MINNEAPOLIS — University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz has named Barbara Wickstrand assistant soccer coach, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Wickstrand, who has worked as an athletic administrative assistant at Arizona State for the past two years, will begin her duties Aug. 1.

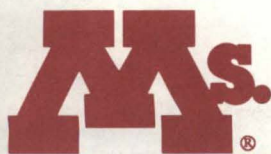
Prior to working at Arizona State, Wickstrand served as assistant soccer coach at North Carolina State for one year and prior to that was an assistant soccer coach for the state of Maryland's Olympic development program during the summers from 1986 to 1991.

Wickstrand has a master's degree in sports administration and marketing from North Carolina State and a bachelor's degree in speech communication from North Carolina State. She played varsity soccer at North Carolina State from 1984-89 and earned all-American honors in 1987 and 1987 and was named her team's MVP in 1985 and 1986. She also was a participant in the U.S. Olympic Festival from 1985-87.

At Minnesota, Wickstrand will replace Lisa Gozley, who resigned to take the head coaching position at Washington State.

MAYS NAMED HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER AT MINNESOTA

Minneapolis, Minn.- University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz has named Sally Mays the new head athletic trainer and director of student services, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Mays, who is currently volunteering at the United States Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., begins her duties August 10.

"Sally will bring us the expertise and dedication so critical to the physical welfare of our student-athletes in order that they will be safe and actualized," Voelz said.

Before her assignment in Colorado Springs, Mays served as head athletic trainer at the University of Arkansas for five years. While at Arkansas, Mays worked directly with eight sports, including volleyball and basketball and was an assistant to all men's sports. Mays also supervised 37 athletic trainers and was responsible for the budget, medical expense reports and facility management while at Arkansas. In addition, Mays was an instructor in the Department of Kinesiology, specializing in athletic training.

Before her stint at Arkansas, Mays was a graduate assistant athletic trainer at the University of North Carolina and Idaho State University and worked with many basketball camps, including the Dean Smith Basketball School.

"I am proud to become a new member of the University of Minnesota Women's Athletic Department," Mays said. "I hope to become an integral part of the success of the athletic program."

Mays earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Washington State University in 1986. She then did graduate work for one year at Idaho State before transferring to North Carolina in 1987. Mays received her master's in physical education from North Carolina in 1989, and began doctoral coursework at Arkansas. She is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association, Southwest Athletic Trainer's Association and the College Athletic Trainer's Society.

MILLER-DOMBECK NAMED ASSISTANT VOLLEYBALL COACH AT MINNESOTA

Minneapolis, Minn.— University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz has named Pam Miller-Dombeck as a new assistant volleyball coach, pending approval by the Board of Regents. Miller-Dombeck, who played for Minnesota under current head coach Stephanie Schleuder from 1983-86, begins her duties August 1.

Dombeck comes to Minnesota after having served for four years as junior varsity volleyball coach at Lakeville High School. For the last year she was the Lakeville Junior Olympic volleyball coach and spent a season as a coach with the 14-and-under Golden Spike Junior Volleyball club. She spent one year coaching at Bloomington Jefferson High School and one year at St. Agnes High School in St. Paul. She served as a student assistant coach with the Gopher program in 1987, and was the coach of the men's club volleyball team at Minnesota in 1988.

Dombeck was the Gophers' all-time kill leader with 1,519 kills when she graduated and is currently third on the all-time kills list. As a senior, she compiled 517 kills and a school-record 169 total blocks. Dombeck remains on Minnesota's top ten career lists in blocks, digs and service aces, and she is the all-time leading blocker with 398 block assists and 536 total blocks. She was named to the all-Midwest Region team and was an all-Big Ten first-team selection in 1986.

"I'm thrilled to have Pam returning to our program as a coach," Schleuder said. "The work ethic and leadership she displayed as a player will tremendously enhance our program."

Dombeck earned a B.S. in education from Minnesota and is currently pursuing a degree in health science from Mankato State. She spent one year teaching physical education at Orchard Lake Elementary School and one year at McGuire Junior High, both in Lakeville.

No. 22 MINNESOTA VOLLEYBALL PICKED TO FINISH THIRD IN BIG TEN

(Minneapolis, Minn.)-- The University of Minnesota volleyball team, ranked 22nd in the Tachikara/American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) preseason poll, was selected to finish third in the Big Ten in a preseason poll announced today at the fifth annual Big Ten Volleyball luncheon in State College, Pa.

The poll, selected by Big Ten coaches, has Ohio State unseating two-time defending Big Ten champion and NCAA runner-up Penn State in the race for the 1994 conference title. Ohio State received 117 votes to 114 for Penn State. Minnesota finished with 99 points followed by Illinois and Wisconsin to round out the top five.

Also announced at the luncheon was the preseason all-Big Ten team. Gopher sophomore outside hitter Katrien DeDecker was the only Gopher selected to the squad. DeDecker, the Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 1993, led the conference with a 4.49 kill per game average. DeDecker also led the Gophers in kills (520), attacks (1209) and hitting percentage (.290).

1994 Season Outlook (for immediate release):

With success comes expectations

Following a 13-6 record in 1993, Minnesota Golden Gopher head women's soccer coach Sue Montagne is preparing her team for their first season of expectations.

Prior to last season's campaign, Montagne refused to predict how her team would finish the year, saying it would place unwanted pressure on her team.

Montagne had little idea how her 22 student-athletes would blend together in only a couple of weeks of preseason practice before facing a challenging 19 match schedule.

But with the 1994 season at the door step and a group of 13 letterwinners returning, along with some key additions, Montagne can not avoid expectations--especially with the Big Ten Conference adding women's soccer to its list of championships in 1994.

"I wish I could give the same answer as last year, but I guess I really can't," Montagne said. "We have a great class of incoming frosh, a transfer student and we have got some key players returning. But we must remember, it is only our second year.

"We are expecting a strong regular season in hopes of becoming a Big Ten championship contender. The team believes we can meet this goal, but we need to work extremely hard on mental and physical conditioning in order to be ready for the challenge."

If 1993 is any indication of what the conference season may bring, a feeling of excitement permeates the Gophers prior to the start of the season. Minnesota defeated Michigan State, 2-1, in East Lansing, Mich. and Ohio State, 2-0, at home while splitting a home-and-home series with Indiana. Wisconsin handed the Gophers a 5-0 thumping in Madison, Wis, giving Minnesota a 3-2 record against future conference opponents.

Include a pair of one goal losses to five-year women's soccer member Creighton and a 1-0 loss to seven-year veteran Wisconsin-Green Bay, and the Gophers chances of winning some matches in 1994 are likely to be better than last season.

As for the first-year of the conference, Montagne believes that the apparent five-goal gap between Wisconsin and the Gophers of 1993, may not be as broad in 1994.

"This year things have changed," Montagne said. "Everybody has a good class of incoming athletes. I know Ohio State and Indiana have good classes and I am assuming Michigan State does as well. Wisconsin lost some key players in the center of the field and they have got some good frosh that will start for them right away in those positions.

"It is going to be interesting to see how much of a leap Ohio State, Indiana and Minnesota can make and what a difference Wisconsin, losing its starters, will have."

The Gophers will have a chance to prove themselves early, and maybe answer some questions about the team's potential, as the Gophers open their season Sept. 4 against Michigan State at the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field -- the Gophers new home field.

"We have a tough opening game," Montagne said of the Spartans. "We beat them last year in a 2-1 game, but we had luck on our side. They had us pinned in our own end the entire game. Anything can happen on any given day with soccer -- and fortunately on that day the score favored the Gophers."

The season the Gophers have stepped-up their schedule, dropping all Division III opponents and replacing them with Division I teams, except for an encounter with Division II St. Cloud State on Sept. 11.

"This year our schedule is a lot tougher," Montagne said "We have added some very good and established Division I opponents to our schedule."

Two such teams the Gophers will face in non-conference matches are Colorado College and William & Mary, Sept. 17-18 in Madison. Prior to the Madison trip, the Gophers will have an opportunity to avenge a 5-2 loss from last season against 10-year program Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Sept. 9 at home.

Minnesota will finish its non-conference and regular season Oct. 28 and Oct. 30 when the Gophers travel to San Diego, Calif., to play veteran programs San Diego and San Diego State.

Other non-conference opponents for Minnesota include second-year programs Virginia Tech (Oct. 2) and Valparaiso (Oct. 7), in addition a home match with Montana (Oct. 14) -- a team in its first season of varsity soccer.

As for the Big Ten, the Gophers will have home matches against first-year teams Penn State (Oct. 9) and Northwestern (Oct. 16). Minnesota will travel to first-year Michigan (Sept. 23) before playing at Indiana (Sept. 25) and Ohio State (Sept. 30).

The Gophers final home match will be Oct. 22 when the Badgers of Wisconsin visit the Twin Cities. The conference championship will be held Nov. 4-6 in Madison with all eight conference teams playing in a single-elimination tournament.

EXPERIENCED IN '94?

Even with 13 letterwinners returning in 1994, Montagne is hesitant to call the

Gophers experienced since the team is only in its second season of varsity soccer. "I think it is still a young team," Montagne said. "We have one year of experience as a team, but we are playing teams with many years of Division I experience."

Young or not, the 13 returning Gophers will be able to enter the 1994 season having the first year of Division I soccer behind them.

"They know what to expect this fall," Montagne said. "Last year coming into the preseason, they had know idea what to expect. They did not know how tough it was going to be, or how many days a week they were going to be practicing, or how many times a day. This season, the returning players know what to expect and what top physical and mental condition they need to be in to compete at this level."

Returning to the Gophers will be the front-line trio of senior Anne Meitz, junior Gretchen Brandt and sophomore Jennifer Walek. In 1993, the three accounted for 43 of Minnesota's 65 goals, 18 of Minnesota's 45 assists and 104 of the Gophers' 175 points. Walek finished the year with 22 goals and nine assists for 53 points, fifth highest point total in the country. Walek's efforts earned her NSCAA/UMBRO all-Central Region second team honors.

Brandt finished second on the team in scoring and 14th in the Central Region with 15 goals and six assists for 36 points. Brandt recorded Minnesota's first "hat trick" with three goals in the Gophers' 4-1 victory over Macalester. Meitz finished fourth on the team in scoring with six goals and three assists for 15 points. According to Montagne, she expects much of the same from the three in 1994, but with additional help from the midfield players.

"We are going to count on our three forwards for most of the scoring," Montagne said. "We have some diverse incoming frosh which is nice, but I still expect big things out of Anne, Gretchen and Jennifer. I would like to see our midfield contribute in the scoring efforts with our defenders pushing forward to create scoring opportunities."

Sophomore Erin Hussey is a returning midfielder that has proven scoring ability. Hussey finished last season third on the team in scoring with six goals and five assists for 17 points. Among Hussey's six goals was a three-goal game against St. Thomas.

Defensively, the Gophers will have the services of senior sweeper Chelon Danielson. Primarily a midfielder throughout her career, Danielson moved to sweeper last season and help the Gophers in allowing only 27 goals in 1993.

"Chelon had a heck of a season last year," Montagne said. "She came-on extremely strong during the spring because she started to feel more in control in the back. She started making the plays and started the attack by connecting the passes rather than kicking the ball out of the zone. She is starting to use her head more and seeing the whole field."

One defender that could put a dent in the back of the net is senior **Ellen Peterfeso**. Blessed with one of the most powerful left legs in the conference, Peterfeso finished the 1993 year with three goals and seven assists for 13 points.

"Ellen has a very strong foot and a heck of a shot," Montagne said. "But she just needs to learn to control it. With more patience, she could be lethal."

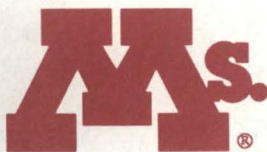
Playing behind Danielson in goal will be sophomore **Teresa O'Hearn**. Listed as the Gophers' only goalkeeper heading into the preseason, O'Hearn's experience is needed after recording 73 saves in 1993 in route to a 2.00 goal against average and 2.5 shutouts.

"Teresa has a terrific work ethic," Montagne stated. "She was one of the most fit and prepared people coming in last year. She knows what to expect, has more confidence and she can read the game better. She will be able to focus for the entire 90 minutes."

Joining the Gophers in 1994 will be a foursome blessed with a wealth of talent. Local products **Carrie Johnson** and **Jennifer McElmury** along with North Carolina transfer **Michealene Denney** and Georgia native **Nellie Barnes** gives Montagne a group with enough talent to contribute immediately.

"Our incoming players give our program a solid recruiting class," Montagne said. "They are gifted, diverse and should see a lot of playing time."

Johnson was an alternate to the 1992 Olympic short track speed skating team while McElmury played soccer during the summer in Europe with the U.S. National B team. Denney transferred from North Carolina, a school that has won 11 national championships in the past 12 years, while Barnes was a member of the State Team of Georgia Regional Top 30 pool the past three years.

COACHING CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS SUSPENDED

(Minneapolis, Minn.) -- University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz announced today the university has suspended its contract negotiations with head women's volleyball coach Stephanie Schleuder and head women's basketball coach Linda Hill-MacDonald. After several months of negotiations between university lawyers and counsel for Schleuder and Hill-MacDonald, no agreement was reached. MacDonald had a four-year contract with the university which expired June 30, 1994, while Schleuder had a three-year agreement which ran out June 30, 1993. Voelz said that "despite the suspension of this round of talks, we want the coaches to remain at the university this season to maintain the continuity of the Gopher program. And, in spite of the fact that negotiations have broken down, marketplace adjustments will be made in line with a year-long study."

"It is regrettable that we were not able to have a successful completion of contract negotiations," Voelz said. "However, I do feel the university acted in good faith in extending fair offers with the compensation reflecting achievement."

On July 18, 1994, United States District Court Judge Paul Magnuson dismissed former university gymnastics head coach Katalin Deli's gender equity claims and in his decision rejected her comparison of her job and its duties to the men's football, basketball and hockey coaches. Another federal court threw out claims of sexual discrimination by the former coach of the University of Southern California women's basketball team, Mary Ann Stanley. She had compared her duties to men's head basketball coach and former Iowa head coach George Raveling.

However, the university and department remains committed to the quality and quantity of the opportunities for its student-athletes. To that end, Voelz completed a year-long marketplace analysis of her department personnel. In order that Minnesota remains and gains in its competitiveness, Voelz is making appropriate marketplace salary adjustments to head, assistant and administrative positions throughout the department, placing them at or above the median for those positions.

Schleuder, who enters her thirteenth season as head coach at Minnesota will be on a one-year appointment ending June 30, 1995. In the 1993-94 academic year, the university paid Coach Schleuder \$42,329. The women's athletic department will adjust her salary along with all other salaries in the department to reflect changes in the market salaries of coaches and administrators. Coach Schleuder will earn \$50,000 in 1994-95. The adjustments, an 18 percent increase to her base salary, will make her one of the highest paid women's volleyball coaches in the Big Ten.



ADD ONE..CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS SUSPENDED

Hill-MacDonald, in her fifth year with the Gophers, will also be on a one-year appointment ending June 30, 1995. The university increased her annual salary by 32 percent to \$65,000 as a marketplace adjustment. Hill-MacDonald's salary in the 1993-94 academic year was \$49,198. The adjustment places her above the median salary of \$55,000 among Big Ten head women's basketball coaches in 1993-94.

Any further contract negotiations will take place at the conclusion of each sport season.

Minneapolis, Minn.-- University of Minnesota women's athletic director Chris Voelz was named District Six Administrator of the Year by the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA). Voelz is now one of seven finalists for the national NACWAA Administrator of the Year award to be announced at the NACWAA 1994 Fall Forum Sunday, Sept. 18, in San Diego, Calif.

Voelz, entering her seventh year as Athletic Director for the Women's Athletic Department at Minnesota, has been a district and national leader in women's athletics during her tenure at Minnesota. Minnesota received 99 points in the balloting, behind Ohio State (117) and defending conference champion Penn State (114). The Gophers finished third in last year's conference standings.

Minnesota was 24-10 overall, 14-6 in the conference last season and advanced to the "Sweet Sixteen" of the NCAA Tournament after an upset of fourth-ranked UC-Santa Barbara on the Gauchos' home court.

Finishing fourth in the coaches' voting was Illinois (84), followed by Wisconsin (77), Purdue (56), Michigan (46), Indiana (38), Michigan State (30), Northwestern (24) and Iowa (21).

LOUREY AND BAUER LEAD GOPHERS IN INTRASQUAD — Transfer BRIGITTE LOUREY (COLUMBIA HEIGHTS, MN/WISCONSIN) had 16 kills, while newcomer BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) had 45 assists in the teams first intrasquad last Thursday at the Sports Pavilion. Lourey, who transferred from Wisconsin for her final season, led all Gophers in kills. Sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM/ROYAL ATHENEUM) and senior middle blocker JEAN SCHNITZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) had 13 kills each and junior setter KATE CALLAHAN (LAKEVILLE) had 43 assists for the Gophers.

PEARMAN OUT FOR SEASON WITH TORN ACL -- Sophomore outside hitter SARAH PEARMAN (APPLE VALLEY, MN) will miss the upcoming season after tearing her anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee during the intrasquad match Thursday evening. Pearman, who was fighting for a spot in the starting line-up, will undergo surgery Friday morning. Last season, Pearman had 22 kills and 162 digs in 34 matches for the Gophers.

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder (Minnesota-Duluth '72) is in her 13th season at the University of Minnesota and her 22nd season as a collegiate volleyball head coach. Schleuder is 540-270 overall (.667), 242-158 at Minnesota (.605) and 118-88 in the Big Ten (.573). Her 540 wins rank eighth among NCAA Division I active women's volleyball coaches.

With 242 wins at Minnesota, Schleuder is four wins away from tying former Gopher coach Linda Wells' career victory mark of 246 wins.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

TEXAS TECH — The Red Raiders finished 14-16 overall last season and 3-7 (fifth) in the Southwest Conference. Texas Tech returns four starters, including 5-9 junior outside hitter Diane Owens, 6-0 junior middle blocker Jennifer Cohn, 5-5 sophomore defensive specialist Courtney Thames and 5-7 senior setter Ginger Carter. Other top returners include 6-0 senior outside hitter Liu Li, 6-1 senior middle hitter Stefanie Francis and 5-9 senior outside hitter Liz Martin.

SERIES — Minnesota leads 2-0. The Gophers defeated the Colonial Women 15-10, 15-10, 15-6 at the Minnesota Classic in 1993.

NEW MEXICO STATE — The Roadrunners posted an 8-21 overall record in 1993, and 5-13 mark (seventh) in the Big West Conference. Three starters return, including 5-7 sophomore setter Christine Jinbo, 6-0 junior outside hitter Kari Logan and 6-0 sophomore middle blocker Annette Monsen.

SERIES — In the only previous meeting between the schools, Minnesota defeated the Roadrunners 15-5, 15-5, 10-15, 15-2 on Sept. 9, 1988.

ARIZONA STATE — The Sun Devils, ranked 11th in the Tachikara preseason coaches poll, posted a 20-8 overall record and 13-5 mark in the Pacific 10 Conference last season. Arizona State lost to Arizona in the NCAA first round. Five starters return from last season, including 6-0 junior outside hitter Christine Garner, 5-8 senior outside hitter Leanne Schuster and 5-9 senior setter Tiffanie Johnson.

SERIES — Arizona State leads 1-0. The Sun Devils defeated Minnesota 15-9, 16-18, 10-15 on Dec. 14, 1973.

WHAT'S NEXT — The Gophers play a single match at Northern Arizona on Tuesday, Sept. 6, before traveling to Chapel Hill, NC, to face Tennessee and North Carolina on Friday, Sept. 9. Minnesota plays at Duke on Saturday, Sept. 10, before returning to the Twin Cities.

GOPHERS OPEN 1994 SEASON, BIG TEN CONFERENCE SCHEDULE, SUNDAY, SEPT. 4, AT HOME AGAINST MICHIGAN STATE — History will be made Sunday, Sept. 4, as the Minnesota Golden Gopher women's soccer team will open its second season of varsity soccer — and the Big Ten Conference's first season of women's soccer — against the Michigan State Spartans. The game is scheduled to begin at 2 p.m.

In addition to the game being the first women's match in the history of the Big Ten Conference, the event will also be the Gophers' first home match at the new St. Paul Campus Soccer Field. The field is located on the corner of North Cleveland and Larpenteur Avenue.

EIGHT TEAMS COMPETE FOR BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP — In addition to the Gophers and Michigan State, veteran program Wisconsin will be a strong favorite to contend for the title, along with second-year programs Indiana and Ohio State. The remainder of the conference includes first-year programs Northwestern, Michigan and Penn State.

The season will conclude with an eight-team conference championship tournament, Nov. 4-6, in Madison, Wis. The winner of the tournament will receive an automatic bid to the expanded 24-team NCAA tournament.

A LOOK AT THE TEAMS—

MINNESOTA GOLDEN GOPHERS — The Gophers return 13 letterwinners and all 11 starters from last season's 13-6 team. Among the returning players is sophomore JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL). Walek finished the 1993 season with 22 goals and nine assists for a total of 53 points, the fifth highest point total in the country. Walek's efforts earned her NSCAA/UMBRO all-Central Region second-team honors.

Joining Walek on the front line will be junior GRETCHEN BRANDT (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW). Brandt finished the 1993 campaign with 15 goals and six assists for 36 points, 14th highest total in the Central Region.

At the midfield, the Gophers will return sophomore ERIN HUSSEY (PLYMOUTH, MN/WAYZATA), a proven midfielder with scoring potential. Hussey finished the 1993 year with six goals and five assists for 17 points. Included in Hussey's six goals was a three-goal game against St. Thomas.

Defensively, the Gophers will have the services of senior CHELON DANIELSON (STILLWATER, MN/STILLWATER) for another season. Danielson made the transition from the midfield to sweeper last season and was an important member of the Gophers' defense that allowed only 27 goals. Joining Danielson defensively is senior ELLEN PETERFESO (LAKE ELMO, MN/HILL MURRAY). Listed as a defender/midfielder, Peterfeso provided three goals and seven assists for 13 points last season.

In goal for Minnesota this season will be sophomore TERESA O'HEARN (CHAMPLIN, MN/ANOKA). O'Hearn finished her rookie campaign with a 2.00 goals against average while recording 73 saves.

Joining the Gophers this season is the foursome of CARRIE JOHNSON (ROSEVILLE, MN/MOUNDS VIEW), MICHELENE

DENNEY (OMAHA, NE/MARIAN), NELLIE BARNES (SNELLVILLE, GA/BROOKWOOD) and JENNIFER MCEL MURY (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE).

Johnson was a two-time all-Midwest selection, and was an alternate to the 1992 U.S. Olympic short track speed skating team. Denney transferred from the University of North Carolina where she was twice a member of a national championship team. Barnes was a four-time all-state selection in the state of Georgia, while McElmury was the 1993 metro "Player of the Year" award winner.

MICHIGAN STATE SPARTANS — The Spartans return 20 letterwinners and eight starters from a team that finished 12-8 in 1993, giving the program its eighth straight winning season. Among Michigan State's triumphs was a late-season victory over Virginia and an overtime loss to eventual national runner-up George Mason.

Returning to the Spartans' line-up is senior midfielder Karen Winslow. Winslow is Michigan State's top returnee with 13 goals and three assists for 29 points in 1993. Two other returning Spartans finished last season with 10 or more points. Junior midfielder Marcie Dart finished with four goals and three assists for 11 points, while junior forward Beth Ernst had three goals and four assists for 10 points.

THE COACHES — Sue Montagne is in her second season as the Gophers' head coach. Montagne's team finished last season 13-6.

Spartan head coach Tom Saxton is entering his fourth year as a head coach, all at Michigan State. Saxton's overall record is 36-20-2.

THE SERIES — The Gophers lead the all-time series 1-0. Minnesota defeated the Spartans, 2-1, in East Lansing, Mich., last season.

GOLFERS OPEN AT HOME — The Minnesota women's golf team opens its 1994-95 season at home this weekend when they host the 54-hole Minnesota Golf Invitational Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 3-4. Teams will play 36 holes Saturday and the final 18 holes Sunday at the University of Minnesota Les Bolstad Golf Course in Falcon Heights, Minn. The course par is 74 and will play at 5,955 yards.

Fourteen teams will be in the field including Bowling Green (Ohio), James Madison, Iowa State, Winona State, Creighton, Nebraska, Northern Illinois, Michigan, Mankato State, Macalester, Illinois State, Moorhead State, Penn State and Minnesota.

At last year's Minnesota Invitational (April 23-24, 1994), Minnesota finished second behind Wisconsin, which carded a 964 for a 20-stroke victory. Senior AMY SCHMIESING (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) was the top Gopher finisher last year, placing third at 240. Wisconsin's Laura Bleyhl won the tournament in a playoff with Sherri McDonald of Penn State after both players finished the tournament at 234.

THE BIG TEN CONFERENCE ADDS WOMEN'S SOCCER TO NCAA INTERCOLLEGIATE SPORTS

University of Minnesota Women's Soccer Team Begins First Big Ten Season

MINNEAPOLIS, Aug. 24, 1994 -- Riding on the skyrocketed enthusiasm for the sport of soccer since the recently completed World Cup competition, the University of Minnesota women's varsity soccer team is poised to begin a new era of soccer. On Sunday, Sept. 4 at 2 p.m., the 1994 Golden Gopher squad will host Michigan State in its first Big Ten Conference match ever, and the program's first match at the new St. Paul Campus Soccer Field at the corner of North Cleveland Street and Larpenteur Avenue in St. Paul.

For the first time in Big Ten history, women's soccer is being recognized as a conference sport. Joining the Gophers to comprise the eight-member conference are: Wisconsin, Michigan State, Indiana, Ohio State, Michigan, Penn State and Northwestern.

Minnesota, entering its second year of varsity soccer, comes off a successful 13-6 overall record in 1993. The squad was 3-2 in its first year of play against Big Ten schools. Led by head coach Sue Montagne and assistant coach Barbara Wickstrand, the Golden Gophers are returning 13 players from its 1993 team.

"In 1981, only 75 NCAA schools had women's soccer teams, Montagne said. "In comparison, when the University of Minnesota began its women's soccer program last year, it was one on 445 NCAA member school sponsoring such programs. We're very excited about the increased support by schools and the opportunity to compete in the Big Ten."

Players to watch throughout the 1994 season include: sophomore Jennifer Walek, who finished the 1993 season as Minnesota's leader in points with 53, was tied for fifth in the country in scoring and was selected to the NSCAA/UMBRO all-Central Region second team; junior Gretchen Brandt, who completed the season with 15 goals and was 14th in the Central Region in scoring.

Other key players include: sophomore Erin Hussey, who scored a "hat trick" in Minnesota's 12-0 win against St. Thomas on October 10, 1993; senior Chelon Danielson, who anchored the 1993 Gopher defense which allowed only 27 goals; and sophomore goal tender Teresa O'Hearn, who started 13 of 19 matches and finished the year with a 2.0 goals against average.

In addition to the growing interest of women's soccer in the midwest, the sport is gaining great popularity nationwide. According to research by the Soccer Industry Council of America, female participation in soccer during 1993 increased 16 per cent from 1992. That compares to a three per cent increase among males. Because of the sport's popularity worldwide, women's soccer teams will compete for the first time in the Summer Olympics in 1996 in Atlanta.

DIVER NELSON WINS MINNESOTA WOMAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

Minneapolis, Minn.-- Former University of Minnesota diver LAURIE NELSON (ETOBICOKE, ONTARIO, CANADA/SILVERTHORN) has been named the state of Minnesota's Woman of the Year by the NCAA. Nelson joins 50 other state winners as a candidate for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award, recognizing excellence in athletics, academics and community service. Ten finalists will be announced at the annual meeting of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA), September 18 in San Diego, Calif., with the Woman of the Year being announced at the NCAA Woman of the Year banquet November 14 in Washington D.C.

Nelson is the most decorated diver in Golden Gopher history. While at Minnesota, Nelson was an eight-time NCAA all-American and a three-time all-Big Ten selection. She finished third in the one-meter event at the NCAA championships in 1993 and was the first female Minnesota diver to win a Big Ten championship, when she won the Big Ten title on the one-meter board in 1992. In 1993, Nelson won the platform and three-meter events on her way to being Big Ten Diver of the Year.

A food science major at the University, Nelson also was selected as an academic all-American and an academic all-Big Ten recipient during her career at Minnesota.

Nelson is also active in the community as she is a coach for youth divers and a volunteer with the American Lung Association.

GOPHERS, MICHIGAN STATE BATTLE TO TIE IN SEASON OPENER — The Big Ten Conference's first women's soccer match ever, did not produce the first Big Ten Conference victory.

After 120 minutes of play on the rain-soaked St. Paul Campus Soccer Field, the Gophers and the Spartans of Michigan State finished the historic event tied 1-1.

Michigan State scored early on Becky Ketola's unassisted goal at the 3:31 mark of the first half, taking the 1-0 lead into the second half. But Gopher JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/NORTH ST. PAUL) tied the game for good with a goal at the 56:12 mark, assisted by sophomore ERIN HUSSEY (PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG). The goal was Walek's 23rd of her career after scoring 22 last season.

Also contributing in the game was sophomore goalkeeper TERESA O'HEARN (CHAMPLIN, MN/ANOKA). O'Hearn finished the game with 13 saves, tying her career-best.

GOLF

MINNESOTA TIES FOR SECOND AT HOME—The Minnesota women's golf team tied for second place at the Minnesota Golf Invitational this past weekend, in their only home tournament of the 1994-95 season. The Gophers and Penn State each had 54-hole totals of 963, with Minnesota having rounds of 325, 325 and 317. Iowa State played consistent golf to win the two-day tournament with rounds of 316, 317 and 316-950. The invitational, at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course in Falcon Heights, Minn., played at 5,955 yards and had a par of 74.

SCHMIESING COMES FROM BEHIND TO WIN BY THREE—Senior AMY SCHMIESING (SPICER, MN/SPICER-NEW LONDON) came from a six-way tie for fourth place and seven strokes back after 36-holes to win the Minnesota Golf Invitational by three strokes. Schmiesing carded a one-under par final round for her second collegiate victory. She had rounds of 81, 78 and 73 for 232.

Sophomore MAUREEN REGAN (OMAHA, NE/MARIAN) finished third with two collegiate personal best scores after rounds of 82, 80 and 74 for 236 strokes. Her final round 74 and 54-hole total of 236 were her collegiate low scores.

Rounding out the Gophers in the top 10 was senior ANGIE AUSE (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL) after she finished in a two-way tie for eighth place with a three-round mark of 240 after rounds of 80, 77 and 83.

GOPHERS HOST INTRASQUAD/ALUMNAE MEET—Minnesota will host its annual intrasquad/alumnae meet Saturday, Sept. 10, at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course at 11 a.m. The Gophers first regular season meet is Saturday, Sept. 17, when they host Drake at 11 a.m., at the Les Bolstad University of Minnesota Golf Course. Admission is free.

WILSON LOOKS FOR CONSISTENCY IN 1994—Consistency...Consistency...Consistency...When looking at head coach Gary Wilson and the Minnesota cross country program, consistency is the first word that comes to mind and 1995 should do nothing to disrupt the trend. The Wilson-led Gophers have finished in the upper half of the Big Ten in each of the last seven seasons and have finished in the top five of their region during that time. They also have made their mark nationally, appearing in the Top 25 of the country six of the last seven years, including a No. 24 national-ranking last season.

Although always a model of consistency, Wilson will have some questions to answer for his team to be successful in 1994. The Gophers lost top runner Jessica Langford to graduation and Julia McGough has decided not to return to the team. Langford, the Gophers Most Valuable Runner in 1993, finished fourth at the Big Ten championships and advanced to the NCAA championship meet at Lehigh University in Allentown, Pa. McGough earned Most

Improved honors last year for the Gophers and finished 22nd at the Big Ten race. She also won the Minnesota Open with a meet record time of 14 minutes and 17 seconds.

But things aren't all bad, as the Gophers do return six of eight runners who competed in the Big Ten championships last season, including junior LORI TOWNSEND (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSBURY). Townsend set a Minnesota varsity record in the 5,000 meters during indoor track season and later finished 10th at the NCAA championships, earning all-America honors. She finished 14th at the Big Ten cross country championships and 11th at the Region IV meet. Townsend was also named an academic all-American by the NCAA Women's Cross Country Coaches Association.

Returning with Townsend from last season's Big Ten squad are seniors ANGIE ABBOTT (WINONA, MN), ANDREA GROVE (WINNEPEG, MB, CANADA/TUXEDO SHAFTSBURY), RICKI VAN AMBER (ALEXANDRIA, MN) and KRISTEN GOELZER (JANESVILLE, WI/JOSEPH CRAIG). Abbott won the Coaches Award last season for the Gophers and finished 36th at the Big Ten meet. Grove consistently placed in the upper half of her races and will be counted on for the same results this year. Van Amber, a captain with Abbott, ran a strong race at the Nike Invitational last year and will provide much needed leadership this season. Goelzer finished 26th at the Maine Invitational and was an Academic all-Big Ten selection in 1993.

A strong group of sophomores return with JENNY ELLIOTT (REGINA, SK, CANADA/SHELDON-WILLIAMS COLLEGIATE), KAREN MARIE KLEINDL (GRACEVILLE<,MN/CLINTON-GRACEVILLE), KERI ZWEIG (EXCELSIOR, MN/MINNETONKA) and BRIDGET NEUTGENS (OLIVA, MN) leading the way. Elliott was named Frosh of the Year last season after competing in both the Big Ten and Region IV meet, the only newcomer to do so. Kleindl finished ninth at the St. Olaf Invitational and showed much promise last season. Zweig and Neutgens competed in all three track seasons for the Gophers and should make an impact this season.

The biggest impact in 1994 could be made by the newcomers of LISA ARO (LORETTO, MN), ANDREA SWANSBY (PEWAUKEE, WI), ANDREA LENTZ (WILLMAR, MN) and KARI THOMPSON (ALEXANDRIA, MN). Aro was a swimmer until her junior year of high school when she decided to run cross country. She won the Minnesota state cross country meet two months later and the attention of many college coaches. Swansby, Lentz and Thompson also have a great deal of potential and will be fighting for roster spots immediately.

THE COACH: GARY WILSON: Wilson enters his ninth season as the leader of the Gophers cross country team.

FRESNO STATE— The Bulldogs enter the weekend with a 6-3 overall record. Fresno State has defeated SW Missouri State (3-0), UC Irvine (3-1), Santa Clara (3-0), San Francisco (3-0), Boise State (3-0) and Cal State-Sacramento (3-2), while falling to USC (0-3), Cal State-Northridge (2-3) and Northern Arizona (2-3).

A LOOK BACK —

GOPHERS FINISH 2-1 IN NORTH CAROLINA- The Gophers tallied a pair of victories at the Triangle Invitational in Chapel Hill, N.C. last Friday, defeating Tennessee, 3-1, and North Carolina, 3-0. Minnesota then suffered its only loss of the week, falling to 20th-ranked Duke 3-1 on Saturday.

Senior cocaptain JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) led the way against Tennessee, recording 16 kills, while junior HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) had 12 kills. The Gophers outhit the Volunteers .293-.200. Minnesota won the match 15-7, 14-16, 15-12, 15-9.

Olhausen led the team with 13 kills and hit .434 against North Carolina. After winning game one, 15-7, the Gophers led 8-3 in game two before the Tar Heels rebounded and tied the game 10-10. North Carolina tied the game 14-14 and Minnesota faced game point three times and the Tar Heels had game point twice. In the end, the Gophers led 19-18 when a Tar Heel hitting error sealed game two for Minnesota, 20-18. The Gophers won game three, 15-7, to sweep the match.

Sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) had 23 kills against Duke and four other Gopher players recorded double digit kills against Duke, but the Blue Devils prevailed 16-14, 10-15, 15-9, 15-7. Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) had 58 assists in the match.

INJURY REPORT — The eight matches in nine days took their toll on the Gopher lineup, as junior setter KATE CALLAHAN (LAKEVILLE, MN) sprained her ankle in the Tennessee match and was sidelined for the remainder of the weekend. Her status for next weekend is questionable.

SCHLEUDER ADDS TO LIST OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS — Head coach Stephanie Schleuder became Minnesota's all-time winningest volleyball coach with the win over North Carolina on Saturday. Schleuder's record at Minnesota is now 247-161. Schleuder passed former Gopher coach Linda Wells, who had 246 victories at Minnesota.

Schleuder, currently eighth among active Division I coaches, is 545-273 in her career.

THE LEADERS— DeDecker leads the Gophers in kills through the first eight matches with a total of 113, an average of 4.04 per game. DeDecker is hitting .274. Schintz is the team leader in hitting percentage at .316. She has recorded 75 kills on 158 attempts with 25 errors. Olhausen is second on the team in kills with 80 and leads in digs with 73. Bauer is averaging 12.81 assists per game as the starting setter.

GOPHERS TRAVEL TO MADISON, WIS., TO FACE TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS — For the first time this season, the Minnesota women's soccer team (2-0-1) will play a game away from the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field. Minnesota will travel to Madison, Wis., to face Colorado College and nationally-ranked William & Mary. The Gophers will face Colorado College Saturday at noon, and William & Mary Sunday at noon.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS

COLORADO COLLEGE — The Tigers enter the weekend 0-3-1. Colorado College opened the year with a 5-2 loss to #15 Hartford, followed by a 1-0 loss to Oregon State. This past weekend, the Tigers lost 3-1 in overtime to Cal-State Sacramento on Saturday, before tying #14 California 0-0.

Colorado College has been outscored 9-3 this season, with two of the Tigers goals coming from junior Katie Shenk. Sophomore Meagan McGuire scored the Tigers only other goal this season.

Since 1992, Moe-Coughlin has been serving as a tennis professional at the Minnesota Valley Country Club in Bloomington, Minn., and working as an assistant account executive at Mona Meyer McGrath & Gavin, a public relations firm in Bloomington.

"I am very excited having Jennie aboard," women's tennis coach Martin Novak said. "Jennie is a first-class individual and her return to our team as a coach will help us immensely."

Stephenson has been working with the Gophers gymnastics program for the past two seasons as a volunteer coach. Her responsibilities included balance beam training, skill development and choreography. Last season under Stephenson's tutelage, the Gophers scored a 48.450 against Utah in the beam, breaking the old Minnesota record of 48.125 set earlier in the season.

Stephenson earned a degree in elementary education from Iowa State in 1981. She also was a member of the gymnastics team from 1977-81 and team captain in 1980 and 1981.

"Even though Meg has been working for us the past two seasons, her hiring as an assistant coach will allow her to give more time to the program and be more involved with the team," head coach Jim Stephenson said. "Her expertise has offered us fantastic results over the past two seasons. The team is excited and I am very pleased to have her aboard."

A former golfer at Minnesota, Hennessy was captain of the Golden Gophers squad from 1985-87. She graduated with a degree in education with an emphasis in leisure services management from Minnesota in 1988.

"We are excited to have Julie back at Minnesota as an assistant coach," Gophers golf coach Kathy Williams said. "She will bring quality and credibility to the Minnesota golf program and her experience as a player and a teacher will be a big asset in our improvement."

The Gophers went 3-0 in the tournament and Schintz was named the Most Valuable Player after setting tournament records for hitting percentage in a single match (.619 vs. Fresno State) and hitting percentage in the tournament (.492).

BIG TEN OPENER — The Gophers (8-3) play at Iowa State on Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. before opening the 1994 Big Ten season on the road, playing at Purdue Friday and at Illinois Saturday.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

IOWA STATE — The Cyclones are 7-2 overall and are coming off a 3-1 victory over Wichita State last Saturday. Minnesota and Iowa State have faced two common opponents this season, with both the Gophers and Cyclones defeating Texas Tech and New Mexico State.

The Cyclones are led by junior outside hitter Stephanie McCannon with 4.7 kills per game and a .288 hitting percentage. She also leads the team in digs with 4.57 per game. Junior outside hitter Kirstin Hughahl is averaging 4.6 kills per game while senior middle blocker Kary Law averages 10.50 digs per game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series, 21-4.

PURDUE — The Boilermakers are 2-7 overall after falling to Western Kentucky 3-1, and Mississippi State, 3-1, at the Louisville Classic last weekend. Purdue's victories have come against Kentucky and Alabama-Birmingham.

The Boilermakers are led by sophomore middle blocker Brooke White with 3.19 kills per game and a .286 hitting percentage. Sophomore outside hitter Kelli Kerkhoff averages 2.19 kills per game and is the team leader in digs with 2.39 a game. First-year setter Linda Menconi averages 10.06 assists per game. As a team, Purdue is hitting .158.

THE SERIES — Purdue leads the series 25-14. Minnesota won both matches last year by scores of 3-1.

ILLINOIS — Illinois is 8-4 overall and has won its last eight matches after beginning the season with four losses. Illinois lost to Hawaii, UCLA, Georgia and New Mexico and has defeated Georgia Tech (twice), Vermont, Fairleigh Dickinson, Seton Hall, Boston College, Colgate and Army.

Illinois is led by frosh outside hitter Erin Borske with 3.58 kills per game and a .224 hitting percentage and senior Julie Edwards with 3.56 kills per game and a .312 hitting percentage. Frosh setter Amy Hrischuk averages 10.66 assists per game.

THE SERIES — Illinois leads the series 23-8. Minnesota lost to Illinois in both matches last year, falling 3-0 in Champaign and 3-2 in Minneapolis.

GOPHER LEADERS — Senior middle hitter JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) is leading the team in hitting percentage at .365, while sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) leads in kills with 3.78 per game. DeDecker is hitting .267. Junior outside hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) leads the team in digs with 3.0 per game, averages 2.94 kills per game and is hitting .296. Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) is averaging 11.97 assists per game.

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder is now 548-273 in her career and 250-161 in her 13th year with the Gophers.

GOPHER TENNIS TEAM OPENS SEASON AT WILLIAM & MARY INVITATIONAL—The Minnesota Golden Gopher women's tennis team opens its season Friday at the William & Mary Invitational in Williamsburg, Va. In addition to the Gophers, seven other teams will compete in the tournament. They include: William & Mary, South Florida, Virginia Commonwealth, Marquette, Richmond and Wisconsin and Illinois.

SEVEN LETTERWINNERS RETURN TO GOPHER LINE-UP—Since Gopher head coach Martin Novak arrived on the University of Minnesota campus in 1991, Minnesota has finished 10th once and seventh twice at the annual Big Ten championships. This season, the pattern of previous years should change, as Novak returns eight letterwinners and welcomes a pair of frosh who are ranked in the top 75 nationally.

Leading the list of returnees are sophomore TIFFANY GATES (GRANDVILLE, MI/GRANDVILLE) and senior co-captain SUSAN CULIK (CHAPIN, SC/CHAPIN). Gates finished last season with a 17-11 overall record and was the first Gopher to be named to the all-Big Ten team since assistant coach Jennie Coughlin, formerly Jennie Moe, accomplished the feat in 1992. Gates accomplished many things in 1993-94, including being the first Gopher since Coughlin in 1991 to win three matches at the 64-player Rolex Regional Qualifier. Gates also won her first nine singles matches to place her fourth on the all-time consecutive win list in school history.

Culik finished last season 12-19 overall in singles and, like Gates, competed at the Rolex. Culik lost her first match, but battled back to the quarterfinals of the consolation bracket before losing again.

Also planning to contribute to the Gophers' success this year will be four other returnees and two newcomers. Senior BRIDGET FERGUSON (BURNSVILLE, MN/EDEN PRAIRIE) and junior DANA PETERSON (APPLE VALLEY, MN), should find themselves in the line-up throughout the year. Ferguson played mostly No. 5 and No. 6, finishing the year 13-8 overall. Peterson competed at the No. 4 and No. 5 spots and was 8-18.

Senior AMY ERSKINE (EDINA, MN) played in six matches last season, finishing 1-5, while junior KATHY WAYNE (TEMPE, AZ/CORONA DEL SOL) played 11 times and finished 6-5. The only other returning Gopher is sophomore APRIL STREET (BATON ROUGE, LA/BROADMOOR), who started last season 4-0, but finished 4-3 before missing the rest of the year with a shoulder injury.

Joining the Gophers this season is the duo of JENNIFER HAYES (FOND DU LAC, WI/GOODRICH) and JENNY SVEHLA (NAPERVILLE, IL/CENTRAL). Hayes graduated from Goodrich High School in Fond du Lac, Wis., and was ranked 50th in the nation in 1992 for 16-and-under. Svehla comes to Minnesota from Central High School in Naperville, Ill., and had a combined record of 95-9 in three years of high school in both singles and doubles, in addition to being ranked 73rd in the nation in singles in 1992.

WOMEN'S ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME ANNOUNCES 1995 INDUCTEES

Minneapolis, Minn. - The University of Minnesota Women's Athletic Department Hall of Fame will induct its third group of honorees on November 17, 1995 as part of the celebration of the 20th Anniversary of the department. The six to be inducted into the Hall of Fame are: Laura Coenen, Marie Roethlisberger, Linda Wells, Patty Berg, Shelly Mederbach and Linda Roberts.

The Hall of Fame was initiated in 1985 during the department's tenth anniversary, and inductions are every five years.

The 1995 Inductees are:

For significant accomplishment by a University of Minnesota Woman Athlete: **Laura Coenen** who competed in basketball from 1981-85 and **Marie Roethlisberger** who competed in gymnastics from 1986-90.

Coenen is the only women's basketball to have her jersey, No. 44, retired. At the time she completed her career, she was the all-time leading scorer with 2,044 points and 13 school records, and is currently ranked second to Carol Ann Shudlick (2,097). Coenen was the Big Ten MVP in 1983, a Kodak All-Region IV selection in 1983 & 1985 and AIAW All-Region in 1982. She scored in double figures in 91 of 102 career games, averaging 20.0 points per game and 10.1 rebounds despite being hampered her junior season by a hyperactive thyroid condition. Following her college career, Coenen played professional basketball in Europe and then turned her attention to team handball. She is currently training in Atlanta with the U.S. Olympic team handball squad. Coenen was on the U.S. handball team which won the Gold medal at the 1987 Pan Am Games and placed seventh at the 1988 Summer Olympics as well as competed on the 1992 U.S. Olympic team.

Roethlisberger is arguably the most decorated Gopher women athlete of all-time, and was named the University of Minnesota's Female Athlete of the Decade for the 1980's by the Big Ten Conference. Prior to college, Roethlisberger was a member of the U.S. senior national gymnastics team from 1981-86 and was the senior national uneven bars champion in 1982 and 1986. A member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic team, she was injured and unable to compete in the games but competed internationally at the 1983 and 1985 World Championships and 1986 Goodwill Games. At Minnesota, Roethlisberger won the 1990 NCAA Championship on the uneven bars and was named the AAI American Award (Senior Gymnast of the Year). She was named a NCAA Top Six recipient in 1990 the highest honor from the NCAA, won the 1991 Honda Inspiration Award and received several post-graduate scholarships. She was the senior athlete of the year and Big Ten Medal of Honor winner in 1990. She was a four-time All-American, won four national titles, two NCAA Regional all-around championships and three individual event titles and seven Big Ten titles and was named Big Ten Gymnast of the Year in 1987, 1988 and 1989.

For significant achievement by a University of Minnesota Women's Athletic Coach: Linda Wells. Wells was a key player in the formation of the women's athletic program at the University of Minnesota coaching three sports in the 1970's. She is best known as the Gopher's softball coach from 1974-1989, posting a 347-261-1 (.571) overall record and advancing the team to third place at the 1978 College World Series, the highest national finish in department history. Wells was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 1988, and her teams won the conference in 1981, 1986 and 1988. A volleyball coach from 1974-81, her teams had a 246-95-5 record and seventh place finish at the 1981 AIAW National Championship as well as an unofficial Big Ten title in 1978. Wells also coached basketball from 1973-77. A former professional player-coach in women's fast-pitch softball for the St. Louis Hummers, Wells was the assistant coach of the gold medal-winning U.S. National softball team at the 1987 Pan American Games and assistant coach of the gold medal-winning U.S. National softball team at the 1985 South Pacific Classic. She has served as President of the National Softball Coaches Association and has been inducted into the Minnesota Volleyball Hall of Fame (1985). Wells left Minnesota to become head women's softball coach at Arizona State University.

For significant professional achievement by a former Woman Athlete at the University of Minnesota: Patty Berg. This legendary woman golfer has been selected previously this year as the University of Minnesota's female athlete honoree for the Big Ten Centennial. The women's athletic scholarship fund, established in 1976, has been named in her honor - the Berg Scholarship Fund. The Minneapolis native won her first title, the Minneapolis' City Championship, at age 16, in 1934. She went on to win 83 amateur and professional tournaments in 40 years of competition. Berg was the first president and was among the co-founders of the Ladies' Professional Golf Association in 1948. Named Associated Press Woman Athlete of the Year three times, she played on two Curtis Cup teams and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame as a charter member in 1974. Her awards are numerous including the Patty Berg Award presented by the LPGA in 1990 and selected by the PGA of America in 1992 as one of 15 of Golf's Legendary Teachers (the only woman so honored).

For significant achievement which pioneered women's athletics: Shelly Medernach, who played softball from 1976-79 and Linda Roberts, who played basketball from 1977-81.

Medernach was an offensive force on the Gopher softball team which placed third at the 1978 College World Series and still holds 12 school records including career batting average (.393, 147/374 at bat) and career slugging percentage (.631). In addition she is first in career runs (110), triples (20) and runs batted in (117). A center-fielder, Medernach was invited to the 1979 Pan American game tryouts and competed on local fast-pitch teams following her college career.

Roberts was a formidable presence on the Gopher women's basketball team which qualified for the AIAW national quarterfinals in 1981 as well as winning an unofficial Big Ten Championship. Roberts is still the Gophers all time leading rebounder (1,413) and in her day held 17 school records including the school scoring record with 1,856 career points (now ranked third). Twice a Wade Trophy nominee, Roberts was AIAW All-Region in 1980 and the Gopher's MVP in 1979, 1980 and 1981. Roberts ended her career with a 14.3 points and 10.9 rebounding average playing in 129 games while leading the Gophers in scoring three of her four years and in rebounding every year.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

OHIO STATE — The Buckeyes, ranked sixth in last week's AVCA poll, are 8-2 overall and 1-1 in the Big Ten. Ohio State defeated second-ranked Penn State, 3-1, in University Park, Pa. last Wednesday and then fell to Indiana, 3-2. The Buckeyes only other loss of the season was to Houston, 3-2, on Sept. 9.

Ohio State is led by outside hitter Gabriele Jobst with 3.6 kills per game and a .253 hitting percentage and middle blocker Jenny Jackson with 3.7 kills per game and a .368 hitting percentage. Setting for the Buckeyes is senior Laura Davis, an AVCA first-team all-America selection from 1993, averaging 14 assists a game. Davis led the Big Ten last year and was the nation's second-leading assist-maker.

THE SERIES — Ohio State leads 18-14. The teams split the series last year, with the Gophers winning the most recent matchup, 3-1, in Minneapolis.

PENN STATE — The Lady Lions are 12-1 overall and 1-1 in the Big Ten. Penn State was ranked second in last week's AVCA poll. Penn State was undefeated through its first 10 matches before falling to Ohio State, 3-1, last Wednesday at home. The Lady Lions rebounded to defeat Indiana, 3-1, and Ball State, 3-1, on the road.

Senior outside hitter Larua Cook leads Penn State with 5.12 kills per game and is hitting .305. Frosh middle hitter Terri Zemaitis is hitting .272 with 4.38 kills a game. Senior setter Salima Davidson, the 1993 Big Ten Player of the Year, averages 14.25 assists a game.

THE SERIES — Penn State leads the series 6-2. The teams split the series last year, with the Gophers winning the most recent match, 3-1, at home.

GOPHER LEADERS — Senior middle hitter JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) continues to lead the team in hitting percentage at .350, while sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) leads in kills with 3.50 per game. DeDecker is hitting .249. Junior outside hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) leads the team in digs with 2.9 per game, averages 2.96 kills per game and is hitting .289. Olhausen is the team's leading blocker with 1.1 per game. Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) is averaging 11.76 assists per game.

BIG TEN LEADERS — Schintz is currently second among all Big Ten players in hitting efficiency (.350) while Olhausen is tenth in hitting efficiency (.289) and ninth in blocks (1.13). Bauer is third among Big Ten setters in assists (12.49/game).

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder is now 549-275 in her career and 251-163 in her 13th year with the Gophers. She is 119-89 in Big Ten competition.

A LOOK BACK — Minnesota suffered two setbacks and recorded one victory last week, falling to Iowa State and Illinois and posting its first conference victory of the season over Purdue.

IOWA STATE — The Gophers won the first two games, 15-5 and 15-13, but dropped the last three, 11-15, 7-15 and 13-15. Minnesota hit .563 in game one but did not hit above .150 in any of the last four games. Olhausen led the Gophers with 17 kills, as Minnesota recorded just 69 digs to the Cyclone's 114.

PURDUE — Minnesota defeated Purdue 15-8, 15-2, 15-7 in the Big Ten opener for both teams. Schintz had 14 kills and a .400 hitting percentage while Olhausen had 11 kills. As a team, Minnesota had 48 kills to 29 for the Boilermakers.

TOWNSEND AND MINNESOTA SEVENTH AT MOUNTAIN WEST INVITE — Junior LORI TOWNSEND (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY) finished seventh out of 199 runners at the Mountain West Classic in Missoula, Mont., over the weekend. Townsend finished the 6,000 meter course in a time of 21:20. Liz Wilson, running unattached, won the race in a time of 20:41, while Oregon's Milesa Glusec was the top collegiate finisher taking second in a time of 20:49.

As a team, the Gophers finished seventh out of 15 teams with 163 points. Michigan, ranked fifth in the nation, won the team title with a score of 63. Sixth-ranked Brigham Young was second with 70 points, while Oregon, Arizona and Montana State rounded out the top five.

In other individual results, senior ANGIE ABBOTT (WINONA, MN) finished second for the Gophers and 28th overall in a time of 22:39. ANDREA GROVE (WINNEPEG, MB, CANADA/TUXEDO SHAFTESBURY), seeing her first action of the season,

finished in 37th in a time of 23:01.

SOCCER

GOPHERS ROAD ADVENTURES CONTINUE IN OHIO — The Minnesota Golden Gopher women's soccer team will play away from home for the third consecutive weekend, as Minnesota, 3-2-2 overall and 1-1-1 in the Big Ten Conference, will play Ohio State in a Big Ten Conference game Friday and Virginia Tech in a non-conference game Sunday. Both games will be played in Columbus, Ohio, with Friday's match scheduled for noon (CST) and Sunday's game to start at 10 a.m. (CST).

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS—

OHIO STATE — Ohio State enters the week 5-4-1 for the year and 1-2 in the Big Ten Conference. The Buckeyes lost a pair of games at home during the weekend, losing 3-2 to Xavier and 1-0 to George Washington in overtime.

Leading Ohio State on offense is Lisa Suttmillier. Suttmillier has scored seven goals and recorded four assists for 18 points. She is the only Buckeye to have 10 or more points for the season.

The Gophers and Buckeyes have one common opponent this season. Minnesota tied Michigan State 1-1 at home in the season's first game, while the Spartans defeated Ohio State 5-1 in East Lansing, Mich. Sept. 18.

Ohio State will play Kentucky at home before facing the Gophers.

OVERTIME POPULAR AMONG GOPHERS, BUCKEYES —

Minnesota has made overtime popular this season, playing two overtime contests in the team's first seven matches.

However, in Ohio State's first ten games, the Buckeyes have played four overtime games — winning once, losing twice and tying once.

THE SERIES — Minnesota and Ohio State met once last season, with the Gophers winning 2-0 at the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium. It was the first meeting between the two schools, as both are only in their second seasons of varsity soccer.

VIRGINIA TECH — Virginia Tech will travel to Ohio with a 7-2 record in the school's first season of soccer. The Hokies split a pair of games over the weekend, defeating Old Dominion at home, 1-0, and losing 3-1 to Delaware, also at home.

Tech has scored 20 goals this season, while allowing only six. Leading the Hokies offensive attack is frosh Courtney Sims. Sims has scored four goals and recorded one assist for nine points. Eleven different Virginia Tech players have scored at least one goal this season.

Virginia Tech will play Indiana in Columbus before facing the Gophers on Sunday.

THE SERIES — Minnesota and Virginia Tech have never played each other in women's soccer.

GOPHERS SPLIT AWAY GAMES WITH CONFERENCE FOES —

Minnesota split its weekend road games, winning at Michigan, 2-1, and losing at Indiana, 3-2. Against Michigan, sophomore JENNIFER WALEK (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) scored the winning goal in the final minute of regulation to give Minnesota the 2-1 victory in Ann Arbor, Mich.

Minnesota trailed for the majority of the game, 1-0, until frosh JENNIFER MCELMURY (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) netted a goal 75:28 into the 90-minute match.

Walek scored off a direct free kick by McElmury at the 89:35 mark to give the Gophers their first conference win ever.

On Sunday, the Hoosiers of Indiana scored three goals in the final 20 minutes of regulation to defeat Minnesota 3-2 in Bloomington, Ind.

The Gophers scored first when McElmury scored her seventh goal of the season 38:44 into the match. Minnesota increased its lead at the 62:45 mark, when Walek scored from 17 yards away on a goal assisted by McElmury.

Indiana stormed back with two goals by Debbie Wolkowitz, the first at 70:25 and the game-winner at 83:02. Wendy Dillinger scored at the 80:34 mark to tie the game at 2-2.

WHAT'S NEXT — For the first time since Sept. 11, the Gophers will play a home game when Valparaiso visits the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field, Friday, Oct. 11 at 4 p.m. Minnesota will play five consecutive home matches before traveling to San Diego, Calif., the last weekend of October to play San Diego and San Diego State.

LADY NORTHERN NEXT TOURNEY — The Gophers will be in the field Sept. 30 - Oct. 2 at the Lady Northern Intercollegiate which is being hosted this year by Michigan on the University of Michigan Golf Course. The course will play at 5,931 yards with par of 73. The Lady Northern is held in the fall on the same course that hosts the Big Ten Women's Golf Championship the following May.

AUSE FIRST-TIME MEDALIST — Senior ANGIE AUSE (RED WING, MN/CENTRAL) won her first-ever collegiate tournament with rounds of 80 and 75. Ause is the team's second medalist this fall, with Gopher's winning the individual title in two of the three tournaments in which they have competed.

Frosh AMY DAHLE (RED LAKE FALLS, MN/LAYFAYETTE) tied for third place with 158 strokes after rounds of 78 and 80, and sophomore MAUREEN REGAN (OMAHA, NE/MARIAN) tied for fifth at 159 after scores 81 and 78. Senior JENNY KAISER (RICHFIELD, MN/RICHFIELD) tied for eighth at 160 strokes after a pair of 80's. Senior AMY SCHMIESING (SPICER, MN/NEW LONDON-SPICER) tied for 14th place after rounds of 83 and 79, and sophomore JENNY ELLEFSON (MINNESOTA CITY, MN/WINONA) tied for 29th with 173 strokes after rounds of 85 and 88.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

IOWA — The Hawkeyes are 12-4 overall and 2-2 in the Big Ten conference entering Wednesday's match. After winning 12 matches in a row, Iowa has dropped its last three matches. The Hawkeyes fell to third-ranked Penn State, 3-0, Friday and sixth-ranked Ohio State, 3-1, on Saturday. Iowa's other losses have been to South Florida, 3-1, and Northern Iowa, 3-1.

Iowa is led by sophomore outside hitter Katy Fawbush with 3.8 kills per game and a .261 hitting percentage. Sophomore outside hitter Jennifer Webb is averaging 3.3 kills a game and is hitting .235. Junior setter Lisa Dockray averages 10.8 assists per game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads 34-10. The Gophers have won the last six matches between the schools. Iowa's last victory over Minnesota was in 1990.

INDIANA — The Hoosiers are currently 11-5 overall and 2-2 in the Big Ten. Indiana does not play again until facing the Gophers on Friday. The Hoosiers pulled an upset of sixth-ranked Ohio State on the opening weekend of conference play, defeating the Buckeyes 3-2. Indiana had lost to Penn State, 3-2, the night before. Indiana's other losses have been to Auburn, Louisville, Notre Dame and Wisconsin.

The Hoosiers are led by senior middle blocker Anne Eastman with a 4.2 kills per game average and .281 hitting percentage and senior outside hitter Lynn Crawley with 3.8 kills per game and a .257 hitting percentage. Senior setter Michelle McElroy averages 11.2 assists per game.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads 18-8. The Gophers won both matchups last season, defeating the Hoosiers, 3-1, at home and 3-0 in Bloomington, Ind.

GOPHER LEADERS — Senior middle hitter JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) continues to lead the team in hitting percentage at .342, while sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) leads in kills with 3.60 per game. DeDecker is hitting .247. Junior outside hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) leads the team in digs with 2.8 per game, averages 2.89 kills per game and is hitting .283. Olhausen is the team's leading blocker with 1.1 per game. Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) is averaging 11.88 assists per game.

BIG TEN LEADERS — Schintz is currently second among all Big Ten players in hitting efficiency (.350) while Olhausen is tenth in hitting efficiency (.289) and ninth in blocks (1.13). Bauer is third among Big Ten setters in assists (12.49/game).

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder is now 549-275 in her career and 251-165 in her 13th year with the Gophers. She is 119-91 in Big Ten competition.

A LOOK BACK — Minnesota has dropped its last three matches and posts a 9-7 overall record and 1-3 Big Ten mark. The Gophers lost to sixth-ranked Ohio State and third-ranked Penn State at home last weekend, suffering their first losses in the Sports Pavilion.

OHIO STATE — Ohio State's Jenny Jackson had 23 kills and was one of five Buckeyes with double figure kills as Ohio State defeated Minnesota 15-9, 15-12, 15-11 Friday in front of 1,964 fans at the Sports Pavilion. Schintz led the Gophers with 16 kills and DeDecker had 15. Ohio State hit .312 in the match, while Minnesota hit .231.

PENN STATE — The third-ranked Lady Lions defeated Minnesota 15-7, 15-9, 9-15 and 15-8 Saturday at the Sports Pavilion. Jen Reimer led Penn State with a match-high 17 kills. DeDecker led the Gophers with 15 kills, while Olhausen added 12.

GOPHERS 11TH IN ATTENDANCE — Minnesota is currently 11th nationally in home attendance with an average of 1,429 fans per match. Leading the nation in attendance is Florida with an average of 3,496.

UP NEXT — Minnesota will play at Michigan Oct. 14 and at Michigan State Oct. 15 before returning home to face Northwestern and Wisconsin Oct. 21-22.

SOCCER

GOPHERS PLAY AT HOME FOR FIRST TIME SINCE SEPT. 11 — The Minnesota Golden Gopher women's soccer team, 4-2-3 overall, 1-1-2 Big Ten Conference, will play at the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field for the first time since Sept. 11, when the Gophers host Valparaiso, Friday, at 4 p.m. Minnesota will also host Big Ten Conference member Penn State, Sunday, at 1 p.m.

The Gophers will remain at home for five games. In addition to the Valparaiso and Penn State games, Minnesota will host Montana Oct. 14, Northwestern Oct. 16 and 10th-ranked Wisconsin Oct. 22.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS—

VALPARAISO — The Crusaders enter the week 1-10 overall. Valparaiso won its first game of the season on Saturday with a 3-0 victory over Wisconsin-Whitewater.

Sophomore Elizabeth Tatro leads the Crusaders with three goals and an assist for seven points. Junior Julia Cole is second on the team with a pair of goals and an assist for five points.

Minnesota and Valparaiso have three common opponents this season. Valparaiso lost to Michigan State, 9-0, Wisconsin-Milwaukee, 4-1, and Michigan, 5-0. Minnesota tied Michigan State, 1-1, beat Wisconsin-Milwaukee, 5-1 and defeated Michigan, 2-1.

The Crusaders will play at Loyola before traveling to the Twin Cities to play the Gophers.

THE SERIES — Minnesota and Valparaiso played twice last season, with the Gophers winning both games. Minnesota defeated Valparaiso, 5-0, in Minneapolis, Sept. 18 and 7-0 in Valparaiso, Ind., Oct. 23.

PENN STATE — The Lady Lions enter the week 7-2 overall and 1-0 in the Big Ten Conference. Penn State's conference victory came at home in a 2-1 decision over Indiana.

Frosh Rachel Hoffman leads the Lady Lion offensive attack that has produced 20 goals this season. Hoffman has recorded eight goals and zero assists for 16 points this season. Hoffman is the only Lady Lion with ten or more points.

Indiana is the only common opponent the Gophers and Lady Lions have played. Minnesota lost 3-2 to Indiana in Bloomington, Ind.

THE SERIES — This will be the first meeting between the Lady Lions and the Golden Gophers.

THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HOME — Since women's soccer became a varsity sport at Minnesota in 1993, the Gophers have played 10 home games between the Bierman Track & Field and Soccer Stadium and the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field. Minnesota's record at home in its first ten games is 8-1-1. The Gophers have recorded five shutouts and have outscored their opponents 47-7.

Minnesota's only loss at home was the program's first varsity soccer game, a 3-2 loss to Creighton on Sept. 4, 1993. The Gophers tied Michigan State 1-1 in the 1994 season opener.

GOPHERS TIE, WIN DURING WEEKEND STAY IN COLUMBUS, OHIO — The Gophers earned a tie and a win in a pair of games in Columbus, Ohio, over the weekend. Minnesota tied conference member Ohio State, 1-1, Friday, before defeating non-conference foe Virginia Tech, 4-1, Sunday.

Against the Buckeyes, junior **GRETCHEN BRANDT** (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) scored her third goal of the season with less than one minute left in regulation to tie the game at 1-1. Brandt's goal came at the 89:11 mark and was assisted by senior **ELLEN PETERFESO** (LAKE ELMO, MN/HIL MURRAY).

Sunday, sophomore **JENNIFER WALEK** (LAKE ELMO, MN/N. ST. PAUL) recorded her second multiple goal game of the year, scoring her sixth and seventh goals of the season in the game. Walek, along with frosh **JENNIFER MCELMURY** (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE) are tied for the team lead in goals scored at seven.

Senior **ANNE MEITZ** (MINNEAPOLIS, MN/SOUTH) began Minnesota's scoring against the Hokies with her first goal of the season at the 38:40 mark of the first half. Meitz's goal was assisted by McElmury — her fourth assist of the season. The goal was the only score for either team in the first half.

Brandt clinched the Gopher victory at the 56:10 point of the game when she scored her second goal of the weekend to give Minnesota a 3-0 lead with just over 30 minutes left in game.

O'HEARN BREAKS PERSONAL AND TEAM RECORDS AGAINST OHIO STATE, VIRGINIA TECH — Sophomore goaltender **TERESA O'HEARN** (CHAMPLIN, MN/ANOKA) set two personal, and team records, during the Gophers two games in Columbus. Against Ohio State, O'Hearn broke the single-game record for saves with 15. O'Hearn's, and the team's, previous record was 13, set Sept. 4, 1993 against Creighton and tied Sept. 4, 1994 against Michigan State.

With four saves against Virginia Tech, Sunday, O'Hearn eclipsed last season's individual and team best 73 saves. O'Hearn currently has 75 saves for the season.

DEUCES WILD DURING GOPHER SIX GAME ROAD SWING — With Minnesota's 4-1 victory against Virginia Tech, Minnesota concluded a six-game road swing that produced two wins, two losses and two ties. Minnesota scored 10 goals in the six games, while its opponents produced nine.

Walek led the team with four goals in the six games, while McElmury contributed three goals.

TOWNSEND AND MINNESOTA FIFTH AT NIKE INVITATIONAL— Junior LORI TOWNSEND (CLARKSBORO, NJ/KINGSWAY) finished fifth out of 98 runners at the Nike Invitational held at the Les Bolstad Golf Course last Saturday. Townsend completed the 5,000-meter course in a time of 17 minutes and 28 seconds. Townsend's time was the third best time ever posted by a Minnesota runner on the Bolstad course and the 28th fastest time in Minnesota cross country history.

ANDREA GROVE (WINNEPEG, MB, CANADA/TUXEDO SHAFESBURY) finished 36th with a time of 18:44, KERI ZWEIG (MINNETONKA, MN/EXCELSIOR) finished 38th and KRISTEN GOELZER (JANESVILLE, WI/JOSEPH A. CRAIG) placed 46th, rounding out the Gopher finishers.

GOPHERS HOME FOR WEEKEND TO PLAY WITH GRIZZLIES AND WILDCATS — The Minnesota Golden Gopher women's soccer team (5-3-3 overall, 1-2-2 Big Ten Conference), will remain at home for a second consecutive weekend, facing the University of Montana, Friday, at 4 p.m. and Northwestern, Sunday, at 2 p.m. Both games will be played at the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field.

Montana and Northwestern will play on Saturday at the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field, beginning at 2 p.m.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS—

MONTANA LADY GRIZ — Montana comes to Minneapolis with a 4-3 record. The Lady Griz are in their first season of varsity soccer and play as a Division I independent.

Montana has won three of its last four games, defeating Gonzaga, 1-0, Oct. 8, Whitworth College, 4-0, Sept. 18 and Albertson College, 5-0, Sept. 16. Montana's only loss in the last four games was a 1-0 decision at Colorado College, Sept. 24. Colorado College happens to be the only common opponent between Minnesota and Montana. Minnesota and Colorado College played to a 1-1 tie, Sept. 17 in Madison, Wis.

Offensively, the Lady Griz have relied on the services of frosh Courtney Mathieson. The Redmond, Wash., native has scored five goals for a total of 10 points. Mathieson scored with less than three minutes left in regulation to help the Lady Griz to their most recent win over Gonzaga.

Mathieson is the only Montana player with 10 or more points. Frosh Lisa Oyen and Stacey Forslund are tied for second on the team in scoring with eight points apiece.

As a team, Montana has scored 15 goals and recorded eight assists for 38 points. The Gophers, on the other hand, have 31 goals and 24 assists for 86 points.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN — Friday's game will be the third consecutive game for the Lady Griz away from Missoula, Mont. However, it is not the last, as the Griz conclude their season with 10 games on the road. Montana's final home game was Sept. 18.

A HOMECOMING OF SORTS — A native of Minnesota, Lady Griz head coach Betsy Duerksen was a two-time all-American soccer player at Edina High School in the Twin Cities. She also competed in softball and basketball at Edina.

Following high school graduation in the spring of 1984, Duerksen, formerly Betsy Ready, became the only four-time all-American athlete ever at Boston College. Duerksen was named Boston College's Female Athlete of the Decade for the 1980s.

Duerksen began coaching in 1988 as an assistant at Brown University. She coached at Brown for one year, Boston College in 1989 and 1990 and Seattle University from 1991-93. Her 1993 team qualified for six-team NAIA national tournament and Duerksen was named NAIA National Coach of the Year.

THE SERIES — Minnesota and Montana have never played in women's soccer.

NORTHWESTERN WILDCATS — The Wildcats are in the midst of four game winless streak. Northwestern tied Wisconsin-Green Bay, 1-1, Friday, but lost its three previous games to Northern Illinois (3-0), Michigan State (4-0) and Michigan (4-0).

Northwestern is currently 2-7-2 overall and 0-3 in the Big Ten Conference. Northwestern's two wins this season have been against Aurora, 8-0, on Sept. 25 and Valparaiso, 3-0, on Sept. 13.

As a team, Northwestern has scored 15 goals this season and recorded eight assists for 37 points.

MINNESOTANS LEAD WILDCATS — Wayzata High School graduate Stephanie Erickson leads the Wildcats in scoring this season. The Plymouth, Minn., native has scored five goals and recorded an assist for 11 points. Erickson is the only Wildcat with 10 or more points.

Minneapolis native Beth Reite is tied for second on the team in scoring with three goals and an assist for seven points. Reite is tied with Catherine Kidani (2 goals, 3 assists).

Northfield, Minn., native Wendy Scholz has played 1,062 minutes of a possible 1,110 minutes in goal this season for Northwestern. Scholz has allowed 23 goals, recorded 117 saves and earned 1.95 goals against average.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

MICHIGAN — The Wolverines are 5-11 overall and 1-5 in Big Ten play. Michigan lost to Ohio State (3-0) and Penn State (3-0) last weekend and have lost five out of the last six matches. Their only conference victory of the season came over Purdue (3-1) at home. The Wolverines opened the 1994 season with five straight losses before winning four of the next five heading into the conference season. Michigan's non-conference victories have come against Virginia, Pittsburgh, Kansas and Virginia Tech

Michigan is led by sophomore outside hitter Colleen Miniuk with 3.49 kills per game and a .232 hitting percentage. The Wolverines split the duties at setter between sophomore Erin McGovern (8.29 assists per game) and frosh Linnea Mendoza (7.61 assists per game).

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads the series 25-3. The Gophers have won the last four matchups, with their last loss to Michigan coming in 1992, a 3-2 loss at home.

MICHIGAN STATE — The Spartans are currently 9-8 overall and 1-5 in the Big Ten. They host Iowa on Friday before meeting Minnesota on Saturday. Michigan State, like Michigan, lost both of its matches last weekend, falling to Penn State (3-1) and Ohio State (3-1). Michigan State has lost five of its last six matches, with its only conference win coming against Purdue, 3-0, on Sept. 30.

Michigan State is led by frosh outside hitter Veronica Morales of Argentina with 4.8 kills per game and a .285 hitting percentage. Junior Courtney DeBolt averages 11.7 assists per game at the setter position.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads 22-5. The Gopher have won the last six matchups between the teams. The Spartans' last win over the Gophers was in 1990.

WEEKEND REVIEW — Minnesota defeated Indiana, 8-15, 15-4, 15-6, 15-5, in its only match of the weekend. The Gophers had 10 service aces and were led by sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) with 17 kills. Minnesota hit .262 in the match.

Minnesota defeated Iowa, 15-6, 15-11, 15-10 last Wednesday at the Sports Pavilion.

GOPHER LEADERS — Senior middle hitter JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) continues to lead the team in hitting percentage at .324, while DEDECKER leads in kills with 3.66 per game. DeDecker is hitting .251. Junior outside hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) leads the team in digs with 2.7 per game, averages 2.9 kills per game and is hitting .295. Olhausen is the team's leading blocker with 1.1 per game. Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) is averaging 11.87 assists per game.

BIG TEN LEADERS — Schintz is currently second among all Big Ten players in hitting efficiency (.324), while Olhausen is sixth in hitting efficiency (.295) and tenth in blocks (1.1). Bauer is third among Big Ten setters in assists (12.25/game).

SCHINTZ JOINS ELITE GROUP — Schintz is currently ninth on Minnesota's all-time career kills list with 1,027 and has recently joined only eight others in school history who have topped 1,000 career kills. She is just 18 kills away from moving into eighth on the all-time career kills list.

Schintz is also moving up on the career digs list, moving into eighth place with 865 career digs. She is sixth in career service aces and eighth in career block assists.

OLHAUSEN ENTERS CAREER RECORDS — Olhausen is making her way into the record books and is currently tied for tenth in career block assists with 199. Senior cocaptain GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) has moved into fifth place on the career block assists list.

WASTING NO TIME — While only 18 matches into her career, Bauer is already fifth on the career assists list at Minnesota with 748. Career assist records were not kept prior to 1983.

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder is now 551-275 in her career and 253-165 in her 13th year with the Gophers. She is 121-91 in Big Ten competition.

GOPHERS 11TH IN ATTENDANCE — Minnesota is currently 11th nationally in home attendance with an average of 1,429 fans per match. Leading the nation in attendance is Florida with an average of 3,496.

Roell earned All-America recognition six times in her career. The Burnsville, Minn., native placed fourth in her specialty, the 100-yard breaststroke, at the 1987 NCAA Championships. In 1987, she received the Big Ten Medal of Honor and was voted women's athletics Senior Athlete of the Year.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS —

NORTHWESTERN— The Wildcats are 11-9 overall and 2-6 in the Big Ten after falling to Ohio State, 3-0, and Penn State, 3-0, last weekend. Both matches were at home. After winning its first two conference matches, Northwestern has now lost six in a row. Its two conference wins came against Michigan and Michigan State.

Northwestern is led by a pair of senior outside hitters, Alison Krumbein and Molly Maloney. Krumbein averages 4.0 kills per game and is hitting .184, while Maloney averages 3.6 kills per game and hits .158. Setting for the Wildcats is senior Jeanne Wohlberg, who averages 10.8 assists per game.

THE SERIES —Minnesota leads the series 16-13. The teams split the series last year, with Northwestern winning the first matchup, 3-1, in Evanston, Ill. and Minnesota winning the most recent contest, 3-1, in Minneapolis.

WISCONSIN— The Badgers are 14-6 overall and 4-4 in the Big Ten. Wisconsin fell to Penn State, 3-0, and Ohio State, 3-0, last weekend at home. The Badgers are on a four-match losing streak after falling to Illinois and Purdue the previous weekend. They began the conference season at the top of the standings after winning their first four matches.

Senior outside hitter Joanna Grotenhuis leads the Badgers with 4.97 kills per game and a .286 hitting percentage. Outside hitter Lauren Burny is averaging 2.7 kills in her first year at Wisconsin. Sophomore Laura Abbinante averages 12.0 assists per game as the team's top setter.

THE SERIES — Minnesota leads 22-12. The teams split the series last year, with each team winning on its home court.

SATURDAY HOMETOWN DAY FOR BAUER —Frosh BECKY BAUER (BLOOMINGTON, MN/JEFFERSON) will be honored in a hometown day celebration, sponsored by WCCO Radio News Talk 8-3-0, Saturday against Wisconsin. The ceremony will be held between games two and three.

Saturday is also Star Tribune Family Day at Gopher volleyball.

ALUMNAE MATCH/HALL OF FAME/PARENT'S DAY— The annual volleyball alumnae match will be held Saturday at 4 p.m. in the Sports Pavilion. Among those expected to appear are Pam Miller-Dombeck, Chris Schaefer, Sue Jackson Lori Miller and Krista Nevelle.

Also on Saturday, former Gopher Chris Donnell will be inducted into the "Golden Spikers," the Minnesota Volleyball Hall of Fame. In addition, team members will be introduced along with their parents before Saturday's match as a part of Parent's Day.

WEEKEND REVIEW

Michigan —Minnesota defeated the Wolverines 15-10, 15-10, 15-13 Friday in Ann Arbor, Mich. Sophomore KATRIEN DEDECKER (BREDENE, BELGIUM) had a match-high 17 kills, while senior JEAN SCHINTZ (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) had 14 kills and hit .520.

Michigan State— The Gophers defeated Michigan State 15-12, 14-16, 15-6, 18-16 in East Lansing, Mich., Saturday. DeDecker had a match-high 24 kills and hit .315 while Schintz added 21 kills to tie a career high. Bauer recorded a season-best 69 assists in the match. The Gophers fell behind 8-1 in the fourth game and were down 14-11 before a GRETCHEN DAHL (PRIOR LAKE, MN/HOLY ANGELS) kill tied it at 14-14. The score was tied again at 15-

15 and 16-16 before a DeDecker kill and a DeDecker block gave the Gophers the victory.

SEASON HIGHS — Several team and individual bests were recorded against the Spartans. The team's 81 kills was a season best, as were the 74 assists. Individually, DeDecker's 24 kills was a season high, as were Bauer's 69 assists. Dahl's six block assists was a season high and Schintz's 21 kills tied a career high.

GOPHER LEADERS — Schintz (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN) continues to lead the team in hitting percentage at .326, while DeDecker leads in kills with 3.87 per game. DeDecker is hitting .258. Junior outside hitter HEIDI OLHAUSEN (APPLE VALLEY, MN/LAKEVILLE) leads the team in digs with 2.6 per game, averages 2.9 kills per game and is hitting .287. Olhausen is the team's leading blocker with 1.1 per game. Bauer is averaging 12.4 assists per game.

BIG TEN LEADERS — Schintz is currently second among all Big Ten players in hitting efficiency (.326), while Olhausen is eighth in hitting efficiency (.287) and ninth in blocks (1.1). Bauer is second among Big Ten setters in assists (12.70/game). DeDecker is ninth in the Big Ten in kills (3.87).

SCHINTZ MOVES UP — Schintz has moved up to eighth on the career kills list with 1,062. She is 11 kills away from moving into seventh place.

Schintz is also moving up on the career digs list, moving into sixth place with 890 career digs. She is sixth in career service aces (196) and seventh in career block assists (263).

OLHAUSEN ENTERS CAREER RECORDS — Olhausen is making her way into the record books and is currently eighth in career block assists with 209. Dahl has moved into fifth place on the career block assists list with 298.

WASTING NO TIME — While only 20 matches into her career, Bauer is already fifth on the career assists list at Minnesota with 866. Career assist records were not kept prior to 1983.

THE COACH — Minnesota head coach Stephanie Schleuder is now 553-275 in her career and 255-165 in her 13th year with the Gophers. She is 123-91 in Big Ten competition.

WHAT'S NEXT — Minnesota will travel to Pennsylvania and Ohio next weekend, playing Penn State Oct. 28 and Ohio State Oct. 29.

MINNESOTA CONCLUDES 1994 HOME SCHEDULE WITH WEEKEND GAMES — The Minnesota Golden Gophers (7-3-3 overall, 2-2-2 Big Ten Conference) will conclude their 1994 home schedule with games against 15th-ranked Wisconsin, Saturday and Marquette, Sunday. Both games will be played at the St. Paul Campus Soccer Field, beginning at 2 p.m.

SOCCER SPECIAL ON MSC — Midwest Sports Channel will air a Gopher Soccer Special Wednesday, Oct. 19 at 7:30 p.m. and Friday, Oct. 21 at 6:30 p.m. MSC's Dick Bremer and Gopher head coach Sue Montagne will host the telecast, featuring Minnesota soccer.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS—

WISCONSIN BADGERS — Wisconsin enters the week 10-4 overall and 4-1 in the Big Ten Conference. Wisconsin will play a home game against Wisconsin-Green Bay, Oct. 19, before facing the Gophers.

Leading the Badger attack is junior Kari Torkko. Torkko has scored seven goals and recorded an assist for 15 points. Junior Jackie Billet is second on the team in scoring with five goals and four assists for 14 points. Frosh Marci Miller is the only other Badger with 10 or more points. Miller has three goals and seven assists for 13 points.

Goalkeeper Ursula McKnight ranks first in the Big Ten in goalkeeping, allowing only five goals while stopping 54 shots for a .60 goals against average.

NCAA TOURNAMENT THE NORM FOR WISCONSIN — Since 1981, Wisconsin has reached the NCAA tournament six times, five times in the last six years. Last season, the Badgers lost 3-1 to George Washington in the quarterfinals. Wisconsin's best finish came in 1991 when the Badgers lost 3-1 to North Carolina in the championship game.

GOPHER-WISCONSIN GAME WILL MAKE HISTORY — History will be made in the Minnesota sports scene, Saturday, when the Gophers and Badgers play each other. The game will be the first time a nationally-ranked team has played Minnesota on its home field.

MINNESOTA CONNECTION — Five Minnesotans appear on the Wisconsin roster. Junior Jenny Haigh is from St. Paul, sophomore Jill Stewart hails from Apple Valley, junior Laura Rademacher is from Shoreview, junior Katy Reese is an Edina native and frosh Ruth Brennan is from Rochester.

Stewart has started all 14 games, scoring a goal and recording three assist for five points; Brennan has played in 12 games, scoring one goal for two points; Haigh has played in 11 games and scored one goal; Rademacher has played in four games without scoring, while Reese has played in eight games with no points.

THE SERIES — Wisconsin and Minnesota have played once, with the Badgers winning 5-0 in Madison, Wis., last season.

HEAD COACH SUE MONTAGNE — Gopher head coach Sue Montagne is currently in her second season with Minnesota and her second season as a head coach. Montagne's record at Minnesota and overall career coaching record is 20-9-3 (.672)

HOME SWEET HOME — The Gophers have played 15 games at home in almost two seasons of varsity soccer. Minnesota is 12-2-1 at home, having outscored its opponents 66-12.

THREE IS NOT A CROWD — Minnesota is 16-0 lifetime when the team scores three or more goals.

NO MORE OVERTIME — Minnesota has played four overtime games during the 1994 season and five all-time. The Gophers are 0-2-3 in overtime games. Minnesota has never scored a goal in overtime.

BACK-TO-BACK — GOPHERS LIKE DAY ONE — Minnesota has played two games in consecutive days only once this season. The Gophers tied Colorado College, 1-1, Sept. 17, and lost to seventh-ranked William & Mary, 2-0, Sept. 18. Lifetime, the Gophers are 4-1-1 the first day of consecutive games and 2-4 on day two.

GOPHERS HAVE NEVER LOST CONSECUTIVE GAMES — Minnesota's 4-1 victory, Friday, against the Lady Griz of Montana eliminated the possibility of Minnesota losing two consecutive games. The Gophers lost to Penn State, 3-2, in overtime in its previous game.

Minnesota has never lost consecutive games. The Gophers did lose to Indiana, 3-2, earlier in the season before tying Ohio State 1-1 in their next game.

GOPHERS 0-2 AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED OPPONENTS — Minnesota has never defeated a nationally-ranked opponent, losing to 17th-ranked Wisconsin last season, 5-0, and seventh-ranked William & Mary, 2-0, earlier this season.

PAUL) and frosh JENNIFER MCELMURY (WHITE BEAR LAKE, MN/WHITE BEAR LAKE) moved into the record books in the Gophers victories over Montana and Northwestern, tying the school record for most consecutive games with at least one point. Walek and McElmury both recorded at least a point in both games during the weekend, leaving their consecutive streak at five. Walek and junior GRETCHEN BRANDT (SHOREVIEW, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) set the mark at five games last season, while sophomore ERIN HUSSEY

(PLYMOUTH, MN/ARMSTRONG) tied the record in the Gophers final two games of 1993 and the first three games of 1994.

GOPHERS SCORE NINE GOALS IN TWO WEEKEND WINS — Minnesota scored nine goals during the weekend, defeating Montana, 4-1, Friday and Northwestern, 5-1, Sunday.

Against the Lady Griz, four different Gophers scored at least one goal while Walek recorded two assists. Hussey scored 11:19 into the game to Minnesota a 1-0 lead. Montana rebounded to tie the game at 1-1 on a Stacy Forslund goal at the 21:12. The game remained tied until the 64:04 point when Brandt scored on a crossing pass by Walek. Frosh CARRIE JOHNSON (ROSEVILLE, MN/MOUNDS VIEW) and McElmury scored Minnesota's other two goals.

Sunday, the Gophers built a 2-0 lead on goals by McElmury and Hussey before Northwestern countered with a Ginger Tosch goal before halftime to cut the lead to 2-1. Minnesota went scoreless for over 45 minutes until Peterfeso increased Minnesota's lead to 3-1 at the 63:02 mark. Johnson and Walek scored Minnesota's other two goals.
