**TENNIS TEAM HAS WEEK OFF FROM COMPETITION** -- After a weekend invitational at Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, N.C., the women's tennis team has a week free from competition before heading for the Nebraska Invitational in Lincoln on October 10-12. At the Wake Forest Invitational the team competed for individual honors in six singles and three doubles flights against top tennis schools in the South, including nationally-ranked Texas Christian.

## **SINGLES RESULTS** --

**No. 1** -- Sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN/Hill-Murray) was defeated in the first round 7-5, 6-4 by Janie Starus of Furman. In the first round of consolation play, she was defeated 6-2, 7-5 by Maryland's Claudia Borgiani. Gorde placed seventh overall with a 7-6, 6-1 win over Lynne Cleary of Alabama.

**No. 2** -- Freshman Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) was defeated 6-3, 6-3 by Monica Kowal of Wake Forest in the first round, but she won both of her consolation matches and earned consolation champion honors. Consolation results -- 6-4, 6-2 win over Regina Fletcher of Furman in the first round, and a 6-4, 6-2 win over Alabama's Beth Marrow for the consolation title.

**No. 3** -- Junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) also competed for consolation champion honors, but she was defeated 2-6, 6-3, 6-2 by Maryland's Denise Farrow in the title match. In the first round, Eneberg was defeated by South Carolina's Carolina Culik 6-1, 6-0, but she defeated Furman's Cathryn Jarvis 6-2, 5-7, 7-5 in the opening consolation round.

**No. 4** -- Senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) lost her three singles matches: first round -- 6-4, 6-2 to Alabama's Kristin Broad; consolation first round -- 6-2, 6-2 to Rhona Howett of Texas Christian; consolation final round -- 6-3, 6-1 to Loren Smolensky of Illinois.

**No. 5** -- Freshman Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) won her first-round match with a 6-4, 6-0 win over Furman's Joanie Ekins. Linda Boedecker of Alabama defeated Ovnik 6-1, 6-3 in the second round, but Ovnik blanked Maryland's Dee Dee Adolph 6-0, 6-0 to take third-place honors. Ovnik now has the team's top singles record with a 4-1 mark, even though she is nursing a summer foot injury.

No. 6 -- Freshman Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) also won her first-round match 6-3, 6-2 over Jolyn Smith of Wake Forest. She lost 6-4, 6-4 to Alabama's Rachel Marrow in the second round, but Breitag rallied to defeat Texas Christian's Clare Thet 6-7, 6-2, 6-2 to place third.

DOUBLES --

No. 1 -- A new combination proved to be successful, as Gorde and Jones won consolation honors with a 6-3, 4-6, 6-1 over Ochoa and Howett of Texas Christian. In the first round, the duo was defeated 6-2, 6-4 by Cleary and Broad of Alabama, but in the consolation round they slipped past Strause and Jarvis of Furman 6-4, 7-5. Roach was impressed with the team's play, especially in the consolation round, and he plans to keep them together.

No. 2 -- Bengtsson and Breitag won their first round consolation match 6-1, 1-6, 6-1 over Farmer and Sherman of Alabama, but they were defeated by O'Grady and Culik of South Carolina 6-4, 6-4 in the championship match. Roach also plans to keep the Bengtsson/Breitag duo intact for the Nebraska Invitational.

No. 3 -- Eneberg and sophomore Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario) also competed for the consolation title, but were defeated 7-5, 6-4 by Costigan and Stout from Big Ten rival Illinois. The team won their first consolation match 7-6, 6-3 over Adolph and Aquino of Maryland.

ROACH SAYS -- "We came back and played a lot better after losing the close ones on the first day. Anne (Gorde) played well during the whole tourney at both No. 1 singles and doubles. Gorde and Jones also played very well together at No. 1 doubles during the last two days." Roach also said that it took the team a while to adjust to playing outside in 90-degree heat, but overall he was very pleased with the squad's performances.

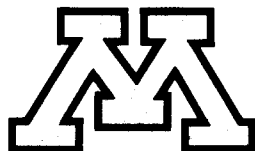

**TENNIS TEAM DOMINATES NEBRASKA INVITE** -- Three flight championships led a Gopher attack at the Nebraska Invitational last weekend in Lincoln. The team won 26 of their 35 matches in the tournament and had the highest winning percentage of the eight-team field. Eight singles players and four doubles teams competed for championship and consolation honors against players from Iowa, Illinois, Wichita State, Nebraska, Colorado, Utah and Texas Tech.

Minnesota's next competition will be at the four-team Iowa Invitational on October 25-26. The team was scheduled to compete at the ITCA Regionals in Madison, Wisc., this weekend, but head coach Jack Roach has elected to withdraw because the invitational does not have a consolation bracket.

**ROACH SAYS** -- "I'm really pleased. We had good balance with everyone winning at least two singles and doubles matches. The team is doing very well and they were very happy with their play this weekend. We had only three individual champions, but we had lots of second places and consolation champions."

## **SINGLES RESULTS --**

**No. 1 --** Sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE, MN/Hill-Murray) came back from a 7-6, 4-6, 6-0 defeat to Utah's Michelle Mras in the first round and won the consolation championship. In consolation play Gorde defeated Jill Pasarick of Nebraska 6-3, 6-4 in the semi-finals, and then defeated Illinois' Kathy Neil 7-5, 6-4 for the title.

**No. 2 --** Swedish sensation Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) won the flight championship by defeating Iowa's Pennie Wohlford 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 in the championship match. A freshman, Bengtsson won 6-0, 6-1 over Sheila Ohlsson of Colorado in the first round, and stopped Michele Heever of Wichita State 6-1, 5-7, 6-0 in the semifinals.

**No. 3 --** Freshman Anne Marie Ovník (LA GRANGE, IL) moved from fifth to third in the Gopher lineup and placed second in her flight. In the first round she dominated Robin Gerstein of Iowa 6-1, 6-0; in the semifinals Ovník rebounded from a first set loss to defeat Nebraska's Cari Groce 3-6, 6-2, 6-3. But Utah's Pam Miller took the title with a 6-4, 6-3 win.

Ovník and Bengtsson currently have the team's top singles records with identical 6-2 marks.

**No. 4 --** Junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) placed third in the flight with a 5-7, 6-1, 6-1 win over Doneta Holmen of Nebraska in the final match. In the first round Eneberg defeated Illinois' Carrie Costigan 7-6, 6-2, but another Big Ten rival, Iowa's Elizabeth Canzoneri, stopped Eneberg 6-3, 2-6, 7-6 (11-9) in the semifinals.

**No. 5 --** After a 6-3, 3-6, 6-3 loss to Utah's Susy Westfall in the first round, freshman Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, SD) won the consolation title. Breitag defeated Laura Boone of Wichita State 6-3, 6-3 in the semifinals and swept Illinois' Loren Smolonsky 6-3, 6-3 in the championship match. Breitag played at No. 5 last weekend after opening the season in the No. 6 position.

**No. 6 --** Senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) won the flight title with three straight set wins. In the first round she defeated Nebraska's Jenny Diedrich 6-0, 6-3, and in the semifinals Jones won 7-5, 6-2 over Utah's Liz Fox. In the title match Jones was a 6-2, 6-4 winner over Iowa's Patty Desimond.

**No. 7 --** Sophomore Jennie Huston (BURNSVILLE, MN) opened competition with a 6-0, 6-1 win over Nebraska's Ann Stephens. Huston was defeated 6-2, 6-0 by Colorado's Susie Oesterlund in the semi's, but she placed third in the flight with a 6-2, 6-3 win over Utah's Linda Anderson.

**No. 8 --** Another sophomore, Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario), also placed third in her flight. Dick defeated Cari Arlt of Colorado 6-4, 7-6 in the first round, but was defeated 6-3, 6-1 by Texas Tech's Shannon Cizek in the semifinals. In the third place match, Dick defeated Iowa's Colleen Nichols 7-6, 6-2.

#### DOUBLES RESULTS --

**No. 1 --** For the second consecutive tournament, Gorde and Jones won the consolation title. The duo was defeated 6-1, 6-0 by Texas Tech's Walson and Brigance team in the first round, but they swept Utah's Miller and Mras 6-1, 6-3 in the consolation semifinals. Gorde and Jones then dominated Iowa's Wohlford and Conlin 6-1, 6-0 to win the championship, and they now hold the team's best doubles record at 4-2.

**No. 2 --** Bengtsson and Breitag won their first two matches and placed second in the flight. In the first round the team defeated Nebraska's Pizarick and Martin 6-4, 4-6, 6-3, and they swept Iowa's Canzoneri and Desimore 6-2, 6-3 in the semifinals. In the finals, Texas Tech's Carlson and Hrebec finished on top with a 6-4, 6-3 win.

**No. 3 --** Eneberg and Ovnik, a new Gopher combination, also placed second in their flight. They defeated Nebraska's Stephens and Diedrich 6-3, 6-3 in the first round and won 6-3, 6-1 over Iowa's Willard and Gerstein in the semi's. Utah's Fox and Anderson won the championship with a 6-3, 4-6, 6-1 win.

**No. 4 --** After a first-round bye, Dick and freshman Dana Goldsmith (SHEBOYGAN, WI) won the flight championship with a 7-6, 6-2 win over Iowa's Johnston and Nichols and a 6-3, 2-6, 6-3 win over Texas Tech's Fitterer and Cizek. Goldsmith saw her first collegiate action last weekend after recovering from a pre-season foot injury.

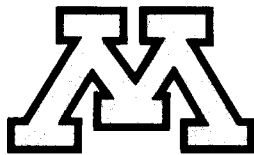

GOPHER LEADERS -- Bengtsson and Ovnik have the team's top singles records with identical 9-5 marks. Jones and Eneberg are close behind with 8-6 records. Eneberg and Ovnik are 7-1 at No. 3 doubles, while Gorde and Jones are 7-4.

TEAM WINS FOUR OF SIX TITLES AT IOWA INVITE -- On October 25-26, Minnesota dominated the four-team Iowa Invitational in Iowa City by winning two singles titles and sweeping the doubles competition. Iowa, SIU-Edwardsville and Southwest Missouri also played in the bracketed tournament.

SINGLES

FIRST BRACKET -- Gorde and Bengtsson both won their first-round matches, lost in the semifinals, and played each other for third place. Bengtsson pulled off the victory in straight sets, 7-5, 6-3.

In first round competition, Gorde swept Southwest Missouri's Lori Jones 6-1, 6-2, while Iowa's Michele Conlon stopped Gorde in the semifinals 4-6, 6-3, 6-2. Bengtsson defeated Portia George of SUI-Edwardsville 6-2, 2-6, 6-1 in the first round, but lost to Iowa's Pennie Wohlford 6-4, 6-3 in the semifinals.



**SECOND BRACKET** -- Eneberg won the title with a 6-2, 6-1 win over Iowa freshman Liz Canzoneri. Eneberg opened competition with a 6-4, 6-3 win over Iowa's Robin Gerstein, and she added a 6-2, 6-2 win over SIU's Jenny Reuter in the semifinals.

Ovnik placed third after a 6-3, 7-6 win over Reuter. She defeated SIU's Michele Wreen 6-2, 4-6, 7-5 in the first round, but fell to Canzoneri 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 in the semifinals.

**THIRD BRACKET** -- This bracket featured another Gopher vs. Gopher showdown, this time for the title. Jones came out on top, 7-5, 7-6, over Breitag. In the first round, Jones defeated Kim Crowson of Southwest Missouri 6-3, 6-1, and Breitag swept Iowa's Pat Leary 6-3, 7-5. In the semifinals, Jones defeated Iowa's Madeliene Willard 6-3, 6-0, and Breitag won 6-3, 6-1 over SIU's Lisa Schuito.

**FOURTH BRACKET** -- Jennie Huston (BURNSVILLE, MN) placed second after a narrow 6-4, 6-7, 7-6 loss to Iowa's Patty DeSimone. Huston defeated Iowa's Susan Evans 6-1, 7-6 in the first round and won 6-1, 4-6, 7-6 over SIU's Jill David in the semifinals.

Lisa Dick (DON MILLS, Ontario) rebounded from a 6-4, 3-6, 6-2 loss to DeSimone in the first round to win the consolation flight. She won 6-0, 6-1 over Southwest Missouri's Karen Kinney in the consolation semis, and defeated Iowa's Evans 6-3, 6-0 in the championship match.

**FIRST BRACKET** -- After two straight consolation titles, Gorde and Jones won a championship flight with a 6-3, 4-6, 6-2 win over SIU's George/Reuter team. In the first round, the Gopher team defeated Jones and Mendes of SW Missouri 6-1, 6-3, and they dominated Iowa's Nichols/Wohlford team 6-0, 6-2 in the semifinals.

After dropping their first round match 6-4, 5-7, 7-6 to George and Reuter, Bengtsson and Breitag defeated Iowa's Leary/DeSimone team 6-1, 6-4 in the consolation semifinals. In the consolation championship match they were defeated 6-2, 4-6, 6-3 by SIU's Bokeland/Schuito combination.

**SECOND BRACKET** -- The outcome of the championship match was delayed until Thursday, Oct. 30, when Eneberg and Ovnik met Dick and Goldsmith for the title. Eneberg and Ovnik won in straight sets, 6-4, 6-1.

In the first round the Eneberg/Ovnik duo defeated SIU's Wreen/Martin team 6-1, 6-3, while Dick and Goldsmith edged Iowa's Canzoneri/Evans team 7-6, 3-6, 6-3. In the semifinals Eneberg and Ovnik pulled off a dramatic 0-6, 6-4, 6-2 comeback over Iowa's Gerstein and Willard. Dick and Goldsmith's semifinal match was another three-setter, and they prevailed, 7-5, 5-7, 6-2 over SIU's David and Demuro. Due to time considerations and some nagging injuries, the team was able to delay the championship match until the next week.

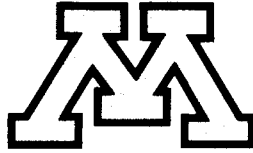

**NETTERS CLOSE FALL SEASON AT MINNESOTA INVITATIONAL** -- The tennis team closed their fall season competition last weekend at the Minnesota Invitational at the 98th St. Racquet Club. **BAKER ANNOUNCES RESIGNATION OF TENNIS COACH JACK ROACH**

Minnesota women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker has announced the resignation of Jack Roach as head tennis coach effective at the end of the 1986-87 academic year.

Roach is in his fourth year as head coach and has compiled a 47-30 (.610) overall record and three consecutive fourth-place finishes at Big Ten championships. During his first year at Minnesota, 1983-84, he led the team to a fourth place finish in the Big Ten, up from 10th place in 1982-83.

"I want to spend more time with my family, especially on weekends. I have a student-athlete at home who needs my support as much as the women student-athletes at the U," says Roach on his decision to leave.

Baker says that she is sorry to see Roach leave, but she respects his decision. "We're really going to miss him," she says. "Jack has made tremendous contributions in the past four years and built a solid base for the future. We're grateful for what he has done."

A respected member of the Twin Cities tennis community, Roach has worked to bring national recognition and respect to the women's tennis program. His teams have traveled throughout the nation and competed against top tennis schools. Roach has also proven to be an effective recruiter, as four top Swedish players and area champions, including former Hill-Murray standout Anne Gorde, have competed for Minnesota.

Although he had never coached at the collegiate level before coming to Minnesota, Roach has extensive playing and coaching experience. He was inducted into the Minnesota Tennis Hall of Fame in 1982 and was named Outstanding Teaching Pro of the Year in 1977 by the Northwest Professional Tennis Association. As a coach, Roach led the U.S. team at the 1967 Pan American Games with a squad that included former pro player and Davis Cup coach Arthur Ashe. Locally, Roach has also coached at Minneapolis Edison and St. Paul Kellogg high schools.

A graduate of Minneapolis Central High School, Roach won the state prep doubles title in 1953. He played tennis while earning a teaching degree at Macalester College in St. Paul, and he received his master's degree from St. Cloud State. In addition to coaching high school tennis, Roach also served as head basketball and cross country coach. Roach and his wife Jean have three sons, Dan, Michael and Paul.

Baker said that a national search for Roach's replacement will begin in February, 1987.

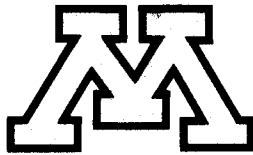

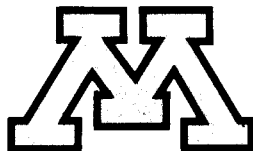

She defeated Eastern Michigan's Deniese Kaercher 7-5, 6-2 in the first round, and then blanked Northern Illinois' Heidi VanLankvelt 6-2, 6-0 in the second round.

In the round of 16, Gorde defeated Purdue's Krista Shreck 6-1, 6-4. Schreck has been Purdue's top singles player for the past two years. Gorde was defeated in the quarterfinals 7-5, 3-6, 6-3 by Jacqui Van Wijk of Wake Forest to finish the tournament with a 3-2 record. Gorde improves her season mark to 9-12 and she snapped an eight-match losing streak.

Roach was especially pleased with Gorde's play because she was fighting a cold all week. "Anne played better with each match. Despite the cold she played very well, and she said that she is glad she went."

OVNIK WINS OPENING SINGLES MATCH -- Following a first-round bye, Ovnik defeated Meg Mulcahy of Marquette 6-3, 6-2 to advance in the championship draw. But in the third round Ovnik was defeated by the tournament's #7 seed, Rita Winebarger of South Carolina, 6-3, 6-4. Ovnik now has a 10-8 singles record, and she is the first Gopher to win ten singles matches this season.

Gorde and Ovnik teamed in doubles for the second time this year, but they were eliminated in the opening round by Lanae Renschler and Robyn Field of Texas, 6-2, 6-3.

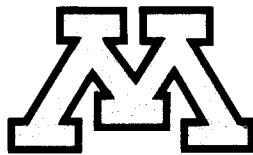

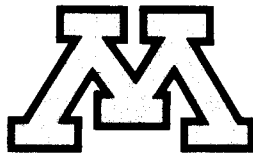

NETTERS OPEN SPRING SEASON AGAINST DEFENDING CONFERENCE CHAMPION -- The Minnesota women's tennis team starts the spring Big Ten season on April 3 against two-time defending champion and seventh-ranked Northwestern, and on April 4 and 5 the Gophers meet Illinois and Purdue. Head coach Jack Roach said that defeating Illinois and Purdue, and wins over Michigan and Michigan State on April 11 and 12, are important so that the team can earn a good seed at the Big Ten Championship. Last year the Gophers were seeded fourth at the tournament, and they placed fourth for the third straight year.

"Our team is a lot different than last year's team," said Roach. "It will be interesting to see how they do against Big Ten competition. The next two weeks are the real test. We need to win three of four matches to earn the fourth seed at Big Tens."

TEAM SPLITS MATCHES IN CALIFORNIA -- Before the Gophers left on their spring training trip in California, Roach said he would be happy if they split their four matches. The team accomplished just that: they were blanked 9-0 by No. 14 U.S. International and No. 11 Georgia, but they rebounded to defeat Oregon 7-2 and Cornell 8-1. The split brings the team's overall record to 8-10, 1-1 in the Big Ten.

INJURY UPDATE -- Freshman Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) was bothered by a foot injury during the California trip, and she only played once during each match. After playing doubles in the first two matches, Ovnik returned to the singles lineup for the first time in two months. Roach said that Ovnik is a question mark for this weekend's play, and for now she will only play singles or doubles in a match.

Freshman Dana Goldsmith (SHEBOYGAN, WI) has also been bothered by a foot injury, but she has returned to the doubles lineup. She and Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, SD) were 2-0 at No. 3, and Roach plans to play them at No. 3 until Ovnik is healthy.

GORDE, BENGTSOON SHARE NO. 1 SINGLES -- Freshman Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) won her first No. 1 singles match over Oregon's Kelly Stuart, 6-4, 6-1, and Roach has decided to alternate Bengtsson and sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE/Hill-Murray) at No. 1 singles. Gorde has played at No. 1 throughout the season, and she has a 15-17 record, while Bengtsson is 18-9 overall and 15-7 at No. 2. In addition, Gorde and Bengtsson continue to compile wins at No. 1 doubles where they have a 13-6 record.

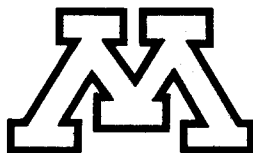

**NETTERS HOST IOWA FRIDAY** -- After two weeks on the road, the Gopher women's tennis team hosts the University of Iowa netters on Friday, April 17, beginning at noon at the Bierman Tennis Courts. Friday's match is the team's only home competition this spring.

Last weekend the Gophers defeated Michigan State 6-3 and downed Michigan 8-1 in East Lansing, Mich. In their Big Ten opener, the team fell to No. 6 Northwestern 8-1 on April 3, but edged Illinois 5-4 and defeated Purdue 8-1. The netters now have a 12-11 record overall, 5-2 in the Big Ten.

"We played better than we have all season," said Gopher head coach Jack Roach. "We're getting in a good position for the Big Ten tournament." The Gophers are shooting for the fourth seed or higher at the conference championship. The conference record determines seedings at the Big Ten Championship, and Roach has stressed that the team needs to win five or six of their seven spring matches. Generally, a team is seeded ahead of the schools they defeat, but not higher than a team they lose to.

**NETTER NOTES** -- Freshman Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden) picked up her 20th singles win of the year over Purdue's Krista Schreck. She has now won four straight matches at No. 2 singles and improved her record to 22-10, best on the team. In doubles, Bengtsson and Anne Gorde (ROSEVILLE/Hill-Murray) have a 16-7 record at No. 1. They could become Minnesota's first 20-win doubles team since Claudia Brisk and Nancy Rost compiled a 22-12 record in 1984.

Senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) and freshman Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) won both of their singles and doubles matches last weekend. Breitag clinched the Michigan State win with a come-from-behind 1-6, 6-2, 7-6 (7-2) victory at No. 6 singles, while Jones dropped only eight games in her straight-set wins at No. 5. Breitag and Jones also combined for wins at No. 3 doubles to remain undefeated in Big Ten play with a 3-0 record, 4-1 overall.

Junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) is the latest player to be bothered by a foot injury, and she has not played doubles for the last four matches. In singles, she has won four straight matches at No. 4 to bring her record to 18-14.

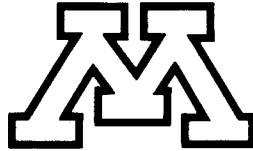

**NETTERS END SEASON AT BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIP** -- The Minnesota women's tennis team concluded the 1986-87 season with a fourth-place finish at the Big Ten Championship on May 1-3 at Ohio State. The Gophers placed fourth for the fourth straight year, and they have finished fourth each year that Jack Roach has coached at Minnesota.

Although the team was seeded fifth heading into the tournament, Roach said that they had a good chance to upset the fourth-seeded Iowa Hawkeyes. Minnesota and Iowa had tied for fourth in the regular-season standings, but the Hawkeyes earned the fourth seed due to their 5-4 regular-season win over Minnesota. At the championships, however, the Gophers jumped out to a 4-2 lead after singles and then won two of three doubles matches.

"This match was the hardest one of the four years," said Roach. "They played better (in the Big Ten match) after losing to Iowa. I'm very happy with the win. It would have been hard to come back and play two (consolation) matches on Saturday."

In the semifinals, sixth-ranked and top-seeded Northwestern blanked the Gophers 9-0, which sent them to the third-place match. Wisconsin then topped the Gophers 5-2 in the rain-shortened third-place match.

**YEAR IN REVIEW** -- The team ends the 1986-87 season with a 13-15 overall record, 6-6 in the Big Ten for the first losing record in Roach's four years as head coach. The team met nine top-25 teams, including sixth-ranked Northwestern, 12th-ranked Indiana and No. 24 Wisconsin in conference matches.

The season began with dual wins over Drake and Iowa State and strong showing at three individual tournaments. Then the team ended the fall season with five straight losses, including three 9-0 shutouts.

Roach revamped the doubles lineups over Christmas break, and the winter season started with a 9-0 win over Ohio State and a near-sweep of the Gopher Doubles Invitational where Minnesota doubles teams won 23 of 28 matches. The winter season closed with a loss to Harvard, a 5-4 win over Boston College, and 2-2 split at the Wichita State team invitational.

The Gophers traveled to California for their annual spring break training trip, and they started with 9-0 losses to nationally-ranked Georgia and U.S. International before they defeated Oregon and Cornell. The spring Big Ten season began in April with a loss to two-time and defending conference champion Northwestern, but then the Gophers won their next four matches.

In the team's only home match of the spring season, Iowa surprised Minnesota 5-4 on April 17. The Hawkeyes led 4-2 after singles, but Minnesota rallied with two doubles wins to tie the match 4-4. The next week, April 25, 24th-ranked Wisconsin upset Minnesota 8-1 in their final regular-season match.

Minnesota earned the fifth seed at the conference championship, but they topped fourth-seeded Iowa 6-3 in the first round. The Gophers then dropped their next two matches to Northwestern and Wisconsin to end the year.

**THREE GOPHERS WIN 20 SINGLES MATCHES** -- Three singles players earned at least 20 wins this season, led by freshman Catharina Bengtsson (HOLLVIKEN, Sweden). Bengtsson compiled a 25-12 record which included a 22-9 mark at No. 2 singles. She won two of three matches at the Big Ten tournament, including a 6-4, 6-4 win over All-Big Ten selection Chris Gilles of Wisconsin. Unfortunately for the team, Bengtsson has decided to attend school in Sweden next year, and her collegiate career ends after one season.

Minnesota's other 20-match winners both earned their 20th wins at the conference championship. Freshman Tonya Breitag (SIOUX FALLS, S.D.) notched her 20th against Iowa's Pat Leary. Breitag was elevated to No. 5 singles for the tournament, and she finished the season with a 20-16 mark. Senior Darcy Jones (TOPSFIELD, MA) earned her 20th win in her final collegiate match when she rallied to defeat Wisconsin's Kris Yahr, 1-6, 6-2, 6-3. Jones finishes the season with a 20-17 record, her first 20-win season as a collegiate player.

**PLAYER NOTES** -- Sophomore Anne Gorde (ROSEVILL, MN) played No. 1 singles for most of the year where she compiled a 17-25 mark. Roach said that Gorde's lack of playing experience at No. 1 hurt her, but he added that Gorde is a strong competitor who continues to improve.

Both junior Karin Eneberg (HELSINGBORG, Sweden) and freshman Anne Marie Ovnik (LA GRANGE, IL) were slowed by foot injuries this year. Ovnik played at No. 3 singles and had a 16-17 record, while Eneberg played at No. 3 and No. 4 singles and had an 18-19 mark.

**DOUBLES NOTES** -- Gorde led the team with a 25-19 doubles record, all at the No. 1 position. Bengtsson compiled a 23-20 doubles record which includes an 18-10 record with Gorde at the No. 1 position. Bengtsson and Gorde missed selection to the All-Big Ten doubles team and an at-large berth for NCAA competition, according to Roach.

Jones was the third Gopher to notch 20 doubles wins. She compiled a 21-19 mark and played at Nos. 1, 2, 3. Gorde and Jones played at No. 1 during the fall season, and they won the first flight title at the Iowa Invitational.

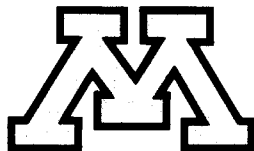

## (BENGTSSON ATTENDS COLLEGE, PLAYS TENNIS IN UNITED STATES)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Hollviken native Catharina Bengtsson was the latest addition to the "Swedish invasion" of the University of Minnesota men's and women's tennis teams. Bengtsson adapted to American life quickly -- both on the courts and in the classroom.

Minnesota head coach Jack Roach praised Bengtsson's hard serve, one-hand backhand and her familiarity with the American serve-and-volley game. And Bengtsson exceeded expectations throughout the year. The ninth-ranked Swedish junior, she led the Gophers with a 25-12 singles record which includes a 22-9 mark at the No. 2 position. Bengtsson also played at No. 1 doubles for most of the year, and she compiled a 23-20 mark.

Along with her perfect 4.0 grade point average during winter quarter, Bengtsson was named the Gophers' most valuable player for the 1986-87 season. Unfortunately, Bengtsson will not be able to repeat the successes of her rookie season because she has elected to return to Sweden to concentrate on academics.

During the fall season, Bengtsson won the No. 2 singles flight championship at the Nebraska Invitational and she was the No. 2 singles consolation champion at the Wake Forest Invitational. In the winter season Bengtsson won all seven of her singles matches, and she was the fourth-seeded player and singles finalist at the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic, a non-collegiate tournament.

Bengtsson's achievements continued during the spring. She put together a five-match winning streak with all of the wins coming in straight sets, and she then won two of three singles matches at the Big Ten Championships.

An equally successful doubles player, Bengtsson and teammate Anne Gorde just missed selection to the All-Big Ten tennis team and an at-large berth to the NCAA National Championship. Roach paired Bengtsson and Gorde at the No. 1 position in January, and they went on to become Minnesota's most successful doubles team in three years.

Bengtsson and Gorde won their first eleven matches of the winter season and finished the year with an 18-10 overall record, 6-4 in the Big Ten. They went 7-0 at the Gopher Doubles Invitational and then won the doubles title at the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic. They clinched two team victories, including Minnesota's first-round win Iowa at the Big Ten tournament.

The team was seeded fifth heading into the Big Ten championship, but they upset fourth-seeded Iowa 6-3 in the first round to move into the championship draw. The team ended the 1986-87 season with a 13-15 overall record, 6-6 in the Big Ten.

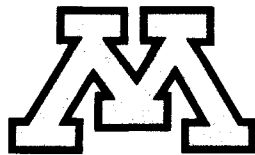

## (ENEBERG COMPLETES JUNIOR TENNIS SEASON)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Just as Helsingborg native Karin Eneberg has played consistent singles and doubles on the University of Minnesota women's tennis team, so has she consistently returned for each season.

Of the four Swedish women to play at Minnesota, Eneberg is the only one to compete for more than one season. In 1984-85, Eneberg and Ulrika Pahlett played. In 1985-86, Eneberg returned and Anna Hallgren came. And in 1986-87, Eneberg returned and Catharina Bengtsson came. For 1987-88, Eneberg may have a new role: in addition to being the team's only senior, she may be the team's only Swede.

Nagging foot and back injuries hampered Eneberg's play throughout the year, and for much of the spring she could not play doubles. Eneberg finished the year with an 18-19 singles record and now has 52 career singles victories. She is only 12 wins away from the top ten career winners in Minnesota history.

Eneberg played at No. 4 singles for most of the season, but she also saw action at No. 3 when a teammate was injured. She won the second bracket singles title at the Iowa Invitational, and she put together a five-match winning streak in the fall season. During the Big Ten season, Eneberg strung together four straight victories, and she won six of her first nine matches in the spring.

Eneberg continued to improve her doubles game, as this year she had 17 victories, the most in her collegiate career. Playing at the No. 2 and No. 3 positions, she compiled a 17-17 record. 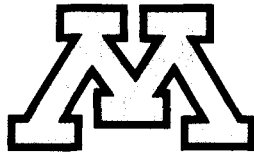

## (GOLDSMITH PLAYS DOUBLES ON MINNESOTA TENNIS TEAM)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The tennis season did not get off on the right foot for University of Minnesota freshman Dana Goldsmith. On the first day of practice, Goldsmith sprained her ankle and then missed a month of competition.

A native of Sheyboygan, Goldsmith returned to the Gopher lineup for the Nebraska Invitational in mid-October. She played in the No. 4 doubles bracket with sophomore Lisa Dick, and they won their first two matches and the flight title. Two weeks later Goldsmith and Dick placed second in their doubles bracket at the Iowa Invitational, and Goldsmith earned a spot in the Gophers' doubles lineup.

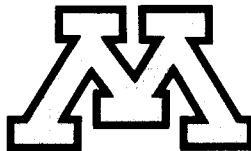

## (GORDE PLAYS NO. 1 SINGLES AND DOUBLES FOR GOPHERS)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Roseville native Anne Gorde entered the 1986-87 tennis year as the University of Minnesota's top returning player on the Gopher tennis team. That's a large responsibility for any player, but particularly for an underclassman.

But Gorde, a sophomore, rose to the challenge. She played No. 1 singles and doubles throughout the season and helped the Gophers to an upper-division finish at the Big Ten tournament.

A winning summer helped prepare Gorde for the collegiate season. She won the singles titles at both the Minnesota State Open and the Lilydale Open, and she was a singles finalist and doubles champion at the Aquatennial tournament. She also advanced to the doubles semifinals of the USTA Amateur tournament.

But after playing No. 4 and No. 2 singles as a freshman, it took Gorde a while to feel comfortable at No. 1. She ended the fall season with a 6-10 record and an eight-match losing streak, but she did win the consolation championship at the Nebraska Invitational.

Gorde snapped the losing streak at the Milwaukee Tennis Classic in January. The tournament is the leading winter tournament for collegiate men and women, and Gorde was one of two Gophers selected to compete. At the classic, Gorde advanced to the consolation quarterfinals, and she went on to win four of seven singles matches during the winter season.

In non-collegiate competition during the winter, Gorde was the top-seeded player at the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic, but she was defeated by fourth-seeded and Gopher teammate Catharina Bengtsson in the semifinals.

Although she ended the season with a 17-25 singles record, Gorde led the Gophers with a 25-19 doubles record. Gorde played with four different partners, including senior Darcy Jones in the fall. Gorde and Jones won first flight consolation titles at the Wake Forest and Nebraska invitationals before they won the first flight championship at the Iowa Invitational.

Head coach Jack Roach paired Gorde and Bengtsson for January's Gopher Doubles Invitational, and they were an instant success. They won their first eleven matches, including a 7-0 mark at the Gopher Doubles Invitational and the St. Paul Winter Carnival Classic championship. Gorde and Bengtsson also clinched two Gopher team wins against Big East champion Boston College in February and over Iowa in the first round of the Big Ten Championship.

With an 18-10 record (6-4 Big Ten), Gorde and Bengtsson became Minnesota's most successful doubles team since Nancy Rost and Claudia Brisk went 22-12 in 1983-84. They just missed being selected to the All-Big Ten team and receiving an at-large berth to the NCAA National Championship.

The Gophers were seeded fifth heading into the Big Ten meet, and they upset fourth-seeded Iowa 6-3 in the first round to move into the championship draw. That first round win avenged a 5-4 loss to the Hawkeyes during the Big Ten season.

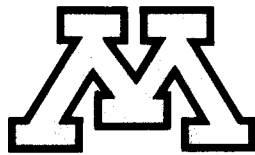

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Topsfield native Darcy Jones closed out her Gopher tennis career with her first 20-win season in both singles and doubles.

She took the No. 6 flight title at the Nebraska Invitational, and two weeks later she won the third bracket championship at the Iowa Invitational when she defeated teammate Tonya Breitag 7-5, 7-6 in the championship match.

In doubles, Jones played with eight different partners and compiled a 21-19 record. During the fall season she played with sophomore Anne Gorde, and they started the year quickly by winning seven of their first nine matches at No. 1 doubles. The team earned consolation championships at the Wake Forest and Nebraska invitationals and a championship title at the Iowa Invitational. Jones teamed with Breitag during the spring season, and they won four straight Big Ten matches en route to a 5-2 conference and 6-3 overall record.

For the fourth straight year, the netters concluded the season with a fourth-place finish at the Big Ten Championship. 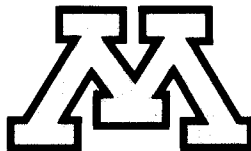

## (OVNIK COMPLETES FRESHMAN TENNIS SEASON AT MINNESOTA)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- Although a nagging foot injury hampered her play, La Grange native Anne Marie Ovnik adapted quickly to collegiate tennis play. A freshman at the University of Minnesota, Ovnik jumped from No. 5 to No. 3 singles in the first month of the season.

Ovnik started the year with two dual match wins at No. 5 singles, and after she placed third in the fifth flight at the Wake Forest Invitational, head coach Jack Roach moved Ovnik up to No. 3, where she played for the rest of the season. She ended the year with a 16-17 singles record, 4-8 in Big Ten matches.

A summer foot injury slowed Ovnik throughout the season, but her tennis talent was not overlooked. A highly-recruited high school standout, Ovnik was one of two Gophers selected to compete in the prestigious Milwaukee Tennis Classic. In open competition, Ovnik advanced to the third round of the championship draw before she was defeated by the tournament's seventh seed, Rita Winebarger of South Carolina.

In doubles, Ovnik compiled a 14-20 individual record with five different partners. She teamed with junior Karin Eneberg during the fall season, and they won the second flight title at the Iowa Invitational with a 6-4, 6-1 win over teammates Lisa Dick and Dana Goldsmith.
