TIPOFF LUNCHEON -- The second annual Big Ten Women's Basketball Tipoff Luncheon is scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 14 at the Hyatt Regency in Indianapolis. The luncheon will begin at 11:30 a.m. ET and features the conference's head women's basketball coaches as the afternoon's speakers. ESPN women's basketball expert Leandra Reilly will again serve as Master of Ceremonies.

MEDIA REGISTRATION -- Media registration begins at 7:30 a.m. Wednesday morning in Salon A. A 60-minute Big Ten Roundtable discussion with the conference coaches regarding current issues in collegiate women's basketball begins at 8:30 a.m. in Mt. Rushmore on the third floor.

ONE-ON-ONE INTERVIEWS -- Coaches will be available for one-on-one interviews between 9:45 and 10:45 a.m. in Celebration Hall, directly adjacent to the luncheon's Regency Ballroom.

SCRIMMAGES SET -- The Gopher women's basketball team has set two intrasquad scrimmage dates, Friday, Nov. 9 in Faribault, Minn. and Friday, Nov. 16 in Buffalo, Minn.

BADGERS NEXT OPPONENT-- In the first of two meets this weekend, the Gophers (2-0, 2-0 Big Ten) travel to Madison, Wis. to take on the Badgers in a coed dual meet Saturday, Nov. 3. Wisconsin (1-1, 0-1 Big Ten) defeated Iowa State 151-149, but lost to Iowa 182-118 over the weekend.

SEVEN BIG TEN TEAMS AT NORTHWESTERN RELAYS- Seven Big Ten teams will meet at 12 noon on Sunday, Nov. 4 at the Northwestern Relays in Evanston, Ill. Joining Minnesota and Northwestern will be Michigan, Michigan State, Indiana, Wisconsin and Illinois. Southern Illinois-Carbondale is the only non-conference school in the meet.

GOPHERS 2-0 AFTER OPENING WEEKEND- In their opening meet of the season, the swimming and diving team swept a pair of conference teams in a double-dual competition at Iowa City Saturday. The Gophers defeated Iowa 151-148 and Indiana 153-146.

Junior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) was first six times for the Gophers, winning the 200 butterfly (2:06.42), the 200 breaststroke (2:22.97) and the 200 individual medley (2:08.70) against both the Hawkeyes and the Hoosiers. Oegema's times in the 200 breaststroke and 200 IM against Iowa were meet records. Freshman **SUSAN SUOMU** (WAUKEGAN, IL) earned a pair of first-place marks in the 200 free (1:52.75) against Iowa and Indiana and was the top Gopher in the 200 backstroke (2:11.63) in the Iowa meet.

In the distance events, junior **LYNN NEWTON** (INVER GROVE HEIGHTS, MN) was first against Iowa in the 500 (5:01.18) and 1000 freestyles (10:23.62) and first versus the Hoosiers in the 1000 free. Freshman **STACEY NIEDENFUER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN) won the 100 free (:54.32) against Iowa. In the Indiana competition junior **LISA DAVIS** (AUSTIN, MN) was first in 1-meter diving (245.70 points) and freshman **ANDREA RUDSER** (MINOT, ND) won the 100 butterfly (:59.09).

COACH FREEMAN COMMENTS- In talking about Minnesota's victory over the Hawkeyes, head swimming and diving coach Jean Freeman said "I am glad to come out ahead of Iowa since they were ranked 18th in the pre-season coaches poll and we were ranked 19th."

"Susan Suomu had her lifetime best time in the 200 freestyle which was an outstanding race," said Freeman. "Our depth in the 500 freestyle is evident as we went 1-2-3 against Iowa in the event. Linda Oegema turned in good times for this time of the year in all three of her events, with her victory in the 200 breaststroke being decided by 17 hundredths of a second over Iowa's Chrissy Eck."

VOLLEYBALL

GOPHERS TRAVEL TO IOWA, THIRD-RANKED NEBRASKA THIS WEEK — Minnesota is looking to end its six-match losing streak this week but it will not be easy. The Gophers (6-19 overall, 1-10 Big Ten) will be in Iowa City, Iowa for a 7:30 p.m. match on Wednesday against the Hawkeyes, who have won eight of their last 10. Minnesota will travel to Lincoln, Neb. to take part in Nebraska's Runza Classic Friday and Saturday after returning home to attend classes on Thursday. Minnesota will play the third-ranked Cornhuskers Friday at 7:30 p.m. following the tournament-opening match between Texas and Illinois State at 5:30 p.m. The winners of Friday's matches will play for the tournament championship at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday with Friday's losers squaring off at 5 p.m. for third place.

HAWKEYE HELPERS — The Hawks are hot. After losing to Purdue in four games Friday in West Lafayette, Iowa (10-11, 5-6) came back to sweep 19th-ranked Illinois in Champaign, Ill. on Saturday. The win snapped a two-match Hawkeye losing streak. Prior to the two losses, Iowa had won eight in a row, with a five-game comeback win over Minnesota at Williams Arena being the first win of the streak. Iowa is hitting .188 on the season, .184 in the conference.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

HEAD COACH RUTH NELSON — Nelson is in her second year at Iowa and 15th year overall. Her all-time record is 551-202-3 (.732) and she is 32-22 (.593) at Iowa.

WATCH FOR — Senior middle blocker **Barb Willis** nearly destroyed Illinois by herself. Against the Illini, she hit .512 with 26 kills and also added 16 digs. Willis is hitting .251 in the conference and leads the team with a 4.74 kill and 1.07 block per game average in the conference. Junior middle hitter **Trista Schoenbeck** from Roseville had eight kills and nine blocks, including five solos, against Illinois. She is second on the team with a Big Ten block per game average of 0.95. Senior setter **Janet Moylan** averages 11.74 assists per game in the Big Ten. The Hawkeye roster features two other Minnesotans, senior outside hitter **Ginger Lorentson** of Lakeville and senior outside hitter **Jennifer Thompson** of Rochester. Thompson, the sister of former Gopher running back Darrell Thompson, has not played this season because of an injury.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 28-9 but has lost two in a row to Iowa. The Gophers lost 13-15, 13-15, 15-11, 15-12, 15-6 earlier this season and also lost in five games to the Hawkeyes in last year's series finale, with both setbacks coming at Williams Arena. The Gophers have won five in a row in Iowa City. The last Minnesota loss there was on Nov. 2, 1984.

'HUSKER CORNPONE CRUMBS — Nebraska (19-2 overall, 6-0 Big Eight), the runnerup in last year's NCAA championship, is currently ranked third in the NCAA poll. The only 'Husker losses have been to second-ranked Pacific and fifth-ranked Stanford. A typical conversation about the Nebraska volleyball team centers on how long the current 'Husker winning streak is. Nebraska has already racked up two eight-game streaks this season and has now won three straight. There will likely be a good crowd on hand for Friday's matches. Nebraska is averaging 2,918 a match. The 'Huskies are hitting .295 on the season.

HEAD COACH TERRY PETTIT — Pettit is in his 14th season at Nebraska and 17th year overall. His overall mark is 476-122 (.796) and his record at Nebraska is 429-105 (.803).

WATCH FOR — Nebraska has plenty of weapons. Junior outside hitter **Cris Hall** leads the team in kills with 242 (3.97/game) and sophomore **Eileen Shannon** is second (214 kills-3.16/game). The middle is in good hands with junior **Janet Kruse** (.296 hitting percentage and 197 kills) and sophomore **Stephanie Thater** (.382 hitting percentage and 190 kills). Senior all-American setter **Val Novak** (12.11 assists/game) runs the offense. The 'Huskies have one Minnesotan on the roster, senior **Linda Barsness** of Rochester.

SERIES — Nebraska leads 22-4. Last year the 'Huskies ended the Gophers' season with a 15-10, 11-15, 15-13, 15-12 win in Lincoln, Neb. in the sweet sixteen round of the NCAA championship. Earlier last season, Nebraska defeated Minnesota in four games in the Gophers' Reebok Classic.

REDBIRD REVIEW — Illinois State (18-6 overall, 4-2 Gateway) lost a five-game, two hour and 40 minute match to Northern Iowa Saturday after sweeping Drake on Friday night. The loss snapped a five-match Redbird winning streak. Earlier this season, Illinois State had an 11-match winning streak. Eleven of the Redbirds' 18 wins have been sweeps. Minnesota would be the fourth Big Ten opponent Illinois State has played, should the two teams meet. The Redbirds have defeated Michigan State (five games) and Northwestern (three games) and lost to Illinois (three games). Illinois State is hitting .210 on the season.

HEAD COACH JULIE MORGAN — Morgan is in her fourth year at Illinois State and seventh year overall. She has an overall mark of 139-84 (.623) and a 79-37 (.681) record at Illinois State.

WATCH FOR — Junior **Hollie Cravens** averaged 4.70 kills per game in her last four Gateway Conference matches. She leads the team with a 3.95 conference kill per game average. Junior outside hitter **Lisa Rolf** leads the team with 314 season kills (3.69 kills/game). Freshman **Michelle Rucker** leads the team in hitting (.238) and has 133 kills. The Illinois State setter is senior **Marci Maier**, who is averaging 10.0 assists per game.

SERIES — The Redbirds lead 4-3. The last time the teams faced each other was on Sept. 15, 1982, with Minnesota winning in five games in its season opener.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

LONGHORN LOGISTICS — Fourth-ranked Texas (24-0 overall, 8-0 Southwest Conference) can clinch its ninth straight SWC title with a win over Rice on Wednesday. The Longhorns have a 61-match SWC winning streak and are off to their best-ever start. Texas was one of two undefeated teams left in the nation as of last week (along with Penn State). In three matches last week, the Longhorns defeated Kentucky 3-0 (Oct. 21), downed Houston 3-1 (Wednesday) and bested LSU 3-0 (Saturday). Texas is hitting .264 for the season.

HEAD COACH MICK HALEY — Haley is in his 11th season at Texas and his 18th season overall. He has an overall record of 612-141-1 (.813) and is 361-90-1 (.800) at Texas. Longhorn assistant coach Glen Lietzke is a 1979 graduate of Minnesota and is in his seventh year at Texas.

WATCH FOR — The Longhorns are led by junior middle blocker **Nikki Busch** (242 kills-3.3/game), junior outside hitter **Janine Gremmel** (233 kills-3.0/game) and senior hitter **Quandalyn Harrell** (214 kills-2.9/game). Busch is hitting .382 and junior outside hitter **Annette Garza** (183 kills) is hitting .294. Junior setter **Missy Kurt** is averaging 11.0 assists per game. Junior middle blocker **Kimberly Komula** of Eden Prairie has seen limited action, playing in just seven matches thus far.

SERIES — Minnesota has never faced Texas.

GOPHERS LOSE TO ILLINOIS, PURDUE — Life is tough on the road for any Big Ten Conference team. The Gophers got another first-hand experience on how tough that life can be. Friday night, 19th-ranked Illinois defeated the Gophers in three games, 15-6, 15-6, 15-8, before the standard Huff Gym crowd of 1,605. The Illini revenged the 1989 home loss to Minnesota, a loss that broke a 37-match home conference winning streak. Saturday night, Purdue completed a season sweep of Minnesota by defeating the Gophers in three games, 15-8, 15-8, 15-11. Minnesota hit .231 in the match, a conference season high for the Gophers and its best performance since Labor Day against Connecticut. The Gophers hit .444 in game three and led 8-7 at one point before the Boilermakers rallied for the 15-11 win.

INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES — Sophomore middle hitter **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) was the most consistent hitter for Minnesota over the weekend. **Benning** hit .310 in the two matches, including a team-high 12 kills against Purdue. She has now contributed six double-figure kill performances to the Gopher effort in 1990, including four in the last eight matches. **Benning's** blocking also continues to be a strong suit as she is third on the Minnesota roster with 56 total blocks for the season.

On the subject of blocking, Minnesota's **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) and **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) are approaching significant milestones in their careers.

Thompson needs just one block to reach 400 in her career. By doing so, she would become only the fourth Gopher in history to reach that level. She also needs six total blocks to reach 100 for the season, the third time that she would accomplish that feat. This past weekend, **Thompson** had five block assists to boost her career total to 321 and move her past Lori Miller (1986-89) into second place on the all-time block assist list.

Lushine had four block assists on the recent road trip and now has 188 total blocks in her Minnesota career, moving her into 10th place on the all-time Minnesota list (see stat page for complete list). She needs only two total blocks to move past Beth Hiner (1982-85) into ninth place. **Lushine** leads the Gophers in Big Ten play with an average of 1.21 blocks/game.

Sophomores **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) is tied with fellow sophomore **BECKY LINDBERG** (FOREST LAKE, MN) for eighth place on the career dig list with 437 digs, while **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG) is 10th with 416 digs. **Thompson** is the only other current Gopher on the list, holding down sixth place with 667 digs. **Ahlquist** leads Minnesota in 1990 with 233 digs and a 2.62 digs/game average.

HEAD COACH STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER'S RECORD — Schleuder is in her 18th season overall and ninth year at Minnesota. She has an overall record of 475-225 (.679) and is 177-113 (.610) at Minnesota. In the Big Ten, Schleuder is 79-61 (.564). Saturday's match at Purdue was the 700th of Schleuder's coaching career.

CROSS COUNTRY

HARRIERS FINISH FIFTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP — On a blustery day at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course, the Gophers hosted their first-ever Big Ten Women's Cross Country Championship and finished in fifth place as a team. Minnesota ran a team which only returned senior **LAURA DUFFY** (KENNEBUNK, ME) and junior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) from last year's Big Ten squad, and came within eight points of defeating a nationally-ranked team. Third-ranked Indiana improved its national championship hopes with a 37-49 win over 10th-ranked Wisconsin, with four Hoosiers finishing in the top 10. Michigan upheld its No. 13 position with a solid third-place finish with 59 points, followed by 21st-ranked Iowa's 118 and Minnesota's 126.

INDIVIDUAL RESULTS — Chris Rowe has been Minnesota's top runner in every race in 1990, and Saturday's Big Ten meet was no exception. Rowe finished 10th in the race in a career best time of 17:51.0. She improved her spot by 14 places over last season's Big Ten meet. Freshman **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) ran in only her second 5,000-meter race as a Gopher and finished 16th in 18:22.6, a 14-second improvement over her time at the GBS Invitational.

WHAT'S NEXT — Minnesota will take a weekend off for the first time this season and prepare for the Region 4 meet Nov. 10 at Purdue. Last year, the Gophers surprised Iowa and Michigan by taking second place in the meet and qualifying for their first NCAA Championship since 1983. Minnesota head coach **GARY WILSON** was named the Region 4 Coach of the Year for his team's performance.

FALL SEASON COMPLETED- The golf team finished their fall season Saturday at the Stanford Women's Intercollegiate tournament by posting a 10th-place finish in the field of 18 teams. Minnesota carded rounds of 310, 315 and 310 for a 54-hole total of 935 strokes. Arizona won the tournament with an 885 team total.

The Gophers were led by sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND), who carded rounds of 74, 76 and 78 for a three-day total of 228 strokes and a 20th-place tie. Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) finished in a tie for 25th-place after recording rounds of 74, 80 and 75 for a total of 229 strokes. Finishing in a tie for 34th-place was junior **KRISTA REUTERFELDT** (COON RAPIDS, MN) with rounds of 77, 79 and 77 for a 54-hole total of 233.

Sophomore **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) tied for 71st place after carding rounds of 85, 80 and 84 for a 249-stroke total. Freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWSITON, MN) finished one stroke behind Leighton in a tie for 73rd place after carding a score of 88, 82 and 80 for a 250-stroke score. San Jose State's Pat Hurst, who won the 1989 NCAA women's golf championship on the Stanford Golf Course, was the medalist with a total of 212 strokes.

GOPHERS TRAVEL TO IOWA, THIRD-RANKED NEBRASKA THIS WEEK — Minnesota is looking to end its six-match losing streak this week but it will not be easy. The Gophers (6-19 overall, 1-10 Big Ten) will be in Iowa City, Iowa for a 7:30 p.m. match on Wednesday against the Hawkeyes, who have won eight of their last 10. Minnesota will travel to Lincoln, Neb. to take part in Nebraska's Runza Classic Friday and Saturday after returning home to attend classes on Thursday. Minnesota will play the third-ranked Cornhuskers Friday at 7:30 p.m. following the tournament-opening match between Texas and Illinois State at 5:30 p.m. The winners of Friday's matches will play for the tournament championship at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday with Friday's losers squaring off at 5 p.m. for third place.

HAWKEYE HELPERS — The Hawks are hot. After losing to Purdue in four games Friday in West Lafayette, Iowa (10-11, 5-6) came back to sweep 19th-ranked Illinois in Champaign, Ill. on Saturday. The win snapped a two-match Hawkeye losing streak. Prior to the two losses, Iowa had won eight in a row, with a five-game comeback win over Minnesota at Williams Arena being the first win of the streak. Iowa is hitting .188 on the season, .184 in the conference.

HEAD COACH RUTH NELSON — Nelson is in her second year at Iowa and 15th year overall. Her all-time record is 551-202-3 (.732) and she is 32-22 (.593) at Iowa.

WATCH FOR — Senior middle blocker **Barb Willis** nearly destroyed Illinois by herself. Against the Illini, she hit .512 with 26 kills and also added 16 digs. Willis is hitting .251 in the conference and leads the team with a 4.74 kill and 1.07 block per game average in the conference. Junior middle hitter **Trista Schoenbeck** from Roseville had eight kills and nine blocks, including five solos, against Illinois. She is second on the team with a Big Ten block per game average of 0.95. Senior setter **Janet Moylan** averages 11.74 assists per game in the Big Ten. The Hawkeye roster features two other Minnesotans, senior outside hitter **Ginger Lorentson** of Lakeville and senior outside hitter **Jennifer Thompson** of Rochester. Thompson, the sister of former Gopher running back Darrell Thompson, has not played this season because of an injury.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 28-9 but has lost two in a row to Iowa. The Gophers lost 13-15, 13-15, 15-11, 15-12, 15-6 earlier this season and also lost in five games to the Hawkeyes in last year's series finale, with both setbacks coming at Williams Arena. The Gophers have won five in a row in Iowa City. The last Minnesota loss there was on Nov. 2, 1984.

OPPONENT INFORMATION CONTINUED --

'HUSKER CORNPONE CRUMBS — Nebraska (19-2 overall, 6-0 Big Eight), the runnerup in last year's NCAA championship, is currently ranked third in the NCAA poll. The only 'Husker losses have been to second-ranked Pacific and fifth-ranked Stanford. A typical conversation about the Nebraska volleyball team centers on how long the current 'Husker winning streak is. Nebraska has already racked up two eight-game streaks this season and has now won three straight. There will likely be a good crowd on hand for Friday's matches. Nebraska is averaging 2,918 a match. The 'Huskies are hitting .295 on the season.

HEAD COACH TERRY PETTIT — Pettit is in his 14th season at Nebraska and 17th year overall. His overall mark is 476-122 (.796) and his record at Nebraska is 429-105 (.803).

WATCH FOR — Nebraska has plenty of weapons. Junior outside hitter **Cris Hall** leads the team in kills with 242 (3.97/game) and sophomore **Eileen Shannon** is second (214 kills-3.16/game). The middle is in good hands with junior **Janet Kruse** (.296 hitting percentage and 197 kills) and sophomore **Stephanie Thater** (.382 hitting percentage and 190 kills). Senior all-American setter **Val Novak** (12.11 assists/game) runs the offense. The 'Huskies have one Minnesotan on the roster, senior **Linda Barsness** of Rochester.

SERIES — Nebraska leads 22-4. Last year the 'Huskies ended the Gophers' season with a 15-10, 11-15, 15-13, 15-12 win in Lincoln, Neb. in the sweet sixteen round of the NCAA championship. Earlier last season, Nebraska defeated Minnesota in four games in the Gophers' Reebok Classic.

REDBIRD REVIEW — Illinois State (18-6 overall, 4-2 Gateway) lost a five-game, two hour and 40 minute match to Northern Iowa Saturday after sweeping Drake on Friday night. The loss snapped a five-match Redbird winning streak. Earlier this season, Illinois State had an 11-match winning streak. Eleven of the Redbirds' 18 wins have been sweeps. Minnesota would be the fourth Big Ten opponent Illinois State has played, should the two teams meet. The Redbirds have defeated Michigan State (five games) and Northwestern (three games) and lost to Illinois (three games). Illinois State is hitting .210 on the season.

HEAD COACH JULIE MORGAN — Morgan is in her fourth year at Illinois State and seventh year overall. She has an overall mark of 139-84 (.623) and a 79-37 (.681) record at Illinois State.

WATCH FOR — Junior **Hollie Cravens** averaged 4.70 kills per game in her last four Gateway Conference matches. She leads the team with a 3.95 conference kill per game average. Junior outside hitter **Lisa Rolf** leads the team with 314 season kills (3.69 kills/game). Freshman **Michelle Rucker** leads the team in hitting (.238) and has 133 kills. The Illinois State setter is senior **Marci Maier**, who is averaging 10.0 assists per game.

SERIES — The Redbirds lead 4-3. The last time the teams faced each other was on Sept. 15, 1982, with Minnesota winning in five games in its season opener.

LONGHORN LOGISTICS — Fourth-ranked Texas (24-0 overall, 8-0 Southwest Conference) can clinch its ninth straight SWC title with a win over Rice on Wednesday. The Longhorns have a 61-match SWC winning streak and are off to their best-ever start. Texas was one of two undefeated teams left in the nation as of last week (along with Penn State). In three matches last week, the Longhorns defeated Kentucky 3-0 (Oct. 21), downed Houston 3-1 (Wednesday) and bested LSU 3-0 (Saturday). Texas is hitting .264 for the season.

HEAD COACH MICK HALEY — Haley is in his 11th season at Texas and his 18th season overall. He has an overall record of 612-141-1 (.813) and is 361-90-1 (.800) at Texas. Longhorn assistant coach Glen Lietzke is a 1979 graduate of Minnesota and is in his seventh year at Texas.

WATCH FOR — The Longhorns are led by junior middle blocker **Nikki Busch** (242 kills-3.3/game), junior outside hitter **Janine Gremmel** (233 kills-3.0/game) and senior hitter **Quandalyn Harrell** (214 kills-2.9/game). Busch is hitting .382 and junior outside hitter **Annette Garza** (183 kills) is hitting .294. Junior setter **Missy Kurt** is averaging 11.0 assists per game. Junior middle blocker **Kimberly Komula** of Eden Prairie has seen limited action, playing in just seven matches thus far.

SERIES — Minnesota has never faced Texas.

WEEKEND IN REVIEW --

GOPHERS LOSE TO ILLINOIS, PURDUE — Life is tough on the road for any Big Ten Conference team. The Gophers got another first-hand experience on how tough that life can be. Friday night, 19th-ranked Illinois defeated the Gophers in three games, 15-6, 15-6, 15-8, before the standard Huff Gym crowd of 1,605. The Illini revenged the 1989 home loss to Minnesota, a loss that broke a 37-match home conference winning streak. Saturday night, Purdue completed a season sweep of Minnesota by defeating the Gophers in three games, 15-8, 15-8, 15-11. Minnesota hit .231 in the match, a conference season high for the Gophers and its best performance since Labor Day against Connecticut. The Gophers hit .444 in game three and led 8-7 at one point before the Boilermakers rallied for the 15-11 win.

INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES — Sophomore middle hitter **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) was the most consistent hitter for Minnesota over the weekend. **Benning** hit .310 in the two matches, including a team-high 12 kills against Purdue. She has now contributed six double-figure kill performances to the Gopher effort in 1990, including four in the last eight matches. **Benning's** blocking also continues to be a strong suit as she is third on the Minnesota roster with 56 total blocks for the season.

On the subject of blocking, Minnesota's **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) and **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) are approaching significant milestones in their careers.

Thompson needs just one block to reach 400 in her career. By doing so, she would become only the fourth Gopher in history to reach that level. She also needs six total blocks to reach 100 for the season, the third time that she would accomplish that feat. This past weekend, **Thompson** had five block assists to boost her career total to 321 and move her past Lori Miller (1986-89) into second place on the all-time block assist list.

Lushine had four block assists on the recent road trip and now has 188 total blocks in her Minnesota career, moving her into 10th place on the all-time Minnesota list (see stat page for complete list). She needs only two total blocks to move past Beth Hiner (1982-85) into ninth place. **Lushine** leads the Gophers in Big Ten play with an average of 1.21 blocks/game.

Sophomores **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) is tied with fellow sophomore **BECKY LINDBERG** (FOREST LAKE, MN) for eighth place on the career dig list with 437 digs, while **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG) is 10th with 416 digs. **Thompson** is the only other current Gopher on the list, holding down sixth place with 667 digs. **Ahlquist** leads Minnesota in 1990 with 233 digs and a 2.62 digs/game average.

HEAD COACH STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER'S RECORD — Schleuder is in her 18th season overall and ninth year at Minnesota. She has an overall record of 475-225 (.679) and is 177-113 (.610) at Minnesota. In the Big Ten, Schleuder is 79-61 (.564). Saturday's match at Purdue was the 700th of Schleuder's coaching career.

BIG TEN TELECONFERENCE -- Indiana volleyball coach Tom Shoji will be featured on Tuesday's Big Ten football teleconference. Shoji will respond to questions from the media from 12:40-12:50 p.m. Please call the Minnesota sports information office for details.

MANKATO STATE TO VISIT - Mankato State (1-1, 0-0 North Central) and Minnesota (3-0, 3-0 Big Ten) will have their first meeting in seven years at 1 p.m. on Saturday Nov. 10, at the University Aquatic Center. Minnesota leads the series with the Mavericks 5-1, with the last meeting being in 1982-83.

OEGEMA TO TRY OUT FOR DUTCH NATIONAL TEAM -- Junior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) left for The Netherlands on Sunday, Nov. 4 to try for a spot on the Dutch National Team in the World Championship trials. Oegema will compete in both the 200-meter and 400-meter individual medleys, with her main goal being to qualify in the 400 IM. The qualifying time in the 400 IM is 4:51.00 and she has already beaten that time when her best 400-yard IM time is converted to metered time. She will rejoin the Gopher team Nov. 19. If she makes the Dutch national team, Oegema will compete in the World Championships in Perth, Australia, Jan. 3-13.

GOPHERS DEFEAT WISCONSIN - Minnesota defeated Wisconsin 167-133 to win its third Big Ten meet of the season Saturday at the Wisconsin Natatorium. The Gophers maintain the lead in the 15-year series with the Badgers, with an 8-6-1 edge.

Junior **LINDA OEGEMA** was Minnesota's only double-event winner. She won the 400 individual medley in a pool-record time of 4:27.02. She also won the 200 butterfly with a time of 2:07.08. Two sophomores, **KRINA KABANUK** (FARGO, ND/FARGO SOUTH) and **JENNIFER YASIS** (LAKE ELMO, MN/JOHNSON) each earned their first Big Ten Conference victories. Kabanuk won the 500 free in a time of 5:11.79 while Yasis took the honors in 1-meter diving with 167.20 points.

COACH'S COMMENTS - "I was happy that we were able to defeat Wisconsin by the amount of points that we did," said Freeman. "Krina Kabanuk and freshman **MARSHA RIED** (NEW BERLIN, WI/NEW BERLIN WEST), who were both walk-ons, went 1-2 in the 500 free, which was the one of the best races of the meet. For walk-ons to do that in a Big Ten meet is really fantastic."

NORTHWESTERN RELAYS- The women's swimming team took fourth place in the field of eight teams at the Northwestern Relays on Sunday at Evanston, Ill. Michigan won the meet with 134 points, host Northwestern was second with 118 points, Illinois scored 70 points for third place, and the Gophers had 56 points. Minnesota's top finish came in the 1,500 freestyle relay when they finished second with a time of 15:12.28, behind Michigan's winning time of 15:03.93.

GOPHERS TO HOST MICHIGAN, MICHIGAN STATE — The Minnesota women's volleyball team will try to extend its winning ways with home Big Ten matches this weekend against Michigan and Michigan State.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

WOLVERINE WRITINGS — The Wolverines (5-20, 1-12 Big Ten) always seem to pull off one big home upset every season. Last year, Michigan upset Minnesota in five games at Ann Arbor, the Wolverines' only Big Ten win in 1989. Saturday night, Michigan upset Illinois 3-0 (15-13, 15-13, 15-10) in Ann Arbor, snapping a 20-match Big Ten losing streak that dated back to last season's Minnesota match. It was Michigan's first victory over Illinois since Sept. 23, 1983.

THE COACH — Michigan's **Peggy Bradley-Doppes** (Mt. St. Joseph's '79) picked up her first Big Ten victory Saturday night and is 5-20 (.200) in her first season at Ann Arbor. Her 12-year career record is 305-164 (.650).

WATCH FOR — Senior hitter **Julia Sturm** is Michigan's leading gun with her team-leading 3.39 kills/game, 2.04 digs/game, 0.98 blocks/game and 0.31 aces/game. Sturm also leads the Wolverines in conference play with 3.04 kills/game. Sophomore middle blocker **Chris White** leads Michigan with her .200 hitting percentage and also contributes 0.73 blocks/game.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

SERIES VS. MICHIGAN — Minnesota leads the overall series 20-1, with the only blemish coming in a five-game loss at Michigan last season. The Gophers' only Big Ten victory of the 1990 season came at Michigan Oct. 14, when Minnesota defeated the Wolverines 13-15, 15-6, 15-10, 9-15, 15-11.

SPARTAN SIGHTINGS — Michigan State (7-20, 3-10 Big Ten) is struggling, having lost its last eight matches, including its last six matches in three straight games. The Spartans do own conference wins over Indiana, Minnesota and Michigan, with the last of those coming Oct. 17 in East Lansing, over Michigan. Michigan State needs just one victory in its last five Big Ten matches to equal its 1989 conference victory total of four. The Spartans play in Iowa City Friday night before traveling to Minnesota for the Saturday encounter.

THE COACH — Michigan State's **Ginger Mayson** (South Alabama '77) is in her sixth season at East Lansing and has a record of 54-127 (.298), 18-85 (.175) in conference play. Her eight-year overall record is 110-153 (.418).

WATCH FOR — Simply put, senior outside hitter **Becky Belanger** is the best volleyball player that Michigan State has ever had. She is first on MSU's career list for kills (1,589) and total attacks (4,129), second in digs (1,233) and third in hitting percentage (.269) and service aces (168). **Belanger** leads the 1990 Spartan team with 4.07 kills/game and 3.03 digs/game. Senior middle hitter **Dawn Andrews** is one of the Big Ten's better blockers at 1.05 blocks/game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series 16-4, but the Spartans won the first meeting this year in three games at East Lansing. The 15-7, 16-14, 15-4 victory broke a Minnesota 10-match winning streak against Michigan State dating back to Oct. 19, 1984.

GOPHERS UPSET ILLINOIS STATE, FINISH THIRD AT RUNZA CLASSIC — Minnesota snapped a seven-match losing streak Saturday in Lincoln, Neb. when the Gophers defeated Illinois State 15-10, 15-7, 11-15, 15-8 in the third-place match of Nebraska's Runza Classic. Illinois State (19-8) was the ninth-ranked team in the NCAA's Midwest region in Tuesday's poll. Four Gophers reached double figures in kills for the match. Sophomore **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) led with 14, sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) had 13, while sophomore **DENISE HAGLER** (FORT WAYNE, IN/WAYNE) and senior **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) each had 12 kills. **Thompson** also had 14 digs, five block assists and four service aces and was named to the all-tournament team. The Gophers outhit the Redbirds .196 to .160.

SECOND-RANKED 'HUSKERS DOMINATE MINNESOTA — The Gopher volleyball team was beaten decisively by second-ranked Nebraska on Friday, with the 15-2, 15-3, 15-8 humbling reminiscent of the Minnesota football team's early-season 56-0 loss to Nebraska. The 'Husker spikers took just 57 minutes to beat the Gophers, outhitting Minnesota .411 to .023 in the process. One Gopher who was not intimidated was sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG). **Ahlquist** hit .333, led Minnesota with seven kills, and added a service ace and three digs.

GOPHERS BATTLE BUT THEN FALL TO IOWA — The Gophers dropped a 3-0 decision to Iowa on Wednesday in what had to be one of Minnesota's toughest losses of the year. After losing game one 15-5, Minnesota held a 14-4 lead in game two before becoming the victim to an unpleasant Halloween trick. Unable to capitalize on six game-point serves, the Gophers squandered the lead and provided Iowa with an unexpected 16-14 treat. The Hawkeyes completed the sweep with a 15-11 win in game three. **Thompson** had 14 kills to lead the Gophers and freshman setter **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) had a career-high 19 digs. Iowa outhit Minnesota .225 to .137.

MILESTONES — **Thompson** became the fourth Minnesota player to reach 400 career blocks. She had four blocks against Nebraska and five against Illinois State and now has 406 in her career. With a hot finish, **Thompson** could surpass Lori Miller and move into third place. Miller had 430 blocks in her career. Junior **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) moved into the Gopher top ten in career blocks—she had eight against Iowa and now has 196, ninth on the all-time list.

THE SCHLEUDER LINE — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 18th season as a volleyball coach. She has an overall record of 476-227 (.677). In nine seasons at Minnesota, Schleuder has compiled an overall record of 178-115 (.608) and a Big Ten record of 79-62 (.560).

CROSS COUNTRY

REGION MEET PARTICULARS — The University of Minnesota women's cross country team will travel to West Lafayette, Ind. to take part in the Region IV Cross Country Championship Saturday at 11 a.m. EST. This meet serves as the qualifying meet for the NCAA Championship Nov. 19 at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, Tenn.

MEET PREVIEW — The 5,000-meter race will be run at Purdue's South Golf Course, but this circuit is a little more demanding than the Big Ten Championship course at Les Bolstad. **Indiana**, ranked third in the latest NCAA Division I coaches' poll, is the choice to repeat as the region titlist. Hoosier senior **Michelle Dekkers** won the Big Ten meet by 11 seconds at Minnesota and is the clear-cut favorite at Purdue. Tenth-ranked **Wisconsin** presents the greatest team and individual challenges to Indiana, as seniors **Suzy Favor** and **Mary Hartzheim** will try to track down Dekkers and the Hoosiers. **Michigan** fell to 13th in this week's national poll, although they finished a strong third at the Big Ten meet. The Wolverine "pack attack" strategy might prove to be effective in this meet, as Minnesota proved in 1989 with its second-place finish.

LAST YEAR'S MEET — The 1989 edition of the Region IV Cross Country Championship was one of the most successful meets in Gopher cross country history. Minnesota was able to improve on a fourth-place finish at the 1989 Big Ten meet, upsetting Iowa and Michigan to take second place and claim an automatic berth in the 1989 NCAA Championship meet. It was the first NCAA appearance for Minnesota as a team since 1983. Minnesota head coach **GARY WILSON** was named the Region IV Coach of the Year for his team's performance.

MOE AND OLSSON COMPETING AT ROLEX REGIONALS THIS WEEKEND — Juniors **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULL-STRANDSKOLAN) are the only Gophers who qualified for this weekend's Rolex Regional Championships in Madison, Wis. Play begins on Thursday and concludes on Sunday. **Moe** (9-3 in singles) and **Olsson** (5-5 in singles) are scheduled to open on Friday with two singles matches and one doubles match. The duo has a season doubles record of 8-2.

LAST YEAR — **Moe** and **Olsson** each won three matches in last year's regional before losing in the quarterfinals. **Moe** lost 6-2, 4-6, 7-5 to Purdue's Erica Adams and **Olsson** lost 6-4, 6-1 to Indiana's Deb Edelman. In doubles, **Moe** and **Olsson** won their first two matches before losing 6-3, 6-0 to Indiana's Gretchen Doninger and Candy Kopetzki in the quarterfinals.

GYMNASTICS

KRALING NAMED NATION'S TOP HIGH SCHOOL SCORER IN 1990 — Gopher freshman **JENNIFER KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS) had the top all-around and balance beam averages in the nation for 1990, the National High School Gymnastics Coaches Association announced. She is the first Minnesota high school girl gymnast to have the top national all-around average.

Kraling had an overall event average of 9.62 to edge Cassie Osborn of Fargo, N.D. (South High School) for the best all-around average (Osborn had a 9.58 event average). On the balance beam, **Kraling** averaged 9.69 to finish ahead of Laura Waldman of Kingwood, Texas (Kingwood High School), who had a 9.63 average on the beam.

More than 150 gymnasts from over 300 high schools in the coaches association qualified for consideration as the top all-rounder. Each gymnast's average was based on her top five scores of the season, with two of those scores having to be from a championship competition.

Kraling finished second all-around in the 1990 Minnesota State AA High School Girls Gymnastics meet after winning the state AA all-around title in 1989.

There will be a Girl Scout flag ceremony at the match as well as a banner contest, sponsored by Dinkytown Pizza Hut. A free gift will be given to all troop members participating in the banner contest. Last season's Girl Scout Night match against Ohio State drew 5,011 fans, the 1989 season high for Minnesota volleyball.

GOPHERS TO HOST MICHIGAN, MICHIGAN STATE — The Minnesota women's volleyball team will try to extend its winning ways with home Big Ten matches this weekend against Michigan and Michigan State.

WOLVERINE WRITINGS — The Wolverines (5-20, 1-12 Big Ten) always seem to pull off one big home upset every season. Last year, Michigan upset Minnesota in five games at Ann Arbor, the Wolverines' only Big Ten win in 1989. Saturday night, Michigan upset Illinois 3-0 (15-13, 15-13, 15-10) in Ann Arbor, snapping a 20-match Big Ten losing streak that dated back to last season's Minnesota match. It was Michigan's first victory over Illinois since Sept. 23, 1983.

THE COACH — Michigan's **Peggy Bradley-Doppes** (Mt. St. Joseph's '79) picked up her first Big Ten victory Saturday night and is 5-20 (.200) in her first season at Ann Arbor. Her 12-year career record is 305-164 (.650).

WATCH FOR — Senior hitter **Julia Sturm** is Michigan's leading gun with her team-leading 3.39 kills/game, 2.04 digs/game, 0.98 blocks/game and 0.31 aces/game. **Sturm** also leads the Wolverines in conference play with 3.04 kills/game. Sophomore middle blocker **Chris White** leads Michigan with her .200 hitting percentage and also contributes 0.73 blocks/game.

SERIES VS. MICHIGAN — Minnesota leads the overall series 20-1, with the only blemish coming in a five-game loss at Michigan last season. The Gophers' only Big Ten victory of the 1990 season came at Michigan Oct. 14, when Minnesota defeated the Wolverines 13-15, 15-6, 15-10, 9-15, 15-11.

SPARTAN SIGHTINGS — Michigan State (7-20, 3-10 Big Ten) is struggling, having lost its last eight matches, including its last six matches in three straight games. The Spartans do own conference wins over Indiana, Minnesota and Michigan, with the last of those coming Oct. 17 in East Lansing, over Michigan. Michigan State needs just one victory in its last five Big Ten matches to equal its 1989 conference victory total of four. The Spartans play in Iowa City Friday night before traveling to Minnesota for the Saturday encounter.

THE COACH — Michigan State's **Ginger Mayson** (South Alabama '77) is in her sixth season at East Lansing and has a record of 54-127 (.298), 18-85 (.175) in conference play. Her eight-year overall record is 110-153 (.418).

WATCH FOR — Simply put, senior outside hitter **Becky Belanger** is the best volleyball player that Michigan State has ever had. She is first on MSU's career list for kills (1,589) and total attacks (4,129), second in digs (1,233) and third in hitting percentage (.269) and service aces (168). **Belanger** leads the 1990 Spartan team with 4.07 kills/game and 3.03 digs/game. Senior middle hitter **Dawn Andrews** is one of the Big Ten's better blockers at 1.05 blocks/game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series 16-4, but the Spartans won the first meeting this year in three games at East Lansing. The 15-7, 16-14, 15-4 victory broke a Minnesota 10-match winning streak against Michigan State dating back to Oct. 19, 1984.

GOPHERS UPSET ILLINOIS STATE, FINISH THIRD AT RUNZA CLASSIC — Minnesota snapped a seven-match losing streak Saturday in Lincoln, Neb. when the Gophers defeated Illinois State 15-10, 15-7, 11-15, 15-8 in the third-place match of Nebraska's Runza Classic. Illinois State (19-8) was the ninth-ranked team in the NCAA's Mideast region in Tuesday's poll. Four Gophers reached double figures in kills for the match. Sophomore **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) led with 14, sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) had 13, while sophomore **DENISE HAGLER** (FORT WAYNE, IN/WAYNE) and senior **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) each had 12 kills. **Thompson** also had 14 digs, five block assists and four service aces and was named to the all-tournament team. The Gophers outhit the Redbirds .196 to .160.

SECOND-RANKED 'HUSKERS DOMINATE MINNESOTA — The Gopher volleyball team was beaten decisively by second-ranked Nebraska on Friday, with the 15-2, 15-3, 15-8 humbling reminiscent of the Minnesota football team's early-season 56-0 loss to Nebraska. The 'Husker spikers took just 57 minutes to beat the Gophers, outhitting Minnesota .411 to .023 in the process. One Gopher who was not intimidated was sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG). **Ahlquist** hit .333, led Minnesota with seven kills, and added a service ace and three digs.

GOPHERS BATTLE BUT THEN FALL TO IOWA — The Gophers dropped a 3-0 decision to Iowa on Wednesday in what had to be one of Minnesota's toughest losses of the year. After losing game one 15-5, Minnesota held a 14-4 lead in game two before becoming the victim to an unpleasant Halloween trick. Unable to capitalize on six game-point serves, the Gophers squandered the lead and provided Iowa with an unexpected 16-14 treat. The Hawkeyes completed the sweep with a 15-11 win in game three. **Thompson** had 14 kills to lead the Gophers and freshman setter **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) had a career-high 19 digs. Iowa outhit Minnesota .225 to .137.

MILESTONES — **Thompson** became the fourth Minnesota player to reach 400 career blocks. She had four blocks against Nebraska and five against Illinois State and now has 406 in her career. With a hot finish, **Thompson** could surpass Lori Miller and move into third place. Miller had 430 blocks in her career. Junior **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) moved into the Gopher top ten in career blocks—she had eight against Iowa and now has 196, ninth on the all-time list.

THE SCHLEUDER LINE — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 18th season as a volleyball coach. She has an overall record of 476-227 (.677). In nine seasons at Minnesota, Schleuder has compiled an overall record of 178-115 (.608) and a Big Ten record of 79-62 (.560).

VOLLEYBALL TEAM WRAPS UP ROAD SEASON THIS WEEKEND — After splitting home matches against Michigan and Michigan State Friday and Saturday, the Gophers (8-22, 2-12 Big Ten) will venture to Evanston, Ill. and Madison, Wis. for matches against Northwestern and league-leading Wisconsin Friday and Saturday.

WILDCAT WOBBLER — Northwestern (14-15, 6-8 Big Ten) has been struggling of late, losing four in a row, six of its last seven and seven of its last nine. The Wildcats have lost five straight conference matches. Northwestern will play at Notre Dame on Tuesday in hopes of ending its losing streak. The streak almost came to an end Friday but Purdue escaped with a 3-2 win. Illinois then swept the 'Cats 3-0 on Saturday.

WATCH FOR — Sophomore outside hitter **Stacey Kammes** continues to lead Northwestern in hitting. She has topped the team in kills in 15 matches this season and is averaging 3.18 kills per game. She averages 0.39 aces/game, second on the team to junior outside hitter **Jenny Jostes'** 0.41 average. Jostes leads the team in digs (3.40/game). Junior **Heather Fredin** (8.18 assists/game) handles the setting duties. Freshman outside hitter **Kim Hanson** from Chaska (Minn.) High School averages 2.25 kills per game.

THE COACH -- Jerry Angle (George Williams '73) is in his 12th season at Northwestern with a career record of 292-179-5 (.620). In his 17th season as a collegiate head coach, Angle is 429-243-5 (.638).

SERIES — The series is tied 11-11. Northwestern won 15-3, 4-15, 15-4, 15-8 at Williams Arena on Oct. 20. The Gophers won both matches between the teams in 1989.

BADGER BOASTINGS — Tenth-ranked Wisconsin (24-7, 12-2 Big Ten) had an eight-match winning streak snapped Saturday in West Lafayette, Ind. as Purdue beat the Badgers in five and kept Wisconsin's conference title hopes on hold. Wisconsin won 3-1 over Illinois in Champaign, Ill. on Friday. Three teams are still in contention for the Big Ten title: Wisconsin (12-2), Purdue (12-3), and Ohio State (11-3). The schedule favors Wisconsin, as the Badgers have home matches against the Gophers and Iowa this weekend and finish at Michigan and Michigan State on Nov. 23 and 24. Purdue must still play Indiana (away), Ohio State (away) and Illinois (home); while Ohio State has Illinois (home), Purdue (home), Iowa (away) and Minnesota (away) remaining.

WATCH FOR — In Wisconsin's loss to Purdue, junior middle blocker **Arlisa Hagan** hit .479 with 26 kills and senior middle blocker **Lisa Boyd** hit .357 with 19 kills. Hagan is hitting .336 on the season (3.64 kills/game) and Boyd is hitting .262 (2.79 kills/game). Junior outside hitter **Susan Wohlford** (4.54 digs/game, 4.95 digs/Big Ten game) plays tenacious defense and seems to believe she can retrieve any opponent attack. Junior setter **Liz Tortorello** averages 13.00 assists per game in the Big Ten (11.40 overall).

THE COACH -- Steve Lowe (Iowa '78) is coaching in his fifth season at Wisconsin and carries a 103-63 (.620) school and career record.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 19-8 but has lost two straight to the Badgers. Wisconsin won 15-4, 15-3, 11-15, 15-1 at Williams Arena on Oct. 19.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

GOPHERS MAINTAIN CONFERENCE STANDING — The Gophers (8-22, 2-12 Big Ten) entered last weekend's play with the hope of sweeping the two Michigan schools and improving their standing among the Big Ten teams to eighth place. Minnesota fell behind early in game one against Michigan Friday, but rallied for a 15-12, 16-14, 13-15, 15-2 victory, the second conference win of the season. The Gopher hitters had their best night since Labor Day, hitting .270 against the Wolverines. The most impressive statistic may have been the team's blocking numbers. Minnesota sent two and sometimes three Gophers to the net to defend against the Michigan attack and came away with a season-high 23.5 team blocks, including a Williams Arena record 39 block assists. The Gophers tried to complete the sweep against Michigan State Saturday, but the Spartans ran off leads too large to overcome in all three games and held on for a 16-14, 15-13, 15-12 victory. Minnesota's attack percentage fell to .174 for the match and the team only blocked 7.5 attacks.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES — Senior middle hitter **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) had a rare volleyball "triple-double" Friday night against Michigan, collecting 13 kills, 16 digs and a career-high 11 blocks. The triple-double was the fifth in Minnesota volleyball history, while **Thompson's** 11 block assists set a Williams Arena record. She now has 103 block assists for the season, which is a career-high for one season and ranks fourth on the Gopher single-season list. **Thompson's** 420 career blocks now leave her just 10 behind Lori Miller, who ranks third on the all-time Minnesota chart.

Sophomore outside hitter **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) led the Gophers in kills in both matches, gathering 17 against Michigan and 13 against Michigan State. The Michigan match marked the first time since Sept. 29 against Illinois that **Hanna** has led the team in kills. She also added 13 digs and a career-high seven blocks in the Michigan win. **Hanna** now has 485 digs in her two-year career, ranking eighth on the all-time list.

Junior middle hitter **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) did not start the Friday match against Michigan, but made an important contribution. **Lushine** had eight kills and a career-high 11 blocks against the Wolverines and now has 207 career blocks, five short of eighth place on the all-time Minnesota list. **Lushine** also hit .400 for the Michigan match, her second best hitting performance of the season.

Sophomore middle hitter **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) did not lead Minnesota Friday night in kills, blocks or digs, but she put together one of the more complete matches of her career. **Benning** had a career-high 16 kills, hit a Minnesota Big Ten match-high .448, dug a career-high 11 balls and blocked five Michigan kill attempts. The 16 kills and 11 digs marked the first "double-double" of **Benning's** career and the .448 hitting percentage was her best of the 1990 season. Very quietly, she has upped her kill average from 1.11 in 1989 to 2.11 in 1990.

THE SCHLEUDER LINE — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 18th season as a volleyball coach. She has an overall record of 477-228 (.677). In nine seasons at Minnesota, **Schleuder** has compiled an overall record of 179-116 (.607) and a Big Ten record of 80-63 (.559).

MOE AND OLSSON TO COMPETE AT DUPONT CLAY COURT QUALIFYING — Juniors **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) are entered in qualifying play for the Dupont National Intercollegiate Clay Court Championships. Competition will be in Panama City, Fla. with qualifying rounds on Wednesday and Thursday and the main draw beginning Friday and going through Sunday. **Moe** lost her opening singles match in last year's qualifying play, while **Olsson** won her first two matches before losing.

GOPHERS WIN EARLY, LOSE LATE AT ROLEX REGIONAL — **Moe** won her opening two singles matches and combined with **Olsson** to win a round-of-32 doubles match at the Rolex regional tournament in Madison, Wis. before falling in both the singles and doubles round of 16. **Moe** defeated Illinois State's Jane Williams 6-2, 6-3 and then beat Wisconsin's Stephanie Benz 6-1, 6-1 before losing to Badger Jill Chullino 6-3, 6-3. **Olsson** lost to Melissa Harris of Notre Dame 3-6, 6-4, 6-1 in her first singles match. In doubles, **Moe** and **Olsson** defeated Eastern Michigan's Caryn Stube and Lynne Tilden 6-2, 6-2 and then lost to Northwestern's Branaca Elsberry and Julie Willett 4-6, 6-3, 6-3. **Moe's** season singles record is now 11-4 and **Olsson's** singles record is 5-7. The duo's season doubles record is 9-3. -- more

GOPHERS FINISH FIFTH AT REGION MEET — At the Region 4 meet in West Lafayette, Ind. Saturday, Minnesota ran a very similar race to the one they ran two weeks ago at the Big Ten Championship and came through with the same result. The Gophers scored 192 points and finished in fifth place out of 28 teams, losing to the same four teams that they did at the Big Ten meet. Indiana (51), Michigan (72), Iowa (113), and Wisconsin (173) finished ahead of the Gophers and will all participate at the NCAA Championship next Monday at the University of Tennessee. Minnesota defeated every non-ranked Division I team that it raced against in the Region 4 meet, but lost to every ranked Division I team, a fact that has held true all season.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES— Indiana's Michelle Dekkers continued her impressive career with another victory at Purdue, defeating Wisconsin's Suzy Favor by 11 seconds. Minnesota's top finisher was freshman **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY), who placed 22nd in 18:27.09 over the 5,000-meter course. Junior **KARA PARKER** (OLIVIA, MN) had a good performance for Minnesota, finishing 34th in 18:44.67. It was the first time this season that junior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) did not lead the Gophers. Rowe was not feeling well on the day of the race and finished 42nd in 18:51.13.

VOLLEYBALL TEAM WRAPS UP ROAD SEASON THIS WEEKEND — After splitting home matches against Michigan and Michigan State Friday and Saturday, the Gophers (8-22, 2-12 Big Ten) will venture to Evanston, Ill. and Madison, Wis. for matches against Northwestern and league-leading Wisconsin Friday and Saturday.

WILDCAT WOBBLER — Northwestern (14-15, 6-8 Big Ten) has been struggling of late, losing four in a row, six of its last seven and seven of its last nine. The Wildcats have lost five straight conference matches. Northwestern will play at Notre Dame on Tuesday in hopes of ending its losing streak. The streak almost came to an end Friday but Purdue escaped with a 3-2 win. Illinois then swept the 'Cats 3-0 on Saturday.

WATCH FOR — Sophomore outside hitter **Stacey Kammes** continues to lead Northwestern in hitting. She has topped the team in kills in 15 matches this season and is averaging 3.18 kills per game. She averages 0.39 aces/game, second on the team to junior outside hitter **Jenny Jostes'** 0.41 average. Jostes leads the team in digs (3.40/game). Junior **Heather Fredin** (8.18 assists/game) handles the setting duties. Freshman outside hitter **Kim Hanson** from Chaska (Minn.) High School averages 2.25 kills per game.

THE COACH -- **Jerry Angle** (George Williams '73) is in his 12th season at Northwestern with a career record of 292-179-5 (.620). In his 17th season as a collegiate head coach, Angle is 429-243-5 (.638).

SERIES — The series is tied 11-11. Northwestern won 15-3, 4-15, 15-4, 15-8 at Williams Arena on Oct. 20. The Gophers won both matches between the teams in 1989.

BADGER BOASTINGS — Tenth-ranked Wisconsin (24-7, 12-2 Big Ten) had an eight-match winning streak snapped Saturday in West Lafayette, Ind. as Purdue beat the Badgers in five and kept Wisconsin's conference title hopes on hold. Wisconsin won 3-1 over Illinois in Champaign, Ill. on Friday. Three teams are still in contention for the Big Ten title: Wisconsin (12-2), Purdue (12-3), and Ohio State (11-3). The schedule favors Wisconsin, as the Badgers have home matches against the Gophers and Iowa this weekend and finish at Michigan and Michigan State on Nov. 23 and 24. Purdue must still play Indiana (away), Ohio State (away) and Illinois (home); while Ohio State has Illinois (home), Purdue (home), Iowa (away) and Minnesota (away) remaining.

WATCH FOR — In Wisconsin's loss to Purdue, junior middle blocker **Arlisa Hagan** hit .479 with 26 kills and senior middle blocker **Lisa Boyd** hit .357 with 19 kills. Hagan is hitting .336 on the season (3.64 kills/game) and Boyd is hitting .262 (2.79 kills/game). Junior outside hitter **Susan Wohlford** (4.54 digs/game, 4.95 digs/Big Ten game) plays tenacious defense and seems to believe she can retrieve any opponent attack. Junior setter **Liz Tortorello** averages 13.00 assists per game in the Big Ten (11.40 overall).

THE COACH -- Steve Lowe (Iowa '78) is coaching in his fifth season at Wisconsin and carries a 103-63 (.620) school and career record.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 19-8 but has lost two straight to the Badgers. Wisconsin won 15-4, 15-3, 11-15, 15-1 at Williams Arena on Oct. 19.

GOPHERS MAINTAIN CONFERENCE STANDING — The Gophers (8-22, 2-12 Big Ten) entered last weekend's play with the hope of sweeping the two Michigan schools and improving their standing among the Big Ten teams to eighth place. Minnesota fell behind early in game one against Michigan Friday, but rallied for a 15-12, 16-14, 13-15, 15-2 victory, the second conference win of the season. The Gopher hitters had their best night since Labor Day, hitting .270 against the Wolverines. The most impressive statistic may have been the team's blocking numbers. Minnesota sent two and sometimes three Gophers to the net to defend against the Michigan attack and came away with a season-high 23.5 team blocks, including a Williams Arena record 39 block assists. The Gophers tried to complete the sweep against Michigan State Saturday, but the Spartans ran off leads too large to overcome in all three games and held on for a 16-14, 15-13, 15-12 victory. Minnesota's attack percentage fell to .174 for the match and the team only blocked 7.5 attacks.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES — Senior middle hitter **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) had a rare volleyball "triple-double" Friday night against Michigan, collecting 13 kills, 16 digs and a career-high 11 blocks. The triple-double was the fifth in Minnesota volleyball history, while **Thompson's** 11 block assists set a Williams Arena record. She now has 103 block assists for the season, which is a career-high for one season and ranks fourth on the Gopher single-season list. **Thompson's** 420 career blocks now leave her just 10 behind Lori Miller, who ranks third on the all-time Minnesota chart.

Sophomore outside hitter **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) led the Gophers in kills in both matches, gathering 17 against Michigan and 13 against Michigan State. The Michigan match marked the first time since Sept. 29 against Illinois that **Hanna** has led the team in kills. She also added 13 digs and a career-high seven blocks in the Michigan win. **Hanna** now has 485 digs in her two-year career, ranking eighth on the all-time list.

Junior middle hitter **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) did not start the Friday match against Michigan, but made an important contribution. **Lushine** had eight kills and a career-high 11 blocks against the Wolverines and now has 207 career blocks, five short of eighth place on the all-time Minnesota list. **Lushine** also hit .400 for the Michigan match, her second best hitting performance of the season.

Sophomore middle hitter **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN) did not lead Minnesota Friday night in kills, blocks or digs, but she put together one of the more complete matches of her career. **Benning** had a career-high 16 kills, hit a Minnesota Big Ten match-high .448, dug a career-high 11 balls and blocked five Michigan kill attempts. The 16 kills and 11 digs marked the first "double-double" of **Benning's** career and the .448 hitting percentage was her best of the 1990 season. Very quietly, she has upped her kill average from 1.11 in 1989 to 2.11 in 1990.

VOLLEYBALL

GOPHERS CLOSE SEASON WITH INDIANA, OHIO STATE — The Minnesota women's volleyball team ends its 1990 season with two home Big Ten matches. The Gophers will host Indiana Friday at 7:30 p.m., followed by a match with Ohio State Saturday at 7:30 p.m. Saturday's match is Senior Day, with Gopher seniors **JODI ROGERS (VILLA PARK, IL/WILLOWBROOK)** and **DAWN THOMPSON (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN)** being honored in their final matches at Williams Arena.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

HOOSIER HAPPENINGS — Indiana (16-10, 8-8 Big Ten) still has postseason aspirations, especially in terms of the Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball Championship. However, the Hoosiers may have to win both matches this weekend to assure both a winning record in Big Ten play and a postseason berth. The .500 record in conference play should surprise nobody, as the Hoosiers have finished at .500 in the Big Ten both of the past two seasons. Last weekend, Indiana defeated Purdue in four games and lost to Illinois in five games.

WATCH FOR — Senior outside hitter **Diane Hoereth** had a big weekend against Purdue and Illinois, collecting 45 kills and 38 digs in the two matches. She leads the Hoosiers with 4.38 kills/game, 3.05 digs/game and a .280 hitting percentage. Junior outside hitter **Mary Jo Herrett** led Indiana with 22 kills against Purdue and is the second leading hitter for the Hoosiers with 3.51 kills/game. Senior setter **Joy Jordan** is averaging 13.17 assists/game.

THE COACH — Indiana's **Tom Shoji** (UC-Santa Barbara '71) is in his fourth season as the Hoosier mentor with a record of 72-48 (.600) overall and 36-34 (.514) in Big Ten play. Shoji has a 10-year career mark of 188-140 (.573).

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series 13-7. Indiana won the first meeting of the year 15-7, 15-6, 15-7 at Bloomington, Ind. behind **Hoereth's** 19 kills. **KAREN LUSHINE (ROSEVILLE, MN)** had nine kills to lead Minnesota's hitters.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

BUCKEYE BULLETIN — Ohio State (21-7, 13-3 Big Ten) enters the final weekend of regular season play as the only team with a chance to catch Wisconsin for the league title. However, that chance is very slim. Wisconsin (26-7, 14-2 Big Ten) leads the Buckeyes by one full game and holds the tie-breaker advantage, having beaten Ohio State twice. Wisconsin would have to lose at both Michigan schools and Ohio State would have to win at Iowa and Minnesota for the Buckeyes to repeat as Big Ten champions. Regardless, the 15th-ranked Buckeyes are likely on their way to their second consecutive NCAA tournament. The berth was probably cinched with their two home-court victories last weekend over Illinois and Purdue.

WATCH FOR — Senior outside hitter **Holly O'Leary** was the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1989 and is a candidate to repeat in 1990. O'Leary leads the Buckeyes with 4.28 kills/game and is Ohio State's all-time kill leader with 1,726. She had 20 kills in Ohio State's victory over Purdue Saturday night. Junior middle blocker **Leisa Wissler** is second on the club in both kills (2.72/game) and blocks (.81/game). Wissler led Ohio State with 18 kills in the Friday night victory over Illinois. Senior setter **Audrey DiPronio** runs the Buckeye offense, averaging 11.48 assists/game.

THE COACH — Ohio State's **Jim Stone** (Ball State '75) is in his ninth season as the Ohio State coach. He has a 185-107 (.634) overall record and a 93-52 (.641) Big Ten record. Stone's 12-year career record stands at 235-149 (.612).

THE SERIES — Ohio State leads the series 14-11 and has taken the last three matches from Minnesota. Earlier this season, the Buckeyes swept the Gophers 15-4, 15-11, 15-10 in the conference opener for both teams at Columbus. O'Leary had 14 kills to lead Ohio State and **Lushine** had eight kills to lead Minnesota.

GOPHERS BATTLE, BUT FALL TO WILDCATS, BADGERS — Minnesota (8-24, 2-14) may have been the underdog in matches at Northwestern Friday and at Wisconsin Saturday but the Gophers did not play like it. Minnesota took both teams to four games before succumbing to the more experienced Wildcats and Badgers. Northwestern opened Friday's match with 15-4 and 15-10 wins, outhitting the Gophers .444 to .179 in game one and .405 to .154 in game two. Minnesota outhit the 'Cats .283 to .213 in game three and capitalized with a 15-13 win. The Gophers could not maintain the pace, however, and hit just .136 in game four as the Wildcats hung on to win the game 15-13 and the match 3-1.

On Saturday, a Wisconsin volleyball-record 4,335 fans showed up expecting to see the 10th-ranked Badgers sweep the ninth-place Gophers. The crowd was quickly quieted, though, as Minnesota opened up a 13-4 lead in game one and held on for a 15-9 win. The Badgers regrouped to win the next two games 15-4 and 15-3. In game four, Minnesota made a late bid to send the match to a fifth game. Down 12-14, the Gophers held serve but two straight Minnesota net violations resulted in a sideout and match point for Wisconsin.

D.T. MOVES UP ON THE CHARTS — Senior co-captain **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) hit .278 and had a team-leading 14 kills against Northwestern. She also recorded nine digs and four block assists. **Thompson** had three more blocks against Wisconsin and with 427 total blocks in her career, needs just four to pass Lori Miller and move into third place on the all-time Gopher list. **Thompson** has 110 block assists this season, tying her with Martie Larsen for the third-most block assists in one season. Larsen had 110 in 1983. **Thompson's** 122 total blocks this season are just five shy of her career high of 127, set last season.

VOLLEYBALL CONTINUED --

AHLQUIST TOPS 300 DIGS — Sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG) had 11 digs against Northwestern and 18 against Wisconsin to raise her season total to 306, tops on the team and the ninth-best Gopher season total since 1985 (when the current dig definition was established). **Ahlquist** needs 26 more digs in Minnesota's last two matches to move past **Lori Miller's** 1989 total of 331, which is currently the fifth-highest season total by a Gopher since 1985.

MORE INDIVIDUAL NOTES — Sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) led Minnesota with 17 kills against Wisconsin. Sophomore **DENISE HAGLER** (FORT WAYNE, IN/WAYNE) had 13 kills against Northwestern. Sophomore **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN/WINONA) hit .293 on the weekend (13 kills, one error and 41 attack attempts in the two matches).

COACH SCHLEUDER — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 18th season as a volleyball coach. She has an overall record of 477-230 (.675). The last nine seasons at Minnesota, **Schleuder** has compiled a record of 179-118 (.603) and a Big Ten record of 80-65 (.552).

SCHLEUDER NAMED ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER -- **Schleuder** has been named assistant commissioner of volleyball for the 1991 U.S. Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. She coached the North team to a gold medal victory at the 1990 festival in Minneapolis.

BASKETBALL

FOUR-GAME HOMESTAND -- Monday's home opener against Marquette marks the first time since 1987-88 that the Gophers open their season at home. Minnesota is 10-8 in season openers since 1973-74, 5-1 when it opens at home. After hosting Kansas Nov. 28, the Gophers will play host to the ninth annual Dial Soap Classic Nov. 30-Dec. 1. Georgia Tech takes on South Florida in the opening game of the tournament Friday, Nov. 30 at 6 p.m. Minnesota meets Illinois-Chicago in the nightcap at 8 p.m. Consolation and championship games will be played Saturday, Dec. 1 at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

A LOOK AT MARQUETTE -- The Warriors are coming off an 11-17 finish in 1989-90. Marquette was 9-8 in Midwestern Collegiate Conference play, good for a third-place finish. Marquette returns nine players from last year's squad, which closed out the season by losing to Butler 88-87 in overtime in the conference tournament.

WATCH FOR -- Senior forward-center **Heidi Ach**, the fifth-leading scorer in Marquette history, led the Warriors in scoring last season with a 13.3 points/game average. Although she was sidelined for six games due to an ankle injury, **Ach** consistently ranked in the top 20 among NCAA statistical leaders in field goal percentage. She finished the season with a 57.6 percent accuracy rate from the floor. Junior forward **Tammy Shain**, who starred for Mankato East High School as a prep player, is a native of Eagle Lake, Minn. **Shain** ranked second in scoring for the Warriors with a 10.9 points/game average last season. She also led Marquette in rebounding in 10 games, reaching the double-figure mark twice. She ended the year with a 6.3 rebounds/game average.

The Warriors will have two games under their belts by the time they hit the Williams Arena floor. They play host to the WarriorFest in Milwaukee, Wis. over the Thanksgiving weekend with competition from Austin Peay, Florida and William & Mary.

THE COACH -- **Jim Jabir** (Nazareth '84) is in his first season at Marquette after fashioning a 50-29 (.633) record in three seasons at Siena (N.Y.) College. His four-year collegiate coaching record is 64-40 (.615).

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Marquette.

BASKETBALL CONTINUED --

A LOOK AT KANSAS -- The Lady Jayhawks rolled to a 20-9 record last season and finished in a fourth-place tie in the Big Eight Conference with a 9-5 record. Kansas returns no less than 10 players from last year's squad, which should aid in their run for a Big Eight Conference title.

Heading up the list of Kansas returnees is leading rebounder **Terrilyn Johnson**, the only Jayhawk to start all 29 games last season. The 5-11 junior forward averaged 7.2 points/game and 7.9 rebounds/game last season. Junior guard **Kay Kay Hart**, who averaged 5.7 points and 2.9 assists/game last season, directs the Jays from the point. Junior forward **Danielle Shareef** rounds out the list of returning starters and is the team's leading returning scorer after averaging 8.0 points/game last season. Shareef was a member of the Big Eight Conference select team that traveled to Czechoslovakia over the summer.

Kansas opened its season over the holiday weekend at the very competitive Iowa Tournament, among Iowa, LSU and UCLA.

THE COACH -- Marian Washington (West Chester St. '70) begins her 18th season as head coach at Kansas. She carries a 302-197 (.605) career record with the Lady Jays and will be coaching in her 502nd game on Wednesday.

THE SERIES -- Kansas leads the series 10-1 and won the last meeting between the teams, 64-60 on Dec. 11, 1988 in Lawrence, Kan.

A LOOK AT THE GOPHERS -- "Believe to Achieve" is the theme of the 1990-91 season for the Minnesota basketball team, under the direction of new head coach Linda Hill-MacDonald.

"The primary focus of this season will be to create a winning attitude," says Hill-MacDonald. "We need to help these athletes realize what kind of a commitment it takes to win. They want to win, but they have to know that they can win and what has to be done in order to win. That's commitment."

The Gophers will be starting fresh in 1990, not only with a new coach, but with several new faces after the graduation of six seniors from last year's squad that finished 8-20 overall and 3-15 in the Big Ten, tied with Wisconsin for ninth place.

TOP RETURNERS -- Senior **Ellen Kramer**, the top returning scorer from a year ago, has earned honorable mention all-Big Ten honors the last two seasons while leading the team in scoring and rebounding. Junior **Holly Thompson** returns after a year of starting experience at the point guard slot.

Junior **Dana Joubert** and sophomore **Stacy Carver** both saw action at the U.S. Olympic Festival trials over the summer and will be counted on to bolster the Gopher front court this season. Junior guard **Jenny Zeller** also served in a reserve role last season, but her defensive prowess should earn her additional minutes this year.

Sophomore **Jenny Dillon** and freshmen **Nikki Coates** and **Crystal Flint** have all spent one season as redshirts due to knee injuries, but should be able to see more court time this season.

The recruiting class of 1990 is headed by 6-0 center/forward **Carol Ann Shudlick**, a metro star from Apple Valley. **Mary Klotzbecher**, a 5-7 point guard, and **Nancy Alexander**, a 5-11 guard/forward, were the first two student-athletes to sign with the Minnesota program under Hill-MacDonald.

GOPHERS CLOSE SEASON WITH INDIANA, OHIO STATE — The Minnesota women's volleyball team ends its 1990 season with two home Big Ten matches. The Gophers will host Indiana Friday at 7:30 p.m., followed by a match with Ohio State Saturday at 7:30 p.m. Saturday's match is Senior Day, with Gopher seniors **JODI ROGERS** (VILLA PARK, IL/WILLOWBROOK) and **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) being honored in their final matches at Williams Arena.

HOOSIER HAPPENINGS — Indiana (16-10, 8-8 Big Ten) still has postseason aspirations, especially in terms of the Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball Championship. However, the Hoosiers may have to win both matches this weekend to assure both a winning record in Big Ten play and a postseason berth. The .500 record in conference play should surprise nobody, as the Hoosiers have finished at .500 in the Big Ten both of the past two seasons. Last weekend, Indiana defeated Purdue in four games and lost to Illinois in five games.

WATCH FOR — Senior outside hitter **Diane Hoereth** had a big weekend against Purdue and Illinois, collecting 45 kills and 38 digs in the two matches. She leads the Hoosiers with 4.38 kills/game, 3.05 digs/game and a .280 hitting percentage. Junior outside hitter **Mary Jo Herrett** led Indiana with 22 kills against Purdue and is the second leading hitter for the Hoosiers with 3.51 kills/game. Senior setter **Joy Jordan** is averaging 13.17 assists/game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series 13-7. Indiana won the first meeting of the year 15-7, 15-6, 15-7 at Bloomington, Ind. behind **Hoereth's** 19 kills. **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) had nine kills to lead Minnesota's hitters.

BUCKEYE BULLETIN — Ohio State (21-7, 13-3 Big Ten) enters the final weekend of regular season play as the only team with a chance to catch Wisconsin for the league title. However, that chance is very slim. Wisconsin (26-7, 14-2 Big Ten) leads the Buckeyes by one full game and holds the tie-breaker advantage, having beaten Ohio State twice. Wisconsin would have to lose at both Michigan schools and Ohio State would have to win at Iowa and Minnesota for the Buckeyes to repeat as Big Ten champions. Regardless, the 15th-ranked Buckeyes are likely on their way to their second consecutive NCAA tournament. The berth was probably cinched with their two home-court victories last weekend over Illinois and Purdue.

WATCH FOR — Senior outside hitter **Holly O'Leary** was the Big Ten Player of the Year in 1989 and is a candidate to repeat in 1990. O'Leary leads the Buckeyes with 4.28 kills/game and is Ohio State's all-time kill leader with 1,726. She had 20 kills in Ohio State's victory over Purdue Saturday night. Junior middle blocker **Leisa Wissler** is second on the club in both kills (2.72/game) and blocks (.81/game). **Weissler** led Ohio State with 18 kills in the Friday night victory over Illinois. Senior setter **Audrey DiPronio** runs the Buckeye offense, averaging 11.48 assists/game.

THE SERIES — Ohio State leads the series 14-11 and has taken the last three matches from Minnesota. Earlier this season, the Buckeyes swept the Gophers 15-4, 15-11, 15-10 in the conference opener for both teams at Columbus. **O'Leary** had 14 kills to lead Ohio State and **Lushine** had eight kills to lead Minnesota.

GOPHERS BATTLE, BUT FALL TO WILDCATS, BADGERS — Minnesota (8-24, 2-14) may have been the underdog in matches at Northwestern Friday and at Wisconsin Saturday but the Gophers did not play like it. Minnesota took both teams to four games before succumbing to the more experienced Wildcats and Badgers. Northwestern opened Friday's match with 15-4 and 15-10 wins, outhitting the Gophers .444 to .179 in game one and .405 to .154 in game two. Minnesota outhit the 'Cats .283 to .213 in game three and capitalized with a 15-13 win. The Gophers could not maintain the pace, however, and hit just .136 in game four as the Wildcats hung on to win the game 15-13 and the match 3-1.

On Saturday, a Wisconsin volleyball-record 4,335 fans showed up expecting to see the 10th-ranked Badgers sweep the ninth-place Gophers. The crowd was quickly quieted, though, as Minnesota opened up a 13-4 lead in game one and held on for a 15-9 win. The Badgers regrouped to win the next two games 15-4 and 15-3. In game four, Minnesota made a late bid to send the match to a fifth game. Down 12-14, the Gophers held serve but two straight Minnesota net violations resulted in a sideout and match point for Wisconsin.

D.T. MOVES UP ON THE CHARTS — Senior co-captain **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) hit .278 and had a team-leading 14 kills against Northwestern. She also recorded nine digs and four block assists. **Thompson** had three more blocks against Wisconsin and with 427 total blocks in her career, needs just four to pass Lori Miller and move into third place on the all-time Gopher list. **Thompson** has 110 block assists this season, tying her with Martie Larsen for the third-most block assists in one season. Larsen had 110 in 1983. **Thompson's** 122 total blocks this season are just five shy of her career high of 127, set last season.

AHLQUIST TOPS 300 DIGS — Sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG) had 11 digs against Northwestern and 18 against Wisconsin to raise her season total to 306, tops on the team and the ninth-best Gopher season total since 1985 (when the current dig definition was established). **Ahlquist** needs 26 more digs in Minnesota's last two matches to move past Lori Miller's 1989 total of 331, which is currently the fifth-highest season total by a Gopher since 1985.

MORE INDIVIDUAL NOTES — Sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL) led Minnesota with 17 kills against Wisconsin. Sophomore **DENISE HAGLER** (FORT WAYNE, IN/WAYNE) had 13 kills against Northwestern. Sophomore **HEATHER BENNING** (WINONA, MN/WINONA) hit .293 on the weekend (13 kills, one error and 41 attack attempts in the two matches).

COACH SCHLEUDER — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 18th season as a volleyball coach. She has an overall record of 477-230 (.675). The last nine seasons at Minnesota, Schleuder has compiled a record of 179-118 (.603) and a Big Ten record of 80-65 (.552).

SCHLEUDER NAMED ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER -- Schleuder has been named assistant commissioner of volleyball for the 1991 U.S. Olympic Festival in Los Angeles. She coached the North team to a gold medal victory at the 1990 festival in Minneapolis.

Minnesota is 10-8 in season openers since 1973-74, 5-1 when it opens at home. After hosting Kansas Nov. 28, the Gophers will play host to the ninth annual Dial Soap Classic Nov. 30-Dec. 1.

A LOOK AT MARQUETTE -- The Warriors (1-1) are coming off an 11-17 finish in 1989-90. They finished 9-8 in Midwestern Collegiate Conference play, good for a third-place finish. Marquette dropped a 99-70 contest to Florida Saturday in the championship game of the WarriorFest in Milwaukee, Wis. after defeating Austin Peay 73-67 in Friday's first round.

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Senior forward **Heidi Ach**, the fifth-leading scorer in Marquette history, led the Warriors in scoring last season with a 13.3 points/game average. Although she was sidelined for six games due to an ankle injury, Ach consistently ranked in the top 20 among NCAA statistical leaders in field goal percentage. She finished the season with a 57.6 percent accuracy rate from the floor. Ach led all scorers against Austin Peay with 18 points, hitting 8-of-12 from the field, however, she was held to just two points by the Gators in Saturday's championship. Junior forward **Tammy Shain**, who starred for Mankato East High School as a prep player, is a native of **Eagle Lake, Minn.** Shain ranked second in scoring for the Warriors with a 10.9 points/game average last season and scored 17 points in each game in the WarriorFest. Sophomore guard **Courtney Romeiser** canned six three-pointers against Florida while leading Marquette with 22 points.

THE COACH -- **Jim Jabir** (Nazareth '84) is in his first season at Marquette after fashioning a 50-29 (.633) record in three seasons at Siena (N.Y.) College. His four-year collegiate coaching record is 65-41 (.613).

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Marquette.

VOLLEYBALL

GOPHERS COME CLOSE, FALL SHORT IN UPSET BID — After losing the opening two games 15-13 and 15-4 to 15th-ranked Ohio State Saturday at Williams Arena, the Gopher volleyball team came back to win the next two games 15-8 and 15-11 before finally falling 15-9 in game five to the NCAA tournament-bound Buckeyes.

On Friday, Minnesota lost to visiting Indiana 15-10, 15-6, 15-9. Junior middle hitter **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) led the Gophers with 12 kills against the Hoosiers and had 16 against Ohio State, tying for team kill honors with sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL). Minnesota closed the season with an 8-26 overall record and 2-16 Big Ten mark. It was only the Gophers' second losing season since 1973. Minnesota's only other losing season was in 1983, when the Gophers were 15-16 overall and 6-7 in the Big Ten.

FOUR BIG TEN TEAMS TO NCAA TOURNAMENT — Big Ten champion Wisconsin (28-7, 16-2) knew it would be competing in the NCAA tournament on Saturday after clinching the conference title with a win at Michigan State. Three other Big Ten teams, Ohio State (23-7, 15-3), Purdue (22-10, 12-6) and Illinois (21-11, 11-7), received invitations on Sunday. Iowa (16-14, 10-8) will be competing in the second annual Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball Classic at Alabama-Birmingham. The Hawkeyes earned the berth by defeating Indiana Saturday, edging the Hoosiers (17-11, 9-9) for fifth place in the Big Ten.

THOMPSON FINISHES THIRD ON ALL-TIME GOPHER TOTAL BLOCK LIST — Gopher senior **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) had two block assists against Indiana and five more against Ohio State to finish her career with 434, third on the all-time Gopher list. She passed Lori Miller, who had 430. Her career block per game average of 0.95 is second on the all-time Gopher list, behind Pam Miller's 1.25 block per game average.

Thompson's 1.02 block per game average this season was the Gophers' sixth-best of all time and her season total of 129 (a career high) was eighth-best in Gopher history. Thompson had 14 digs Saturday and finished with 761 for her career, fifth on the all-time Gopher list. She had a career-high 294 digs this season. Her 311 kills this season were a team high and a personal season best as was her 2.47 kill per game average. Her 39 service aces were also a personal best.

MORE SEASON TEAM LEADERS — Sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARM-STRONG) led the team in digs with 320 (2.62/game), the ninth-best single season total ever at Minnesota. Lushine led the team with a 1.14 block per game average that was the fourth-highest season per game average in team history. She also led the team in hitting with a .205 hitting percentage.

Freshman **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) led the team in assists with 1,153 (9.53/game), becoming just the second Gopher (Sharon Oesterling (1987-90) was the first) to top 1,000 assists for a season. Hanna led the team with 45 service aces (0.37/game).

COACH SCHLEUDER — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) closes her 18th season as a volleyball coach with an overall record of 477-232 (.673). In her last nine seasons at Minnesota, Schleuder has compiled a record of 179-120 (.599) and a Big Ten record of 80-67 (.544).

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Senior forward **Heidi Ach**, the fifth-leading scorer in Marquette history, led the Warriors in scoring last season with a 13.3 points/game average. Although she was sidelined for six games due to an ankle injury, Ach consistently ranked in the top 20 among NCAA statistical leaders in field goal percentage. She finished the season with a 57.6 percent accuracy rate from the floor. Ach led all scorers against Austin Peay with 18 points, hitting 8-of-12 from the field, however, she was held to just two points by the Gators in Saturday's championship. Junior forward **Tammy Shain**, who starred for Mankato East High School as a prep player, is a native of **Eagle Lake, Minn.** Shain ranked second in scoring for the Warriors with a 10.9 points/game average last season and scored 17 points in each game in the WarriorFest. Sophomore guard **Courtney Romeiser** canned six three-pointers against Florida while leading Marquette with 22 points.

THE COACH -- **Jim Jabir** (Nazareth '84) is in his first season at Marquette after fashioning a 50-29 (.633) record in three seasons at Siena (N.Y.) College. His four-year collegiate coaching record is 65-41 (.613).

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Marquette.

VOLLEYBALL

GOPHERS COME CLOSE, FALL SHORT IN UPSET BID — After losing the opening two games 15-13 and 15-4 to 15th-ranked Ohio State Saturday at Williams Arena, the Gopher volleyball team came back to win the next two games 15-8 and 15-11 before finally falling 15-9 in game five to the NCAA tournament-bound Buckeyes.

On Friday, Minnesota lost to visiting Indiana 15-10, 15-6, 15-9. Junior middle hitter **KAREN LUSHINE** (ROSEVILLE, MN) led the Gophers with 12 kills against the Hoosiers and had 16 against Ohio State, tying for team kill honors with sophomore **ANGIE HANNA** (FORT WAYNE, IN/CARROLL). Minnesota closed the season with an 8-26 overall record and 2-16 Big Ten mark. It was only the Gophers' second losing season since 1973. Minnesota's only other losing season was in 1983, when the Gophers were 15-16 overall and 6-7 in the Big Ten.

FOUR BIG TEN TEAMS TO NCAA TOURNAMENT — Big Ten champion Wisconsin (28-7, 16-2) knew it would be competing in the NCAA tournament on Saturday after clinching the conference title with a win at Michigan State. Three other Big Ten teams, Ohio State (23-7, 15-3), Purdue (22-10, 12-6) and Illinois (21-11, 11-7), received invitations on Sunday. Iowa (16-14, 10-8) will be competing in the second annual Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball Classic at Alabama-Birmingham. The Hawkeyes earned the berth by defeating Indiana Saturday, edging the Hoosiers (17-11, 9-9) for fifth place in the Big Ten.

THOMPSON FINISHES THIRD ON ALL-TIME GOPHER TOTAL BLOCK LIST — Gopher senior **DAWN THOMPSON** (PORTAGE, MI/NORTHERN) had two block assists against Indiana and five more against Ohio State to finish her career with 434, third on the all-time Gopher list. She passed Lori Miller, who had 430. Her career block per game average of 0.95 is second on the all-time Gopher list, behind Pam Miller's 1.25 block per game average.

Thompson's 1.02 block per game average this season was the Gophers' sixth-best of all time and her season total of 129 (a career high) was eighth-best in Gopher history. Thompson had 14 digs Saturday and finished with 761 for her career, fifth on the all-time Gopher list. She had a career-high 294 digs this season. Her 311 kills this season were a team high and a personal season best as was her 2.47 kill per game average. Her 39 service aces were also a personal best.

MORE SEASON TEAM LEADERS — Sophomore **EMILY AHLQUIST** (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARM-STRONG) led the team in digs with 320 (2.62/game), the ninth-best single season total ever at Minnesota. **Lushine** led the team with a 1.14 block per game average that was the fourth-highest season per game average in team history. She also led the team in hitting with a .205 hitting percentage.

Freshman **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) led the team in assists with 1,153 (9.53/game), becoming just the second Gopher (Sharon Oesterling (1987-90) was the first) to top 1,000 assists for a season. **Hanna** led the team with 45 service aces (0.37/game).

COACH SCHLEUDER — Minnesota's **STEPHANIE SCHLEUDER** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) closes her 18th season as a volleyball coach with an overall record of 477-232 (.673). In her last nine seasons at Minnesota, Schleuder has compiled a record of 179-120 (.599) and a Big Ten record of 80-67 (.544).

GOPHERS DEFEATED BY GEORGIA TECH IN DIAL CHAMPIONSHIP — Minnesota went into Saturday's Dial Classic championship game hoping to win its fourth Dial Classic title in nine years and first since 1988. Visiting Georgia Tech put a damper on those hopes, though, by opening up a 46-28 halftime lead enroute to a 84-69 win.

Minnesota (2-2) defeated Illinois-Chicago 79-59 Friday to earn the right to play Georgia Tech, which defeated South Florida 98-58 in Friday's first game. South Florida defeated Illinois-Chicago 73-72 in the consolation final on Saturday.

MINNESOTA BEATS MARQUETTE IN OPENER, FALLS TO KANSAS — The Gophers gave Hill-MacDonald a win in her first game as head coach, defeating visiting Marquette 80-65 on Monday, Nov. 26. Minnesota tried to make it two in a row on Wednesday but Kansas held off the Gophers in the final minute and won 71-63 at Williams Arena.

HILL MacDONALD'S RECORD AFTER FOUR — Hill-MacDonald, in her first year as Gopher coach and 11th year of collegiate coaching, now has a lifetime record of 168-132 (.560) in addition to her 2-2 (.500) mark at Minnesota. Saturday's game against Georgia Tech was Hill-MacDonald's 300th as a collegiate coach.

SHUDLICK, KRAMER NAMED TO DIAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM — Freshman **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) capped off a stellar first week by being named to the Dial Classic all-tournament team. In two tournament games, **Shudlick** had a team-leading 37 points, second-best in the tournament, and 18 rebounds. She shot 59.3 percent from the field (16-27) and 62.5 percent from the free throw line (5-8). Senior captain **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN) was also named to the team. She had 32 points and was the tournament's third-leading scorer.

HOME-GROWN THREESOME EMERGES TO LEAD GOPHERS — After four games, it has become evident who will be expected to carry Minnesota's scoring load this season. Three Gophers, **Kramer**, **Shudlick** and **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO) have each scored in doubles figures in all four Minnesota games. **Shudlick** leads Minnesota in scoring (18.5 average), **Kramer** is second (16.5 average) and **Carver** is third (13.3). All three of those players are native Minnesotans.

CARVER FAST OUT OF THE "SHOOT" — Need a quick basket? Call **Stacy Carver**, the Gophers' resident expert on instant offense. Whether coming off the bench or starting at guard or forward (she did all three in Minnesota's first four games), the 6-1 sophomore has displayed a knack for racking up points in short periods of time. She scored the Gophers' first basket of the season on a layup one second into Minnesota's opener against Marquette. Against Kansas, **Carver** scored 13 points in the game's first 9:14 to help Minnesota jump out to a 16-6 lead over the Jayhawks.

Even more impressive was **Carver's** performance off the bench against Illinois-Chicago. She entered the game with 11:15 to play in the half and shortly thereafter went on a scoring spree, with 12 points in a 3:03 span. Her 12 points led all players at the half. In Saturday's game against Georgia Tech, **Carver** had 10 points at the half, leading Minnesota in scoring at intermission for the third straight time.

JOUBERT CRASHING THE BOARDS — Junior forward **DANA JOUBERT** (DETROIT, MI/ST. MARTIN DePORRES) is playing an average of 26 minutes a game and making the most of it. She leads Minnesota in rebounding (8.8 average) and is averaging 13.6 rebounds per 40 minutes. Sixteen of **Joubert's** 35 rebounds have come on the offensive end. Her career-best 14 rebounds against Marquette were a team season high. **Shudlick** is second on the team with 31 rebounds (7.8 average) and **Kramer** is third with 28 (7.0 average). **Carver** has also contributed on the boards, with 24 rebounds (6.0 average) to her credit.

FLINT INJURED -- Redshirt freshman guard/forward **CRYSTAL FLINT** (ROXBURY, MA/SOUTH BOSTON) injured her left knee while going after a loose ball against Illinois-Chicago Friday. Flint's status is to be determined.

SWIMMING & DIVING

MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL REVIEW -- The Golden Gophers won the six-team Minnesota Invitational this past weekend, setting 10 University Aquatic Center pool records in the process. Minnesota won 14 of 21 events in the three-day meet, scoring 1,445 points. Iowa State finished second with 911 points, followed by North Dakota (531), Wisconsin-Eau Claire (192), St. Olaf (175) and Hamline (86).

Suomu set her pool record in the 200 backstroke with a time of 2:08.24, and won the 200 freestyle after clocking a time of 1:53.48.

DIVERS SWEEP THREE EVENTS-- Minnesota won all three diving events led by freshman LAURIE NELSON's (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CAN/SILVERTHORN) pair of victories and pool record. Nelson set the 3-meter diving pool record and qualified for the NCAA Zone Diving competition after scoring 457.20 points. Nelson also won the 10-meter platform diving with 348.60 points. Senior LISA DAVIS (AUSTIN, MN) won the 1-meter diving event with 420.40 points.

RELAY TEAM VICTORIES-- The Gophers won three of the five relay events, setting a pool record with each victory. Sophomore KRINA KABANUK (FARGO, ND/SOUTH), LINDA OEGEMA (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) and Suomu combined their talents with Newton's to win the 800 free relay with a time of 7:39.36. Individually, Oegema also won the 100 backstroke in a time of 1:02.12.

In the 200 medley relay, Suomu, KRIS ZELLER (FARIBAULT, MN), Rudser and LAURA HERMAN (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) won in a pool-record time of 1:51.22. Herman, along with JENNY EASTER (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), DEANNE HOP (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) and STACEY NIEDENFUER (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON), won the 400 free relay and set a pool record with a time of 3:34.87.

TRACK & FIELD

Minnesota cross country/track & field coach Gary Wilson has signed two jumpers to letters of intent **CINDY BETHANY** -- long jump, triple jump, relays, Mounds View High School, Roseville, MN. Bethany is expected to compete in both horizontal jumps and relays for Minnesota. As a junior, Bethany placed second in the long jump at the state meet and has marks of 19-1 and 18-6 to her credit in the event.

NICOLE JOHNSON -- triple jump, relays, Stillwater High School, Stillwater, MN. Johnson competed in the triple jump as a freshman in California and jumped 37-1 as a sophomore in a boys' JV meet. Minnesota does not sanction a girls' triple jump competition. Johnson sat out of last year's track season with mononucleosis.

Both of UConn's losses have come at the hands of Big Ten teams. Iowa defeated Connecticut 58-41 in Storrs, Conn. while Purdue knocked off the Huskies 89-87 in overtime at the Duke Dial Classic.

UConn advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament in 1989-90 and finished the season with a 25-6 overall record. Connecticut was 14-2 in the Big East, tied with Providence for first place.

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Senior center **Kerry Bascom**, Connecticut's all-time leading scorer, ripped the nets for a game-high 30 points against Auburn, canning five three-pointers along the way. She also tallied 10 rebounds, four assists and two steals. Bascom leads the Huskies in scoring with a 20.6 points/game average and in rebounding (7.4 rebounds/game). Senior forward **Laura Lishness** is ready to pick up the scoring slack if Bascom ever leaves any. Lishness led UConn with 17 points against Fordham and scored 13 against Auburn.

THREE-GAME ROAD SWING -- Minnesota (2-2) takes to the road for the first time this season as they travel to Connecticut, Dartmouth and Bradley on a three-game sweep. This will be the first action for the Gophers since the Dial Soap Classic Nov. 30-Dec. 1. Minnesota returns home to play host to Oklahoma Dec. 22 at Williams Arena.

ROAD HISTORY -- Minnesota will try to put an end to its road losing streak which stands at 29 games. The last non-neutral site road contest won by the Gophers was March 9, 1988 when they defeated Wisconsin 73-71 in Madison, Wis. Minnesota has won three neutral site contests since that time. The Gopherst defeated Arkansas State and Sam Houston State to win the Oklahoma Sooner Thanksgiving Classic last season. Minnesota also won a neutral site game in 1988 when it defeated Washington State in the consolation game of the the Nebraska Invitational.

INJURY UPDATE -- Redshirt freshman guard/forward **CRYSTAL FLINT** (ROXBURY, MA/SOUTH BOSTON), who tore the anterior cruciate ligament in her left knee in the Gophers' Nov. 30 game against Illinois-Chicago, will be sidelined for the the remainder of the season. Sophomore forward **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO) will be out for two weeks with a stress fracture in her right leg.

TEAM STATISTICS -- Through four games, the Gophers hold a slight edge on their opponents in field goal percentage (43.5 percent to 43.0 percent) and a significant edge in free throw percentage (68.0 percent to 57.3 percent)... Minnesota opponents lead in rebound per game average (45.3/game to the Gophers' 42.3/game)...the Gophers have committed fewer turnovers on average than its opponents (24.5/game to 27.5/game)...nearly half (48) of Minnesota's 98 turnovers have come on bad passes.

THE COACH -- First-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** (West Chester '70) is 2-2 (.500) at Minnesota and 168-132 (.560) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach.

DEC. 15 at CONNECTICUT (Storrs, CT)

A LOOK AT CONNECTICUT -- The 23rd-ranked Huskies (5-2) pulled a major upset Sunday by defeating Auburn, then-ranked number two in the nation, 67-63 in the championship game of the Connecticut Classic. Auburn moved out to a 42-36 halftime lead, but the Tigers were outscored 31-21 in the second half as UConn held out for the four-point victory. Connecticut crushed Fordham 85-43 to reach the final. Both of UConn's losses have come at the hands of Big Ten teams. Iowa defeated Connecticut 58-41 in Storrs, Conn. while Purdue knocked off the Huskies 89-87 in overtime at the Duke Dial Classic.

UConn advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament in 1989-90 and finished the season with a 25-6 overall record. Connecticut was 14-2 in the Big East, tied with Providence for first place.

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Senior center **Kerry Bascom**, Connecticut's all-time leading scorer, ripped the nets for a game-high 30 points against Auburn, canning five three-pointers along the way. She also tallied 10 rebounds, four assists and two steals. Bascom leads the Huskies in scoring with a 20.6 points/game average and in rebounding (7.4 rebounds/game). Senior forward **Laura Lishness** is ready to pick up the scoring slack if Bascom ever leaves any. Lishness led UConn with 17 points against Fordham and scored 13 against Auburn.

THE COACH -- **Geno Auriemma** (West Chester '81) is in his sixth season at Connecticut and as a collegiate head coach. His record is 97-53 (.647).

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Connecticut.

PROBABLE STARTERS -- **F: Laura Lishness**, 5-11, Sr., Bristol, CT (13.9 ppg/6.1 rpg); **F: Meghan Pattyson**, 5-11, Jr., Furlong, PA (7.1 ppg/4.9 rpg); **C: Kerry Bascom**, 6-1, Sr., Epping, NH (20.6 ppg/7.4 rpg); **G: Debbie Baer**, 5-6, Jr., Red Lion, PA (4.3 ppg/4.6 apg); **G: Wendy Davis**, 5-8, Jr., Birdsboro, PA (10.7 ppg/2.7 rpg).

DEC. 17 at DARTMOUTH (Hanover, NH)

A LOOK AT DARTMOUTH -- The Big Green (1-3) won its first game of the season Sunday at the Rice Tournament, defeating Texas-Pan American 60-54 to take third-place honors. Alcorn State defeated Dartmouth 77-54 in the tourney opener. Dartmouth has also suffered losses this season to Lehigh 70-60 and Boston College 79-54. The Big Green will play at Maine Dec. 15, prior to hosting the Gophers Dec. 17.

Dartmouth finished the 1989-90 season at 23-3 overall, 13-1 in the Ivy League, good for first place. Like Minnesota, Dartmouth has just one senior on its roster and is a very young team with five freshmen and six sophomores.

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Freshman forward **Sara Bone** leads Dartmouth in scoring with a 9.7 points/game average. She was successful on 9-of-12 field goals against Alcorn State and ended the game with a team-leading 20 points. Complementing Bone in the front court is another freshman, **Amy Fowler**, who led the Big Green with 17 points against UT-Pan American and is averaging 7.2 points/game. Sophomore center **Sue Stuebner**, a native of Deephaven, Minn. and a graduate of Minnetonka High School, leads Dartmouth on the boards with a 6.2 rebounds/game average.

THE COACH -- **Jacqueline Hullah** (Cal.-Fullerton '78) is in her seventh season at Dartmouth and as a collegiate head coach. Her record is 107-52 (.673).

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Dartmouth.

DEC. 20 at BRADLEY (Peoria, IL)

A LOOK AT BRADLEY -- The Braves (2-4) will host their first game of the 1990-91 season Tuesday when Miami-Ohio visits Peoria, Ill. Bradley just returned from a weekend in Kentucky where it fell to Louisville 82-77 Sunday and Kentucky 103-75 Friday. The Braves own victories over Bucknell and Loyola-Chicago with their other two losses coming at the hands of Toledo and DePaul.

Bradley returns nine players from a team that finished 16-12 last season and 12-6 in the Gateway Conference, placing fourth.

BASKETBALL CONTINUED --

BRADLEY PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Senior forward **Sheila Jenkins** has carried the Braves in their last two outings. She put together an 18-point, seven-rebound performance against Kentucky and came back with a 29-point, 17-rebound outpouring against Louisville. Jenkins is averaging 13.3 points/game and 8.2 rebounds/game. Senior forward **Heidi Nelson** led the Braves against Kentucky with 19 points and is averaging 11.0 points/game on the season. All-Gateway Conference forward **Val Wancket** leads the Braves in scoring with a 16.7 points/game average, but has been quiet as of late, scoring just 10 points against Kentucky and nine against Louisville.

THE COACH -- Lisa Boyer (Ithaca '79) is in her fifth season at Bradley and as a collegiate head coach. Her record is 54-62 (.563).

THE SERIES -- Minnesota leads 1-0. The Gophers defeated Bradley 77-69 last season in Minneapolis.

DEC. 20 vs. OKLAHOMA (Williams Arena)

OKLAHOMA NOTES -- The Sooners (2-4) dropped an 83-71 contest to Texas A&M Sunday and will now have nearly two weeks off before traveling to Minnesota for their next contest. Oklahoma returns 12 players from last season's squad which finished with a 7-22 overall record, 2-12 in last place in the Big Eight Conference.

PLAYERS TO WATCH -- Junior guard **Carin Stites** leads the Sooners in scoring with a 18.0 points/game average. No less than 23 of her 42 field goals have been scored from three-point range. She led Oklahoma with 16 points and six assists against Texas A&M. Junior forward **Angie Alexander** scored 14 points and tallied 11 rebounds against A&M. She ranks second in scoring with a 13.5 points/game average and second in rebounding with a 6.6 rebounds/game average. Senior forward **Cathy Bassett** leads the Sooners in rebounding with a 7.6 rebounds/game average.

THE COACH -- Gary Hudson (Augustana '71) is in his first season at Oklahoma. He spent last season as the recruiting coordinator at Oregon State and six years at St. Gregory's Junior College in Shawnee, Okla. where he compiled a 166-34 (.830) record.

THE SERIES -- This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Oklahoma.

MARIE ROETHLISBERGER IS FIRST GOPHER TO WIN NCAA TOP SIX AWARD — Former Gopher gymnast **MARIE ROETHLISBERGER** (AFTON, MN) became the first University of Minnesota athlete, male or female, ever to win the NCAA's Top Six Award when she was named a recipient of the honor on Dec. 26. The award, instituted in 1973, honors the nation's top six athletes of the preceding calendar year.

Roethlisberger will be honored at an honors dinner Tuesday in Nashville, Tenn. Other winners were runner Suzy Favor of Wisconsin, gymnast Patrick Kirksey of Nebraska, wide receiver Edward McCaffrey of Wisconsin, runner Meridith Lee Rainey of Harvard and linebacker Patrick Tyrance of Nebraska.

Roethlisberger, the 1990 NCAA uneven bars champion, won three all-America honors at last season's NCAA championships and was also a 1990 GTE-CoSIDA first team academic all-America. She won seven Big Ten titles and six NCAA region titles in her career.

The Boilermakers competed in the first-ever women's basketball Big Ten-SEC Challenge Saturday in Iowa City, Iowa, which was televised live by CBS Sports. Purdue lost to the nation's 5th-ranked team, Auburn, by a 75-65 score. The Boilermakers' Big Ten win was over Ohio State 105-45 Jan. 3. Purdue finished third in the Big Ten last season with a 14-4 conference record and advanced to the NCAA tournament where it defeated Northern Illinois 86-81 and lost to Louisiana Tech 91-47.

WATCH FOR -- Preseason *Street & Smith's* honorable mention all-American selection **Joy Holmes** tallied 27 points, 10 rebounds, five assists, three blocks and two steals against Auburn. She leads the Boilers in scoring (22.7 points/game) and in rebounding (7.0 rebounds/game). She is shooting at a 65.2 percent (100-158) clip from the field and canned 3-of-4 three-point attempts against Auburn. Junior guard **MaChelle Joseph**, a preseason *Street & Smith* all-American selection, leads Purdue at the guard slot. She ranks second in scoring for the Boilers with a 19.7 points/game average and is the team's assist leader (6.3/game).

PURDUE COACH -- Lin Dunn (Tennessee-Martin '69), in her fourth season at Purdue, has a 78-24 (.765) record. In her 20th season as a collegiate head coach, Dunn is 319-213 (.600).

A LOOK AT ILLINOIS -- The Fighting Illini (5-7, 2-0 Big Ten) had recorded just three victories in 10 games prior to the start of the Big Ten season. However, Illinois handily defeated Indiana (69-50) and Ohio State (90-74) over the weekend to add two victories to its win column. The Illini, winners in their last three games, finished last season in eighth place in the Big Ten with a 5-13 conference record.

WATCH FOR -- Senior forward **Sarah Sharp** went on a scoring spree over the weekend, recording 23 points against Indiana and 26 against Ohio State. She leads the Illini with a 17.9 points/game average and ranks third in rebounding at 6.1 rebounds/game. Freshman guard **Mandy Cunningham** has given a lift to the Illinois backcourt, scoring at a 12.7 points/game rate. She tallied 25 points against Ohio State, hitting 3-of-6 from three-point land. Junior forward **Sonya Waters** leads the Illini on the boards with a 7.6 rebounds/game average. She snared 13 rebounds in each game over the weekend and added 21 points against Indiana.

SERIES VS. ILLINOIS -- Minnesota leads 10-9 and split with the Illini last year, winning 84-71 at Williams Arena, but losing 86-62 at Assembly Hall.

ILLINOIS COACH -- Kathy Lindsey (Ohio State '78) is in her first season at Illinois after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

MINNESOTA RECENTLY -- The Gophers (4-8, 0-2 Big Ten) will be happy to return to the friendly confines of Williams Arena after playing seven of their last eight games on the road. Minnesota suffered its 21st straight Big Ten road loss Sunday in Madison, Wis. as they fell to the Badgers 102-77. Things were just as rough against 11th-ranked Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena Friday in the two teams' Big Ten openers. Northwestern defeated Minnesota by 41 points, 90-49. The Gophers have not won a Big Ten game away from Williams Arena since March 7, 1988 when they defeated Wisconsin 73-71 at the UW Fieldhouse. Last season, Minnesota finished in a ninth-place tie with the Badgers in the conference race with a 3-15 record.

KRAMER KEEPS CLICKING -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) must battle two and many times three defenders at once, but that has not slowed her yet. She has led Minnesota in scoring in its last four games and in seven of 12 games this season. She has recorded four double-doubles in scoring and rebounding and has led the Gophers five times on the boards. Against Northwestern, Kramer tallied 19 points and scored 16 against Wisconsin, while recording nine rebounds and seven assists. Kramer has now scored a career total of 1,142 points, which ranks seventh on the all-time Minnesota career scoring list. She needs 203 points to reach the sixth-place slot. She also ranks in the top ten in rebounding with 613 career rebounds to her credit, which ranks ninth all-time. She needs 25 rebounds to reach the eighth position.

NOTES, NOTES, NOTES -- Junior forward **JENNY ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN) tied her career high of 15 points against Wisconsin and also dished out seven assists...junior center **DANA JOUBERT** (DETROIT, MI/ST. MARTIN DePORRES) scored in double figures in both games over the weekend with 13 against Northwestern and 11 against Wisconsin...tibial stress fractures are still limiting the playing time of freshman forward **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) and sophomore forward **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO)...junior guard **HOLLY THOMPSON** (EAST CLEVELAND, OH/SHAW) suffered a cut under her eye in practice Saturday that required stitches...Minnesota continues to run into bad weather on the road - during the team's bus ride from Evanston, Ill. to Madison, Wis. Saturday after an early morning snow, a car spun out on Hiway 94, leaving just enough room for the Gophers' oncoming bus to squeeze by on the left side between the car and the guard rail.

THE COACH -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 170-138 (.552) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 4-8 (.333) mark at Minnesota.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

BUSY WEEKEND -- In one of the toughest weekends of competition this year, the 20-ranked Minnesota swimming and diving team (6-0) hosts Kansas Friday night and then flies to Columbus, Ohio early the next morning to face Ohio State and Notre Dame in a double-dual meet.

KANSAS -- This will be the first dual meet ever between Minnesota and Kansas. The Jayhawks are ranked 19th and are 3-1 on the year. Kansas has clocked faster times than Minnesota this season in every event except the 400 individual medley and the three distance freestyle events. The Jayhawks have not competed since Nov. 29, while Minnesota has had four meets during that time.

OHIO STATE -- The Buckeyes are undefeated this year at 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the Big Ten. The Buckeyes, who have not competed since November's U.S. Open, lead the series with Minnesota 4-2.

NOTRE DAME -- The Gophers have competed against Notre Dame only once, winning with a lopsided victory during the 1986-87 season.

THAMES JOINS TEAM -- Sophomore **TRINA THAMES** (EAU CLAIRE, WI/NORTH) transferred to Minnesota from Pittsburgh and joined the team for the Hawaii training trip. Thames is a backstroke specialist and according to head swimming coach Jean Freeman, she is "two seconds faster in the backstroke than anyone else on the team."

PAST COMPETITIONS -- Minnesota won the six-team Gold Country Invitational Saturday, scoring 1,289.5 points, followed by St. Olaf (504 pts.), St. Cloud State (331 pts.), Mankato State (275 pts.), Hamline (92.5 pts) and the College of St. Catherine (70 pts.) Overall, Minnesota won 16 of the 17 individual and relay team events. And in the 200 freestyle, the Gophers placed swimmers in seven of the top eight slots.

TRIPLE WINNER -- Newcomer **TRINA THAMES** was the Gophers' only triple-event winner at the Gold Country Invitational, winning the 100 backstroke in a time of :59.27, the 50 free with a time of :25.23 and the 100 free with a time of :53.76. The Gophers posted three double-event winners at the invitational. Freshman **SUSAN SUOMU** (WAUKEGAN, IL) won the 500 (5:02.00) and 1,650 (17:26.41) freestyle events. Junior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) won the 200 free (1:56.62) and the 200 backstroke (2:10.51), while senior **ANNE ELDEGARD** (RORVIK, NORWAY) took honors in the 400 IM (4:39.04) and the 200 breaststroke (2:26.93.)

HAWAII/UTAH DOUBLE-DUAL -- The Gophers won a double-dual meet against Hawaii and Utah on Dec. 22 in Hawaii during their winter training trip. Minnesota defeated Hawaii 154.5-60.5, and Utah 153-82. Junior **LYNN NEWTON** (INVER GROVE HEIGHTS, MN) won the 500 (4:59.82) and 1000 (10:05.50) freestyles against both opponents. **Linda Oegema** also scored a victory against Hawaii and Utah in the 200 IM (2:08.91) and won the 200 breaststroke (2:27.73) in the Utah dual.

DIVING AT BOCA RATON -- In an unscored diving dual meet against Pittsburgh on Dec. 22 at Boca Raton, Fla., Minnesota took the top three places in 1- and 3-meter springboard diving. The Gophers were led by senior co-captain **LISA DAVIS** (AUSTIN, MN) who scored victories on both boards. Davis won the 1-meter diving with 230.25 pts., and the 3-meter event with 253.50 pts. Sophomore **JENNIFER YASIS** (LAKE ELMO, MN) was second in both events, earning 209.85 points on the low board and 243.00 points on the 3-meter board. Freshman **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO/SILVERTHORN) finished third at both heights, scoring 208.50 points in 1-meter diving and 214.28 points on the 3-meter board.

GOPHERS OPEN INDOOR SEASON — The Minnesota women's track and field team opens its 1991 indoor season with the annual intrasquad/alumnae meet Saturday, Jan. 12 at 11 a.m. in the University Fieldhouse. The meet will be team scored with the current squad being split into Maroon and Gold squads. An alumnae team of past Gopher athletes will also compete.

1990 IN REVIEW — Minnesota finished seventh in the Big Ten and 20th in the country as an indoor team last season. The Gophers set seven indoor school records in 1990, including new bests in both relay events. Minnesota won its second straight Reebok Invitational title during the season, which featured top Division I competition from Rice and Brigham Young.

TOP RETURNERS — Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) scored all eight of Minnesota's national championship points last season with a second-place finish in the shot put. Lewis won her third conference title last season with a win in the indoor shot and also set a school record with a toss of 51-5 at the Husker Invitational. Sophomore **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) took third place in the 800 meters at the Big Ten meet and set a school record in the event with a showing of 2:10.77 at the Northwest Open. Balint was also a member of both record-setting relay teams last season.

COMING UP — The intrasquad/alumnae meet is the first of three consecutive home meets for Minnesota. The Gophers will host the Northwest Open Jan. 19 at 9 a.m. and the Reebok Invitational Jan. 25-26 at the University Fieldhouse.

GYMNASTICS

GYMNASTICS TEAM OPENS SEASON AT WISCONSIN QUADRANGULAR — The Gopher women's gymnastics team will face an early test in its opener Saturday in Madison, Wis., going against three solid opponents in Arizona, Michigan and host Wisconsin in the first of 12 regular season meets for Minnesota. Arizona has qualified for the 12-team NCAA championships in each of the last four years, finishing 10th last year after finishing 11th in 1989, ninth in 1988 and 11th in 1987. Wisconsin improved from sixth to fourth in the Big Ten last year and Michigan improved from seventh to sixth. Both teams are expected to show continued improvement this season.

The Gophers, meanwhile, will renew their quest for a team berth in the NCAA championships and attempt to regain the Big Ten championship. Last year's squad, the highest-scoring team in school history with a 185.04 meet average, missed qualifying for nationals by less than half a point and finished with the 16th-best national qualifying score in the nation. After winning the Big Ten title in 1988 and 1989, the Gophers slipped to third last year despite scoring 187.45 to equal the 1989 team's meet-winning mark. Minnesota capped the 1990 season by scoring a school-record 188.65 while finishing third in the NCAA Central regional championship at Williams Arena.

The Gophers will play host to Winona State on Jan. 20 in the first of six home meets on the schedule.

MINNESOTA LOOKING TO SET NEW OPENING-MEET SCORING MARK — The Gophers will be looking to break the 180.00 mark for the first time in a season opener. Last year's Minnesota squad opened the year with a school-opening meet record score of 179.10 against Winona State on Jan. 7, 1990 at Williams Arena.

ZOLKOWSKI, JUHASZ-NAGY LEAD RETURNERS — Senior co-captain **CATHY ZOLKOWSKI** (NEENAH, WI/ARMSTRONG-NEENAH) is Minnesota's top returning all-arounder. A two-time all-Big Ten performer on the floor exercise, she finished in a three-way tie for last season's Big Ten floor exercise title with a 9.70 score. **Zolkowski** and sophomore **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) set a new school vaulting record in last season's Central region meet, with each scoring a 9.775.

Also vying for spots in the Minnesota lineup will be junior **IKA LINDHOLM** (WINNETKA, IL/YORK COMMUNITY) and sophomore **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN). **Lindholm** has competed on the uneven bars in every Minnesota meet the last two seasons. **Allstadt** averaged 9.23 on the floor exercise last season and also competed frequently on the vault and balance beam.

FOUR NEWCOMERS EXPECTED TO CONTRIBUTE — Three freshmen and a sophomore transfer joined the Gopher squad this fall and all have a chance to compete immediately. Sophomore **ZSUZSA CSISZTU** (PILISBOROSJENO, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) is the leading candidate for an all-around spot. **Csisztu**, a transfer from the Hungarian University of Physical Education, competed for Hungary in the 1988 Olympics in Seoul, S. Korea. She returned to Hungary for the break following fall quarter to train with the Hungarian senior national team. Also contending for spots will be freshmen **KELLY McCONNELL** (FORT LAUDERDALE, FL/ST. THOMAS AQUINAS) and **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST), who have experience in club-level national competition, and freshman **JENNY KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS), the 1989 Minnesota State AA High School all-around champion.

NESS, KETCHER OUT — The Gophers were dealt a setback when sophomore **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) suffered a mild hyperextension of her left knee in the team's practice meet Dec. 28 while doing her dismount on the uneven bars. **Ketcher**, the team's freshman of the year last season, is expected to be out for three weeks and could miss the first four meets. She joins senior co-captain **KATHY NESS** (COON RAPIDS, MN) on the sidelines. **Ness**, the team's top returner on the uneven bars and balance beam, incurred a tibial plateau fracture to her right knee in practice in early December and will likely miss the entire regular season. She may return in time for the March 22 Big Ten championship meet.

NOTING HEAD COACH KATALIN DELI — Gopher head coach **Katalin Deli** is in her 18th year as Minnesota head coach. Her overall coaching record is 268-155-1 (.634), including conference and regional meets. She has coached Gopher gymnasts to five of the last nine Big Ten all-around titles.

GOPHERS HONE ROUTINES IN DEC. 28 PRACTICE MEET — Minnesota got its first chance to compete in front of judges in a practice meet on Dec. 28 at Williams Arena, with several individuals performing well. **Zolkowski** was the top scorer with a 36.60 all-around score that included marks of 9.40 on the vault and 9.30 on the balance beam. Other top scores were **Wolf's** 9.20 on the vault and 9.10 on the floor exercise, **McConnell's** 9.10 on the beam and **Ketcher's** 9.10 on the vault.

BADGER BRIEFS — Seventh-year head coach **Terry Bryson** led Wisconsin to its best season since 1986 last year as the Badgers finished fourth in the Big Ten. A strong start earned Wisconsin an early national ranking of 10th and the team finished the year with six of the top 10 team scores in school history.

WATCH FOR — Sophomore **Elizabeth Mahaney** is the defending Big Ten all-around champion. She scored 38.15 to win the title and break a four-year string in which a Gopher gymnast either won or shared the title. **Mahaney** and senior **Michele Hernandez** both qualified for the NCAA Central region championship as individuals last year. **Hernandez** finished seventh all-around at regionals. Freshman **Sherri Dillehay** of Minnetonka, Minn. won the 1990 Minnesota State AA High School all-around title. Another Minnesota native, freshman **Susan Swigart** of Eden Prairie, was a Class I national participant from 1987-89.

SERIES — The Gophers hold 23-4 lead but the Badgers have been tough on Minnesota in recent years, winning four of ten since 1987. Last year Wisconsin beat Minnesota 185.30-184.40 in a Jan. 20 triangular at Williams Arena, but the Gophers topped the Badgers 185.55-183.15 in Florida's Shands Invitational on March 9 and 187.45-186.05 in the Big Ten championship meet on March 23.

HOPERS — Head coach Jim Gault is in his 11th year at the Arizona helm. He has led the Gophers to the national appearances in 1978-80. Last year Arizona finished third in the West region with a 189.70 team score after posting a season-high team score of 190.15. The Wildcats scored 187.175 in finishing 10th at the NCAA championships.

WATCH FOR — Senior **Diane Monty** led the Wildcats last year with a 38.32 regional qualifying average that was 15th in the nation. Sophomore **Anna Basaldua** is only 4-11 but she stood tall with her 38.07 regional qualifying average last year as a rookie. Junior **Diana Rendall** of Bloomington trained at the Delis' Olympic Gymnastics Academy prior to enrolling at Arizona. She was third on the team last year with a regional qualifying average of 37.85.

SERIES — Arizona leads 8-1 with the last meeting being a 182.70-174.00 Wildcat win in the Brigham Young Invitational Jan. 16, 1988. The Gophers only win came in the first meeting between the schools, 140.70-136.55 in the UCLA Invitational on Feb. 29, 1980.

WOLVERINE WANDERINGS — Second-year head coach **Beverly Fry's** Michigan squad set a school record with its 1990 top team score (184.85). Fry has said the team has a goal of finishing among the Big Ten's top three this year and she hopes the team's four returning Big Ten event finalists and seven incoming freshmen will enable the Wolverines to do just that. Last year Michigan finished sixth in the Big Ten after finishing seventh the two previous years.

WATCH FOR — Sophomore **Debbie Geiger** was the Wolverines' top all-arounder last season and set the school balance beam record (9.60). Junior co-captain **Diane Armento** is a two-time Big Ten finalist on the balance beam and junior co-captain **Laura Lundbeck** of Burnsville tied the Michigan floor exercise record (9.60) while qualifying for the Big Ten floor exercise finals.

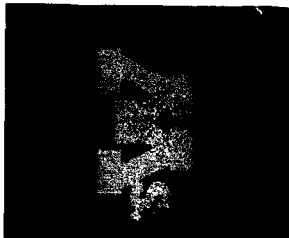

A LOOK AT PURDUE -- The Boilermakers (10-1, 1-0 Big Ten) are the seventh-ranked team in the nation according to the Associated Press Top 25 Women's Basketball Poll. The Boilermakers competed in the first-ever women's basketball Big Ten-SEC Challenge Saturday in Iowa City, Iowa, which was televised live by CBS Sports. Purdue lost to the nation's 5th-ranked team, Auburn, by a 75-65 score. The Boilermakers' Big Ten win was over Ohio State 105-45 Jan. 3. Purdue finished third in the Big Ten last season with a 14-4 conference record and advanced to the NCAA tournament where it defeated Northern Illinois 86-81 and lost to Louisiana Tech 91-47.

WATCH FOR -- Preseason *Street & Smith's* honorable mention all-American selection **Joy Holmes** tallied 27 points, 10 rebounds, five assists, three blocks and two steals against Auburn. She leads the Boilers in scoring (22.7 points/game) and in rebounding (7.0 rebounds/game). She is shooting at a 65.2 percent (100-158) clip from the field and canned 3-of-4 three-point attempts against Auburn. Junior guard **MaChelle Joseph**, a preseason *Street & Smith* all-American selection, leads Purdue at the guard slot. She ranks second in scoring for the Boilers with a 19.7 points/game average and is the team's assist leader (6.3/game).

SERIES VS. PURDUE -- Purdue leads the series 9-8 and has won the last eight meetings. The last Minnesota victory over the Boilers was a 75-66 win Jan. 5, 1986 at Williams Arena.

PURDUE COACH -- **Lin Dunn** (Tennessee-Martin '69), in her fourth season at Purdue, has a 78-24 (.765) record. In her 20th season as a collegiate head coach, Dunn is 319-213 (.600).

A LOOK AT ILLINOIS -- The Fighting Illini (5-7, 2-0 Big Ten) had recorded just three victories in 10 games prior to the start of the Big Ten season. However, Illinois handily defeated Indiana (69-50) and Ohio State (90-74) over the weekend to add two victories to its win column. The Illini, winners in their last three games, finished last season in eighth place in the Big Ten with a 5-13 conference record.

WATCH FOR -- Senior forward **Sarah Sharp** went on a scoring spree over the weekend, recording 23 points against Indiana and 26 against Ohio State. She leads the Illini with a 17.9 points/game average and ranks third in rebounding at 6.1 rebounds/game. Freshman guard **Mandy Cunningham** has given a lift to the Illinois backcourt, scoring at a 12.7 points/game rate. She tallied 25 points against Ohio State, hitting 3-of-6 from three-point land. Junior forward **Sonya Waters** leads the Illini on the boards with a 7.6 rebounds/game average. She snared 13 rebounds in each game over the weekend and added 21 points against Indiana.

SERIES VS. ILLINOIS -- Minnesota leads 10-9 and split with the Illini last year, winning 84-71 at Williams Arena, but losing 86-62 at Assembly Hall.

ILLINOIS COACH -- **Kathy Lindsey** (Ohio State '78) is in her first season at Illinois after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at Ohio State.

MINNESOTA RECENTLY -- The Gophers (4-8, 0-2 Big Ten) will be happy to return to the friendly confines of Williams Arena after playing seven of their last eight games on the road. Minnesota suffered its 21st straight Big Ten road loss Sunday in Madison, Wis. as they fell to the Badgers 102-77. Things were just as rough against 11th-ranked Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena Friday in the two teams' Big Ten openers. Northwestern defeated Minnesota by 41 points, 90-49. The Gophers have not won a Big Ten game away from Williams Arena since March 7, 1988 when they defeated Wisconsin 73-71 at the UW Fieldhouse. Last season, Minnesota finished in a ninth-place tie with the Badgers in the conference race with a 3-15 record.

KRAMER KEEPS CLICKING -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) must battle two and many times three defenders at once, but that has not slowed her yet. She has led Minnesota in scoring in its last four games and in seven of 12 games this season. She has recorded four double-doubles in scoring and rebounding and has led the Gophers five times on the boards. Against Northwestern, Kramer tallied 19 points and scored 16 against Wisconsin, while recording nine rebounds and seven assists. Kramer has now scored a career total of 1,142 points, which ranks seventh on the all-time Minnesota career scoring list. She needs 203 points to reach the sixth-place slot. She also ranks in the top ten in rebounding with 613 career rebounds to her credit, which ranks ninth all-time. She needs 25 rebounds to reach the eighth position.

Saturday after an early morning snow, a car spun out on Hiway 94, leaving just enough room for the Gophers' oncoming bus to squeeze by on the left side between the car and the guard rail.

THE COACH -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 170-138 (.552) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 4-8 (.333) mark at Minnesota.

Minnesota finished third in the meet and came up just short of qualifying for the NCAA's big meet.

Sunday the Gophers will be back at Williams Arena, beginning the home part of a season the team hopes will be even more successful than last season. Winona State will be the opponent for the 2 p.m. meet. It is the third straight year Minnesota has opened its home season against Winona State.

WINONA STATE NOTES — The Warriors opened their season Saturday with a home triangular against Northern Illinois and Hamline. Northern Illinois won the meet with a 180.05 score, with Winona State finishing second with a 169.20. Hamline was third with a 164.20. Dr. Stephen Juare has been head coach at Winona State for 14 years. **WATCH FOR** — Seven Minnesotans are on the Winona State roster. The Warriors' top all-rounder is junior **Nikki Setnicker** from White Bear Lake. She scored 35.40 in Saturday's meet, including a 9.20 score on the floor exercise. Junior **Carolyn Tobin** also competed all-around, scoring 31.45, including a 9.55 on the balance beam. **SERIES** — Minnesota leads 10-0. The Gophers won 179.10-171.50 last year and 178.40-173.25 in 1988.

CSISZTU WINS ALL-AROUND IN DEBUT, GOPHERS SET SCHOOL RECORD — Sophomore transfer **ZSUZSA CSISZTU** (PILISBOROSJENO, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) opened her collegiate career with a flourish, scoring 37.85 to win the individual all-around at Wisconsin's four-team invitational in Madison, Wis. Saturday. **Csisztu** (pronounced CHISS-too) finished first on the balance beam with a 9.70, tied for first on the bars with a 9.55 and tied for third on the vault with a 9.50. **Csisztu's** beam score tied for the seventh-highest ever by a Minnesota gymnast. Only former Gophers **Marie Roethlisberger** (three times) and **Shelley Brown** (once) and current Gopher **KATHY NESS** (COON RAPIDS, MN) (twice) have ever scored higher on the beam for Minnesota.

The Gophers finished fourth as a team but scored a school-opening meet record 179.25 despite having three gymnasts injured and unable to compete. Wisconsin won the meet with a 184.80 score, upsetting #8 Arizona, which scored 184.60. Michigan, which finished third with a 179.90, defeated Minnesota for the first time since 1982. The Gophers had beaten Michigan in 11 straight meets prior to Saturday.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES — Three Minnesota freshmen made their Gopher debuts on Saturday. **KELLY McCONNELL** (FORT LAUDERDALE, FL/ST. THOMAS AQUINAS) scored 35.40 all-around, including a 9.25 on the balance beam. **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST) scored 35.20 all-around, including a 9.30 on the vault and a team-leading 9.40 on the floor exercise. **JENNY KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS) competed on three events with her top score an 8.85 on the floor exercise. Among the returners, sophomore **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) scored 35.10 all-around and had scores of 9.20 on the vault and 9.15 on the balance beam. BASKETBALL CONTINUED--

A LOOK AT OHIO STATE-- The Buckeyes (4-9, 1-2 Big Ten) broke a six-game losing streak with a 72-63 victory over Indiana Friday at Bloomington, Ind. It was the first conference win for Ohio State against two losses, 105-45 at Purdue and 90-74 at Illinois. The Buckeyes compiled a 3-7 record while playing a tough non-conference schedule. OSU suffered losses to five ranked teams in Penn State, Georgia, LSU, Tennessee, and Texas. The Buckeyes' three wins were over Eastern Michigan (80-74), Pittsburgh (84-71), and Akron (92-50). Last year, Ohio State advanced to the NCAA tournament for the eighth time in nine years and seventh year in a row. The Buckeyes lost to Texas in the Midwest Regional second round after finishing the Big Ten season with an 11-7 record.

WATCH FOR -- Sophomore sensation **Averrill Roberts** leads the Buckeyes in scoring with a 16.8 points/game average. Last year's Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Roberts played on the U.S. Junior National team and participated in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Minneapolis over the summer. She scored 12 points against the Hoosiers Friday. Senior forward **Vickie Pullie** underwent arthroscopic knee surgery Dec. 13 and should return to the Ohio State lineup in time to face the Gophers Friday. Pullie, an all-Big Ten honorable mention selection a year ago, was averaging 11.5 points after four games this season. Senior guard **Cheryl Perozek** led the Buckeyes with 16 points and eight assists in 38 minutes against Indiana. She averages 8.7 points/game and 4.2 assists/game.

SERIES VS. OHIO STATE -- Ohio State leads 19-3 and has won the last 15 straight over Minnesota. The last Gopher win over the Buckeyes was nearly eight years ago in a 68-56 win Feb. 6, 1983 at Williams Arena.

OHIO STATE COACH -- Nancy Darsch (Springfield '73), in her sixth season at Ohio State, carries a 120-44 (.732) school and career record.

A LOOK AT INDIANA -- The Hoosiers (8-4, 0-2 Big Ten) have lost three in a row and are looking for their first conference victory of the year. Indiana opened the Big Ten season at Illinois with a 69-56 loss and then dropped a 72-63 decision to Ohio State Friday at Assembly Hall. The Hoosiers went 8-2 in the non-conference season with wins over Western Illinois, Missouri, Indiana State, Creighton, Kentucky, Notre Dame, Miami (Ohio), and Nevada. Setbacks came at the hands of Illinois State and Kentucky. Last year, Indiana finished the conference slate with a 6-12 Big Ten record, good for seventh place. The Hoosiers play at Purdue Wednesday and host Iowa Friday before meeting Minnesota.

WATCH FOR -- Indiana returns all five of its starters from a year ago and nine letterwinners overall. Senior center **Pam Owens** has come on strong this season and leads the Hoosiers in scoring with a 14.9 points/game average. Owens is shooting 75.3 percent from the free throw line and made 12-of-16 from the line against Ohio State while leading the Hoosiers with 16 points. She also tallied nine rebounds and four blocks. Last year's team MVP and all-Big Ten selection **Zandrea Jefferies** is scoring 13.3 points/game and recorded 15 points and nine rebounds against Ohio State. Junior guard **Tisha Hill** averages 7.2 points/game, but scored 12 against the Buckeyes. She is also averaging 6.1 assists/game.

SERIES VS. INDIANA -- Minnesota leads 13-8. The two teams split the series last season with the Gophers winning 85-67 at Williams Arena and Indiana escaping with a 61-59 win in Bloomington.

INDIANA COACH -- Jim Iazard (Mississippi '71), in his third season at Indiana, has a 36-32 (.529) school record. He is looking for his 200th win this week and has a career record of 199-81 (.711) in 10 years as a collegiate head coach.

MINNESOTA RECENTLY -- The Gophers (4-10, 0-4 Big Ten) hoped to snap out of a two-game losing streak after playing seven of their last ten games on the road. That streak increased to four games, however, as Minnesota failed to get its first conference victory of the season. Seventh-ranked Purdue rang up a 106-60 victory at Williams Friday and Illinois came away with a 78-60 win Sunday before a live KITN-TV audience. Minnesota will look to break out of a 21-game Big Ten road losing streak this weekend. Last season, Minnesota finished in a ninth-place tie with the Badgers in the conference race with a 3-15 record.

BASKETBALL CONTINUED --

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK -- Minnesota has added a player to its roster in **YOLANDA MURPHY** (ST. PAUL, MN/CHRIST'S HOUSEHOLD OF FAITH). The 6-foot freshman joined the Gopher roster as a walk-on and became eligible to compete last Friday. Murphy saw three minutes of action against Purdue in her first collegiate game.

KRAMER HONORED -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) was honored at the start of the Purdue game with a game ball commemorating her scoring achievement of 1,000 points. With 19 and 12 points over the weekend, Kramer has now scored a career total of 1,173 points, which ranks seventh on the all-time Minnesota scoring chart. She needs 172 points to reach the sixth-place slot. She also ranks in the top ten in rebounding with 630 rebounds to her credit, which ranks ninth all-time. She needs just eight rebounds to reach the eighth position.

OVERTIME -- Besides increasing her career totals in points and rebounds, **Kramer** now averages 35 minutes per game after playing all 40 minutes in the last three games and in seven of the last ten games.

SHUDLICK RETURNS TO STARTING LINEUP -- Freshman forward **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) returned to the starting lineup against Illinois. She was honored at halftime of that game in a WCCO-Radio Hometown Days presentation. Shudlick scored 10 points in 18 minutes of playing time. Her time is still being limited due to a tibial stress fracture. Shudlick played 22 minutes against Purdue and scored eight points while snaring 10 rebounds.

CARVER STARTS AGAINST PURDUE -- Sophomore forward **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO) took her place in the starting lineup against Purdue and led the Gophers in scoring with 15 points on a 7-of-13 shooting clip. Carver played just 20 minutes against the Boilermakers as she is also nursing a tibial stress fracture.

ALEXANDER HITS CAREER HIGHS -- Freshman forward **NANCY ALEXANDER** (BROCKPORT, NY) is quietly improving each game. She racked up career highs in scoring and rebounding against Purdue with 12 points, on 5-of-10 shooting from the field, while adding five rebounds. Alexander also dished out a team-leading four assists, another career high.

JOUBERT SHUT DOWN -- Minnesota opponents did a good job of containing **DANA JOUBERT** (DETROIT, MI/ST. MARTIN DePORRES) over the weekend. The junior post, who is averaging 11.9 points/game and 8.6 rebounds/game, garnered just seven points and six rebounds against Purdue and eight points and five rebounds against Illinois.

COLD, COLD -- Temperatures may be on the upswing in the Twin Cities area, but the Gophers' shooting just seems to get colder. Minnesota shot a season-low 34.6 percent (27-of-78) against Purdue. The Gophers came back with a 41.9 percent (26-62) performance against Illinois, but shot only 33.3 percent in the second half.

FLINT UPDATE -- Redshirt freshman guard/forward **CRYSTAL FLINT** (ROXBURY, MA/SOUTH BOSTON), out for the season with a knee injury, had surgery to repair the anterior cruciate ligament of her left knee Friday. She came through the surgery better than expected, according to Gopher assistant trainer Cathy Czeh, and will be on crutches for two weeks as the rehabilitation process begins.

THE COACH -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 170-140 (.548) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 4-10 (.286) mark at Minnesota.

A LOOK AT OHIO STATE-- The Buckeyes (4-9, 1-2 Big Ten) broke a six-game losing streak with a 72-63 victory over Indiana Friday at Bloomington, Ind. It was the first conference win for Ohio State against two losses, 105-45 at Purdue and 90-74 at Illinois. The Buckeyes compiled a 3-7 record while playing a tough non-conference schedule. OSU suffered losses to five ranked teams in Penn State, Georgia, LSU, Tennessee, and Texas. The Buckeyes' three wins were over Eastern Michigan (80-74), Pittsburgh (84-71), and Akron (92-50). Last year, Ohio State advanced to the NCAA tournament for the eighth time in nine years and seventh year in a row. The Buckeyes lost to Texas in the Midwest Regional second round after finishing the Big Ten season with an 11-7 record.

WATCH FOR -- Sophomore sensation **Averill Roberts** leads the Buckeyes in scoring with a 16.8 points/game average. Last year's Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Roberts played on the U.S. Junior National team and participated in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Minneapolis over the summer. She scored 12 points against the Hoosiers Friday. Senior forward **Vickie Pullie** underwent arthroscopic knee surgery Dec. 13 and should return to the Ohio State lineup in time to face the Gophers Friday. Pullie, an all-Big Ten honorable mention selection a year ago, was averaging 11.5 points after four games this season. Senior guard **Cheryl Perozek** led the Buckeyes with 16 points and eight assists in 38 minutes against Indiana. She averages 8.7 points/game and 4.2 assists/game.

SERIES VS. OHIO STATE -- Ohio State leads 19-3 and has won the last 15 straight over Minnesota. The last Gopher win over the Buckeyes was nearly eight years ago in a 68-56 win Feb. 6, 1983 at Williams Arena.

OHIO STATE COACH -- Nancy Darsch (Springfield '73), in her sixth season at Ohio State, carries a 120-44 (.732) school and career record.

A LOOK AT INDIANA -- The Hoosiers (8-4, 0-2 Big Ten) have lost three in a row and are looking for their first conference victory of the year. Indiana opened the Big Ten season at Illinois with a 69-56 loss and then dropped a 72-63 decision to Ohio State Friday at Assembly Hall. The Hoosiers went 8-2 in the non-conference season with wins over Western Illinois, Missouri, Indiana State, Creighton, Kentucky, Notre Dame, Miami (Ohio), and Nevada. Setbacks came at the hands of Illinois State and Kentucky. Last year, Indiana finished the conference slate with a 6-12 Big Ten record, good for seventh place. The Hoosiers play at Purdue Wednesday and host Iowa Friday before meeting Minnesota.

WATCH FOR -- Indiana returns all five of its starters from a year ago and nine letterwinners overall. Senior center **Pam Owens** has come on strong this season and leads the Hoosiers in scoring with a 14.9 points/game average. Owens is shooting 75.3 percent from the free throw line and made 12-of-16 from the line against Ohio State while leading the Hoosiers with 16 points. She also tallied nine rebounds and four blocks. Last year's team MVP and all-Big Ten selection **Zandrea Jefferies** is scoring 13.3 points/game and recorded 15 points and nine rebounds against Ohio State. Junior guard **Tisha Hill** averages 7.2 points/game, but scored 12 against the Buckeyes. She is also averaging 6.1 assists/game.

SERIES VS. INDIANA -- Minnesota leads 13-8. The two teams split the series last season with the Gophers winning 85-67 at Williams Arena and Indiana escaping with a 61-59 win in Bloomington.

INDIANA COACH -- Jim Izard (Mississippi '71), in his third season at Indiana, has a 36-32 (.529) school record. He is looking for his 200th win this week and has a career record of 199-81 (.711) in 10 years as a collegiate head coach.

MINNESOTA RECENTLY -- The Gophers (4-10, 0-4 Big Ten) hoped to snap out of a two-game losing streak after playing seven of their last ten games on the road. That streak increased to four games, however, as Minnesota failed to get its first conference victory of the season. Seventh-ranked Purdue rang up a 106-60 victory at Williams Friday and Illinois came away with a 78-60 win Sunday before a live KITN-TV audience. Minnesota will look to break out of a 21-game Big Ten road losing streak this weekend. Last season, Minnesota finished in a ninth-place tie with the Badgers in the conference race with a 3-15 record.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK -- Minnesota has added a player to its roster in **YOLANDA MURPHY** (ST. PAUL, MN/CHRIST'S HOUSEHOLD OF FAITH). The 6-foot freshman joined the Gopher roster as a walk-on and became eligible to compete last Friday. Murphy saw three minutes of action against Purdue in her first collegiate game.

KRAMER HONORED -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) was honored at the start of the Purdue game with a game ball commemorating her scoring achievement of 1,000 points. With 19 and 12 points over the weekend, Kramer has now scored a career total of 1,173 points, which ranks seventh on the all-time Minnesota scoring chart. She needs 172 points to reach the sixth-place slot. She also ranks in the top ten in rebounding with 630 rebounds to her credit, which ranks ninth all-time. She needs just eight rebounds to reach the eighth position.

OVERTIME -- Besides increasing her career totals in points and rebounds, **Kramer** now averages 35 minutes per game after playing all 40 minutes in the last three games and in seven of the last ten games.

SHUDLICK RETURNS TO STARTING LINEUP -- Freshman forward **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) returned to the starting lineup against Illinois. She was honored at halftime of that game in a WCCO-Radio Hometown Days presentation. Shudlick scored 10 points in 18 minutes of playing time. Her time is still being limited due to a tibial stress fracture. Shudlick played 22 minutes against Purdue and scored eight points while snaring 10 rebounds.

CARVER STARTS AGAINST PURDUE -- Sophomore forward **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO) took her place in the starting lineup against Purdue and led the Gophers in scoring with 15 points on a 7-of-13 shooting clip. Carver played just 20 minutes against the Boilermakers as she is also nursing a tibial stress fracture.

ALEXANDER HITS CAREER HIGHS -- Freshman forward **NANCY ALEXANDER** (BROCKPORT, NY) is quietly improving each game. She racked up career highs in scoring and rebounding against Purdue with 12 points, on 5-of-10 shooting from the field, while adding five rebounds. Alexander also dished out a team-leading four assists, another career high.

JOUBERT SHUT DOWN -- Minnesota opponents did a good job of containing **DANA JOUBERT** (DETROIT, MI/ST. MARTIN DePORRES) over the weekend. The junior post, who is averaging 11.9 points/game and 8.6 rebounds/game, garnered just seven points and six rebounds against Purdue and eight points and five rebounds against Illinois.

COLD, COLD -- Temperatures may be on the upswing in the Twin Cities area, but the Gophers' shooting just seems to get colder. Minnesota shot a season-low 34.6 percent (27-of-78) against Purdue. The Gophers came back with a 41.9 percent (26-62) performance against Illinois, but shot only 33.3 percent in the second half.

FLINT UPDATE -- Redshirt freshman guard/forward **CRYSTAL FLINT** (ROXBURY, MA/SOUTH BOSTON), out for the season with a knee injury, had surgery to repair the anterior cruciate ligament of her left knee Friday. She came through the surgery better than expected, according to Gopher assistant trainer Cathy Czech, and will be on crutches for two weeks as the rehabilitation process begins.

THE COACH -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 170-140 (.548) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 4-10 (.286) mark at Minnesota.

INDOOR TRACK & FIELD

MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL BEGINS FRIDAY — The University of Minnesota will host the Minnesota Invitational this weekend at the University Fieldhouse. The pentathlon portion of the meet will be conducted at 3:30 p.m. Friday, while the remainder of the meet will start at 4 p.m. Saturday. The coed meet will feature team scoring among some of the best teams in the country.

THE ENTRANTS — The Gophers are expecting full contingents from UCLA, Northern Iowa, Virginia, Iowa State and Drake to compete in this weekend's meet. Partial squads from North Dakota State and Mankato State will also compete. UCLA is one of the perennial powers in women's track and field, led by coach Bob Kersee. Iowa State was among the top 25 in cross country during the fall season.

SHOT PUT SHOWDOWN -- One of the top matchups in this weekend's meet could develop in the shot put, where UCLA's Tracie Millett and Minnesota's Rachel Lewis finished 1-2 in the 1990 NCAA indoor shot put championship.

NORTHWEST REVIEW — The Gophers won six events at last Saturday's Northwest Open, led by double winner **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN). Rowe sprinted ahead of the field early in the 1500 meters and won easily in 4:41.8. She came back in the 800m to win a very close race in a time of 2:21.38. Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) continued her domination in the shot put with a winning toss of 49-9 1/4, just 1 1/4 inches short of the NCAA automatic qualifying mark. The other Minnesota winners were senior **SHELLY WALL** (WILSON, WI/SPRING VALLEY) in the 600m, **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC) in the 55-meter hurdles and **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) in the long jump. Wall's time of 1:38.67 ranks sixth on the all-time Minnesota indoor list, while Owen's leap of 18-2 1/4 improved her fourth-place standing on the long jump chart.

BUSY WEEKEND AHEAD -- The 20th-ranked Gophers (9-1, 4-0 Big Ten) host the Minnesota Challenge Friday at 6 p.m. at the University Aquatic Center and then make a quick trip to Evanston, Ill. to challenge the Northwestern Wildcats in a Big Ten coed dual meet Saturday at 2 p.m.

THE CHALLENGE -- A portion of the Minnesota Challenge pits the Minnesota women's and men's swimming and diving teams against St. Olaf in a coed dual meet. The other half features a dual meet between the Gopher women's team and Team Minnesota, a United States Swimming (USS) senior team. Both meets will run concurrently.

THE WILDCATS -- Minnesota is considered the underdog in this meet by Gopher head coach Jean Freeman. "The Wildcats (5-4, 2-2) killed us at the Northwestern Relays earlier this season, outscoring us 118-56," said Freeman. "They were 10th at the national championship last year, so we can't take them lightly."

Minnesota and Northwestern have both faced Nebraska this season with the Wildcats losing to the Cornhuskers 170-130 in November, while Minnesota defeated Nebraska by the nearly identical score of 172-128, Jan. 18 at the UAC. Northwestern is led by senior **Marilyn Peck** in the 100 (:52.75), 500 (5:00.26), 1000 (10:12.03) and 1650 (17:22.92) freestyle events. Junior **Laura Vitcenda** is the top competitor in the 200 free (1:52.84), 200 individual medley (2:08.95), 400 individual medley (4:33.46) and 200 backstroke (2:08.09). Sophomore **Susan Donahoe** is Northwestern's number one swimmer in the 50 freestyle (:24.77), while freshman **Kim Lloyd** leads in the 100 backstroke (:59.52). Sophomore **Christine Simmons** is the Wildcats' top 100 (1:07.18) and 200 (2:22.56) breaststroke competitor.

NEBRASKA FALLS -- The Gophers won 11 of 16 events in defeating Nebraska 172-128 over the weekend. Eight races were decided by less than a second between the top finishers. In two of the closer races, junior **STACEY NIEDENFUER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON) won the 50 free (:24.13) by twelve-one-hundredths of a second and the 100 free (:53.01) by thirty-one-hundredths of a second. Junior **LYNN NEWTON** (INVER GROVE HEIGHTS, MN) dominated both of her events, winning the 500 free (4:58.55) by over two seconds and the 1650 free (16:55.96) by over 11 seconds. Sophomore **TRINA THAMES** (EAU CLAIRE, WI/NORTH) won the 200 backstroke (2:08.95) by nearly one second and set a UAC pool record while winning the 100 backstroke (:57.72).

GOPHERS OPEN DUAL MATCH SEASON AGAINST 16TH-RANKED INDIANA — After a fall schedule that consisted of strictly individual tournaments, the Minnesota women's tennis team will begin team competition at 9 a.m. Sunday at the 98th Street Racquet Club, with the season's first team opponent being defending Big Ten champion Indiana. The Gophers are coming off a strong weekend performance in the fifth annual Gopher Doubles Invitational, which saw Minnesota win 12 of 16 doubles matches.

HOOSIER HIGHLIGHTS — Head coach Lin Loring's Indiana teams have won four straight Big Ten championships and nine in 11 years. Loring, in his 14th year, came into the season with a 357-70 (.838) dual match record at Indiana. Last year, Indiana finished the season 23-7 with a final ITCA/Volvo national ranking of 15th and advanced to the second round of the NCAA championships. The Hoosiers won their season opener this year 7-2 over visiting Miami (Ohio) Saturday. Indiana will play at Iowa on Friday and will play Kansas (at Iowa) on Saturday before meeting the Gophers Sunday.

WATCH FOR — The Hoosiers pack a lineup that features several heavy hitters. Sophomore **Deborah Edelman**, ranked 27th nationally, has an 8-5 record at No. 1 singles. Junior **Stephanie Reece**, ranked 17th nationally, has a 13-6 record at No. 2 singles. Edelman and Reece team up at No. 1 doubles for the Hoosiers and are 9-2 on the season while carrying a No. 2 national ranking. The duo defeated the Gophers' top doubles team of **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) by a 6-0, 6-0 score in Indiana's Hoosier Classic in the fall. Indiana freshman **Jody Yin** has a 9-5 record at No. 3 singles and senior **Brenda Hacker** is 8-5 at No. 4.

SERIES — Indiana is 11-0 against Minnesota. The Hoosiers won 8-1 last year in Bloomington, Ind.

GOPHERS CAP OFF ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL DOUBLES INVITATIONAL — The Gophers went into the weekend doubles competition at the 98th Street Racquet Club hoping to prepare the team's doubles skills for the rigors of the dual season. When the results were in, Minnesota had a 12-4 doubles record over three days, bettering the marks of its opponents from Nebraska (11-8), Iowa (8-10), Drake (7-8) and Southwest State (0-7).

MOE, OLSSON GO UNDEFEATED; CLOSE IN ON SCHOOL RECORD — Moe and Olsson were 6-0 in the tournament and now have a season doubles record of 15-3. The duo has 57 career wins, just two shy of the school's all-time record for doubles teams, 59 by Leslie Larm and Kari Sandvig (1977-80). Minnesota's No. 2 doubles team, consisting of sophomore **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI) and senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS), was 3-3 on the weekend. Freshman **JENNY MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA) made her collegiate debut after missing the fall season with stress fractures. She combined with sophomore **VICKY KOLARIC** (WILLOUGHBY HILLS, OH/NOTRE DAME ACADEMY) for a 3-1 record.

GYMNASTICS

IMPROVING GOPHERS FACE TEST, ADVERSITY AT HUSKY CLASSIC — The Gopher women's gymnastics team will travel to Seattle, Wash. to take part in Washington's sixth annual Husky Classic Friday at 7:30 p.m. PST in the Edmundson Pavilion Addition. Other tournament participants include UCLA and Seattle Pacific. The meet will be televised on Prime Sports Northwest on a delayed basis. It is scheduled to be aired on Jan. 26 at 7 p.m. on Seattle cable channel 6.

Minnesota has shown steady improvement in its first three meets but now looks to the rest of the season without newcomer **ZSUZSA CSISZTU** (PILISBOROSJENO, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY), the all-around winner in the Gophers' first three meets, who suffered a possible season-ending knee injury Monday.

OPPONENT NOTES — Host **Washington** opened its season Friday by scoring 182.35 in losses to Georgia and Arizona State at a triangular in Tempe, Ariz. The Huskies defeated Oklahoma 184.55-183.95 Sunday in Norman, Okla. Against the Sooners, Husky junior **Shylo Milner** scored 9.40 on the vault and 9.50 on the uneven bars enroute to a second-place all-around tally of 37.55. Washington junior **Tashy Simonton** finished third all-around with a career-high 37.20. Washington head coach Bob Levesque is in his first year. **SERIES** — Last year, in the first meeting between the two schools, the Gophers beat Washington 186.60-186.50 in Oregon State's Shanico Invitational.

UCLA finished fourth at last season's NCAA championships and appears ready to make another run at the national title. The Bruins are led by sophomore **Rhonda Faehn**, a Coon Rapids, Minn. native who scored 38.10 all-around in UCLA's season opener at Georgia on Jan. 13. UCLA's other top all-arounder is senior all-American **Carol Ulrich**, who scored 37.45 all-around at Georgia. UCLA had a team score of 188.60. Valorie Kondos is in her first year as UCLA coach. **SERIES** — The Gophers, 1-6 against UCLA, lost 187.60-177.45 last year in Los Angeles.

Seattle Pacific, an annual Division II power, finished third at the USGF Division II national meet last year. The Falcons have competed twice at the Husky Classic, finishing third in both 1986 and 1988. Seattle Pacific's head coach is Laurel Tindall. **SERIES** — This is the first meeting between Minnesota and Seattle Pacific.

MINNESOTA TOPS WINONA STATE AT HOME, IOWA STATE ON THE ROAD — The Gophers opened their home season with a 181.75-168.45 win over Winona State on Sunday, the third straight year Minnesota has defeated the Warriors in the Gophers' opener. Minnesota followed that with a narrow 182.45-182.35 win over Iowa State Monday in Ames, Iowa. It was a costly win, however, as **Csisztu** suffered her knee injury while dismounting from the beam in the team's last event of the night.

Minnesota excelled on the balance beam in both meets, scoring 46.00 on the apparatus Sunday and 46.55 Monday. The 46.55 mark is the seventh-best in school history and the best-ever for Minnesota at this stage of the season. The Gophers also posted season-high vault (45.90) and uneven bars (45.70) scores against the Cyclones. Minnesota's strongest events in recent years have been the vault and floor exercise, so the team's early-season beam efforts bode well for the future. -- more

CSISZTU ROLLS TO TWO MORE ALL-AROUND TITLES — One of the hottest starts ever by a Gopher gymnast came to an abrupt halt Monday when **Csisztu** was injured. After making her debut with an all-around win in Wisconsin's four-team invitational on Jan. 12, the sophomore scored a season-high 37.95 to take all-around honors against Winona State Sunday and 37.50 to win the all-around at Iowa State on Monday. Her scores included her second straight 9.70 on the balance beam and a season-high 9.50 on the floor exercise Sunday and a season-high 9.60 on the bars Monday. Against Winona State, **Csisztu** was first on the bars, beam and floor exercise, and against Iowa State she was first on the vault and bars.

WOLF, McCONNELL MAKING THEIR MARK — Freshmen **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST) and **KELLY McCONNELL** (FORT LAUDERDALE, FL/ST. THOMAS AQUINAS) have been improving rapidly and putting up the scores to prove it. **Wolf** finished second all-around with a 36.65 score against Winona State that included a team-best 9.55 on the vault and a 9.45 on the floor exercise. **McConnell's** consistence has been instrumental in the team's emergence on the beam. She scored 9.55 on the beam Monday after posting identical 9.25 scores in her first two outings on the event. She had a personal-best 35.95 all-around score against Iowa State.

ALLSTADT, JUHASZ-NAGY COMING ON — Sophomores **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) and **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) have made important contributions to Minnesota's steadily improving team scores. **Allstadt** scored a career-best 35.90 all-around against Winona State, including a 9.30 on the floor exercise, and came back with another 9.30 on the floor and a 9.30 on the vault the next night. **Juhasz-Nagy**, after a slow start in Minnesota's first two meets, hit a career-best 9.55 on the beam at Iowa State as well as a personal-season high 9.45 on the uneven bars.

INJURY REPORT — Senior co-captain **CATHY ZOLKOWSKI** (NEENAH, WI/ARMSTRONG-NEENAH), still recovering from a sprained ankle, is almost ready to go all-around. She competed on the bars (8.65) and beam (9.40) at Iowa State after competing on the beam (8.95) and performing a bars (9.10) exhibition against Winona State. Freshman **JENNY KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS) missed both meets with tendonitis in an achilles tendon but is expected back soon. Sophomore **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER), out with a hyperextended left knee, could be back by Minnesota's Feb. 2 meet at UCLA.

A LOOK AT IOWA-- The Hawkeyes (8-6, 2-3 Big Ten) have dropped to No. 23 in the Associated Press Women's Top 25 after being ranked as high as 11th this season. Iowa split on the road over the weekend, losing to Indiana 74-59 and defeating Ohio State 88-68. It was the first time since 1985 that Iowa had lost to Indiana. The Hawkeyes have also suffered losses to Wisconsin (78-67) and Purdue (84-75 OT) in Big Ten play, with their other conference victory coming over Illinois (63-47). Iowa has won just two of its last seven games, but two of its losses in the last month have come against ranked teams - No. 6 Georgia (62-51) and No. 16 Washington (71-61).

WATCH FOR -- Sophomore forward **Toni Foster** carries the Hawkeyes inside with a 15.6 points/game average. She scored 16 points against Ohio State and 10 against Indiana. Foster is shooting 56.4 percent from the field and averages 7.5 rebounds/game. Helping out in the front court is freshman **Necole Tunsil**, who averages 7.6 points and 3.5 rebounds/game. She scored 14 points against the Buckeyes. The middle is anchored by senior **Felicia Hall**, who has been bothered by a knee injury after an anterior cruciate ligament tear over the summer. Hall, who played just seven minutes against Ohio State, is backed up by sophomore **Molly Tideback**, a transfer from UCLA. Tideback became eligible Jan. 15 after sitting out the spring and fall semesters due to NCAA transfer rules. She scored eight points and tallied four rebounds in her 13-minute debut against Ohio State. Senior point guard **Steph Schueler** directs the Iowa offense. Schueler, who averages 12.3 points/game, led the Hawkeyes with 20 points on 6-of-10 shooting against Ohio State. She scored two baskets from three-point range and was 6-of-8 from the free throw line. Junior guard **LaTonya Tate** has started 13 games for Iowa and scored 15 and 14 points in the two games over the weekend. Iowa's other double-figure scorer, junior forward **Trisha Waugh**, has been out with back spasms, but could return to action this weekend. Waugh leads the Hawkeyes in rebounding with an 8.3 rebounds/game average and ranks third in scoring with an 11.4 points/game average.

SERIES VS. IOWA -- Iowa leads 16-11 and has won the last 13 straight over Minnesota. The last Gopher win over the Hawkeyes was Jan. 20, 1984 by a 57-55 score at Williams Arena. The last Minnesota win at Carver-Hawkeye Arena was Feb. 27, 1983 by a 78-53 score.

IOWA COACH -- C. Vivian Stringer (Slippery Rock '70), coaching in her eighth season at Iowa, has a record of 172-49 (.778). In her 19th season as a collegiate head coach, she has a 423-100 (.809) overall record.

BASKETBALL CONTINUED --

MINNESOTA RECENTLY -- The Gophers (4-12, 0-6 Big Ten) increased their losing streak to six games over the weekend, losing 78-64 to Ohio State and 92-63 to Indiana. Minnesota was down by just five points at halftime against the Hoosiers, 34-29, but five three-pointers in the first six minutes of the second half by Indiana guard Kris McGrade helped the Hoosiers put the game out of reach. Minnesota has not won a game since Dec. 30 when it defeated Western Carolina in the third-place game of the Western Kentucky tournament. With the two losses on the road, the Gopher Big Ten road losing streak also increased to 23 games.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK -- Minnesota has added a player to its roster in **YOLANDA MURPHY** (ST. PAUL, MN/CHRIST'S HOUSEHOLD OF FAITH). The 6-foot freshman joined the Gopher roster as a walk-on and became eligible two weeks ago.

SHUDLICK GETS BACK ON TRACK -- Freshman forward **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) is back to scoring in double figures as she racked up 20 points against Indiana and 15 against Ohio State. Shudlick, who has not reached the 20-point mark since the fourth game of the season, scored 12 points in the first half against the Hoosiers on a 6-of-8 shooting performance. She finished the game shooting 9-of-13 from the field and 2-of-3 at the line. Shudlick's playing time has been steadily increasing as she recovers from a tibial stress fracture.

CARVER CLIPS -- Sophomore forward **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO), who is also seeing increased playing time while her tibial stress fracture heals, may have a case for starting versus coming off the bench for Minnesota. Carver has started five games for the Gophers this season and has scored in double figures in all five contests, including recording a career-high 19 points against Ohio State. In the eight games in which she has come off the bench, Carver has scored in double figures just twice.

KRAMER CONSISTENCY -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) can always be counted on for an offensive spark. She has scored in double figures in every game but one this season, leading Minnesota in scoring in nine games and in six of its last eight. Kramer has also hit the double-figure mark in rebounding in six games and in two of the last three. With 18 and 21 points over the weekend, Kramer has now scored a career total of 1,212 points, which ranks seventh on the all-time Minnesota scoring chart. She needs 133 points to reach the sixth-place slot. She also ranks in the top ten in rebounding with 645 rebounds to her credit, moving into the eighth spot on the list over the weekend. She needs 25 rebounds to reach the seventh position.

THE COACH -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 170-142 (.545) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach, including a 4-12 (.250) mark at Minnesota.
