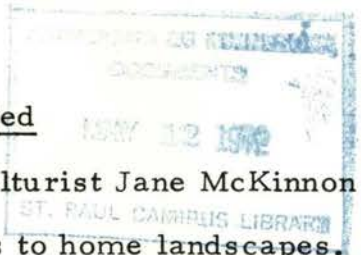

Juneberries Recommended

University Horticulturist Jane McKinnon says Juneberries are very useful additions to home landscapes.

These shrubs open white, lacy blossoms in late April and early May. Juneberries will grow in the light shade of other trees as well as in full sunlight. They do well in soils too sandy for more demanding plants.

Plant Cauliflower, Broccoli In Fall

Cauliflower and broccoli generally do better as a fall crop than an early crop in Minnesota.

University Horticulturist Orrin Turnquist says hot weather during late development often results in poor quality when cauliflower and broccoli are planted early.

Plan Your Vegetable Garden

(0:30)

Try locating related vegetable crops in areas of your garden where they were not grown last year.

Rotate the crops within the garden space every three or four years to prevent buildup of disease problems. Draw the plan to scale and show the arrangement of crops, length of rows, spacing between rows and dates of planting for each vegetable variety.
