BASEBALL TEAM TAKES THREE OF FOUR FROM MICHIGAN STATE

The Golden Gopher baseball team completed another successful week by defeating Michigan State in 3-of-4 contests in East Lansing, Mich. over the weekend. The Maroon and Gold went 4-1 during the week, to up their record to 27-13 (13-3 Big Ten). The team is 26-5 since their 1-8 start against three of the top five ranked teams in the April 18, *Baseball America* poll.

Road Warriors: The Golden Gophers continue to impress on the road this season by taking 3-of-4 from the Spartans at Kobs Field. By doing so, Minnesota raised its road record to 10-2 in Big Ten play. The Maroon and Gold will host two of their three final conference

sending two shots out of the yard and collecting four RBI. Gunderson has hit seven home runs in Big Ten play and eight overall this spring. It was his second multiple home run game of the year. Merila went 2-for-5 with his third home run of the year and added four RBI. Freshman Mike Diebolt (LHP, Mayfield Village, Ohio) picked up his first collegiate win, going 4 2/3 innings and giving up six earned runs. In Sunday's second game, shortstop Bill Mobilia (Sr., Ely, Minn.) hit his fifth home run of the year and collected three RBI. Outfielder Shane McCarthy (Jr., Billings, Mont.) hit the team's second grand slam of the season to give Minnesota a 12-6 lead. Junior Mark Vandersall (OF, Plymouth, Minn.) later collected his fourth home run of the season. Senior Jason Karrman (LHP, Platteville, Wis.) earned his first win of the year by going 2/3 of an inning in relief, allowing two runs.

Nelson Breaks Runs Scored Record: Senior right fielder Charlie Nelson (Perham, Minn.) scored five runs over the weekend to give him 199 runs scored in his collegiate career, eclipsing the old school mark of 195 runs scored held by Ryan Lefebvre (1990-93). With three stolen bases over the weekend, giving him 26 for the season and 76 overall, he is two shy of becoming Minnesota's all-time stolen base king. The current record holder is J.T. Bruett, who stole 77 bases from 1986-88.

Hit Streak Continues: Wes Denning is excelling in the lead-off and ninth spot in the lineup this season. He continued to shine with a 6-for-13 performance against Michigan State. The center fielder scored 10 runs and drove in six, as well as walking four times, to extend his hitting streak to 16 games. Denning is one shy of tying Mark Merila's team-high 17-game hitting streak set earlier this season.

Karrmann Closes In: With three appearances against the Spartans, Jason Karrmann now has been in 21 games for the Maroon and Gold this season. He is bearing down on the single-season record of 25 appearances, which he set last year.

Big Numbers: Senior shortstop Bill Mobilia was a one-man wrecking crew in Sunday's doubleheader. He collected five hits and five RBI. Against the Spartans, the senior was 9-of-14 with six runs scored, six RBI and a walk. Mobilia has collected seven multiple-hit games in 16 Big Ten contests this season. He picked up his fourth three-hit contest in Big Ten competition in Sunday's first game of a doubleheader.

The Beat Goes On: Mark Merila collected eight RBI against Michigan State to give him 36 on the year and 154 for his career. He moved past Alex Bauer (152, 1983-86) into fourth place all-time. Tom Steinbach holds the school record with 175 RBI from 1980-83.

Minnesota defeated Michigan State 10-0 in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader, with the Spartans taking the second game 5-4. The Maroon and Gold pounded out 31 hits and scored 36 runs in sweeping Sunday's double-dip 19-6, and 17-6.

Junior pitcher Jim Brower (Minnetonka, Minn.) was untouchable for the third straight start in the first game Saturday. Brower went 6 2/3 innings allowing no runs and striking out three to increase his record to 5-1. In his three Big Ten starts, Brower is 3-0 with a 1.31 ERA. Center fielder Wes Denning (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) and second baseman Mark Merila (Sr., Plymouth, Minn.) each contributed three RBI to the cause. One of the few bright spots in Saturday's 5-4 loss was junior catcher Darren Grass' (St. Paul, Minn.) solo home run. It was his 11th of the year and the 31st of his career, which ties him with Alex Bauer for second on Minnesota's all-time home run list.

Minnesota exploded for 10 home runs over the weekend, including a season-high six homer barrage in Sunday's first game. Sophomore Shane Gunderson (Faribault, Minn.) led the attack,

MAROON DEFEATS THE WHITE 13-7 IN THE ANNUAL SPRING FOOTBALL GAME

Led by a pair of interceptions from sophomore defensive back **Rodney Heath** (Cincinnati, Ohio), the Maroon squad defeated the White squad 13-7 in the annual spring football game held on Saturday at the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome.

Big Crowd: A crowd estimated at 10,000 came out to watch Saturday's spring game. That marked the largest attendance for a Golden Gophers' spring game since 13,260 attended the 1986 game at the Metrodome.

Heath Shines: Rodney Heath put the finishing touches on an outstanding spring with a stellar performance in Saturday's spring game. He picked off two passes, and then also batted down a ball in the end zone to prevent a White score. He finished with seven total tackles in the game, including six unassisted, and had a punt return for 31 yards to set up the Maroon team's touchdown.

Scoring Summary: The ground game accounted for both touchdowns on Saturday. Redshirt freshman **Javon Jackson** (Newport News, Va.) gave the Whites a 7-0 advantage with 6:25 left in the second quarter on a one-yard scoring run. A roughing the kicker penalty earlier in the drive on a field goal attempt gave the Whites a second opportunity and they cashed in on it. The Maroon team knotted things up at 7-7 when sophomore running back **Tommy Watson** (Denver, Colo.) hit paydirt from one yard out. That touchdown capped a 27-yard drive, set up by Rodney Heath's 31-yard punt return. Junior placekicker **Mike Chalberg** (Auckland, New Zealand) was the difference in the second half. He scored all six of the Maroon's points in the final 30 minutes by nailing a 52-yard field goal with 3:59 remaining in the third quarter, and then a 39-yarder early in the fourth quarter.

A Closer Look: Senior **Scott Eckers** (St. Louis Park, Minn.)

led all quarterbacks by completing 14 of 28 pass attempts for 159 yards on the day for the White team. Fellow senior **Tim Schade** (Pekin, Ill.) connected on 11 of 17 attempts for 114 yards for the Maroon squad. Tommy Watson led all rushers in the game with 69 net yards on 21 carries for the Maroon team. Teammate **Eric Harmon** (Roseville, Minn.), a redshirt freshman, gained 59 yards on eight carries. The White team was paced in rushing by Javon Jackson who had 46 yards on 16 carries. In the receiving department, senior **Lew Garrison** (Burnsville, Minn.) of the White team led the way with eight receptions for 76 yards. Senior **Aaron Osterman** (Elk River, Minn.) and junior **Johnny Woodson** (Houston, Texas), a transfer from Redwoods Community College, led the Maroon squad with five catches apiece. In addition to Rodney Heath, the Maroon defense was led by 10 total tackles from senior linebacker **Dan Li Santi** (Manalapan, N.J.) and an interception by junior defensive back **Justin Conzemius** (Fargo, N.D.). Junior linebacker **Craig Sauer** (Sartell, Minn.) and senior linebacker **Todd Wolke** (Lakeville, Minn.) led the White defense with 11 and 10 total tackles, respectively. Sophomore defensive back **Don Williams** (New Orleans, La.) also recorded an interception for the Whites.

Coach Wacker Says: "It was a fun spring football game. Overall, the effort was real good on both sides of the ball. Some of our young people really played well and that's encouraging. We still have to eliminate some of the penalties and mistakes, but I think that we're going to be a darn good football team in 1994."

YEE FINISHES SEVENTH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS; NEBRASKA WINS TITLE

Junior **Brian Yee** (Houston, Texas) capped off a fine 1994 season by finishing seventh overall on the pommel horse event with a score of 8.70 at the NCAA Championships held in Lincoln, Neb., over the weekend. Yee scored a 9.75 in the prelims to reach Saturday night's individual event finals. Senior co-captain **Brian Ottenhoff** (Kersey, Colo.), competing in his final collegiate meet, finished tied for 26th-place on the high bar with a score of 9.50.

For the third season in a row, the same three teams qualified for the finals (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State). Top-ranked

Nebraska knocked off two-time defending national champion Stanford and came away with its eighth NCAA Gymnastics Championship. Ohio State finished third for the third consecutive season. Senior Dennis Harrison of Nebraska claimed the all-around title with a score 58.20.

Minnesota concluded their season with a 4-8 record overall and an 0-5 record in the Big Ten. This marked the first time in 23 seasons that the Golden Gophers did not have an all-arounder competing in the championships. It also marked the first time in eight seasons that the Golden Gophers did not have a full team qualified.

MEN'S TENNIS AWAITS BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

After completing their fourth straight Big Ten regular season unbeaten, the Golden Gopher men's tennis team has the week off to prepare for the Big Ten Championships May 5-8 at the 4th Street Courts on the University of Minnesota campus.

Minnesota, 19-4 overall and 10-0 in the Big Ten, will be shooting for their third straight Big Ten title next week. The Golden Gophers have won 36 consecutive Big Ten dual matches.

The streak spans over three years, during which the Golden Gophers have captured two consecutive Big Ten titles under Head Coach David Geatz. Minnesota's last conference loss was on May 5, 1991 to Ohio State in the finals of the Big Ten Championships.

In the latest ITA/Rolux Rankings, Minnesota is ranked No. 33.

Last Weekend: The Golden Gophers completed their Big Ten regular season with a 6-1 victory over Ohio State in Rochester, Minn.

Freshman **Ben Gabler** (Chambersburg, Pa.) and junior **Ross Loel** (Marina Del Ray, Calif.) finished the Big Ten regular season play at 10-0 and 9-0, respectively. Teammate **Lars Hjarrand** (Oslo, Norway), a leading candidate for Big Ten Freshman-of-the-Year honors, is 27-8 this season at the No. 2 singles slot for the Golden Gophers.

Senior captain **Paul Pridmore** (North Aurora, Ill.) has posted an impressive 32-12 record at the No. 1 singles position this season.

GOLFERS FINISH THIRD AT GOLDEN FLASH INVITATIONAL

Head Coach John Means' Golden Gopher golf team notched its second consecutive third place finish at the Golden Flash Invitational last weekend with a team score of 885. The Golden Gophers finished behind host Kent which won the tournament with a score of 864. Miami of Ohio and Kent tied for the lead and Kent won the title on the first hole of a sudden death playoff. Last weekend, the Golden Gophers finished third at the Legends of Indiana tournament. They placed ahead of three higher ranked teams in the district.

Kelly Leads the Way: Junior **Jonathon Kelly** (Mankato, Minn.) led the Maroon and Gold individually with a score of 71-76-71=218, good for a tie for eighth. **Mark Hanson** (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) finished 15th with a score of 71-76-74=221, while **Aaron Barber** (New London, Minn.) finished tied for 18th with a score of 73-74-75=222. **Phil Ebner** (Hudson, Ohio) fired a 227 score, and **Jeff Nielsen** (Grand Rapids, Minn.) shot 229 to round out the team scoring. Minnesota was ranked fifth in the district going into the weekend. They may have improved their standing with their performance and helped their chances of landing an NCAA bid in the process.

Next Up: The Golden Gophers will be off until May 6-8, when they will travel to East Lansing, Mich., for the Spartan Invitational.

GRIAK TO BE INDUCTED INTO DRAKE RELAYS COACHES HALL OF FAME THIS WEEK

University of Minnesota Head Cross Country/Track & Field Coach Roy Griak will be inducted into the Drake Relays Coaches Hall of Fame during ceremonies at the Knapp Center on the Drake University campus in Des Moines, Iowa Thursday.

Good Company: Fellow coaches Bob Teel, former track & field mentor at the University of Missouri, and Peter Tegen, coach of the highly successful Wisconsin women's track & field program, will join Coach Griak as 1994 inductees. The trio will increase membership in the Drake Relays Coaches Hall of Fame to 56. The Hall of Fame was established in 1977 with six charter members, including the founder of the Drake Relays, John L. Griffith.

Great Career: In his 31st season at the helm of the Golden Gopher cross country and track & field programs, Griak has coached a total

of 42 All-Americans, including three NCAA national champions (Garry Bjorklund 1971, Ron Backes 1986, Martin Eriksson 1993). He has also had 56 Big Ten champions. Active on the national and international coaching scene, he has worked with three U.S. Olympic teams during his illustrious career.

Drake Relays: The Golden Gophers will compete in the 85th annual Drake Relays on Friday and Saturday.

Home Meet Upcoming: The Golden Gophers will host the first of three events during the outdoor season on Saturday, May 7 by holding the Minnesota Invitational. The action will get underway at Bierman Stadium at 1:00 p.m.

Big Ten, NCAA Outdoor Meets: The 1994 Big Ten Outdoor Track & Field Championships will be held May 21-22 in Madison, Wis. The 1994 NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships will take place May 31-June 2 in Boise, Idaho.



The University of Minnesota (31-14, 16-4 Big Ten) won three-of-four games against Northwestern over the weekend. The Golden Gophers remained one-half game behind frontrunner Ohio State entering this week. The Buckeyes won both games of a doubleheader on Sunday, and had a pair of games rained out on Saturday. Ohio State will attempt to make up those games on Monday afternoon.

Nelson Becomes Minnesota's All-Time Stolen Base King: Senior right fielder **Charlie Nelson** (Perham, Minn.) became Minnesota's all-time stolen base leader on Saturday during the second game of a doubleheader against Northwestern. Nelson collected his 78th career stolen base when he swiped second base on the back end of a double steal in the second inning to break the

(27/69) with 30 runs scored during that stretch. Denning, who has scored 57 runs this season, is 11 away from breaking J.T. Bruett's single-season mark of 67 (1988).

Double Trouble: Sophomore **Shane Gunderson** (1B, Faribault, Minn.) hit his 10th and 11th home runs of the season on Sunday to join junior catcher **Darren Grass** (St. Paul, Minn.) (12 home runs) as the only Golden Gophers on the team with double digits in home runs. It is only the seventh time in school history that at least two players on the same Minnesota team have hit at least 10 home runs. The last time that feat was accomplished was last season with **Charlie Nelson** (10 HR) and **Grass** (12 HR).

Grass Ranks Second on Home Run List: With **Darren Grass'** homer on Sunday, he now has 32 career home runs as a Golden Gopher which vaults him into second place on Minnesota's all-time home run list. **Alex Bauer** (1983-86) previously held second place with 31 career home runs. **Tom Steinbach** (1980-83) is on the top of the list with 45 home runs.

Hammer'em: Senior left-hander **Andy Hammerschmidt** (New Ulm, Minn.) pitched the team's third complete game of the season on Saturday when the Golden Gophers beat Northwestern 12-1 in the second game of a doubleheader. Hammerschmidt pitched his fourth career complete game as he scattered six hits through seven innings. He struck out a career-high eight batters in the contest and was one home run away from throwing his first career shutout. He allowed a solo home run to **Ron Rojas** in the sixth inning which made the score 12-1.

Karrmann Closes In: With two appearances against the Wildcats, **Jason Karrmann** (Platteville, Wis.) has now been in 23 games for the Maroon and Gold this season. He is closing in on the single-season school record of 25 appearances, which he set last year.

Mobilla Swings the Hot Stick: Senior shortstop **Bill Mobilla** (Ely, Minn.) is currently on an 11-game hitting streak and is batting .576 (19/33) with three home runs and 14 RBI during that span. Mobilla went 5-for-11 with two homers and four RBI against Northwestern.

Merila Watch: All-America second baseman **Mark Merila** (Plymouth, Minn.) hit .533 (8/15) with seven RBI last week. He went 7-for-12 vs. Northwestern. He is on pace to become the all-time leading hitter in school history. Heading into this week, Merila is batting .393 for his career. **Brent Gates** (1990-92) is the all-time leader with a career .387 average. With a .479 average at the plate this season, Merila is also on pace to break **John Peterson's** (1970) single-season mark of .443.

The Schedule: The 85th Annual Big Ten Men's Tennis Championships will be held at the 4th Street Courts on the University of Minnesota campus on May 5-8. First round matches will begin at 9:00 a.m. Thursday with the winners and losers meeting at 1:30 p.m. Quarterfinal play begins Friday at 9:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. The Golden Gophers, the No. 1 seed, will play their quarterfinal match at 1:30 p.m. on Friday. Semifinal and consolation matches began on Saturday at 9:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. The seventh, fifth, third, and championship matches will all take place on Sunday, with the finals to begin at 1:30 p.m.

Big Ten's Returns To Minneapolis: The last time Minnesota hosted the Big Ten Championships was in 1987, when Michigan defeated Minnesota 5-2 in the championship match. Minnesota has hosted the championships five times since the tournament began in 1910.

Minnesota in the Big Ten Championships: The Golden Gophers have captured 12 conference titles, which includes five co-championships. Minnesota has won six titles in the past 10 years: 1984, 1986, 1987, (Under Head Coach Jerry Noyce) - 1989, 1992, 1993, (Under Head Coach David Geatz).

A Year Ago: Minnesota captured their second consecutive Big Ten title at the 1993 championships in Iowa City, Iowa. The Golden Gophers were 3-0 in the tournament, defeating Michigan 4-1 in the second round and Indiana 4-1 in the semifinals. In the championship match, Minnesota defeated Northwestern 4-0 to finish the season unbeaten in conference play at 13-0. Northwestern finished 2-1, while Indiana and Iowa also went 2-1 to finish in third and fifth place, respectively.

National Rankings: Minnesota and Northwestern are the only two teams ranked in the current (April 26) ITA Rolex Collegiate Rankings at No. 25 and No. 47, respectively. Six individuals in the Big Ten Championships field are nationally ranked: No. 18

Dan Brakus, Mich.; No. 44 Mashika Washington, Mich. St.; No. 50 Paul Pridmore, Minn.; No. 67 Johan Landsberg, Ind.; No. 73 Ivan Spinner, Penn St.; and No. 99 (tie) Jerry Turek, Ill.

Golden Gopher Season Update: Minnesota was 19-4 overall and 10-0 in the Big Ten during the regular season campaign. The Golden Gophers dropped four regular season matches to nationally-ranked opponents Tennessee, Kansas, Texas A&M, and South Alabama. The Golden Gophers upset No. 15 ranked Notre Dame 5-2 in South Bend, Ind. on April 10 for their first win over the Irish in 10 years.

Big Ten Streak Continues: After a third straight unbeaten regular season, the Golden Gophers have won 36 consecutive Big Ten dual matches. The streak spans over three years and includes six wins at the Big Ten Championships. Minnesota's last conference loss was on May 5, 1991 to Ohio State in the finals of the Big Ten Championships.

Cohen, Gabler and Loel Unbeaten: Golden Gophers' Adam Cohen (Buffalo, Minn.), Ben Gabler (Chambersburg, Pa.), and Ross Loel (Rancho LaCosta, Calif.) are all looking to continue their unbeaten streak in Big Ten dual match play during the Big Ten Championships. Gabler and Loel completed the Big Ten regular season at 10-0 and 9-0, respectively. Cohen is 4-0 in conference play.

Coach David Geatz: David Geatz is in his sixth year as Minnesota's head coach. He has posted a 126-39 record and is 65-8 in the Big Ten at Minnesota. Geatz coached at the University of New Mexico from 1982-87 and has a 247-104 career record. He has guided the Golden Gophers to three Big Ten Championships ('89, '92, '93) and a second in 1991. Geatz is a native of Grand Forks, N.D., where he was one of the finest tennis players in state history with a 103-0 career record. He was also a standout player at the University of New Mexico where he won the WAC doubles title as a junior. Geatz also went on to win eight tournaments as a pro in Europe.

Griak Honored: Head Cross Country/Track & Field Coach Roy Griak was inducted into the Drake Relays Coaches Hall of Fame during ceremonies at the Knapp Center on the Drake University campus in Des Moines, Iowa, last Thursday. Fellow coaches Bob Teel, former track & field mentor at the University of Missouri, and Peter Tegen, coach of the highly successful Wisconsin women's track & field program, joined Coach Griak as 1994 inductees. The trio increased membership in the Hall of Fame to 56. The Hall of Fame was established in 1977 with six charter members, including the founder of the Drake Relays, John L. Griffith.

Great Career: In his 31st season at the helm of the Golden Gopher cross country and track & field programs, Griak has coached a total of 42 All-Americans, including three NCAA national champions (Garry Bjorklund 1971, Ron Backes 1986, Martin Eriksson 1993). 

The duo become the first Golden Gophers to earn Big Ten Player of the Week honors since Joe Westfall was honored on April 6, 1993 for his no-hitter against Penn State.

Gunderson batted .600 (6/10) with three home runs and nine RBI in the four game series against Northwestern last weekend. The native of Faribault, Minn. currently leads the Big Ten in several categories for Conference games only: home runs (10), runs batted in (28), slugging percentage (1.057) and on-base percentage (.589). BIG TEN MEN'S TENNIS AWARD WINNERS ANNOUNCED

Lars Hjarrand of the University of Minnesota was named Freshman of the Year and Golden Gopher Head Coach David Geatz was selected as Coach of the Year at the Big Ten men's tennis awards banquet Thursday night at the Radisson Metrodome Hotel.

Hjarrand, a freshman from Oslo, Norway, is the first Minnesota men's tennis player to earn Freshman of the Year honors. He has had an outstanding rookie season at No. 2 singles with a 27-8 record overall and a 7-2 record in the Big Ten.

For the second straight year Geatz was awarded Big Ten Coach of the Year, as he was selected in 1993 with Northwestern Head Coach Paul Torricelli. GOLDEN GOPHERS ADVANCE TO SEMIFINALS OF BIG TEN MEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Top-seeded Minnesota advanced to the semifinals of the Big Ten Men's Tennis Championships with a 4-1 victory over Illinois Friday at the 4th Street Courts on the U of M campus.

The two-time defending Big Ten champion Golden Gophers captured their 37th consecutive Big Ten conference dual match victory in the process. The last defeat in a league dual match for Head Coach David Geatz's squad was back on May 5, 1991 to Ohio State in the finals of the Big Ten Championships.

"We started off a little shaky at first in the singles play, so it was nice to have the one point advantage from the doubles," Geatz said. "Ben Gabler and Erik Donley played well today. They won together at No. 3 doubles and came back to both win in singles. That gave us a big boost today."

Minnesota will meet Wisconsin, a 4-0 winner over Iowa Friday afternoon, in Saturday's second semifinal at 1:30 p.m. at the 4th Street Courts. The Golden Gophers defeated the Badgers 6-1 back on April 8 in Madison. In Saturday's first semifinal set to begin at 9 a.m., Michigan will face Northwestern. The Wolverines defeated Penn State 4-2 Friday, while the Wildcats scored a 4-0 win over Ohio State. The championship match is at 1:30 p.m. Sunday.

The Golden Gophers then sealed the win with a 2-6, 6-0, 6-4 victory by Hjarrand over Devore at No. 2 singles.

"I had trouble adjusting to the courts in the first set, but as the match went on I got my rhythm and timing," Hjarrand said. "Winning my match and the match for the whole team was great. It was really an exciting way to start off the Big Ten Championships at home."

GOLDEN GOPHERS ADVANCE TO FINALS OF BIG TEN MEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Top-seeded Minnesota moved to within one victory of its third straight conference title with a 4-1 win over Wisconsin in the semifinals of the Big Ten Men's Tennis Championships Saturday at the 4th Street Courts on the U of M campus.

The Golden Gophers, 21-4 overall on the season following Saturday's win, will face Michigan in Sunday's championship match at 1:30 p.m. The Wolverines upended Northwestern 5-0 in Saturday's other semifinal.

Michigan will take a 15-6 overall record into Sunday's championship match. After capturing the doubles portion of the competition against Northwestern to take a 1-0 lead, Dan Brakus at No. 1, Peter Pusztai at No. 3, Adam Wager at No. 5 and Geoff Prentice at No. 6 all won singles matches to secure the semifinal win for the Wolverines.

"We played very solid in all of our doubles matches," Michigan Head Coach Brian Eisner said. "That was the most focused we've been in doubles all year and it really helped set up our singles play. The pressure builds in this tournament with each match, so we will need to continue the focus we had in today's match into tomorrow's championship match."

The last time the University of Minnesota hosted the Big Ten Men's Tennis Championships was in 1987 when Michigan defeated Minnesota 5-2 in the championship match at the 98th Street Courts in Bloomington. Sunday's encounter will mark the first meeting between Minnesota and Michigan in the title match since 1989 when the Golden Gophers defeated the Wolverines 5-2 in Iowa City, Iowa.

Minnesota and Michigan met once during the 1994 regular season, with the Golden Gophers coming away with a 5-2 victory over the Wolverines on April 2 in Ann Arbor, Mich.

The Golden Gophers have now won 38 consecutive Big Ten conference dual matches. The last defeat in a league dual match for Head Coach David Geatz's squad was back on May 5, 1991 to Ohio State in the finals of the Big Ten Championships.

"Tomorrow is one more match and I don't think our players are thinking about the winning streak," Geatz said. "It's great to be at home and we're going to go out and give it our best and try and win our third straight title."

Wisconsin jumped out to a 1-0 advantage against the Golden Gophers by capturing the doubles portion of the match. One point is awarded to the team that wins the best-of-three doubles matches.

At No. 2 doubles, Jordan Richmond and Malcolm Thorne of Wisconsin defeated Minnesota's Ross Loel and Lars Hjarrand 8-4. At No. 3 doubles, Minnesota's Ben Gabler and Erik Donley defeated the Badgers' Jason Zuckerman and Aaron Dubie 8-6. After one doubles win apiece, both teams awaited the result of the No. 1 doubles match.

In a match that went right down to the wire, David Ortiz and Todd Koehler of Wisconsin defeated Minnesota's Paul Pridmore and Adam Krafft 9-8 (7-4 in the tiebreaker) to clinch the doubles point for the Badgers.

"After we dropped the doubles point, I got the team together and told them that there was no reason to panic," Geatz said. "Even though we were down one point, it was important for the guys to go out and play their own matches in singles. We knew that everything would come out alright if everyone just went out and played like they have all year long."

In singles play, Loel topped Dubie 6-3, 6-3 at the No. 4 position to tie the match at 1-1. Gabler, undefeated in Big Ten dual match singles play this season, broke the deadlock with a 6-3, 6-3 victory at No. 6 singles over Mike Goldstein. Minnesota went ahead 3-1 when Hjarrand scored a 1-6, 6-3, 6-2 win over Koehler at the No. 2 singles slot. Seconds later, the Golden Gophers then sealed the win with a 6-3, 6-4 victory by Donley over Zuckerman at No. 5 singles.

"Everything ended so quickly that I didn't feel any pressure to win the match," Donley said. "But it's always nice to have your match be the clincher for the team. It's even better to win your match when it sends you into the championship."

GOLDEN GOPHERS CAPTURE THIRD STRAIGHT BIG TEN MEN'S TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIP

The University of Minnesota men's tennis team captured its third straight Big Ten title Sunday with a 4-0 victory over Michigan at the 4th Street Courts on the U of M campus.

Minnesota became the first team in 10 years to win three straight Big Ten men's tennis titles. Michigan captured 16 consecutive team crowns from 1968-83, which included a co-championship with the Golden Gophers in 1981.

In winning its third straight title, the Golden Gophers finished the Big Ten season with a perfect 13-0 record for the third consecutive year. The win was Minnesota's 39th consecutive in Big Ten dual match play under Head Coach David Geatz. The last Minnesota loss in the Big Ten was on May 5, 1991 to Ohio State in the finals of the Big Ten Championships.

"Winning today's match made me feel excited and relieved," Geatz said. "I am excited because our guys played very well today and captured the Big Ten title. I am relieved that we could continue the streak at home in front of a great crowd."

Minnesota jumped out to a 1-0 lead by capturing two of three doubles matches to win the doubles point. Michigan won the first doubles match on a 9-8 (1) tiebreaker by Peter Pusztai and Grady Burnett over Minnesota's Lars Hjarrand and Ross Loel at the No. 2 position. At No. 3 doubles, Minnesota's Erik Donley and Ben Gabler defeated Michigan's Geoff Prentice and Chris Wyatt in another tiebreaker 9-8 (2). Donley and Gabler overcame two match points to send the match into the tiebreaker.

With one doubles win apiece, Minnesota's No. 1 twosome of Paul Pridmore and Adam Krafft broke the tie with a 9-7 win over Michigan's Dan Brakus and John Costanzo.

Minnesota then won the match quickly with three straight singles wins. At No. 4 singles, Loel defeated Burnett 7-6 (1), 6-4 to give the Golden Gophers a 2-0 advantage. Pridmore, an All-Big Ten selection, then upset Big Ten Player of the Year Dan Brakus 6-3, 6-2 in the No. 1 singles match to up the lead to 3-0.

Hjarrand, the Big Ten Freshman of the Year this season, captured the win for Minnesota with a 6-4, 6-2 victory over Costanzo at the No. 2 singles position.

"The match was the way it should be, one versus two," Geatz said. "The whole tournament went really well. The crowds were wonderful, and it was great to see the former players who are all a part of the Golden Gopher tennis tradition at the tournament."

"I was nervous going into the tournament since everyone was expecting us to win," said Pridmore, who also played the national anthem on guitar before the match. "It was great to win at home in front of our fans."

In other matches Sunday, Northwestern defeated Wisconsin 4-3 for third place, Illinois topped Penn State 4-3 for fifth place, and Ohio State upended Iowa 4-0 for seventh place.

Minnesota and Michigan will compete at the NCAA Region IV Tournament, which begins on Friday at Notre Dame, Ind. Top-seeded Minnesota will face fourth-seeded Ball State at 10:00 a.m., while third-seeded Michigan will face second-seeded Notre Dame at 2:00 p.m. The region finals are on Saturday, with the winner securing a berth in the NCAA Championships to be held May 21-29 at Notre Dame.

"I am really looking forward to next week," Geatz said. "Hopefully we can have an all Big Ten regional final and play Michigan again in Notre Dame."



The University of Minnesota men's golf team was notified today that it had received its second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid based on its sixth-place ranking in the district. The Maroon and Gold will compete at the NCAA Central Regional at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club in Oklahoma City, Okla., on May 19-21. GOLF TEAM NOTCHES SECOND CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNAMENT BID; TRAVELS TO ANN ARBOR FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP THIS WEEKEND

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Before this year's NCAA tournament begins, the Golden Gophers will compete in this weekend's Big Ten Championship in Ann Arbor, Mich, Friday through Sunday. John Means and his charges are looking to improve on last year's third place finish, which was the highest finish at the Big Ten's since 1977.

"We are extremely excited about getting another chance to compete in the NCAA Tournament," said Head Coach John Means. "I think it is a testament to the hard work and determination of our squad that we have elevated our program to the NCAA Tournament level the past two years and we intend to keep it there. But before we tee off at nationals we have the Big Ten Championship this weekend, and our goal is to bring Minnesota its first conference crown since 1972."

Big Ten Update: The Golden Gophers will try to improve on last year's third place finish at the Big Ten Championship, which was the best finish by a Minnesota men's team since 1977. The Maroon and Gold will travel the same five starters that they have the past three trips. Co-captain Phil Ebner (Hudson, Ohio) will lead the way and he hopes to finish his final Big Ten career with a championship ring. Mark Hanson (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), Jonathon Kelly (Mankato, Minn.), Aaron Barber (New London, Minn.), and Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, Minn.) round out the lineup.

Last Week: The Golden Gophers posted a disappointing sixth-place finish at the Bruce Fossum Invitational, when they suffered through without the full services of Ebner who was hospitalized with food poisoning. The sixth-place finish was enough to keep them in the hunt for the NCAA bid. Aaron Barber led the team with a three-round score of 224 which put him in 11th place overall.

MINNESOTA LAST CHANCE MEET SET FOR SATURDAY

In their final tune-up before the Big Ten Championships, Head Coach Roy Griak's Golden Gopher track & field team will host the Minnesota Last Chance Meet on Saturday at the Bierman Track & Field Stadium. The co-ed competition is scheduled to get underway with the field events at 9:30 a.m. The running events will begin at Noon.

Last Weekend: Last weekend was a busy one for the Golden Gophers. On Saturday at the Minnesota Invitational at the Bierman Stadium, juniors Chris Brinkworth (Bloomington, Minn.) and Rob Hydukovich (Bemidji, Minn.) paced the Golden Gophers with outstanding performances. Brinkworth won the discus with a toss of 184-2 and Hydukovich placed second in the shot put behind former Golden Gopher All-American Mark Lacy with a personal-best and NCAA provisional qualifying throw of 58-8 1/2. In the pole vault, senior Martin Eriksson (Stockholm, Sweden) won the event with

a vault of 17-0 3/4, while freshman Tye Harvey (Jamestown, Calif.) was second with a collegiate best of 16-8 3/4. Junior Mark Gonzales (La Habra, Calif.) also turned in a superb effort. He won the 3,000 meters with a clocking of 8:39.25. On Sunday at the Jesse Owens Classic at Columbus, Ohio, senior co-captains Mark Narveson (Mankato, Minn.) and Norris Williams (Milwaukee, Wis.) each ran season-best performances to lead the Golden Gophers. Narveson placed fifth in the 1,500 meters with a time of 3:48.09. Sophomore Paul Michalek (Bloomington, Minn.) finished eighth with a personal-best time of 3:51.31. Williams finished sixth in the 800 meters in 1:50.20. In the high jump, senior co-captain Matt Burns (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) tied for first with a leap of 6-11 3/4.

GOLDEN GOPHERS SWINGING FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE NCAA FINALS APPEARANCE

The Minnesota Golden Gophers men's golf team will head to Edmond, Oklahoma, this Thursday to compete in their second consecutive NCAA Regional Qualifying Tournament. The Maroon and Gold hope to continue the success that has been building slowly since Head Coach John Means' arrival on campus in June, 1990.

In his first season as head coach, Means' squad finished seventh at the Big Ten Championships. From there, in three short years, they have improved to capture third place in the Big Ten Conference for the last two years, their highest places since finishing third in 1977. The Golden Gophers look to duplicate their success from last season when the team finished sixth in NCAA Central Regional play advancing to their first NCAA Tournament bid since 1972. At the 1993 NCAA Finals, the Golden Gophers finished in a tie for 20th, their highest finish since 1962.

"We made great progress with our program last year when we qualified for the NCAA Tournament, but the work has just begun," said Means. "Now we have to continue to improve our team and increase our depth, so we are a consistent Big Ten contender and NCAA Tournament participant."

With the graduation of All-American Joe Gullion in 1993, Coach Means challenged his squad to have someone step up to fill the void on the team, and the men of Maroon and Gold answered. No fewer than four different players have topped the card for the Golden Gophers this year, all in the last four tournaments. Critics would view this as instability, but Means sees it as a testament to his team's depth, character, and competitiveness.

The hottest Golden Gopher lately has been junior Jon Kelly (Mankato). Kelly finished second at this year's Big Ten Championships with a four round total of 285. In that tournament, Kelly posted his career collegiate low-round carding a 70 in the second round. Kelly has a 73.2 stroke average over his last 10 rounds played. He was also the top Gopher at the Golden Flash Invitational in Kent, Ohio on April 21-23 firing a 218 54-hole total, earning an eighth place individual finish. Kelly leads the Maroon and Gold with 80 birdies, hits 12.2% of holes under par and carries a 75.51 stroke average into this year's NCAA Regional Tournament.

Senior captain Phil Ebner (Hudson, Ohio) paves the way for the Golden Gophers. Ebner has a smooth stroke that has helped him hit 76.6% of fairways and 63.7% of greens in regulation. A pre-season All-American by Golf Week, he finished 18th at this year's Big Ten Championships and is looking to regain the form that earned him medalist honors at this year's Pacific Coast Intercollegiate Tournament, March 22-24. In that tournament, Ebner fired a two round total of 140, tying his collegiate low round of 67 in the first round. Ebner enters the NCAA Regional with the fourth-best stroke average on the team at 75.84 and his 10.97 pars per round ranks second on the team.

Junior Aaron Barber (New London), placed 13th at the Big Ten Championships and was the highest Golden Gopher finisher in the Bruce Fossum Invitational, May 6-8, in East Lansing, Mich., when he finished 11th with a 224. Barber is second on the team in eagles, birdies, percent subpar holes, and stroke average. He is competing at the varsity level for the first year, and carries a low round of 71 into the NCAA Regional Tournament.

The most consistent golfer for Coach Means' squad has been junior Mark Hanson (Cedar Rapids, Iowa). Hanson is in the running for Academic All-Big Ten and Academic All-America honors and brings two years of collegiate experience to the team. He is a sharpshooter with a keen eye as his 64.7% for par threes in regulation attests. Hanson has recorded a low round of 70 at the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate this season and was the top Golden Gopher finisher at the Legends of Indiana Invitational on April 17-18 when he finished sixth with a 227. His stroke average is 74 over his last 10 rounds played. Hanson leads the team in pars per round, greens in regulation, and stroke average.

Rounding out the squad is late addition senior Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids). Nielsen has joined the team for the last four tournaments and is the wild card of the team. His lack of experience may hinder him, as his 77.14 stroke average can attest, but he makes up for that with natural talent and competitiveness. Evidence of this is found in his play during this season. Nielsen started out slowly, averaging 78.67 per round in his first two tournaments. As he played more and grew more comfortable with his role on the team, his stroke average has fallen to 75.86 over his last seven rounds. In the short time he has been with the team, he already leads the team in eagles with two. He fired his low round of 71 during the 1993 spring season at the Wolverine Invitational. At this year's Big Ten Championships, Nielsen finished 22nd with a 298. Nielsen was also a four-year letterwinner for the Minnesota hockey team and served as co-captain for the team last year, helping the team to the NCAA Finals in St. Paul, Minn., where they finished with the Third-place trophy. He has been drafted by the New York Rangers and will probably pursue a professional hockey career next fall.

MEN'S GOLF TEAM FINISHES THIRD AT 1994 BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

With a four round total of 1,159, the University of Minnesota men's golf team finished third at the 1994 Big Ten Championships held in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Wisconsin, placing three individuals among the top 10, won their second consecutive conference title with 1,151, becoming the first team to repeat as Big Ten champions since Ohio State accomplished the feat in 1989 and 1990. Northwestern was second, five strokes ahead of the Golden Gophers at 1,154.

Leading the way for the Golden Gophers was Junior Jon Kelly (Mankato), who fired a 72-hole total of 285 to finish in a tie for second place with Brian Payne from Northwestern. Wisconsin senior Ben Walter captured medalist honors with a 274 total over the four day tournament. Golden Gopher junior Mark Hanson (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) finished in a tie for ninth with Wisconsin's Jim Pejka with a 292. Third for the Golden Gophers was junior Aaron Barber (New London) who fired a fourth round 74 to finish tied for 13th with a 295. Senior captain Phil Ebner (Hudson, Ohio) regained his composure after struggling in the second and third rounds to card a final round 72 to finish tied for 18th with a 296. Rounding out the card for the Maroon and Gold was junior Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids) who, in only his fourth tournament of the season, fired a four round total of 298 to finish tied for 22nd.

This Thursday the Golden Gophers will travel to Edmond, Oklahoma, to compete in the NCAA Central Regional Tournament.



BASEBALL TEAM HEADS TO THE BIG TEN TOURNAMENT AGAIN

The University of Minnesota baseball team (39-17, 21-7) will head into this week's Big Ten Tournament on an up note despite losing the fourth game of their series against Indiana 9-5 on Sunday. The Golden Gophers took three out of four games from the Hoosiers, including a come from behind victory in the second game of Saturday's doubleheader.

The Maroon and Gold scored four runs in the fifth and five runs in the sixth inning as they rallied from a 7-1 deficit to win 12-7.

Gunderson Ties Big Ten Home Run Record: Sophomore first baseman **Shane Gunderson** (Faribault, Minn.) tied the Big Ten home run

record with his 14th Big Ten clout during Sunday's contest. Gunderson tied the record in the sixth inning when he hit a two-run homer, his second of the day, to right center field. It was Gunderson's third multiple-home run game of the season. The home run ties him with Michael Smith of Indiana who hit 14 Big Ten homers in 1992. Gunderson hit .600 (9/15) with four home runs and six RBI against the Hoosiers in the four-game series.

Merila Watch: All-America second baseman **Mark Merila** (Sr., Plymouth, Minn.) knocked in three runs over the weekend and is now second on Minnesota's all-time RBI list with 169. Merila is six behind leader Tom Steinbach (1980-83), who knocked in 175 runs. His .458 batting average to date is on pace to break Minnesota's single-season record (.443, John Peterson 1970). His career batting average of .392 stands to break the all-time career mark of Brent Gates who hit .387 as a Golden Gopher from 1989-91.

Strength of Schedule: The Golden Gophers have played one of the toughest schedules in all of collegiate baseball. They started the season against five of the top 11 teams in the nation. They have played 11 games against teams ranked in the top 25 including games at

Georgia Tech, Florida State and Miami.

Mobililia Goes Out With a Bang: Senior shortstop **Bill Mobililia** (Ely, Minn.) struck out in each of his first three at-bats in his final game at Siebert Field. In his final at-bat in the bottom of the seventh inning against Indiana on Sunday, Mobililia hit a two-run homer to close the deficit to 9-5. It was Mobililia's ninth home run of the season.

Karrmann Sets Single-Season Appearance Record: Senior reliever **Jason Karrmann** (Platteville, Wis.) set Minnesota's single season appearance record for the second consecutive season with his 26th appearance on Wednesday against Minnesota-Duluth. Karrmann, with 27 appearances this season, has appeared in 72 contests in his career.

Hammer Time: Junior left-hander **Andy Hammerschmidt** (New Ulm, Minn.) threw his first career shutout on Friday night in a 4-0 win against Indiana. Hammerschmidt retired 12 of his last 14 batters and faced four batters over the minimum.

The Big Ten Tournament: The Golden Gophers enter the tournament as the No. 2 seed. They have appeared in every tournament except one--1989. Minnesota has won five tournaments 1982, 1985, 1988, 1992 and 1993 (declared).

In The Opener: Minnesota will face Michigan in the tournament opener Thursday at 3:30 p.m. EST. Michigan holds a 57-51 all-time advantage over Minnesota. The two schools met in Ann Arbor, Mich. May 8-9, splitting a four-game set. Minnesota took games one and three by 5-2 and 1-0 scores, while Michigan grabbed the other two games 2-1, 2-0.

Record Against 1994 Tournament Opponents: Minnesota is 6-3 this season against the competition they will face in Battle Creek, Mich. The Golden Gophers are 1-0 against Ohio State, 3-1 versus Michigan State and 2-2 against Michigan.

Minnesota Climbs To 18th in Baseball America Poll: Minnesota continues to climb in the *Baseball America* Top 25 rankings. The Golden Gophers are among the top 25 for a fourth straight week, claiming the 18th spot. It is Minnesota's highest ranking on the list since February 14 of this season, when they started out the year at 0-3. Minnesota is also ranked 26th in this week's *Collegiate Baseball* poll. It is the third time that the Golden Gophers have been ranked in that poll since the pre-season.

**MEN'S TENNIS CAMPAIGN ENDS
AFTER OUTSTANDING SEASON**

The Golden Gophers men's tennis season came to an end Saturday after a 4-3 loss to Notre Dame at the NCAA Region IV Qualifying Tournament in Notre Dame, Ind. The loss ended a string of 14 straight dual match wins for the Golden Gophers.

Minnesota reached the final by defeating Ball State 4-2 in the opening match of the regional on Friday.

Minnesota Tennis Success in '93-'94: Despite Saturday's loss, the 1993-94 men's tennis team had an outstanding season. Head Coach David Geatz lead Minnesota to a 23-5 overall record this season, including a 13-0 Big Ten mark en route to a third straight conference title. The Golden Gophers' five losses all came against nationally-ranked opponents, four of which were in the top 20.

In Geatz's six years at Minnesota he has posted a 130-40 overall record, which includes an 84-18 record the past four seasons.

Pridmore/Krafft in NCAA's: Senior captain Paul Pridmore (North Aurora, Ill.) and junior Adam Krafft (Saginaw, Mich.) were selected to compete in the individual competition of the NCAA Championships to be held May 25-29 in Notre Dame. Pridmore will compete in singles, and will also team-up with Krafft and play in the doubles competition of the championships.

20 Plus Wins Club: Five of the top six singles players had strong singles seasons, posting 20 or more wins. Pridmore has a career high 33-13 record heading into the NCAA Championships. Junior **Ross Loel (Marina Del Ray, Calif.)** posted his third straight 20 win season with a 32-9 record at No.3 and 4 singles. Sophomore **Erik Donley (Duluth, Minn.)** set his career best mark with a 28-9 record this season. Freshman **Ben Gabler (Chambersburg, Pa.)** and **Lars Hjarrand (Oslo, Norway)** both had outstanding inaugural seasons with records of 26-7 and 31-9, respectively.

GOLF TEAM TRAVELS TO NORMAN OKLAHOMA FOR NCAA CENTRAL REGIONAL

The University of Minnesota men's golf team will compete in the NCAA Central Regional at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club in Oklahoma City, Okla., on May 19-21. The NCAA Finals are at Stonebridge Country Club in Dallas, Texas, on June 1-4. The NCAA Tournament appearance is the second consecutive for Minnesota.

Last year, Minnesota was awarded an NCAA bid for the first time since 1972. The Golden Gophers traveled to Columbus, Ohio, for the NCAA Central Regional and finished sixth, advancing to the NCAA Finals in Lexington, Ky., where they finished tied for 20th. That 20th-place finish was the highest since 1962.

Big Ten Recap: The Golden Gophers matched last year's third-place finish again this year as they were passed on the final day by

Northwestern and finished with a four-round team score of 1159.

Jonathon Kelly (Mankato, Minn.), led the way for the Maroon and Gold as he posted a score of 72-70-69-74=285 and finished in a tie for second overall. **Mark Hanson (Cedar Rapids, Iowa)**, was second for the Golden Gophers and ninth in the tourney with a 72-71-78-74=292, and score. **Aaron Barber (New London, Minn.)**, finished tied for 13th at 295, and co-captain **Phil Ebner (Hudson, Ohio)** posted a score of 296 to finish 18th. **Jeff Nielsen (Grand Rapids, Minn.)** fired a score of 73-73-74-78=298 to finish tied for 22nd. That gave Minnesota five golfers in the top 25 and if they continue to play at that level their chances of advancing out of the NCAA regional to the finals is very good.

Central Regional: Ten teams will advance out of the NCAA Central Regional in Edmund, Okla. The tournament is being played at Oklahoma Golf and Country Club. The NCAA Finals are being played in Dallas, Tex., at the Stonebridge Country Club on June 1-4.



GOPHERS TO MEET KENT IN NCAA FIRST ROUND GAME FRIDAY

Head Coach John Anderson's fourth-seeded Golden Gopher baseball team (40-19, 21-7 Big Ten) will meet third-seeded Kent (33-15, 18-7 Mid-American) on Friday in the first round of the NCAA Tournament's Atlantic I Regional in Miami, Fla. The game time is TBA.

Minnesota vs. Kent: Minnesota has a 2-0 advantage in the all-time series against Kent. The two schools met back on May 29-30, 1964, at the District 4 playoffs in Kent, Ohio. The Golden Gophers swept the best two-out-of-three series, 9-4 and 13-2, en route to the College World Series where they won the school's third NCAA Championship in nine years.

Big Ten Tournament Recap: The Golden Gophers lost two of three games at the Big Ten Tournament last week at Battle Creek, Mich. Minnesota was looking to win its third straight Big Ten Tournament title. The Maroon & Gold defeated Michigan 8-1 in the opener Thursday, and then lost

6-5 to Ohio State Friday. The Golden Gophers were then eliminated when they fell 4-2 to Michigan Saturday. Senior second baseman **Mark Merila** (Plymouth, Minn.) and senior outfielder **Charlie Nelson** (Perham, Minn.) were named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. Merila went 3-for-9 with two RBI in the tournament, while Nelson went 6-for-15 with three stolen bases, three runs and one RBI.

Merila Earns Big Ten Player of the Year Honors: All-American second baseman Mark Merila was selected by the Big Ten coaches as Big Ten Co-Player of the Year. Merila shared the honor with Ohio State left-hander Matt Beaumont and catcher Jonathan Sweet. Merila is the first Golden Gopher to become Big Ten Player of the Year since Brent Gates won the award in 1991. Merila currently leads the team with a .451 batting average, which is on pace to break John Peterson's mark of .443 set back in 1970. Also, his career .392 batting average can break Minnesota's record (.387 - Gates, 1989-91). Merila's career RBI total of 171 is five short of breaking Minnesota's all-time RBI record (175 - Tom Steinbach, 1980-83).

All-Big Ten Teams: Joining Merila on the first team All-Big Ten were pitchers **Jim Brower** (Jr., Minnetonka, Minn.) and **Brad Kearin** (So., Minnetonka, Minn.) and outfielder **Charlie Nelson** (Perham, Minn.). It marks the second year in a row that four Minnesota players were put on the first team. Three other players were named to the second team All-Big Ten. Senior shortstop **Bill Mobilia** (Ely, Minn.), junior catcher **Darren Grass** (St. Paul, Minn.) and sophomore first baseman **Shane Gunderson** (Faribault, Minn.) were selected. Junior outfielder **Wes Denning** (St. Paul, Minn.) earned third team All-Big Ten honors.

Denning Sets Single Season Runs Scored Record: Center fielder Wes Denning scored two runs in the Big Ten Tournament which gave him 68 runs scored this season, establishing a new Minnesota record. The previous mark was held by J.T. Bruett who scored 67 runs back in 1988. Denning broke the record when he scored a run in Saturday's 4-2 loss against Michigan.

Westfall Pitches a Gem: Sophomore right-hander **Joe Westfall** (Marathon, Wis.) tossed his first complete game of the season on Thursday in an 8-1 victory over Michigan at the Big Ten Tournament. Westfall pitched the longest outing of his career as he went nine innings and allowed one run on five hits. He had a shutout going into the ninth, but allowed a one-out triple to Brian Simmons, who eventually scored on a ground out. Westfall retired 14 of the last 15 batters he faced, including 11 straight at one point.

Vandersall is Named District Five Academic All-American: Junior outfielder/catcher **Mark Vandersall** (Plymouth, Minn.) was named a District Five Academic All-American. Vandersall is double-majoring in management and pre-med.

Junior **Rob Hydukovich** (Bemidji, Minn.) placed sixth in both the discus and shot with throws of 169-6 and 57-9, respectively. Freshman **Jason Schlueter** (New London, Wis.) finished fifth in the discus with a throw of 174-5. Senior **Martin Eriksson** (Stockholm, Sweden) was the runner-up in the pole vault with an NCAA provisional qualifying mark of 17-10 1/4. Freshman **Tye Harvey** (Jamestown, Calif.) finished eighth with a vault of 15-10 1/2. ERIKSSON RECEIVES TOP HONOR AT M BANQUET

Martin Eriksson, a senior from Stockholm, Sweden, was named recipient of the University of Minnesota's Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor at the M Banquet on Tuesday at the Radisson Metrodome Hotel in Minneapolis.


