Tomato Leaf Spot

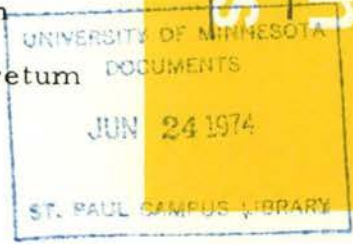
