MINNESOTA SIGNS FOUR GOLFERS TO LETTERS OF INTENT

University of Minnesota head women's golf coach Kathy Williams announced the signing of four high school golfers to national letters of intent to attend Minnesota on a golf scholarship.

The Signees

Laura Krumenauer, Onalaska, Wisconsin, Holmen Senior High School

Krumenauer is four-year member of her high school team. She has competed twice at the Wisconsin State Girls Golf Tournament, finishing 11th in 1996. Krumenauer was a fifth-flight consolation runner-up at the 1996 Western Women's Golf Championships and a second-flight runner-up at the 1996 Wisconsin State Junior Match Play tournament. Krumenauer is a member of National Honor Society, a student council member and a two-year editor of her high school yearbook. She is interested in studying business at the University.

Marilee Dahlman, Marshalltown, Iowa, Marshalltown Senior High School

As a sophomore and junior, Dahlman's team won the Iowa Class 3A tournament, with Dahlman placing 10th as a sophomore. A top-three competitor at the her district and conference meets, she won the 1996 Iowa PGA Junior Girls championship.

Kristin Dooley, Albany, Minnesota, Albany Senior High School

Dooley was ranked Minnesota's #1 female golfer in Class A in 1996, and won conference and sub-region medalist honors. A 1996 all-state recipient, Dooley was a three-year letterwinner, team captain and team MVP. As a junior, she was 11th at the state high school girls championships. Ranked second in her class of 130, Dooley is a member of the National Honor Society and senior class president. Her brother, Adam Dooley, is a member of the University of Minnesota men's golf team.

Arminda Yutuc, La Crosse, Wisconsin, Central Senior High School

At the WIAA 1996 Girls State Golf Championships, Yutuc was sixth overall at 166 after rounds of 84 and 82. As a sophomore, Yutuc was the Wisconsin state representative to the LPGA Junior National Tournament in West Palm Beach, Fla. A four-time La Crosse Country Club champion, Yutuc has been a consistent top-10 finisher in eight Junior LPGA tournaments.
