GYMNASTICS

GOPHERS BACK HOME THIS WEEKEND AGAINST OHIO STATE — After road meets at Iowa, Florida and Alabama the past three weekends, the Gophers (0-4 overall, 0-1 Big Ten) will be back in Williams Arena this weekend when they take on Ohio State on Saturday in a 7:30 p.m. dual. Although it is still early in the season, the meet is an important one in Minnesota's hopes of qualifying for the NCAA Central Region championship.

This is why: Six scores are used to determine a team's regional qualifying average, with at least two of the six required to be home scores and at least two required to be away scores. Because Saturday's meet is the second of just three home meets on the Gopher schedule and because Minnesota scored just 181.50 in its previous home meet, the Gophers need to score well (187+) in their two remaining home meets to have a reasonable chance at qualifying as a team to the regional meet.

OHIO STATE NOTES — The Buckeyes (5-1, 1-1) defeated North Carolina State 188.15 to 186.80 on Sunday in Raleigh, N.C., with senior **Lynn Beagley's** 38.10 all-around score leading the Buckeye all-arounders. Beagley is from St. Paul, Minn. Senior **Emily Arnold** scored a team-high 9.90 in the vault.

SERIES — Ohio State leads 14-11-1. The Buckeyes won twice last season, 182.90 to 181.40 in Columbus, Ohio on Jan. 11 and 186.50 to 183.25 on March 27 at the Big Ten championships.

ANOTHER SCHOOL RECORD FALLS AT ALABAMA, BUT SO DO GOPHERS — The Gophers set a school event record for the second consecutive week—scoring 48.15 to set a new school mark in the floor exercise—but were victimized by falls and missed routines in the other events enroute to a 184.25 team score and third-place finish in a triangular at Alabama on Saturday. Alabama won the meet with a 195.10 team score and Southeast Missouri score 188.65 to finish second. Iowa was scheduled to compete but withdrew.

The Gophers started in the uneven bars and scored 45.15, with just three individuals topping 9.00. It was more of the same in the beam, as Minnesota again had just three gymnasts top 9.00. Then came the floor exercise. When it was over, the Gopher scores read in order: 9.55, 9.65, 9.60, 9.45, 9.65 and 9.70. The 48.15 score broke the old school mark of 47.90 that was scored March 3, 1991 against Missouri. Minnesota finished up in the vault, scoring 45.80.

CASTNER AGAIN TOPS GOPHER ALL-AROUND QUARTET — Freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH) again led Minnesota's four all-arounders, scoring 36.85. She has led the Gopher all-arounders in all four meets this season. Among **Castner's** scores were new personal bests in the vault (9.30) and floor exercise (9.60). Junior **LORI KINDLER** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL-MURRAY) scored 9.70 in the floor exercise for the second straight meet, tying her team-season high. Junior **SHANNON FISHER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) set a new career-best in the floor exercise with a 9.65 score and senior **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) also scored 9.65 in the floor exercise.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT—

NORTHWESTERN—The Wildcats are 12-5 overall and 6-2 in the conference after winning two games last weekend. Northwestern defeated Michigan State 78-58 on Friday night and downed the Gophers 76-68 on Sunday. Northwestern is on a seven-game winning streak. The Wildcats' only conference losses have been to Iowa and Penn State.

Northwestern posts four scorers averaging in double figures, led by sophomore forward **Maureen Holohan** with a 16.5 ppg average. Senior forward **Donna Groh** averages 12.0 ppg while junior center **Patricia Babcock** posts a 11.1 ppg average and is the team's leading rebounder with 7.8 rpg.

SERIES — Northwestern leads, 21-6. The Wildcats have won the last 10 matchups, including last Sunday's victory in Evanston, Ill. Minnesota's last win over Northwestern was on Jan. 8, 1988.

IN REVIEW — PENN STATE— Minnesota's five-game winning streak ended Friday night at Williams Arena when fourth-ranked Penn State defeated the Gophers 77-62. Sophomore **CARA PEARSON** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) scored 21 points to lead all scorers. The Gophers trailed by just one point, 37-36, at the half. Penn State opened up a 56-46 lead with 11:21 remaining but the Gophers went on an 8-0 run to close the gap to 56-54 with 8:25 to play. The Lady Lions opened the lead back up to eight and the closest Minnesota came the rest of the way was four points, 62-58, at 5:56.

NORTHWESTERN— **Shudlick** led the Gophers with a game-high 26 points but it was not enough as Minnesota fell to the Wildcats 76-68. Maureen Holohan led Northwestern with 15 points. The Gophers fell behind 11-4 early but scored the next eight points to take its only lead of the game, 12-11, with 13:26 to play in the first

half. The Wildcats responded by scoring 11 unanswered points to take a 22-12 lead with 9:19 on the clock. Minnesota trailed 40-27 at the half but scored the first six points of the second half to pull within seven, 40-33, for the closest margin of the second half. Northwestern took its largest lead of the game, 67-48, at the 6:38 mark, and the final score of 76-68 was the closest Minnesota came the rest of the game. The Gophers shot just 38 percent from the floor while Northwestern shot 53 percent.

PEARSON IMPROVING — Sophomore CARA

PEARSON recorded a career-high 21 points against Penn State on Friday night. Pearson also recorded a game-high 11 rebounds against the Lady Lions.

IN THE NATION — Shudlick continues to post all-America numbers and is among the nation's top scorers, checking in at sixth among Division I players as of last Tuesday.

TENNIS

GOPHERS OPEN BIG TEN DUAL MATCH SEASON

THIS WEEKEND — Minnesota (0-3 overall) will begin its Big Ten season with two matches this weekend. On Friday, the Gophers will take on Ohio State (2-1) at 6:30 p.m. at the Burnsville Racquet Club, and on Sunday, Minnesota will face its fourth nationally ranked opponent of the season when 10th-ranked Indiana (1-1) visits for a 9 a.m. match at the 98th Street Racquet Club.

OPPONENT NOTES —

OHIO STATE — The Buckeyes (2-1) lost 5-4 to Western Michigan on Saturday after posting 9-0 wins over Eastern Michigan on Jan. 16 and West Virginia on Jan. 23. Freshman **Linda Magid** has the team's best singles mark. She is 7-2 while playing primarily in the No. 4 spot in the lineup. In doubles, Ohio State's top team is the duo of sophomore **Michelle Busch** and senior **Abigail Villena**, who have combined for a 2-1 mark at No. 1 doubles.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 11-5. Last year the Gophers won twice—5-4 on March 28 in Columbus, Ohio and 5-1 in the seventh-place match at the Big Ten championships.

#10 INDIANA — In their only two matches thus far, the Hoosiers (1-1) lost 6-3 to fourth-ranked Duke on Jan. 24 and defeated Miami (Ohio) 9-0 on Jan. 23. Several Indiana players were in the Twin Cities this past weekend for the Rolex National Indoor Intercollegiate Tennis Championships. Senior **Deborah Edelman** (ranked 22nd nationally) and junior **Jody Yin** (ranked 43rd) each competed in both singles and doubles. Both lost their opening-round singles matches.

In doubles, Edelman and her partner, sophomore **Rachel Epstein**, won their opening-round match before losing. They are ranked fourth in the nation. Yin and her doubles partner, junior **Danielle Paradine**, who are ranked 15th, lost their opening-round Rolex doubles match. Paradine is not expected to make the trip to Minnesota because of illness.

SERIES — Indiana leads 13-0. In the teams' last meeting, the Hoosiers won 9-0 on March 29 in Bloomington, Ind.

CULIK BEATS ANOTHER RANKED OPPONENT —

Gopher sophomore **SUSAN CULIK** (CHAPIN, SC) lost two of three singles matches at the Rolex national indoor championships this past weekend, but her win came against the 18th-ranked player in the nation, Katrin Guenther of William & Mary. After losing to 15th-ranked Antonia Homolya of Campbell College (2-6, 3-6) in her opening-round singles match, **Culik** downed Guenther 6-4, 6-2 in the opening round of consolation play. **Culik** then lost to 43rd-ranked Jody Yin (1-6, 6-7) of Indiana in the consolation quarterfinals.

The win over Guenther, though, was **Culik's** second over a ranked opponent in less than a week. She beat ninth-ranked Cammie Foley of UCLA in a team dual on Jan. 30. The next rankings will be released March 9.

In doubles competition at the Rolex, **Culik** and sophomore **SHANNA JOHNSON** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/ROFFERSON) lost both their matches. In the first round, they were defeated 6-3, 6-2 by Laura Richards and Julie McKeon of San Diego (ranked fourth in the nation), and in the second round, **Culik** and **Johnson** lost to Auburn's Anna Funderburk and Nadia Smirnova (7-5, 5-7, 3-6). Funderburk and Smirnova are ranked 10th in the nation.

TRACK AND FIELD

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO THE CYCLONE INVITATIONAL—The Minnesota women's track and field team will take its first trip of the 1993 season and compete in the Iowa State Invitational on Saturday at 9 a.m. The Gophers have two athletes that lead the Big Ten best list and are close to provisional qualification marks for the NCAA meet. Senior **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) set a school record Jan. 16 with her long jump of 19-8 3/4 at the Northwest Open. That is the best jump in the conference this year and is 3 1/2 inches away from the NCAA provisional qualification standard. Freshman **DANIELLE PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CENTRAL) set a freshman shot put record at the Nike Invitational on Jan. 30 with a throw of 47-1. That is the top throw in the Big Ten this season and is within a foot of the NCAA provisional qualification standard.

HAT'S NEXT—Minnesota's final home meet will be the Minnesota Open on Feb. 27 at 9 a.m. at the University Fieldhouse. The Gophers will travel to Indiana University for the 1993 Big Ten meet March 5-6 in Bloomington, Ind.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

DUAL MEET SEASON ENDS WITH VICTORIES — The women's swimming and diving team concluded its dual meet season this past weekend by defeating all three of its opponents at the Purdue Quadrangular in Indianapolis, Ind. Minnesota beat Purdue 168-110, Illinois 159-102 and Wisconsin 167.5-106.5. The Gophers are 7-4 overall and 5-3 in the Big Ten Conference.

Triple winners for the Gophers were senior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) in the 400-yard individual medley (4:28.04) and the 200-yard individual medley (2:06.24); junior **SUSAN SUOMU** (WAUKEGAN, IL/WAUKEGAN WEST) in the 500- (5:02.54) and the 200-yard freestyle (1:52.53) events; freshman **TRESSIA SHAW** (PHOENIX, AZ/ARCADIA) in the 1,000-yard freestyle (10:21.01); senior **LAURA HERMAN** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) in the 50-yard freestyle (:23.98); and junior **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONT., CAN.) in 3-meter diving (475 pts.). **Herman** was also first in the 100-yard (:52.80) freestyle against Purdue and Illinois and tied for first with Wisconsin. **Nelson** was first in 1-meter diving against the Boilermakers and Badgers with 420.15 points.

Minnesota also won two relay events at the quadrangular. The 800-yard freestyle relay team of **Suomu**, freshman **WENDY WOODS** (MADISON, WI/MADISON WEST), senior **KRINA KABANUK** (FARGO, ND/FARGO SOUTH) and sophomore **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) was first with a time of 7:38.05. In the 400-yard free relay, **Herman** junior **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), freshman **KIM BRYANT** (Eagan, MN) and **Smith** turned in a winning time of 3:32.04.

BIG TEN SWIMMING AND DIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS AT MICHIGAN

The 12th Annual Big Ten Women's Swimming and Diving Championships will be at the University of Michigan Canham Natatorium, Feb. 18-20. Michigan, the defending Big Ten Champion, last hosted the conference meet in 1989.

FAVORED TEAMS – Michigan, ranked 11th in the country by the College Swimming Coaches Association of America, is favored to win its seventh consecutive conference title. Thirteenth-ranked Northwestern is considered the strongest contender for second place, with Minnesota (23), Penn State (15), Ohio State (21) and Purdue (26) in a battle for third through sixth place.

THE GOPHERS BY EVENT

There are 21 events at the conference meet and event scoring goes through the top 16 finalists in each event. The top eight competitors from the preliminary rounds compete in the finals each night and the ninth through 16th place finishers swim in the consolation finals each evening.

Minnesota is the defending Big Ten champion in the 200-yard freestyle relay and returns two of the four members from the 1992 relay team. Returning champions senior **LAURA HERMAN** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) and sophomore **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) will be joined by either junior **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) or freshmen **RACHEL CLAFLIN** (MCFARLAND, WI) or **KIM BRYANT** (EAGAN, MN). Head coach Jean Freeman expects the relay team to be among the top four finishers and to qualify for the NCAA championships.

Herman is the defending Big Ten champion in the 50-yard freestyle and is currently the fastest conference swimmer in that event. She is hoping to surpass the NCAA qualifying standard of :23.24 at the championship. **Smith, Easter, Claflin** and **Bryant** will also be racing in the short sprint freestyle race. Freeman thinks three or four Gophers will score in the top 16.

In the 500-yard freestyle, junior **SUSAN SUOMU** (WAUKEGAN, IL, WAUKEGAN WEST) and freshman **WENDY WOODS** (MADISON, WI/MADISON WEST) will vie for the top eight positions and freshman **TRESSIA SHAW** (PHOENIX, AZ/ARCADIA) is expected to finish in the consolation finals. Senior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) is ranked third in the conference in the 200-yard individual medley and Freeman thinks Oegema can finish third overall and qualify for the NCAA meet. Junior **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN) and senior **KRINA KABANUK** (FARGO, ND/FARGO SOUTH) are expected to place in the consolation finals of the event.

In the diving events, all three of Minnesota's divers have an opportunity to score. Junior **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONT., CAN.) is the defending Big Ten champion in 1-meter diving and was third in 3-meter diving at last year's conference meet. Sophomore **KARA MARTIN** (LINCOLN, NE/LINCOLN EAST) and freshman **JENNY COOK** (ELK RIVER, MN) both have the ability to score at the meet. Platform diving will not be a scored event this year by a vote of the conference athletic directors.

Freeman expects the Gophers' 400-yard medley relay team of **Oegema, Zeller, Herman** and sophomore **KIRSTEN ANDERSON** (FALCON HEIGHTS, MN/ROSEVILLE) to place in the top eight. **Anderson, Zeller** and **Herman** will be joined by **Smith** in the 200-yard medley relay and that team can be among the top five in the conference this year. In the 400-yard individual medley, **Oegema** is seeded third and should be among the top three finalists and make NCAA meet qualifying standards. **Kabanuk** and junior **KAREN ADAMS** (WALNUT CREEK, CA/NORTHGATE) should place in the event and **Shaw** has an outside chance to score.

The 100-yard butterfly is one of the Gophers' weakest events this year, according to Freeman. **Anderson** and **Adams** will both be challenged to score among the field of strong competitors. On the other hand, the 100-yard breaststroke is the most improved event for Minnesota this season. **Zeller** and freshman **LESLIE WILCOX** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) are capable of scoring in the top eight and senior **ALISON LUCAS** (LACROSSE, WI/CENTRAL) should place in the consolation finals of the event.

Suomu is the Gophers' top 200-yard freestyler and is a top eight contender. **Smith, Woods** and **Easter** will also be in contention for consolation slots. **Suomu, Woods** and **Smith** will be joined by **Oegema** in the 800-yard freestyle relay and the foursome is expected to be among the top five teams.

Anderson and junior **JENNY BIERBAUM** (ROCHESTER, MN/JOHN MARSHALL) will be Minnesota's only entries in the 100-yard backstroke and will be challenged to place in the top 16. In the 200-yard backstroke, **Oegema** is expected to be in the top eight and **Anderson** in the top 16.

In the 1,650-yard distance freestyle, the swimmers mile, the Gophers will have four entrants - **Suomu, Shaw, Woods** and **Kabanuk**. Freeman is hoping that three will place in the finals and one in the consolation bracket. In an opposite race, the 100-yard sprint freestyle, **Herman** will be challenged by **Smith** for the top Gopher finish. **Easter, Claflin** and **Bryant** will battle one another for consolation slots.

Wilcox, says Freeman, is in a good position to place in the finals of the 200-yard breaststroke with **Zeller** and **Lucas** in the consolation finals. In the 200-yard butterfly, **Adams** is Minnesota's only entry and is capable of a top 16 finish.

Minnesota is the defending champion of the final event of the three-day championship, the 400-yard freestyle relay. **Herman** and **Smith** are the only returning defending champions from the relay event and will be joined by either **Claflin, Easter** or **Bryant** in an effort to defend their title.

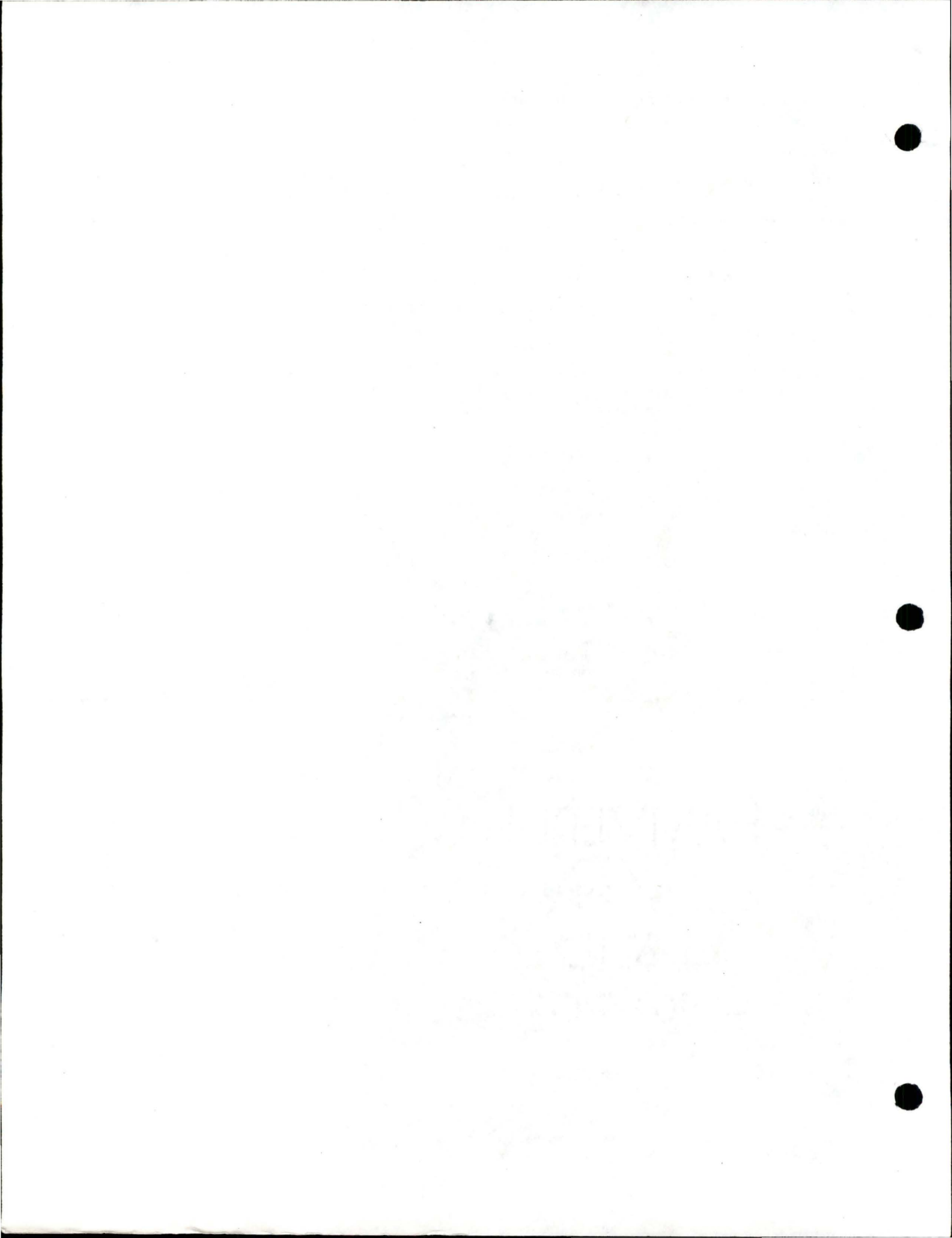

The other newcomers are Katrien DeDecker of Bredene, Belgium, Tara Fiamengo of Long Beach, Calif., and Conya Wakefield of Las Vegas, Nev.

"In general, I feel this is probably our strongest recruiting class since Chris Schaefer, Lori Miller and Sharon Oesterling were freshmen (1986)," Schleuder said. "And that class took us to the NCAA tournament. This class is a great group that will really change the profile of our team--physically and athletically. We'll be dramatically increasing the size of our team overall."

**Katrien DeDecker, 6-2 1/2, Middle Hitter
Bredene, Belgium (Royal Atheneum High School)**

DeDecker has been a member of the top 18s team in Belgium and will be a member of Belgium's 1993 World University Games team. She has played on her national and state A & B juniors team and was selected to train at the Dutch National Olympic Training Center. She is a member of the Belgium national women's team and is an Olympic team hopeful for 1996 and 2000.

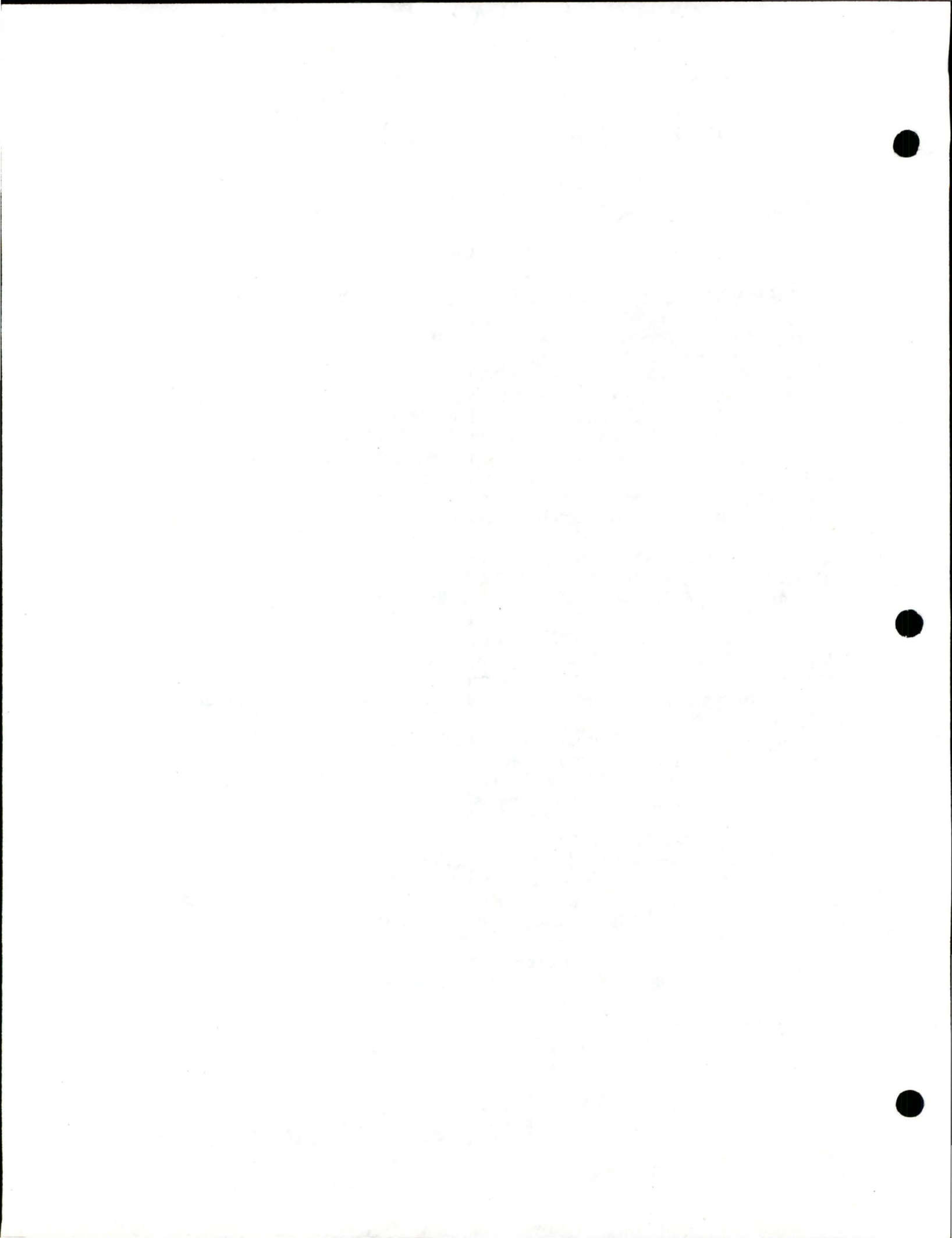
"She brings a level of experience that we haven't had for a while with her international play," Schleuder said. "She's an outstanding player and one of the best in Belgium. She's a very good passer and defensive player and that's pretty unusual for someone her size."

**Tara Fiamengo, 6-0, Middle/Outside Hitter
Long Beach, California (St. Anthony High School)**

Fiamengo played for the Cal Juniors club team. She was named to the California All-State tournament team in 1991 and in 1992 was her team's captain and MVP in addition to being an all-league player and her league's player of the year.

"She comes from one of the oldest and most respected junior clubs in California," Schleuder said. "It's a real coup for us to be able to sign one of the best players from one of the best clubs in California. Tara's strongest asset is probably blocking, but I think the thing that's impressive about her is that she's also an outstanding all-around player."

**Jamie McKibbon, 6-1 1/2, Middle Hitter
Hibbing, Minnesota (Hibbing High School)**

McKibbon was her team MVP in 1991 and team captain in 1992. She was named to the Associated Press all-state team in 1991 and 1992 and the Pioneer Press all-state team in 1991 and 1992, also.

"Jamie will have an immediate impact for us as a hitter," Schleuder said. "She hits the ball harder than anyone we've had here since Andrea Gonzalez. She was the runnerup nationally in the shot and discus as a junior and is one of the biggest hitters ever to come out of the state when it comes to raw power."

**Sarah Pearman, 5-9, Outside Hitter
Apple Valley, Minnesota (Apple Valley High School)**

As a junior in 1991, Pearman was named her team's best all-around player and was an all-conference selection as well as an honorable mention all-metro pick. As a senior in 1992, she was named the Star Tribune's metro player of the year and was also all-conference, all-metro and all-state. She has played for the Twin Cities-based Mosquito Coast volleyball club.

"Sarah has great all-around abilities and I think will be one of our most well-rounded players," Schleuder said. "She is a great passer and defensive player and an excellent hitter. In addition, she comes from one of the strongest high school programs in the state and one of the best junior clubs in the state."

**Conya Wakefield, 6-0, Middle Hitter
Las Vegas, Nevada (Edward Clark High School)**

Wakefield was named to the Nevada state all-tournament team as a junior and senior. As a senior, she earned USA Today second team all-American recognition, an honor that placed her among that publication's top 13 players in the nation. She was her team's captain and an all-conference selection as a senior.

"She has great talent and great leaping ability," Schleuder said. "She is very quick and has played at the highest level of club ball for several years. I think she will have an immediate impact for us at the net."

1992 RECAP -- The 1992 Gophers volleyball team (25-12, 13-7) won more than 20 matches for the seventh time in Stephanie Schleuder's 11 years as head coach and finished in fourth place in the Big Ten. At season's end the Gophers were selected to play in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship in Kansas City, Mo., where they finished third.

The Gophers will lose four seniors--Emily Ahlquist, Angie Hanna, Megan Huston and Krista Nevelle--from that team but return three starters.

VOELZ TO APPEAL DELI RULING

Chris Voelz, director of Women's Intercollegiate Athletics at University of Minnesota, said Friday (Feb. 12) that she will appeal a faculty panel recommendation that Katalin Deli be reinstated as women's gymnastics coach.

Reacting to statements attributed to Deli in the *Pioneer Press* and *Star Tribune*, Voelz said that although the three-member panel did not find sufficient cause to support Deli's dismissal, it "certainly did not exonerate her." Voelz dismissed Deli June 2.

Voelz said that, contrary to Deli's public statements, the panel "clearly found misconduct, which it did not condone." The panel did not "completely exonerate" Deli, as stated in the newspaper, rather it concluded that she:

- probably violated NCAA rules
- probably asked student athletes to lie
- was insubordinate

Voelz also countered newspaper reports that she "has hired a substitute" in Jim Stephenson. Voelz stated that Stephenson "will remain head coach with my full confidence and that of the university." Said Voelz: "I believe that when the sun sets on this case that Katalin Deli will not be the head coach and that Jim Stephenson will continue to do the fine job he's doing."

Voelz also contends that it is not true that the panel "sided with the seven people who testified in the Deli's behalf," or that the panel issued a preliminary report in December, as publicly reported.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENTS—

INDIANA—The Hoosiers post a 12-7 overall record and 3-7 conference mark after losing two road games over the weekend. Indiana fell to seventh-ranked Ohio State 99-58 on Friday and fifth-ranked Penn State 94-69 on Sunday. Indiana has lost its last four games and seven of its last eight. The Hoosiers opened the season with 11 consecutive wins, including a 71-65 upset over Penn State.

Indiana is led in scoring and rebounding by sophomore forward **Shirley Bryant** with 12.7 ppg and 8.4 rpg. Senior forward **Dawn Douglas** averages 10.2 ppg and 5.3 rpg for the Hoosiers.

LAST MEETING — Minnesota defeated Indiana 80-70 on Jan. 24 on front of a record crowd of 6,746 in Minneapolis. Carol Ann Shudlick led Minnesota with 26 points and 9 rebounds while Dawn Douglas paced the Hoosiers with 18 points and 7 rebounds.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 14-12. Indiana had won four in a row over Minnesota prior to last month's Minnesota win.

PURDUE—The Boilermakers are 11-9 overall and 3-8 in the conference after dropping a pair of road games last weekend. Purdue fell to fifth-ranked Penn State 90-69 on Friday and seventh-ranked Ohio State 72-61 on Sunday. Purdue hosts Iowa on Friday night before meeting Minnesota on Sunday. The Boilermakers are averaging 71.4 ppg while Minnesota averages 71.3 ppg.

Sophomore guard **Cindy Lamping** leads Purdue in scoring with a 16.3 ppg average, followed by senior forward **Tricia Cullop** with 9.4 ppg. Cullop is also the team's leading rebounder with 6.0 rpg.

LAST MEETING — The Gophers defeated Purdue 67-51 in the season's earlier matchup on Jan. 22 in Williams Arena. Stacy Carver led the Gophers with 15 points while freshman **Stacey Lovelace** led Purdue with 12 points.

SERIES — Purdue leads, 13-9. The Boilermakers had won 12 straight matchups over the Gophers prior to last month's Minnesota victory.

IN REVIEW —

NORTHWESTERN —Minnesota avenged its earlier season loss to Northwestern when it defeated the Wildcats 72-70 on Sunday. The Gophers shot a season-high 57 percent from the field for the game, hitting 60 percent in the second half. Sophomore **SHANNON LOEBLEIN** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) scored a season-high 16 points, including the winning basket at the buzzer to lift the Gophers to victory. Minnesota led 40-32 at the half but the Wildcats pulled withing one point at the 13:41 mark in the second half and Maureen Holohan tied the game for the Wildcats with 12 seconds to play. Loeblein connected on a 14-foot jumper on a pass from **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN/APPLE VALLEY) as time expired. **SHUDLICK** led the Gophers with a game-high 25 points, connecting on 12-of-15 shots from the field. Sophomore **CARA PEARSON** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) added 15 points and six rebounds.

INJURY UPDATE — Junior point guard **NIKKI COATES** (LEAVENWORTH, KS/LEAVENWORTH) sustained a grade two concussion during the second half of Sunday's game against Northwestern. She was taken to the university hospital where she was admitted for overnight observation and will be released today. Her playing status will be evaluated on a day-to-day basis.

ON THE RISE — Attendance for Sunday's game against Northwestern was 2,302, the third highest of the season and fifth-best ever for the Gophers in Williams Arena. Minnesota's average attendance for the 1992-93 season is 1,926 — more than double last year's average of 923 per game. The Gophers are averaging 2,818 in Big Ten games this year — more than double last year's average of 1,044.

SHUDLICK SHOWING — **Shudlick** continues to lead the Big Ten in scoring, posting a 23.3 ppg average. She is fourth in the conference in field goal percentage (.528), fourth in blocked shots (1.3/game) and sixth in steals (2.2/game). Shudlick is currently eighth on Minnesota's all-time scoring list with 1,253 career points and is 92 points away from moving into seventh place. She has recorded 421 points this season. She is currently seventh in career field goals made with 515 and eighth in free throws made with 223.

Minnesota will be competing in the five-team UCLA Invitational at 9 p.m. (CST) on Saturday at Pauley Pavilion in Los Angeles. The opponents include fifth-ranked Arizona State, 10th-ranked UCLA, California and Illinois.

UCLA NOTES — The 10th-ranked Bruins are averaging 191.00, with a high score of 192.95. Sophomore **Kareema Marrow** is tied for ninth in the national all-around rankings with a 38.95 season average. Sophomore **Megan Fenton** is tied for fifth nationally in the vault (9.81 average).

SERIES — UCLA leads 9-1. The Gophers finished second to the Bruins in last season's UCLA Invite. UCLA scored 189.85 to Minnesota's 185.45.

ARIZONA STATE NOTES — The fifth-ranked Sun Devils (6-1) scored a school-record 194.80 in wins over Boise State and San Jose State on Friday in Tempe, Ariz. Arizona State also set school marks in the vault (49.05) and bars (48.75). Three Sun Devil gymnasts recorded 10.0s in the meet—sophomore **Danna Lister** in the beam, freshman **Jenny Ester** in the bars and sophomore **Tina Brinkman** in the vault.

SERIES — Arizona State leads 8-1. The Sun Devils won 191.45-188.50 last season in Tempe.

CALIFORNIA NOTES — The Golden Bears have a high of 186.45 and average of 185.22 through their first five meets. Ca; scpreed 185.95 and finished third behind Arizona (193.00) and Cal-Santat Barbara (186.95) in a home triangular on Saturday. Freshman **Sirinda Sincharoen** had the team's high all-around score (37.65) through five meets.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 3-0, but the teams have not met since 1983. That year the Gophers won 177.35-177.25 in Berkeley, Calif.

ILLINOIS NOTES — The Fighting Illini lost to Iowa 86.35-183.70 on Saturday. Illinois' top team score thus far has been a 184.90 but the Illini have been competing without all-arounders **Kara Corso** and **Kim Bathke** at full strength. Both have been limited to the bars because of ankle injuries. Illinois sophomore **Nicole Ward** won the all-around competition at Iowa with a 37.50 score, while freshman **Natalie Foersthoefer** was named Big Ten Gymnast of the Month in January after posting three consecutive 9.80 scores in the uneven bars.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 18-5. The Fighting Illini beat Minnesota 185.50-183.25 at last year's Big Ten championship in the most recent meeting between the schools.

GOPHERS COME UP SHORT AGAINST BUCKEYES — The Gophers equaled a team best in the vault with a 46.35 score, but were victimized by six falls in the uneven bars, balance beam and floor exercise in a 189.40-186.20 loss to Ohio State on Saturday at Williams Arena. Three of those falls counted in Minnesota's team score, costing the Gophers 1.5 points.

KETCHER LEADS GOPHERS ALL-AROUNDERS — Senior **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) scored 37.45 and finished third all-around behind Ohio State's Emily Arnold (38.40) and Lynn Eagley (38.20). **Ketcher** notched scores of 9.50 in the vault, 9.55 in the uneven bars, 8.90 in the beam and 9.50 in the floor exercise. Her all-around score was just .10 from her career high.

Other top performances: freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH) in the bars (9.60); junior **SHANNON FISHER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) and senior **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) in the floor exercise (each scored 9.65 for the second straight meet); and sophomore **MICHELLE RIEGER** (MARIETTA, GA/WESTFIELD-HOUSTON, TX) in the beam (9.45).

SOFTBALL

GOPHERS OPEN SEASON IN SAN DIEGO—The Minnesota softball team opens its 1993 season at the San Diego State Spring Classic on Friday in Escondido, Calif. The three-day, seven-team tournament will be the first of three weekend tournaments that the Gophers will compete in over the next three weekends. Minnesota will see two nationally ranked teams and one team ranked ahead of the Gophers in the Mideast Region.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT—The San Diego State Spring Classic is a round-robin tournament on Friday and Saturday, with each of the seven teams playing three games each day. The teams will be seeded on Sunday for championship and consolation play, with the top four teams going to a single-elimination championship

bracket and the bottom three teams going to a single-elimination consolation bracket. Minnesota will play a minimum of seven games and a maximum of eight games, barring weather difficulties. The Gophers' weekend schedule (all times CST):

THE OPPONENTS—Minnesota will play **St. Mary's** (6-1) for the second consecutive season at the San Diego State Spring Classic. The Gophers defeated the Gaels 6-0 last year and hold a 2-0 lead in the all-time series. **Northwestern** (0-0) is ranked fifth in the Mideast Region poll and finished two games ahead of Minnesota last season in the Big Ten standings. Minnesota holds a 24-20 edge in the all-time series, but is 2-2 against the Wildcats in non-conference NCAA play. **San Diego State** (6-0) will meet the Gophers for the sixth time in three years. Minnesota leads the all-time series 4-3, including a 2-1 win in last year's Spring Classic. Eighth-ranked **Long Beach State** (2-0) played in the 1992 Women's College World Series. The 49ers lead the all-time series 5-1, including an 8-5 win over the Gophers in last year's Spring Classic. **UC Santa Barbara** has not played Minnesota since 1989. Minnesota leads the infrequent all-time series 5-3. Fourth-ranked **California** (3-0) also competed in the 1992 Women's College World Series. The Bears lead the Gophers 3-1 in all-time meetings, including a 4-0 win at the Arizona Softball Classic last year. California pitcher Michelle Granger threw a no-hitter to beat the Gophers.

WEISS WATCH—Gopher senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) enters the 1993 season as Minnesota's all-time hit leader with 204 hits. The 1992 second-team all-American selection at third base, Weiss needs 37 hits to surpass Alicia Seegert of Michigan as the all-time hit leader in the Big Ten Conference. She is currently in sixth place on the Big Ten list and needs three hits this weekend to surpass Diane Pohl of Iowa to move into fifth place. Weiss has improved her batting average in every season and is the only Gopher in history to have three 60-hit seasons.

THE COACH—Minnesota's **Lisa Bernstein** (Arizona '86) enters her second year as the head coach of the Gopher program. Her career record is 33-28-1 (.541).

TENNIS

TEAM ROAD SCHEDULE BEGINS THIS WEEKEND —

The Minnesota women's tennis team (1-4, 1-1) will play the first of six consecutive non-conference matches this weekend when it takes on Drake at 1 p.m. Saturday in Des Moines, Iowa. The Gophers have the distinction of being Drake's first women's tennis opponent in the brand new \$3.5 million Drake Tennis Center, which opened last fall.

Minnesota will then travel to Ames, Iowa, where the Gophers will face Iowa State at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday. The matches are Minnesota's first road duals of the season.

OPPONENT NOTES — DRAKE — The Bulldogs (2-2) lost to 20th-ranked Kansas 8-0 on Sunday after beating Kansas State 6-3 on Saturday and Arkansas 7-2 on Friday. Drake lost to Northwestern 7-2 on Jan. 31 in Evanston, Ill. Sophomore **Vera Vitels** (20-4), ranked 26th in the nation, did not play against Kansas on Sunday because of a wrist injury. Vitels and freshman **Nikki Uelze** combine to form Drake's top doubles team. The duo is 13-3 on the season.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 12-1. The last time the teams met—in 1987—the Gophers won 6-3.

IOWA STATE — In their most recent match, the Cyclones (2-1) defeated Creighton 8-1 on Feb. 6 in Ames, Iowa. Junior **Lesley Lewis** (1-5) plays No. 1 singles and teams with senior **Franchel Bennett** at No. 1 doubles.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 17-1. The Gophers won 9-0 last season.

GOPHERS OPEN BIG TEN SEASON WITH WIN OVER OHIO STATE —

Minnesota won four of six singles matches and swept all three doubles matches in a 7-2 win over Ohio State on Friday at the Burnsville Racquet Club in the Big Ten season opener for both teams. Gophers freshmen **Karin ERLANDSSON** (MOLNDAL, SWEDEN) and **DANA PETERSON** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) won at No. 3 doubles to clinch the victory for Minnesota.

Erlandsson and **Peterson** defeated Ohio State's Allison Kinsey and Louise Johnson 6-0, 6-3.

On Sunday at the 98th Street Racquet Club, the Gophers lost 7-2 to 10th-ranked Indiana. It was Minnesota's fourth loss of the season, all of which have come against ranked opponents. The Gophers' wins came at Nos. 2 and 3 doubles.

GOPHERS SIGN FIRST PLAYER — University of Minnesota head women's soccer coach Sue Montagne has announced the signing of Jami Philip of Little Canada, Minn. to a national letter of intent. Philip, a senior at Roseville Area High School, was an all-conference goalkeeper in the Twin Cities Suburban Conference this past season. Philip has also played for the St. Paul Lightning club team.

TRACK AND FIELD

GOPHER RESULTS AT IOWA STATE—Several Gophers improved personal bests and moved up on Minnesota's all-time indoor lists at the Iowa State Invitational last Saturday in Ames, Iowa. Junior **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN) lowered her time in the 400 meters to 57.33 and became the third-fastest performer on the Gopher list. Ramsay is .46 seconds away from the school record. Sophomore **ANDREA GROVE** (WINNIPEG, MANITOBA, CANADA) finished third in the 1000 meters in 2:56.78, placing her sixth on the all-time Minnesota list. Sophomore **ANGIE ABBOTT** (WINONA, MN) and freshman **LORI TOWNSEND** (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY) both ran under the 10-minute barrier in the 3000 meters for the first time indoors. Abbott finished with a time of 9:56.82 and is seventh on Minnesota's all-time list, while Townsend finished in a time of 9:57.32 and is eighth on that same list. Freshman **LORI HARDRICK** (MILWAUKEE, WI/WISCONSIN LUTHERAN) had Minnesota's best performance in the field Saturday, jumping 37-8 in the triple jump. Hardrick becomes the third Gopher in history to jump 37 feet indoors, joining former Gopher Leslie Revier and current Gopher **CINDY BETHANY** (ROSEVILLE, MN/MOUNDS VIEW).

WHAT'S NEXT—Minnesota next meet will be the Minnesota Open on February 27 at 9 a.m. at the University Fieldhouse. It will be the last home meet indoors for the Gophers in 1993 and it will be the last chance for Minnesota to improve its marks before the Big Ten meet March 5-6 at Indiana.

GOLF

GUADALAJARA FIRST STOP OF SEASON — The golf team will trade the Minnesota winter for Mexico's warmth as they travel to the Oklahoma State hosted Guadalajara Women's Intercollegiate Golf Tournament. The Gophers will join a dozen teams in the two-day, 54-hole tournament at the Guadalajara Country Club. Others competing are Baylor, Florida, Lamar, Miami, Missouri, Northern Illinois, Oklahoma State, San Francisco, Texas A&M, Texas-El Paso, Mexico and the Guadalajara Country Club.

TRAVELING TEAM — Head golf coach Kathy Williams has named seniors **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) and **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN), junior **JANA ERDMANN** and sophomores **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) and **JENNY KAISER** (RICHFIELD, MN) to the traveling team. Going into the spring season, Evens leads the squad with a 77.50 average. Kolb is second (77.71) and is followed by Erdmann (79.14), Leighton (79.25) and Kaiser (79.29).

GOPHERS SOCCER TEAM SIGNS WALEK, HUSSEY --

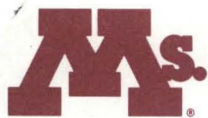
University of Minnesota women's soccer coach Sue Montagne has announced the signing of two metro area high school soccer stars to national letters of intent. Joining the Gophers squad in the fall will be **Erin Hussey** of Wayzata and **Jennifer Walek** of North St. Paul, both of whom were named to the state soccer coaches association's all-state team last fall.

Walek, the 1992 *St. Paul Pioneer Press* girls prep athlete of the year, scored 19 goals and assisted on six others this past season from her midfielder position while leading North St. Paul to an 8-7-1 record. The 5-4 Walek, whose natural position is forward, was also named the *Star Tribune's* metro player of the year. Walek was a two-time all-state and all-metro selection and three-time all-conference pick. She has also been named all-conference in basketball and twice named all-conference in softball.

Hussey, a 5-5 midfielder at Wayzata, led the Trojans to an 18-2-1 record and the semifinals of the state tournament as a senior. She was a member of Wayzata's state championship team as a junior and state runnerup team as a sophomore. She had a team-high 27 goals and was second on the team with 36 points as a senior. Hussey was named to the *Star Tribune's* all-metro team this past season and was honorable mention all-metro the previous two years. In addition to being named all-state as a senior, she was a two-time honorable mention all-state pick and three-time all-conference selection for Wayzata.

Hussey and Walek are the second and third players to sign with the Gophers. Signing earlier was Jami Philip of Roseville, who was an all-Twin Cities Suburban Conference goalkeeper last fall at Roseville Area High School.

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENTS —

MICHIGAN—The Wolverines are 1-20 overall and 0-12 in the Big Ten after falling to Ohio State 79-59 on Sunday. Michigan has lost its last 14 games.

The Wolverines are led in scoring and rebounding by 6-2 senior center **Trish Andrew** with 20.0 ppg and 12.2 rpg. Andrew leads the Big Ten in rebounding and in blocked shots (3.0/game).

LAST MEETING — The Gophers defeated Michigan 71-62 on Jan. 31 in Ann Arbor. Carol Ann Shudlick led Minnesota with 22 points while Andrew paced the Wolverines with 19 points and 17 rebounds.

SERIES — The series is tied, 12-12. The Wolverines had won seven straight games over the Gophers before this season's earlier matchup.

MICHIGAN STATE—The Spartans are 8-13 overall and 4-8 in the conference after dropping a pair of games over the weekend. Michigan State lost to Ohio State 88-51 on Friday and Penn State 87-54 on Sunday.

The Spartans are led in scoring and rebounding by sophomore forward **Kisha Kelly** with 14.8 ppg and 7.5 rpg. Sophomore guard **Tanya Place** is the team's second leading scorer with 11.9 ppg.

LAST MEETING — The Gophers defeated Michigan State 70-61 on Jan. 29 in East Lansing, Mich. That game marked the Gophers' first Big Ten road win since 1987-88.

SERIES — Michigan State leads the series, 13-9.

IN REVIEW —

INDIANA — CAROL ANN SHUDLICK (APPLE VALLEY, MN/APPLE VALLEY) led the Gophers with a game-high 26 points as Minnesota edged Indiana 60-59 in Bloomington, Ind. on Friday. The Gophers led by four at the half, 30-26, but Indiana tied the game 38-38 with 13:13 to play and opened up a 54-46 lead with 6:33 to play. Minnesota scored the next six points and went on a 10-3 run, including four consecutive field goals from Shudlick, to pull within one, 57-56, at the 3:14 mark. Sophomore **CARA PEARSON (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING)** connected on two free throws to give Minnesota a 58-57 lead before Indiana reclaimed a 59-58 lead with 2:00 to play. Junior **CRYSTAL FLINT (ROXBURY, MA/S. BOSTON)** scored the game-winning basket for the Gophers on a driving layup at 1:24.

PURDUE — Senior **STACY CARVER (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO)** scored a game-high 26 points for the Gophers but Minnesota fell 72-64 to Purdue in W. Lafayette, Ind. on Sunday. Minnesota held a 33-27 halftime lead and outshot Purdue 51 percent to 31 percent in the first half. But the tables were turned in the second half as the Boilers shot 51 percent and the Gophers shot 31 percent. Purdue took its first lead, 42-40, with 13:30 to play and opened up a 55-47 lead at 8:47. Carver hit two of her four three-point goals in the game on connected on two free throws to tie the game 63-63 at the 3:43 mark. The game was tied again 64-64 with 2:18 to play but the Boilermakers scored the last eight points of the game.

INJURY UPDATE — Junior point guard **NIKKI COATES** (LEAVENWORTH, KS/LEAVENWORTH) did not travel to Indiana or Purdue after sustaining a grade two concussion during the second half of the Northwestern game on Feb. 14. Her playing status is being evaluated on a day-to-day basis.

BIG TEN LEADERS — Shudlick is among the leaders in the Big Ten in five categories — she is first in scoring (22.3 ppg), fourth in field goal percentage (.525), fifth in rebounding (8.7 rpg), seventh in steals (2.25/game) and fourth in blocks (1.42/game). Coates is fourth in assists (4.6/game) and sixth in steals (2.3/game).

SHUDLICK UPDATE — **Shudlick** has now scored 1,297 career points and is 48 points away from moving into seventh place on Minnesota's career scoring list. She has posted double figures in 21 consecutive games and 45 of the last 46. The 465 points she has already scored this season stands as the ninth-best in school history while the 202 field goals made is currently eighth.

They have played three Big Ten opponents, losing 9-0 to Wisconsin and 5-4 to Purdue and beating Ohio State 5-4. Last year's team was 14-9 overall and finished second at the MAC championships. The No. 1 singles player is sophomore **Holly Taylor**, who holds a 15-8 season record. Taylor teams with senior **Yacqui Peete** at No. 1 doubles. The duo is 7-5.

SERIES — The Gophers lead 2-0. Minnesota won 8-1 in 1990 in the last meeting between the schools.

NEBRASKA — Nebraska (2-0) has defeated Creighton 6-3 and Northern Illinois 9-0. Senior **Zarina Galvin** is 2-0 at No. 1 singles and also 2-0 at No. 1 doubles with senior **Heidi Junius**.

SERIES — The Gophers lead 8-0. Minnesota won 8-1 in 1983 in the last meeting between the schools.

GOPHERS WIN 17 OF 18 IN WINS OVER DRAKE, IOWA STATE — It was a successful weekend for the netters, as they downed Drake 8-1 on Saturday in Des Moines and Iowa State 9-0 on Sunday in Ames, Iowa.

Freshman **KATHY WAYNE** (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) played her first two singles matches of the season and won both, beating Drake's Nicole Gianci 6-1, 6-2 on Saturday and Iowa State's Kristin Dahlberg 7-5, 6-1 on Sunday. Wayne also won both her doubles

matches with partner **JENNY MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA). The duo is now 4-0, as is the freshman combination of **KARIN ERLANDSSON** (MOLNDAL, SWEDEN) and **DANA PETERSON** (APPLE VALLEY, MN).

GYMNASTICS

GOPHERS TO FACE GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS IN FINAL HOME MEET — The Minnesota women's gymnastics team will wrap up a three-meet home season on Saturday when it plays host to Gustavus Adolphus at 7:30 p.m. at Williams Arena. The meet will be the final home competition for seniors **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN), **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) and **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER).

GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS NOTES — Gustavus Adolphus (14-2) has won three consecutive Division III national championships and seven national titles in the last 10 years. When the Golden Gusties (14-2) take to the floor Saturday, they will have had a two-week break since losing to MIAC rival Hamline 138.55-136.85 on Feb. 13. Gustavus lost three all-Americans off last year's national championship team, but return Division III vault champion **Shasta Lininger**, vault all-American **Leslie Bloedel** and balance beam all-American **Cindy Lynn Swatland**. Jerry Connolly is serving as interim head coach this year, as long-time head coach Nancy Baker is taking a sabbatical.

SERIES — The series is tied 3-3. Last year Minnesota won 185.60-178.95 in the Gophers' home opener.

GOPHERS DOWN BIG TEN FOE ILLINOIS AT UCLA INVITATIONAL — Minnesota (1-9, 1-2) got its first win of the season Saturday at the UCLA Invitational. The Gophers' 184.90 score topped Illinois' 183.55 tally, giving Minnesota a fourth-place finish in the five-team meet. UCLA won the meet with a 194.25 team score, Arizona was second with a 191.35 mark and California was third with a 184.95 total.

As it has been all season, the Gophers' best event was the floor exercise. All six floor performers scored 9.45 or better and Minnesota totaled a 47.60 team floor exercise score. The vault, a trouble spot all season, was again the Gophers' worst event, as Minnesota scored just 45.05 in that event.

CASTNER HITS SEASON HIGH IN THE UNEVEN BARS — The bright spot of the meet for Minnesota was the performance by freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH) in the uneven bars. **Castner** scored a team-season high 9.70 in the bars. **Allstadt** tied a career best in the balance beam with a 9.50 score and scored 9.65 in the floor exercise for the fourth meet in a row. Junior **LORI KINDLER** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL-MURRAY) scored 9.50 in the floor exercise, while sophomore **SHANNON FISHER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) scored 9.40 in the

balance beam and 9.45 in the floor exercise.

Sophomore **MICHELLE RIEGER** (MARIETTA, GA/ESTFIELD-HOUSTON, TX), who has been one of the team's most consistent performers in the bars and balance beam all season, had a solid meet again on Saturday, posting scores of 9.45 in the bars and 9.25 in the beam.

GOPHERS SETTING RECORD PACE IN FLOOR

EXERCISE — The Gophers are having their best year ever in the floor exercise, averaging 47.25 in the event through six meets. That is up from the team's 46.06 average in 1992 and 46.18 average in 1991.

Minnesota's best total season average in the floor prior to this season was the 46.66 average by the 1990 team.

BEAM UPDATE — The Gophers' beam average (46.06) is just slightly behind the school-record average (46.20) of last year's team.

BARS UPDATE — Although Minnesota's 45.99 bars average is down from last year's school-record 46.50 average, it is still the team's third-best average since 1985.

VAULT UPDATE — In the vault, Minnesota is suffering through its worst season in five years, with just a 45.66 average. Looking back, the Gophers' vaulting averages have been: **1992**—46.49; **1991**—46.73; **1990**—46.73; **1989**—46.69; **1988**—45.64; **1987**—45.57; **1986**—45.90; **1985**—45.29.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

GOPHER SIXTH AT CONFERENCE MEET — Minnesota finished the 12th Annual Women's Big Ten Swimming and Diving Championships in sixth place with 327 points. Michigan won an unprecedented seventh consecutive team title with 676 points. Northwestern was second (628) and was followed by Ohio State (436), Penn State (378) and Purdue (356).

DIVER OF THE YEAR — Junior **Laurie Nelson** (ETOBICOKE, ONT., CAN) was named the Big Ten Diver of the Year and all-Big Ten. Nelson was the Big Ten champion in 3-meter (528.51 points) and platform diving (553.40), which was an exhibition event this year, and placed fifth in 1-meter diving (409.23). Nelson's 3-meter total destroyed the old school record of 499.25 points set by Chris Curry Gentz in 1982 and her platform diving total bettered her 1991 recording of 479.85 points. A three-time all-American and last year's Big Ten 1-meter diving champion, Nelson is the only Minnesota woman to ever win a diving event at the conference meet.

WILCOX SETS RECORD — In the 200-yard breaststroke, freshman **Leslie Wilcox's** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) third place time of 2:16.37 shattered the Minnesota school record by nearly two seconds and was her second lifetime best mark of the day in the event. It came less than seven hours after setting her previous lifetime-best of 2:18.75 during the preliminaries. The previous school record of 2:18.22 was set by Tami Grewenow in 1990. Wilcox placed

second in the 100-yard breaststroke with Minnesota's second-fastest time in the school's history, 1:03.11.

HERMAN QUALIFIES FOR NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS — Senior **Laura Herman** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) was Minnesota's only swimmer to qualify for the NCAA women's championships, which will be at Minnesota, Mar. 18-20. Herman clocked a time of :23.19 (qualifying standard - :23.24) in the 50-yard freestyle while swimming the lead-off leg of the 200-yard freestyle relay during a Saturday time trial. The defending Big Ten champion in the 50-yard freestyle, Herman placed third in the event with a time of :23.50. She also placed sixth in the 100-yard freestyle (51.26).

POINT MAKERS — In the 1,650-yard freestyle, the Gophers' placed four swimmers, with junior **Susan Suomu** (WAUKEGAN, IL/WAUKEGAN WEST) leading the way with a seventh place finish (16:58.85). She was followed by freshman **Tressia Shaw** (PHOENIX, AZ/ARCADIA) in eighth (17:02.56), freshman **Wendy Woods** (MADISON, WI/MADISON WEST) in 13th (17:13.24) and senior **Krina Kabanuk** (FARGO, ND/FARGO SOUTH) in 14th (17:14.87).

In the 50-yard freestyle, sophomore **Pam Smith** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) was 14th with a time of :23.96. In the longer sprint race, the 100-yard freestyle, junior **Jenny Easter**, SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW, was 14th (:51.86) and **Smith** was 16th (:52.87). In the 500-yard freestyle, **Suomu** was sixth (4:51.47) and **Woods** was 12th (4:56.31). In the 200-yard freestyle, **Suomu** was 10th (1:50.95) and **Woods** was 16th (1:53.23).

Senior **Linda Oegema** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) was 10th in the 200-yard individual medley (2:06.00) and junior **Kris Zeller** (FARIBAULT, MN) was 13th (2:07.60). In the consolation finals of the 400-yard individual medley, **Oegema** had a come-from-behind win during the final 25 yards of the race, placing ninth with a time of 4:25.82.

In the 100-yard breaststroke, **Zeller** was 10th (1:04.95) and senior **Alison Lucas** (LACROSSE WI/CENTRAL) was 14th (1:06.03). In 1-meter diving, freshman **Jenny Cook** (ELK RIVER, MN) was eighth (348.81). Sophomore **Kara Martin** (LINCOLN, NE/LINCOLN EAST) was 14th (412.44) and **Cook** was 15th (409.71) in 3-meter diving. In platform diving, **Martin** was seventh (465.55) and **Cook** ninth (242.60).

RELAY TEAM RESULTS — Minnesota's 200-yard medley relay team of sophomore **Kirsten Anderson** (FALCON HEIGHTS, MN/ROSEVILLE), **Wilcox**, **Pam Smith** and **Herman** clocked a fifth place time of 1:45.63. **Suomu**, **Woods**, **Easter** and **Smith** placed seventh in the 800-yard freestyle relay (7:32.68). The Gophers placed ninth in the 400-yard medley relay after **Anderson**, **Zeller**, junior **Karen Adams** (WALNUT CREEK, CA/NORTHGATE) and **Herman** clocked a time of 3:51.85.

In the 200-yard freestyle relay, Minnesota's team of **Herman**, **Easter**, sophomore **Rachel Claflin** (MCFARLAND, WI) and **Smith** placed sixth (1:34.95), and in the final event of the meet, Minnesota's 400-yard freestyle team of **Easter**, **Herman**, **Smith** and **Claflin** placed seventh (3:28.07).

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO LOUISIANA — The Minnesota softball team (3-1) will travel to the state of Louisiana for the first time in Gopher history this weekend to participate in the Louisiana Classics Tournament in Lafayette, La. Minnesota is off to its fastest start since 1985 after a 3-1 weekend at the San Diego State Spring Classic in Bakersfield, Calif. This tournament is the second of three consecutive weekend tournaments for the Gophers.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT — The five-team tournament is a round-robin tournament, with Minnesota playing additional games against some of the tournament opponents. For example, Minnesota will play Southwest Louisiana three times, but only the first game Thursday will count toward the tournament standings. Minnesota is scheduled to play seven games in four days. The Gopher schedule:

Thursday — Minnesota (3-1) at Southwest Louisiana (3-0), 5 p.m. (DH)

Friday — Minnesota vs. Georgia Tech (2-2), 12 noon
Minnesota vs. Southwest Louisiana, 6 p.m.

Saturday — Minnesota vs. DePaul (0-0), 2 p.m. (DH)

Sunday — Minnesota vs. Samford (1-3), 11 a.m.

THE OPPONENTS — The featured opponent this weekend is 10th-ranked **Southwest Louisiana**. The Lady Cajuns opened their season at home last weekend with two wins over McNeese State and one win over Northern Illinois. USL has hosted an NCAA regional in each of the last three years, but has failed to advance to the Women's College World Series in each regional. Junior pitcher Kyla Hall (1-0, 0.00 ERA) has a career record of 45-14 and was a third team all-American in 1992. Senior pitcher Missy Skow (1-0, 0.00 ERA) threw a no-hitter last weekend against McNeese State and has a personal 10-game winning streak. The Lady Cajuns' top returning hitters are sophomore outfielder Kathy Morton (.333, 1 RBI) and junior infielder Alyson Habetz (.500, 3 RBI). These will be the first career meetings between Minnesota and USL.

Among the other opponents, Minnesota will be playing **Georgia Tech** and **Samford** for the first time in school history. The Gophers own a 1-0 series lead over **DePaul**, as they defeated the Blue Demons 4-2 on March 30, 1991 in Columbia, Mo. The Gophers will play DePaul in the first round of the Fullerton Mini-Tournament on March 21.

GOPHER SUCCESS IN CALIFORNIA — For the most part, softball teams from the Midwest will struggle on road trips to the West Coast in February for two reasons. The teams in the Midwest have to practice indoors, while the teams on the West Coast get to practice outdoors, which is an advantage. Also, the balance of power in NCAA Division I softball has traditionally been on the West Coast. Six of the top eight teams in the NCAA preseason softball poll are from California or

Arizona. This did not deter Minnesota from earning a winning record at the San Diego State Spring Classic against four teams from the state of California. Last Friday, Minnesota handed San Diego State its first loss in seven games by defeating the Aztecs 6-3. The next day, the Gophers defeated St. Mary's 3-1 and headed into its first game with fourth-ranked California with a 2-0 record. The Gophers rallied from 1-0 and 4-1 deficits, but dropped a 6-5 decision to the Bears in a ninth-inning tiebreaker. Minnesota came back strong Sunday, as **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) threw a one-hitter and **JODI MASSUCCI** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) and **MISCHEL DOERR** (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) provided run-scoring singles in a 2-0 win over eighth-ranked Long Beach State. The Gophers are 3-1 after four games for the first time since 1985. That record includes a split with two top-10 NCAA teams. Minnesota will play three games against Southwest Louisiana this weekend, which is another top-10 NCAA team.

THE COACH—Minnesota's **Lisa Bernstein** (Arizona '86) is in her second year as the head coach of the Gopher program. Her career record is 36-29-1 (.554).

WHAT'S NEXT — Minnesota jumps back on the road next weekend to participate in the Arizona Softball Classic in Tucson, Ariz. The Gophers have guaranteed matchups against second-ranked Arizona, third-ranked Fresno State, and fourth-ranked California.

TRACK AND FIELD

GOPHERS HOST MINNESOTA OPEN — The Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Minnesota Open on Saturday at 11 a.m. at the University Fieldhouse. This meet will be Minnesota's final home meet of the 1993 indoor season and the final chance to prepare before the Big Ten indoor meet.

CLOSE TO QUALIFY — Minnesota does not have any qualifiers for the NCAA meet at this time, but has two that are close. Senior **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) is within three inches of the NCAA provisional qualifying mark in the long jump. Owen's best of 19-8 3/4 is a Minnesota school record and is one of the top marks in the Big Ten this season. Freshman **DANIELLE PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CENTRAL) is within a foot of the NCAA provisional qualifying mark in the shot put. Parkos has a best this season of 47-1 and is one of four Gophers that are among the top ten shot putters in the Big Ten.

BIG TEN MEET NEXT WEEKEND — The Gophers will take part in the 12th annual Big Ten Women's Indoor Track and Field Championship on March 5-6 at Indiana University. If any Gophers qualify, they would participate in the NCAA indoor meet March 12-13 at the Hoosier Dome in Indianapolis.

✓ **NELSON ATHLETE OF MONTH** - Junior **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONT., CAN) was named the Athlete of the Month by the Sports Information department. Nelson was the Big Ten Diver of the Year and named to the all-conference team. She was the Big Ten champion in 3-meter (528.51 points) and platform diving (553.40), which was an exhibition event this year, and placed fifth in 1-meter diving (409.23). Nelson also set two varsity records, destroying the 3-meter record of 499.25 points set by Chris Curry Gentz in 1982. She also broke her own 1991 platform diving recording of 479.85 points. A three-time all-American and last year's Big Ten 1-meter diving champion, Nelson is the only Minnesota woman to ever win a diving event at the conference meet.

✓ **NCAA SWIMMING AND DIVING** - Only 17 days remain before the NCAA Division I Women's Swimming and Diving Championships take place at the University Aquatic Center on March 18, 19 and 20. March 8 is the last day to purchase and receive tickets by mail. March 15 is the first day to purchase single session tickets.

TRACK AND FIELD

MINNESOTA TO COMPETE AT BIG TEN MEET—The Minnesota women's track and field team will compete in the 1993 Big Ten Indoor Track and Field Championships on Friday and Saturday at Indiana University. The Gophers finished in ninth place in 1992 with 22 points. Minnesota's best finish at an indoor Big Ten meet came in 1989 at Illinois, where the Gophers finished sixth with 40 points.

ATHLETES TO WATCH—If Minnesota is going to improve upon its 1992 performance, the majority of the points will have to come from the field events. Senior **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) is one of the top long jumpers in the conference and owns Minnesota's school record with a leap of 19-8 3/4. Freshman **LORI HARDRICK** (MILWAUKEE, WI/WISCONSIN LUTHERAN) and sophomore **CINDY BETHANY** (ROSEVILLE, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) should compete for scoring places in the triple jump. In the high jump, junior **CORALEA BROWN** (ANDROSSAN, ALBERTA, CANADA) joins freshman **KATHIANNE SELLERS** (LANCASTER, PA/MANHEIM TOWNSHIP) as scoring possibilities. Freshman **DANIELLE PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CEN-

TRAL) leads a group of four Gopher shot putters that are ranked in the Big Ten's top ten list.

OWEN SETS SECOND SCHOOL RECORD—Minnesota senior **Val Owen** set her second school record of the indoor season last Saturday at the Minnesota Open. Owen ran her 55-meter trial race in 7.18, breaking the existing mark of 7.20 set by Sam Caffey in 1990. Owen was Minnesota's lone double-winner on Saturday, winning the 55-meter final in 7.19 and the long jump with a mark of 19-5 1/2.

Other winners for Minnesota on Saturday included junior **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN) in the 200 meters, junior **ANGIE MAULDIN** (COLUMBUS, WI) in the 400 meters, freshman **JENNIFER IMSANDE** (BRAINERD, MN) in the 600 meters, senior **ALISON TITCOMB** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG) in the 800 meters, senior **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC) in the 55-meter hurdles and **Coralea Brown** in the high jump.

NCAA MEET NEXT WEEKEND—The NCAA indoor meet is March 12-13 at the Hoosier Dome in Indianapolis. Currently, the Gophers have no qualifiers for the NCAA meet.

OHIO STATE—The fourth-ranked Buckeyes are 20-3 overall and 12-2 in the Big Ten. Ohio State has won its last six games, including a 73-71 win over eighth-ranked Penn State last week. The Buckeyes' only conference losses have been to Penn State and Iowa.

PENN STATE — The Lady Lions, ranked eighth in this week's AP Top 25 poll, post a 19-4 overall record and 11-3 mark in the Big Ten. Penn State had won 19 consecutive games before falling to third-ranked Vanderbilt on Feb. 16. Penn State has not lost a Big Ten game at home and posts a 171-32 record in Rec Hall.

The Lady Lions are led in scoring by sophomore guard **Katina Mack** with 16.0 ppg and junior forward **Helen Holloway** with 12.0 ppg. Holloway also leads Penn State in rebounding with 7.0 rpg.

LAST MEETING — Penn State defeated Minnesota 77-62 in the season's earlier matchup in Williams Arena on Feb. 5. Sophomore **CARA PEARSON** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) led the Gophers with 21 points and 11 rebounds. Mack led Penn State with 20 points.

SERIES — Penn State leads, 2-0.

IN REVIEW —

MICHIGAN— **SHANNON LEOBLEIN** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) and **CRYSTAL FLINT** (ROXBURY, MA/S. BOSTON) each tied career highs on Friday night to lead Minnesota to an 85-68 victory over Michigan. Loeblein

tied her career best with 18 points while Flint matched her career high with 17. Trish Andrew led the Wolverines with a game-high 30 points. The Gophers led by as many as 11 points in the first half and took a 42-35 lead into halftime. Michigan closed the margin to 66-65 with 7:12 to play before an 8-2 Gopher run gave Minnesota a 74-67. The Gophers outscored Michigan 19-4 in the last seven minutes to seal the victory.

MICHIGAN STATE —Sophomore Kisha Kelly scored a game-high 27 points to lead Michigan State to a 71-54 won over the Gophers on Sunday. **STACY CARVER** (MONTROSE, MN/BUFFALO) led Minnesota with 19 points and **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN/APPLE VALLEY) added 17 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. The game was tied 25-25 at halftime, but Michigan State scored the first six points of the second half. The Gophers closed to within two at 35-33 on a Shudlick layup with 14:39 to play. Minnesota closed to within five on three occasions before a 15-4 Spartan run made it 62-46 with 2:46 to play.

INJURY UPDATE — Junior point guard **NIKKI COATES** (LEAVENWORTH, KS/LEAVENWORTH) was cleared to play late last week after suffering a grade two concussion on Feb. 14. Coates started both games over the weekend.

BIG TEN LEADERS —Shudlick is among the leaders in the Big Ten in five categories — she is second in scoring (21.4 ppg), fifth in field goal percentage (.522), fifth in rebounding (8.7 rpg), seventh in steals (2.20/game) and fifth in blocks (1.3/game). Coates is fourth in assists (4.6/game) and sixth in steals (2.2/game).

SHUDLICK UPDATE — **Shudlick** has now scored 1,328 career points and is just 17 points away from moving into seventh place on Minnesota's career scoring list. She has posted double figures in 23 consecutive games and 47 of the last 48. She has scored 496 points this season, which is tied for sixth on the season scoring list. The 215 field goals she has scored for the season is fifth on the season record list.

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO ARIZONA—The University of Minnesota softball team (6-4) continues its tour of America this week by travelling to Tucson, Ariz. and the Arizona Softball Classic. This tournament, hosted by the University of Arizona, has four of the top five teams in the NCAA preseason poll in the field of 10 teams. The Gophers have played four games to date against NCAA top 10 teams and are scheduled to play at least three more this week.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT—The 10 teams in Tucson this weekend have been split into two pools of five teams. Each team will have two games Thursday and two games Friday against the other four members of its pool, and then play one game Saturday against a team from the other pool. THE OPPONENTS—Third-ranked **Fresno State** is a yearly entrant in the NCAA Women's College World Series. The Bulldogs have not been too kind to the Gophers over the years, winning all six previous matchups. **Washington** is embarking on its first year of softball in 1993, with former Minnesota coach Teresa Wilson at the helm. The Huskies have split with Michigan and lost to Iowa among its first five games. Minnesota and **Northwestern** were supposed to play in San Diego, but were rained out. The Gophers and Wildcats will try again in Arizona, with Minnesota holding a 24-20 lifetime lead. Second-ranked **Arizona** has also been a perennial thorn in the side of Minnesota, winning 10 of the previous 14 matchups. The Wildcats have outscored their first eight opponents by a combined score of 65-9. Head coach Lisa Bernstein and assistant coach Julie Standerling both played for current Arizona coach Mike Candrea. Fourth-ranked **California** and Minnesota will meet for the second time this season. The Gophers were one out away from defeating the Golden Bears in Bakersfield, but California rallied for a 6-5, nine-inning victory.

DID YOU KNOW—The history of the Minnesota softball program will be well-represented in Arizona this week. Current Arizona State coach Linda Wells was the mentor of the Gophers from 1974-75 and 1977-89, while current Washington coach Teresa Wilson led the Minnesota team in 1990 and 1991. Combined with Lisa Bernstein's term since 1992, you could find the Minnesota softball coach for every year of the program except 1976 in Tucson this week. Jenny Johnson was the Minnesota coach in 1976.

GOPHERS SPLIT SIX IN LOUISIANA—Minnesota went 3-3 and took second place at the five-team Louisiana Classics tournament in Lafayette, La. Minnesota hit .291 as a team in the six games to raise its season average to .267. Senior catcher **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORD, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) and junior infielder **MARIANN DUKART** (OAK GROVE, OR/REX PUTNAM) were named to the all-tournament team. Sojka leads the Gophers in 1993 with a .355 batting average and is tied for the club leadership with six runs scored. Dukart hit .421 in Louisiana to lead the Gopher attack and now leads Minnesota with eight runs batted in. The Gophers are leading the opponent in stolen bases 19-8 and are successful 83% of the time, as opposed to the opponents' success rate of 57%.

WEISS WATCH—Senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) is creeping closer to becoming the Big Ten's all-time hit leader. Weiss had seven hits over the weekend to raise her career total to 214, good for fifth on the all-time Big Ten list. She needs 27 hits to pass Alicia Seegert of Michigan and become the Big Ten's best.

WHAT'S NEXT—Minnesota will have some time off for finals before packing its bags for California and its annual spring break trip. The Gophers will spend eight days in California, including an appearance in the Pony Tournament at Fullerton.

GYMNASTICS

GOPHERS TO MAKE THIRD SHANICO APPEARANCE THIS WEEKEND — This weekend at Oregon State's 13th annual Shanico Invitational the Gophers (2-9, 1-2) will be looking to continue the success they found in Saturday's home finale, when a school-record 47.95 balance beam score helped Minnesota to a season-high 188.10 score and win over Gustavus Adolphus.

It will be Minnesota's third appearance in the Shanico Invitational, a four-team meet that annually features some of the nation's best teams. The Gophers competed in the meet in both 1989 and 1990, finishing third both times. In the 1989 meet, former Gopher Marie Roethlisberger placed first in the all-around and uneven bars.

Meet time Saturday is 9 p.m. (CST).

OPPONENT NOTES —

OREGON STATE — The Beavers (10-4) finished second in a triangular meet at Arizona on Friday, scoring 190.80 to finish behind Arizona (193.85) and ahead of Stanford (189.25). Junior **Chari Knight**, who holds Oregon State's top all-around mark of the season (39.75), tore an anterior cruciate ligament in her knee three weeks ago and is lost for the season. Sophomore **Marilyn Anderson** scored 38.50 to lead the Beaver all-arounders at Arizona.

SERIES — Oregon State leads 6-0. The Beavers won 190.05-183.55 last year at Williams Arena.

CAL-SANTA BARBARA — The Gauchos lost to Boise State 190.65-187.10 on Saturday. Cal-Santa Barbara's high score is 190.95, which they scored in a Feb. 6 win over Cal-Davis. BALANCE BEAM RECORD FALLS...AGAIN — The Gophers set a school balance beam record in Saturday's 188.10-177.65 win over visiting Gustavus Adolphus. Minnesota scored 47.95 in the beam to break the 47.55 record that was set earlier this season at Florida. Minnesota scored 48.05 in the floor exercise on Saturday, a figure that is second in school history only to the 48.15 the team scored at Alabama on Feb. 6. The 188.10 team score is the seventh-best figure in school history.

Senior **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) closed out her home career with her finest collegiate meet, scoring a career-best 38.10 to win all-around honors. Her total included 9.55 scores in the vault, uneven bars and balance beam and a 9.45 score in the floor exercise. Her 9.55 beam score tied a career best.

Freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH) equaled a career best with a 37.85 all-around score that was second-best in the meet. **Castner** scored a team-season high and personal-best 9.75 in the balance beam, tying for meet honors with sophomore teammate **MICHELLE RIEGER** (MARIETTA, GA/WESTFIELD-HOUSTON, TX), for whom the 9.75 mark was also a career best. **Castner** and **Rieger's** 9.75 scores equaled the best ever balance beam scores by a Gopher at Williams Arena and were the seventh and eighth times a Gopher gymnast ever reached that figure. Former Gopher Marie Roethlisberger did it three times, Kathy Ness twice, and Shelley Brown once.

Junior **LORI KINDLER** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL-MURRAY) set a career best in the balance beam with a 9.35 score and tied a career best in the floor exercise with a 9.70 mark. Senior **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) set a new career best in the floor exercise with a 9.80 score that equaled the best floor exercise ever by a Gopher at Williams Arena. It was also only the fifth 9.80 or better in the floor exercise by a Gopher gymnast. Roethlisberger did it three times and Cathy Zolkowski once.

GOPHERS TAKE TO ROAD WITH FOUR-MATCH WINNING STREAK — The women's tennis team's four-match winning streak will be on the line when it heads west for outdoor matches at California-Irvine on Saturday and Cal State Fullerton on Sunday. The Gophers (5-4, 1-1) will play at noon on both Saturday and Sunday.

OPPONENT NOTES —

CAL-IRVINE — The Anteaters (3-5) were rained out this past weekend. In their most recent match, they defeated Cal State Fullerton 7-2 on Feb. 16. Prior to that, Cal-Irvine lost to Pacific 7-2 and Nevada-Las Vegas 7-2. The team's top singles player is senior **Ali Yoshimoto**, who is 1-7 at No. 1 singles. 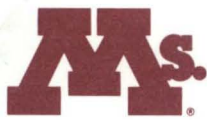

THIS WEEK'S OPPONENTS —

WISCONSIN—The Badgers, 7-19 overall and 4-13 in Big Ten play, will close out their season against the Gophers on Wednesday. Wisconsin has lost its last seven games and 12 of its last 13. The Badgers fell to Indiana 79-72 on Friday and to Purdue 77-57 on Sunday.

Wisconsin is led in scoring by senior guard **Robin Threatt** with 19.1 ppg and sophomore forward **Camille Williams** with 12.2 ppg. Williams is also the team's leading rebounder with 5.3 rpg.

LAST MEETING — The Gophers and Badgers met on Jan. 12 in Madison, with Wisconsin claiming a 75-72 victory. Junior **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN/APPLE VALLEY) led all scorers with 31 points in that game while Wisconsin was led by Threatt with 21 points.

SERIES — Minnesota owns a 16-12 advantage in the series but the Badgers have won the last four matchups. Minnesota's last victory over Wisconsin was on March, 7, 1991 in Williams Arena.

IOWA— The fourth-ranked Hawkeyes were handed their first two conference defeats of the season last weekend, dropping a pair of games to Ohio State and Penn State. Iowa had been 15-0 in the Big Ten before last weekend. The Hawkeyes are now 23-3 overall and 15-2 in the conference. Iowa's 17-game winning streak was broken on Friday night in State College, Pa. with a 70-64 loss to Penn State. Ohio State defeated the Hawkeyes 72-60 in Columbus on Sunday.

Four players are averaging in double figures for the Hawkeyes, led by senior forward **Toni Foster** with 16.2 ppg and junior forward **Tia Jackson** with 12.4 ppg. Foster is also the team's leading rebounder with 8.4 rpg.

LAST MEETING —The Hawkeyes defeated the Gophers 75-47 in Iowa City on Jan. 10 in Minnesota's conference opener. Foster led Iowa with 22 points and nine rebounds while Shudlick led Minnesota with 20 points and six rebounds.

SERIES — Iowa leads 21-11 and has won the last 18 matchups. Minnesota's last victory over Iowa was on Jan. 20, 1984 in Williams Arena.

REVIEW —

OHIO STATE — Five players posted double figures to lead the fourth-ranked Buckeyes to a 95-76 victory over the Gophers on Thursday night in Columbus. **Carol Ann Shudlick** led all scorers with 32 points for her highest total of the season in Big Ten play. Ohio State led 50-36 at the half and by as many as 24 points in the second half. Katie Smith led Ohio State with 26 points.

PENN STATE— **Shudlick** led all scorers with 23 points but it was not enough as the Gophers fell to Penn State 99-78 in University Park, Pa. on Sunday. The Lady Lions posted five players in double figures, led by **Katina Mack** with 20 points. Penn State shot 60 percent from the field in the first half and led 48-33 at the half. Minnesota opened up the second half with eight unanswered points to pull within seven, 48-41, for their closest lead of the second half.

IN THE BIG TEN — Minnesota is currently in fifth place in the Big Ten and will close out the season with its best conference finish in seven years. The Gophers have not finished higher than tied for eighth in the Big Ten in the last seven years. This year's preseason Big Ten coaches poll predicted the Gophers to finish 10th (of 11 teams) in the conference.

BIG TEN LEADERS — **Shudlick** continues to lead the Big Ten and is seventh in the nation in scoring. She is averaging 23.0 ppg in all games and 22.1 ppg in conference matchups.

SHUDLICK IN THE RECORDS— **Shudlick** has now scored 1,383 career points and has moved into fifth place on Minnesota's career scoring list, passing Marty Dahlen (1,345 points), Debbie Hunter (1,361 points) and Ellen Kramer (1,371 points). She began the weekend with 1,328 points, eighth on the scoring list and needing 17 points to move into seventh place. Her 55 points over the weekend propelled her past the seventh, sixth and former fifth place players in scoring history. She now needs 58 points to move into fourth place, owned by Carol Peterka with 1,441 career points.

Shudlick is also moving up in other records:

- Her current season scoring total of 551 points surpassed her third-place total of 547 from last year. Another 31 points this season would place her second on the all-time season scoring list, surpassing Laura Coenen's total of 581 points in 1982-83.
- Her 237 field goals for the season replaces her old third-place record of 226 last season.
- She has moved into fifth place on the career field goals made list with 570, needing 26 to move into fourth place.
- She is seventh in career field goals attempted with 1,111.
- She is eighth on the career free throws made list with 243 and ninth on the career free throws attempted list with 329.

FRESHMAN HIGH — Freshman **KELLY MCNULTY** (EDINA, MN/EDINA) posted her best performance of the season on Sunday against Penn State, scoring 10 points in 16 minutes of play, all in the second half. McNulty shot 4-of-5 from the field, was 2-of-2 from the line, recorded two rebounds, three assists and one steal. McNulty scored six points against Ohio State.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

DIVERS TO NCAA ZONES - Minnesota's diving contingent of junior **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONT., CAN), sophomore **KARA MARTIN** (LINCOLN, NE/LINCOLN EAST) and freshman **JENNY COOK** (ELK RIVER, MN) will be competing at the NCAA Zone C Diving Meet this Friday and Saturday at the University of Michigan. Nelson and Cook will be competing in both 1- and 3-meter diving while Martin will compete only on the low board.

TIMES IMPROVE - Minnesota improved its NCAA consideration times in two relay events and made consideration time in an individual event at the USS Invitational meet at the University Aquatic Center on Sunday. The 200-yard medley relay team of sophomore **KIRSTEN ANDERSON** (FALCON HEIGHTS, MN/ROSEVILLE), junior **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN), sophomore **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) and senior **LAURA HERMAN** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) improved their NCAA consideration time by 1.2 seconds when they clocked a time of 1:44.41. The 200-yard freestyle relay of freshman **RACHEL CLAFLIN** (MCFARLAND, WI), junior **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), **Smith** and **Herman** cut nearly one second off their prior NCAA consideration time with a mark of 1:33.99. **Zeller** surpassed the NCAA consideration in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:04.19) with a time of 1:04.12. Both relay teams and **Zeller** finished first in their respective races. The NCAA will decide prior to the national championships which consideration qualifiers will be invited to the meet, which will be at the University of Minnesota Aquatic Center, March 18-20.

In other action at the USS meet, freshman **KIM BRYANT** (EAGAN, MN) was first in the 50- (:24.16) and the 100-yard freestyle (:52.87) events, and **Anderson** was first in the 100-yard backstroke (:59.16). Freshman **TRESSIA SHAW** (PHOENIX, AZ/ARCARDIA) was first in the 1,650-yard freestyle (17:06.29), senior **LINDA OEGEMA** (DEDEMSVAART, THE NETHERLANDS) was first in the 400-yard individual medley (4:31.01) and freshman **WENDY WOODS** (MADISON, WI/MADISON WEST) was second in the 200-yard backstroke (2:10.87).

GOPHERS RESUME BIG TEN PLAY FRIDAY AT IOWA

— The women's tennis team (7-4, 1-1) will continue its conference season Friday against Iowa (7-1, 1-0) in Iowa City, Iowa. Match time is 1:30 p.m.

IOWA NOTES — The Hawkeyes (7-1, 1-0) beat Drake 8-1 on Friday and defeated Oklahoma State 5-2 on Saturday. Sophomore Laura Dvorak is Iowa's top singles player. She is 6-2 at No. 1 singles. Dvorak teams with senior Andrea Calvert to form the Hawkeyes' No. 1 doubles team. The duo is 9-5 on the season.

SERIES — The Gophers lead 24-5. Minnesota won 6-3 in a regular season dual match last year, but Iowa won 5-3 in the consolation bracket of the 1992 Big Ten championship tournament.

WINNING STREAKS THE NORM — The Gophers extended several winning streaks this past weekend. The wins over Cal-Irvine (9-0) on Saturday and Cal State Fullerton (8-1) on Sunday were the team's fifth and sixth in a row. They were also the Gophers' third and fourth consecutive wins on the road, as Minnesota upped its away record to 4-0.

The last time the Gophers won as many as six in a row was in 1988-89, when they had an eight-match winning streak. During the current streak, Minnesota has won 51 of 54 matches, with two of the losses being in singles and one in doubles.

The Gophers now have an overall season singles record of 62-59 (.512) and an overall season doubles mark of 30-21 (.588).

FRESHMEN LEADING THE WAY — The freshman doubles team of **KARIN ERLANDSSON** (MOLNDAL, SWEDEN) and **DANA PETERSON** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) won its seventh match in a row and each player also won her sixth consecutive singles match in a row in Sunday's win over Fullerton. **Erlandsson** and **Peterson** defeated Cal State Fullerton's Kara Kolb and Helen Lu 6-1, 6-1 at No. 2 doubles, raising the duo's record to 7-1 on the season. **Erlandsson** downed the Titans' Christa Hanson 6-0, 6-1 at No. 2 singles, raising her individual singles record to 13-7, while **Peterson** beat Patty Vasos 6-0, 6-1 at No. 4 singles, improving her mark to 8-10.

Freshman **KATHY WAYNE** (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) remained unbeaten (6-0) in singles, as she won both of her matches in the No. 5 spot this weekend.

— Minnesota (3-11, 1-2) will have a two-week break before competing at the Big Ten championships in Ann Arbor, Mich. on March 20.

GOPHERS HIT SCHOOL-RECORD 190.35 AT OREGON STATE

— Gophers head coach Jim Stephenson had a preseason goal of hitting 190 this season, and Minnesota made that goal a reality on Saturday when the Gophers scored 190.35 and finished third at the Shanico Invitational in Corvallis, Ore. Thirteenth-ranked Brigham Young won the meet with a 191.55 score and host Oregon State (ranked fourth nationally) was second with a 191.40. Cal-Santa Barbara finished fourth with a 189.55 score.

Minnesota's team score was its highest ever, breaking the old school mark of 189.25 that was set last year against Michigan. Another standard was equaled this past weekend—that being the school uneven bars record. The Gophers scored 48.00 to equal the mark set by the 1990 team at the 1990 Big Ten championship. Minnesota established new balance beam and floor exercise records earlier in the season.

KETCHER THIRD IN ALL-AROUND, RIEGER SECOND IN BEAM

— After scoring a career-best 38.10 in the all-around last week against Gustavus Adolphus, senior **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) did even better this week, scoring 38.15 to finish third in the all-around at the Shanico Invitational. **Ketcher** scored a team-season high 9.70 in the vault; 9.55 in the uneven bars, 9.45 in the balance beam and 9.45 in the floor exercise.

Sophomore **MICHELLE RIEGER** (MARIETTA, GA/WESTFIELD-HOUSTON, TX) finished second in the balance beam with a 9.70 score. **Rieger** also competed in the uneven bars, finishing second on the team with a 9.65 mark that tied the career best she set last week. Sophomore **SHANNON FISHER** (MOUNDS VIEW, MN/SHOREVIEW) scored a career-best 38.00 to finish fourth all-around. **Fisher** notched scores of 9.25 in the vault, 9.55 in the bars, 9.55 in the beam and 9.65 in the floor exercise.

Senior **KRISTIN ALLSTADT** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) finished fourth all-around with a 37.95 score. Her event scores: 9.30 vault, 9.50 bars, 9.50 beam and 9.65 floor exercise.

Other top scores: freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH)—37.70 all-around, 9.75 bars, 9.55 beam; senior **MONIKA JUHASZ-NAGY** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY)—personal-season best 9.55 in the vault; junior **JESSICA WOLF** (OSHKOSH, WI/WEST)—personal-season best 9.40 in the bars; junior **LORI KINDLER** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL-MURRAY)—9.65 in the floor exercise.

CASTNER, KETCHER IN REGIONAL RACE — Castner and Ketcher are among the top contenders for the seven individual NCAA regional all-around spots. In last week's regional standings, **Castner** (37.36 regional qualifying score) ranked 13th and **Ketcher** (37.19 regional qualifying score) 15th among individual all-arounders. What is important to note, however, is that based on last week's rankings, eight of those 15 will qualify to the regional meet with their teams. That would leave **Castner** and **Ketcher** in the fifth and seventh spots, respectively, among those individual contenders.

Minnesota is mathematically eliminated from any chance of getting to regionals as a team. No matter what the Gophers score at the Big Ten championships on March 20, they can finish no higher than 10th in the region. The highest possible regional qualifying score Minnesota can attain is 188.15. Because regional qualifying scores can increase but never decrease, the Gophers cannot surpass Michigan State, which is currently in ninth place in the region with a 188.237 regional qualifying score.

Leading the Gophers were the team of senior **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) and sophomore **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN), shooting one under par with a 71.

SOFTBALL

GOPHERS GO 1-5 IN ARIZONA—The University of Minnesota softball team (7-9) had a 1-5 weekend against top-flight competition at the Arizona Softball Classic in Tucson, Ariz. Four of Minnesota's five losses came against teams that are currently ranked in the NCAA top five. The Gophers were finally shut out in their 15th game of the season on Saturday, with fourth-ranked California shutting down the Gopher offense by a score of 5-0. Fifth-ranked Cal State Fullerton eliminated the Gophers 2-0 later on Saturday.

THREE HITTERS AT .300 OR BETTER—Minnesota has three hitters that are currently hitting at least .300. Senior catcher **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL) continues to lead the Gophers with 16 hits, a .327 batting average and a .429 slugging average. Sojka, who hit .151 in 1992, needs three hits to surpass her total for the entire 1992 season. Senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) is hitting .319 and leads the Gophers with seven runs scored. Her 219 career hits currently rank her fifth on the all-time Big Ten list. Sophomore shortstop **KIKI ROMERO** (ALTA LOMA, CA/ST. LUCY PRIORY) hit .333 in Arizona to raise her batting average to .300. Romero has already surpassed her 1992 total of 11 hits with 12 in the first 16 games of the 1993 season.

RECORDS AT A GLANCE—Minnesota center fielder **MISCHEL DOERR** (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) is just 12 at bats away from the Minnesota career record. Her 666 at bats trail only the 678 accumulated by **Karl Blank** between 1988 and 1992. **Lezlie Weiss** moved closer to becoming the Gophers' all-time career leader in walks. Weiss now has 62 walks, just three short of the record which is shared by **Barb Drake** and **Dani Ortler**. Senior pitcher **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/MANKATO EAST) moved past Drake into fourth place on the all-time games pitched list this past weekend. Maschka now has 91 career games pitched.

FULLERTON TRIP STARTS MARCH 21—The Gophers' final excursion to the West Coast will start March 21. Minnesota will play in the Fullerton Round-Robin against DePaul, followed by a game against Ohio State or Cal State Fullerton. The Gophers will play Utah in a non-conference doubleheader at Fullerton on March 23, before beginning play in the Pony Tournament the next day.

TRACK AND FIELD**MINNESOTA FINISHES 10TH AT BIG TEN MEET—**

The University of Minnesota women's track and field team scored four points in each day of the two-day Big Ten indoor meet for a total of eight points, which earned the Gophers a 10th-place finish. Minnesota had four athletes and one relay that scored in the meet. Senior **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE) finished fifth in the long jump with a leap of 19-1. The 4x880-yard relay team of senior **ALISON TITCOMB** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG), sophomore **ANDREA GROVE** (WINNIPEG, MANITOBA, CANADA), freshman **BRIDGET NETUGENS** (OLIVIA, MN), and sophomore **HEATHER AMUNDSON** (NORTHWOOD, IA/NORTHWOOD-KENSETT) finished fifth with a time of 9:14.85, Minnesota's fastest time at that distance since 1985. Freshman **JOAN KARNES** (LONG PRAIRIE, MN) had her best meet of the year, placing fifth in the shot put with a throw of 45-2 1/2, followed by senior **JOYCE SCHULTZ** (WELLS, MN/WELLS-EASTON) in sixth with a put of 44-1 1/4. Freshman **LORI HARDRICK** (MILWAUKEE, WI/WISCONSIN LUTHERAN) was sixth in the triple jump with a mark of 36-3 1/2.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

MINNESOTA HOSTS NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS - The women's athletics department is hosting the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Swimming and Diving Championships Thursday through Saturday at the University Aquatic Center. The Gophers have three swimmers competing in seven events.

NELSON QUALIFIES IN DIVING - Junior three-time all-American **Laurie Nelson** (ETOBICOKE, ONT, CAN) qualified for all three diving events (1- and 3-meter springboard and platform) at the NCAA Zone Diving Meet in Ann Arbor, Mich. this past weekend. Nelson was second in platform diving with 345.35 points and third in 3-meter diving (471.25).

SWIMMING QUALIFIERS - Senior **Laura Herman** (HALES CORNERS, WI/WHITNALL) and freshman **Leslie Wilcox** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) have both qualified for the championships. Herman is ranked 10th in the 50-yard freestyle with a time of :23.19) and 45th in the 100-yard freestyle (:51.26). Wilcox is ranked ninth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:03.11) and 15th in the 200-yard breaststroke (2:16.37).

GYMNASTICS

GOPHERS TO END SEASON AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS — After being idle this past weekend, Minnesota (3-11, 1-2) will be looking to close its season with a strong showing Saturday at the Big Ten championships in Ann Arbor, Mich. The meet will be held in Crisler Arena and will begin at 7:10 p.m.

For the first time, the Big Ten championships will take place in a one-day format rather than the previous two-day format. Prior to this year, the team and individual all-around titles were awarded on the first night of competition, with the top eight scorers in each event coming back the following night to compete for individual event titles. This year's individual event titles will be awarded to the high scorers in each event during team competition.

LAST YEAR — The Gophers finished seventh among seven teams at last year's championship after winning three of the previous four Big Ten titles.

TEAM PREVIEW — No. 11 Penn State (192.01 regional qualifying score) and No. 12 Michigan (191.97 RQS) are the top-ranked teams. Michigan won its second conference title last season with a meet-record 191.70 score.

The other conference teams and current national ranking are: No. 24 Ohio State (189.80 RQS); No. 26 Iowa (189.17 RQS); No. 29 Michigan State (188.97 RQS); No. 38 MINNESOTA (186.85 RQS); and No. 48 Illinois (184.19 RQS).

INDIVIDUALS TO WATCH — The top-ranked individual entering the meet is Penn State senior **Allison Barber**, who is ranked 12th nationally with a 38.77 regional qualifying score. Michigan sophomore **Beth Wymer**, last year's all-around champion, is back, but it is not certain whether or not she will compete all-around, as she has not competed all-around in every Michigan meet this season. Wolverine sophomore **Kelly Carfora** is ranked 20th nationally with a 38.60 RQS.

Ohio State has three individuals ranked in the Northeast Region top 10. Buckeye senior **Emily Arnold** ranks third (38.34 RQS), freshman **Betsy Cousins** is fourth (37.96 RQS), and senior **Lynn Beagley** from St. Paul, Minn. is 10th (37.42 RQS).

Iowa freshman **Kim Baker** is ranked sixth in the Central Region all-around rankings with a 38.31 RQS, while Hawkeye junior **Sandy Stengel** is 15th (37.75 RQS). Gopher freshman **SUSAN CASTNER** (WORTHINGTON, OH) ranks 17th (37.55 RQS) in the Central Region, and Minnesota senior **DAWN KETCHER** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) is 18th (37.51 RQS).

CASTNER, KETCHER IN CONTENTION FOR INDIVIDUAL REGIONAL BERTHS — Seven teams qualify for NCAA regional competition in each of five regions. In addition, the top seven individual all-arounders not qualifying with their teams also make it.

Although Minnesota has been mathematically eliminated from team consideration, **Castner** and **Ketcher** are

in the running for individual berths. Prior to this past weekend's competition, **Castner** ranked sixth and **Ketcher** seventh in the region among individuals not among the region's current top seven teams.

The NCAA Central Region championship is April 3 in Baton Rouge, La.

BASKETBALL

ALL-BIG TEN — Minnesota's **CAROL ANN SHUDLICK** (APPLE VALLEY, MN/APPLE VALLEY) was named to the All-Big Ten first team for the 1992-93 season. Shudlick is the Gophers' first first-team selection since Laura Coenen in 1985. Shudlick is joined on the all-Big Ten team by Iowa's Toni Foster, Ohio States Nikki Keaton and Averill Roberts and Wisconsin's Robin Threatt. Foster was named the Big Ten's Player of the Year and Iowa's Vivian Stringer was named Coach of the Year.

Sophomore **CARA PEARSON** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) was named to the honorable mention All-Big Ten team.

FINAL STANDINGS— Minnesota finished in fifth place in the Big Ten Conference for its highest conference finish since 1984-85. In a preseason coaches poll, Big Ten coaches predicted the Gophers to finish 10th of 11 teams.

TOURNAMENT TEAMS — Four Big Ten teams were selected to participate in the NCAA Tournament 48-team field. Ohio State is the first seed in the East region and Penn State is the third seed in the East. Iowa is seeded second in the Midwest region. Ohio State, Penn State and Iowa all received first round byes. Northwestern will host Georgia Tech in the first round on March 17.

LEADER OF THE PACK — Shudlick closed out the season as the Big Ten's leading scorer with a 21.7 ppg average. Shudlick was also fourth in the conference in field goal percentage (.540), seventh in rebounding (8.1/game) and seventh in blocked shots (1.22/game).

SHUDLICK IN THE RECORDS— **Shudlick** closed out her junior season with 1,419 career points and is in fifth place on Minnesota's career scoring list. She is just 22 points away from passing Carol Peterka for fourth place (1,441) and is 581 points away from scoring 2,000. Shudlick's season scoring average of

22.6 ppg is Minnesota's best since Laura Coenen's 25.3 ppg in 1984-85.

Shudlick has also moved up in other records:

- Her season scoring total of 587 points is second on the all-time season scoring list. Shudlick passed Laura Coenen's second-place total of 581 points in 1982-83. Coenen holds the top season scoring spot with 708 points in 1984-85. Coenen and Shudlick now hold the top four spots in that category.

- Her 253 field goals for the season is second on the season list, passing Laura Coenen's second-place total of 251. Again, Coenen and Shudlick hold the top four spots in that category.

- She has moved into fifth place on the career field goals made list with 586.

- She is sixth in career field goals attempted with 1,140.

- She is eighth on the career free throws made list with 247 and ninth on the career free throws attempted list with 334.

HAWKEYES EDGE GOPHERS — Minnesota's six-match winning streak was halted Friday in Iowa City, Iowa, as Iowa downed Minnesota 5-4 in a contest that came down to the doubles matches. The teams split the six singles matches before the Hawkeyes clinched the match by winning at Nos. 1 and 2 doubles.

GOPHERS FRESHMEN STILL STREAKING — Freshman **KATHY WAYNE** (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) won her seventh consecutive singles match and remained undefeated (7-0) on the season by beating the Hawkeyes' Amy Jahn 6-1, 5-7, 6-3 at No. 5 singles. Minnesota's No. 3 doubles team, freshmen **KARIN ERLANDSSON** (MOLNDAL, SWEDEN) and **DANA PETERSON** (APPLE VALLEY, MN), won its eighth match in a row, topping Jahn and Cara Cashon 6-7 (4), 6-4, 6-1.

Four Gophers had singles winning streaks stopped at Iowa. Those individuals were: sophomore **SHANNA JOHNSON** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON), who had won four in a row; sophomore **SUSAN CULIK** (CHAPIN, SC), who had won five straight. **Erlandsson**, who had won six in a row; and **Peterson**, who also had won six in succession.

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA TAKES TO THE ROAD, AGAIN—The University of Minnesota softball team (7-9) will play a minimum of nine games in eight days as they take to the road for its fourth trip of the season. The Gophers will play Sunday, March 21 in the Fullerton-Round Robin, hosted by Cal State Fullerton. After an off day, Minnesota will play Utah in a non-conference doubleheader March 23 at Fullerton. The Gophers open play in the Pony Tournament on March 24, and will continue through March 28.

ROUND-ROBIN REPORT—Minnesota is one of four teams participating in the one-day Fullerton Round Robin. Each team will play a semifinal game, followed by a championship or third-place game. The Fullerton Round-Robin schedule (all games March 21, CST):

ROUND-ROBIN OPPONENTS—Minnesota and DePaul (4-5) have already met in 1993, with the Gophers and Blue Demons splitting a doubleheader in Lafayette, La. on Feb. 27. DePaul won the opener 4-2 in eight innings, while Minnesota took the nightcap 5-3. The Gophers lead the all-time series 2-1. Minnesota has won more games against **Ohio State** (2-4) than any other opponent in school history, winning 34 of 43 matchups. If the Gophers and Buckeyes play, it would be a precursor to their four-game Big Ten series April 30 and May 1 at the Bierman Softball Stadium. As successful as Minnesota has been against Ohio State, they have been as unsuccessful against **Cal State Fullerton** (6-8). The Titans have won 12 of the 13 lifetime matchups against the Gophers, with their only loss coming in 1992 at Arizona. **JENNIFER MCGUINNESS** (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG) hit a solo home run off of Cheryl Longeway and **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) hurled a five-hitter as Minnesota defeated Cal State Fullerton 5-0. Earlier this season, Titan ace Tiffany Boyd shut down the Gophers by a score of 2-0.

UTAH—The Utes and Gophers have not met since their two games in the 1991 NCAA Regional at College Station, Tex. In those games, Utah pitcher Janet Womack did not allow a run and Charmelle Green was the Utes' entire offense as Utah eliminated Minnesota by scores of 1-0 and 2-0. Green and Womack have now graduated from the Utah program. Utah leads the all-time series 5-1.

PONY PARTICULARS—The Pony Tournament is a 16-team, five-day tournament hosted by Cal State Fullerton. The teams are split into four pools of four teams, and each pool will conduct round-robin play. The teams are then seeded into a single-elimination cham-

championship bracket. Losers in the first round of the championship bracket will play in a consolation bracket. Minnesota's pool play schedule (all games CST):

PONY OPPONENTS—Minnesota and **Cal Poly-Pomona** (7-8) are in the same pool for the third consecutive year. The Gophers defeated the Broncos 5-1 in 1991, but dropped a 1-0 decision in 1992. Cal-Poly Pomona head coach Carol Spanks entered the 1993 season as the fourth-winningest active coach in the NCAA with 559 career victories. **Fresno State** (10-7) was ranked third in the 1993 NCAA preseason poll, but may move down when the first regular-season poll comes out Tuesday. The Bulldogs own the longest active winning streak against Minnesota, winning all seven career meetings. However, Fresno State had to rally from behind to defeat Minnesota 5-4 in the Arizona Softball Classic on March 4. **Florida State** and Minnesota have never played in the sport of softball. The Seminoles, ranked sixth in the 1993 NCAA preseason poll, participated in the 1992 Women's College World Series.

The highlight of the home season is the Nike Invitational on May 1, with Nebraska and Kansas expected to compete against the Gophers.

Nelson guided Minnesota to a 21st-place finish at the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, hosted by the University of Minnesota. Nelson placed in all three of the diving events, earning 33 of the Gophers' 39 points, two all-American and one honorable mention all-American honors. Nelson was third in 1-meter diving with 428 points, a Minnesota school record. She was sixth in platform diving (482.10) and 13th in 3-meter diving (453.80).

GYMNASTICS

CASTNER NAMED AS REPLACEMENT COMPETITOR AT REGIONAL — Freshman **Susan Castner**

(WORTHINGTON, OH) was Friday named to replace Northern Illinois' Goha Mroz as an individual all-around competitor in the NCAA Central Region Women's Gymnastics Championship meet Saturday in Baton Rouge, La. Mroz, who was seeded third among the seven individual qualifiers, broke a foot playing recreational soccer. **Castner**, who finished ninth all-around at the Big Ten championships, was the first alternate.

Castner's being named to a regional spot kept alive Minnesota's streak of having at least one individual qualify to an NCAA Regional in every year since the NCAA began sponsoring women's athletics in 1982.

GOPHERS HIT FAMILIAR SCORE AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS — Minnesota scored 187.45 and finished sixth out of seven teams at the Big Ten championship meet March 20 in Ann Arbor, Mich. Michigan won its second team title in a row with a meet-record 192.925 team score. Penn State was second (192.40), followed by Michigan State (191.60), Ohio State (189.675), Iowa (189.65), Minnesota and Illinois (184.00). Michigan sophomore Beth Wymer won her second consecutive all-around title with a 39.45 mark.

It was the third time in five years that the Gophers have scored 187.45 at the Big Ten championships. In the 1989 championships, Minnesota scored 187.45 at Iowa City, Iowa and won its second team title in a row.

The Gophers scored 187.45 again in 1990 (in Ann Arbor, Mich.), but slipped to third place.

KINDLER, CASTNER, ALLSTADT LEAD GOPHER SCORING — Junior **Lori Kindler** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL-MURRAY) had Minnesota's best individual showing in the meet, scoring a career-best 9.775 and tying for fourth in the floor exercise. **Castner's** 37.775 all-around score (ninth in the meet) was Minnesota's best all-around mark. She scored 9.25 in the vault, 9.60 in the bars, 9.45 in the beam and 9.475 in the floor exercise. Senior **Kristin Allstadt** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) closed her career with by scoring 37.575 in the all-around, which included a 9.675 in the floor exercise.

Senior **Monika Juhasz-Nagy** (BUDAPEST, HUNGARY/VOROSMARTY) scored 9.525 in the vault and 9.50 in the floor exercise in her final career meet. Sophomore **Shannon Fisher** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) scored 37.45 all-around, with scores of 9.275 in the vault, 9.20 in the bars, 9.40 in the beam and 9.575 in the floor exercise. Senior **Dawn Ketcher** (BROOKLYN PARK, MN/PARK CENTER) had Minnesota's best vault score (9.60) and scored 9.45 in the floor exercise and 36.80 all-around.

SEASON RECAP — The 1993 Gophers set new team meet records in the following categories: team score (190.35), balance beam (47.95) and floor exercise (48.15). Minnesota tied its previous best uneven bars mark (48.00).



Overall, the Gophers had their best-ever averages in team scoring (186.21), balance beam (46.50), and floor exercise (47.46). In the bars, Minnesota's 46.32 average was the third-highest in school history. The vault, however, was the Gophers' nemesis all season, as the team's 45.93 average was its first that was below 46.00 since 1988.

Minnesota finished the 1993 season with a 4-16 overall record and 2-7 Big Ten mark. The team's .200 winning percentage was the worst in school history, but the Gophers' 187.425 regional qualifying score was the third-best in school history. Minnesota finished in 13th place in the NCAA Central Region, the nation's deepest region.

GOPHERS START BIG TEN SEASON AT MICHIGAN

— The 1991 Big Ten champion Minnesota softball team (10-14) will take on 1992 Big Ten champion Michigan to open the 1993 Big Ten softball season. The Gophers and Wolverines will play doubleheaders Friday at 3 p.m. (EST) and Saturday at 1 p.m. (EST) at Alumni Field in Ann Arbor, Mich. Minnesota has lost the last nine games it has played against NCAA top 10 teams, including the last three games of the Pony Tournament. Michigan is currently ranked ninth, but there will be a new NCAA poll released Tuesday.

MICHIGAN—The Wolverines (14-6) have won seven of their last eight games, including a 3-1 record at the National Invitational Tournament at Sunnyvale, Calif. last weekend. Michigan defeated Santa Clara, Utah State and Bowling Green, while losing to Nebraska. Senior outfielder **Patti Benedict** was the 1992 Big Ten Player of the Year, and is having another banner year in 1993, hitting .500 (29-58) with seven triples and 19 runs batted in. Michigan has a team batting average of .277 with five Wolverines over .300. The Wolverines will likely rotate sophomore **Kelly Kovach** (5-4, 1.52 ERA) and senior **Kelly Forbis** (9-2, 1.55 ERA) in the circle.

THE SERIES—Michigan leads 23-18 and has won the last six contests. This series has been played the last two years on the last weekend of the season in Minneapolis and has decided the Big Ten championship on both occasions. In 1991, Minnesota won the first two games of the series to clinch the Big Ten title.

In 1992, Michigan swept the four-game series from Minnesota and waited to hear that Iowa lost its final game of the season for the Wolverines to clinch their first-ever Big Ten softball championship. Minnesota last traveled to Michigan in 1990. On that chilly weekend in Ann Arbor, Minnesota won the first two games and lost the last two games, gaining a split in the series.

SPRING BREAK REVIEW—Minnesota was 3-5 on its annual trip to Fullerton, Calif. The Gophers started play on the West Coast on March 21 with two games in the Pony Mini-Tournament. Senior **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) threw her second shutout of the season in blanking DePaul 2-0, but the Gophers were blanked 6-0 in the championship game by Cal State Fullerton. Minnesota split a non-conference doubleheader with Utah on March 23, losing the first game 2-1 in eight innings and winning the nightcap 3-0. In the second game, pitchers **JENNIFER McCANN** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XI) and **JENNIFER JOHNSON** (DIAMOND BAR, CA) combined on the shutout, while sophomore **JENNIFER McGUINNESS** (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG) drove in all three runs with a single and her first home run of the season.

The Pony Tournament started for Minnesota on March 24 with a 3-2 victory over Cal Poly Pomona. Senior **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) had the game-winning hit, a two-run homer in the fourth inning. The Gophers lost their final three games of the Pony Tournament to highly-ranked teams. Minnesota lost to fifth-ranked Fresno State 8-1, fourth-ranked Florida State 3-1 and third-ranked UNLV 5-4 to close out the tournament. Minnesota scored four runs in the top half of the first inning against the Rebels, its biggest output in an inning this season, but was unable to hold the lead.

Weiss needs five hits to tie Jenny Allard of Michigan for fourth place on the list and is 18 hits shy of the all-time record set by Alicia Seegert of Michigan. As a footnote, Patti Benedict of Michigan needs four hits this weekend to become the ninth player in Big Ten history to reach the 200-hit plateau for her career.

MINNESOTA OPENS HOME SEASON NEXT TUESDAY—Minnesota opens its 1993 home season at the Bierman Softball Stadium next Tuesday, April 6, against Mankato State in a non-conference doubleheader at 4 p.m. The Gophers will continue their Big Ten season next weekend with their first-ever trip to Penn State. The doubleheaders are scheduled for April 9 at 3 p.m. (EDT) and April 10 at 1 p.m. (EDT).

GOPHERS OPEN AT HOME, TRAVEL TO PENN STATE

After 26 games on unfamiliar grounds, the Minnesota softball team (10-16, 0-2 Big Ten) will open its 1993 home schedule at the Bierman Softball Stadium on Tuesday. Mankato State (13-7) is the opponent for a 4 p.m. non-conference doubleheader in Minneapolis.

Minnesota's homestand is a short one, as they will be back on the road for Big Ten action this weekend against Penn State (8-12, 0-4 Big Ten). The Gophers and Lady Lions will hook up for doubleheaders Friday at 3 p.m. (EDT) and Saturday at 1 p.m. (EDT).

MANKATO STATE—The Mavericks are currently ranked 15th in the NCAA Division II softball poll. Head coach **Lori Meyer** is in her ninth year at Mankato State and owns an overall record of 258-162-2 (.614).

The two Mankato State starting pitchers will likely be senior **Beth Herickhoff**, a high school teammate of Gopher **Melissa Wold** at Hill-Murray, and senior **Tami Johnson** from Champlin. The Mavericks have nine returning letterwinners on their 1993 squad, including infielders **Theresa Mackey**, **Vicki Schull** and **Missy Laatsch**. Nine of the 15 Mavericks hail from the state of Minnesota.

SERIES—Minnesota leads 16-4. The Gophers won last year's game 4-0, outhitting the Mavericks 14-3. Minnesota has won the last four games in the series, dating back to 1990.

PENN STATE—The Lady Lions opened their 1993 Big Ten season last weekend by dropping four games at Iowa by scores of 10-1, 3-0, 3-1 and 10-1. Dating back to last year, Penn State has now lost six consecutive Big Ten games and is 4-26 lifetime in Big Ten games. Penn State head coach **Sue Rankin** is 267-243 (.524) in 12 years as the Lady Lions' mentor.

The likely starters for Penn State in the circle are senior **Dawn Hoover** and junior **Leigh Bakun**. Hoover won Penn State's first-ever Big Ten game, a 1-0 eight-

inning shutout over Minnesota last season.

SERIES—Minnesota leads 5-1. The Gophers won three of four against the Lady Lions at the Bierman Softball Stadium to open the 1992 Big Ten season.

Minnesota lost the first game of the weekend series 1-0 but rebounded to win the next three games by scores of 6-0, 3-1, and 6-0. **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) and **MARIANN DUKART** (OAK GROVE, OR/REX PUTNAM) had batting averages of .500 and .462, respectively, against Penn State in 1992.

MICHIGAN REVIEW—Minnesota's scheduled four-game series with 15th-ranked Michigan was cut back to two games and moved to East Lansing, Mich. due to poor and snowy field conditions in Ann Arbor, Mich.

The two games were played Sunday on Michigan State's Old College Field. Michigan came out of the box quickly in the first game, scoring five runs in the first two innings in an 8-0 victory.

The nightcap saw a great pitcher's duel between Minnesota's **JENNIFER JOHNSON** (DIAMOND BAR, CA) and Michigan's Kelly Kovach. With the tie-breaker rule eliminated for the 1993 Big Ten season, the teams battled on until the 13th inning, when Michigan's Michelle Silver hit an inside-the-park home run to give the Wolverines a 1-0 victory.

The Gophers had chances to score, leaving 21 runners on base in 20 innings of play. Minnesota left Michigan with an 0-2 Big Ten record, with the other two games lost to the elements.

The record of 12 in a row was set by Kathleen Heckman and Claudia Brisk in 1982-83.

Sophomore **SHANNA JOHNSON** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) kept alive a winning streak of her own, beating Molly McCormick 6-3, 6-4 at No. 2 singles for her eighth win in a row. **Johnson** now has an overall season singles record of 9-7.

Minnesota won all three doubles matches.

Erlandsson and **Peterson** beat the Gusties' Bridget Ferguson and Kelly Laumann 6-1, 6-1 at No. 2 doubles to extend their winning streak, which began with a win on Feb. 12 over Ohio State's Allison Kinsey and Louise Johnson. **Erlandsson** and **Peterson** played their first match together on Jan. 31, losing to Notre Dame's Christy Faustmann and Lisa Tholen.

OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

TRACK TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA—The Minnesota women's track and field team will send a full squad to the Husker Invitational in Lincoln, Neb. on Saturday.

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA HOSTS IOWA STATE, TRAVELS TO NORTHWESTERN

The Minnesota softball team (16-16, 4-2 Big Ten) will host Iowa State in a non-conference doubleheader Tuesday at 4 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Stadium. Minnesota will travel to Evanston, Ill. for a Big Ten weekend with Northwestern (15-16, 2-2 Big Ten). The Gophers and Wildcats will meet Friday at 2 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. Minnesota is coming off of its most successful week of the season, having won two games against Mankato State and four games at Penn State. The six-game winning streak matches the longest of the 1992 season. After this weekend the Gophers will have 14 of the remaining 16 Big Ten games at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

BIG TEN UPDATE—Iowa is the only undefeated team in the conference, having swept four-game sets from Penn State and Michigan State over the past two weekends. This weekend, the Hawkeyes will travel to second-place Ohio State, which won three of four games at Indiana last weekend.

Michigan and Northwestern split a four-game series at Evanston last weekend, leaving the Wolverines, Wildcats and Gophers tied in the loss column. Minnesota and Northwestern will battle each other this weekend, while Michigan will host Michigan State in a Tuesday doubleheader and Indiana in a four-game series this weekend. Complete standings can be located on the Minnesota softball results page.

IOWA STATE—The Cyclones were 7-9 before games last week with Creighton, Western Illinois and Oklahoma. Iowa State returns 10 letterwinners from its 12-29 squad of 1992, including junior infielder **Missy Miller** from Richfield, Minn. Head coach **Deb Kuhn** is in her

11th season as Iowa State's head coach.

SERIES—Minnesota and Iowa State are tied at 25-25. The two teams split a doubleheader last year at Bierman, with the Cyclones winning the first game 2-1 and the Gophers taking the nightcap 3-0. The scheduled doubleheader at Iowa State last year was snowed out. The two teams are scheduled to meet again in Ames on April 21.

NORTHWESTERN—The Wildcats put themselves right back in the middle of the conference race last Saturday by sweeping 15th-ranked Michigan in a doubleheader. Northwestern junior pitcher **Michele Hawkins** pitched 20 innings in the four-game series and received all four decisions. Hawkins is 9-11 in 1993 with four shutouts and a 1.94 ERA. The Wildcats' top hitters are junior catcher **Anne Carpenter** (.329, 6 RBI) and senior infielder **Dena Petersen** (.286, 7 RBI). Petersen was 3-for-12 in the Michigan series and Carpenter was 2-for-8. Head coach **Sharon Drysdale** is in her 15th year as the Wildcats' coach and has a career record of 460-325-3.

SERIES—Minnesota leads 25-20. In 1992, Minnesota won three of five matchups with Northwestern, including three wins in the the four-game series at Minneapolis. Earlier this year, sophomore **JENNIFER McCANN** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XI) and Hawkins met in a pitching duel, with McCann twirling a five-hitter and Minnesota defeating Northwestern 1-0 in Tucson, Ariz. on March 5.

A PERFECT WEEK—Well, maybe not perfect, but Minnesota did win all six softball games it played last week. The Gophers started with a doubleheader sweep of Mankato State last Tuesday at the Bierman Softball Stadium. Senior **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) shut down the Mavericks on three hits to lead

the Gophers to a 6-0 win in the first game. The Minnesota offense took over in the second game, bashing out a season-high 21 hits to win the nightcap 11-1. Junior **MARIANN DUKART** (OAK GROVE, OR/REX PUTNAM) tied the Minnesota single-game record and the Bierman Softball Stadium single-game record with four hits in the second game.

Last Friday, Minnesota threw two shutouts at Penn State, winning by scores of 5-0 and 1-0. Maschka limited the Lady Lions to six hits in the opener, while freshman **JENNIFER JOHNSON** (DIAMOND BAR, CA) did not allow a hit until the sixth inning of the second game and ended up with a two-hitter and her first shutout as a Gopher. Saturday's games were postponed until Sunday morning due to rain. On Sunday, senior catcher **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) tripled home one run and scored a second run as Minnesota defeated Penn State 2-0 in the opener. Maschka threw her third shutout of the week, a two-hitter. The nightcap was decided in the bottom half of the seventh inning. Senior infielder **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) walked with the bases loaded and two out to score **KATIE PETERSON** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XI) from third base to give Minnesota a 2-1 win and a four-game sweep over the Lady Lions.

SOJKA, MASCHKA NOMINATED FOR BIG TEN AWARDS

Senior catcher **Lisa Sojka** and senior pitcher **Sarah Maschka** were nominated for Big Ten Player of the Week and Big Ten Pitcher of the Week, respectively. Sojka was 9-for-18 (.500) last week with three doubles, one triple, three runs scored and three runs batted in. Sojka leads Minnesota with a .389 Big Ten batting average and a .323 overall batting average. Maschka threw three shutouts in three appearances, her first such streak as a Gopher. She allowed 11 hits and no walks in 21 innings while striking out 10 batters. Maschka has not allowed a walk in her last 36 innings of work.

WEISS WATCH—With seven hits last week, senior Lezlie Weiss moved into third place on the Big Ten's all-time hit list and now needs 11 hits to break the conference's all-time record. The top five:

VOELZ DISMISSAL OF DELIS UPHELD

The dismissal of Katalin Deli, former head coach of the University of Minnesota Women's Gymnastics Team, has been upheld at the final stage of the university's grievance process.

Women's Athletics Director Chris Voelz, who dismissed Deli last June, appealed an internal panel's Feb. 8 ruling that Deli be reinstated as head coach. Elton Kuderer, chair of the Board of Regents, reviewed the case at the request of President Nils Hasselmo.

Kuderer upheld Voelz's action, concluding that Katalin Deli violated NCAA rules, encouraged students to lie and disregarded direct orders from Voelz.

"College athletics are supposed to teach student athletes to play by the rules," Kuderer wrote in his decision. "The conduct of Katalin Deli in directing her student athletes to lie to the director (Voelz) and to law enforcement people is contrary to the rules and moral values of our society. Such an example is counter-productive, contrary and it is just plain wrong."

"I believe Regent Kuderer's final decision validates the university's expectations of honesty and accountability by its employees," Voelz said.

Kuderer countered the contention that Katalin Deli was fired because of a videotape showing explicit sex circulated among gymnastics team members. He called the tape the "triggering mechanism" that compelled Voelz to investigate Katalin Deli's coaching activities. "The investigation produced other evidence justifying the dismissal," Kuderer wrote.

In addition, Kuderer confirmed the panel's Feb. 8 ruling that Voelz justifiably fired Deli's husband, former assistant gymnastics coach Gabor Deli.

Kuderer concluded that Gabor Deli had twice videotaped sexual acts between him and his wife, using university equipment and tapes he knew would be seen by team members. Kuderer said his findings show the tapes were made and distributed by Gabor without his wife's knowledge.

In the nightcap, sophomore **KATIE PETERSON** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XI) doubled home freshman **JODI MASSUCCI** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) from second base with two out in the seventh inning to cap a three-run rally as the Gophers defeated the Cyclones 4-3.

Minnesota's four-game series with Northwestern did not start until last Saturday. **Maschka** and Northwestern's **Michele Hawkins** traded zeros until the 11th inning of the opener, when **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) singled home **MISCHEL DOERR** (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) with the game's only run in the Gophers' 1-0 victory.

In the second game, Wildcat hurler **Beverly Stiglbauer** tossed a three-hitter to give Northwestern a 3-0 win and snap Minnesota's nine-game winning streak.

Sunday started with Minnesota scoring three runs in the third inning and holding on for a 3-2 victory. In the final game, the Gophers scored in each of the first three innings and stranded 10 Northwestern runners on base to earn a 4-1 win and the doubleheader sweep.

Minnesota is now 7-3 in the Big Ten and will play 14 of its 16 remaining Big Ten games at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

Neither diver qualified for the Phillips 66 United States Diving Championships, April 20-24 in Austin, Texas. **Cook** was 12th in 1-meter diving and 10th in 3-meter diving, while **Martin** was ninth in 1-meter diving and 18th in 3-meter diving. Earlier this year **Martin** prequalified for the national championships in platform diving.

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO DRAKE—The Minnesota women's track and field team will make its annual trip to the Drake Relays next Friday and Saturday in Des Moines, Iowa.

THREE PROVISIONAL QUALIFIERS AT MT. SAC—The Gophers had three NCAA provisional qualifiers at the Mt. Sac Relays in Walnut, Calif. Senior **SUSAN BLISS** (ST. CHARLES, MO/FRANCIS HOWELL) ran the second-fastest 10,000-meter time in Minnesota history with a time of 34:22.50. Junior **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS) improved her NCAA provisional mark in the javelin with a throw of 167-6 and is third on Minnesota's all-time list. Senior **JOYCE SCHULTZ** (WELLS, MN/WELLS-EASTON) qualified with a career-best throw in the discus of 160-0. Before last weekend, no Big Ten athlete had a mark this season that was better than **Berlin's** throw in the javelin or **Schultz's** throw in the discus.

The Minnesota 4x100-meter relay team of **VAL OWEN** (McCOOK, NE), **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC), **ANGIE MAULDIN** (COLUMBUS, WI), and **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN) ran Minnesota's fastest time in three years with a time of 47.68.

WHAT'S NEXT—Minnesota will host its biggest meet of the year when it hosts the Nike Invitational on May 1 at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. Nebraska and Kansas will be among the opponents.

— Sophomore **SHANNA JOHNSON** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) had her 12-match singles winning streak broken Friday as Northwestern's Elissa Kim beat **Johnson** 6-4, 2-6, 6-4 in a 7-2 Northwestern win in Evanston, Ill. **Johnson** fell one match short of tying Lisa Martin's school-record 13-match streak.

The Gophers wrapped up their regular season dual schedule on Sunday in Madison, Wis., where they lost to Wisconsin 8-1. Minnesota's only win against the Badgers was at No. 3 doubles, where **Johnson** and freshman **KATHY WAYNE** (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) beat Kira Gregersen and Jamie Furet 6-4, 6-1. It was the second win in a row for **Johnson** and **Wayne**, who teamed up in doubles for the first time on Friday and beat Northwestern's Joanna Feria and Amy Heath 6-4, 6-1.

Wayne got the Gophers' only singles win over the weekend, beating Northwestern's Heath 6-4, 6-3 on Friday.

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA HOSTS IOWA, OHIO STATE—The Minnesota softball team (23-17, 7-3 Big Ten) will host Iowa (33-8, 14-2 Big Ten) and Ohio State (21-17, 10-4 Big Ten) in six games this week at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

The ninth-ranked Hawkeyes and Gophers will play a doubleheader Tuesday at 3 p.m. The four-game season series is scheduled to conclude in Iowa City next Tuesday.

Minnesota will play Ohio State in doubleheaders Friday at 6 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. Saturday is "Hall of Fame Day," as the On Deck Circle will honor the newest members to the Minnesota Softball Hall of Fame.

BIG TEN UPDATE— Iowa seized first place in the conference with a four-game sweep at Indiana. The Hawkeyes picked up two games on idle Michigan and Minnesota, which were idle last week. Michigan and Minnesota will have a chance to makeup the two games during the weekend of May 7-8, when Iowa is idle.

Ohio State also had a four-game sweep last weekend, as it swept Michigan State at East Lansing, Mich. The Buckeyes trail the Hawkeyes by two games in the standings. Complete Big Ten standings can be found on the Minnesota results page of this release.

IOWA—The ninth-ranked Hawkeyes have won seven consecutive games and 24 of their last 27 games. The Hawkeye offense is the tops in the conference with 5.5 runs/game and a .369 batting average in Big Ten play.

For the season, senior outfielder **Kim Davis** leads the Big Ten with a .431 batting average and leads the Hawkeyes with 33 runs scored and 13 doubles. Freshman outfielder **Tasha Reents** leads the Big Ten with 25 stolen bases and wields a .393 batting average.

In the circle, junior right-hander **Karen Jackson** is the staff workhorse. In Big Ten play, Jackson has thrown 72 of Iowa's 108 innings and has 10 of the Hawkeyes' 14 conference wins. Overall, Jackson is 23-5 with a 0.50 ERA. Jackson also leads the Big Ten with 190 strikeouts in 181 2/3 innings pitched.

SERIES—Minnesota leads 29-24. The Hawkeyes won three of four games in 1992, sweeping a doubleheader in Iowa City and splitting a doubleheader in Minneapolis. Minnesota's last season series win over Iowa came in 1990, when the Gophers took three of four games from the Hawkeyes.

OHIO STATE—The Buckeyes are the only team in the conference to have defeated Iowa, doing it twice in Columbus. Ohio State is 17-5 since returning from the Pony Tournament on March 27.

Offensively, junior **Krion Clark** is the Buckeyes' top threat. Clark leads the Buckeyes with a .413 batting average, 10 doubles, five triples, three home runs, 26 runs scored and 23 runs batted in.

Clark is one of three pitchers that share the Ohio State pitching chores. Clark (5-4, 2.30 ERA) is joined by senior **Belinda Cernava** (8-8, 1.49 ERA) and senior **Stacy Dickins** (8-5, 1.48 ERA). Ohio State has a team earned run average of 0.28 after 14 Big Ten games.

SERIES—Minnesota leads 34-9. Minnesota won three of four games at Ohio State in 1992. The Gophers have won nine of the last 10 meetings with the Buckeyes dating back to 1990, and own a six-game winning streak against Ohio State at Bierman dating back to 1989.

GOPHERS SWEEP IOWA STATE—Minnesota swept a doubleheader from Iowa State in Ames last Wednesday by scores of 5-1 and 1-0. The two wins extended the Gophers' streaks to four consecutive wins and 13 wins in their last 14 games. It also marked the first time in school history that Minnesota had swept a four-game season series from Iowa State.

In the opener, senior **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) limited the Cyclones to one unearned run on six hits to earn her seventh consecutive victory. Junior designated player **JENNIFER McGUINNESS** (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG) had her second three-hit game of the year to lead an 11-hit attack.

Gopher freshman **JENNIFER JOHNSON** (DIAMOND BAR, CA) had her best-ever pitching performance at the collegiate level in the second game. Johnson allowed only one hit and one walk while striking out a career-high nine batters in pitching her second shutout of the season.

WEISS WATCH—Minnesota senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) had three hits in the doubleheader against Iowa State to raise her career total to 240 and tie Alicia Seegert of Michigan for the all-time Big Ten record.

Weiss has been the hottest bat for Minnesota recently, as she holds an eight-game hitting streak. Weiss has had at least one hit in 13 of the last 14 games and is 17-for-41 (.415) during that stretch. Her season batting average of .308 leads the Minnesota regulars.

ONE FOR THE DEFENSE—Minnesota's fielding percentage of .966 through 40 games is on pace to break the school record of .961 set by the 1983 team. Minnesota is averaging 1.15 errors/game in 1993, compared with 1.58 errors/game for the 1992 season.

Minnesota's .978 fielding percentage in Big Ten play leads all conference teams. That means that the Big Ten's top hitting team (Iowa), top pitching team (Ohio State) and top fielding team (Minnesota) will be in action this week in the Twin Cities.

THE COACH—Minnesota's **Lisa Bernstein** (Arizona '86) is in her second year as the Gopher mentor and has a career record of 56-45-1 (.554).

WHAT'S NEXT—The Gophers and Hawkeyes will play a Big Ten doubleheader in Iowa City on May 4 at 3 p.m. Minnesota will come home for its final 10 regular season games, starting with a four-game series against Indiana. The Gophers and Hoosiers will play doubleheaders May 7 at 6 p.m. and May 8 at 1 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

MINNESOTA HOSTS NIKE INVITATIONAL—The University of Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Nike Invitational on Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. This is a coed meet and will be team scored. Teams that are scheduled to compete against the Gophers include Nebraska, Kansas, Mankato State, St. Cloud State, St. Olaf and North Dakota.

MARKS IMPROVE AT DRAKE—Senior **JOYCE SCHULTZ** (WELLS, MN/WELLS-EASTON) and freshman **DANI PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CENTRAL) both improved their career bests in the discus Saturday. Schultz tossed the discus 163-1 to improve her NCAA provisional qualifying mark and her fifth-place standing on Minnesota's all-time list. Parkos had a mark of 160-10 to provisionally qualify for the NCAA meet and become the sixth Gopher in history to throw the discus 160 feet.

The distance medley team of **ALISON TITCOMB** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG), **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN), **BRIDGET NEUTGENS** (OLIVIA, MN) and **SUSAN BLISS** (ST. CHARLES, MO/FRANCIS HOWELL) finished with a time of 11:42.34, the second-fastest in Minnesota history. The school record of 11:37.34 was set at the Drake Relays in 1990.

WHAT'S NEXT—Minnesota will host the Minnesota Open next Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. There is also a possibility that the Gophers will send some athletes to the Nebraska Twilight next Saturday in Lincoln, Neb.

SCHEDULE CHANGE—The Minnesota Twilight has been rescheduled for Wednesday, May 26 at 5 p.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. That is a change from Thursday, May 27.

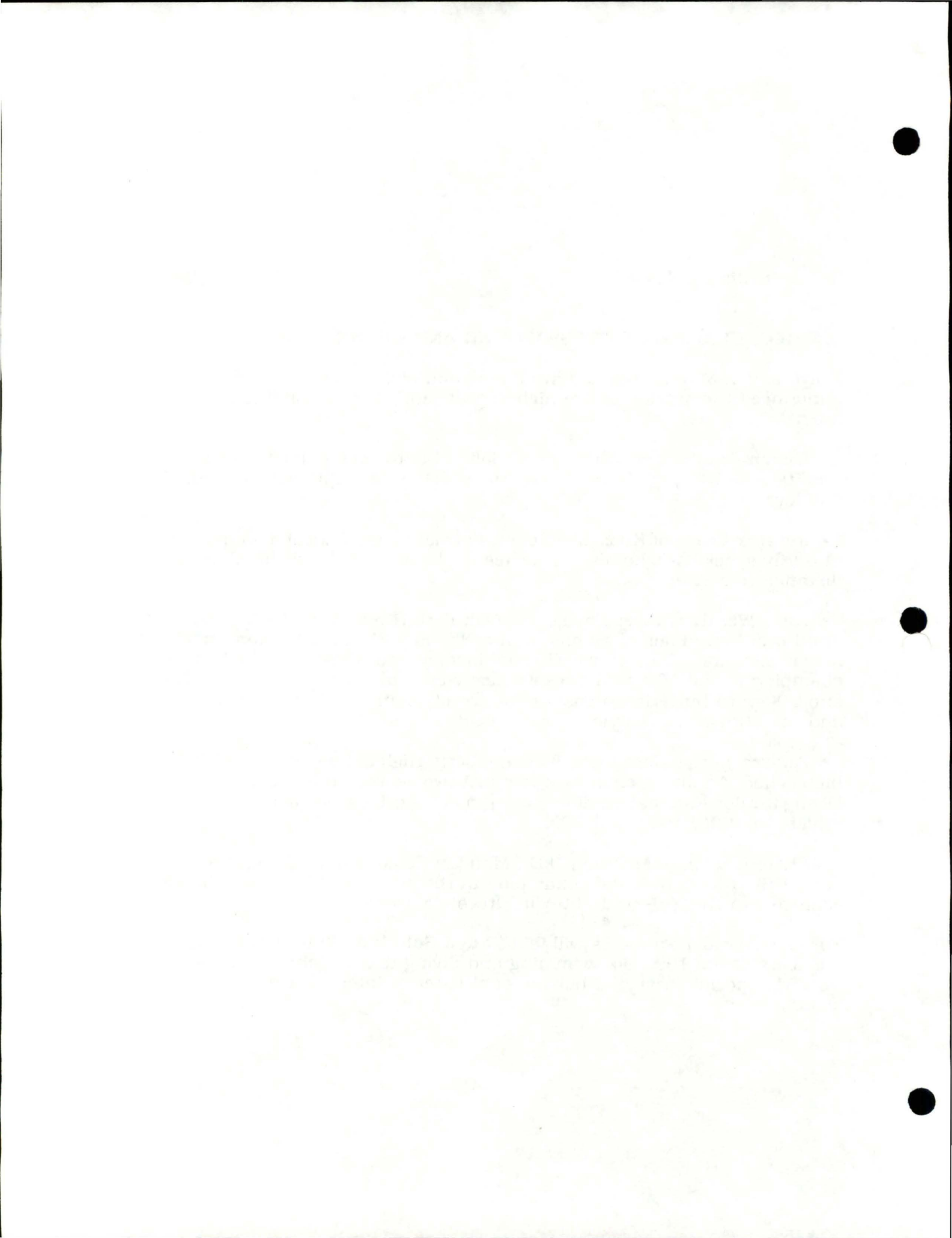

MASCHKA NAMED ATHLETE OF THE MONTH—Minnesota senior pitcher **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) was named the Athlete of the Month for April for the Minnesota women's athletic department. Maschka was 9-1 in April, winning her final nine decisions of the month. Seven of Maschka's wins were shutouts and she had a 0.81 earned run average. Maschka won five consecutive games by shutout during the month, tying a school record. For the season, Maschka is 14-9 with a 1.19 earned run average. She has set personal bests in a season for wins, earned run average, shutouts (9), complete games (21) and strikeouts (106). As a team, the Gophers were 16-3 and moved into third place in the Big Ten Conference.

GOLF

BIG TEN GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS AT IOWA CITY -

The 12th Annual Big Ten Women's Golf Championships will be May 7-9 at the University of Iowa Finkbine Golf Course in Iowa City. The three-day tournament features 72 holes, with 36 holes being played on Friday and the final two rounds being played Saturday and Sunday. Tee times are 8 a.m. on Friday and 9 a.m. for Saturday and Sunday. For the Big Ten championship, the course is par 73 and played at 5,950 yards.

THE GOPHERS- Minnesota returns all six members of its second-place 1992 Big Ten team to this year's championship, including two all-Big Ten selection competitors. Last year Minnesota finished five strokes behind tournament winner Indiana and eight strokes ahead of third-place Illinois.

The Gophers are led by senior **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND), a 1991 and 1992 all-Big Ten selection and the 1990 Big Ten freshman of the year. Evens has a 78.42 stroke average this spring and was third last year at the championship. Senior **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN), playing in the number two slot for the Gophers, was a 1992 all-Big Ten selection and has a 79.00 spring stroke average. She was 20th last year at the Big Ten tournament.

Sophomore **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) was fifth at last year's championship and

has a 79.45 stroke average this spring. Junior **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN/LEWISTON-ALTURA), playing in her third Big Ten championship, was sixth last year at the Big Ten meet and is carrying an 81.83 spring stroke average. Sophomore **JENNY KAISER** (RICHFIELD, MN) has an 80.67 stroke average for the spring season and was 17th last year at the the championships. Sophomore **AMY SCHMIESING** (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) has an 82.33 stroke average this spring and was 46th at the 1992 conference championship.

BASKETBALL

ELECTED— Head coach Linda Hill-MacDonald was recently elected second vice-president of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) and is in line to serve as the organization's president in 1995. Minnesota hosts the Women's Final Four at the Target Center in 1995.

Hill-MacDonald has also been selected to lead a team of Big Ten All-Stars over the summer and will take the team to Helsinki, Finland, and St. Petersburg, Russia in August.



SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO IOWA, HOSTS INDIANA—

The Minnesota softball team (27-18, 11-4 Big Ten) will travel to Iowa (35-11, 16-5 Big Ten) and host Indiana (21-19, 5-13 Big Ten) in seven Big Ten games this week.

The ninth-ranked Hawkeyes and Gophers will play a doubleheader Tuesday at 3 p.m. and a single game Wednesday at 3 p.m. in Iowa City. The Wednesday game is a makeup of the game that was rained out last Tuesday in Minneapolis.

Minnesota will play Indiana in doubleheaders Friday at 6 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Stadium. Saturday is a "Hometown Day" for **Ann Bartholmey**, **Rachelle Tveter** and the city of **Austin**. WCCO Radio and Cenex/Land O' Lakes are the sponsors of this "Hometown Day."

BIG TEN UPDATE—Michigan took over possession of first place in the Big Ten with a four-game sweep of Penn State in Ann Arbor. Iowa fell to second after losing three of five games to Minnesota and Northwestern last week, while Minnesota won four of five games against Iowa and Ohio State to strengthen its hold on third place.

In this week's action, Michigan will travel to Ohio State this weekend for a four-game series. Iowa and Minnesota will play three games Tuesday and Wednesday in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes have the weekend off, while Minnesota hosts Indiana for a four-game series. Complete Big Ten standings are located on Minnesota's results page.

IOWA—The ninth-ranked Hawkeyes slumped with a 2-3 record last week and fell out of first place in the Big Ten for the first time all season. Iowa's offense averaged 1.4 runs and 5.6 hits per game last week, as opposed to 5.5 runs and 10.3 hits per game during the first 16 games of the conference season.

For the season, senior outfielder **Kim Davis** leads the Big Ten with a .417 batting average. Senior outfielder **Jenny Roe** became the 10th player in Big Ten history to accumulate 200 hits in a career last weekend against Northwestern and is Iowa's all-time career leader in runs batted in.

In the circle, junior right-hander **Karen Jackson** has been one of the dominant pitchers in the Big Ten. The exception to this statement was last week, when she went 0-3 against Minnesota and Northwestern and received no runs in support. Despite her 0-3 week, Jackson still has very credible overall numbers (23-8, 0.62 ERA, 206 strikeouts in 201 2/3 innings pitched).

SERIES—Minnesota leads 30-24. Minnesota won last week's game by a final score of 2-0. Iowa has won the last two games in Iowa City.

INDIANA—The Hoosiers will be well-rested when they arrive in the Twin Cities, as their last games before this weekend's doubleheader were played April 27 against Indiana State. Indiana swept Indiana State by scores of

9-1 and 6-0 and enters the Minnesota series with a two-game winning streak.

Offensively, freshman infielder **Angie Rapp** leads the Hoosiers with a .361 batting average and a .345 average in Big Ten play. Sophomore catcher **Michelle Venturella** has 22 runs batted in to lead the Hoosiers.

Indiana's pitching duties have been split between sophomore **Janelle Campbell** (9-8, 2.18 ERA), freshman **Gina Ugo** (6-4, 2.29 ERA) and freshman **Kassey Reynolds** (6-6, 2.63 ERA). Ugo graduated from Carl Sandberg High School, the same school that produced Minnesota designated player **Jennifer McGuinness**.

SERIES—Indiana leads 27-16. Minnesota has won six of the last eight games over the past two years. This is the first meeting between the two teams in the Twin Cities since 1990.

GOPHERS DEFEAT IOWA, WIN THREE OF FOUR

FROM OHIO STATE—Minnesota defeated ninth-ranked Iowa 2-0 last Tuesday at the Bierman Softball Stadium before the rains came and postponed the second game. Senior **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) pitched her eighth shutout of the year, while **JENNIFER McGUINNESS** (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG) and **MELISSA WOLD** (OAKDALE, MN/HILL-MURRAY) each had run-scoring singles.

Minnesota swept Ohio State in a doubleheader Friday at Bierman, winning by scores of 1-0 in nine innings and 3-2. **Maschka** threw nine scoreless innings for her ninth win in a row, and **MARIANN DUKART** (OAK GROVE, OR/REX PUTNAM) had a run-scoring single in the ninth inning. In the nightcap, **McGuinness** hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning to rally the Gophers from a 2-1 deficit. The home run was the first for a Minnesota player in 12 years at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

After a rainout on Saturday, the Gophers and Buckeyes split a doubleheader Sunday. Minnesota won the first game 2-1 in 13 innings on **McGuinness'** run-scoring single in the last half of the 13th. Ohio State broke Minnesota eight-game winning streak in the nightcap, defeating the Gophers 2-0. The loss was the first at home for Minnesota in 1993.

WEISS SETS NEW BIG TEN RECORD—Minnesota senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) became the Big Ten's all-time career leader in hits Friday against Ohio State. Weiss' fourth-inning bunt single against Buckeye pitcher Belinda Cernava was the 241st of her career, breaking the record of 240 set by Alicia Seegert of Michigan from 1984-87. Weiss has 245 hits in her career with 13 games remaining in Minnesota's regular season.

MASCHKA OUT INDEFINITELY—Gopher senior left-hander **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) was struck by a line drive off the bat of Buckeye infielder Marla Pickard in the 13th inning of Sunday's first game against Ohio State. The ball hit Maschka's left hand, breaking a bone in her fourth finger.

Maschka will be out indefinitely, pending a re-examination of her hand Monday.

THE COACH—Minnesota's **Lisa Bernstein** (Arizona '86) is in her second year as the Gopher mentor and has a career record of 60-46-1 (.566).

WHAT'S NEXT—The Gophers will close the 1993 regular season with six games at the Bierman Softball Stadium. The Gophers will host Minnesota-Duluth on May 11 at 6 p.m., followed by Big Ten doubleheaders against Michigan State on May 14 at 6 p.m. and May 15 at 1 p.m.

OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

GOPHERS HOST MINNESOTA OPEN — The Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Minnesota Open on Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. This women's only, non-scoring meet will feature Division II and III teams from Minnesota and Wisconsin. This is the next-to-last chance for Minnesota to prepare for the Big Ten meet May 1-22 at Michigan State.

MINNESOTA FINISHES THIRD AT NIKE INVITATIONAL — The Gophers (55 points) finished behind Nebraska (89) and Kansas (68) at last Saturday's Nike Invitational at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium.

Individually, Minnesota won two events Saturday. Junior **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS) won the javelin with a throw of 165-9, just short of her seasonal best of 167-6. Senior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) won the 3000 meters with a time of 9:44.36, Minnesota's fastest time at that distance this season.

Freshman **ANNA-MARIE LARSON** (ST. PAUL, MN/HARDING) had Minnesota's best long jump of the season, leaping 18-0 1/2. The jump also marked a personal best at Minnesota by over 20 inches and ranks seventh on Minnesota's all-time list.

Senior **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC) finished second in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 14.28, a seasonal best. Redman is the Minnesota record holder in the event, running a time of 14.08 at last year's Big Ten meet in Minneapolis.

WHAT'S NEXT — The Gophers will host the Minnesota Open II on May 15 at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. The Big Ten meet is May 21-22 at Michigan State.

TENNIS

GOPHERS FINISH SEVENTH AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS — Minnesota split four matches at the Big Ten championships this past weekend in Bloomington, Ind. and finished seventh in the conference for the second year in a row.

The Gophers (12-13, 5-9), seeded eighth going into the tournament, beat ninth-seeded Ohio State 5-2 in the first round and then lost to top-seeded Indiana 5-0 in the quarterfinals.

Minnesota then lost to fifth-seeded Michigan 5-2 in the semifinals of the back draw before beating seventh-seeded Michigan State 5-2 in the seventh-place match.

Indiana won the conference title, beating Wisconsin 5-0 in the championship match. Illinois defeated Northwestern 5-4 for third place; Iowa beat Michigan 5-4 for fifth place; and Penn State beat Ohio State 5-4 for ninth place. Purdue finished in 11th place.

JOHNSON PACES TEAM WITH 3-0 MARK AT BIG TENS — Sophomore **SHANNA JOHNSON** (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) had the team's best record at the championship tournament, as she went 3-0 at No. 3 singles and 1-0 at No. 3 doubles. Sophomore **SUSAN CULIK** (CHAPIN, SC) was 3-1 at No. 1 singles.

Culik finished the season with a team-high 20 wins, going 20-19 overall and 13-12 at No. 1 singles. **Johnson** had the team's best Big Ten singles record at 10-3 and finished with a 16-9 overall singles record. Freshman **KARIN ERLANDSSON** (MOLNDAL, SWEDEN) was 17-17 at No. 2 singles and tied for the team lead in doubles wins with 16. She had a 16-7 overall doubles record. Sharing team honors with **Erlandsson** for most doubles wins was freshman **DANA PETERSON** (APPLE VALLEY, MN), who had a 16-8 individual mark. Together, **Erlandsson** and **Peterson** were a team-leading 14-5 in doubles.

Freshman **KATHY WAYNE** (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) had the team's best winning percentages in both singles and doubles. **Wayne** had a .647 (11-6 record) singles winning percentage and .765 (13-4 record) doubles winning percentage.

SOFTBALL

MINNESOTA CLOSES WITH SIX AT HOME—The Minnesota softball team (28-23, 12-9 Big Ten) will finish its 1993 season this week with two games against Minnesota-Duluth (30-7, 9-1 NSIC) on Tuesday and four games against Michigan State (11-32, 4-18 Big Ten) on Friday and Saturday.

The Gophers and Bulldogs will play two games Tuesday night at 6 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Stadium.

Minnesota and Michigan State will end their respective seasons with Big Ten doubleheaders Friday at 6 p.m. and Saturday at 1 p.m. at the Bierman Softball Stadium. The Gophers will salute their five outgoing seniors before Saturday's doubleheader.

BIG TEN UPDATE—Michigan won four games at Ohio State last weekend to strengthen its hold on first place in the Big Ten standings. The Wolverines need at least one win at Michigan State on Tuesday and two wins at Iowa on Friday and Saturday to clinch the Big Ten title. Iowa can win the Big Ten with three wins over Michigan, regardless of the Wolverines' results in East Lansing on Tuesday.

Minnesota will finish third, fourth or fifth in the Big Ten standings. Third-place Northwestern and fifth-place Ohio State each have Tuesday Big Ten doubleheaders before closing the season against each other in Columbus this weekend. Complete Big Ten standings are located on Minnesota's results page.

MINNESOTA-DULUTH—The Bulldogs have won their last 15 games, with their last loss coming April 23 against Winona State. That loss against Winona State is UMD's only conference loss in the last two years. The defending Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference champions will play their final two conference games Monday at Southwest State before playing the Gophers on Tuesday.

Duluth's top hitters are junior infielder **Karen Denslow** (.434, 16 RBI), junior infielder **Brenda Bergquist** (.404, 4 HR, 25 RBI) and junior outfielder **Bridget Vesel** (.396, 23 RBI). The Bulldogs have split their pitching chores between sophomore **Jennifer Sager** (12-3, 1.02 ERA), freshman **Laura Wentz** (8-1,

1.24 ERA) and sophomore **Laura Wegler** (10-3, 2.18 ERA). Minnesota-Duluth coach Bill Haller is in his 12th season and has a record at Duluth of 339-115-1 (.747).

SERIES—Minnesota leads 15-2. In their last meeting, the Gophers defeated Minnesota-Duluth 3-2 at the Metrodome on February 9, 1991. In 1990, the Bulldogs earned a split of the last doubleheader played between the two teams at Bierman.

MICHIGAN STATE—The Spartans will finish either seventh or eighth in the Big Ten standings, depending on their performances and Penn State's performances this week. Michigan State will host Big Ten leader Michigan in a doubleheader Tuesday before heading to the Twin Cities for the weekend.

Michigan State is on a 12-game losing streak. The Spartans' leading hitters are freshman infielder **Patty Raduenz** (.316, 16 RBI) and senior infielder **Julie Hirth** (.268, 13 RBI). Michigan State's pitchers will likely be senior **Shelly Wynn** (5-17, 2.65 ERA) and sophomore **Alina Baron** (4-14, 3.16 ERA). Michigan State coach **Gloria Becksford** (Michigan State '77) is in her 14th year and has a career record of 259-402-4 (.392).

SERIES—Minnesota leads 27-14. The Gophers won all four meetings at Michigan State last year by shutout and have not allowed a run to the Spartans in the last 48 innings. Minnesota owns a current 10-game winning streak against Michigan State.

GOPHERS LOSE FIVE OF SIX TO IOWA, INDIANA—The Gophers lost a doubleheader at ninth-ranked Iowa last Wednesday and three of four games to Indiana on Friday and Saturday at Bierman to fall into fourth place in the Big Ten standings.

The Hawkeye pitchers were the dominating forces in Iowa's sweep of Minnesota. In the opener, Karen Jackson struck out 13 Gophers in Iowa's 4-1 win. Alisha Nelson followed with a three-hit shutout in a 6-0 Hawkeye victory. Iowa has won four straight and six of the last seven games against Minnesota in Iowa City.

Minnesota started the Indiana series with one healthy pitcher. That pitcher, sophomore **JENNIFER McCANN** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XII), won a 6-1 decision in game one of the series. Catcher **LISA**

SOJKA (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) had a career-high four runs batted in. Indiana won the nightcap 7-1.

The Hoosiers started the second doubleheader strong, winning the first game 7-2. Minnesota had some dramatics in the series finale, as sophomore **JENNIFER MCGUINNESS (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG)** hit a two-run home run in the top of the seventh inning to tie the game at 5-5. Indiana answered with a run in the bottom of the inning to win 6-5 and claim its third win of the series.

FIVE SENIORS TO END CAREERS—Five Gopher seniors will play their last games in Minnesota uniforms this week. Minnesota has won 140 games over the past four years, which is the most of any four-year period in school history. This class was part of Minnesota's 1991 Big Ten championship team, which produced a school-record 48 wins and led the nation in hits.

MISCHEL DOERR (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) has been Minnesota's starting center fielder for the past four years. Doerr will lead the Gophers in stolen bases for a fourth consecutive year and will leave Minnesota as the Gophers' career leader in that category. Her 77 career stolen bases rank third on the all-time Big Ten list. Doerr has a chance to become the third Gopher and 11th player in Big Ten history to compile 200 hits, as she enters the final week of her career with 195 hits.

SARAH MASCHKA (MANKATO, MN/EAST) has been a productive member of Minnesota's pitching staff for the past four seasons. As a senior, Maschka became the staff ace and won her last nine games before a hand injury against Ohio State on May 2 ended her season. She leaves the Gopher program third on Minnesota's career list with 41 wins, tied for second with 20 shut-outs, and third with 226 strikeouts.

KERBY NORMAN (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG) started as a part-time catcher for the Gophers and has ended her career as a starting outfielder/ designated player for her final two seasons. During the past two seasons, Norman has started in 98 of Minnesota's 113 games, hitting .242 with 29 runs scored and 23 runs batted in. Norman is second on the 1993 squad in runs scored (15) and stolen bases (7).

LISA SOJKA (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) has been Minnesota's starting catcher for the past two seasons. Sojka has caught all but two innings since Lisa Bernstein took over as the Gopher coach in 1992. Offensively, Sojka's senior year has been her best year. She will set career highs in batting average (.275), hits (44), runs batted in (16), doubles (9) and home runs (2).

LEZLIE WEISS (FOREST LAKE, MN) followed Kathy Casull (1986-89) into the third base position in 1990 and has not moved since. Weiss will leave Minnesota with more hits than any other player in Big Ten history. Her current total of 250 hits includes three seasons of over 60 hits. Weiss' .334 career batting average is the best for any Gopher in the NCAA era of softball (1982-93). She also is Minnesota's career leader with 739 defensive assists.

THE COACH—Minnesota's **Lisa Bernstein** (Arizona '86) is in her second year as the Gopher mentor and has a career record of 61-51-1 (.545).

OUTDOOR TRACK AND FIELD

MINNESOTA HOSTS MINNESOTA OPEN II—The Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Minnesota Open II this Saturday at 11 a.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. This coed, non-scoring meet is the Gophers' last chance to prepare for the Big Ten meet, which will be held next Saturday and Sunday at Michigan State. Minnesota has four NCAA provisional qualifiers, but no NCAA automatic qualifiers heading into the Minnesota Open II.

MINNESOTA OPEN RESULTS—The Gophers won 12 of 13 events at the Minnesota Open last Saturday at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium.

Junior **SASCHA RAMSAY (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN)** won the 100 meters in 12.0 seconds, which is Minnesota's fastest time since 1990 and third-fastest in school history.

Freshman **LORI HARDRICK (MILWAUKEE, WI/WISCONSIN LUTHERAN)** won the triple jump with a leap of 38-0 1/4, which is Minnesota's best mark in the triple jump this season. Hardrick is now tied for fourth on Minnesota's all-time triple jump list.

Freshman **JOAN KARNES (LONG PRAIRIE, MN)** won the shot put with a throw of 45-2 1/2. Karnes now owns Minnesota's top mark in the event this year and is in 10th place on Minnesota's all-time list.

WHAT'S NEXT—The Gophers will travel to Michigan State for the 1993 Big Ten Track and Field Championships next Saturday and Sunday. Minnesota will be trying to improve on its ninth-place finish from the 1992 meet.

GOLF

GOPHERS THIRD AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS — Minnesota shot 309 in the fourth round of play and finished in a tie for third with Illinois at the Big Ten Championships, held in Iowa City, Iowa. Ohio State won the tournament with a four-round total of 1,240 strokes, edging Indiana by just one stroke (1,241). Minnesota and Illinois finished third with a total of 1,250 strokes.

Leading the Gophers and finishing in a tie for fourth place was senior **SARA EVENS (GRAFTON, ND)**. Her 75 on the final 18 holes was the lowest Gopher score of the tournament and just two over par for the course. Evens shot a four-round total of 309 (81-77-76-75) for her fourth-place tie with Indiana's Stacy Quilling. Senior **KRIS LEIGHTON (AUSTIN, MN)** finished tenth overall with 313 strokes (78-77-80-78) and led the Gophers after the first two rounds of play. Sophomore **STACY KOLB (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN)** placed eleventh with a 314-stroke total (79-78-78-79).

Other Gophers competing were sophomore **AMY SCHMIESING (SPICER, MN/NEW LONDON-SPICER)**,

14th (80-80-79-80--319); junior **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN/LEWISTON-ALTURA), 20th (82-78-85-77--322); and sophomore **JENNIFER KAISER** (RICHFIELD, MN/RICHFIELD), 32nd (82-85-84-79--330).

Illinois' Renee Heiken won the tournament with 300 strokes, followed by Indiana's Angela Buzminiski (302) and Ohio State's Tami Dougan (303).

ALL-BIG TEN — EVENS and KOLB were named to the eight-member all-Big Ten team. The team is voted on by coaches and selection of the team is based on the entire season. Heiken was named Player of the Year and Ohio State's Therese Hession was named 1993 Big Ten Coach of the Year.

REGIONALS — Evens and Kolb have been invited to play in the 1993 NCAA East Regional, which will be held at the Santa Marie Golf Course in Baton Rouge, La. from May 13-15.

TRACK & FIELD

MINNESOTA TRAVELS TO BIG TEN MEET—The Minnesota women's track and field team will travel to Michigan State for the 12th annual Big Ten Women's Track and Field Championships this Saturday and Sunday. Competition on both days begins at 8 a.m. The Gophers will be looking to improve on their ninth-place finish from the 1992 Big Ten meet and hoping to earn their first individual Big Ten championships since 1991.

GOPHER HISTORY—Minnesota has never finished in the top five of a Big Ten outdoor championship. The Gophers' best performance in a Big Ten meet came in 1990 when they finished 6th with 59 points. Minnesota's history in Big Ten outdoor meets:

GOPHERS TO WATCH—Junior **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS) continues to be Minnesota's most consistent performer. Berlin has thrown the javelin 160 feet four times during the 1993 outdoor season and has a personal best of 167-6, which ranks eighth on the Big Ten's all-time list. A throw of 167-6 would have won the Big Ten championship in nine of the previous 11 seasons.

Senior **JOYCE SCHULTZ** (WELLS, MN/WELLS-EASTON) and freshman **DANI PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CENTRAL) are two of the top-seeded athletes in the discus. Schultz (163-1) and Parkos (160-

6) set their seasonal bests at the Drake Relays last month.

Others to watch include Gopher sprinter **SASCHA RAMSAY** (MIAMI, FL/KILLIAN), distance runners **ALISON TITCOMB** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG), **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) and **SUSAN BLISS** (ST. CHARLES, MO/FRANCIS HOWELL), hurdler **SARAH REDMAN** (WAVERLY, IA/OCONOMOWAC), and heptathlete **CORALEA BROWN** (ANDROSSAN, ALBERTA, CANADA).

WHAT'S NEXT—Minnesota's final opportunity to qualify runners for the 1993 NCAA meet will be at the Minnesota Twilight next Wednesday at 5 p.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium.

GOLF

Senior **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) and sophomore **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SC/O'GORMAN) both qualified for the NCAA Women's Golf Championship by finishing among the top competitors at the NCAA East Regional Championship in Baton Rouge, La.

Evens, who tied for seventh at the regional, and Kolb, who tied for 10th, qualified to nationals by being among the top six individual finishers at the regional tournament not qualifying to nationals with their teams. The top seven teams at the regional earned national berths.

Evens tied for seventh place at the regional with rounds of 77, 74 and 71 for 222 strokes, tying Tennessee's Abby Peason as the top non-team qualifier.

Kolb in tying for 10th place had scores of 79, 73 and 72 for 224 strokes, which also tied her for the number three non-team qualifying slot with two other golfers.

Kimberly Byham of North Carolina was the medalist with 213 strokes and Georgia won the team title with 897 strokes. Georgia will host the national championship May 26-29 at the University Course in Athens, Ga.



SOFTBALL

GOPHERS END SEASON WITH SWEEP—The Minnesota softball team ended its season last weekend with four wins over Michigan State at the Bierman Softball Stadium. The Gophers ended the season with a 32-24 record, and its .571 winning percentage was its second highest over the last nine seasons. In the Big Ten standings, Minnesota finished in third place with a 16-9 record, and its .640 conference winning percentage was the third highest in school history.

McGUINNESS NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK—Minnesota junior designated player **JENNIFER McGUINNESS** (PALOS PARK, IL/CARL SANDBURG) was named Big Ten Player of the Week by the conference office Monday. McGuinness was 11-for-18 (.611) with two doubles and nine runs batted in. For the season, McGuinness led Minnesota in Big Ten play with two home runs and 18 runs batted in. Overall, McGuinness hit three home runs in 1993, becoming the first Gopher since 1979 to accomplish that feat.

BIG TEN UPDATE—Michigan won its second consecutive Big Ten title with two wins at Iowa last Friday. The Wolverines finished the year with a 21-5 Big Ten record, 1 1/2 games better than second-place Iowa.

Minnesota vaulted into third place with its four wins over Michigan State. The Gophers finished 1/2 game ahead of Northwestern and 1 1/2 games better than Ohio State.

Michigan and Iowa both qualified for the 1993 NCAA Division I Softball Tournament, which begins this weekend. The Big Ten champion Wolverines will host their first-ever regional, with Bowling Green and SW Louisiana providing the opposition. The Hawkeyes, qualifying as an at-large team for the second time in three years, will join Florida State and Kansas for a regional in Tallahassee, Fla.

FINAL WEEKEND REVIEW—After a 4-3 loss in eight innings to Minnesota-Duluth last Tuesday, Minnesota focused its efforts on Michigan State in a weekend series. The Gophers won all four games, outscoring the Spartans 32-6 in the series.

In the first game, Minnesota scored six runs in the sixth inning and won by a final of 11-1. Sophomore outfielder **KATIE PETERSON** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XII) was 3-for-3 at the plate and set a new Bierman Softball Stadium record with six runs batted in. Prior to the game, Peterson had nine runs batted in for her first 50 games.

The nightcap was more of the same for the Gophers, as they scored eight times in the fifth inning en route to a 10-3 victory. Minnesota pounded out 14 hits, including three from junior **Jennifer McGuinness**.

Saturday started with a 4-1 Minnesota win in the first game. The Gophers scored two runs in the fourth and fifth innings to erase a 1-0 Michigan State lead. Senior **KERBY NORMAN** (CRYSTAL, MN/ARMSTRONG) has the game-winning hit, a two-run double in the fourth inning.

In the final game of the season, the Gophers had 16 hits in a 7-1 victory. **MELISSA WOLD** (OAKDALE, MN/HILL-MURRAY) set two career highs in the game with four hits and three runs scored. Wold was one of six Gophers to have a multiple-hit game in the season finale.

Sophomore pitcher **JENNIFER McCANN** (MILWAUKEE, WI/PIUS XII) won all four games for the Gophers, pitching four complete games. McCann allowed 23 hits in 27 innings pitched and had a 1.04 ERA for the weekend.

STATISTICAL NOTES DOWN THE PAGE—Senior **LEZLIE WEISS** (FOREST LAKE, MN) led Minnesota in 1993 with 55 hits, marking the third time in four years that Weiss has led the Gophers in hits. She finishes her career with a total of 259 hits, more than any other Big Ten player in history.

Senior **MISCHEL DOERR** (EUGENE, OR/SHELDON) moved into second place on Minnesota's all-time hit list with 203 career hits. Doerr had 19 stolen bases to lead the Gophers in that category for a fourth consecutive year. She leaves Minnesota with 81 career stolen bases, more than any Gopher in history.

Despite only 101 at bats, junior **Jennifer McGuinness** led the Gophers with 29 runs batted in. McGuinness' RBI total is Minnesota's second-highest over the past 12 years, topped only by **Karl Blank's** school record of 43 runs batted set in 1991.

Senior **SARAH MASCHKA** (MANKATO, MN/EAST) was Minnesota's pitching leader in most categories, even though she did not pitch in the final two weeks of the season. Maschka led the Gopher staff with 14 wins, nine shutouts, 21 complete games, 106 strikeouts and a 1.19 earned run average. She leaves Minnesota as the third all-time winningest pitcher with 41 victories.

The final note is one that you might not easily find. Senior catcher **LISA SOJKA** (FRANKFORT, IL/LINCOLN-WAY) caught every pitch of every game for Minnesota in 1993. In the last two seasons, Sojka was the catcher for 829 1/3 of Minnesota's 831 1/3 innings (99.76 percent). Despite wearing the "tools of ignorance," Sojka had her best offensive season in 1993, hitting .281 with 17 runs scored and 20 runs batted in.

THE COACH—Minnesota coach Lisa Bernstein (Arizona '86) has completed her second year as the Gopher head coach and has a career record of 65-52-1 (.556). Bernstein is the first Minnesota softball coach to have winning records in each of her first two seasons.

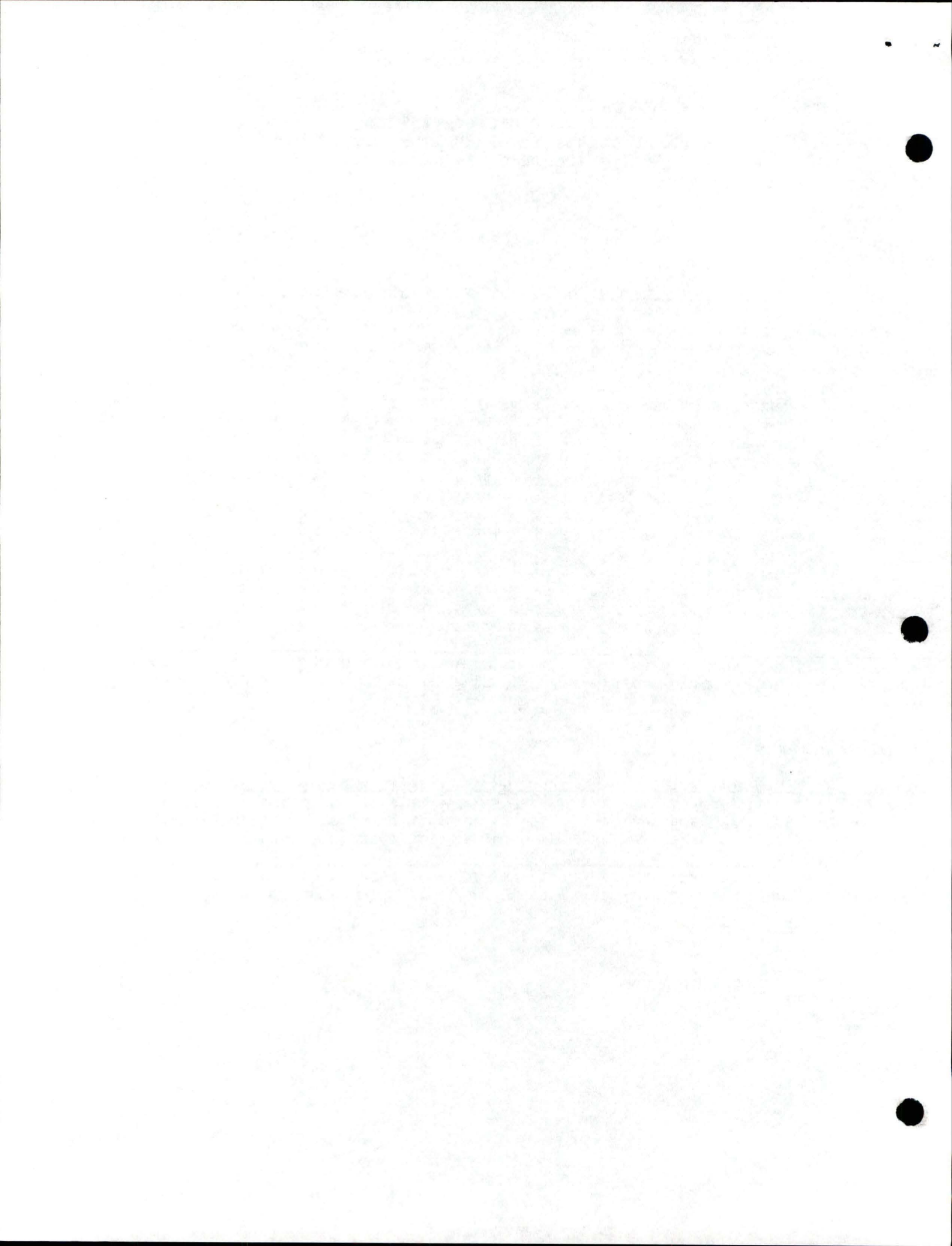

VOELZ REAPPOINTED TO NEW 5-YEAR TERM AS U OF M WOMEN'S A.D.

Chris Voelz, University of Minnesota women's athletic director since 1988, has been reappointed to the post for five more years, President Nils Hasselmo announced Tuesday (May 18).

Voelz recently had a routine five-year performance evaluation by a review committee, which, Hasselmo said, found Voelz has "provided excellent leadership to women's intercollegiate athletics." In the review, a committee received written and oral comments from more than 100 people, including coaches, faculty, staff, student-athletes and the general public.

"Chris Voelz has been instrumental in advancing the participation level, visibility, resources and success of women's athletics both locally and nationwide," Hasselmo said.

In announcing Voelz's reappointment, Hasselmo cited Women's Intercollegiate Athletics' (WICA) academic and athletic records. "Chris Voelz merits our appreciation and support and so do her coaches, staff and student athletes."

Hasselmo noted the 69 percent graduation rate and a 3.05 fall quarter grade point average for WICA student-athletes plus three Big Ten championships and eight NCAA Top 20 finishes as major accomplishments of Voelz's tenure. Continued academic achievement and athletic success at the national level will be on-going goals, Hasselmo said.

Improvements in departmental communication and cohesiveness and diversity top the list of WICA goals Hasselmo and Voelz set for 1993-94. Hasselmo met with coaches and staff Tuesday to discuss the goals and to announce the appointment of a facilitator to help accomplish those goals.

"The continued success of the women's program requires a team effort," Hasselmo said. "Director Voelz is looking to her coaches and staff for participation in finding new ways to expand the effort. I strongly support her initiative for greater staff involvement as well as her leadership goals. Progress will continue to be monitored on the university's standard annual and five-year cycle."

"I look forward, with renewed commitment and enthusiasm, to serving the department, the university and the community," Voelz said.

The NCAA's Gender Equity Task Force released its preliminary report last week and hearings are set for San Francisco, Chicago and Washington, D.C. Women's athletic director **CHRIS VOELZ**, a member of the Gender Equity task force, will be available throughout the week to answer questions.

GOLF

TWO AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS — Senior **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) and sophomore **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SC/O'GORMAN) are competing Wednesday through Friday at the 1993 National Collegiate Women's Golf Championships at the University of Georgia in Athens. Evens and Kolb qualified for the national championships at NCAA East Regional Championship.

The four-day, 72-hole tournament is at the University of Georgia Golf Course, which is rated at par 73 and playing at 6,114 yards for the championships. The 1983 NCAA and the 1981 AIAW women's golf championships were also held at the golf course.

Seventeen teams and 10 Division I individuals from the East and West Regional Championships have qualified for the tournament. Seven Division II and III individuals were selected by the NCAA Golf Committee to compete, as well.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

SIGNING — Jessica Smith, a senior at Reynolds High School in Troutdale, Ore., has signed a national letter of intent to attend the University of Minnesota on a swimming and diving scholarship. Smith, who lives in Portland, Ore., competed in high school in the 100- and 200-yard breaststroke events and in the 100- and 200-yard freestyles as well as the 200-yard individual medley.

TRACK

GOPHERS HOST MINNESOTA TWILIGHT—The Minnesota women's track and field team will host the Minnesota Twilight this Wednesday at 5 p.m. at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. This coed, non-scoring meet is the Gophers' last chance to qualify athletes for the NCAA meet, which will be held next weekend in New Orleans.

BIG TEN TRIUMPH—Minnesota had its most successful Big Ten meet in school history. The Gophers finished with 79 points, 20 more than any other Minnesota team in Big Ten competition. The 79 points earned Minnesota a fourth-place finish, its highest finish in a Big Ten outdoor meet. Michigan won its first-ever Big Ten title with 150 1/2 points, followed by Illinois with 143. Wisconsin edged the Gophers for third place by one point, 80-79. Ohio State rounded out the top half of the conference with 68 points.

"FIELD & TRACK?"—With all due respect to the Minnesota athletes who run on the track, the Gophers ought to consider giving top billing to their field athletes. Minnesota scored 62 of its 79 points at the Big Ten meet in the field events. Of those 62 points, 32 came in the three throwing events (shot put, discus and javelin), 25 in the three jumping events (long jump, triple jump and high jump), and five in the heptathlon.

TOP PERFORMANCES—Minnesota's lone Big Ten champion was junior javelin thrower **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS). Berlin set a personal best, a Minnesota school record and qualified automatically for the NCAA meet with her winning throw of 178-2. The mark was eight inches short of the Big Ten meet record. Berlin now ranks third on the all-time Big Ten javelin list. She also becomes Minnesota's first automatic qualifier for the NCAA meet in 1993.

Minnesota had three second-place finishes in the meet, highlighted by two freshman performers. Triple jumper **LORI HARDRICK** (MILWAUKEE, WI/WISCONSIN LUTHERAN) leaped 39-1 to finish second and lead Minnesota's 17-point outburst in the event. Hardrick is the third Gopher in history to triple jump 39 feet outdoors.

Thrower **DANI PARKOS** (GRAND FORKS, ND/CENTRAL) finished second in the discus with a throw of 152-7. Coupled with her fifth-place finish in the shot put (46-6 1/4), Parkos scored 12 points in her first-ever Big Ten meet to lead the Gopher contingent.

Senior distance runner **SUSAN BLISS** (ST. CHARLES, MO/FRANCIS HOWELL) finished second in the 10,000 meters with a time of 35:31.57. Bliss now has two Big Ten runner-up positions to her credit outdoors, as she finished second in the 5,000 meters at the 1992 Big Ten outdoor meet in Minneapolis.

Minnesota had two athletes finish in the top five in two events. **Dani Parkos** did it with her performances in the shot put and discus, while **CORALEA BROWN** (ANDROSSAN, ALBERTA, CANADA) did it in the heptathlon and the high jump. Competing in her second-ever heptathlon, Brown finished fifth with 4,452 points and moved into fourth place on Minnesota's all-time list. She finished in a tie for fourth in the high jump with a leap of 5-6.

WHAT'S NEXT—The Gophers will send at least one athlete and possibly more to the NCAA Women's Track and Field Championships on June 2-5 in New Orleans.

Fri. June 4 OUTDOOR TRACK AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS (New Orleans, La.)

BERLIN NAMED SPORTS INFORMATION ATHLETE OF THE MONTH—Minnesota junior javelin thrower **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS) was named the athlete of the month for the Minnesota women's athletic department for the month of May. Berlin was victorious in all four javelin competitions that she competed in during the month. Her best performance came in winning the Big Ten javelin title May 22 at Michigan State. Berlin set a personal best, a Minnesota varsity record and qualified automatically for the NCAA outdoor meet with her throw of 178-2. The throw is a personal best by over nine feet and is the third-best throw by a collegian in 1993. Berlin will compete at the 1993 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships on Friday.

TRACK AND FIELD

BERLIN, BLISS TO COMPETE AT NCAA MEET—

Junior **HEATHER BERLIN** (LIBERAL, KS) and senior **SUSAN BLISS** (ST. CHARLES, MO/FRANCIS HOWELL) will represent the University of Minnesota women's track and field team at the 1993 NCAA Women's Track and Field Championships in New Orleans.

Berlin and Bliss will both compete in their events Friday. Berlin will throw the javelin at 4 p.m., while Bliss will run in the 10,000 meters at 9:10 p.m.

SECOND TRIP FOR BERLIN—Heather Berlin is making her second consecutive trip to the NCAA meet. After missing a trip to nationals by two centimeters as a freshman at Kansas, the former Jayhawk qualified for last year's meet in Austin, Texas. Berlin finished fourth with a throw of 164-4 and won her first all-American citation.

Berlin, the 1992 Big Eight champion and 1993 Big Ten champion, is seeded third in the event with a throw of 178-2. That mark was achieved at the Big Ten meet May 22 in East Lansing, Mich., and set a Minnesota varsity record in the process.

BLISS RETURNS TO NATIONALS—Susan Bliss is making her second appearance at the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and her seventh appearance at an NCAA championship. In 1990, Bliss competed at the NCAA outdoor meet in Durham, N.C. for the University of Missouri. She placed ninth in the 3000 meters with a time of 9:23.20 and earned her only outdoor all-American honor with that finish.

The four-time all-American qualified for the 1993 NCAA meet with her mark of 34:22.50 at the Mt. Sac Relays on April 16 in Walnut, Calif. Bliss is second on Minnesota's all-time list in the event and finished second in the Big Ten at the conference meet in the 10,000 meters. She was seeded 13th before the declarations of entries were made last Saturday.

ROWE IMPROVES AT MINNESOTA TWILIGHT—

Minnesota senior **CHRIS ROWE** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) ended her Gopher career with a personal best in the 1500 meters at the Minnesota Twilight meet last Wednesday at the Bierman Track and Field Stadium. Rowe's time of 4:26.07 improved her fourth-place position on Minnesota's all-time list by five-hundredths of a second. She was attempting to run under the NCAA provisional standard of 4:24.20.

GOLF

GOLFERS NAMED TO ALL REGION TEAM - At the conclusion of the 1993 NCAA Women's Golf Championships in Athens, Ga., senior **SARA EVENS** (GRAFTON, ND) and sophomore **STACEY KOLB** (SIOUX FALLS, SD/O'GORMAN) were named to the All Regional Team for the East Region.

Evens and Kolb ended their Minnesota golf careers at the NCAA championships, May 26-29. Evens, a senior competing in her first NCAA meet, finished in 67th place after four rounds of 79 strokes each. Her 72-hole total was 316 strokes. Kolb, a sophomore who is transferring to Texas Tech next year, was 99th in the field of 102 after rounds of 80, 88, 82 and 85 (335 strokes).

SCHOLAR AWARDS - Senior **KRIS LEIGHTON** (AUSTIN, MN) and **JENNY KAISER** (RICHFIELD, MN) were named as recipients of the 1992-93 Smith-Corona All-Scholar College Golf Team Award. Leighton is a child psychology major with a 3.53 grade point average (GPA) and Kaiser is a retail merchandising major with a 3.49 GPA.
