Lodging Industry (0:25)

Minnesota's industry catering to tourists and other travelers is in a state of dynamic change. New forms appear as those suited to travel of earlier years suffer obsolescence and attrition.

University of Minnesota Agricultural Extension Service community resource development specialists say 72 percent of Minnesota hotels in 1970 were 40 or more years old. Sixty-two percent of the state's present motels were constructed from 1945 to 1959 when travel shifted from railroads to freeways and airways.

Humidity Levels (0:20)

Relative humidity --both too little of it and too much of it-- can cause serious problems in the home. University of Minnesota Extension Specialist Lewis Hendricks says the safest and most comfortable level of humidity is between 25 and 35 percent when the outside temperature is 20 degrees.
