## TWO WEEK TRIP OPENS SEASON

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The 15-member Minnesota volleyball squad opens training on Monday, August 11, with practices scheduled from 9-11 a.m. and 2-5 p.m. most days. The team will have three pre-season exhibitions open to the public. Stephanie Schleuder starts her fifth season as head coach, and she will be assisted by Dorothy Franco for the third year.

PRE-SEASON COMPETITION -- Competition in Hawaii against nationally-ranked schools opens the 1986 Minnesota volleyball pre-season. The Hawaii trip features matches against several nationally-ranked schools including the University of Hawaii, a Division I national competitor. After seven matches in Honolulu, the team travels to Utah to compete in the 12-team Brigham Young Invitational.

SCHLEUDER ON THE SCHEDULE -- "This is our toughest pre-season schedule ever. The University of Hawaii is a top ten school and the other schools are nationally ranked in their own divisions. We'll see quickly how strong we are. It's a crucial trip, and we need to do well out there. A good Hawaii trip and a good performance at the BYU tournament could move us into the national top twenty."

MEDIA DAY -- On Tuesday, Sept. 23, the team will have a media day preceding the team's home and Big Ten double round robin opener against Iowa. The Iowa match is scheduled for Wednesday, Sept. 24, at 7:30 p.m. in Williams Arena.

Minnesota Women's Sports News 2-2-2

KEY RETURNERS -- Pam Miller (WORTH, Ill.)...5-11 senior...team leader on and off the court...captain for second year...leading middle hitter and blocker...led the Big Ten in blocking in 1985...could become all-time Gopher kill leader...has a shot at All-American honors.

Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, Argentina)...5-11 sophomore middle/outside hitter...knee problems have cleared up...could have a better season than 1985's record-breaking debut...may move to outside hitter...a legitimate All-American.

SCHLEUDER ON THE TEAM -- "Everybody's healthy; they worked hard over the summer. We have the hitting power, but how well we do depends a lot on the consistency of setting. I'm still deciding if we stay with a 5-1 offense or switch to a 6-2. With three setters we have the flexibility to have different people play and two of our setters are front-row players.

RECRUITS -- Karen Staab (PALATINE, Ill.)...6-0 freshman middle hitter...recovering from broken leg...rehabilitation is going well...was expected to start at middle hitter before injury...should be ready to play by the Big Ten season.

Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, Ky.)...6-1 freshman...middle/outside hitter...a possible setter...Lori Miller (WORTH, Ill.)...6-0 freshman...will give depth at middle hitter position...Pam Miller's younger sister...Sharon Oesterling (FRANKFORT, Ind.)...5-9 setter/hitter...strong front-row player.

SCHLEUDER ON THE RECRUITS -- "This is our largest recruiting class in four years and one of the strongest in the nation. They can all legitimately step in and start, I think they're that strong. They give us more depth than we've ever had, especially at middle hitter."

ELIAS NAMED INTERIM ASSISTANT COACH -- Women's athletic director Merrily Dean Baker has announced the hiring of Kirk Elias as interim assistant coach of the Minnesota track and field team for the 1986-87 season. A part-time coach last year, Elias will begin his coaching duties in September.

Before coming to Minnesota, Elias was the head women's cross country and track coach at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire from 1981-83 where his teams placed among the top ten at small college nationals. He coached a total of 14 All-Americans at UW-Eau Claire. Elias has also served as head coach of the Minneapolis-based Club Sota running club since April 1984. In addition, he has coached at the College of St. Thomas and Armstrong High School in Plymouth.

## 1986 MINNESOTA VOLLEYBALL OUTLOOK

Strong returners, top recruits and depth at all positions are three reasons that head coach Stephanie Schleuder says the 1986 volleyball team can finish among the top three in the Big Ten. "Placing in the top three in the conference is a realistic goal for us," she says. "We had no key losses, and we had a great recruiting year."

Eight letterwinners return from last year's 22-12 overall and 11-7 fourth place Big Ten team. This year's squad will again be anchored by the strongest middle hitting/blocking combination in the conference in senior Pam Miller and sophomore Andrea Gonzalez. And this year's team will have both balance and depth with four incoming recruits, ranked among the strongest frosh class in the nation. Still, success may hinge on the Gophers improving their setting, and getting contributions from a mix of veterans and newcomers.

**Key Players:** Gonzalez, Miller -- Gonzalez, a 5-11 middle/outside hitter, is the team's most powerful hitter and was ranked in the top-twenty nationally with a 4.24 kills per game average. Miller, a 5-11 middle blocker, is the team's sole captain and led the Big Ten in blocking with a 1.64 average last year.

"Andrea exceeded every expectation and hope we had for her as a freshman. She is a legitimate All-American for 1986," Schleuder says. As a freshman, Gonzalez compiled a long list of honors including selection to the All-Big Ten first team and All-Midwest second team. She was also named the 1985 Gopher MVP and Freshman of the Year. During the season Gonzalez set a new individual match record for most kills in a match (37) and led the team in season kills (522, a new Minnesota record), kill percentage (.295), and service aces (58).

Although Miller provides plenty of offensive firepower, more importantly, she inspires the team with her on-court intensity. "The team looks to Pam for leadership on the court, both by her actions and her emotions," Schleuder says.

Miller led the team in blocking last year with 45 block solos and a 1.43 blocks per game average. Her 124 block assists also broke her school record of 122, set in 1984. The Gophers MVP as a sophomore, Miller was the team's second leading hitter in 1985 with 445 kills and a 3.77 kills per game average. A co-captain last year, she now has 1002 career kills, and could break Jill Halsted's career kill record of 1350 this season.

**Contenders for a Starting Spot** -- Although Miller and Gonzalez are assured starting positions in this year's lineup, the remaining four spots are up for grabs, as 10 players are capable of starting. "It presents us with a pleasant problem," says Schleuder. "There will be competition for spots on the starting lineup. The pre-season will be important for us to get settled."

Senior Karyn Daline, a starter for the last three years, continued to play consistently at all positions in 1985. A 5-9 outside hitter, Daline led the team in digs for the second season and set a new single-season record in fewest service errors with only 11 errors in 491 total attempts.

Senior Julie Binder and junior Patty Ryan may also earn starting spots this year after splitting court play for much of the 1985 season. A 5-7 hitter, Binder missed the last two months of the 1984 season after reconstructive knee surgery, and was a defensive player in 1985. She had the top service ace average on the team last year -- .49 per game. The 5-9 Ryan is a versatile player who could also start at outside hitter. She can hit from the right or left side and is a strong blocker.

## Minnesota Volleyball Outlook 2-2-2

**Reserves Add Depth --** Rochele Goetz, a 5-9 junior hitter, may also see more court time this year after showing great improvement in 1985, and starting in several matches. Two walk-ons who saw limited playing time in 1985, Shaleen Hipschen and Dawn Rasmussen, may play more in 1986. A 5-7 sophomore, Hipschen is a strong defensive player and server, and the 5-10 Rasmussen gained confidence and experience as a front-row substitute.

**Setters --** The Gophers' return two experienced setters in 5-9 senior Jennie Collings and 5-4 junior Missy Larson. Schleuder prefers staying with a 5-1 offensive pattern, but she may utilize a 6-2 offense if the setters establish themselves.

Collings led the team with 960 assists (7.87 per game) in 1985, and Schleuder says that she gained more confidence and control in her setting. "Jennie's leadership has also improved. She knows the hitters better, and she knows what type of set is best for them," Schleuder says.

Larson is a sparkplug defensive player who can change the tempo of a match. In 1985 she averaged 2.50 assists per game, including a career-high 37 assists in a come-from-behind win over Indiana. Larson saw increased playing time as a sophomore, as she played in all 34 matches as a setter or defensive specialist.

**Newcomers --** Schleuder rates her four recruits as talented and dominating players who are all capable of starting. The 1986 recruiting class is Minnesota's largest in four years as well as the tallest class ever, as three of the four newcomers are 6-0 or more.

A leading newcomer is 6-0 middle blocker Karen Staab of Palatine, Ill. She was rated as one of the top twenty college prospects in the nation. Her collegiate debut will be slowed because of a broken leg suffered in June. She may not be ready to play until the Big Ten season begins.

Five-nine setter/hitter Sharon Oesterling from Frankfort, Ind., is a capable setter, hitter, blocker, and impact player, according to Schleuder. Two middle hitters, 6-1 Chris Schaefer of Florence, Ky., and 6-0 Lori Miller of Worth, Ill., complete the recruiting class. Both players can hit from all sides, and Schaefer could also be used as a setter. Miller is the younger sister of senior Pam Miller.

The Gophers will again have a walk-on in 6-1 sophomore middle blocker Cathy Childs. A transfer from the College of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minn., Childs may be red-shirted this year.

**The Season --** The Gophers open their season with six matches in Hawaii and competition at the 12-team Brigham Young Tournament. Returning home, Minnesota opens the Big Ten schedule by hosting Iowa on Wednesday, Sept. 24. This is the second year of double round robin competition in the Big Ten, and Schleuder predicts that Illinois will be the team to beat. The Illini placed second in the Big Ten in 1985 and return most of their team, including the 1985 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Mary Eggers, and all-conference setter Disa Johnson.

After Illinois, any one of six teams, including Minnesota, has a chance to place high. Purdue, the 1985 champion, had several key losses, including two-time Player of the Year Marianne Smith and All-Big Ten players Kim Corwin and Cheryl Flowers. Other strong teams to watch include Indiana, Ohio State, Northwestern and Iowa. Indiana returns all-conference setter Karen Dunham and adds several strong recruits. The Buckeyes lost All-Big Ten hitter Lisa Bettio but return five starters.

(WELLS NAMED ASSISTANT COACH OF PAN AMERICAN SOFTBALL TEAM)

Minneapolis, Minn. -- University of Minnesota head softball coach Linda Wells has been named the assistant coach of the United States Pan American Games softball team for 1987. Wells, 36, will join head coach Carol Spanks of Cal-Poly Pomona in selecting the Pan American Games team from 64 players who will be invited to tryouts at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, June 12-19, 1987.

The Tenth Pan American Games will be held in Indianapolis, Ind. August 7-23, 1987. Every four years, since 1951, the Pan American Games have been held in cities throughout the Western Hemisphere, traditionally in the summer preceding the Olympics. The Games have been held once before in the United States when Chicago was the site in 1959.

Wells was also recently named president of the National Softball Coaches Association for a three year term beginning in January of 1987. She previously gained international coaching experience as the assistant coach of the U.S. national team which took the gold medal at the South Pacific Classic in Melbourne, Australia in March of 1985.

At Minnesota, Wells has been the head softball coach since 1974 and has compiled a winning 283-186-1 (.610) record. She surpassed the 250 career wins mark in 1985 and her 1986 team finished as tri-champions of the Big Ten Conference with a 15-9 league and 28-23 overall record.

Minnesota placed third in the 1978 women's College World Series, the team's highest national finish ever, and Wells has coached several outstanding players. They include 1979 Pan American selections Shelly Medernach and Judy Knight, and former pro players Vicky Swanson and Mary Owen, who was 1978 Rookie of the Year in the pro league. More recently she coached two-time All-American Gretchen Larson who played for the U.S. Olympic exhibition team and national champion Raybestos Brackettes, and current team member Barb Drake who was the Big Ten's MVP in 1986 and ASA batting champion at the nationals in 1985.

Wells is probably Minnesota's most versatile coach; besides her softball career, she has also coached the Gopher basketball and volleyball teams. In five years at the helm of the volleyball team, she had a 246-95-5 record, (.718 pct.) and led the team to a seventh place finish at the 1981 AIAW national championships. Her contribution to the Minnesota volleyball program was recognized in October of 1985 when she was one of the first inductees into the Golden Spikers Minnesota Volleyball Hall of Fame.

As versatile an athlete as she is a coach, Wells graduated in 1972 from Southeast Missouri State University, where she played five varsity sports: softball, volleyball, basketball, field hockey, and tennis. She also played amateur league softball and field hockey, and signed on with the Chicago Ravens when the women's professional softball league was organized. She later moved to the St. Louis Hummers in her native Missouri, where she was a player and player-coach until the league folded in 1978.

Softball is a year-round activity for Wells; in the summer, she is the player-coach of the American Softball Association (ASA) Class AA Twin Cities T.C. Jammers (formerly known as the Sport Print "Blizzards" and Outbound Travel). This summer the team won the region and advanced to the ASA nationals, where they placed 14th. In 1985, the Blizzards won the region and finished 7th at the ASA national championships. Outbound Travel finished ninth in the nation in 1984, and 17th in 1983. She is an active supporter of fast-pitch softball in area schools, parks and clubs.

Wells is an advisor to the YWCA's sport committee, teaches physical education at the University of Minnesota, and conducts softball camps and clinics through the Wells Sports Corporation. She earned a master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Minnesota in 1984. Originally from Pacific, Mo. outside St. Louis, Wells has been involved with the women's athletic program at the University since 1972-73.

## (UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA HOSTS GOLF TOURNEY AT HAZELTINE)

The University of Minnesota golf teams will be premiering a new tournament this fall -- The University of Minnesota-Hazeltine Collegiate Invitational. The tourney will be co-ed and played at two different sites - the University's Les Bolstad Golf Course in St. Paul, and the Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska, Minn. Play will begin on Sunday, Sept. 7, at Bolstad with 36-holes played from two shotgun starts; and Hazeltine will host the final 18-holes on Monday, Sept. 8.

SIXTEEN TEAMS TO COMPETE -- The Women's and Men's Intercollegiate Athletic Departments are combining forces to bring a field of 16 teams to the tournament. Teams competing in the women's division include Iowa, Michigan, Bowling Green, Wisconsin, South Florida, Northern Iowa, Iowa State and Minnesota. The men's field includes Iowa, Wisconsin, Northern Iowa, Indiana, Bowling Green, Gustavus Adolphus, Carleton College and Minnesota.

CO-AM BENEFIT PLAY PRECEDES TOURNEY -- Another new competition, the University of Minnesota-Hazeltine Co-Am Tournament, will be played on Saturday, Sept. 6, in conjunction with the Minnesota-Hazeltine Collegiate Invitational. This is a benefit tourney for the men's and women's golf programs at the University and the Hazeltine National's Junior Golf Program.

The Co-Am will give Hazeltine members the opportunity to play in a foursome of three amateurs and the number one or two player from each of the schools playing in the Sunday-Monday tournament. The cost to each amateur is \$100.00, which includes a banquet at Hazeltine after the Co-Am. The Saturday benefit begins with a 1:30 p.m. shotgun start, with entries limited to 96 amateurs who will play with 32 collegiate athletes.

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE -- The two-day 54-hole University of Minnesota-Hazeltine Collegiate Invitational will kick-off with 36-holes at the Bolstad course on Sunday, Sept. 7, with an 8:30 a.m. shotgun start, with the afternoon round shotgunning at about 2 p.m. The final 18-holes will be played at the Hazeltine National Golf Club in Chaska on Monday, Sept. 8, with a shotgun start at 8:30 a.m.

The Radisson University Hotel, the official tournament headquarters, is hosting buffet breakfasts for the players and coaches Saturday and Sunday. Practice rounds will be at the University course on Friday and Saturday, with a practice round at Hazeltine on Saturday.

HAZELTINE NATIONALLY KNOWN -- The Hazeltine National Golf Club is not a newcomer when it comes to hosting tournaments. The 1991 U.S. Men's Open will be played on the Chaska links, which has fielded four other Opens. The 1970 U.S. Men's Open was at Hazeltine, as well as the 1966 and 1977 U.S. Women's Open and the 1983 U.S. Senior Men's Open. Hazeltine was also part of the 1980 PGA Grand Slam Of Golf.

GOPHERS BEGIN PRACTICE SEPT. 2 -- The Minnesota 10-member women's golf team starts their season with qualifying rounds on Sept. 2 at the Bolstad course. The Gopher's will hit their home course at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday and no later than 10:30 a.m. on Thursday. On Wednesday the squad will play a qualifying round at Hazeltine. Only five members of the Gopher squad can compete as a team in the tournament, with the top four scores from each round being counted toward the team total. The men's golf team has not yet started formal practices, but will hold a practice round at Bolstad on Friday, Sept. 5.

ZAHN ON HAZELTINE, THE SEASON -- "We're hoping to build the Minnesota-Hazeltine tournament into a premier event by attracting top quality teams to Minnesota to play in one invitational," says Zahn. "The co-ed format is new and refreshing, and should be a lot of fun for everyone."

This year's team consists of only returning players; all of whom are hungry to play in tournaments. "Even those who didn't travel last year have gained a lot of experience," says the coach, winner of the 1986 MWGA State Match Play Tournament. "It's going to be a different year than last season when the same four golfers qualified for most of the tournaments."

TOP GOPHERS -- Of the 10 returning players, three lead the pack after last school year and the recent summer season. Sophomore Kate Hughes (WOODBURY, MN) was in the top three in three tournaments last season as a freshman, and won two tournaments this summer. Hughes was second in the opener last year, the Gopher Fall Invitational (75-75-75=225) and the Beacon Woods Invitational (73-72-77=222), and was third at the Lady Badger Invitational (76-76-78=230). This summer she won both the Birchmont International in Bemidji, Minn., defeating her opponent 7 and 6, and the Piper Jaffrey Women's Open with a 36-hole 152. Hughes also finished a respectable fourth in the State Amateur with a 73-83-74=230.

Senior Dee Forsberg (FARMINGTON, MN) won her first two college tournaments last season -- the Lady Badger with a 75-75-73=223 in the fall, and the Iowa Invitational with a 71-76-76=223. This summer she finished second in the State Amateur at Bemidji's Town and Country Country Club with a 76-77-75=228.

Julie Hennessy (LEWISTON, MN), a senior, was one of two Gophers to play in every tournament last year. She won the Gopher Fall Invitational with a 75-75-75=225. This summer in the MWGA Four-Ball Tournament, Hennessy shared the winning honors with Gopher teammate Ann Meyer. A highlight of her summer came when Hennessy qualified and competed in the U.S. Amateur in Santa Cruz, Cal.

MINNESOTA LAST SEASON -- The Gophers had a good season last year, winning both the Gopher Fall and the Lady Badger Invitationals. They were second at the Iowa and third at the Lady Buckeye Invitationals. Minnesota completed the season with a second place finish at the Big Ten Golf Championship, tying the Gopher's best finish in the five official Big Ten championships.

## (VOLLEYBALL OPENS SEASON IN HAWAII, MEETS #2 RANKED TEAM)--

Minneapolis, Minn. -- The University of Minnesota women's volleyball team is making final preparations for their season opening trip to Hawaii. The team leaves on Thursday, Sept. 4, and the Gophers will open the 1986 season against Chaminade in Honolulu Sept. 8.

The team's seven game schedule includes matches against Hawaii-Pacific, Sept. 9, back-to-back matches against No. 2 ranked Hawaii Sept. 11-12, and two matches with Hawaii-Hilo, Sept. 13-14. The team will then travel to Utah for a single match with Weber State and for the 12-team Brigham Young Invitational Tournament.

"This is the toughest pre-season schedule we have played," says Gopher Head Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "It starts out tough and gets tougher throughout the week. I'm anxious to see how we stack up against those teams."

Pre-Season Rankings -- In the Midwest Volleyball Magazine pre-season poll, Minnesota is rated third in the Big Ten behind Illinois and Purdue and sixth in the Midwest Region. In the pre-season top-twenty poll by Volleyball Monthly Magazine, Hawaii is rated No. 2 behind Pacific, Brigham Young is rated ninth, Illinois is 11th, and Purdue is 17th. The first Tachikara Coaches Top Twenty pre-season poll will be released Wednesday Sept. 3.

Probable Starters for Minnesota -- A probable starting lineup for the Gophers would include 5-11 senior Pam Miller of WORTH, IL at middle hitter and younger 6-0 freshman sister Lori Miller of WORTH, IL at the other middle hitter position. Freshman Karen Staab of PALATINE, IL, a 6-0 middle hitter, has been cleared to play following a broken leg injury and June and will be available for back-row play and gradually work into the front-row to challenge Lori Miller for the other middle hitter position.

At left-side hitter 5-11 sophomore Andrea Gonzalez of BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA will see action this year after playing at middle hitter last season. The other spot will most likely still belong to 5-9 senior Karyn Daline of MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST, although Schleuder could also use 5-7 senior Julie Binder of HANOVER PARK, IL in this position.

At right-side hitter, junior Rochelle Goetz of WACONIA, MN will probably start and 6-1 freshman Chris Schaefer of FLORENCE, KY will also see some action. At setter, 5-9 senior Jennie Collings of ROCHESTER, IL and 5-9 freshman Sharon Oesterling of FRANKFORT, IN are still battling for the starting nod. Schleuder says she will plan to use 5-4 junior Missy Larson of GLEN ELLYN, IL and 5-7 sophomore Shaleen Hipschen of HOWELL, MI extensively in the back-row.

The Gopher women's golf team opened their season over the weekend with a second-place finish at the Minnesota-Hazeltine Collegiate Invitational Golf Tournament. The first two rounds of the 54-hole tournament were played Sunday at the Les Bolstad University Golf Course with the final 18 holes played Monday at Hazeltine National Golf Club.

The Gophers (314-326-336=976) led after one round, but were unable to withstand a challenge by a strong South Florida team (315-310-329=954). The Lady Bulls took over the lead with the low team round of the tournament (310) in the second round Sunday, and, with a 15-stroke lead going into the final round, could not be overtaken at the tough Hazeltine layout.

## (VOLLEYBALL OPENS HOME, BIG TEN SCHEDULE VS. IOWA & IOWA STATE)

The University of Minnesota volleyball team will open action at Williams Arena for the first time this season by hosting Iowa, Wednesday September 24 at 7:30 p.m. and Iowa State, Sunday September 28 at 2 p.m. The Gophers (6-6) hope to improve upon last year's fourth place Big Ten finish (11-7) in double round-robin league action, and so do their travel partner - Iowa. The Hawkeyes are 6-1 overall and defeated inter-state rival Iowa State at home 15-8, 15-8, 15-11 September 12.

NOTING THE HAWKEYES -- Iowa was 7-11 in league play last season, but have their sights set on the upper-division this year. The team is hitting a .230 kill pct. overall and are led by senior setter Kathy Griesheim who is averaging 9.96 assists per game and was the Big Ten's Freshman of the Year her rookie season. Leading hitters include: sophomore Cheryl Zemaitis (78 kills, .241), senior Lana Kuiper (74 kills, .257), and junior Ellen Mullarkey (73 kills, .264). Head Coach: Sandy Stewart, 5th year, 70-68. Series: Minnesota leads 21-6. Last Year: The Gophers won 3-2 at Iowa and in three straight at home.

NOTING THE CYCLONES -- Iowa State is 3-4 prior to hosting Nebraska Omaha on Tuesday and Kansas State on Friday this week. The Cyclones were 15-15 last year and placed third in the Big Eight tournament. Iowa State is hitting just .148 as a team and are led by juniors Linda Evans (49 kills, .169) and Sue Nosal (37 kills .105). Head Coach: Vicki Mealer, 2nd year, 15-15. Series: Minnesota leads 18-3. Last Year: Iowa State won 16-14, 15-2, 15-9 in Ames.

COACH SCHLEUDER'S COMMENTS -- "We went over (to Hawaii & Utah) with much higher expectations than results, but rather than worry about that we are going to focus on the Big Ten season. Iowa will be a good test for us, they are doing well and are optimistic about their season."

"Our blocking, which was our strength last year, has been inconsistent, and we haven't been putting the ball on the floor as much as we need to. We hope to be more balanced and productive with our offense."

PAM MILLER LEADS GOPHERS -- Senior captain Pam Miller (WORTH, IL) has been leading the Gophers this season and moved into second place on the career kill list last week with 1,201 kills, passing former Big Ten MVP Martie Larsen (1980-83) who had 1,154. Miller should surpass All-American Jill Halsted's record of 1,350 this year.

Miller has led the Gophers in kills in nine of 12 matches, and is hitting .290 with a 4.23 kills per game average and also leads in blocks with a 1.40 per game average. Last week, Miller hit .302 with 17 kills in the win over Weber State and also had the second best single match kill percentage of her career in the Gophers three game win over Maryland, when she hit .571 with 17 kills and just one error in 28 attempts. In the second game of that match, Miller powered the Gophers with five kills to bring them from a 6-13 deficit to 12-13 and then had the deciding 16th point in the 16-14 win on a kill.

OESTERLING SETS SCHOOL RECORD-- Freshman Sharon Oesterling (FRANKFORT, IN) has not only earned the starting setter position, but set a new school record for most assists in a match with 68 against Montana. She also had a season high 15 digs in that match. In 12 matches, Oesterling has a .357 assist percentage and is averaging 9.52 assists per game. Senior Jennie Collings (ROCHESTER, IL) has seen action in ten matches with a .404 assist percentage and 5.63 assist average. Collings held the old record for assists with 66 against Wisconsin, 10/24/84.

GONZALEZ AND OTHER GOPHERS -- Sophomore Andrea Gonzalez (BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA) has had a slower start this year, because of a sore shoulder, but still is hitting .259 and averaging 3.57 kills per game at outside hitter. Freshman Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY) came in for Gonzalez against Montana and had a team high 21 kills and hit .250 while adding 14 digs. Schaefer is hitting .228 in nine matches.

Senior Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL) had another stroke of bad luck last weekend. The 5-7 senior had earned a starting spot in the front-row as well as back-row this year after a devastating knee injury and reconstructive surgery following her sophomore year. Binder injured her hitting shoulder on Thursday, but should be back in action this week.

Junior Rochelle Goetz (WACONIA, MN) contributed to the Gophers win against Weber State. In the fifth game, she earned the 16th point on a kill in the 16-14 win and had a block assist for the 15th point. Senior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) is leading the team with a 2.54 dig average. Against Montana she had 13 kills, 20 digs, and career bests of four block solos and six total blocks.

Freshman Lori Miller (WORTH, IL) has been starting at middle hitter opposite her sister, Pam. She had one block solo and five block assists against Weber State, and a career best of 12 kills, hitting .200 against Montana. Freshman Karen Staab (PALATINE, IL) has been working into the lineup as she recovers from a broken leg suffered in June.

### (VOLLEYBALL HOSTS NO. 12 ILLINOIS/DEFENDING BIG TEN CHAMPION PURDUE)

The Gopher women's volleyball team will host their stiffest weekend of Big Ten competition as two conference powers invade Williams Arena. Illinois (ranked No. 12 nationally) leads the league with a 4-0 mark while Purdue (the defending conference winners) are 3-1 in Big Ten play. The Gophers (2-1) have something to prove if they are to contend in the conference race.

IT'S BEEN A LONG TIME since Minnesota defeated Purdue in a volleyball match -- the Boiler's hold a 13-straight match winning streak with the last Minnesota win October 27, 1978 at the Minnesota Invitational and the series stands at 19-2 in Purdue's favor. The Boilermaker's have won the Big Ten title four of the last seven years, and advanced to the NCAA second-round last season, posting a 34-4 overall and 17-1 Big Ten record.

ILLINOIS IS UP AND COMING as the volleyball power in the conference. Coach Mike Hebert was named the Coach of the Year by the Collegiate Volleyball Coaches Association following last seasons second place Big Ten finish (16-2) and NCAA appearance, (39-3 overall). The Illini lead the series 10-6 winning both matches last year -- Minnesota won the previous meeting in 1984, October 6, at Williams Arena.

NEW LINE-UP AIDS ROAD SWEEP -- Gopher Coach Stephanie Schleuder changed the team's rotation order, and the Gophers picked up back-to-back road wins over Northwestern and Wisconsin, upping their overall record to 9-7. "We are much more balanced then we have been and we showed good intensity the whole weekend," says Schleuder. "Our passing was very good and our defense is much improved. For this weekend, blocking is crucial and we have to become a little more aggressive at the net."

GONZALEZ PUTS 'EM AWAY -- Sophomore Andrea Gonzalez led the Gophers in kills in both matches last weekend. Against Northwestern she had 17 kills, hit .213 and led the team with 17 digs, and in the win over Wisconsin, Gonzalez had 19 kills and hit .421. In the three Big Ten matches she has a 4.42 kills per game average, and overall has 226 kills on the season, is hitting .267 and averaging 3.83 kills per game while leading the team in service aces (37) and digs (122).

**MILLERS' HOLD-UP THE MIDDLE** -- Senior Pam Miller and freshman Lori Miller of (WORTH, IL) have been anchoring the middle blocker positions this year. Pam is leading the team with 265 kills, and a 4.27 per game average while Lori has 67 kills and is hitting .179. Pam also leads the Gophers in blocking with a 1.35 per game average while Lori is second in blocks with a 0.98 average. Last weekend, Pam had 16 kills and six blocks against Wisconsin and 13 kills vs. Northwestern. Lori had four blocks in both matches.

**SCHAEFER HAS STRONG WEEKEND** -- Freshman Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY) was in double-figures in kills in both matches last weekend. She had 15 kills and hit .229 vs. Northwestern and had 13 kills and hit .313 at Wisconsin, while adding 12 digs. Overall, she is hitting .229 on the season with 82 kills and has won a starting position at left-side hitter.

**OTHER GOPHERS AID ATTACK** -- Freshman setter Sharon Oesterling led the team with 16 digs at Northwestern and has upped her assist average to 10.09 per game. In the three Big Ten matches, that average is 11.67. Senior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) has moved to right-side hitter and had eight kills while hitting .318 vs. Northwestern. On the year, Daline leads the team in digs with a 2.56 per game average. Freshman Karen Staab (PALATINE, IL) has been playing in the back-row for Lori Miller and had six service aces vs. Northwestern. Senior Julie Binder (HANOVER PARK, IL) has returned to action as a back-row passer and passed 71 per cent vs. Wisconsin.

**OPPONENT NOTES -- ILLINI** -- Sophomore Mary Eggers was the Big Ten's Freshman of the Year in 1985, and she is powering the team with 183 kills, a .418 kill pct., 27 service aces and 81 blocks (1.42 avg.)...two other freshmen are starting, Nancy Brookhart who has 106 kills and Bridget Boyle who has a 2.96 kill average. Junior setter Disa Johnson is averaging 11.48 assists per game. The Illini will host Loyola Tuesday before meeting the Gophers.

**BOILERMAKERS** -- Purdue had several key losses, including Big Ten MVP Marianne Smith, but this year's team is young and talented. Freshman Debbie McDonald is leading the team with 130 kills, and junior Lineda Reichl has 110. Sophomore Darcy Orin is setting with a 9.8 assists per game average. Purdue will meet Wisconsin Friday night.

They will not compete again until October 24 at the Lady Tar Heel Invitational in Chapel Hill, N.C. "This break couldn't come at a better time," said Coach Anne Zahn. **COACH ANNE ZAHN** was very pleased with the way the Gophers finished, particularly since temperatures were in the 90s all three days. "The heat really wore the players down, so our final-round score was really a good sign," she said. "It was indicative of the way we are capable of playing."

### **SWIMMING AND DIVING ALUMNI MEET FEATURES HALL OF FAME INDUCTION**

As part of Homecoming Week, the women's and men's swimming and diving teams will hold their annual Alumni Meet, Saturday, Oct. 11. Midway through the meet, Dorothy L. Sheppard will be inducted into the Minnesota Aquatic's Hall of Fame. Sheppard was a multi-sport athlete at Minnesota in the mid-1920's, earning a 'M' sweater by scoring over 1,000 points in 10 different sports.

Swimming and education have always be important to Sheppard. She established the first endowment fund for the Minnesota Women's Athletic's Department; in the future, the fund will provide 10 full scholarships to athletes in the women's swimming and diving program.

Three past members of the women's Gopher swim team have been inducted into the Hall of Fame, which was created in the fall of 1984: Mary Jablonski, Terry Ganley Nieszner and Chris Curry Gentz. Jablonski was Minnesota's first Big Ten swimming champion (1971); Nieszner was the first Gopher All-American (1974) in any sport; Gentz recieved the first women's scholarship at Minnesota based solely on athletic ability. Gentz went on to become the first national champion at Minnesota when she took the gold in three meter diving at the 1981 AIAW National Championships.

The Alumni meet will feature former Gopher greats, such as Jo Elsen (RICHFIELD, MN), Diane Wallner (ROSEVILLE, MN), Elyce Iwerks (SIOUX FALLS, SD) and Mana Raikala (KANKAANPA, FINLAND) against the current Gopher team. Most of the individual events will be 50-yard races with one exception, the 100-yard freestyle. The relays will be 200 yard events.

## MINNESOTA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL OUTLOOK 1986-87 --

Scoring points. That's the key factor for Minnesota to improve upon their ninth-place conference finish last year, and head back towards the upper-division of the league where they placed third in 1983 and 1985. Last year the team was 4-14 in the Big Ten and winless on the road all season posting a 8-20 overall mark.

Five newcomers will join Gopher coach Ellen Hanson's eight returning letterwinners, including three starters. That is the largest roster ever in her tenure at Minnesota. "I feel we have a good strong group of players, and because we have so many people we should be able to do more than one thing," says Hanson. "I want us to stay strong with rebounding, but we have to score more points."

The two losses from last year's starting lineup are honorable mention all-Big Ten pick, 6-0 forward Carol Peterka (14.3 ppg, 7.9 reb.), and 5-8 guard Lisa Hoelscher (7.4 ppg, 2.6 assists). But one thing will remain unchanged -- the Gophers will still maintain their reputation of a big front-line in 1986-87 -- anchored by returning three year starter Molly Tadich.

Despite the team's finish, the 6-2 forward/center had an outstanding season, scoring the third most points in school history (511) last year. Tadich led the Gophers with an 18.3 ppg average and 11.7 rebounding average and also led the Big Ten in rebounding (11.1) and blocked shots (1.9). She is sixth in career scoring with 1,237 points and third in career rebounding with 904 caroms, and was picked to the all-Big Ten second team both her sophomore and junior seasons.

Six-four junior center Diane Kinney returns with experience after starting in 23 of 28 games last year and averaging 9.1 ppg and 6.9 rebounds overall. But this year, she may be spelled by incoming freshmen Sue Renner (6-4), and Juanita Boehland (6-3). Renner, of Grand Rapids, Minn. was a first team all-state pick, while Boehland of Shoreview, Minn. was a second team all-state selection. Another strong returner is the scrappy 6-0 forward/center Susie Piram. The junior appeared in 27 of 28 games last year, starting at center in four games, and averaged 5.1 points and rebounds during the Big Ten schedule.

Senior 5-10 guard Cindy Phillips had the starting nod at point guard much of last year and made substantial improvements. She averaged 10.3 ppg in the Big Ten season, (8.5 ppg overall) and also averaged 4.3 assists and 1.7 steals in league play. Two other guards with playing experience return in 5-10 junior Debbie Hilmerson, and 5-7 junior Mary Jo Nowak. A newcomer at the guard slot will be 5-9 freshman Jodi Olson of Bellevue, Wash. Olson won the national AAU free throw shooting contest last summer and was an all-state pick.

There are several players Hanson will look to at the forward/guard slot, including returners 5-10 junior Beth Hufford and 6-0 sophomore Cindy Bradley. Hufford is an outside scoring threat, while Bradley should see more playing time after strengthening herself by competing on the outdoor track and field team last spring.

Newcomers at forward/guard include 5-10 freshman Jennifer Hall of Burnsville, Minn., and 5-11 forward Jackie Goulet of Midland, Mich. Hall was an all-state pick and was also selected Minnesota Player of the Year and Metro Player of the Year. Goulet was a first team all-state pick in Michigan by AP and UPI and a Miss Basketball finalist.

The Gophers will open the season with the Dial Classic at home November 28-29 meeting Northern Illinois in the first-round, while Auburn meets Clemson. The Big Ten schedule will begin on the road January 2, with the first home weekend January 16 and 18 against Purdue and Illinois.

### (VOLLEYBALL FACES ROAD WEEKEND AT MICHIGAN STATE/MICHIGAN)

The Minnesota women's volleyball team will seek to improve their Big Ten and overall record this weekend as they travel to Michigan State and Michigan Friday and Saturday. The Gophers upped their Big Ten record to 3-2 and overall mark to 10-8 over the weekend by splitting matches at home. Minnesota fell to 13th ranked and undefeated Illinois in four games, 4-15, 2-15, 15-8, 5-15 and then came out on top in a five game battle with the Boilermaker's. The Gophers 15-12, 4-15, 15-13, 0-15, 15-13 win broke a 13-match losing streak to Purdue which dated back to October of 1978.

"I'm hoping this can be a turning point in our season," says Head Coach Stephanie Schleuder. "It was a must-win match against Purdue and after losing 0-15 in the fourth game we had our backs against the wall and played very aggressively to win the fifth game. Both the Michigan and Michigan State matches concern me. We need to play with more intensity before we reach a critical situation."

MICHIGAN STATE -- The Spartan's are on the verge of an upset with a much improved team and came close to defeating Ohio State last weekend, losing 15-13, 16-18, 15-12, 14-16, 6-15 at Columbus. Overall the team is 7-9, with four five-game match losses, and 1-4 in league play. Junior Shantelle Schmidt leads the team with 228 kills, a .332 pct. and 3.7 game average, while junior Pam Wischmeyer has 187 kills, is hitting .265, with a 3.1 average. The setter is freshman Judy Doles who is averaging 9.24 assists per game. SERIES -- The Gophers lead 8-3 and have won the past four meetings with the last Spartan win October 19, 1984 at E. Lansing in three games.

MICHIGAN SEEKS FIRST WIN -- The Wolverine's are 0-5 in the Big Ten and 8-8 overall prior to hosting Iowa on Friday night. First year coach Joyce Davis is trying to improve upon last year's 18-18 overall and 6-12 (8th) Big Ten records. The teams' leading hitters are junior Heather Olsen who has 173 kills and a 2.7 game average, and sophomore Marie-Ann Davidson who has 151 kills for a 2.3 per game average. Setter Lisa Vahi, a junior, is averaging 8.4 assists per game. SERIES -- Minnesota leads 12-0.

Gonzalez also had 18 digs against the Boilermakers. "Andrea really came on at the end of the Purdue match," says Coach Schleuder.

Freshman Chris Schaefer (FLORENCE, KY) had another good match against Illinois. She had a career best kill pct. of .333 with 12 kills, 3 errors, in 27 attempts and led the team with 11 digs. Freshman Karen Staab (PALATINE, IL) has shown "steady improvement" according to Schleuder. Against Purdue, she had two block solos and three assists, while contributing 16 digs.

Senior Karyn Daline (MINNEAPOLIS/SOUTHWEST) had "played very well" according to Schleuder. Daline came on in the Purdue match, hitting .391 with 11 kills, 2 errors and 23 attempts, and led the team with 20 digs. Daline has 930 kills in her career and should pass 1,000 this season.

The Golden Spikers initiated three new members into Minnesota's volleyball hall of fame on Saturday, Oct. 11, before the Minnesota-Purdue match. Middle hitter Jill Halsted played from 1979-1982 and was named an NCAA Honorable Mention All-American in 1982 and an AIAW All-American in 1981. Gopher softball coach Linda Wells coached the volleyball team for six years, in 1974 and 1977-1981, compiled a 246-95-5 (.718) record, and led the team to a 7th place finish at the AIAW National Championship in 1981.

**Michele Hank Brekke:** Brekke was a part of the team's early development. A setter/hitter during the 1973 and 1974 seasons, Brekke ran the squad's 5-1 offense and led the Gophers to two AIAW National Championship berths. A native of Rochester, N.Y., Brekke has distinguished herself professionally as a member of the NASA space shuttle program at the Johnson Space Center in Houston. After earning bachelor's and master's degrees in aeronautical engineering from Minnesota, Brekke worked as a flight instructor in the astronaut program and later as a payload officer in mission control. She presently is a flight director in the shuttle program and works in mission control in the planning and directing of shuttle missions.

**Patti Hagemeyer:** Hagemeyer's dedication and devotion to volleyball helped the program gain respect and status at Minnesota and in the nation. A middle hitter from 1976-79, Hagemeyer's name dots the Gopher record books, including the season record for most matches played with 71 in 1978. Also in 1978, she led the team to their first Big Ten championship based on tournament play and was named the Gopher MVP. In her career, Hagemeyer had 464 kills and 1,706 attack attempts, both among the tops in Gopher history. In addition, she had only 262 hitting errors in her career -- the fewest in school history.

A graduate of St. Paul Highland Park High School, Hagemeyer was named the department's Senior Athlete of the Year in 1980. She currently serves as the assistant volleyball coach at Notre Dame and has also coached at Florida State and the University of Washington.

**Deb Bell Hegerle:** Hegerle competed from 1979-1981 as a left-side hitter. Her three-year career statistics are impressive: she currently ranks fourth on the all-time Gopher career kill list with 1,045 kills, third in career service attempts with 1,612 total attempts, and she holds the longest successful service streak with 85 consecutive matches without a service error.

As a senior in 1981, Bell led the team to a 7th place finish at the AIAW National Championship and compiled a team-leading 447 kills. Hegerle is a native of Brooklyn Park and a graduate of Osseo High School. She currently lives outside Lino Lakes where she and her husband board horses.
