## MINNESOTA TENNIS TEAM WRAPPING UP FALL SEASON --

The Minnesota women's tennis team competed at the Hoosier Classic in Bloomington, Ind. from Friday through Sunday, the team's third and final tournament of the fall season. Three individual tournaments, the ITCA All-American qualifying (Oct. 23-24), the Rolex Regional Championships (Nov. 8-11) and the Dupont National Intercollegiate Clay Court Championship qualifying (Nov. 16-18), remain on the fall schedule for team members who qualify. The Gophers will open the winter season Jan. 17 against North Carolina State in a home dual match.

**MOE, OLSSON TO COMPETE IN ITCA ALL-AMERICAN QUALIFYING ROUNDS --** Juniors **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) are competing in this week's ITCA All-American Championships qualifying rounds (Tuesday and Wednesday) at the Riviera Tennis Club in Pacific Palisades, Calif. They will compete as a doubles team and **Moe** will compete in singles. The ITCA All-American Championship (Thursday-Sunday) is the first leg of the ITCA Collegiate Grand Slam.

**GOPHERS FIND GOING ROUGH AT HOOSIER CLASSIC --** The Gophers expected the competition to be tough at Indiana's Hoosier Classic and were proven correct. Minnesota won just four of 19 singles matches and two of seven doubles matches in the tournament. The bright spot for the Gophers was the second place finish in the first doubles flight by **Moe** and **Olsson**.

The duo defeated Indiana's Brenda Hacker and Danielle Paravine 7-6, 7-5 in the first round and bested Georgia Tech's Kristy Kottich and Pierette Harshaw 6-2, 7-5 in second-round play. In the final, **Moe** and **Olsson** were beaten 6-0, 6-0 by Indiana's Deb Edelman and Stephanie Reece, currently the eighth-ranked doubles team in the country. **Moe** won two of her four singles matches to finish sixth in the 16-player first flight.

**NELSON, MARQUES SIDELINED BY STRESS FRACTURES --** The Gophers were without the services of senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOL) at Indiana. **Nelson**, diagnosed as having a stress fracture of the talus in her right foot, will be out six to eight weeks. Both she and freshman **JENNIFER MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA), who has stress fractures in her left and right tibias, are expected to be back in action by the season-opening dual match Jan. 17 against North Carolina State. **Marques** has not competed this fall.

**GOPHERS DOMINATE MINNESOTA INTERCOLLEGIATE INVITATIONAL --** The home season opened on a positive note as the Gophers won 15 of 18 singles matches and six of eight doubles matches Oct. 12-14 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Invitational at the Burnsville Racquet Club. **Moe** was 4-0 in singles and **Olsson** and **Nelson** were both 3-0 in singles play. Sophomores **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO/MATER DEI) and **VICKY KOLARIC** (WILLOUGHBY HILLS, OH/NOTRE DAME ACADEMY) were both 2-1 in singles and sophomore **ANNA EYRING** (SALT LAKE CITY, UT) was 1-1.

Although a singles final was not played because of injuries to semifinalists **Nelson** and **Olsson**, **Moe** and **Olsson** won all three of their doubles matches and won the doubles draw. **Nelson** and **Kolaric** combined for a 2-1 doubles record and **Cordova** and **Eyring** were 1-1.

**MOE WINS FIRST SINGLES, DOUBLES FLIGHTS AT NEBRASKA INVITE --** Moe defeated Nebraska's Ildiko Guba 6-4, 6-3 in the No. 1 singles flight final to claim title honors after beating Kansas State's Michele Riniker 6-1, 6-2 in the semifinals. In doubles, Moe and Olsson defeated Baylor's Stephanie Krienke and Leanne Forney 6-1, 6-2 in the No. 1 doubles flight final.

Olsson was defeated by Texas Tech's Karen Biggerstaff 6-4, 6-4 in the second singles flight final and Nelson was defeated by Nebraska's Nancy Tyggum 6-2, 3-6, 6-0 in the third singles flight final. Cordova finished seventh in the No. 4 singles flight, while Kolaric finished sixth in the No. 5 singles flight and Eyring finished fourth in the No. 6 singles flight.

**MILESTONES --** Moe and Olsson now have 50 career doubles wins as a team and need just 10 more to become Minnesota's all-time winningest doubles team. Moe and Olsson each have 53 individual career doubles wins, 14 shy of the Gopher all-time top ten list. Nelson leads all current players with 53 lifetime singles wins -- Moe has 52 and Olsson has 51.

## MOE, OLSSON COMPETE IN ALL-AMERICAN QUALIFYING, ROLEX REGIONALS

The Minnesota women's tennis team completed its fall season at Indiana's Hoosier Classic from Oct. 19-21 but juniors **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) had an extended fall schedule.

**Moe** competed in singles in ITCA All-American qualifying play on Oct. 23 in Pacific Palisades, Calif. and was defeated in the first round 6-2, 7-6 (7-2) by Oklahoma State's Christina Sirianni. **Moe** and **Olsson** lost 6-2, 6-2 in the first doubles round to UCLA's Kirsten Dreyer and Alegra Mulholland.

**GOPHERS WIN EARLY, LOSE LATE AT ROLEX REGIONAL -- Moe** won her opening two singles matches and combined with **Olsson** to win a round-of-32 doubles match at the Rolex regional tournament in Madison, Wis. from Nov. 8-11 before falling in both the singles and doubles round of 16. **Moe** defeated Illinois State's Jane Williams 6-2, 6-3 and then beat Wisconsin's Stephanie Benz 6-1, 6-1 before losing to Badger Jill Chullino 6-3, 6-3.

**Olsson** lost to Melissa Harris of Notre Dame 3-6, 6-4, 6-1 in her first singles match. In doubles, **Moe** and **Olsson** defeated Eastern Michigan's Caryn Stube and Lynne Tilden 6-2, 6-2 and then lost to Northwestern's Branaca Elsberry and Julie Willett 4-6, 6-3, 6-3. **Moe's** season singles record is now 11-4 and **Olsson's** singles record is 5-7. The duo's season doubles record is 9-3.

**NEXT UP: NORTH CAROLINA STATE ON JAN. 17 --** The Gophers did not compete in last week's Dupont Clay Court qualifying rounds in Panama City, Fla. as originally scheduled. Minnesota is off until meeting North Carolina State in a home dual on Jan. 17. It will be the Gophers' first dual match of the season.

## **GOPHERS RESUME DUAL MEET SCHEDULE AFTER PLAYING HOST TO ROLEX --**

Minnesota has a two-week layoff, with no matches scheduled until Feb. 22, when the Gophers meet Big Ten opponent Northwestern in a dual match at Evanston, Ill. Minnesota will travel to South Bend, Ind. the following day, where they will play LSU on Feb. 23 and Notre Dame on Feb. 24.

**ROLEX PROVES TO BE ROUGH GOING FOR MOE, OLSSON --** The best college players in the nation were in town from Feb. 7-10 for the Rolex National Intercollegiate Indoor Tennis Championships, held for the fourth straight year at the 98th Street and Crosstown Racquet Clubs. Juniors **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) and **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) competed in the tournament as a wildcard doubles team and **Moe** represented Minnesota as a wildcard singles entry.

**Moe** lost her opening singles match to 22nd-ranked Laura Kimel of Georgia. Kimel won 5-7, 6-2, 6-4. In consolation singles, **Moe** lost to 26th-ranked Monika Waniek of Oklahoma State by a 6-1, 7-5 score. In their opening doubles match, **Moe** and **Olsson** lost 6-2, 6-2 to eventual tournament winners Jillian Alexander and Nicole Arendt of Florida, who are ranked eighth in the nation. In consolation doubles, **Moe** and **Olsson** lost 6-4, 6-3 to eventual consolation champs Mamie Ceniza and Stella Sampras of UCLA. **Moe's** season singles record is now 12-8 and the **Moe/Olsson** season doubles record is 17-6.

**MOE GETS BIG WIN IN SEASON-OPENING LOSS --** **Moe** had Minnesota's biggest win in nearly two years in the Gophers 6-3 loss to Indiana at the 98th Street Racquet Club on Jan. 27. Her win over Indiana's 17th-ranked Stephanie Reece 2-6, 6-4, 6-4 at No. 1 singles was also the best win of her career.

Prior to **Moe's** win over Reece, no Minnesota player had defeated a player ranked higher than 30th in the ITCA/Volvo coaches poll since former Gopher Anne Gorde defeated No. 30 Amy Schwartz of Miami (Fla.) 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 on March 1, 1989. **Moe's** previous best career win came in the opening round of last season's Rolex National Indoor Intercollegiate Tennis Championships, when she defeated No. 47 Nathalie Rodriguez of South Carolina.

**Moe** came into this season ranked 46th in the preseason poll, but is unranked in the current poll, which runs through March 12. The poll ranks the top 50 singles players in the country and the top 20 doubles teams.

**DOUBLES WINS IMPRESSIVE DESPITE DEFAULTS --** Minnesota got two free wins when Indiana defaulted at No. 1 and No. 3 doubles in order to catch a plane back to Bloomington, Ind. But both matches could have resulted in Minnesota wins had they been completed. At No. 1 doubles, **Moe** and doubles partner **Olsson** had defeated Reece and Gretchen Doninger 7-6 (9-7) in the first set and were losing 3-0 in the second set. At No. 3 doubles, freshman **JENNIFER MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA) and sophomore **VICKY KOLARIC** (WILLOUGHBY HILL, OH/NOTRE DAME ACADEMY) were playing a strong match despite trailing 5-7, 3-5 to the Hoosiers' Brenda Hacker and Danielle Paradine.

**GOPHERS CAP OFF ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL DOUBLES INVITATIONAL** -- The Gophers went into the Jan. 18-20 doubles competition at the 98th Street Racquet Club hoping to prepare the team's doubles skills for the rigors of the dual season. When the results were in, Minnesota had a 12-4 doubles record over three days, bettering the marks of its opponents from Nebraska (11-8), Iowa (8-10), Drake (7-8) and Southwest State (0-7).

**MOE, OLSSON GO UNDEFEATED** -- Moe and Olsson were 6-0 in the tournament, while Minnesota's No. 2 doubles team, sophomore **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI) and senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS), was 3-3 on the weekend. **Marques** made her collegiate debut after missing the fall season with stress fractures. She combined with **Kolaric** for a 3-1 record.

**MILESTONES** -- Moe and Olsson now have 59 doubles wins as a team, tying them for the school's all-time record for wins by a doubles team (59 by Leslie Larm and Kari Sandvig from 1977-80). Both players have 62 individual career doubles wins, tying them for 14th on the all-time Gopher list. With 16 dual matches remaining on the schedule along with the Big Ten championships, the duo is virtually assured of becoming the most prolific doubles team ever to play at Minnesota.

**GOPHERS OPEN SPRING SEASON ON WEST COAST --** The Minnesota women's tennis team, off this weekend because of final exams, will be starting a new term in the classroom on March 25. Before the Gophers open the books, however, they will be looking for a fresh start on the tennis courts.

Minnesota (0-9 overall, 0-4 Big Ten) opens its spring season March 21 in San Diego against defending Ivy League champion Princeton. The Gophers will then face San Diego on March 22 before returning home. An originally scheduled match against U.S. International was canceled when USIU terminated most of its athletic programs because of financial difficulties.

**OPPONENT NOTES --** Princeton (2-1 overall) has not competed in a dual match since October, when the Tigers lost to William & Mary 6-3 and defeated Brown (6-3) and Penn State (5-1). The Tigers' top doubles team, Lauren Fortgang and Aila Winkler, has a 17-2 season record and is ranked 14th in the current ITCA/Volvo Tennis rankings. Fortgang, ranked 45th, is 11-6 at No. 1 singles and Winkler is 12-5 at No. 2 singles. This will be the first meeting between Minnesota and Princeton.

Fourteenth-ranked San Diego has lost four straight matches and has a season record of 6-5. Prior to playing Minnesota, San Diego will take on No. 6 Texas (March 14), No. 5 Cal-Berkeley (March 16), Miami (March 17) and Iowa (March 21). The Toreros lost to No. 11 Pepperdine 5-4 in their most recent match. Senior Tonya Fuller, ranked 10th nationally, plays No. 1 singles for San Diego and has a season record of 23-6. At No. 2 singles is Tuck Kacharoen from Bangkok, Thailand. She is ranked 33rd and has a season mark of 12-7 at No. 2. Fuller and freshman Julie McKeon have a 7-4 record at No. 1 doubles. **SERIES --** San Diego defeated Minnesota 5-1 last season and leads the series 2-1.

**MINNESOTA LOSING STREAK HITS DOUBLE DIGITS --** The Gophers lost two more matches over the weekend, extending the team's school-record losing streak to 10. Minnesota lost 6-0 to Kentucky on Saturday, dropping all six of its singles matches. No doubles matches were played. On Sunday, the Gophers lost 8-1 to Wisconsin, with junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN) getting Minnesota's only win. Moe defeated the Badgers' Elaine Demetroulis 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 at No. 1 singles to up her season singles record to 14-12. The Gophers lost 8-1 to Illinois on March 3. Minnesota was defeated 9-0 by Northwestern on Feb. 22 in Evanston, Ill. and 7-2 by LSU (Feb. 23) and Notre Dame (Feb. 24) in South Bend, Ind.

**NELSON WINS CLOSE MATCH --** Senior captain **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS) posted the Gophers' only win against Illinois, winning 7-5, 7-6 over Kristi Meola at No. 3 singles. The only other Gopher to win a set in singles was sophomore **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI), who was defeated 6-3, 4-6, 6-4 by Illinois' Cynthia Chambers at No. 4 singles. Minnesota's No. 1 and No. 2 doubles teams each lost in three sets. **Moe** and doubles partner **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN) were defeated 6-1, 5-7, 7-5 by Illinois' Lindsey Nimmo and Kristin Willey at No. 1 doubles. At No. 2 doubles, Meola and Laurie Kane of Illinois defeated Nelson and **VICKY KOLARIC** (WILLOUGHBY HILLS, OH/NOTRE DAME ACADEMY) 4-6, 6-4, 6-1.

**SINGLES WINS SCARCE IN NORTHWESTERN, LSU, NOTRE DAME LOSSES --** The Gophers' lone victories Feb. 22-24 were by **Moe** (at No. 1) and **Olsson** (at No. 2) in the loss to LSU and **Cordova** at No. 4 singles against Notre Dame. **Moe** defeated LSU's Laura Randman 6-1, 6-3 and **Olsson** defeated the Tigers' Claudia Herrera 6-2, 6-0. **Cordova** beat Notre Dame's Kim Pacella 6-3, 6-2. (Note: In another match of interest, Notre Dame's Terry "daughter of ESPN's Dick" Vitale defeated Gopher Nelson 6-4, 6-4 at No. 3 singles.)

**MOE/OLSSON RANKED 21ST, SET SCHOOL DOUBLES TEAM WIN RECORD --** **Moe** and **Olsson** were ranked 21st nationally in doubles in the March 12 Volvo Tennis Collegiate rankings. When **Moe** and **Olsson** defeated Notre Dame's Lisa Tholen and Ann Bradshaw 6-2, 7-6 at No. 1 doubles on Feb. 24, the duo became the all-time winningest women's doubles team in school history. The win was their 60th and surpassed the 59 wins that former Gophers Leslie Larm and Kari Sandvig achieved from 1977-80. **Moe** and **Olsson** have a 1990-91 season doubles record of 18-10 after going 21-15 in 1989-90 and 21-14 in 1988-89.

**GOPHERS CLOSE REGULAR SEASON AT MICHIGAN, MICHIGAN STATE --** The Gopher women's tennis team wraps up its regular season with two road matches this weekend. Minnesota will play Michigan at 11 a.m. Saturday in Ann Arbor, Mich. and will take on Michigan State at 11 a.m. Sunday in East Lansing, Mich. Following the matches, the Gophers (4-14 overall, 2-5 Big Ten) will have a better idea of where they will be seeded for the Big Ten championship tournament in Madison, Wis. (April 26-28). Teams are seeded one through 10 going in with the top two teams getting byes. The bottom eight seeds will each play three matches in the tournament to determine each team's final Big Ten standing.

**MINNESOTA LOSES TWO ON SOUTHERN TRIP --** The Gophers found the weekend competition in Auburn, Ala. less than hospitable. Mississippi State beat Minnesota 5-1 on Saturday and Auburn beat the Gophers 7-2 on Sunday. Only five players went on the trip, so Minnesota went into both matches shorthanded, having to forfeit matches at No. 6 singles and No. 3 doubles before any balls had even been served. Junior **JENNIE MOE** (EDINA, MN), ranked 73rd in singles in the Volvo Tennis/collegiate rankings, had a hand in all three Minnesota wins. She won both her matches at No. 1 singles, extending her winning streak to seven, and also won at No. 1 doubles with sophomore **VICKY CORDOVA** (MISSION VIEJO, CA/MATER DEI) against Auburn.

Moe (21-14 overall) defeated Mississippi State's Sabine Guibal 6-3, 6-7 (4-7) default and then bested Auburn's Tracy Bankston 6-2, 6-2. The Moe/Cordova duo (4-2 overall) defeated Auburn's Michelle Beadman and Sandra Mieres 6-4, 7-6. Senior **LIBBY NELSON** (WAYZATA, MN/THE BLAKE SCHOOLS) had her five-match singles winning streak snapped by Mississippi State's Michelle Oldham, who beat Nelson 6-1, 6-2.

**CLIMBING THE CHARTS --** Moe's most recent singles win was the 64th of her career, tying her with former Gopher Leslie Larm (1977-80) for 14th on the all-time Gopher singles win list...the 13th spot is held by Kathy Bjornson (1980-84), who had 68 wins...Moe's last doubles win was the 67th of her career, tying her with Patty Moran (1975-79) for 11th on the all-time doubles win list...Karin Eneberg (1984-88) is in 10th with 70 doubles wins...With 131 combined singles and doubles wins in her career, Moe ranks 14th on the all-time Gopher list...Tonya Breitag (1986-90) is 13th with 138.

**MARYLEE LIBERA NAMED ASSISTANT COACH --** The women's athletic department has announced the hiring of **Marylee Libera** as the assistant coach to head women's tennis coach Martin Novak. Libera, currently a tennis teaching professional at Northwest Racquet, Swim and Health Clubs, is a native of Rochester, Minn. She graduated from Rochester Lourdes High School in 1982 and went on to play tennis for four years at the University of Houston, where she earned a degree in journalism. Libera worked in Dallas from 1986-90 in the Texas Instruments employee services department. She has been working at the Northwest clubs since October.

**MOE, NELSON LEAD GOPHERS OVER OHIO STATE, GUSTAVUS --** Moe and Nelson extended their personal winning streaks to five at No. 1 and No. 2 singles while helping Minnesota to a pair of wins. The Gophers beat Ohio State 7-2 on April 5 and Gustavus Adolphus 8-1 on April 7.

Moe defeated Ohio State's Kelly Story 6-0, 6-1 and Gustavus's Amy McCrea 6-0, 6-0. Nelson defeated the Buckeyes' Abigail Villela 6-1, 6-2 and the Gusties' Heidi Rostberg 6-1, 6-1. It was a successful weekend for Minnesota in singles play as the Gophers won all 12 of its singles matches. The team had won just 33 percent of its season singles matches going into the weekend.

Moe and Cordova won both of their doubles matches at No. 1 doubles. For Moe, the April 5 doubles win was the 20th of the season. She has won more than 20 doubles matches in all three of her collegiate seasons.

**OLSSON WINS TWO MATCHES DESPITE SHOULDER INJURY --** Gopher junior **SOFIE OLSSON** (ASMUNDTORP, SWEDEN/GULLSTRANDSKOLAN), out since March 10 with a shoulder injury, returned to action in limited capacity on April 5 and 7 and won two matches at No. 6 singles. She defeated Ohio State's Debbie Horton 4-6, 6-0, 6-2 on April 5 and Gustavus's Linnea Carlson 6-2, 6-1 on April 7. Olsson, normally Minnesota's No. 2 singles player, was limited to ground strokes and underhand serving because of her injury, which was been diagnosed as subclavian vein thrombosis. For her specifically, a vein was impinged between a muscle and her first rib, causing a loss of circulation in her arm in certain instances, particularly when she raised it above her shoulders. She had surgery April 11 and will miss the remainder of the season. A full recovery is expected.

**EYRING INJURES KNEE, OUT FOR TWO WEEKS --** Gopher sophomore **ANNA EYRING** (SALT LAKE CITY, UT/OLYMPUS), who suffered a torn meniscus in her right knee during the Gophers' April 3 match at Iowa, had surgery on April 9. Minnesota head trainer Leah Wollenburg said the injury may have been an aggravation of an old injury. Eyring missed Minnesota's matches with Mississippi State and Auburn and will miss the Michigan and Michigan State matches but may be ready for the Big Ten championships.

**GOPHERS END LOSING SKID, PILE UP SINGLES WINS --** Minnesota waited a long time for its first win of the season, but once its March 29 match with Purdue began, it did not take the Gophers long to break its 12-match losing streak. It was decided after singles play as Minnesota won five of six singles matches to clinch the win. Results from the first five singles spots were in when Eyring won the deciding singles match. She defeated the Boilermakers' Dana Pearson 2-6, 6-3, 6-3 at No. 6. Moe beat 59th-ranked Erica Adams 6-4, 6-3 at No. 1 singles.

Against Iowa State on March 30, the Gophers won four of six singles matches enroute to a 6-3 win. Moe and Cordova, playing doubles together for the second time, got their first win, downing the Cyclones' Susanne Pollmann and Kim Dempsey 6-4, 6-3.

**PRINCETON, 14TH-RANKED SAN DIEGO DOWN GOPHERS --** Minnesota lost a school-record 12th straight match dating back to last year when 14th-ranked San Diego shut out the Gophers 9-0 on March 22. Princeton beat Minnesota 8-1 on March 21. The lone Gopher win against the Tigers was by freshman **JENNY MARQUES** (LAGUNA HILLS, CA), who defeated Kristin Green 6-3, 6-2 at No. 4 singles. ## NELSON COMPLETES GOPHER TENNIS CAREER --

Wayzata native **Libby Nelson** capped off a fine collegiate tennis career at the University of Minnesota by winning two of her three matches at the Big Ten championships April 26-28 in Madison, Wis. She finished the season with a 7-5 Big Ten record and an overall mark of 14-15. She was 8-6 at No. 2 singles.

Nelson, a 1987 graduate of The Blake Schools, also served as the team captain this season. The leadership she showed through example was probably her greatest impact on this year's team, said Gophers head coach Martin Novak.

"She led very much by example," Novak said. "She is so good to work with because she's really self-motivated."

Nelson played primarily at No. 5 and 6 singles her first three years so playing in the No. 2 position was a big jump for her. She had started the year at No. 3 but was moved to No. 2 when the team's previous No. 2 player, junior Sofie Olsson, suffered a season-ending shoulder injury.

"Libby held her own at No. 2," said Novak. "If you put expectations on yourself and work hard towards them, you will achieve, and she did that this year."

Despite Nelson's efforts, the Gophers finished 10th in the Big Ten for just the second time in school history. Minnesota lost its first 11 matches of the season and finished 4-19.

Nelson concluded her career with a career singles mark of 62-57. She was 41-45 in doubles.

While she led by example on the court, she also led by example off it, by being a two-time Big Ten all-academic pick.

Prior to coming to Minnesota, Nelson was a four-time high school all-conference selection. She finished third individually in the state high school AA championships in 1985 and 1986 and third in the state high school A championship in 1984. She was a three-time Prince High School honorable mention all-America selection.

Nelson made her presence felt immediately as a freshman at Minnesota, posting a 14-18 singles mark. She improved to 15-10 as a sophomore and 19-14 as a junior. Among other career highlights were the winning streaks she had last year (seven in doubles and six in singles), and a fifth flight championship in the 1989 Nebraska Flight Invitational. Her consistent play and quiet leadership will be missed, said Novak.

"I think very highly of Libby and I respect her very much," Novak said. "I wish she had a few more years left."

Nelson, a political science major, is the daughter of James and Robin Nelson.

### JENNIE MOE WRAPS UP ANOTHER OUTSTANDING SEASON --

Gophers junior tennis player **Jennie Moe** finished her 1990-91 tennis season by winning two of three matches at the Big Ten championships in Madison, Wis. April 26-28. She was named all-Big Ten for the second straight year.

Moe, a speech-communications major who was a member of four state championship teams at Edina High School (from 1984-87), posted a 25-15 overall singles record and 22-17 overall doubles mark. She played at No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Gophers and finished the season ranked 74th in the nation in the Volvo Tennis/Collegiate Rankings. Despite Moe's accomplishments, Minnesota did not fare as well as a team.

The Gophers finished 4-19 overall and 2-10 in the Big Ten, worst-ever in school history. At the conference championships, Minnesota finished 10th for just the second time in 16 years. Gophers first-year head coach Martin Novak was well aware that Moe provided most of the positives this year for Minnesota women's tennis.

"Overall, what I respect about Jennie this year is that she could have played for a lot of top schools," Novak said. "It must have been frustrating. She is a very quality individual. She is helping the University of Minnesota and herself."

While helping bring more recognition to the Minnesota women's tennis program, Moe's name has begun to take a prominent place in the Minnesota record books. She has 68 career singles wins (tied for 13th all-time at Minnesota) in three years and needs 27 next year to move into second place. With 67 career doubles wins (also 13th), Moe needs 29 to move into second place on that list. She has 135 overall wins and needs 49 to move into third place on that list.

There is one category at which Moe is already at the top. She and junior Sofie Olsson have combined for 60 doubles wins as a team, more than any other duo in school history. If both players remain healthy next season, the record could be put out of reach. The previous best (59 by Leslie Larm and Kari Sandvig) had stood for 11 years until Moe and Olsson broke it on Feb. 24.

There were several other season highlights for Moe. Among them were eight and 10-match winning streaks and wins over Indiana's Stephanie Reece (ranked 15th in the nation at season's end) and Purdue's Erica Adams (ranked 21st in the nation at season's end). Of Moe's 15 losses, 13 were to players ranked in the top 100.

How far Moe's talents can take her next year in her senior year is up to her, Novak said.

The key, explained Novak, will be for Moe to continue honing the style of play she worked on implementing this year. Previously, Moe played primarily a power game, relying on her hitting ability to dispatch of opponents. That style of play, however, did not always work against the nation's top players. So this year, Novak worked with her on new strategies, such as mixing up her shots more, coming to the net and playing a serve and volley game.

Novak also encouraged Moe to further examine her game and abilities from a mental standpoint.

"In my opinion, it's a matter of ownership," said Novak. "Jennie has such potential and she has used so many different shots and used her options so well...she needs to take full credit for that herself--that means her own planning, her own decision-making and credit for the results.

"I think she is close to her own ownership. (Having that) protects you from outside distractions. You learn to filter your own feelings, knowledge and so forth."

Novak, who played collegiate tennis at Texas Christian University, plans on playing against Moe this summer to help her keep her game sharp. With a summer of preparation, Novak said, Moe should be even better next season. She already has the tools.

"She's quick, she's strong, she has good endurance, she has tremendous drive and she has good hands," said Novak. "That's all you need."
