Fact Box

BIG TEN MAGIC

The Golden Gophers have been known as the Big Ten Champions of the 1990s. Since 1910, Minnesota has won 14 Big Ten titles. The greatest streak was from 1992-95, when the Golden Gophers strung together four straight championship years. All four of those titles were under the direction of head coach David Geatz.

MINNESOTA AT THE BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS: The No. 21-ranked Golden Gopher tennis team will bring a solid array of talent and experience to the 2000 Big Ten Championships in Bloomington, Ind., this weekend. So far this season, Minnesota has come across much success in the Big Ten Conference as well as in tournaments played and other competitions. Currently, the Golden Gophers are 20-5 overall and 9-1 in the Big Ten. Minnesota's only Big Ten loss was to three-time defending tournament champion and top-seeded Illinois, 4-3, two weeks ago.

The 9-1 league mark represents the best since Minnesota won the Big Ten title in 1995. In that year, Minnesota went 12-2 in the conference en route to claiming its fourth consecutive regular season crown. In 1996, the Golden Gophers compiled an 11-3 Big Ten record placing third. In addition, Minnesota went 4-6 in the conference the following year and 7-3 last year, both of which marked third place finishes as well.

LAST YEAR REVISITED: Last year Minnesota finished 7-3 in the Big Ten in dual matches. Heading into the Big Ten Championships, Minnesota could have finished anywhere from first to dead last. However, after winning their first game against Indiana 4-0, the fourth-seeded Golden Gophers were eliminated by Illinois in the semi-finals by a score of 4-0 to finish the tournament in a three-way tie.

In the first round, Minnesota squared off against Indiana. After going head-to-head in a close battle with the Hoosiers which resulted in Minnesota winning 4-3 earlier in the season, the Golden Gophers pinned a 4-0 shutout to Indiana in the second meeting.

In the semi-finals of the championships, the outcome was reversed as Minnesota fell victim to a 4-0 shutout at the hands of the Fighting Illini. Prior to their meeting with Illinois, the Golden Gophers won three straight matches and will enter this year's pool on a three-game winning streak as well, aiming to be the spoiler of Illinois' fourth straight Big Ten tournament championship.

ranks third all-time in most Big Ten championships won. Since 1910, the Golden Gophers have tallied 15 team championships, 14 of which were combined with seven each in singles and doubles. Minnesota's mark of 15 titles, ranks behind Michigan (36) and Chicago (20) while Illinois is fourth (12). Although the tournament has belonged to Illinois the past three years, the Golden Gophers have the ammunition to claim its first crown since 1995.

THE LONE RANKER: University of Minnesota freshman Harsh Mankad is the only Golden Gopher to be ranked among the ITA's Division I national singles leaders. Ranked 94th, Mankad has compiled an overall record of 28-18 this season and a 7-3 mark in the Big Ten.

Mankad, whose overall record is a third best in singles for Minnesota this season, also ranks sixth in the Big Ten at the No. 3 slot. Currently 14-10 this spring, Mankad won his first eight of nine matches in the first 11 days of the spring season (Jan. 4-15). In addition, four of his five wins this past fall came consecutively.

HAUG WILD: Sophomore Thomas Haug of Zurich, Switzerland, who was a late addition to the University of Minnesota men's tennis team a year ago, is the Golden Gophers' No. 2 singles threat. Haug, who ranks sixth in the Big Ten (8-2) in the No. 2 singles slot, has done some damage winning seven straight matches over league opponents this season. Despite winning seven consecutive Big Ten matches, Haug has cooled off considerably in the latter part of the season dropping his last two of three meetings with league opponents.

PARRY DANGEROUS: Junior Tyson Parry posted the best overall singles record of his career this season. Competing in the No. 5 singles spot, Parry ranks sixth in the Big Ten with a record of 2-0 and leads the Golden Gophers with an overall singles record of 20-3 this spring and a Big Ten mark of 8-1.

SVENSSON PLAYING WELL: Junior sensation Jon Svensson stands perfect in the Big Ten in No. 6 singles this

season with a record of 9-0. Svensson, who has compiled a 14-6 mark this spring, holds the fourth longest winning streak in school history. Svensson put together a streak of 16 consecutive matches won from January 16 to April 22 in 1998.

ON THE DOUBLE: With an even record of 5-5 in the Big Ten, Minnesota's No. 1 doubles team of Martin Michalowski and Thomas Haug currently rank sixth in the league with their .500 mark. Despite their quiet 5-5 showing this season, the duo stands at 18-11 overall and ranks 25th in the nation. Earlier this season, the tandem strung together a five-game winning streak which spanned over 16 days (March 3-19, 2000).

DUENAS DOMINATES: No. 1 singles standout Jorge Duenas is 30-10 overall, 7-2 in the Big Ten this season which is a second best on the team. In the fall, Duenas was nearly flawless as he won 10 straight matches before losing his final meeting to post a 10-1 record. This spring, Duenas is 17-6 and ranks sixth in the Big Ten in No. 1 singles. In addition, Duenas combined with Harsh Mankad to post a 17-4 record in No. 2 doubles. Seven of those 17 wins were over Big Ten opponents as the pair's only league loss was to Illinois' Jeff Laski and Jamal Parker.

MAGICAL MICHALOWSKI: Martin Michalowski is Minnesota's lone senior on the 1999-2000 and will compete in his last Big Ten Championships tournament this weekend. Michalowski put together a spring record of 18-5 as the Golden Gophers' No. 4 singles player this season. Additionally, Michalowski combined with Thomas Haug in No. 1 doubles to post an overall mark of 18-11.

ASSISTANT COACH ADAM COHEN: Adam Cohen begins his second season as the assistant coach for the Golden Gophers men's tennis team. Cohen also handles a great deal of the recruiting responsibilities for the Golden Gophers.

In his first year at Minnesota, Cohen assisted in leading the Golden Gophers to a 13-12 overall record including a NCAA berth and a tie for third at the Big Ten Championships. he also has worked very hard to get recruits to commit to Minnesota such as Harsh Mankad, the first ever tennis player to join the program from India.

Cohen is a 1997 graduate of the University of Minnesota, with a bachelor of arts degree in history. As a collegiate athlete, the Buffalo, Minn., native compiled a 29-13 overall record and earned two letters as a member of two Big Ten championship teams in 1994-95. Prior to his days as a Golden Gopher, Cohen earned three letters, compiling an overall record of 23-1 at Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. Cohen was a four-year all-conference player at Buffalo High School.

GEATZ RETURNS FOR HIS 12TH SEASON: Head Tennis Coach David Geatz returns for his 12th season with the Golden Gophers. In 12 seasons, Geatz has compiled a 225-101 overall record in dual meets. In addition, Geatz has led the Golden Gophers to five Big Ten Championships in nine seasons at the helm. He has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (1991, '92 and '94) and was named Region IV Coach of the Year in 1994. In 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach, his teams have put together 20-win seasons on 10 occasions.
