MINNESOTA ATHLETICS ANNOUNCES 1999 SPRING QUARTER 300 CLUB MEMBERS

The Academic Counseling & Student Services at the University of Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletics recognizes student-athletes who earned a minimum grade point average of 3.0 for Spring quarter 1999. The 249 scholar-athletes from the men's and women's athletics departments simultaneously pursue academic excellence with participation in intercollegiate athletics and are acknowledged for their efforts as members of the 300 Club.

The University of Minnesota's women athletes earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.08. This marks the 23rd consecutive term with an overall grade point average above 3.0 for women athletes. The 1998-99 academic year also signifies the men's athletics department's highest overall grade point averages since Academic Counseling & Student Services began monitoring grade point averages in 1984 with 2.87, 2.86, 2.85 for Fall, Winter and Spring quarters respective grade point average. The following student-athletes earned a minimum 3.0 GPA. Names in bold/italics indicate the student-athlete achieved a 4.0 grade point average during the 1999 Spring quarter.

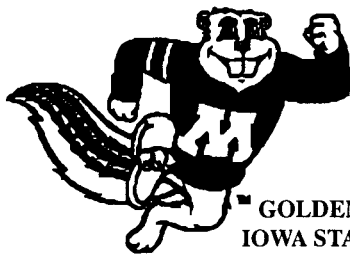

GOLDEN GOPHERS COMPETE AT IOWA STATE MEMORIAL CROSS COUNTRY CLASSIC

The University of Minnesota men's cross country team took third place among Division I teams and fourth place overall with 77 points. The Golden Gophers had 70 points to take third place behind McKendree with 59 points and Illinois State with 67 points.

Freshman **NEIL HANSON** (Granada, Minn.) was the top finisher for the maroon and gold with a clocked time of 25:56 for 14th place. Senior **NATE CLAY** (Rochester Hills, Mich.) finished with a time of 26:08 for 18th place and freshman **SCOTT UTNE** (Shoreview, Minn.) finished in 26:11 for 19th place overall among Division I, II and III teams. Missouri Valley's Janko Bensa finished first with a time of 24:15. Iowa's Stetson Steele ran unattached finishing second with a time of 24:35.

Not all of Minnesota's top runners competed in this weekend's meet. The Golden Gophers will head to Bloomington, Ind., on Saturday, Oct. 16 to take part in the 1999 Pre-NCAA meet.

LAST YEAR AT THE PRE-NCAA MEET: The University of Minnesota men's cross country team took an 11th-place finish at the Bob Timmons Invitational in Lawrence, Kan., with 361 points. No. 1 Stanford captured top honors with 80 points followed by Oregon with 103 points.

The top finisher for the Maroon and Gold was **ERIC PIERCE** (Forest Lake, Minn.), who finished with a time of 25:52.16 to take 49th-place.

JOSH BRANG (Winona, Minn.) took 55th-place, clocking a time of 25:57.83, while

JEREMY POLSON (Duluth, Minn.) placed 58th with a time of 25:59.37. Julius Mwangi of Butler University won the meet with a time of 23:45, while Colorado's Adam Goucher, who later went on to win the 1998 NCAA Championship, took runner-up honors with a time of 23:54.37.

Other finishers for the Golden Gophers include Charles McClure, who clocked a time of 26:19.72 to take 95th. **MIKE STOICK** (St. Michael, Minn.) took 115th with a time of 26:30.07 and **ANDREW MCKESSOCK** took 123rd place with a time of 26:54.36.

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO SUNNY CALIFORNIA TO COMPETE IN THE PEPPERDINE INTERCOLLEGIATE: The

University of Minnesota men's golf team will participate in the Pepperdine Intercollegiate in Pepperdine, Calif., Monday-Tuesday, Oct. 12-13. The Golden Gophers are currently ranked 15th in the nation.

GOLDEN GOPHERS PLACE SIXTH AT WINDON MEMORIAL:

The University of Minnesota men's golf team finished sixth at the Windon Memorial at the Conway Farms Golf Club in Lake Forest, Ill. The event, hosted by Northwestern University, is played each fall at the golf course that played host to the 1997 NCAA Men's Golf Championships.

The tournament was delayed over one hour on Monday due to rain and forced the late finish of the first day's second round. The Golden Gophers were in 13th place after one round of the event.

Two-time All-American James McLean fired a one over-par total of 214 to lead the Golden Gophers and finished in a tie for second individually. Senior All-American Martin LeMesurier shot a five-over par 218 total and finished tied for eighth place.

Kent State captured the team portion of the event with a 25-over par total of 877. Northwestern finished second at 881, with first-round leader Stanford five shots back in third place at 882.

Defending NCAA Champion Luke Donald claimed the individual medalist honors with a four-under par total of 209. Ben Curtis of Kent State tied McLean for runner-up standing at 214.

Sophomore Thomas Haug and senior Martin Michalowski competed in the All-American Championships in Austin, Texas over the weekend.

Michalowski lost his first round match in the pre-qualifying portion of the tournament, 6-4, 6-3 to Henry Choi of Indiana State. Haug defeated Fabian Gonzalez of the University of Texas at Arlington, 6-1, 6-1 in the first round. He then went on to beat David Tzou of California, 7-6 (3), 6-0 to advance to the round of 64. Sunday morning, Haug defeated Sean Monk of Tulsa, 6-2, 6-1 to advance to the round of 32. Play will resume Monday.

Parry will begin competition Tuesday in the qualifying round.

in the first round. He then lost to Stephen Huss of Auburn 7-5, 6-2 in the second round.

NEXT UP: Junior Tyson Parry will compete in the qualifying round of the All-American Championships, Tuesday-Wednesday in Austin, Texas. The Golden Gophers will split up Oct. 22-24, when they will travel to Philadelphia, Pa., to compete in the Penn Fall Tournament and also to New Orleans, La., to compete in the Tulane Invitational.

THE 1999 "M" CLUB HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

The University of Minnesota "M" Club and the Men's Intercollegiate Athletic Department is holding the Ninth Annual Hall of Fame this weekend. Eleven former athletes and a former team physician will be inducted into the prestigious University of Minnesota "M" Club Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony will be held at the Radisson Metrodome on the Minnesota campus. For more information, call the "M" Club at (612) 929-8813.

Contemporary Group:

Ron Backes served as a track & field team captain in 1986. He was an indoor Big Ten individual champion in shot put in 1985 and 1986, and an outdoor Big Ten champion in the event in 1984, 1985 and 1986. He also captured the conference crown in the discus in 1986. He was an indoor shot put All-American in both 1985 and 1986, finishing first in the NCAA championships in 1986. He was also an outdoor All-American in the shot put in 1984, '85 and '86. A member of the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team, he was also honored as co-MVP at the 1986 Big Ten Outdoor Championships.

Marion Barber lettered in football from 1977-80. He was selected as team MVP in 1978 and 1980. He is currently third on the all-time school records list in career rushing with 660 attempts, fourth with 3,094 yards and second in career rushing touchdowns with 34. He served as captain for the 1980 season. He was a member of the Golden Gopher team that played Maryland in the 1977 Hall of Fame Bowl. He went on to play professionally for the NFL's New York Jets.

Alfred "Bud" Ericksen was a swimming letterwinner from 1962-64. He was a two-time All-American in 1963 and 1964. He competed on the Big Ten and NCAA Championship 400-yard medley relay team in 1963.

Lew Kennedy was a three-time wrestling letterwinner. He was a Big Ten individual champion in 1963 at 130 pounds and in 1964 at 137 pounds. He was an All-American in 1962 and 1963, finishing fourth both years at the NCAA Championships at 130 pounds.

Trent Tucker was a four-time letterwinner as a guard under Head Basketball Coach Jim Dutcher. He was an All-American in 1982 and selected as team MVP in 1981. He helped lead the Golden Gophers to the 1982 Big Ten title and the NCAA Tournament. He is currently tied for sixth place on the all-time school records list in career steals with 153 and seventh place for a steals in a single season with 63.

Doug Woog was hockey team captain in 1965-66. He led the team in scoring in 1965 with 47 total points in 29 games for the Maroon and Gold. He was selected as the John Mariucci MVP of the 1965-66 season and was named a First-Team All-American in 1965. Following his collegiate playing years he was selected as a member of the 1967 U.S. National Team. He continued his career at Minnesota as head coach from 1985-99. In 14 years as head coach he went 389-187-40, over 66% winning average.

Pioneer Group:

Neil Croonquist lettered in golf from 1938-40. He was a member of the 1938 Big Ten title team and the 1939 NCAA 11th-place finishers. He was a co-captain in 1939.

Arnie Oss was a three-time basketball letterwinner from 1919-21 under Head Coach L. J. Cooke. He was Minnesota's first repeat All-American in basketball, receiving those honors in 1919 and 1921. He also lettered in football from 1919-21, earning All-Big Ten honors in 1919 and lettered twice in track. He was an assistant coach for football and basketball.

Alan Rice earned his wrestling letters from 1947-50. He was a Big Ten individual champion in 1949 at 136 pounds and in 1948 at 128 pounds. He won a medal in the National AAU championships.

Gordon Soltau lettered from 1946-49. He was selected to play on the 1949 East-West Shrine Game, the 1950 All-Star Game and the 1950 Hula Bowl. He also lettered in hockey in 1949.

Lifetime Achievement Group:

David Metzen began his dedication to education and athletics as a hockey player lettering from 1962-64. He served as team captain in 1963-64. He earned his undergraduate degree in elementary education, his master's degree in administration and his doctorate in educational administration all from the University of Minnesota. He is currently the superintendent for the South St. Paul Public Schools and a member of the University's Board of Regents.

Harvey O'Phelan served as a team orthopedic surgeon for the Golden Gophers for more than two decades from 1962-83 after graduating from the University of Minnesota Medical School. He received his honorary letter in 1983. He became the associate clinical professor of orthopedic surgery at the U of M Medical School in 1955. He is a member of the American Board of Orthopedic Surgeons and the American Academy of Sports Medicine. He also served as team orthopedic surgeon for numerous U.S.A. Olympic and World Championship squads, along with a number of professional teams.

The purpose of the annual Hall of Fame event is to honor achievements and preserve the tradition of those athletes, coaches and athletic staff members who have contributed in an outstanding and positive way to the University of Minnesota Men's Athletics Program.

Charles Howell of Oklahoma State claimed the individual title with a 12-under par total of 201. Paul Casey of Arizona State and Andy Sanders of Houston finished one stroke behind at 11-under par 202. Casey's opening round 65 was undone by Sanders' final round 64 as the tournament's best 18-hole score.

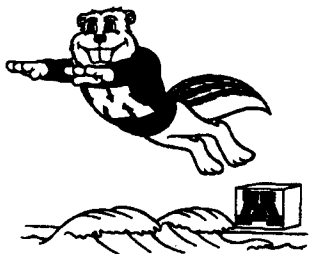

In the second round of the consolation bracket, Sloss topped Matt Nielson of Penn State 7-6, 2-6, 5-3. He was then defeated by Ethan Farbman of Columbia. 6-3, 6-4.

Freshman Eric Robertson was the other Golden Gopher to compete in the Penn Fall Classic. Robertson also dropped his first round match 7-5, 6-4 to Josh Axler of Northwestern. He then lost to Chris Chatham of Virginia 6-4, 6-2 in the first round of the consolation bracket.
