A meeting of the Budget Committee was held in the Regents' Room on Friday, June 13, 1941, at two-thirty o'clock.

Voted to recommend approval of the report of the University Committee on Fees recommending a general increase in tuition.

Voted on recommendation of the President to recommend approval of the following lists of budget adjustments and inclusion of these adjustments in the budget for 1941-42. Voted further to recommend approval of the budget for 1941-42 as recommended and presented by the President, with the understanding that the President may make such minor adjustments as are required to complete the budget.

Resolution

Institutions, no less than human beings, are subject to the storms and stresses, the tribulations and the crises that affect all life. Institutions no less than human beings, have important decisions to make when beset by calamity or pressed by untoward events.

Twice within recent years the University of Minnesota, through its Board of Regents, has faced disquieting uncertainties. The illness of a gallant leader necessitated the appointment of a temporary helmsman. Later, with the passing of that leader, came the grave responsibility of selecting his successor. Such situations impose heavy burdens upon those who must make the ultimate choices.

Fortunate, therefore, is the governing body that can turn, as did the Regents of the University of Minnesota, to a true and tested friend and colleague, and in him find a focus for the loyalty, devotion, and respect of an entire university staff. Such a person was Guy Stanton Ford. He, and he alone, because of endearing personal qualities and eminent scholarly reputation, symbolized the faith and the hopes of a great educational institution. He, and he

alone, was the logical choice, for to him could be trusted, with full confidence, the leadership of the University of Minnesota.

Now, at the age of retirement, Guy Stanton Ford relinquishes the high position he has held with such distinction.

The Board of Regents, mindful of the years of devoted service he has given, and doubly conscious of the obligations they imposed upon him during the final years of his active association with the University of Minnesota, now, with rising vote, express their deep gratitude for all that Guy Stanton Ford has been, and all that he has done. As he leaves this campus to enter upon new fields of activity, they wish for him and Mrs. Ford happy years, and further rich accomplishment. They cherish the thought that a memory of friendship and comradeship, enriched by more than a quarter-century of joint endeavor in a common educational task, will grow in depth and satisfaction with each passing year.

And the Regents do further direct that this resolution shall be spread upon their minutes, there to remain in perpetuity as evidence of an association that is broken with regret and heartfelt sadness.

Voted to approve the following modification of the internal organization of the College of Science, Literature, and the Arts, as outlined in the statement filed supplement to the minutes, page 1857:

The faculty of the College of Science, Literature, and the Arts, following action taken at a meeting on May 19, 1941, submits to the Board of Regents for its approval certain changes in the form of faculty organization. The purpose of these adaptations is to stimulate more general and more productive participation of the faculty in the formulation of the educational policy and program of the College. The fundamental plan for faculty and administrative organization remains substantially the same as that previously adopted, as outlined on pp. 190-193 of *Laws and Regulations Governing the University of Minnesota* (1931). The principal changes are summarized in the following paragraphs:

I. Divisional and Student Personnel Councils

To the present faculty organization, consisting of the General Assembly, the Departments, the Advisory Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Students' Work Committee, there shall be added certain *Divisional Councils*, representing two or more related departments as may be authorized from time to time by the faculty, and a *College Student Personnel Council*.

The purpose of the *Divisional Councils*, which shall include such groups of related departments as the humanities, the social sciences, and the natural sciences, is to effect a better integration of curriculum and instruction in related disciplines.

The membership of the *Divisional Councils* shall be composed of representatives of the constituent departments elected by ballot with all persons of rank of instructor or above entitled to vote. The Dean and the Associate Dean shall be chairman and vice-

chairman, respectively, of the divisional councils until some other arrangement proves feasible.

The purposes of the *College Student Personnel Council* shall be (1) to study and recommend desirable policies and procedures related to such student personnel problems as admission; personal, educational, and vocational counseling; the effective utilization of all-University personnel services; and informal faculty-student relationships; (2) to provide assistance to faculty counselors in performing their activities effectively; (3) to stimulate research on problems of student adjustment; and (4) to consider the bearing of information about students on curricular and instructional problems.

The members of the *College Student Personnel Council* shall be composed of the Associate Dean (chairman), the Assistant Deans, and five members of the faculty elected by the Divisional Councils and the Committee of Faculty Counselors.

II. The Advisory Committee

The members of the Advisory Committee are to be elected in somewhat different fashion from the present procedure. The Committee shall be composed of the Dean (chairman), the Associate Dean (vice-chairman) and representatives elected by the Divisional Councils and the *College Student Personnel Council*.

The functions of the Advisory Committee shall be as follows: (1) to formulate, and to submit to the General Assembly for approval, regulations governing the requirements for admission and graduation, the election of studies, and the scholastic discipline of students; (2) to direct and conduct continuous study into the general problems of the college; (3) to formulate educational policies for the college and to report to the General Assembly for its approval such measures as in its judgment will best serve to carry out such policies and to improve the work of the college; and (4) to serve as an advisory body to the Dean on all questions of college policy.

It shall be understood that the organization is tentative, and may be adapted from time to time as experience makes desirable.

"The Special Committee on Permanent University Fund Lands of the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota have directed me to advise you that if any bids on Permanent University Fund iron ore lands are received at the opening scheduled for June 9, 1941, the Regents request an opportunity to examine the bids and the provisions of the proposed leases, and to advise you further that if in their judgment the bids and lease form are found satisfactory they will be willing to join with the State in the consummation of these leases.

"The Regents are in possession of an opinion from Dean Everett Fraser of the Law School to the effect that the management and control of the Permanent University Fund lands vests in the Regents. However, the Regents do not desire to discourage possible lessees who may be reluctant to enter into leases due to legal uncertainties. It is for this reason that the Regents would be willing to consider joining in any proposed leases.
