage: Thursday's game at Iowa will be televised on ESPN, while the Purdue game on Saturday will be a part of the Raycom weekend package and be seen locally on WCCO Channel 4 and the Midwest Sports Channel. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball.

Do You Remember?: The Golden Gophers defeated Iowa 79-77 at Williams Arena on Jan. 12 and then scored a 59-56 victory over Purdue at home on Jan. 17. Behind 26 points from **Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN)**, the Golden Gophers rallied from a 16-point first half deficit to defeat the Hawkeyes, who were led by 24 points from Val Barnes. Lynch nailed six three-pointers in the contest to tie the single-game school record set by Tim Hanson against Michigan State on Feb. 28, 1987. **Walter Bond (Chicago, IL)** and **Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI)** both scored 17 points apiece in the game, with Metcalf's total being a new career-high. **Dana Jackson (Chicago, IL)**, starting his first game of the season with **Randy Carter (Memphis, TN)** forced to the sidelines with a hip pointer, made the most of his opportunity. He grabbed a team-high eight rebounds and scored 10 points, including the game-winner with 1.3 seconds remaining. **Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC)** scored 10 points in the last 2:02 of the game to lead the Golden Gophers to the three-point win over Purdue. McDonald, who led the team with 12 points in the contest, drained six free throws without a miss in the final 56 seconds to preserve the victory. Jackson, with 10 points and seven rebounds, and Metcalf, with six points and seven rebounds off the bench, also played key roles in the win. Purdue was led by a game-high 19 points from center Craig Riley.

Series Records: Minnesota holds an 81-68 edge in the all-time series against Iowa, but the Hawkeyes lead 40-32 in games played at Iowa City. The Golden Gophers have won three straight games in the series and have not won four straight since sweeping back-to-back season series from the Hawks in the 1976-77 and 1977-78 seasons. Purdue holds a 71-63 lead in the all-time series with Minnesota, but the Golden Gophers will be looking for their third straight win over the Boilermakers for the first time since reeling off four straight that started with the last meeting between the two teams in 1980-81 to the first meeting of the 1982-83 season. The Golden Gophers have dropped eight straight games at West Lafayette.

Shooting Woes Continue: The Golden Gophers dropped a 94-74 decision to Illinois before 16,305 fans at Williams Arena on Sunday. Kevin Lynch scored a career-high 28 points, but the team once again struggled from the field shooting just 34 percent (26-77) in the contest. Coach Haskins' young squad has shot better than 50 percent in only three of 20 games this season and is connecting on only 43.5 percent (547-1258) for the season to date. Andy Kaufmann of Illinois tied Lynch for game-high honors with 28 points.

Lynch Tied For 13th On All-Time Scoring List: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch scored a career-high 28 points in the loss to Illinois on Sunday. With 1,223 career points, he now is tied with Jim McIntyre for 13th on the all-time school chart. Melvin Newbern is 12th with 1,224 points. The all-time school record holder with 110 three-pointers to his credit, he also tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa on Jan. 12. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 111 games with 86 starts as a Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native, who has led or tied the team in scoring in 15 of 20 games this season, was named Big Ten Player of the Week

on Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Big "D": Despite giving up a season-high 94 points to Illinois on Sunday, the Golden Gopher defense has been superb thus far this season. They rank near the top in the Big Ten in scoring defense, allowing just 68.7 points a game, in opponents field goal percentage at 42.4 (432-1,018) and in turnover margin at 3.0 (16.0-13.0). The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: The 66-62 loss to Michigan on Jan. 31 marked just the second time this season that the Golden Gophers have lost a game when holding an opponent under 70 points. The Golden Gophers are now 8-2 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-8 record on the season.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 20 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 395-222 (19.8-11.1) margin and racked up a 206-132 (10.3-6.3) advantage in rebounding.

New Kids On The Block: The Golden Gophers are once again scheduled to start two seniors (Kevin Lynch & Walter Bond), one sophomore (Dana Jackson) and two freshmen (Arriel McDonald & Randy Carter) against both Iowa and Purdue. Last season the 23-9 Golden Gophers started four seniors (Willie Burton, Richard Coffey, Jim Shikenjanski and Melvin Newbern) and a junior (Kevin Lynch).

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standout collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alma mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 71-68 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 52-31 mark (.627) over the past three seasons. He has a 172-141 overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have now lost four straight home games. The last time they lost four straight at Williams Arena was when they dropped the final three home games of the 1986-87 season to Purdue (81-73), Michigan (95-70) and Michigan State (77-67), and then the 1987-88 opener to Drake (70-67). With a 7-6 home record thus far this season, they have now racked up an impressive 34-10 record (.773) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,618, attended the Indiana game on Feb. 3. The Illinois game last Sunday attracted a crowd of 16,305, bringing the 13-game season total to 199,586 for an average of 15,353 a game.

Fighting Sioux Review: The North Dakota Fighting Sioux began the season as one of the favorites to challenge for the McNaughton Cup. Their season has been full of ups and downs as they have faced losing top players to injuries and to national teams. The Sioux currently hold fourth-place in the WCHA standings with a 16-10-2 record in the league and a 19-13-2 overall record.

The Coaches: The Fighting Sioux are coached by John "Gino" Gasparini who is in his 13th season and has posted a 347-175-19 record at North Dakota. A former Fighting Sioux captain, Gasparini has led the Sioux into the NCAA playoffs six times, bringing home the NCAA title three times. Doug Woog has been head coach of the Golden Gophers since 1985 and he has posted a 188-70-11 record in that time. He has led the Golden Gophers to the NCAA Final Four four of the last five years, and has led the team to the NCAA Tournament five straight years. In addition the Golden Gophers under Woog have never finished lower than second in the WCHA, and the Gophers have locked up second-place or better in the WCHA this year.

The Series: The closely contested series between the Golden Gophers and The Fighting Sioux now stands at 93-88-4 with the Maroon and Gold holding that slight edge. In the first meeting between these two teams at Grand Forks, ND, last fall the Gophers split the series, losing a 6-1 decision in the series opener before rebounding for a 6-3 victory to gain the split. North Dakota will be in action this weekend as they host the UMD Bulldogs in a key series for both teams.

Northern Michigan Recap: The Gophers had a disappointing weekend as they earned only one point in a key series with Wildcats. The Gophers jumped to an early 2-0 lead on Friday but couldn't hold the lead and had to rally to tie the game in the third period on Cory Laylin's (St. Cloud, MN) tip-in goal. Both teams had chances to win the game in the overtime period but couldn't find the net. The Saturday night event was frustrating for the Gophers as they dug themselves into a 4-0 deficit and never got any closer than two goals behind.

Skate With the Gophers: The Gophers annual event which allows area fans to come out onto the ice and join the Gophers squad and staff while they skate and sign autographs is scheduled for Sunday night, February 17, from 7:00-9:00 p.m. The event is being co-sponsored by KITN-FOX 29 and KLXK 93.7 FM radio. KITN broadcasters Wally Shaver and Frank Mazzocco will emcee the event.

Seniors **Kevin Werwie (Sheboygan, WI)** and **Anthony Cruz (Medinah, IL)** captured the consolation doubles championship for Minnesota in the Rolex Intercollegiate Tennis Championship at the 494/Crosstown Racquet & Health Club. The Golden Gophers' road to the consolation championship was anything but easy, as the duo lost in the opening round to fourth-seeded Southern California (Byron Black and Brian MacPhie) 6-3, 7-6 (7-4). In the consolation bracket, the Golden Gophers defeated seventh-seeded Princeton (Greg Hartch and Andy Weiss) in straight sets, 6-3, 6-4, to reach the semi-finals of the consolation bracket. In the semi-finals, Minnesota knocked off top-seeded Alabama (Ellis Fereira, Rick Witsken) in straight sets (6-2, 6-1) to advance to the doubles consolation championship. Here the Golden Gophers defeated San Diego State's unseeded tandem of Dax Peterson and Jeff Belloli in straight sets (6-2, 6-1) to win the consolation championship. Cruz and Werwie have improved their overall doubles record to 12-4 on the season. Senior **Brian Uihlein (Lake Forest, IL)** represented the Golden Gophers in the singles portion of the tournament. In the first round, Uihlein lost to seventh-seeded Luis Ruette of Texas Christian in straight sets (6-2, 6-4). He then moved into the consolation bracket, where he was upended by Nebraska's Matthias Mueller (7-6 (7-3), 6-3). Next Friday and Saturday, the Golden Gophers will host their annual Ice Volleys Tennis Showcase at the 98th Street Racquet Club. The tournament showcase features Arkansas, Clemson, Miami, and Alabama.

MINNESOTA GYMNASTS BOW TO THE 'HUSKERS; TRAVEL TO IOWA THIS WEEKEND

The Golden Gopher gymnasts lost their first dual meet of the season to last season's NCAA Champions, the Nebraska Cornhuskers 278.60 to 272.45, in Lincoln, NE. Sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) reclaimed the school pole vault record with an NCAA provisional qualifying mark of 17-1 1/2 at last Saturday's Iowa State Invitational in Ames. No team scores were kept in the meet that featured a host of outstanding performances.

Flying High: Justin Daler, who finished third in the event on Saturday, had claimed the school record with a winning vault of 16-9 1/4 at the Northwest Open back on Jan. 19. Teammate **Martin Eriksson (Stockholm, Sweden)**, a freshman, cleared 17-1 the following week to win the event at the Minnesota Invitational. Eriksson placed fifth on Saturday with a vault of 16-7 1/2, while junior co-captain **Ross Thompson (Esko)** finished sixth with a personal best vault of 16-1 3/4.

Williams & Arinze Set Records: Junior **Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria)** finished ninth in the 200 meters, but set a new school indoor record with a fine clocking of 22.27. WRESTLERS TO CLOSE DUAL-MEET SEASON SUNDAY

After invading Nebraska for a non-conference battle Wednesday, the University of Minnesota wrestling team will bring down the curtain on the 1990-91 dual-meet season next Sunday when they host Purdue in a Big Ten showdown at 2:30 p.m. in Williams Arena.

Then it will be time for the Big Ten championships at Illinois Mar. 2-3 before Coach J Robinson's contingent closes out the current campaign with the NCAA championships at Iowa Mar. 14-15.

The Golden Gophers came into this week's action with an overall record of 9-5 and a Big Ten mark of 2-3 after splitting honors on the road this past weekend. First, Minnesota downed the Spartans, 30-7, at Michigan State last Saturday. The Gophers then fell, 21-17, to the Wolverines at Michigan on Sunday.

Marty Morgan (Jr., Bloomington, MN) kept his record unblemished by notching two more wins on the trip. He's now 28-0 on the season and 5-0 against conference opposition. He's ranked number one in the nation at 177 pounds, and he has nine falls to his credit.

Two other Golden Gophers recorded two wins over the weekend. Shannon Ward (Jr., Irving, TX) scored two decisions at 126 pounds, improving his record to 15-6-1 on the year. In addition, Willy Short (So., Inver Grove Heights, MN) won a pair at 150 pounds to up his record to 23-7-1.

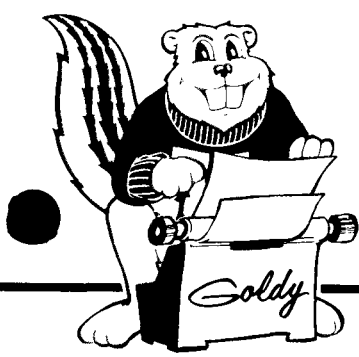
MINNESOTA GOLFERS OPEN UP SPRING SEASON AT FOUNTAINBLEU CLASSIC THIS WEEKEND

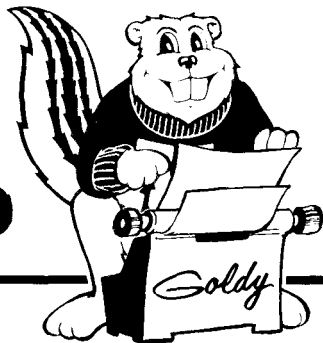

U OF M ADDS SIX FOOTBALL OPPONENTS ON FUTURE SCHEDULES

Six more non-conference opponents have been added to University of Minnesota football schedules through the year 2000, and negotiations continue with several additional NCAA Division I schools for other open dates that still remain.

"We have adopted the philosophy that we need to schedule opponents from major conferences," Men's Athletic Director Rick Bay said, "and in accordance with those beliefs, we have added teams from the Pac 10 Conference, the Big Eight Conference and the Southwest Conference."

In addition, Minnesota's athletic administration feels strongly that the non-conference portion of the football schedule should reflect geographical considerations. "We want our student-athletes to have an opportunity to visit various parts of the country," Bay said, "and at the same time we want our teams to play in areas where Minnesota alumni will have a chance to see their University perform."

Among the opponents added to U of M schedules by Bay's staff during the next decade are Kansas State and Iowa State from the Big Eight Conference, Oregon and Oregon State from the Pac Ten Conference and Baylor from the Southwest.

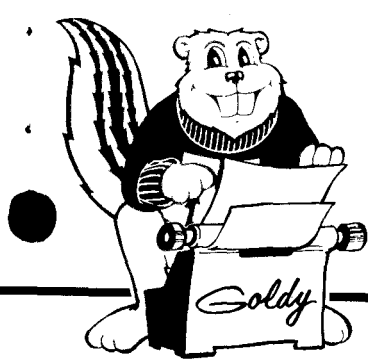

The game will be carried by WCCO TV Channel 4 and Midwest Sports Channel, beginning at 2:00 p.m. Monday night's contest with Michigan State at Williams Arena will be televised nationally by ESPN beginning at 8:30 p.m. WCCO AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball.

GOLDEN GOPHERS PLAY AT NO. 2 OHIO STATE ON SATURDAY; HOST MICHIGAN STATE ON BIG MONDAY

Powerful Ohio State: The Golden Gophers (10-12 overall/3-9 Big Ten) will play their third straight road game when they face No. 2 Ohio State (22-1 overall/12-1 Big Ten) on Saturday at St. John Arena in Columbus, OH. Tip-off is at 2:00 p.m. (CST). The Buckeyes took over sole possession of first-place in the Big Ten with a thrilling 97-95 victory in two overtimes over Indiana last Sunday at home. Treg Lee (11.8 ppg/5.8 rpg) nailed a baseline jumper off a feed from Jim Jackson (18.8 ppg/4.8 rpg/4.3 apg) for the game-winner in the second overtime session. Jackson led the way with 30 points and 11 rebounds in the contest. The Buckeyes played much of the game without explosive point guard Mark Baker (11.8 ppg/5.3 apg), who turned his ankle in the first half. Perry Carter (13.3 ppg/7.9 rpg), and Jamaal Brown (12.2 ppg/2.3 rpg), along with Chris Jent (8.0 ppg/3.7 rpg), one of the best sixth men in the league, are also featured in the potent Buckeye arsenal. Head Coach Randy Ayers' club will play at Illinois on Wednesday.

Big Monday: The Steve Smith-led Michigan State Spartans (15-8 overall/8-5 Big Ten) will invade Williams Arena on Monday night. The game, part of ESPN's "Big Monday" package, will begin at 8:30 p.m. Smith (25.6 ppg/6.0 rpg/3.7 apg) led Head Coach Jud Heathcote's squad to a 62-58 win over Illinois at home last Saturday. Matt Steigenga (12.7 ppg/5.4 rpg) ranks second on the team in scoring and is a versatile all-around player, while Mike Peplowski (6.9) is the rebounding leader for the Spartans. The Spartans will play host to Purdue on Saturday at the Jack Breslin Center.

Broadcast Coverage: Saturday's contest at Ohio State is part of the Raycom Weekend Package and will be seen locally on WCCO-TV Channel 4 and the Midwest Sports Channel. The Michigan State game will be aired nationally by ESPN with Mike Patrick and Dick Vitale as the announcers. WCCO-AM 830 is the exclusive radio voice of Golden Gopher basketball with Ray Christensen calling the action.

Series Records: Ohio State holds a 63-41 edge in the all-time series with Minnesota which includes an 80-70 victory over the Golden Gophers at Williams Arena back on Jan. 24. Kevin Lynch (Bloomington, MN) scored 27 points, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out five assists, but it wasn't enough as the Buckeyes came away with the victory. Walter Bond (Chicago, IL) and Randy Carter (Memphis, TN) joined Lynch in double figures with 11 and 10 points respectively. Jamaal Brown led the Buckeyes, who simply had too much firepower and physical strength inside for the Golden Gophers to contend with over 40 minutes, with 17 points. Minnesota leads the all-time series with Michigan State 45-33, but the Spartans won 73-64 in East Lansing on Jan. 19 as Steve Smith stole the show. The Spartan star tallied 33 points in the contest. Arriel McDonald (Raleigh, NC) scored a career-high 25 points for the Golden Gophers.

Struggles Continue: Minnesota dropped a pair of road games last week and have now lost five straight overall. The last time the Golden Gophers lost five straight games was during the 1987-88 season when they actually lost six straight games. They fell 78-68 at Wichita State in their final non-conference game of the season, before losing the first five Big Ten contests. Coach Haskins' young club lost 82-69 to the Iowa Hawkeyes on Thursday night in Iowa City. Walter Bond led Minnesota with 17 points, while Val Barnes led Iowa with 20 points. Jimmy Oliver and Chuckie White tallied 30 and 26 points respectively to pace host Purdue to an 89-82 victory on Saturday. Rob Metcalf (Port Edwards, WI) led the Golden Gophers, who shot 50 percent (31-62) in a game for just the fourth time this season, with 16 points in the contest. Walter Bond (15), Arriel McDonald (13) and Randy Carter (12) joined Metcalf in double figures.

Lynch Moves To 12th On All-Time Scoring List: The 24th University of Minnesota player to join the school's coveted 1,000 point club, All-America candidate Kevin Lynch is now ranked 12th on the school's all-time scoring chart with 1,245 points. Lou Hudson is 11th with 1,329 points. The all-time school record holder with 112 three-pointers to his credit, he also tied Tim Hanson's single-game school record with six three-pointers against Iowa on Jan. 12. He has never missed a game during his college career playing in a total of 113 games with 87 starts as a

Golden Gopher. The Minnesota native, who has led or tied the team in scoring in 15 of 22 games this season, was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 18 after scoring a total of 39 points, grabbing 14 rebounds and collecting five assists in the team's victories over Santa Clara and Oregon State.

Carter & McDonald Shine: Freshmen Randy Carter and Arriel McDonald have distinguished themselves as two of the finest rookie players in the Big Ten this season. Carter, a 6-8 forward, scored 29 points and grabbed 15 rebounds, both career-highs, to pace the Golden Gophers to an 85-68 victory at Northwestern on Jan. 26. Carter shot 13 of 18 from the field and seven of his 15 rebounds were on the offensive end of the floor. He is currently ranked second on the team in rebounding (5.1) and fourth in scoring (9.0). McDonald, a 6-2 point-guard, leads the team in assists (4.3) and is third in scoring (10.0). The only member of the team to start all 22 games this season, he registered a career-high 25 points in the Golden Gophers' 73-64 loss at Michigan State back on Jan. 19.

Bond's Back: Walter Bond returned to the Golden Gophers lineup for the January 5 contest at Youngstown State and proceeded to score 11 points and grab seven rebounds in 34 minutes of action to help the team put an end to their three-game skid with a 95-77 victory. Since his return, he has averaged 11.6 points and 4.7 rebounds for the Golden Gophers in 13 games. His season-high is an 18-point effort in the 67-66 loss at Illinois on Jan. 10. The senior forward underwent successful surgery on his right foot on Nov. 27 at the University of Minnesota Hospital, after suffering a stress fracture of the fifth metatarsal during the second half of the Golden Gophers' 74-61 victory over Robert Morris in the season opener at Williams Arena on Nov. 25. Recognized as one of the finest sixth men in the country a year ago, he had scored 10 points and hauled down four rebounds in 24 minutes of action prior to going down with the injury.

Big "D": The Golden Gopher defense has surrendered a total of 265 points over the past three games for an average of 88.3 points a contest. Superb on the defensive end all season long, they are still allowing just 70.2 points a game, opponents are shooting only 43.0 percent (478-1,111) and they have a 2.5 (16.0-13.5) turnover margin. The 37 points allowed in the Dec. 1 victory over Northern Illinois was the least points given up by a Minnesota squad since a 79-37 victory over Army during the 1981-82 season. You have to go back to the 1974-75 season, a 68-35 win over Navy, to find when they have held an opponent to less than 37 points in a contest.

70 The Magic Number: The Golden Gophers are now 8-2 when they have held opponents to 70 points or less. When opponents have scored more than 70 points, they have a 2-10 record on the season.

Great Start: The Golden Gophers opened the season with six straight victories, their best start since the 1976-77 team went 11-0 to open the season. That team, which featured among others, eventual NBA first-round draft picks Mychal Thompson, Kevin McHale and Ray Williams, holds the school record for most wins in a season after registering an overall 24-3 record. Golden Gopher Assistant Coach Dan Kosmoski was a member of that powerful squad.

The Bench Factor: Through 22 games, the Golden Gopher bench has outscored the opposition by a whopping 448-234 (20.4-10.6) margin and racked up a 224-151 (10.2-6.9) advantage in rebounding.

Coach Haskins: In his fifth season at the helm of the University of Minnesota basketball program, Clem Haskins has been the chief architect behind the resurgence of the Golden Gopher basketball program. After two rebuilding seasons, he has directed the Golden Gopher program to national prominence with back-to-back storybook runs through the NCAA Tournament. Known as "Clem the Gem", he was a consensus All-American choice, and is still recognized as one of the most dominant players to ever play in the Ohio Valley Conference, after charting a standou collegiate career at Western Kentucky. The third player selected in the NBA draft, he went on to play nine outstanding seasons with the Chicago Bulls (1967-70), Phoenix Suns (1970-74) and Washington Bullets (1974-76). He was named to the head job at Minnesota on April 1, 1986, after six outstanding seasons as head coach at his alm mater, where he led the Hilltoppers to two NCAA Tournaments and one NIT Tournament. He has recorded a 71

70 overall record at Minnesota, including a fine 52-33 mark (.611) over the past three seasons. He has a 172-143, overall record in 11 seasons.

Williams Arena: The Golden Gophers have now lost four straight home games. The last time they lost as many as four straight at Williams Arena was when they dropped the final seven home games of the 1986-87 season to Iowa (78-57), Ohio State (93-78), Indiana (77-53), Illinois (79-67), Purdue (81-73), Michigan (95-70) and Michigan State (77-67), and then the 1987-88 opener to Drake (70-67). With a 7-6 home record thus far this season, they have now racked up an impressive 34-10 record (.773) over the past three seasons within the hallowed walls of Williams Arena.

Tough Ticket: The Golden Gophers attracted 13,993 to their season opener against Robert Morris on Nov. 25...that was the largest crowd for a season opener since 14,887 attended the 1983-84 opener against South Dakota State. The season's largest crowd, 16,618, attended the Indiana game on Feb. 3. The Illinois game on Jan. 10 attracted a crowd of 16,305, bringing the 13-game season total to 199,586 for an average of 15,353 a game.

Tough Non-Conference Schedule: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their demanding 10-game non-conference schedule with a fine 7-3 overall record. Taking a closer look, they finished 2-2 against teams that qualified for post-season tournament action in 1990, defeating a pair of NCAA Tournament teams in Robert Morris and Oregon State, and falling to another in Virginia. They also came up short against Cincinnati which qualified for the NIT.

Big Ten Teleconference: Big Ten basketball coaches are once again participating in a weekly teleconference call. The teleconference call takes place each Tuesday beginning at 11:00 a.m. (CST) and continues up until March 5. The teleconference will be replayed at 4:00 p.m. (CST) each Tuesday. THE GOLDEN GOPHER HOCKEY TEAM ENTERS FINAL REGULAR SEASON SERIES WITH WCHA PLAYOFF PAIRINGS AT STAKE

The Golden Gophers enter this weekend's two-game series with North Dakota at Mariucci Arena with the league title decided and most of the playoff pairings decided. The Northern Michigan Wildcats won their first McNaughton Cup and regular season WCHA Championship when they swept a pair of games from their in-state rival Michigan Tech. The sweep of Tech also ensured that the Huskies will be the Gophers opponent when the WCHA first-round playoffs open March 1-3, at Mariucci Arena.

Season Finale: Before the playoffs start the Gophers have some unfinished business with the Fighting Sioux. The Sioux are coming off of a two-game sweep of the UMD Bulldogs at Grand Forks this past weekend. They have climbed to within two points of the Wisconsin Badgers and the positioning of those two will be at stake this weekend at Mariucci Arena and Dane County Coliseum where the Badgers will try to knock off the league champion Northern Michigan Wildcats.

Fighting Sioux Review: The North Dakota Fighting Sioux began the season as one of the favorites to challenge for the McNaughton Cup. Their season has been full of ups and downs as they have faced losing top players to injuries and to national teams. The Sioux currently hold fourth-place in the WCHA standings with a 18-10-2 record in the league and a 21-13-2 overall record.

The Coaches: The Fighting Sioux are coached by John "Gino" Gasparini who is in his 13th season and has posted a 349-175-19 record at North Dakota. A former Fighting Sioux captain, Gasparini has led the Sioux into the NCAA playoffs six times, bringing home the NCAA title three times. Doug Woog has been head coach of the Golden Gophers since 1985 and he has posted a 188-70-11 record in that time. He has led the Golden Gophers to the NCAA Final Four four of the last five years, and has led the team to the NCAA Tournament five straight years. In addition the Golden Gophers under Woog have never finished lower than second in the WCHA, and the Gophers have already locked up second-place in the WCHA this year.

The Series: The closely contested series between the Golden Gophers and The Fighting Sioux now stands at 93-88-4 with the Maroon and Gold holding that slight edge. In the first meeting between these two teams at Grand Forks, ND, last fall the Gophers split the series, losing a 6-1 decision in the series opener before rebounding for a 6-3 victory.

Stolp Loses Top Spot in WCHA While Idle: All-American candidate Jeff Stolp (Greenway, MN) lost the top spot in the WCHA for goalies, while he was idle this past weekend. Northern Michigan goalie Billy Pye now has a slight lead on Stolp with a 2.78 GAA to Stolp's 2.79 GAA.

WCHA First Round Tickets on Sale: Tickets for the first round of WCHA Playoffs at Mariucci Arena on March 1-3 are now on sale at the Gopher Ticket Office. The Gophers will play host to the Michigan Tech Huskies. For more information call 624-8080.

WCHA and Final Four Tournament Update: Ticket Sales for the WCHA and NCAA Final Four Tournaments which will both be held at the St. Paul Civic Center appear to be on pace for a sellout once again. The WCHA Tournament, which will be held March 10-11, will determine the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. The NCAA Final Four will be held on March 28-30 at the Civic Center. MEN'S TENNIS CAPTURES ICE VOLLEYS CHAMPIONSHIP

After manhandling the 24th-ranked team in the nation on Friday, the Golden Gophers pounded one of the nation's foremost up-and-coming teams on Saturday to capture the title at the Tenth Annual Ice Volleys Tennis Showcase at the 98th Street Racquet Club in Bloomington.

Friday, led by straight set singles victories from senior captain **Kevin Werwie** (Sheboygan, WI), freshman **Paul Pridmore** (No. Aurora, IL), and sophomore **Grant Julian** (Voorhees, NJ) Minnesota upset the 24th-ranked Clemson Tigers, 7-2. On the doubles side Werwie teamed up with fellow senior **Anthony Cruz** (Medinah, IL) to notch their 14th victory of the season when they defeated Clemson's Greg Seilkop and Mike Williams in straight sets, 6-1, 6-4. Minnesota swept the doubles portion of the match when the team of junior **Brian Uihlein** (Lake Forest, IL) and freshman **Adam Krafft** (Saginaw, MI) won a three set match over Munneryn/Lampert. Earlier, sophomore **Roger Anderson** (New Hope, MN) and partner Pridmore won a straight set decision over Merza/Johansson, 6-4, 6-4.

On Saturday, the Golden Gopher baseliners overwhelmed the Razorbacks of Arkansas, 5-2, by gaining a 4-2 advantage in the singles portion of the match, leaving them one doubles victory away from the title.

In singles, Werwie and Pridmore rambled to straight set victories over Arkansas' Cha Hoon Im and Euan McGinn, respectively. Meanwhile, the other Minnesota victories didn't come so easily as Cruz defeated Joaquin Lopez, 6-3, 3-6, 6-3, in a three-hour three set drama that left the Minnesotan dehydrated and unable to compete in the doubles competition. Pridmore brought home the other singles victory when he defeated Marcus Hilpert in a thrilling three-setter, 6-3, 4-6, 6-3. Hilpert by the way is the 48th-ranked player in the nation.

Forced to face the doubles competition without Cruz, Werwie was teamed with Julian for the first time all season. Though Minnesota owned a comfortable lead the tension was growing. In the end, it was the number three doubles team of junior **Phillippe LeBlanc** (St. Bruno, Quebec) and Krafft who clinched the team victory by defeating McGinn and Antoun in straight sets, 6-3, 6-4. Once the fifth Minnesota win was recorded the remaining doubles matches were suspended.

Murrell Looks To Defend Title: Sophomore Chris Murrell (Grand Island, NE) is the defending league indoor champion in the high jump. He claimed the title as a rookie a year ago with a school record leap of 7-3. He has already met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard with a jump of 7-0 1/2 earlier this season. Junior Mark Lacy (Oak Brook, IL) and sophomore Justin Daler (Toledo, OH) both return after placing at the conference indoor meet last year. Lacy finished sixth in the shot put with a throw of 53-2 1/4. He has surpassed the NCAA provisional qualifying standard with a personal-best of 58-11 1/4 to his credit this winter. Daler was also sixth a year ago with a mark of 16-1 3/4 in the pole vault. He is the team's third NCAA provisional qualifier after meeting the standard with a school record vault of 17-1 1/2 at the Iowa State Invitational on Feb. 9. All three will look to be in the hunt for individual titles this weekend.

Flying High: The Golden Gophers turned in a number of outstanding performances, highlighted by Justin Daler's NCAA provisional qualifying and school record vault of 17-1 1/2, at the Iowa State Invitational on Feb. 9 in their final meet before the Big Ten Championships. Daler, who finished third in the event, had claimed the school record with a winning vault of 16-9 1/4 at the Northwest Open back on Jan. 19. Teammate Martin Eriksson (Stockholm, Sweden), a freshman, cleared 17-1 the following week to win the event at the Minnesota Invitational. Eriksson placed fifth at Iowa State with a vault of 16-7 1/2, while junior co-captain Ross Thompson (Esko) finished sixth with a personal best vault of 16-1 3/4.

Williams & Arinze Set Records: Junior Tim Arinze (Festic Town, Lagos, Nigeria) finished ninth in the 200 meters at the Iowa State Invitational, but set a new school indoor record with a fine clocking of 22.27. Emmanuel Onyia had held the record with a time of 22.38 set back in 1984. Norris Williams, Jr. (Milwaukee, WI) continued to excel for the Golden Gophers. He lowered his freshman school record to 48.24 with a fourth-place finish in the 400 meters.

Looking Good: Freshman Matt Burns (Cedar Rapids, IA) placed fourth in the high jump at the Iowa State Invitational with a personal best leap of 6-10 3/4, junior Dan Savitt (Plymouth, MN) was fourth in the long jump with a personal-best leap of 24-2 and junior co-captain Sean Fitzgerald (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) finished fifth in the mile in 4:10.85.

Sophomore John Roethlisberger (Afton, MN) continues to work himself back into form as he competed in both the pommel horse (9.55) and the still rings (9.45) events. Minnesota will host Michigan State and the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh next Saturday, at Williams Arena, beginning at 1:00 p.m.

MINNESOTA SWIMMING AND DIVING TEAM CAPTURES GOPHER INVITATIONAL TEAM CROWN IN SEASON'S FINALE

Minnesota ended their regular season on a positive note by capturing the 1991 Gopher Invitational crown. Minnesota earned an abundance of points, 548, to place first, while Bemidji State finished second with 176, Iowa State third with 36 and St. John's was fourth with 10 points. Junior Sean Quackenbush (Rochester, MN) was the only Gopher to win two events, however, thirteen different Golden Gophers each won a single event. Quackenbush won the 100 butterfly in :50.37 and the 200 butterfly in 1:53.00. The Golden Gophers will have next weekend off to prepare for the 1991 Big Ten Championships, in Indianapolis, February 28 thru March 2. The Golden Gophers finished the regular season with an overall record of 14-2 and 11-2 in dual meet competition.

BASEBALL OPENS THE 1991 SEASON AGAINST FLORIDA STATE

The 26th-ranked Golden Gopher baseball team opens up the 1991 season this weekend with a three-game series against the second-ranked Florida State Seminoles in Tallahassee, FL. The series will be the third, fourth and fifth meetings between these two teams with the Seminoles holding a 2-0 edge in the series. The Seminoles are 7-2 for the season after dropping two of three last weekend at Arizona.

About the Gophers: The Gophers return 19 letterwinners from last season's squad that finished 36-24-1 and tied for second in the Big Ten with a 19-9 record. This year's team is led by pre-season All-American shortstop **Brent Gates (Grandville, MI)**. Gates is coming off a fine summer season with Team USA where he helped the team win the bronze medal at the Goodwill Games in Seattle, WA. Last season Gates set team records for the Gophers with most at-bats with 223, and most hits with 82. He batted .368 with 63 RBI's and 10 stolen bases.

Another key tandem for the Gophers will be fifth-year senior co-captains **John Kopfer (Oconomowoc, WI)** and **Jeff Monson (Bloomington, MN)**. Kopfer is rebounding from an off year and is looking to improve on his career .344 average. He led the Gopher summer league team with 16 home runs and is expected to add that power to the lineup this year.

Monson is the old man of the Gophers infield having played in 140 games for the Maroon and Gold. An ironman, he has missed just one game in the past two seasons. With a lifetime .335 average, his bat will be a key component of the Gophers offensive arsenal this year. In the field Monson posted a sterling .993 fielding percentage last year as the Gophers led the Big Ten in fielding.

The three expected starters for the opening series are; **John Lowery (Shepherdstown, WV)**, **Jeff Schmidt (LaCrosse, WI)**, and **Eric Slagle (Barrington, IL)**. Lowery, considered the anchor of the Gophers starting rotation, led the team with a 7-4 record last season, and has a career 14-4 record. The bullpen duties will rest largely in the hands of **J.T. Gilbert (LaCrosse, WI)** and **Brent Davis (Minnetonka, MN)**. Last year the two combined for an 11-4 record in 87 innings.

The outfield corps will be led by third-team All-Big Ten selection **Ryan Lefebvre (Los Angeles, CA)** who will start in center, with **Keith Krenke (Owatonna, MN)** and **Tom Doyle (Rapid City, S.D.)** platooning in right field, while Kopfer will try to hold down the starting left field job with newcomers **Charlie Nelson (Perham, MN)** and **Darren Schwankl (Burnsville, MN)** pushing him for playing time.

About Anderson: Head Coach John Anderson is entering his 10th season as skipper of the Minnesota program. His career mark stands at 305-204-3, with a 113-63 record in Big Ten play, including three Big Ten Championships, and four NCAA post-season appearances. Anderson is believed to be one of the youngest collegiate coaches to reach the 300-win plateau.

Minnesota Tradition: Last season marked the 28th consecutive winning season for the Minnesota baseball program. After the series with Florida State the Gophers return home to open the home slate with a three-game matchup against the University of Kansas on March 1-3 at the Metrodome. The Gophers Siebert Field home opener will be April 10, against Mankato State in a 2:00 p.m. start. For more information call the Gopher Ticket Office at 624-8080.

U OF M ADDS SIX FOOTBALL OPPONENTS ON FUTURE SCHEDULES

Six more non-conference opponents have been added to University of Minnesota football schedules through the year 2000, and negotiations continue with several additional NCAA Division I schools for other open dates that still remain.

"We have adopted the philosophy that we need to schedule opponents from major conferences," Men's Athletic Director Rick Bay said, "and in accordance with those beliefs, we have added teams from the Pac 10 Conference, the Big Eight Conference and the Southwest Conference."

In addition, Minnesota's athletic administration feels strongly that the non-conference portion of the football schedule should reflect geographical considerations. "We want our student-athletes to have an opportunity to visit various parts of the country," Bay said, "and at the same time we want our teams to play in areas where Minnesota alumni will have a chance to see their University perform."

Among the opponents added to U of M schedules by Bay's staff during the next decade are Kansas State and Iowa State from the Big Eight Conference, Oregon and Oregon State from the Pac Ten Conference and Baylor from the Southwest.

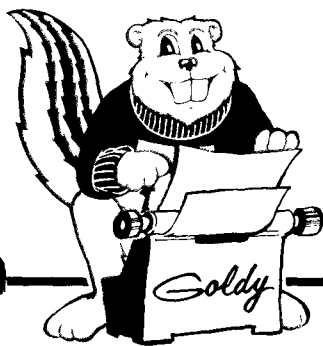

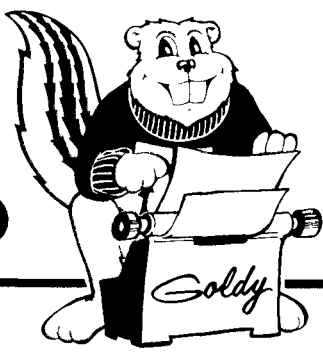

HASKINS REPRIMANDED FOR COMMENTS ON OFFICIATING

University of Minnesota Athletic Director Rick Bay has publicly reprimanded Head Basketball Coach Clem Haskins for his comments regarding the officiating following yesterday's 63-62 loss at Ohio State.

"Coach Haskins' remarks were contrary to the rules of sportsmanlike conduct in the Big Ten and are inexcusable," Bay said. "Public criticism of officials cannot be tolerated and any repeat offenses will result in a minimum penalty of a one game suspension. I have great personal respect for Coach Haskins and I believe that he is doing an outstanding job again this season, but I am very disappointed in his post-game comments about the officiating at Ohio State."

"I accept and understand the the public reprimand," Haskins said. "But I'm still disappointed, not for Clem Haskins, but for this group of young men who played so hard and so well yesterday."
