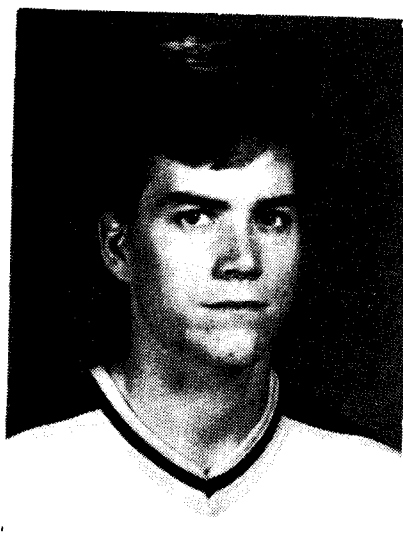
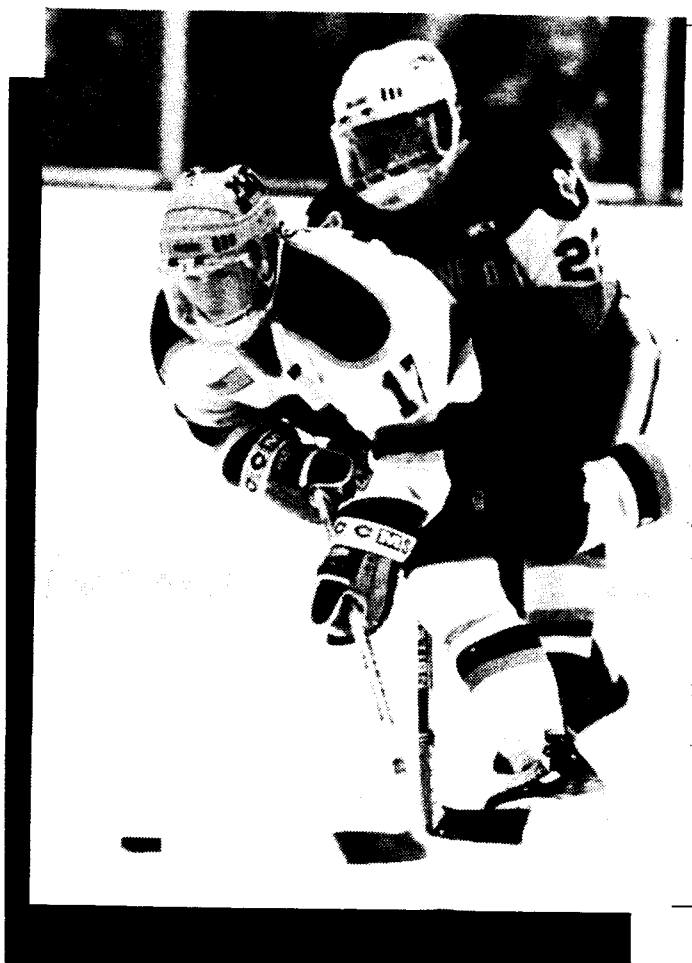

1991-92 hockey outlook

The University of Minnesota hockey team will attack the 1991-92 hockey season at "Full Strength." Leading the assault for the Gophers will be All-American and Hobey Baker Award candidate Larry Olinb, who led the Gophers in scoring last season with 19 goals and 38 assists en route to team MVP honors and second team All-WCHA honors as the Gophers first line center. "Larry is a very skilled player who has the ability to make other players around him play better," said Head Coach Doug Woog. "He will be our team captain and leader of our power play and he will be counted on to score goals. In addition, we need him working to help bring the other players' games to a higher level through his playmaking skills and overall leadership on the ice."

The first order of business for the Golden Gophers is replacing the lost firepower from last season's WCHA runnerup team which finished the season 30-10-5. The burden of replacing those scoring numbers will not rest solely on Olinb's shoulders. A contingent of eight letterwinning forwards return for the 1991-92 season, including alternate captain and junior wing Trent Klatt, who returns after ranking third on the Gophers scoring chart last season. The 6-1, 205-pound right wing is a punishing player who has the size and strength to muscle for the puck in the corners and in front of the net, while possessing the speed and stick skills necessary for the finesse game as well. An Olympic Trials finalist, he will look to improve on his numbers of 16 goals and 26 assists from a year ago. Sophomore center Craig Johnson will bring his blazing speed and smooth moves back to the Mariucci ice after a successful Olympic camp that left him as a prime candidate for the 1994 squad. Johnson posted 13 goals and 18 assists in 33 games last season for the Gophers, earning a spot on the All-WCHA freshmen team.

The Gophers offense will be a mixture of size and speed with nine forwards being over six feet tall and averaging close to 200 pounds. In the speed department the Gophers will have Klatt and Johnson and will be strengthened by the return of a healthy Cory Laylin. The senior left wing from St. Cloud, MN was hampered by injuries during part of the 1990-91 season and looks to go out in style during his final year wearing the Maroon and Gold. The Grand Rapids connection of junior John Brill and sophomore Jeff Nielsen will add tremendous team speed and size to the Gophers and their outstanding play on the specialty teams will be counted on. Offensively, both players are looking to improve on their scoring numbers of a year ago. Joe Dziedzic will be the biggest player for the Gophers at 6-3, 225 pounds. The sophomore wing is anticipated to be an impact player in both zones for the Gophers. He is coming off a great summer and is expected to develop into a fine goal scorer. Other forwards who will add depth and compete for ice time are; senior center Nick Gerebi, sophomore wing Todd Westlund and sophomore wing Scott Bell who may also see some action at defense.

Veteran players are not the only source of scoring punch for coach Woog. A highly regarded group of freshmen will skate onto the ice in September and stake their claim at some of the forward positions. That freshmen group is led by Darby Hendrickson from Richfield High School. He had an excellent senior season, leading the Spartans to the state tournament while garnering the Metro Player of the Year award and Minnesota's Mr. Hockey award. The 6-1, 185-pound center is a highly developed player for his age who was chosen to participate in the 1992 U.S. Olympic Trials camp where he surprised many with his ability to play at that high octane level of competition. Alongside Hendrickson at the St. Cloud camp was Steve Magnusson of Anoka. A multi-sport athlete in high school, he had an impressive showing at the Olympic camp with a goal and two assists while consistently being in good scoring position. The Gophers freshmen corps will be further solidified by three other outstanding forward prospects in Brandon Steege, Justin McHugh

and Jed Fiebelkorn. Steege was a linemate of Hendrickson's at Richfield, while McHugh was a prolific scorer for the Minnetonka Skippers program and a teammate of fellow freshman goalie recruit Jeff Callinan. Fiebelkorn comes from a family of fine athletes and his 6-4, 210-pound frame will add to the stable of big strong forwards Woog has assembled.

The key to any championship caliber hockey team starts right between the goalposts and the 1991-92 edition of Minnesota hockey will have as fine a goaltending tandem as the school has ever seen. The Gophers will be led by senior Jeff Stolp (30-11-6, 3.34GAA) who led the WCHA in goals against average and save percentage last season posting an 18-8-3 overall record and a 2.78 GAA with a save percentage of .894%. This fine product of the Greenway/Coleraine program rebounded from a tough sophomore season to become the backbone of the Gophers success last season. He will be looking to improve on last season during his final collegiate campaign and is a top candidate for post-season honors. Junior Tom Newman (31-15-4, 3.71) will battle Stolp for the top position. A fine all-around athlete from the Blaine program and a two-year letterman, he gives the Gophers the best one-two punch in the nets in the WCHA. The future of Gopher goaltending was bolstered as well this season by the addition of Jeff Callinan. The talented product of Minnetonka has been involved with the USA Hockey program and is a fine addition to the squad.

The goaltending duties for this year's team will rest in veteran hands, while this year's blueline corps is also expected to be one of the Gophers best ever. The Gophers return five lettermen at the defense position, and have added a talented redshirt player, and a letterwinning forward who played the position in high school. The group is anchored by a threesome of two-time letterwinners starting with Doug Zmolek, a number one draft choice of the North Stars whose rights have been obtained by the San Jose Sharks. An Olympic Trials finalist, Zmolek is a solid two-way player who will serve as an alternate captain for the Gophers this year. Fifth-year senior Sean Fabian will provide much of the team's muscle in its own end while looking to finish his college career with a strong season. Travis Richards is the third member of that group, and was one of the Gopher Olympic Trials camp players as well. Richards turned in a strong Olympic camp with his dramatic rushes up the ice and his consistently strong defensive play against the best in the land and the Gophers look for that success to carry on into the 1991-92 season. The blueline corps will be further augmented by the return of sophomore Chris McAlpine, an All-WCHA freshman team choice who impressed everyone with his strong physical play and winning attitude. Sophomore Eric Means will return to the team after sitting out as a redshirt for a year. He is expected to contribute on a regular shift and on the power play unit this year. In addition, sophomore letterwinner Scott Bell may see some action at his old high school position of defense depending on the team's needs, and incoming freshman John O'Connell from Apple Valley will add some new talent and depth to the position.

The 1991-92 Gopher hockey schedule is one of the toughest ever, with the team playing as many as 15 games against teams who qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 1990-91. Coach Woog feels pretty good about the team's chances though. "We face another tough schedule, full of challenges," Woog said. "However, this year's squad has the versatile quality performers capable of producing a fun packed winning season." The Gophers team will return all of its weapons for this grueling test and like all the Gopher teams of the past it will offer exciting, fast, physical hockey as they enter the 1991-92 season operating at "Full Strength."

A former Golden Gopher All-American center iceman, Doug Woog returned to his alma mater to take over a hockey program with a long history of success. Since being named head coach at the University of Minnesota on June 12, 1985, Woog has written several new chapters in this success story.

Woog has led the Gophers to six consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament and NCAA Final Four appearances in four of the last six years. Woog's teams have finished first or second in the WCHA all six years. The squad won back-to-back WCHA league titles in 1987-88 and 1988-89. Minnesota, one of only two schools to repeat as WCHA champion, also won back-to-back titles in 1952-53 and 1953-54.

In Woog's six years at Minnesota, the Golden Gophers have recorded a 195-74-11 record, giving Woog the highest winning average, .716, of any collegiate coach in the country.

Woog is a 1962 graduate of South St. Paul (Minn.) High School, where he garnered all-state honors for three consecutive years. He then accepted a scholarship to attend the University of Minnesota and play under Head Coach John Mariucci. Woog had a stellar collegiate career at the U of M and was named to the All-American team his junior year when he led the team in scoring. He returned for his senior season to captain the squad to a 16-12-0 record and was named the team's MVP.

After graduating from Minnesota with honors in 1967 with a B.S. degree in Education, he went on to play for the 1967 U.S. National team and was a candidate for the 1968 Olympic team. After failing to make the '68 Olympic squad, he decided to pursue a career in education.

He began his teaching and coaching career at Hopkins West Junior High School in 1968. While there, he taught geography and coached football and hockey. In the fall of 1968 he took a job at his high school alma mater, South St. Paul, where he became head soccer coach, and an assistant in hockey and baseball. Under his tenure there his soccer program won six conference championships and was runnerup for the state title twice.

In 1971 his coaching career branched out to Junior Hockey when he took a position with the St. Paul Vulcans. From 1971 through 1977 he coached the Vulcans and the Minnesota Junior Stars, where he won two U.S. Junior National titles. In 1978 he was chosen as the coach of the West Team in the U.S. Olympic Festival in Colorado Springs, CO, where his squad won the Gold Medal. In addition, he coached in the 1989 Olympic Festival, in Oklahoma City, when his team again won the Gold Medal.

In 1978 he returned to South St. Paul to take over the head hockey coaching position. From 1978 through 1985, with a 1984 leave of absence to be an assistant for the '84 Olympic team, his Packer teams won two conference titles and advanced to the state tournament four times.

Coach Woog has been involved with amateur hockey at all levels. He has been a national committee member for AHAUS. He was chairman of the National Skating Committee for USA Hockey. He was the Head Coach of the U.S. National Junior team in 1985, and the U.S. Select 17 team in 1989 that toured Czechoslovakia..

Woog is an active member of the community. He is a member of the St. Paul Chamber of Commerce. He has been the chairperson for the Wakota Arena Board for the South St. Paul area. He is a past president of the South St. Paul Coaches Association. He has been instrumental in initiating and maintaining youth athletic organizations in his community. In 1973 he earned his Master's Degree in Guidance and Counseling from the College of St. Thomas.

He and his wife Janice reside in South St. Paul. They are the proud parents of three children who are all in college, their daughter Amy, 23, and their two sons, Steve, 20, and Dan, 19.

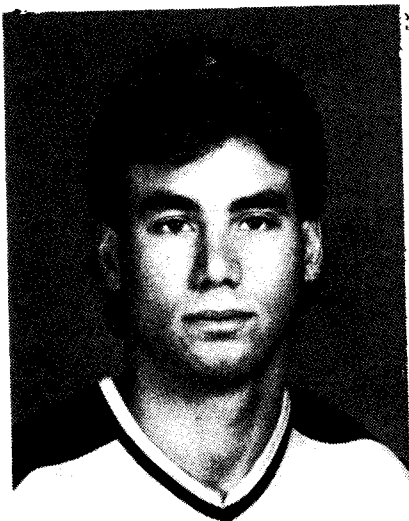
