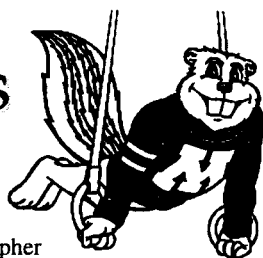

LAST WEEK/THIS WEEK: Golden Gopher senior co-captain **JASON KROB** (St. Charles, Mo.) scored a career-high 9.875 to finish in first place at the NCAA East Regional held at the University of Illinois late Saturday night. Krob bested his previous career-high of 9.825 which he set his sophomore year in a meet against the University of Iowa. Prior to the NCAA East Regional, Krob was ranked No. 5 in the nation on the pommel horse. He defeated the No. 1-ranked pommel horse performer, Penn State's Brandon Stefaniak, by five one-hundredths of a point. This now qualifies him for the NCAA Men's Gymnastics Championships which will be held at the University of Nebraska on April 22-24. Also scoring well for the Golden Gophers were freshman **JUSTIN LECHER** (West St. Paul, Minn.) and **TODD GUILBEAU** (Houston, Texas). Lecher scored a 9.7 on the pommel horse to finish in a tie for 12th place while Todd Guilbeau scored a 9.575 on the horizontal bar to also finish in a tie for 12th place. Both will now wait to see if they are selected to participate in the NCAA Championships.

HOLY KROB!!!!: Senior co-captain Jason Krob continues to lead the Golden Gophers in his specialty event, the pommel horse. Krob scored a career-high 9.875 at the NCAA East Regional last weekend to take home first place honors. In the process, Krob defeated the No. 1-ranked pommel horse performer in Penn State's Brandon Stefaniak. The 9.875 is also the second-highest pommel horse score ever recorded by a Golden Gopher gymnast. He ties former Gopher Brian Yee's 9.875

recorded at the Big Ten Championships in 1995. Krob will now compete at the NCAA Championships at the University of Nebraska on April 22-24.

THE FRESHMEN: Freshmen Todd Guilbeau, Justin Lecher and **JUSTIN CONNER** (Dallas, Texas) have all put together outstanding freshman campaigns. All three competed at the NCAA Regional last weekend. Both Guilbeau and Lecher turned in 12th-place finishes in their respective events. Guilbeau scored a 9.575 on his horizontal bar routine, while Lecher turned in a 9.7 on his pommel horse routine. Both will now wait and see if their scores earned them the right to participate in the NCAA Championships. Conner, on the other hand, scored a 9.0 on his horizontal bar routine to finish in 42nd place. With these three freshmen in the line-up, next season could be a whole new ballgame for the Golden Gophers.

HAZY SHADE OF WINTER: Junior **RYAN WINTERBOURNE** (Anaheim, Calif.) had a strong second half of the season after overcoming some injury problems early on this season. Competing in just his second all-around this season against UIC, the junior turned in a team season high score of 56.0, good for first place. It was also his career-high score. Competing on the still rings and parallel bars at the NCAA East Regional last weekend, Winterbourne scored a disappointing 8.25 on his still rings routine to finish 54th. He improved in his parallel bar routine where he scored a 9.1 to finish 42nd. It was the first time he had competed in the NAAs.

MINNESOTA FINISHES THIRD AT BELL-SOUTH INTERCOLLEGIATE:

On the strength of four golfers finishing in the top 20 individually, the sixth-ranked University of Minnesota men's golf team finished in third place Saturday afternoon in the 12-team Bellsouth Yellow Pages Intercollegiate at the MacGregor Downs Country Club in Cary, N.C. The Golden Gophers fired a final round, two-over par score of 290, the second best team score of the tournament's final 18 holes.

The showing was Minnesota's sixth top three finish in nine tournaments this season. The Golden Gophers have gathered a first place trophy (Dr. Pepper Intercollegiate), a runner-up finish (Compaq U.S. Collegiate), and a third-place showing in each of the last three weekends.

Defending NCAA champion James McLean led the way for the Golden Gophers by carding a one-under par 71 on Saturday, ending in a tie for third place individually. Junior Martin LeMesurier, senior Andy Komor, and junior Jeff Barney all finished in a tie for 19th individually among 66 total golfers, ending with five-over par totals of 221.

Among the schools Minnesota defeated in the event is top-ranked Clemson. The Tigers finished in a tie for fourth place, three shots back of Minnesota and eight strokes behind team champion UNLV. Wil Collins of New Mexico held on to his 36-hole lead by shooting a final round 71 to win the individual title.

The Golden Gophers will be idle until participating in the Wolverine Invitational on May 8-9 in Ann Arbor, Mich.

GOLDEN GOPHERS TO HOST BIG TEN AND NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS: The University of Minnesota men's golf team is bracing for an exciting spring, as they will play host to both the 1999 Big Ten Championships and 1999 NCAA Championships.

The 1999 Big Ten Championships will be held on May 14-16 at Les Bolstad Golf Course in Lauderdale, Minn. The Golden Gophers should be considered one of the favorites for their first Big Ten Championship since 1972, as they currently are the highest conference team in the national rankings (sixth). Defending champion Indiana, Ohio State, Illinois, and Northwestern will also be serious contenders for the conference crown this season.

The 1999 NCAA Championships will be held June 2-5 at Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska, Minn. The Golden Gophers finished the 1998 event in New Mexico with their highest standing in 54 years, placing seventh. Golden Gopher James McLean was the individual champion, and will have a chance to defend his title and lead the Minnesota team to a national championship on its home turf. GOLDEN GOPHERS TO TRAVEL TO MICHIGAN FOR LAST BIG TEN ROAD SERIES:

The Golden Gophers will travel to Michigan this weekend for two Big Ten dual matches against Michigan Saturday afternoon and Michigan State Sunday afternoon. Michigan is ranked 39th overall. Michigan does not have any singles or doubles teams ranked according to the latest ITA rankings. Michigan State is currently not ranked in the top 75 teams in the nation, but the Spartans do have the 16th-ranked doubles team in the nation in juniors Ken Kingongo and Francisco Trinidad.

MINNESOTA BEGINS LATE BIG TEN SURGE: The 36th-ranked Golden Gophers began their late Big Ten surge this past weekend defeating Wisconsin Friday night 5-2 and shutting out Iowa 7-0 Saturday night. Minnesota improves to 10-9 overall and 5-2 in the Big Ten Conference.

Friday night, Minnesota won four singles matches and two of the three doubles matches to earn 5-2 victory over Wisconsin. Sophomore Tyson Parry defeated David Chang 6-2, 6-0 at the No. 2 singles position. Freshman Thomas Haug notched another Big Ten victory with a 6-4, 0-6, 4-6 victory over Stefan Reist at the No. 3 singles spot. Also winning in singles play was senior Adam Selkirk, who defeated Danny Westerman 7-6, 6-3 at No. 4 and junior Martin Michalowski, who defeated Jason Gonzaga 6-3, 6-3 at the No. 6 position.

In doubles play, Michalowski and senior Martin Kristoffersen defeated Mark Loughrin and Adam Schumacher 8-6 at the No. 1 position. Parry and Selkirk also won at the No. 2 spot, 8-5 over Chang and Reist.

Saturday night, Minnesota swept all six singles matches and all three doubles matches from Iowa. Parry defeated Iowa's top-ranked Tyler Cleveland 6-7, 7-5, 6-4 at the No. 1 singles position to get the Golden Gophers rolling. Haug won his seventh Big Ten match 6-3, 6-0 over J.R. Chidley at the No. 2 position to remain undefeated in the conference. Selkirk defeated Ulf Jentler at No. 3, 7-5, 6-3. Sophomore Jon Svensson won his match at No. 4, 6-1, 6-0 over Petar Mandic. Michalowski defeated Girts Auskaps 6-1, 6-3 at No. 5 and sophomore Jorge Duenas defeated Ben Bamsey 6-2, 6-1 at the No. 6 position.

Kristoffersen and Michalowski defeated Cleveland and Bamsey 8-3 at No. 1 doubles. Parry and Selkirk defeated Jentler and Auskaps 8-5 at No. 2 doubles and Haug and freshman Ryan Davies defeated Chidley and Madic 8-5 at the No. 3 position.

CHICOINE DROPS TO 24TH IN LATEST ITA RANKINGS:

Senior Tom Chicoine dropped to 24th in the latest ITA singles rankings. Chicoine was ranked 14th in the Fall poll. The team ranking also slipped from 24th to currently 36th overall. The doubles team of Chicoine and junior Martin Michalowski moved up from 37th to 31st.

NEXT UP: Minnesota will return home Saturday, April 24 to play Penn State at the Northwest Athletic Club at 98th Street in Bloomington, Minn., at 6 p.m. The match will serve as the last Big Ten dual match before the Big Ten Championships, April 30 - May 2 at Ann Arbor, Mich.

MINNESOTA'S JOHANNSEN TAKES TOP HONORS IN THE HIGH JUMP AT OREGON: Sophomore **MARC JOHANNSEN** (Miller, S.D.) took top honors in the high jump with a jump of 7-0 1/2 (2.15m) on Saturday at the Hayward Relays at the University of Oregon. It was his best jump of the outdoor season. Teammates **WIL KURTH** (Rochester, Minn.) and **TYLER MCCORMICK** (White Bear Lake, Minn.) took third and fourth place, respectively with jumps of 6-10 3/4 (2.10m) and 6-6 3/4 (2.00m).

McCormick also took a first-place finish in the long jump with a jump of 23-7 1/4 (7.19m).

Sophomore **JUSTIN ASHER** (Plymouth, Minn.) took second place in the discus with a throw of 175-1 (53.38m), while teammate **MARK FAHEY** (Scandia, Minn.) took third with a throw of 173-2 (52.78m).

Junior **ERIC PIERCE** (Forest Lake, Minn.) took a fourth-place finish in the steeplechase with a time of 8:48.09 and sophomore **STEVE BURKHOLDER** (Superior, Wis.) took a second-place finish in the 200m dash with a time of 21.38.

HARTMARK TAKES SECOND PLACE AT ST. THOMAS INVITATIONAL: Sophomore **ERIC HARTMARK** (Duluth, Minn.) took a second-place finish in the 5,000m at the St. Thomas Invitational in St. Paul on Saturday. His time of 14:50.49 was two seconds behind winner Mike Gade of South Dakota. Teammates **JOEY CORR** (Redmond, Wash.) and **SAMI VALTONEN** (Lahti, Finland) took seventh and ninth places respectively with times of 15:06.51 and 15:14.43.

Junior **MICHAEL STOICK** (St. Michael, Minn.) finished fourth in the 1,500m run with a time of 4:08. It was his highest time of the outdoor season.

Freshman **LYNDON MCDOWELL** (Port Elgin, Ontario) took second place in the 110 high hurdles with a career-best time of 15.67.

MINNESOTA'S JOEY CORR NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN: University of Minnesota cross country runner **JOEY CORR** (Redmond, Wash.) was named to the 1998 Men's NCAA All-Academic Cross Country Team. The award is presented by the United States Cross Country Coaches Association.

Corr, a redshirt freshman has a GPA of 3.32 and majoring in pre-business. He was the Big Ten Conference's top-placing freshman at the 1998 Big Ten Cross Country Championships held in Ann Arbor, Mich., back in November.

CAHOY, ZIELINSKI AND HARTUNG NAMED GTE/CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

University of Minnesota senior swimmers John Cahoy and Martin Zielinski and senior wrestler Tim Hartung all were named to the first team GTE/CoSIDA Academic Fall-Winter At-Large All-American Team. In addition, Cahoy was named the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year.

Cahoy, from Hudson, Wis., has held a 4.0 GPA all quarters of his college career with a double major in chemistry and biochemistry. He was a member of four Big Ten Champion relay teams this season and also earned first team All-America honors as a member of the seventh place 800 free relay team. Cahoy also received first team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors in 1998.

Zielinski, of Bloomington, Minn., has recorded a 3.67 GPA majoring in biology and pre-medicine. He was the 1997 and 1999 Big Ten Champion in the 100 fly and also earned first team All-America honors with a sixth place finish in that event in 1998. He is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree and All-Big Ten performer. This is his first GTE/CoSIDA Academic first team All-America honor.

Hartung, of Durand, Wis., has a 3.24 GPA in kinesiology. He became only the second wrestler in Minnesota history this season to win back-to-back NCAA titles at 197 pounds. He also won his third consecutive Big Ten Championship and was named Big Ten Wrestler of the Year. He finished out the year winning 58 consecutive matches. He is also a three-time Big Ten Academic selection.

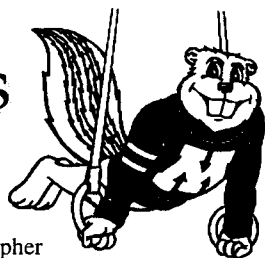

LAST WEEK/THIS WEEK: Golden Gopher senior co-captain **JASON KROB** (St. Charles, Mo.) scored a career-high 9.875 to finish in first place at the NCAA East Regional held at the University of Illinois two weeks ago. Krob bested his previous career-high of 9.825 which he set his sophomore year in a meet against the University of Iowa. Prior to the NCAA East Regional, Krob was ranked No. 5 in the nation on the pommel horse. He defeated the No. 1-ranked pommel horse performer, Penn State's Brandon Stefaniak, by five one-hundredths of a point. This now qualifies him for the NCAA Men's Gymnastics Championships which will be held at the University of Nebraska on April 22-24. Also scoring well for the Golden Gophers were freshman **JUSTIN LECHER** (West St. Paul, Minn.) and **TODD GUILBEAU** (Houston, Texas). Lecher scored a 9.7 on the pommel horse to finish in a tie for 12th place while Todd Guilbeau scored a 9.575 on the horizontal bar to also finish in a tie for 12th place.

HOLY KROB!!!!: Senior co-captain Jason Krob continues to lead the Golden Gophers in his specialty event, the pommel horse. Krob scored a career-high 9.875 at the NCAA East Regional two weeks ago to take home first place honors. In the process, Krob defeated the No. 1-ranked pommel horse performer in Penn State's Brandon Stefaniak. The 9.875 is also the second-highest pommel horse score ever recorded by a Golden Gopher gymnast. He ties former Gopher Brian Yee's 9.875 recorded at the Big Ten Championships in 1995. Krob will now com-

pete at the NCAA Championships at the University of Nebraska on April 22-24.

He improved in his parallel bar routine where he scored a 9.1 to finish 42nd. It was the first time he had competed in the NCAAs.



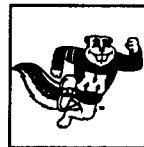

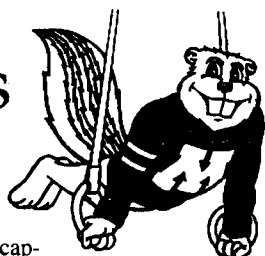

Krob qualified for the event finals by scoring a 9.7 in the preliminaries on Thursday night to finish in the sixth spot. Krob becomes Minnesota's first All-American since 1995 when former Golden Gopher Brian Yee finished third on the pommel horse at the 1995 NCAA Championships.

HOLY KROB!!!!: Jason Krob turned in an outstanding senior campaign topping it all off last weekend by finishing second at the NAAs. He was Minnesota's most consistent performer throughout this season for the turning in five first place finishes, two second place finishes and one third in 13 meets this season. A three-time Academic All-Big Ten performer who finished the season ranked in the top five on the pommel horse, Krob will graduate with his degree in finance in June from the highly regarded Carlson School of Management.

NEXT YEAR: While the team fought through many injuries, next year's squad looks to be much improved. Gymnasts such as freshman **JUSTIN LECHER** (West St. Paul, Minn.), **TODD GUILBEAU** (Houston, Texas) and **JUSTIN CONNER** (Dallas, Texas) will all be looked upon to build on the experience of this year. All three freshmen reached the NCAA East Regional and turned in performances that gives

the impression that next year will find Minnesota back into contention in the tough Big Ten Conference. Add to the youth the experience of seniors to be **RYAN WINTERBOURNE** (Anaheim, Calif.), **BART CRAMER** (Edina, Minn.) and **CHAD CONNER** (Dallas, Texas) and you have the makings for what could be a good season.

HAZY SHADE OF WINTER: Junior Ryan Winterbourne is another reason why the optimism for next season is high. He had a strong second half of the season after overcoming some injury problems early on this season. Competing in just his second all-around this season against UIC, the junior turned in a team season high score of 56.0, good for first place. It was also his career-high score. Competing on the still rings and parallel bars at the NCAA East Regional last weekend, Winterbourne scored a disappointing 8.25 on his still rings routine to finish in 54th. He improved in his parallel bar routine where he scored a 9.1 to finish in 42nd. It was the first time he had competed in the NAAs.

The 35th-ranked Golden Gophers are prepared to contend for their first Big Ten title since 1995 this week-end in Ann Arbor, Mich. Competition begins Thursday and concludes with the championship match Sunday afternoon.

MINNESOTA CRUSHES PENN STATE: The Golden Gophers wrapped up their regular dual meet season with a 7-0 victory over the Penn State Nittany Lions at the Northwest Athletic Club 98th Street in Bloomington, Minn., Saturday evening. Minnesota finishes the season with a 12-10 overall dual meet record and a 7-3 record in the Big Ten. The Golden Gophers finished third in the Big Ten standings underneath Michigan and Illinois.

Minnesota won all six singles matches and took two of the three doubles matches to sweep the Nittany Lions. Sophomore **TYSON PARRY** (Chatham, Ontario, Canada) defeated Mike Griesser 6-3, 7-6 at the No. 1 singles position. At No. 2 singles, freshman **THOMAS HAUG** (Zurich, Switzerland) took Marc Dorfman to three sets and won 6-3, 6-7, 7-5. Senior **ADAM SELKIRK** (St. Joseph, Mo.) defeated Eric Meditz 7-6, 6-2.

At No. 4 singles, sophomore **JON SVENSSON** (Kristianstad, Sweden) defeated Marc McCallister 6-2, 6-2. Following him at No. 5 singles, junior **MARTIN MICHALOWSKI** (Ottawa, Ontario,

Canada) defeated Matthew Neilsen 6-0, 6-3. Completing the sweep was sophomore **JORGE DUENAS** (Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic) who defeated Christopher DeStafano 6-1, 6-2 at the No. 6 singles position.

In doubles play, freshman **RYAN DAVIES** (Corpus Christi, Texas) and Michalowski defeated Meditz and Dorfman 8-5 at the No. 1 spot. Also winning in doubles play was Haug and senior **MARTIN KRISTOFFERSEN** (Portsgrunn, Norway) who defeated Nielson and Damon Accardi 8-5.

CHICOINE DROPS TO 25TH; TEAM MOVES UP TO 35TH: In the final ITA poll preceeding the Big Ten Championships, the Golden Gophers jumped up one spot from 36th to 35th in the team poll. They are the third highest Big Ten team ranked in the poll. Illinois is second overall and Michigan is 30th. Senior **TOM CHICOINE** (Neenah, Wis.) is currently ranked 25th overall, which is down from his previous ranking at 22nd. Also moving up one in the rankings was the doubles team of Chicoine and Michalowski, who moved up from 39th to 38th overall.

NEXT UP: The Golden Gophers will wait to receive a bid to the NCAA Region IV Championships to be held at a location selected by the NCAA Committee May 4. The NCAA Region IV Championships will take place May 14-16. Last year Minnesota defeated top-ranked teams in the region including Notre Dame and Northwestern to win the Region IV Championships and receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Championships.

YUDOF NAMES TASK FORCE TO REVIEW ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUBS

MINNEAPOLIS / ST. PAUL-- In response to a March 4 internal audit of travel reimbursements for university athletic staff, University of Minnesota President Mark Yudof has appointed a five-member task force to address the use of, and accounting for, booster club funds for the athletic departments. Booster clubs, which are volunteer groups that provide support for university athletics, have traditionally raised money to cover the cost of such items as facilities improvements and other team expenses.

The purpose of the task force is to review the standards and purposes for which booster funds may be used, the authorization process for such uses, federal and state tax considerations and any applicable NCAA limitations.

The task force, which has been asked to report its findings by June 4, will be chaired by E. Thomas Sullivan, dean of the university's Law School, and will include Peggy Lucas, chair of the university's Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Advisory Council; Marvin Borman, a senior partner with the Minneapolis law firm of Maslon, Edelman, Borman and Brand; Michael Wright, president and CEO of Eden Prairie-based SUPERVALU Inc.; and Josie Johnson, former university associate vice president for minority affairs. University General Counsel Mark Rotenberg will oversee the task force and coordinate its work.

Also, in a memo issued today to university athletic directors and coaches, Yudof announced that no booster club funds may be utilized or accepted by any university employee for gifts or travel, except for bona fide university business purposes consistent with existing university and foundation guidelines. □

Other top finishers include: **ADAM REED** (Milwaukee, Wis.) in the discus throw with a throw of 175-9 (53.58m), **GLENN LINDQVIST** (Aland, Finland) in the javelin with a throw of 188-4 (57.40m), **BEN MEYER** (Pine Island, Minn.) in the hammer throw with a throw of 175-5 (53.46m), and Minnesota's 4 x 100 team, consisting of Fred Rodgers, Adam Freed, **ANDY WIBERG** (Roseville, Minn.) and Tom Gerding, took first with a time of 40.67.

106 GOLDEN GOPHER MALE ATHLETES EARN SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

106 University of Minnesota male athletes earned scholar-athlete awards Monday night at an annual banquet at the Radisson Metrodome Hotel. A total of 234 student-athletes received scholar-athlete awards, which includes 128 female student-athletes. Scholar-athletes must receive a 3.0 GPA or better and be a member of an athletic team. Five male student-athletes were recognized as the Top Five Scholar-Athletes of the Year. They include: senior swimmer John Cahoy, junior gymnast Chad Conner, senior track athlete Glenn Lindqvist, junior track athlete Staffan Strand and junior gymnast Matt Kieffer.

Cahoy, a native of Hudson, Wis., has earned a 4.0 GPA in all four years at the University of Minnesota with a double major in chemistry and biochemistry. In 1999, Cahoy was named the GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year. He also was named to the first team GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-American team in 1998. At the 1999 Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships, Cahoy was a member of four title winning relay teams. He was also a member of the 800 free relay that placed seventh to earn first team All-America honors at the NCAA Championships.

ER ADAM REED TAKES FIRST PLACE IN THE DISCUS:

Sophomore **ADAM REED** (Milwaukee, Wis.) took top honors in the discus with a personal best and NCAA provisional qualifying discus throw of 185-0 (56.38m) as Minnesota hosted the 1999 Minnesota Last Chance meet at the Bierman Track Stadium. Teammates **JEFF MARSH** (Seymour, Wis.) and **JUSTIN ASHER** (Plymouth, Minn.) claimed sixth and ninth places, respectively with throws of 168-4 (51.32m) and 164-6 (50.14m).

Four-time Big Ten Indoor Champion and All-American **BEN-JAMIN JENSEN** (Mandal, Norway) took top honors in the pole vault with a vault of 17-21/4 (5.24m). Teammate **MATT STARK** (Apple Valley, Minn.) claimed third place with a vault of 15-1 (4.60m) and **MIKE BROCKWELL** (Edina, Minn.) took eighth place with a 14-7 1/4 mark.

Senior **CHAD JOHNSON** (Chetek, Wis.) took second place in the 1,500m run with a time of 3:49.4, while teammates **ERIC PIERCE** (Forest Lake, Minn.) and **JOEY CORR** (Redmond, Wash.) took third and sixth places, respectively with times of 3:49.7 and 3:56.6. Teammate **JOSH BRANG** (Winona, Minn.) followed close behind with a time of 4:06.56, which was good for 10th place.

Sophomore **STEVE BURKHOLDER** (Superior, Wis.) took first place in the 400m dash with a time of 49.07, while teammates **RON HOFFNER** (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) and **TOBY HENKELS** (Worthington, Minn.) took fifth and sixth places, respectively with times of 51.37 and 51.40.

This year, Staffan Strand will be going for his sixth straight Big Ten title in the high jump, while senior Benjamin Jensen will try for his first Big Ten outdoor title in the decathlon and pole vault while having four Big Ten indoor titles to his credit. The 1998 Big Ten outdoor champion in the 100m dash Fred Rodgers will also be out to defend his Big Ten title.

The 38th-ranked Golden Gophers dropped their first round match to No. 24 Washington 4-1 in Athens, Ga., Saturday afternoon.

With the single elimination bracket, Minnesota finishes its season with an overall record of 13-12 and a 7-3 record in the Big Ten Conference.

The match started with Minnesota winning two of three doubles matches to earn a team point. Parry also dropped his match, 6-4, 6-4 to Eric Drew at No. 2 singles. Junior **MARTIN MICHALOWSKI** (Ottawa, Ontario, Canada) also lost in the No. 6 singles spot, 6-4, 6-2 to Mark Woolley. The clinching match for Washington was a 1-6, 6-1, 6-4 victory for Marius Lunde over Selkirk at the No. 4 spot. Haug was winning his match, 2-6, 6-4, 5-4 over Christoph Kull at the No. 3 spot when play was suspended and sophomore **JON SVENSSON** (Kristianstad, Sweden) was down 3-6, 6-2, 5-1 to Jeremy Berman at No. 5 singles.

CHICOINE RECEIVES AUTOMATIC BID TO NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Senior Tom Chicoine received one of four automatic bids from Region IV to compete at the 1999 NCAA Singles Tennis Championships, May 26-30 in Athens, Ga. This is the second straight year Chicoine has received an automatic bid to the singles championships.

Chicoine, a native of Neenah, Wis., has a 32-15 overall record this season and is currently ranked 27th in the nation. He plays No. 1 singles for the 38th-ranked Golden Gophers. Chicoine is joined by Notre Dame's Ryan Sachire, Illinois' Oliver Freelove and Wisconsin's Mark Loughrin as the four automatic selections from Region IV. Doug Bohaboy of Northwestern and Tyler Cleveland of Iowa also received at-large bids.

Senior Tom Chicoine and sophomore Tyson Parry were named to the All-Big Ten team announced two weeks ago following the banquet at the Big Ten Tournament. Illinois' Oliver Freelove was named Big Ten Athlete of the Year, Northwestern's Doug Bohaboy was named Sportsman of the Year and Illinois Head Coach Craig Tiley was named Big Ten Coach of the Year.

106 GOLDEN GOPHER MALE ATHLETES EARN SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

106 University of Minnesota male athletes earned scholar-athlete awards Monday night at an annual banquet at the Radisson Metrodome Hotel. A total of 234 student-athletes received scholar-athlete awards, which includes 128 female student-athletes. Scholar-athletes must receive a 3.0 GPA or better and be a member of an athletic team. Five male student-athletes were recognized as the Top Five Scholar-Athletes of the Year. They include: senior swimmer John Cahoy, junior gymnast Chad Conner, senior track athlete Glenn Lindqvist, junior track athlete Staffan Strand and junior gymnast Matt Kieffer.

Cahoy, a native of Hudson, Wis., has earned a 4.0 GPA in all four years at the University of Minnesota with a double major in chemistry and biochemistry.
