## Weekly Release

**On Tap This Week:** Minnesota (11-3) will play a trio of games this week starting Tuesday night with St. Scholastica at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday night, the Golden Gophers take on Gustavus Adolphus at 6:30 p.m., and Friday night the team will finish the week with Mankato State (1-1) with a game at 6:30 p.m.

**Radio:** In his third year as the radio voice of the Golden Gophers, Paul Barnes will provide play-by-play and color commentary of Minnesota's game with Mankato State Friday night on KKMS-AM (980).

**In the Series:** The Golden Gophers hold a combined 52-11 mark against this week's opponents. Tuesday night's game with St. Scholastica will mark the first meeting between the two teams. Minnesota holds a 14-0 edge over Gustavus Adolphus, winning the last meeting by a 12-2 margin on April 28, 1993.

The Golden Gophers have a 38-11 advantage in the series with the Mankato State, although the Mavericks won the last meeting 7-5 at Siebert Field April 30.

**Minnesota Goes 2-1 at the Hormel Classic:** The Golden Gophers went 2-1 in the 1998 Hormel Foods Baseball Classic, improving their overall record to 11-3. Minnesota opened the tournament with a 9-8 win over Rutgers. Minnesota started off the attack with a five-run first inning, highlighted by sophomore **Mike Arlt's (Lakeville, Minn.)** lead-off triple. Arlt and sophomore **Matt Scanlon (Richfield, Minn.)** each had three hits as Arlt went 3-for-4 and Scanlon went 3-for-5.

In Saturday's game vs. California, the Golden Bears defeated the Golden Gophers 9-7. Cal's Xavier Nady hit a two-run triple in the eighth to lead his team past the Gophers. Junior **Robb Quinlan (Maplewood, Minn.)** hit his fourth home run of the season in the loss.

Minnesota cruised to an 11-1 win over Connecticut on Sunday on the strength of five and 2/3 scoreless innings from junior right-hander **Kai Freeman (Shorewood, Ill.)**. Four pitchers combined in a five-hitter for the Golden Gophers, including Freeman, sophomore **Dan McGrath (Victoria, Australia)**, freshman **Kurt Haring (Champlin, Minn.)** and sophomore **Vince Gangl (Nashauk, Minn.)**.

**Golden Gophers Equal Start of 1976 Team:** The Golden Gophers are 11-3 this season, matching the start of the 1976 team that opened the year with a 19-3

## ALL-TOURNEY TEAM

Three Golden Gophers were named to the Hormel Foods Classic All-Tournament team in first baseman Robb Quinlan, pitcher Kai Freeman and outfielder Mike Arlt. Quinlan hit two home runs over the weekend, and Freeman pitched 6 2/3 scoreless innings in two appearances. Arlt was among the batting leaders with a .538 average. The three selections mark the most for Minnesota since 1994 when four Gophers were named all-tournament including infielder Mark Merila, outfielders Wes Denning and Charlie Nelson and pitcher Andy Hammerschmidt.

mark. That team started 6-3 before winning its next 13 games for the 19-3 start. With a seven-game winning streak to open this season, the Golden Gophers accomplished their best start since 1935. That squad earned the best start in school history, winning nine straight en route to a 17-3 record and the Big Ten championship.

**About Anderson:** In his 17th season at the helm, Golden Gopher Head Coach **John Anderson** holds a career record of 571-372-3 and a Big Ten mark of 233-133. He is one of the youngest coaches in the nation to surpass the 500-win plateau and is the second active Big Ten coach to reach 200 conference victories. Anderson has led the Golden Gophers to four Big Ten titles (1982, 1985, 1988, and 1992) in his tenure at the U of M.

**The .300 Club:** Eleven of Minnesota's hitters are batting at least .300 this season. Overall, the team is hitting at a .351 clip (186-530) with 113 RBIs. Sophomore **Mike Arlt (Lakeville, Minn.)** leads the team with a scorching .435 average (20-46). Junior **Craig Selander (West St. Paul, Minn.)** is the team leader in slugging percentage with a .660 mark. He has eight extra-base hits this season, including three home runs. Junior **Robb Quinlan (Maplewood, Minn.)** leads the team with four home runs on the season, including two vs. Iowa State and two in the Hormel Classic last weekend.

**Minnesota with the Bat:** The Golden Gophers have knocked in a grand total of 129 runs this season for an average of 9.2 runs per game. Last year through 14 games, the team had only scored 84 runs (6.0 rpg). This season, Minnesota's opponents have scored only 86 runs, an average of 6.1 per contest.

Senior **Mark Groebner (Coon Rapids, Minn.)** leads the team with 18 RBIs, including five at the Hormel Classic. Sophomore **Matt Scanlon (Richfield, Minn.)** has knocked in 17 runs and junior **Craig Selander (West St. Paul, Minn.)** has knocked in 15.

**More on Minnesota's Bats:** The Golden Gophers have pounded out an average of 13.3 hits per game. Minnesota has reached double figures for hits in 12 of its 14 games, including a season-high 18 in wins over Iowa State (3/4) and Rutgers (3/6).

Quinlan is the team leader with 23 hits on the season, including his 4-for-5 performance, which included two home runs, in the 12-6 win over Iowa State March 4.

**Birk Sets Career High with 10 Strikeouts:** Sophomore **Ben Birk (St. Paul, Minn.)** set a career high when he fanned 10 batters in Minnesota's win over Nebraska Feb. 15, surpassing his previous high of nine set in a 7-5 loss to Mankato State last year (April 30) at Siebert Field. The left-hander earned his first collegiate victory in Minnesota's 15-9 win vs. Washington and leads the team with 28 strikeouts in four appearances.

**On the Mound:** Minnesota's pitchers have a combined 4.92 ERA this season. Two Golden Gophers have ERAs under 2.00 led by junior **Brad Pautz (Reedsville, Wis.)**, who has played the role of closer thus far this season. Pautz has a 1.59 ERA, giving up only three earned runs in 17 innings this season. He leads the team with two saves and has a 2-1 record in eight appearances. Freshman **Jason Shupe (Spencer, Wis.)** holds a 1.69 ERA in 5.1 innings with a 1-0 record.

**San Diego Update:** On the spring trip to San Diego, the Golden Gophers hit .320 with 87 hits in 272 at-bats. Senior **Mark**

**Groebner (Coon Rapids, Minn.)** led the team hitting a remarkable .591 (13-22) with 11 RBIs while in San Diego. Junior **Matt Brosseau (North Oaks, Minn.)** hit .438 (8-23) on the trip. As a team, the Golden Gophers scored 67 runs, an average of 9.57 per game, compared with only 51, 7.29 runs per game, for their opponents.

**Records Watch:** Junior All-America candidate **Robb Quinlan (Maplewood, Minn.)** is poised to climb to the top of Minnesota's record book for career doubles. With his school single-season record of 29 doubles last year and three on Minnesota's trip to San Diego, he moved into sixth place, just four two-baggers away from Tony Bender and Jeff Monson, who each had 45 during their careers at the U of M.

**Extra Innings:** Already this season, the Golden Gophers have gone into extra innings three times with a 2-1 record. Last year, the team played three total extra innings games, coming away with losses in all three affairs.

**Comeback Kids:** Minnesota has come from behind in four games so far this year. Most recently the team was down 2-1 to San Diego in the third inning before coming back to win 3-2 on Feb. 26. The largest deficit Minnesota has overcome was five runs on Feb. 25 when it trailed San Diego State 11-6 heading into the sixth inning. Minnesota posted six runs in its half of the sixth inning to take the lead en route to a 18-12 victory.

**1997 Review:** The Golden Gophers finished with a 30-24 overall record for their 35th consecutive winning season and took fifth in the Big Ten with a 15-10 mark. The team finished strong, winning seven of its final eight games.

Senior pitcher **Mike Diebolt**, who set the single-season strikeout record previously held by Dave Winfield, was named first-team All-Big Ten along with outfielder **Robb Quinlan**, who set the single-season mark with 29 doubles.

Infielder **Eric Welter** and pitchers **Ted Zrust** and **Justin Pederson** were honored on the third-team All-Big Ten squad. A total of nine letterwinners, including Quinlan and six position starters, return to the 1998 team.

**Minnesota Baseball to Honor Coach "Ike":** The Golden Gophers honored a special part of Minnesota's baseball tradition at this year's Pro-Alumni Game when the team retired the jersey of longtime volunteer assistant coach Herb "Ike" Isakson. Isakson, who retired from active coaching following last season, dedicated 34 years to the Golden Gopher baseball team as a vol-

unteer coach. An honorary "M" letterwinner, Isakson also received the Men's Athletics Distinguished Service award. Later this season, his number will be hung on the walls of Siebert Field, joining the numbers of Paul Molitor, Dave Winfield, Dave Chelesnik and Dick Siebert.

**The Program:** The Golden Gopher baseball program is one filled with a history of success and pride. Among the facts:

- 83 winning seasons
- 35 consecutive winning seasons
- Only five losing seasons in the last 63 years
- 17 Big Ten Championships, 15 in the last 42 seasons
- 21 NCAA appearances
- Five College World Series appearances
- Three NCAA titles

**Professionally Speaking:** Six former Golden Gophers are currently members of Major League rosters. Minnesota's current Major Leaguers include Minnesota Twins Paul Molitor, Terry Steinbach and Brent Gates, Atlanta Braves Denny Neagle and Kerry Ligtenberg and Seattle Mariner Dan Wilson. In addition, Brian Raabe is playing on a major league roster in Japan.

**Home Field, Dome Field Advantage:** Minnesota will play 29 home games this season with 17 at the Metrodome (home of the Minnesota Twins), including the Golden Gophers' Big Ten opener vs. Purdue, March 27-29. In the month of March, Minnesota will play all 14 of its games in the Metrodome. The other 12 home games will be played at Siebert Field, Minnesota's on-campus home.

**KKMS-AM (980) and Midwest Sports Channel to Broadcast Games in 1998:** The University of Minnesota announced that KKMS-AM (980) will broadcast 40 games, including all of Minnesota's Big Ten Conference games. Paul Barnes will be entering his third year as the radio voice of the Golden Gophers.

Midwest Sports Channel will televise four games beginning with last week's Connecticut vs. Minnesota game in the Hormel Foods Baseball Classic. Other games on MSC will include the March 29 matchup with Purdue, the first game of the doubleheader with Iowa on April 4 and the first game of the April 25 doubleheader with Indiana. Former Golden Gopher center fielder Ryan Lefebvre will handle the broadcast duties for MSC.
