**A LOOK AT WISCONSIN** -- The Badgers (13-13, 7-9 Big Ten) moved into a three-way tie for fifth place in the Big Ten Conference with victories over Ohio State and Indiana at the UW Fieldhouse over the weekend. Wisconsin is now tied for fifth with those two teams after going into the weekend in eighth place in the league. The Badgers used 45 percent shooting from the floor and an 87 percent accuracy mark from the line for a 92-77 win over the Buckeyes. Down by three at halftime against the Hoosiers, Wisconsin outscored Indiana 46-38 in the second half on 56 percent shooting from the field to post an 80-75 victory. The Badgers broke a three-game losing streak with their pair of wins over the weekend.

**WATCH FOR** -- Junior guard **Mynette Clark** had a spectacular weekend for the Badgers, scoring a career-high 28 points in the Indiana game and adding 13 against Ohio State. The long-range shooter, who leads the Big Ten in three-point goals per game, shot 50 percent from the three-point line, connecting on 5-of-10 three pointers for the weekend. Clark also contributed 10 assists in the two games. Sophomore guard **Robin Threatt**, Wisconsin's leading scorer with a 16.9 points/game average, led the Badgers against Ohio State with 21 points. She ranks fifth among the Big Ten scoring leaders. Junior forward **Michele Kozelka** tallied 17 points and 13 rebounds against Ohio State and ranks second in the conference with a 9.4 rebounds/game average.

**THE SERIES** -- Minnesota leads the all-time series 15-9, although the Badgers have won four of the last five meetings, including a 102-77 victory in Madison Jan. 6.

**THE COACH** -- Fifth-year head coach **Mary Murphy** (Northwestern '80) is 47-90 (.343) at Wisconsin.

**A LOOK AT NORTHWESTERN** -- The 20th-ranked Wildcats (19-7, 11-5 Big Ten) also defeated Ohio State and Indiana over the weekend to move into a third-place tie in the Big Ten standings with Iowa. Junior forward **Michele Savage**, the Big Ten's leading scorer and the key to the Northwestern offense, racked up 30 points and nine rebounds against Indiana, but was forced to sit out the Ohio State contest. Unfortunately for Northwestern, Savage is suffering from chicken pox and may be out of commission this weekend. Northwestern has posted wins in seven of its last eight games and looks to be heading for another NCAA tournament bid. The Wildcats will play at Iowa Thursday before making the trip to Minneapolis.

**WATCH FOR** -- With Savage out of the lineup, junior guard **Nancy Kennelly** will be looked at to take on additional scoring responsibilities. Kennelly posted 11 points against Indiana, but came back with a game-high 19 against Ohio State. Kennelly leads the Big Ten in assists with a phenomenal 8.4 assists/game average. She has racked up 219 assists on the season and recorded 14 over the weekend. It was Kennelly's younger sister, freshman **Maira Kennelly** who stepped up to help out against the Buckeyes. She tallied 18 points and matched her sister's assist total of six. She also contributed five steals and five rebounds in 30 minutes of playing time. Senior guard **Kelly Cole**, averaging 10.1 points/game, is also a Wildcat threat. She scored 25 points and snared 12 rebounds in weekend play.

**THE SERIES** -- Northwestern leads the series 17-6 and has won the last six meetings, including a 90-49 win in Evanston, Ill. Jan. 4.

**THE COACH** -- **Don Perrelli** (Southern Connecticut '61) is 120-76 (612) in his seventh season at Northwestern and 295-147 (.667) in 15 years of collegiate coaching.

**MINNESOTA RECENTLY** -- The Gophers just about snapped their Big Ten road losing streak at Michigan, but came up just short in a 74-70 loss to the Wolverines, their seventh straight. Minnesota has now lost 15 of its last 16 contests with its lone Big Ten victory over Michigan State 58-55, Feb. 3 at Williams Arena. The Gophers were down by just two points, 72-70, with 20 seconds remaining in the game after rallying with four straight makes at the free throw line. However, Minnesota was forced to foul as the clock ran down, allowing the Wolverines to capture their fourth conference win of the season. The Gophers dropped a 68-52 decision at Michigan State Friday. The weekend losses put Minnesota's conference road losing streak at 28 straight games, dating back to a March 7, 1988 win at Wisconsin.

**IMPROVED STATS** -- Minnesota shot 47.5 percent against the Wolverines, its best performance since a Feb. 8 game at Illinois. The Gophers outrebounded their opponents in both games, 44-37 over the Spartans and 43-37 over the Wolverines. That marked the first time since the Gophers' Feb. 3 win over Michigan State that Minnesota has outrebounded an opponent by more than two rebounds. Free throw shooting was also given a boost as Minnesota sank 75 percent (24-32) of its shots against Michigan and MSU (6-8).

**SHUDLICK POURS IT ON** -- Freshman forward **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) caught fire over the weekend, scoring 51 points in two games. She came off the bench against Michigan State and hit four-of-six first-half shots, before ending the game with 20 points on an 8-of-14 shooting performance, 4-of-6 at the line. Shudlick also ripped down 10 rebounds and contributed two assists, two steals and a blocked shot against the Spartans. Shudlick started Sunday's contest against Michigan and racked up a career-high 31 points, also a team-season high. Shudlick scored 11 of the Gophers' 14 points during a second-half rally that pulled Minnesota to within two points with 4:20 remaining. Shudlick scored on 10 of 17 attempts from the field and 11-of-12 at the line, another team-season high. She added five rebounds, three assists and two steals in just 29 minutes.

**THE NUMBERS ON KRAMER** -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) will move into the sixth-place slot, past Marty Dahlen (1978-82), on the all-time career scoring chart this weekend as she needs just two points to reach that spot. After scoring 29 points in the two weekend games, she has now scored a career total of 1,343 points. The fifth position, occupied by Debbie Hunter (1979-83), is within definite reach as Kramer needs just 18 points to get there. She averages 16.3 points/game and has two games remaining in her career. She will probably go no further than fifth though, as the fourth-place spot is 98 points away and is held by Carol Peterka (1982-86).

Kramer reached the fifth spot on the career rebounding chart over the weekend, surpassing Marty Dahlen (1978-82), and now has a total of 714 rebounds to her credit. Kramer would need 30 rebounds in her final two games to reach the fourth position. She averages 7.6 rebounds/game.

**KRAMER TO BE HONORED ON SENIOR NIGHT** -- Ellen Kramer, the lone senior and captain of the 1990-91 Gopher basketball team, will be honored before the start of Saturday's game against Northwestern, which tips off at Williams Arena at 7:30 p.m. As mentioned above, Kramer will likely end up fifth on both the all-time scoring and all-time rebounding charts. She should also finish in a tie for fifth on the career list for games played, seventh in field goals made, sixth in field goals attempted, second or third in free throws made, and second in free throws attempted.

**JOUBERT DOMINATES THE BOARDS** -- Junior center **DANA JOUBERT** (DETROIT, MI/ST. MARTIN DePORRES) upped her rebounding average to 9.5 rebounds/game over the weekend with a game-high 12 rebounds against Michigan State and another game-high 11 boards against Michigan. Joubert also scored 24 points in the two contests.

**THE COACH** -- Minnesota first-year head coach **Linda Hill-MacDonald** is 171-151 (.531) in her 11th season as a collegiate head coach.

**GOPHERS TO FACE CYCLONES IN BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP TUNEUP** — The Minnesota women gymnasts will take on Iowa State at 2 p.m. Sunday at Williams Arena in the regular season finale. The meet will be the Gophers' last chance to sharpen routines and raise individual as well as team regional qualifying scores prior to the March 22 Big Ten championship. Minnesota, currently ranked eighth in the NCAA Central Region, needs a good performance Sunday and at the Big Ten championship if it is to qualify for NCAA postseason competition for the fifth straight year. The top seven teams in each of the NCAA's five regions qualify for postseason regional championships. This will be the second time Iowa State and Minnesota have met this season. The Gophers won a close meet in Ames, Iowa on Jan. 21, edging the Cyclones 182.45-182.35. Minnesota has been steadily raising its team scores since then, scoring 186.00 and above in the team's last five meets. Friday the Gophers scored a team-season high 188.15 at Florida.

**IOWA STATE COMING OFF SEASON-BEST ROAD OUTING** — Not only will Iowa State be the Gophers' opponent Sunday, but the Cyclones figure to be one of the Gophers' stiffest competitors for one of the Central Region's final two postseason slots. Iowa State has a 186.16 regional qualifying score, just slightly behind Minnesota (186.34), Wisconsin (186.32) and Iowa (186.31). The Cyclones scored 187.05 in Iowa City Thursday, defeating the Hawkeyes (184.40) and Central Michigan (185.55) in a triangular meet. The Cyclones have three other scores above 187.00 this season, all of which were reached at home. Sunday's meet is Iowa State's last regular season competition prior to the March 23 Big Eight championship meet at the University of Missouri.

**WATCH FOR** — Junior **Kathie Jo Kindler** has a season-best all-around score of 38.30 and an all-around average of 37.29. She scored 38.05 Thursday at Iowa. Kindler has highs of 9.70 on the bars, beam and floor exercise. Senior **Janelle Emerson** has an all-around high of 37.35. Last year's top all-arounder, sophomore **Kristin Moore**, has missed most of this season because of an elbow injury but has recently returned to compete in the vault and balance beam. She has highs of 9.40 in the vault and 9.45 in the beam. Two native Minnesotans compete for the Cyclones, sophomore **Carrie Hauptert** of Apple Valley and freshman **Jenny Olson** of Mahtomedi. Hauptert has a 9.70 high in the floor exercise and a 9.60 season best in the uneven bars while Olson has highs of 9.60 in the vault, 9.55 in the beam and 9.65 in the floor exercise. **SERIES** — The Gophers lead 17-5 and have won 15 of the last 16 meetings between the schools. Iowa State had not defeated the Gophers since 1979 until beating Minnesota 190.50-187.65 in Ames, Iowa late last season.

**BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP PREVIEW** — Because of spring break next week, there will be no press release issued by the women's athletic department's sports information office. Therefore, a capsule look at each of the seven Big Ten's women's gymnastics teams is included in this week's release. A look at the season results of the Big Ten teams does not reveal a clear-cut favorite, although based on rankings over the course of the season, Wisconsin, Michigan and Ohio State appear to be the Gophers' prime competition for the championship.

**MINNESOTA** scored 187.45 at last year's championship and finished third. The Gophers lost seven-time Big Ten champion Marie Roethlisberger from last year's squad but return defending Big Ten floor exercise tri-champion **Cathy Zolkowski** and a strong supporting cast. Minnesota has what is probably the Big Ten's best vaulting team with four individuals who have scored 9.60 or better in the event this year. They include Zolkowski, freshman **Jessica Wolf**, and sophomores **Monika Juhasz-Nagy** and **Dawn Ketcher**. Wolf's all-around high (38.20) is tied for the Big Ten's best and she is a strong candidate for conference freshman of the year honors. Head coach Katalin Deli, in her 18th season, is the dean of Big Ten women's gymnastics coaches. The Gophers currently have the second-highest team score in the Big Ten this season at 188.15. Minnesota closes the regular season Sunday at Iowa State.

**Illinois** scored a conference-record 188.75 to win last season's title. This year, Illinois lost two of its top all-arounders, **Peggy Pullman** and **Jennifer Durdil**, to season-ending injuries. The Fighting Illini's top season score thus far is 186.40. Freshman **Kim Bathke** has Illinois' top all-around score (37.50), while



Illinois' top event scores have been sophomore **Kara Corso's** 9.75 in the vault (best in the Big Ten) and a 9.75 in the floor exercise by Bathke, Corso and freshman **Sarah Wasserman**. Illinois, coached by Bev Mackes (14th year), will play host to Missouri Saturday in its last regular season meet.

An improved **Iowa** team scored a Big Ten-season high 188.95 Saturday in a win over Michigan. The Hawkeyes scored 184.10 at last season's championships and finished seventh, a spot they have occupied in six of the last seven years. The exception was 1989, when the Iowans finished fifth. The Hawkeyes return one of the Big Ten floor exercise tri-champions from last season, junior **Lori Cole**, who holds the Iowa all-around high this season (38.05). Senior **Michelle Cahal** has an all-around high of 38.00 this season. Freshman **Sandy Stengel** is tied for the Big Ten's top balance beam score (9.75) of the season and Cole ranks first in the floor exercise (9.80). Iowa, coached by Diane DeMarco (12th year), closes its regular season Saturday at Oklahoma.

**Michigan** finished sixth at last season's championship with a 184.85 score following a last-place finish in 1989. The Wolverines are improved this season under second-year coach Bev Fry. Michigan scored a school-record 187.00 in a dual meet loss to LSU in Baton Rouge, La. on March 1 and followed up with a 184.90 in a road loss to Iowa on Saturday. The top Wolverine scorers this season have been sophomore **Ali Winski** and freshman **Wendy Wilkinson**. Wilkinson has an all-around high of 37.90 (as of 3/4) and Winski ranks among the Big Ten's top ten in all four events. Her best mark is a 9.75 on the floor exercise. Junior **Kim Crocker's** high balance beam score (9.75) is tied for the Big Ten's best on that event. Michigan closes out the regular season Saturday at home against Michigan State and Central Michigan.

**Michigan State** scored 187.50 and finished second at last year's Big Ten championships after finishing third the previous four years. First-year head coach Kathy Klages has assembled another strong Spartan team that could make a bid for the title. Michigan State has a team high score of 187.95 but had a shaky outing Saturday at Arizona, scoring just 174.55. The top Spartan all-arounders are sophomore **Ruth Aguayo** (37.90 high) and freshman **Jennifer Dube** (37.70 high). Aguayo's top bars score (9.75) ranks second in the Big Ten as does junior **Laura Makowski's** top beam score (9.75). The Spartans close their regular season Saturday at Michigan.

**Ohio State** slipped to fifth in the Big Ten last season with a 185.60 score at the conference championship. The Buckeyes finished second in 1989 after winning the Big Ten title for five straight years from 1984-88. Although Ohio State did not have a strong conference meet last season, the Buckeyes came back and won the NCAA Northeast Region championship, earning a team berth in the NCAA championships, where they finished 12th. Twelfth-year head coach Larry Cox has helped the team carry last season's momentum into this year, as Ohio State appears ready to challenge for another title. The Buckeyes scored a season-high 187.55 in a home win over Indiana (Pa.) on Saturday. The leading Ohio State all-arounder is junior **Claire Wilson**, who tied a Big Ten season high with her 38.20 all-around score Saturday. Wilson has the Big Ten's best uneven bars score (9.80). Ohio State will conclude its regular season Friday at Kent State.

**Wisconsin** has been at the top of the Big Ten rankings nearly all season after upsetting both Arizona and Minnesota in the Badgers' season-opening meet. Last year Wisconsin scored 186.05 and finished fourth at the Big Ten championship for the Badgers' best-ever finish. Seventh-year head coach Terry Bryson's team has a 1991 season high of 187.60 and several individuals who rank in the Big Ten's top ten. Defending Big Ten all-around champion and 1990 Big Ten Freshman of the Year **Elizabeth Mahaney** has a season-high all-around score of 37.80, while sophomore **Holly Bremer** has an all-around high of 38.05. Senior **Michele Hernandez's** top floor exercise score (9.75) is tied for second-best in the Big Ten. Wisconsin finishes its regular season Saturday at home against Winona State.

**GOPHERS SCORE SEASON-BEST 188.15, FINISH THIRD AT FLORIDA** — Minnesota equaled the second-best mark in school history with the 188.15 score achieved Friday at Florida's quadrangular meet in Gainesville, Fla. The Gophers finished third in the meet behind Florida (193.70) and future Big Ten foe Penn State (190.80). William & Mary was fourth with a 186.65 team score. Minnesota had season highs on the vault (47.75) and uneven bars (47.00). Individually, the Gophers tied or set seven new career bests and set six new season bests. Minnesota's regional qualifying score jumped from 185.20 to 186.34.

**GYMNASTICS CONTINUED --**

**ALLSTADT, WOLF REACH CAREER BESTS IN ALL-AROUND** — Sophomore **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) scored a career-best 37.40 Friday and freshman **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST) became the first Gopher to top 38.00 this season as she rang up a career-best 38.20 to finish fourth all-around in the meet. **Allstadt's** scores included a 9.30 in the vault, 9.20 in the uneven bars, 9.35 in the balance beam and 9.55 in the floor exercise. **Wolf**, meanwhile, scored a career-best 9.60 in the bars and tied a career best with a 9.70 in the floor exercise while also scoring 9.60 in the vault and 9.30 in the beam competition. Her all-around score is tied for the best in the Big Ten this season. Ohio State's Claire Wilson scored 38.20 Saturday against Indiana (Pa.).

**LINDHOLM HITS SEASON HIGHS IN VAULT, BARS** — The Gophers will need everyone to contribute if they hope to win the Big Ten title and sophomore **IKA LINDHOLM** (WINNETKA, IL/YORK COMMUNITY) showed she is ready to do her part by scoring a season-best 9.20 in the vault and a career-best 9.40 in the uneven bars. Other event specialists who played a big role in Friday's meet were freshmen **JENNIFER KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS) and **KELLY McCONNELL** (FORT LAUDERDALE, FL/ST.THOMAS AQUINAS) and sophomore **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER). **Kraling** scored a career-best 9.50 in the balance beam, **McConnell** scored a career-best 9.50 in the uneven bars and **Ketcher** notched season bests in the vault (9.60) and floor exercise (9.30).

**MORE INDIVIDUAL NOTES** — Sophomore **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) scored a season best in the vault (9.65), as did senior co-captain **CATHY ZOLKOWSKI** (NEENAH, WI/ARMSTRONG-NEENAH), who tallied a 9.60 in the vault. Senior co-captain **KATHYNESS** (COON RAPIDS, MN) did an exhibition on the bars and scored a 9.05 with a simple dismount and without the giant swing-full twist she usually performs. **Ness** has been working out on the balance beam and may be inserted in either the bars or beam lineups or both for this weekend's meet at Iowa State.

**DIVING**

**THREE DIVERS TO NCAA ZONE COMPETITION** - Three Minnesota divers will be among the competitors this weekend at the NCAA Zone 'C' Qualifying Meet in Columbus, Ohio. The top five finishers in 1-meter diving and the top three competitors on the 3-meter board will advance to the NCAA championships March 21-23 in Indianapolis, Ind.

Senior **LISA DAVIS** (AUSTIN, MN) will compete only in the 1-meter spring board competition as she has already qualified for the national championships in 3-meter diving. **Davis** received the automatic bid after finishing second at the Big Ten championships. The top two divers on the high board at the conference meet automatically qualified for the national championships. Sophomore **JENNIFER YASIS** (LAKE ELMO, MN/JOHNSON) and freshman **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CANADA/SIVERTHORN) will compete in 1- and 3-meter diving at the zone competition.

**SWIMMING & DIVING**

**NIEDENFUER NAMED BIG TEN SWIMMER OF THE MONTH** -- Minnesota junior **STACEY NIEDENFUER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON) has been named the February Big Ten women's athlete of the month for swimming and diving. A sprint freestyler, **Niedenfuier** paced the Gophers to their second-place finish at the conference championships Feb. 21-23 in Minneapolis. The Big Ten champion in the 50 free (:23.18), **Niedenfuier** also placed second in the 100 free and third in the 200 free. She is a member of Minnesota's winning 200 free relay team, as well as the second-place 400 free relay and 400 medley relay teams. **Niedenfuier** also swam on the Minnesota's fifth-place 800 free relay team.

During February, she qualified for the NCAA championships in the 50 free and three separate relays, while surpassing the optional entry standard in the 100 and 200 freestyle events. **Niedenfuier** also set three varsity records and eclipsed the all-time Big Ten and championship records in the 200 free relay. In regular season meets with Harvard, Purdue and Illinois (double-dual meet) and Northern Michigan, **Niedenfuier** garnered two first-place finishes, four second-place finishes and swam on three champion relay squads.

**SWIMMING & DIVING CONTINUED --**

**EIGHT SWIMMERS AND A DIVER QUALIFY FOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS --** Nineteenth-ranked Minnesota has qualified to compete in 12 events at the NCAA Division I Women's Swimming and Diving Championships March 21-23 in Indianapolis, Ind. All of the qualifications came at the Big Ten championships at the University Aquatic Center this past weekend. The Gophers made the entry standards in the 200 and 400 free relay events, the 200 and 400 medley relays, the 50 free, the 100 free, the 400 individual medley and 3-meter diving. Minnesota also made the optional entry standards in the 200 individual medley, the 200 backstroke and the 100 and 200 freestyle events.

**THE RELAYS —** Minnesota's 200 free relay team of sophomore **LAURA HERMAN** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL), junior **STACEY NIEDENFUER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON), sophomore **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) and sophomore **TRINA THAMES** (EAU CLAIRE, WI/NORTH) made the NCAA time standard (1:34.04) with a time of 1:32.77. **Thames**, freshman **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN), freshman **ANDREA RUDSER** (MINOT, ND/MINOT) and **Herman** combined their individual specialties to make the cuts (1:45.19) in the 200 medley relay after they clocked a combined time of 1:44.77. **Rudser**, **Thames**, and **Zeller** were joined by **Niedenfuier** in the 400 medley relay (3:48.64) as they qualified for the NCAA championships with a time of 3:47.37. The Gophers also made the 400 free relay time standard (3:24.51) with the relay team of **Niedenfuier**, **Herman**, junior **DEANNE HOP** (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN/ST. LOUIS PARK) and **Thames**.

**INDIVIDUAL EVENTS --** The Gophers also qualified to compete in eight individual events, four by meeting the qualifying time standard and four by the optional entry standard. The optional entry standard allows swimmers to compete in an event if they have made the qualifying time standard in another event.

**Trina Thames** made the standard cut time in the 100 backstroke (:57.60) with a time of :56.00 and the optional standard in the 200 backstroke (2:04.74) after recording a time of 2:04.51. **Stacey Niedenfuier** made the standard in the 50 free (:23.37) with a time of :23.18 and the optional standard in the 100 free (:51.36) with a time of :50.55 and the 200 free (1:51.12) after clocking a time of 1:49.71. Junior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) qualified for the 400 individual medley (4:22.56) with a time of 4:22.00 and made the optional entry standard in the 200 individual medley (2:05.31) with a time of 2:04.06.

Senior **LISA DAVIS** (AUSTIN, MN/AUSTIN) became an automatic qualifier for the NCAA championships in 3-meter diving after taking second in the event at the Big Ten championships. The top two conference divers in three-meter diving automatically qualify for NCAA championships.

**COACHES COMMENTS --** "We qualified more relay teams and individuals for the NCAA championships than we did last year," said head coach Jean Freeman. "My pre-season goal for the team of finishing no lower than 18th at the championships has not changed." Last year, the Gophers qualified one relay team (400 medley relay) and three individuals in seven events.

**ADAMS RESETS OWN RECORD --** Freshman **KAREN ADAMS** (WALNUT CREEK, CA/NORTHGATE) broke her own Minnesota varsity record in the 200 butterfly with a time of 2:04.59 at the USS State Championships this past weekend. Adams held the previous record of 2:04.82 in the event, which she set at the Big Ten championships.

**GOLF**

**GOLF SEASON UNDERWAY --** With snow still on the ground and more to come, the 27th-ranked Minnesota women's golf team has already seen action this spring. The Gophers started their spring season March 1 at the Auburn Country Club of Alabama Intercollegiate tournament where they finished fifth in the rain-shortened outing.

Minnesota will compete in four more tournaments this spring before teeing off at the Big Ten championships at Wisconsin in May. The next outing is the Desert Challenge in Tempe, Ariz., March 21-22. Minnesota and Iowa are co-hosting the 36-hole tournament which will field teams from Michigan State, Missouri, Pepperdine, Iowa and Minnesota. Coach Nancy Harris is taking nine golfers to the Desert Challenge and will name the competition team once they are in Arizona.

The Gophers will also compete this spring at the South Carolina Invitational (March 29-31), the Ohio State Invitational (April 13-14) and the South Alabama Invitational (April 19-21).

**GOLF CONTINUED --**

**BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS --** The 1991 Big Ten Women's Golf Championships will be held in Madison, Wis. on May 3-5 at the Cherokee Country Club, which was the site of last fall's Lady Northern Golf Invitational. The Gophers won that tournament, defeating eighth-ranked Indiana by nine strokes.

"Our goal is to win the conference title," says Harris. "We'll have to play well to beat Indiana, whose top players didn't play well at the Lady Northern. It'll be tough, but that's our goal."

**GOPHERS TO WATCH --** This spring's traveling team promises to carry three familiar faces. Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) and sophomores **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) and **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) competed in all five of the fall tournaments. Ross had a fall stroke average 77.00, with Evens close behind with a 77.40 stroke average. Leighton was third in stroke averages last fall with an 80.26.

The faces are expected to change throughout the spring for the fourth through sixth traveling team slots. Redshirt freshman **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN), senior **TRACI JOHNSON** (MARSHALL, MN), junior **KRISTA REUTERFELDT** (COON RAPIDS, MN) and freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN) are the leading candidates for those slots.

**GOPHERS RETURN TO FULLERTON —** The Minnesota softball team (11-15) will spend spring break in Fullerton, Calif. for the fifth consecutive season. The Gophers will play Rutgers (0-0) in a non-conference doubleheader March 17 at 4 p.m. in Fullerton and at Cal. State-Northridge March 19 at 1:30 p.m. The Gophers open play in the 15-team Pony Tournament Wednesday against Rutgers at 5 p.m., followed by games against 10th-ranked Nevada-Las Vegas (19-4) and Cal Poly-Pomona Thursday. Championship play in the tournament begins Friday night.

**TOURNAMENT FORMAT —** The 11th-annual Pony Tournament has changed very little since its inception, but there will be one minor change this year. With U.S. International declaring bankruptcy, Pool D was left with only Minnesota, Rutgers and Nevada-Las Vegas. To fill the void, each of those three teams will play a game outside of Pool D. **OPPONENTS AT A GLANCE** — Rutgers will open its 1991 season with the doubleheader against Minnesota. The Lady Knights were 27-21-1 in 1990, including an impressive 11-1 in the Atlantic 10 regular season. Rutgers had a 12-game winning streak during the 1990 season. The Lady Knights return their top four hitters and all three pitchers from last year's team, including senior catcher **Laurie McMahon** (.296, 29 runs scored) and sophomore pitcher **Nikki Ambruso** (14-12, 1.13 ERA). Last year, Minnesota rallied from a 2-1 deficit in the seventh inning to defeat the Lady Knights 3-2 in eight innings. Three Lady Knight errors led to two Minnesota runs and the Gopher victory. The meeting was the first-ever between the two schools.

**Cal. State-Northridge** has been a tough opponent already for Minnesota this season, as the Lady Matadors have defeated the Gophers twice this season in two February tournaments. At the Arizona Softball Classic, Minnesota out-hit Northridge 9-7 but lost the game 5-3. At the San Diego State Spring Classic, Minnesota committed a season-high seven errors and lost 2-1. **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN/TAR-TAN) and **Diane Field** have three hits each against Northridge, while Northridge's Kim Oakes has four hits against Minnesota. Northridge leads the all-time series 3-1. Minnesota is 0-7 this season against Cal. State schools and 2-19 lifetime.

**Nevada-Las Vegas** was ranked 10th in the NCAA preseason poll and participated in the 1990 NCAA Women's College World Series. The Lady Rebels defeated Cal. State-Northridge and Santa Clara twice in Northridge last weekend. The Gophers have lost the only lifetime meeting between the two schools.

**Cal Poly-Pomona** was an entrant in the 1989 NCAA Women's College World Series and is an annual participant in the Pony Tournament. Coach **Carol Spanks** is one of the veterans of the college softball scene. The Broncos lead the all-time series 9-5.

**MILESTONES** — With one more hit, junior **Kari Blank** will become the 18th Gopher in history to accumulate 100 hits in her Minnesota career. **Blank** hit the eighth triple of her career against Sam Houston State, tying her for sixth on Minnesota's all-time list. Both of her triples in 1991 have been game-winning hits.

Senior **Diane Field** has appeared in 146 games in her Minnesota career, more than any current Gopher. **Field** needs four more games to become the 16th Gopher in history to play in 150 games. **Field** has 938 career putouts, 53 short of Patricia Johnson (1987-88) and first place on the all-time Gopher list. Her fielding percentage of .9838 is also a close second behind Johnson's .9842.

**THIS YEAR VS. LAST** — Minnesota's 26th game in 1990 was after the Pony Tournament and in 1991 the 26th game was before the trip to Fullerton. The records between the 1990 and 1991 seasons seem similar until you stumble upon this fact: In 1990, Minnesota lost only three of its first 16 games by one run and had been blanked eight times in the process. This season, the Gophers have lost 10 of their 15 games by one run and have been shut out only four times. The comparison:

**COACH TERESA WILSON** — Gopher second-year head coach Teresa Wilson is 42-47 (.472) at Minnesota and 168-151 (.527) in six years as a collegiate head coach.

## TENNIS

**GOPHERS OPEN SPRING SEASON ON WEST COAST** — The Minnesota women's tennis team, off this weekend because of final exams, will be starting a new term in the classroom on March 25. Before the Gophers open the books, however, they will be looking for a fresh start on the tennis courts.

Minnesota (0-9 overall, 0-4 Big Ten) opens its spring season March 21 in San Diego against defending Ivy League champion Princeton. The Gophers will then face San Diego on March 22 before returning home. An originally scheduled match against U.S. International was canceled when USIU terminated most of its athletic programs because of financial difficulties.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — Princeton (2-1 overall) has not competed in a dual match since October, when the Tigers lost to William & Mary 6-3 and defeated Brown (6-3) and Penn State (5-1). The Tigers' top doubles team, **Lauren Fortgang** and **Aila Winkler**, has a 17-2 season record and is ranked 14th in the current ITCA/Volvo Tennis rankings. Fortgang is 11-6 at No. 1 singles and Winkler is 12-5 at No. 2 singles. This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Princeton.

Fourteenth-ranked San Diego has lost four straight matches and has a season record of 6-5. Prior to playing Minnesota, San Diego will take on No. 6 Texas (March 14), No. 5 Cal-Berkeley (March 16), Miami (March 17) and Iowa (March 21). The Toreras lost to No. 11 Pepperdine 5-4 in their most recent match. Senior **Tonya Fuller**, ranked 11th nationally, plays No. 1 singles for San Diego and has a season record of 23-6. At No. 2 singles is **Tuck Kacharoen** from Bangkok, Thailand. She is ranked 24th and has a season mark of 12-7 at No. 2. Fuller and freshman Julie McKeon have a 7-4 record at No. 1 doubles. **SERIES** — San Diego defeated Minnesota 5-1 last season and leads the series 2-1.

**MINNESOTA LOSING STREAK HITS DOUBLE DIGITS** — The Gophers lost two more matches over the weekend, extending the team's school-record losing streak to 10. Minnesota lost 6-0 to Kentucky on Saturday, dropping all six of its singles matches. No doubles matches were played. On Sunday, the Gophers lost 8-1 to Wisconsin, with junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) getting Minnesota's only win. Moe defeated the Badgers' Elaine Demetroulis 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 at No. 1 singles to up her season singles record to 14-12.

## *INDOOR and OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD*

**SPRING TRIP** — The Minnesota women's track and field team will travel to Arizona for its annual spring break trip, culminating in the Arizona State Multi-Events Invitational March 21-23 at Sun Angel Stadium in Tempe, Ariz. The Gophers will compete with Arizona State, Brigham Young, Dartmouth, Princeton, Texas-El Paso and Utah in the meet.

**OUTDOOR OPENER** — Minnesota returns both of its Big Ten outdoor champions from a year ago and hopes to crack into the top five at the Big Ten meet this season. Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA) won the Big Ten shot put and discus titles last season. Lewis is the school record-holder in the shot put and is second on the all-time discus list. Senior co-captain **DECIA AGNEW** (BETHEL PARK, PA) is a two-time Big Ten titlist in the javelin and the second best all-time in Minnesota history. The Gophers also expect fast times from their distance corps, led by sophomore **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) and junior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN).

**NCAA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP RESULTS** — The Gophers scored one point at the NCAA indoor championship this past weekend in Indianapolis. Senior **Rachel Lewis** gained all-American status with her sixth-place finish in the shot put. Her throw of 51-0 was well short of her personal best of 52-10 set last month. UCLA's Tracie Millett won her second consecutive title with a heave of 54-3. Sophomore **Monika Balint** did not qualify for the finals of the 800 meters, finishing sixth in her heat in 2:09.23. The time was Balint's second fastest of the indoor season.

## BASKETBALL

**GOPHERS GO OUT IN STYLE** -- Talk about saving the best for last. The Minnesota women's basketball team went out with a bang over the weekend, defeating Wisconsin 76-62 to gain its second conference win of the season. The Gophers gave 20th-ranked and NCAA tournament-bound Northwestern all it could handle Saturday before succumbing to an 87-78 defeat in a game that was closer than the final margin indicates. Minnesota wraps up the 1990-91 season with a 6-22 overall record, 2-16 in the Big Ten, marking the third straight season it has finished at the bottom of the league standings.

**KRAMER NAMED TO ALL-BIG TEN SECOND TEAM** -- Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) played her last game as a Gopher Saturday. Kramer closes out her career as the fifth-leading scorer and rebounder in Minnesota women's basketball history. Kramer scored a career total of 1,371 points and recorded 728 career rebounds. She is the seventh Gopher to score over 1,000 points and record over 500 rebounds in a career. Kramer scored 28 points in her final weekend to go along with 14 rebounds, five assists, two steals, and a blocked shot. For her efforts, Kramer was selected by the Big Ten coaches as a member of the all-Big Ten second team after being named to the honorable mention list the last two seasons.

**THE NEW NIKKI COATES** -- Minnesota freshman guard **NIKKI COATES** (LEAVENWORTH, KS) was the epitome of "saving the best for last" over the weekend. Coates exploded for a career-high 28 points in the Gophers' win over the Badgers, canning 6-of-10 from three-point land. The six three-pointers marked a Williams Arena and Minnesota school record. She led Minnesota with nine first-half points and then exploded for 19 in the second half, hitting 5-of-8 three-pointers. Coates nailed two of those three-pointers in succession in the second half at 13:45 and 13:25 to take Minnesota from a close four-point lead at 44-40 to a 10-point advantage, 50-40. Coates also hit all four of her free throw attempts and was 9-of-15 overall from the field.

Coates showed that she was not just a flash in the pan when she cranked out 16 points in the Gophers' finale against Northwestern Saturday. There were a few less opportunities from the three-point line, but Coates managed to capitalize on 2-of-5 attempts. She ended the game with 16 points, her second-highest scoring total ever, and also contributed four assists and two steals in 30 minutes of playing time.

For the weekend, Coates racked up 44 points on 16-of-28 (.571) shooting from the field. She was 8-of-15 (.533) at three-point range and 4-of-4 (1.000) at the line.

**GOPHERS GO OUT IN STYLE --** Talk about saving the best for last. The Minnesota women's basketball team went out with a bang over the weekend, defeating Wisconsin 76-62 to gain its second conference win of the season. The Gophers gave 20th-ranked and NCAA tournament-bound Northwestern all it could handle Saturday before succumbing to an 87-78 defeat in a game that was closer than the final margin indicates. Minnesota wraps up the 1990-91 season with a 6-22 overall record, 2-16 in the Big Ten, marking the third straight season it has finished at the bottom of the league standings.

**KRAMER NAMED TO ALL-BIG TEN SECOND TEAM --** Senior forward **ELLEN KRAMER** (ROSEVILLE, MN/ALEXANDER RAMSEY) played her last game as a Gopher Saturday. Kramer closes out her career as the fifth-leading scorer and rebounder in Minnesota women's basketball history. Kramer scored a career total of 1,371 points and recorded 728 career rebounds. She is the seventh Gopher to score over 1,000 points and record over 500 rebounds in a career. Kramer scored 28 points in her final weekend to go along with 14 rebounds, five assists, two steals, and a blocked shot. For her efforts, Kramer was selected by the Big Ten coaches as a member of the all-Big Ten second team after being named to the honorable mention list the last two seasons.

**THE NEW NIKKI COATES --** Minnesota freshman guard **NIKKI COATES** (LEAVENWORTH, KS) was the epitome of "saving the best for last" over the weekend. Coates exploded for a career-high 28 points in the Gophers' win over the Badgers, canning 6-of-10 from three-point land. The six three-pointers marked a Williams Arena and Minnesota school record. She led Minnesota with nine first-half points and then exploded for 19 in the second half, hitting 5-of-8 three-pointers. Coates nailed two of those three-pointers in succession in the second half at 13:45 and 13:25 to take Minnesota from a close four-point lead at 44-40 to a 10-point advantage, 50-40. Coates also hit all four of her free throw attempts and was 9-of-15 overall from the field.

Coates showed that she was not just a flash in the pan when she cranked out 16 points in the Gophers' finale against Northwestern Saturday. There were a few less opportunities from the three-point line, but Coates managed to capitalize on 2-of-5 attempts. She ended the game with 16 points, her second-highest scoring total ever, and also contributed four assists and two steals in 30 minutes of playing time.

For the weekend, Coates racked up 44 points on 16-of-28 (.571) shooting from the field. She was 8-of-15 (.533) at three-point range and 4-of-4 (1.000) at the line.

## **GYMNASTICS**

---

**TEAM FALLS SHORT OF REGIONALS DESPITE BIG TEN TITLE** — Despite winning its third Big Ten title in four years, the Gopher women's gymnastics team did not qualify for the NCAA Central Region meet for the first time in five years. Minnesota had a school-record regional qualifying score (RQS) of 187.62 but finished eighth, .10 shy of earning the seventh and final spot. Iowa, which finished just ahead of the Gophers with a 187.71 score, will be going to regionals as a team for the first time. Individual all-around berths will be announced today. One or more Gophers may qualify.

**GOPHERS WIN THIRD BIG TEN TITLE IN FOUR YEARS** — Going into this year's Big Ten championship meet in Champaign, Ill., Minnesota was not listed among the favorites. Early-season injuries kept the Gophers' average score down, and with three newcomers competing, Minnesota was considered an unknown by many Big Ten women's gymnastics observers.

But after winning the Big Ten title on Friday with a championship-meet record 189.00 score, the Gophers made sure they will no longer go unnoticed. To top off the weekend on Saturday, three Minnesota gymnasts won event titles, four Gophers were named all-Big Ten and head coach Katalin Deli was named Big Ten coach of the year. The title was Minnesota's third in four years Deli earned her second coach of the year recognition in the last three years. Iowa finished second with a 188.25 score and Michigan was third with a 188.00. Illinois and Ohio State tied for fourth with 187.10 scores, Wisconsin was sixth with a 186.95 in its last-ever team competition and Michigan State was seventh (last) with a 186.10.

The Gophers scored a season-best 47.95 in the vault, just .05 away from the school record. Minnesota scored 46.85 in the uneven bars, 46.50 in the balance beam and 47.70 in the floor exercise.

**NESS, WOLF, ZOLKOWSKI WIN BIG TEN TITLES** — Senior co-captain **KATHY NESS** (COON RAPIDS, MN) came into the season as the team's top returner on the uneven bars and balance beam but suffered a fracture in her right knee in December and did not compete on the balance beam until the Friday night's team competition. On Friday, she scored 9.55 on the beam to qualify for the finals on Saturday. The last of 10 beam finalists to perform her routine, Ness closed out her gymnastics career by scoring a meet-record 9.70 to tie for the title. She earned all-Big Ten honors for the first time in her career.

Freshman **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI) won the Big Ten vault title with a 9.70 score and finished second in the floor exercise with a 9.70. **Wolf** finished seventh all-around with a 37.70 score on Friday. Also an all-Big Ten selection, she scored 9.65 in the vault, 9.00 in the bars, 9.35 in the beam and 9.70 in the floor.

Last year, senior co-captain **CATHY ZOLKOWSKI** (NEENAH, WI/ARMSTRONG-NEENAH) finished in a three-way tie for the floor exercise title with a 9.70 score. This season **Zolkowski** was alone at the top, scoring a meet-record and career-best 9.80 to win the title. She was named all-Big Ten for the third straight year after finishing in a third-place tie in the all-around competition on Friday. She scored 37.85 all-around, with scores of 9.70 in the vault, 9.30 in the bars, 9.20 in the beam and 9.65 in the floor exercise.

**JUHASZ-NAGY NAMED ALL-BIG TEN** — Sophomore **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) successfully executed all of her routines on Friday and scored 37.80 to finish fifth all-around, earning all-Big Ten honors for the first time. She tied for second in the vault with a 9.65 in event finals and scored a 9.50 to tie for sixth in the uneven bars. Sophomore **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) scored 37.10 all-around, the fourth straight meet she has scored 37.00 or better all-around. Included were scores of 9.20 in the vault, 9.30 in the bars, 9.20 in the beam and 9.40 in the floor exercise.

Freshman **KELLY McCONNELL** (FORT LAUDERDALE, FL/ST. THOMAS AQUINAS) scored a 9.55 in the bars and 8.85 in the balance beam on Friday. In event finals, she scored 9.45 in the uneven bars and finished ninth. Freshman **JENNY KRALING** (PLYMOUTH, MN/HOPKINS) scored a career-best 9.55 in the floor exercise Friday and senior **IKA LINDHOLM** (WINNETKA, IL/YORK COMMUNITY) scored a career-best 9.30 in the vault on Friday. Sophomore **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK MN/PARK CENTER) equaled a personal-season best with a 9.60 in the vault on Friday and set a new personal season best with a 9.40 in the floor exercise on Friday.



## SWIMMING & DIVING

**HIGHEST NCAA FINISH EVER** -- The women's swimming and diving team tied for 18th place at the NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championships in Indianapolis, Ind. on Saturday, giving the Gophers their highest finish ever at the national meet. The Gophers and Big Ten opponent Northwestern each scored 45 points for the tie. Minnesota's previous best finished was 20th in 1989 with 47 points. Texas won its seventh team title in the last eight years with 746 points, followed by Stanford with 653.

**TWO ALL-AMERICANS** -- Freshman diver **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CANADA/SILVERTHORN) and sophomore backstroke specialist **TRINA THAMES** (EAU CLAIRE, WI/NORTH) each earned all-American honors for their top eight finishes. Nelson was fifth in platform diving with 479.85 points, becoming Minnesota's first-ever NCAA all-American in diving. The only other Gopher diver to receive all-American honors was Chris Curry when she won the 3-meter diving competition at the 1982 AIAW national championships. Thames, who joined the Gophers in December after transferring to Minnesota from Pittsburgh, earned all-American status in the 100-yard backstroke with a seventh-place time of :56.61.

**HONORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICANS** -- Eight Minnesota swimmers and divers earned 14 honorable mention all-American accolades in two individual and three relay team events. Individually, senior **LISA DAVIS** (AUSTIN, MN) received honorable mention honors in 1-meter diving with her 13th-place finish, as did **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) with her 16th-place finish in the 200 individual medley. **Thames** garnered three honorable mention all-American honors as a member of 14th-place 400 medley relay team and the 15th-place 200 medley relay and 400 free relay teams. **Oegema** also received honorable mention status as member of the 400 medley relay team. Sophomore **LAURA HERMAN** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) was a double recipient of honorable mention all-American honors as member of the 400 free and 200 medley relay teams. Also receiving double honors were junior **STACEY NIEDENFUER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON) in the 400 free and medley relay team events, and freshman **ANDREA RUDSER** (MINOT, ND) in the 200 and 400 medley relay events. Junior **DEANNE HOP** (ST. LOUIS PARK, MN) received honorable mention all-American honors as member of the 400 free relay team as did freshman **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN) as a member of the 200 medley relay team.

The first meeting went nine innings and two tiebreakers at the Metrodome in February with the Tigers coming away with the 3-2 victory. The Gophers will be playing **Drake** for the first time in school history Sunday. **Northern Iowa** (4-10) will be looking to avenge a 3-1 loss earlier this season to Minnesota. The Gophers won that game at the Metrodome Softball Classic for third place. The Panthers will also play Minnesota in a non-conference doubleheader at the Bierman Softball Complex April 30.

**CALIFORNIA REVIEW** — Minnesota's 7-2 road trip to southern California is the best road trip of the 1991 season, as far as overall record is concerned. The Gophers have won 13 of their last 18 games and at 18-17, are over the .500 mark after 35 games for only the third time in the last seven years. Minnesota opened the week with a sweep of Rutgers, their first non-conference doubleheader sweep of the season. The Gophers split a doubleheader with Cal State Northridge, winning the opener 6-0 and losing the nightcap 1-0. The Gophers had lost two previous games to the Lady Matadors this season before the victory at Northridge.

Minnesota opened play in the Pony Tournament by defeating Rutgers 3-2 and then scored its biggest victory of the season the next day, a 4-0 shutout of fifth-ranked Nevada-Las Vegas. The Gophers finished the pool play section of the tournament with their third straight win, a 5-1 victory over Cal Poly Pomona. The streak continued into the first round of bracket play with a 2-1 victory over Kent, a 1990 NCAA Women's College World Series participant. That four-game winning streak was the longest of the season. It also came to an abrupt end in the quarterfinals with a 4-0 loss to ninth-ranked Texas A&M.

**SOFTBALL CONTINUED --**

**STAT NOTES** — As a team, Minnesota hit .282 during the nine-game California road swing, improving its season batting average to .251. The Gophers had six starters over the .300 mark on the trip, led by senior **DIANE FIELD** (MORTON GROVE, IL/NILES WEST), senior **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK) and sophomore **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN). **Field** and **Woody** each had .360 batting averages in California. **Field** had her first career home run in 383 career at bats in the first game against Cal State Northridge, a solo blast over the right-field fence. **Woody** had two doubles and a triple to lead the Gophers with a .520 slugging percentage on the road trip. **Weiss** had a team-high 11 hits and a .355 average in California.

The Gopher pitching staff had a team ERA of 0.35 in California, lowering the season mark to 1.08. Junior **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) did not allow an earned run in California, posting a 3-0 record and allowing only 12 hits and two walks in 22 innings while striking out 17 batters. Junior **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) pitched a two-hit shutout against Nevada-Las Vegas, her second of the season and 15th of her career. Sophomore **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) pitched four innings to defeat Kent for her sixth victory of the season, five more than her total after the Pony Tournament last season.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — Minnesota makes a six-game road trip next weekend which includes the opener of the Big Ten season. The Gophers play a non-conference doubleheader at Iowa State April 4 (3 p.m.), followed by two Big Ten doubleheaders at Iowa April 5 (3 p.m.) and April 6 (1 p.m.). The Hawkeyes are currently eighth in the NCAA poll and are the defending Big Ten co-champions.

**TRACK & FIELD**

---

**ARIZONA STATE REVIEW** — The Gophers finished third at the Arizona State Multi-Events Invitational last weekend in Tempe, Ariz. Minnesota finished with 85 points, trailing Brigham Young (205) and Arizona State (147). The Gophers finished ahead of Princeton (53), Texas-El Paso (28) and Dartmouth (16).

**DOUBLE WINNER, DOUBLE QUALIFIER** — Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) guaranteed her trip to Eugene, Ore. and the NCAA outdoor meet by throwing qualifying marks in both the shot put and the discus at Arizona State. The defending Big Ten champion in both events, Lewis threw 51-6 1/4 in the shot and 174-6 in the discus to win both events. Both marks are automatic qualifying marks, although Lewis has a better indoor shot put mark this year (52-10).

**AGNEW, BROWN HAVE SUCCESSFUL STARTS** — Senior javelin thrower **DECIA AGNEW** (BETHEL PARK, PA) finished second in the javelin this weekend with a toss of 159-5. The defending Big Ten champion now has a provisional qualifying mark for the NCAA meet, but will need to throw 173-11 to guarantee the trip to Eugene. Freshman high jumper **CORALEA BROWN** (ANDROSSAN, ALBERTA, CANADA) made an impressive debut in a Gopher uniform, leaping 5-8 to claim second place in the high jump. Brown is only two inches off the Minnesota school record of 5-10, which is also the provisional standard for the NCAA outdoor meet.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — The Gophers will not compete in any meets this weekend. Minnesota will next see action April 6 when they travel to Austin, Texas to compete in the Texas Relays.

## GOLF

---

**GOLFERS TO SOUTH CAROLINA** - The South Carolina Invitational in Columbia, S.C. is the next stop on the schedule for the women's golf team. Twelve teams are expected to be in the field at the Woodlands Country Club. Joining Minnesota and South Carolina are Auburn, Duke, Furman, Indiana, James Madison, Kentucky, Memphis State, Michigan, Nebraska and North Carolina-Wilmington. Minnesota head golf coach Nancy Harris will name the Gopher starters later this week.

**GOPHERS FOURTH IN TEMPE** - Minnesota placed fourth in the field of five teams at the Desert Challenge, March 20-21 in Tempe, Ariz. The Gophers, who co-hosted the tournament with Iowa, carded rounds of 340 and 326 strokes for a 36-hole total of 666 strokes. Iowa was first with a team total of 644 strokes. Sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) led the way for Minnesota with a tie for third place after carding rounds of 82 and 81 strokes for total of 163 strokes. Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) and sophomore **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) carded identical rounds of 85 and 82 for 36-hole total of 167. Freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN) shot a score of 169 after rounds of 88 and 81. Junior **KRISTA REUTERFELDT** (COON RAPIDS, MN) had rounds of 89 and 85 for a two-day total of 174, and redshirt freshman **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN) carded a 176 after recording rounds of 91 and 85.

**GOPHERS RETURN HOME; STILL LOOKING FOR FIRST WIN** — The Minnesota women's tennis team is hoping to break a school-record 12-match losing skid this weekend. The Gophers will play host to Purdue Friday at 6:30 p.m. and non-conference foe Iowa State Saturday at 12 noon, with both matches at the 98th Street Racquet Club. Minnesota resumes Big Ten action in Iowa City, Iowa against the Hawkeyes April 3.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — Purdue (5-7 overall, 0-2 Big Ten) lost 6-3 to Ohio State on Saturday and 8-1 to 11th-ranked Indiana on Sunday. The Boilermakers' only win against the Hoosiers was at No. 6 singles, where junior **Dana Pearson** defeated Indiana's Brenna Bodnar 6-1, 6-1. Purdue is led by senior **Erica Adams**, who has a 7-4 spring record at No. 1 singles. Adams and junior **Eve Slowinski** are 9-1 this spring at No. 1 doubles. **SERIES** — The Gophers lead 11-3 and have won three straight over Purdue. Last year Minnesota won 6-0 and 8-1.

**Iowa State** (3-7) is led by No. 1 singles player **Susanne Pollman**. Pollman is 5-4 in spring competition and 12-7 overall. Pollman teams with **Kim Dempsey** at No. 1 doubles for the Cyclones. The duo is 5-3 on the year. **SERIES** -- Minnesota leads 15-1 and defeated Iowa State 9-0 last year.

**Iowa** (5-7, 0-4) has lost six straight matches. The Hawkeyes lost 9-0 to Wisconsin on March 9 and 8-1 to 14th-ranked San Diego on Thursday. Sophomore **Andrea Calvert** leads Iowa with a 12-9 singles record at No. 3 and junior **Tracey Donnelly** is 10-5 at No. 4. Junior **Lori Hash** and junior **Catherine Wilson** have a 15-9 record at No. 1 doubles. The Hawkeyes play host to Purdue March 31 before meeting Minnesota. **SERIES** — The Gophers lead 23-5 and have won three straight over Iowa. Last year Minnesota won 6-3.

**PRINCETON, 14TH-RANKED SAN DIEGO DOWN GOPHERS** — Minnesota lost its 12th straight match dating back to last year when 14th-ranked San Diego shut out the Gophers 9-0 on Friday. Princeton beat Minnesota 8-1 on Thursday. The lone Gopher win against the Tigers was by freshman **JENNY MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA), who defeated Kristin Green 6-3, 6-2 at No. 4 singles. It was Marques' first collegiate singles victory. She is now 1-10 on the season. The match was Minnesota's first without senior **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN), who will undergo shoulder surgery this spring and miss the remainder of the season.

**GOPHERS HOPING TO EXTEND WIN STREAK** — Before last weekend, Minnesota had spent the whole season trying to end a losing streak that eventually reached school-record proportions. Now the Gophers will be seeking to continue a winning streak that began with 6-3 wins over Purdue and Iowa State this past weekend at the 98th Street Racquet Club. Minnesota (2-11, 1-4) will travel to Iowa City, Iowa for a 1:30 p.m. Wednesday match against Iowa and will return home to face Ohio State at 6:30 p.m. on Friday at the 98th Street Racquet Club and Gustavus Adolphus at 12 noon on Sunday at the Burnsville Racquet Club.

**HOMETOWN DAY FOR NELSON** -- WCCO-Radio and the women's athletic department will honor Gopher senior **Libby Nelson** and her hometown of Wayzata, Minn. Friday in a "Hometown Day" celebration. The "Hometown Day" campaign honors Minnesota student-athletes and their hometowns on selected dates throughout the season.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — Iowa (6-7, 1-4) beat Purdue 6-3 Sunday to break a six-match losing streak. The Hawkeyes lost 9-0 to Wisconsin on March 9 and 8-1 to 14th-ranked San Diego on March 21. Prior to Sunday, sophomore **Andrea Calvert** led Iowa with a 12-9 singles record at No. 3, while junior **Tracey Donnelly** was 10-5 at No. 4. Junior **Lori Hash** and junior **Catherine Wilson** have a 15-10 record at No. 1 doubles. They were defeated 6-4, 7-5 by Purdue's Erica Adams and Eve Slowinski. **SERIES** — The Gophers lead 23-5 and have won three straight over Iowa. Last year Minnesota won 6-3.

Ohio State (11-4, 1-1) has dropped three of its last four after winning seven in a row and 10 of 11 to start the season. The Buckeyes lost 8-1 to South Florida on Tuesday and 9-0 to Notre Dame on March 24. Sophomore **Abigail Villena** leads the team in overall singles wins with 17 and is 11-4 at No. 2 singles. Junior **Kelly Story** has 15 singles wins and is 9-6 at No. 1 singles. Junior **Amy Marzluff** is 7-0 at No. 5 singles. Story and Villena are 25-8 overall in doubles and are 11-4 at No. 1 doubles. **SERIES** — The Gophers are 8-4 against Ohio State. The Buckeyes won 5-4 last year.

Gustavus Adolphus had a 3-5 record prior to playing five matches on their spring break trip last week. Results from the trip were unavailable at release time. Last year's Division III national champion, the Gusties are led by senior **Amy McCrea** from Edina. She came into the season ranked sixth among Division III players. **SERIES** — Minnesota leads 6-0. The teams have not met in team competition since 1983, when the Gophers won 9-0. Gustavus Adolphus had several players entered in the Minnesota Invitational in October.

**GOPHERS GET NINE SINGLES WINS IN VICTORIES** — Minnesota waited a long time for its first win of the season, but once Friday's match with Purdue began, it did not take the Gophers long to sew up their first victory. It was decided after singles play as Minnesota won five of six singles matches to clinch the win. Results from the first five singles spots were in when sophomore **ANNA EYRING** (SALT LAKE CITY, UT/OLYMPUS) won the deciding singles match. She defeated the Boilermakers' Dana Pearson 2-6, 6-3, 6-3 at No. 6. Junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) beat 59th-ranked Erica Adams 6-4, 6-3 at No. 1 singles. Against Iowa State Saturday, the Gophers won four of six singles matches enroute to a 6-3 win. **Moe**, senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS), and sophomore **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI) all won their second straight singles matches. **Moe** and **Cordova**, playing doubles together for the second time, got their first win, downing the Cyclones' Susanne Pollmann and Kim Dempsey 6-4, 6-3. **Moe** now has a season doubles mark of 19-13, just one victory short of her third straight 20-win doubles season. She is six victories shy of tying former Gopher Karin Eneberg (1984-88) for 10th place on the all-time doubles win list. **Moe's** next singles win will be the 60th of her career. She needs five more singles victories to tie for 14th on the all-time singles win list.

**MARYLEE LIBERA NAMED ASSISTANT COACH** — The women's athletic department has announced the hiring of **Marylee Libera** as the assistant coach to head women's tennis coach Martin Novak. Libera, currently a tennis teaching professional at Northwest Racquet, Swim and Health Clubs, is a native of Rochester, Minn. She graduated from Rochester Lourdes High School in 1982 and went on to play tennis for four years at the University of Houston, where she earned a degree in journalism. Libera worked in Dallas from 1986-90 in the Texas Instruments employee services department. She has been working at the Northwest clubs since October.

**IOWA TRIP OPENS BIG TEN SEASON** — The Minnesota softball team (21-19) makes its sixth consecutive road trip of the season when it travels to the state of Iowa this weekend. The Gophers play a non-conference doubleheader at Iowa State Thursday at 3 p.m. and then travel to Iowa City to play seventh-ranked Iowa in a pair of doubleheaders Friday at 3 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. The Gophers have won 10 of their past 14 games, including their second-place finish at the six-team Mizzou Invitational last weekend.

**BIG TEN OPENS LEAGUE PLAY** — The 1991 Big Ten season opened last weekend with Michigan splitting four games with Indiana. On the national level, Iowa is ranked seventh and Michigan 14th in the latest NCAA softball poll. Also, Minnesota and Ohio State are the only two teams in the Midwest Region that own two victories against the current NCAA top 10 (Minnesota defeated UNLV and California, Ohio State defeated Arizona and Cal State Long Beach). **ABOUT IOWA STATE** — The Cyclones (11-10) went 1-4 in the Lady Redbird Tournament, hosted by Illinois State over the weekend. Iowa State's lone victory was a 2-0 shutout over Northern Illinois. The Cyclones lost twice to Utah, 5-1 and 7-2, and twice to Illinois State, 7-6 and 2-0. Iowa State is hitting .249 as a team with sophomore **Jenny York** leading the way with a .327 average. Junior 1B **Julie Witt** is batting .308 and leads the team with 20 total hits. Senior catcher **Denise Harper** has a team-leading 12 RBI and is batting .297 with 19 hits on the year. Junior pitcher **Tracy Berg** leads the Cyclones on the mound with a 5-2 record while carrying a 1.51 ERA.

**SERIES VS. IOWA STATE --** Iowa State leads the all-time series 23-20, but the Gophers have won the last three games after losing eight straight. Minnesota took three of four games against Iowa State in 1990, winning the season series outright for the first time since 1983.

**ABOUT IOWA —** The seventh-ranked Hawkeyes were 5-2 last week, including a 4-1 mark in the Ball State Invitational. Iowa split a doubleheader at Western Illinois on Thursday, losing 6-4 and winning by the same score in the nightcap. The Hawkeyes opened play in the Ball State tourney with a loss to Big Ten foe Michigan State 4-3. Iowa followed the loss with four straight wins, defeating Indiana State 1-0, Ball State 1-0, Bradley 5-1 and Akron 3-2. Senior centerfielder **Amy Johnson** hit .421 last week and leads the Hawkeyes with a .377 batting average. Johnson is currently riding a seven-game hitting streak. Sophomore shortstop **Jenny Roe** leads Iowa with 16 RBI and 11 stolen bases while hitting .356. Roe hit .364 over the weekend and also has a seven-game hitting streak going. 1990 Big Ten Player of the Year **Terri McFarland** is 9-2 on the mound after suffering her first two losses over the weekend. Freshman pitcher **Karen Jackson** is 10-1.

**SERIES —** Minnesota leads the all-time series 25-17 and had its most successful Big Ten series last year against Iowa, winning three of four games in the Twin Cities. All three Minnesota wins were achieved in its final at-bat.

Minnesota opened the tournament Saturday morning with two victories over DePaul and Wisconsin-Green Bay. Junior right-hander **BRENDA BIXBY (ESTHERVILLE, IA)** picked up the win and the save in Minnesota's 4-2 victory over DePaul. The Gophers scored a 2-0 victory over winless Wisconsin-Green Bay, scoring both runs in the top of the seventh. Minnesota was looking for revenge Saturday night against Missouri after the 3-2 loss at the Metrodome. The Tigers won the rematch 3-0, with pitcher Karen Snelgrove winning her second game against Minnesota with a four-hitter. The Gophers lost to Drake 1-0 Sunday morning, giving up a run in the bottom of the seventh. Minnesota rallied and defeated Northern Iowa 5-1 in its tournament finale, giving the Gophers second place in the tournament to Missouri.

**STAT NOTES** — Minnesota's offense hit .256 in Missouri, maintaining its season batting average at .251. Sophomore **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) hit .467 and **STACEY FUNDERBURG** (LEBANON, OR) hit .462 to lead the Gopher offense. **Weiss** has her average for the season at .313, her highest mark of the season and a team-leading figure. **Funderburg** has improved her average 62 points over the last two road trips, improving her season average to .226. The only other Gopher besides **Weiss** over .300 is senior outfielder **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK), who had four hits this weekend to improve to .303.

Minnesota's pitching staff had a team ERA of 1.04 in Missouri, lowering its season ERA to 1.08. Junior **Brenda Bixby** went 1-1 with a 0.47 ERA on the trip. **Bixby** pitched 15 innings and allowed one run on seven hits and no walks while striking out 16. Sophomore **Sarah Maschka** won her team-leading eighth decision against Northern Iowa, pitching six innings for the victory. **Maschka** was 2-0 for the weekend with a 0.54 ERA and improved her season ERA to 1.18.

**MINNESOTA COMES HOME** — After 42 consecutive games away from the state of Minnesota, the Gophers will open their 1991 home season at the Bierman Softball Complex next weekend with a Big Ten series against Northwestern. Minnesota will host the Wildcats April 12 at 6 p.m. and April 13 at 1 p.m. in a pair of doubleheaders. The games mark the beginning of a 14-game homestand for Minnesota that stretches out over a 13-day period.

Freshman high jumper **CORALEA BROWN** (ARDROSSAN, ALBERTA) rounds out the squad.

**MINNESOTA HOSTS MINNESOTA OPEN** — The Minnesota women's track and field team will host its first-ever meet in the new Bierman Track and Field Stadium Wednesday when it hosts the Minnesota Open at 4 p.m. Athletes from Hamline, Moorhead State and St. Catherine's will join Minnesota in the meet. The Gophers will also send a squad to the Drake Invitational Saturday.

**TEXAS TALES** — Several Gophers had very impressive performances at the Texas Relays last Friday and Saturday in Austin. Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) extended her school outdoor shot put record to 53-2 1/4 with her second place finish. The mark is also better than her school indoor record of 52-10, making it her longest throw of her career. Lewis also won the discus with a throw of 169-8. Senior **DECIA AGNEW** (BETHEL PARK, PA) improved her season-best in the javelin with her third-place throw of 160-0. Junior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) cut 12 seconds off of her personal-best in the 1500 meters with her fourth-place time of 4:27.63. The mark places Rowe fourth on the all-time Minnesota list and is 4.63 seconds away from the NCAA provisional qualifying mark. The 4x800 meter relay team of Rowe, **SHELLY WALL** (WILSON, WI/SPRING VALLEY), **JENNY ALBY** (APPLETON, WI/EAST) and **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) ran the fifth-fastest time in school history with a time of 9:00.77.

**SNOWBALL REVIEW** — There were two first-place finishes of note for Minnesota at the Snowball Open in St. Paul last Saturday. **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) became the fifth Gopher in school history to leap 37 feet in the triple jump with her leap of 37-0. That was Owen's first leap of 37 feet in her career. Junior **CHRIS ABBOTT** (WINONA, MN) won her 3,000-meter race in a time of 10:00.9, the top time for Minnesota at that distance this season.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — The Gopher track team will be in two places April 20. The majority of the team will be at the Hamline Invitational in St. Paul, while a few members will be at the Mt. Sac Relays in Walnut, Calif.

**GOPHERS OPEN BIERMAN SEASON THIS WEEKEND**— The Minnesota softball team (25-21, 2-2 Big Ten) opens its 1991 home season at the Bierman Softball Complex with a four-game series against Northwestern (9-15, 1-3 Big Ten). The Gophers will host the Wildcats in a pair of doubleheaders - Friday at 6 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. The series starts a stretch of seven home doubleheaders in 13 days. Minnesota has had a winning record on each of its last four road trips and defeated seventh-ranked Iowa twice in a four-game series last weekend in Iowa City.

**BIG TEN UPDATE**— The 1991 Big Ten season got into full swing last weekend with three sets of weekend doubleheaders. In addition to Minnesota's four-game split at Iowa, Ohio State won three of four games at Northwestern and Indiana swept four games from Michigan State. **IOWA REVIEW** — The Gophers opened their six-game Iowa road trip last Thursday with a doubleheader sweep of Iowa State. In the opener the Gophers scored a season-high eight runs in the seventh inning and routed the Cyclones 15-4. It was the most runs Minnesota has scored in a game since March 25, 1985 when the Gophers defeated Wichita State 15-0. Minnesota followed that game with a 6-1 win in the nightcap. In the doubleheader, the Gophers outhit the Cyclones 24-8.

Minnesota traveled to Iowa City to open the Big Ten season against seventh-ranked Iowa. In the opener, Minnesota trailed 1-0 but scored four runs in the top of the sixth inning off of 1990 Big Ten Player of the Year Terri McFarland to defeat the Hawkeyes 4-1. Senior **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK) hit a three-run double to right-center to break a 1-1 tie and give **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) the victory. Bixby did not allow a hit after the first inning in pitching the complete-game three-hitter. In the nightcap, Iowa scored three runs in the first inning and freshman Karen Jackson pitched a four-hitter as the Hawkeyes cruised to a 4-0 win.

The two games Saturday were the closest of the weekend. In the first game, Iowa raced to a 3-0 lead after five innings and held on for a 3-2 victory. Minnesota had its opportunities in the opener, leaving 10 runners on base in the game, including runners at second and third base to end the game. The Gophers responded with a 12-hit attack in the nightcap against McFarland and Jackson and won a 5-3 decision in the final game. Minnesota scored two runs in the second inning and three runs in the third inning to gain a split in the series.

**STAT NOTES** — Minnesota hit .304 on its latest road trip to raise its season batting average to .258, 23 points higher than last year's team. Sophomore **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) had 10 hits in Iowa to raise her season batting average to .338. The mark is 33 points higher than her 1990 average. Senior **DIANE FIELD** (MORTON GROVE, IL/NILES WEST) had a .429 average in Iowa to raise her season average to .285. Field owns the longest current hitting streak for Minnesota at six games and leads the team with 15 walks. Weiss, Field and junior **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN) all had a team-leading five hits in the four-game series at Iowa. Blank leads the Gophers with 19 runs batted in, which was the Minnesota high for any Gopher during the entire 1990 season.

The Gopher pitching staff continues its quest to lower its team earned run average under the 1.00 mark. The team ERA is currently at 1.10 with three pitchers just over the 1.00 mark (see Lineup). Minnesota's pitching staff surrendered only one walk in the four-game series vs. Iowa, compared to nine for the Hawkeyes. The Gophers only gave up three Hawkeye extra-base hits, as opposed to nine for Minnesota's hitters.

**GOLF**

**LADY BUCKEYE FEATURES 18 TEAMS** — Minnesota will be one of 18 teams competing in the Lady Buckeye Spring Invitational at Columbus, Ohio on April 13-14. Thirty-six holes will be played Saturday with the final 18 holes on Sunday. Each team will field five players with the low four scores counting towards the team score. The invitational is on Ohio State's par 72, 6,000-yard Scarlet Golf Course, which will be the site of the 1991 NCAA Women's Golf Championships, May 22-25.

Seven of the nine Big Ten Conference teams will be in the tournament. They are Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio State, Purdue and Wisconsin. The other teams in the field are Bowling Green, Cincinnati, DePauw, Furman, Indianapolis, Illinois State, Kansas State, Northern Illinois, Tennessee Tech and Western Kentucky.

**TWO GOPHERS AUTOMATIC QUALIFIERS FOR LADY BUCKEYE** — Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) and sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) are automatic qualifiers for the Lady Buckeye. Minnesota's team policy states that if a student-athlete wins or scores 240 or less in the most previous competition, they will automatically qualify for the next tournament. In the Gophers last outing, the South Carolina Invitational, Ross carded a 230 and Evens a 237. The final three members of the traveling team will be named later this week by head golf coach Nancy Harris.

**GOPHERSTAKE WINNING STREAK SOUTH** — The Minnesota women's tennis team (4-12, 2-5) has won two in a row and four of its last five. This weekend the Gophers will be looking to continue their winning ways against Mississippi State and Auburn, with both matches at Auburn. Minnesota will play Mississippi State at 10 a.m. on Saturday and Auburn at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — Mississippi State (7-8 overall, 1-5 SEC) has won two of its last four after dropping its four previous matches. The Lady Bulldogs defeated Georgia Tech 5-4 on Sunday after losing 5-2 to Tennessee on Sunday. **Sabine Guibal** is 12-6 at No. 1 singles and **Michelle Oldham** is 14-5 at No. 2 singles. Guibal and **Alex Niepel** are 7-4 at No. 1 doubles. **SERIES** — Mississippi State won 5-4 in 1986 in the only previous meeting between the schools.

Auburn (8-11 overall, 1-6 SEC) lost 6-0 to No. 1-ranked Florida on Sunday. The doubles matches were rained out. At No. 1 singles, Florida's **Andrea Farley** defeated Auburn's **Tracy Bankston** 7-5, 6-3. At No. 2 singles, Florida's **Nicole Arendt**, the nation's top-ranked player, defeated the Tigers' **Missy Donald** 6-2, 6-1. **SERIES** — Minnesota leads 2-0. The Gophers won 6-3 last season at Auburn.

**MOE, NELSON LEAD GOPHERS TO TWO WEEKEND WINS** — Junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS) extended their personal winning streaks to five at No. 1 and No. 2 singles while helping Minnesota to a pair of wins. Moe is currently ranked 73rd in the Volvo Tennis/Collegiate Series Rankings. The Gophers beat Ohio State 7-2 on Friday and Gustavus Adolphus 8-1 on Sunday.

**Moe** defeated Ohio State's **Kelly Story** 6-0, 6-1 and Gustavus's **Amy McCrea** 6-0, 6-0. **Nelson** defeated the Buckeyes' **Abigail Villela** 6-1, 6-2 and the Gusties' **Heidi Rostberg** 6-1, 6-1. **Moe** leads the team with a 19-14 singles record. **Nelson** has the Gophers' next best singles mark (11-11). It was a successful weekend for Minnesota in singles play as the Gophers won all 12 of its singles matches. The team had won just 33 percent of its season singles matches going into the weekend.

**Moe** and sophomore **VICTORIA CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI) won both of their doubles matches at No. 1 doubles. **Moe** now has a season doubles record of 21-14, marking the third straight season she has won more than 20 doubles matches. With the two wins, she moved into 12th place on the all-time Gopher career doubles win list. She has 67 doubles wins and needs three more doubles wins to tie former Gopher **Karin Eneberg** (1984-88) for 10th place in career doubles wins.

**OLSSON WINS TWO MATCHES DESPITE SHOULDER INJURY** — Gopher junior **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN), out since March 10 with a shoulder injury that will require surgery, returned to action in limited capacity and won two matches at No. 6 singles. She defeated Ohio State's **Debbie Horton** 4-6, 6-0, 6-2 on Friday and Gustavus's **Linnea Carlson** 6-2, 6-1 on Sunday. **Olsson**, normally Minnesota's No. 2 singles player, was limited to ground strokes and underhand serving because of her injury, which has been diagnosed as subclavian vein thrombosis. For her specifically, a vein is impinged between a muscle and her first rib, causing a loss of circulation in her arm in certain instances, particularly when she raises it above her shoulders. She is scheduled to have surgery on Thursday and will definitely miss the remainder of the season. A full recovery is expected.

**EYRING INJURES KNEE, OUT FOR TWO WEEKS** — Gopher sophomore **ANNA EYRING** (SALT LAKE CITY, UT/OLYMPUS), who suffered a torn meniscus in her right knee during last week's match at Iowa, will undergo surgery this week. Minnesota head trainer **Leah Wollenburg** said the injury may have been an aggravation of an old injury. **Eyring** will miss this weekend's matches but may be able to return for Minnesota's final regular season matches April 20-21 at Michigan and Michigan State.

**ZOLKOWSKI CAPS SEASON AND CAREER WITH SCHOOL-RECORD VAULT** — The Gopher women's gymnastics season came to a finish sooner than hoped for Saturday at the NCAA Central Region championship in Auburn, Ala., but not before senior **CATHY ZOLKOWSKI** (NEENAH, WI/ARMSTRONG-NEENAH) came away with a school record. Zolkowski scored a 9.80 in the vault, tying for fifth in the meet and bettering the old school mark (9.775) she shared with sophomore **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY).

Zolkowski had scored a 9.60 with her first vault before nailing the record-setting 9.80 on her second trip down the runway. The vault she performs, a handpring front in tucked position, is worth a maximum of 9.90, so it had to be virtually flawless to earn the 9.80 score.

Zolkowski, the seventh seed among seven individual qualifiers, tied for 16th all-around with a 37.425 score. Her other scores were 9.50 in the floor exercise, 9.30 in the uneven bars and 8.825 in the balance beam. Freshman **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST), the second-seeded individual, scored 36.70 all-around. She had a 9.65 vault score, a 9.55 floor exercise score, a 9.00 uneven bars mark and an 8.50 balance beam score.

**GOPHERS FINISH 24TH IN FINAL REGULAR SEASON RANKINGS** — Minnesota finished 24th in the final National Association of College Gymnastics Coaches regular season rankings (March 7). The rankings were based on regional qualifying scores. The Gophers had a regional qualifying score of 187.62, missing the NCAA Central Region championship by .10. The top seven teams in each of the NCAA's five regions qualify. Minnesota finished eighth.

The Gophers were a victim of regional alignment as their score would have been good enough to qualify for regional championships in three of the five regions. Minnesota would have ranked second in the Northeast, fourth in the Southeast and sixth in the West. The only region besides the Central in which Minnesota would not have qualified is the Midwest, where the Gophers also would have ranked eighth.

This season is the first since 1984-85 that Minnesota will not have an individual competing at the NCAA championships. Although the team had no nationally recognized individual, the Gophers overcame several injuries to win their third Big Ten championship in four years March 22 at Illinois—with a meet and school-record 189.00 score.

"I will miss all the athletes and there are some that I will especially miss," said Outlaw.

**RIHM RESIGNS AS DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT AND FUND RAISING** — University of Minnesota Women's Athletic Director Chris Voelz announced today that Cynthia Rihm has resigned effective April 19 as director of development and fund raising. Rihm joined the department in March of 1990. She will become a tournament official for the FUTURES Golf Tour, which is the largest privately owned and operated women's professional golf tour in the world. It serves as the leading training ground for the LPGA Tour.

"Although Cynthia has been with us only a relatively short time, her contributions have been many," said Voelz. "Her strong work ethic and shared mission of the department never went unnoticed. Her untiring efforts in development and fund raising are truly appreciated and her access into another potential constituency, the golf world, was truly a benefit. We regret that her new job opportunity - working in the field of golf, something that she has always dreamed of - came along while she was part of our team."

Rihm will begin her appointment with the FUTURES Tour April 30 in Salisbury, N.C. for the 10th Annual Salisbury Futures Classic.

Freshman catcher **Theresa Mackey** leads Mankato State in hitting after a .367 outing over the weekend. Sophomore **Beth Herickhoff** leads the Mavericks on the mound with a 7-11 record and has pitched in all but three games for MSU. Mankato State will play host to St. Cloud State Tuesday before traveling to Minnesota.

**THE SERIES —** Minnesota leads 11-4. The two teams split last season at Bierman with the Mavericks taking the first game 2-0 and Minnesota coming back for a 3-1 win in the second game.

**ABOUT OHIO STATE —** The Buckeyes (13-18, 7-2 Big Ten) are riding atop the Big Ten Conference after defeating Michigan State in three out of four games over the weekend. Ohio State scored 8-0 and 3-1 wins Friday, while the teams split Saturday with the Spartans winning the first game 1-0 and the Buckeyes coming back to take the second, 3-1. Ohio State shared the Big Ten title with Iowa last season and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the first time.

**THE PLAYERS --** Senior 3B **Shauna Bowman** is batting .336 to lead Ohio State. She has 36 hits and carries a slugging percentage of .364. Freshman pitcher **Krion Lapihuska** is hitting .284 and leads the Buckeyes with five doubles. Freshman shortstop **Jenny Fredrickson** has 13 RBI to her credit. **Lapihuska** is 3-0 on the mound for OSU after picking up two wins over the weekend. She carries a team-low 0.31 ERA. Sophomore pitchers **Belinda Cernava** and **Stacy Dickins** are both 4-5 in the circle with Cernava carrying a 1.27 ERA while Dickins' ERA is at 1.97. Cernava leads the staff with 26 strikeouts.

**THE SERIES —** Minnesota leads 25-8 and has already defeated the Buckeyes once this season. The two teams met at the Arizona Softball Classic Feb. 15 with Minnesota gaining a 6-0 shutout. Gopher Sarah Maschka pitched a three-hitter and Kari Blank keyed the offense with a three-run double. In last season's meeting, Minnesota won three of four games in Columbus, Ohio.

**ABOUT CREIGHTON —** The Lady Jays (23-15) will play three doubleheaders before traveling to Minnesota. They will host Kansas, Southern Utah and Utah this week. Creighton is led by senior pitcher **Kelly Brookhart**, who leads the Lady Jays on the mound and at the plate. Brookhart is 9-8 with a 1.06 ERA and is batting .365 with a team-leading 22 RBI.

**THE SERIES —** Creighton leads 10-5. The teams split last season in Omaha, Neb. with Minnesota winning the first game 2-1 in 10 innings and the Lady Jays taking the nightcap 4-1.

**NORTHWESTERN REVIEW** — Minnesota swept its first four-game series of the 1991 season last weekend, winning all four games over the Northwestern Wildcats. The Gophers scored early and often in Saturday's two games, winning the opener 6-0 and taking the nightcap 7-0. Sophomore catcher **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) went 5-for-5 in the doubleheader, scoring three runs and driving in one. Junior pitcher **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) pitched her third shutout of the year in the first game, giving up only three hits while striking out seven. Bixby now has 204 strikeouts, tops on the Gopher charts. In the second game, junior **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) won her ninth game of the year, pitching six scoreless innings and striking out a season-high nine batters.

Sunday, Minnesota's offense was not as potent, but the Gophers still won both games by scores of 1-0 and 4-2. In the opener, **Bixby** and **Bumpus** combined on a four-hitter and junior **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN/TARTAN) drove in the game's only run. **Blank** was also an important part of the second game, when she broke a 1-1 fifth-inning tie with a two-run single. **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) won her ninth game of the season, with **Bumpus** saving her second game of the day with two innings of hitless relief. Dating back to last season, Minnesota has won nine of its past 10 games at the Bierman Softball Complex, seven of which have come in Big Ten play.

**STAT NOTES** — Minnesota's team and individual statistics have improved gradually during this five-game winning streak. The Gophers' team batting average is .262, while their Big Ten average is .278. Sophomore **LEZLIE WEISS** (FORESTLAKE, MN) garnered her 50th hit of the season Sunday and is now batting a team-leading .342 for the season, .385 in Big Ten play. Minnesota's leading hitter in conference play is **Kari Blank**, who is hitting .417 with six runs batted in. Junior outfielder **SANDY SCOTT** (EUGENE, OR/CHURCHILL) also has six Big Ten runs batted in, half of which came on a three-run double Saturday against Northwestern. Catcher **Lisa Sojka** was 6-for-9 in the Northwestern series, jumping her season average from .164 to .220.

The Gopher pitching staff yielded only one earned run in the Northwestern series for a weekend ERA of 0.25. **Robin Bumpus** and **Brenda Bixby** both lowered their season ERA's under the 1.00 mark during the weekend. **Bumpus** pitched nine scoreless innings to drop her ERA to 0.92, while **Bixby** pitched 13 scoreless innings to lower her ERA to 0.95. Minnesota's team ERA for the season is 1.03, its lowest mark of the season. The Gophers' 0.91 Big Ten ERA is over a half point lower than last year's mark (1.45), and the staff is yielding only one walk every two games.

**BIXBY IS ALL-TIME WINNER** -- **Brenda Bixby** became the Gophers' all-time winningest pitcher Saturday with her 6-0 shutout of Northwestern. The win marked her 39th career win, which moved her past **Barb Drake** (1984-87) and **Mary Lee Hanson** (1981-84) on the all-time win list. With another win Sunday, **Bixby** now has 40 career wins.

**SOUTH ALABAMA NEXT STOP FOR GOLFERS**— Minnesota will be one of 18 teams in the South Alabama Intercollegiate Championship tournament April 19-21 at the Lakeview Golf Club in Foley, Ala. The 5,901-yard course has a par 72 rating. Besides the Gophers and Jaguars, teams competing include Alabama, Alabama-Birmingham, Central Florida, Indiana, Iowa, Lamar, Louisiana State, Memphis State, Michigan State, Mississippi, Mississippi State, North Texas, Rollins, Vanderbilt, Western Kentucky and Wichita State.

**MINNESOTA THIRD AT COLUMBUS**— The Gophers finished in third place at the 16-team Lady Buckeye Spring Invitational with rounds of 326 and 321 for a total of 647 strokes. The tournament was scheduled for 54-holes but was cut to two rounds due to rain. Furman won with 632 strokes and Ohio State was second with 638 strokes.

**EVENS SECOND, ERDMANN FOURTH** — Sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) finished second at the Lady Buckeye after carding rounds of 79 and 75 strokes for a 154-stroke total. Evens jumped to second from 13th place after the first round. Freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN) had her best collegiate finish and scores at Ohio State after finishing in fourth place with rounds of 79 and 77 for a 156-stroke total. Erdmann's second round 77 and 36-hole total of 156 are her lowest Minnesota scores.

Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) was 24th with rounds of 84 and 82 for 166 strokes and senior **TRACI JOHNSON** (MARSHALL, MN) was 56th after carding scores of 92 and 85 for 177. Sophomore **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) started the tournament and carded a first-round score of 86 strokes, but had to withdraw from play due to an injury suffered on Friday. Leighton broke the ring finger on her right hand after getting it caught in the door of the team's van.

Sac meet is one of the premier track meets in the country and will feature many top athletes from around the nation.

**BIERMAN PREMIERE** — The Gophers hosted their first-ever meet in the Bierman Track and Field Stadium last Wednesday when they hosted Hamline, Moorhead State and St. Catherine in the Minnesota Open. Minnesota won eight of the 11 events, including a double win by **KARI MOWER** (CHIPPEWA FALLS, WI). She won the long jump (16-0 1/4) and the 400-meter hurdles (1:06.00). The Gophers will next be at home May 4 when they host the Minnesota Invitational.

**DRAKE REVIEW** — Minnesota won four events last Saturday at the 17th annual Jim Duncan Invitational in Des Moines Iowa. Junior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) led a 1-2-3 Minnesota finish in the 3000 meters with a time of 9:51.7, the best this season in the Big Ten. Rowe owns Minnesota's best times this season in three events (1500, 3000, 5000). Sophomore **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) won the long jump with a leap of 17-11 and now owns Minnesota's best marks in both horizontal jumps. Sophomore **STACY KLOS** (LaCROSSE, WI/WEST SALEM) won the triple jump with a mark of 34-5 1/2 and sophomore **SHARON GEISLER** (UNION CITY, PA) won the javelin with a throw of 133-9.

**BACK TO DES MOINES** — The Gophers will take a full contingent to the Drake Relays April 26-27. It will be Minnesota's second meet in three weekends at the Drake Track Stadium.

## TENNIS

**GOPHERS CLOSE REGULAR SEASON AT MICHIGAN, MICHIGAN STATE** — The Gopher women's tennis team wraps up its regular season with two road matches this weekend. Minnesota will play Michigan at 11 a.m. Saturday in Ann Arbor, Mich. and will take on Michigan State at 11 a.m. Sunday in East Lansing, Mich. Following the matches, the Gophers (4-14 overall, 2-5 Big Ten) will have a better idea of where they will be seeded for the Big Ten championship tournament in Madison, Wis. (April 26-28). Teams are seeded one through 10 going in with the top two teams getting byes. The bottom eight seeds will each play three matches in the tournament to determine final Big Ten standing.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — Michigan (11-6 overall, 3-3 Big Ten) split two matches over the weekend, beating Ohio State 7-2 on Sunday after losing 7-2 to Indiana on Saturday. The Wolverines have won four out of their last five and five out of their last seven. They are 7-0 at home this season. Michigan's best player is junior **Christine Schmeidel**. Ranked 78th in the country, she has a 4-7 record at No. 1 singles this spring. **Amy Malik** has a 9-3 record at No. 5 singles and **Jennifer Lev** is 10-5 at No. 6 singles. **HOME SWEET HOME** — When the Minnesota softball team came back from Iowa April 6, the Gophers were looking forward to 14 games at home and the opportunity to improve their standing in the Big Ten race. After the first ten games, Minnesota has exceeded all of its expectations and put together one of the better streaks in school history. In those ten games, the Gophers are 10-0 with eight of those wins coming by shutout. Minnesota has extended its current winning streak to 11 games, tying the school record set in 1983. The Gophers have won 12 straight at the Bierman Softball Complex, 10 by shutout. The home-field streak is a new record, breaking the mark of 11 set in 1976 and 1983.

Last Wednesday, Minnesota defeated Mankato State 2-0 and 5-0. Minnesota did not score until the bottom of the sixth inning, when **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN/TARTAN) and **DIANE FIELD** (MORTON GROVE, IL/NILES WEST) each had run-scoring singles to break the scoreless deadlock. The Gophers did not waste as much time in the nightcap, as they scored three first-inning runs to put the game away early. **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) tossed a three-hitter in the opener, while **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) and **ANGIE GEBHARD** (COLLINSVILLE, IL) combined on a five-hitter in the nightcap.

The Gophers opened the Ohio State series Friday night with two one-hitters. **Bixby** threw the first one, walking one and striking out eight in the 2-0 Minnesota win. **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) did not allow a hit until the seventh inning and pitched her first shutout of the season in a 5-0 Gopher triumph. **Bixby** came back Saturday and pitched a five-hitter in Minnesota's 3-0 win. The shutout was **Bixby's** third in a row, two short of Vicki Swanson's (1977-78) school record. Minnesota fell behind 2-1 in the final game, but **Field's** two-out, two-run single in the bottom of the fifth gave Minnesota a 3-2 victory.

**STAT NOTES** — The Minnesota team batting average continues to move up the charts. The team average is now .263, .277 in Big Ten play. **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) continues to lead the Gophers with a .335 mark and also has a team-leading 10 doubles. **Diane Field** went 5-for-10 in the Ohio State series to increase her season average to .309. Her .394 Big Ten batting average leads all Minnesota players. **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK) went 4-for-11 against the Buckeyes to bump her season average up to .303. **Kari Blank** continues to lead the Gophers with 28 runs batted in and seven Big Ten RBI. The 28 RBI are most by any Gopher since 1981.

In the 10-game homestand, Minnesota's pitchers have given up one earned run for a microscopic 0.10 ERA. **Brenda Bixby's** five consecutive scoreless outings have lowered her season ERA to 0.83 and she is now 5-1 in Big Ten play with a 0.33 ERA. **Robin Bumpus** has also lowered her ERA to 0.83 and has saved three of Minnesota's Big Ten victories.

**GOPHERS SEEDED EIGHTH IN BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS** — The Minnesota women's tennis team (4-16 overall, 2-7 Big Ten) is the No. 8 seed in the Big Ten championships this weekend in Madison, Wis. The Gophers will play No. 9 Ohio State (1-8 Big Ten) Friday at 8 a.m. The winner will play Friday at 2 p.m. against No. 1 seed Wisconsin, which has a first round bye. The loser of the Minnesota-Ohio State match will play the loser of the Northwestern (3)-Illinois (6) opening round match in the back draw. If the Gophers beat Ohio State, they could assure themselves of an upper division conference finish with an upset of Wisconsin. A win over the Buckeyes would guarantee the Gophers of no lower than an eighth-place finish.

**IN PREVIOUS CHAMPIONSHIPS** — Minnesota finished sixth in last year's championships. The Gophers lost 5-1 in the opening round to Wisconsin and then defeated Michigan State 6-0 and Purdue 6-0 before losing to Michigan 5-1 in the fifth-place match. Minnesota finished fourth in 1988-89, ninth in 1987-88 and fourth for four straight years, from 1983-84 to 1986-87. The best finish Minnesota has ever had is third, in 1975-76 and 1977-78.

**OHIO STATE NOTES** — The Buckeyes are 11-12 overall and 1-8 in the Big Ten. Junior Kelly Story, who plays No. 1 singles, is 17-16 overall and 2-7 in the Big Ten. Ohio State's No. 2 singles player, sophomore Abigail Villena, is 19-16 overall and 4-5 in the Big Ten. Story and Villena team up at No. 1 doubles and the duo has a 28-13 overall mark and 4-5 record in the Big Ten. **SERIES** — Minnesota leads 9-4. The Gophers won 7-2 on April 5 at the 98th Street Racquet Club. In that match, the Gophers swept all six singles matches and won one of two doubles contests.

**REGULAR SEASON ENDS WITH TWO LOSSES** — Minnesota dropped its two weekend matches, losing 8-1 to Michigan on Saturday in Ann Arbor, Mich. and 7-2 to Michigan State on Sunday in East Lansing, Mich. The Gophers finished the regular season 4-16 overall and 2-7 in the Big Ten. It is only the third losing season Minnesota has had since 1974-75. Even if the Gophers were to win all three of their matches at the Big Ten championships, the team would still finish with its worst-ever record. The only other losing seasons Minnesota has had were in 1986-87 (13-15 record) and last season (11-13 record).

**MOE STILL ROLLING** — Junior JENNIE MOE (EDINA, MN) extended her winning streak to nine by beating both of her singles opponents at No. 1 singles over the weekend. She beat Michigan's Christine Schmeidel 6-2, 6-0 on Saturday and then downed Michigan State's Alex Hilbert 6-0, 6-0 on Sunday. Moe, who at one time had a 14-14 singles record, upped her mark to 23-14 overall and 7-2 in the Big Ten with the two wins. Twelve of her 14 losses have come to players currently ranked in the top 100 of the Volvo Tennis/Collegiate Rankings. Three of those 14 losses were in three sets.

The two injured Gophers who did not make the trip were junior **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN), who recently had shoulder surgery, and sophomore **ANNA EYRING** (SALT LAKE CITY, UT/OLYMPUS), who recently had knee surgery. Eyring is still questionable for this weekend.

## SCHOLAR-ATHLETES TO BE HONORED AT AWARDS DINNER --

The University of Minnesota women's and men's athletic departments will honor 164 student-athletes tonight in the second annual Scholar-Athlete Awards Reception, to be held at the Minneapolis Institute of Arts in Minneapolis.

To receive this honor, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 and be a member of a University of Minnesota athletic team. The number of recipients has increased by 21 percent from last year's inaugural reception, when 136 student-athletes were honored.

**Abbott**, a member of the track and cross country teams, an honors physiology major completing pre-med requirements in the College of Liberal Arts, has a cumulative grade point average of 3.75. She has been a member of Minnesota's top seven runners in cross country her last three years.

**Newman**, who competed for four years on the gymnastics team, is a management major (marketing emphasis) with a French minor. She has a 3.81 grade point average and is a second-year Top Five Award recipient. A vault, bars, and beam specialist during her Gopher career, **Newman** was one of the team's most consistent uneven bars performers. A co-captain as a senior, she competed for two Big Ten championship teams--in 1988 and 1989.

**Thompson**, a volleyball player majoring in rhetoric and sports management in University College, has a grade point average of 3.77. ## **TRACK & FIELD**

**MINNESOTA HOSTS MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL** — The Minnesota women's track and field team hosts its biggest meet of the year at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium Saturday at 11 a.m. The Minnesota Invitational will feature Drake, Iowa State, Marquette, Oregon and Wisconsin and will be team scored.

**OPPONENT NOTES** — The sight of Drake will not be a new one for Minnesota as the Bulldogs were also at the indoor version of the Minnesota Invitational. The Gophers have also been to Des Moines twice already this season. Coach **Bob Ehrhart** is in his 22nd season and his team features two Minnesotans in junior sprinter **Jaylene Gerenz** (Eagan) and sophomore runner **Julie Schweigert** (Plymouth). **Iowa State** was also at the indoor Minnesota Invitational and the Drake Relays. The Cyclones currently have one national qualifier in **Edith Nakiyingi**, who has qualified to defend her NCAA 800-meter title with her seasonal best of 2:04.86. The Gophers will see **Marquette** for the first time this season. Coach **Bill Wegehaupt** is in his eighth season at Marquette and his top athletes include distance runner **Erica Larson**, hurdler **Chris Spindler** and horizontal jumper **Peppur Chambers**. **Oregon** is coming out of the Pacific time zone for the only time this season to participate in this meet. The Ducks will host the NCAA meet next month and have a good chance of placing among the top 10 teams in the country. The athletes to watch are sprinter **Rosie Williams**, distance runners **Lucy Nusrala** and **Stephanie Wessell**, shot put/discus thrower **Julie Beck** and javelin throwers **Paula Berry** and **Kim Hyatt**. Berry and Hyatt are qualified for the NCAA meet in the javelin. Coach Peter Tegen is in his 17th year at Wisconsin and has a distance-oriented team. **Jenny Kreager** has qualified for the NCAA meet in the 10,000 meters. **Sue Gentes** finished second in last year's Big Ten meet at 800 meters and **Lisa Payne** is a sprinter and long jumper who won the 1991 Big Ten Indoor Track Athlete of the Year award.

**DRAKE IN REVIEW** — At the Drake Relays, **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) easily won the shot put with a mark of 50-2, more than a foot better than her competition. She also took second in the discus with a throw of 171-9. Senior **DECIA AGNEW** (BETHEL PARK, PA) had a very busy weekend. Friday, she took second in the javelin with a throw of 155-7. Sunday, at the United States Weightlifting Championships in Blaine, Agnew won the 75-kilogram national championship. Agnew will be back throwing the javelin this weekend. The 4x800-meter relay team, consisting of **JENNY ALBY** (APPLETON, WI/EAST), **SHELLY WALL** (WILSON, WI/SPRING VALLEY), **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX CITY, SD/O'GORMAN) and **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) finished sixth in a time of 8:58.93.

## GOLF

**GOLFERS TRAVEL TO WISCONSIN FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP** – The Cherokee Country Club in Madison, Wis. is the site of the 10th annual Big Ten Women's Golf Championship, May 3-5. The 72-hole tournament, hosted by Wisconsin, features 36 holes of play on Friday, with 18 holes being played on Saturday and Sunday. The golf course is par 72 and 5,873 yards long.

**GOPHERS AIMING FOR NO. 1** – The Cherokee Country Club was the site of the Lady Northern Invitational last September, where the Gophers topped the field of 15 teams with 932 strokes over 54 holes. In six of the last eight years, the Lady Northern champion has won the conference title the following spring. The Lady Northern and conference championship are always played on the same course. Indiana finished second at the 1990 Lady Northern, nine strokes back with 941 strokes and Iowa was third with 946 strokes.

“Our goal is to win the Big Ten title or be among the top two teams,” says head golf coach Nancy Harris. Defeating 1990 Big Ten champion Indiana at the Lady Northern Invitational in the fall is only part of what fuels Minnesota's goal. Minnesota also defeated Indiana at the Ohio State Invitational (Minnesota - 3rd, Indiana - 4th) and at the South Carolina Invitational (Minnesota - 7th, Indiana - 9th) this spring.

Indiana is first in the conference standings with a team average of 321.3 strokes per round and Minnesota is second with 318.8 strokes. The Gophers have two players ranked in the top ten and Indiana has five. In 1990, the Gophers were third at the conference championship after winning it in 1989.

**MINNESOTA LINEUP** - Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN), who has a 78.32 season average and is ranked fifth in the conference, will play in the number one slot for the Gophers. Playing number two is third-ranked sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) who has a 78.07 season stroke average. Ross and Evens are the only Gophers to have played in all 11 tournaments that Minnesota has competed in this year.

Ranked 16th in the conference is sophomore **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN), who is playing in the third slot and has an 81.46 average. Leighton is making her first competition appearance since breaking her finger in van door at the Lady Buckeye Invitational in mid-April. Freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN) is playing at the number four position and is carrying an 84.40 season stroke average. At the number five slot with an 83.95 stroke average is junior **KRISTA REUTERFELDT** (COON RAPIDS, MN). Freshman **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN) is playing number six and has an 85.63 season stroke average.

**MINNESOTA TAKES BIG TEN LEAD** — Early last week, Minnesota found out that it is not easy being ranked among the nation's elite. Monday, the Gophers extended their school-record winning streaks to 12 overall games and 13 games at the Bierman Softball Complex with a 5-2 victory over non-conference foe Creighton. Both streaks came to a halt in the nightcap as the Lady Jays shut out the Gophers 1-0. The Gopher offense came back to life Wednesday in the opener against Iowa State, pounding out 13 hits in an 11-1 win. Iowa State prevented a four-game season series sweep, edging the Gophers 4-3 in the nightcap.

The Gophers had nine straight Big Ten victories when they traveled to Michigan State over the weekend, and they left with 13 straight victories in conference play and a two-game lead. Michigan State scored the first run of the series Friday, but **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN/TARTAN) and **DIANE FIELD** hit run-scoring doubles to give Minnesota a 2-1 win. **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) and **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) combined on a five-hitter in the nightcap and **Blank** added a two-run triple as the Gophers won 2-0.

The strong Minnesota pitching continued Saturday as **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) threw her seventh shutout of the year in Minnesota's 2-0 opening-game victory. The Gopher offense responded in the final game with a 12-hit outburst and a 10-0, five-inning victory. **Blank** went 4-for-4 in the series finale with three runs batted in, giving her an 8-for-13 (.615) weekend with seven RBI's. **Field** went 3-for-3 in the final game with three runs batted in, giving her a 5-for-10 (.500) weekend with four RBI's. **Bumpus** retired 15 of the 16 batters she faced in the last game, giving up an infield single in the fourth inning.

**STAT NOTES** — The Gophers now have three people who are hitting over .330 for the season. **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) continues to lead the team at .337, but **Diane Field** (.333) and **Kari Blank** (.330). are close behind. **Blank** now owns Minnesota's single-season hit record with 69, and leads the team with 27 runs scored and 37 runs batted in. **Field** had a 13-game hitting streak snapped in the opener Saturday against Michigan State, but she has hits in 14 of Minnesota's 16 Big Ten games. **SANDY SCOTT** (EUGENE, OR/CHURCHILL) increased her average to .280 over the weekend with a 4-for-9 performance. **Scott** leads the team with 12 doubles and is second to **Blank** with 26 runs scored. The Gophers have four players with 20 or more runs scored and four players with 20 or more runs batted in.

The Minnesota pitching staff gave up only one run in the four games against Michigan State, lowering the team ERA to 0.89. The Gophers were 16th in the nation last week with the previous ERA of 0.92. **Robin Bumpus** pitched 10 scoreless innings in the Michigan State series to improve her record to 12-8 and lower her ERA to 0.67. **Brenda Bixby** has won her last nine decisions and has a record of 18-8 with a 0.87 ERA. **Bixby** continues to have an excellent walk/innings pitched ratio, as she is allowing one walk per 11.3 innings pitched.

**MOE AWAITS WORD ON POSSIBLE NCAA BID** — The season is over for the Minnesota women's tennis team but junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) may have her season extended. She is a candidate for an individual bid to the NCAA championships. Head coach Martin Novak hopes to know this week whether or not **Moe** will qualify.

**Moe** finished the season with a team-leading singles mark of 25-15, with 13 of those losses coming to players ranked among the nation's top 100 in the Volvo Tennis/Collegiate rankings. Four of her wins were against top 100 opponents. **Moe**, currently ranked 74th, was one of seven unanimous selections to the 12-member all-Big Ten team. It was the second straight year she has won 25 matches. Last year she had a 25-13 singles mark after going 18-17 as a freshman.

**GOPHERS FINISH TENTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS** — Minnesota went into the Big Ten Women's Tennis Championships as the No. 8 seed but came out in last place this past weekend in Madison, Wis. It was only the Gophers' second tenth-place finish in 16 years. The team also finished 10th in 1982-83.

Minnesota lost 5-2 to Ohio State on Friday and then lost 5-0 to Illinois on Saturday and 5-2 to Iowa on Sunday. The Gophers finished 4-19 overall and 2-10 in the Big Ten. It was the team's worst-ever record and only the third losing season in school history.

**NELSON CLOSSES GOPHER CAREER WITH TWO WINS AT CHAMPIONSHIPS** — The only Gopher besides **Moe** to win a match at the Big Ten championships was senior **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS), who was 2-1 at No. 2 singles. She defeated Ohio State's Abigail Villena 4-6, 6-4, 6-4 on Friday and Iowa's Tracey Peyton 6-1, 6-3 on Sunday after losing 2-6, 0-6 to Illinois' Kristin Willey on Saturday. **Nelson** finished the season with a 14-15 singles mark and was 62-57 (.521) in her career.

**Moe** extended her winning streak to 10 by defeating Ohio State's Kelly Story 6-0, 6-3 on Friday but had it snapped in a 1-6, 2-6 loss to Illinois' Lindsey Nimmo on Saturday. She closed the regular season with a 6-0, 6-2 win over Iowa's Lori Hash on Sunday.

Action begins with a doubleheader Friday at 6 p.m. and two games Saturday at 1 p.m. The 19th-ranked Gophers need two wins in the series to clinch the 1991 Big Ten championship. Minnesota has won 17 straight Big Ten games and 25 of its last 29 games overall.

**WIN A DIAMOND** -- Friday night is "Win a Diamond at the Diamond Night," presented by Tivoli Jewelers. Fans present will have an opportunity to win a diamond through "Lucky Numbers" on their scorecards. Saturday is a WCCO-Radio Hometown Day featuring **Kelly and Kerby Norman** and the town of **Crystal**.

**IT TAKES TWO TO CLINCH** — Minnesota needs a combination of two wins over Michigan and/or Iowa losses against Michigan State to clinch the Big Ten title and the automatic NCAA tournament berth. **ABOUT MICHIGAN --** With a four-game sweep of Ohio State over the weekend, Michigan (32-17, 11-7 Big Ten) moved past the Buckeyes into the third-place spot in the Big Ten standings. The Wolverines are on a five-game winning streak, which includes an 11-1 victory over Detroit last Wednesday. Michigan defeated Ohio State by scores of 2-1, 3-1, 3-1 and 2-0.

Sophomore outfielder **Patti Benedict** leads the Wolverines offensively with a .340 batting average while collecting a team-high 52 hits on the season. She has also scored 17 runs and leads Michigan with 21 RBI. Benedict is hitting .411 in Big Ten games with 23 league hits to her credit. Senior catcher and co-captain **Julie Cooper** suffered an injury to her left knee April 19 at Northwestern, but may return to bat in the Michigan order this weekend. Cooper, batting .307 at the time of the injury, was batting second for the Wolverines and had collected 35 hits on the year. Sophomore **Karla Kunnen** has filled in for Cooper behind the plate and ranks second on the team in RBI with 16. She also has recorded the team's only home run this season. Senior **Andrea Nelson** leads Michigan on the mound with a 14-5 record, 7-3 in Big Ten play. Nelson's league ERA is at 0.71 after picking up two of the Wolverine victories over the weekend. Freshman **Julie Clarkson** also recorded two of the Michigan wins and is 10-6 overall and 4-2 in conference play with a 1.03 ERA.

**THE SERIES --** The series is all tied up at 16-16. The two teams split last season in Ann Arbor with Minnesota sweeping Friday's games by scores of 4-3 in eight innings and 2-1 in 11 innings. The Wolverines defeated the Gophers 10-1 and 4-0 in Saturday's doubleheader.

**MINNESOTA SWEEPS INDIANA** — Any way you look at it, Minnesota has played some very good softball over the last five weeks. The streaks are now eight consecutive wins, 17 straight Big Ten victories and 25 out of the last 29 games. The Gophers continued their stellar play last weekend with a four-game sweep at Indiana. In Friday's opener, **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK) drove in two runs with a double and a triple and **BRENDA BIXBY** (ESTHERVILLE, IA) scattered seven hits over seven innings to give Minnesota a 2-1 win. In the nightcap, **STACEY FUNDERBURG** (LEBANON, OR) drove in three runs in Minnesota's 6-3 triumph. In Saturday's opener, the Gophers scored early and often to post an 11-1 victory. Minnesota pounded out 13 hits to support **Bixby**, who picked up her 20th win of the season. **Bixby** becomes the only pitcher in Minnesota history to win 20 games twice. In the nightcap, **KARI BLANK** (OAKDALE, MN/TARTAN) and **DIANE FIELD** (MORTON GROVE, IL/NILES WEST) had run-scoring triples to lead Minnesota to the 5-2 victory. **Blank** had three runs batted in for the game to boost her season total to 42, tying the Minnesota single-season record set by **Shelly Medernach** in 1978.

**STAT NOTES** — Minnesota had 39 hits in the four-game series against Indiana to raise its season batting average to .272. **Kari Blank** (.336), **LEZLIE WEISS** (FORESTLAKE, MN) (.333) and **Diane Field** (.320) are over the .300 mark while **KELLY NORMAN** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG) (.299), **Tabbatha Woody** (.298) and **SANDY SCOTT** (EUGENE, OR/CHURCHILL) (.297) are close to that mark. **Scott** was Minnesota's leading hitter in Indiana, going 7-for-14 (.500). In Big Ten play, Minnesota is hitting .287 and averaging 4.1 runs per game. Last year, Minnesota hit .217 and scored 1.6 runs per game against conference opponents. The Gophers continue to rank in the top 20 nationally with their 0.90 earned run average. **Brenda Bixby** and **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) own identical 0.83 earned run averages, while **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) lowered her ERA to 1.04 last weekend with six scoreless innings. **Maschka** saved two games at Indiana to bring her season total to five, tying her with **Bixby** and two others for the national lead in that category.

**THE COACH** — Minnesota's **Teresa Wilson** (Missouri '84) won her 200th game as a collegiate coach in Friday's second game against Indiana. In her six-year coaching career, **Wilson** is 202-159 (.560). In her two years at Minnesota, **Wilson** is 76-55 (.580), 30-14 (.682) in Big Ten play. **Wilson** has won 23 of her last 26 Big Ten games.

**TRACK AND FIELD**

**MINNESOTA HOSTS MINNESOTA OPEN/LAST CHANCE** — The Minnesota women's track and field team hosts the Minnesota Open/Last Chance meet Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. Teams from Iowa, UW-Milwaukee and UW-River Falls are expected to compete.

**MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL REVIEW** — Minnesota finished a strong second in last Saturday's Minnesota Invitational, scoring 165.5 points. Oregon won the meet with 215.5 points. It marked the first time in school history that Minnesota had defeated Wisconsin (117) in a team-scored meet. Senior **RACHEL LEWIS** (SIOUX CITY, IA/NORTH) won the shot put with a throw of 49-3 1/2 and was also the top collegiate finisher in the discus, finishing second overall with a throw of 172-7. Senior co-captain **DECIA AGNEW** (BETHEL PARK, PA) finished third in the javelin with a personal-best throw of 165-6. That is an NCAA provisional-qualifying throw, but she remains seven feet short of the NCAA automatic qualifying standard.

Minnesota's distance corps put up some impressive times in the meet. Sophomore **MONIKA BALINT** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY) finished third in the 800 meters in 2:10.73, the third-fastest outdoor time in school history. In the 1500 meters, junior **JENNY ALBY** (APPLETON, WI/EAST) ran a personal-best time of 4:35.83 to finish fifth. Junior **CHRIS ABBOTT** (WINONA, MN) finished third in the 5000 meters in a time 17:10.16, a personal best by 13 seconds.

Minnesota's 4 x 100 meter relay team of **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE), **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC), **ANGIE MAULDIN** (COLOMBO, WI/COLUMBUS) and **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN) ran a season-best time of 48.12 to finish second. **Owen** finished fifth in the long jump with a season-best outdoor mark of 18-0 1/4.

## GOLF

**GOLFER'S FIFTH AT THE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP** -- The golf team finished fifth at the Big Ten championship over the weekend at the Cherokee Country Club in Madison, Wis. Minnesota carded rounds of 325, 313, 313, 321 for a total of 1,272 strokes. It was the Gophers' lowest placing at the conference meet since 1985 when they were sixth. Iowa won their first-ever women's golf title after carding scores of 307, 299, 306 and 326 on Sunday for 1,238 strokes. Indiana was second with rounds of 310, 312, 307 and 318 for 1247 strokes. Wisconsin was third after carding scores of 317, 312, 316 and 314 for 1259 strokes.

**ROSS HAS PERSONAL BEST** -- Senior **KELLI ROSS** (BURNSVILLE, MN) had a personal-best low 72-hole score by three strokes after carding rounds of 81, 74, 78 and 80 for 313 strokes. Ross' mark tied for ninth place in the field of 54 golfers.

Sophomore **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) tied for 12th place after recording rounds of 76, 83, 79 and 77 for 315 strokes. Freshman **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN) tied for 23rd after carding rounds of 85, 78, 80 and 81 for 324 strokes. Redshirt freshman **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN), playing in only her second tournament of the spring, tied for 34th with scores of 87, 85, 77 and 83 for 332 strokes.

Tying for 38th place was junior **KRISTA REUTERFELDT** (COON RAPIDS, MN) with rounds of 88, 80, 79 and 87 for 334 strokes. Sophomore **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) tied for 42nd place after rounds of 83, 81, 87 and 88 for 339 strokes. Illinois' **Renee Heiken** won the individual championship after carding scores of 73, 75, 71 and 80 for 299 strokes.

**BIG TEN HONORS** -- Ross and Evens were both named to the all-Big Ten team at the conclusion of this year's championship. Other members of the all-conference team are Stacey Arnold of Iowa; Angela Buzminski, Courtney Cox and Shannon Hardesty of Indiana; Jenny Hecht of Michigan State; and Renee Heiken of Illinois. Iowa swept the rest of the conference awards with Mary Jo Rollins being named Freshman of the Year; Stacey Arnold, Player of the Year; and Iowa head coach Diane Thompson, Coach of the Year.

## SOFTBALL

**GOPHERS TRAVEL TO TEXAS** -- The Minnesota softball team (47-25) will make its second-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I Softball Tournament Friday in College Station, Texas. The Big Ten champion Gophers will play Utah (25-13), the Western Athletic champion, Friday at 1 p.m. Texas A&M (45-13) will play both Minnesota and Utah on Friday. The Aggies are the ninth-ranked team in the country and the top seed in the regional. Minnesota is looking for its first-ever NCAA tournament win and its first-ever trip to the NCAA Women's College World Series.

**REGIONAL FORMAT** — The three-team regional at Texas A&M is under a double-elimination format. Minnesota is guaranteed two games Friday, but will have to win at least once to continue on Saturday. Minnesota is the second highest-ranked team in this regional, so they will be the home team in Friday's first game against Utah. The entire 20-team NCAA field is listed at the end of the softball release.

**MINNESOTA'S NCAA HISTORY** — The Gophers have made one previous NCAA tournament appearance. After winning the Big Ten title in 1988, the Gophers were sent to Tucson, Ariz. for regional play. Minnesota did not score a run in Arizona, losing to South Carolina 1-0 and Arizona 5-0. Even though the Gophers shared the Big Ten title in 1985, they did not make an NCAA tournament appearance that year.

### **OPPONENT NOTES --**

**UTAH'S ROAD TO TOURNEY A RECORD BREAKER** -- Three or four marathons could have been run in the time it took unranked Utah (25-13) to beat Creighton for the Western Athletic Conference Crown Saturday and Sunday in Omaha, Neb. The teams began play at 6 p.m. Saturday with Utah needing one win and Creighton two to win the conference title and the automatic bid into the NCAA championship.

Creighton kept its hopes alive by edging the Utes 1-0 in an NCAA-record 31 innings, breaking the old mark of 28 innings set by Central Michigan and Kent State on April 21, 1984. After a 20-minute break, the teams went at it again, this time for 25 innings, with Utah coming out on top 4-3 at around 6 a.m. on Sunday.

Utah will be hoping that junior pitcher **Janet Womack** is rested in time to face the Gophers on Friday. She pitched all 31 innings and took the loss in Saturday's record-setting game. Womack has a 19-7 season mark and a 0.79 ERA. The Utes' other starter, sophomore **Melissa Halkinrude**, should be more rested. She pitched "only" 25 innings in Utah's 4-3 win over Creighton Sunday morning.



**SOFTBALL CONTINUED --**

The Utah hitting attack is led by senior outfielder **Charmelle Green**. She is hitting .372 with six home runs and 31 RBI in 38 games. Freshman catcher **Deb DiMeglio** is hitting .304 with seven home runs and 32 RBI. Sophomore outfielder **Laurel Simmons** also has a .304 batting average.

**SERIES --** Utah leads 3-2. The last time the team met was March 8, 1988 in the Roadrunner Invitational at New Mexico State. Utah won 5-0.

**AGGIES HOPING HOME FIELD CAN BOOST TEAM TO COLLEGE WORLD SERIES --**

Unlike Utah, ninth-ranked Texas A&M (45-13) has had plenty of rest recently, having been idle since April 28. The Aggies, however, were hot before the layoff, winning four games in a row and nine of 10. The success of the team during that stretch and throughout the season is largely a result of the outstanding pitching by sophomore **Missi Young**. She leads the nation with 35 wins and has a 35-5 overall record and 0.54 ERA. Among Young's wins were 18 shutouts. She has pitched 36 complete games and has won her last eight decisions.

Freshman shortstop **Jennifer McFalls** is Texas A&M's offensive leader. She is hitting a team-best .356 and is second on the team with 26 RBI. Sophomore 1B **Sharla Cannon** is hitting .323 with a team-leading 45 RBI. Junior 3B **Rhonda Halbert** has 15 doubles.

**SERIES --** Texas A&M leads 8-2. The Aggies beat Minnesota 4-0 on March 23 at the Pony Tournament in Fullerton, Calif.

**MINNESOTA CLINCHES BIG TEN TITLE —** The Gophers needed two wins in the final weekend against Michigan to clinch the Big Ten title, and that's exactly what they got. Minnesota's 20-4 conference record ties the Big Ten record for most Big Ten wins in a season set by the 1984 Northwestern squad. Iowa picked up an at-large berth to the NCAA tourney, the first time since 1985 that two Big Ten teams have qualified for the NCAA tournament.

**MINNESOTA SPLITS FOUR WITH MICHIGAN** — The 15th-ranked Gophers entered the final four-games series of the year with 19th-ranked Michigan needing two wins to clinch the 1991 Big Ten title. They accomplished their goal last Friday night with a doubleheader sweep before a Bierman-record 619 fans.. Minnesota won the opener 2-1 in the bottom of the seventh inning. **TABBETHA WOODY** (DEWEY, OK) and **MISCHEL DOERR** (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) singled to start the rally and moved up one base on a wild pitch. **STACEY FUNDERBURG** (LEBANON, OR) followed with a ground ball to second base that was good enough to score **Woody** with the winning run. Minnesota followed with a 1-0 victory in the nightcap to clinch the championship. **ROBIN BUMPUS** (MUNNSVILLE, NY/ STOCKBRIDGE VALLEY) and **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) combined on a five-hitter to shut down the Wolverines.

Michigan shut down the Gophers in both games on Saturday, winning by scores of 4-3 and 5-0. The losses broke Minnesota's 10-game overall winning streak and its 19-game Big Ten winning streak, a new Big Ten record. However, Minnesota's 20-4 Big Ten record was one game better than second-place Iowa and good for the Big Ten championship. Minnesota's low point of the season was February 22, when the Gophers were 5-12. Since then, Minnesota is 42-13, including a 23-4 stretch since April 6.

**WOODY NAMED TO ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM** — Minnesota senior outfielder **Tabbatha Woody** has been selected to the 1991 GTE-CoSIDA Academic All-District softball team, which was released Monday. **Woody** has started 69 games for Minnesota in the outfield this season, hitting .305 with 26 runs scored and 20 runs batted in. **Woody's** name will now be placed on the national ballot for consideration for the Academic All-American team.

**THE COACH** — Minnesota's **Teresa Wilson** (Missouri '84) makes her second appearance in the NCAA tournament as a coach. She led the 1989 Oregon team to the 1989 Women's College World Series and a fifth-place national finish. In her six-year career, Wilson is 204-161 (.559). In her two years at Minnesota, Wilson is 78-57 (.578), including a 32-16 (.667) mark in Big Ten play.

**SEASON ENDS AT REGIONAL** — The Minnesota softball team (48-27) ended its 1991 season in NCAA regional play last weekend at College Station, Texas. The 15th-ranked Gophers won their first-ever NCAA tournament game, a 3-0 decision over host Texas A&M. Utah sandwiched that victory with two wins over Minnesota, by scores of 1-0 and 2-0. Utah advanced to the 1991 Women's College World Series with a 3-0 win over Texas A&M in the championship game. Minnesota finished the 1991 season with 10 more wins than any previous Gopher team and as the 1991 Big Ten champions.

## UNIVERSITY TO HOST NCAA WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS CHAMPIONSHIPS --

The University of Minnesota women's athletic department will play host to the 1992 NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships at the St. Paul Civic Center on April 24-25, 1992 with the assistance of the St. Paul Area Chamber of Commerce and a volunteer steering committee.

Twelve teams and twelve individual all-around qualifiers will compete for national titles in what will be the NCAA's 11th annual championship in college women's gymnastics.

Tickets will go on sale Oct. 1. The prices for two-day event tickets purchased in advance are \$20 for lower level reserved seats and \$16 for general admission. One-day ticket prices (sold the day of the event only) are \$12 (reserved) and \$10 (general admission). Special group ticket packages will be available by advance sale only.

The chair of the steering committee for the championships is Anne Ford Nelson, vice president, Norwest Bank. The St. Paul Area Chamber of Commerce and president Rich Hadley has also pledged its support.

"Having run scores of successful tournaments in this town, St. Paul and its corporate community is proud to partner itself with Chris Voelz and the University of Minnesota women's athletic department in making this gymnastics tournament a huge success," Nelson said.

University women's athletic director Chris Voelz said the goal of the women's athletic department in serving as host for the event is to set a new NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships two-day attendance record. The current attendance record for the two-day event (17,000) was set in 1983 in Salt Lake City, Utah.

"We are proud to bring one of the most popular NCAA national championships to Minnesota," said Voelz. "It is especially significant to have this event embraced by the community and chamber of St. Paul and such a wonderful leader as Anne Ford Nelson."

Currently joining Nelson on the steering committee are chamber of commerce programs director Pat Tapp; Dennis Cashman, vice president, John Ryan & Co.; Michelle McQuarrie Colton, partner, O'Neill, Burke, O'Neill, Leonard & O'Brien; Tom Duffy, manager of public affairs, IBM; James Hansen, senior vice president, pension division, Northwestern National Life; Dianne Johnson, business development analyst, Deluxe Corporation; Diane Moser, vice president/marketing, St. Paul Pioneer Press; Anne Reilly, tax manager, Deloitte & Touche; and Linda Ruiz of St. Paul Companies.

Companies that have committed local support to the championships include IBM, Transtop, Inc. and the St. Paul Pioneer Press. The steering committee will solicit further involvement from the Twin Cities business community.

The meet director for the championships is Donna J. Olson, associate director of women's athletics at the University, with Karen Smith, assistant athletic director of women's athletics, serving as assistant meet director.

Among the teams expected to vie for berths in the championships are 1991 national champion Alabama; six-time national champion Utah, the 1991 runnerup; two-time national champion Georgia; Oregon State, which finished fourth at the 1991 national championships; and new Big Ten Conference member Penn State, which finished fifth in 1991.

Individuals expected to compete are 1991 all-around champion Hope Spivey of Georgia (1988 U.S. Olympic team); Melissa Marlowe of Utah (1988 U.S. Olympic team); Coon Rapids native Rhonda Faehn of UCLA (1988 U.S. Olympic team alternate); and former U.S. national team members Chari Knight of Oregon State and Dee Dee Foster of Alabama, the latter of whom was the 1990 NCAA all-around champion.

This will be the second national championship event and fourth NCAA postseason event that the University's women's athletic department has hosted in the past four years. The success of the NCAA Central region gymnastics meet held at Williams Arena in April 1990 led to the University's securing of the national championships bid for 1992. The Central regional championship drew an NCAA-region record crowd of 7,591.

Previously, in December 1988, the department set a national attendance record (17,202 over two days) in hosting the NCAA Division I Volleyball Championship at Williams Arena. In December 1989, there were 4,969 in attendance (then a record for an NCAA first round match) as the Gophers beat Colorado in an NCAA first round volleyball match.
