### **THREE POSITIONS FILLED IN WOMEN'S ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT AT MINNESOTA**

Minneapolis, Minn. — University of Minnesota Women's Athletic Director Chris Voelz announced Tuesday that three positions within the women's athletic department have been filled, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Joining the department August 1 will be Jennifer Buttriss, strength and conditioning coach; Lisa Gozley, assistant soccer coach; and Norma Barnes, event manager/assistant promotions director.

Buttriss has served as head strength and conditioning coach and assistant defensive line coach at Eastern New Mexico for the last two years. She will receive her Master's degree in physical education from Eastern New Mexico in August. Buttriss received her bachelor's degree in exercise technology from the University of New Mexico in 1988, where she served as assistant strength coach for three years. In addition to her experience on the collegiate level, Buttriss has worked in exercise technology at Health First Corporate Fitness and Highpoint Racquet and Swim Club in Albuquerque, New Mex. as well as working as weight room manager at Portales Fitness Center. Buttriss replaces Melissa Stoillis, who resigned in June.

Gozley, who joins the soccer program prior to its initial season, brings valuable experience as both a player and a coach. Gozley served as an assistant women's soccer coach at the University of Massachusetts from 1989 to 1992, where the team qualified for the NCAA Tournament three of her four years. A 1991 graduate of the University of Central Florida, Gozley served as the team captain at UCF in 1986 and was a two-time first team all-American. Gozley is currently a member of the National Amateur team, the Sports Festival— East team and the Southeastern Regional Senior Women's team. "Lisa will bring a lot of experience at the top level to our program," said Sue Montagne, head soccer coach. "She gets the most out of her players and is an excellent motivator."

Barnes has served as a marketing and development intern at the University of Texas at Austin women's athletic department for the past two years. She received her Bachelor's degree from the University of the Ozarks in Clarksville, Ark. in May 1989 and is currently enrolled at Western Illinois in the Master's of Sport Management program. She also served as a graduate assistant in the athletic department at Western Illinois.

### NEW FULL SERVICE TICKETING ANNOUNCED FOR WOMEN'S ATHLETICS --

The University of Minnesota women's athletic department has implemented a ticketing system that will provide fans more convenience than ever before. Season tickets will be available for five sports and for the first time, advance single event tickets will also be available.

Season tickets and single event advance tickets are available in soccer, volleyball, basketball, gymnastics and softball. Season ticket holders will receive 2 for 1 coupons for use at other Gopher women's sports.

Fans will also be able to purchase advance single event tickets for swimming & diving and track & field.

Tickets can be purchased by phone, mail order, or in person at the Gopher ticket office, which has moved into the new Mariucci Arena, located at 4 Oak Street (across 4th Street S.E. from Williams Arena). Convenient short-term parking for ticket buyers will be available next to Mariucci Arena,

The Gopher volleyball team will play its final season in Williams Arena this fall, while the women's basketball and gymnastics teams will move in December to the new Sports Pavilion (in the old Mariucci Arena adjacent to Williams Arena).

The Sports Pavilion will have an intimate 5,600 seating capacity (made up primarily of new bleacher seating), providing a symbolic presence for women's athletics that will reflect the pride and commitment of all Minnesotans.

Prices for women's athletics reflect a unique entertainment value for Twin Cities sports fans.

Single event ticket prices are \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for U of M students, 18 and under fans and senior adults. Although these prices are up 75 cents from last season, it is the first ticket price increase since 1985.

Also available is a special \$6.00 "courtside theater style" ticket (approximately 900) for women's basketball and gymnastics spectators. Tickets for these prime seats, which will be located behind team benches, can be purchased on either a season or single event basis.

Ticket discounts are available through advance sale to youth groups of 10 or more (age 18 & under) for \$2.00 each, and there is a new group ticket (for 25 or more) at \$4.00 each for any regular season sports event.

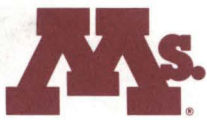

**GOPHER VOLLEYBALL SEASON OPENS WEDNESDAY —**  
The University of Minnesota volleyball team opens its season Wednesday at 7 p.m. against Colorado State in Fort Collins, Colo.

The Gophers will then travel approximately 35 miles south to Boulder, Colo., where they will take part in the Colorado PowerBar Volleyball Invitational on Friday and Saturday. The tournament host is the University of Colorado.

**BIG TEN COACHES PICK GOPHERS FIFTH —** In a preseason poll of the 11 Big Ten volleyball coaches, Minnesota was picked to finish fifth in the conference. The Gophers finished fourth in last year's conference standings. Minnesota received 60 of a possible 110 points in the balloting, behind defending conference champion Illinois (95), Ohio State (92), Penn State (82) and Michigan (65).

The Gophers were 25-12 overall and 13-7 (fourth) in the conference last season and tied for third in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship (NIVC).

Finishing sixth in the coaches' voting was Wisconsin (51), followed by Purdue (48), Iowa (40), Northwestern (28), Indiana (18) and Michigan State (15).

### DAHL, FOESCH, SCHINTZ LEAD GOPHERS IN

**INTRASQUAD —** There were several bright spots in Thursday's intrasquad in Bierman Gym, which featured a 15-12, 15-5, 15-3 win by the Gophers over the Gopher "Red" squad. Leading the Gophers were junior **GRETCHEN DAHL** (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) with eight kills and junior **JEAN SCHINTZ** (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) and sophomore **HEIDI FOESCH** (HECTOR, MN/BUFFALO LAKE-HECTOR) with seven each. Foesch and Schintz each had nine digs.

**THE COACH —** Minnesota head coach **Stephanie Schleuder** (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 12th season at the University of Minnesota and her 21st season as a collegiate volleyball head coach. Last season she reached three major milestones, as she became the first coach with 500 career wins, 200 wins at a Big Ten conference school and 100 in Big Ten conference play. Schleuder is 516-260 (.676) overall, 218-148 (.596) at Minnesota, and 104-82 (.560) in the Big Ten. Her 516 wins rank eighth among NCAA Division I active women's volleyball coaches.

### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

**COLORADO STATE —** The Rams, like the Gophers, were one of those teams listed among the "others receiving votes" in the AVCA's national preseason poll. Colorado State finished 19-11 overall last season and 6-8 (sixth) in the Western Athletic

Conference. Following the season, UAB competed in the National Invitational Volleyball Championship, compiling a 2-2 record. Four starters return, including 5-8 junior setter Ginger Kidd, 5-9 junior outside hitter Kellie Barnes, 6-0 senior middle blocker Kristen Walton and 6-1 junior middle blocker Jaime Hindmarch. Rich Feller is in his 11th year as head coach.

**SERIES** — In the only previous meeting between the schools, Colorado State beat the Gophers 15-13, 15-9, 15-12 on Sept. 21, 1987 in Fort Collins, Colo.

**BOWLING GREEN** — The Falcons were the runners up in the NIVC tournament last December. After beating Minnesota 3-1 in the semifinals, Bowling Green lost 13-15, 9-15, 9-15 to Washington State. Bowling Green was 30-8 overall last season and won the Mid-American Conference title with a 17-1 mark. The leading returners are 5-11 senior middle blocker Nicky Mudrak, 5-10 junior outside hitter Jessica Andrasko and 5-9 senior outside hitter Lori Hilton. Head coach Denise Van De Walle is in her 11th year at Bowling Green.

**SERIES** — The series is tied 1-1. Last season Bowling Green beat the Gophers 5-15, 15-11, 15-9, 15-11 in the NIVC on Dec. 6 in Kansas City, Mo.

**#12 COLORADO** — The Buffs, ranked 12th nationally in the AVCA poll, were consistently ranked throughout last season, with their highest ranking 12th and a final ranking of 15th. Colorado finished 22-9 overall and 10-2 (second) in the Big Eight Conference, but won the Big Eight's postseason tournament. The Buffs lost to Nebraska in the first round of the NCAA tournament. It should be another good season for Colorado, as they return five starters. The top returners are 5-8 senior setter Nicole Vranesh, who was a 1992 first team all-region selection; 6-2 junior quick hitter Janine Zumerchik, a 1992 second team all-region pick; and 5-10 junior outside hitter Karrie Downey, who made four all-tournament teams. Brad Saindon is in his seventh year as head coach at Colorado.

**SERIES** — Minnesota leads 2-0. There was more at stake in the last meeting (Dec. 2, 1989 at Williams Arena) between the teams, as the Gophers won 15-11, 16-14, 15-11 in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

**TENNESSEE** — The Lady Volunteers are coming off a season in which they finished 13-14 overall and 8-6 (fifth) in the Southeastern Conference. Five starters return, including 5-11 senior middle blocker Tamala Brightman, 5-6 junior setter Molly Mooney and 5-6 junior outside hitter Sonja Thomas. The head coach is Julie Hermann, currently in her second year at Tennessee.

**SERIES** — This is the first meeting between the schools.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — The Gophers will return home on Sunday, before departing Monday for New Orleans, where they will take on Tulane on Sept. 7. Minnesota will then travel to Houston to participate in a tournament at the University of Houston on Sept. 10-11.

## SOCCER

**SOCCER TEAM SEASON OPENER** — The University of Minnesota women's soccer team kicks off its inaugural season Saturday, Sept. 4, at Bierman Athletic Field when the Lady Jays of Creighton University visit the Twin Cities. The match is scheduled to begin at 2 p.m.

**A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT** —

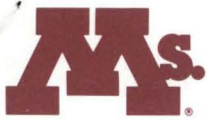
**CREIGHTON** — Creighton returns seven starters and 13 letter-winners from last season's 6-12 team. This season marks the fifth season of Lady Jay soccer.

Leading the Lady Jays will be junior midfielder Melissa Estrada. Estrada finished last season with eight points on 3 goals and 2 assists. Her effort placed her third on the team in points and tied her for second in goals scored. Other key returnees for the Lady Jays will be seniors Kristin King (0 goals, 3 assists, 3 points in 1992) and Lori Fickenschler (2-3-7).

The Golden Gophers, on the other hand, will rely on the experience of their four transfers- sophomore forward **GRETCHEN BRANDT** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), senior **ANNE MEITZ** (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/NORTH), and juniors **CHELON DANIELSON** (STILLWATER, MN) and **ELLEN PETERFESO** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL MURRAY). Brandt transferred from Wisconsin-Madison and provides the only Division I experience to the Golden Gophers. Danielson transferred from Division II Northern Colorado while Peterfeso and Meitz came from Division III St. Thomas.

Minnesota will return to action on Tuesday, Sept 7, at 4 p.m. when Macalester visits Bierman Field. Creighton will face Macalester on Sunday before returning home to Omaha, Neb.

### SOCCER

**SOCCER TEAM DROPS INAUGURAL MATCH** - The University of Minnesota women's soccer team began its inaugural season Saturday at the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium, dropping a tough 3-2 decision to the Lady Jays of Creighton in front of almost 500 fans.

Frosh forward JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) scored the first goal in the history of the program, 6:58 into the match. Senior forward ANNE MEITZ (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/SOUTH) scored Minnesota's second goal of the half on a play assisted by Walek at the 34:32 mark of the half.

The Lady Jays stormed back in the second half with three goals in a 7:30 span to take control of the match. Junior forward Melissa Estrada scored Creighton's first goal on a penalty kick at the 56:16 point of the match. Freshman forward Kalan Malone scored the Lady Jays' other two goals, the last coming just before the 64:00 point.

**GOPHERS BACK ON THE FIELD TODAY** - Minnesota will have little time to worry about its loss to Creighton, as the Golden Gophers host Division III Macalester today at 4 p.m.

**SCOTS LOADED WITH TALENT** - Macalester returned eight starters from last year's team that finished first in the MIAC with an 8-1 record and 16-2 overall. The Scots qualified for the NCAA Division III playoffs, but lost their opening round match 1-0 to UC-San Diego.

In only her junior year, forward Jenny Scanlon will look to improve on her 21-goal, 10-assist performance of a year ago. Scanlon's efforts earned her first-team Division III honors, making her the only sophomore named to the team.

Sophomore forward Nikki Epperson also contributed her share of goals in her freshman year. Epperson scored 17 goals in 1992 and would have earned a place as the all-time single season goal scorer in the history of the program had Scanlon not done so well.

Also finding a spot in the record books, senior midfielder Paige Fitzgerald set a single-season assist recorded when she had 11 in her junior year. Fitzgerald is the only senior on the Scots

roster this season.

**WEEKEND FUN** - The Gophers will take to the road for the first time this season when they travel to Green Bay, WI to participate in the Wisconsin-Green Bay/NIKE Classic on Sept 11 and 12. On Saturday, Minnesota will face Northern Illinois at 2 p.m. and then play the host team, the Phoenix of Wisconsin-Green Bay, at 4 p.m. on Sunday.

#### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

**NORTHERN ILLINOIS** - Like the Gophers, the Huskies have a fresh face this season as they are also competing in their first season of women's soccer. The Huskies opened their inaugural season on Sunday at Valparaiso with a 6-0 victory. NIU was led by sophomore Beth Pomies with two goals. Pomies is a transfer from Lindenwood College in Missouri.

The Huskies dominated the second half of the match, scoring five goals on 25 shots on goal. NIU tallied 38 shots on goal for the match while holding Valparaiso to a mere five.

**WISCONSIN-GREEN BAY** - The Phoenix are coming of a 5-9-1 season a year ago, but will be blessed with 10 returning starters. The team opened its season last week in Tulsa, OK against the University of Tulsa and Oral Roberts University. In their first match, the Phoenix dropped a 1-0 decision to Tulsa, but rebounded to crush Oral Roberts 8-0. Senior forward Tonya Greenwood and freshman forward Lisa Boeser led UWGB in the win with two goals apiece. The Phoenix held Oral Roberts to one shot on goal for the entire match.

This season marks the seventh season of Phoenix soccer.

### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS—

**SOUTHWEST TEXAS BOBCATS** - The 'Cats enter this week 3-1 after posting three straight victories over James Madison, Virginia and William & Mary. The team's lone loss came against North Carolina State in five games.

The Bobcats are being led by senior outside hitter Maripat Panko with 62 kills and a .283 hitting percentage. Freshman outside hitter Krishna Neimann is second on the squad with 56 kills while junior Kristy Braun leads the team in assists with 187.

**NORTH TEXAS LADY EAGLES** - The Lady Eagles fell on hard times early this season, as the team lost four straight matches at the Pizza Inn Classic in Jonesboro, Ark. against Austin Peay, Arkansas State, Xavier and Alabama-Birmingham. After starting the year 0-5, North Texas broke into the win column on Monday, defeating South Alabama in five games.

Dee Dee Carlock leads the team with 55 kills while Christy Rooney is second with 51. Michelle Dressel leads North Texas with 81 assists.

The Lady Eagles will play Rice on Thursday before meeting the Gophers in Houston.

**UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON** - The Cougars have gotten off to a slow start, dropping their first four matches of the season. Houston participated in the Wildcat Classic at the University of Arizona where the team went 0-3, losing to Santa Barbara, Pepperdine and Arizona. Houston's other loss came in its opener at Sam Houston State.

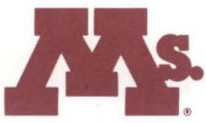
Prior to Taylor's stint at SLU, she worked in the athletic department at Louisiana State University and assisted ABC Sports with the production of athletic events.

Mona is also active at the University as co-chair of the Eastcliff legacy committee for enhancement and upkeep of the presidential residence and president-elect of the Goldstein Gallery in the College of Human Ecology. She was involved in hosting the Super Bowl and served on the VIP Host Committee for the 1992 Final Four in men's basketball. She is a member of the women's athletics Advisory Council.

"The final four is a great way to showcase to the city and the community how far women's athletics has come," said Mona. "Women's basketball is entertaining. This event will be good for the community and the University just as the men's final four was.

The full steering committee membership will be appointed by the spring of 1994, according to Voelz.

## Leadership Changes on Advisory Council

(Minneapolis, MN)--Women's Athletic Director Chris Voelz has announced that Marilyn Tickle Bryant will begin a three-year term as the new Chair of the Advisory Council for women's athletics, replacing Sharon Bredeson, whose two-year term ended this past spring.

"Marilyn Tickle Bryant's chairship of the Advisory Council carries on a strong tradition of high profile, committed leaders and advocates for women's opportunities in athletics in higher education," said Voelz. "Marilyn is class and Marilyn is action and we'll have plenty of both in her era."

Bryant is vice president and director of Adjustable Joist Company and is a founding member of the Minnesota Women's Campaign Fund. Bryant chaired the 100 Women Campaign and the Ten Year Anniversary committee in 1985 while serving consistently on the Advisory Council. A University of Minnesota Foundation trustee, Bryant is a President's Club member with women's athletics. She is also on the Higher Education Coordinating Board for the state.

Bryant is involved because she "strongly believes in excellence in athletics and academics and progress for women."

Additionally, Kathleen C. Ridder will chair the activities for the opening of the new Sports Pavilion and has been serving as the co-chair of the On-Campus Sports Facilities Fundraising Campaign. Ridder is a member of the Advisory Council and its former chair, and has been an active supporter of the department. She also serves on the Foundation Board of the University of Minnesota and the Children's Foundation Board. Ridder is a President's Club member with women's athletics and has donated a designated scholarship to the department.

"We, as women, finally have a facility which is primarily devoted to our activities in sports in the new Sports Pavilion," said Ridder. "Now we would like to work to fill it on a regular basis by developing a constituency that will buy season tickets and support women's athletics as they have supported men's athletics."

"I fondly refer to Kathleen Ridder as our 'whirlwind wonder woman,' said Voelz. "The fruits of her advocacy, her generosity and her fundraising will be evident as we open the Sports Pavilion in December. It will be more than bricks and mortar — it will be a symbol of the integration of women in our university and society. No one speaks more vividly to that value than a hall-of-famer Kathleen Ridder."

In 1995-96, the women's athletic department will be celebrating its 20th Anniversary, and Barbara Lupient has agreed to chair the 20th Anniversary dinner in the fall of 1995. A director with Lupient Enterprises, Lupient currently serves as chair of the Methodist Hospital Foundation and has been active with that foundation since 1986. She is also on the State Board of the Minnesota Women's Campaign Fund and the President's Council at the University. A member of the women's athletic Advisory Council, Lupient agreed to chair the 20th Anniversary celebration and become involved with women's athletics because "we owe it to the next generation. They are our future and we need to make it bright for them by offering women the same opportunities in sports which young men have traditionally had."

"We are fortunate to have Barbara agree to lead the 20th celebration — her values, her leadership and her commitment will be a perfect match for this very special celebration," said Voelz."

**BRIGHAM YOUNG** — The Cougars are 3-1 and ranked 10th in the most recent (Sept. 7) Tachikara Coaches poll. BYU will play Idaho State on Wednesday before arriving in Minneapolis. Brigham Young opened the season with a three-game loss to Hawaii on Sept. 2 before turning around and defeating the Wahines in three games the following day. Last week, BYU defeated Weber State (3-0) and Cal State-Sacramento (3-1).

**GOPHERS WIN TOURNAMENT** — The Gopher volleyball team returned home on Sunday, bringing with it the championship title of the Houston Invitational. Minnesota went undefeated in the tournament (3-0) and beat host Houston 17-15, 15-6, 15-5 for the championship. Frosh **KATRIEN DEDECKER** (BREDENE, BELGIUM) recorded 13 kills while junior **JEAN SCHINTZ** (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) and sophomore **HEIDI OLHAUSEN** (APPLE VALLEY, MN) added 10 kills each in the championship match. The Gophers defeated North Texas 15-1, 15-4, 15-5 in a 44-minute match earlier on Saturday. On Friday night, Minnesota defeated SW Texas State 15-13, 15-12, 15-11, led by DeDecker with 14 kills.

**ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM** — DeDecker was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament, while Schintz and Olhausen were also named to the six-person all-tournament team.

**TULANE** — The Gophers played a single match against Tulane in New Orleans last week before heading to the Houson Invitational. Minnesota defeated Tulane 15-12, 11-15, 15-5, 15-5. DeDecker led the team with a match-high 23 kills.

**"HATS OFF" TO SOPHOMORE GRETCHEN BRANDT** - Minnesota sophomore forward GRETCHEN BRANDT (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) had a career week, scoring three goals in EACH of the Gophers two wins. Brandt's scoring binge began in the first half of the Macalester match when she scored just over ten minutes into the game to tie the contest at 1-1. She scored twice in the second half to record her, and the programs, first ever hat trick.

Brandt's explosion continued against Northern Illinois where she earned her second hat trick by the end of the first half - scoring all three of the Gophers first half goals in just over 28 minutes of action.

Senior ANNE MEITZ (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/SOUTH) and freshman JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) scored the Gophers other two goals of the week. Walek scored 1:09 after Brandt's first goal against Macalester to give the Gophers a 2-1 lead. Meitz put the final touches on the Huskies of Northern Illinois as her second half goal gave the Gophers a 4-2 lead.

**RANKING AMONG THE ELITE** - Brandt's efforts this past week ties her for first in the Central Region in goals scored and second in total points. The Central Region is comprised of 47 schools.

Brandt is tied with Liz Pilce of American University and Lisa Gibbons of Bucknell in goals scored with six. Brandt and Pilce are tied with Missy Gaitka of Radford for second in total points with 12. Gibbons leads the point race with 14.

**GOLFERS FINISH 10TH AT LADY TAR HEEL —** The Gophers finished 10th at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational in Chapel Hill, N.C. after rounds of 318, 317 and 323 for 958 strokes. ### TAYLOR NAMED ASSISTANT TRACK COACH —

Angie Taylor has been named women's assistant track coach, pending approval by the Board of Regents.

Taylor has been the assistant track coach at Southeastern Louisiana since July 20, 1992. While at SLU, Taylor coached both men and women, primarily the sprinters, hurdlers and jumpers.

Prior to Taylor's stint at SLU, she worked in the athletic department at Louisiana State University and assisted ABC Sports with the production of athletic events.

"It is truly exciting to add a world class heptathlete and a technical coach of her caliber to this program," head track coach Gary Wilson said. Taylor's talent in the heptathlon ranked her 10th in the U.S. during the 1991 and 1992 seasons. She finished eighth at the 1992 Olympic Trials with a personal best scored of 5,690.

In 1993, Taylor did not compete in the heptathlon, opting for the 100 hurdles and long jump. She made the finals of the long jump at the U.S. Championships in Eugene, Ore., before finishing fifth in both the hurdles and long jump at the Olympic Festival in San Antonio, Texas.

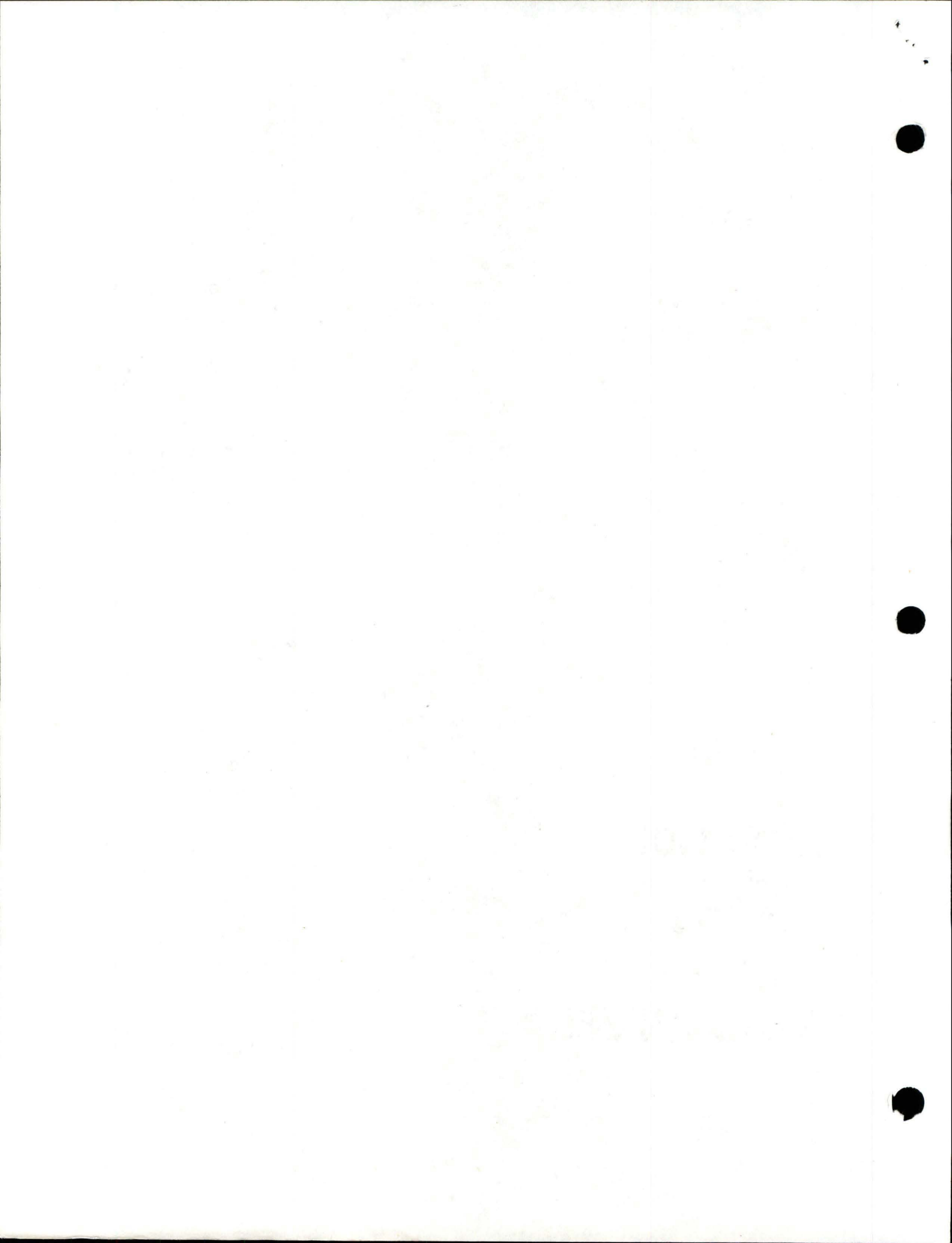

**GOPHERS OPEN BIG TEN SEASON AGAINST TWO RANKED TEAMS** — Minnesota (8-3) will open its conference season at 6:30 p.m. Friday against 10th-ranked Penn State in State College, Pa. On Saturday, the Gophers will travel to Columbus, Ohio, where they will take on 12th-ranked Ohio State at 6:30 p.m.

Minnesota will be looking for its first win against a ranked opponent. All three of its current losses are against teams currently ranked in the top 25.

### OPPONENT NOTES —

**#10 Penn State** — The Lady Lions (8-2) defeated St. Bonaventure, Lehigh and Connecticut this past weekend, each by a score of 3-0.

**SERIES** — Penn State leads 5-1. The Lady Lions have won three straight over the Gophers.

**#12 Ohio State** — The Buckeyes (6-2) have won three matches in a row. They won the Buckeye Classic this past weekend, defeating Oklahoma 3-1 and Rhode Island 3-0. Junior outside hitter Gabriele Jobst leads the team with 106 kills (3.53/game). Junior setter Laura Davis leads the team in assists (12.37).

**SERIES** — Ohio State leads 17-13. The teams split last season as Minnesota broke a five-match losing streak to the Buckeyes.

**GOPHERS FINISH SECOND IN MINNESOTA CLASSIC** — For the fifth time in the six-year history of the tournament, the Gophers finished second in the Minnesota Classic. Minnesota went 2-1 in the tournament, with its loss coming to seventh-ranked Brigham Young in three games (3-15, 8-15, 8-15) on Friday.

The Gophers won both of their matches Saturday, first downing Illinois State 15-6, 15-6, 13-15, 13-15, 15-12 and then defeating George Washington 15-10, 15-10, 15-6.

Brigham Young went 3-0 to win the round-robin tournament, with the Gophers finishing second, Illinois State (1-2) third, and George Washington (0-3) fourth.

**DE DECKER, JACKSON EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS** — Two Gophers—freshman KATRIEN DE DECKER (BREDENE,

BELGIUM) and senior SUE JACKSON (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) made the six-player all-tournament team.

De Decker hit .364 in the tournament with 55 kills. Against Illinois State, she hit .439 with 31 kills, becoming the first Gopher to record 30 or more kills in a match since Andrea Gonzalez in 1988.

Jackson had 110 assists and 34 digs in the tournament.

Others named to the team were Brigham Young's Tumua Matu'u, who earned MVP honors, and Charlene Fiaputa, Illinois State's Kim Nelson and George Washington's Svetlana Vtyurina, who set a tournament match record with 35 kills on Friday against Illinois State.

It was De Decker's second all-tournament nomination of the season. She was the MVP at the Houston Invitational (Sept. 10-11).

**NEW TOURNAMENT ATTENDANCE MARK SET** — Minnesota Classic attendance was 775 on Friday and 817 on Saturday for a two-day total of 1596, eclipsing the old mark of 1,323 that was set in 1989.

**GOPHERS IN THE BIG TEN STATISTICAL RANKINGS** — After this past weekend's play, De Decker ranks fourth in the conference in kills per game (4.17) and fifth in hitting (.348). Jackson is fifth in assists per game (11.00) and fifth in digs (3.19).

**MILESTONES** — Gopher junior GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) had seven block assists in the tournament's three games to move into 10th place on the school career block assist list. Her 172 block assists surpassed the old 10th-place total of 171 by former Gopher Karyn Daline (1983-86). Dahl needs 12 block assists to tie Andrea Gonzalez (1985-88) for ninth place and 15 to tie Jill Halsted (1979-82) for eighth place.

Jackson's 110 assists in the tournament give her 4,069 for her career. She and Sharon Oesterling (1986-89) are the only Gophers who have recorded more than 4,000 assists in their careers.

**NEXT** — Minnesota will play host to Michigan State on Oct. 1 and Michigan on Oct. 2 at Williams Arena.

## SOCCER

**WEEKEND AT BIERMAN** - The University of Minnesota women's soccer team improved its record to 4-2 this weekend, following home victories over the Crusaders of Valparaiso and the Indiana Hoosiers.

Minnesota cruised to an easy 5-0 victory over Valparaiso on Saturday by outshooting the Crusaders 35-3. Freshman goal-keeper JAMI PHILIP (LITTLE CANADA, MN/ROSEVILLE) recorded the Gophers first-ever shutout in her first collegiate start.

Sunday's match-up featured two future Big Ten Conference opponents, both competing in their first year of varsity soccer. The Hoosiers scored first at the 10:58 mark on a goal by Wendy Dillinger to take an early 1-0 lead. Sophomore GRETCHEN BRANDT (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) scored her eighth goal of the season with about five minutes left in the first half to send the contest to intermission tied at 1-1. Freshman JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) scored Minnesota's two second-half goals to send the Gophers to victory.

**THE SHOOTERS.....SHE SCORES** - Walek's two goals against Indiana were her fourth and fifth of the weekend. The two-time all-state selection in high school scored three goals against Valparaiso to give her 18 points for the year on seven goals and four assists. Walek's hat trick against the Crusaders was her first career and the program's third of the season. Brandt recorded back-to-back hat tricks against Macalester and Northern Illinois.

**KEEPING PACE** - Brandt, who entered weekend's play tied for third in the nation in scoring with 12 points, added to her season output with six points to tie her with Walek for most points on the team. Brandt scored a goal and an assist against Valparaiso in addition to her goal against Indiana.

**NORTHERN EXPOSURE** - The Gophers will return to action on Tuesday when they travel to Duluth, Minn. to play St. Scholastica.

The Saints will enter Tuesday's match with a 0-6 record for the year. Sophomore Nikki Stroinski leads the Saints with four points on two goals. St. Scholastica dropped one match over the weekend, losing 2-1 to Concordia College-Moorhead.

**SPARTAN INVITATIONAL** - Minnesota will take to the road this weekend to participate in the Michigan State Invitational on Friday and Sunday. The Gophers will play the host Spartans Friday at 4 p.m. before facing the Golden Griffins of Canisius College at 1 p.m. on Sunday.

### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

**MICHIGAN STATE** - The Spartans enter this week 2-4 for the year. MSU ended a four-match losing streak on Sunday with a 1-0 victory over Butler. The Spartans' four losses have come against Wisconsin (0-2), Massachusetts (0-3), Hartford (1-4) and Notre Dame (0-6).

The only common opponent between the Spartans and Gophers is Valparaiso. MSU defeated the Crusaders 10-0 on Sept. 4.

Leading the Spartans this year has been Karen Winslow with seven points. The junior has scored three goals and recorded one assist in MSU's six matches.

The Spartans will play Loyola on Wednesday before hosting the invitational.

### SEPTEMBER ATHLETE OF THE MONTH

**WALEK NAMED ATHLETE OF THE MONTH** — Freshman JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) has been named the sports information athlete of the month for September. Walek is among the nation's top five scoring leaders, having scored 11 goals and recording seven assists for 29 points in nine games. Walek, who scored Minnesota's first-ever goal, has led the Gophers to a 7-2 start in their first year of varsity soccer. She scored a career-high three goals against Valparaiso and in the Gophers' most recent contest recorded three assists and one goal against Canisius. Walek, a forward, has started every game.

### CROSS COUNTRY

**GOPHERS HOST NIKE INVITATIONAL** — The Minnesota women's cross country team will host the Nike Invitational on Saturday at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course. The coed meet features a women's Maroon race for NCAA Division II and III schools at 10:15 a.m., a men's race at 11 a.m. and the women's Gold race for NCAA Division I schools at 12:00 Noon. This is Minnesota's biggest home cross country of the season, with 14 Division I entries (at release time) and more than 25 Division II and III teams. Minnesota enters the race looking to solidify its top seven and improve its times from the past two weeks. The Gophers finished eighth in last year's 17-team field at the Nike Invitational.

**THE OPPONENTS** — Five of the nation's top 25 teams will be competing in this weekend's Nike Invitational. Seventh-ranked North Carolina State, 10th-ranked Iowa, 15th-ranked Nebraska, 17th-ranked Wisconsin and 24th-ranked Kansas will be competing. Approximately 40 schools will compete in the two women's races, giving this meet one of the biggest participant fields in the nation for the 1993 women's cross country regular season.

**MINNESOTA'S LINEUP** — For the first time since the intrasquad meet, the entire Gopher roster will run in the same meet. Minnesota's featured runners are senior JESSICA LANGFORD (WINNEBAGO, IL), sophomore LORI TOWNSEND (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY) and junior JULIA MCGOUGH (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL). Langford was Minnesota's top finisher in both races that she has run in 1993 and is Minnesota's only returning member from the Gophers' 1991 NCAA team. Townsend has finished second in both the meets that she has run in so far this year.

**GOPHERS FINISH THIRD AT ST. OLAF INVITATIONAL** — Minnesota finished third in the 18-team field at the St. Olaf Invitational on Saturday. Leading the Gophers was senior KRISTEN BUBOLZ (APPLETON, WI/WEST) with a third place finish in a time of 19:29. Leading the first-year runners (seven freshmen competed for Minnesota) was KAREN MARIE KLEINDL (GRACEVILLE, MN/CLINTON-GRACEVILLE) in 19:59. Also finishing in Minnesota's top five were freshmen CHRISTIE HEIKES (MONTEVIDEO, MN/MONTIVIDEO) in 20:06, KERI ZWEIG (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) in 20:12 and MEREDITH SCHREADER (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) in 20:25.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — After the Nike Invitational, Minnesota will travel to Orono, Maine and the Maine Invitational. The following week, the Gophers will be in Wisconsin at the LaCrosse Invitational

## VOLLEYBALL

**GOPHERS OPEN HOME BIG TEN SEASON FRIDAY** — Minnesota (8-5, 0-2) will open its conference home season at 7:30 p.m. Friday against Michigan State (5-8, 1-1). On Saturday, the Gophers will play host to Michigan (4-6, 0-2). This weekend's matches are the first of four in a row for Minnesota. Next week, the Gophers will play host to Iowa (Oct. 6) and Illinois (Oct. 8).

The Gophers are coming off losses at Penn State (3-1) and Ohio State (3-0).

### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

**MICHIGAN STATE** — The Spartans (5-8, 1-1) opened conference play by beating Michigan 3-0 on Wednesday and then lost 3-0 to Illinois on Saturday. Junior Jennifer Jones has a team-high 108 kills (4.7/game) and freshman Dana Cooke has 102 (2.4/game).

**SERIES** — Minnesota leads 20-5. The Gophers have won four in a row over the Spartans.

**MICHIGAN** — The Wolverines (4-6, 0-2) have dropped three in a row, losing 3-1 to Colorado on Sept. 18 and then 3-0 to both Michigan State (Wednesday) and Illinois. Junior outside hitter Aimee Smith leads the team in kills (105) and senior middle blocker Fiona Davidson leads in hitting percentage (.251).

**SERIES** — Minnesota leads 23-3. The teams have split in each of the last two seasons.

**GOPHERS FIND GOING TOUGH AGAINST RANKED TEAMS** — Minnesota lost 3-1 to 11th-ranked Penn State on Friday and 3-0 to 13th-ranked Ohio State on Saturday. All five of the Gophers' losses have been to teams currently ranked in the nation's top 25.

Minnesota lost 15-11, 10-15, 9-15, 13-15 to Penn State and 5-15, 8-15, 3-15 to Ohio State. **KATRIEN DE DECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM)** led the Gophers in kills in both matches. She had 20 against the Lady Lions while hitting .333. De Decker had nine kills against the Buckeyes and has now led the Gophers in kills in nine of 13 matches.

**NOTABLES** — Sophomore **HEIDI FOESCH (HECTOR, MN/BUFFALO LAKE-HECTOR)** recorded a career-high 27 digs against Penn State, while sophomore **HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE)** notched a career-high 17 kills. The Gophers outhit Penn State .243 to .237 and had a season-high 100 digs against the Lady Lions. Junior **GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS)** had a season-high eight total blocks (one solo) against Penn State.

**MILESTONES** — Dahl's 180 block assists are four shy of the 184 recorded by Andrea Gonzalez (1985-88) for ninth place on that school list and seven behind Jill Halsted's eighth-place total of 187.

## SOCCER

**GOPHERS TO PLAY IN CREIGHTON INVITATIONAL** - The Gophers return to action this weekend when they travel to Omaha, Neb. to participate in the four-team Creighton Invitational. Minnesota will face Creighton on Friday at 7 p.m. and then play Northern Illinois on Saturday at 3 p.m.

Minnesota's two opponents in the Invitational are no strangers to the Gophers as Minnesota lost to Creighton 3-2 in the team's season opener and defeated Northern Illinois 4-3 at the Wisconsin-Green Bay/NIKE Classic.

**AND THE STREAK CONTINUES** - With three wins this past week, the Gophers improved to 7-2 on the year and have won five straight matches. During the last five matches, the Gophers have outscored their opponents 21-2.

### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

**CREIGHTON** - Creighton enters the week 6-1-1. The Lady Jays lost their first match of the year last week with a 2-1 loss to Tulsa. 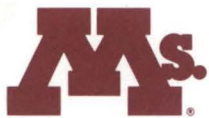

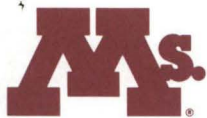

**BUCKEYES BATTLE FOR BIG TEN RESPECT** — Ohio State enters the week 3-4 overall and 0-1 against Big Ten teams. The Gophers began the week 9-4 for the season and 2-1 against Big Ten teams. The only common Big Ten opponent between the two schools has been Wisconsin. The Gophers lost 5-0 in Madison on Friday, while Ohio State lost 1-0 on Sept. 18.

The teams have two other common opponents for the season - Valparaiso and Wisconsin-Green Bay. The Gophers defeated Valparaiso 5-0 at home and lost 1-0 on the road to Wisconsin-Green Bay. Ohio State followed a similar pattern, defeating Valparaiso 6-0 and losing to the Phoenix 3-1.

**GOPHERS CARRY EDGE IN BATTLE OF OFFENSIVE NUMBERS** — As a team, Ohio State has recorded 13 goals and five assists for a total of 31 points in its seven games this season.

The Gophers scored 12 goals and registered six assists for a total of 30 points in the team's 12-0 win over St. Thomas on Sunday at the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium. For the season, Minnesota has scored 44 goals and recorded 35 assists for 123 points.

Defensively, both teams have posted decent numbers as opponents average 1.23 goals per game against Minnesota and 1.15 against the Buckeyes.

**JUNIOR BECKY WENTZ HEADS STATE'S OFFENSIVE ATTACK** — Junior Becky Wentz entered the week with 11 of Ohio State's 31 team points. The Bay Village, Ohio native has scored 5 goals and recorded one assist this season. Wentz had the opportunity to add to her total, as the Buckeyes played Wright State on Monday.

**GOPHER WOMEN CONTINUE OFFENSIVE SHOW** — Frosh JENNIFER WALEK, (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) and sophomore GRETCHEN BRANDT, (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) continue to burn the net as the two have reached

the 30-point mark for the season. Walek finished the week with 14 goals, eight assists for 36 points. Brandt ended Sunday with 12 goals, six assists for 30 points on the season.

**MINNESOTA DEFEATS ST. THOMAS** — Minnesota improved to 9-4 on the season with a 12-0 victory over St. Thomas at the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium on Sunday. Frosh ERIN HUSSEY, (PLYMOUTH, MN/WAYZATA) recorded her first career hat trick in the victory, while Walek, Brandt, and senior ANNE MEITZ, (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/SOUTH) pitched in with two goals apiece.

### OPPONENT NOTES

**Wisconsin** — The Badgers (9-8, 2-4) have dropped four of their last five matches. Wisconsin lost 3-0 to Michigan on Saturday after beating Michigan State 3-2 on Friday. **SERIES** — Minnesota leads 21-11 and has won two in a row between the schools.

**Northwestern** — The Wildcats (7-8, 0-6) are looking for their first Big Ten win after dropping 3-1 matches to both Michigan and Michigan State this past weekend. It is the first time Northwestern has lost six

Big Ten matches in a row since 1986. Junior **Alison Krumbain** paced the Wildcats with nine kills in the Michigan match and set a career high with 21 kills against Michigan State. Senior middle blocker **Shawn Karey** ranked eighth in the nation in blocking (1.82 blocks/game) as of Oct. 3.

**SERIES** — Minnesota leads 15-12 and has won four in a row between the schools.

**GOPHERS DOWN IOWA, LOST TO #22 ILLINOIS** — After beating Iowa 15-12, 15-9, 15-9 on Wednesday, Minnesota went into Saturday's match against 22nd-ranked Illinois hoping to extend the team's longest home winning streak since 1989 to six matches. It looked for a while like it would happen, as Minnesota led 2-1 after three games. It was not meant to be, though, as Illinois rallied for a 15-11, 12-15, 7-15, 15-13, 15-11 win—the Fighting Illini's 23rd straight conference win.

Junior **GRETCHEN DAHL** (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) tied a career high with 17 kills to lead Minnesota. **KATRIEN DE DECKER** (BREDENE, BELGIUM) and **JEAN SCHINTZ** (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE) had 15 kills for the Gophers. Illinois junior **Sue Nucci** led all players with 19 kills.

In the rally-scored fifth game, Illinois led 4-2, but six points in a row by Minnesota, including two service aces by **De Decker**, made it 8-4 Gophers. Minnesota led 9-6 but Illinois scored four consecutive points to lead 10-9. A **HEIDI OLHAUSEN** (LAKEVILLE, MN/APPLE VALLEY) kill tied it 10-10 but Illinois scored four in succession to lead 14-10. After a **Schintz** kill made it 14-11, **Rogers** fired a cross-court shot that fell in to give Illinois the win.

Against Iowa on Wednesday, the Gophers used a balanced attack to sweep the Hawkeyes. Four Gophers—**Olhausen**, **Schintz**, **De Decker** and sophomore **HEIDI FOESCH** (HECTOR, MN/BUFFALO LAKE-HECTOR) each had eight kills to share team kill honors. Minnesota out-hit Iowa .218 to .043 and outblocked the Hawkeyes 6-3.

**GOPHERS AMONG BIG TEN LEADERS** — In Big Ten-only statistics through Oct. 9, **De Decker** ranks fourth in the conference in kills (4.14/game), while **Schintz** ranks third in service aces (0.64/game). In Big Ten individual statistics that include all games, **De Decker** ranks sixth in hitting percentage (.310) and fourth in kills (4.16/game).

**MILESTONES** — **Dahl** recorded five block assists for the weekend to give her 191 for her career and move her past former Gopher **Jill Halsted** into eighth place on Minnesota's all-time school list. **Halsted** had 187 block assists. **Dahl** needs 18 block assists to equal **Heather Benning's** seventh-place total of 209. She will have to wait until next season, though, to surpass **Krista Nevelle's** sixth-place total of 270.

Senior **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) had 25 digs last week, upping her career total to 1,002 and making her the fifth player in team history ever to reach 1,000 digs in a career. She is 32 digs away from former Gopher **Emily Ahlquist's** fourth-place total of 1,034.

Minnesota finished with 58 points. Langford's 17:31.7 earned her the fourth place finish and the number one spot for the Gophers. Also finishing in the top five for Minnesota were junior **JULIE McGOUGH** (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL), 17:46.9, 4th; sophomore **LORI TOWNSEND** (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY), 17:49.6, 8th; junior **ANGIE ABBOTT** (WINONA, MN/WINONA), 18:05.2, 14th; and junior **KRISTEN GOELZER** (JANEVILLE, WI/JOSEPH A. CRAIG), 18:23.5, 26th.

Arizona won the team competition with 33 points and **Suzanne Castrulta** of Arizona finished first in 17:25.8.

Although Minnesota did not crack the top 25 poll, it was one of 32 teams that received votes this week.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — After the LaCrosse Invitational, Minnesota will return home to host the 1993 Minnesota Open at the Les Bolstad Gold Course on the University's St. Paul Campus. The following week the squad will travel to Michigan State and the Big Ten Championship.

## GOLF

**LADY BADGER NEXT STOP** — The Gophers' next stop on their fall golf circuit is the Lady Badger Invitational, Oct. 16-17. The two-day, 54-hole tournament is being played on the Robert Trent Jones-designed University Ridge Golf Course, which opened in 1991. Thirty-six holes will be played on Saturday, with the final 18 holes on Sunday. The course is 5,826 yards long and has a par of 72. The nine teams competing are Wisconsin, Michigan State, Bradley University, Minnesota, Northwestern, Bowling Green, Purdue, Michigan and Winona State.

This is the first Lady Badger Invitational since the fall of 1988 and the 14th overall. Minnesota has won six team and six individual titles in this tournament -- more than any other school. The Gophers won team titles in 1976, 1977, 1978, 1984, 1985, 1988. Kathy Williams, Minnesota head women's golf coach and former Gopher, holds the record for most individual wins at the Lady Badger with two; Williams was medalist in 1977 and 1978. Former Minnesota golfer and coach Nancy Harris won the tournament in 1983, and was followed by Julie Hennessy (1984), Dee Forsberg (1985) and Kate Hughes (1988).

Williams has named senior **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN/LEWISTON-ALTURA), junior **AMY SCHMIESING** (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) and frosh **MAUREEN REGAN** (OMAHA, NE/MARIAN) to the travel team for this weekend's outing. The final three spots on the team will be decided by qualifying rounds Tuesday and Wednesday.

**GOPHERS FOURTH AT LADY NORTHERN** — Minnesota finished in fourth place at the Lady Northern Golf Invitational in Columbus, Ohio this past weekend. ### OPPONENT NOTES

**Purdue** — Purdue (10-7, 3-5) is coming off weekend wins over Michigan State and Michigan. Senior outside hitter **Carey Burvis** is hitting .312 with a team-leading 267 kills (4.38/game). First-year middle blocker **Brooke White** leads the team in hitting percentage (.337).

**SERIES** — Purdue leads 23-12. The teams split last season, with Purdue winning 3-0 in Minneapolis and Minnesota winning 3-0 in West Lafayette, Ind.

**Indiana** — Like Purdue, the Hoosiers (9-8, 5-3) beat Michigan and Michigan State this past weekend. Indiana has had a season similar to the Gophers, with six of eight losses coming to nationally ranked teams. Non-conference teams the Hoosiers have lost to include Kentucky, Notre Dame and Colorado. Junior middle hitter **Anne Eastman** has a team-high 196 kills (3.32/game) and averages 1.27 blocks per game. Junior outside hitter **Jill Kerkhoff** averages 0.64 service aces per game.

**SERIES** — Minnesota leads 16-8 and has won three in a row.

**GOPHERS SPUTTER AT WISCONSIN, NORTHWESTERN** — The Gophers went into their weekend road trip with the idea that two wins could keep them within striking distance of the Big Ten's top three teams. Instead the Gophers lost both matches by 3-1 scores, and now are faced with an uphill climb in their quest to finish in the upper half of the Big Ten.

The Gophers went into Evanston, Ill. on Saturday to play a Northwestern team that had a 1-6 Big Ten record. The Wildcats' lone conference win had come the night before against an Iowa team that is 0-8 in the Big Ten.

Minnesota won game one 15-13, but Northwestern came back to win the next three—15-13, 15-10 and 20-18. The Gophers were out-hit .211 to .169.

On Friday, the Gophers faced a Wisconsin team hungry for a win. A Badger victory over the Gophers would enable Wisconsin to close within one victory of .500 and enhance its postseason chances. The Badgers got what they needed, beating Minnesota 15-10, 6-15, 15-6, 15-9.

After Wisconsin won two of the first three games, Minnesota led 7-2 in the fourth game and looked poised to even the match at two games apiece. It was not to be, however.

Two Wisconsin service aces made it 7-5 Gophers, and the Badgers then won the game on Minnesota mistakes, getting six of their last 10 points on Gopher hitting errors.

**BLOCKING IS A BRIGHT SPOT** — No problem here. If blocking totals determined wins and losses, the Gophers might be unbeaten. Minnesota is outblocking opponents 2.73 to 2.13 per game in Big Ten matches and 2.68 to 1.96 overall. The Gophers' 2.68 per game mark is its best since 1985, when Minnesota averaged 2.84 blocks per game.

In comparison, the Gophers averaged 2.52 blocks per game last season and 2.44 in the 1989 NCAA season.

**DEFENSE IMPROVING** — After averaging 13.31 digs per game in 11 non-conference matches this season, the Gophers have been wearing out their knee pads in Big Ten play, digging up opponent attacks at a 16.97 per game rate in eight conference matches.

The last time a Minnesota team averaged more digs per game in conference play was in 1989, when the Gophers dug up 18.37 opponent attempts per game.

**SERVING AND RECEIVING DIFFICULTIES** — In 1987, Minnesota averaged a school-record 2.86 service aces per game. That average has decreased every year since—right down to the current team's average of 1.75 service aces per game. And while the aces have been fewer, the service errors have been more. The Gophers are averaging 3.62 errors per game this season—up from 3.59 in 1992 and 3.43 in 1991.

Opponents, on the other hand, are serving tougher. They are averaging 1.82 service aces per game against Minnesota this season after averaging 1.42 per game in 1992.

**INDIVIDUAL HIGHLIGHTS** — Sophomore **HEIDI FOESCH** (HECTOR, MN/BUFFALO LAKE-HECTOR) was moved to left outside hitter for the weekend's matches and she responded with a career-high 21 kills and career-high 10 blocks against Northwestern. Junior **GRETCHEN DAHL** (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) came up with a career-best 28 digs against the Wildcats. That total is also a team season high.

First-year volleyball player and student-athlete **TARA FIAMENGO** (LONG BEACH, CA./ST. ANTHONY) saw her first extended hitting action over the weekend. Fiamengo recorded a personal-best nine kills against Wisconsin and seven kills against Northwestern, while sharing time on the left side with fellow rookie **KATRIEN DE DECKER** (BREDENE, BELGIUM/ROYAL ATH-ENEUM)

**MILESTONES** — Dahl recorded seven block assists for the weekend to give her 198 for her career. Dahl needs 11 block assists to equal Heather Benning's seventh-place total of 209 in the school record book. Former Gopher Krista Nevelle is in sixth place with a total of 270.

Senior **SUE JACKSON** (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) had 30 digs for the weekend, upping her career total to 1,032. Jackson, currently in fifth place on the Gophers' all-time dig list, is two digs away from former Gopher **Emily Ahlquist's** fourth-place total of 1,034. Third place figure on the all-time school list is 1,188, recorded by Andrea Gonzalez from 1985-88.

## SOCCER

**THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME** — The University of Minnesota women's soccer team concludes its 1993 home schedule today when the team hosts the Blazers of St. Benedict. Prior to Monday's match, the Gophers (10-4) compiled a 5-1 record at home, losing only to Creighton in the team's season opener. Minnesota will finish its season with four road matches, beginning this Friday at Valparaiso. Saturday, the Gophers will face future Big Ten Conference opponent Indiana.

**VALPARAISO EXPERIENCING DIVISION I GROWING PAINS** — The Crusaders enter the week 0-14 for the season. The team has scored only two goals this season, one by senior **Louise Verneuil** and one by junior **Jennifer Schreiber**. Like Minnesota, Valparaiso is in its first year of women's soccer as a varsity sport.

**HOOSIERS REGAIN WINNING WAYS** — Indiana started the season 3-0 but hit hard times as the team lost its next six matches, including a 3-1 decision to Minnesota on Sept. 19. However, the Hoosiers have bounced back to win their last five matches to improve to their season record to 8-6.

The first-year program will also be looking for its first win against a Big Ten team when the Gophers come to Bloomington, Ind. In addition to its loss against the Gophers, Indiana lost 3-1 to Wisconsin in its only other Big Ten game. Following their match with Minnesota, the Hoosiers will play Ohio State and Michigan State before finishing the season on Oct. 31.

**GOPHERS IMPROVE TO 3-1 AGAINST BIG TEN TEAMS** — Although the Big Ten will not recognize women's soccer as an official conference sport until next season, the Gophers improved their record against Big Ten teams to 3-1 with a 2-0 victory over Ohio State on Saturday at the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium.

Frosh **JENNIFER WALEK** (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) scored her 15th and 16th goals of the year in the win. **Walek** continues to lead the Gophers in scoring as she now has 40 points for the year.



## CROSS COUNTRY

**GOPHERS HOST MINNESOTA OPEN**—The Minnesota women's cross country team will host the 1993 Minnesota Open on Saturday at the Les Bolstad U of M Golf Course. The Gophers are the only Division I team running in this non-scoring meet. Division II, Division III and junior college teams scheduled to run against the Gophers include St. Olaf, Wisconsin-Superior and North Dakota School of Science.

### GOPHERS FINISH SIXTH AT THE LaCROSSE INVITATIONAL

— Two first-year runners led the Gopher squad to a sixth place finish with 166 points at the LaCrosse Invitational on Saturday. Frosh **KERI ZWEIG** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) led the Gophers with her 10th-place finish time of 19:01. This was Zweig's fastest collegiate time on a 5,000 meter course.

**KAREN MARIE KLEINDL** (GRACEVILLE, MN/CLINTON-GRACEVILLE) finished second for the Gophers, just ten seconds behind Zweig. Kleindl's time was 19:11, good for a 15th place finish. Other Gopher leaders at LaCrosse were junior **ANDREA GROVE** (WINNIPEG, MANITOBA, CANADA) in 19th place, 19:17; **BRIDGET NEUTGENS** (OLIVIA, MN/OLIVIA) in 49th place, 19:50; and **HEATHER AMUNDSON** (NORTHWOOD, IA/NORTHWOOD-KENSETT), in 73rd place, 20:12.

Wartburg won the 26 team competition with 87 points and Amy Suppranot of fourth-place St. Cloud State, finished first in 18:15.

**BIG TEN MEET NEXT WEEKEND** — The 1993 Big Ten Cross Country Championships will be Oct. 30 in East Lansing, Mich.. Minnesota finished fifth at the 1992 meet.

## GOLF

**SEASON FINALE THIS WEEKEND** — The Gophers conclude their fall season this weekend at the Stanford Women's Invitational at the Stanford University Golf Course (6,190-yards, par 73) in Palo Alto, Calif. The 19 teams competing are Arizona, Arizona State, British Columbia, Hawaii, Indiana, Minnesota, New Mexico, New Mexico State, Oregon, Oregon State, San Jose State, Southern California, Stanford, Texas Tech, Tulsa, UCLA, Washington, Washington State, and Wisconsin.

Three Gophers -- **AMY SCHMIESING** (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON), senior **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN/LEWISTON-ALTURA) and **MAUREEN REGAN** (OMAHA, NE/MARIAN) -- have pre-qualified for the Stanford tournament. Head coach Kathy Williams is holding qualifying rounds this week for the slots for the traveling team.

**GOLFERS WITH BEST FINISH OF SEASON** — Minnesota had its best finish of the fall season in three different ways at the Lady Badger Golf Invitational this past weekend. The Gophers were third with rounds of 309, 317 and 309 for 935 strokes for the best team finish this year; the Gophers have finished fourth in two other outings this year. The 54-hole total of 935 strokes was the lowest stroke total for three-round tournament, with the previous low being 958 strokes. Minnesota also had its first medalist of the year when a Gopher junior won the individual title.

Wisconsin finished first in the tournament with 921 strokes, followed by Michigan State with 922 strokes.

**SCHMIESING WINS FIRST COLLEGIATE TITLE** — Junior **AMY SCHMIESING** (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) won the Lady Badger Golf Invitational by one after coming from five strokes back after 36 holes. She had rounds of 74, 78 and 76 for 228 strokes. The win is the first of Schmiesing's collegiate career, with her previous best finishes being a pair of 10th-place marks, both recorded this year at the Spartan Invitational (Sept. 12) and the Lady Northern Invitational (10/10). Her 54-hole total of 228 strokes is five strokes better than her previous low three-round mark of 233 strokes, set at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational. Minnesota's last medalist honor was last fall at the 1992 Minnesota Invitational by former Gopher Stacey Kolb.

**THE REST OF THE FIELD** — Erdmann was the number two Gopher at the Lady Badger Invitational, placing eighth with rounds of 78, 78 and 77 for 233 strokes. **Regan** tied for 18th-place with 239 strokes after marks of 82, 80 and 77. Junior **ANGIE AUSE** (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL) had rounds of 80, 81 and 79 for 240 strokes for a 20th place tie. Playing in her first collegiate tournament, frosh **JENNY TREND** (OWATONNA, MN/OWATONNA) tied for 29th-place after rounds of 77, 86 and 83 for 246 strokes. Senior **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN) was 36th with scores of 81, 81 and 89 for 251 strokes.

## SWIMMING AND DIVING

**ALUMNI MEET** — The men's and women's swimming and diving teams will host their annual Alumni Meet on Saturday, Oct. 23 at 1 p.m. at the University Aquatic Center (UAC). **INTRASQUAD MEET** — The Maroon defeated the Gold, 180-130, at the annual intrasquad meet this past weekend at the UAC. Four women's school meet records were broken at the meet. Frosh **KATE WENDT** (RIVER FOREST, IL/OAK PARK RIVER FOREST) won the 100-yard backstroke in a time of 1:00.53, breaking the previous record of 1:00.96 set in 1984 by Elyce Iwerks. Wendt was also top scorer at the meet with 29.75 points.

Two swimmers broke the 100y breaststroke record, with sophomore **LESLIE WILCOX** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) winning the event in time of 1:06.60. Senior **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN) was second with a time of 1:06.73. The previous record was 1:07.60, set by former Gopher Tami Grewenow in 1989. Frosh **TANYA SCHUH** (LAKE ELMO, MN/STILLWATER) set a new intrasquad record in the 100y butterfly with a time of :59.51, breaking former Gopher Andrea Rudser's previous meet mark of :59.62 set in 1990.

The final record to fall was in the 200y medley relay as Wendt, Wilcox, Schuh and junior **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) had a record time of 1:50.15. 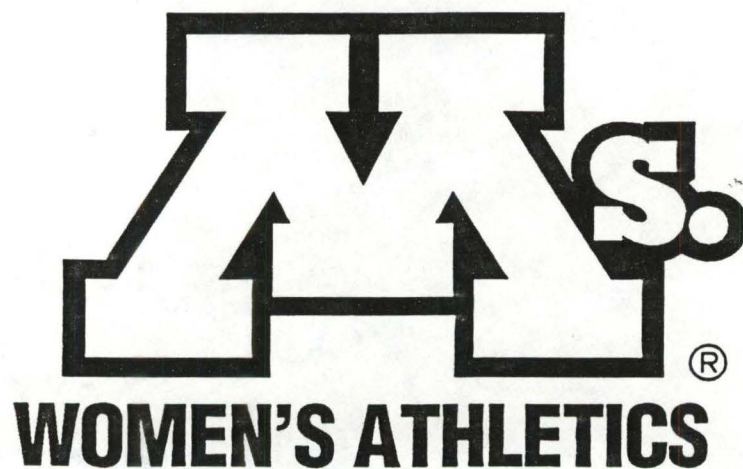

### SHUDLICK NAMED FIRST TEAM ALL-AMERICA BY STREET & SMITH

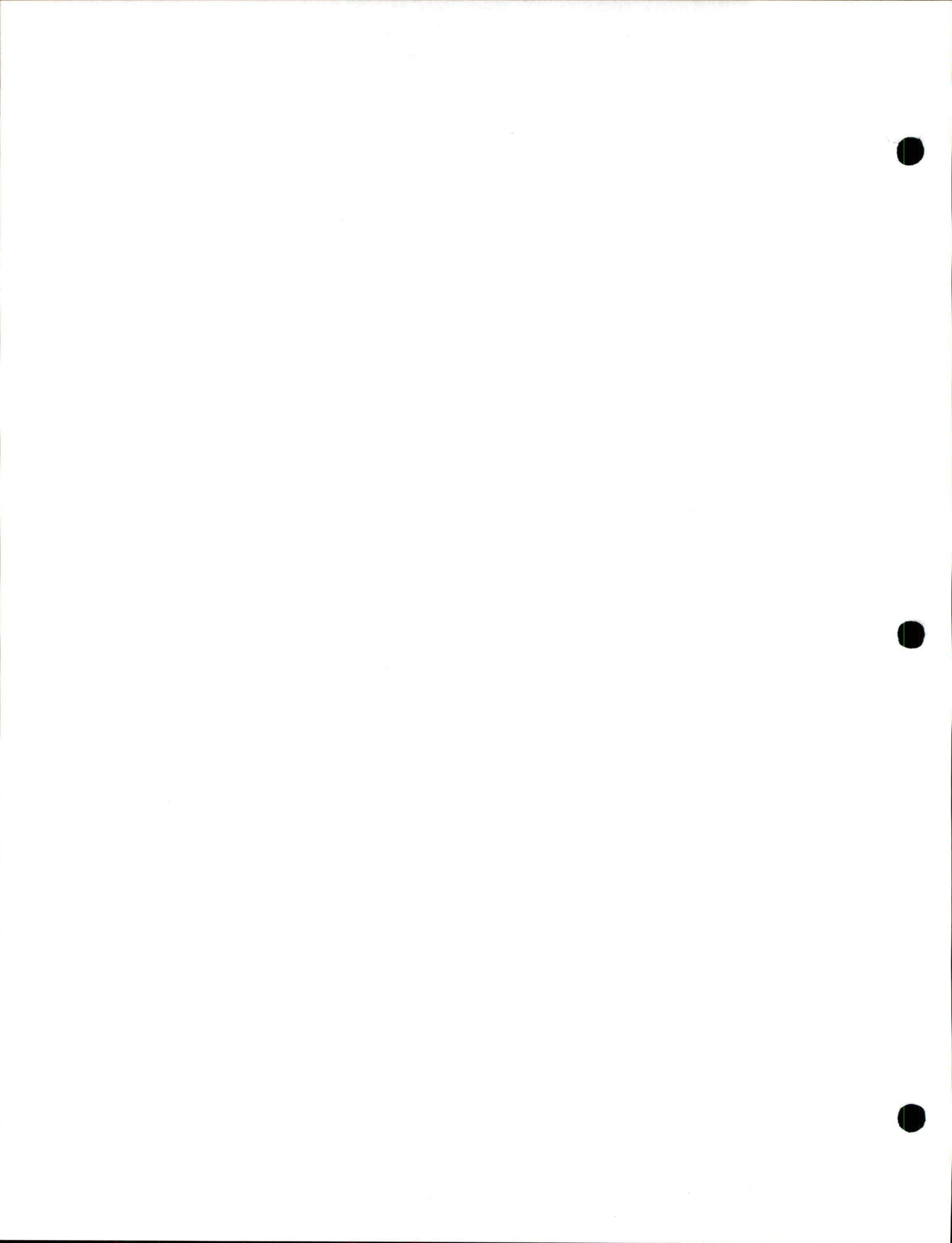
(Minneapolis, MN)-- Minnesota senior forward Carol Ann Shudlick has been named a preseason first-team All-America by Street & Smith college basketball magazine. The magazine first appeared in newstands yesterday.

Shudlick, a native of Apple Valley, Minn., was the Big Ten's leading scorer in 1992-93 and finished the season eighth in the nation in scoring (22.1 ppg). She was named to the honorable mention Kodak All-America team and to the all-Big Ten first team. Shudlick led the Gophers to a 14-12 overall record in 1992-93 and fifth-place Big Ten finish, the highest for Minnesota since the 1984-85 season.

Shudlick is currently fifth on the all-time scoring list at Minnesota with 1,419 career points. She owns the school single game scoring record of 44 points, recorded during her sophomore year. She has scored in double figures in 27 consecutive games and in 63 of 77 games in her career.

This past summer, Shudlick was a member of the Big Ten all-star team that traveled to Hungary, where she was named the most outstanding post player at the Miskolc Tournament in Miskolc, Hungary.

Shudlick is the first Minnesota women's player ever to receive first-team honors by Street & Smith. Former Gopher Laura Coenen was a two-time preseason honorable mention and a one-time high honorable mention team member by Street & Smith between 1983 and 1985.

CRAIG), **ANDREA GROVE** (WINNIPEG, MANITOBA, CANADA), **JESSICA LANGFORD** (WINNEBAGO, IL/WINNEBAGO), **JULIE McGOUGH** (RED WING, MN), **LORI TOWNSEND** (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY), **RICKI VAN AMBER** (ALEXANDRIA, MN/JEFFERSON). Frosh **KERI ZWEIG** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) will be the team's first alternate.

Abbott, Bubolz, Goelzer, Grove, Langford and Townsend ran for Minnesota in the 1992 Big Ten Championships. Abbott finished 22nd overall in last year's meet with a time of 17:47.

### GOPHERS ENJOY HOME COOKING ON HOMECOMING

First-year student-athlete KATRIEN DE DECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM/ROYAL ATHENEUM) fired 28 kills to lead Minnesota to a 16-14, 8-15, 15-9, 15-10 win over Indiana in Big Ten volleyball at Williams Arena on Saturday.

Junior GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) and sophomore HEIDI FOESCH (HECTOR, MN/BUFFALO LAKE-HECTOR) each had eight kills for the Gophers.

Eleven of De Decker's kills came in the first game, helping

Minnesota come back from an 11-4 deficit. Eight unanswered points gave the Gophers a 12-11 lead before the teams traded five points to make it 14-14.

With Indiana serving, De Decker fired a kill to earn the sideout and another kill to make it 15-14 Minnesota. On the next serve, a Hoosier attack attempt went wide to give the Gophers the win.

The Gophers led 7-2 in game two, but the Hoosiers scored 13 of the next 14 points to win 15-8. Indiana held the Gophers to a .070 hitting percentage in the game.

The Hoosiers jumped out to a 6-1 lead in game three, but Minnesota came back to tie it 7-7. The Gophers then pulled away, scoring eight of 10 points to win. Minnesota led throughout in game four, with the Gophers' biggest lead being 12-5. Indiana came within three at 13-10, but could not get closer as Minnesota won 15-10.

**GOPHERS BOIL PURDUE** — De Decker's 27th kill capped a comeback from an 8-0 deficit in game four, as the Gophers outlasted Purdue 15-12, 15-11, 13-15, 15-12 at Williams Arena on Friday to snap a three-match losing streak.

The Gophers trailed 9-2 in game four before taking the lead 10-9 on a De Decker service ace. Minnesota built the lead to 13-9 and Purdue narrowed it to 13-12, but a De Decker solo block and cross-court kill finished it off.

Sophomore right-side hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) added 16 kills for Minnesota and Dahl had 10.

Minnesota was down 8-3 in game one but came back to tie the score 11-11. The Gophers then scored four of the next five points to win 15-12. De Decker recorded nine kills in the first game as the Gophers hit .270 to Purdue's .167.

The Gophers were down again in game two, trailing 6-2, but tied the score 6-6 before opening up leads of 11-8 and 13-10. Minnesota outhit the Boilermakers .294 to .125 in the game.

Purdue came back from a 10-8 deficit in game three, winning 15-13, behind six kills from Lauri Grimes. The Boilermakers had four blocks to the Gophers' one.

For the match, Minnesota outhit Purdue .269 to .162, outblocked the Boilermakers 14-10 and had 87 digs to Purdue's 85.

**GOPHERS IN BIG TEN RANKINGS** — De Decker ranks fifth in the Big Ten in conference kills per game (4.22) and third in overall kills per game (4.19). Dahl ranks fifth in conference blocks per game (1.13) and seventh overall (1.09). She ranks sixth in conference digs (3.26). Junior JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE) ranks sixth in conference service aces per game (0.55) and sixth overall (0.53). Jackson ranks seventh in conference assists per game (10.39) and sixth overall (10.67).

**MILESTONES** — Dahl recorded 11 block assists for the weekend to give her 209 for her career, equaling Heather Benning's seventh-place total in the school record book. Former Gopher Krista Nevelle is in sixth place with a total of 270.

Senior SUE JACKSON (KALAMAZOO, MI/COMSTOCK) had 27 digs for the weekend, upping her career total to 1,059. Jackson moved ahead of former Gopher Emily Ahlquist into fourth place on the all-time school dig list. Ahlquist had 1,034 digs in her career. Third place on the all-time school list is 1,188, recorded by Andrea Gonzalez from 1985-88.

## TENNIS

**TWO GOPHERS TRAVEL TO EAST LANSING, MICH. FOR ROLEX REGIONAL** - Two Minnesota Golden Gopher women's tennis players will be looking to make history this week when they represent the school at the Rolex Regional Qualifier in East Lansing Mich. Frosh **TIFFANY GATES** (GRANDVILLE, MI/GRANDVILLE) and junior **SUSAN CULIK** (CHAPIN, SC/CHAPIN) will enter the 64-singles and 32-doubles draw looking to become the first Gophers to earn a berth at the Rolex National Intercollegiate Indoor Tennis Championships in February. Minnesota has been represented at Nationals in previous years, but always received an at-large berth for being the host school.

To qualify, **Gates** and **Culik** will need to reach the finals of the singles or win the doubles draw.

**RECORDS MAY FALL AT THE ROLEX** - **Gates** enters the event with a perfect 6-0 singles mark for year. Besides being a contender to reach the finals in singles, **Gates** may enter the Gopher record books for most consecutive singles wins.

Former Gopher **Lisa Martin** holds the record of 13 wins set in 1983-84, but **Gates** can close the gap with an impressive showing at the Rolex.

**Culik** enters the event 2-3 in singles, while the doubles pair of **Gates-Culik** stands at 3-3 for the season.

The best showing ever by a Gopher in the event came from **Jennie Moe** in 1989 when she won three singles before being defeated in the quarterfinals.

## SWIMMING AND DIVING

**SWIMMING AND DIVING OPENS SEASON IN INDIANA** - The swimming and diving team opens its dual meet and Big Ten Conference season this weekend at Indiana University in Bloomington. The Gophers have seen action this year, hosting the annual intrasquad and alumni meets the last two weekends. Indiana was in action this past weekend, winning a four-team invitational, featuring state college teams from the Hoosier state.

The Gophers are a mix of the tried and new this year, with newcomers numbering 21 of 39 swimmers and divers on the roster. Top returnees include six-time all-American diver senior **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CANADA), seniors **SUSAN SUOMU** (WAUKEGAN, IL/WAUKEGAN WEST), **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN/FARIBAULT) and **KAREN ADAMS**, sophomore **LESLIE WILCOX** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) and junior **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST). Frosh to keep any eye this year include **KATE WENDT** (RIVER FOREST, IL/OAK PARK RIVER FOREST), **ALICIA HICKEN** (CAMPBELLVILLE, ONTARIO, CANADA) and **DEVON COELLNER** (SALINA, KS/SALINA SOUTH). **Wendt** was the top scorer of all Gophers at the intrasquad meet with **Hicken** and **Coellner** being close behind her in points.

## GOLF

**GOLF FALL SEASON OVER** — The golf team concluded its fall season this past weekend, finishing 13th at the Stanford Women's Intercollegiate Golf Tournament. The Gophers had rounds of 318, 301 and 316 for 935 strokes. The second-round 301 is Minnesota's lowest 18-hole team score this fall, with the previous low round being 309 strokes from last week's **Lady Badger Invitational**. San Jose State won the 54-hole tournament with a 13-under par 863 strokes.

Junior **AMY SCHMIESING** (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) was the top Gopher in the field, tying for 26th place with scores of 76, 76 and 75 for 227 strokes. Her 54-hole total of 227 strokes is her collegiate-career low mark and the best score of any Gopher this year. Senior **JANA ERDMANN** (LEWISTON, MN/LEWISTON-ALTURA) had rounds of 77, 71 and 82 for 230 strokes and a tie for 35th place. Her second round 71 was two-under par, the only under par round this year by a Gopher.

Junior **ANGIE AUSE** (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL) tied for 62nd with 236 strokes after rounds of 84, 74, and 78. Senior **CHRIS WOLLACK** (DULUTH, MN/HERMANTOWN) had a 54-hole total of 248 strokes for an 87th-place tie. She had rounds of 82, 85 and 81. 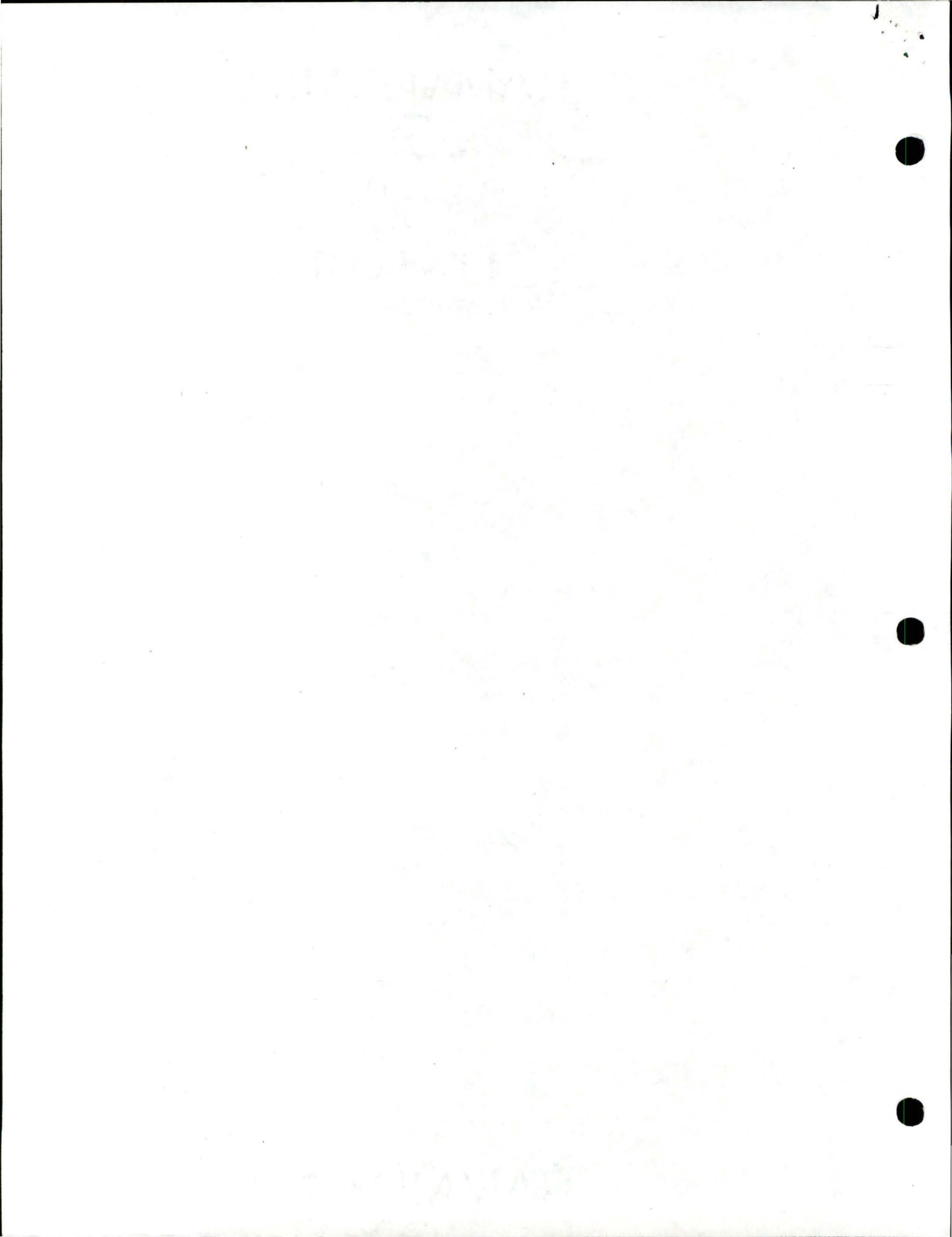

**LANGFORD NAMED SPORTS INFORMATION ATHLETE OF THE MONTH**— Minnesota senior cross country runner **JESSICA LANGFORD** (WINNEBAGO, IL/WINNEBAGO, IL) has been chosen by the women's sports information office as October's Athlete of the Month. Langford was Minnesota's top finisher in all three of her competitions during the month. Langford helped Minnesota to a third-place finish at the Big Ten Championships, tying the Gophers' best-ever finish at the conference meet. Langford finished fourth in the Big Ten meet, out of over 80 runners, and secured All-Big Ten honors. Her time at the Big Ten meet was 17:44.10. Langford is the only remaining member of the 1991 NCAA meet team.

Also during the month of October, Langford placed fourth at the Maine Invitational and ninth at the Nike Invitational.

## VOLLEYBALL

**FOUR AND COUNTING** — The Gophers (15-8, 7-5) will try to extend their four-match winning streak on Wednesday, when Minnesota squares off against Iowa (11-13, 3-9) in Iowa City. **Iowa** — The Hawkeyes (11-13, 3-9) have won two in a row and three of four. Iowa beat Michigan State 3-0 on Friday and Michigan 3-1 on Saturday. Freshman outside hitter **Jill Oelschlager** leads the team in kills with 249 (3.2/game). Sophomore middle blocker **Tiffany Meligan** is averaging a team-high 1.10 blocks per game.

**SERIES** — The Gophers have won five in a row and lead 33-10. Minnesota won earlier this season (Oct. 6) 15-12, 15-9, 15-9 in Minneapolis.

**Illinois** — The 24th-ranked Fighting Illini (12-8, 9-3) split two matches last weekend, losing 3-2 to Purdue on Friday and then beating Indiana 3-1 on Saturday. Illinois is led by the formidable hitting duo of **Kristen Henriksen** and **Tina Rogers**. Henriksen is hitting .366 in conference play and Rogers, .362.

**SERIES** — Illinois has won seven in a row and leads 22-8-1. The Fighting Illini won a five-game thriller (11-15, 15-12, 15-7, 13-15, 11-15) in Minneapolis on Oct. 8.

**MINNESOTA RANKED NINTH IN REGION** — The Gophers were ranked 10th in the Oct. 25 NCAA Mideast Region rankings after being ranked eighth on Sept. 27 and ninth on Oct. 11. Final NCAA regional rankings will be released Nov. 8.

GOPHERS WIN PAIR IN MICHIGAN — Rookie KATRIEN DE DECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM/ROYAL ATHENEUM) slammed 15 kills against Michigan on Friday and 15 more against Michigan State on Saturday, leading the Gophers to wins over both teams. Minnesota beat Michigan 3-15, 15-5, 15-10, 15-11 and downed Michigan State 15-5, 15-12, 15-5.

Minnesota outhit Michigan State .407 to .039 and outhit Michigan .225 to .142.

De Decker hit .462 against Michigan State and .278 against Michigan. Junior JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE) hit .421 with 11 kills in the Michigan State win.

MILESTONES — Junior GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) recorded nine block assists for the weekend, giving her 218 in her career and moving her past former Gopher Heather Benning into seventh place on the all-time school list.

**SOCCER**

INAUGURAL SEASON ENDS IN MILWAUKEE WITH WEEK-END SPLIT — The Minnesota Golden Gophers ended their 1993 inaugural season on the road, defeating Marquette 6-1 on Saturday before losing 5-2 to Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Sunday.

Saturday, the Gophers were led by frosh JENNIFER WALEK'S (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) three goals in the game. Frosh SARAH SCRIPP (MILWAUKEE, WI/RUFUS KING) added two goals while sophomore GRETCHEN BRANDT (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) scored the Gophers' other goal in the match.

Sunday, the Gophers hit harder times as UW-Milwaukee benefited from Mary Jakuczak's two goals to drop Minnesota to 13-6 for the year. Gopher goals came from junior ELLEN PETERFESO (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL MURRAY) and Scripp.

WALEK FINISHES ROOKIE SEASON WITH IMPRESSIVE NUMBERS - Walek's three goals over the weekend left her with 22 goals and 9 assists for 53 points on the season. Brandt finished second on the team in points with 36 with 15 goals and six assists.

**TENNIS**

GATES MAKES NOISE AT ROLEX REGIONAL — Frosh TIF-FANY GATES (GRANDVILLE, MI/GRANDVILLE) reached the quarterfinals of the ITA Rolex Regional Qualifier in East Lansing, Mich. before losing to top-seeded Jody Yin of Indiana, 6-1, 6-2. Gates' three wins in the 64-player draw equals the best showing by a Gopher in the event since Jennie Moe equaled the feat in 1989 and 1991.

Gates began the event on Thursday by defeating Stephanie Benz of Wisconsin 6-2, 6-3. On Friday, Gates handled Kim Anderson of Michigan State 6-1, 6-1 and Sherri Vitale of Notre Dame 6-1, 6-4 before losing to Yin on Saturday morning. Gates' 3-1 effort for the weekend leaves her 9-1 for the season in singles. The nine consecutive wins moved Gates into the fourth spot all-time for most consecutive wins by a Gopher.

CULIK ADVANCES TO CONSOLATION QUARTERFINALS — Junior SUSAN CULIK (CHAPIN, SC/CHAPIN) lost her first round match at the Rolex, but battled back to reach the quarterfinals of the consolation bracket before losing to Erin Gowen of Notre Dame 6-1, 6-0. Culik began the event losing to Lee Ann Rostovsky of Indiana 7-6, 6-2 before defeating Chris Lucia of Ohio State 4-6, 6-4, 6-2 and Kelly McDonough of Michigan State 6-2, 7-6. Culik's 2-2 weekend leaves her 4-5 in singles for the year.

DOUBLES DUO OF CULIK - GATES MAKES EARLY EXIT AGAINST NO. 2 SEEDED TEAM — The doubles team of Culik and Gates lost in the opening round of the 32-team doubles draw to the No. 2 seeded team of Rachel Epstein and Jody Yin of Indiana, 7-5, 6-1. Epstein and Yin eventually captured the doubles crown. The loss dropped Culik and Gates to 3-4 in doubles competition.

FALL SEASON OVER — The Gophers will not be in action again until Jan. 21 when they host the Federated Insurance Court Classic, hosting Auburn, Duke and Baylor.

## CROSS COUNTRY

**GOPHERS FINISH THIRD AT BIG TEN MEET** — The Minnesota women's cross country team finished third at the 1993 Big Ten Cross Country Championships on Saturday in East Lansing, Mich. The Gophers finished ahead of 18th-ranked Iowa, the highest ranked team that Minnesota has defeated the season. Minnesota's strong finish should give them a chance at being nationally ranked for the first time this season. Minnesota's third-place finish ties its highest finish ever at a conference meet. It is also the highest finish for Minnesota since 1987, when the team also finished third. The Gophers have finished in the upper half of the Big Ten in each of the past seven years.

**LANGFORD EARNS ALL-BIG-TEN HONORS**—Minnesota senior **JESSICA LANGFORD** (WINNEBAGO, IL/WINNEBAGO) finished fourth individually at the Big Ten meet, earning her all-Big Ten honors for the first time in her career. Langford completed the 5,000-meter course at Michigan State in 17:44.1.

**WHAT'S NEXT** — Minnesota will attempt to qualify for the NCAA meet at the Region IV meet on Nov. 13 at Indiana. The top two teams from that meet will automatically qualify for the NCAA meet on November 22 in Bethlehem, Pa.

## SWIMMING AND DIVING

**GOPHERS NEXT TRAVEL TO MICHIGAN** — After opening its season this past weekend, the swimming and diving team has two weeks to prepare for their next opponent, the University of Michigan. One of the top teams in the land, the Wolverines are the defending Big Ten Conference champions and placed fifth at the 1993 NCAA Division I Women's Swimming and Diving Championships. Michigan's Lara Hooiveld, named the NCAA women's swimmer of the year, set an NCAA record in 100-yard breaststroke at the championship.

**GOPHERS WIN SEASON OPENER** — Minnesota won its dual meet and conference opener defeating Indiana 183-117 in Bloomington, Ind. last Saturday. The Gophers won seven individual events and both relay races in the 16-event contest.

Sophomore **LESLIE WILCOX** (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINETONKA) was the Gophers' only double event winner in individual events, winning both the 100- (1:06.66) and 200-yard breaststroke events (2:23.83). Freestyle event winners were sophomore **WENDY WOODS** (MADISON, WI/MADISON WEST) in the 1000-yard freestyle (10:27.44) and frosh **SUZIE HELVIG** (MANDAN, ND/MANDAN) in the 50-yard freestyle (:24.69).

Frosh **JESSICA GRASS** (KNOXVILLE, TN/FARRAGUT) won the 200-yard butterfly (2:06.17) and **TANYA SCHUH** (LAKE ELMO, MN/STILLWATER) was number one in the 100-yard butterfly. Senior all-American diver **LAURIE NELSON** (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CANADA/SILVERTHORN) was first in 1-meter diving (266.10).

The 200-yard medley relay team of junior **KIKI ANDERSON** (FALCON HEIGHTS, MN/ROSEVILLE), senior **KRIS ZELLER** (FARIBAULT, MN/FARIBAULT), Schuh and junior **PAM SMITH** (SPRINGFIELD, IL/SPRINGFIELD SOUTHEAST) were first with a time of 1:48.73. In the 400-yard free relay, frosh **DEVON COELLNER** (SALINA, KS/SALINA SOUTH), Helvig, senior **JENNY EASTER** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) and Smith recorded a winning time of 3:33.47.
