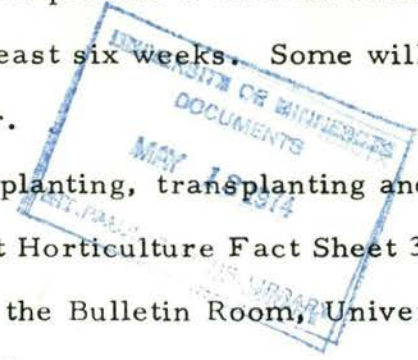

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Warm Season Crops

Wait until mid-May before seeding warm season crops such as beans, sweet corn, cucumber, squash, pumpkin and melons.

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Setting Out Tomatoes

University of Minnesota horticulturist Orrin Turnquist reminds gardeners to wait until Memorial Day before setting out tomato or pepper plants. Usually soil and air temperatures are unfavorable before the end of May. Also, there is a risk of frost until Memorial Day
