**1. 1HEALTH UPDATE**

Ms. Myers welcomed the committee and asked for introductions.

The 1Health team, comprised of Brian Sick, team lead, and team members Cheri Friedrich, and Amy Pittenger, attended the meeting to discuss interprofessional education. Ms. Friedrich gave an overview of the phases of the 1Health learning process, which serves as a framework for interprofessional health profession collaboration. They are currently devoting resources and attention to developing activities involving giving care to patients in controlled environments. 1Health "...provides opportunities for students in medicine, nursing, pharmacy, public health, dentistry, veterinary medicine and allied health to gain exposure to and develop the skills needed for an interprofessional collaborative practice via awareness, immersion, and mastery" (Source: <http://www.ahceducation.umn.edu/1Health/index.htm>).

The team invited members from the committee to attend various meetings in which student input is needed involving curriculum development, experiential education, and 1Health. Members expressed interest in attending meetings when their schedules permit and they invited the 1Health team to regularly attend committee meetings. Members then asked the following questions:

- Will the Dental School, including Dental Hygiene be involved? Yes, the community program will involve the Dental School and Dental Hygiene. Ms. Martin mentioned that Dental Hygiene recently visited nursing homes and this could be an opportunity for interprofessional experiences, for example Nursing could be included.
- Will the curriculum be the same for all of the programs? There will be a required interprofessional curriculum for each program, but it will be customizable because each program has different needs. For example, programs such as Nursing, Medicine, and Pharmacy will naturally have interprofessional opportunities.
- There will never be more than three students on a team to avoid overcrowding and overwhelming patients.

Members discussed that a closer relationship with 1Health would be beneficial to the committee. The feedback that they could offer to the 1Health team and information that they would receive would help members communicate the value of the committee. Dr. Sick asked members to forward opportunities for interprofessional education to Ms. Kunden, as they are always looking to integrate existing activities and gather new ideas.

Hearing no further business, Ms. Myers adjourned the meeting.
