#### LEGISLATIVE BUILDING REQUESTS

Dean Rodney A. Briggs, University of Minnesota, Morris and Dean Sherwood O. Berg, Institute of Agriculture reviewed the Ten-Year Building Program for the University of Minnesota, Morris and the West Central School and Station.

Voted, on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, and the President, to approve the planning of physical facilities on the Morris Campus to accommodate 2,000 students. Voted further to approve the principle of 25% equity funding of dormitory construction on the Morris Campus.

Voted, on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, and the President, to approve the presentation of the above ten-year building programs to the Legislative Building Commission. Detail filed supplement to the minutes, page 18,645.

Professor William F. Hueg, Jr., Assistant Director, Agricultural Experiment Station, reviewed the Ten-Year Program for the Southwest Experiment Station, Lamberton.

Voted, on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, and the President, to approve the presentation of the above plans to the Legislative Building Commission.

#### GIFT FROM ALICE TWEED TUOHY

Voted, on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, and the President, to accept a gift of \$10,000 from Mrs. Alice Tweed Tuohy toward the construction of the addition to the Tweed Gallery, Duluth. This gift is in the form of a cancellation of the University's promissory note dated December 13, 1963 and payable December 13, 1966.

The President reported for the information of the Board, the completion of cataloguing of a significant addition to the Kerlan Collection in the University Library which was received from the estate of the late Dr. Irvin Kerlan.

#### GIFT FROM MacPHAIL COLLEGE OF MUSIC

The President introduced Mr. William G. MacPhail and Mr. Vern Moss of the MacPhail College of Music and reported the receipt of the following formal communication from Mr. Mac-

Dear President Wilson:

In recognition of the mutual interest of the University of Minnesota, and the MacPhail College of Music in developing music education of the highest quality in the State of Minnesota, the Board of Trustees of the MacPhail College of Music have adopted the following Resolutions:

"IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of MacPhail College of Music, Inc., that the college itself, its School of Music, its name, its real and personal properties located at 1128 LaSalle Avenue and 52 So. 12th Street, Minneapolis, Minnesota, its good will, its reputation, traditions and sixty years of musical heritage be presented and entrusted to the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota to the end that the cultural development of the City of Minneapolis and State of Minnesota may be enhanced."

This gift is undertaken with the desire that the Regents of the University of Minnesota assume all rights to use or dispose of the properties given in whatever manner they deem most appropriate to the purposes of the University and is also undertaken in recognition of the Memorandum of Understanding between the University of Minnesota and the MacPhail College of Music developed in two years of discussion between representatives of these institutions, and attached to this letter. If accepted, the gift would become effective on July 1, 1966, and the MacPhail College of Music would cease to exist as a corporate enterprise offering music instruction and degree programs after September 1, 1966. The functions and activities now being carried on by the MacPhail School Division will continue initially under the same faculty at the same location.

The gift of land, buildings, and other property here offered is as follows:

"The names of MacPhail School of Music and of MacPhail College of Music.

The real properties, land, buildings and parking areas located at 1128 LaSalle Avenue and 52 So. 12th Street in the City of Minneapolis.

The inventory of organs, pianos and other musical instruments.

The traditions and functions of MacPhail."

It is our hope that this gift can be accepted, and that the benefits to music and music education which we expect to flow from the gift will be fully realized in the years ahead.

operation will be made in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding between the University of Minnesota and the MacPhail School and College of Music, filed supplement to the minutes, page 18,647.

#### MINNESOTA JUNIOR COLLEGE BOARD

Voted, on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, and the President, to authorize the appropriate administrative officers to negotiate and execute a lease agreement with the Minnesota Junior College Board covering the use by the Itasca Junior College of facilities and land on the campus of the North Central School and Experiment Station, Grand Rapids for a period of seventy-five years.

#### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS—MEDICAL SCIENCES

Voted, at the request of the faculty of the College of Medical Sciences and the Dean of the College and on the recommendation of the Vice President, Business Administration, the Vice President, Academic Administration, and the President, to approve the Constitution and By-Laws of the College of Medical Sciences with the understanding that the methods of liaison between the College and groups outside the University should be incorporated in an amendment to these documents either separately or as a part of the By-Laws, Article III, Section C2, Educational Policy Committee and with the further understanding that the By-Laws, Article III, Section E, Advisory Council and subsequent references would be changed to read "Faculty Advisory Council" for purposes of clarity. Constitution and By-Laws filed supplement to the minutes, page 18,648.

Voted further to amend the wording in the Statement of Policy and Implementing Resolution Concerning Private Consultation Practice in the College of Medical Sciences adopted on June 15, 1963 and September 20, 1963 to be in harmony with the wording of the above Constitution and By-Laws as follows:

1. The penultimate sentence in the final paragraph of the Statement of Policy should read, "Expenditures from accounts established for the support of college-wide activities will be administered by the dean with the advice of the Committee on Private Practice Activity."
2. The second sentence of paragraph 4 of the Implementing Resolution should read: "Four additional members of the faculty of clinical departments shall be elected by the vote of the Executive Faculty of the clinical departments of the Medical School."



## CONSTITUTION—COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

Voted, at the request of the faculty of the College of Liberal Arts and the Dean of the College and on the recommendation of the Vice President, Academic Administration, and the President, to approve the Constitution of the College of Liberal Arts with the understanding that the Dean of the College will submit a statement of the purpose or mission of the College to the Board at a subsequent meeting. Constitution filed supplement to the minutes, page 18,649.

## EMPLOYEES UNION

The Vice President, Business Administration, reported the receipt of a summons and complaint filed in District Court against the Regents by the University of Minnesota Employees Union, an unincorporated labor association, Alois Klick and Ernest Degraff as Plaintiffs.

Regent Mayo, Chairman of the Labor Committee reported that the Labor Committee and Regent Montague had considered the above matter at a meeting of the committee held on March 10, 1966. At the request of the chairman, Regent Montague made the following statement:

"Members of the Board have been furnished copies of the Summons and Complaint in the recent action by the University of Minnesota Employees Union and certain individual employees against the Regents in connection with the life insurance, hospital and medical benefits problem.

At the last Session of the Legislature, the University representatives strongly urged that the Legislature include University employees and make suitable provision for carrying out this plan. The Bills in both the House and the Senate, as introduced, specifically excluded all employees of the University nor were they included in the Bill as passed. The language of the Act makes clear that it is applicable only to "Regular Employees in the Classified Service of the State Civil Service and Paid on the State Payroll." The title to the Act is similarly limited. It is therefore clear that the Legislature did not intend to include and did not include University employees in the Act. I am sure that at the next Session of the Legislature we will review our efforts to have the University employees included in the State plan.

Even the provision in the Act for permitting the Administrative Board to include additional members clearly contemplates that this be done without expense to the State, that is, at the expense of the additional employees included.

The employees in this case, however, attempt to secure judgment of the court that the University must install this service despite the refusal of the Legislature to include the University.

I think it advisable that the University employ counsel to defend this case. I also think there may be some questions that may arise that would require consideration by a special committee. I therefore move that the Administration be authorized to employ special counsel to appear for the University in the case. I further move that an *ad hoc* committee be appointed by the Chairman to keep in touch with the counsel thus employed and with power to act for the Board."

Voted, on the recommendation of the Labor Committee and Regent Montague, to authorize the appropriate administrative officers to retain special counsel to appear for the University in the above case. Voted further to instruct the Chairman to appoint an *ad hoc* committee to keep in touch with the counsel retained with the understanding that the committee will have the power to act for the Board in this matter.

The Chairman appointed the following to serve on the *ad hoc* committee concerning the legal action brought by the University of Minnesota Employees Union: Regents Gainey, Hartl, Hess, Hughes, Mayo, Montague, and Silha.
