## THROUGH THE YEARS

As each succeeding year has passed into history, it has taken with it the milestones that have marked the path of the department of Mortuary Science. For your information and to mark the Fiftieth Anniversary of the founding of the Department of Mortuary Science, the following chronological data is presented.

1908 The first recorded mention in the Board of Regents proceedings:

March 4, 1908—"The question of a School of Embalming in the Medical College was presented. The matter was referred to Dean Wesbrook to make arrangements for this work at no expense to the University."

From the Board of Regents, Executive Committee minutes of August 21, 1908—  
"Report of Dr. Wesbrook, on School for Embalming was read, accepted and ordered on file.

Tuition received	16 students at \$45	\$720.00
Total expenditures		650.45

Balance in University treasury \$ 69.55"

From the Board of Regents Minutes of December 29, 1908 (page 3)

"Voted that the School of Embalming be continued the coming year, under the same arrangements as last year."

1914 The description of the school was first included in the Medical School bulletin:

"At the instance of the State Undertaker's Association, a School of Embalming has been organized and is conducted for a period of six weeks, commencing January 4, 1915. It is under the direction of the Administration Board of the Medical School.

Didactic and laboratory instruction is given in anatomy, bacteriology, chemistry, public health and sanitation, in autopsies, and in professional embalming, and in funeral management. Certificates are issued to candidates successfully completing the course.

Circulars of information will be sent upon application."

1920 The University administration began to consider the advisability of shifting the administrative responsibility for the curriculum in embalming to another college. Both the Medical School bulletin and the General Extension Division Bulletin carried course descriptions for the 1920-1921 academic year.

From the Medical School bulletin:

"A course in Embalming is conducted for a period of 12 weeks, commencing about January 1 each year. Certificates are issued to candidates successfully completing the course, and are accepted for State license by the State Board of Health.

Circular of information will be sent upon request."

From the General Extension Division bulletin:

"The Short Course in Embalming, offered by the General Extension Division with the cooperation of the Medical School, the school of Chemistry, and the State Board of Health, is a three month course of study, given annually. On the successful completion of the work a certificate is granted which is accepted by the State Board of Health in lieu of examination for an embalmers license."

Curriculum extended to twelve weeks.

1922 The General Extension Division assumed the responsibility for all instruction in the Embalming Curriculum. It is interesting to note that all announcements indicated that the General Extension Division was assuming the responsibility on

behalf of the Medical School until 1928 when the announcements indicated that it was now a curriculum of its own standing offered by the General Extension Division with the cooperation of the Medical School.

1925 With the increasing interest of the Minnesota Funeral Directors Association in the curriculum at the University, their Educational Committee through the person of Mr. R. P. Lee was influential in adding such practical subjects to the curriculum as: Funeral Directing, Woods and Metals used in Casket and Vault Construction, Embalming History, Psychology of Grief, Fine Arts, Accounting and English.

1927 The first of four successive Institutes on Embalming were held. These were co-sponsored by the Minnesota Funeral Directors Association. They commanded national attention and registration at each of the Institutes exceeded 300 participants.

1927 Accreditation at a national level was becoming of increasing interest to the profession. A "political move" was started by a group of persons, interested in personal gain, designed to exclude all schools of embalming which were a part of public tax-supported colleges or universities. Dr. Lotus D. Coffman, then University president, Dr. Charles Erdmann and Mr. Reuel P. Lee cooperated in the drafting of a resolution to be presented at a national meeting called for the purpose of establishing accreditation rules and regulations. Dr. Coffman supported the university administration point of view, Dr. Erdmann brought a vast amount of experience to the group due to his extensive activities in the field of Medical School accreditation and Mr. Lee was representing the profession.

Their resolution and persuasive arguments were instrumental in establishing the first national accreditation procedure and the current method and standards are an outgrowth of their early interest and contributions.

1928 Curriculum extended to twenty-four weeks.

1932 Curriculum extended to thirty-two weeks.

1937 A Funeral Directing licensing law was passed by the Minnesota legislature and this action brought about the necessity of expanding the Department curriculum to include funeral directing subjects and material.

1939 Mr. F. Lloyd Hansen was appointed to the department staff as the first full-time staff member. In his first year of staff duty he served as consultant to Dr. Price and began the formulation of a more formal curriculum.

1946 Mr. T. F. Saholt became second full-time staff member to be appointed.

1947 Mr. Hansen was appointed the first full-time Director of the Course in Applied Mortuary Science.

Mr. Robert C. Slater joined the department as administrative assistant to the Director.

1948 The University sought and applied for national accreditation from the Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States, Inc. Such accreditation was granted and has been in continuous effect since that date.

1951 From the Board of Regents Minutes for April 13, 1951 (page 1059)

"Voted to approve revision of the Applied Mortuary Science Curriculum in the General Extension Division to a two-year basis and to authorize the granting of the appropriate degree of Associate in Mortuary Science (recommendation filed supplement to the minutes, page 5950) both with understanding that the changes involved shall constitute no additional claim upon the support funds of the University."

Curriculum integrated to include two academic years of study.

1953 On June 13, 1953, the following students received at the June Commencement of the University of Minnesota the first Associate in Mortuary Science degrees to be awarded: David Boldt, James Kluegel, Thomas Markovich, Gerald Mishler, Donald Peterson, Dale Stroud, Charles Wenner, George R. Werness, and Eugene P. Willwerscheid, Jr.

1955 From the Board of Regents Minutes, July 8, 1955 (page 97)

"Voted, upon recommendation of a special committee by the Vice President, Academic Administration, and with the approval of the President, to authorize a change in the curriculum of the Course in Mortuary Science, General Extension Division, from the present two-year basis to a three-year basis, effective 1955-1956, thus bringing the program into conformity with legislation enacted by the 1955 Minnesota Legislature."

This created a three year integrated curriculum.

At this time official designation was changed to Department of Mortuary Science.

1957 Robert C. Slater was appointed Director of the Department.

1958 The department enters its fifty-first year of service to the University, the state, the nation and its Profession at all levels.

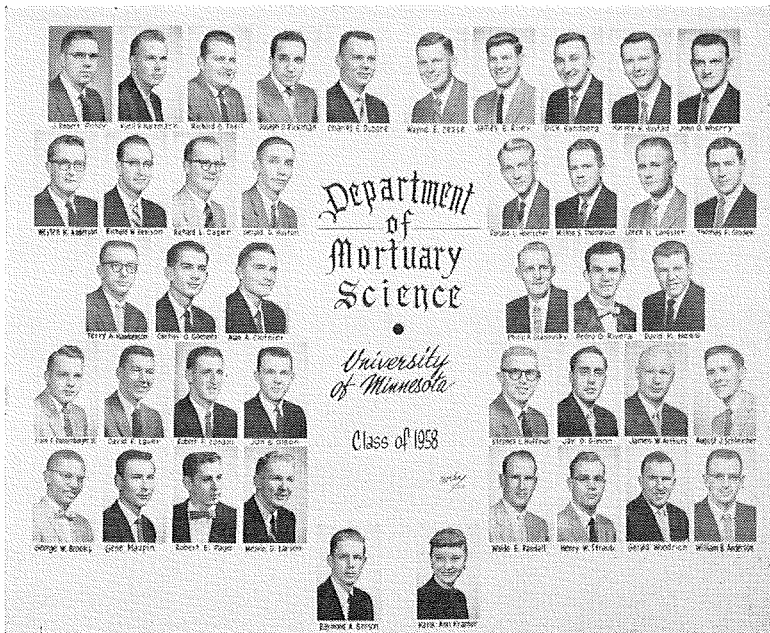

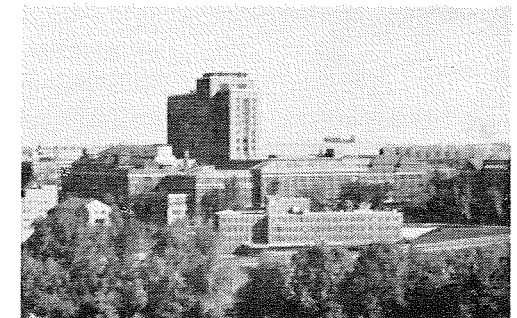
