PHYSICAL PLANT COMMITTEE
MINUTES

December 7, 1961

A meeting of the Physical Plant Committee was held in the office of the Vice President, Business Administration, commencing at the hour of two o'clock, December 7, 1961. Those in attendance included: Regent Skyberg, Chairman; Regents Hess and Howard. Also present were Messrs. Lunden and Lund.

The Regents viewed the site of the Pillsbury Mansion and also looked at that portion of the block not yet owned by the Regents.

Following this tour, the Committee reconvened to give consideration to the matter before them which was the disposition of the structures presently on the site owned by the Regents as well as consideration of possible ultimate uses. The members of the Committee reviewed a copy of a memorandum written on November 27, 1961, which set forth proposals for use that had been considered previously and several other considerations that would necessarily be involved in determining an ultimate use. This memorandum is filed supplement to the minutes, page 14,215-A.

In view of the annual outlay required for minimum maintenance and protection, the Committee felt that the razing of the buildings would be in the best interests of economy. Accordingly, Regent Howard moved, with Regent Hess seconding, that authority be given administration to raze the residence and appurtenant garage, but this to be accomplished only after consultation with representatives of Southeast Minneapolis Planning and Coordinating Committee and University District Improvement Association. This motion was unanimously adopted.

Discussion took place at some length on the conclusion of the administrative group that had agreed upon the use of the site for junior faculty housing. However, there was consensus that there were many other possible uses, each of which should be explored and considered at a later time. In connection with the report to which reference has previously been made, the other uses are:

- (a) It might be used as a Pan Hellenic Court for sororities. FHA financing is a possibility if the University exercises control as they

do with residence halls. (The fraternity groups were not enthusiastic about this prospect.) As an alternative, the University might simply lease the land for private development by sororities. It was thought that the value of the cleared site would be about \$200,000 or \$25,000 per lot for 8 houses.

- (b) The site might be developed for faculty housing for junior staff members or teaching assistants for relatively short-term occupancy, perhaps two to five years.
- (c) It is a possible site for University residence halls.
- (d) It might be considered for married student housing.

The meeting adjourned at 4 o'clock p.m.
